Additional information:

You can either attach the legs and arms for Mommy with security joints, or make them moveable with yarn – there are step by step images after the Assembly chapter. If you don't want to make the legs and arms moveable, it works fine just to sew them to the body. For the baby it is better to sew the legs and arms directly to the body (not moveable).

I recommend to look/read through the whole pattern, and make decision regarding legs and arms before you start crochet.

Think about the environment and don't print out. If you do so, avoid printing the pages with full page-pictures.

Materials required:

- Yarn – I used a cotton and acrylic blend DK weight yarn; Scheepjes Softfun. I used approx. 1,5 skeins (50 g + approx. 25-30 g) for the main color, and for ears, toes and bow I used leftovers.
(If you using bigger hook, I would recommend to have at least 2 skeins or more of the main color.)
- Crochet hook 2.5 mm
- Fibrefill / toy stuffing
- Security eyes, 10 mm (mommy)
- Security eyes, 7 mm (baby)
- Optional: 4 security joints (only for mommy)
- Stitch markers, scissor and embroidery needle

Size:

Mommy: approx. 17,5 cm in height (sitting)

Baby: approx. 10 cm in height (sitting)

(Note! When using 2.5 mm crochet hook and the yarn Scheepjes Softfun.)



Mommy elephant



Head

Work with blue color.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [inc] x 6 (12)

Rnd 3: [In back loops:](#) 12 sc (12)

Rnd 4-6: 12 sc – [3 rounds](#) (12)

Rnd 7: inc, 5 sc, dec, 4 sc (12)

Rnd 8: 12 sc (12)

Rnd 9: inc, 5 sc, dec, 4 sc (12)

Rnd 10: 1 sc, inc, 4 sc, dec, 4 sc (12)

Rnd 11: 2 sc, inc, 4 sc, dec, 3 sc (12)

Rnd 12-13: 3 sc, inc, 4 sc, dec, 2 sc – [2 rounds](#) (12)

Rnd 14: 12 sc (12)

Rnd 15: 1 sc, inc, 5 sc, inc, 4 sc (14)

Rnd 16: 2 sc, inc, 6 sc, inc, 4 sc (16)

Stuff the trunk firmly with filling. Make sure to shape it correctly and try not stuff too much so it loses its shape!

Rnd 17: 2 sc, inc, 8 sc, inc, 4 sc (18)

Rnd 18: 3 sc, inc, 9 sc, inc, 4 sc (20)

Rnd 19: 4 sc, inc, 9 sc, inc, 5 sc (22)

Rnd 20: 5 sc, inc, 10 sc, inc, 5 sc (24)

Rnd 21: 6 sc, [1 sc, inc] x 6, 6 sc (30)

Rnd 22: 6 sc, [inc, 2 sc] x 6, 6 sc (36)

Rnd 23: 6 sc, [3 sc, inc] x 6, 6 sc (42)



In the next two following rounds, we will mark where to place the security eyes. If you planning to embroider the eyes, you can use these marks as a direction.

Rnd 24: 3 sc, inc, [6 sc, inc] x 4, 5 sc, [mark next st by draw a separate yarn under the stitch:](#) 1 sc, inc, 3 sc (48)

Rnd 25: 4 sc, [mark next st by draw a separate yarn under the stitch:](#) 1 sc, 2 sc, inc, [7 sc, inc] x 5 (54)



Continue on the next page...

Rnd 26: 4 sc, inc, [8 sc, inc] x 5, 4 sc (60)

Rnd 27: 60 sc (60)

Rnd 28: [inc, 1 sc] x 3, 48 sc, [inc, 1 sc] x 3 (66)

Now place the security eyes where you marked with different yarn on round 24-25.

Use 10 mm security eyes (if using 2.5 mm hook, otherwise use what fits the gauge best).

