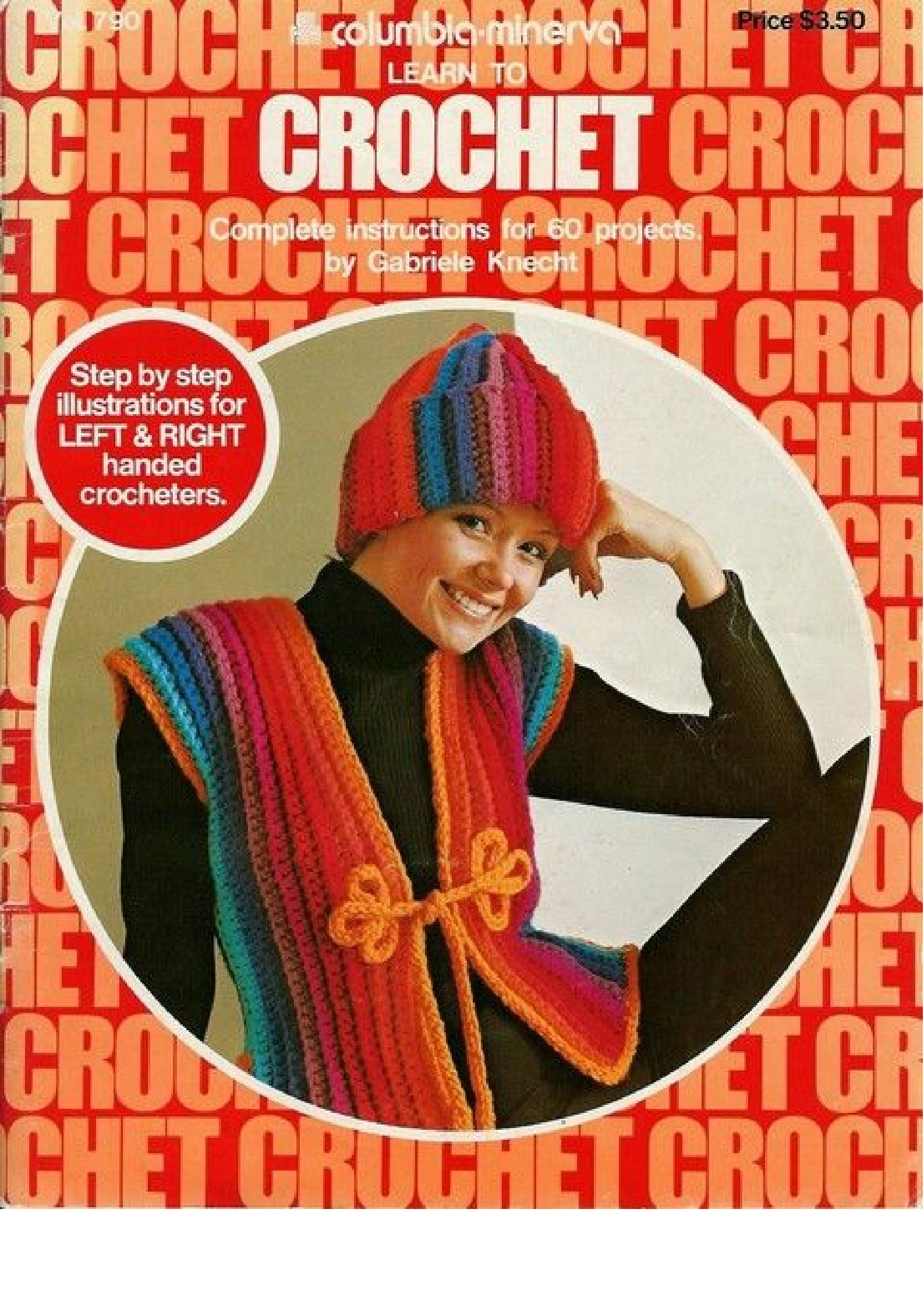

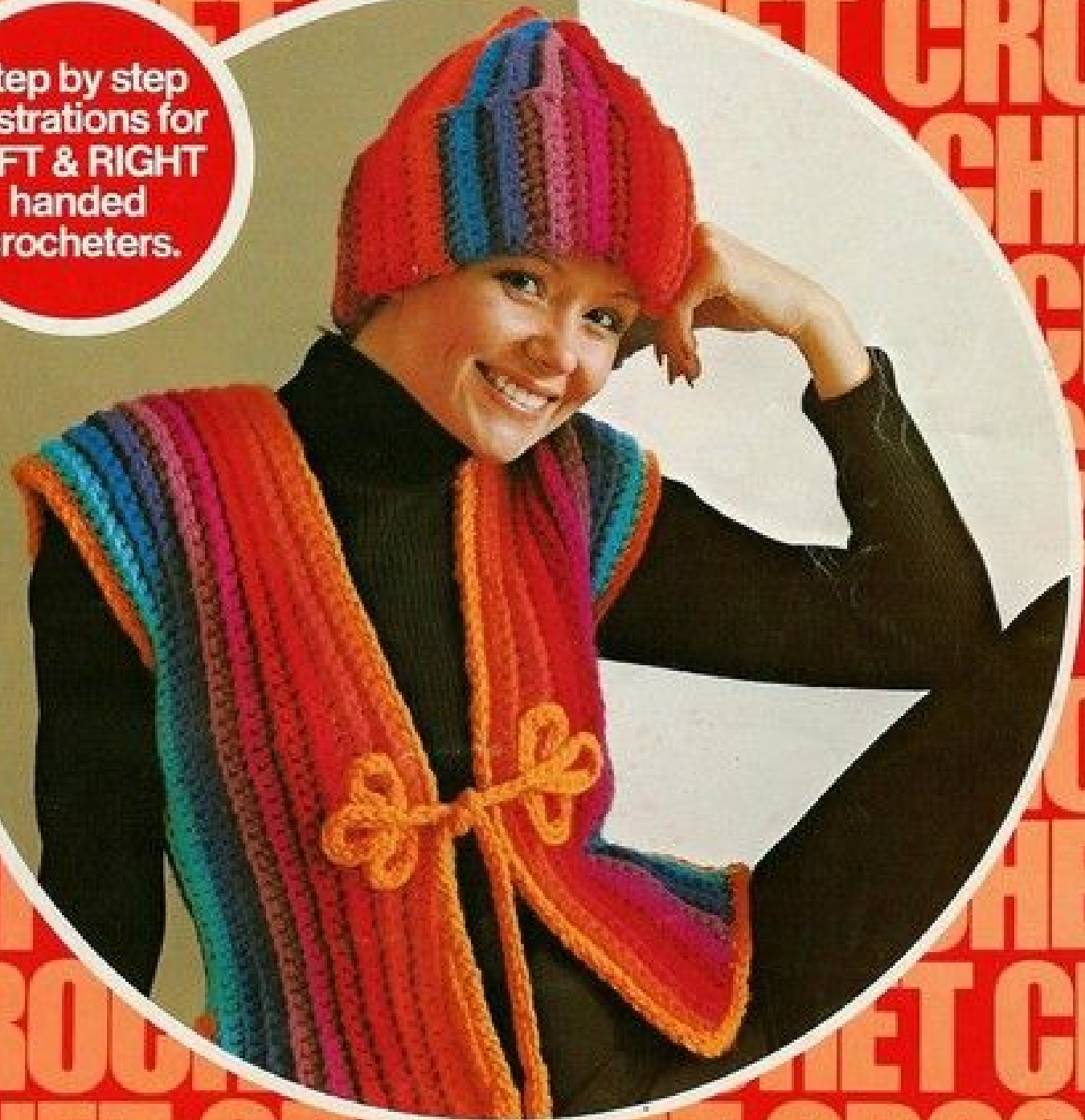

Interchangeable Yarn

Washing Instructions for Wool: Wash by hand in mild soap flakes, cold water soap or mild detergent. Squeeze suds through but **do not rub**. Be sure soap is thoroughly dissolved before immersing the item and test the water for tepid, lukewarm temperature. Do not soak for more than a few minutes. Rinse thoroughly. Be sure that no soap remains in garment. Always support the garment in your hands when lifting from water to prevent stretching. Never wring or twist, just squeeze gently. Roll garments in terry towel to absorb excess moisture. Shape garment on smooth surface to original size. Keep away from heat and sunlight which may affect white and pastels.

Important

A few drops of white vinegar in final rinse sets the color and prevents "bleeding" of one color into another. This is very helpful especially when white is combined with other colors.

Washing Instructions for Nantuk Yarns: Use method most convenient for you. Turn garment inside out.

Machine Laundering: Set at moderate temperature and cycle using suitable soap or detergent. A fabric softener is recommended in final rinse. Do not use chlorine bleach. Machine washed items should be machine dried. **Hand Washing:** Use cold or warm water. Follow same instructions as for wool. Machine dry at moderate temperature and cycle, or hand dry same as wool. Do not hang knits or crochets. Do not dry in sunlight.

Gauge

The stitch gauge or number of stitches to the inch which appears at the beginning of all instructions is most important to the size and fit of your project. Before starting, make a sample swatch of the pattern stitch with the hook and yarn specified.

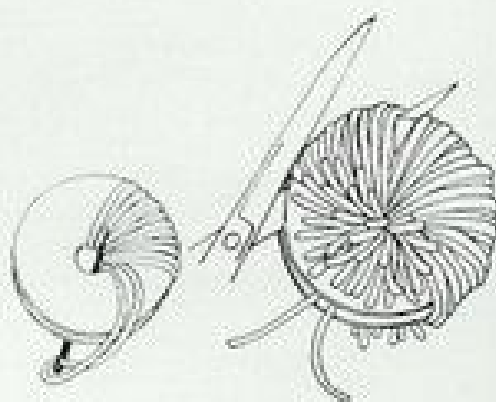
If you get **MORE** stitches to the inch than called for, use a **LARGER** hook.

If you get **FEWER** stitches to the inch than called for, use a **SMALLER** hook.

The size of the hook used does not matter as long as your stitch gauge is correct.

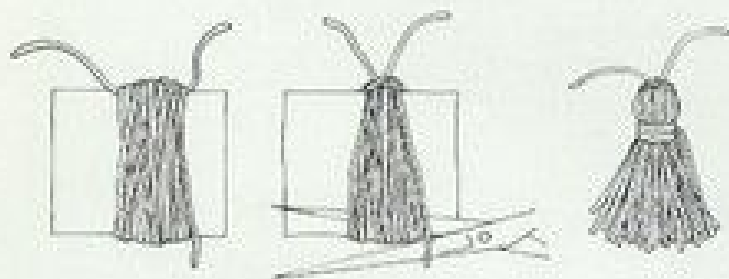
To Make a Pompon

Cut two cardboard circles the desired size of pompon; cut out hole in center of both. The larger the hole the thicker the pompon. Thread needle with two strands of yarn. Place circles together. Working through holes, wind with yarn until desired thickness. Slip scissors between disks. Cut through all strands at outer edge. Draw new strand of yarn between circles and wind several times very tightly around cut strands; knot, leaving ends for attaching pompon. Remove circles; shake well and trim ends.



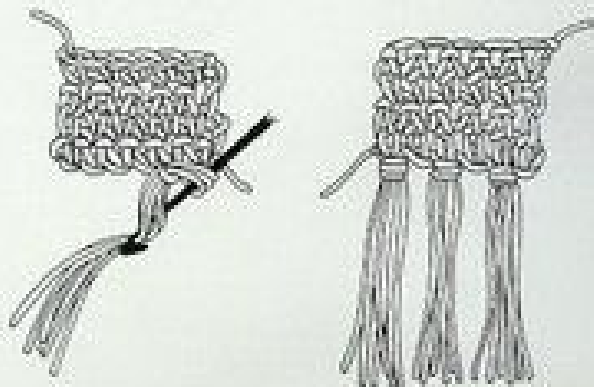
To Make a Tassel

Place short strand of yarn across top of cardboard cut to length of tassel desired. Wind yarn several times around cardboard. Tie strands tightly together around top as shown, leaving at least 3" ends on tie; clip other end of strands. Wrap piece of yarn tightly around strands a few times about 1" below tie and knot. Trim ends.



To Make Fringe

Cut strands of yarn desired length and place in groups of 3 or more strands according to the thickness required. With the wrong side of the edge to be fringed facing you, insert a crochet hook as near the edge as possible, fold strands in half to form a loop, put loop on hook, pull through edge of work, place hook behind all strands of yarn and draw through loop. Trim ends evenly.

