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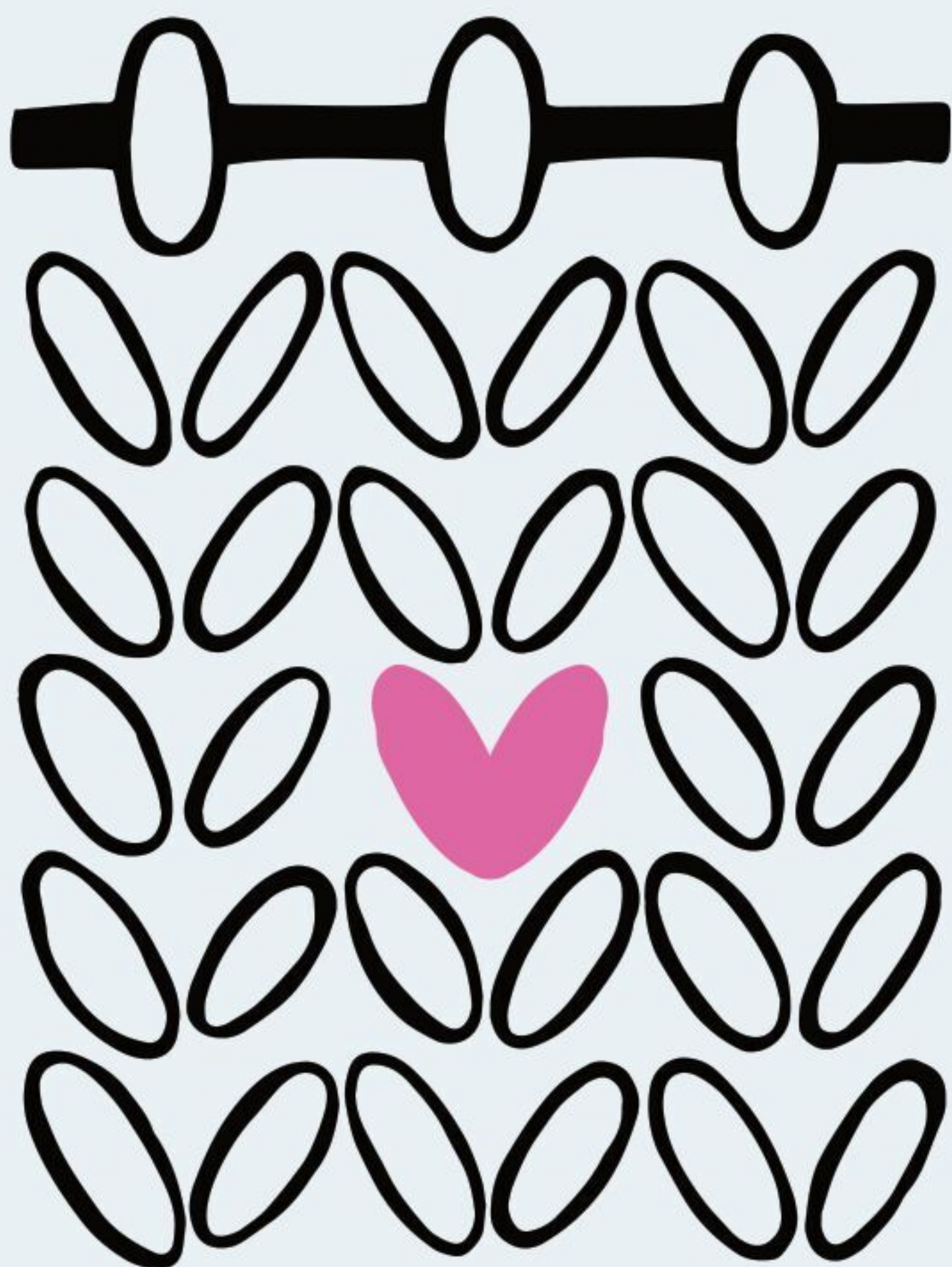

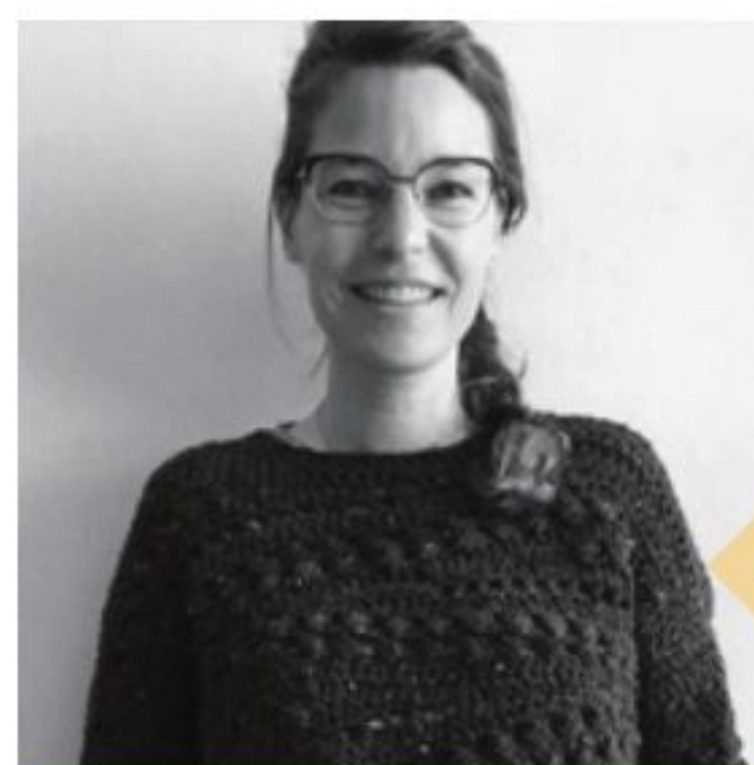


This symbol lets you know that there's a yarn kit available for the project.

NOW BACK IN FASHION

COMFORTABLE leg warmers

These leg warmers are truly fashionable must-haves and should not be missing from your winter wardrobe. When the cold sneaks up, you'll be ready!



THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

You'll crochet these leg warmers with post stitches which create a fun effect. For a post stitch, you need to insert the needle over the double crochet. Crochet around the stitches, rather than on the stitches. Do this by yarn over hook and insert the hook around the post of the stitch from the previous round. First, make a gauge swatch: 16 hdc x 13 rows = 10 x 10 cm. The example is crocheted with 48 stitches. The leg warmers have a circumference of 28 cm and are 22 cm tall. Additional abbreviations used are BPdc = back post double crochet, FPdc = front post double crochet.

LEG WARMERS (2 X)

Crochet with a multiple of 8 ch, for example 48 ch.

Rnd 1: 1 ch, 1 hdc in every ch from the

2nd ch from the hook and turn.

Rnd 2: 1 ch, 1 hdc, 2 BPdc, rep (2 hdc, 2 BPdc) to the last hdc, 1 hdc and turn.

Rnd 3: 1 ch, 1 hdc, 2 FPdc, rep (2 hdc, 2 FPdc) to the last hdc, 1 hdc and turn.

Rnd 4 and 5: rep Rnd 2 and Rnd 3.

Rnd 6: 1 ch, 1 hdc, 2 BPdc, rep (6 hdc, 2 BPdc) to the last 5 hdc, 5 hdc and turn.

Rnd 7: 1 ch, 5 hdc, 2 FPdc, rep (6 hdc, 2 FPdc) to the last hdc, 1 hdc and turn.

Rnd 8-23: rep Rnd 6 and Rnd 7.

Rnd 24-27: rep Rnd 2 and Rnd 3.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Sew the side closed. To finish, crochet a border sc along the top and bottom.

Attach a thread to 1 of the stitches, crochet 1 ch, 1 sc in every stitch, 1 sl st in the 1st sc. Fasten off and weave in ends. •

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Scheepjes Merino Soft yarn:
3 balls of Dali 608
- 4 mm crochet hook
- Darning needle
- Scissors

FROSTY THE...

SNOWMAN

You rarely find them this cute. This cheerful snowman is ready for the winter. With his bowler hat and warm scarf, he endures all blizzards. Of course, a broom is essential!

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Scheepjes Sweetheart Soft yarn: 1 ball of color 20
- Scheepjes Catona yarn: 1 ball of color 179 (25 g.), color 249 (10 g.), color 281 (10 g.), color 393 (50 g.), color 162 (25 g.), color 518 (10 g.), color 528 (25 g.), color 110 (10 g.), color 157 (10 g.)
- 3.5, 4 and 5 mm crochet hooks
- Stuffing
- Stitch markers
- Darning needle
- Scissors

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

The snowman is crocheted using the amigurumi technique, which means you crochet in the round. For amigurumi, always use a stitch marker. Because you are crocheting in the round, you can't quite see where your round ends and the new one begins. Therefore, always put a stitch marker in the last stitch of the round. As you continue to crochet on the next round, you'll see when you get to the end. Take out the stitch marker, crochet in the last stitch, and put the stitch marker back in the last stitch of this round.

SNOWMAN

Using Sweetheart Soft 20 and the 5 mm crochet hook, crochet a MR.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the MR (= 6).

Rnd 2: 2 sc in every stitch (= 12).

Rnd 3: *1 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 18).

Rnd 4: 1 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, *2 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until 1 stitch remains, 1 sc (= 24).

Rnd 5: *3 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 30).

Rnd 6: 2 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, *4 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until 2 stitches remain, 2 sc (= 36).

Rnd 7-12: 36 sc.

Rnd 13: 2 sc, sc2tog, *4 sc, sc2tog*, rep from *to* until 2 stitches remain, 2 sc (= 30).

Rnd 14: *3 sc, sc2tog*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 24).

Rnd 15: 1 sc, sc2tog, *2 sc, sc2tog*, rep from *to* until 1 stitch remains, 1 sc (= 18).

Rnd 16: *1 sc, sc2tog*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 12).

Rnd 17: 2 sc in every stitch (= 24).

Rnd 18: *3 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 30). Stuff the head.

Rnd 19: 2 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, *4 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until 2 stitches remain, 2 sc (= 36).

Rnd 20: *5 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 42).

Rnd 21-28: 42 sc.

Rnd 29: *5 sc, sc2tog*, rep from *to* (= 36).

Rnd 30: 2 sc, sc2tog, *4 sc, sc2tog*, rep from *to* until 2 stitches remain, 2 sc (= 30).

Rnd 31: *3 sc, sc2tog*, rep from *to* (= 24).

Rnd 32: 1 sc, sc2tog, *2 sc, sc2tog*, rep from *to* until 1 stitch remains, 1 sc (= 18).

Rnd 33: *1 sc, sc2tog*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 12). Continue to stuff the body.

Rnd 34: *sc2tog*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 6). Fasten off.

EYES AND MOUTH

Using Catona 110, embroider the eyes and eyelashes on Rnd 9 of the head with 2 stitches between the eyes. Using Catona 110, embroider the mouth on Rnd 13 of the head. Use the photo as an example.

CARROT

Using Catona 281 and the 2.5 mm crochet hook, crochet a MR.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the MR (= 6).

Rnd 2: 6 sc.

Rnd 3: 5 sc, 2 sc in next stitch (= 7).

Rnd 4: 7 sc.

Rnd 5: 3 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, 3 sc (= 8).

Rnd 6: 8 sc.

Rnd 7: 2 sc in the 1st stitch, 7 sc (= 9).

Rnd 8: 9 sc.

Rnd 9: 4 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, 4 sc (= 10). »



**THE SNOWMAN IS
ABOUT 27 CM TALL.**



Rnd 10: 10 sc, sl st in the 1st sc (= 10).
Fasten off.
Stuff the nose and sew it to Rnd 11 and
Rnd 12 of the head.

BRANCH (2 X)

Using Catona 162 and the 2.5 mm crochet
hook, crochet a MR.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the MR (= 6).

Rnd 2 and 3: 6 sc.

Rnd 4: 5 sc, 2 sc in next stitch (= 7).

Rnd 5: 7 sc.

Rnd 6: 3 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, 3 sc (= 8).

Rnd 7: 8 sc.

Rnd 8: 2 sc in the 1st stitch, 7 sc (= 9).

Rnd 9: 4 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, 4 sc (= 10).

Rnd 10-18: 10 sc.

Rnd 19: 5 sc, 1 sl st (= 6). You don't crochet
the round all the way through. Fasten off.
Using Catona 162 and the 2.5 mm crochet
hook, crochet a MR.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the MR (= 6).

Rnd 2-5: 6 sc.

Rnd 6: 5 sc, 2 sc in next stitch (= 7).

Rnd 7-9: 7 sc.

Rnd 10: 3 sc, 1 sl st (= 4).

You don't crochet the round all the way
through. Fasten off. Stuff the branches.

Sew the short parts to the long parts
and sew them to Rnd 21 and Rnd 22 of
the body.

SCARF

Using Catona 528 and the 4 mm
crochet hook, crochet a chain with
93 ch. Continue to crochet with the
3.5 mm crochet hook.

Rnd 1: 1 sc in the 3rd ch from the hook
(the 2nd skipped ch counts as a stitch),
1 ch, skip 1 stitch, 1 sc in the next stitch,
rep from *to* until the end of the round,
turn (= 92). Change to Catona 518.

Rnd 2: 2 ch (= 1 tch + 1 ch), skip 1st sc, *1 sc
around next 1-ch space, 1 ch, skip 1 sc*, rep
from *to* until the end of the round, end
with 1 sc in chain space, turn (= 92).
Change to Catona 393.

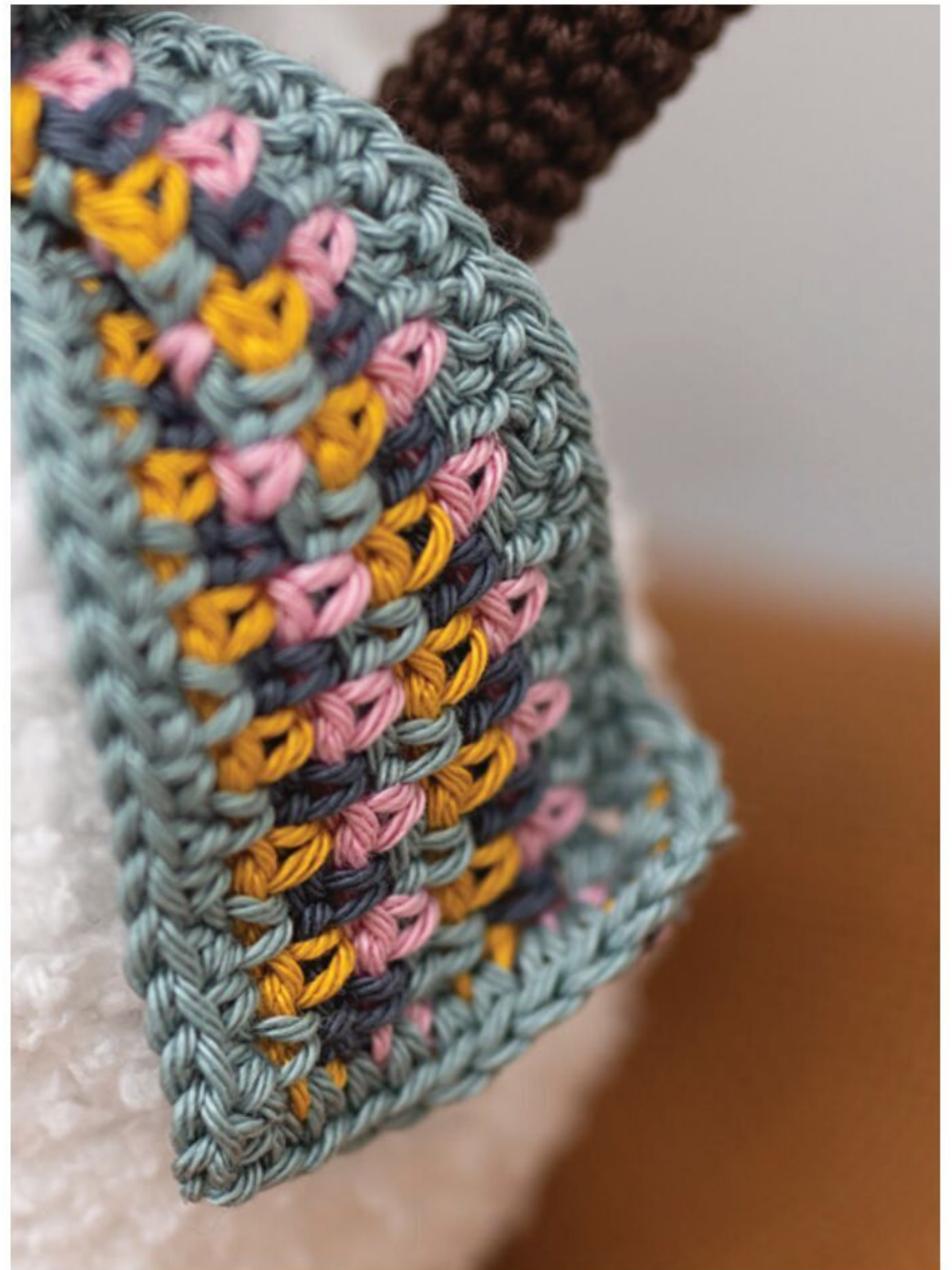
Rnd 3: 2 ch (= 1 tch + 1 ch), skip 1st sc,
*1 sc around next 1-ch space, 1 ch, skip
1 sc*, rep from *to* until the end of the
round, end with 1 sc in chain space,
turn (= 92). Change to Catona 249.

Rnd 4: 2 ch (= 1 tch + 1 ch), skip 1st sc,
*1 sc around next 1-ch space, 1 ch, skip
1 sc*, rep from *to* until the end of the
round, end with 1 sc in chain space,
turn (= 92). Change to Catona 528.

Rnd 5: 2 ch (= 1 tch + 1 ch), skip 1st sc,
*1 sc around next 1-ch space, 1 ch, skip
1 sc*, rep from *to* until the end of the
round, end with 1 sc in chain space,
turn (= 92). Change to Catona 518.

Rnd 6: 2 ch (= 1 tch + 1 ch), skip 1st sc,
*1 sc around next 1-ch space, 1 ch, skip





1 sc*, rep from *to* until the end of the round, end with 1 sc in chain space, turn (= 92). Change to Catona 393.

Rnd 7: 2 ch (= 1 tch + 1 ch), skip 1st sc, *1 sc around next 1-ch space, 1 ch, skip 1 sc*, rep from *to* until the end of the round, end with 1 sc in chain space, turn (= 92). Change to Catona 249.

Rnd 8: 2 ch (= 1 tch + 1 ch), skip 1st sc, *1 sc around next 1-ch space, 1 ch, skip 1 sc*, rep from *to* until the end of the round, end with 1 sc in chain space, turn (= 92). Change to Catona 528.

Rnd 9: 1 ch, 1 sc in every stitch until you have 1 stitch left, [1 sc - 2 ch - 1 sc] in the last stitch (= corner), 7 sc along the short side, [1 sc - 2 ch - 1 sc] in the corner, 1 sc in every stitch, [1 sc - 2 ch - 1 sc] in the corner, 7 sc along the short side, [1 sc - 2 ch] in the corner, 1 sl st in the 1st sc. Fasten off. Tie the scarf around the snowman.

HAT

Using Catona 393 and the 2.5 mm crochet hook, crochet a MR.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the MR (= 6).

Rnd 2: 2 sc in every stitch (= 12).

Rnd 3: *1 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 18).

Rnd 4: 1 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, *2 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until 1 stitch

remains, 1 sc (= 24).

Rnd 5: *3 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 30).

Rnd 6: 2 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, *4 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until 2 stitches remain, 2 sc (= 36).

Rnd 7: *5 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 42).

Rnd 8: 3 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, *6 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until 3 stitches remain, 3 sc (= 48).

Rnd 9-11: 48 sc.

Rnd 12: 7 sc, sc2tog, *14 sc, sc2tog*, rep from *to* one more time, 7 sc (= 45).

Rnd 13-15: 45 sc.

Rnd 16: *13 sc, sc2tog*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 42).

Rnd 17-19: 42 sc.

Rnd 20: 3 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, *6 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until 3 stitches remain, 3 sc (= 48).

Rnd 21: *7 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 54).

Rnd 22: 4 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, *8 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until 4 stitches remain, 4 sc (= 60).

Rnd 23: *9 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 66).

Rnd 24: 5 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, *10 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until 5 stitches

remain, 5 sc (= 72).

Rnd 25: *11 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until the end of the round (= 78).

Rnd 26: 6 sc, 2 sc in next stitch, *12 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to* until 6 stitches remain, 6 sc (= 84).

Rnd 27: *13 sc, 2 sc in next stitch*, rep from *to*, 1 sl st in the 1st sc (= 90). Fasten off.

Put some stuffing in the hat and sew it to the snowman's head at a slight angle.

BROOM

Using Catona 157 and the 2.5 mm crochet hook, crochet a MR.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the MR (= 6).

Rnd 2: 2 sc in every stitch (= 12).

Rnd 3-35: 12 sc. Stuff the handle of the broom.

Rnd 36: *sc2tog*, rep from *to* (= 6). Fasten off.

Cut pieces of Catona 179 and knot about 4 or 5 pieces of 5 strands to the bottom of the broomstick. Next, cut more pieces of Catona 179 and place them around the broomstick. Twist a strand of Catona 179 tightly around it, and also pierce it through the broomstick a few times and tie a knot. Cut the threads to the desired length. Use the photo as an example. •

TIP! MAKE A COVER FOR

COTTON FABRIC IN THE COLOR
OF THE CROCHET YARN.



PUT YOUR FEET UP

HASSOCK WITH GRAPHIC PATTERN

Put your feet up, and relax on this round hassock made of recycled cotton. This will get you through the winter!

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Barbante XL recycled cotton yarn: 3 bobbins Ivory white (approximately 500 g per bobbin) (Huisje van Katoen)
- 8 mm crochet hook
- Inner cushion hassock: Ø 50 cm, 30 cm tall (kussengigant.nl)
- Cotton fabric in the same color of the crochet yarn for inner hassock (optional)
- Darning needle
- Scissors
- Pins

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

The hassock has a graphic pattern on the side and is filled with a lightweight stuffing that makes it easy to move around. It has a diameter of 50 cm and is 30 cm tall.

TOP AND BOTTOM

The 3 ch at the beginning of the round count as the 1st dc. Join each round with 1 sl st in the top of the 3 ch.

Rnd 1: make a MR. Crochet 3 ch (= 1st dc) and 11 dc into the MR (= 12 dc).

Join with 1 sl st in the top of the 3 ch (1).

Rnd 2: 3 ch, 1 dc in the same stitch, 2 dc in all next stitches (= 24), close with sl st (2).

Rnd 3: 3 ch, 2 dc in every 2nd stitch, 1 dc

in all other stitches (= 36). Join with 1 sl st.

Rnd 4: 3 ch, 2 dc in every 3rd stitch, 1 dc in all other stitches (= 48).

Rnd 5: 3 ch, 2 dc in every 4th stitch, 1 dc in all other stitches (= 60).

Rnd 6: 3 ch, 2 dc in every 5th stitch, 1 dc in all other stitches (= 72).

Rnd 7: 3 ch, 2 dc in every 6th stitch, 1 dc in all other stitches (= 84).

Rnd 8: 3 ch, 2 dc in every 7th stitch, 1 dc in all other stitches (= 96).

Rnd 9: 3 ch, 2 dc in every 8th stitch, 1 dc in all other stitches (= 108).

Rnd 10: 3 ch, 2 dc in every 9th stitch, 1 dc in all other stitches (= 120).

Rnd 11: 3 ch, 2 dc in every 10th stitch, 1 dc in all other stitches (= 132).

Rnd 12: 3 ch, 2 dc in every 11th stitch, 1 dc in all other stitches (= 144) (3).

The circle now measures about 50 cm Ø, check this on the hassock filling.

The work is somewhat stretchy, but if it is too big or too small, take off one round or crochet an extra round, possibly from sc. Join with 1 sl st and fasten off. Crochet this circle one more time. The top and bottom are now ready.

SIDE

Crochet the side crossways. For all stitches, insert only into the back loop. The tch do not count as a stitch. Start loosely with 31 ch. Insert in the 2nd ch from the hook.

Rnd 1: 6 sl st, 6 hdc, 6 sl st, 6 hdc, 6 sl st >>

TIP! ENJOY IT
AS A SIDE TABLE WITH
A TRAY ON TOP.





(all in the back loop) (= 30), 1 tch, turn.

Rnd 2: rep Rnd 1.

Rnd 3: 6 hdc, 6 sl st, 6 hdc, 6 sl st, 6 hdc (all in the back loop) (= 30), 1 tch, turn.

Rnd 4: Rep Rnd 3 (4).

Crochet Rnd 1-4 another 34 times (= 136 rounds). The side should be about 28 cm wide and 153 cm tall. The work is slightly stretchy. Try it regularly around your

hassock, it should not be too loosely, but not too tight either. If necessary, adjust the size of the crochet hook or the number of rounds. Always end with Rnd 4. Fasten off. Place the ends together with the right side of the work facing up. Crochet the sides together with 2 sl st. Insert only into the front loop of Rnd 4 creating an almost invisible seam (5).

FINISHING

Pin the side to the top. Crochet the side with 1 round of sc and work from the top (= 144). Insert only into the back loop of Rnd 12 from the top (6 and 7).

Join with 1 sl st and turn. Crochet 1 round of sl st, insert through both loops of the previous round from the side (= 144). Join with 1 sl st and fasten off. Fit the crocheted cover around the hassock stuffing. Attach the bottom in the same way as the top.

Thus: pin in place, crochet 1 round of sc, turn and crochet 1 round of sl st (8). It is useful to lay the hassock on its side while crocheting. Crochet the seam all the way closed. Fasten off and leave a long tail so you can easily undo the seam if you want to wash the cover. Weave in ends. Put the hassock into shape. •

WITH A NOD TO THE HIGHLANDS



SCOTTISH *Furry Cardigan*

The idea for this cardigan comes from the Scottish Highlands. During cold and windy days, you can "live in" it, because it feels so nice and soft.

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Scheepjes Eliza yarn: 4 balls of Night Sky 219 and 1 ball of Denim Patch 220, Birdhouse Grey 221 and Satin Bow 228
- Scheepjes Furry Tales yarn: 3 balls of Buttons 976
- 5 mm and 9 mm crochet hook
- Scissors
- Stitch markers
- Darning needle

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

The cardigan is crocheted in 3 parts. Part 1 is the "framework" (vertical) that is colored in (horizontal) in part 2. In part 3, the finishing touches are added. In both part 1 and part 2 you work with a color scheme which is repeated. The pattern is suitable for a size 42/44. But the cm are listed for size 38/40 and 46/48. The length of the cardigan including hem is 82 cm.

GAUGE SWATCH

The instructions are suitable for a size 42/44. 10/20 cm. For size 38/40: 6/16 cm and for size 46/48: 14/24 cm. Start each round with 4 ch (= 1 dc + 1 ch). Turn the work after each round. The additional abbreviation rhdc stands for raised half double crochet. First, make a gauge swatch with the 5 mm crochet hook and Eliza yarn. Crochet 18 ch.

Rnd1: crochet 1 dc + 1 ch in the 4th ch from hook, rep until the end (skip 1 stitch, 1 dc + 1 ch). You should now have 8 open squares.

Rnd 2-15: 4 ch, rep until the end (skip 1 stitch, 1 dc + 1 ch on the previous dc of the previous round). Crochet 15 rounds in total. To practice the technique of the pattern, attach another color with the 9 mm crochet hook, and crochet 1 sl st in the 1st open square. Keep the thread at the bottom of the work and the needle at the top. Now color all the empty squares by crocheting back and forth with sl st. Always pull up the thread in the empty square (1) and crochet 1 tch

at the end of each round. Turn the work. If using a different size crochet hook, the needle with which you 'color' the squares must be at least 3 sizes larger than the needle with which you crochet the squares (2).

PART 1 - FRAMEWORK

Crochet vertically with the 5 mm crochet hook.

Right front/back panel

Crochet 204 ch with Night Sky and continue according to the color scheme (see drawing 1).

Rnd 1: 1 dc + 1 ch in the 4th ch from hook, rep until the end (skip 1 stitch, 1 dc + 1 ch in the next stitch).

Rnd 2-5: 4 ch, rep until the end (skip 1 stitch, 1 dc + 1 ch on the previous dc of the previous round). Fasten off at the end of Rnd 5. Rep Rnd 1-5 up to and including Rnd 19, but crochet in the colors shown below.

Rnd 6: Satin Bow.

Rnd 7-11: Night Sky.

