Introduction

Yet another accessory with the addictive Ivy stitch pattern.

The Autumn Buds Scarf can be worn alone or with the Ivy Crochet Hat or the Ivy Crochet Beret. The Harmony crochet mittens will complete the ensemble.

The stitch pattern is created using short rows and slip-stitch variations, smoothly integrated into ribbing edges.

The Autumn Buds Scarf is worked vertically, flat, in one piece. Repeats of the stitch pattern are structured to create a double-sided scarf textile.

Main steps

- ✓ Working on the gauge swatch is optional but recommended to study pattern stitches and set a density
- ✓ Decide on the scarf length.
- ✓ You can decide on the width as you go because you can work finishing after each half panel.
- ✓ Enjoy creating the beauty of your masterpiece.
- ✓ Block it.
- ✓ Wrap yourself in!

Materials

1. Yarn: 150 - 250m per 100 g. Approximately 300 - 400 g depending on the length and width.

Choose solid colours, hand-dyed yarns or tweeds. Variegated yarns will obscure the stitch pattern but can add other exciting effects. Do not choose very contrasted colour-changing yarn; it will eat up the stitch pattern's appearance. A z-twist yarn will give a different stitch definition; not all can be recommended.

2. A crochet hook size 5mm – 6.5mm and a hook 0.5mm smaller for the last row.
3. A pointy needle for weaving in. The pointy needle will make weaving more reliable as it gets the yarn end through fibres and is less likely to get out during wear.

Some examples:

Red Heart Roll With It Melange in Green Room, 100% Acrylic, 356 m per 150 g, hook 5.5 mm.

Length – 152 cm, foundation cords 256 st.

Width – 28 cm, 3.5 panels.

Weight – 300 g, 2 yarn cakes.



Concept by Katia, Karina, 55% Alpaca, 45% Polyamide, 110 m per 50 g, hook 6.5 mm.

Length – 180 cm, foundation cords 264 st.

Width – 28 cm, 3 panels.

Weight – 350 g, 7 yarn balls.



Caron, Macchiato Cakes in Boundless, 80% Acrylic, 20% Wool, 440 m per 227 g, hook 6.5 mm.

Length – 190 cm, foundation cords 264 st.

Width – 25 cm, 2.5 panels.

Weight – 350 g, 1.5 yarn cake.



Pattern Stitches (special stitches are clickable)

BL – back loop; lp – loop; ch – chain; st – stitch; rem – remaining.

In charts, **WS** (wrong side) rows are shaded blue. In written instructions, **WS** rows are shaded grey.

- - beginning
- 2 - row number
- 1
- 12 - stitch count in the current row
- 3 - remaining stitch count in the row below
- o - **foundation cord chain** – measure the yarn tail approximately three times longer than the desired length of your scarf, slip knot, *yo with the yarn tail, placing it in front of the hook, and lead backward over the hook, yo with the working yarn, and pull through both loops*, repeat between * to reach needed foundation cord length.
As an option, use two separate yarn ends at the start; you will need to weave them in after.
- ⌚ - **tch** - turning chain and turn the work clockwise; do not tighten it. Not counted as a stitch.
- ⌚ - **tch tight** - make this chain tighter for a neat edge and turn the work clockwise.
- > - **yoslst** - yarn over slip stitch: yarn over, insert the hook into the next unworked BL, pull up a loop, and pull it through 2 loops on the hook. **Note:** the arrow represents the direction of work relative to a chart.
-> - wrong side row; <- right side row.
- >~ - **e-yoslst** – edge yarn over slip stitch: yarn over, insert the hook into the last unworked BL from back forward to twist it, pull up a loop, and pull it through the 2 loops on the hook, tighten the stitch a little by pulling the working yarn and a live loop at the same time to reduce the length of the lower loop to give the edge a reliable finish.
- <6 - stitch type count inside the row: starting from this stitch work indicated stitch count of specified stitch type.
- v - **inc-yoslst** – yarn over slip stitch increase: yarn over, insert the hook first into the BL of the worked stitch below and then into the BL of the next unworked stitch below, pull up a loop, and pull it through two loops on the hook. **Note:** counted as one stitch.
- < - **wbl-yoslst**: work yoslst in the last worked BL, right after the inc-yoslst.