Rnd 29-35: 66 sc – [7 rounds](#) (66)

Rnd 36: [9 sc, dec] x 6 (60)

Rnd 37: 60 sc (60)

Rnd 38: 4 sc, dec, [8 sc, dec] x 5, 4 sc (54)

Rnd 39: 54 sc (54)

Rnd 40: [7 sc, dec] x 6 (48)

Rnd 41: 48 sc (48)

Rnd 42: 3 sc, dec, [6 sc, dec] x 5, 3 sc (42)

Rnd 43: 42 sc (42)

Rnd 44: [5 sc, dec] x 6 (36)

Rnd 45: 2 sc, dec, [4 sc, dec] x 5, 2 sc (30)

Stuff the head firmly with filling and keep doing as you go.

Rnd 46: [3 sc, dec] x 6 (24)

Rnd 47: 1 sc, dec, [2 sc, dec] x 5, 1 sc (18)

Rnd 48: [1 sc, dec] x 6 (12)

Rnd 49: [dec] x 6 (6)

Fasten off and leave a small yarn tail. Weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each stitch and pull it tight to close. Then weave in the yarn end.



Ears

Inner ear

Work with pink color. Make 2.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [inc] x 6 (12)

Rnd 3: [1 sc, inc] x 6 (18)

Rnd 4: 1 sc, inc, [2 sc, inc] x 5, 1 sc (24)

Rnd 5: [3 sc, inc] x 6 (30)

Rnd 6: 2 sc, inc, [4 sc, inc] x 5, 2 sc (36)

Rnd 7: [5 sc, inc] x 6 (42)

Rnd 8: 3 sc, inc, [6 sc, inc] x 5, 3 sc (48)

Rnd 9: [7 sc, inc] x 6 (54)

Fasten off and cut the yarn.



Outer ear

Work with blue color. Make 2.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [inc] x 6 (12)

Rnd 3: [1 sc, inc] x 6 (18)

Rnd 4: 1 sc, inc, [2 sc, inc] x 5, 1 sc (24)

Rnd 5: [3 sc, inc] x 6 (30)

Rnd 6: 2 sc, inc, [4 sc, inc] x 5, 2 sc (36)

Rnd 7: [5 sc, inc] x 6 (42)

Rnd 8: 3 sc, inc, [6 sc, inc] x 5, 3 sc (48)

Rnd 9: [7 sc, inc] x 6 (54)

Take the inner ear and place it with the backside against the backside of the outer ear. Now you will crochet next round through both pieces (all 4 loops) starting from the first stitch on the outer ear and last stitch on the inner ear – see picture below. Hide the yarn tail from the inner ear and magic ring in-between the pieces.

Rnd 10: Both pieces and all 4 loops: 4 hdc, hdc-inc, [8 hdc, hdc-inc] x 5, 4 hdc (60)

Rnd 11: 60 hdc (60)

Pinch the top and crochet across the stitches: **5 sc** – see picture below.

Fasten off and leave a long tail to sew the ears to the head.




Place both pieces with backside against each other.



You will now crochet across both stitches (all 4 loops)



Hide all the yarn tails in between, before closing up.



Pinch the piece as a half moon and crochet across the stitches with 5 sc.

Legs

Start with blue color. Make 2.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [inc] x 6 (12)

Rnd 3: [1 sc, inc] x 6 (18)

Rnd 4: 1 sc, inc, [2 sc, inc] x 5, 1 sc (24)

Rnd 5: This round will be crochet in back loops: 8 sc, change to white: 1 bo, change back to blue: 2 sc, change to white: 1 bo, change to blue: 2 sc, change to white: 1 bo, change to blue: 9 sc (24) – see pictures below how to make bobble stitches and change colors at the same time.



1. Before you close the last single crochet (sc) (before heading to bobble stitch) you will change color to white.



2. Close the single crochet.



3. Yarn over.



4. Insert the hook through the next stitch's back loop. Yarn over.



5. Draw up a loop.



6. Yarn over and draw through the **two first loops** on the hook.



7. You will now have two loops on your hook.



8. Repeat step 3-6. Remember to draw the yarn only through the two first loops. You will now have three loops on the hook.