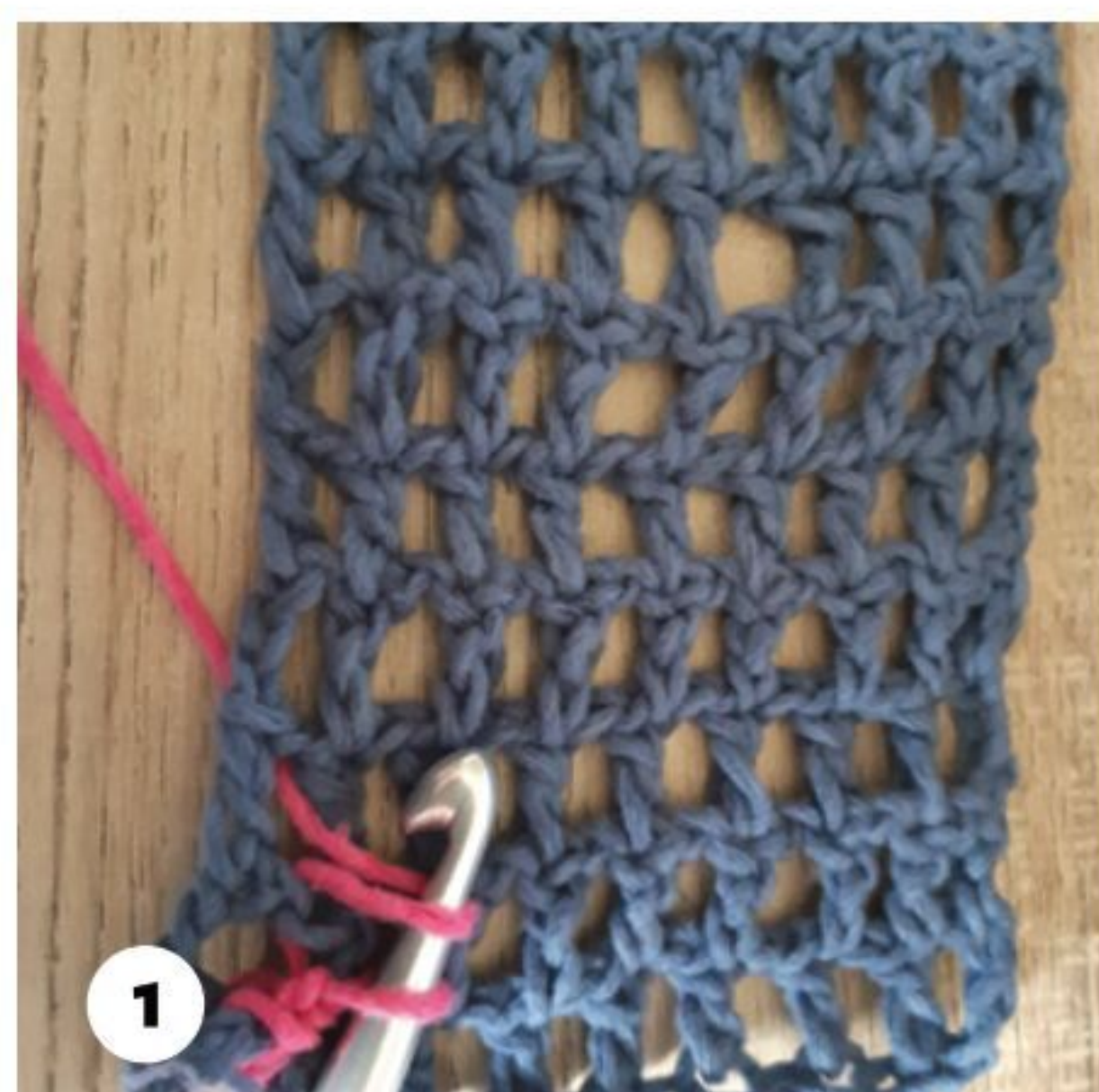
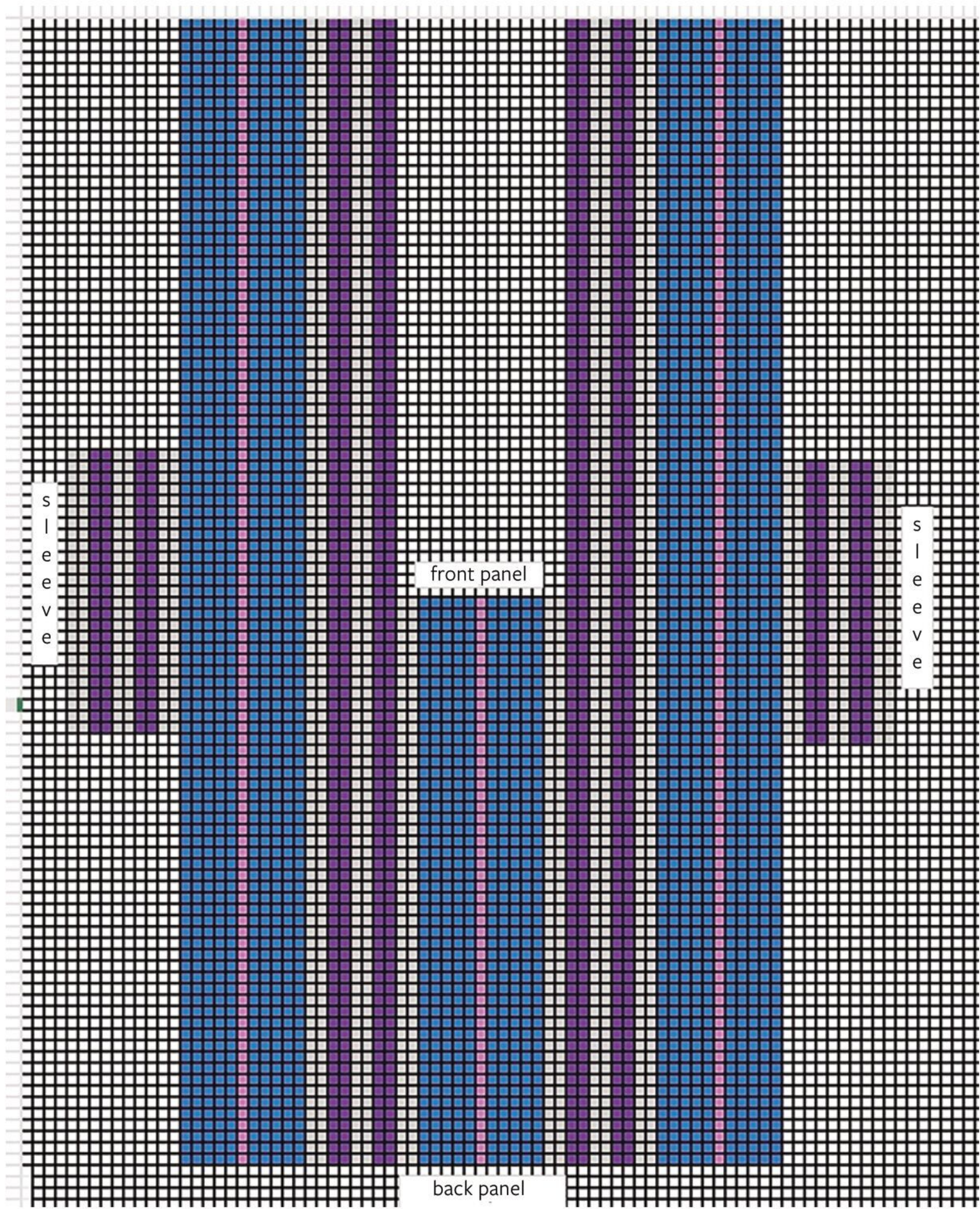

Rnd 12 and 13: Birdhouse Grey.

Rnd 14 and 15: Denim Patch.

Rnd 16 and 17: Birdhouse Grey.

Rnd 18 and 19: Denim Patch.

The work is now 26 cm (22/30 cm) long (3). Continue with the middle part of the back. This is 50 open squares counted from the bottom of the back panel. Count this out and place a stitch marker.

Rnd 20 and 21: attach Birdhouse Grey and crochet as previous rounds, but now until the stitch marker.

Rnd 22-26: change to Night Sky.

Rnd 27: change to Satin Bow.

Rnd 28-32: change to Night Sky.

Rnd 33 and 34: change to Birdhouse Grey. At the end of Rnd 34 the work is approximately 46 cm wide (38/54 cm) (4).

Left front/back panel

After Rnd 34, crochet 104 ch with Denim Patch.

Rnd 35 and 36: crochet 1 dc + 1 ch in the 4th ch from hook, rep until the end (skip 1 stitch, 1 dc + 1 ch in the next stitch). You now have again 101 open squares. Fasten off.

Rnd 37 and 38: attach Birdhouse Grey and crochet as previous rounds.

Rnd 39 and 40: change to Denim Patch.

Rnd 41 and 42: change to Birdhouse Grey.

Rnd 43-47: change to Night Sky.

Rnd 48: change to Satin Bow.

Rnd 49-53: change to Night Sky. At the end of Rnd 53 the work is approximately 72 cm wide (60/84 cm). Fasten off (5).

SLEEVE (2 X)

Follow the color scheme. The sleeves consist of 25 open squares and have a width of approximately 36 cm (32/40 cm). From the back panel, count out 38 squares and place a stitch marker. Now count out 25 squares and place a stitch marker here as well. The front panel now also has 38 squares.

Rnd 54 and 55: attach Birdhouse Grey and crochet back and forth between the stitch markers (25 squares).

Rnd 56 and 57: crochet with Denim Patch as before.

Rnd 58 and 59: change to Birdhouse Grey.

Rnd 60 and 61: change to Denim Patch.

Rnd 62 and 63: change to Birdhouse Grey (6). Part 1 is done. Fasten off and weave in ends.

PART 2 - COLORING BOXES

Crochet horizontally and with the 9 mm crochet hook. Start coloring the squares (see drawing 2), starting in the middle of the back panel (squares 25 and 26, counting from the bottom).

Rnd 1 and 2: Attach Birdhouse Grey with 1 sl st in square 26. Now crochet horizontally and start (always from the same side) from right to left with sl st, keeping the thread at the bottom of your work. At the end of Rnd 1, crochet 1 tch and crochet back through square 25 (i.e. from left to right). Fasten off. Rep this process until all the squares are colored.

Rnd 3 and 4: Attach color 220 in square 24.

Rnd 5 and 6: change to Birdhouse Grey in square 22.

Rnd 7-11: change to Night Sky in square 20.

Rnd 12: change to Satin Bow in square 15.

Rnd 13-17: change to Night Sky in square 14.

Rnd 18 and 19: change to Birdhouse Grey in square 9.

Rnd 20 and 21: change to Denim in square in square 7.

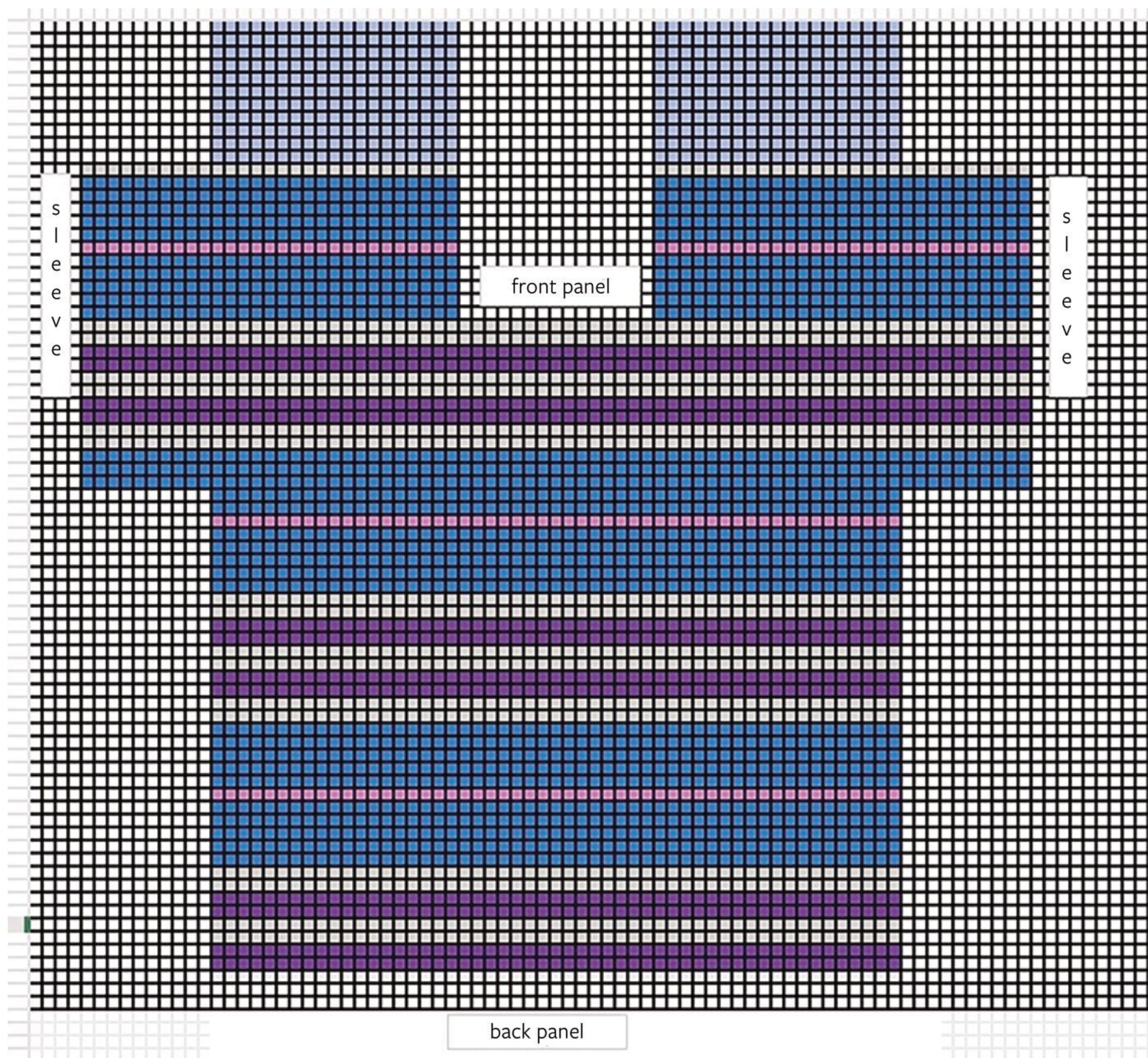
Rnd 22 and 23: change to Birdhouse Grey in square 5.

Rnd 24 and 25: change to Denim Patch in square 3.

Rnd 26: change to Birdhouse Grey in >>



DIAGRAM 2



square 1 and crochet from right to left. Later, the hem will be crocheted on this round. The lower part of the back panel is now "colored". Proceed to the upper part, the sleeves and a part of the front panel (7).

Rnd 27 and 28: change to Denim Patch in square 27.

Rnd 29 and 30: change to Birdhouse Grey in square 29.

Rnd 31-35: change to Night Sky in square 31.

Rnd 36: change to Satin Bow in square 36.

Rnd 37 and 38: change to Night Sky in square 37. Fasten off at the end of Rnd 38.

Rnd 39-41: attach Night Sky in the 1st square of the right sleeve (= square 39 of the back panel). Crochet through the back panel to the left sleeve. Continue to crochet in this way up to and including Rnd 50.

Rnd 42 and 43: change to Birdhouse Grey in square 4 of the right sleeve (= square 42 of the back panel).

Rnd 44 and 45: change to Denim Patch in square 6 of the right sleeve (= square 44 of the back panel).

Rnd 46 and 47: change to Birdhouse Grey in square 8 of the right sleeve (= square 46 of the back panel).

Rnd 48 and 49: change to Denim Patch in square 10 of the right sleeve (= square 48 of the back panel).

Rnd 50: change to Birdhouse Grey in square 12 of the right sleeve (= square 50 of the back panel) and crochet from right sleeve to left sleeve. Fasten off.

Rnd 51: change to Birdhouse Grey in square 13 of the right sleeve, now crochet the right front panel along each time and fasten off.

Rnd 52-56: change to Night Sky in

square 14 of the right sleeve.

Rnd 57: change to Satin Bow in square 19 of the right sleeve.

Rnd 58-62: change to Night Sky in square 20 of the right sleeve.

Rnd 63: change to Birdhouse Grey in square 25 of the right sleeve. Fasten off at the end of the round (8).

Now crochet the left sleeve in the same way with a part of the left front panel. Fasten off. Next, crochet the open squares for the Furry part of the sleeve.

Rnd 64-74: attach Night Sky to the dc of Rnd 63 of part 1. Crochet 4 ch, rep until the end (skip 1 stitch, 1 dc + 1 ch on the dc of the previous round). Fasten off (9). Now crochet sl st with the Furry yarn and with the 9 mm crochet hook in the same way as before. Crochet back and forth with 1 tch at the end of each round. Fasten off at the end of Rnd 73.

Pull up the Eliza yarn again in Rnd 74 and crochet 1 round of sl st. This is where you later crochet the hem. The sleeve now has a length of about 30 cm. Next is to fill the remaining squares of both the right and left front panel with the Furry Tales yarn. Do this in the same way like the sleeves crocheted with this yarn. Crochet the last round of both panels with Eliza yarn and the border will be added here as well.

Tip! With the Furry yarn, if you have trouble seeing the stitches, choose to crochet a thread of Eliza yarn along with it or make the Furry yarn wet. You can blow dry this again later.

PART 3 - FINISHING

Sew the sides of the cardigan and the bottom of the sleeves together. Crochet the outer loops of the sl st together.

SLEEVE CUFFS (2 X)

Rnd 1: attach Night Sky at the bottom of the sleeve in the sl st you crocheted in the last round. In each outer loop, crochet 1 hdc, do not close the round but continue to crochet in a spiral.

Rnd 2-5: crochet 1 rhdc around the hdc of the previous round. Fasten off at the end of Rnd 5.

Rnd 6 and 7: attach Satin Bow and crochet 1 rhdc around each rhdc of the previous round. Fasten off.

Rnd 8 and 9: attach Night Sky and crochet 1 rhdc around each rhdc of the previous tour. Fasten off.

CARDIGAN BOTTEM BORDER

Rnd 1: attach Night Sky in the last round of sl st. Alternately, crochet 1 hdc and 2 hdc in the outer loops at the bottom of the front panels and the back panel, 1 tch.

Rnd 2-5: alternately, crochet 1 hdc on



the hdc of the previous round and 1 rhdc on the hdc of the previous round. Fasten off (10).

Now crochet the hem on the inside of the front panels.

Left

Rnd 1: attach Night Sky to the side of the hem of the bottom, crochet 1 hdc and then alternately 1 hdc and 2 hdc in each round up. At the transition from the front panel to the middle part, crochet the last 2 hdc together. Crochet 1 tch.

Rnd 2: the 1st hdc2tog, alternately crochet 1 hdc and 1 rhdc on/around the hdc of the previous round, 1 tch.

Rnd 3: alternately, crochet 1 hdc on the hdc of the previous round and 1 rhdc around the rhdc of the previous round. At the top, crochet the last 2 stitches together.

Rnd 4: as Rnd 2.

Rnd 5: as Rnd 3. Fasten off.

Right

Rnd 6-10: crochet the hem in the same

way as on the left. Now start at the top and dec each round at the top as well (11). Attach Satin Bow where you left off and crochet 1 round of hdc along the entire cardigan, including along the neckline.

COLLAR

Rnd 1: attach Denim Patch in the 1st hdc on the diagonal part of the right hem. Crochet 4 ch, 1 dc in the same stitch (inc), rep (skip 1 stitch, 1 dc and 1 ch in the next stitch) and crochet through the neck to the top of the diagonal part of the left hem. At the last stitch, crochet 1 dc + 1 + 1 dc in the same stitch (inc), 1 tch.

Rnd 2-6: crochet in the same way as before and inc both right and left 1 stitch each. Fasten off (12).

Next is to fill the squares of the collar by crocheting sl st (horizontally) with the Furry yarn. •

Cool SHOPPER

This bag is nice and sturdy, and looks very cool. Yet, it is lightweight and feels very soft to the touch, all because of the Washi yarn.
Must-have!

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Katia Washi yarn: 3 balls of color 110
- 8 mm crochet hook
- Scissors
- Darning needle
- Stitch markers

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

The additional abbreviation sc3tog stands for crocheting 3 sc together. Insert the hook into the next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop, do this 3 times. Yarn over hook and pull the yarn through all 4 loops on the hook. You have now decreased by 2 stitches. Note: Crochet as loosely as possible because that makes the stitch a little easier.

BOTTOM

Do not join the rounds, but work in a spiral. Use a stitch marker at the end of a round and shift the stitch marker each round.

Rnd 1: make a MR and work 1 ch into the MR, 6 sc. Do not join, place a stitch marker in the end of the round. Pull the MR tight (= 6).

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc (= 12).

Rnd 3: rep all around (2 sc in the next stitch, 1 sc in the next stitch) (= 18).

Rnd 4: 1 sc in the next stitch, 2 sc in the next stitch, rep (1 sc in the next 2 stitches, 2 sc in the next stitch) until the last stitch, 1 sc in the last stitch (= 24).

Rnd 5: rep all around (2 sc in the next stitch, 1 sc in the next 3 stitches) (= 30).

Rnd 6: 1 sc in the next 2 stitches, 2 sc in the next stitch, rep (1 sc in the next 4 stitches, 2 sc in the next stitch) until the last 2 stitches, 1 sc in the last

2 stitches (= 36).

Rnd 7: rep all around (2 sc in the next stitch, 1 sc in the next 5 stitches) (= 42).

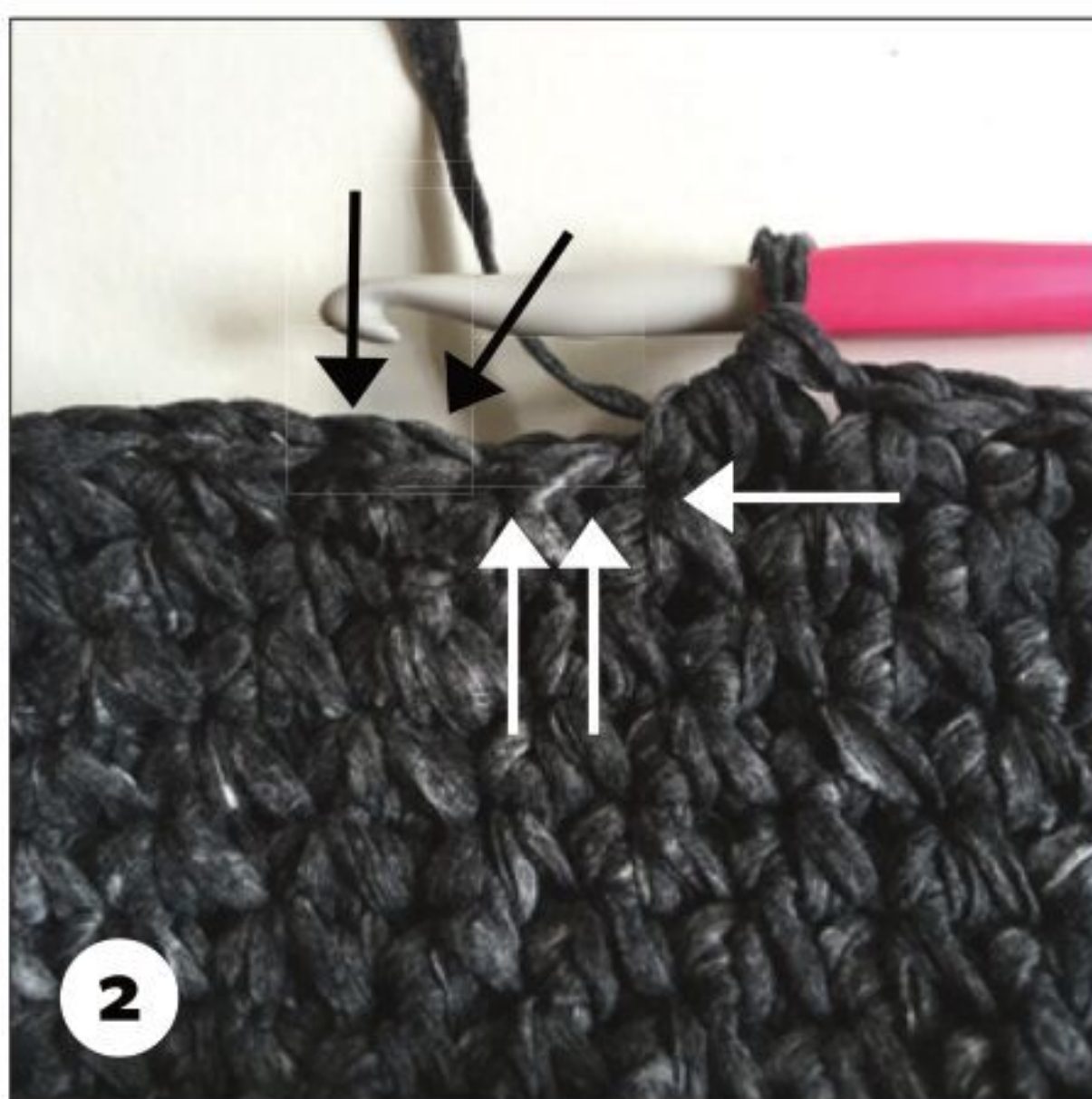
Rnd 8: 1 sc in the next 3 stitches, 2 sc in the next stitch, rep (1 sc in the next 6 stitches, 2 sc in the next stitch) until the last 3 stitches, 1 sc in the last 3 stitches (= 48).

Rnd 9: rep all around (2 sc in the next stitch, 1 sc in the next 7 stitches) (= 54).

Rnd 10: 1 sc in the next 4 stitches, 2 sc in the next stitch, rep (1 sc in the next 8 stitches, 2 sc in the next stitch) until the last 4 stitches, 1 sc in the last 4 stitches (= 60).

Rnd 11: rep all around (2 sc in the next stitch, 1 sc in the next 9 stitches) (= 66).

Rnd 12: 1 sc in the next 5 stitches, 2 sc in the next stitch, rep (1 sc in the next 10 stitches, 2 sc in the next stitch) until the last 5 stitches, 1 sc in the last 5 stitches (= 72). »



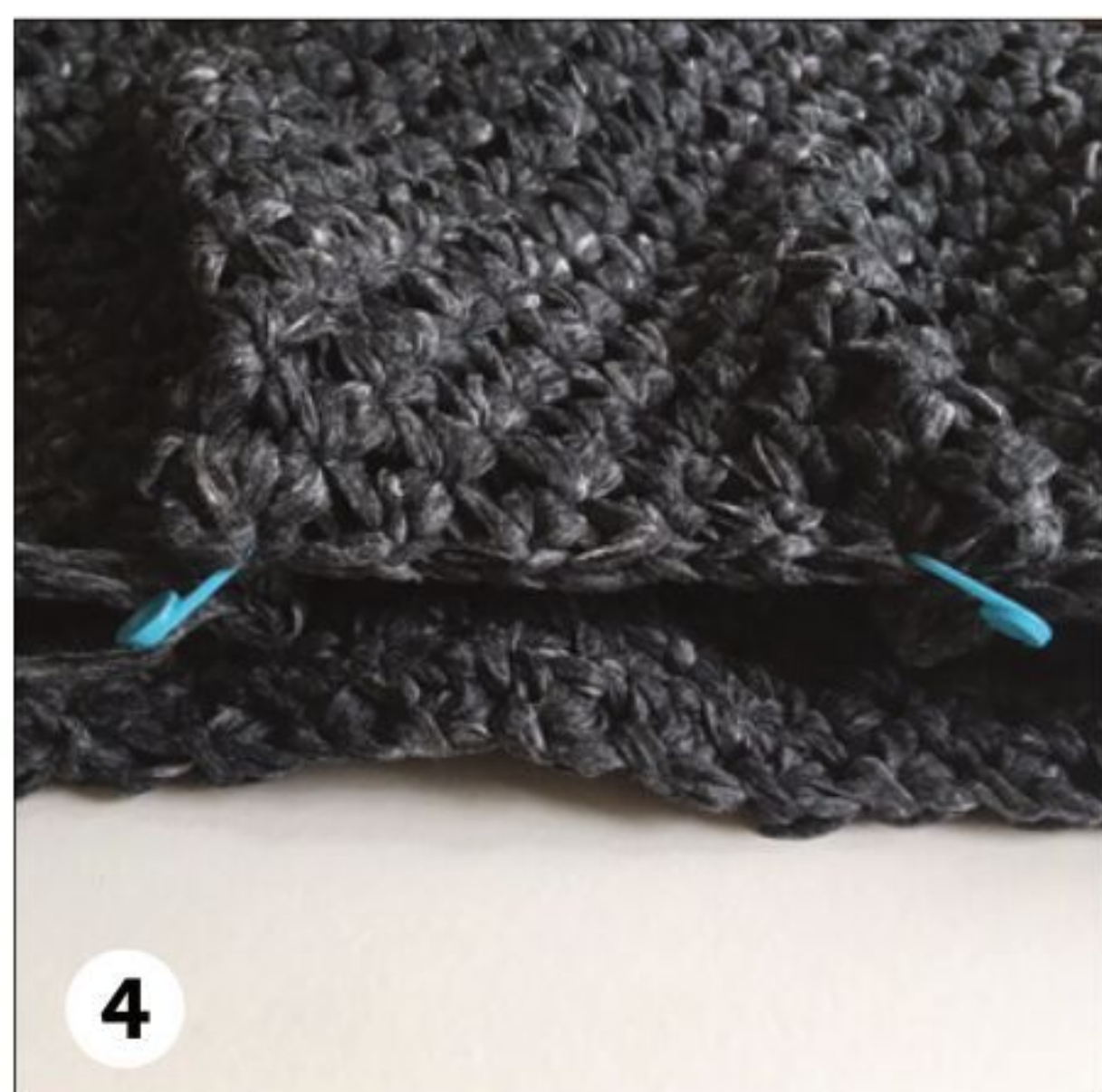


BAGS

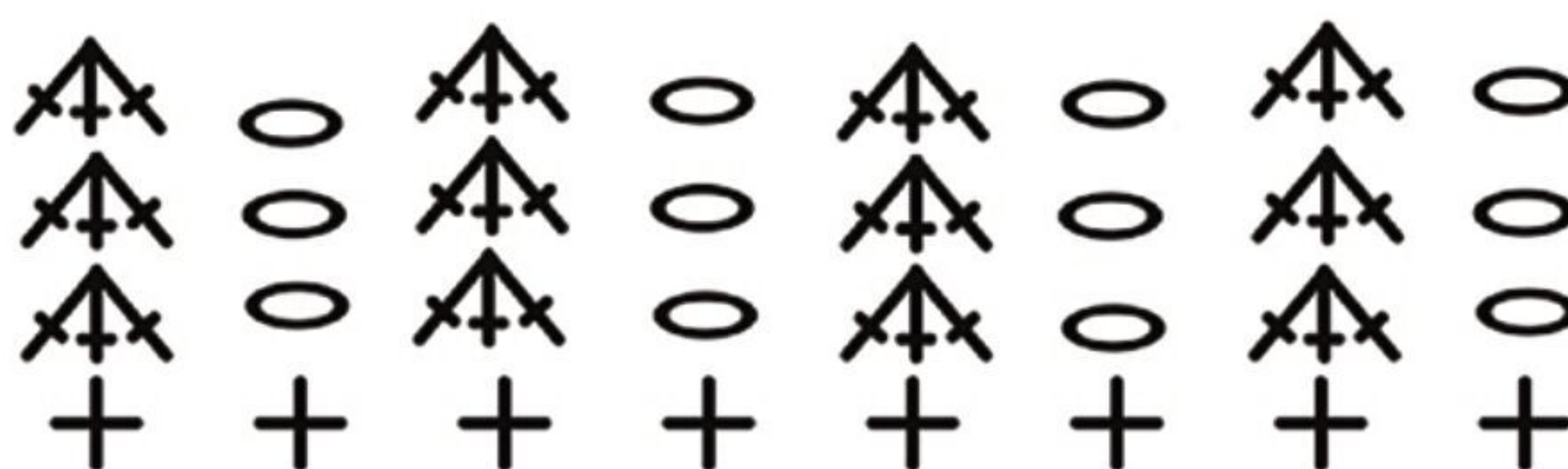


TIP!

