DESIGNER Nicky Barfoot

- Increasing & decreasing
- Colourwork (intarsia)
- Pick up & knit
- Knitting in the round
- Knitting in rows
- Working from a chart
- Seaming

YARN USED

Rowan, Tweed

- 100% wool
- 50g/118m/129yd
- Colours:
MC: Malham, 586
CC1: Bainbridge, 588, (Hair)
CC2: Buckden, 584 (Face)
- Rowan, Felted Tweed DK**
- 50% merino, 25%

rayon, 25% alpaca

- 50g/175m/191yd
- Colour:
CC3: Watery, 152 (Eyes)
- Rowan, Pure Wool DK**
- 100% wool
- 50g/124m/136yd
- Colour:
CC4: Tea Rose, 025 (Lips)

EASE

- 5-12.5cm/2-5in positive ease

TENSION


- Work 20 sts and 28 rows in stocking st to measure 10x10cm/4x4in using 4mm (US 6) needles, or size required to obtain correct tension

NOTIONS


- Pair of 4mm (US 6) needles
- 3.25mm (US 3) circular needle, 50cm/20in long
- 4mm crochet hook
- Smooth waste yarn
- Two stitch holders
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch marker

30 (32: 37: 40: 44.5: 47)cm
11 3/4 (12 1/2: 14 1/2: 15 3/4: 17 1/2: 18 1/2)in



BACK

Cast ON

Using a length of smooth scrap yarn and a crochet hook, provisionally cast on 81 (89: 99: 107: 119: 131) sts onto 4mm (US 6) needles. Using MC and beginning with a RS row, work 26cm/10 1/4 in in st st, ending after a WS row.

Shape armhole

With RS facing, cast off 3 (3: 4: 4: 5: 6) sts at the beg of next 4 rows. 69 (77: 83: 91: 99: 107) sts
Dec 1 st at either end of foll 2 (2: 3: 5: 6: 7) RS rows.
65 (73: 77: 81: 87: 93) sts
Continue even in st st until armhole measures 14.5 (16: 17: 18: 19: 20.5)cm or 5 3/4 (6 1/4: 6 3/4: 7: 7 1/2: 8)in, ending after a WS row.

Shape right neck and shoulder

Next row (RS): K16 (18: 18: 18: 20: 20), turn work.
Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 4 (6: 6: 6: 6) rows.

12 (12: 12: 12: 14: 14) sts

Work 1 WS row even.

Next row (RS): Cast off 6 (6: 6: 8: 8) sts. 6 sts rem
Work 1 WS row.

Cast off rem 6 sts.

With RS facing, slip centre 33 (37: 41: 45: 47: 53) sts onto a holder for neck, rejoin yarn to remaining 16 (18: 18: 18: 20: 20) sts and knit to end.

Complete to match right side, reversing all shapings.

FRONT

Using smooth waste yarn, cast on 81 (89: 99: 107: 119: 131) sts onto a 4mm (US 6) needle.

Row 1 (RS): With MC, k2 (6: 11: 15: 21: 27). Knit across the 77 sts of the chart beginning in the bottom right-hand corner and working from right to left, using the intarsia method and joining in new colours as required. K2 (6: 11: 15: 21: 27) with MC. This row sets the placement of the chart.

Continue in st st, working all shaping as for Back, until Row 125 of Chart is completed.

Cont shaping as for Back in CC1 (hair colour) over rem sts of chart, cont to work 0 (0: 0: 2: 5: 8) sts on either side of chart in MC.

CHART



KEY Work intarsia chart in St st, beginning at bottom right hand corner.
Chart reads right to left on RS rows and left to right on WS rows.

YARN REVIEW

SLEEVES

Using 3.25mm (US 3) needles and MC, cast on 45 (49: 55: 57: 63: 67) sts.

Knit 6 rows.

Inc row (RS): K1, M1, knit to last st, M1, k1.

Purl 1 row.

Rep last two rows 6 (6: 8: 10: 11: 12) times more.
59 (63: 73: 79: 87: 93) sts

Shape cap

Cast off 4 (6: 6: 6: 7: 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 51 (51: 61: 67: 73: 79) sts

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 (3: 3: 3: 5: 7) rows, then every RS row 3 (3: 3: 5: 6: 5) times, then every foll 4th row 4 (5: 6: 6: 6) times. 31 (29: 37: 39: 43) sts rem

Dec 1 st at each end of every RS row four times, then every row 2 (2: 3: 3: 3) times.

Work 1 (1: 0: 0: 0: 0) row even, ending after a WS row.
Cast off rem 19 (17: 23: 25: 25: 29) sts.

FINISHING

Weave in ends from intarsia panel.

Block and press pieces according to instructions on ball band.

Join shoulder seams.

Hem

With work upsidetdown and RS facing, remove provisional cast on from bottom of front and back of work, placing the sts onto a 3.25mm (US 3) circular needle.

Rnd 1: Working in MC, join in the round by slipping first st from RH needle onto LH needle, k2tog.

K79 (87: 97: 105: 117: 129), k2tog, k79(87: 97: 105: 117: 129), and pm for beg of round. 160 (176: 196: 212: 236: 260) sts

Rnd 2: Purl.

Rnd 3: Knit.

Repeat Rnds 2 – 3 three times more (9 rounds worked in total).

Cast off knitwise.

Neck edging

With RS facing, beginning at left front edge and using MC and 3.25mm (US 3) circular needle, pick up and knit 8 (10: 10: 10: 10: 10) sts down left front neck, knit 33 (37: 41: 45: 47: 53) sts from holder, pick up and knit 8 (10: 10: 10: 10: 10) sts up right front neck to shoulder, 7 (9: 9: 9: 9) sts from right back neck, knit 33 (37: 41: 45: 47: 53) sts from holder and 7 (9: 9: 9: 9) sts up left back neck to shoulder. Join in the round and pm for beg of rnd.
96 (112: 120: 128: 132: 144) sts

Knit 1 rnd.

Purl 1 rnd.

Rep these 2 rnds twice more, then knit 1 more rnd.
Cast off knitwise.

Sew up side seams and sleeve seams using mattress stitch.

Sew sleeve caps into armhole, gathering the fullness at the top, around the shoulder seams, to create the sculptural effect.
