

Math check: Fifty gifts for twelve months divide up into an average of twelve per season using one versatile yarn, Universal Yarn's "Deluxe Worsted."

Newbie friendly? Easter egg toppers, Passover yarmulkes, a back-to-school zipped pencil case and patriotic bunting are among the more basic patterns.

Love is in the air: V-day heart motifs are knit into coffee cup snuggies, a hot-water-bottle cozy and a lacy pink cowl.

Dad's day: Forget the necktie. This Father's Day, go for a hound's-tooth felted eyeglass case or argyle golf-club covers.

Spook-tacular: Spiderweb boot toppers, a felted jack-o-lantern trick-or-treat bag and a ghoulish ghost hat scare up Halloween fashion.

Technical tricks: Mosaic swag stitch, two-stitch buttonhole, chevron cable.



Monster Knits for Little Monsters

By Nuriya Khegay

The concept: Whimsical anthropomorphic knit hats, mittens and bootie trios for wee ones up to age 3.

Math check: Twenty designs make up a menagerie of five categories—cuddly critters, feathered friends, huggable horrors, adorable animals and festive friends.

Newbie-friendly? Honey Bear—a Pooh-rific hoodie with ears, mittens embroidered with bumblebees and basic ribbed booties—is billed as the straightforward starter set.

The nose knows: Little Piggy has a spiral crocheted snout, 3-D beaks grace a quartet of bird-brained toppers and Reindeer sports a red pompon to guide the way.

Knit the force: An elfin cap with pointy ears and cabled crown furrows will make any infant look a whole lot like a certain small Jedi master.

Creature feature: Wise Owl's leafy brown scarf, Cute Shark's stand-up scales and fin, Cheeky Chicken's comb—the darling's in the details.

Technical tricks: Invisible seam, thumb gussets, make 1 left and right.



Christmas Stockings

By Robin Denney
WD Designs; \$24.95

The concept: Knit stockings to hang by the chimney with care.

Math check: Fifteen holly-jolly holiday designs. Stuff them to your heart's content.

Newbie-friendly? These are intarsia socks, so newbies beware. The good news is that you have to knit only one—no second-sock syndrome.

Deck the heels: Reindeers, gift boxes, ornaments, wreaths, snowflakes, candy canes and mistletoe are just a few of the yuletide motifs embellishing the stockings.

Check it twice: The intarsia charts are both color-coded and numbered (by row, column and stitch count), so you have two ways to keep track of the pattern.

Comfort and joy: An inspiration section shows how shifts in color, yarn and even


beaded bling can alter the basic motifs.

Technical tricks: Slip stitch stitch-wise (SLSW), pick up heel stitches, tassels.

The concept: Some of the most innovative cable experts around design twists and turns for women, men and kids using Debbie Bliss "Rialto" yarns.



Math check: Dozens of cable motifs within 25 garments, from full-sized coats to small-scale wristers and everything in between.

Newbie-friendly? A rice-stitch bustier,

shaped by changing needle sizes, is rated easy, so treat this as an entrée piece.

Peplum power: With peplums popping up everywhere this season, the opening garment—Jacqueline van Dillen's show-stopping wavy peplum sweater with allover intertwined cables and side ribs descending into undulating pleats—is right on trend.

Kiddin' around: Girls can pick from a little red patchwork poncho or a picot-edged smock with a pyramid of cables at the waist, each column topped by embroidered flowers; boys can choose from a festive Cosby-esque striped pullover with interrupted cables and a classic Bliss entrelac entry.

Not just sweaters: Socks, a shrug, a cowl, an oversized tee and a rocker vest with multidirec-



Wrist Bone Herringbone-rib pattern arm warmers

Seventh in a series

Here we are again, the fast-approaching holidays on our minds. So, my KAL friends, I bring you what I'm calling "Wrist Bone," a mid-length set knit in a herringbone-rib stitch pattern. I love using smaller projects to practice different skills, so to keep things interesting, this pattern incorporates a few advanced-beginner techniques: knitting in the round using double-pointed needles (dpns), reading a chart and creating a thumb gusset. Not to worry, beginners: As always, the *Knit Simple* crew will be on hand to help you if you get stuck. And to all you veteran stitchers out there: You'll dig how this pattern whips up quickly and still keeps your interest. My favorite part about these arm warmers? They're one of the debut projects for my newest yarn, Bernat "Sheep(ish) Stripes," the self-striping extension of the line that (if I may be so bold to say) we all know and love.

Join me on Facebook or Ravelry to Stitch (because we love it); to Rock (because we all do); to Knit-along (because everything's more fun when it's done with friends). Making a set (or three) of Wrist Bone warmers is just what we need to keep our hearts warm and our minds sane during this busy season. Looking forward to stitching with you soon! 


FACT: All six options have an eyelet row through which a ribbon or crochet tie can be woven.



These sweet booties are perfect for special occasions. Without the embroidery and picot bind-off, they're just right for everyday wear.



Mix and match the cuffs and insteps, play with the colors and ties—the options are endless. Knit up dozens of pairs for gift giving or donate them to a local charity.



DESIGNER: Annabelle Speer. **YARN:** CALYPSO by Tahki Yarns/Tahki•Stacy Charles (shown left). **TIP:** You can use these instructions with any weight of yarn; the afghan's finished size will change accordingly.

MATERIALS

Calypso by Tahki Yarns/Tahki•Stacy Charles, 3½oz/100g ball, each approx 184yd/168m (wool/acrylic)

- 9 balls in #03 rainforest
- One pair size 10 (6mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Size 10 (6mm) circular needle, 40"/100cm long
- Stitch holders
- Stitch markers

MEASUREMENTS

- Length 52½"/133cm
- Width 43½"/110.5cm

GAUGE

14 sts and 20 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 10 (6mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

STITCH GLOSSARY

M1L (make one left) Insert tip of LH needle from front to back under the strand between the last stitch worked and the next stitch on the needle. Knit into the back loop to increase one stitch.

M1R (make one right) Insert tip of LH needle from back to front under the strand between the last stitch worked and the next stitch on the needle. Knit into the front loop to increase one stitch.

SEED STITCH

(over an odd number of sts)

Row 1 K1, *p1, k1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 K the purl sts and p the knit sts.

Rep row 2 for seed stitch.

STRIP A

Cast on 9 sts, place marker (pm), cast on 27 sts.

Beg chart

*Row 1 (RS) Work chart over 27 sts, slip marker, work 9 sts in seed st. Cont in pats as established through row 34 of chart.

Next row (RS) Work 27 sts in St st (k on RS, p on WS), work 9 sts in seed st.

Next row (WS) Work 9 sts in seed st, work in St st to end.

Cont in pats as established for 32 rows more. *Rep between *'s twice more, then work rows 1–34 of chart with seed st border once more. Place sts on holder for upper edge.

STRIPS B and D

Cast on 27 sts. Work 34 rows in St st. *Work 34 rows in seed st, work 34 rows in St st; rep from * twice more. Place sts on holder for upper edge.

STRIP C

Cast on 27 sts. *Work rows 1–34 of chart. Work 34 rows in St st; rep from * twice more, then work rows 1–34 of chart once more. Place sts on holder for upper edge.

STRIP E

Cast on 27 sts, pm, cast on 9 sts.

Beg chart

*Row 1 (RS) Work 9 sts in seed st, slip marker, work chart over 27 sts. Cont in pats as estab-

lished through row 34 of chart.

Next row (RS) Work 9 sts in seed st, work 27 sts in St st.

Next row (WS) Work 27 sts in St st, work in seed st to end.

Cont in pats as established for 32 rows more. *Rep between *'s twice more, then work rows 1–34 of chart with seed st border once more. Place sts on holder for upper edge.

FINISHING

Sew panels together.

Upper edge



GAUGE

36 sts and 40 rows to 4"/10cm over k2, p2 rib, slightly stretched, using size 2 (2.75mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

SOCK

Note Socks are worked from top of leg to the foot.

With A, cast on 56 sts for top of leg. Divide evenly on dpn and join, taking care not to twist sts. Place marker for beg of rnd.

Rnd 1 K1, *p2, k2; rep from * to last 3 sts, p2, k1.

Rep rnd 1 for k2, p2 rib until piece measures 6 1/4"/16cm from beg.

Next (heel) rnd With scrap yarn, k28 sts, then return to beg of rnd and, with A, work same 28 sts again in rib, work in rib to end of rnd. Work 12 rnds more in rib. Bind off in rib.

Heel trim

Carefully remove scrap yarn row a few sts at a time, placing live sts above and below row on dpns—56 sts.

Next rnd (dec) With B, *k1, p1; rep from * around, dec'ing 8 sts evenly around—48 sts.

Cont in K1, p1 rib as established for 11 rnds more. Bind off in rib.



THE GAUGE

Knitting gauge—the number of stitches and rows per inch—determines the size of the garment you are making. Every knitting pattern states the gauge, or “tension,” on which the sizing is based. For successful results, it is essential to test your knitting against this measurement before you start a project. Make a test swatch at least 4" /10cm square, using the yarn and needle size called for in the pattern. Then measure your swatch using a ruler or a knit gauge tool, pictured at right. If the number of stitches and rows does not match the



pattern's gauge, you must change your needle size. An easy rule to follow is: TO GET FEWER STITCHES TO THE INCH/CM, USE A LARGER NEEDLE; TO GET MORE STITCHES TO THE INCH/CM, USE A SMALLER NEEDLE. Try different needle sizes until you get the proper stitch and row gauge.

glossary

BIND OFF: To finish off an edge and keep stitches from unraveling by lifting the first stitch over the second, the second over the third, etc. (U.K.: cast off)

BIND OFF IN RIBBING: Maintain the rib pattern as you bind off (knit the knit stitches; purl the purl stitches). (U.K.: cast off in ribbing)

CAST ON: Form a foundation row by making specified number of loops on the knitting needle.

DECREASE: Reduce the number of stitches in a row (i.e., knit 2 together; purl 2 together).

INCREASE: Add to the number of stitches in a row (i.e., knit in front and back of stitch).

KNITWISE: Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to knit it.

MAKE ONE: Insert tip of LH needle from front to back under the strand between the last stitch worked and the next stitch on the needle. Knit into the back loop to increase one stitch.

PLACE MARKERS: Loop a piece of contrasting yarn or a purchased stitch marker onto the needle.

PICK UP AND KNIT (PURL): Knit (or purl) into the loops along an edge.

PURLWISE: Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to purl it.

SELVAGE STITCH: Edge stitch that helps make seaming easier.

SKIP: Skip specified number of stitches of the previous row and work into next stitch. (U.K.: miss)

SLIP, SLIP, KNIT (PURL): Slip next two sts knitwise (purlwise), one at a time, to right-hand needle. Insert tip of left-hand needle into fronts of these sts from left to right and knit (purl) them together to decrease one st.

SLIP STITCH: In knitting, pass a stitch from the left-hand to the right-hand needle as if to purl without working it. In crochet, insert hook through loop or edge, yarn over and pull through loop on hook. (U.K.: abbreviation—ss or sc)

WORK EVEN: Continue in specified pattern without increasing or decreasing. (U.K.: work straight)

YARN OVER: In knitting, make a new stitch by placing the yarn over the right-hand needle. (U.K.: yfwd, yon, yrn) In crochet, wind yarn around hook. (U.K.: yoh or yrh)

Each pattern suggests a size and says OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE. See the gauge explanation opposite, and use any size that will give you the correct gauge.




slipknot



The slipknot becomes the first stitch. Hold the tail end of the yarn in your palm with your thumb. Wrap the yarn from the ball twice around your index and middle fingers.



Pull the strand attached to the ball through the loop between your two fingers to form a new loop.




Place the new loop on the needle. Tighten it by pulling on both ends of the yarn to form the slipknot. To prepare for casting on, leave an extra-long tail when making the slipknot.


casting on



With a slipknot on the needle in your right hand, wind the tail end around your left thumb. Wrap yarn from the ball over your left index finger. Hold both ends in your palm.



Insert the needle upward in the loop on your thumb, then behind the loop on your index finger. Use the needle to draw the yarn up from the ball through the loop to form a stitch.



Take your thumb out of the loop and pull the tail end to tighten the stitch on the needle. Repeat Steps 1 to 3 until the desired number of stitches is cast on.


making a knit stitch




The needle with the stitches is in your left hand, the first stitch near the tip. With the empty needle in your right hand, wrap the yarn around your fingers as shown. Insert the right needle from front to back into the first stitch on the left needle. Keep the right needle under the left needle and the yarn at the back.



Bring the yarn under and over the right needle, and pull it gently between the two needles. Use your right index finger to manipulate the yarn.




With the right needle, catch the yarn and pull it through the stitch on the left needle.




Slip the stitch off the left needle, leaving the new stitch on the right. Repeat Steps 1 to 4 until all the new stitches are on the right needle.

making a purl stitch




Hold the needle with the stitches in your left hand and the empty needle in your right hand. For the purl stitch, the yarn is held to the front of the work. Insert the right needle from back to front into the first stitch. The right needle is in front of the left needle, and the yarn is at the front of your work.



With your right index finger, wrap the yarn counterclockwise around the right needle, as shown.



Draw the right needle and yarn backwards through the stitch on the left needle, forming a loop on the right needle.



Slip the stitch off the left needle. Repeat Steps 1 to 4 until all the new stitches are on the right needle.

basic stitches

Garter stitch

Knit every row. For circular knitting: Knit one round, then purl one round.

Stockinette stitch

Knit right-side rows and purl wrong-side rows. For circular knitting: Knit all rounds. (U.K.: stocking stitch)

Reverse-stockinette stitch

Purl right-side rows and knit wrong-side rows. For circular knitting: Purl all rounds. (U.K.: reverse stocking stitch)

K1, P1 ribbing

Row 1: *K1, p1; rep from *.

Row 2: K the knit sts and p the purl sts. Rep row 2 for k1, p1 rib.

binding off

This process finishes off the edges of a garment to prevent them from unraveling. The most popular bind-off method for finishing knitting is: Knit two stitches.

*Insert the point of the left-hand needle (LHN) into the first stitch on the right-hand needle (RHN). With the point of the LHN, pull this stitch over the second stitch on the RHN. You have completed one bind-off, and one stitch remains on the RHN. Knit the next stitch. Repeat from * until you have bound off the required number of stitches. When one stitch remains on the RHN, pull the yarn end through the loop to fasten off.