T - **hdc** - half double crochet: yarn over, insert the hook into the BL, pull up a loop, yarn over, and pull the loop through all 3 loops on the hook.

δ - **e-hdc** – extended half double crochet: yarn over, insert the hook into the BL of the next stitch, pull up a loop, yarn over and pull through one loop on hook, yarn over and pull through remaining loops on hook.

> - **p2l-yoslst** – pick up 2 loops yarn over slip stitch: working yarn behind the work, insert the hook in one motion into 2 loops of the turning ch directly under the hook (3 loops on the hook), yarn over placing the working yarn on the hook between the live loop and two picked loops, secure its place with your finger (4 loops on hook), insert the hook into the next unworked BL below, yo, pull up a loop and pull it directly through all 4 loops on the hook.

^ - **dec-yoslst** – yarn over slip stitch decrease: yarn over, insert the hook first into the next unworked BL below and then into the following unworked BL below, pull up a loop and pull it through 2 loops on the hook. Pull the working yarn and live loop simultaneously to tighten this stitch to balance its appearance. **Note:** work the next st into the next unworked BL below.

[...] - repeat instructions inside the square brackets, followed by an indication of times (twice, thrice, etc.).

Gauge Swatch Instructions *(Watch video)*



All images show work in progress the way it looks on the right side.



Before starting your project, working on the gauge swatch to establish the suitable crochet hook size and density and to study pattern stitches is recommended but still **optional**.

If your yarn is limited and you wonder about the scarf size you can make, work the gauge swatch and take its measurement to apply in the Calculations.

Choose a hook size that gives even stitches and a good drape suitable for the scarf.

Block your swatch and give it time to dry completely. Evaluate: if it suits your scarf, follow the main instructions. It is better to change the hook if it is too dense or very loose with unclear or uneven stitches.

! Important Notes

1. Work the foundation cord with a relaxed tension. With some yarns, you can increase the hook size.
2. All the stitches are back loop (BL) stitches unless another is specified.
3. The total stitch count in the current row and the remaining stitch count of the row below are included at the end of all rows in written instructions: total – (6), remaining – (10), or both (6, 10).
4. In each row after the turning chain, always **turn the work clockwise** unless another is specified. We won't repeat this instruction in each row.

Measure the yarn tail approximately 60 cm long.

Slip knot, foundation cord ch26, ch1 tight, turn counterclockwise (26). Watch video.



Working into the foundation cord, insert the hook into the back bars.



Row 1: (WS) 25 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (26).

Row 2: (RS) 8 yoslst, tch (8, 18).



Row 3: 2 yoslst, inc-yoslst, wbl-yoslst, 4 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (9).

Row 4: 9 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 7 yoslst, tch (17, 10).



Row 5: 10 yoslst, inc-yoslst, wbl-yoslst, 5 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (18).

Row 6: 16 yoslst, tch (16, 2).



Row 7: Set1, tch (6, 10).

Row 8: 6 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 8 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (18).



Row 9: 18 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (20, 8).



Row 10: 19 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (20).

Row 11: 6 yoslst, dec-yoslst, 2 yoslst, tch (9, 10).

Row 12: 8 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (9).



Row 13: 6 yoslst, dec-yoslst, yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (10, 8).



Row 14: 9 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (10).

Row 15: 7 yoslst, tch (7, 3).

Row 16: 2 yoslst, inc-yoslst, wbl-yoslst, 3 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (8).



Row 17: 8 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 2 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 3 yoslst, tch (15, 4).



Row 18: 10 yoslst, inc-yoslst, wbl-yoslst, 3 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (16).

Row 19: 14 yoslst, tch (14, 2).

Row 20: 6 yoslst, tch (6, 8).