9. Repeat step 3-6. You will now have four loops on the hook.



10. Repeat step 3-6. You will now have five loops on the hook.



11. Pick up the blue yarn and yarn over.



12. Draw the yarn through **all** loops.



13. Continue with the next stitch that is a single crochet.



14. Now the bobble stitch is secured and you can push it out from backside, so it looks better.



15. Repeat the same for next bobble stitches. Cut the white yarn and tie it together inside the foot.

Rnd 6-11: 24 sc – 6 rounds (24)

Right foot:

Rnd 12: 3 sc, dec, 1 sc, dec, 16 sc (22)

Rnd 13: 4 sc, dec, 16 sc (21)

Rnd 14: 4 sc, dec, 15 sc (20)

Rnd 15: 3 sc, dec, 15 sc (19)

Rnd 16: 3 sc, dec, 14 sc (18)



Left foot:

Rnd 12: 17 sc, dec, 1 sc, dec, 2 sc (22)

Rnd 13: 18 sc, dec, 2 sc (21)

Rnd 14: 17 sc, dec, 2 sc (20)

Rnd 15: 17 sc, dec, 1 sc (19)

Rnd 16: 17 sc, dec (18)

If you will use safety joints, put the joint now between rnd 14 and 15 – on the side where the decreases are – see picture above. Take the help of the crochet hook to make a bigger hole, since they are quite wide and tricky to insert. Read more about security joints on page 15.

Stuff firmly with filling the bottom of the foot – up to round 10. Rest of the piece, stuff very lightly and keep it flat.

Rnd 17: [1 sc, dec] x 6 (12)

Rnd 18: [dec] x 6 (6)

Fasten off.

If you will have moveable legs (with either security joints or just yarn – read more on page 15) then leave a small yarn tail. Weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each stitch and pull it tight to close. Then weave in the yarn end.

If you will attach the leg on the body (not moveable), then leave a long yarn tail. Weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each stitch and pull it tight to close. Don't cut the yarn, you will use this to sew the leg to the body.



Arms

Start with blue color. Make 2.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [inc] x 6 (12)

Rnd 3: [1 sc, inc] x 6 (18)

Rnd 4: This round will be crochet in back loops: 6 sc, change to white: 1 bo, change back to blue: 1 sc, change to white: 1 bo, change to blue: 1 sc, change to white: 1 bo, change to blue: 7 sc (18) – see pictures on page 8 how to make bobble stitches and change colors at the same time. Here you need to make the color change right away on the next stitch after bobble stitch, see below.



Make the color change to white, before closing up the single crochet inbetween the bobble stitches.



Rnd 5-7: 18 sc – 3 rounds (18)

Rnd 8: [4 sc, dec] x 3 (15)

Rnd 9-10: 15 sc – 2 rounds (15)

Rnd 11: [3 sc, dec] x 3 (12)

Rnd 12-15: 12 sc – 4 rounds (12)

If you will use safety joints, put the joint now between rnd 13 and 14 – on the side of the arm (toes pointing forward - see picture above). Don't forget that right and left arm should have the joint opposite of each other. Read more about security joints on page 15.

Stuff **lightly** with filling to round 9.

Rnd 16: [dec] x 6 (6)

Fasten off.

If you will have moveable arms (with either security joints or just yarn – read more on page 15) then leave a small yarn tail. Weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each stitch and pull it tight to close. Then weave in the yarn end.

If you will attach the arm on the body (not moveable), then leave a long yarn tail. Weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each stitch and pull it tight to close. Don't cut the yarn, you will use this to sew the arm to the body.



Tail

Work with blue color. Do not stuff.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2-8: 6 sc – [7 rounds](#) (6)

Place the stitches together and crochet **3 sc** across.

Fasten off and leave a long tail to sew the tail to the body.

Take a different or same yarn and knot some fringes on the tip. Either with the crochet hook, or follow the steps below.