Lamb's Pride Bulky by Brown Sheep Company, 4oz/113g skeins, each approx 125yd/114m (wool/mohair)

- 6 (6, 7, 8, 8) skeins in #M80 blue blood red (A)
- 1 skein each in #M105 RPM pink (B) and #M127 navy sailor (C)
- One each sizes 10 and 10½ (6 and 6.5mm) circular needles, 60"/150cm long OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Six 7/8"/22mm buttons
- Stitch markers, stitch holders

MEASUREMENTS

- **Bust** (buttoned) 33½ (37½, 41¼, 46¾, 50½")/85 (95, 104.5, 118.5, 128)cm
- **Length** 23 (23½, 24, 24½, 25")/58.5 (59.5, 61, 62, 63.5)cm

GAUGE

13 sts and 18 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using larger needles. TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

3-NEEDLE BIND-OFF

- 1) Hold right sides of pieces together on two needles. Insert third needle knitwise into first st of each needle, and wrap yarn knitwise.

2) Knit these two sts together, and slip them off the needles. *Knit the next two sts together in the same manner.

3) Slip first st on 3rd needle over 2nd st and off needle. Rep from * in step 2 across row until all sts are bound off.

NOTE

Body is worked in one piece to underarm. Circular needle is used to accommodate the large number of sts. Do not join.

BODY

With smaller needle and A, cast on 105 (117, 129, 147, 159) sts.

Row 1 (RS) K2, *p1, k1; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 2 (WS) P2, *k1, p1; rep from * to last st, p1. Rep rows 1 and 2 for k1, p1 rib until piece measures 3½"/9cm from beg, end with a WS row. Change to larger needle.

Beg with a RS row, work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) until piece measures 11½"/29cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Beg chart

Row 1 (RS) Working in St st, work 6-st chart rep 17 (19, 21, 24, 26) times, work sts 1–3 once more.

Cont to work chart in this way through row 12.

Next row (RS) With A, k 18 (21, 23, 27, 29) pm, k16 (16, 18, 18, 20), pm, k 37 (43, 47, 57, 61), pm, k16 (16, 18, 18, 20), k to end.

Next row (WS) [P to next marker, k to next marker] twice, p to end. K next row. Rep WS row once more. Piece measures approx 15"/38cm from beg.

Shape armhole

Next (armhole) row (RS) K23 (26, 28, 32, 34) sts for right front, bind off 6 (6, 8, 8, 10) sts, k until there are 47 (53, 57, 67, 71) sts from bind-off for back, bind off 6 (6, 8, 8, 10) sts, k to end—23 (26, 28, 32, 34) sts for left front.

LEFT FRONT

Working on left front sts only, work as foll:

Next row (WS) P to last 5 sts, k5.

Next (dec) row (RS) K5, ssk, k to end.

Rep last 2 rows 3 (4, 4, 5, 5) times more—19 (21, 23, 26, 28) sts.

Maintaining 5-st garter st border at armhole edge, work rem sts in St st until armhole measures 8 (8½, 9, 9½, 10)"/20.5 (21.5, 23, 24, 25.5)cm, end with a WS row.

Next row (RS) Bind off 10 (12, 14, 17, 19) sts, place rem 9 sts on st holder for hood.

BACK

Join A to 47 (53, 57, 67, 71) sts for back ready to work a WS row.

Next row (WS) K5, p to last 5 sts, k5.

Next (dec) row (RS) K5, ssk, k to last 7 sts, k2tog, k5.

Rep last 2 rows 3 (4, 4, 5, 5) times more—39 (43, 47, 55, 59) sts.

Maintaining 5-st garter st border at armhole edges, work even until back measures same as left front to shoulder, end with a WS row.

Next row (RS) Bind off 10 (12, 14, 17, 19) sts for shoulder, place center 19 (19, 19, 21, 21) sts on st holder for back neck, bind off rem 10 (12, 14, 17, 19) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Join A to 23 (26, 28, 32, 34) sts for right front ready to work a WS row.

Next row (WS) K5, p to end. **Next (dec) row (RS)** K to last 7 sts, k2tog, k5. Rep last 2 rows 3 (4, 4, 5, 5) times more—19 (21, 23, 26, 28) sts.

Maintaining 5-st garter st border at armhole edge, work even until right front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a WS row.

Next row (RS) Work 9 sts and place on st holder for hood, bind off rem 10 (12, 14, 17, 19) sts for shoulder.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams.




Next (inc) row (RS) K to 1 st before marker, M1, k1, sl marker (sm), k1, sm, k1, M1, k to end—2 sts inc'd.



Work in St st, rep inc row every other row 8 (8, 8, 7, 7) times more—55 sts.

Work even until hood measures 8½"/21.5cm, end with a WS row.

Next (dec) row (RS) K to 2 sts before marker, ssk, sm, k1, sm, k2tog, k to end—2 sts dec'd.

Rep dec row every other row 6 times more—41 sts. **Next (dec) row (RS)** Purl, dec'ing 1 st at center—40 sts. Divide rem sts evenly on 2 needles and join using 3-needle bind-off.

Front bands

With RS facing, smaller needle and A, beg at lower right front, pick up and k 83 (85, 87, 89, 91) sts along right front edge to shoulder, 83 sts along hood edge to left shoulder, 83 (85, 87, 89, 91) sts along left front edge—249 (253, 257, 261, 265) sts.

Next row (WS) P1, *k1, p1; rep from * to end.

Cont in k1, p1 rib as established for 2 rows more. **Next (buttonhole) row (RS)** Work 4 sts in rib, [yo, k2tog, work 8 sts in rib] 5 times, yo, k2tog, work in rib to end.

Work 3 rows more in rib. Bind off in rib.

Sew buttons opposite buttonholes. ☺

BODY

With smaller needle and A, cast on 121 (135, 147, 159) sts.

Row 1 (RS) K2, *p1, k1; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 2 (WS) P2, *k1, p1; rep from * to last st, p1.

Rep rows 1 and 2 for k1, p1 rib until piece measures 3"/7.5cm from beg, end with a WS row. Change to larger needle.

Beg with a RS row, work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) until piece measures 12½"/31.5cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Beg chart

Row 1 (RS) Working in St st, work 6-st chart rep 20 (22, 24, 26) times, then work sts 1 (1–3, 1–3, 1–3) once more.

Cont to work chart in this way through row 12.

Next row (RS) With A, k 22 (26, 28, 29) pm, k16 (16, 18, 22), pm, k 45 (51, 55, 57), pm, k16 (16, 18, 22), k to end.

Next row (WS) [P to next marker, k to next marker] twice, p to end. K next row. Rep WS row once more. Piece measures approx 16"/40.5cm from beg.

Shape armhole

Next (armhole) row (RS) K27 (31, 33, 34) sts for right front, bind off 6 (6, 8, 12) sts, k until there are 55 (61, 65, 67) sts from bind-off for back, bind off 6 (6, 8, 12) sts, k to end—27 (31, 33, 34) sts for left front.

LEFT FRONT

Working on left front sts only, work as foll:

Next row (WS) P to last 5 sts, k5.

Next (dec) row (RS) K5, ssk, k to end.

Rep last 2 rows 4 (5, 5, 5) times more—22 (25, 27, 28) sts.

Maintaining 5-st garter st border at armhole edge, work rem sts in St st until armhole measures 9½ (10½, 11, 11½)"/24 (26.5, 28, 29)cm, end with a WS row.

BACK

Join A to 55 (61, 65, 67) sts for back ready to work a WS row.



Next row (RS) With A, k 13 (14, 15, 17) pm, k14 (16, 16, 16), pm, k 27 (27, 31, 33), pm, k14 (16, 16, 16), k to end.

Next row (WS) [P to next marker, k to next marker] twice, p to end. K next row. Rep WS row once more. Piece measures approx 10½ (11, 12, 12½)"/27 (28, 30.5, 32)cm from beg.

Shape armhole

Next (armhole) row (RS) K18 (19, 20, 22) sts for right front, bind off 4 (6, 6, 6) sts, k until there are 37 (37, 41, 43) sts from bind-off for back, bind off 4 (6, 6, 6) sts, k to end—18 (19, 20, 22) sts for left front.




Next (dec) row (RS) K to last 7 sts, k2tog, k5. Rep last 2 rows 1 (1, 2, 2) times more—16 (17, 17, 19) sts. Maintaining 5-st garter st border at armhole edge, work even until right front measures same as back to shoulder, end with a WS row.

Next row (RS) Work 7 (8, 8, 9) sts and place on st holder for hood, bind off rem 9 (9, 9, 10) sts for shoulder.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams.

Hood

With RS facing, larger needle and A, k 7 (8, 8, 9) sts from right front hood holder, 15 (15, 17, 17) sts from back neck holder, 7 (8, 8, 9) sts from left front hood holder—29 (31, 33, 35) sts.

Next row (WS) Purl. **Next row (RS)** K14 (15, 16, 17), place marker (pm), k1, pm, k to end. P 1 row.

Next (inc) row (RS) K to 1 st before marker, M1, k1, sl marker (sm), k1, sm, k1, M1, k to end—2 sts inc'd. Work in St st, rep inc row every other row 7 (6, 7, 6) times more—45 (45, 49, 49) sts.

Work even until hood measures 7½"/19cm, end with a WS row.

Next (dec) row (RS) K to 2 sts before marker, ssk, sm, k1, sm, k2tog, k to end—2 sts dec'd.

Rep dec row every other row 6 times more—31 (31, 35, 35) sts.

Next (dec) row (WS) Purl, dec'ing 1 st at center—30 (30, 34, 34) sts.

Divide rem sts evenly on 2 needles and join using 3-needle bind-off.

Front bands

With RS facing, smaller needle and A, beg at lower right front, pick up and k 61 (63, 65, 67) sts along right front edge to shoulder, 75 sts along hood edge to left shoulder, 61 (63, 65, 67) sts along left front edge—197 (201, 205, 209) sts.

Next row (WS) P1, *k1, p1; rep from * to end.

Next (buttonhole) row (RS) Work 4 sts in rib, [yo, k2tog, work 8 sts in rib] 4 times, yo, k2tog, work in rib to end.

Work 4 rows more in rib. Bind off in rib.

Sew buttons opposite buttonholes.

For Stripes

- 1 hank each in #2117 real teal (A) and #2100 spring green (B)
- One pair size 8 (5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE

MEASUREMENTS

- Circumference 18½ (19½, 20½)"/47 (49.5, 52)cm
- Length (brim folded up) 8 (8½, 9½)"/20.5 (21.5, 23)cm

GAUGE

22 sts and 25 rows to 4"/10cm over elongated rib (unstretched) using larger needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

K1, P1 RIB (over an odd number of sts)

Row 1 (RS) K1, *p1, k1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 (WS) P1, *k1, p1; rep from * to end.

Rep rows 1 and 2 for k1, p1 rib.

ELONGATED RIB

(over an odd number of sts)

Row 1 (RS) K1, *p1, k1 wrapping yarn twice around needle; rep from * to last 2 sts, p1, k1.

Row 2 (WS) P1, *k1, sl next st wyif, dropping extra wrap; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, p1.

Rep rows 1 and 2 for elongated rib.

SOLID HAT

Cast on 101 (107, 113) sts. Work in k1, p1 rib for 2½(3, 3)"/6.5 (7.5, 7.5)cm (for brim), end with a WS row. Work in elongated rib until piece measures 8 (8½, 9)"/20.5 (21.5, 23)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape top

Cont k1, p1 rib, working decs as foll:

For man's size only—Next row (RS) Dec 3 sts evenly across row—110 sts. Work 1 row even.

Next row (RS) [K2tog, rib 20 sts] 5 times—105 sts. Work 1 row even. **Next row** [K2tog, rib 19 sts] 5 times—100 sts. Work 1 row even.

For woman's size only—Next row (RS) [K2tog, rib 13 sts] 7 times, rib to end—100 sts. Work 1 row even.

For child's size only—Next row (RS) K2tog, rib to end—100 sts. Work 1 row even.

For all sizes—Next row (RS) [K2tog, rib 18 sts] 5 times—95 sts. **Next row and every WS row** Work even.

Next row [K2tog, rib 17 sts] 5 times—90 sts.

Next row [K2tog, rib 16 sts] 5 times—85 sts.

Next row [K2tog, rib 15 sts] 5 times—80 sts.

Next row [K2tog] 40 times—40 sts.

Next row [K2tog] 20 times—20 sts.

Next row [K2tog] 10 times—10 sts.

FINISHING

Cut yarn, leaving long tail. Thread through rem 10 sts. Pull tog tightly and secure end. Sew back seam, sewing first 2½ (3, 3)"/6.5 (7.5, 7.5)cm from WS, so that seam does not show when folded up. Fold up brim.

COLOR BLOCK HAT

With A, cast on 101 (107, 113) sts. Work same as solid hat until piece measures 7 (7½, 8)"/18 (19, 20.5)cm from beg, end with a WS row. Change to B, and complete as for solid hat.

STRIPED HAT

With A, cast on 101 (107, 113) sts. Work in k1, p1 rib for 2½ (3, 3)"/6.5 (7.5, 7.5)cm from beg, end with a WS row. Cont in elongated rib as foll:

Beg stripe pat

[With A, work 4 rows. With B, work 4 rows] 4 times. With A, work 4 rows more. Cont with B and work even (if necessary) until pieces measures 8½ (9, 9½)"/21.5 (23, 24)cm from beg, end with a WS row. Shape top and complete as for solid hat. ☀

- Length (with brim rolled) 8½"/21.5cm

GAUGE

20 sts and 28 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 7 (4.5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

K1, P1 RIB

(over an even number of sts)

Rnd 1 *K1, p1; rep from * around.

Rep rnd 1 for k1, p1 rib.

HAT

With circular needle and A, cast on 100 sts. Place marker (pm) for beg of rnd and join, taking care not to twist sts.

Work in St st (k every rnd) until piece measures 1½"/4cm from beg. Work in k1, p1 rib for 2 rnds. Work in St st until piece measures 8"/20.5cm from k1, p1 rib.

Divide for ears

Next rnd K20 for left ear and place on scrap yarn, k30 and place on st holder for front, k20 for right ear and place on scrap yarn, k30 for back. Graft 30 sts from front st holder to 30 sts for back.

Left ear

With RS facing and dpn, join A to 20 sts on scrap yarn for left ear, join and pm for beg of rnd.

Next rnd K10, pm, k to end of rnd.

K 3 rnds.

Next (inc) rnd K to 1 st before marker, kfb, slip marker (sm), kfb, k to end of rnd—2 sts inc'd. Rep inc rnd every 5th rnd 4 times more—30 sts. K 1 rnd.

Cut yarn, leaving long tail. Graft front and back 15 sts tog.

Right ear

Work as for left ear.

FINISHING

Teeth

With dpn and B, cast on 25 sts. K 3 rows.

Shape teeth

Row 1 (RS) K5, turn, leave rem sts unworked.

Row 2 (WS) Ssk, k3.

Row 3 Ssk, k2.

Row 4 Ssk, k1.

Row 5 K2tog.

Cut yarn, fasten off last st.

*With RS facing, join B and work rows 1-5 over next 5 sts, fasten off last st; rep from * until all sts have been worked and 5 teeth have been shaped. Using photo as guide, sew teeth to hat approx 2 1/2"/6.5cm from lower edge.