Row 21: Set2, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 3 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 6 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (20).



Row 22: 20 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (22, 6).



Row 23: 21 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (22).

Row 24: 8 yoslst, dec-yoslst, 2 yoslst, tch (11, 10).

Row 25: 10 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (11).

Row 26: 9 yoslst, dec-yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (12, 8).

Row 27: 11 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (12).



Row 28: 12 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 7 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 4 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (26).

Row 29: **Use a smaller hook.** 25 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch, fasten off (26).



Gauge Swatch Height, (H) _____ cm:
measure as shown in Photo 1.

The swatch is 26 stitches in height; this will be used for calculations.

Panel Width, (W) _____ cm - measure as shown in

Photo 1.

Gauge Swatch Weight, _____ g.

Scarf Length, st.

The main formula for the scarf length: stitch count is a multiple of 8.

Simply work a foundation cord of the desired scarf length, ensuring your stitch count can be evenly divided by 8. Use stitch markers to help count.

Scarf Width

Calculate the scarf width by multiplying Panel Width, cm or decide the width as you go, growing it by adding the Main Panel repeats. Add 1-1.5cm for edges.

You can finish with the whole panel or with the half panel. This will be noted in the Main Panel instructions. Finishing instructions are the same in both cases.

! Tips on yarn consumption:

If there is a limited amount of yarn in your stash, use our [Autumn Buds Scarf Calculator](#) to find out what size of scarf you can make.

Alternatively, use the tips below to help figure out the yarn needed at each stage of work and plan the scarf width according to your remaining yarn.

- ✓ Foundation weight (1) _____ g: weigh the full-length foundation cord.
- ✓ 1st-row weight (3) _____ g: weigh the work after completing the 1st row (2) _____ g, and subtract the foundation cord weight (1).
- ✓ Half Panel weight (4) _____ g: after completing the Beginning instructions, weigh the work, _____ g, and subtract the weight (2).
- ✓ Finishing weight (5) _____ g: triple the 1st-row weight (3) and have this amount remaining to work on Finishing instructions.
- ✓ You can confidently grow the width, knowing you need not less than the weight (5) + (4) _____ g remaining to finish the scarf.

The Autumn Buds Scarf

Beginning

Leave the yarn end approximately 3 times longer than your desired scarf length, or use an alternative two-yarn-end method.

Slip knot. Work foundation cord with a relaxed tension (not tight or very loose). The foundation cord stitch count is a multiple of 8, tch tight, and turn the work *counterclockwise*.

Row 1: (WS) yoslst across, e-yoslst in the last foundation cord ch, tch tight.

Row 2: (RS) 10 yoslst, tch (10).

Row 3: 2 yoslst, inc-yoslst, wbl-yoslst, 6 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (11).

Row 4: 11 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 7 yoslst, tch (19).

Row 5: 10 yoslst, inc-yoslst, wbl-yoslst, 7 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (20).

Row 6: 18 yoslst, tch (18, 2).

Row 7: Set1, tch (6, 12).

Row 8: 6 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 7 yoslst, tch (16).

Row 9: 16 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (18, 10).

Row 10: 16 yoslst, tch (16, 2).

Row 11: Set1, tch (6, 10).

Row 12: 6 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 7 yoslst, tch (16).

Row 13: 16 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (18, 8).

Row 14: 16 yoslst, tch (16, 2).

Row 15: Set1, tch (6, 10).

Repeat **Rows 12 – 15** across until 14 st rem after the last repeat of Row 12, complete Rows 13-15. Your work will look similar to the picture below.



Row 16: 6 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 12 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (22).

Row 17: 22 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (24, 8).

Row 18: 23 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (24).

Row 19: 9 yoslst, dec-yoslst, 2 yoslst, tch (12, 11).

Row 20: 11 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (12).

Row 21: 10 yoslst, dec-yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 2 yoslst, tch (14, 8).


Row 22: 13 yoslst, e yoslst, tch tight (14).