1. Put the stitches together after round 8, and crochet 3 sc across.



2. After fasten off it is time to do some fringes. Cut some strands of yarn.



3. Insert one of the strands with needle into the tip – at the magic ring.



4. Don't draw out the whole yarn, leave a yarn tail.



5. Now insert the needle on the other side.




6. Don't draw out the whole yarn, leave a loop.



7. Now, take the the yarn tails and draw them through the loop.



8. Repeat the steps to do more fringes.



9. When you are done, cut to the length you want.



Body

Work with blue color.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [inc] x 6 (12)

Rnd 3: [1 sc, inc] x 6 (18)

Rnd 4: 1 sc, inc, [2 sc, inc] x 5, 1 sc (24)

Rnd 5: [3 sc, inc] x 6 (30)

Rnd 6: 2 sc, inc, [4 sc, inc] x 5, 2 sc (36)

Rnd 7: [5 sc, inc] x 6 (42)

Rnd 8: 3 sc, inc, [6 sc, inc] x 5, 3 sc (48)

Rnd 9: 48 sc (48)

Rnd 10: [7 sc, inc] x 6 (54)

Rnd 11-15: 54 sc – [5 rounds](#) (54)

Rnd 16: [7 sc, dec] x 6 (48)

If you will use safety joints, insert the legs with joints now between rnd 10 and 11. Take the help of the crochet hook to make a bigger hole, since the joints are quite wide.



On the inside of the body, insert the bigger plastic washer, and then press in the lock as much as you can.



Place them across each other.



Align the arms with the legs.

Rnd 17-18: 48 sc – [2 rounds](#) (48)

Rnd 19: 3 sc, dec, [6 sc, dec] x 5, 3 sc (42)

Rnd 20: 42 sc (42)

Rnd 21: [5 sc, dec] x 6 (36)

Rnd 22: 36 sc (36)

Rnd 23: 2 sc, dec, [4 sc, dec] x 5, 2 sc (30)

Rnd 24: 30 sc (30)

If you will use safety joints, insert the arms with joints now between rnd 21 and 22.

Align the arms with the legs (should be straight above).

Stuff the body with filling.

Fasten off and leave a long yarn tail to sew to the head.



Assembly

Start to sew the ears to the head. Count 12 rows backwards from the last round of the head, and place the ears from the 12th row to the 16th row. Place them with approx. 18 stitches between.

Sew the ears on the side too – see dotted line on the picture – so they stay close to the head.



Make the face adjustment to give the eyes more depth – follow the steps on page 17. Embroider white yarn around the eyes like the picture below. On my instagram account, on my IGTV channel you can find videos how to do face adjustment and add white yarn.



Now you will sew the body to the head. The trunk should be little away from the neck, or adjust as desired. Just make sure to give some space in the end of the trunk, so baby can wrap her trunk around her mommies.



Continue on the next page...

If you used security joints, skip next part.

Place the legs between round 8 and 14 of the body. If you will sew them to the body (not moveable), then sew them as shown below with dotted line. This way the legs will stay against the body.

If you will do moveable legs with yarn, follow the steps on page 16. On my instagram account, on my IGTV channel you can find videos how to do moveable legs with yarn.

Place the arms between round 20 and 23. If you will sew them to the body (not moveable), then sew them as shown below with dotted line. This way the arms will stay against the body. If you will do moveable arms with yarn, follow the same steps for legs on page 16.



Place the tail in the middle between the legs, on round 9.



Now continue and make baby Amina, on page 18.

Moveably arms & legs

How to make moveable arms and legs:

There are two options to make moveable arms and legs. One is with security joints and the other you can use the same yarn as you crochet with.

Pros and cons for using security joints.

Pros = this is a great and secured way to have the arms/legs moveable and still not risk it to come out. They sit really steady, even better than security eyes.

Cons = It will cost a little bit extra. You can buy these in many hobby stores where you can buy other parts of doll making. Use the size after the yarn weight. Use smaller joints for thinner yarn. (One idea for saving, is to have the legs with security joints and arms without.)


Another con is that since the joints and locks are very hard pressed against each other, it's not super smooth to move the arms/legs up and down. To move them, you need to grab the arm/leg very close to the body and turn it.

Pros and cons for using just yarn.

Pros = it will not cost you any extra. The arms/legs are also very easy to move up and down.