Eyes (make 2)

With dpn and C, cast on 4 sts. Pm for beg of rnd and join, taking care not to twist sts. K 1 rnd.

Next (inc) rnd [Kfb] 4 times—8 sts.

Next rnd Knit. Bind off.

Using photo as guide, sew eyes to hat approx 2 1/2"/6.5cm above teeth. ☀

- One set (4) size 7 (4.5mm) double-pointed needles (dpns)
- Fiber fill for ears (optional)
- Stitch markers

MEASUREMENTS

• Head circumference 20"/51cm

• Length 8 1/4"/21cm

GAUGE

20 sts and 28 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 7 (4.5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

K1, P1 RIB (over an even number of sts)

Rnd 1 *K1, p1; rep from * around.

Rep rnd 1 for k1, p1 rib.

HAT

With circular needle and A, cast on 100 sts. Place marker (pm) for beg of rnd and join, taking care not to twist sts.

Work in k1, p1 rib until piece measures 1 1/4"/3cm from beg. Work in St st (k every rnd) until piece measures 3"/7.5cm from beg.

Shape mouth

Next rnd Bind off 50 sts, k to end—50 sts.

Next rnd Pick up and k into back loop of each bound-off st from previous rnd to create mouth ridge on RS, k to end—100 sts.

Cont in St st until piece measures 8"/20.5cm from beg.

Shape crown

Note Change to dpns when there are too few sts to fit comfortably on circular needle.

Next (dec) rnd [K2tog, k3] 20 times—80 sts.

Next rnd Knit.

Next (dec) rnd [K2tog, k2] 20 times—60 sts.

Next rnd Knit.

Next (dec) rnd [K2tog, k1] 20 times—40 sts.

Next (dec) rnd [K2tog] 20 times—20 sts.

Next rnd Knit.

Next (dec) rnd [K2tog] 10 times—10 sts.

Next rnd Knit.

Cut yarn, leaving long tail. Thread yarn through rem sts and pull tight to close.

FINISHING

Ears (make 2)

With dpn and A, cast on 18 sts. Pm for beg of rnd and join, taking care not to twist sts.

Next rnd K9, pm, k to end of rnd.

K 4 rnds.

Next (inc) rnd [Kfb, k to 1 st before marker, kfb] twice—4 sts inc'd.

[K 5 rnds, rep inc rnd] twice—30 sts.

Work even in St st until piece measures 4 1/2"/11.5cm from beg.

Next (dec) rnd [Ssk, k to 2 sts before marker, K2tog] twice—4 sts dec'd.

Next rnd Knit.

Rep last 2 rows 5 times more—6 sts.

Cut yarn, leaving long tail. Thread yarn through rem sts and pull tight to close. Stuff ears if desired. Using photo as guide, sew base of ear to side of hat centered on mouth ridge.

Tooth

With RS facing, dpn and B, beg approx 2 1/4"/5.5cm from left side edge, pick up and k 8 sts along mouth ridge. Work in garter st (k every row) for 12 rows. Bind off.

Tack upper edge of tooth to hat.

Eyes (make 2)

With dpn and C, cast on 4 sts. Pm for beg of rnd and join, taking care not to twist sts. K 1 rnd.

Next (inc) rnd [Kfb] 4 times—8 sts.

Next rnd Knit.

Bind off. Sew eyes to front of hat using photo as guide. ☀

Rep rnd 1 for k1, p1 rib.

HAT

Work in k1, p1 rib until piece measures 1 1/4"/3cm from beg.

Beg stripes

*With B, k 6 rnds, with A, k 6 rnds; rep from * 4 times more.

Shape crown

Note Change to dpns when there are too few sts to fit comfortably on circular needle.

Next (dec) rnd With B, [k2tog, k3] 20 times—80 sts.

Next rnd Knit.

Next (dec) rnd [K2tog, k2] 20 times—60 sts.

Next rnd Knit.

Next (dec) rnd [K2tog, k1] 20 times—40 sts.

Next (dec) rnd [K2tog] 20 times—20 sts.

Next rnd Knit.

Next (dec) rnd [K2tog] 10 times—10 sts.

Next rnd Knit.

Cut yarn, leaving long tail. Thread yarn through rem sts and pull tight to close.

FINISHING

Teeth

With dpn and C, cast on 35 sts. K 3 rows.

Shape teeth

Row 1 (RS) K5, turn, leave rem sts unworked.

Row 2 (WS) Ssk, k3.

Row 3 Ssk, k2.

Row 4 Ssk, k1.

Row 5 K2tog.

Cut yarn, fasten off last st.

*With RS facing, join C and work rows 1–5 over next 5 sts, fasten off last st; rep from * until all sts have been worked and 7 teeth have been shaped. Sew cast-on edge of teeth to cast-on edge of hat using photo as guide.

Eyes (make 2)

With dpn and D, cast on 4 sts. Pm for beg of rnd and join, taking care not to twist sts. K 1 rnd.

Next (inc) rnd [Kfb] 4 times—8 sts.

Next rnd Knit.

Next (inc) rnd [Kfb] 8 times—16 sts.

Bind off. Sew eyes to front of hat using photo as guide. ☺

Encore Tweed by Plymouth Yarn Company, 3½ oz/100g skeins, each approx 220yd/183m (acrylic/wool/rayon)

• 2 (3, 3, 4) skeins in #T212 brick (A)

• 1 skein in #1237 granola taupe (B)

• Two size 8 (5mm) circular needles, each 24"/60cm long OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE

• One extra size 8 (5mm) knitting needle

- Six ¾"/20mm buttons
- Two ¾"/10mm buttons (for eyes)
- One ¾"/20mm button (for nose)
- Stitch markers and holders
- Tapestry needle
- Scrap yarn

MEASUREMENTS

- **Chest** (buttoned) 22¼ (24, 26, 28)"/56.5 (61, 66, 71)cm
- **Length** 13 (14, 15, 16)"/33 (35.5, 38, 40.5)cm
- **Upper arm** 9 (10, 11, 12)"/23 (25.5, 28, 30.5)cm

GAUGE

17 sts and 25 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 8 (5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

PROVISIONAL CAST ON

Using scrap yarn and crochet hook, ch the number of sts to cast on plus a few extra. Cut a tail and pull the tail through the last chain. With knitting needle and yarn, pick up and knit the stated number of sts through the "purl bumps" on the back of the chain. To remove scrap yarn chain, when instructed, pull out the tail from the last crochet stitch. Gently and slowly pull on the tail to unravel the crochet stitches, carefully placing each released knit stitch on a needle.

3-NEEDLE BIND-OFF

See Pattern #1.

NOTES

- 1) Body is worked in one piece to underarm.
- 2) Lower garter border piece is worked first, then folded to RS, the fronts are put on hold to shape pockets after body is complete, the back is joined to back sts.

BODY

Cast on 88 (96, 104, 112) sts using provisional cast on and working pick up row with B. Work in garter st (k every row) until piece measures 4"/10cm from beg. Cut B and join A.

With A, work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) until piece measures 8"/20.5cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Carefully remove scrap yarn from provisional cast-on as foll: Place 22 (24, 26, 28) sts on st holder for pocket, place center 44 (48, 52, 56) sts on 2nd circular needle to join to body, place rem 22 (24, 26, 28) sts on st holder for pocket.

Join lower garter piece

Fold garter section to RS.

Next (joining) row (RS) With A, k22 (24, 26, 28) sts from body needle, holding garter section needle in front of body needle, [k 1 st from garter section needle tog with 1 st from body needle] 44 (48, 52, 56) times, k to end.

Cont in St st with A until piece measures 8½ (9, 9½, 10)"/21.5 (23, 24, 25.5)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Separate for armhole

Next row (RS) K22 (24, 26, 28), place on st holder for right front, k44 (48, 52, 56), place on st

holder for back, k22 (24, 26, 28) sts for left front.

Left front

Cont in St st over left front sts only until armhole measures 2½ (3, 3½, 4)"/6.5 (7.5, 9, 10)cm, end with a RS row.

Shape neck

Bind off 4 sts at neck edge (beg of WS rows) twice, then dec 1 st at neck edge every other row 4 times—10 (12, 14, 16) sts. Work even, if necessary, until armhole measures 4½ (5, 5½, 6)"/11.5 (12.5, 14, 15)cm, end with a WS row. Bind off sts for shoulder.

Back

Join A to 44 (48, 52, 56) sts for back ready to work a WS row. Cont in St st until armhole measures same as left front to shoulder, end with a WS row. Bind off.

Right front

Join A to 22 (24, 26, 28) sts for right front ready to work a WS row. Cont in St st until armhole measures 2½ (3, 3½, 4)"/6.5 (7.5, 9, 10)cm, end with a WS row.

Shape neck

Bind off 4 sts at neck edge (beg of RS rows) twice, then dec 1 st at neck edge every other row 4 times—10 (12, 14, 16) sts. Work even, if necessary, until armhole measures same as back to shoulder, end with a WS row. Bind off.

Right front pocket

Join B to 22 (24, 26, 28) right pocket sts ready to work a RS row.

Next row (RS) Knit.

Next row (dec WS) K1, k2tog, k to end—1 st dec'd.

Rep last 2 rows 13 times more—8 (10, 12, 14) sts. Bind off. Sew top of pocket to body.



SLEEVES

With B, cast on 26 (28, 32, 32) sts. Work in garter st until piece measures 2"/5cm from beg. Cut B and join A.

With A, work in St st, inc 1 st each side every 6th row 6 (7, 8, 10) times—38 (42, 48, 52) sts.

Work even until piece measures 9 (9½, 11½, 12½)"/23 (24, 29, 31.5)cm from beg, end with a WS row. Bind off.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. With center of bound-off sts of sleeve at shoulder seam, sew top of sleeve to front and back armhole. Sew sleeve and side seams.

Hood

With RS facing and A, beg at right front neck edge, pick up and k 48 (48, 50, 52) sts evenly around neck edge.

Next row (WS) K4 for garter st border, place marker (pm), p20 (20, 21, 22), pm, p20 (20, 21, 22), pm, k4.

Cont in St st, working 4-st garter st border at edges, for 8 rows more.

Next (inc) row (RS) Work to 1 st before marker, kfb, sl marker, kfb, work to end—2 sts inc'd.

Rep inc row every 10th row 4 times more—58 (58, 60, 62) sts. Work 1 WS row.

Next (dividing) row (RS) K26 (26, 27, 28), ssk, k1, turn, leave rem 29 (29, 30, 31) sts on hold.

Next row (WS) Purl.

Next (dec) row (RS) K to last 3 sts, ssk, k1—1 st dec'd.

Rep last 2 rows 5 times more—22 (22, 23, 24) sts. Place on st holder.

Join A to 29 (29, 30, 31) sts for 2nd half of hood ready to work a RS row.

Next row (RS) K1, k2tog, k to end.

Next row (WS) Purl.

Rep last 2 rows 6 times more—22 (22, 23, 24) sts. Join top of hood using 3-needle bind-off. Sew center back opening closed.

Brim

Place markers at hood edge 4"/10cm from center seam on each side.

With RS facing and B, pick up and k 32 sts between markers.

Row 1 Knit.

Short row 2 (RS) K to last 4 sts, turn.

Short row 3 (WS) K to last 4 sts, turn.

Short rows 4 and 5 K to last 8 sts, turn.

Row 6 K24.

Row 7 K32.

Rows 8–14 Rep rows 1–7.

Row 15 (WS) K32, pick up and p 4 sts from

hood edge—36 sts.

Row 16 K to end, pick up and k 4 sts from hood edge—4 sts inc'd.

Rep row 16 for 6 times more, k picked up sts on RS and p picked up sts on WS—64 sts.

Row 23 K64, pick up and p 6 sts from hood edge ending at neck edge—70 sts.

Row 24 K70, pick up and k 6 sts from hood edge ending at neck edge—76 sts.

Bind off.

Ears (make 2)

With B, cast on 8 sts. K 12 rows.

Row 13 (dec) K1, k2tog, k2, k2tog, k1—6 sts.

Rows 14 and 16 Knit.

Row 15 (dec) K1, [k2tog] twice, k1—4 sts.

Row 17 (dec) K1, k2tog, k1—3 sts. Cut B and cont with A. **Rows 18, 20, and 22** With A, k3.

Row 19 K1, kfb, k1—4 sts.

Row 21 K1, [kfb] twice, k1—6 sts.

Row 23 K1, kfb, k2, kfb, k1—8 sts.

K 12 rows. Bind off.

Fold ears in half with WS tog, sew side seams. Using photo as guide, sew ears to top of hood approx 5"/12.5cm from center seam.

Sew nose button to center front hood approx ¾"/2cm from edge.

Eyes

With tapestry needle and B, using photo as guide, work duplicate st foll chart. Sew small buttons in center of eyes.

Button band

With RS facing and B, beg at lower edge, pick up and k 48 (52, 56, 60) sts along right front edge to neck edge, working through both layers along pocket. K 12 rows. Bind off.

Buttonhole band

With RS facing and B, beg at neck edge, pick up and k 48 (52, 56, 60) sts along left front edge, working through both layers along pocket.

K 5 rows.

Next (buttonhole) row (RS) K3 (3, 2, 4), [yo, k2tog, k6 (7, 8, 8)] 5 times, yo, k2tog, k to end. K 5 rows more. Bind off.

Sew buttons to buttonband opposite buttonholes. •

- 1 ball each in #37 earth (A) and #42 pink (B)
- Small amount of Rialto 4 Ply in #02 ecru for eyes and nose
- One pair each sizes 1 and 3 (2.25 and 3.25mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Polyester fiberfill

Large rabbit

Rialto Chunky by Debbie Bliss/KFI, 1¾oz/50g balls, each approx 66yd/60m (wool)

- 2 balls in #04 chocolate (A)
- 1 ball in #16 rose pink (B)
- Small amount of Rialto 4 Ply in #02 ecru for eyes and nose
- One pair each sizes 5 and 7 (3.75 and 4.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Polyester fiberfill

MEASUREMENTS

- **Body circumference** (stuffed) 5½ (7, 9)"/14 (18, 23)cm
- **Length** (excluding legs) 4 (5, 7)"/10 (13, 18)cm

GAUGES

Small rabbit

26 sts and 35 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 1 (2.25mm) needles.

Medium rabbit

20 sts and 25 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 3 (3.25mm) needles.

Large rabbit

16 sts and 22 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 7 (4.5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGES.

NOTE

Rabbits are made using the same pattern in different yarn weights.

LEGS (make 2)

With larger needles and A, cast on 12 sts. P 1 row. **Next (inc) row (RS)** K1, [M1, k1] 11 times—23 sts. P 1 row.

Next (inc) row K1, M1, k8, [M1, k1] 6 times, k7, M1, k1—31 sts.

Work 3 rows in St st (k on RS, p on WS).