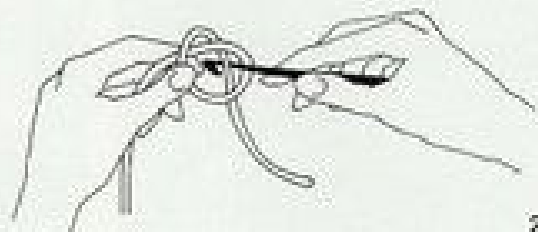
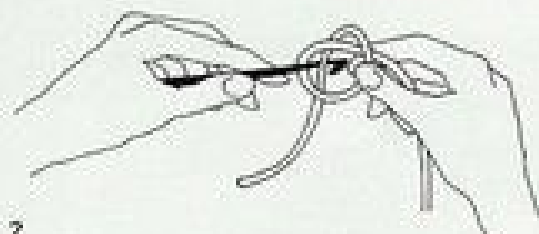

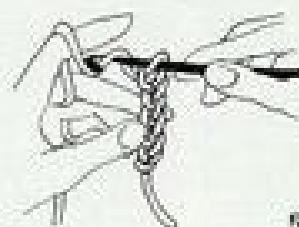
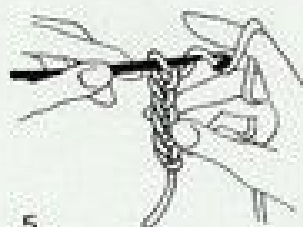
2. Make a slip knot several inches from yarn end.

4. Hold slip knot with thumb and middle finger. Bring yarn over hook and draw through loop making first chain stitch.

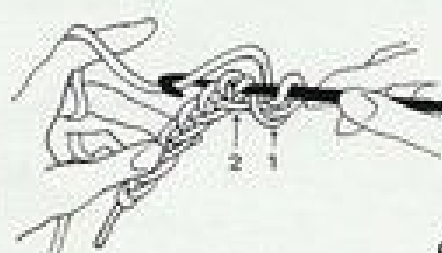
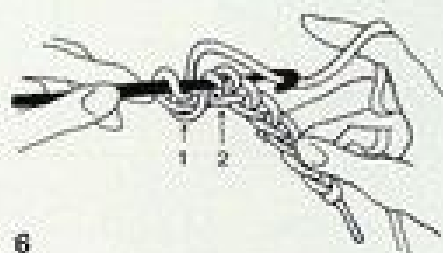


5. Repeat for as many chain stitches as required. (One loop always remains on hook, but does not count as a chain.) This is the foundation for all crochet stitches. Practice until you can make chains even in size.

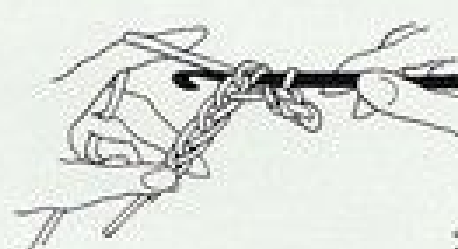
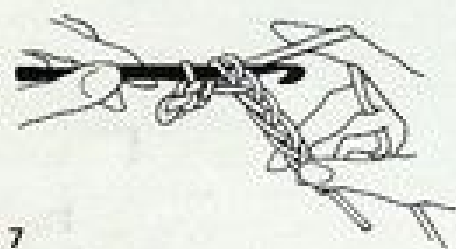

Chain Stitch & Slip Stitch

TIE BELT, PLANT HANGER, CARRY-ALL & JULIET CAP

The following items were made with **Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY** (2 oz skein)

You Need: For Belt - 1 skein each A & B

For Plant Hanger - 1 skein MC

For Carry-All - 2 skeins MC

For Cap - 1 skein each A, B & C

"Boye" crochet hook Size K or size to give gauge

Gauge: 3 chs or 2 sl sts to 1"

TIE BELT (Photo page 5)

With A, ch 190 to measure approx 72". Sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Fasten off. Make a 2nd ch in same way. Knot chains tog 18" from each end. Join color B to 7th sl st from knot on top chain, ch 4, sk first 9 sl sts of bottom chain (from knot), sl st in next st, * ch 4, sk 3 sts of top ch, sl st in next st, ch 4, sk 3 sts of bottom chain, sl st in next st; rep from * 14 times, fasten off. Weave in ends.

PLANT HANGER (Photo page 5)

Finished Measurement: To fit 4 1/2" pot

Beg at bottom, ch 15, join with sl st to first ch to form ring. **Rnd 1:** [Ch 9, sk 2 chs, sl st in next ch] 4 times, ch 9, sk 2 chs, join with sl st to sl st of ring (5 petals formed), sl st across 5 chs to center of first petal.

Rnds 2 & 3: [Ch 9, sl st in center ch of next petal] 4 times, ch 9, sl st to 5th sl st at beg of rnd, sl st across 5 chs to center of first petal. **Rnd 4:** [Ch 7, sl st in center ch of next petal] 4 times, ch 7, sl st to 5th sl st at beg of rnd. **Rnd 5:** Sl st in each ch around, join with sl st to first sl st. Do not fasten off.

Ties (Make 5): Ch 40, fasten off, leaving a 3" end.

Join yarn to point between each petal, ch 40, fasten off. Knot ends together, leaving 2 1/2" ends for tassel.

CARRY-ALL (Photo page 5)

Beg at bottom, ch 15, join with sl st to first ch to form ring. **Rnd 1:** [Ch 7, sl st in next ch] 14 times, ch 7, join with sl st to first ch (15 lps formed), sl st across 4 chs to center of first lp. **Rnds 2-15:** [Ch 7, sl st in center ch of next lp] 14 times, ch 7, sl st to 4th sl st at beg of rnd, sl st across 4 chs to center of first lp. **Rnd 16:** [Ch 5, sl st in center ch of next lp] 14 times, ch 5, end as Rnd 2. **Rnd 17:** Sl st in each ch around, join with sl st to first sl st. Do not fasten off. Ch 53 for strap, join and secure with sl st to opposite side. Sl st in each ch across, fasten off. Cut ten 16" ends for each tassel, knot around each end of strap as shown.

JULIET CAP (Photo page 5)

With A, ch 16, join with sl st to first ch to form ring. **Rnd 1:** [Ch 9, sk 1 ch, sl st in next ch] 7 times, ch 9, sk 1 ch, join with sl st to sl st of ring (8 lps formed), fasten off A. **Rnd 2:** Join B to center ch of a lp, [ch 9, sl st in center ch of next lp] 7 times, ch 9, sl st in same ch with joining, sl st across 5 chs to center of first lp. **Rnd 3:** [Ch 11, sl st in center ch of next lp] 7 times, ch 11, sl st to 5th sl st at beg of rnd, fasten off B. **Rnd 4:** Join C to center ch of a lp, [ch 9, sl st in center ch of next lp] 7 times, ch 9, join as Rnd 2, sl st across 5 chs to center of first lp. **Rnd 5:** [Ch 7, sl st in center ch of next lp] 7 times, ch 7, join as Rnd 3, sl st across 4 chs to center of first lp. **Rnd 6:** [Ch 7, sl st in center ch of next lp] 7 times, ch 7, join to 4th sl st at beg of rnd. **Rnd 7:** Sl st in each ch around, fasten off.

Single Crochet

POMPON SCARF, HEADBAND & MITTENS

The following items were made with **Columbia-Minerva NANTUK DENIM 4-PLY** (4 oz skein)

You Need: For Scarf - 1 skein

For Headband - 1 skein

For Mittens - 1 skein

"Boye" crochet hook Size I or size to give gauge.

Tapestry needle

Gauge: 3 sc to 1"; 4 rows to 1"

SCARF (Photo page 5)

Ch 13 to measure approx 4 1/2". **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across (12 sc), ch 1, turn. **Row 2:** Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn. Rep Row 2 for 87" or desired length. Fasten off leaving a 4" end.

Finishing: Thread end into tapestry needle and draw through sts tightly and secure. Gather other end in same way. Make a pompon following instructions, page 2. Sew to each end.

HEADBAND (Photo page 5)

Work same as for Scarf for 14". Fasten off. Gather ends.

Ties (Make 2): Join double strand of yarn at center of

one end, ch 65 for tie, sl st in 2nd ch and in each ch across, join with sl st at center of gathered ends. Finish with pompons same as for Scarf.

MITTENS (Photo page 5)

Beg at cuff, ch 22 to measure approx 7 1/2". **Row 1 (right side):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across (21 sc); ch 1, turn at end of every row. **Rows 2-10:** Sc in each sc across. **Row 11:** * Sc in next 3 sc, inc 1 st in next sc; rep from * ending sc in last sc (26 sc). Work 1 row even. **Thumb Gusset - Row 13:** Sc in first 12 sc, inc 1 st in each of next 2 sc, sc in last 12 sc (28 sc). Work 2 rows even. **Row 16:** Sc in first 12 sc, inc 1 st in next sc, sc in next 2 sc, inc 1 st in next sc, sc in last 12 sc (30 sc). Work 2 rows even. **Row 19:** Sc in first 12 sc, inc 1 st in next sc, sc in next 4 sc, inc 1 st in next sc, sc in last 12 sc (32 sc). **Row 20:** Sc in first 12 sc, sk 8 sc (thumb opening), fold mitten in half at center of thumb gusset, sc in last 12 sc (24 sc). Work even for 13 rows more or 1 1/2" less than desired length to top. **Shape top - Row 34:**

Single Crochet

Dec 4 sts evenly spaced. Work 1 row even. Rep last 2 rows twice (12 sc). Fasten off, thread yarn end into tapestry needle. Draw through rem sts, pull tight and secure. With right side facing, through double thickness, work 1 sc in end of each row for side seam. **Thumb:** With right side facing, work 1 sc in sc at right of thumb sts, sc in each of 8 sc of thumb, sc in next sc (10 sc). Work even for 6 rows more or desired length of thumb. **Last Row:** Work 2 sts tog across (5 sc). Fasten off, finish same as top of mitten. Sc thumb tog at side seam.

SLIPPERS, VESTS & HATS

Instructions for the following slippers, vests & hats are written for Child's small size (6-8). Changes for Women's small size (6-8) and Men's small size (34-36) are in parentheses.

SLIPPERS (Photos pages 8, 9 & 12)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY (2 oz skein), 2(2-3) MC; for Child's slippers small amount of A. "Boye" crochet hook Size K or size to give gauge.

Gauge: 5 sc to 2"; 8 ridges to 7"

Begin at back edge with MC, ch 21 (25-27) to measure approx 8" (10-10 1/2)". **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch to end, 20(24-26) sc. Ch 1, turn. **Row 2 - (right side):** * Working in BACK LPS only, sc in next 7(8-8) sc (side) *, working in BOTH LPS, sc in next 6(8-10) sc (sole); rep between *s once - 20(24-26) sc. Ch 1, turn. **Next 8(10-12) Rows:** Rep Row 2.

Next 4 Rows: Working in pat as established, sk first sc of each row (1 sc dec each row); 16(20-22) sc. **Next 6 (8-10) Rows:** Work even in pat as established. Fasten off leaving end for sewing.

Finishing: Thread needle and pass through sts of last row; draw tog for toe. At back edge, sew 6 (8-8) sts of sides tog, pass needle through 6 (8-10) sts of sole, draw tog for heel. Secure, fasten off. From right side, join yarn at top of toe, through double thickness sc front of slipper tog to end of dec's, sc around top edge of slipper. Join with sl st to sc on top edge, fasten off. For Child's slippers make 2 pompoms as follows: wind A & B 30 times around 2" cardboard (see page 2). Sew to slippers.

CHILD'S VEST, MANDARIN VEST & TOGGLE VEST (Photos pages 8, 9 & 12)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY (2 oz skein)

For Child's - 3 Skeins A (Dk Orange), 2 B (Lt Orange)
For Women's - 1 skein each A (Lt Orange), B (Dk Orange), C (Lt Red), D (Red), E (Cranberry), F (Magenta), G (Violet), H (Purple), I (Bright Blue) and J (Turquoise).
For Men's - 8 skeins MC, 1 skein A; 2 toggles

Hook and Gauge: Same as Slippers

Note - Color Sequence: Child's vest is made alternating 2 Rows B, 2 Rows A; Women's Vest, 2 Rows each B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, & J; Men's Vest in MC.

Main Piece (Make 2): Begin at center edge with B(8-MC), ch 91(101-109) to measure approx 36(40-44)". **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch to end, 90(100-108) sc. Ch 1, turn. **Row 2 (right side):** Working in BACK LPS only, sc in each sc (1 ridge made). Ch 1, turn. Following

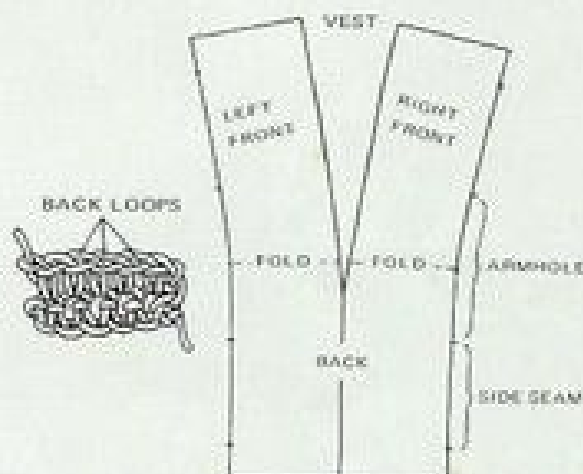
color sequence, rep Row 2 for a total of 14 (18-22) rows from beg or 7(9-11) ridges. Fasten off.

Finishing: Following diagram, sew 36(39-42) sts tog for back seam. Fold in half, leaving 9(11-12) sts at lower edge free. Sew next 17(19-21) sts tog for side seams. Join A at lower right front, from right side work sc in each st and row around edge working 2 sc in each lower corner, join to first sc. Sl st in each sc around, fasten off. Work sc and sl st around armholes in same way.

