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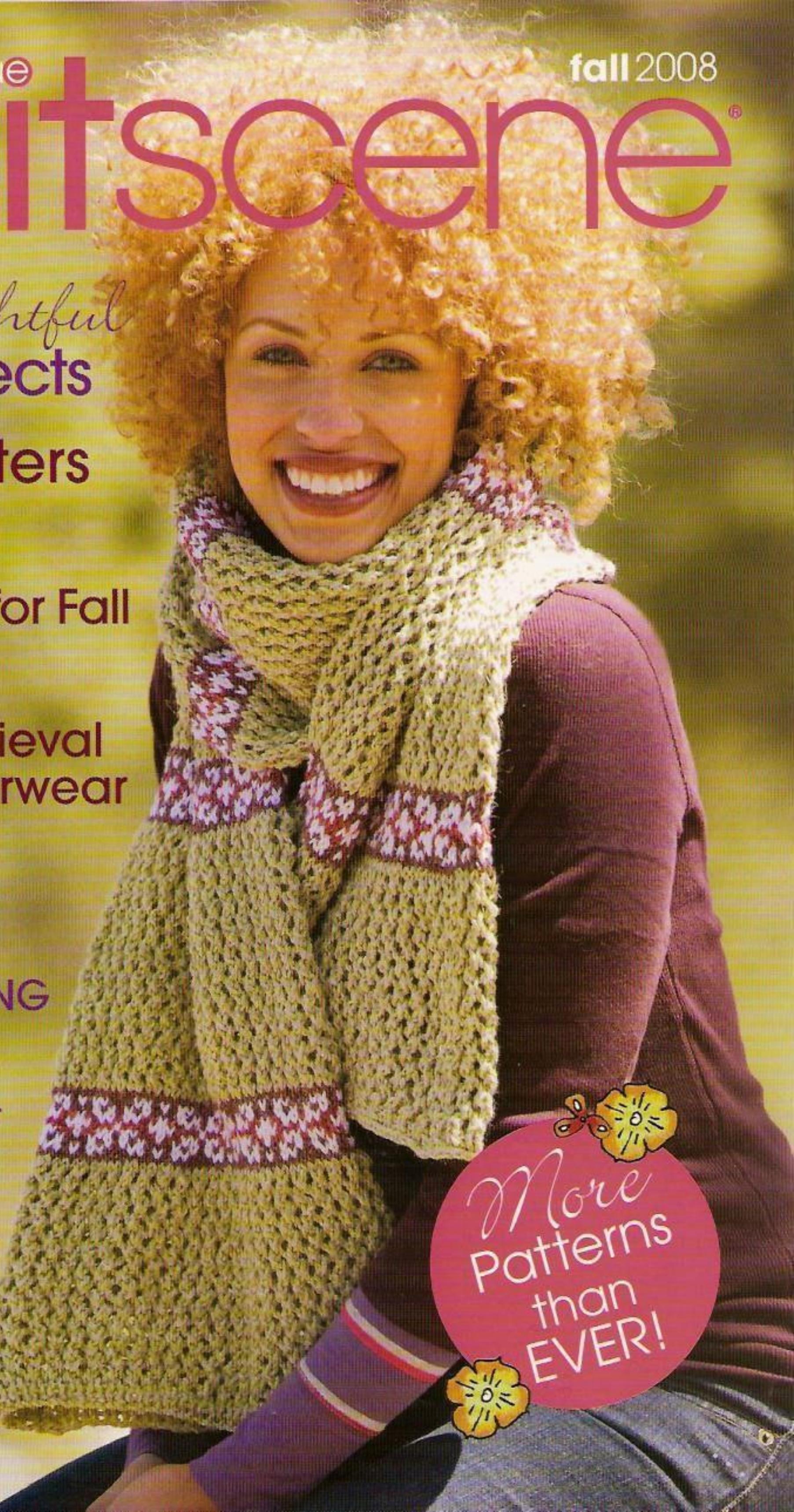

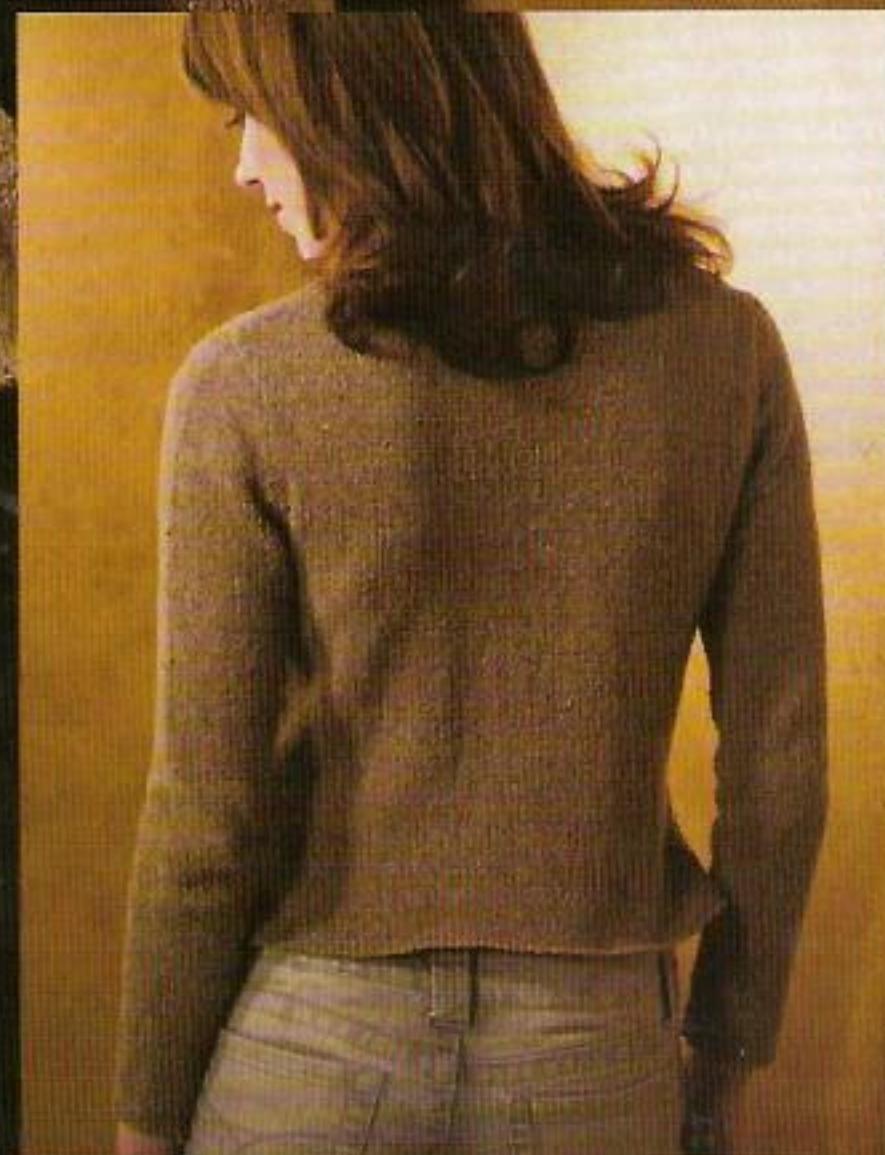

opulent raglan **wendy bernard** Seamless and worked top-down, this tunic is a quick knit. Extra body length is set off with elbow-length cuffs that flare dramatically. The lofty alpaca blend drapes beautifully, and its heathered coloring deepens the richness of the cable. We tried this pullover on several models, all different sizes, and it looked great on everyone. In the end, we liked the curve-hugging fit the top gave Angela. She wears it here with a couple inches of negative ease. **Yarn** GGH Cumba, distributed by Muench. Instructions page 44.

ah!strom bodice lou schielo If you can work intarsia, this exquisite pullover is not difficult at all. The front is worked in two pieces: Each piece consists of a main-color side panel and a center biased panel worked in intarsia. The two mirror-image fronts are then joined with an intertwined I-cord. Mix up the colors and the aesthetic changes completely. **Yarn** Elsebeth Lavold Silky Wool, distributed by Knitting Fever. Instructions page 46.

michaelmas mitts cecily glowik

These long mitts are buttoned up the wrist with closely spaced pearl buttons, set against a crochet-like cluster lace stitch. **Yarn** Blue Sky Alpacas Suri Merino. Instructions page 50.