The Beginning instructions are no longer needed.

Continue working with Main Panel instructions starting from Row 22 onward.

- Row 3:** 11 yoslst, [p2l-yoslst, 3 yoslst] twice, tch (19, 4).
- Row 4:** 10 yoslst, inc-yoslst, wbl-yoslst, 7 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (20).
- Row 5:** 18 yoslst, tch (18, 2).
- Row 6:** Set1, tch (6, 12).
- Row 7:** 6 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, [p2l-yoslst, 3 yoslst] twice, tch (16, 4).
- Row 8:** 16 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (18, 10).
- Row 9:** 16 yoslst, tch (16, 2).
- Row 10:** Set1, tch (6, 10).

- Row 11:** 6 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, [p2l-yoslst, 3 yoslst] twice, tch (16, 4).
- Row 12:** 16 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (18, 8).
- Row 13:** 16 yoslst, tch (16, 2).
- Row 14:** Set1, tch (6, 10).

Repeat **Rows 11 – 14** across the scarf length until after the last repetition of Row 11, 4 st rem unworked in the row below, and 10 stitches rem unworked in the third row down. Complete Rows 12 – 14. Your work will look similar to the picture below.



- Row 15:** 6 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 3 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 8 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (22).

Row 16: 22 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (24, 8).

Row 17: 23 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (24).

Row 18: 9 yoslst, dec-yoslst, 2 yoslst, tch (12, 11).

Row 19: 11 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (12).

Row 20: 10 yoslst, dec-yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 2 yoslst, tch (14, 8).

Row 21: 13 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (14).

At this point, if you decide to finish the scarf, hop to the [Finishing](#) instructions.



Row 22: 10 yoslst, tch (10, 4).

Row 23: 2 yoslst, inc-yoslst, wbl-yoslst, 6 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (11).

Row 24: 11 yoslst, [p2l-yoslst, 3 yoslst] twice, tch (19, 4).

Row 25: 10 yoslst, inc-yoslst, wbl-yoslst, 7 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (20).

Row 26: 18 yoslst, tch (18, 2).

Row 27: 6 yoslst, tch (6, 12).

Row 28: Set2, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, [p2l-yoslst, 3 yoslst] twice, tch (16, 4).

Row 29: 16 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (18, 10).

Row 30: 16 yoslst, tch (16, 2).



Row 31: 6 yoslst, tch (6, 10).

Row 32: Set2, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, [p2l-yoslst, 3 yoslst] twice, tch (16, 4).

Row 33: 16 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (18, 8).

Row 34: 16 yoslst, tch (16, 2).

Repeat **Rows 31 – 34** across the scarf length until after the last repetition of Row 31, 4 stitches remain unworked in the row below, and 10 stitches remain unworked in the third row down. Complete Rows 32 – 34. Your work will look similar to the picture below.



Row 35: 6 yoslst, tch (6, 10).

Row 36: Set2, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 3 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 8 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (22).

Row 37: 22 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, yoslst, tch (24, 8).

Row 38: 23 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (24).

Row 39: 9 yoslst, dec-yoslst, 2 yoslst, tch (12, 11).

Row 40: 11 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (12).

Row 41: 10 yoslst, dec-yoslst, p2l-yoslst, 2 yoslst, tch (14, 8).

Row 42: 13 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight (14).

Repeat **Rows 1 – 42** of these instructions until you reach your desired width.

To stop growing the width after completing only half of any panel work the Finishing instructions after Row 21 of these instructions.



Main Panel Chart

Row 1: 14 yoslst, p2l-yoslst, repeat [7 yoslst, p2l-yoslst] across the length until no more p2l-yoslst is possible, 8 yoslst, e-yoslst, tch tight.


Use a smaller hook.

Row 2: Yoslst across the row, e-slst into the last st, tch tight.

Row 3: Yoslst across the row, e-slst into the last st, tch tight, fasten off and pull the live loop until the yarn end is out.

Weave in yarn ends.