For Child's Vest - Lower Ties: Sk 11 sts from lower front edge, join A in next st, ch 20. Sl st in each ch, secure and fasten off. **Upper Ties:** Sk 8 sts above lower ties, work in same way.

For Women's Vest - Decorative Ties (Make 2): With A, ch 80. Sl st in each ch, fasten off. Pin ties to vest front about 7" from lower edge, wind in 3 loops (see page 9). Tack in place.

For Men's Vest: For lower loop, join A to 15th st from lower left front edge, ch 12, sl st at joining, fasten off. Sk 12 sts above lower loop, work upper loop in same way. With A, sew toggles opposite loops.



HATS (Photos pages 8, 9 & 12)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY (2 oz skein)

For Child's - 1 skein each A & B

For Women's - 1 skein each B, C, D, E, F, G, H & I

For Men's - 3 skeins MC

Hook and Gauge: Same as Slippers

Note: Child's Hat is made alternating 2 rows A, 2 rows B; Women's Hat, 2 rows each B, C, D, E, F, G, H & I; Men's Hat entirely in MC.

Begin at back seam, ch 33 (37-37) to measure approx 13(15-15)". **Row 1 (right side):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch to end, 32(36-36) sc. Ch 1, turn. **Row 2:** Working this and all following rows in BACK LPS only, sc in next 27(30-30) sc, do not work in last 5(6-6) sts (top shaping). Ch 1, turn. **Row 3:** Sc in each of 27(30-30) sc. Ch 1, turn. **Row 4:** Sc in each of 32(36-36) sc. Ch 1, turn. **Row 5:** Sc in each of 32(36-36) sc. Ch 1, turn. Rep Rows 2-5 for a total of 44(48-50) rows or 22(24-25) ridges from beg. Fasten off, leaving end for sewing.

Finishing: Thread needle, weave through ends of rows to

BOOTS (Photo page 9)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY (2 oz skein), 1 each A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I & J (see colors on Women's Vest page 27)

Hook & Gauge: Same as Slippers

Beg at back seam with J (Turquoise), ch 69 to measure approx 28". **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch to end (68 sc). Ch 1, turn. **Row 2 (right side):**

* Working in BACK LPS only, sc in each of 30 sc (side). *, working in BOTH LPS, sc in next 8 sc (sole); rep between *'s once (68 sc). Join color I, ch 1, turn.

Rows 3-14: Rep Row 2, working 2 rows each I, H, G, F, E & D. Fasten off, turn. **Row 15:** Sk 23 sts, join C in next st, sc in same st with joining and in BACK LPS of next 6 sc, sc in BOTH LPS of next 8 sc, sc in BACK LPS of next 8 sc, do not work in last 22 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 16-18: Skipping first st of each row, work in established pat and color sequence of 1 more row C and 2 rows B (1 sc dec each row - 20 sc). Ch 1, turn.

Rows 19-24: Work in established pat on 20 sc in color sequence of 2 rows each C, D & E, fasten off.

Finishing: Finish toe and heel same as Slippers. Sew back seam. With A from right side beg at top through double thickness, sc boot tog along front edge to toe. Fasten off. Beg at first sc, sl st in each sc. Fasten off. For ties, ch 130 to measure approx 50". Sl st in each ch. Sew at back seam 3" above heel. Tie as shown.

ENVELOPE BAG (Photo page 9)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY (2 oz skein), 1 each A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I & J

Hook & Gauge: Same as Slippers

With B, ch 26. Rep Rows 1 & 2 of Vest, page 27 (25 sc). Rep Row 2 working in color sequence of 2 rows each C, D, E, F, G, H & I, 6 rows J, 2 rows each I, H, G, F, E, D, C, B, A, B, C, D, E, F & G. Fasten off.

Finishing: Fold bag at center J stripe. Through double thickness matching stripes, with A, sc left side edge tog from B through J, fasten off. Beg in first sc, sl st in each sc. Fasten off. Beg at J stripe, sc right edge tog, ch 25 for loop, join to bag. Sl st in each sc.

MINI BAGS (Photo page 9)

Instructions are written for the 2 - color bag. Changes for multicolor bag are in parentheses.

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY (2 oz skein)

For 2-Color Bag - 1 skein each I & J

For Multicolor Bag - 1 each A, B, C, D, E, F, G & H

Hook & Gauge: Same as Slippers

Main Piece (Make 2): With (H), ch 17(19) to measure approx 7(8)". Rep Rows 1 & 2 of Vest, page 27 - 16(18) sc. Rep Row 2 for a total of 12 rows from beg, working 2-Color bag in I, Multicolor bag in color sequence of 2 rows each B, C, D, E, F & G. Ch 1, turn. **Last 2 Rows:** Sk first sc, sc in each sc to last 2 sc, sk next sc, sc in last sc, 12(14) sc. Fasten off.

Finishing: With J(A) through double thickness, right side facing you, sc bag tog working sc in each matching row

and st around sides and bottom. Ch 75 (about 30") for strap, join to first sc, sl st in each sc and ch of strap. Fasten off.

BABY SET & COVERLET (Photo page 8)

Instructions are written for Infant Size (newborn to 6 months). Changes for Size 1 are in parentheses.

BABY SET

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK TWEED 4-PLY (2 oz skein), 3 MC; NANTUK 4-PLY (4 oz skein), 1 A. "Boye" crochet hook Size J or size to give gauge

Gauge: 7 sc to 2"; 7 ridges to 4"

BABY SET JACKET

Main Piece: Beg at center edge with MC **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch to end, 67(73) sc. Ch 1, turn. **Row 2 (right side):** Working in BACK LPS only, sc in each sc, 67(73) sc. Ch 1, turn (1 ridge made). Rep Row 2 for a total of 18(20) rows from beg or 9(10) ridges. Fasten off. Make a 2nd piece in same way.

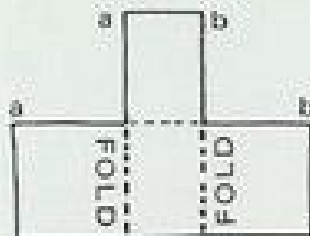
Sleeve: With wrong side of last row worked facing you, sk 19(21) sc of last row. **Row 1:** Join yarn in next sc, sc in same st with joining, sc in BACK LPS of next 28(30) sc, leave rem 19(21) sc unworked, ch 1, turn. **Row 2 (right side):** Rep Row 2 of Main Piece, 29(31) sc. Work in ridge pat for a total of 10(12) rows or 5(6) ridges for sleeve. Fasten off. Work sleeve on other Main Piece in same way.

Finishing: Sew 27 (30) sts tog for back seam. Fold in half (see diagram page 27), leaving 7 sts at bottom edges free. Sew side and sleeve seams. With right side facing, join A at lower right front, sc in each sc and row, working 2 sc in each lower corner. Join with a sl st to first sc, sl st in each sc around, fasten off. Work sc and sl st around sleeve edges in same way. **Upper and Lower Ties:** Work same as Child's Vest page 27.

BABY SET CAP

Beg at bottom edge, with MC, ch 18 (20). **Row 1:** Rep Row 1 of Jacket 17(19) sc. **Rows 2-14:** Rep Row 2 of Jacket (7 ridges). At end of Row 14, ch 16 for center piece. **Row 15:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch, working in BACK LPS only, sc in each sc to end, 32(34) sc. Ch 1, turn. **Rows 16-24(26):** Rep Row 2 of Jacket, 12(13) ridges from beg. At end of Row 24(26), fasten off, turn. Sk first 15 sc, join yarn in next sc, sc in same sc as joining, sc in BACK LPS of next 16(18) sc. Work on 17(19) sc for 13 rows more, a total of 19(20) ridges from beg. Fasten off.

Finishing: Sew side edges to center piece following diagram. From right side join A at beg of front edge, sc in each row across front edge, 3 sc at corner, sc in next 17(19) sc, [sc in next ridge, sk 1 row] 5(6) times, sc in each of next 17(19) sc, work 2 sc at corner. Ch 35 for tie, sl st in each ch and join with sl st to first sc, sl st in each sc to next corner, work 2nd tie in same way and sl st around. Fasten off.

BABY SET BOOTIES

Beg at back edge, with MC, ch 19(21). **Row 1:** Rep Row 1 of Jacket, 18(20) sc. **Row 2 (right side):** * Working in BACK LPS only, sc in next 6 sc (side) *, working in BOTH LPS, sc in next 6(8) sc(sole); rep between *'s once - 18(20) sc. Ch 1, turn. **Next 8(10) Rows:** Rep Row 2. **Next 6 Rows:** Working in pat as established, sk first sc of each row (1 sc dec each row) - 12(14) sc. Ch 1, turn at end of every row. Fasten off, leaving end for sewing. **Finishing:** Sew tog same as Slippers (see page 27). With A, sc toe of booties tog and work top edge same as Slippers do not join. * Ch 10 for tie, sl st in each ch *, join; rep between *'s once, sl st in each sc around top. Fasten off.

COVERLET (Approx 32½" x 27")

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY (2 oz skein), 2 each A, B, D, & E; 3 C. "Boye" crochet hook Size K or size to give gauge
Gauge: 5 sc to 2"; 8 ridges to 7"
With A, ch 65 to measure approx 26". **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch to end (65 sc), ch 1, turn. **Row 2 (right side):** Working in BACK LPS only, sc in each sc to end working off last 2 lps with B (65 sc). Ch 1, turn (1 ridge made), cut A. Continue in stripe pat of 2 Rows each B, C, D, E & A, repeating Row 2 for a total of 70 rows (35 ridges) or 7 stripe pattern repeats. Fasten off. **Edging:** With C working from right side, and beg in top corner, * work 3 sc in corner, sc in each sc across, 3 sc in corner, sc in each row of side; rep from * once, join with sl st to first sc. Sl st in each sc around. Fasten off.

CHECKERED PILLOW, WOODLAND SCARF & HARLEQUIN AFGHAN

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK 4-PLY (4 oz skein)
For Pillow - 2 skeins each C & D; 18" pillow form or polyester filling
For Scarf - 1 skein each A, B, C, D & E
For Afghan - 1 skein F, 2 skeins each G, H, I, J & K
"Boye" crochet hook Size J or size to give gauge
Gauge: 3 sc to 1"; 3 rows to 1"; square is approx 4½"
CHECKERED PILLOW (Approx 18" square) (Photo page 12)
SQUARE (Make 16 of each color): Ch 15 to measure approx 4½". **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch to end (14 sc), ch 1, turn. **Row 2 (right side):** Working in BACK LPS only, sc in each sc (1 ridge made), ch 1, turn. **Rows 3-14:** Rep Row 2. Fasten off. **Finishing:** Working from wrong side matching sts to rows (alternating as in photograph), sl st 16 squares tog for front and back. With C, from right side through double

thickness and matching squares, sc front and back tog on 3 sides, working 3 sc in each corner. Insert form or filling, join 4th side. Sl st in each sc around, fasten off. Make 4 tassels (see page 2) and attach to pillow as shown.

WOODLAND SCARF (Photo page 12)

Center Square: With A, work same as for Pillow Square working off last sc with B. Fasten off A, ch 1, turn. **Row 1:** Working in BACK LPS only, sc in each sc, working 3 sc in ch-1 (corner), sc in each row down side (31 sc), ch 1, turn. **Row 2:** Sk first sc, working in BACK LPS only, sc in next 14 sc, in next sc work 3 sc, sc in next 14 sc, do not work in last sc (31 sc), ch 1, turn. Rep Row 2 working 18 rows each of Colors B, C, D & E. Fasten off. For other side of square, join yarn at beg of foundation chain. Ch 1, do not turn. Sc in same ch with joining and in each ch across, continue as on other side.

HARLEQUIN AFGHAN (Approx 60" x 46") (Photo page 16)

Center Square (Make 7): With F work same as for Pillow Square (fasten off first 6 squares). On 7th square work off last sc with G, fasten off F. **Ripple Stripes - Ch 1, turn. Row 1:** Work same as Row 1 of Scarf (31 sc). [pick up another square, hold with same side facing you as first square, work 31 sc on square as before] 6 times - 7 squares joined (217 sc). Ch 1, turn. **Row 2:** Sk first sc, * working in BACK LPS only, sc in next 14 sc, in next sc work 3 sc (corner), sc in next 14 sc, sk 2 sc *, on next 5 squares rep between *'s; on last square sc in next 14 sc, work corner, sc in next 14 sc, do not work in last sc (217 sc). Ch 1, turn. Rep Row 2 for pat working 12 more rows G, then 14 rows each H, I, J & K. With wrong side facing, join G and work on other sides of squares to correspond. Sew in all ends neatly.