Worked from back hem to front hem in an extended single crochet mesh, this asymmetrical cropped jacket is nearly seamless. The sleeves are worked as horizontal extensions of the body. Deep knit-like ribbings cuff the puffed sleeves and edge the off-set fronts. **Yarn** Filatura di Crosa Zara, distributed by Tahki Stacy Charles. Instructions page 50.



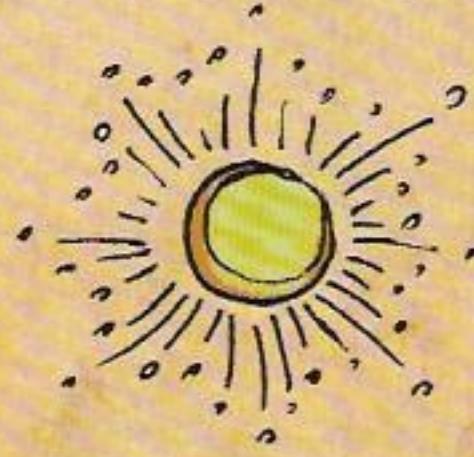

Functional buttons double as embellishment in this clean-lined hoodie. The oversize buttons are clustered closely together at the wrist slits and at the crossover neck placket. A subtle purl twist pattern highlights the marled yarn, a transeasonal merino/silk blend that feels fabulous against the skin. **Yarn** Lorna's Laces Swirl DK. Instructions page 54.

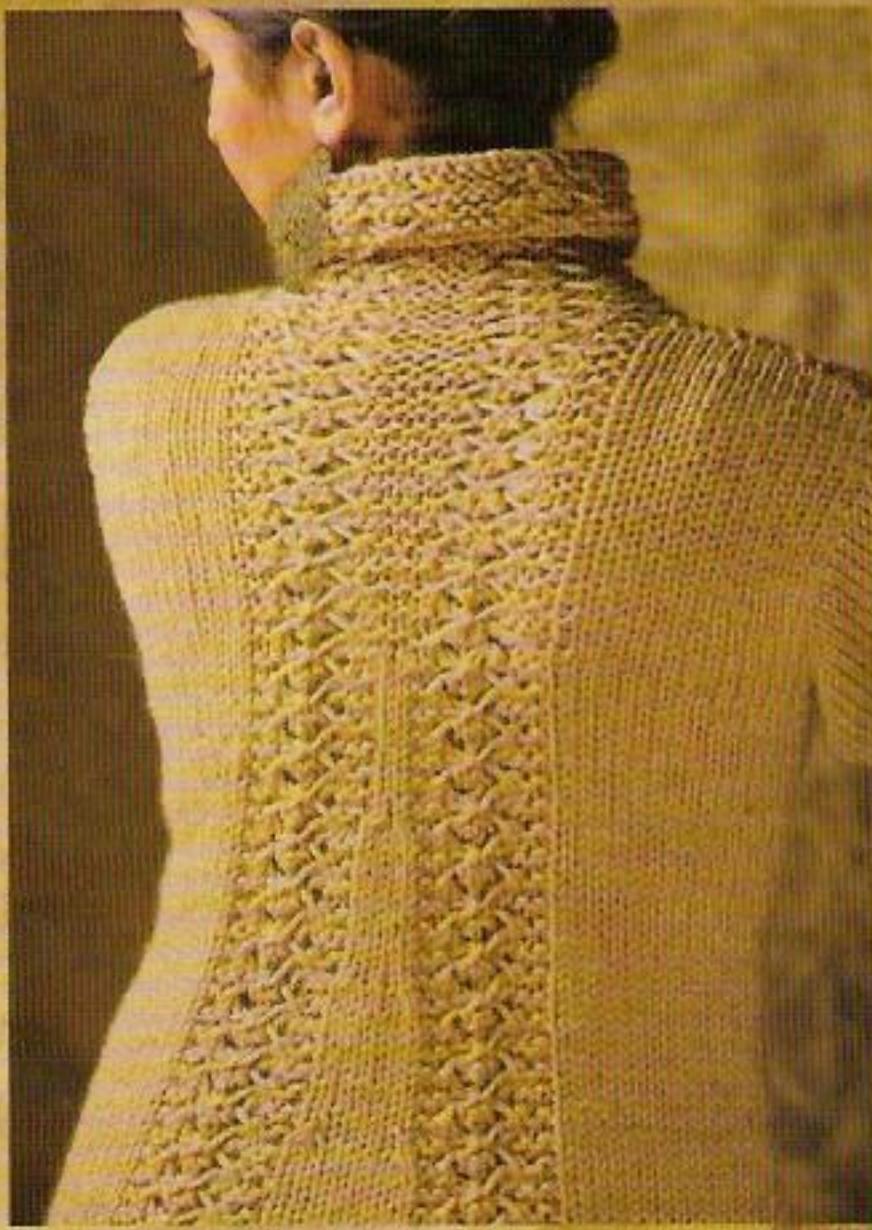


lady's duet nancy shroyer The exaggerated shape of this beret, accentuated by a cinching horizontal cable brim, is reminiscent of hats depicted in medieval paintings. Nancy Shroyer decorated the body of the hat with a simple colorwork repeat, which is echoed on the ends of the cabled scarf. Both projects are worked in the round to ease the stranded colorwork. The tube scarf is blocked flat but has no wrong side. **Yarn** Nancy's Knit Knacks Digit. Instructions page 58 .