Next (dec) row K13, k2tog, k1, SKP, k13—29 sts. P 1 row.

Next (dec) row K12, k2tog, k1, SKP, k12—27 sts. P 1 row.

Next (dec) row K7, bind off 13 sts, k to end.

Work 9 rows across all sts, inc one st at each end of 2nd row—16 sts.

Next (dec) row [K1, SKP, k3, k2tog] twice—12 sts. P 1 row.

Next (dec) row [K1, SKP, k1, k2tog] twice—8 sts.

Next (dec) row [P2tog] 4 times—4 sts.

Cut yarn, thread through rem sts and pull tightly. Sew instep, sole, and back leg seam, leaving an opening. Stuff with fiberfill and close opening.

BODY

Note Begin at neck edge.

With larger needles and A, cast on 15 sts. P 1 row.

Next (inc) row K1, [M1, k1] 14 times—29 sts.

Beg with p row, work 5 rows in St st.

Next (inc) row [K7, M1] twice, k1, [M1, k7] twice—33 sts.

Work 3 rows even.

Next (inc) row K16, M1, k1, M1, k16—35 sts.

Work 5 rows even.

Next (dec) row K15, SKP, k1, k2tog, k15—33 sts.

Work 3 rows even.

Next (dec) row K14, SKP, k1, k2tog, k14—31 sts.

Next (dec) row K1, [k2tog] 15 times—16 sts.

P 1 row. Bind off.

ARMS (make 2)

With larger needles and A, cast on 6 sts. P 1 row.

Next (inc) row K1, [m1, k1] 5 times—11 sts.

P 1 row.

Next (inc) row K1, [M1, k4, M1, k1] twice—15 sts.

Work 7 rows even.

Next (dec) row K1, [SKP, k2, k2tog, k1] twice—11 sts.

Work 13 rows even, inc one st at each end of 4th row—13 sts.

Next (dec) row K1, [SKP, k1, k2tog, k1]—9 sts.

P 1 row.

Next (dec) row K1, [k2tog] 4 times—5 sts. P 1 row.

Cut yarn, thread through rem sts and pull tightly. Sew underarm seam, leaving an opening. Stuff with fiberfill and close opening.

HEAD

Note Begin at back.

With larger needles and A, cast on 7 sts. P 1 row.

Next (inc) row K1, [M1, k1] 6 times—6 sts inc'd.

Rep last 2 rows once more—25 sts.

Work 3 rows in St st.

Next (inc) row K1, [M1, k3]—33 sts.

Work 13 rows even.

Next (dec) row K1, [k2tog] 16 times—17 sts.

Work 5 rows even.

Next (dec) row K1, [k2tog] 8 times—9 sts.

P 1 row. Cut yarn, thread through rem sts and pull tightly. Sew seam, leaving an opening. Stuff with fiberfill and close opening.

OUTER EARS (make 2)

With larger needles and A, cast on 4 sts. K 1 row.

Next (inc) row K1, [M1, k1] 3 times—7 sts. K 1 row.

Next (inc) row K3, M1, k1, M1, k3—9 sts.

K 30 rows.

Next (dec) row SKP, k to last 2 sts, k2tog—2 sts dec'd. K 1 row.

Rep last row twice more—3 sts.

K 1 row. K3tog, fasten off.


INNER EARS (make 2)

With smaller needles and B, work same as for outer ears.

FINISHING

Fold sides of body to center, then join bind off edge. Gather neck edge, pull up and secure. Join back seam, leaving an opening. Stuff and close opening. Sew inner ears to outer ears. Fold cast on edges in half and stitch outside edges tog. Sew head in position, then sew on ears. With C, embroider eyes and nose using photo as a guide. Attach yarn at seam approx 1/2" / 1cm below top of one arm, thread yarn through body at shoulder position, then attach other arm, pull yarn tightly and thread through body again in same place, then attach yarn to first arm again and fasten off. Attach legs at hip position same way as arms. ☺

Royal Petites

Sized for Newborn to 3 months. Shown on page 31.

MATERIALS

Royal Petites by Blue Sky Alpacas, 1.2oz/35g balls, each approx 100yd/91m (royal alpaca)

- 1 ball will make one pair of booties:

For moss st #1708 sea glass (light green);

For rib #1701 pewter (gray);

For cable #1703 café au lait (beige);

For embroidery #1700 alabaster (off white), small amount of embroidery floss in pink and green;

For lace #1706 petticoat (pale pink);

For shell stitch #1704 cameo (peach)

- One pair size 4 (3.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Crochet hook size H-8 (5mm) for crochet tie
- Cable needle (cn) for cable version
- 1yd/1m of 1/4" / 6mm matching satin ribbon for tie (optional)

MEASUREMENTS

- Sole 3" / 7.5cm

GAUGE

24 sts and 36 rows to 4" / 10cm over St st using larger needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

PICOT BIND OFF

K1, bind off 1, k1, bind off 1, *put the st on LH needle, cast on 2 sts (3 sts on needle), bind off 2 sts, k1, bind off 1, k1, bind off 1; rep from *, end bind off last st. Fasten off.

SOLE (for all six versions)

Cast on 31 sts. Purl 1 row on WS. Cont in St st as foll:

Row 1 (RS) *K1, inc 1 st in next st, k12, inc 1 st in next st; rep from * once, end k1—35 sts.

Row 2 and all WS rows Purl.

Row 3 *K1, inc 1 st in next st, k14, inc 1 st in next st; rep from * once, end k1—39 sts.

Row 5 *K1, inc 1 st in next st, k16, inc 1 st in next st; rep from * once, end k1—43 sts.

Row 7 *K1, inc 1 st in next st, k18, inc 1 st in next st; rep from * once, end k1—47 sts.

Row 8 Purl.

Next row (RS) K2tog, k43, k2tog—45 sts.

Purl 1 row. Work instep and cuff for desired version as foll:

MOSS STITCH

Shape instep

Row 1 (RS) K27, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 2 (WS) Sl 1, [k1, p1] 4 times, k1, p2tog, turn.

Row 3 Sl 1, [p1, k1] 4 times, p1, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 4 Sl 1, [p1, k1] 4 times, p1, p2tog, turn.

Row 5 Sl 1, [k1, p1] 4 times, k1, k2tog tbl, turn.

Rep last 4 rows until 10 sts are on each side of instep, end with a WS row.

Next row (RS) Sl 1, k20. Purl 1 row—31 sts.

Work 2 rows in St st.

Eyelet row (RS) K1, *yo, k2tog, k1; rep from * to end. Purl 1 row. Work 2 rows in St st; dec 1 st on last row—30 sts.

Cuff

Row 1 (RS) K1, *k1, p1; rep from *, end k1.

Row 2 P1, p the knit sts and k the purl sts to last st, p1. Rep last 2 rows for 12 rows more.

Turning row (RS) Knit.

Next row (WS) P1, *p1, k1; rep from *, end p1.

Next row K1, p the knit sts and k the purl sts to last st, k1. Rep last 2 rows 10 times more. Bind off in pat.

RIB AND EMBROIDERY

Shape instep

Row 1 (RS) K27, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 2 (WS) Sl 1, p9, p2tog, turn.

Row 3 Sl 1, k9, k2tog tbl, turn.

Rep last 2 rows until 10 sts are on each side of instep, end with a WS row.

Next row (RS) Sl 1, k20. Purl 1 row—31 sts.

Work 2 rows in St st.

Eyelet row (RS) K1, *yo, k2tog, k1; rep from * to end. Purl 1 row. Work 2 rows in St st, dec 1 st on last row—30 sts.

Rib cuff

Row 1 (RS) K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Row 2 K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Rep last 2 rows for 12 rows more.

Turning row (RS) Knit.

Next row (WS) K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Next row K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Rep last 2 rows 10 times more. Bind off in rib.

Embroidery cuff

Work in k1, p1 rib for 14 rows.

Turning row (RS) Knit.

Next row (RS after turnback) [K4, P1] 6 times.

Next row K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Rep last 2 rows 10 times more. Work picot bind off.

Embroidery

Note Work embroidery before seaming.

Embroider one flower on instep and 4 on cuff (see photo).



CABLE

Shape instep

Row 1 (RS) K27, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 2 (WS) Sl 1, p4, kfb, p4, p2tog, turn.

Row 3 Sl 1, k2, p1, 4-st LC (sl 2 sts to cn and hold to front, k2, k2 from cn), p1, k2, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 4 Sl 1, p2, k1, p4, k1, p2, p2tog, turn.

Row 5 Sl 1, k2, p1, k4, p1, k2, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 6 Rep row 4.

Rep rows 3–6 until 10 sts are at each side of instep and 12 sts in center.

Next row (RS) Sl 1, k19, k2tog.

P 1 row—31 sts. Work 2 rows in St st.

Eyelet row (RS) K1, *yo, k2tog, k1; rep from * to end. P 1 row. Work 2 rows in St st.

Cuff

Work in k1, p1 rib for 14 rows.

Turning row (RS) Knit, inc 1 st at end of row—32 sts.

Next row (RS after turnback) K1, p1, *k4, p2; rep from *, end k4, p1, k1.

Next row K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Cable row K1, p1, *4-st LC, p2; rep from *, end 4-st LC, p1, k1.

Next row K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Rep last 4 rows twice more. Bind off in pat.

LACE

Shape instep

Row 1 (RS) K27, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 2 Sl 1, k9, p2tog, turn.

Row 3 Sl 1, k1 * [yo, k2tog] 4 times, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 4 Rep row 2.

Row 5 Sl 1, k9, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 6 Sl 1, p9, p2tog, turn.

Row 7 Rep row 5.

Row 8 Rep row 2.

Rep rows 3–8 once more.

Row 15 Sl 1, k1 * [yo, k2tog] 4 times, k2tog tbl, turn—10 sts are at each side of instep and 11 sts in center.

Next row (RS) Sl 1, k20.

P 1 row—31 sts.

Work 2 rows in St st.

Eyelet row (RS) K1, *yo, k2tog, k1; rep from * to end. P 1 row. Work 2 rows in St st.

Cuff

Work in k1, p1 rib for 14 rows.

Turning row (RS) Knit.

Row 1 (RS after turnback) Knit.

Row 2 (WS) Knit.

Row 3 (eyelet) row K2, *yo, k2tog, rep from * end k1.

Row 4 P1, k to last st, p1.

Rows 5–7 Work in St st.

Rows 8–10 Rep rows 2–4.

K 1 row, p 1 row. Work picot bind off.

SHELL STITCH

Shape instep

Row 1 (RS) K27, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 2 Sl 1, p9, p2tog, turn.

Row 3 Sl 1, p2, k1, [yo, k1] 4 times, p2, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 4 Sl 1, k2, p1, [k1, p1] 4 times, k2, p2tog.

Row 5 Sl 1, p2, k1, p1, ssk, k1, k2tog, p1, k1, p2, k2tog tbl, turn.

Row 6 Sl 1, k2, p1, k1, p3tog, k1, p1, k2, p2tog, turn. Rep rows 3–6 twice more.

Next row (RS) Sl 1, k20. P 1 row—31 sts.

Work 2 rows in St st.

Eyelet row (RS) K1, *yo, k2tog, k1; rep from * to end.

P 1 row. Work 2 rows in St st.

Cuff

Work in k1, p1 rib for 14 rows.

Turning row (RS) Knit, dec 1 st—30 sts.

Next row (RS after turnback) P2, *k1, [yo, k1]

4 times, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 2 K2, *p1, [k1, p1] 4 times, k2; rep from * to end.

Row 3 P2, *k1, p1, ssk, k1, k2tog, p1, k1, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 4 K2, *p1, k1, p3tog, k1, p1, k2; rep from * to end.

Rep rows 1–4 twice more.

Bind off purwise.

FINISHING

Sew sole and back seam up to turning row.

Cord (make 2)

With 2 strands held tog and crochet hook, ch approx 18"/45.5cm. Fasten off.

Thread cord (or ribbon) through eyelet row and tie in bow. Fold cuff to outside. ☀

- Stitch marker

MEASUREMENTS

- Circumference 14"/35.5cm
- Length (cuff to heel) 14"/35.5cm
- Foot (heel to toe) 10"/25.5cm

GAUGE

17 sts and 26 rnds to 4"/10cm over St st using size 7 (4.5mm) dpns.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

I-CORD

With 2 dpns cast on desired number of sts.

*Knit one row. Without turning work, slide the sts back to the opposite end of needle to work next row from RS. Pull yarn tightly from the end of the row. Rep from * until desired length. Bind off.

POMPOM

- 1) Following the template on page 93, cut two circular pieces of cardboard.
- 2) Hold the two circles together and wrap the yarn tightly around the cardboard. Carefully cut around the cardboard.
- 3) Tie a piece of yarn tightly between the two circles. Remove the cardboard and trim the pompom.

K1, P1 RIB

(over an even number of sts)

Rnd 1 *K1, p1; rep from * around.

Rep rnd 1 for k1, p1 rib.

STOCKING

With A, cast on 60 sts, evenly distributed on 4 needles. Place marker (pm) and join, being careful not to twist sts. Work in k1, p1 rib until cuff measures 1"/2.5cm from beg. Cut A.
With B, k 6 rnds. With C, k 2 rnds.
With B, k 4 rnds. With C, k 2 rnds. Cut C.
With B, cont in St st (k every rnd) until piece measures 12"/30.5cm from beg. Cut B.

Beg heel flap

Next rnd With A, k15 and turn.

Next row Sl 1, p29, dropping marker for beg of rnd, and working all 30 heel sts onto one dpn. Leaving 30 sts for instep on hold, work back and forth on heel sts as foll:

Row 1 *Sl 1, k1; rep from * to end of row.

Row 2 Sl 1, p29.

Rep rows 1 and 2 six times more, then row 1 once more.

Turn heel

Row 1 Sl 1, p16, p2tog, p1, turn.

Row 2 Sl 1, k5, SKP, k1, turn.

Row 3 Sl 1, p to 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1, turn.

Row 4 Sl 1, k to 1 st before gap, SKP, k1, turn.

Rep rows 3 and 4 until all sts have been worked and 18 sts rem on heel needle. Cut A.

Gusset

With free needle and B, pick up and k 8 sts along edge of heel flap. With next needle, k across 30 instep sts. With free needle, pick up and k 8 sts along other edge of heel flap, k9 heel sts. Pm for beg of rnds; with next needle, k9 heel sts and 8 gusset sts onto same needle, work to end of rnd, working instep sts back onto 2 separate needles if desired.

Next (dec) rnd Work to last 3 sts of first needle, k2tog, k1, work across instep sts, k1, SKP, k to end of rnd. Work one rnd even in pat. Rep dec rnd once more—60 sts.

Foot

Cont even in St st in B until foot measures 9"/23cm from back of heel. Cut B.

Toe shaping

Next (dec) rnd With A, *k8, k2tog; rep from * around. K 1 rnd.