POT HOLDER, PILLOW, RUG & AFGHAN SQUARES

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY (2 oz skein)

For Pot Holder - 1 each A & B

For Pillow - 4 A & 7 C, 19" pillow form or polyester filling

For Afghan - 27 A

For Rug - 5 C, 1 each B & D and NANTUK TWEED 4-PLY (2 oz skein), 3 E

"Boye" crochet hook Size K or size to give gauge

POT HOLDER (Approx 7" square) (Photo page 17)

Gauge: 5 sc to 2"; 5 rows to 2"

SQUARE (Make 2): With A, ch 3, join with a sl st to first ch to form ring, ch 1, do not turn. **Row 1:** Work 3 sc in ring, ch 1, turn. **Row 2 (right side):** Sc in first sc, 3 sc in next sc (corner), sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. **Row 3:** Sc in next 2 sc, 3 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. Continue rows, having 1 sc more each side of corner and working 3 sc in corner sc, until there are 8 rows from beg (17 sc). * Do not ch or turn. Draw B through lp on hook, drop A and with B, ch 1, turn. **Row 9:** With B and working over A strand, work as before. Draw A through B lp, drop B and with A, ch 1, turn. **Row 10:** With A and working over B strand, work as before. Rep from * twice. (29 sc). Fasten off A. Join B from right side in center of ring formed by ch-3. **Rnd 1:** Work 3 sc in ring (corner),

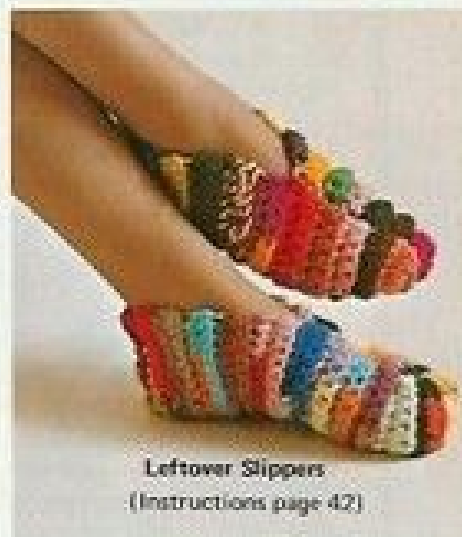

sc in end of next 8 A rows and in end of next 5 stripe rows, sk last A row, 3 sc in next sc (corner), sc in next 13 sc, 3 sc in next sc (corner), sc in next 13 sc, 3 sc in next sc (corner), sk next A row, sc in end of next 13 rows, join with a sl st to first sc, Ch 7, join with a sl st to 3rd sc of corner (ring for hanging). **To Join Squares:** Hold wrong sides tog and match corners. Insert hook through first ch of ch-7 of both squares. Draw B through, ch 1, working through both squares, work sl st in each ch, then working through **top lps** only, work sl st in each sc around. Fasten off. Sew in ends.

PILLOW (Approx 19" square) (Photo page 17)

Gauge: Same as pot holder; 1 square is 4"

SQUARE (Make 32): With C, having Row 1 as right side, work first 5 rows same as for Pot Holder (11 sc). Draw A through lp on hook, ch 1, turn. Cut C. Continue rows as before until there are 4 A rows (19 sc). Fasten off A. Join C from right side in center of ring formed by ch-3. **Row 1:** Work same as Pot Holder, working over 8 rows instead of 13 rows, having 8 sc instead of 13 sc between corners and omitting ch-7 lp. Fasten off. **To Join Squares (First Strip):** Hold wrong sides of 2 squares tog following photograph and matching corners. Insert hook through center sc of a corner on both squares, draw C through, ch 1 and working through **top lps** only, work sl st in each sc to center sc of next corner (12 sts). Fasten off. Continue to join until there are 4 squares joined. Join 7 more strips in same way. **To Join Strips:** Hold as before and beg at a corner, work sc in each sc and in each joining of squares to last corner sc. Join 4 strips for back and for front. **To Join Back and Front:** Hold as before and join 3 sides as for strips. Stuff or insert pillow form. Join 4th side. Fasten off.

RUG (Approx 38" x 25") (Photo page 17)

Gauge: Same as pot holder; 1 square is 6"

SQUARE (Make 24): With 2 strands E held tog, having Row 1 as right side, work first 7 rows same as for Pot Holder (15 sc). Draw single strand D through lp on hook, ch 1, turn. Cut E. Continue rows as before, working 2 rows each D, B & C (27 sc). Fasten off C. Join C in center of ring and work Row 1 as for Pillow, working over 12 rows instead of 8 rows and having 12 sc between corners. **To Join Squares (First Strip):** Join same as for Pillow until there are 6 squares in row (16 sc each side). Fasten off. Join 3 more strips in same way. Join strips same as for Pillow. **Border:** From right side, join C in corner sc, sc in same place with joining, * sc in each sc and joining to next corner, 3 sc in corner; rep from * around, end 2 sc in same place with joining. Join with a sl st to first sc. Fasten off. Working from right side on short end (with 2 rows C),

work 3rd row of sc on end and side. Fasten off. Work 4th row on same end and side. Fasten off.

AFGHAN (Approx 66" x 50") (Photo page 17)

Gauge: Square is approx 8"

SQUARE (Make 48): Work same as for Pot Holder through Row 8 (17 sc). Ch 4, turn (counts as first dc and ch-1 of next row). **Row 9:** Sk first 2 sc, dc in next sc (1 mesh), ch 1, * sk next sc, dc in next sc, ch 1 *; rep between *'s once more, sk next sc, in corner sc work dc, ch 3, dc (corner), ch 1; rep between *'s 3 times, sk next sc, dc in last sc (4 mesh each side of corner). Ch 1, turn. **Row 10:** Sc in each dc and ch-1 sp to corner, 3 sc in corner ch-3 sp, sc in each dc and ch-1 sp to ch-4 (turning ch), sc under turning ch, sc in 3rd ch of ch-4 (21 sc). Ch 4, turn. **Row 11:** Sk first 2 sc, dc in next sc, ch 1, * sk next sc, dc in next sc, ch 1 *; rep between *'s twice more, sk next sc, in corner sc work dc, ch 3, dc, ch 1; rep between *'s 4 times, sk next sc, dc in last sc (5 mesh each side of corner). Ch 1, turn. **Row 12:** Rep Row 10 (25 sc). **Row 13:** Sk first 2 sc, dc in next sc, ch 1, * sk next sc, dc in next sc, ch 1 *; rep between *'s 3 times more, sk next sc, work corner as before, ch 1; rep between *'s 5 times, sk next sc, dc in last sc (6 mesh each side of corner). Ch 1, turn. **Row 14:** Rep Row 10 (29 sc). **Row 15:** Sk first 2 sc, dc in next sc, ch 1, * sk next sc, dc in next sc, ch 1 *; rep between *'s 4 times more, sk next sc, work corner as before, ch 1; rep between *'s 6 times, sk next sc, dc in last sc (7 mesh each side of corner). Ch 1, turn. **Row 1:** Sc in each dc and ch-1 sp to corner, in corner sp work 3 sc, sc in each dc and ch-1 sp to ch-4 (turning ch), in ch-4 sp work 4 sc (1 sc for side, 3 sc for corner), sc in end of next 14 rows, 3 sc in corner (ring), sc in end of next 14 rows, 2 sc in end of last row, join with a sl st to first sc (4th corner - last sc worked is center sc of corner). Fasten off (16 sc between each corner sc).

Finishing: Sew in all ends neatly on wrong side. With wrong side facing, pin squares to measure 8" and steam lightly (do not allow the weight of the iron to rest on work). **To Join Squares:** Hold 2 squares with wrong sides tog, matching corners (see photograph). With right side of square facing you, insert hook from front to back under **top lp** of corner sc at upper right hand edge and through corresponding corner sc of other square. Draw yarn through, ch 1 to fasten. Taking care to work loosely (seam should be as elastic as crochet piece), sl st in same place with joining. Working through **top lps** only, sl st through each sc to next corner sc, sl st through corner sc's (18 sts joined). Fasten off. Join 8 strips of 6 squares each. Hold strips together as for joining of squares and work sl st in each sc and at joinings until all strips are joined. Sew in ends.

Double Crochet

GRANNY SQUARE VEST FAMILY (Photo page 20)

Instructions are for Child's Medium Size. Changes for Women's and Men's Medium Size are in parentheses.

You Need: Columbia-Minerva WOOL 4-PLY WORSTED

(4 oz skein)

For Child's - 1 each MC, A and B

For Women's - 2 MC, 1 each A and B

For Men's - NANTUK SWEATER & AFGHAN YARN

(2 oz skein), 5 MC; NANTUK TWEED 4-PLY (2 oz skein), 3 A, "Boye" crochet hook Size H or size to give gauge.

Gauge: 4 sts to 1"; 2 rnds or rows to 1";

Square is 9 (12-14)"

Finished Chest Measurement: 28(34-38)".

IMPORTANT: Please read before beg Vest. Child's and Women's Vest are worked with A, B and MC, Men's with A and MC. Alternate 1 rnd or row of each color as follows:

A, B, MC for Child's and Women's; A and MC for Men's.

SQUARE (Make 2): Following color sequence work same as Rnds 1-4 of Granny Square Afghan page 39. Then, continue working rnds with 1 more grp between corners in each rnd until there are 7 (10-12) grps between corners on Rnd 9(12-14). Join and fasten off.

Vertical Rows for Sides: From right side join next color of sequence in top of dc after a corner sp. **Row 1:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc), dc in next 2 dc of corner grp, dc in each ch-1 sp and each dc to next corner, dc in next 2 dc of corner. Fasten off. **Row 2:** Join next color from right side in top of ch-3 of last row, dc in each dc. Fasten off. Rep last row 3 times. Work other side to correspond. Do not work at top or lower edge of square.

BACK - Yoke: Skip 4 rows from right edge of back for underarm. Join MC under first side row. **Row 1:** Ch 3, dc in first side row, dc in ch-1 sp of corner, dc in each dc and sp to next corner, dc in 3 dc of corner, dc in next sp and work 2 dc in end of first side row, 41(53-61) dc. Ch 3, turn. **Row 2:** Sk first dc, dc in each dc, dc in top of ch-3. Ch 3, turn. Rep last row until 6(7-9)" from beg. Ch 3, turn.

Neck and Shoulders: Sk first dc, dc in next 8(11-12) dc, [yo, draw up a lp in next dc, yo and through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo and through 3 lps (1 dc decrease), dc in next dc. Ch 3, turn. **Row 2:** Sk first dc, decrease, dc in each of next 3(5-7) dc, hdc in each of next 3 dc, sc in next dc, sc in top of ch-3, ch 1, turn. **Row 3:** Sl st in each of 2 sc and in next 2 hdc, sc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 1(3-5) sts, decrease, dc in top of turning ch. Fasten off. Sk center 17(23-29) dc of last complete row. Join yarn in top of next dc. **Row 1:** Ch 3, decrease, work to end. Complete to correspond to first side. Fasten off.

FRONT - Left Yoke: Join as on Row 1 of back yoke.

Row 1: Ch 3, dc in next dc of corner, dc in ch-1 of corner, dc in each dc and ch-1 sp until there are 20(26-30) dc in row (counting ch-3 at beg). Ch 3, turn. **Row 2:** Sk first dc, work decrease, dc in each dc to end. Ch 3, turn. **Row 3:** Dc in each dc to last 3 dc, work decrease, dc in top of ch-3. Ch 3, turn. Continue in this way to decrease 1 st at neck edge every row until there are 9(12-13) dc.

Work to same number of rows as on back armhole, shaping shoulder as on back when armhole is same length. Fasten off. Sk center st and work Right Yoke to correspond.

Sew shoulder and underarm seams. **Neckband:** Join MC at right shoulder seam. **Rnd 1:** Work 2 sc in end of each row to center (skipped st), sc at center front (mark this sc), work same number of sc on left side of neck to shoulder, 2 sc in each row and 1 sc in each dc at back of neck. Join with a sl st to first sc. **Rnd 2:** Ch 3, dc in each

so to 2 sts before marked st, work decrease, dc in

center st, decrease, dc in each so to end. Join and fasten off. **Armhole Bands:** Join MC at underarm seams. Work sc at seam and mark. **Rnd 1:** Work 2 sc under each row at sides and around armholes. Join. **Rnd 2:** Ch 3, work dc decrease, dc in each so, decrease over last 2 sts. Join and fasten off. **Lower Band:** Join next color of sequence at side seam. Working from right side, ch 3, 2 dc under end of each row to corner, dc in 4 dc of corner, dc in each dc of square to next corner, dc in 4 dc of corner, continue around in same way. Join with sl st to top of ch-3 and fasten off. **Rnd 2:** Join next color in top of ch-3, dc in each dc. Join and fasten off. Following color sequence work 1(1-2) rnds more. Sew in all ends neatly. Steam lightly.

CAMISOLE VEST (Photo page 20)

Instructions are for Small (6-8). Changes for Medium (10-12) and Large (14-16) are in parentheses.

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK 4-PLY (4 oz skein), 2 (2-3), "Boye" crochet hook Size I or size to give gauge. Nine 5/8" buttons

Gauge: 3 dc to 1"; 5 dc rows to 3"

Finished Measurement: Bust (buttoned) 31(34-38)"

Body: Camisole is made in one piece, beg at underarm edge and working to lower edge. Ch 96(104-116) to measure approx 32(35-39)". **Row 1 (right side):** Dc in 4th ch from hook and in each ch to end - 94(102-114) dc, counting ch-3 at beg of row as 1 dc. Ch 3, turn.