PATTERN



Rnd 13: rep all around (2 sc in the next stitch, 1 sc in the next 11 stitches), 1 sl st into the 1st sc (= 78). Now continue to crochet very loosely in spiral (see pattern). At the end, continue with sc3tog (instead of 1 sl st at the end of the round). If you find this too complicated, you can also join each round with 1 sl st, then mark the end of a round. You will now have a visible seam.

SC3TOG

Rnd 1: 1 ch, sc3tog over the same stitch and the next 2 stitches, rep all around (1 ch, sc3tog over the previous ch space and the next 2 stitches) (1).

Rnd 2: 1 ch, sc3tog across (previous ch space, 1 sc (sc3tog) and the next ch space) (2), this is before the end of the round when you crochet sc3tog in a spiral.

Rnd 3-25: 39 x sc3tog, join Rnd 25 with 1 sl st.

Attach a stitch marker next to the sl st. Make a double fold (into an 's' shape) over 5 stitches to the left (5 x sc3tog) and fasten (3). Skip 4 stitches and make another double fold over 5 stitches to the right (4). Skip 5 stitches and rep on other side of the bag (5). This way, you have 1 stitch left. Use it in 1 of the folds. You fold 6, instead of 5, twice. Sew the folds closed through all layers (6).

ROMANIAN CORD

Crochet 1 ch and 1 sc starting in the 2nd ch from the hook. Turn your work so that the stitch you just made is facing you, making sure to keep the thread behind the work. Insert the hook into this stitch and make a sc by pulling up a loop, yarn over hook and pull the yarn through the 2 loops on the hook. Turn the work back toward you, insert again into the 2 loops and make a sc by pulling up a loop, yarn over hook and pull the yarn through the 2 loops on the hook. Repeat these steps.

STRAP

Make 2 Romanian cords of 50 cm, leaving a long tail on both sides. Sew the created folds at the top of the bag on both sides closed. (7). •

WITH THE BEAN STITCH

Blanket

WITH DIAMOND PATTERN

For this blanket, you'll use the bean stitch. This has nothing at all to do with brown or white beans, except that the stitches do indeed look a bit like the shape of beans. With this stitch, you create a beautiful diamond pattern on your blanket. Try it out!



WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Durable Cosy Fine yarn: 6 balls Ocean 295, 5 balls Ivory 326 and Silver Grey 2228
- 4.5 mm crochet hook
- Darning needle
- Scissors

Yarn from DurableYarn.com

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

The blanket will be 85 cm wide and 110 cm tall. At the end of each round, turn and start the new round with 2 tch. These ch do not count as the 1st hdc and are not mentioned in the description.

BEAN STITCH

In this pattern you will crochet with the bean stitch. The abbreviation for which

is bean st. Crochet the stitch as follows: insert the hook into the stitch, yarn over, pull up a loop (2 loops on hook), yarn over, insert the hook into the same stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop (4 loops on hook), yarn over, insert the hook into the same stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop (6 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through all 6 loops on hook. Crochet 1 ch to finish the stitch. Note that this last ch does count as a stitch.

BLANKET

Start with 116 ch. Want a larger size blanket?

Start with a multiple of 10 + 4 ch + 2 tch.

Rnd 1: 1 hdc in the 3rd ch, 1 hdc until the end of the round.

Rnd 2: 6 hdc, rep (1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 8 hdc). Join with 6 hdc.

Rnd 3: 5 hdc, rep (1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 6 hdc). Join with 5 hdc.

Rnd 4: 4 hdc, rep (1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 4 hdc). Join with 4 hdc.

Rnd 5: 3 hdc, rep (1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 2 hdc). Join with 3 hdc.

Rnd 6: 4 hdc, rep (1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 4 hdc). Join with 4 hdc.

Rnd 7: 5 hdc, rep (1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 6 hdc). Join with 5 hdc.

Rnd 8: 6 hdc, rep (1 bean st, skip 1 stitch, 8 hdc). Join with 6 hdc.

Rnd 9: 1 hdc in the remaining stitches until the end of the round. Change colors.

Rnd 10: 1 hdc in the remaining stitches until the end of the round. Rep Rnd 2-10 until the blanket is the desired length. End with Rnd 9. Crochet a total of 13 rounds (or more or less for another desired size). Do not fasten off, but continue crocheting the border of the blanket.

BORDER

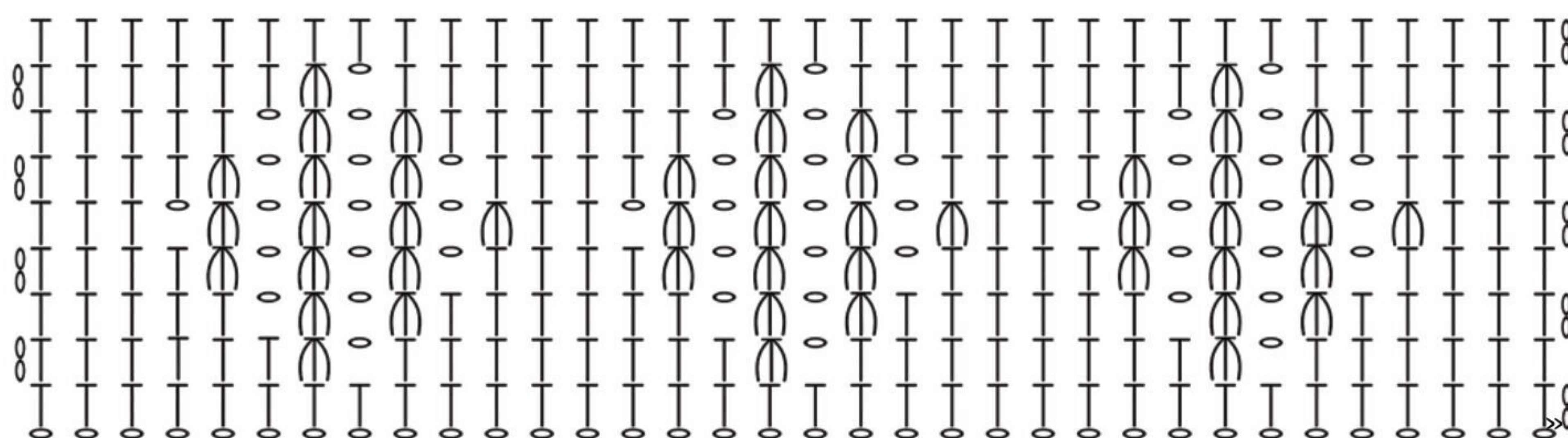
Crochet the border from the top left counterclockwise around the blanket.

TIP!

PREFER A LARGER BLANKET? START WITH A MULTIPLE OF 10 + 4 CH + 2 TCH.



PATTERN





Rnd 1: 1 ch, continue on the left side of the blanket, crochet sc around the rounds hdc. Rep (1 sc around the 1st round, 1 sc around the 2nd round, 2 sc around the 3rd round) until the bottom left corner. This ensures that the side will be straight and the blanket will not become uneven. Crochet 3 sc in the lower left corner and continue at the bottom of the blanket. Next, crochet 1 sc in each stitch and 3 sc in the lower right corner. Crochet the ride side as

the left side, and rep (1 sc around the 1st round, 1 sc around the 2nd round, 2 sc around the 3rd round) until the upper right corner. Crochet 3 sc in the upper right corner. Crochet the top of the blanket with 1 sc in each stitch and 3 sc in the upper left corner. Change to white.

Rnd 2: 2 ch, bean st in the same stitch, skip 1 ch. Rep 1 bean st, skip 1 ch around the entire blanket. On the 4 corners, do not skip 1 ch, but crochet the bean st in

2 stitches instead. At the end of the round, change to gray and turn.

Rnd 3: 2 ch, bean st in the same stitch, skip the ch of the bean st of the previous round. Rep 1 bean st, skip 1 ch around the entire blanket. On the 4 corners, crochet 2 x 1 bean st in 1 stitch. Join the border with 1 sl st and fasten off. Weave in ends. •

BABY WIPES

These baby wipes are crocheted with various stitches. Great for beginners who quickly want to learn more, but also for anyone who does want an extra challenge.

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Rico Creative Cotton yarn
- 5 mm crochet hook
- Scissors
- Darning needle
- Stitch marker

BRICK STITCH

This is a powerful stitch full of texture and a great opportunity to practice the post stitch. Note: attach a stitch marker to the back of a dc in Round 1 to mark the right side. Number of stitches divided by 4 + 5 stitches for the foundation chain.

Rnd 1: RS: 33 ch, 1 dc in 4th ch from the hook and in every ch, turn (= 31 dc).

Rnd 2: 3 ch (counts as dc everywhere), 1 FPdc around the next stitch, rep (1 dc in next 3 dc, 1 FPEdc around next dc) until the last dc, stitch in last dc, turn.

Rnd 3: 3 ch, 1 BPdc to the next FPdc (1), rep (1 FPdc around the next 3 dc (2), 1 BPdc around the next FPdc) until the last dc, 1 dc in the last dc, turn.

Rnd 4: 3 ch, 1 dc in the next 2 dc, rep (1 FPdc to the next BPdc (3), 1 dc in the next 3 dc) until the end, turn.

Rnd 5: 3 ch, 1 FPdc around the next 2 dc (4), 1 BPdc around the next FPdc, rep (1 FPdc around the next 3 dc (5), 1 BPdc around the next FPdc) until the last 3 dc, 1 FPdc around 2 dc, 1 dc in the last dc, turn.

Rnd 6: 3 ch, 1 FPdc around the next FPdc, *1 dc in the next 3 dc (6), 1 FPdc around the next FPdc*. Rep from* until the last dc, 1 dc in the last dc.

Rnd 7-19: Rep 3 x Rnd 3 to 6.

Fasten off and weave in ends. •

CROCHET WITH 'OLD SCHOOL' BLOCK STITCHES

Block stitch PARTY SCARF

Old school crochet motifs are in fashion again and you can see them back on the streets and even on the catwalk. This scarf may be retro, but the new 'look' makes it totally fashionable again!

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Drops Eskimo Mix yarn:
4 balls of Copper 86 and 4 balls
Curry 85
- 10 mm crochet hook
- Scissors
- Darning needle
- Clover Pom-Pom Maker 65

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

Rnd 1: with Copper, crochet 221 ch, then 1 sc in the 2nd ch from hook, rep until the next stitch). Change to Curry and break yarn of Copper (1).

Rnd 2: 3 ch (= 1 dc), 3 dc in the 3-ch space, 1 dc in the last sc, change to Copper and break yarn of Curry (2).

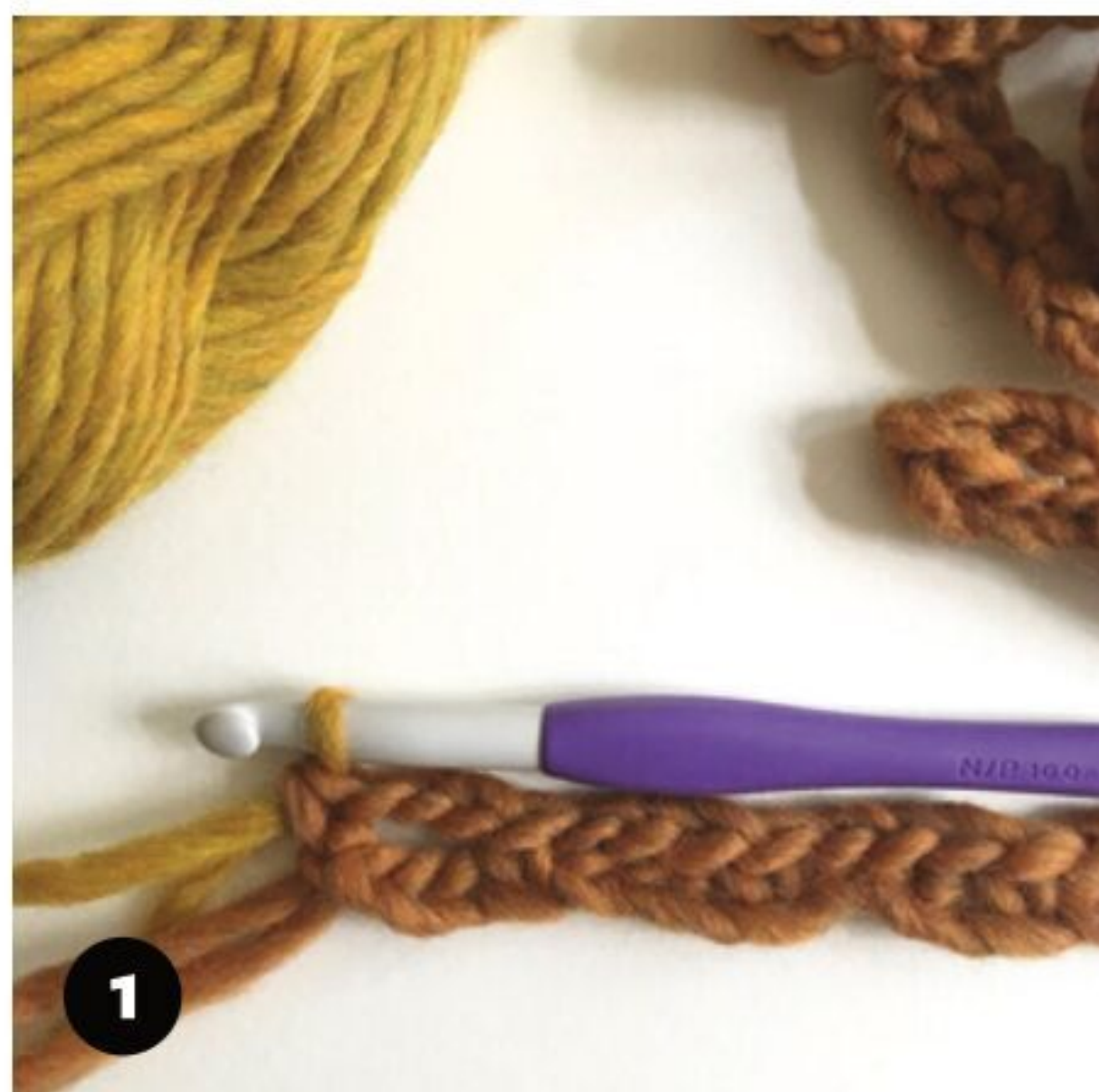
Rnd 3: 1 ch, 1 sc in the 1st dc, 3 ch, skip 3 dc, rep (1 sc between the 2 dc-groups, 3 ch, skip 3 dc) until tch, 1 sc between the

dc-group and 1 tch, 1 sc in tch, change to Curry and break yarn of Copper (3). Repeat Rnd 2 and Rnd 3 4 more times. Weave in ends with the darning needle.

POMPOMS (6 X)

Step 1: Open the pompom maker and fold the 4 "arms" straight out. Make sure to create 2 pairs of "arms" (4).

Step 2: Keep the pompom maker and yarn in 1 hand and wrap the yarn around »







1 set of arms. Go back and forth evenly and wrap 4 times around the arms, thus back and forth 2 times **(5 and 6)**.

Step 3: Close the arms on one side and move the yarn to the other pair of arms **(7)**.

Step 4: Repeat step 2 for these arms **(8)**.

Step 5: Close that side as well and break yarn. Next, cut right through each half of the pompom maker. Run the scissors through the outline of the pompom maker and go through the "slot" **(9 and 10)**.

Step 6: Pull thread of about 20 cm along the pompom maker, through the same 'slot' and make a knot. Be careful not to break the yarn **(11)**.

Step 7: Open the arms of the pompom maker and pull the halves apart to release the pompom **(12)**. Put the pompom maker together again **(13)**.

Step 8: Trim the pompom a little. Use the ends of the yarn, which you've used to tie a knot in step 6, to tie the pompom to the scarf. •

'FEEL GOOD' RUG

You'll feel right at home when you have this cool, homemade rug in your living room or bedroom. After all the crochet work, you can certainly be proud of it.

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Scheepjes Mighty yarn: 39 balls of color 755, 12 balls of 753, 9 balls of 760 and 5 balls of 756 and 757
- 4 mm and 4.5 mm crochet hook
- Stopp filt anti slip 165 x 235 cm
- Sewing thread
- Needle

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

The rug will be 165 cm wide x 230 cm long. First, make a gauge swatch: 16 stitches and 20 rows with a 4.5 mm crochet hook = 10 x 10 cm. Crochet the entire blanket with sc, with a border of sc and close the work with a lobster stitch. **Please note:** 1 square is 2 stitches wide and 2 rows high.

RUG

Using color 755 and a 4.5 mm crochet hook, crochet a foundation single crochet

of 256 stitches.

Rnd 1: 1 tch, 256 sc.

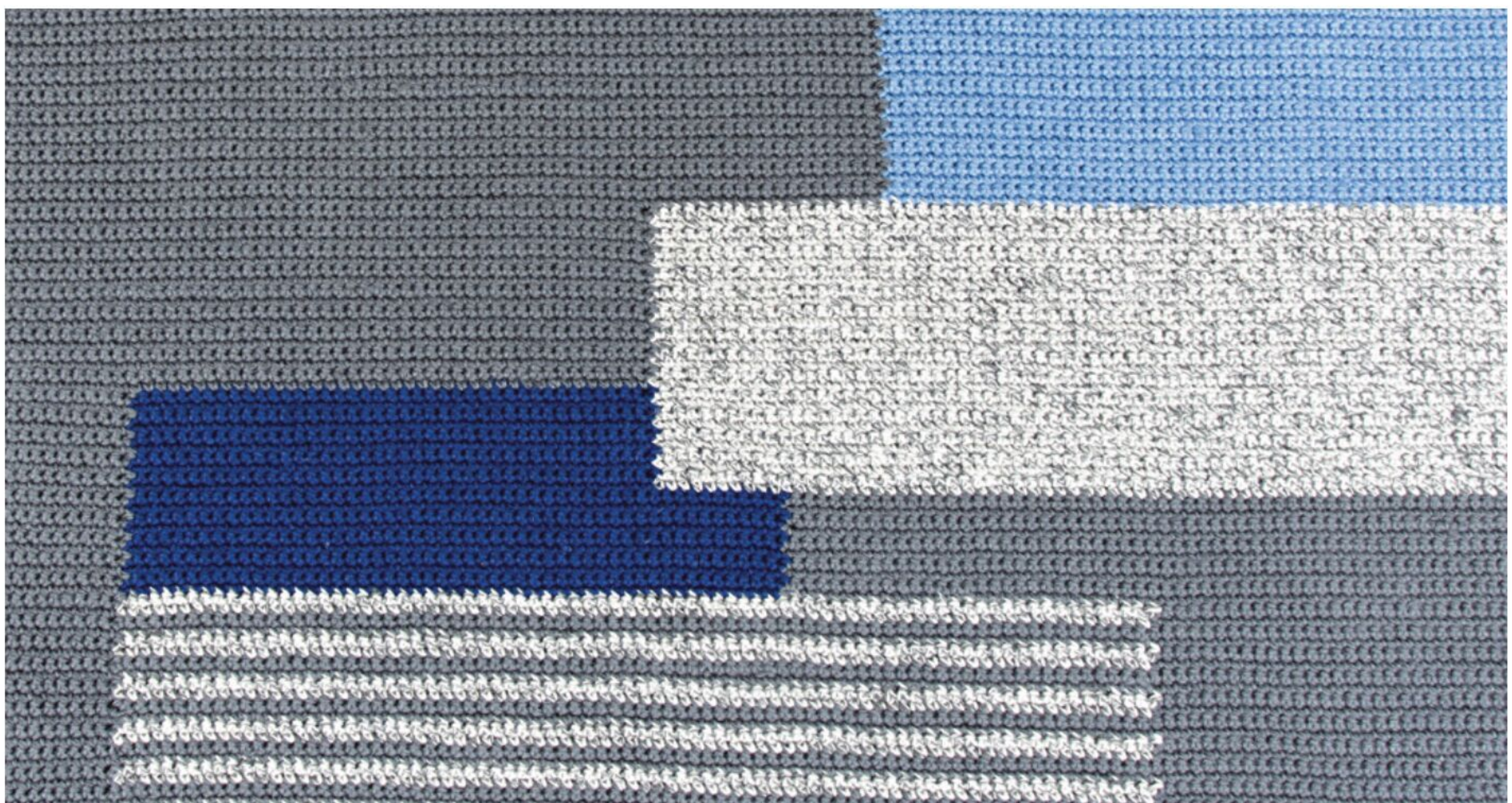
Rnd 2: 1 tch, 256 sc (these 2 rounds is the 1st row in the diagram).

Rnd 3: 1 tch, 256 sc.

Rnd 4: 1 tch, 256 sc (these 2 rounds is the 2nd row in the diagram).

Rnd 5: 1 tch, 168 sc with color 755, 48 sc with color 756, 40 sc with color 753 (= 256).

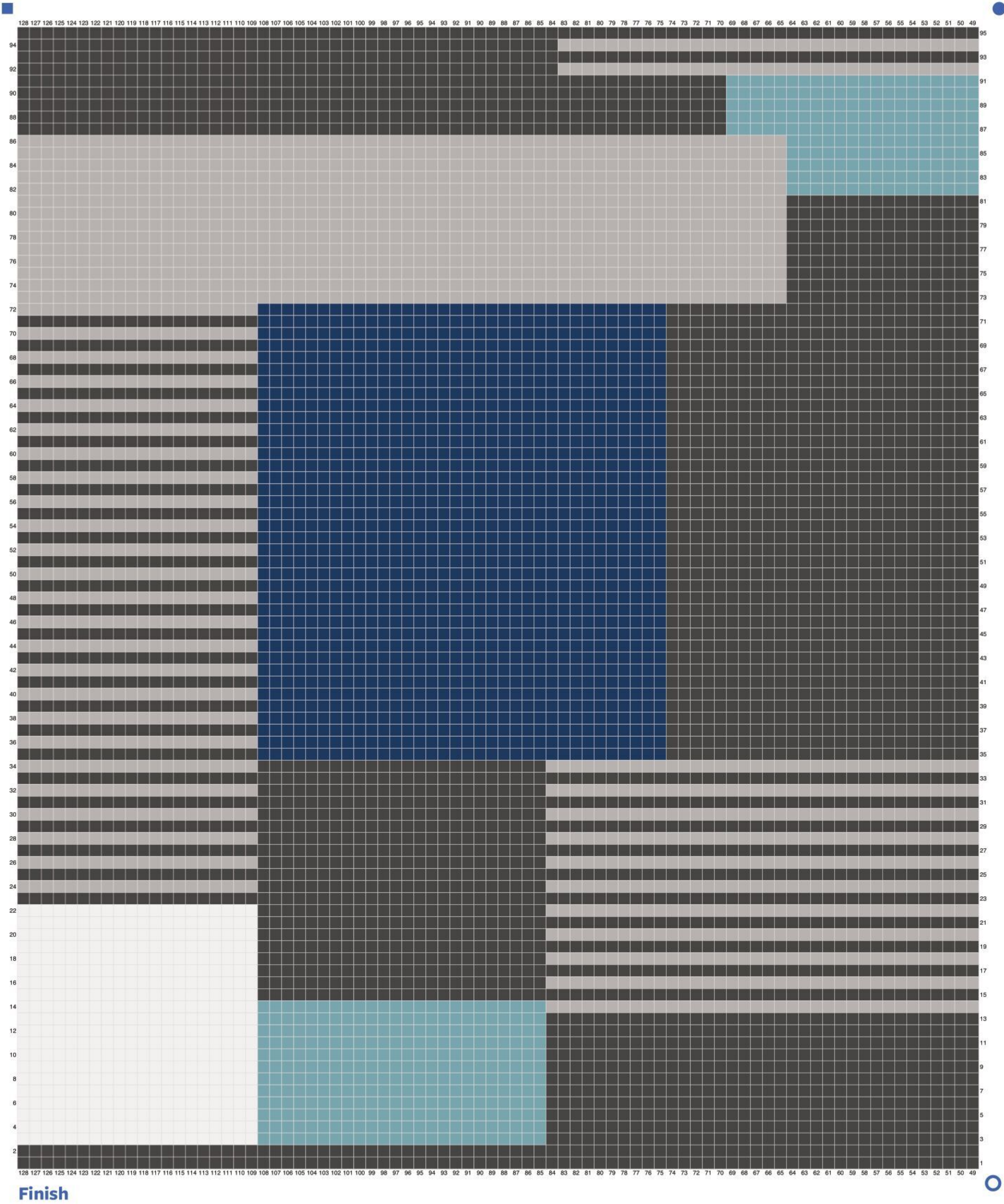
Rnd 6: 1 tch, 40 sc with color 753, 48 sc with color 756, 168 sc with color 755 (= 256) (these 2 rounds in the 3rd row in the diagram). >>

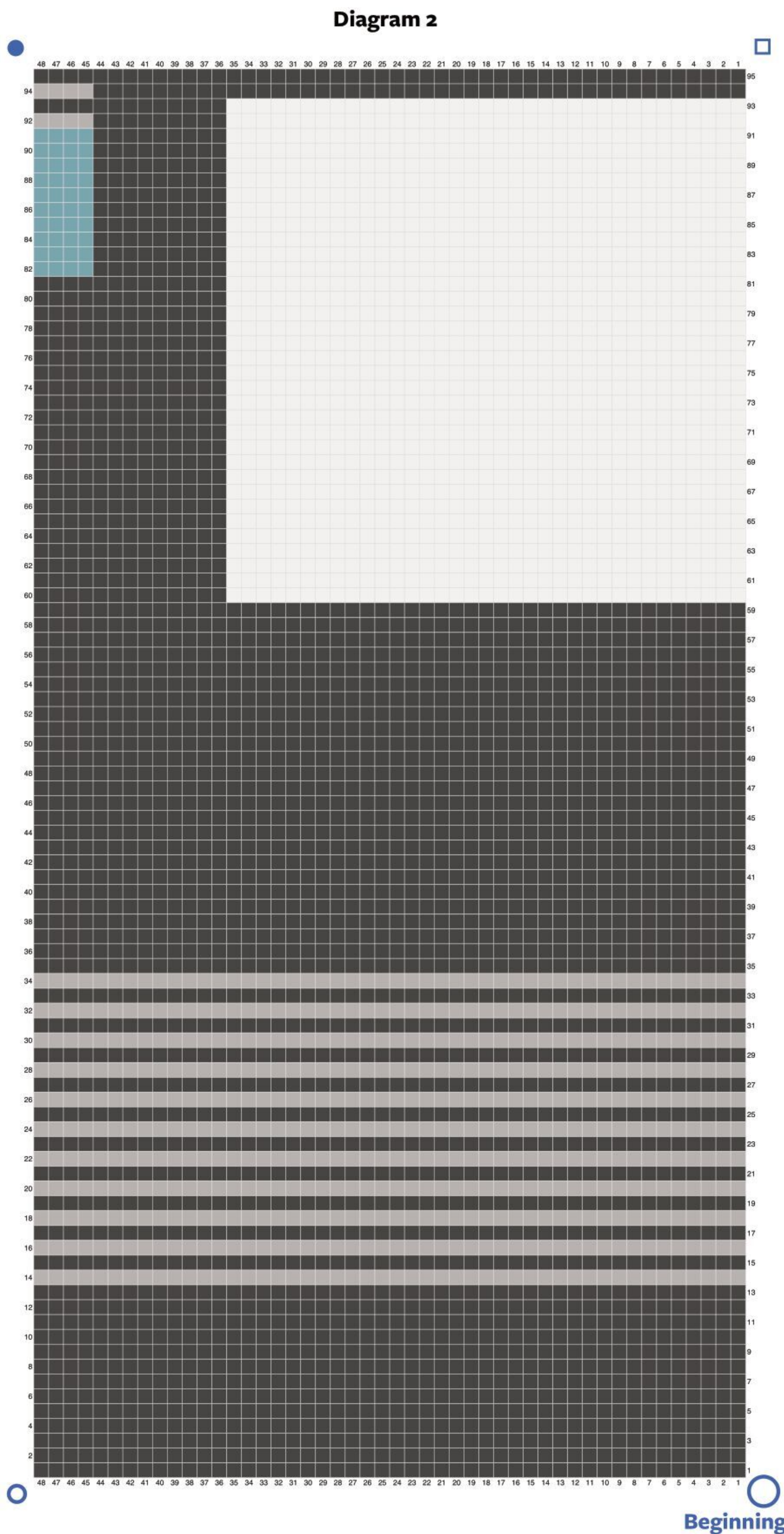

Rnd 7-26: rep Rnd 5 and Rnd 6.