Next (dec) rnd *K7, k2tog; rep from * around. K 1 rnd.

Next (dec) rnd *K6, k2tog; rep from * around.

Next (dec) rnd *K5, k2tog; rep from * around.

Next (dec) rnd *K4, k2tog; rep from * around. Cont to dec in this manner every rnd until 6 sts rem. Cut yarn and thread through sts.

FINISHING

Pompoms and I-cord

With C, cast on 3 sts leaving long tail. Work I-cord until piece measures 15"/38cm or desired length.

With C, make two 2 1/2"/6.5cm pompoms. Use tail from I-cord for step 3 when making each pompom to secure pompoms to end of I-cord. Tack center of I-cord to center of cuff using photo as guide.

I-cord hanging loop

With A, cast on 5 sts. Work I-cord until piece measures 6"/15cm. Turn and work back and forth in garter st (k every row) for 1"/2.5cm. Bind off. Sew garter st tag to inside back of cuff. Form loop with I-cord and sew end to outside back of cuff. See page 93 for How-To. ☺

Row 3 Sl 1, p to 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1, turn.

Row 4 Sl 1, k to 1 st before gap, SKP, k1, turn.

Rep rows 3 and 4 until all sts have been worked and 18 sts rem on heel needle. Cut C.

Gusset

With free needle and A, pick up and k 8 sts along edge of heel flap. With next needle, k across 30 instep sts. With free needle, pick up and k 8 sts along other edge of heel flap, k9 heel sts. Pm for beg of rnds; with next needle, k9 heel sts and 8 gusset sts onto same needle, work to end of rnd, working instep sts back onto 2 separate needles if desired.

Next (dec) rnd Work to last 3 sts of first needle, k2tog, k1, work across instep sts, k1, SKP, k to end of rnd.

Work one rnd even in pat.

Rep dec rnd once more—60 sts.

Foot

With A, k 7 rnds.

With B, k 11 rnds.

With A, k 11 rnds.

Toe shaping

Next (dec) rnd With C, *k8, k2tog; rep from * around. K 1 rnd.

Next (dec) rnd *K7, k2tog; rep from * around. K 1 rnd.

Next (dec) rnd With B, *k6, k2tog; rep from * around.

Next (dec) rnd *K5, k2tog; rep from * around.

Next (dec) rnd *K4, k2tog; rep from * around.

Cont to dec in this manner every rnd until 6 sts rem. Cut yarn and thread through sts.



- One set (4) size 6 (4mm) double-pointed needles (dpn) OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Size H-8/5mm crochet hook
- Scrap yarn
- Stitch marker

MEASUREMENTS

- Diameter of felted coaster 4"/10cm
- Diameter of felted box 4 1/2"/11.5cm

GAUGE

22 sts and 40 rows to 4"/10cm over garter st using size 6 (4mm) needles before felting.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

PROVISIONAL CAST ON

See Pattern #8.

MACHINE FELTING

- 1) Use a low water setting and hottest temperature in a top loading washing machine. Add small amount of laundry detergent and jeans or towels for agitation.

2) Place item in a lingerie bag or zippered pillow-case and add to machine. Check the felting progress frequently, removing item when the individual stitches are no longer visible and item is felted to the desired size.

3) Place item in cool water to stop the felting process and remove suds. Remove from lingerie bag and roll gently in towel to remove excess water.

4) Block and shape while wet. Pin into shape or stuff with plastic bags, and allow to air dry completely.

NOTES

1) Twist yarns when changing colors to prevent holes in work.

2) Knit 1st st tbl on WS rows.

COASTERS (make 4)

With A, cast on 12 sts using provisional cast-on, leaving a long tail.

Short row 1 (WS) With A, k10, turn.

Row 2 (RS) K10.

Short row 3 K8, turn.

Row 4 K8.

Short row 5 K6, turn.

Row 6 K6.

Short row 7 K4, turn.

Row 8 K4.

Short row 9 K2, turn.

Row 10 K2.

Row 11 K12.

Row 12 (RS) With B, k12.

Rows 13–23 With B, rep rows 1–11.

Row 24 (RS) With A, k12.

Rep rows 1–24 four times more, then work rows 1–23 once more for a total of 12 wedges.

Remove provisional cast on and carefully place 12 sts on dpn. With B, graft cast-on row to final row worked.

Thread cast-on tail through sts at center, pull tightly and secure.

BOX BASE

Work as for coaster through finishing. With RS facing and B, pick up and k 72 sts evenly around edge of base. Join and place marker (pm) for beg of rnd. K 1 rnd. [P 1 rnd, k 1 rnd] 7 times. Bind off purrlwise.

BOX LID

With A, cast on 14 sts using provisional cast-on, leaving a long tail.

Short row 1 (WS) With A, k12, turn.

Row 2 (RS) K12.

Short row 3 K10, turn.

Row 4 K10.

Short row 5 K8, turn.

Row 6 K8.



4-st LC SI 2 sts to cn, hold to front, k2, k2 from cn.

K2, P2 RIB

(multiple of 4 plus 2)

Row 1 (RS) *K2, p2; rep from *, end k2.

Row 2 *P2, k2; rep from *, end p2.

Rep rows 1 and 2 for k2, p2 rib.

3-ROW BUTTONHOLE

Row 1 (RS) Work 25 sts in rib, k2tog, yo twice, work in rib to end.

Row 2 Work to buttonhole, knit 1st yo and drop the 2nd yo, work to end.

Row 3 Work to buttonhole, knit into buttonhole and drop the st above, work to end.

SCARF

Cast on 50 sts. Work in k2, p2 rib for 1" / 2.5cm.

Next 3 rows Work 3-row buttonhole.

Cont in k2, p2 rib until piece measures 2" / 5cm from beg, end with a WS row and dec 2 sts on last row—48 sts.

Beg chart (see page 92)

Work rows 1–8 of chart twice, then rows 1–7 once more. Piece measures approx 5 1/2" / 14cm from beg.

Next (turning) row (WS) Knit.

Note RS & WS side are reversed after the turning row.

Purl 1 row (new WS). Beg with row 1 (new RS), work chart through row 8, then rep rows 1–8 until piece measures 60 1/2" / 153.5cm from beg, end with row 8.

Next (turning) row (RS) Knit.

Note RS & WS side are reversed after the turning row.

Beg with row 1 (new RS), work chart through row 8, then work rows 1–8 twice more.

Inc 2 sts on next row, work in k2, p2 rib for 3/4" / 2cm, end with a WS row—50 sts.

Next 3 rows Work 3-row buttonhole.

Cont in k2, p2 rib for 1" / 2.5cm.

Bind off loosely in rib.

FINISHING

Fold 5 1/2" / 14cm pocket at each end to RS along turning row. Sew pocket edges.

Sew buttons to scarf. ☺

3-ROW BUTTONHOLE

Row 1 (RS) Work 21 sts in rib, k2tog, yo twice, work in rib to end.

Row 3 Work to buttonhole, knit *into* buttonhole and drop the st above, work to end.

SCARF

With larger needles, cast on 46 sts.

Beg with row 6 (new RS), cont in basketweave st until piece measures 4"/10cm from 2nd turning row, end with row 4.

Inc row (WS) P23, M1 p-st, p to end.

Change to larger needles.

Work k2, p2 rib for 3/4"/2cm, end with a WS row.

Next 3 rows Work 3-row buttonhole.

Cont in k2, p2 rib for 1"/2.5cm.

Bind off loosely in rib.

FINISHING

Fold 6"/15cm pocket at each end to RS along turning row. Sew pocket edges.

Sew buttons to scarf. ☀

3-ROW BUTTONHOLE

Row 1 K16, k2tog, yo twice, k to end.

Row 2 K to buttonhole, knit 1st yo and drop the 2nd yo, k to end.

Row 3 K to buttonhole, knit *into* buttonhole and drop the st above, k to end.

SCARF

Cast on 36 sts. Work in garter st (k every row) for 1"/2.5cm.

STITCH GLOSSARY

EL (elongated st) Working into yos from previous row, k1 wrapping yarn around needle twice, p1 wrapping yarn around needle twice, drop extra yos. Transfer the last 2 sts back to LH needle dropping extra wraps, creating an elongated bar of twisted strands between the 2 sts. Bring RH needle in front of work, then under elongated bar from back to front, sl 1 st st purllwise, bring RH needle behind and under elongated bar back to original position. Bring RH needle behind and under elongated bar, sl 1 purllwise, bring needle to front, under bar and back to original position.

NOTE

1) Practice EL on a swatch with project yarn before beginning.

2) When changing colors, twist yarns on WS to prevent holes in work.

COWL

With crochet hook and scrap yarn, ch 68 for provisional cast on. Skip first 3 purl bumps. With

MC, pick up and k 1 st in each of next 34 bumps; with CC, pick up and k 1 st in each of next 28 bumps—62 sts.

Rows 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9 (RS) With MC, k2, ssk, yo 4 times, k2tog, k28; with CC, k28.

Row 2 With CC, k28; with MC, k29, EL, k3.

Rows 4, 6, 8 and 10 With CC, k3, p25; with MC, p29, EL, k3.

Rep rows 1–10 until piece measures 38"/96.5cm from beg, end with row 8.

Next row (RS) With MC, k2, ssk, yo 3 times, k2tog, k28; with CC, k28.

Cut MC and CC, leaving 43"/109cm long tails for grafting.

FINISHING

Remove scrap yarn from provisional cast on and place 60 sts and double yo on 2nd needle. Graft CC sts, then graft MC sts to yo. Drop yo, then wrap grafting yarn three times around loose strand, graft rem sts. ✎

Rnd 1 P1, sl 1wyif, *p3, sl 1wyif; rep from * around, end p2.

Rnd 2 *K3, sl 1wyif; rep from * around. Rep these 2 rnds for cartridge belt rib.

COWL

With smaller needle, cast on 324 sts. Join taking care not to twist sts, and place marker for beg of rnd. Work in rev St st (purl every rnd) for 6 rnds for rolled edge.

Change to larger needle. Work in cartridge belt rib for 8 1/2"/21.5cm, end with rnd 2. Piece measures approx 9"/23cm from rolled edge.

Row 1 (RS) K3, *p5, k3; rep from * to end.

Row 2 P3, *k5, p3; rep from * to end.

Row 3 Rep row 1.

Row 4 Purl.

Row 5 P4, *k3, p5; rep from *, end p4.

Row 6 K4, *p3, k5; rep from *, end k4.

Row 7 Rep row 5.

Row 8 Purl.

Rep rows 1–8 until piece measures 7 1/2"/19cm from beg, end with row 4 or 8. Knit 3 rows. Bind off knitwise. Cut B leaving a long tail for sewing.

BLOCK 3 LACE DIAMONDS

With B, cast on 28 sts. Knit 2 rows. Work in lace diamond pat as foll:

Row 1 (RS) K2, *k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k2; rep from *, end k2.

Row 2 and all WS rows Purl.

Row 3 K2, *k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k1; rep from *, end k2.

Row 5 K1, k2tog, *yo, k5, yo, SK2P; rep from *, end last rep ssk (instead of SK2P), k2.

Row 7 K2, *yo, ssk, k3, k2tog, yo, k1; rep from *, end k2.

Row 9 K2, *k1, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k2; rep from *, end k2.

Row 11 K2, *k2, yo, SK2P, yo, k3; rep from *, end k2.

Row 12 Purl.

Rep rows 1–12 until piece measures 7 1/2"/19cm from beg, end with a WS row. Knit 3 rows. Bind off knitwise. Cut B leaving a long tail for sewing.

BLOCK 4 WIDE STRIPES

With B, cast on 36 sts. Knit 2 rows. Work in St st and wide stripe pat as foll:

Rows 1–10 B. Rows 11–18 A. Rows 19–20 B.

Rows 21–24 A. Rows 25–26 B.

Rows 27–34 A. Rows 35–44 B.

Knit 3 rows. Bind off knitwise. Cut B leaving a long tail for sewing.

BLOCK 5 CABLE COMBO

With A, cast on 42 sts. Knit 2 rows. Work in cable pat as foll:

Rows 1 and 5 (RS) K1, p4, k6, p4, k12, p4, k6, p4, k1.

Rows 2 and 4 P1, k4, p6, k4, p12, k4, p6, k4, p1.

Row 3 K1, p4, 6-st RC, p4, 6-st RC, 6-st LC, p4, 6-st LC, p4, k1.

Row 6 Rep row 2.

Rep rows 1–6 until piece measures 7 1/2"/19cm from beg, end with a WS row. Knit 3 rows. Bind off knitwise. Cut A leaving a long tail for sewing.

BLOCK 6 VERTICAL EYELETS

With B, cast on 30 sts. Knit 2 rows.

Work in vertical eyelet pat as foll:

Row 1 (RS) Knit.

Row 2 Purl.

Row 3 K5, *yo, SKP, k2tog, yo, k4; rep from *, end k1.

Row 4 Purl.

Rep rows 3 and 4 until piece measures 7½"/19cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Knit 3 rows.

Bind off knitwise.

Cut B leaving a long tail for sewing.

BLOCK 7 QUILTED LATTICE

With A, cast on 33 sts. Knit 2 rows. Work in quilted lattice pat as foll:

Row 1 (RS) K2, *sl 5 wyif, k1; rep from *, end k1.

Row 2 and all WS rows Purl.

Row 3 K4, *insert RH needle under loose strand and knit next st, bringing st out under strand, k5; rep from *, end last rep k4.

Row 5 K1, sl 3 wyif, *k1, sl 5 wyif; rep from * to last 5 sts, end k1, sl 3 wyif, k1.

Row 7 K1, *k next st under loose strand, k5; rep from *, end last rep k1.

Row 8 Purl.

Rep rows 1–8 until piece measures 7½"/19cm from beg, end with row 4 or 8.

Knit 3 rows. Bind off knitwise.

Cut A leaving a long tail for sewing.







LEFT BOW

Luzia by Louisa Harding/KFI, 1 1/4oz/50g balls, each approx 43yd/40m (viscose/nylon)

- 1 ball in #02 ruby
- One pair size 11 (8mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- 1yd/1m velvet ribbon

MEASUREMENTS

Approx 16 x 3 1/2"/40.5 x 9cm

GAUGE

11 sts and 14 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using size 11 (8mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

COLLAR

Cast on 41 sts.

Rows 1 and 2 Knit.

Row 3 (eyelet RS) K1, *yo, k2tog; rep from * to end.

Row 4 Knit.

Row 5 (inc) K5, [M1, k5] 7 times, k1-48 sts.

Rows 6, 8 and 10 K2, p to last 2 sts, k2.

Rows 7 and 9 Knit.

Row 11 (inc) K3, [M1, k6] 7 times, M1, k3-56 sts.

Rows 12 and 14 Rep row 6.

Rows 13 and 15 Knit.

Row 16 Rep row 6.