Rows 2-8: Sk first dc, dc in each dc, dc in top of ch-3 at beg of last row - 94(102-114) dc. **Note:** Ch-3 at beg of row always counts as first dc. Ch 3, turn at end of

every row. **Row 9 (Dec Row):** Sk first dc, work dc in each of next 0(2-0) dc, [yo hook, draw up a lp in next dc, yo and through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo and through 3 lps on hook (1 st dec), [work 16(17-20) dc, decrease 1 st] 5 times, dc in each dc, dc in top of turning ch (6 decreases evenly spaced). **Row 10:** Dec 6 sts directly over decs of Row 9. **Rows 11-15:** Rep Row 2 on 82(90-102) dc until 9" from beg or desired length from underarm to waistline.

Beg Mesh Pattern - Row 16: Sk first dc, dc in each of next 10(14-20) dc, * ch 3, dc in each of next 12 dc; rep from *, end dc in each of last 10(14-20) dc, dc in top of turning ch - 82(90-102) dc and 6 ch-3 sps. **Row 17:** Sk first dc, dc in next 9(13-19) dc, * ch 3, sk next dc, dc in center ch of ch-3, ch 3, sk next dc, dc in next 10 dc; rep from *, end dc in last 9(13-19) dc, dc in top of turning ch - 76(84-96) dc and 12 ch-3 sps. **Row 18:** Sk first dc, dc in next 8(12-18) dc, * [ch 3, sk next dc, dc in center ch of ch-3] twice, ch 3, sk next dc, dc in next 8 dc; rep from *, end dc in last 8(12-18) dc, dc in turning ch - 70(78-90) dc and 18 ch-3 sps. **Row 19:** Sk first dc, dc in next 7(11-17) dc, * [ch 3, sk next dc, dc in center of ch]

3 times, ch 3, sk next dc, dc in next 6 dc; rep from *, end dc in last 7(11-17) dc, dc in turning ch - 64(72-84) dc and 24 ch-3 sps. **Row 20:** Sk first dc, dc in next 6(10-16) dc * [ch 3, sk next dc, dc in center of ch] 4 times, ch 3, sk next dc, dc in next 4 dc; rep from *, end dc in last 6(10-16) dc, dc in turning ch - 58(66-78) dc and 30 ch-3 sps. **Row 21:** Sk first dc, dc in next 5(9-15) dc, * [ch 3, sk

Double Crochet

next dc, dc in center of ch] 5 times, ch 3, sk next dc, dc in next 2 dc; rep from *, end dc in last 5(9-15) dc, dc in turning ch — 52(60-72) dc and 36 ch-3 sps. Fasten off.

Left Strap: With wrong side facing beg at neck edge, join yarn to 9th(10th-11th) dc from left front edge. **Row 1:** Working along foundation chain, ch 3, dc in next 7(8-9) dc, ch 3, turn at end of every row (ch-3 counts as first dc). **Row 2:** Sk first dc, dc in each dc, dc in turning ch — 8(9-10) dc. Rep Row 2 until strap measures 13 (14-15)", or desired length to back. Fasten off leaving end for sewing. Sk 12(14-16) dc for underarm. Sew strap to next 8(9-10) dc. **Right Strap:** With wrong side facing, beg at armhole edge, join yarn to 17th(19th-21st) dc from right front edge. Work same as left strap and sew.

Armhole Edging: With right side facing, join yarn at center underarm, counting turning chs or dcs at end of rows on straps as sts, * sk 2 sts, work 5 dc in next st (shell), sk 2 sts, sl st in next st; rep from * around, join with a sl st to same st with yarn joining. Fasten off.

Lower Edging: With right side facing, beg at lower Right Front edge, join yarn and work edging same as for armhole along fronts, neck, straps and lower edge to beg of mesh pat; work as follows on mesh pat: * [sk 1 ch, sl st in next ch, sk 1 ch, shell in next dc] 5 times, sk 1 ch, sl st in next ch, sk 1 ch & 1 dc, shell in next dc; rep from * to end of mesh pats, complete same as other side and join same as for armholes. Fasten off. Using first st of rows for buttonhole on Right Front, sew 9 buttons evenly spaced to Left Front.

TRIANGULAR SHAWL (Photo page 20)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK 4-PLY (4 oz skein), 3 skeins, "Boye" crochet hook Size I or size to give gauge.

Gauge: 1 mesh to 1"

Beg at neck edge, ch 293 to measure approx 72".

Row 1: Dc in 9th ch from hook, * ch 3, sk 3 ch, dc in next ch; rep from * to end (72 mesh), turn. **Row 2:** Sl st in each of next 2 ch, * ch 3 (sk 1 ch, 1 dc & 1 ch), dc in next (center) ch of ch-3; rep from *, ending dc in 7th ch of ch-8 (1 mesh dec - 71 mesh), turn. **Row 3:** Sl st in each of next 2 ch, * ch 3 (sk 1 ch, 1 dc & 1 ch), dc in next (center) ch of ch-3; rep from *, ending dc in center ch of last ch-3. **Rows 4-37:** Rep Row 3 (36 mesh). **Row 38:** Sl st in each of next 2 ch, * ch 3 (sk 1 ch, 1 dc & 1 ch), dc in center ch of next ch-3; rep from * to last ch-3, do not work mesh in last ch-3 (2 mesh dec - 34 mesh).

Rows 39-54: Rep Row 38 (2 mesh). **Row 55:** Rep Row 3 (1 mesh). Do not fasten off. **Edging:** Ch 1, turn. Work 2 sc in first mesh, * sk 1 sl st, sc in next sl st, 2 sc in next mesh; rep from * to foundation chain, work 4 sc in corner mesh, across foundation ch work 2 sc in each mesh and 1 sc in each dc; work 2nd side to correspond to first (being sure to have same number of sc on each side), join with sl st to ch-1. **Next Rnd:** Ch 3, work 4 dc in same sc with sl st (5 dc counting ch-3), * sk 1 sc, sl st in next sc, sk 1 sc, work 5 dc in next sc; rep from * around, ending sk 1 sc, join with sl st to top of ch-3. Fasten off. For front tie, ch 150, thread through front as shown.

GRANNY SQUARE BLOUSE (Photo page 21)

Instructions are for Medium size.

You Need: Columbia-Minerva WOOL 4-PLY WORSTED (4 oz skein), 2 MC, 1 each A and B. "Boye" crochet hook Size I or size to give gauge

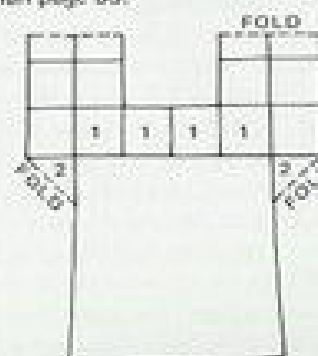
Gauge: 2 rnds to 1"; Large square is 17",

Small square is 3".

Finished Measurement: Bust 34"

LARGE SQUARE (Make 2): With MC, ch 3. Join with a sl st to first ch to form a ring. **Rnd 1:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc), 2 dc in ring, ch 1, [3 dc in ring, ch 1] 3 times, join with a sl st to top of ch-3. **Rnd 2:** Ch 3, 2 dc in ch-1 sp to right of joining, ch 1, 3 dc in same sp, ch 1, [in next ch-1 sp work 3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc, ch 1] 3 times. Join with a sl st to top of ch-3 (all rnds are joined in this way and worked from right side). **Rnd 3:** Ch 3, 2 dc in ch-1 sp to right of joining, ch 1, [in next ch-1 sp work 3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc (corner), ch 1, 3 dc in next ch 1 sp, ch 1] 3 times, work corner, ch 1, join. There are 4 corners with one 3-dc grp between corners. **Rnd 4:** Work as Rnd 3, having two 3-dc grps between corners. Continue rnds with 1 more 3-dc grp between corners in every rnd until there are 15 grps between corners. Join and fasten off.

SMALL SQUARE (Make 26 for Yoke): Using color sequence of A, MC & B, work same as Rnd 1-3 of Granny Square Afghan page 39.



GRANNY SQUARE BLOUSE

To Join Yoke Squares: Follow diagram for placement of squares. Hold right side of 2 squares tog. Using B overcast through top lps only, matching sts. Sew in any loose ends neatly on wrong side. **To Join Yoke to Front:** With right sides tog, pin lower edge of # 1 squares (see diagram) to top edge of large square. Hold front facing you, yoke at back. With crochet hook join B in ch-1 of right hand corner of front and yoke square. Through top lps only work sl st loosely through both pieces (do not draw work), skipping each ch-1 of front square (to gather front to fit yoke), end in corner ch-1 at left edge. Fasten off. Join yoke to back in same way. Fold # 2 squares and overcast to front and back as shown in diagram. Overcast underarm seams.

Picot Edge on Neck: Join B at seam of 2 squares at center back, through back lps, sc in each of next 3 dc, sc in back lp of next ch-1 sp, ch 3, insert hook in top of last sc and under strand at left side of same sc, work sl st (picot), sc in back lp of each dc to joining, sc and picot at

joining. Continue in this way to work sc in each dc, sc and picot in each ch-1 sp and at joining of squares to corner of neck, sc and picot at corner, continue around neck in this way, ending sc and picot in last st. Join with a sl st to first sc. Fasten off. Beg at underarm, work picot edge around armholes in same way.

HOODED GRANNY SQUARE VEST (Photo page 21)

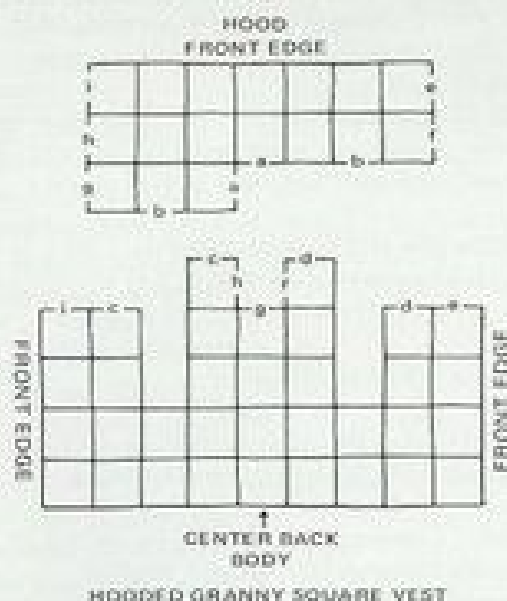
Instructions are for Medium size.

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY (2 oz skein), 4 MC, 3 A; NANTUK TWEED 4-PLY (2 oz skein), 4 B, "Boye" crochet hook Size K or size to give gauge.

Gauge: 1 square is 4 1/2"

Finished Measurement: Bust 39"

SQUARE (Make 51): With A, ch 3, join with a sl st to first ch to form a ring. **Rnd 1:** Same as Rnd 1 of Granny Square Afghan page 39. **Rnd 2:** Holding 2 strands of B tog, work same as Rnd 2 of Granny Square Afghan. Fasten off. **Rnd 3:** Join MC in back lp of a dc after a corner ch-1. * Working in BACK LPS only, sc in each dc and ch-1 to corner ch-1, 3 sc in corner; rep from * around, ending sc in same place with joining. Join with a sl st to first sc and fasten off. Sew in all loose ends neatly on wrong side.



To Join Squares: Follow diagram for placement of squares for body and for hood. With MC and right sides tog, overcast through top lps matching sts.

To Join Hood to Body: Matching letters on diagrams, overcast edges of squares tog as before. **Edge:** With MC, beg at lower center back edge, work sc in each sc (skipping joinings) to corner, 3 sc in corner, continue around entire vest in same way. Join with a sl st to first sc. Fasten off. Join MC at center of underarm square, sc in each sc to within 1 st of corner, draw up a lp in next st, in corner and in first st of next square; yo and through 4 lps on hook (corner dec), continue sc around armhole as on lower edge, decreasing at corners. Join and fasten off.

TIES (Make 2): With MC make a chain 18" long, or

desired length. Work sl st in each ch. Fasten off. Fasten ties to front neck edges.

FLOWER PONCHO & PURSE

Instructions are for Child's Small Size (2-4). Changes for Medium (6-8) and Large (10-12) are in parentheses.

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK SWEATER & AFGHAN YARN (2 oz skein), 5(6-7) MC and several yards each of 6 colors. 1 Zipper, "Boye" crochet hook Size H or size to give gauge.

Gauge: 2 rnds to 1"; 4 dc to 1".

Square is 10(12-14)"

FLOWER PONCHO (Photo page 21)

SQUARE (Make 4): With MC, ch 3, join with sl st to first ch to form ring. All rnds are worked from right side.