Rnd 27: 1 tch, 168 sc with color 753, 48 sc with color 756, 40 sc with color 753 (= 256).

Rnd 28: 1 tch, 40 sc with color 753, 48 sc with color 756, 168 sc with color 753 (= 256).

Rnd 29: 216 sc with color 753, 40 sc with color 753 (= 256).

Rnd 30: 40 sc with color 753, 216 sc with color 753 (= 256).

Continue to crochet in the same way by following the diagram until the desired length is reached.

BORDER

After the last round, continue straight away with the border. Crochet 255 sc along the border at the top, then crochet 3 sc into the last stitch of the previous round (= corner stitch). Continue along the side as follows: crochet rounds of sc, but skip every 4th round (so 3 sc, skip 1 sc), then for the border at the bottom, crochet 3 sc into the 1st stitch, 254 sc and 3 sc into the last stitch. Crochet the other border the same way, but for the 1st stitch,

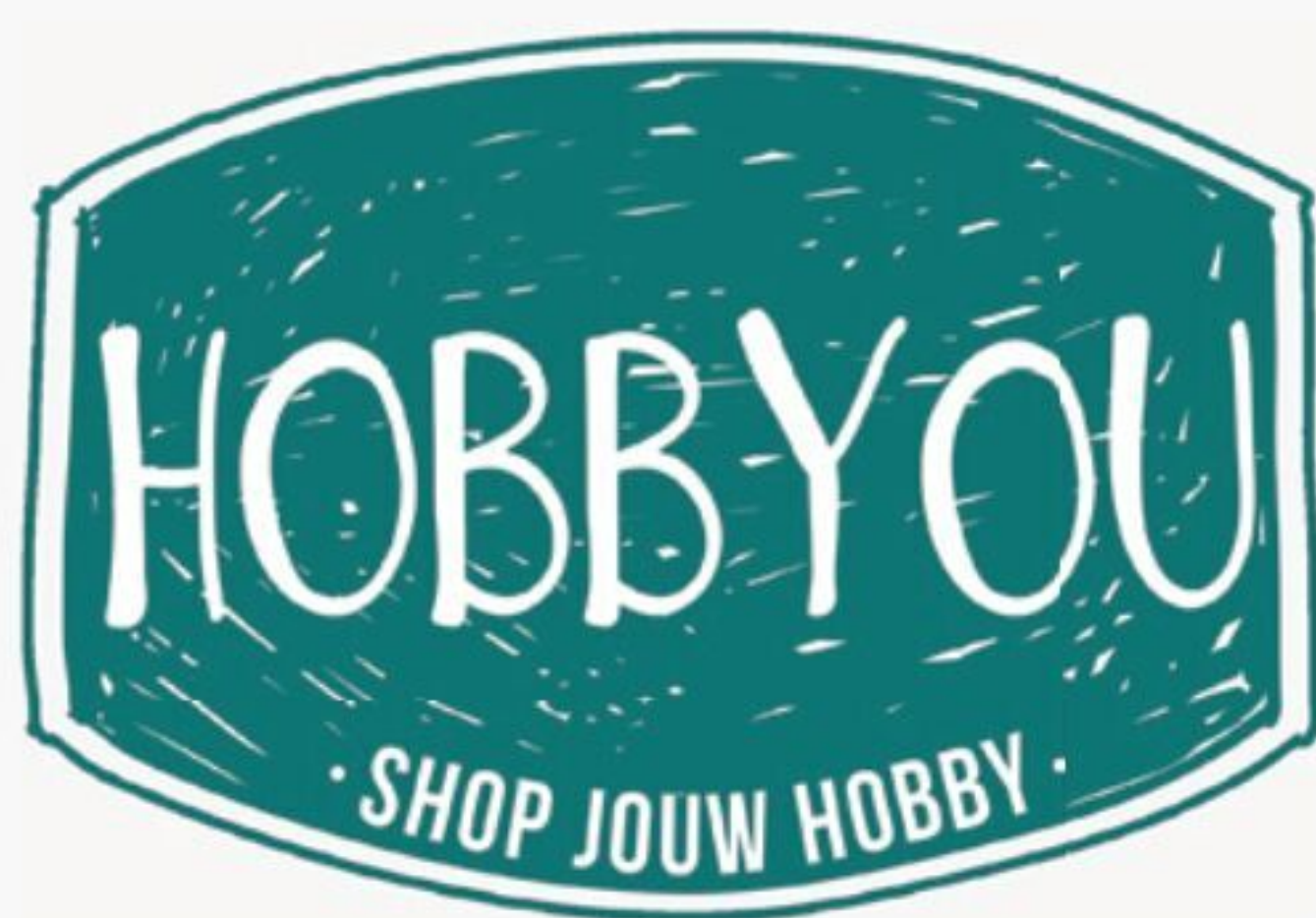
crochet another 2 sc into the same stitch. Next, crochet another 2 rounds of sc, but for every corner, work 3 sc per stitch into the middle corner stitch. Make sure to have at least half a ball of yarn left when reaching the last round, otherwise attach a new ball. Crochet 1 round with the lobster stitch (a single crochet stitch but instead crochet in reverse, from left to right) with the 4 mm crochet hook and do not inc in the corners.

FINISHING

Block the rug, lay down the Stopp filt anti slip and place the rug on top. If the measurements are different from the rug, cut off the excess edges. Secure it together along the edges. •

ALL YOUR CROCHET PROJECTS IN YOUR POCKET

Meet **Nienke**: an enthusiastic crocheter who dreamed of having her own app. Together with her husband Rick, she developed the **Pocket Crochet app**. Of course, we wanted to know more about that!



TIPPING POINT

"I've always had many creative hobbies. I didn't learn to crochet until late in life and I find that quite unfortunate. Because the longer you crochet, the more you learn! Personally, the arrival of our children got me into crocheting clothes. I love Vila's patterns from Mon Petit Violon and I recently started crocheting sweaters

for myself. A blanket or a scarf is often not that difficult, but with garments you really have to pay attention. Nothing is more annoying than at a crucial moment forgetting what crochet hook I was using, what exact round I was on, or what yarn I was using. Although I used to prefer not to use my phone while crocheting, it wasn't until recently I realized that having that very phone with me at all times could allow me to quickly register the details of my crochet work."

FROM DREAM TO APP

"Once on the hunt for a useful app, I found all the existing apps disappointing. Too expensive, too clunky or simply not beautiful enough. My husband and I have built two apps before. He did the technical part and I did the design, marketing and communication. And so I began to dream about having my own app. When I suggested it to my husband Rick, he was immediately excited and we started making designs. The moment the app was live in the app stores of both Android and iOS, I was a bit anxious. Fortunately, it has been very well received, and we are very happy with all the positive feedback! Also with the critical ones, by the way, as this allows us to pick up on flaws and wishes quickly to improve the app. In the app itself you can add projects and one or more patterns, and you can make notes. You can add all the details around a project. For fields we haven't thought of yet, you can use an empty note field. The row counters are placed on top of a pattern. You can zoom in on your crochet pattern, count rows, and even zoom in on the row counters themselves. Ideal for when you're enjoying Netflix, but the buttons are just too small to click on. We are still working out new ideas for the app."

INSPIRE TOGETHER

"Personally, I get a lot of inspiration from magazines, Instagram and the Internet in general for patterns, use of color and



ideas. We have built into the app an possibility to add separate images of pictures you like in a project as well. That way you can capture your inspiration and add it to your (future) crochet project too! One of the things I love about crocheting is the community. Instagram, in particular, is a perfect medium for this, with all those pretty pictures with beautiful colors. Sometimes I can stare at it for such a long time that I forget to crochet. So much inspiration and beauty I find there. We also wanted to give that community a place in the app. We decided to launch the app with three free patterns, including the beautiful My Precious sweater by Catalina Ungureanu.” •

With this sweater you can do plenty of variations. The model is wearing the oversized sweater (size 50-52) and with the longest part in the front.

1 BASIC PATTERN, 2 VARIATIONS

SWEATER Melodie



These sweaters are wonderful to “live in”. You use the same basic pattern for both color variations, except for color Clay, you vary with a longer back and cut. These sweaters are also great for plus sizes.

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Scheepjes Softfun yarn:
9 balls of Clay 2431 and/or
Pine 2643 for size 36/38 (add
1 ball per size)
- 5.5 or 6.5 and 3.5 mm crochet
hook
- Stitch markers
- Blunt needle
- Scissors
- Tape measure

Yarn from Scheepjes.com

- number of chains used
- how many rounds without increases you
have crocheted
- how many increases in total you
crocheted
- how many rounds for the sleeve you
have crocheted
- how many rounds of post stitches you
have crocheting for the sleeve

FRONT PANEL

Start with an even number of ch as you measured above. Write down the number of ch used.

Rnd 1: 1 sc into the 2nd ch from the hook. Rep until to end of the round (1 ch, skip 1 ch, 1 sc in the next stitch).

Rnd 2: 1 ch, turn the work, 1 sc in the 1st stitch. Rep until the end of the round (1 ch, skip 1 ch, 1 sc in the next sc).

Rnd 3: Rep Rnd 2 until the right length of the front panel. Because you divided the size by 2, the front and back panel are the same size. Inc, if necessary, in the front and back as follows:

Rnd 4: 1 ch, turn the work, 1 sc, 1 ch, 1 sc in the 1st stitch, 1 ch, skip 1 ch. Rep (1 sc in the next sc, 1 ch, skip 1 ch) until the last stitch. Crochet 1 sc, 1 ch, 1 ch in the last stitch.

Rnd 5: rep Rnd 2 about 9 rounds. Rep Rnd 4 and Rnd 5 as desired. Please note: 1 inc is x 2, because for the back, increases also have to be made on this point.

TIP!

CROCHET VERY LOOSELY, WHICH MAKES THE SWEATER SUPER STRETCHY AND SOFT.

BACK PANEL

Crochet the 1st part of the back panel the same way as the front panel (see the notes you’ve made for the number of rounds, stitches and increases). Now decide what you want: a longer back panel or not, cut or no cut. The sweater in color Clay has a cut and an extended back panel. In doing so, a total of 12 more rounds were crocheted on the back panel than on the front panel. If you want a cut and or extension, place a stitch marker at the point where the cut or extension starts. This is for assembling the sweater. The sweater in color Pine remained the same and has no cut. Continue to crochet Rnd 2 for an extended back panel.

DIAGONAL EDGES ON BACK PANEL

Decrease about 12 rounds on each side of the back panel.

Rnd 6: 1 ch, turn the work, sc2tog over >>

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

Crochet the sweater in sections that will later be sewn together connecting the right sides together. The pattern is suitable for both beginning and advanced crocheters and can be made in all sizes. The sweater in color Clay is dress size 50/52, and is worn by the model as a short dress and with the back in the front, and the size in color Pine is 36/38. Crochet the basic pattern and finish it to your liking: cut or no cut, ribbed edge or not.

SWEATER

First, measure the widest point of your hips and for plus sizes, the bust size as well. Divide by 2 and write this down. Always write down the following:



the 1st 2 sc (so while tog skip the ch in between the 2 sc), 1 ch, skip 1 ch, rep (1 sc in the next sc, 1 ch, skip 1 ch) until the last 3 stitches, sc2tog over the last 2 sc (so while tog skip the ch in between the 2 sc).

Rnd 7: Rep Rnd 6 11 more time. Fasten off and weave in ends.

ASSEMBLING THE BODY

Take an extra long thread for sewing the body closed. You will need the remaining thread later to sew the sleeves closed. Place the two parts with the right sides

facing each other. Measure your upper arm and add about 5 cm. Divide by 2 and mark this part of the armholes, see the red lines in drawing 1. Sew the side seams closed from bottom to top, see blue arrows/sewing direction in drawing 2. Also, stitch the shoulder seams closed as far as you like.

SLEEVE (2 X)

Crochet the sleeves as a flat, long piece to the desired length. Sew them closed. Next, start with the border.

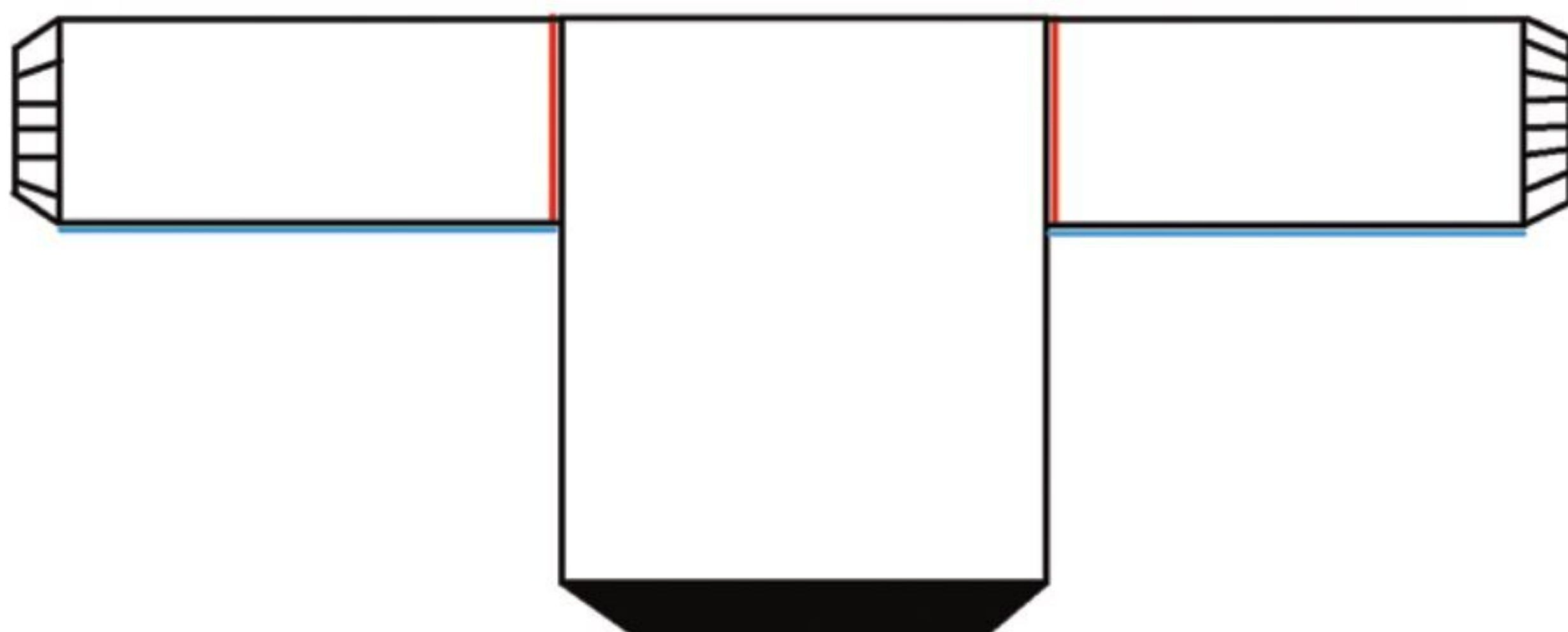
Rnd 8: Attach to the armpit. Crochet 1 sc, *1 ch, skip 1 stitch, 1 sc in the next stitch (note: you are not crocheting in a sc, but in the sides of the rounds. Skip 1 round by 'skip 1 stitch')*. Rep from *to* until you get back to the beginning of this round.

The last sc should join the 1st sc in the same stitch. Make sure to work with an even number of sc.

Rnd 9: Rep Rnd 2 until the length of the sleeve is reached. Don't fasten off if you want to crochet another border. Write down the number of rounds you have crocheted. Turn the work inside out and sew the sleeve closed using the thread from the side seam.

DIAGRAM 1

Sewing directions sleeves



SLEEVE WITH RIBBED CUFFS

Crochet with 3.5 or 4.5 mm crochet hook.

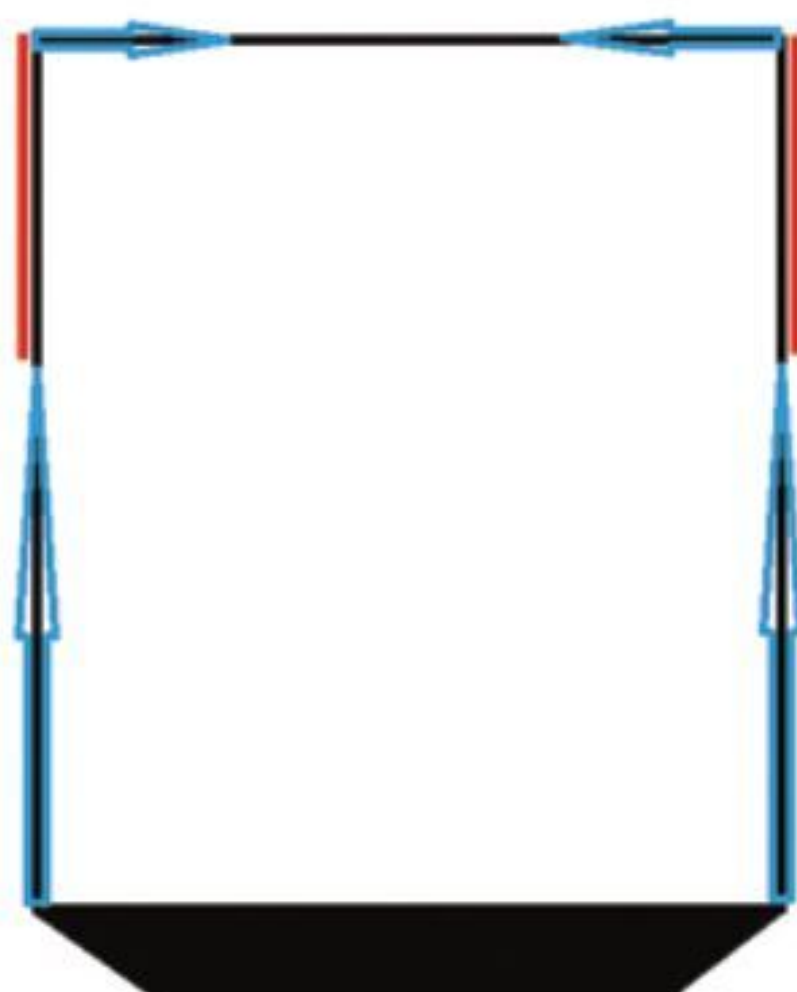
Rnd 10: 1 ch, 1 dc in all sc. Join with 1 sl st in the 1st ch.

Rnd 11: Let the thread slightly loose and immediately crochet 1 FPdc around the 1st dc, 1 BPdc around the next dc, rep (1 FPdc around the next dc, 1 BPdc around the next dc) until the end. Crochet 1 sl st into the 1st stitch.

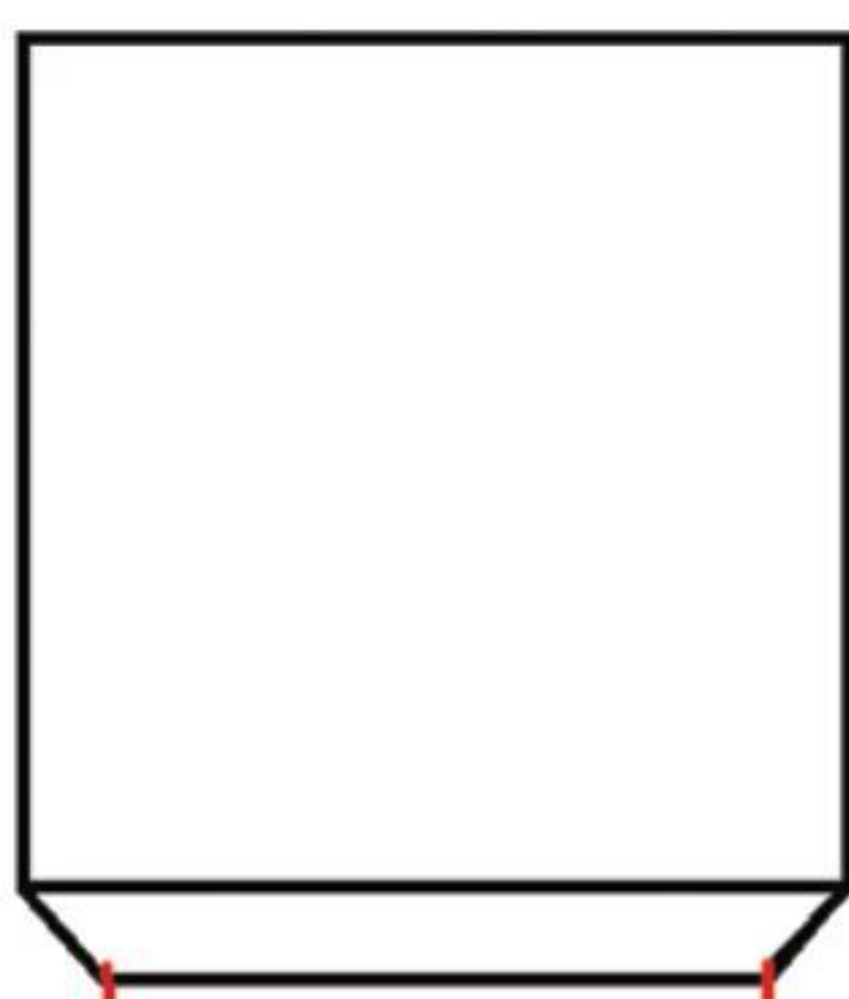
Rnd 12: Let the thread slightly loose. Rep (1 FPdc around the FPdc, 1 BPdc around the BPdc) until the end. Crochet 1 sl st into the 1st stitch.

DRAWINGS 2, 3 AND 4

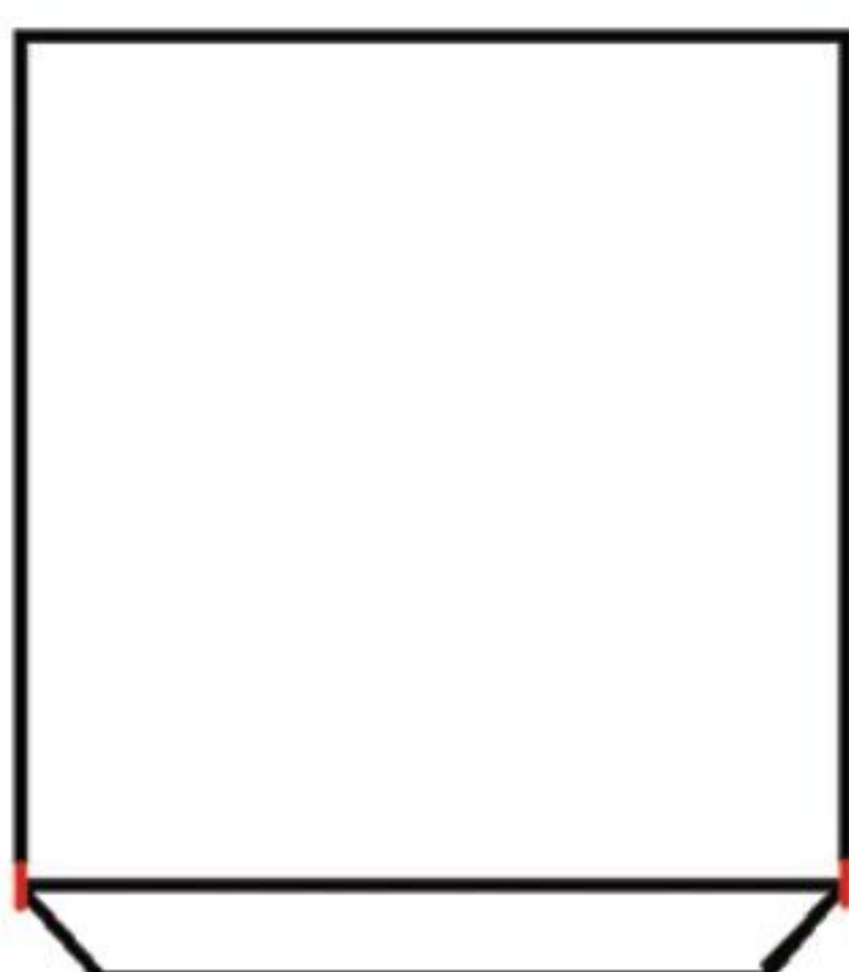

Rnd 13: Rep Rnd 12 as many times as you like.

BORDER AT BOTTOM OF SWEATER WITHOUT SPLIT

Continue to crochet with the 3.5 or 4.5 mm crochet hook.

Rnd 14: attach to side seams, crochet 1 dc in all stitches. Make sure you finish with an even number of stitches.

Rnd 15: rep Rnd 11.

Rnd 16: rep Rnd 12.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

BORDER SWEATER WITH CUT

Attach to the corner of the back panel (see red line on drawing 3).

Rnd 17: 1 sc in all stitches between the red lines.

Rnd 18: 1 ch turn the work, sc2tog in the 1st 2 stitches, 1 sc in all stitches until 2 stitches before the red line, sc2tog over the last 2 stitches.

Rnd 19: Rep Rnd 18 as desired. Fasten off and weave in ends. Attach to the corner of the front panel (see red lines on drawing 4)

Rnd 20: 1 sc in all stitches between the red lines.

Rnd 21: 1 ch, turn the work, 1 sc in all stitches between the red lines.

Rnd 22: Rep Rnd 21 as desired. Fasten off and weave in ends. •

LEAF 1 (2 X)

Turn at the end of each row.

Rnd 1: Make a MR and work 2 sc into the MR (= 2).

Rnd 3: 2 sc in 1 sc, 2 sc, 2 sc in 1 sc (= 6).

Rnd 4 and 5: 6 sc.

Rnd 6: sc2tog, 2 sc, sc2tog (= 4).

Rnd 7: 2 x sc2tog. Fasten off, leaving a long tail.



LEAF 2 (2 X)

Rnd 1: Make a MR and work 2 sc into the MR (= 2).

Rnd 2: 2 x 2 sc in 1 sc (= 4).