Bind off loosely knitwise.

Thread ribbon through eyelets, tacking at center if desired. ☺

MATERIALS

Northfield by Valley Yarns, 1 1/4oz/50g balls, each approx 124yd/113m (wool/alpaca/silk)

- 6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 9) balls in #22 purple haze (A)
- 2 (2, 2, 3, 3, 3) balls in #23 boy blue (B)
- One pair size 6 (4mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One size 8 (5mm) circular needle, 24"/60cm long
- Eleven 3/4"/19mm buttons
- Stitch markers
- Stitch holders

MEASUREMENTS

- **Bust (buttoned)** 32 (34, 36, 38, 43 1/2, 47)"/81 (86.5, 91.5, 96.5, 110.5, 119.5)cm
- **Length** 22 1/4 (23, 23 1/4, 23 1/2, 24 1/4, 24 3/4)"/58 (58.5, 59, 59.5, 61.5, 63)cm

GAUGE

21 sts and 30 rows to 4"/10cm over St st, after blocking, using smaller needles.
TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

TWO-COLOR CAST-ON

Make a slip knot with 1 strand A & B held tog (not to be counted as the first st) and using the long

tail method of casting on with B over thumb and A over index finger, cast on the number of sts required. The sts on the needle should be all in A. After working the first row, drop and unravel the slip knot.

BACK

With smaller needles, cast on 82 (86, 90, 98, 110, 122) sts using 2-color cast-on.

Cut B and cont with A only.

Row 1 (WS) P2, *k2, p2; rep from * to end.

Cont in k2, p2 rib for 1 1/2cm, inc 3 (4, 5, 2, 4, 2) sts evenly across last WS row-85 (90, 95, 100, 114, 124) sts.

Work in St st until piece measures 3"/7.5cm from beg.

Dec row (RS) K1, ssk, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

Rep dec row every 16th row twice-79 (84, 89, 94, 108, 118) sts.

Work even until piece measures 8 1/2"/21.5cm from beg.

Inc row (RS) K1, M1, k to last st, M1, k1.

Rep inc row every 14th row twice more-85 (90, 95, 100, 114, 124) sts.

Work even until piece measures 13 1/2"/34.5cm from beg.

Shape armhole

Bind off 5 (5, 5, 6, 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 0 (0, 0, 0, 2, 4) rows.

Dec row (RS) K1, ssk, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

Rep dec row every other row 3 (4, 5, 6, 7, 9) times more-67 (70, 73, 76, 82, 84) sts.

Work even until armhole measures 8 1/2" (8 1/4, 9, 9 1/4, 10, 10 1/2)"/21.5 (22, 23, 23.5, 25.5, 26.5)cm.

Place markers for center 37 (38, 39, 40, 40, 40) sts on last WS row.

Shape neck and shoulder

Bind off 5 (5, 5, 6, 7, 7) sts at beg of next 4 rows, 4 (5, 6, 5, 6, 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows, AT THE SAME TIME, bind off center 37 (38, 39, 40, 40, 40) sts and working both sides at once, dec 1 st at each neck edge once.

LEFT FRONT

With smaller needles, cast on 43 (43, 47, 51, 55, 59) sts using the 2-color cast-on method.

Cut B and cont with A only.

Row 1 (WS) P3, *k2, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 2 *k2, p2; rep from *, end k3.

Rep these 2 rows for rib for 1 1/2cm, inc 0 (2, 0, 0, 2, 3) sts evenly across the last WS row-43 (45, 47, 51, 57, 62) sts.

Work in St st until piece measures 3"/7.5cm from beg.

Dec row (RS) K1, ssk, k to end.

Rep dec row every 16th row twice more-40 (42, 44, 48, 54, 59) sts.

Work even until piece measures 8 1/2"/21.5cm from beg.

Inc row (RS) K1, M1, k to end. Rep inc row every 14th row twice more-43 (45, 47, 51, 57, 62) sts.

Work even until piece measures 13 1/2"/34.5cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Shape armhole

Bind off 5 (5, 5, 5, 6, 6) sts from armhole edge once, 2 sts 0 (0, 0, 0, 1, 2) times—38 (40, 42, 46, 49, 52) sts.

Dec row (RS) K1, ssk, k to end.

Rep dec row every other row 3 (4, 5, 6, 7, 9) times more—34 (35, 36, 39, 41, 42) sts.

Work even until armhole measures 7 (7½, 7½, 7¾, 8½, 9)"/18 (18.5, 19, 19.5, 21.5, 23)cm, end with a RS row.

Shape neck

Bind off 14 (14, 14, 16, 15, 15) sts at neck edge (beg of WS rows) once, 2 sts once.

Dec row (RS) K to the last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

Rep dec row every other row 3 times more—14 (15, 16, 17, 20, 21) sts rem.

When armhole measures same as back to shoulder, shape shoulder as for back.

RIGHT FRONT

Work as for left front, reversing all shaping and 3-st center front rib.


FINISHING

Block pieces lightly to measurements. Sew shoulder seams.

Cowl

With WS of neck edge facing, circular needle and B, pick up and k 94 (94, 96, 100, 102, 102) sts evenly around neck edge. Beg with a WS purl row (note that WS of cowl is RS of vest, as cowl will turn back), work in St st for ½"/1.5cm.

Next row *K2, M1; rep from *, end k2—140 (140, 143, 149, 152, 152) sts. Cont in St st until cowl measures 9"/23cm. K 4 rows. Bind off.



Armhole trim

With smaller needles and A, pick up and k 100 (104, 106, 110, 118, 124) sts evenly along armhole edge. Work 7 rows in k2, p2 rib.

Cut A. With B and larger needle, bind off loosely knitwise.

Left front band

With RS of cowl facing, circular needle and A, beg at neck edge, pick up and k 50 sts along cowl edge, cut yarn. Return to neck edge.

With RS of vest facing, other end of circular needle and A, pick up and k 114 (116, 116, 118, 122, 126) sts along left front to lower edge—164 (166, 166, 168, 172, 176) sts total.

Work in k2, p2 rib for 7 rows, end with a WS row. With B, bind off 50 cowl sts purlwise (for collar turn back), then bind off rem sts knitwise.

Right front band

With RS of cowl facing, circular needle and A, beg at upper edge of cowl, pick up and k 50 sts along cowl edge to neck edge. Place on holder.

With RS of vest facing, circular needle and A, beg at lower edge of right front, pick up and k 114 (116, 116, 118, 122, 126) sts to neck edge. Cut yarn.

Beg with a WS row (beg at upper edge of cowl), work across all 164 (166, 166, 168, 172, 176) sts in k2, p2 rib 2 rows.

Buttonhole row (WS) Rib 3 (3, 3, 5, 4, 4) sts, bind off 3 sts, *work 13 sts, bind off 3 sts, work 12 (12, 12, 12, 13, 14) sts, bind off 3 sts; rep from * 4 times more, rib to end.

Next row Cast on 3 sts over each set of bound-off sts. Work 3 rows more in rib. Bind off with B as for left front band.

Sew 4 buttons to RS of cowl band (for turn back) and rem 7 buttons to RS of left front band opposite buttonholes.

Sew side and armhole trim seams.

MATERIALS

Northfield by Valley Yarns, 1 1/4 oz/50g balls, each approx 124yd/113m (wool/alpaca/silk)

- 8 (9, 10, 10, 12, 13) balls in #23 boy blue (A)
- 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) balls in #22 purple haze (B)
- One pair size 6 (4mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One size 8 (5mm) circular needle, 24"/60cm long

MEASUREMENTS

- **Bust** 32 (34, 36, 38, 43 1/2, 47)"/81 (86.5, 91.5, 96.5, 110.5, 119.5)cm
- **Length** 22 1/2 (22 3/4, 23 1/4, 23 3/4, 24 1/4, 24 3/4)"/57 (58, 59, 60, 61.5, 63)cm
- **Upper arm** 14 1/2 (15 1/4, 15 1/2, 16, 16 3/4, 17)"/37 (39, 39.5, 40.5, 42.5, 43)cm

GAUGE

21 sts and 30 rows to 4"/10cm over St st, after blocking, using smaller needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

TWO-COLOR CAST-ON

See pattern #40.

BACK

Work as for pattern #40 through armhole shaping. Work even on 67 (70, 73, 76, 82, 84) sts until armhole measures 8 (8 1/2, 9, 9 1/2, 10, 10 1/2)"/20.5 (21.5, 23, 24, 25.5, 26.5)cm.

Shape neck and shoulder


Work as for pattern #40.

FRONT

Work as for back until armhole measures 7 (7 1/2, 8, 8 1/2, 9, 9 1/2)"/18 (19, 20.5, 21.5, 23, 24)cm.

Shape neck

Next row (RS) K18 (19, 20, 21, 24, 25), join a 2nd ball of yarn and bind off center 31 (32, 33,



34, 34, 34) sts, k to end. Working both sides at once, dec 1 st each neck edge every other row 4 times, AT THE SAME TIME, when armhole measures same as back to shoulder, bind off 5 (5, 5, 6, 7, 7) sts from each shoulder edge twice then 4 (5, 6, 5, 6, 7) sts once.

SLEEVES

With smaller needles and B, cast on 42 (46, 46, 50, 54, 54) sts.

Row 1 K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Cont in k2, p2 rib for 2"/5cm, inc 0 (0, 2, 0, 0, 2) sts on last WS row—42 (46, 48, 50, 54, 56) sts.

Inc row (RS) K1, M1 in rib, rib to last st, M1 in rib, k1—2 sts inc'd.

Rep inc row every 6th row 8 times more—60 (64, 66, 68, 72, 74) sts.

Work even until piece measures 8 1/2"/21.5cm from beg.

Change to A and working in St st, cont to work inc row every 6th row 8 times more—76 (80, 82, 84, 88, 90) sts.

Work even until piece measures 16 1/2"/42cm from beg.

Shape cap

Bind off 5 (5, 5, 5, 6, 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Dec row (RS) K1, ssk, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

Rep dec row every other row 19 (20, 22, 24, 26, 28) times more. Bind off 3 (3, 3, 3, 2, 2) sts at beg of next 4 rows. Bind off rem 14 (16, 14, 12, 14, 12) sts.

FINISHING

Block pieces to measurements. Sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

Cowl

Work as for pattern #40, only join and work in rnds of St st (k every rnd) until piece measures 9"/23cm from beg. [K1 rnd, p1 rnd] twice. Bind off. Blocked finished piece lightly. ☺

MATERIALS

Simpleworsted by HiKoo/Skacel Collection, 3 1/2 oz/100g hanks, each approx 140yd/128m (wool/acrylic/nylon)

- 5 (6, 6, 7, 8, 8) hanks in #030 Fijian waters (dark blue A)
- 1 hank in #024 bluebell (light blue B)
- One pair each sizes 8 and 9 (5 and 5.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One size 8 (5 mm) circular needle, 24"/60cm long
- Stitch markers

MEASUREMENTS

- **Bust** 33 (35, 37, 39, 45, 47)"/84 (89, 94, 99, 114, 119.5)cm
- **Length** 24 (24 1/2, 24 1/2, 25, 25 1/2, 26)"/61 (62, 62, 63.5, 65, 66)cm

GAUGE

17 sts and 24 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using larger needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

NOTE

Finished measurements are calculated minus 1 selvage st each side.

BACK

With smaller needles and A, cast on 79 (83, 87, 91, 105, 109) sts. Beg with a RS row, work in k1, p1 rib for 4 rows.

Change to B and work 3 rows in rib. Then, cont with A until rib measures approx 2 1/4"/5.5cm from beg, end with a RS row.

Dec row (WS) Purl, dec 7 sts evenly spaced across—72 (76, 80, 84, 98, 102) sts.

Change to larger needles.

With A, work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) until piece measures 9"/23cm from beg.

Shape armhole

Bind off 3 (4, 5, 3, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 2 (2, 2, 4, 4, 4) rows—66 (68, 70, 72, 78, 82) sts. Work even until armhole measures 14 (14 1/2, 14 1/2, 15, 15 1/2, 16)"/35.5 (37, 37, 38, 39.5, 40.5)cm

Place markers (pm) to mark center 16 (18, 18, 18, 20, 20) sts on last WS row.

Shape neck and shoulder

Row 1 (RS) Bind off 5 (5, 6, 5, 7, 7) sts, work to center marked sts, join a 2nd ball of yarn

and bind off center 16 (18, 18, 18, 20, 20) sts, k to end.

Working both sides at once, bind off 5 (5, 6, 5, 7, 7) sts at beg of next WS row, then bind off 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts from each shoulder edge twice, AT THE SAME TIME, bind off 5 sts from each neck edge twice.

FRONT

Work as for back, including armhole shaping, until armhole measures 3 1/2 (4, 4, 4 1/2, 5, 5 1/2)"/9 (10, 10, 11.5, 12.5, 14)cm, end with a WS row—66 (68, 70, 72, 78, 82) sts.

Shape v-neck

Next row (RS) K33 (34, 35, 36, 39, 41), join a 2nd ball of yarn and k to end. Work both sides with separate balls of yarn for 1 row.

Dec row 1 (RS) K to last 4 sts of first side, k2tog, k2; on 2nd side, k2, ssk, k to end.

Rows 2–4 Work even.

Row 5 Rep dec row 1.

Row 6 Work even.

Rep the last 6 rows until a total of 18 (19, 19, 19, 20, 20) dec's have been completed and 15 (15, 16, 17, 19, 21) sts rem each side.

Work even, if necessary, until armhole measures same as back to shoulder.

Shape shoulder

Bind off 5 (5, 6, 5, 7, 7) sts from each shoulder edge once, then 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts twice.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Sew side seams taking in 1 selvage st each side.

Armhole trim

With circular needle and A, pick up and k 160 (166, 172, 176, 182) sts evenly around armhole. Join and pm for beg of rnd. Work in k1, p1 rib for 3 rnds. Change to B and work 3 rnds in rib. Change to A and work 2 rnds more in rib. Bind off in rib.

Neckband

Beg at right shoulder seam with circular needle and A, pick up and k 49 (51, 51, 51, 53, 53) sts along back neck edge, 66 sts to center front v-neck, pm, 2 sts at center v-neck, pm, 66 sts along opposite side of v-neck—183 (185, 185, 185, 187, 187) sts. Join and pm for beg of rnd.

Rnd 1 Work in k1, p1 rib to 1 st before center marked sts, place new marker and k2tog removing previous marker, ssk over next 2 sts removing previous marker, place new marker, beg with p1, work in rib to end.


Rnd 2 Work in k1, p1 rib to center 2 sts, k center 2 sts, work in rib to end.

Rnd 3 Rep rnd 1.

Rows 4–6 With B, rep rnd 2, then rep rnds 1 and 2.

Rnd 7 and 8 With A, rep rnds 1 and 2.