Cons = after a while the yarn will lose its tension. This means that the arms/legs can feel loose and it's too moveable. But the good thing about this is that you can easily just cut the yarn off and replace it with new yarn by following the steps on the next page again.

How to use security joints*:



You will use 2 or 4 security joints. One joint consists of 3 pieces. One joint, one washer and one lock.



Before you insert the joint, make a big hole with help of the hook, or something else similar.



Insert the joint into the arm/leg, from the inside.



The "head" of the joint will be on the inside of the arm/leg.



Insert the arm/leg with the joint into the body.



Inside the body we will now lock the joint. First insert the washer (the bigger one) into the joint. And then insert the lock – the one with a ribbed hole. Press it in all the way and as much as you can. Use some kind of tool to press it even more to make it as secured as possible.

*Note: the pictures are showing in general, not specific to the doll for this pattern.

How to make moveable legs with yarn:



1. First pin the legs to the body and make sure that both are balanced and touching the ground together with body.



2. Insert the needle into one of the leg. (Preferable to use a long doll-needle. If you don't have this, use your normal needle, but be prepared that you need to squeeze the body to reach the needle.)



3. Pull the needle through the whole body and out on the other side to the other leg.



4. Pull the yarn until you have a small yarn tail left on the first leg.



5. Now insert the needle one stitch away where you pull it out.



6. And then through the body again and back to the first leg – one stitch away from where you first insert it.



7. And then in again on exact same place where you insert the needle on step 2.



8. Through the whole body again, and out again on the same place as step 3. You will now have a yarn tail on each side of the leg. You can now remove the needle.



9. Take the yarn tails on each side and pull away carefully (tighten up). Don't pull too much so body looks squeezed, but not too loose either. Pull as much as needed, and check the movability of the leg.



10. Use a normal-size needle and make a knot to secure the yarn. Insert the needle through a loop.



11. Pull the yarn to you have a small ring. Insert the needle into the ring.



12. Pull the yarn all the way and tie the knot. Weave in the yarn into the leg and cut it. Make the same on the other leg.




13. Taadaa! Now you can move the legs up and down as you wish. You can make same steps for the arms.

One idea is to use a button on each side of the leg. Insert the needle through the button, starting from step 2. You can, in step 10, tie a knot behind the button.



Face adjustment

How to give the face a more depth:



1. Take a long piece of same yarn as used for the head. Insert the needle with yarn just by the bottom corner of the left eye.



2. Pull out the needle to the right eye's bottom corner.



3. Pull the yarn to you have a small tail left on the left eye.



4. Now insert the needle just one stitch above. Try to follow the stitches of the head, so it will be "invisible".



5. Pull out needle one stitch above on the left eye.



6. Pull the yarn all the way so it will not be visible on the right eye's corner. Now insert the needle again where you insert the needle on step 1.



7. And then out again on the right eye where you pull out the needle on step 2.



8. Pull the yarn all the way so it will not be visible on the left eye. Now you can take out the needle.



9. Take each end of the yarn and pull away carefully (tighten up) to you get the depth you want.



10. Weave in the yarn tails as invisible as possible. Now it will looks like the eyes have more depth.

Work with blue color.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [1 sc, inc] x 3 (9)

Rnd 3: [In back loops:](#) 9 sc (9)

Rnd 4: 9 sc (9)

Rnd 5: 1 sc, inc, 3 sc, dec, 2 sc (9)

Rnd 6: 2 sc, inc, 3 sc, dec, 1 sc (9)

Rnd 7: 3 sc, inc, 3 sc, dec (9)

Rnd 8: 4 sc, inc, 2 sc, dec (9)

Stuff the trunk firmly with filling as you go. Make sure to shape it correctly and try not stuff too much so it loses its shape! See picture below.

Rnd 9-10: dec, 3 sc, inc, 3 sc – [2 rounds](#) (9)

Rnd 11: 1 sc, inc, [2sc, inc] x 2, 1 sc (12)

Rnd 12: [1 sc, inc] x 6 (18)

In the next round, we will mark where to place the security eyes. If you planning to embroider the eyes, you can use these marks as a direction.