Rnd 1: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), 2 dc in ring, [ch 2,

3 dc in ring] 3 times, ch 2, join with sl st to top of

ch-3. **Rnd 2:** Ch 3, dc in ch-2 sp to right of joining,

* dc in each of next 3 dc; 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in next

ch-2 sp for corner; rep from * twice, dc in next 3 dc,

2 dc in same sp with ch-3, ch 2, join this and all rnds

as Rnd 1. **Rnd 3:** Ch 3, dc in ch-2 sp to right of

joining, * dc in next 7 dc; 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in next

corner sp; rep from * twice, dc in next 7 dc, 2 dc in

same sp with ch-3, ch 2, join. Continue in this way

working corners as before and having 4 dc more between

corners in every rnd, until there are 10 (12-14) rnds from

beg = 39 (47-55) dc between corners. Fasten off.

To Assemble: Following diagram (page 38) for placement of squares, hold right sides tog, overcast squares taking up back lps only of sts and matching st for st.

BORDER - Lower Edge: Join MC on outside edge at

joining of 2 squares. **Rnd 1:** * Through back lps only,

work dc in each dc, dc in 1 ch of each ch-2 sp on straight

edge, 1 dc at each joining to ch-2 sp at point, in ch-2 sp

work 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc; rep from * around. Join. **Rnd 2:**

Ch 3, through both lps, dc in each dc, in ch-2 sp

at points work 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc. Join, fasten off.

NECK BORDER: Following diagram, fold poncho

forming V neck. Join MC at top of shoulder.

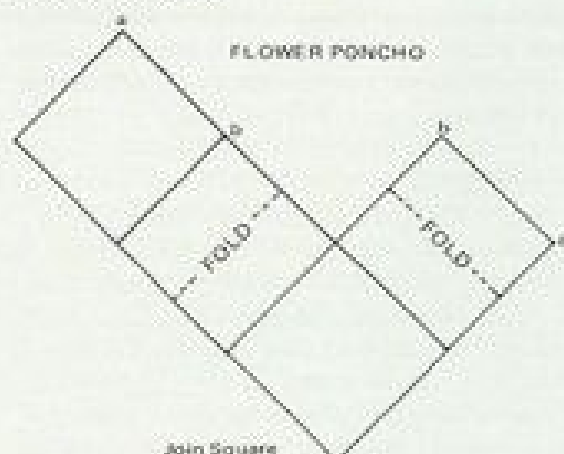
Rnd 1: Ch 3, * working through back lps, dc in each dc to within 1 dc of first ch-2 sp, yo, draw up a lp in next dc, yo and through 2 lps on hook, yo, draw up a lp in first ch of ch-2, yo and through 2 lps, yo, draw up a lp in next (center) ch-2 sp, work off 2 lps, yo, draw up a lp in next ch of ch-2, work off 2 lps, yo, draw up a lp in next dc, yo and through 6 lps on hook, ch 1 (center front or back); rep from * once, dc in each dc to end. Join. **Rnd 2:** Ch 3, * through both lps dc in each dc to within 2 sts of center ch-1, work center decrease over 5 sts as before; rep from * once, dc in each dc to end. Join and fasten off.

FLOWERS (Make 4): With desired color, ch 20. Join with sl st to first ch to form ring. All rnds are worked from right side. **Rnd 1:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc), work 39 dc in ring, join (40 dc). **Rnd 2:** Ch 3, dc in each dc. Join. Cut color 1, draw Color 2 through lp on hook. **Rnd 3:** Ch 1, sc in same st with joining, * [3 dc in next dc] twice, [sc in next dc] twice; rep from * around.

Double Crochet

Join with sl st to first sc (10 petals). Fasten off. Sew 1 flower to center of each square.

FRINGE: Cut strands of MC 12" long. Following instructions, page 2 and using 4 strands, fringe every 4th st on outside edge.



FLOWER PURSE (Photo page 21)

With MC work same as Tassel Bag, for 5 rnds (84 dc). Fasten off.

Flower: Same as for Poncho.

Finishing: Fold oval piece at center with foundation chain in vertical position and wrong sides tog. Join yarn at fold. Through double thickness work sc in each of 7 sc, sc in each of 28 sts for 1 side of opening, through double thickness sc in each of last 7 sc, ch 16 for loop, join with sl st to last sc worked. Ch 1, sl st in each ch. Fasten off. Join yarn and working from wrong side sc in each of 28 sts on other side of opening. Sew on flower as shown. Tack and sew zipper in opening below sc row, so that it does not show.

TASSEL BAG (Photo page 21)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK 4-PLY (4 oz skein), 1 skein. "Boye" crochet hook Size H or size to give gauge.

Gauge: 4 sts to 1"; 2 rnds to 1"

Ch 12 to measure 4". **Rnd 1:** Dc in 4th ch from hook, 5 more dc in same ch (7 dc counting ch-3 as 1 dc), dc in each of next 7 ch, 7 dc in last ch. Working on other side of foundation ch, work dc in each of 7 ch. Join with a sl st to top of ch-3 (28 dc). **Note:** All rnds are worked from right side through BACK LPS only. **Rnd 2:** Ch 3, dc in same place with ch-3, * 2 dc in each of next 6 sts, dc in

each of next 7 sts, 2 dc in next st; rep between *'s once, join as before (7 dc inc each end = 42 dc). **Rnd 3:** Ch 3, 2 dc in next st, [1 dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] 6 times, 1 dc in each of next 7 sts, [1 dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] 7 times, 1 dc in each of next 7 sts, join (56 dc). **Rnd 4:** Ch 3, 1 dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, [1 dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st] 6 times, 1 dc in each of next 7 sts, [1 dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st] 7 times, 1 dc in each of next 7 sts, join (70 dc). Continue in this way to inc 7 dc at each end, having 1 dc more between each inc, every rnd until there are 8 rnds from beg (126 dc). Fasten off.

Finishing: Fold oval piece at center with foundation chain in vertical position and wrong sides tog. Join yarn at fold. Through double thickness work sc in each of 19 sts, ch 50 for handle, skip 20 sts on each half for opening, join 19 sts at other side as before. Fasten off. Join yarn in first sc of joining row. Work sl st in each sc and in each ch of handle. Fasten off. **Buttonloop:** Join yarn between 10th & 11th dc of opening, ch 12, sl st in same place with joining. Fasten off. **Button:** Ch 4, join with a sl st to form a ring. **Rnd 1:** Work 8 sc in ring. **Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc (16 sc). **Rnd 3:** [Draw up a lp in each of 2 sts, yo and through 3 lps on hook] 8 times. Fasten off, leaving a 6" end. Thread end into tapestry needle. Stuff button. Draw sts tog tightly. Sew to opening opposite buttonloop.

Fringe: Cut 64 strands of yarn 10' long. Using 8 strands for each fringe, place fringes at bottom of bag (see page 2) every 2nd row (4 fringe). Place fringe at other side in same way.

GRANNY SQUARE TOTE (Photo page 21)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK 4-PLY (4 oz skein), 1 each A, B and C; NANTUK TWEED 4-PLY (2 oz skein), 1 D. "Boye" crochet hook Size I or size to give gauge (Approx 16" x 13")

Gauge: 4 rnds to 2 1/4"; 1 square is 4 1/2"

SQUARE (Make 16): Using color sequence of A, B, D, C work same as square for Granny Square Afghan page 39 for 4 rnds.

Finishing: Hold 2 squares with right sides tog. With C, matching sts and taking up back lps only, overcast squares tog placing as shown in photograph. Join C in ch-1 sp at a point at top of bag. From right side work sc in each st and ch-1 sp around top edge, join with a sl st to first sc. **Handle:** Ch 51, join with a sl st to ch-1 sp at top of point on same side. Ch 1, turn, work sc in each ch. Fasten off. Join yarn at other side of foundation ch and work sc in each ch. Fasten off. Join and work handle on other 2 points in same way. Join C at center of back or front, from right side work a sl st in each sc of bag and handles, fasten off. Join at side edge and work sl st around as before. Fasten off.

GRANNY SQUARE AFGHAN (Photo page 24)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK 4-PLY (4 oz skein), 5 A, 3 B; NANTUK TWEED 4-PLY (2 oz skein), 4 C. "Boye" crochet hook Size I or size to give gauge (Approx 56" x 56")

Double Crochet

Gauge: 6 rnds to 3½"; 1 square is 7½"

SQUARE (Make 49): With A, ch 3, join with a sl st to first ch to form a ring. All rnds are worked from right side. **Rnd 1:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc), 2 dc in ring, ch 1, [3 dc in ring, ch 1] 3 times, join with sl st to top of ch-3. Fasten off A, join C in any ch-1 sp. **Rnd 2:** Ch 3, 2 dc in same sp, ch 1, 3 dc in same sp (corner), ch 1, [in next ch-1 sp work 3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc (corner), ch 1] 3 times. Join with sl st to top of ch-3 (4 corners). Fasten off C and rejoin in any ch-1 corner sp. **Rnd 3:** [Work corner, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 4 times. Join as before. Fasten off. Join A in any ch-1 corner sp. **Rnd 4:** * Work corner, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] twice; rep from * 3 times. Join, fasten off A. Join B as before. **Rnd 5:**

Work as Rnd 4, having three 3-dc grps between corners. Join, fasten off B. Join A as before. **Rnd 6:** Work as Rnd 4, having four 3-dc grps between corners. Join and fasten off.

Finishing: Hold 2 squares with right sides tog. With A, matching sts and taking up **back lps** only, overcast squares tog. Join 7 strips of 7 squares each, then join strips tog.

Border: Join A in ch-1 sp of right-hand corner.

Rnd 1: * * Work corner, ch 1, * 3 dc and ch 1 in each ch-1 sp to corner of same square, 3 dc in ch-1 corner sp, ch 1, 3 dc in ch-1 corner sp of next square; rep from * to left-hand corner; rep from * * around. Join and fasten off.

Rnd 2: With B, rep Rnd 1. **Rnd 3:** With A, rep Rnd 1.

Half Double Crochet

STRIPED SQUARE TOTE & STOLE

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK SWEATER & AFGHAN YARN (2 oz skein)

For Tote - 2 skeins A, 1 skein B

For Stole - 3 skeins A, 2 skeins B

"Boys" crochet hook Size G or size to give gauge.

Gauge: 4 hdc to 1"; 3 rows to 1"

Square is approx 3½"

TOTE (Approx 11" wide) (Photo page 25)

SQUARE (Make 13): With A, ch 17. **Row 1:** Hdc in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch, working off last hdc with B (15 hdc). Fasten off A. **Row 2:** Ch 2 and being sure to work over ends, hdc in each hdc, working off last hdc with A (15 hdc). Fasten off B. **Row 3:** Ch 2 and rep Row 2 working off last hdc with B. Fasten off A. Rep Rows 2 & 3 for stripe pat for a total of 11 rows from beg. Fasten off.

Finishing: From wrong side, sl st or sew squares tog, alternating as in photograph. For front handle, join A at right-hand top point of a square, ch 55, join to left-hand top point. Fasten off. Work back handle in same way. For outside edge rejoin A in first A joining. * hdc in each ch of handle, 14 hdc evenly spaced in rows down side, hdc in each hdc; rep from * once, join with sl st to first hdc. Sl st in each hdc around, fasten off. For inside edge of handles, rejoin A at right-hand top point, work 14 hdc evenly spaced in end of rows, hdc in each hdc, hdc in each ch along opposite side of handle, join to first hdc. Sl st in each hdc around. Fasten off. Work other handle in same way. Weave in all ends neatly on wrong side.

STOLE (Photo page 25)

Make 51 squares same as Tote square.

Finishing: Alternating squares as in photograph, from wrong side sl st or sew tog as follows: 3 strips of 10 squares each, then join 3 strips tog. Join tog 3 strips of 7 squares each, then join 3 strips tog. Being careful to continue alternating squares, join short end of 7 square strip to 10 square strip as in photograph for back point. For edging, join A at back point, * work hdc in each hdc, 14 hdc in 11 rows of each square to corner, work hdc,

ch 2, hdc in corner *; rep between *'s, work 14 hdc in each square to inside back point, dec 1 hdc at point; rep between *'s 3 times, join to first hdc, ch 2. Work 2 more rnds of edging, working hdc in each hdc; hdc, ch 2, hdc in ch-2 of each corner. Fasten off. **Ties:** Join A at inside top of 4th square from bottom, ch 25, hdc in 3rd ch from hook and each ch to end, sl st to stole. Ch 2, work hdc in each hdc. Fasten off. Weave in all ends neatly on wrong side.

CLASSIC CARDIGANS (Photo page 28)

Instructions are for Her Size Small 8/10; His Small 38/40. Changes for Her Sizes Medium 12/14 and Large 16/18 are in parentheses; His Medium 42/44 and Large 46/48 are in brackets. Numbers for Her Sizes and His Sizes are divided by a slanted line (/).

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK 4-PLY

(4 oz skein), 6(6-7)/7(8-8); 5 Buttons. "Boys" crochet hook Size G or size to give gauge

Gauge: 7 sts to 2"; 3 rows to 1"

Finished Measurements in inches:

Bust or Chest (Buttoned) - 35(39-42)/42(47-51)

Back at Shoulders - 14(15-16)/16(17-18)

Sleeves at Underarm - 12(12½-13)/15(15½-16)

Back: Ch 61(69-73)/73(81-89) to measure approx 17(19-20½)/20½[23-25]" . **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook, * dc in next ch, sc in next ch; rep from *, end hdc in last ch. Ch 1, turn - 60(68-72)/72(80-88) sts.