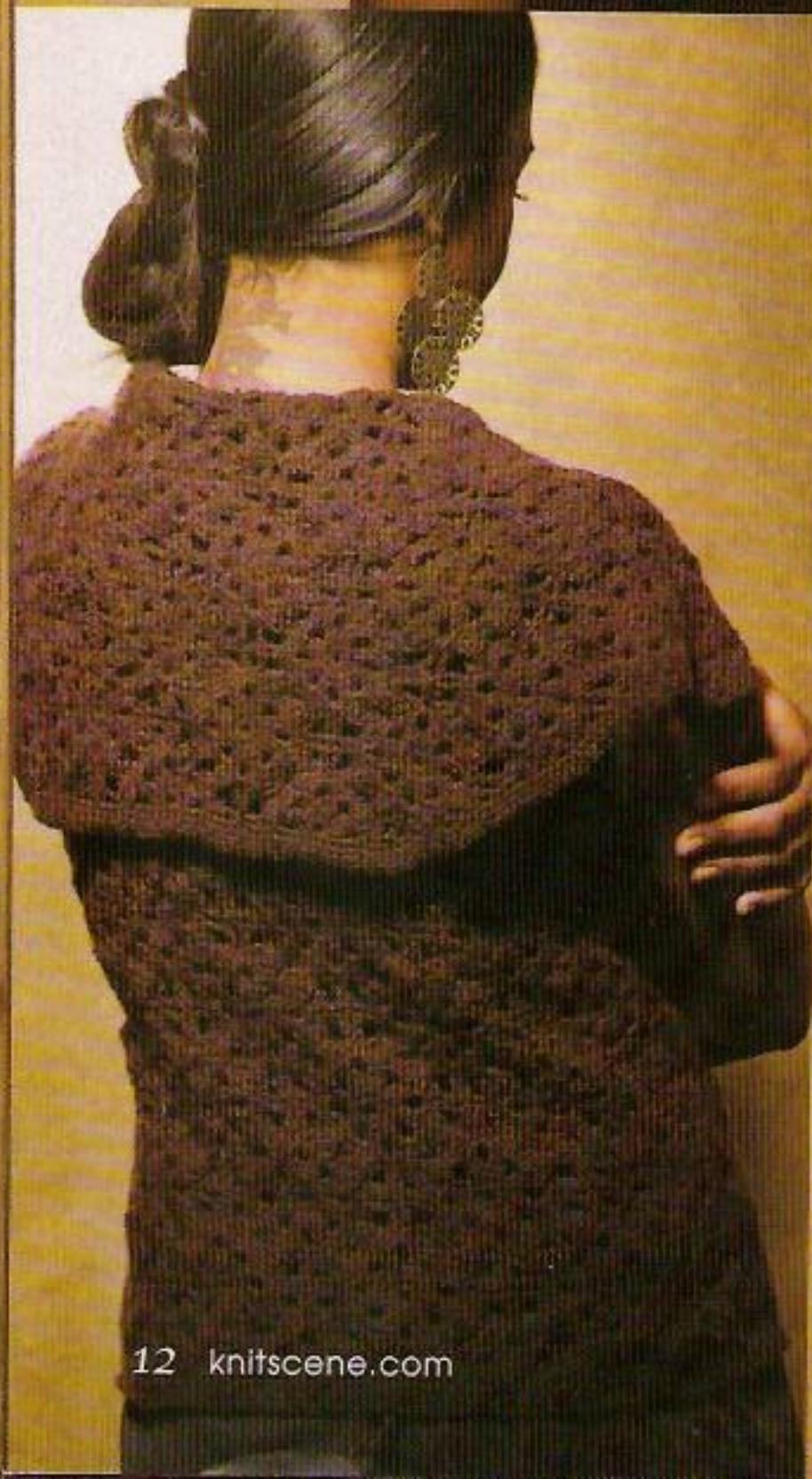
The long A-line shape of this tunic flatters pear shapes. The unusual lace pattern is worked in panels on the body and the sleeve; shaping is worked within the stockinette panel between lace panels on front and back. The resulting sweeping lines of lace merge into the lace turtleneck. The saddle shoulders continue the lace from the sleeves into the neck. **Yarn** Universal Yarn Deluxe Chunky. Instructions page 60.

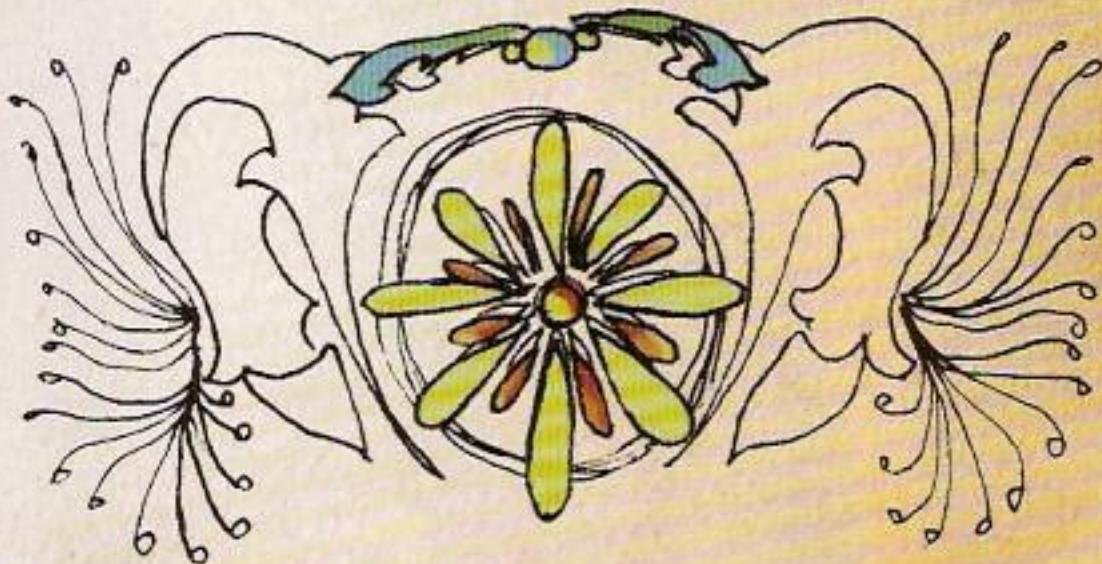

relicella vest robyn chachula An intricate motif repeats throughout this lacy cardigan top. Crocheted in a rich, variegated mahogany cashmere, the motifs are joined to create a seamless-looking fabric of subtle flowers and geometric stitches. Wear the generous neckline as a shawl collar over the upper arms or pin the collar close at the neck to create a drastic overlap and a richly layered look. **Yarn** Jade Sapphire Mongolian Cashmere 4-ply. 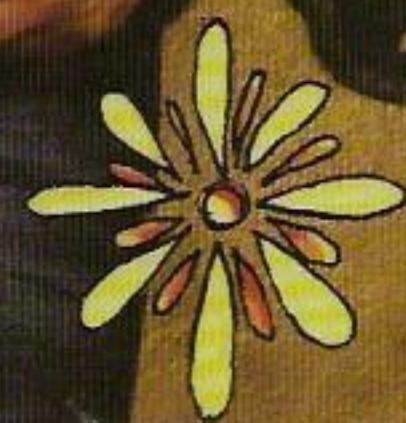
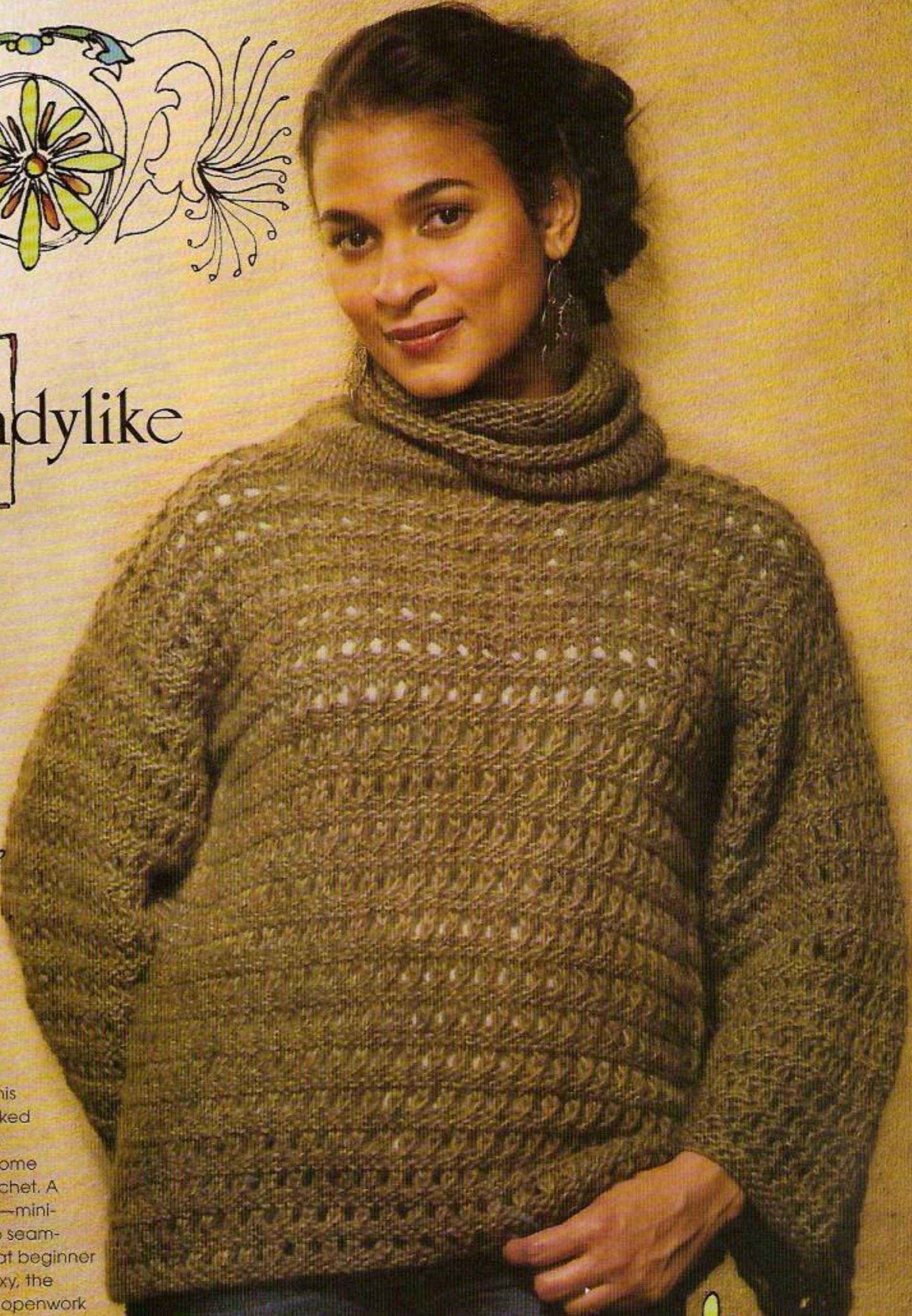