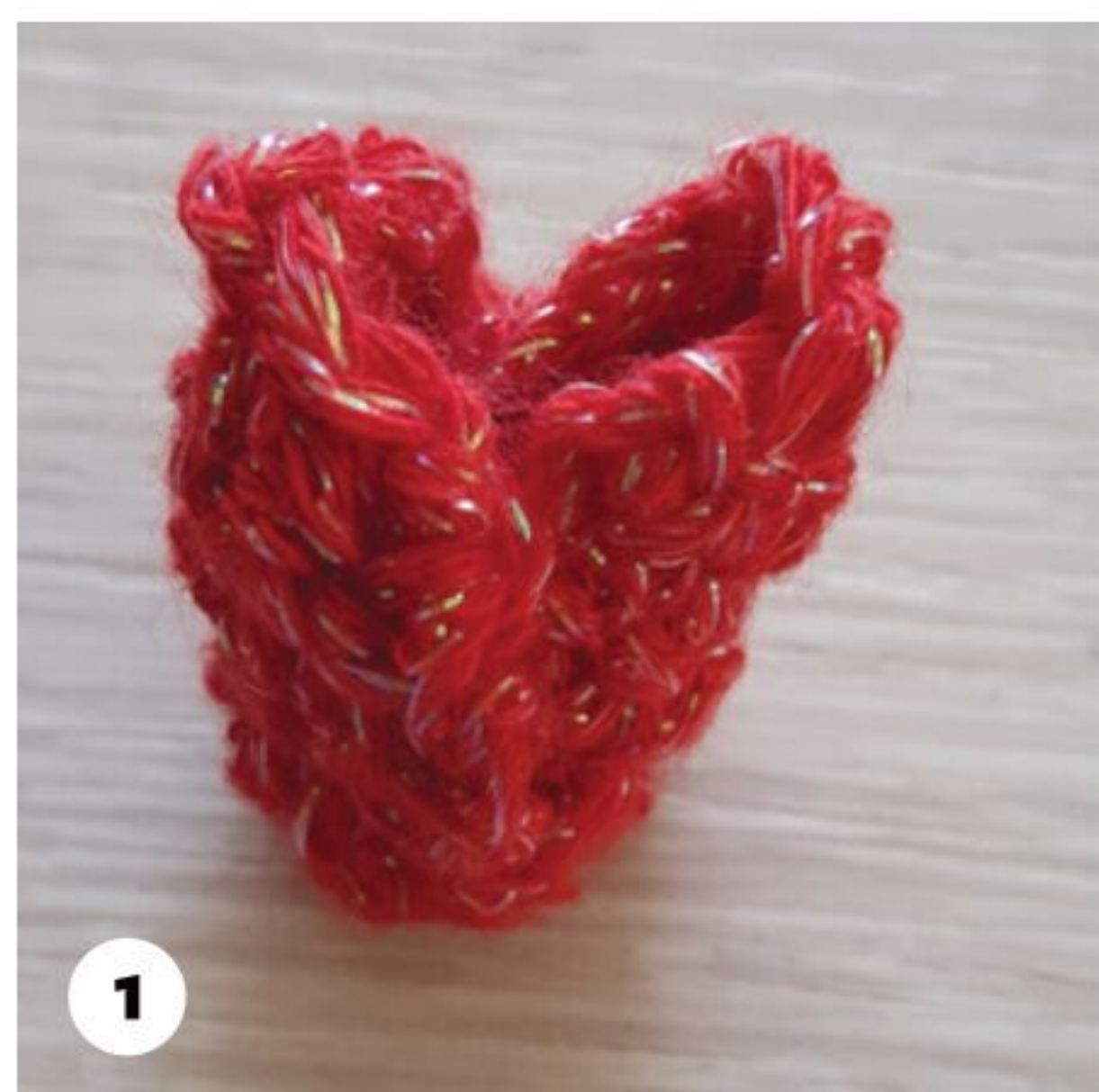
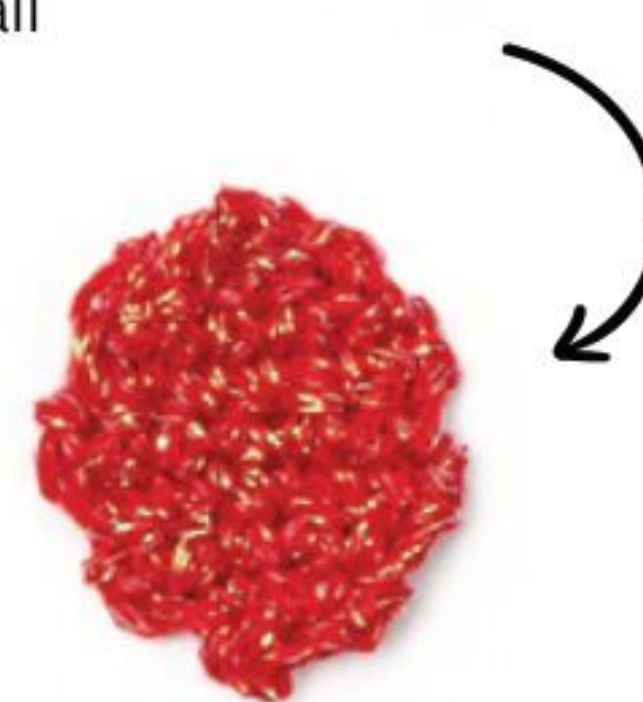
Rnd 3: 2 sc in 1 sc, rep 2 x (1 sc in 1 sc, 2 sc in 1 sc) (= 6).

Rnd 4-6: 6 sc.

LEAF 3 (2 X)

Rnd 1: Make a MR and work 2 sc into the MR (= 2).

Rnd 2: 2 x (2 sc in 1 sc) (= 4).

Rnd 3: 2 sc in 1 sc, 2 sc, 2 sc in 1 sc (= 6).

Rnd 4: 6 sc.

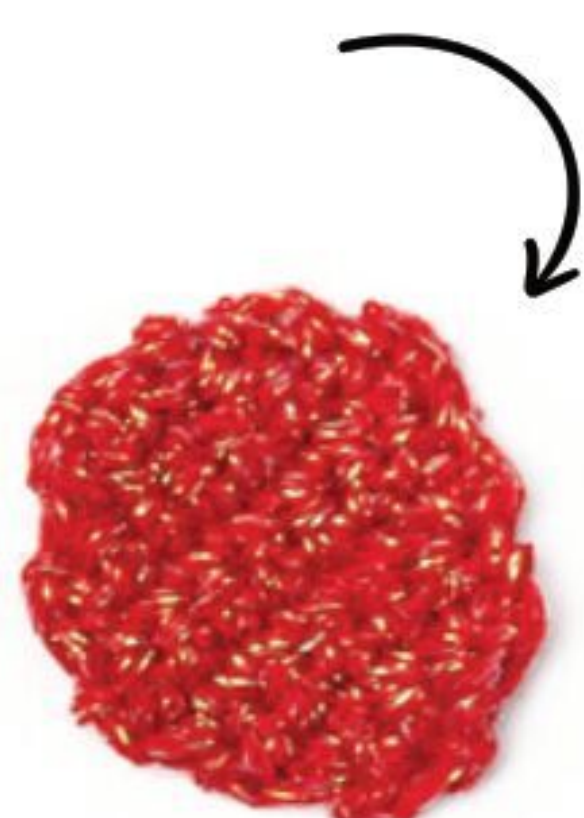
Rnd 5: 2 sc in 1 sc, 4 sc, 2 sc in 1 sc (= 8).

Rnd 6 and 7: 8 sc.

Rnd 8: sc2tog, 4 sc, sc2tog (= 6).

Rnd 9: sc2tog, 2 sc, sc2tog (= 4).

Rnd 10: 2 x sc2tog. Fasten off, leaving a long tail.



LEAF 4 (2 X)

Rnd 1: Make a MR and work 2 sc into the MR (= 2).

Rnd 2: 2 x (2 sc in 1 sc) (= 4).

Rnd 3: 2 sc in 1 sc, 2 sc, 2 sc in 1 sc (= 6).

Rnd 4: 6 sc.

Rnd 5: 2 sc in 1 sc, 4 sc, 2 sc in 1 sc (= 8).

Rnd 6-8: 8 sc.

Rnd 9: sc2tog, 4 sc, sc2tog (= 6).

Rnd 10: sc2tog, 2 sc, sc2tog (= 4).

Rnd 11: 2 x sc2tog. Fasten off, leaving a long tail.



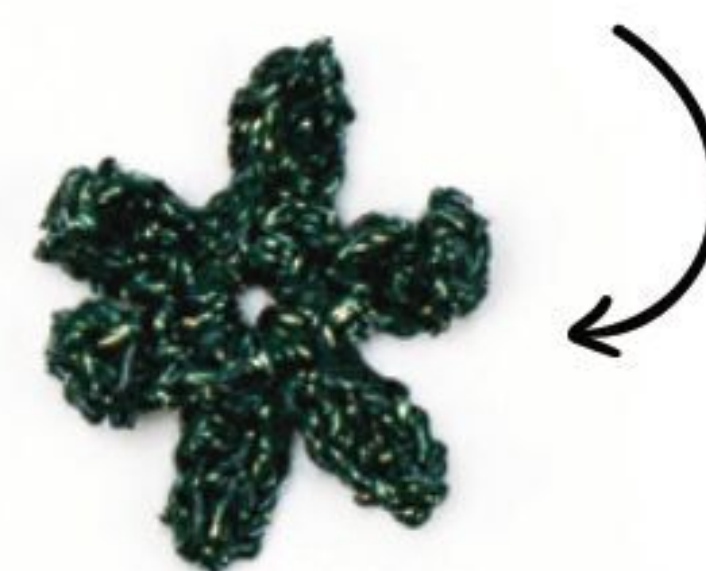
SEWING TOGETHER

Start with the smallest leaves and finish with the largest. Sew them together alternately from the center down, and don't sew too loosely. Let the largest leaves show on top and curl them a bit (1-3).

SEPAL UNDER THE ROSE

Rnd 1: Crochet 5 ch, join with 1 sl st to make a ring.

Rnd 2: 1 sc into the ring, 5 ch, 1 sc into the 2nd ch from the hook, 2 hdc in 1 ch, 1 sc in the last ch. Rep this row 5 more times.



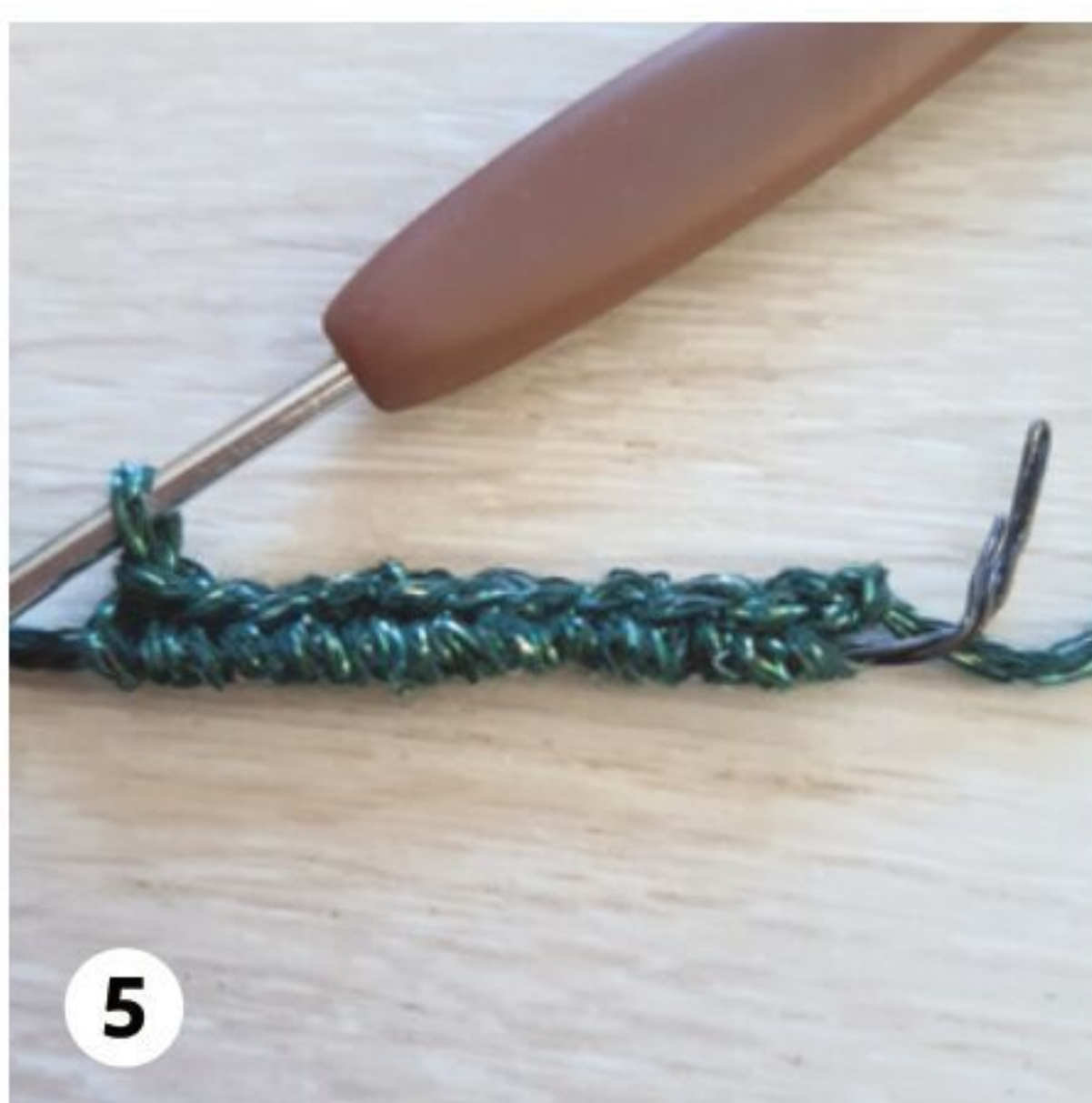
LEAF (2 X)

Cut the florist wire at 21 cm. Bend it into 3 parts of 7 cm and pinch the ends firmly together (4).

Rnd 1: Crochet 10 sc around the wire (5).

Rnd 2: Crochet in the back loops: 2 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 hdc, 2 sc, 1 hdc, 2 sc, 1 ch. Go to the other side of the loops and crochet this round again.

Rnd 3: Crochet around 1 sc in every stitch and at beginning and end, crochet 1 ch in between. Bend the wire at the top and bend the other wire around the stem.



STEM

For the stem, cut 36 cm and bend the top piece. Wrap floral tape around it and also around the entire stem. Slide the rose and sepals onto it. Wrap florist wire under the sepals a few more times. Make some parts of the stem a bit thicker by making some bumps with tape. Twist the iron wire of the leaf around it and cover the stem further with tape. Bend the bottom. Place the rose under a bell jar or in a vase. •

PRETTY OWL

An owl in a weck jar: very cute as a home decoration, but also as a gift. Make a loop for it and you can hang it in your Christmas tree!

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Scheepjes Maxi Sweet treat yarn: Rugby 517, Dark Teal 401 and scraps of Snow White 106, Pale Peach 523, Black 110, Old Lace 130, Red 722, Forest Green 412, Old Rosa 408 and Ginger Gold 383
- 0.75 mm of 1 mm crochet hook
- Fiberfill stuffing
- Translucent sewing thread DecoBob grey 113
- Fine quilting needle
- Wool needle
- Pins
- Scissors
- Merino fleece: 10 g of colors kiwi 414, coconut brown 617
- Weck jar of 8 cm Ø and about 10 cm tall (Xenos)
- Wooden skewer
- 1 or 3 Beads: Toho Beads light gold round and red round (Lenianel)

Yarn from Scheepjes.com

Rnd 24-35: 1 sc into 1 sc, join with 1 tch.

Rnd 36: 2 ch, 4 dc, 8 sc, 2 ch, 4 dc.

Rnd 37: 2 ch, 2 dc, 8 sc, 2 ch, 2 dc. Look at the diagram for Rnd 36 and Rnd 37. Fasten off and weave in ends (1).

BELLY

Rnd 1: crochet 12 ch + 1 tch with Old Lace.

Rnd 2-15: 1 sc into 1 sc, join with 1 tch.

Rnd 16: 1 ch, 3 sc, 6 dc, 3 sc, 1 ch.

Rnd 17: 3 sc, 6 dc, 3 sc.

Look at the diagram for Rnd 16 and Rnd 17. Fasten off and weave in ends (2).

EYES

See the diagram. The eyes consist of 3 layers: the bottom one is white, the middle one Pale Peach and the top one (= pupil) is black. Look at the diagram for Rnd 16 and Rnd 17.

Rnd 1: Make a MR with white and work 7 sc into the MR. Join with 1 sl st in the 1st sc.

Rnd 2: 1 ch, 7 sc, join with 1 sl st.

Rnd 3: 1 ch, 2 sc into 1 sc (= 14 sc). Join with 1 sl st in the 1st ch.

Rnd 4: as Rnd 3 (= 28 sc).

Join with 1 sl st.

Fasten off. Weave in 1 thread, leaving the other attached. For the middle layer, crochet Rnd 1-3 with Pale Peach. For the top layer, crochet Rnd 1 and 2 with black. In layers 2 and 3, weave in ends (3).

BEAK

See the diagram.

Rnd 1: crochet 6 ch with Ginger Gold.

Rnd 2: Skip 1 ch, 1 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st, 1 ch, turn the work and crochet the opposite: 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 1 dc, 1 dc. Cut the thread at 15 cm and leave both threads (4). >>

TIP! IF YOU WANT A LARGER OWL, CROCHET WITH CROCHET COTTON AND A 2.5 MM CROCHET HOOK, THEN THE OWL WILL BE TWICE AS TALL.

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

The owl is 9 cm tall and 4.5 cm wide. In the diagrams, a ► indicates the beginning.

BODY (2 X)

The front and back of the body are the same.

Rnd 1: with Ruby, crochet 18 ch and 1 tch.

Rnd 2-22: 1 sc into every sc, 1 tch. Change to Dark Teal.

Rnd 23: 1 sc into 1 sc, 1 sc into the round before the previous round. Rep and join with 1 tch.





FEET (2 X)

See the diagram.

Rnd 1: Make a MR and work 7 sc into the MR. Join with 1 sl st in the 1st sc.

Rnd 2: *7 ch, crochet from the 6th ch 6 sc into 1 ch, 1 sc in the next sc (of the MR)*, rep from *to* another 2 times, 3 sc (onto the MR), 6 ch, crochet from the 5th ch 5 sc into 1 ch, 3 sc (onto the MR). Join with 1 sl st. You now have 3 toes in the front and 1 mid-back. Fasten off 1 thread, leaving the other attached. Crochet another one **(5)**.

SEWING TOGETHER

Use a thread from DecoBob and a fine needle. Pin and sew the belly with small stitches onto the center of the Dark Teal part of the front panel/body. Do this from the bottom right and then continue counterclockwise to bottom left. Put a little stuffing between the belly and the front panel. Sew the belly closed with the DecoBob **(6)**.

EYES

Insert the white wire through layers 2 and 3. Pull tight and make a French knot on the black pupil by wrapping the thread around the needle twice (see the how-to video on ansjelinadesign.blog). Work the thread down through the 3 layers. Determine the spot for the eye

on the Ruby part and insert the needle through it, to the back of the front panel. Fasten off and break yarn. Rep with the other eye. Next, using DecoBob, attach the white layer with small stitches and then work the thread one more time through the black and pink layer. Weave in ends.

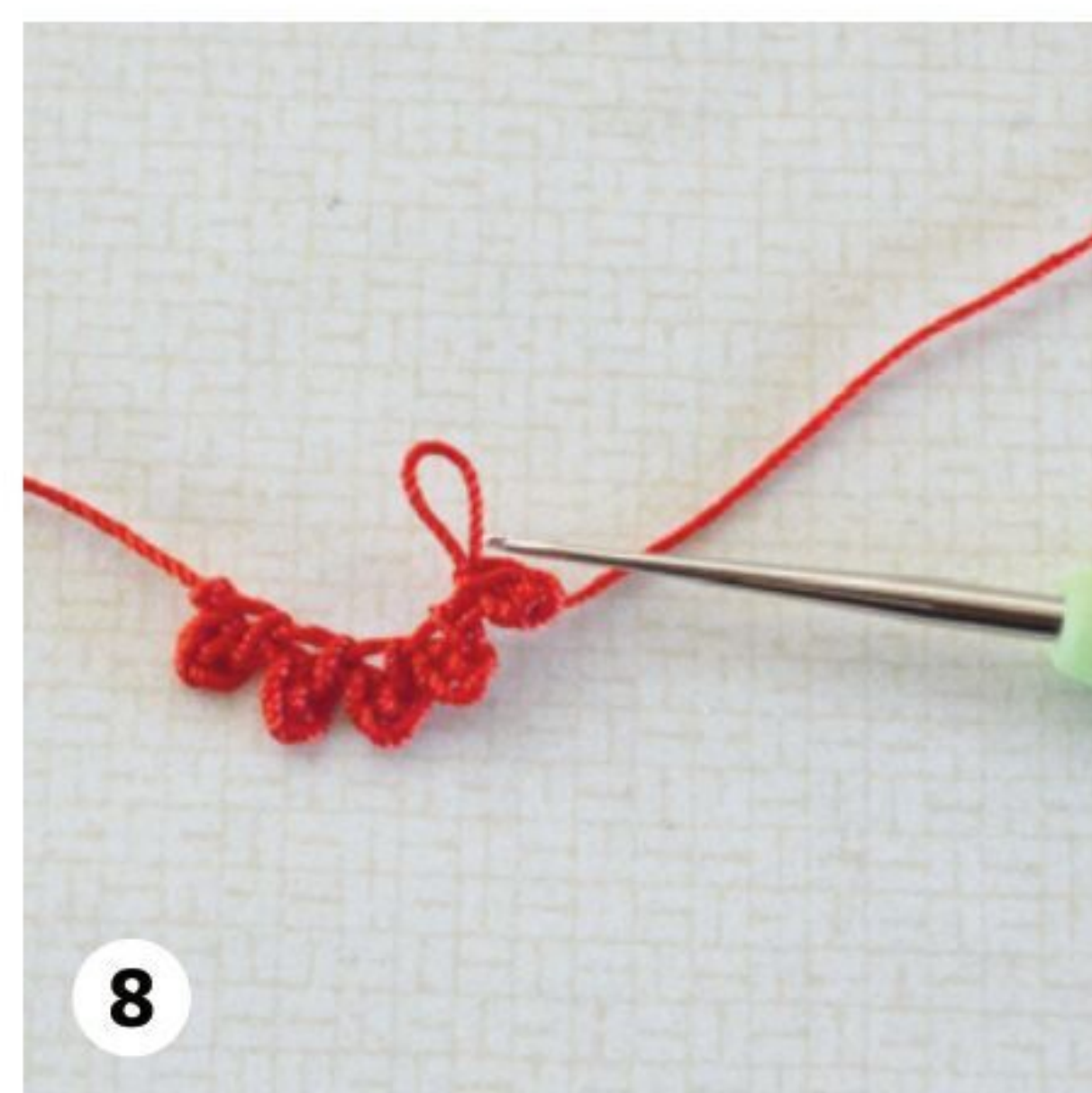
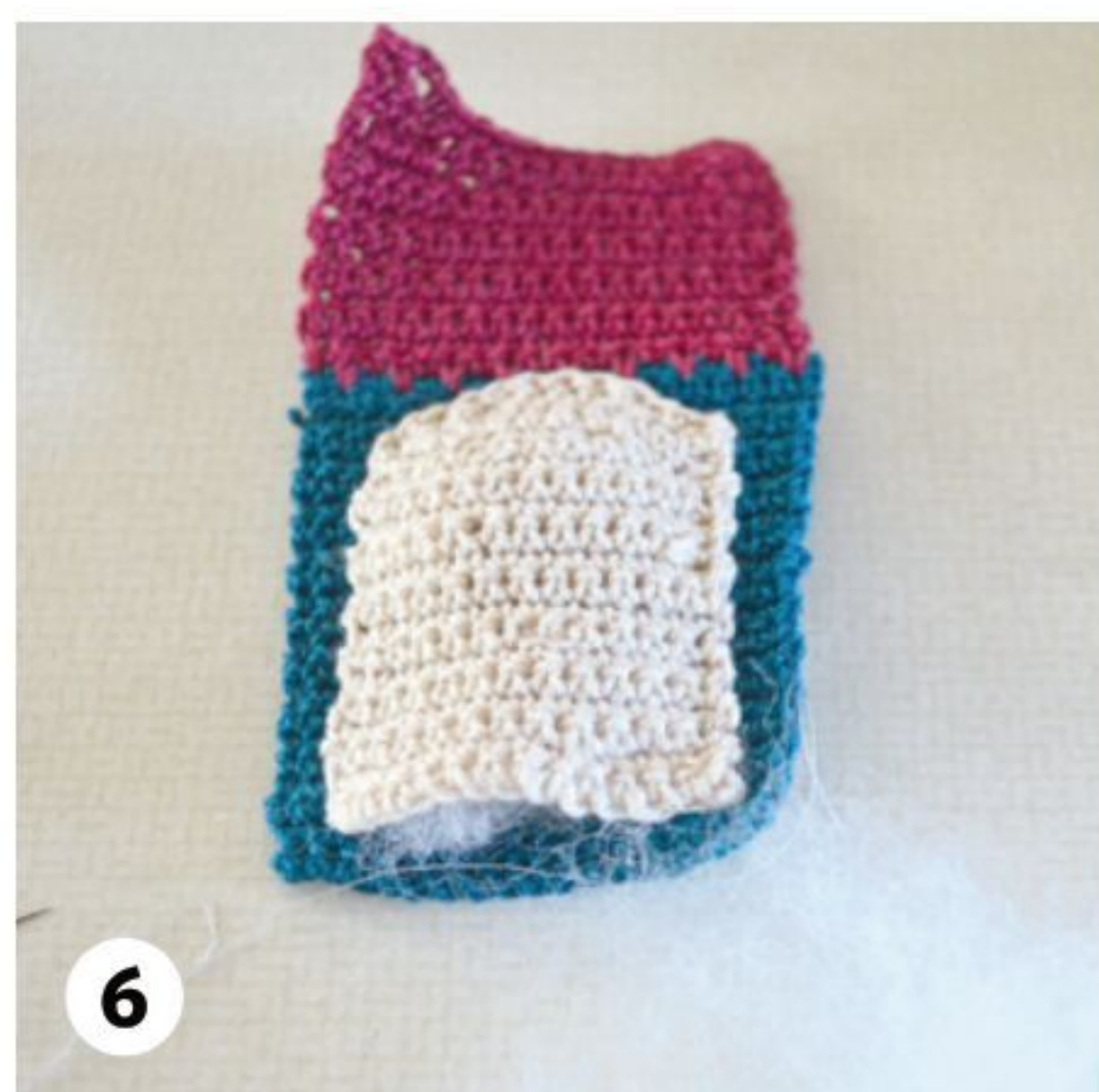
BEAK

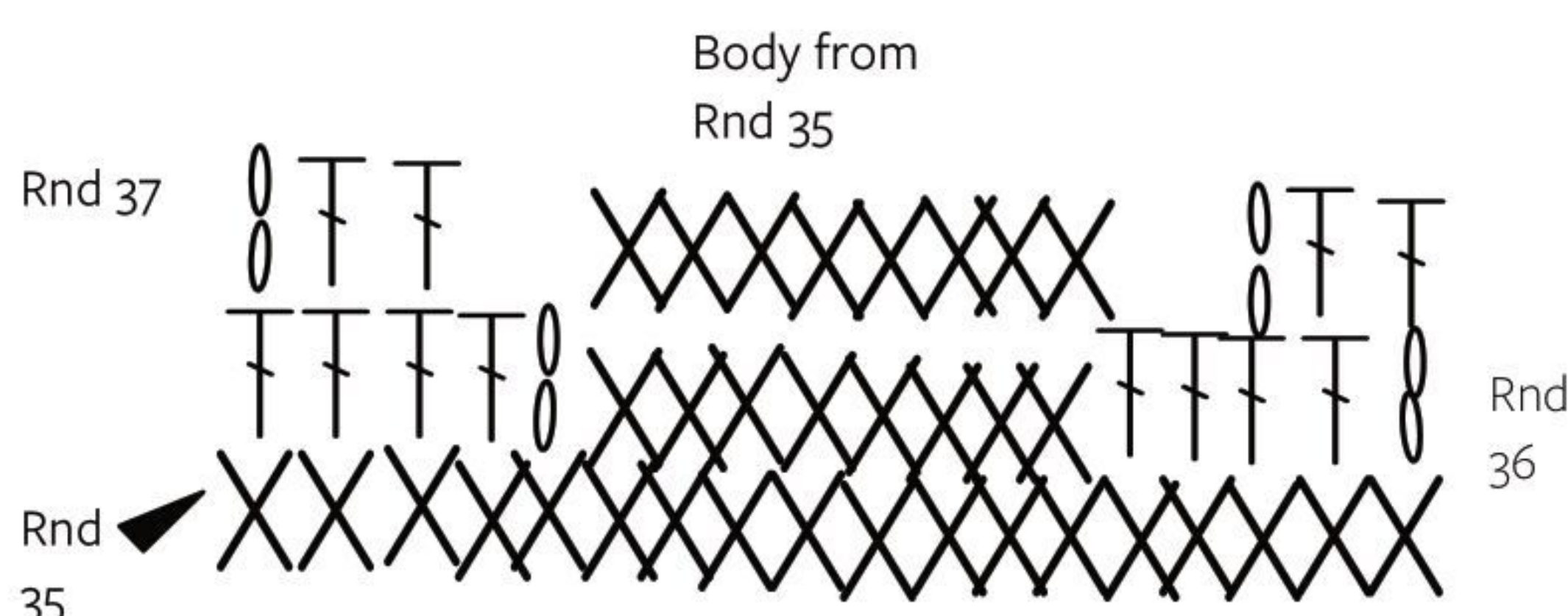
Attach the beak between/under the eyes. Insert the needle with thread to the back

and fasten off. Rep with the 2nd thread at the adjacent corner, with the tip of the beak pointing down. Place the back panel against the inside of the front panel. Pin and sew these 2 parts together with DecoBob and small stitches **(7)**.

EARS, BODY AND LEGS

Do not stuff the body too firmly. Start with stuffing the ears. Once these are in place, continue with small tufts. Don't stuff too tightly for a nice result. Sew the

bottom of the body closed. Pin the 2 legs to the bottom of the body and sew them on with small stitches.

FLOWERS AND LEAVES

Crochet a minimum of 15 flowers in different colors. Here, we have used 6 groups of 3 flowers with 1 green leaf.