Bind off in rib. ☺

- One pair each sizes 8 and 9 (5 and 5.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One size 8 (5mm) circular needle, 24"/60cm long
- Stitch markers
- Cable needle (cn)

MEASUREMENTS

- Bust 33 (35, 37, 39, 45, 47)"/84 (89, 94, 99, 114, 119.5)cm
- Length 24 (24½, 24½, 25, 25½, 26)"/61 (62, 62, 63.5, 65, 66)cm
- Upper arm 27 (28, 28, 29½, 30½, 33½)"/68.5 (71, 71, 75, 77.5, 85)cm

GAUGE

17 sts and 24 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using larger needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

NOTE

Finished measurements are calculated minus 1 selavage st each side.

DOUBLE CABLE PANEL

(over 22 sts)

Row 1 (RS) P2, k8, p2, k8, p2.

Row 2 and all WS rows K2, p8, k2, p8, k2.

Row 3 Rep row 1.

Row 5 P2, sl 4 sts to cn and hold to back, k4, k4 from cn (8-st RC); p2, sl 4 sts to cn and hold to front, k4, k4 from cn (8-st LC); k2.

Rows 7, 9 and 11 Rep row 1.

Row 12 Rep row 2.

Rep rows 1–12 for double cable panel.

BACK

Work same as for pattern #42.

FRONT

Work as for back rib for 2½"/5.5cm on 79 (83, 87, 91, 105, 109) sts. Place markers (pm) on last RS row to mark center 17 sts with 31 (33, 35, 37, 44, 46) sts each side.

Next row (WS) P to marker, dec'ing 2 sts evenly across these sts for 29 (31, 33, 35, 42, 44) sts; sl marker, [p2, pfb] 5 times, p2 for 22 sts between markers, sl marker; p to end dec'ing 2 sts evenly across these sts for 29 (31, 33, 35, 42, 44) sts—80 (84, 88, 92, 106, 110) sts. Change to larger needles.

Beg double cable panel

Row 1 (RS) K29 (31, 33, 35, 42, 44), sl marker, work row 1 of double cable panel, sl marker, k to end. Cont to work pats in this way, working sts on each side of double cable panel in St st, until piece measures 9½"/23cm from beg.


Shape armhole

Bind off 3 (4, 5, 3, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 2 (2, 2, 4, 4, 4) rows—74 (76, 78, 80, 86, 90) sts. Work even until armhole measures 3½ (4, 4, 4½, 5, 5½)"/9 (10, 10, 11.5, 12.5, 14)cm.

Shape v-neck

Note At this point, the cable panel will divide into 2 panels, the left neck edge cable will cont as 8-st RC every 12th row and the right neck edge cable will cont as 8-st LC every 12th row as established.

Next row (RS) K to marker, sl marker, p2, work 8 sts in cable pat as established, M1 purwise, p1; join a 2nd ball of yarn, p1, M1 purwise, work



8 sts in cable pat as established, p2, sl marker, k to end—38 (39, 40, 41, 44, 46) sts each side. Working both sides at once, work 1 WS row, then work as foll:

Dec row 1 (RS) K to 3 sts before marker on first side, k2tog, k1; on 2nd side, work to marker, sl marker, k1, ssk, work to end.

Rows 2–4 Work even.

Row 5 Rep dec row 1.

Row 6 Work even.

Rep the last 6 rows until a total of 18 (19, 19, 19, 20, 20) dec's have been completed and 20 (20, 21, 22, 24, 26) sts rem each side.

Work even, if necessary, until armhole measures same as back to shoulder.

Shape shoulder

Bind off 5 (5, 6, 6, 7, 8) sts from each shoulder edge once, then 5 (5, 5, 6, 7, 8) sts once, then bind off across each cable panel by [k2tog] 5 times, binding off resulting sts.

SLEEVES

With smaller needles and A, cast on 37 (37, 37, 43, 45, 53) sts. Work as for back rib for 2½"/5.5cm.

Next row (WS) Purl, dec 3 sts evenly spaced—34 (34, 34, 40, 42, 50) sts.

Change to larger needles. With A, cont in St st for 2 rows.

Inc row (RS) K2, M1, k to last 2 sts, M1, k2. Rep inc row every other row 41 (43, 43, 43, 46) times more—118 (122, 122, 128, 132, 144) sts. Work even until piece measures 20"/51cm from beg. Bind off.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams, taking in 1 selavage st each side.

Neckband

Work same as for pattern #42. ☀

MATERIALS

Majestic Tweed by Classic Elite Yarns, 3½oz/100g hanks, each approx 110yd/101m (wool/angora/silk/nylon)

- 3 (3, 3, 3, 4, 4) hanks in #7257 cobalt (A)
- *Montera* by Classic Elite Yarns, 3½oz/100g hanks, each approx 127yd/116m (llama/wool)
- 4 (4, 4, 5, 5, 5) hanks in #3816 La Paz natural (B)
- One pair each sizes 7 and 9 (4.5 and 5.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Size 7 (4.5mm) crochet hook
- Seven 7/8" 22mm buttons
- Stitch markers, stitch holders

MEASUREMENTS

- **Bust (closed)** 34 (36, 38, 40, 46, 50)"/86.5 (91.5, 96.5, 101.5, 117, 127)cm
- **Length** 23½ (24, 24½, 25, 26, 26½)"/59.5 (61, 62, 63.5, 66, 67.5)cm

GAUGES

- 18 sts and 22 rows to 4"/10cm over St st after blocking, using *Majestic Tweed* (A) and larger needles;
- 16 sts and 21 rows to 4"/10cm over St st after blocking, using *Montera* (B) and larger needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGES.

NOTE

- 1) Lower facings are picked up and worked downwards after the pieces are knit.
- 2) Finished measurements are calculated based on the number of sts minus 1 selavage st each side.

BACK

With larger needles and A, cast on 86 (90, 94, 98, 110, 118) sts. Beg with a purl row work in reverse St st (p on RS, k on WS), dec 1 st each side every 12th row 3 times—80 (84, 88, 92, 104, 112) sts. Work even until piece measures 8"/20.5cm from beg, end with a knit row.

Dec row (RS) Purl, dec 6 sts evenly across—74 (78, 82, 86, 98, 106) sts.

Change to B and k 3 rows. Then, beg with a RS row, work in reverse St st, dec 1 st each side every 10th row twice—70 (74, 78, 82, 94, 102) sts. Work even until piece measures 15"/38cm from beg, end with a purl row.

Shape armhole

Bind off 4 (5, 5, 5, 6, 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 (2, 2, 2, 3, 3) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Dec row (WS) K1, SKP, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. Rep dec row every other row 3 (3, 4, 5, 6, 8) times more—50 (52, 54, 56, 62, 64) sts. Work even until armhole measures 7½ (8, 8½, 9, 10, 10½)"/19 (20.5, 21.5, 23, 25.5, 26.5)cm. Pm to mark the center 20 (20, 22, 22, 24, 24) sts on the last WS row.

Shape neck and shoulder

Next row (RS) Bind off 3 (4, 4, 5, 5, 6) sts, p to

center marked sts, join a 2nd ball of yarn and bind off center 20 (20, 22, 22, 24, 24) sts, p to end.

Working both sides at once, bind off 3 (4, 4, 5, 5, 6) sts at beg of next row, then bind off 4 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 4 rows, AT THE SAME TIME, bind off 4 sts from each neck edge once.

Hem

With WS facing, larger needles and B, pick up and k 79 (82, 87, 90, 102, 109) sts along lower back edge. (Note that picking up sts from the WS will create a dotted ridge on the RS.) Work in St st for 5 rows. Bind off.

LEFT FRONT

With larger needles and A, cast on 41 (43, 45, 47, 53, 57) sts. Beg with a purl row, work in reverse St st dec 1 st at armhole edge (beg of RS rows) every 12th row 3 times—38 (40, 42, 44, 50, 54) sts. Work even until piece measures 8"/20.5cm from beg, end with a knit row.

Dec row (RS) Purl, dec 3 sts evenly across—35 (37, 39, 41, 47, 51) sts.

Next row (WS) With B, k2 and sl these 2 sts to a st holder, bind off 26 sts knitwise, then k7 (9, 11, 13, 19, 23) and sl these last sts to a 2nd st holder. Do not cut yarn.

Hem and pocket lining

With WS facing, larger needles and B, pick up and k 38 (40, 42, 44, 50, 54) sts along lower edge. (Note that WS of front will be RS of facing.) Beg with a k row, work in St st for 5 rows.

Next row (WS) Bind off 8 (10, 12, 14, 20, 24) sts, p to end. Cont in St st on these 30 sts (for pocket lining).

et lining) for 34 rows or to match the front in A.

Join lining to front

Next (joining) row (RS) Return to sts on hold and with B, k5 (7, 9, 11, 17, 21) sts from holder, then holding the lining sts to the back, [k1 st from holder tog with 1 st from lining] twice, k26 lining sts, then [k1 st from holder tog with 1 st from lining] twice—35 (37, 39, 41, 47, 51) sts.

Next row (WS) Knit. Cont in reverse St st, dec'ing 1 st at armhole edge every 10th row twice—33 (35, 37, 39, 45, 49) sts. Work even until piece measures same as back to armhole.

Shape armhole

Bind off 4 (5, 5, 5, 6, 7) sts from armhole edge once, then 2 (2, 2, 2, 3, 3) sts once.

Dec row (WS) K to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

Rep dec row every other row 3 (3, 4, 5, 6, 8) times more—23 (24, 25, 26, 29, 30) sts. Work even until armhole measures 5 (5½, 6, 6½, 7½, 8)"/12.5 (14, 15, 16.5, 19, 20.5)cm, end with a RS row.

Shape neck

Bind off 2 (2, 3, 3, 3, 3) sts from neck edge once, 3 sts 0 (0, 0, 0, 1, 1) time, 2 sts 3 (3, 3, 3, 2, 2) times, then 1 st 4 times—11 (12, 12, 13, 15, 16) sts rem. When armhole measures same as back to shoulder, shape shoulder as for back.

RIGHT FRONT

Work to correspond to left front, reversing all shaping.

FINISHING

Block pieces to measurements. Sew shoulder seams.

Armhole trim

With smaller needles and B, pick up and k 75 (80, 85, 90, 100, 105) sts evenly around armhole edge. Cut B. With A, k 2 rows. Bind off knitwise.

Left front buttonband

Note A surface chain sl st is worked along the edge to provide a neat pick-up line for the sts.

With crochet hook and A, work a surface chain sl st 1 st in front from front edge as foll:

Beg at neck edge, work 48 (50, 52, 54, 58, 60) chain sl sts to pocket, then 32 sl sts through both pocket and front thicknesses (to join) to lower edge. With RS facing, smaller needles and A, beg at neck edge, pick up and k 80 (82, 84, 86, 90, 92) sts along sl st chain.

Row 1 (WS) With A, knit.

Rows 2–9 With B, knit.

Row 10 With A, knit. Bind off knitwise.


Right front band

Work as for left front band for 5 rows.

Buttonhole row 6 (RS) K3 (4, 5, 3, 5, 3), [yo, k2tog, k10 (10, 11, 11, 11, 12)] 6 times, yo, k2tog, k3 (4, 5, 3, 5, 3). Complete as for left front band.

Neckband

With smaller needles and B, pick up and k 7 sts from right front band, 18 (18, 19, 19, 20, 20) sts from shaped neck edge, 32 (32, 34, 34, 36, 36) sts from back neck edge, 18 (18, 19, 19, 20, 20)



sts from shaped neck edge, 7 sts from left front band—82 (82, 86, 86, 90, 90) sts. K2 rows. Bind off. Sew side seams. Turn hems to WS and sew in place. Sew pocket lining edges to fronts. Sew on buttons. ☺

- One pair each sizes 7 and 9 (4.5 and 5.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One size 7 (4.5mm) circular needle, 24"/60cm long
- 4 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5) 7/8"/22mm buttons
- Stitch markers, stitch holders

MEASUREMENTS

- Bust (closed) 34 (36, 38, 40, 46, 50)"/86 (91.5, 96.5, 101.5, 117, 127)cm
- Length 24 (24½, 25, 25½, 26½, 27)"/61 (62, 63.5, 65, 67.5, 68.5)cm
- Upper arm 12½ (13¼, 13¾, 14¼, 15¾, 16¼)"/32.5 (33.5, 35, 36, 40, 41)cm

GAUGES

- 18 sts and 22 rows to 4"/10cm over St st after blocking, using Majestic Tweed (A) and size 9 (5.5mm) needles;
- 16 sts and 21 rows to 4"/10cm over St st after blocking, using Montera (B) and size 9 (5.5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGES.

NOTE

- 1) Lower facings are picked up and worked downwards after the pieces are knit.
- 2) Finished measurements are calculated based on the number of sts minus 1 selvage st each side.

BACK

With larger needles and A, cast on 97 (101, 105, 109, 121, 129) sts.

Beg with a purl row, work in reverse St st (p on RS, k on WS) for 11 rows and pm to mark the center st on the last RS row.

Dec row 1 (WS) K1, SKP, k to marker, sl marker, k2tog, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1—3 sts dec'd. Work even for 11 rows.

Dec row 2 (WS) K1, SKP, k to 2 sts before marker, SKP, sl marker, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1—3 sts dec'd.

Work even for 11 rows.

Next row Rep dec row 1—88 (92, 96, 100, 112, 120) sts. Work even for 6 rows.

Dec row (RS) P3 (5, 7, 4, 6, 5), [p2tog, p7 (7, 7, 8, 9, 10)] 9 times, p2tog, p2 (4, 6, 4, 5, 5)—78 (82, 86, 90, 102, 110) sts. Change to B and k3 rows. Then, beg with a RS row, work in reverse St st for 11 rows more.

Dec row (WS) K1, SKP, k to 6 sts before center marker, SKP, k4, sl marker, k4, k2tog, k to last 4 sts, k2tog, k1—4 sts dec'd.

Rep the last dec row every 12th row once more—70 (74, 78, 82, 94, 102) sts.

Work even until piece measures 16"/40.5cm from beg, end with a purl row.

Shape armhole

Bind off 4 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 2 (2, 2, 2, 4, 4) rows.

Dec row (WS) K1, SKP, k to the last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. Rep dec row every other row 1 (2, 3, 4, 5, 8) times—54 (56, 58, 60, 64, 66) sts. Work even until armhole measures 7 (7½, 8, 8½, 9½, 10)"/18 (19, 20.5, 21.5, 24, 25.5)cm.

Place markers for center 22 (24, 24, 26, 28, 28) sts on last WS row.

Shape shoulder

Bind off 4 (4, 5, 5, 4, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows, then 4 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 4 rows, AT THE SAME TIME, bind off center marked 22 (24, 24, 26, 28, 28) sts and working both sides at once, bind off 4 sts from each neck edge once.