gudrun johnston This loose pullover is worked in an easy slip-stitch pattern that bears some resemblance to crochet. A simple construction—minimal shaping and no seaming—makes it a great beginner project. Far from boxy, the combination of the openwork mesh and the yarn creates drape that contours the body. The wide sleeves echo the volume of habit or cloak sleeves.

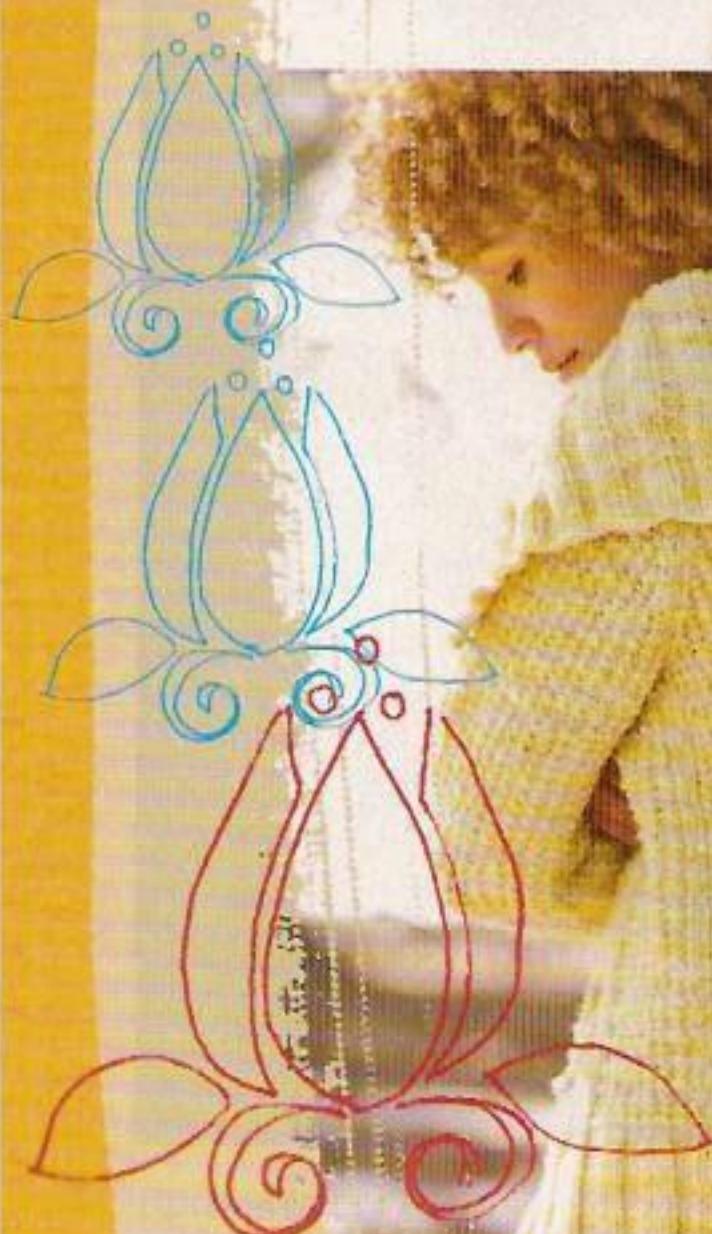

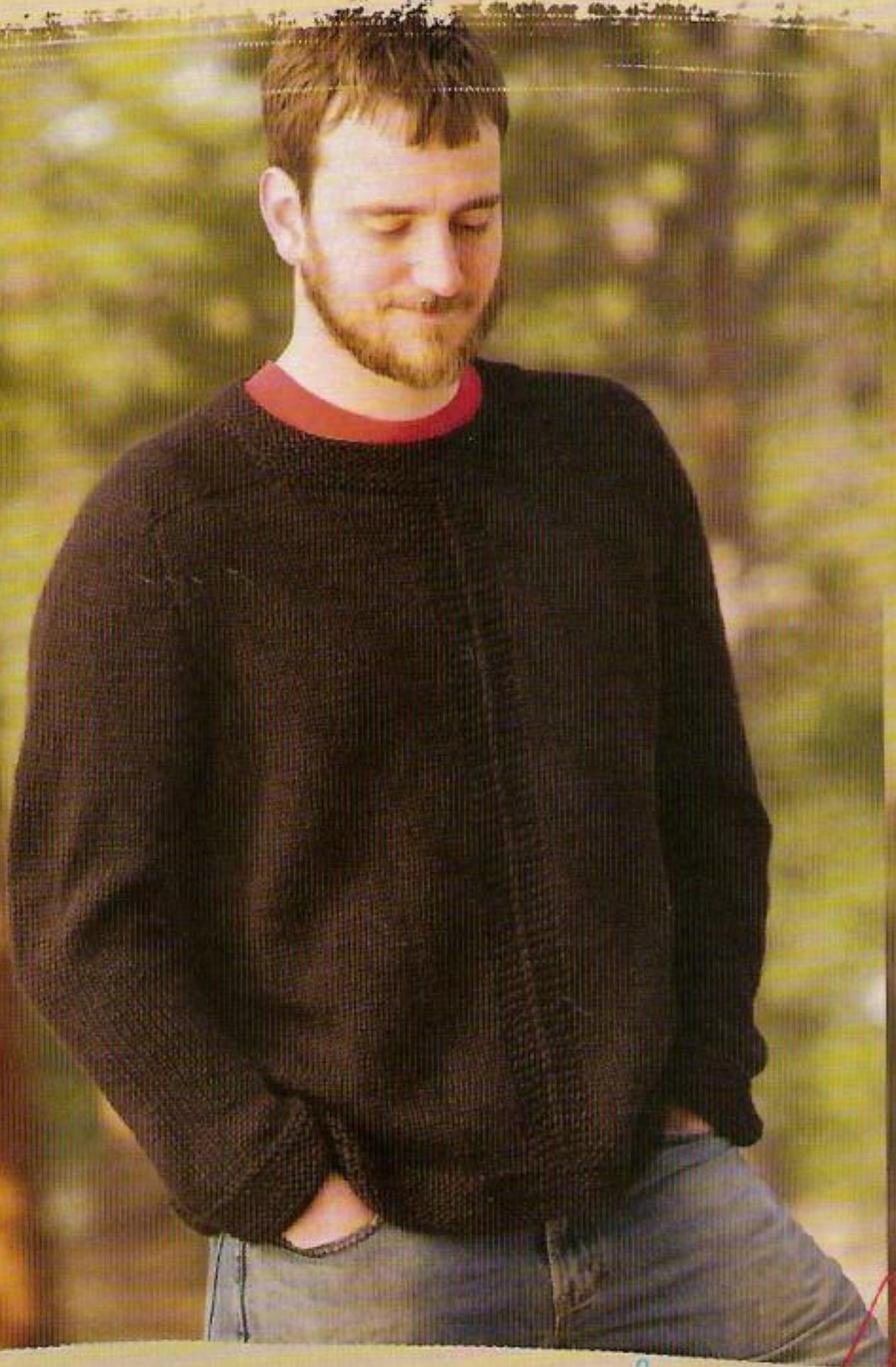

The cable might look complex, but it isn't! It is an unusual cable that has one strand worked in seed stitch and the other worked in stockinette," says Deborah Newton. big thaw pullover amanda berka "A top-down seamless construction allows the wearer to try on this sweater as the knitter progresses through the pattern." Amanda Berka consulted her husband as she designed this sweater, so it gets the all-important man's stamp of approval. The yoke piece is worked from shoulder to shoulder, while short-rows shape the sleeve caps and the slope of the shoulders. **Yarn** Zitron