FLOWER

Rnd 1: rep 5 x (4 ch, 1 sl st in the 1st ch) (= 5 small petals). Rotate the work (do not turn), 1 sl st at the bottom of petal 4, 3, 2 and 1. Rotate the work and close with 1 sl st at the bottom of petal 5 (8).

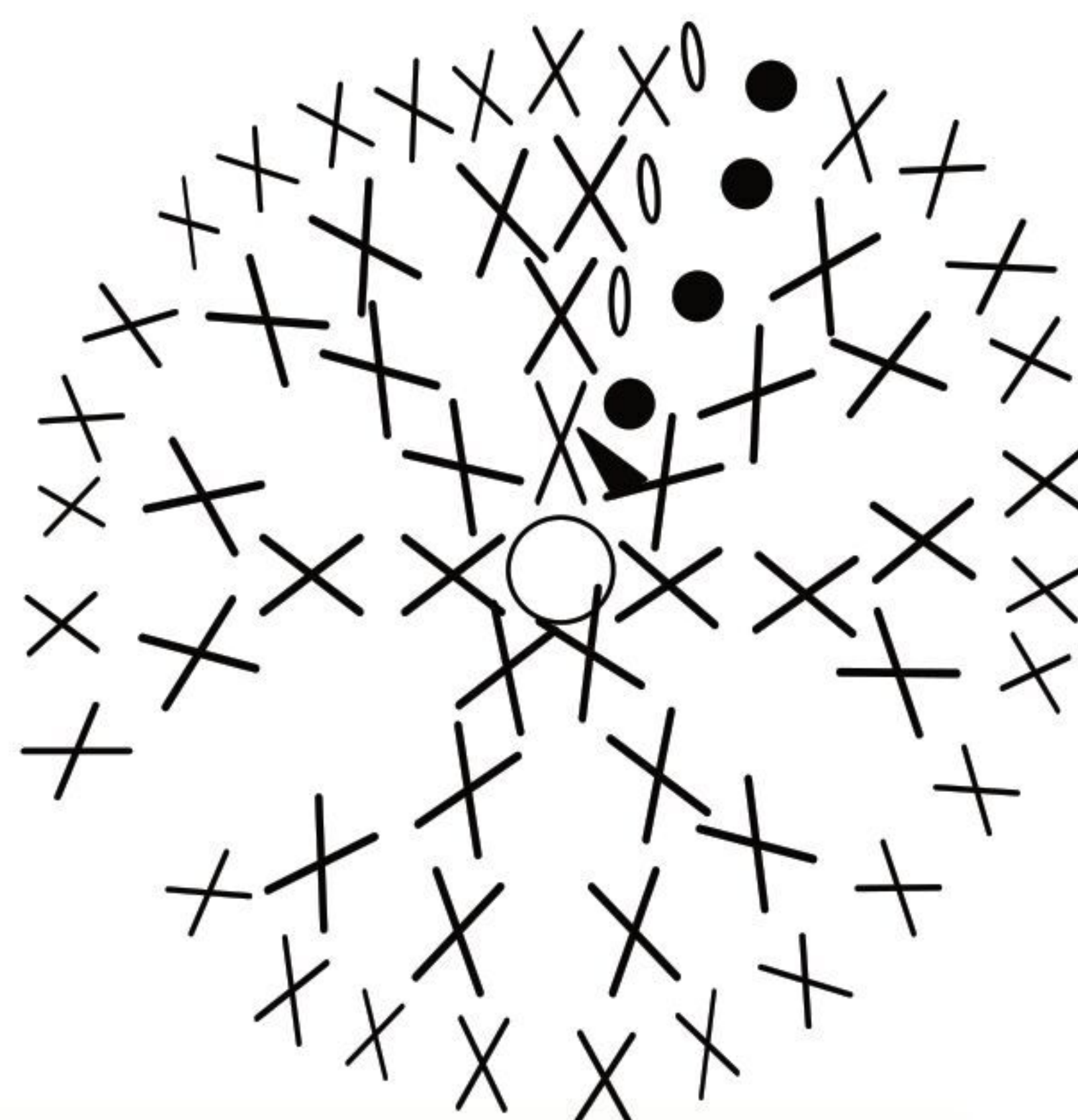
Cut the threads, leaving a long tail for both. Insert 1 thread in the wool needle. Insert through the center of 1 flower: from the bottom of the heart of the flower to the top. Thread 1 or 3 beads on them (red ones on the white and pink flowers and the gold beads on the red flowers). Insert the thread back through the eye of the needle. Rep this with all the flowers.

HOLLY LEAVES (6 X)

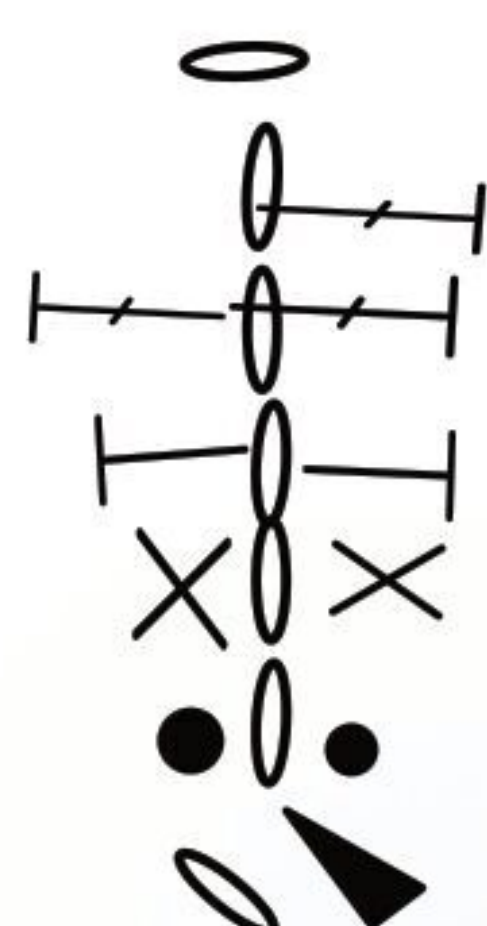
Crochet 2 leaves with Forest Green and 4 with Dark Teal.

Rnd 1: crochet 7 ch in the 4th ch, 1 sl st, 6 ch in the 3rd ch, 1 sl st, rep 3 x (2 ch in the 1st ch, 1 sl st). Crochet from here in reverse: 2 dc between the 2nd >>

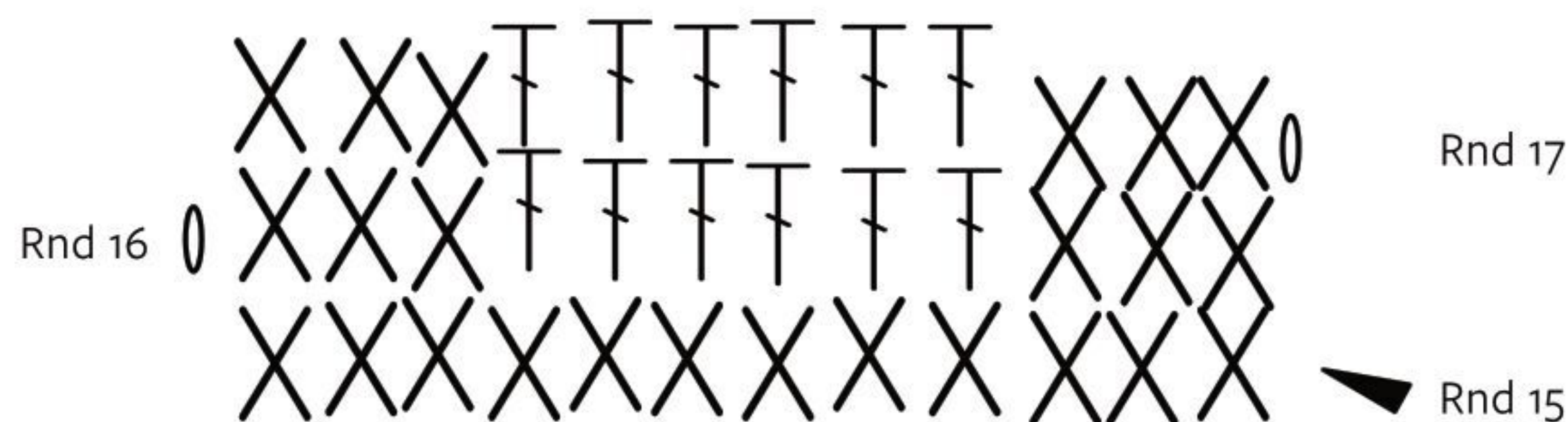

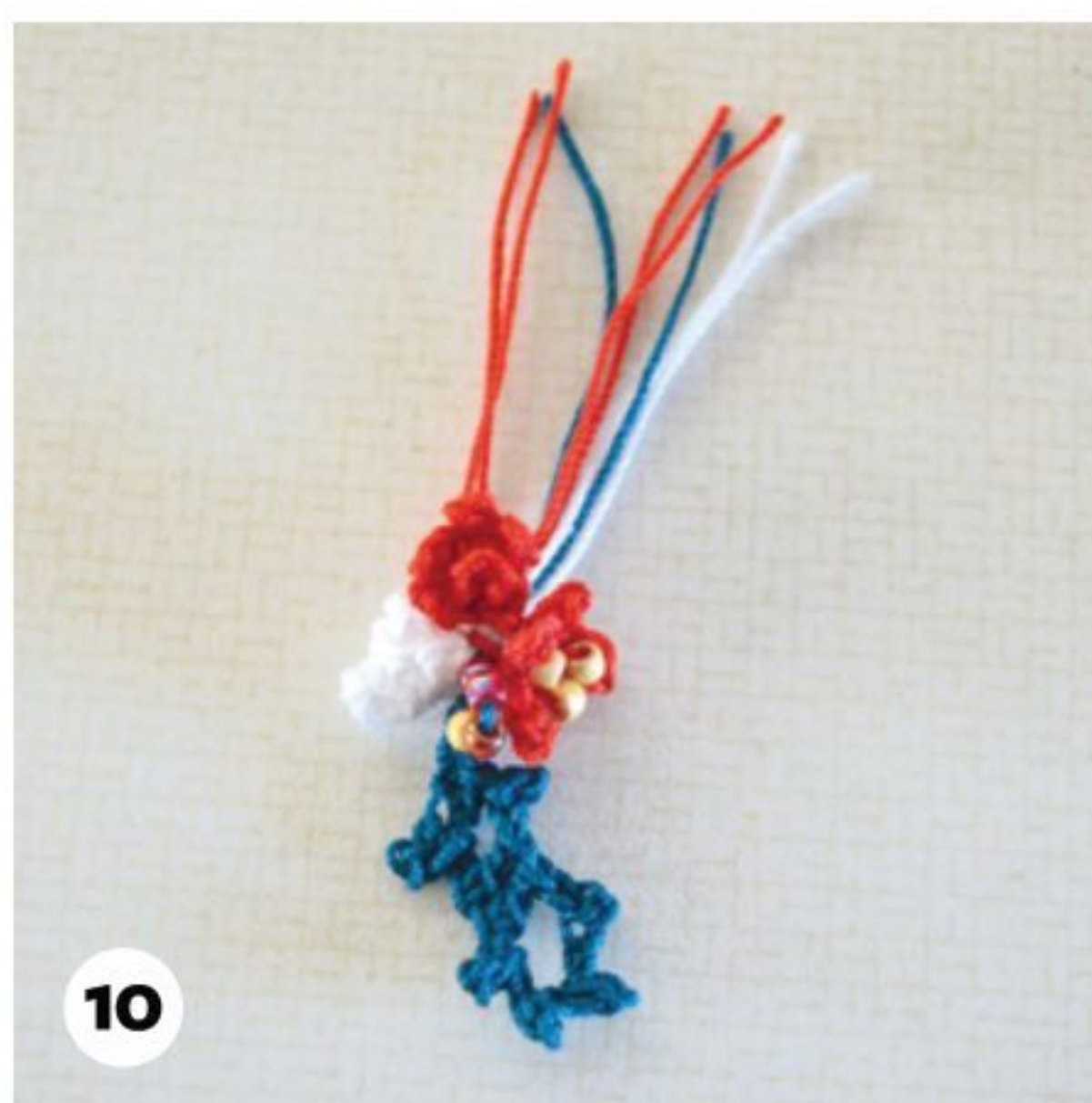


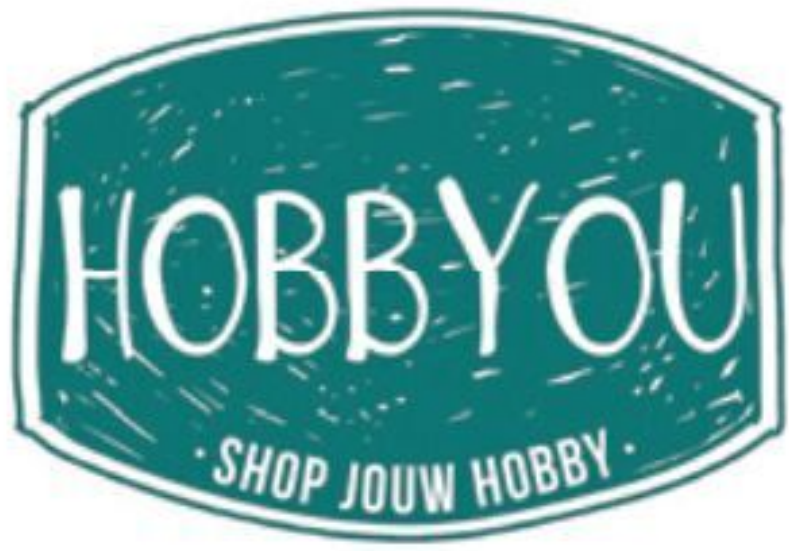
and 3rd "tip" counted from the beginning, 3 ch, 1 sc in the 1st ch, 1 dc next to the 1st "tip" in the next ch, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 sl st. Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Crochet a minimum of 5 leaves. Make a group of 1 red and 1 white flower with 2 green holly leaves (9). Make a tight knot by wrapping 2 wires around all the threads. Cut the threads evenly at 2 cm (10). Sew this group at the bottom left of the belly with DecoBob. Have 1 leaf pointing to the left and 1 leaf pointing to the right and sew on some extra beads if need be.

WECK JAR

Loosely fill three-quarters of the jar with brown Merino wool. Put some green wool on top, followed by a thin layer of brown. Don't use force. Cut the skewer at about 14 cm and carefully insert it into the owl, from the bottom to about the head. Let it stick out a bit, the rest of the skewer is sticking out from the bottom. Push this gently into the wool. Place the owl with its legs in the middle of the wool, close the lid halfway until it 'sticks' on the skewer. Make 4 more groups of 3 flowers and 1 holly leaf. Attach 1 near the closure at the bottom, 1 slightly to the side at the front and 2 side by side at the top of the lid closure. Tie them securely and then cut the threads to the desired length. ●

WARM BABY FEET

BABY SLIPPERS

Walking with your baby in the winter cold? Go ahead and crochet these super cute and practical slippers, as they will keep your child's feet nice and warm all winter long.



WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Scheepjes Eliza yarn: 218 Bobtail White 218, less than ½ ball, (color A), Cornflower 216, less than ½ ball, (color B)
- Scheepjes Furry yarn: leftover Tails 970 (color C)
- 4 mm crochet hook
- Scissors
- Darning needle

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

The design of the slippers was named Daan and is suitable for babies aged 9-12 months. The sole measures 12 cm, the slippers are 7.5 cm tall.

SOLE

Crochet 12 ch with color A.

Rnd 1: 2 ch (= 1st hdc), 2 hdc in the 3rd stitch from the hook.

Rnd 2: 1 hdc in the next 10 stitches.

Rnd 3: 6 hdc in the last stitch of the chain.

Rnd 4: 1 hdc in the next 10 stitches.

Rnd 5: 2 hdc in the next stitches, join with 1 sl st (1).

Rnd 6: 1 ch and 1 hdc in the same stitch.

Rnd 7: 2 hdc in the next 2 stitches.

Rnd 8: 1 hdc in the next 11 stitches.

Rnd 9: 2 hdc in the next 6 stitches.

Rnd 10: 1 hdc in the next 11 stitches.

Rnd 11: 2 hdc in the last stitches, join with 1 sl st (2).

Rnd 12: 1 ch and in the same stitch 1 more hdc.

Rnd 13: 2 hdc in the next 2 stitches.

Rnd 14: 1 hdc in the next 11 stitches.

Rnd 15: 1 dc in the next 4 stitches.

Rnd 16: 2 hdc in the next 6 stitches.

Rnd 17: 1 dc in the next 4 stitches.

Rnd 18: 1 hdc in the next 12 stitches.

Rnd 19: 2 hdc in the last stitches, join with 1 sl st (3).

Rnd 20: 1 ch, work for every stitch 1 sc in the back loop. Pick up color B at the last sc (4).

Now continue with the slipper.

SLIPPER

Rnd 21: crochet 2 ch with color B, 2 ch (= 1st hdc).

Rnd 22: 1 hdc in every stitch, join with 1 sl st.

Rnd 23: 2 ch and in the same stitch 1 more hdc.

Rnd 24: 1 hdc in the next 22 stitches.

Rnd 25: crochet 4 x 2 stitches together

Rnd 26: 1 hdc in the next 20 stitches, join with 1 sl st.

Rnd 27: 2 ch, 1 hdc in the vlg 18 stitches.

Rnd 28: crochet 8 x 2 stitches together.

Rnd 29: 1 hdc in the next 13 stitches, join with 1 sl st.

Rnd 30: 2 ch, 1 hdc in the vlg 13 stitches.

Rnd 31: crochet 8 x 2 stitches together.

Rnd 32: 1 hdc in the next 10 stitches,

join with 1 sl st.

Rnd 33: 2 ch. 1 hdc in the next 12 stitches.

Rnd 34: crochet 7 x 2 stitches together.

Rnd 35: 1 hdc in the next 5 stitches, join with 1 sl st.

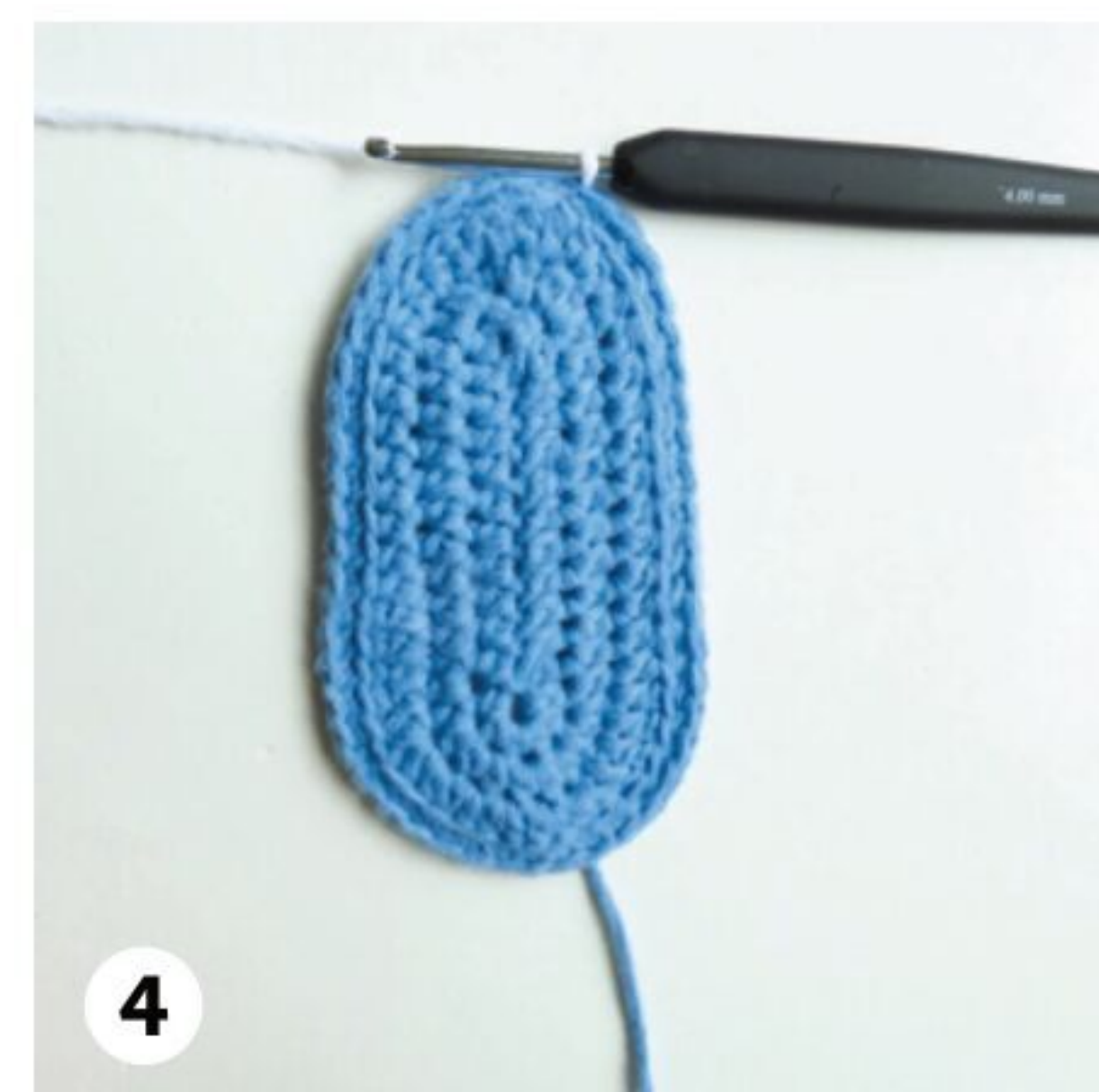
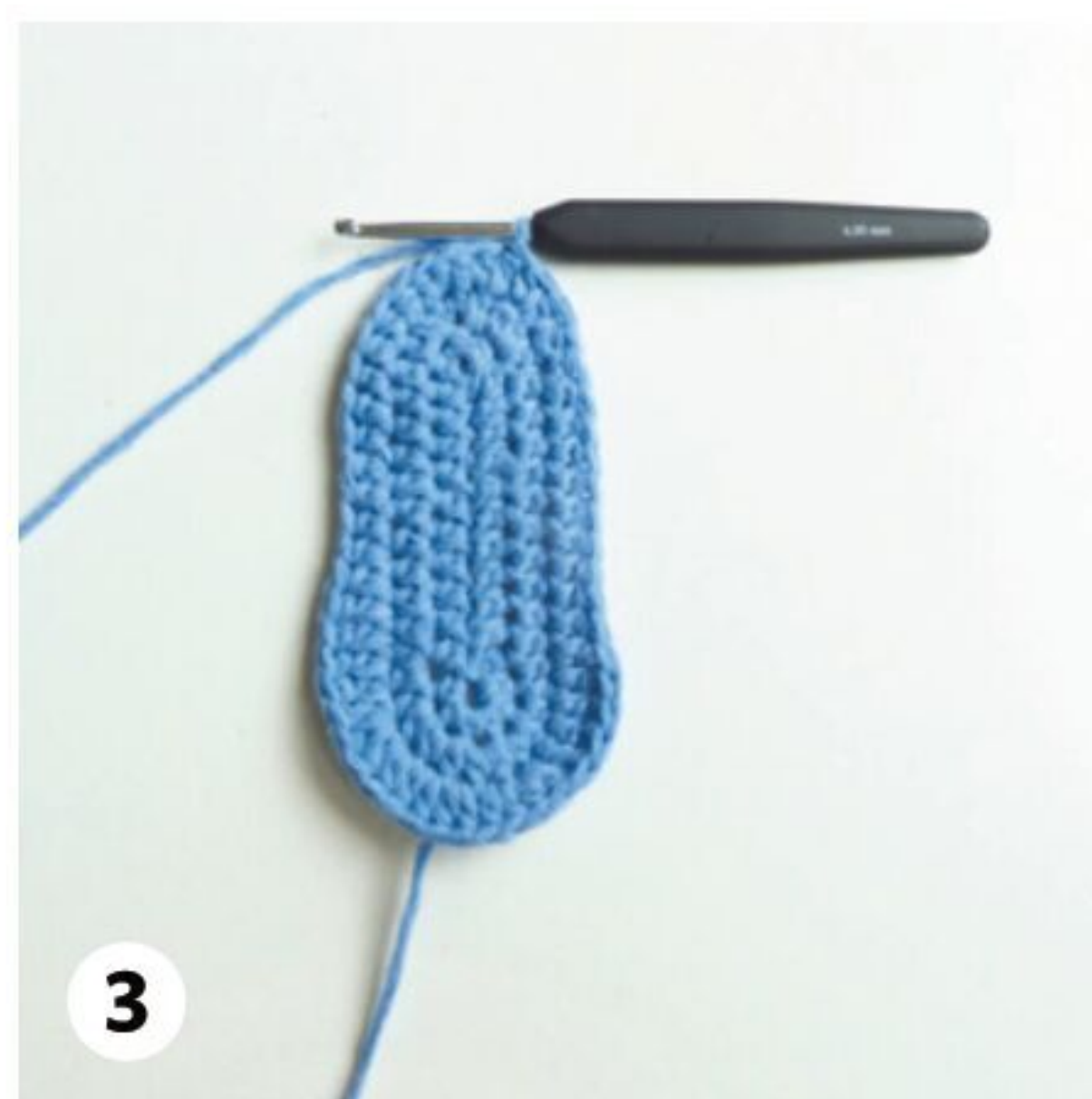
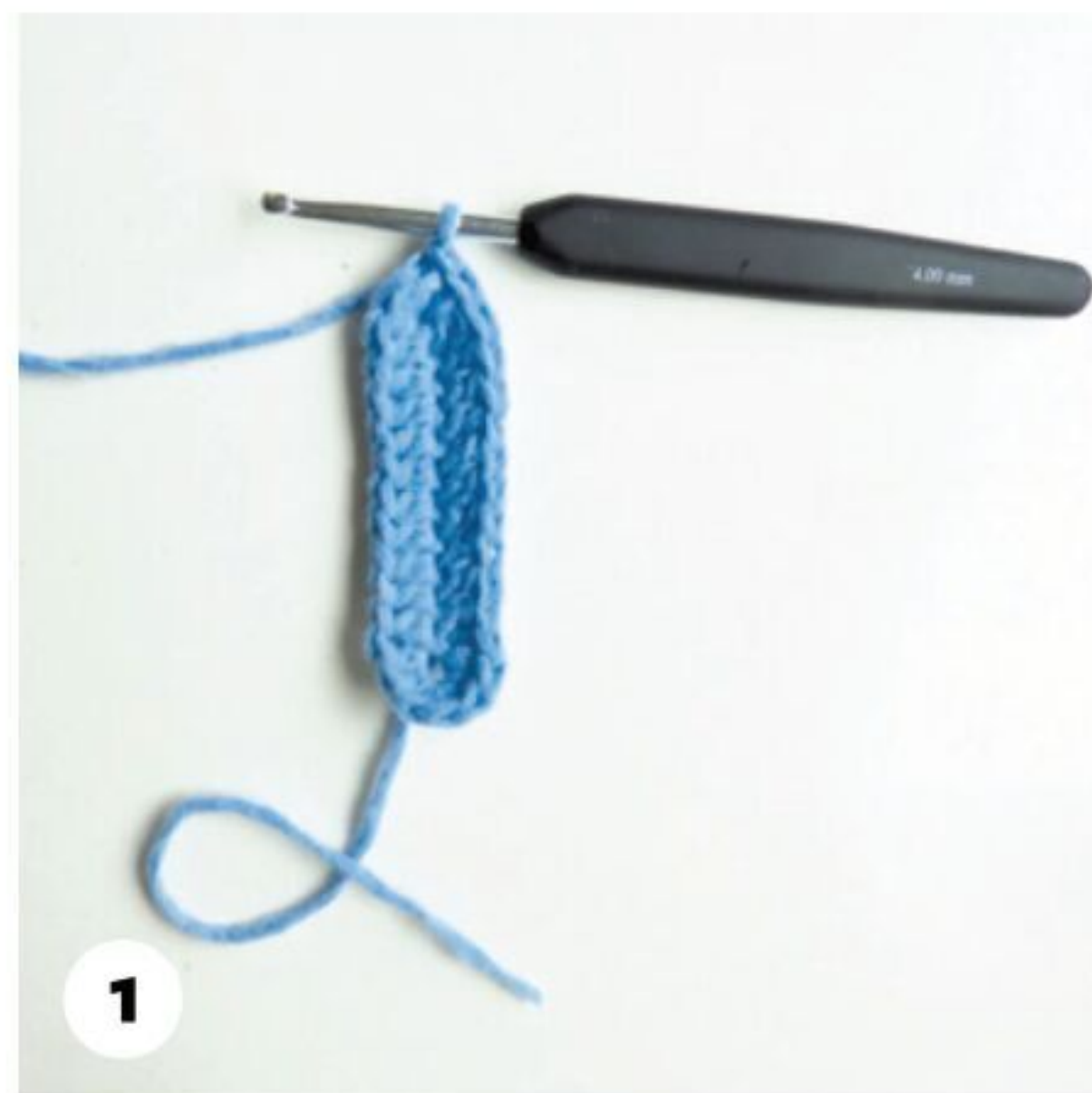
Rnd 36-38: 2 ch, work 1 hdc in every stitch (= 24 stitches), join with 1 sl st.