Hem

With WS facing, larger needles and B, pick up and k 91 (95, 99, 103, 115, 123) sts along lower edge. (Note that picking up sts from the WS will create a dotted line ridge on the RS.)

Work in St st for 5 rows. Bind off.

LEFT FRONT

With larger needles and A, cast on 50 (52, 54, 56, 62, 66) sts. Beg with a purl row, work in reverse St st for 11 rows.

Dec row (WS) K to last 24 sts, k2tog, k19, k2tog, k1.

Rep dec row every 12th row twice more—44 (46, 48, 50, 56, 60) sts. Work even for 6 rows.

Dec row (RS) Purl, dec 4 sts evenly spaced—40 (42, 44, 46, 52, 56) sts. Cut A.

Next row (WS) With B, k8, bind off 26 sts knitwise, k to end. Leave these sts on hold with yarn attached.

Hem and pocket lining


With WS facing, larger needles and B, pick up and k 46 (48, 50, 52, 58, 62) sts along lower edge. Beg with a RS row, work in St st for 5 rows (note that WS of front will be RS of facing).

Work in reverse St st for 9 rows.

Dec row (WS) K to last 24 sts, k2tog, k19, k2tog, k1.

Note Read before cont to knit.

Rep dec row every 12th row once more, AT THE SAME TIME, when piece measures 12½ (12½, 12½, 12½, 15, 15)"/32 (32, 32, 32, 38, 38)cm from beg, work neck dec row as foll:

Neck dec row (WS) K1, SKP, k to end.

Rep neck dec row every other row 7 (8, 8, 8, 9, 9) times, then every 4th row 8 (8, 8, 9, 9, 9) times, AT THE SAME TIME, when piece measures same as back to armhole, shape armhole at side edge as for back—12 (12, 13, 13, 14, 15) sts when all shaping is complete.

Work even until armhole measures same as back to shoulder. Shape shoulder at armhole edge as for back.

RIGHT FRONT

Work to correspond to left front, reversing all shaping and pocket placement.

SLEEVES

With larger needles and A, cast on 41 (43, 45, 47, 53, 55) sts. Beg with a purl row, work in reverse St st for 43 rows, AT THE SAME TIME, inc 1 st each side every 12th row 3 times—47 (49, 51, 53, 59, 61) sts.

Change to B and k 3 rows.

Then, beg with a purl row, cont in reverse St st, inc 1 st each side every 12th row 3 times—53 (55, 57, 59, 65, 67) sts.

Work even until piece measures 18"/45.5cm from beg, end with a RS row.

Shape cap

Bind off 4 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Dec row 1 (WS) K1, SKP, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

Rep dec row 1 every other row 10 (11, 12, 13, 15, 16) times more—19 sts. Work 1 row even.

Dec row 2 (WS) K1, SK2P, k to last 4 sts, k3tog, k1.

Rep dec row 2 every other row twice more. Bind off rem 7 sts.

Hem

With WS facing, larger needles and B, pick up and k 37 (39, 41, 43, 49, 51) sts along cuff edge. Work in St st for 5 rows. Bind off.

FINISHING

Block pieces to measurements. Sew shoulder seams.

Front and neck band

Pm at beg of neck shaping on left and right fronts. With RS facing, circular needle and B, pick up and k 48 (48, 48, 48, 58, 58) sts along right front edge to neck marker, pm, 49 (51, 53, 55, 49, 51) sts to back neck, 30 (32, 32, 34, 36,

36) sts along back neck, 49 (51, 53, 55, 49, 51) sts to neck marker, pm, 48 (48, 48, 48, 58, 58) sts along left front edge to lower edge. P 4 rows.

Buttonhole row (WS) P to right neck marker, [yo, p2tog, p12 (12, 12, 12, 11, 11) 3 (3, 3, 3, 4, 4) times, yo, p2tog, p4. P 3 rows. Bind off purlwise using larger needle.

Turn hems to WS and sew in place.

Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams. Sew pocket lining edges to fronts. Sew on buttons. ☺

- **Length** 21 (21½, 22½, 22½, 23, 23½)"/53.5 (54.5, 57, 57, 58.5, 59.5)cm

GAUGE

15 sts and 28 rows to 4"/10cm over garter st using size 8 (5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

NOTE

Sl the 1st st of every row throughout.

BACK

Cast on 64 (72, 78, 86, 94, 102) sts.

Work in garter st (k every row) until piece measures 14½ (14½, 14½, 14, 14, 14)"/37 (37, 37, 35.5, 35.5, 35.5)cm from beg.

Shape armholes

Bind off 4 (6, 7, 10, 13, 17) sts at beg of next 2 rows—56 (60, 64, 66, 68, 68) sts.

Cont in garter st until armhole measures 5½

(6½, 7½, 7½, 8½, 8¾)"/14.5 (16, 18.5, 19.5, 21, 22)cm, end with a WS row.

Shape neck

Next row (RS) K14 (15, 16, 17, 17, 17) sts, join 2nd ball of yarn and bind off center 28 (30, 32, 32, 34, 34) sts, k to end.

Working both sides at once, cont in garter st until armhole measures 6½ (7, 8, 8½, 9, 9½)"/16.5 (18, 20.5, 21.5, 23, 24)cm. Bind off rem 14 (15, 16, 17, 17, 17) sts each side.

LEFT FRONT

Cast on 34 (38, 42, 46, 50, 54) sts. Work in garter st until piece measures same as back to underarm, end with a WS row.

Shape armhole

Bind off 4 (6, 7, 10, 13, 17) sts at side edge (beg of next RS row)—30 (32, 35, 36, 37, 37) sts. Cont in garter st until armhole measures 3½ (3¾, 4¾, 5¼, 5¾, 6½)"/8.5 (9.5, 12, 13.5, 14.5, 16)cm, end with a RS row.

Shape neck




Shape neck

Bind off 16 (17, 19, 19, 20, 20) sts at neck edge (beg of next RS row)—14 (15, 16, 17, 17, 17) sts. Cont in garter st until armhole measures same as back to shoulder. Bind off.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Sew side seams. Sew buttons to left front edge opposite buttonholes. ✎

- Length 21 (21½, 22½, 22½, 23, 23½)"/53.5 (54.5, 57, 57, 58.5, 59.5)cm
- Upper arm 12½ (13½, 15½, 16½, 17½, 18½)"/31.5 (34.5, 39.5, 42, 44.5, 47)cm

GAUGE

15 sts and 28 rows to 4"/10cm over garter st using size 8 (5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

NOTE

Sl the 1st st of every row throughout.

BACK

Cast on 64 (72, 78, 86, 94, 102) sts.

Work in garter st (k every row) until piece measures 14½ (14½, 14½, 14, 14, 14)"/37 (37, 37, 35.5, 35.5, 35.5)cm from beg.

Shape armholes

Bind off 4 (6, 7, 10, 13, 17) sts at beg of next 2 rows—56 (60, 64, 66, 68, 68) sts.

Cont in garter st until armhole measures 5¾ (6¼, 7¼, 7¾, 8¼, 8¾)"/14.5 (16, 18.5, 19.5, 21, 22)cm, end with a WS row.


Shape neck

Next row (RS) K14 (15, 16, 17, 17, 17) sts, join 2nd ball of yarn and bind off center 28 (30, 32, 32, 34, 34) sts, k to end.

Shape armhole

Cont in garter st until armhole measures 3½ (3¾, 4¾, 5¼, 5¾, 6¼)"/8.5 (9.5, 12, 13.5, 14.5, 16)cm, end with a RS row.

Shape neck

Bind off 16 (17, 19, 19, 20, 20) sts at neck edge (beg of next RS row)—14 (15, 16, 17, 17, 17) sts.

Cont in garter st until armhole measures same as back to shoulder. Bind off. Place markers for 5 buttons along left front edge, the first 2¾"/7cm from lower edge, the last 1"/2.5cm from neck edge and the rem 3 spaced evenly between.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 34 (38, 42, 46, 50, 54) sts.

Work in garter st until piece measures 2¾"/7cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Next (buttonhole) row (RS) K3, k2tog, yo, k to end.

Rep buttonhole row opposite left front markers 4 times more, AT THE SAME TIME, work in garter st until piece measures same as back to armhole, end with a RS row.

Shape armhole

Bind off 4 (6, 7, 10, 13, 17) sts at side edge (beg of next RS row)—30 (32, 35, 36, 37, 37) sts.

Cont in garter st until armhole measures 3½ (3¾, 4¾, 5¼, 5¾, 6¼)"/8.5 (9.5, 12, 13.5, 14.5, 16)cm, end with a WS row.

Shape neck

Bind off 16 (17, 19, 19, 20, 20) sts at neck edge (beg of next RS row)—14 (15, 16, 17, 17, 17) sts.

Cont in garter st until armhole measures same as back to shoulder. Bind off.

SLEEVES

Cast on 47 sts. Work in garter st, inc 1 st each side every 0 (20th, 20th, 16th, 12th, 10th) row 0 (2, 5, 7, 9, 11) times—47 (51, 57, 61, 65, 69) sts. Work even until piece measures 19¾ (20¼, 20¾, 21¼, 22¼, 23¼)"/50 (51.5, 52.5, 54, 56.5, 59)cm, end with a WS row. Bind off.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Sew sleeves into armholes, sewing top 1 (1½, 2, 2½, 3½, 4½)"/2.5 (4, 5, 6.5, 9, 11.5)cm of sleeve along bound-off armhole sts of front and back underarm and easing sleeve to fit if necessary. Sew side and sleeve seams.

Collar

Cast on 84 (87, 90, 90, 93, 93) sts. Work in garter st until piece measures 4"/10cm from beg, end with a WS row. Bind off.

Center collar at center back neck and pin in place. With WS tog, sew collar around neck opening. Sew buttons to left front opposite buttonholes. ✎

- One set (2) size 6 (4mm) double-pointed needles (dpn) OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One set (2) size 5 (3.75mm) dpn
- Size H-8 (5mm) crochet hook
- Scrap yarn

MEASUREMENTS

- Length approx 54"/137cm

GAUGE

20 sts and 28 rows to 4"/10cm over St st using larger needles and A or B.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

PROVISIONAL CAST ON

Using scrap yarn and crochet hook, ch the number of sts to cast on plus a few extra. Cut a tail and pull the tail through the last chain. With knitting needle and yarn, pick up and knit the stated number of sts through the "purl bumps" on the back of the chain. To remove scrap yarn chain, when instructed, pull out the tail from the last crochet stitch. Gently and slowly pull on the tail to unravel the crochet stitches, carefully placing each released knit stitch on a needle.

STITCH GLOSSARY

Inc 2 (P1, yo, p1) in next st—2 sts inc'd.

Lifted inc (L inc) Insert RH needle into p bump under next st on LH needle and p into this st—1 st inc'd.

LONG I-CORD STEM WITH LEAVES (make 7)

With larger dpn and A, cast on 3 sts using provisional cast-on.

*Knit one row. Without turning work, slide the sts back to the opposite end of needle to work next row from RS. Pull yarn tightly from the end of the row. Rep from * until i-cord measures 10"/25.5cm from beg.

Cut A and join B, work leaf in B only.

Leaf

*Row 1 (RS) With B, k3.

Row 2 (inc WS) P1, inc 2, p1—5 sts.

Rows 3, 5 and 7 Sl 1, k to end.

Row 4 (inc) Sl 1, p1, inc 2, p2—7 sts.

Row 6 (inc) Sl 1, p2, inc 2, p3—9 sts.

Row 8 (inc) Sl 1, p3, inc 2, p4—11 sts.

Row 9 Sl 1, k4, p1, k5.

Rows 10, 12, 14 and 16 Sl 1, p to end.

Row 11 (dec RS) Sl 1, k2tog, k2, p1, k2, ssk, k1—9 sts.

Row 13 (dec) Sl 1, k2tog, k1, p1, k1, ssk, k1—7 sts.

Row 15 (dec) Sl 1, k2tog, p1, ssk, k1—5 sts.

Row 17 (dec) K2tog, p1, ssk—3 sts. Without turning work, slide the sts back the opposite end of needle to work next side from RS.

Row 18 (RS) K3. Without turning work, slide the sts back the opposite end of needle to work next side from RS.

Row 19 (dec RS) S2KP. Cut yarn leaving a 6"/15cm tail. Fasten off last st.*

Carefully remove sts from provisional cast-on and place on needle. With B, rep between *'s to make a leaf at cast-on end.

SHORT I-CORD STEM (make 1)

Work as for long i-cord stem, but make i-cord only 6"/15cm long.

LEAVES (make 8)

With larger dpn and B, cast on 3 sts. Without turning work, slide the sts back to the opposite end of needle to work next row from RS. Pull yarn tightly from the end of the row. K 1 row. Rep between *'s of leaf.

BERRIES (make 9)

With smaller dpn and C, cast on 3 sts leaving a long tail.

Row 1 and all RS rows through row 11 Knit.

Row 2 (inc WS) P1, L inc, p2—4 sts.

Row 4 (inc) P1, L inc, p2, L inc, p1—6 sts.

Row 6 (inc) K1, L inc, p4, L inc, k1—8 sts.

Row 8 (dec WS) P1, p2tog, p2, p2tog, p1—6 sts.

Row 10 (dec) P1, [p2tog] twice, p1—4 sts.

Row 12 P4. Row 13 (dec) K1, k2tog, k1—3 sts.

P 1 row, k 1 row p 1 row. K3tog. Fasten off last st. Roll last 4 rows and tail end into center to form stuffing. With cast-on tail, sew around edges to gather into a ball. Leave tail for finishing.

FINISHING


Lightly block leaves.

Assemble garland

Make a loop approx 1 1/2"/4cm long in one end of long i-cord stem, tack in place. *Sew base of next long i-cord stem at same point as tack on opposite side of cord. Make a loop in opposite end of next cord, tack in place; rep from * to last long i-cord, then rep with short i-cord, omitting loop.

Using photo as guide, sew additional leaves to garland so that each join has a group of 2 or 3 leaves, with 3 at each end. Sew berries in center of leaf clusters. ☺







pompom


1. Following the template, cut two circular pieces of cardboard.




2. Hold the two circles together and wrap the yarn tightly around the cardboard. Carefully cut around the cardboard.



3. Place pom-pom between 2 smaller cardboard circles held together with a long needle and trim edges.



4. Knot tie strand tightly. Remove cardboard.



Easy I-cord Loop


1. Once your I-cord with garter-st tag is finished, secure it firmly to the stocking with tapestry needle threaded with the end tail.

2. Sew tag to back of stocking cuff on WS, as shown, stitching all edges. Then, sew 1/2"/1.5cm of end of I-cord to cuff on RS.

I-cord



I-cord is made on double-pointed needles. Cast on the instructed number of sts to 1 dpn. *Knit one row. Without turning the work, slip the stitches back to the beginning of the row. Pull the yarn tightly from the end of the row. Repeat from the * as desired. Bind off.