Loft Classic, distributed by Skacel. obverse jacket lisa shroyer A two-color slip-stitch belt serves as the only closure in this loose shawl-collar cardigan. Diagonal ribs flow in opposite directions, keeping the eye intrigued, while deep fitted cuffs and slightly puffed sleeves accent the silhouette. **Yarns** Tahki Donegal Tweed and Tahki Torino. big ivy scarf christine lorin A voluminous scarf is worked in a tweedy alpaca/cotton blend. In this lightweight fiber and worked mostly in an open mesh (in the round), the scarf is not heavy or stiff but wraps and wears beautifully. 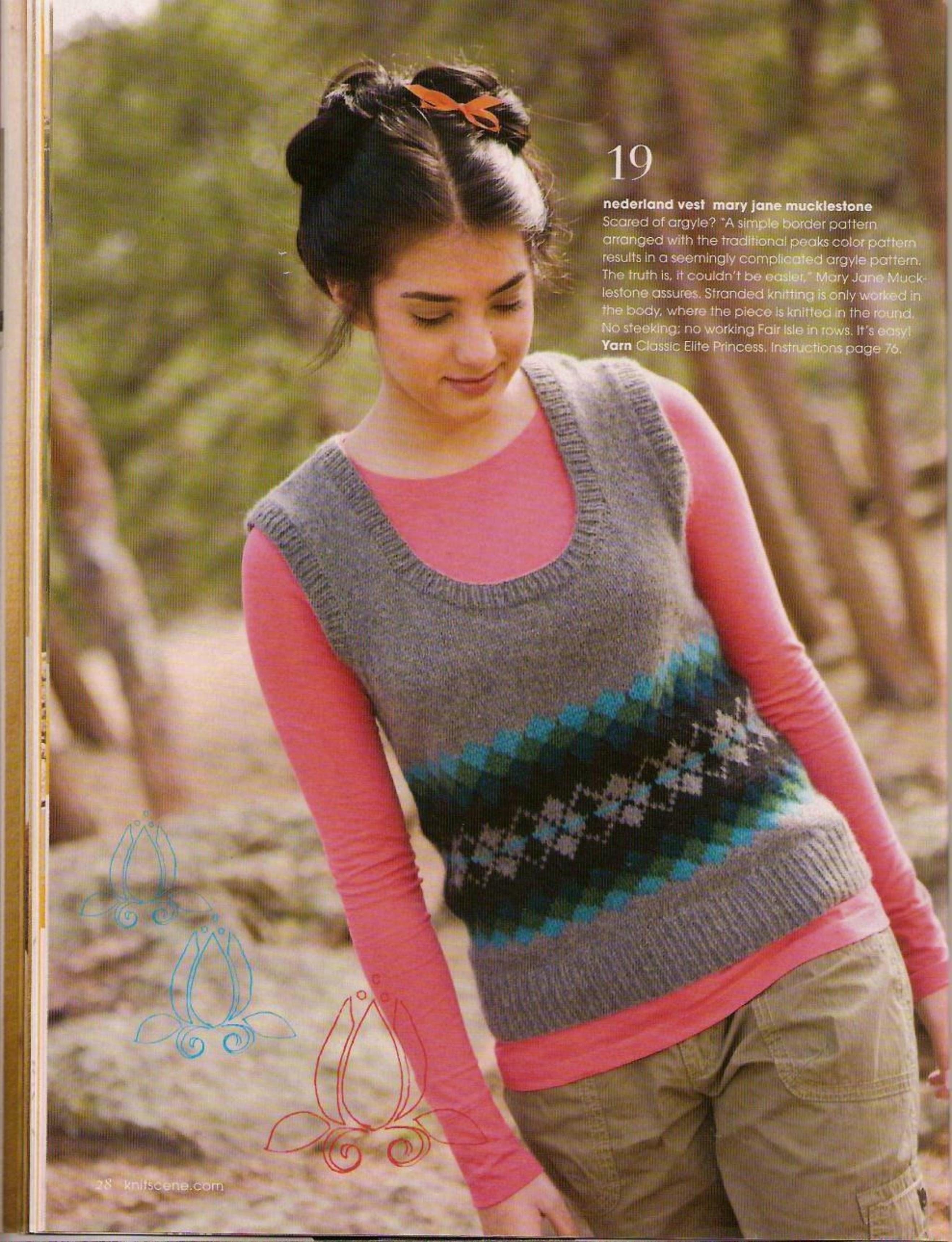
double cap kat coyle "This cap is constructed on straight needles and worked in a long, shaped rectangle that's folded in half and sewn together along both sides. The cuff is a wide k3, p3 rib followed by a p3, k3 rib that can be doubled for extra warmth. If the hat is worn with the cuff unfolded, it has a slouchy look," Kat Coyle explains. **Yarn** ShibuiKnits Merino Alpaca. Instructions page 75.