Row 2: Sc in hdc, * dc in sc, sc in dc; rep from *, end hdc in last sc. Ch 1, turn. Rep Row 2 for pat (to maintain pat, always work sc over dc and dc over sc). Continue pat until piece measures 15/18" from beg or desired length to underarm, do not ch 1 at end of last row, turn.

Armholes: Sl st in each of first 3(4-4)/4(6-6) sts, ch 1, work to last 3(4-4)/4(6-6) sts. Ch 1, turn. **Decrease Row:** Draw up a lp in each of first 2 sts, yo and through 3 lps on hook (1 st decrease), work to last 2 sts - work decrease (1 st decreased each side), turn. Rep decrease row 2(3-3)/3(3-5) times more. Continue pat on 48(52-56)/56(60-64) sts until 7(7½-8)/9(9½-10)" from beg of armholes (measured in a straight line).

Half Double Crochet

Shoulders: Sl st in each of first 7(8-9)/9(9-10) sts, work pat over next 8(8-8)/8(9-9) sts, fasten off. Sk center 18(20-22)/22(24-26) sts for back of neck, join yarn in next st, ch 1. Beg in same st with ch 1, work pat over 8(8-8)/8(9-9) sts, fasten off, 15(16-17)/17(18-19) sts for each shoulder.

Left Front: Ch 31(35-37)/37(41-45) to measure approx 8%(9-10%)/10%(11%-12%)". Work pat on 30(34-36)/36(40-44) sts as on back to 1" less than back to underarm. **Neck and Armhole:** Decrease 1 st at end of next row (mark for neck edge). Rep dec at neck edge every 2nd row 8(9-10)/10(11-13) times more AND AT SAME TIME when same length as back to underarms, sl st across 3(4-4)/4(6-6) sts at armhole edge once, then decrease 1 st at armhole edge every row 3(4-4)/4(4-5) times. When neck decreases are completed, work on rem 15(16-17)/17(18-19) sts to same length as back to shoulder, ending at armhole edge. **Shoulder:** Work sl st in each of 7 (8-8)/9(9-10) sts, ch 1, work to end and fasten off.

Right Front: Work same as left front (pat is reversible).

Sleeves: Ch 31(31-35)/35(39-39) to measure approx 8%(8%-9)/9(11-11)". **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch to end, 30(30-34)/34(38-38) sts. Ch 1, turn. **Row 2:** Sc in each sc. Ch 1, turn. Rep Row 2 for 3". **Inc Row:** 2 sc in first st, sc in each sc to last st, 2 sc in last st (1 st inc each side), 32(32-36)/36(40-40) sts.

Work pat as on back, inc 1 st each side every 6th/4th row 5(6-5)/8(7-8) times. Continue pat on 42(44-46)/52(54-56) sts to 17/19" from beg or desired length to underarm. **Sleeve Cap:** Sl st in each of first 3(4-4)/4(6-6) sts, ch 1, work to last 3(4-4)/4(6-6) sts. Ch 1, turn. Decrease 1 st each side every row 7(6-7)/9(6-7) times; every 2nd row 3(4-4)/4(6-6) times. **Last Row:** Sl st in each of first 2 sts, ch 1, work to last 2 sts, fasten off, leaving 12/14 sts at top of cap.

Finishing: Sew underarm, shoulder and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves.

Front and Neckband: From right side, beg at lower right front edge, work 1 row sc on right front to first neck decrease, spacing sts to keep edge flat (place marker in work and count number of sts), continue sc in same way to shoulder, mark and count sts, continue sc to left shoulder, place marker, work sc on left front to correspond, being sure to have same number of sc between markers as on right front. Ch 1, turn. **Row 2:** Sc in each sc. Ch 1, turn. Place markers on right/left front for buttonholes, first marker 1/8" from lower edge, last 1/8" below first neck decrease, others evenly spaced between. **Row 3:** * Sc in each sc to marker, ch 2, skip 2 sts for buttonhole; rep from * until all buttonholes are made, sc in each sc to end. Ch 1, turn. **Row 4:** Sc in each sc, 2 sc over each ch-2. Ch 1, turn. **Row 5:** Sc in each sc, fasten off. Sew buttons opposite buttonholes.

Triple Crochet

WAVY STRIPE HAT & SCARF (Photo page 25)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY (2 oz skein)

For Hat - 2 each A & B

For Scarf - 3 A, 2 B

"Boye" crochet hook Size K or size to give gauge

Gauge: 11 sts to 5"; 4 rows (2 pat rows) to 5"

HAT

With A, ch 39. **Row 1 (right side):** Beg at cuff edge, sc in 2nd ch from hook, * hdc in next ch, 1 dc in each of next 2 chs, tr in next ch, 1 dc in each of next 2 chs, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch *; rep between *'s 3 times, sl st in each of last 5 chs for top edge shaping (38 sts). Ch 1, turn.

Row 2: Sl st in each of first 5 sts, sc in each st to end. Join B, ch 4, turn. **Row 3:** Sk first st, * dc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in next st, sc in next st, hdc in next st, 1 dc in each of next 2 sts, tr in next st; rep from * 3 times, sl st in each of last 5 sts. Ch 1, turn. **Row 4:** Sl st in each of first 5 sts, sc in each st, ending sc in top of ch-4. Join A, ch 1, turn. **Row 5:** Sc in first st, * hdc in next st, 1 dc in each of next 2 sts, tr in next st, 1 dc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in next st, sc in next st; rep from * 3 times, sl st in each of last 5 sts. Rep Rows 2-5 for pat until there are 10 B stripes ending with Row 4, do not fasten off.

Joinings: Ch 1, turn. Hold wrong side of last row and foundation ch tog, work sl st through top of each st and matching ch until 6" from cuff edge. Sl lp through to right

side and continue to sl st for turnback of cuff.

SCARF

With A, ch 146 to measure approx 65". **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook, rep between *'s of Row 1 of hat 18 times, do not work last 5 sts in sl st. Continue to work in pat as for hat (omitting 5 sts in sl st) until there are 4 complete A stripes, ending with Pat Row 2 of Hat. Fasten off.

Tassels (Make 8): Cut strands of A, 13" long. Using 13 strands make tassel (see page 2). Sew 1 tassel to end of each A stripe.

RACQUET COVER (Photo page 28)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY (2 oz skein), 1 each A, B & C. "Boye" crochet hook Size K or size to give gauge

Gauge: 5 tr to 2"; 4 rnds to 5"

With A, ch 9 for top edge. **Rnd 1:** Tr in 6th ch from hook and in each of next 2 ch, 8 tr in last ch for corner, working on other side of foundation chain, tr in each of next 3 chs, in next ch work 7 tr, join with a sl st to top of ch-5 (22 tr). **Rnd 2 (Inc Rnd):** Ch 4 (counts as first tr), working through back lps only, work 1 tr in same place with joining (1 tr inc), 2 tr in each tr around, join with sl st to top of ch-4 (44 tr). Fasten off A. **Note:** All rnds are worked through back lps only and joined as in Rnd 2. Draw B through lp on hook. **Rnd 3 (Inc Rnd):** Ch 4, tr in each of next 2 trs, 2 tr in next tr, * tr in each of next 3

Triple Crochet

tr, 2 tr in next tr; rep from * around, join (55 tr). Cut B, draw C through lp. **Rnd 4:** Ch 4, tr in each tr around (55 tr). Cut C, draw B through lp. Continue in this way to work 1 rnd B and 1 rnd C until there are 12 rnds from beg, end with C rnd. Fasten off. **Drawstring:** With A, make a chain 35" long. Work a sl st in each ch across. Fasten off. Weave drawstring through last B rnd drawing over and under 2tr.

WINDOW SQUARES (Approx 11" x 11") (Photo page 29)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK SWEATER &

AFGHAN YARN (2 oz skein), 1 each A, B, C, D & E.

"Boye" crochet hook Size J or size to give gauge

Gauge: 7 tr to 2"; 1 rnd to 1"

With A, ch 10, join with sl st to first ch to form ring. All rnds are worked from right side. **Rnd 1:** Ch 10, * work 4 tr in ring, ch 7; rep from * 3 times, work 3 tr in ring, sl st to 3rd ch of ch-10 (16 tr and 4 ch-7 sps). Fasten off A, draw B through lp on hook. **Rnd 2:** Ch 4, * tr in each of next 3 ch, in corner ch work 1 tr, ch 7, 1 tr, tr in next 3 ch, working through BACK LPS, tr in next 4 tr; rep from * around ending tr in last 3 tr, sl st to top of ch-4 (48 tr and 4 ch-7 sps). Fasten off B; draw C through lp. **Rnds 3, 4 & 5:** Working 8 more tr on each side every rnd, rep Rnd 2 with C, D and E (144 tr and 4 ch-7 sps). Fasten off.

Afghan Stitch

STRAPPED POT HOLDER (Photo page 29)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK BULKY

(2 oz skein), 1 MC, 1 CC, "Boye" Afghan Hook Size H

or size to give gauge and crochet hook Size G

Gauge: 3 sts to 1"

With MC, ch 20 to measure 7". Work Afghan Stitch (see pages 22 & 23) for 14 rows. Bind off. **Strap:** With CC, ch 5 and work Afghan Stitch for 14 rows. Bind off. With G hook, sc on each long edge of strap. Steam both pieces. Tack strap at edges to right side of pot holder.

Edging: With G hook and CC from right side, beg at first foundation ch, * work 1 sc in each st (through both thicknesses at strap), 2 sc at corner, 1 sc in end of each row, 2 sc at corner; rep from * to last corner, sc at corner, ch 10 for loop, sc in same corner. Join with a sl st to first sc, sl st in each sc around to loop, work 12 sc in loop. Join, fasten off.

ACORN AFGHAN (Approx 70"x 57") &

PILLOW (Approx 17"x 17")

You Need: Columbia-Minerva NANTUK 4-PLY

(4 oz skein)

For Afghan - 5 Winter White(A), 6 Beige (B), 7 Camel (C)

For Pillow - 2 Winter White (A), 1 Lt Orange (B); pillow form or polyester filling. "Boye" Afghan Hook size I or size to give gauge

Gauge: 9 sts to 2"; 10 rows to 3"

AFGHAN (Photo page 32)

Wide Strip (Make 2): With B, ch 27 to measure 6 1/2".

Rows 1-5: Work Afghan Stitch (see pages 22 & 23). **Row 6:** Pick up until there are 7 lps on hook, + yo, insert hook under 2nd bar to right of last lp on hook and 3 rows below lps on hook, draw up a lp, * yo and through 1 lp, yo and through 2 lps, yo and through 1 lp (8 lps on hook) *; yo, insert hook under first bar to right of last lp picked up on this row and 4 rows below lps on hook, draw up a lp; rep between *'s once (9 lps on hook); yo twice, insert hook under bar directly below last lp picked up on this row and 5 rows below lps on hook, draw up a lp, yo and through 1 lp, [yo and through 2 lps] twice, yo and through 1 lp (10 lps on hook); yo, insert hook under first bar to left of last lp picked up on this row and 4 rows below lps on hook, draw up a lp; rep between *'s once (11 lps on hook);

yo, insert hook under 2nd bar to left of last lp picked up on this row and 3 rows below lps on hook, draw up a lp; rep between *'s once (12 lps on hook); yo and through 6 lps (7 lps again on hook) +; pick up until there are 7 more lps on hook; rep between +'s twice; pick up 6 lps to end (27 lps on hook). Work off lps in usual way. Work 4 rows in Afghan Stitch. Rep from Row 6 until piece measures approx 70" or desired length, ending with 3 rows Afghan Stitch. Bind off.

Narrow Strips (Make 6 A, 6 B, 3 C): Ch 9 to measure 2 1/2".

Rows 1-4: Work Afghan Stitch. **Row 5:** Pick up until there are 5 lps on hook, yo, insert hook under first bar to right of last lp on hook and 3 rows below lps on hook, draw up a lp; rep between *'s of Row 6 of "Wide Strip"; yo, insert hook under first st to left of last lp picked up on this row, draw up a lp; rep between *'s of Row 6 of "Wide Strip", yo and through 3 lps (5 lps on hook), pick up 4 lps to end (9 lps on hook). Work off lps. Work 1 row in Afghan Stitch. Rep from Row 5 until there is the same number of rows as on Wide Strip. Bind off.

Finishing: With C from right side work 1 sc in beg and end of each row of all strips. Hold right side of strips tog and join by working sl st loosely through top lps only of sc in following sequence: beg with narrow strips, * A, B, C, B, A, then wide B strip; rep from * ending with narrow strips. With C from right side, work sc through back lps around entire afghan, working sc in each st, 3 sc at corners. Join with a sl st to first sc, fasten off.

PILLOW (Photo page 29)

Strip (Make 4 - 2 for front, 2 for back): With B, ch 27 to measure 6 1/2". **Rows 1-4:** Work Afghan Stitch (see pages 22 & 23). Draw A through lp on hook, cut B. **Rows 5-12:** Work Afghan Stitch. **Row 13:** Work same as Row 6 of Afghan (wide strip). **Rows 14-17:** Work Afghan Stitch. Rep Rows 13-17 once. **Row 23:** Rep Row 13.