Rnd 13: 1 sc, inc, [2 sc, inc] x 3, 1 sc, [mark next st by draw a separate yarn under the stitch:](#) 1 sc, inc, 2 sc, [mark next st by draw a separate yarn under the stitch:](#) inc, 1 sc (24)



Rnd 14: [3 sc, inc] x 6 (30)

Rnd 15: 2 sc, inc, [4 sc, inc] x 5, 2 sc (36)

Rnd 16: [5 sc, inc] x 6 (42)

Now place the security eyes where you marked with different yarn on round 13. Use 7 mm security eyes (if using 2.5 mm hook, otherwise use what fits the gauge best).

Rnd 17-21: 42 sc – [5 rounds](#) (42)

Rnd 22: [5 sc, dec] x 6 (36)

Rnd 23: 36 sc (36)

[Continue on the next page...](#)

Rnd 24: 2 sc, dec, [4 sc, dec] x 5, 2 sc (30)

Rnd 25: 30 sc (30)

Rnd 26: [3 sc, dec] x 6 (24)

Stuff the head with filling and stuff as you go.

Rnd 27: 1 sc, dec, [2 sc, dec] x 5, 1 sc (18)

Rnd 28: [1 sc, dec] x 6 (12)

Rnd 29: [dec] x 6 (6)

Fasten off and leave a small yarn tail. Weave the yarn tail through the front loops of each stitch and pull it tight to close. Then weave in the yarn end.



Ears

Inner ear

Work with pink color. Make 2.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [inc] x 6 (12)

Rnd 3: [1 sc, inc] x 6 (18)

Rnd 4: 1 sc, inc, [2 sc, inc] x 5, 1 sc (24)

Fasten off and cut the yarn.



Outer ear

Work with blue color. Make 2.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [inc] x 6 (12)

Rnd 3: [1 sc, inc] x 6 (18)

Rnd 4: 1 sc, inc, [2 sc, inc] x 5, 1 sc (24)

Take the inner ear and place it with the backside against the backside of the outer ear. Now you will crochet next round through both pieces (all 4 loops) starting from the first stitch on the outer ear and last stitch on the inner ear – see picture below. Hide the yarn tail from the inner ear and magic ring in-between the pieces.

Rnd 5: Both pieces and all 4 loops: [3 hdc, hdc-inc] x 6 (30)

[Pinch the top and crochet across the stitches: 3 sc](#) – see picture below.

Fasten off and leave a long tail to sew the ears to the head.



Place both pieces with backside against each other.



You will now crochet across both stitches (all 4 loops)



Hide all the yarn tails in between, before closing up.



Pinch the piece as a half moon and crochet across the stitches with 3 sc.

Legs

Work with blue color. Make 2.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [inc] x 6 (12)

Rnd 3: [2 sc, inc] x 4 (16)

Rnd 4: *In back loops:* 16 sc (16)

Rnd 5: 16 sc (16)

Rnd 6: [2 sc, dec] x 4 (12)

Rnd 7: 12 sc (12)

Stuff the leg with filling, but just up to round 5.

Rnd 8: [1 sc, dec] x 4 (8)

Rnd 9: 8 sc (8)



Place the stitches together and crochet **4 sc** across.

Fasten off and leave a long tail to sew the leg to the body.

Now embroider the toes by following the steps below.



1. Put the stitches together after round 9, and crochet 4 sc across.



2. After fasten off it is time to do the toes. Make sure to hold the leg correct. The flat side is the side of the leg.



3. Insert the needle into the side of the leg, inbetween stitches. Draw the needle out from the top, just in front of the front loop.



4. Now insert the needle one stitch above and out again on the same spot.



5. In again one stitch above, and out on the side, just in front of the front loop.



6. Make the same steps as 4 and 5, but draw out the needle on the other side.



7. Make same steps again on the last toe, and draw the needle out on exact spot where you insert the yarn in the beginning.