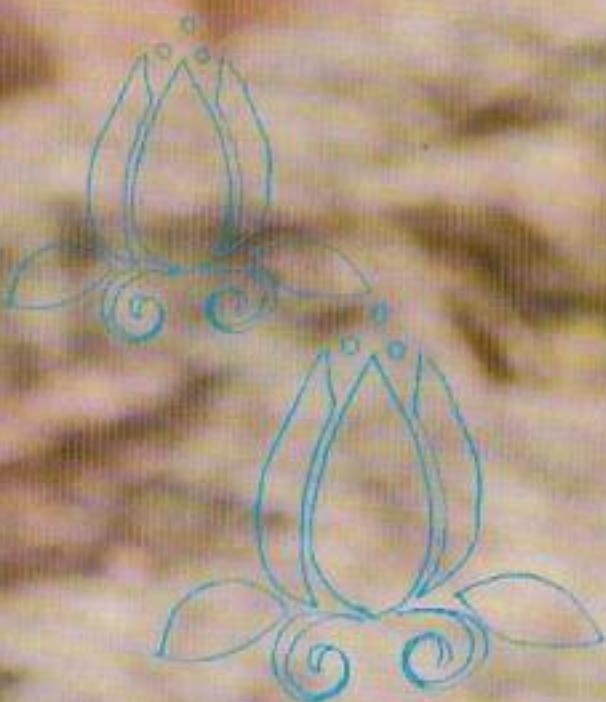

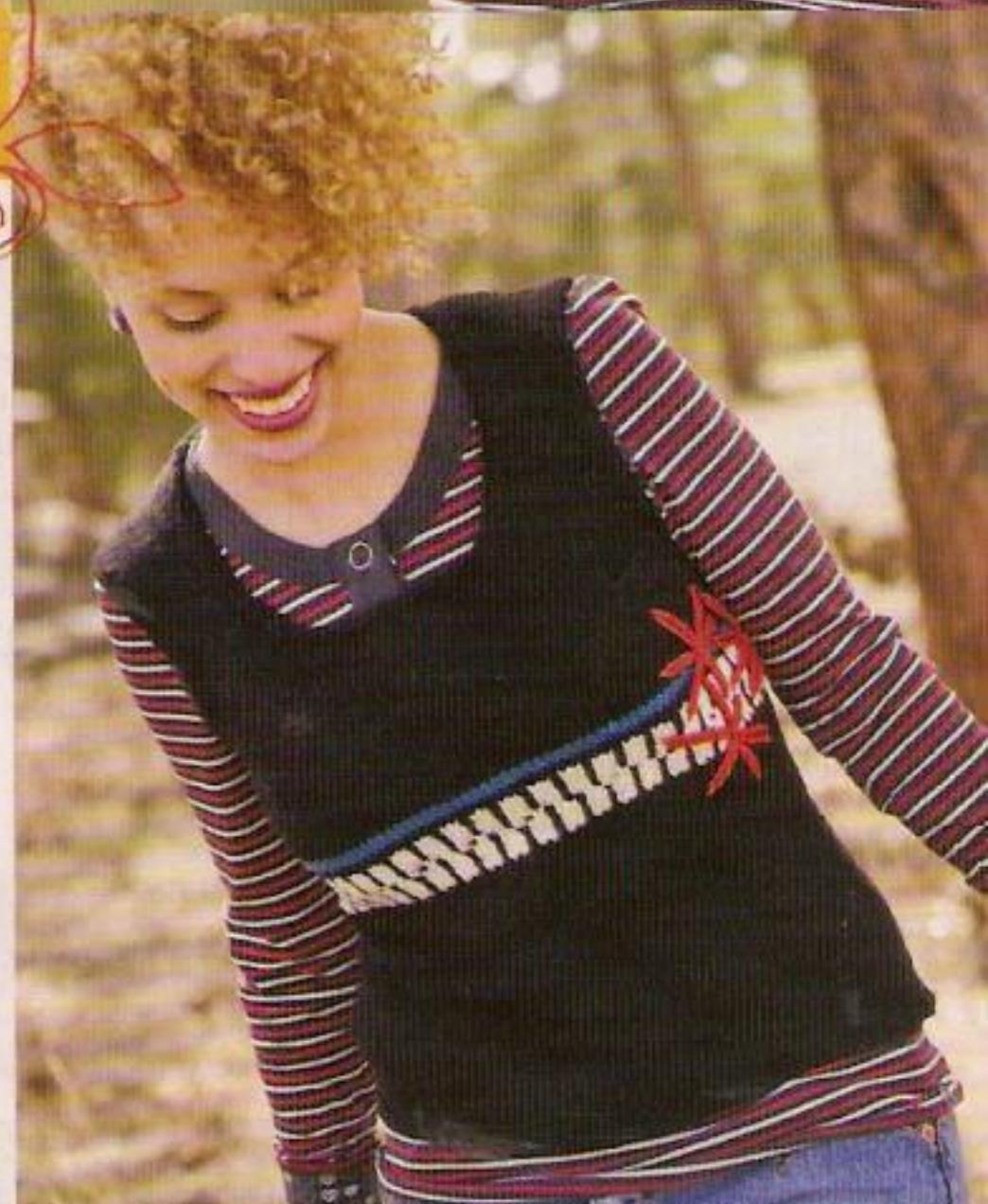
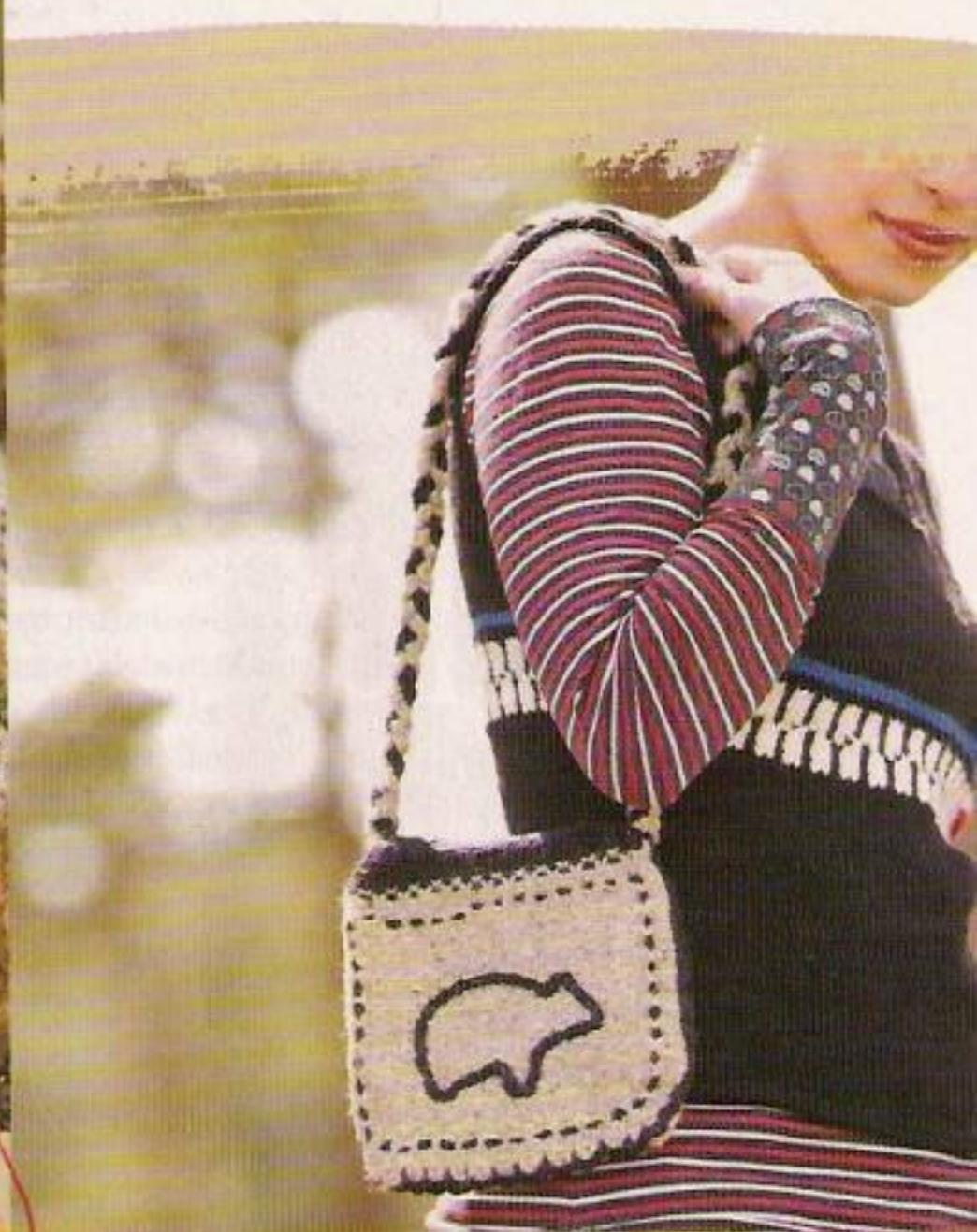