Attach color C in the final sl st of Rnd 38.

Rnd 39: Now turn the slipper so its toe is facing you. With color C, crochet 1 sl st in every stitch. Fasten off and weave in ends. •

IS IT A TURTLENECK OR A SCARF?

TURTLENECK SCARF

For this scarf, you crochet with a different color almost every round, which gives a wonderful ton-sur-ton effect. And with the leather strap, you can turn it into a lovely turtleneck scarf!



WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Scheepjes Invicta yarn: 100 g dark blue with glitter 98524
- Colour Crafter yarn: 100 g Sint Niklaas (gray) 2019, Ameland (green) 1725, Goes (light blue) 1820 and Dordrecht (verdian green) 1062
- Spirit blended yarn: 50 g Turtle 308
- 3.5 mm and 4 mm crochet hook
- Leather strap grey (The Hook Factory)
- Black buttons, Ø 10 mm
- Wool needle
- Scissors
- Pins

Rnd 3: Rep (2 ch, skip 2 dc, 1 sc). Change to Turtle.

Rnd 4: 2 ch, 1 dc, rep (3 x 1 dc into 1 sc, skip 2 ch), end the round with 2 x 1 dc. Change to gray.

Rnd 5: 2 ch, 1 dc, 1 ch, rep (2 x 1 dc around 2 ch of Rnd 3, 1 ch), end the round with 2 x 1 dc.

Rnd 6: 2 ch, 1 dc, 1 sc around ch, end with 2 x 1 dc. Change to Ameland.

Rnd 7: 1 ch, 1 sc on every stitch. Change to Turtle.

Rnd 8: 1 ch, 1 dc, dc2tog, rep (skip 2 sc, 1 sc, dc2tog around ch of Rnd 5), end the round with 1 sc, 1 dc. Change to dark blue glitter.

Rnd 9: 2 ch, rep (1 hdc).

Rnd 10: rep Rnd 9. Change to Goes.

Rnd 11: 2 ch, 1 dc, rep (skip 1 hdc, 1 ch,

dc5tog in 1 hdc, skip 1 hdc, 1 ch), end with 1 hdc. Change to gray.

Rnd 12: 2 ch, skip 2 hdc, rep (1 tr, 1 tr in the 2nd skipped stitch (see explanation xtr), skip 2 hdc), end with 2 x 1 tr. Change to Turtle.

Rnd 13: 3 ch, 1 dc, rep (1 tr between the dc5tog (around the ch of Rnd 11), insert »

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

The turtleneck scarf measures about 32 x 140 cm. Crochet (almost) every round in a different color, and create a ton-sur-ton effect with a dark blue colored glitter thread for an extra twist. Additional abbreviation: crossed treble crochet = xtr. Crochet as follows: skip 2 stitches, crochet 1 tr and insert from the front 1 tr into the 2nd skipped stitch, crochet together.

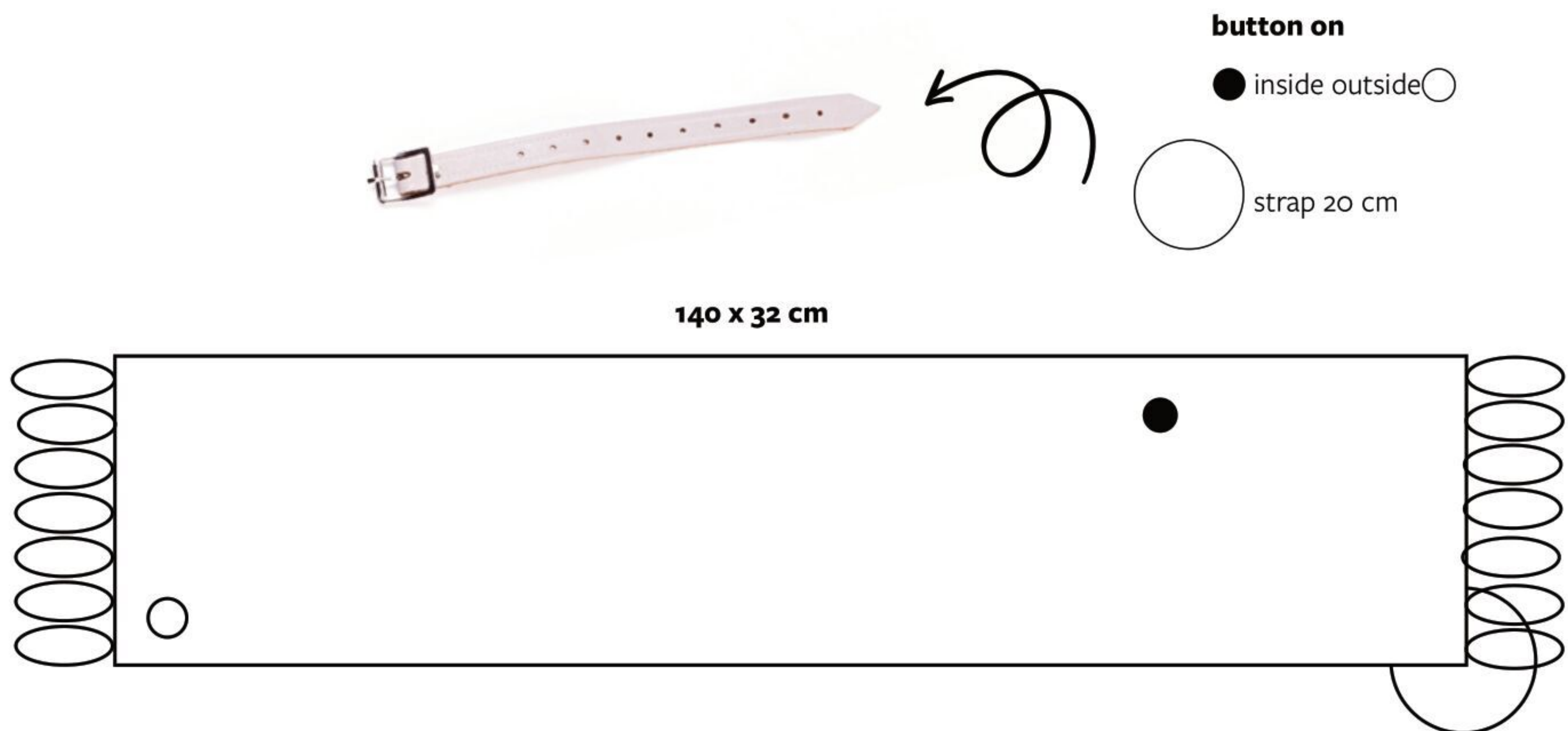
TURTLENECK SCARF

Rnd 1: Using Dordrecht and the 4 mm crochet hook, crochet 200 ch and 1 tch.

Rnd 2: skip the 1st ch (= 1st dc) in the 2nd ch, rep (1 dc) until the last ch.



PATTERN



TIP! FROM TIME TO TIME, WEAVE IN SOME OF THE BEGINNING AND END THREADS, AND CAREFULLY CUT THE REMAINING THREAD.

from the back, 1 dc, 1 dc), join with 1 dc, 1 dc. Rep Rnd 2-13. Crochet Rnd 2 with color Ameland and continue to crochet everything else in the same color. Next, rep Rnd 2-13 and crochet Rnd 2 again with color Dordrecht. Then crochet Rnd 2 one more time with color Ameland. Fasten all threads off.

SHORT SIDES

Rnd 1: crochet 1 round of dc with color Goes.

Rnd 2: 20 ch, rep (skip 1 dc, 1 sc, 20 ch), end with 1 sc on the 2nd last dc. Fasten off and weave in ends. Change to gray.

Rnd 3: start in the 1st dc of Rnd 1 with 1 sc, 20 ch, rep Rnd 2. While doing so, push the loops of Rnd 2 back slightly and crochet the sc into the skipped dc of Rnd 1. Weave in all threads. Rep these 3 rounds also on the other short side.

LONG SIDES

Crochet with dark blue glitter and the 3.5 mm crochet hook. Start with 2 x 1 sc in the 1st dc of the short side, rep (5 ch, 1 sc into the same stitch, 1 sc), end with 2 x 1 sc. Weave in all ends. Rep this round also on the other long side.

FINISHING

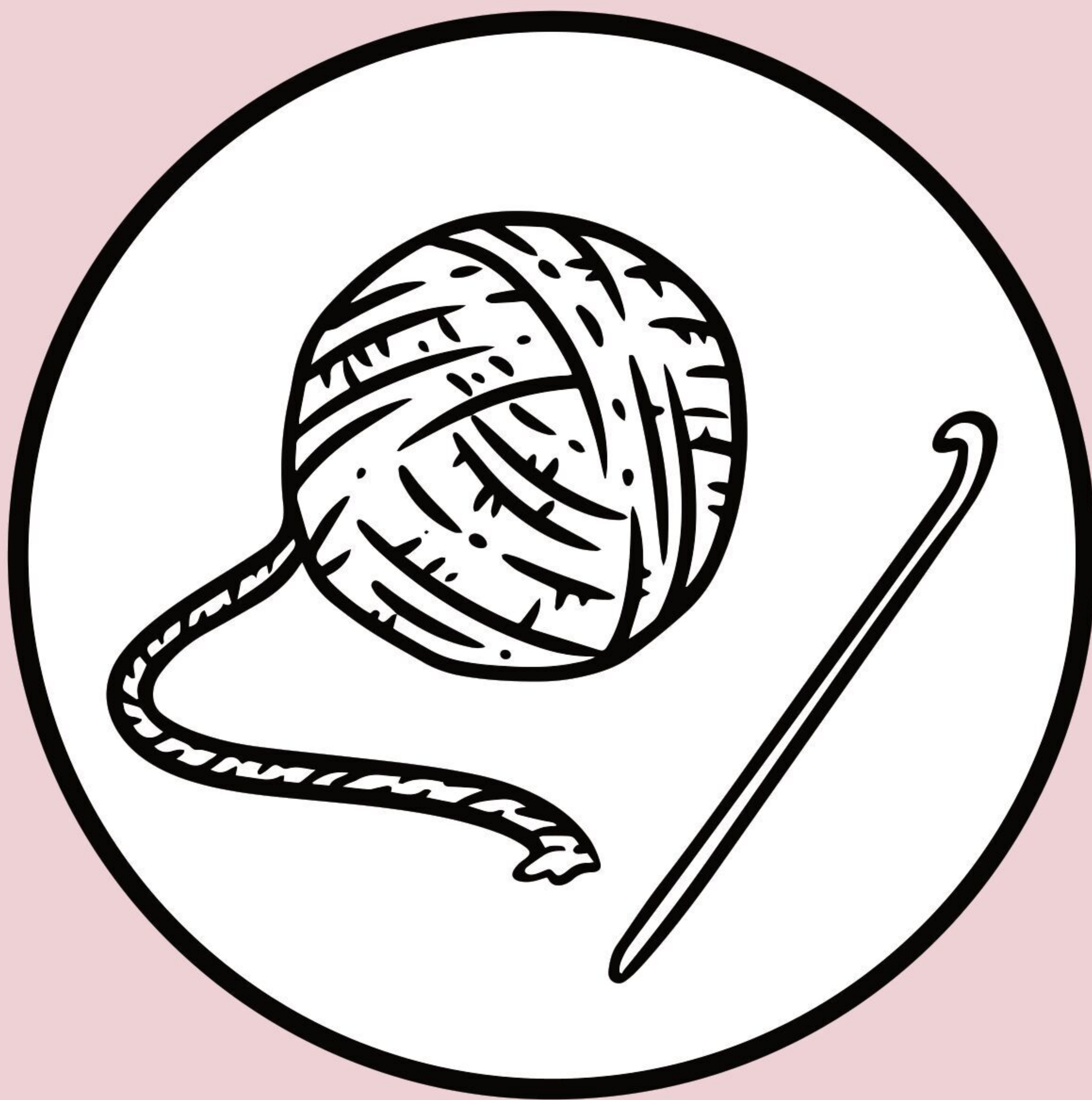
Insert the leather strap between the 3rd and 4th round in the right corner. On the corner, facing the same long side (see diagram), sew the button to the inside of the edge.

Fold the strap around the other side of the scarf and secure it in the 2nd hole. Pull the short side, which falls down loosely, up at an angle (opposite side). Measure 30 cm along the long side (opposite the corner of the strap location) on the outside/edge of the scarf.

If the scarf fits nicely, attach a pin to both sides and sew the two parts of the button there. Remove the pins. Dampen the work, block it into shape and leave it to dry. •

This adorable snowdrop will become your buddy when working from home. But of course this buddy is also very cute to give as a gift.

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Scheepjes Eliza yarn: white 7420, yellow/green 7402 and green 7414
- Katia Capri yarn: pink 82159
- 2 mm crochet hook
- Fiberfill stuffing
- Coin or pebbles
- Safety eyes, Ø 6 mm
- Stitch marker or colored yarn
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

The snowdrop will be about 8 to 10 cm tall. The additional abbreviations used stand for: rsc = raised single crochet,

picot stitch = 1 sc, 2 ch, 1 sl st in 2nd ch, 1 sc in the same stitch and BPsc = back post single crochet, see explanation and photos on next page.

HEAD

Make a MR with pink.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the MR (= 6).

Rnd 2: 6 x (2 sc in sc) (= 12).

Rnd 3: 6 x (1 sc, 2 sc in sc) (= 18).

Rnd 4: 6 x (1 sc, 2 sc in sc) (= 24).

Rnd 5: 24 sc.

Rnd 6: 6 x (3 sc, 2 sc in sc) (= 30).

Rnd 7: 6 x (2 sc, 2 sc in sc, 2 sc) (= 36).

Rnd 8: 6 x (5 sc, 2 sc in sc) (= 42).

Rnd 9-13: 42 sc.

Rnd 14: 6 x (5 sc, sc2tog) (= 36).

Rnd 15: 6 x (2 sc, sc2tog, 2 sc) (= 30).

Rnd 16: 6 x (3 sc, sc2tog) (= 24).

Rnd 17: 24 sc.

Rnd 18: 6 x (1 sc, sc2tog, 1 sc) (= 18).

Rnd 19: 6 x (1 sc, sc2tog) (= 12).

Stuff the head. Note: if you want to work with safety eyes, place them on Rnd 11, approximately 9 stitches apart.

Rnd 20: 6 x sc2tog (= 6). Fasten off and pull the hole closed.

BODY

Make a MR with green.

Rnd 1: 6 sc in the MR (= 6).

Rnd 2: 6 x (2 sc in sc) (= 12).

Rnd 3: 6 x (1 sc, 2 sc in sc) (= 18).

Rnd 4: 6 x (1 sc, 2 sc in sc) (= 24).

Rnd 5: crochet FBsc around in every stitch (= 24).

Rnd 6 and 7: 24 sc.

Rnd 8: 4 x (4 sc, sc2tog) (= 20).

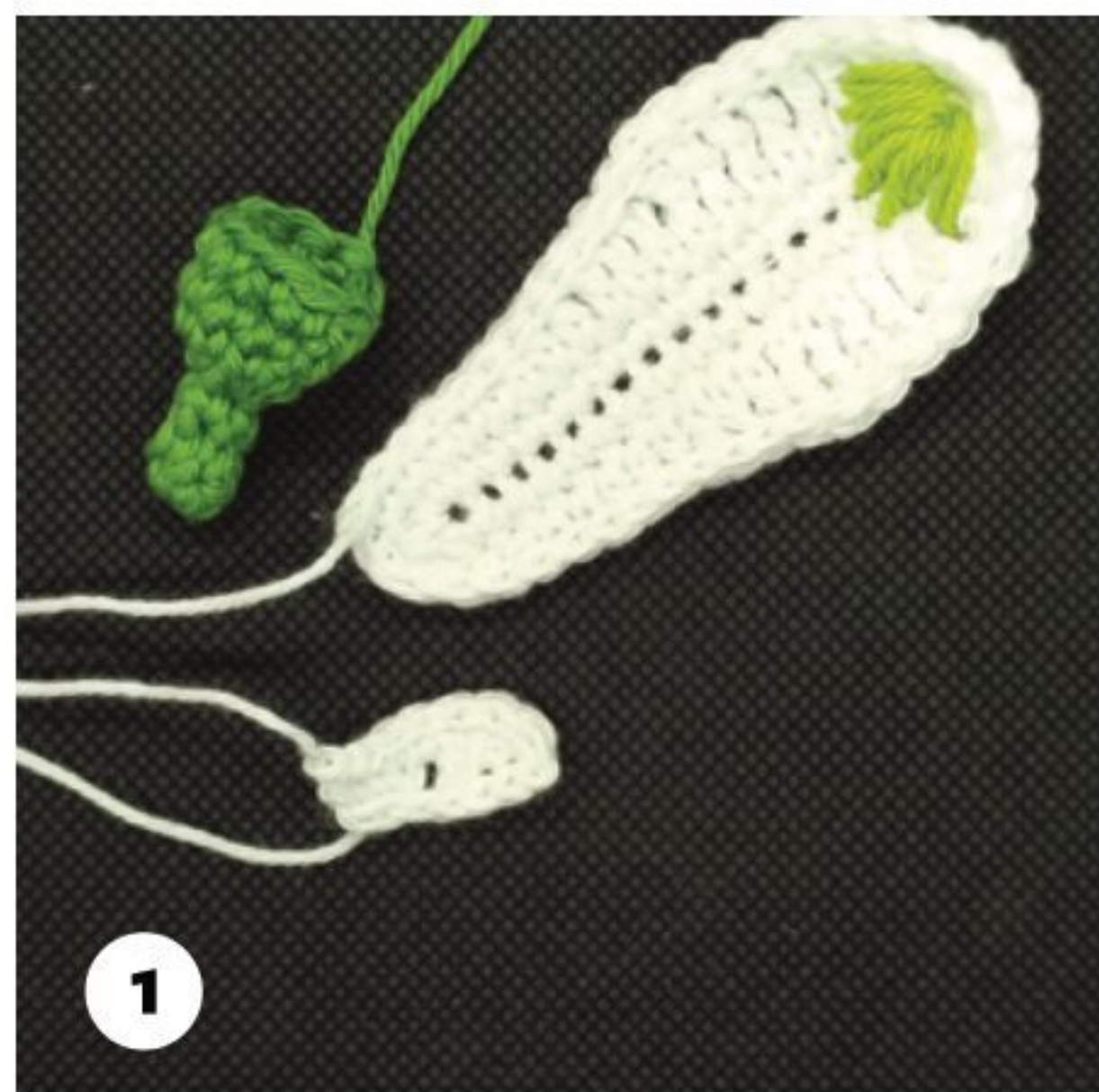
Rnd 9: 20 sc.

Rnd 10: 4 x (3 sc, sc2tog) (= 16).

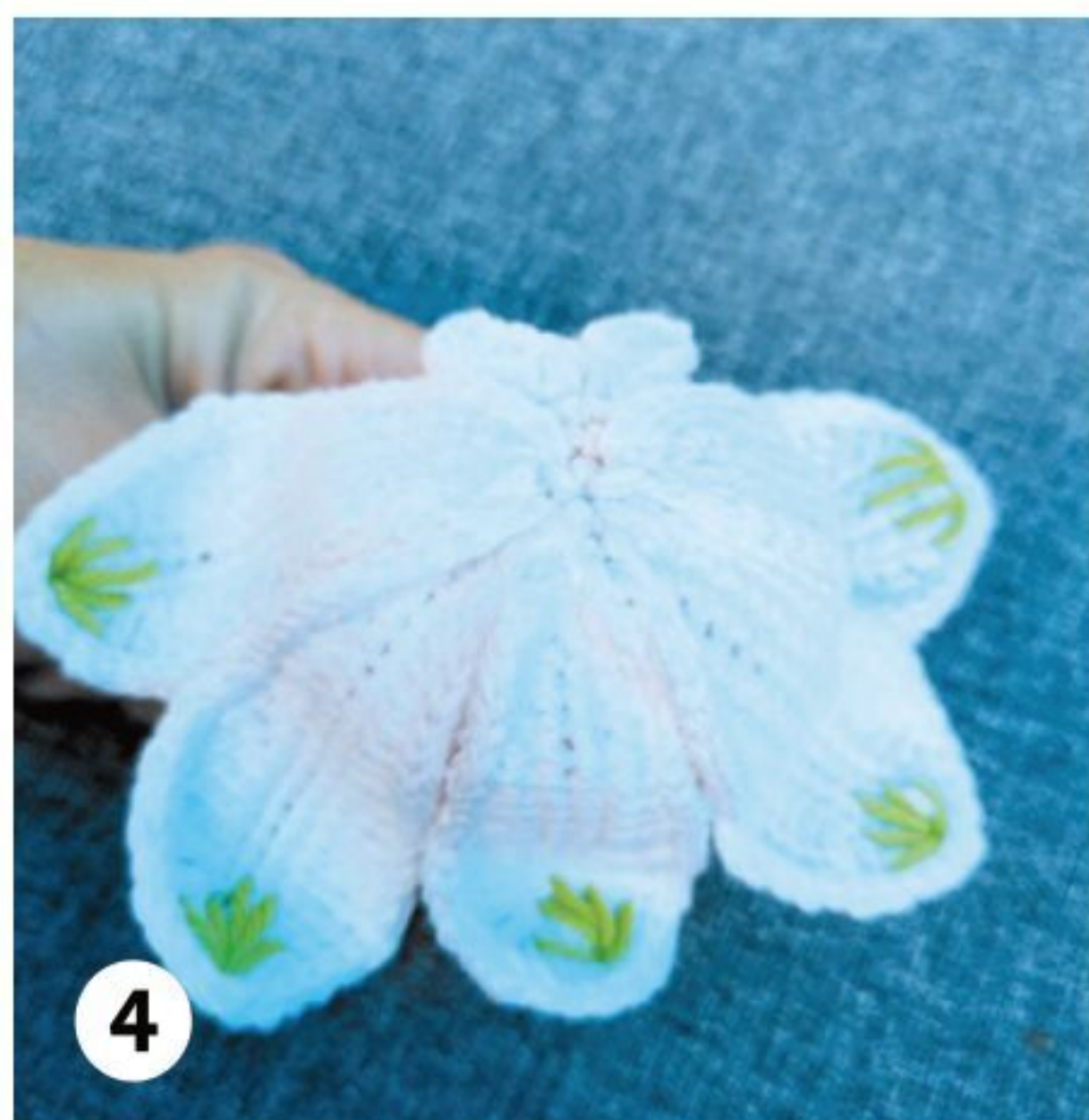
Rnd 11: 16 sc.

Rnd 12: 4 x (2 sc, sc2tog) (= 12).

TIP! WANT TO HANG THE SNOWDROP FROM YOUR BAG? THEN MAKE A **LOOP OF 15 CH** AND SECURE IT TO THE HEAD AT THE STEM. DO NOT STUFF THE BODY WITH PEBBLES, BUT WITH **FIBERFILL**.

Rnd 13: 12 sc. Stuff the body with a coin or pebbles. It must be strong enough to support the head. Leaving a long tail and do not sew the hole closed.

HAT WITH STEM

Make a MR with green.

Rnd 1: 4 sc in the MR (= 4).

Rnd 2-4: 4 sc.

Rnd 5: 4 x (2 sc in sc) (= 8).

Rnd 6: 4 x (1 sc, 2 sc in sc) (= 12).

Rnd 7 and 8: 12 sc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail. (1).

LARGE LEAF (5 X)

Rnd 1: with white, crochet 20 ch + 1 tch (=20).

Rnd 2: start in the 2nd ch from hook, crochet 19 sc, 3 sc in sc (into the last ch), continue to crochet on other side: 18 sc, 2 sc in sc, 1 ch (= 43).

Rnd 3: 5 sc, 3 hdc, 3 dc, 6 tr, 1 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 2 sc in sc, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 1 dc, 6 tr, 3 dc, 3 hdc, 5 sc, 2 sc in sc, 1 ch (= 45).

Rnd 4: crochet sl st all around (= 45). Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

SMALL LEAF (2 X)

Rnd 1: with white, crochet 6 ch + 1 tch (=6).

Rnd 2: start in the 2nd ch from hook, crochet 3 sc, 1 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc (into the last ch), 1 tch. (= 6).

Rnd 3: 6 sl st, 1 ch, 6 sl st on the other side (= 12). Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

ARMS (2 X)

Rnd 1: Make a MR with pink and work 4 sc into the MR (= 4).

Rnd 2: 4 sc. Change to green.

Rnd 3 and 4: 4 sc. Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Do not stuff.

FINISHING

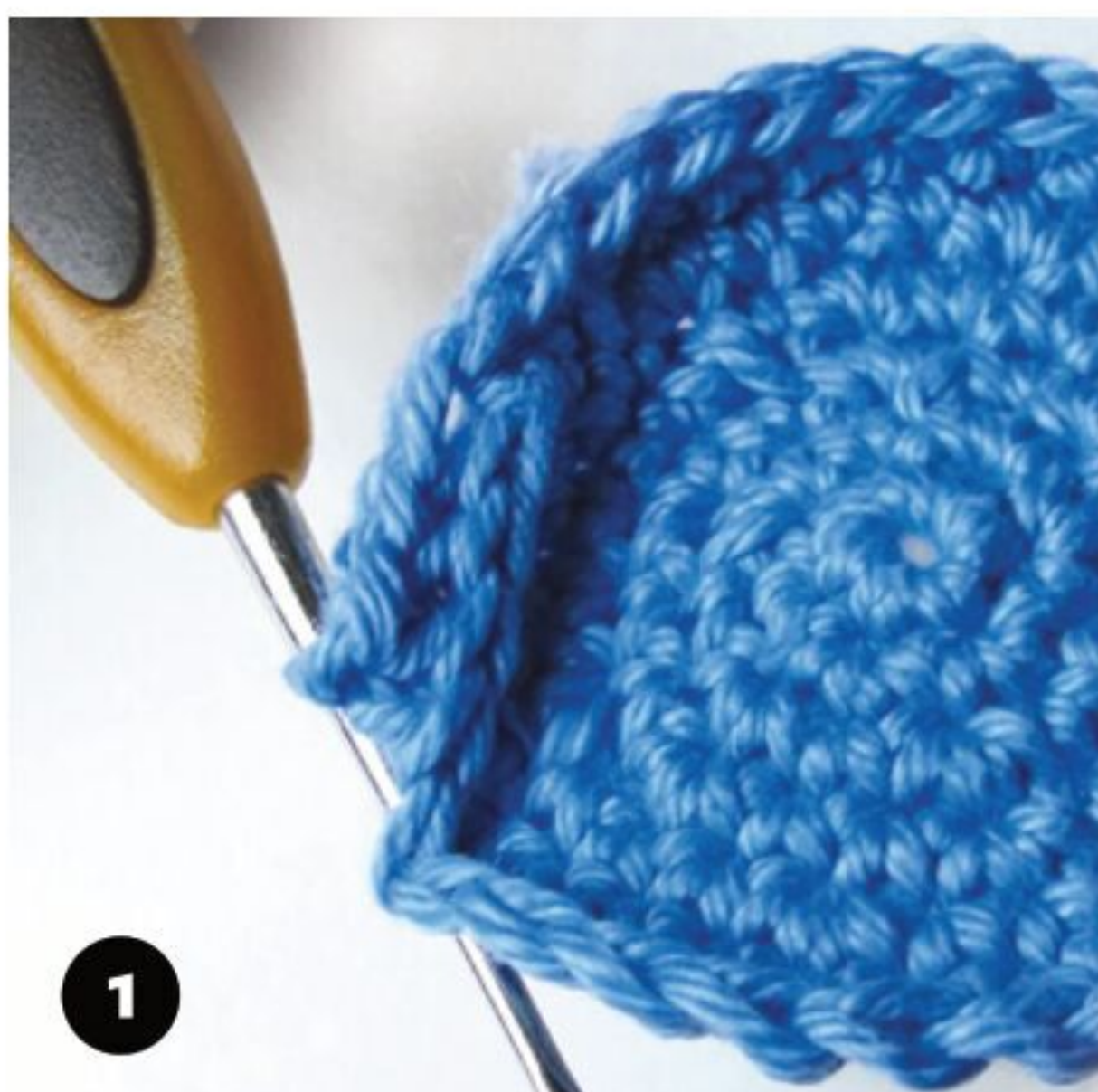
Embroider a green spot on the large leaves with yellow/green thread (2). Place the 5 large leaves from the eyes to the back. Place the 2 small leaves at the front between the eyes. Do this from the center of the head, i.e. Rnd 1. Secure them only in the middle with small stitches at the height of the eyes, so that the leaves can curl (3 and 4). Lastly, sew the hat with stem over the leaves until they are all covered in the middle (5 and 6). Stuff the body with granulate with a bit of fiberfill on top. Sew the body under the center of the head. Attach the arms to the sides of the body. Embroider a small black stripe at the eyes. •

BACK POST SINGLE CROCHET

The abbreviation for back post single crochet is BPsc. Usually the post stitch is made with sc, but it can also be made with a dc. Insert the crochet hook from back to front around the 'post' of the sc from the previous row, pull back to the back of the work and finish by crocheting as a regular sc. At the back, the raised single crochet rests on top of the work, creating a thickening (1-3).