8. Make a tight knot. Cut the yarn tail as close as possible to the knot.



9. Push the knot into the piece to hide it.



10. Now you have toes to the leg.

Arms

Work with blue color. Make 2.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [1 sc, inc] x 3 (9)

Rnd 3: *In back loops:* 9 sc (9)

Rnd 4-8: 9 sc – 5 rounds (9)

Stuff the arm with filling, but just up to round 5.

Place the stitches together and crochet **4 sc**

across. Skip 1 stitch.

Fasten off and leave a long tail to sew the arm to the body.

Embroider the toes same as the feet, see previous page.



Tail

Work with blue color. Do not stuff.

Rnd 1: 4 sc in a magic ring (4)

Rnd 2-5: 4 sc – 4 rounds (4)

Rnd 6: [1 sc, inc] x 2 (6)

Fasten off and leave a long tail to sew the tail to the body.

Take a different or same yarn and knot some fringes on the first round, same as tail on mommy, see page 11.



Body

Work with blue color.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a magic ring (6)

Rnd 2: [inc] x 6 (12)

Rnd 3: [1 sc, inc] x 6 (18)

Rnd 4: 1 sc, inc, [2 sc, inc] x 5, 1 sc (24)

Rnd 5: [3 sc, inc] x 6 (30)

Rnd 6: 2 sc, inc, [4 sc, inc] x 5, 2 sc (36)

Rnd 7-10: 36 sc – [4 rounds](#) (36)

Rnd 11: 2 sc, dec, [4 sc, dec] x 5, 2 sc (30)

Rnd 12: 30 sc (30)

Rnd 13: [3 sc, dec] x 6 (24)

Rnd 14: 24 sc (24)

Fasten off and leave a long yarn tail to sew to the head. Stuff the body with filling.



BOW

Work with purple yarn.

Make a magic ring. Crochet following:

3 ch, 2 dc ([inside the magic ring](#)), 3 ch, slst ([inside the magic ring](#)),
3 ch, 2 dc ([inside the magic ring](#)), 3 ch, slst ([inside the magic ring](#)).



Now close the magic ring, but keep the hook in the loop while you do following: [wrap the yarn around the middle 3-4 times](#). Make a knot with the yarn tail from the middle of magic ring. **Do not cut the yarn yet!**

Now continue make **45 chains**. Before you fasten off, check if it fits the babys head (it should be placed sideways, one side in front of the ear and one side behind). Otherwise, adjust.

When you are satisfied with the length, sew the yarn tail from the chains on the backside of the bow. Make a knot with the other yarn tail and cut the yarn.



1. Start by making a magic ring. Make 3 chains.



2. Next you will crochet 2 double crochet inside the magic ring.



3. Make 3 chains.



4. Make a slip stitch inside the magic ring.



5. Make 3 chains.



6. Crochet 2 double crochet inside the magic ring.



7. Make 3 chains.



8. Make a slip stitch inside the magic ring.



9. Now close the magic ring by pulling the loose yarn tail. Keep the hook inside the loop.



10. Take the loose yarn tail and wrap it around the middle 3-4 times. Tie it on the backside with the other yarn, just at the loop where the hook is.



11. Continue now and make 45 chains. Before fasten off, check if it fits the babys head.





12. Fasten off and cut the yarn. Now take a needle and sew the yarn tail to the backside of the bow (at the middle). Tie it with the other yarn tail, cut the yarn close to the knot. Done!

Assembly

Start to sew the ears to the head. Count 8 rows backwards from the last round of the head, and place the ears from the 8th row to the 11th row. Place them with approx. 10 stitches between.

Sew also on the side of the ears – see dotted line on picture, so they stay close to the head.



Now you will sew the body to the head. Place the body on the centered underneath.



Sew the legs between round 6 and 8 of the body, aligned with the ears. Check how it looks by using pins on the legs first before sewing them. Sew the legs on the side too, so it stays close to the body. See dotted line below.

Sew the arms between round 11 and 13 of the body, aligned with the legs. Sew the arms on the side too, so it stays close to the body. See dotted line below.

Place the tail in the middle between the legs, on round 5-6.