brocade leaves pullover kathy zimmerman The geometric “carpet of leaves” stitch pattern becomes an allover brocade in this classic V-neck. matryoshka stole **cirilia rose** "Quick to knit with inexpensive supplies, this stole is a practical beauty, at once striking and wholesome. Painted wooden beads nestle in the middle of a high-relief lozenge motif, and a beaded cast-on adds drama to a stole worked with deceptively easy increases and a centered double decrease," says Cirilia Rose. Named after the Russian nesting dolls, this stole takes on the folky feel of the little painted dolls, and the motifs nest upon each other like carefully carved figurines. **Yarn** Valley Yarns Stockbridge, distributed by WEBS. 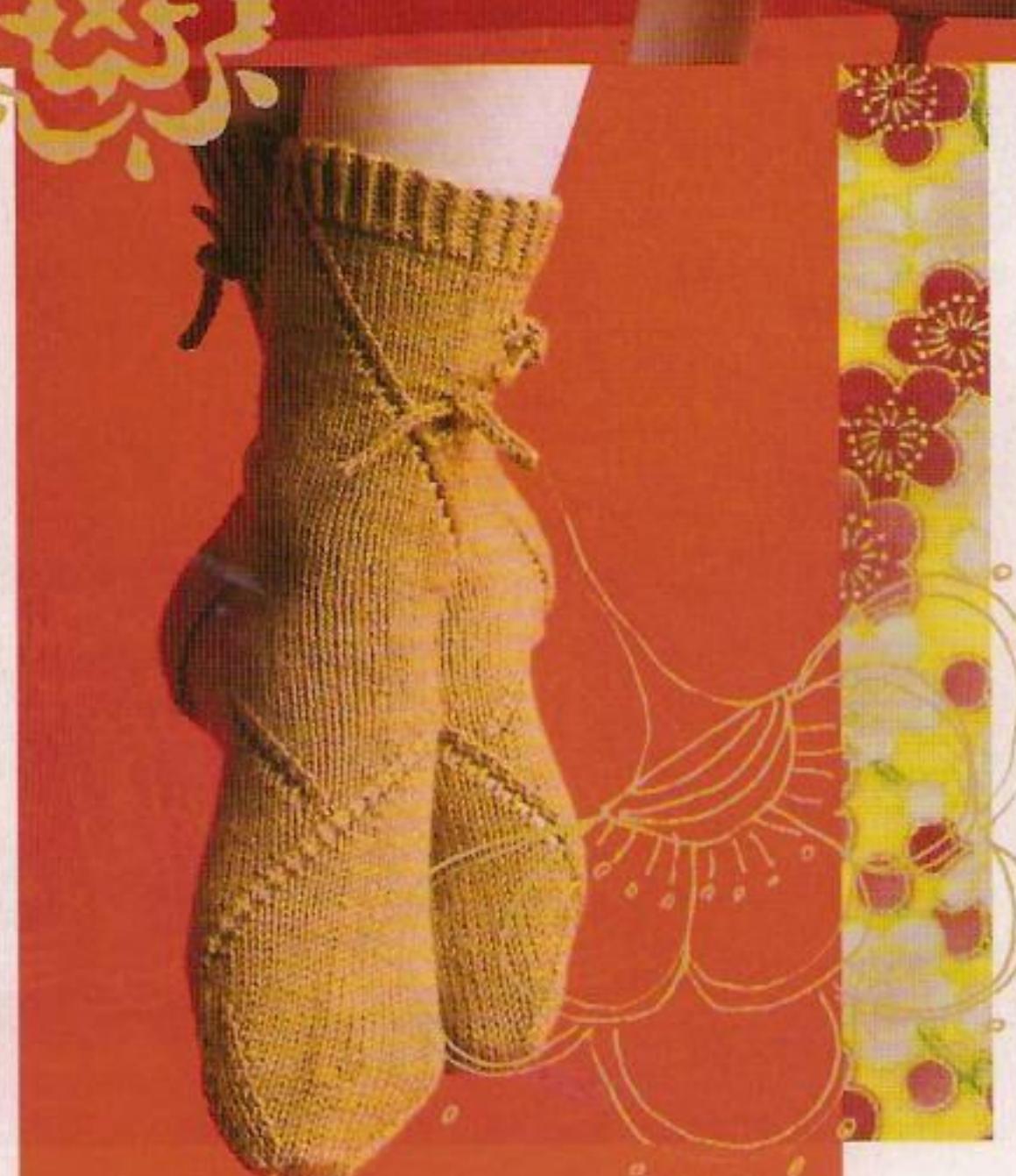

Yarn distributed by Muench Yarns

Gauge 19 sts and 22 rows = 4" in St st on larger needles

Tools

- Size 6 (4 mm): 29" or longer circular (cir) needle and set of double-pointed needles (dpn)
- Size 5 (3.5 mm): 24" or longer cir needle
- Markers (m)
- Cable needle (cn)
- Waste yarn
- Yarn needle

Notes

Tunic is worked from the top down. Before joining front below neckline, garment is worked flat in rows; after joining back and front, the body is worked in the round.

Stitches

7/6 Left Cross (LC): Sl 6 sts to cn and hold in front, k6, p1, k6 from cn.

Right Twist (RT): Knit 2nd st on left needle but do not drop st from needle, knit first st on left needle and drop both sts from needle.

Opulent Cable: (worked over 13 sts)

Rnds 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 15, and 17 K6, p1, k6.

Even-numbered Rnds 2–20 Work sts as they appear.

Rnds 13 and 19 Work 7/6 LC (see Stitches).

Rep Rnds 1–20 for patt.

Easy Braid: (worked over 2 sts)

Rnd 1 RT (see Stitches).

Rnd 2 K2.

Rep these 2 rows for patt.

Yoke

Beg at neck edge, using larger cir needle, CO 2 (2, 2, 2, 4, 6, 6) sts (front), place marker (pm), 2 (2, 2, 2, 4, 4, 4) sts (sleeve), pm, 26 (26, 28, 30, 36, 40, 42) sts (back), pm, 2 (2, 2, 2, 4, 4, 4) sts (sleeve), pm, 2 (2, 2, 2, 4, 6, 6) sts (front)—34 (34, 36, 38, 52, 60, 62) sts total. Do not join.

Shape raglan:

Row 1 (RS) Knit to m, sl m, k1f&b, [knit to 1 st before next m, k1f&b, sl m, k1f&b] 2 times, knit to 1 st before next m, k1f&b, sl m, knit to end—6 sts inc'd.



Row 2 (WS) Purl.