Rows 24 & 25: Work Afghan Stitch. Draw B through lp, cut A. Rep Rows 1-25 once. Draw B through lp, cut A, work 4 rows Afghan Stitch. Bind off.

Center & Side Strips (Make 6): With B, ch 6 to measure 1 1/2". Work Afghan Stitch for 54 rows. Bind off.

Finishing: Hold right side of side strip to right side of

Afghan Stitch

back strip (be sure all foundation chains are at bottom). With B from wrong side and taking up top lps only, work sl st loosely in each row, joining strips as shown in

photograph. With wrong side of back and front tog and taking up back lps, join 3 sides with sl st. Insert pillow form. Join 4th side.

Leftovers

All of the following items were made using Columbia-Minerva yarns, left over from the other projects in this book.

Each item was made with single strand **NANTUK BULKY** or double strand **NANTUK 4-PLY** or double strand **WOOL 4-PLY WORSTED**, which are interchangeable and can be combined as desired.

Note: Work over all ends when changing colors.

SLIPPERS (Photo page 33)

You Need: Approx 4 oz of leftover yarn. Work same way as Slippers page 27 using leftover yarns. Sew slipper tog instead of joining with sc.

CLOCHE (Photo page 33)

You Need: Approx 4 oz of leftover yarn. "Boye" crochet hook Size J or size to give gauge.

Gauge: 5 hdc to 2"

Begin at top of crown, ch 2. **Rnd 1:** Work 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Mark beg of rnds, do not join this or following rnds. **Rnd 2:** Work 2 hdc in each sc around (16 hdc). **Rnd 3:** * 1 hdc in next hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc (1 hdc inc); rep from * 7 times (24 hdc). **Rnd 4:** * Inc 1 hdc, hdc in each of next 2 hdc; rep from * 7 times (32 hdc). **Rnd 5:** * Hdc in each of next 3 hdc, inc 1 hdc; rep from * 7 times (40 hdc). **Rnd 6:** * Inc 1 hdc, hdc in each of next 7 hdc; rep from * 4 times (45 hdc). Work 9 rnds even in hdc (approx 7 1/2" measured from center of crown or to desired depth).

BRIM - Next Rnd: * Sc in each of next 4 hdc, 2 sc in next hdc; rep from * 8 times (54 sc); join with sl st to first sc, ch 2. **Next 4 Rnds:** Being careful not to inc directly over previous incs and working in hdc, inc 9 hdc evenly spaced each rnd (90 hdc). Work 2 rnds even in hdc. Work 1 rnd in sc; sl st in each sc around. Fasten off.

CAP (Photo page 33)

Work same way as cloche, omitting brim.

RUG (Approx 21" x 25") (Photo page 33)

You Need: Approx 6 oz of leftover yarn.

"Boye" crochet hook Size K or size to give gauge

Gauge: 2 sc to 1"; 2 rnds to 1"

Begin at center, ch 11 to measure approx 6". **Rnd 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 8 ch, in last ch work 5 sc. Working along opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next 8 ch, in last ch work 4 sc. Mark beg of rnds. Do not join this or following rnds. Working in BACK LPS only, sc in each sc of side, inc 1 sc in each of 5 sc at each end. Continue to work sc rnds in BACK LPS only with increases spaced at ends of rug when needed to keep work flat, until desired size. Join with a sl st to first sc of last rnd. Fasten off.

JACKET (Women's Size Small) (Photo page 33)

You Need: Columbia-Minerva WOOL 4-PLY WORSTED

(4 oz skein), approx 16 oz leftover yarn.

Hook and Gauge: Same as Vest page 27

Main Piece: Using 1 strand MC held tog with 1 strand leftover yarn, make 2 main pieces same as Women's Vest page 27. **Sleeve:** With wrong side of last row worked facing you, sk first 30 sc. **Row 1:** Join yarn in next sc, sc in same st with joining, sc in BACK LPS of next 39 sc, do not work in last 30 sc, ch 1, turn. **Row 2 (right side):** Rep Row 2 of Main Piece on 40 sc. Continue ridge pat for a total of 18 rows or 9 ridges on sleeve. Fasten off. Work 2nd sleeve on other Main Piece in same way.

Finishing: Sew seams and with double strand, work sc and sl st edging same as Women's Vest. Work sc and sl st around sleeve in same way. For lower ties, sk 11 sts from lower front edge, join double strand in next st, ch 20. Sl st in each ch. Secure and fasten off. For upper ties, sk 11 more sts and work in same way.

PONCHO (Photo page 33)

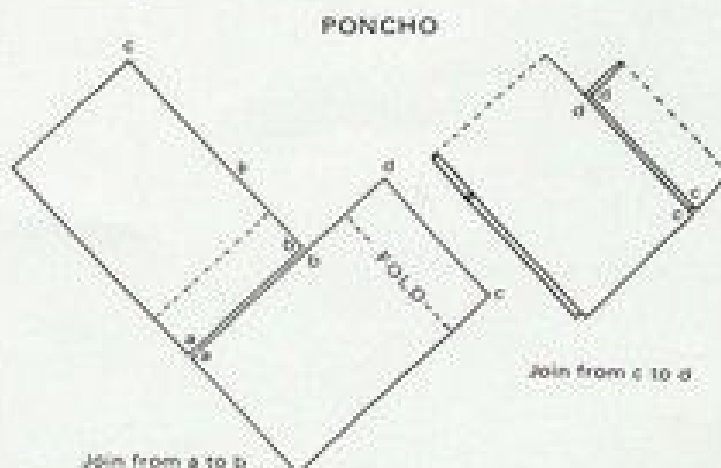
You Need: Approx 32 oz of leftover yarn. "Boye" crochet hook Size J or size to give gauge

Gauge: 12 tr to 5"; 1 row to 1"

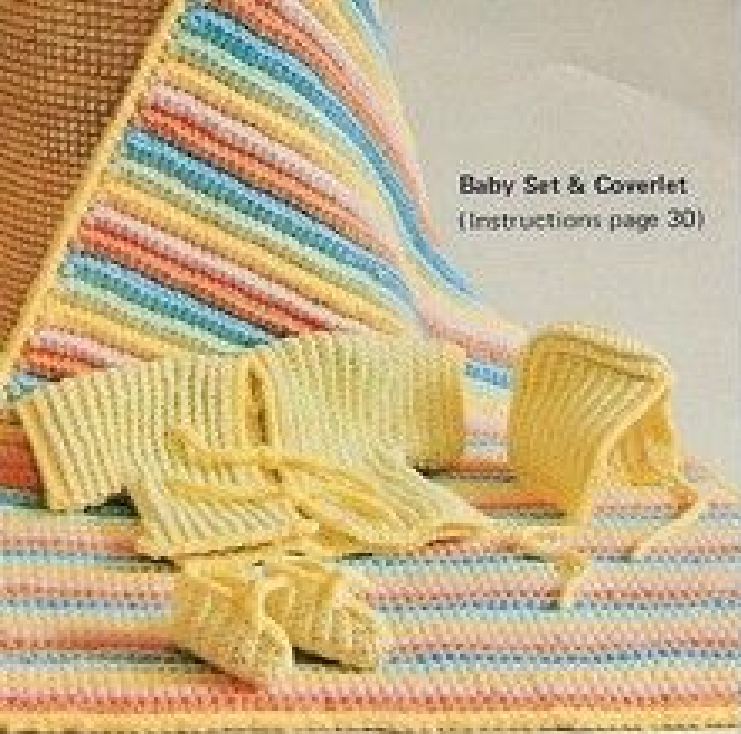
Begin at short edge, ch 60 to measure approx 26".

Row 1: Tr in 5th ch from hook and in each ch to end (57 tr counting ch-4 at beg as 1 tr). Ch 4, turn.

Row 2: Sk first tr, tr in next tr and in each tr to end (57 tr). Ch 4, turn. Continue to work even in tr for a total of 37 rows (37" from beg). Make a second piece in same way.



Finishing: Sew 2 pieces tog following diagram. For outside edge, join yarn at right-hand corner of one long edge, * work 1 tr in each tr and 2 tr in each row to corner, work 2 tr, ch 1, 2 tr in corner; rep from * around, join with sl st to first tr. Fasten off. For neck edge, work 2 tr in each row around, work 1 tr decrease at front and back points. Fasten off.

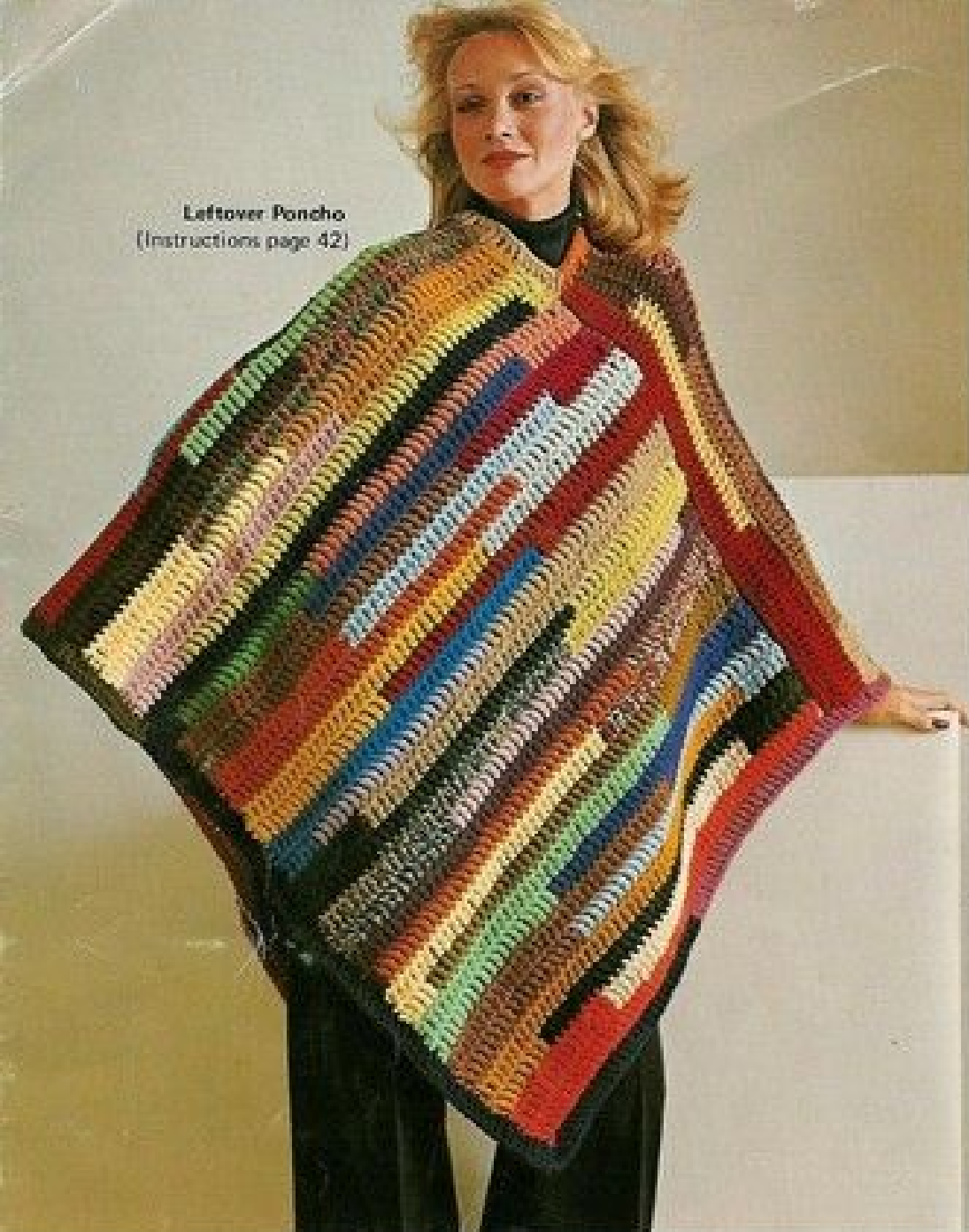

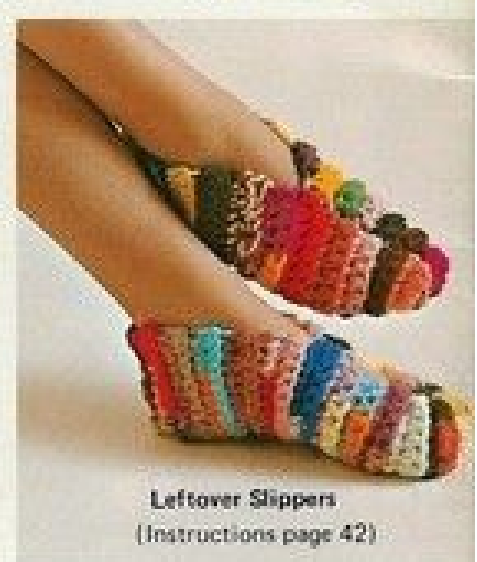