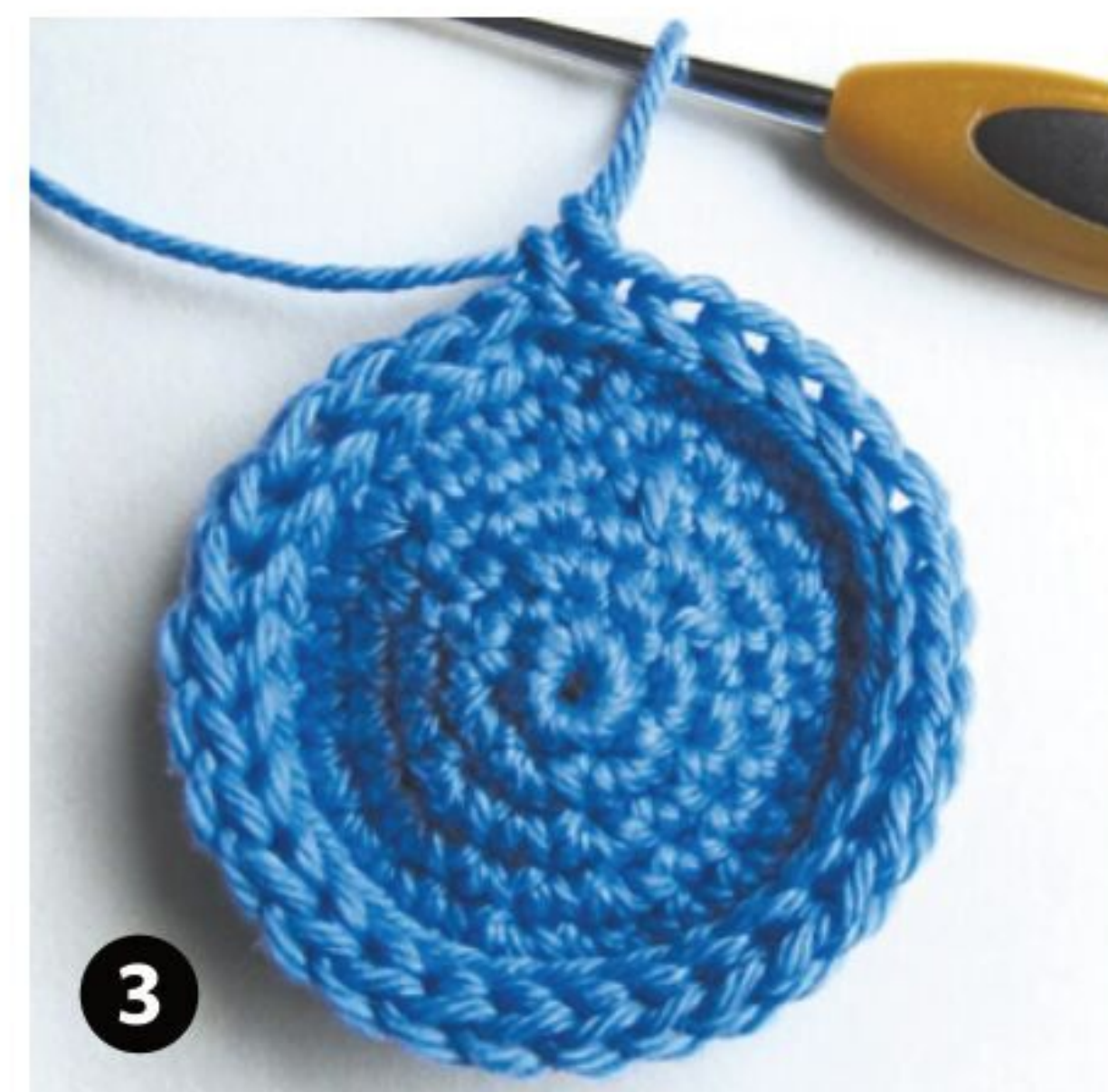

A planner is essential for writing down all your appointments and "facts" you don't want to forget. Make it your own with this cover!

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Durable Coral yarn: 1 ball of Ivory 126, Pale pink 2192, Rose blush 223, Brick 2239, Coffee 285, Petrol 375, Light blue 282 and Navy 321
- 2.5 mm and 3 mm crochet hook
- Fimo Leather clay
- Cookie Stamps (Creatime)
- Planner 15 cm wide x 21 cm tall
- Round cane (or, for example, rolling pin or bottle)
- Letter bar with loose letters (craftgarden.nl)

Yarn from Durableyarn.com

THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

Is your planner wider? You can make the cover larger by multiplying the number of stitches with 9 +1.

Please note! On both sides, an inward fold is made over 8 stitches per side. Add these stitches to your count. The abbreviation FL stands for front loop, BL for back loop.

COVER

Rnd 1: Using Ivory and 3 mm crochet hook, crochet a chain of 91 ch +1 tch (= 91).

Rnd 2: Crochet 91 sc with the 2.5 mm crochet hook: Turn the work.

Rnd 3: 1 tch with Pale pink, rep 10 times (1 ch in the next, crochet the remaining stitches through both loops, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc), 1 sc.

Rnd 4: 1 tch with Ivory, 9 ch, 1 dc in the next of Rnd 2 (this is the FL seen from the side you are working on now, but seen from Rnd 3 it is the BL), rep 8 x (8 sc, 1 dc in the FL of Rnd 1), 9 sc (1 and 2).

Rnd 5: crochet 3 tch with Rose blush (= 1st tr), rep 10 x (1 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc in the FL, 1 hdc, 2 hdc, 1 tr).

Rnd 6: 3 tch (= 1st tr), 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, rep 9 x (2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr). Fasten off.

Rnd 7: Attach a new thread of Ivory to the beginning of Rnd 6. Turn the work, crochet 4 sc, 1 tr in the FL of Rnd 4, 8 sc, rep 8 x (8 sc, 1 tr in the FL of Rnd 4), 5 sc (3).

Rnd 8: Change to Brick, then crochet

1 tch, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc in the FL, rep 9 x (1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc in the FL).

Rnd 9: 1 tch, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc, rep 9 x (1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc). Fasten off.

Rnd 10: Change to Ivory and crochet from the beginning of Rnd 9. Crochet 9 sc, 1 tr in the FL of Rnd 7, rep 8 x (8 sc, 1 tr in the FL of Rnd 7), 9 sc.

Rnd 11: Change to Coffee. Crochet 3 tch (= 1st tr), rep 10 x (1 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc in the FL, 1 hdc, 2 hdc, 1 tr).

Rnd 12: 3 tch (= 1st tr), 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, rep 9 x (2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr). Fasten off.

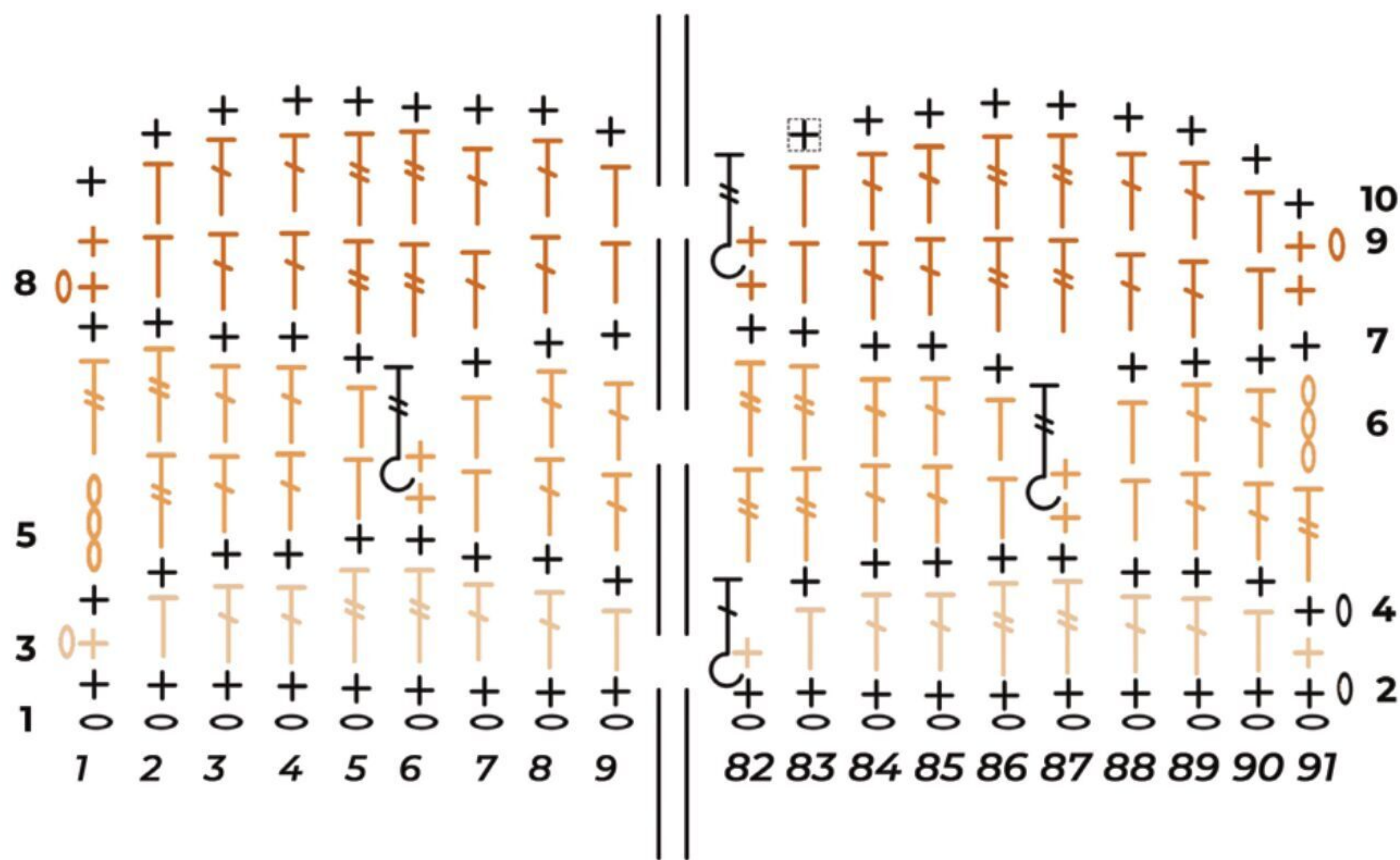
Rnd 13: Change to Ivory and crochet from the beginning of Rnd 12. Crochet 4 sc, 1 tr in the FL of Rnd 10, 8 sc, rep 9 x (8 sc, 1 tr in the FL of Rnd 10), 5 sc.

Rnd 15: 1 tch, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, 2 dc, »

Rnd 16: Change to Ivory and crochet from the beginning of Rnd 14.

Crochet 9 sc, 1 tr in the FL of Rnd 13, rep 8 x (8 sc, 1 tr in the FL of Rnd 13), 9 sc.

Rnd 17: Change to Light blue. Crochet 3 tch (= 1st tr), rep 10 x (1 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc in the FL, 1 hdc, 2 hdc, 1 tr).

Rnd 18: 3 tch (= 1st tr), 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, rep 8 x (2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr). Fasten off.

Rnd 19: Change to Ivory and crochet from

the beginning of Rnd 18. Crochet 4 sc, 1 tr in the FL of Rnd 16, rep 9 x (8 sc, 1 tr in the FL of Rnd 17), 5 sc.

Rnd 20: Change to Navy. Crochet 1 tch, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc in the FL, rep 9 x (1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc in the FL).

Rnd 21: 1 tch, 1 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc, rep 9 x (1 hdc, 2 dc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc). Fasten off.

Rnd 22: Change to Ivory and crochet from the beginning of Rnd 21. Crochet

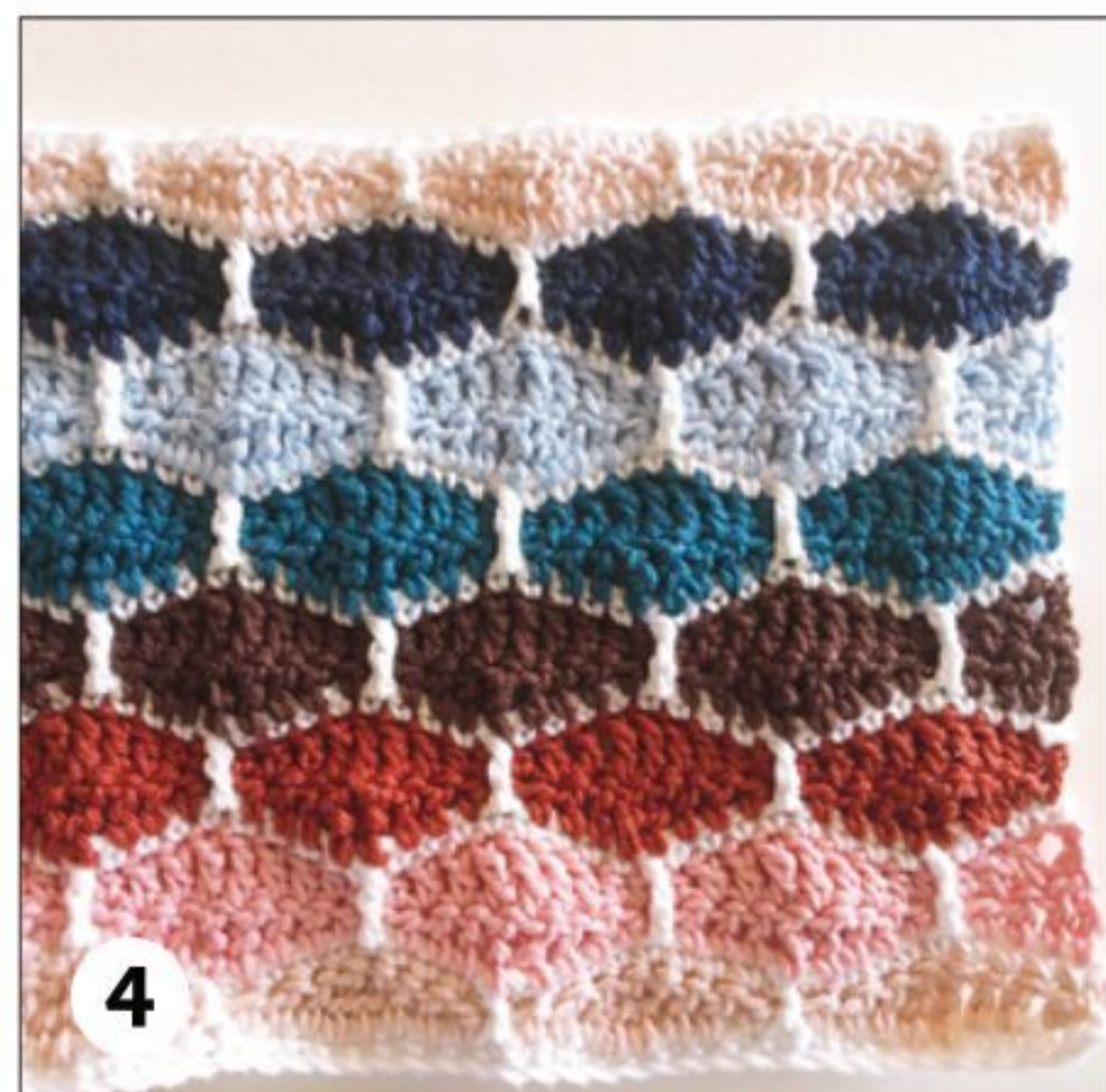

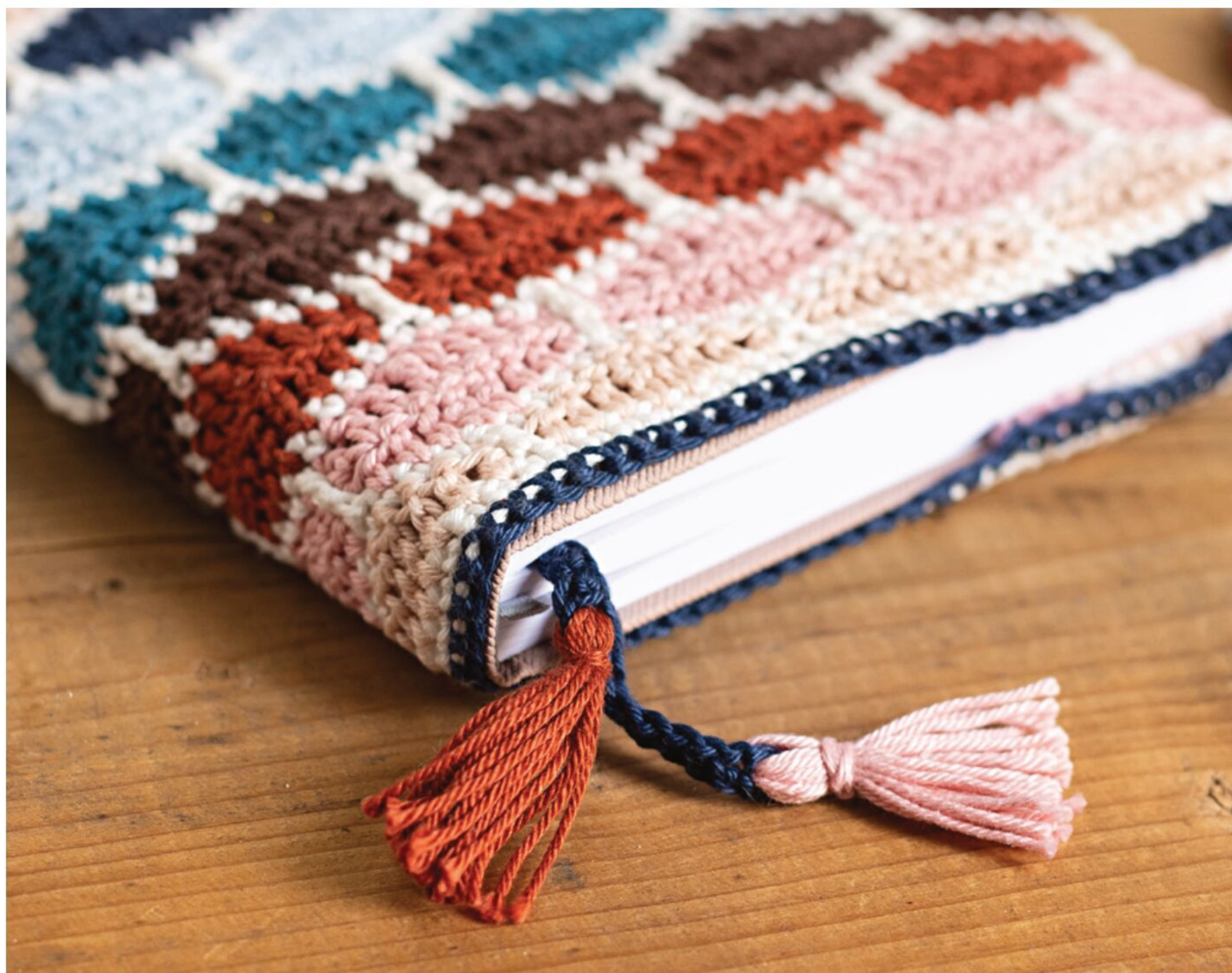

 Over the FL of Rnd 25 and Rnd 28, crochet 1 sl st in all FL in the color of the tour (5).

Weave all threads in. Crochet with Rose blush 50 sc over the sides (6). Over 3 rounds, crochet 1 sc in each sc. With Ivory, crochet around 1 sc in each sc or round. End with 1 sl st (you will have 99 sc at the top and bottom and 50 sc along the sides). Around a total of 298 sc (7). From the corners of the long sides, count 24 sc each time and mark this spot with a stitch marker (8). Fold the outer corner inward to the marked spot (9). From the corner, crochet with Navy 12 sc over the top and bottom layers. Continue to crochet >>





to the other corner and fold the last 24 sc in half and crochet 12 sc over both layers (10).

FINISHING

Break yarn at 15 cm: 10 x Rose Blush and 10 x Brick. Mark the center of the top of the cover and attach Navy there. Crochet 70 ch. Place the 10 threads of Rose blush on the ch and skip 4 ch. Crochet 66 sc back over the ch (11). Crochet 75 ch, place the 10 threads of Rose blush in the ch, skip 4 ch and crochet 71 sc back over the ch to the top. Fasten off. Wrap yarn in the same color around the 2 x 10 threads and make tassels. Cut them to the desired length (12). Finish the cover with a homemade label made of Fimo Leather.

LABEL

Using a round cane, roll out the Fimo leather to a width of 2 ice cream sticks (13). Put the separate letters for the text in mirror image in the letter bar and press it into the clay (14). Cut the clay to the desired size and poke a hole in each corner. Bake the label for 30 minutes at 130° C and let it cool in the oven. Sew it through the holes on the cover. Place the cover around the planner. •

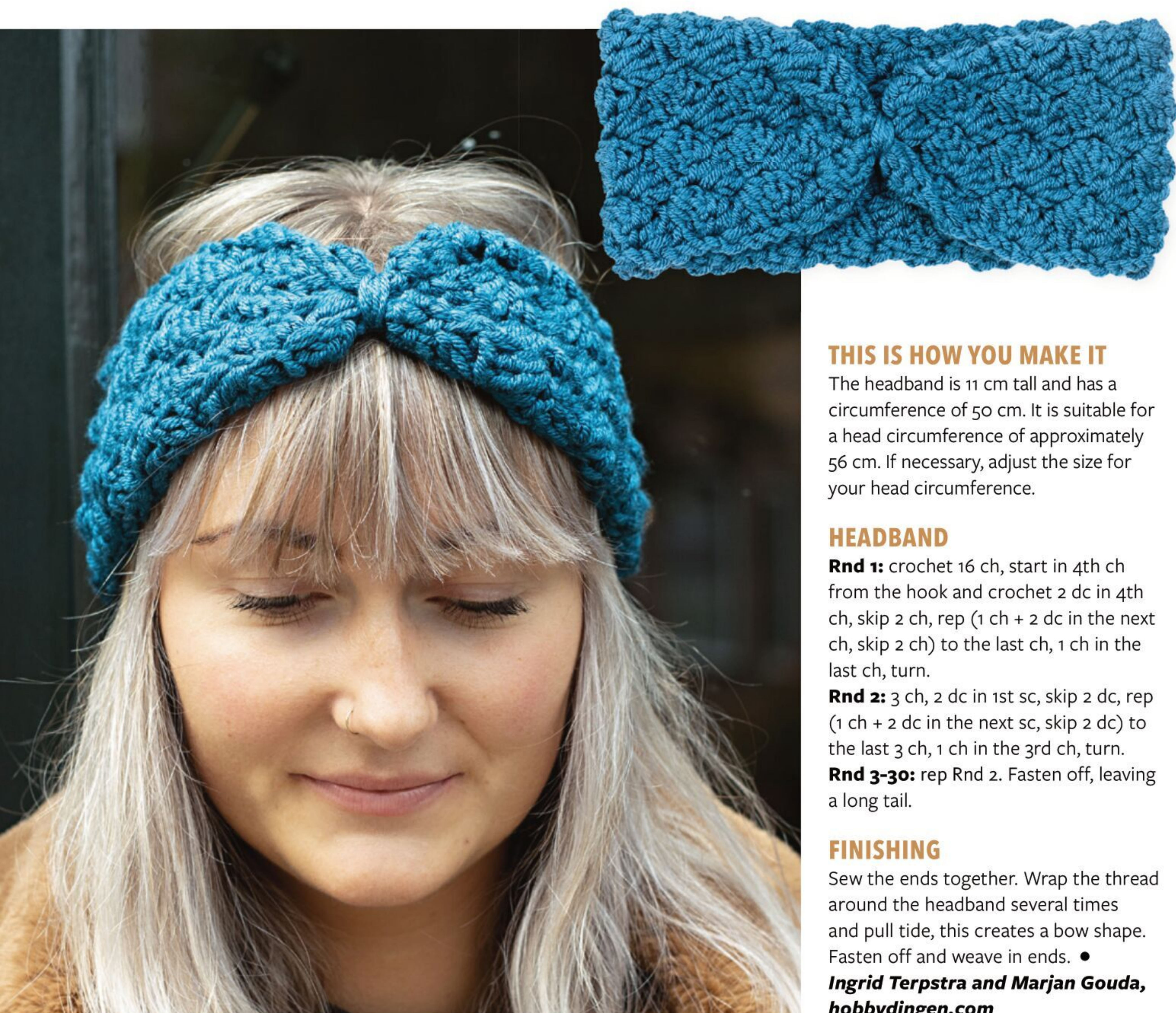

COSY WINTER ACCESSORIES

Warm HEADBAND

Will the winter bring cold days this year?
At least you won't get cold ears with this trendy headband!



THIS IS HOW YOU MAKE IT

The headband is 11 cm tall and has a circumference of 50 cm. It is suitable for a head circumference of approximately 56 cm. If necessary, adjust the size for your head circumference.

HEADBAND

Rnd 1: crochet 16 ch, start in 4th ch from the hook and crochet 2 dc in 4th ch, skip 2 ch, rep (1 ch + 2 dc in the next ch, skip 2 ch) to the last ch, 1 ch in the last ch, turn.

Rnd 2: 3 ch, 2 dc in 1st sc, skip 2 dc, rep (1 ch + 2 dc in the next sc, skip 2 dc) to the last 3 ch, 1 ch in the 3rd ch, turn.

Rnd 3-30: rep Rnd 2. Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

FINISHING

Sew the ends together. Wrap the thread around the headband several times and pull tight, this creates a bow shape. Fasten off and weave in ends. •

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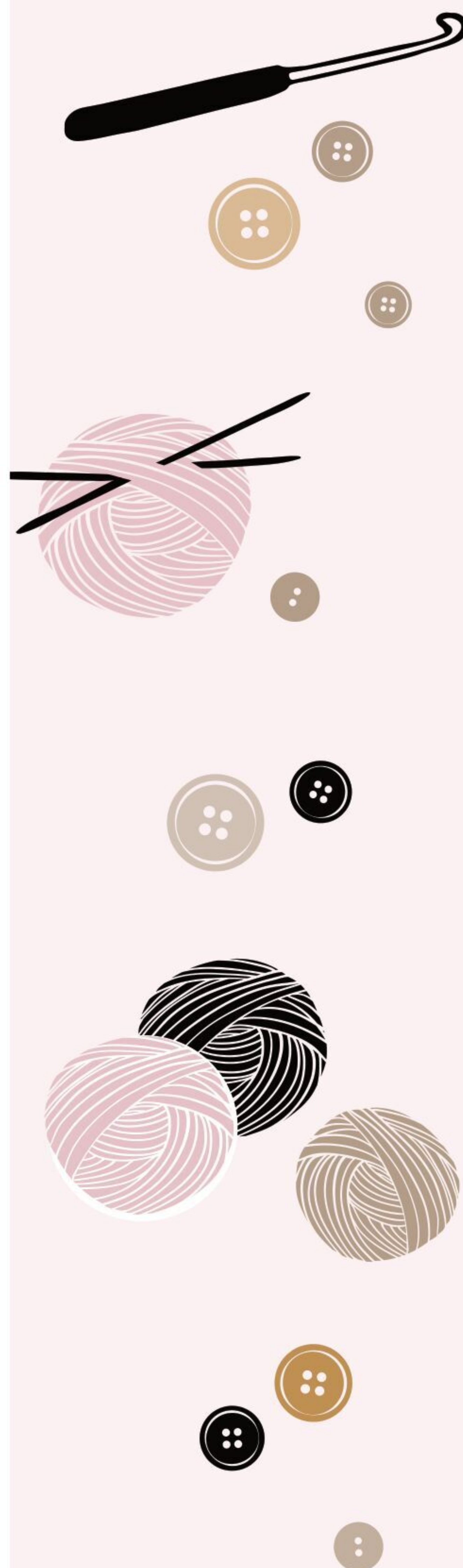

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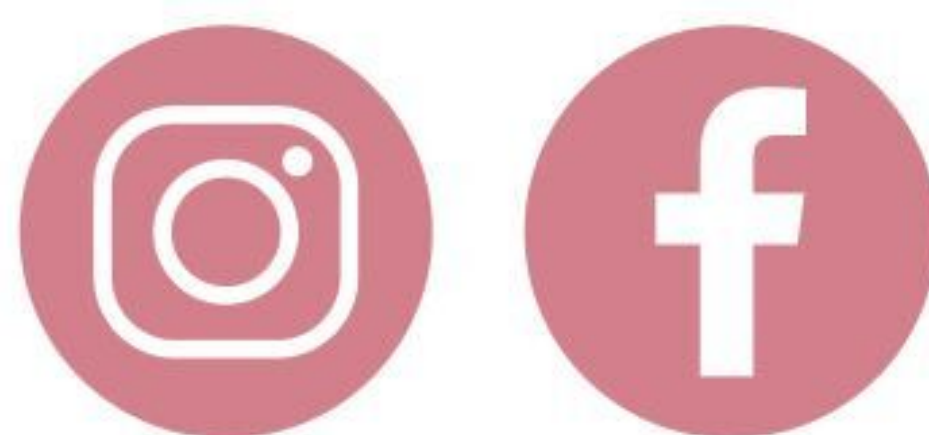
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