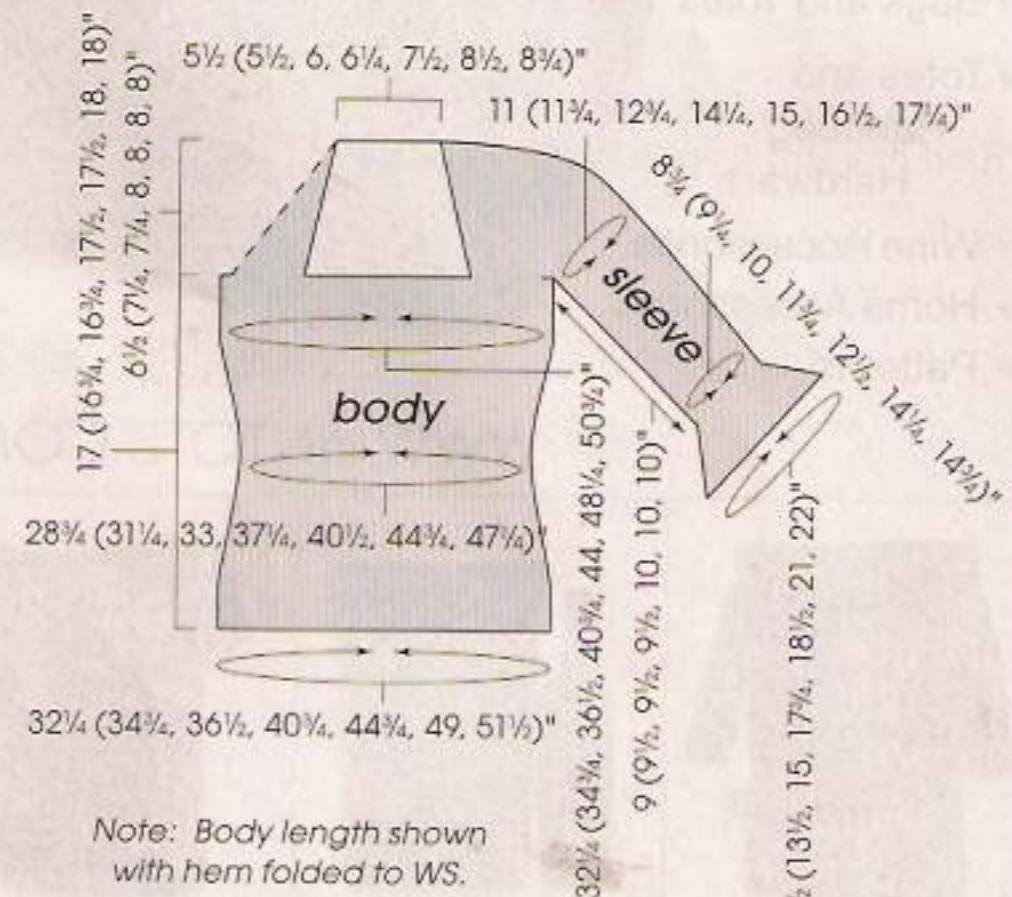
Rep last 2 rows 5 (5, 5, 3, 3, 3) more times—70 (70, 72, 74, 76, 84, 86) sts. **Shape neck and raglan:**

Row 1 (RS) [Knit to 1 st before next m, k1f&b, sl m, k1f&b] 4 times, knit to end—8 sts inc'd.

Row 2 Purl.

Rep last 2 rows 11 (13, 13, 15, 17, 17, 17) more times—166 (182, 184, 202, 220, 228, 230) sts: 14 (16, 16, 18, 22, 24, 24) sts for each front, 38 (42, 42, 46, 48, 48, 48) sts for each sleeve, and 62 (66, 68, 74, 80, 84, 86) sts for back. Work 1

WS row. **Join body:** Knit across right front, remove m, place sleeve sts on waste yarn, remove m, use the backward-loop method to CO 7 (8, 9, 11, 12, 15, 17) sts, pm for beg of rnd, CO 7 (8, 9, 11, 12, 15, 17) sts, pm, join to back, work across back to m, remove m, place sleeve sts on waste yarn, CO 7 (8, 9, 11, 12, 15, 17) sts, sl m for "side seam," CO 7 (8, 9, 11, 12, 15, 17) sts, join to left front, work to end, pm for cable panel, CO 35 (35, 37, 39, 37, 37, 39) sts for cable panel, pm, join to right front—153 (165, 173, 193, 209, 229, 241) sts on needle. **Cable panel and body:** Work sts on each side of cable



Note: Body length shown with hem folded to WS.

panel in St st (knit all rnds) and work cable panel as foll:
Rnd 1 Knit to cable-panel m, p3, work Rnd 1 of easy braid (see Stitches), p2, work Rnd 1 of easy braid, p2 (2, 3, 4, 3, 3, 4), work Rnd 1 of opulent cable (see Stitches) over 13 sts, p2 (2, 3, 4, 3, 3, 4), work Rnd 1 of easy braid, p2, work Rnd 1 of easy braid, p3, knit to end of rnd.

Work in established patt for 21 (19, 19, 23, 23, 27, 27) rnds.

Shape waist: Cont in patt, work as foll: K1, k2tog, work to 3 sts before next side m, ssk, k1, sl m, k1, k2tog, work to 3 sts before end-of-rnd m, ssk, k1—4 sts dec'd. Cont in patt, rep last rnd every 5th rnd 3 more times—137 (149, 157, 177, 193, 213, 225) sts rem. Work 5 rnds even. **Inc rnd** K1, M1, work to 1 st before next side m, M1, k1, sl m, k1, M1, work to 1 st before end-of-rnd m, M1, k1—4 sts inc'd. Rep Inc rnd every 5th rnd 3 (3, 3, 3, 4, 4, 4) more times—153 (165, 173, 193, 213, 233, 245) sts. Work even in patt until piece measures 23½ (24, 24, 25½, 25½, 26, 26)" from back neck. End with Rnd 6 or 18 of cable patt, then purl 1 rnd (turning rnd). Change to smaller needle and knit 6 rnds for hem. BO all sts.

SLEEVES

Place 38 (42, 42, 46, 48, 48, 48) held sleeve sts on dpn, join yarn and knit all sts, pick up and knit 7 (7, 9, 11, 12, 15, 17) sts in underarm, pm for beg of rnd, pick up and knit 7 (7, 9, 11, 12, 15, 17) more sts in underarm, join in the rnd—52 (56, 60, 68, 72, 78, 82) sts. Knit 2 rnds. **Shape sleeve:** K1, k2tog, knit to 3 sts before end of rnd, ssk, k1—2 sts dec'd. Work 7 (8, 8, 8, 9, 9, 9) rnds even. Rep dec rnd every 8 (9, 9, 9, 10, 10, 10)th rnd 4 (5, 5, 5, 5, 4, 5) more times—42 (44, 48, 56, 60, 68, 70) sts rem. Work even until sleeve measures 9 (9½, 9½, 9½, 10, 10, 10)" from underarm. **Cuff:** Inc 22 (20, 24, 28, 28, 32, 34) sts as foll:

Size 32½" only:

M1, *k2, M1; rep from * to end—64 sts.

Sizes 34¾ (44, 48¾, 50¾)" only:

K2, *k2, M1; rep from * to last 2 (2, 2, 0) sts, k2 (2, 2, 0)—64 (88, 100, 104) sts.

Sizes 36½ (40¾)" only:

*K2, M1; rep from * to end—72 (84) sts.

All sizes:

Rnd 1 *K2, p2; rep from * to end.

Rnd 2 *RT, p2; rep from * to end.

Rep Rnds 1 and 2 two more times. **Inc rnd** *K2, p1, M1P, p1; rep from * to end—80 (80, 90, 105, 110, 125, 130) sts.

Rnd 3 *RT, p3; rep from * to end.

Rnd 4 *K2, p3; rep from * to end.

Rep Rnds 3 and 4 five more times. BO all sts in patt.

FINISHING

Neckline: With removable markers, mark left-most st and right-most st at corners of lower edge of front neckline. With RS facing and beg at top of left sleeve, with smaller cir needle, pick up and knit 2 (2, 2, 2, 4, 4, 4) sts along top of sleeve, 30 (34, 34, 38, 38, 38, 38) sts along left neck edge to left marked st, pm, 34 (34, 36, 38, 36, 36, 38) sts along front neck to right marked st, pm, 30 (34, 34, 38, 38, 38, 38) sts up right neck edge, 2 (2, 2, 2, 4, 4, 4) sts along top of right sleeve, and 26 (26, 28, 30, 36, 40, 42) sts along back neck—124 (132, 136, 148, 156, 160, 164) sts. Pm for beg of rnd. Work in 1x1 rib to 2 sts before first neck m, sl 1, k1, pss0, work in patt to next m, k2tog, work in patt to end. Rep last rnd 2 more times. BO loosely in patt. Turn hem to WS at purl rnd and tack in place. Weave in ends. ☐

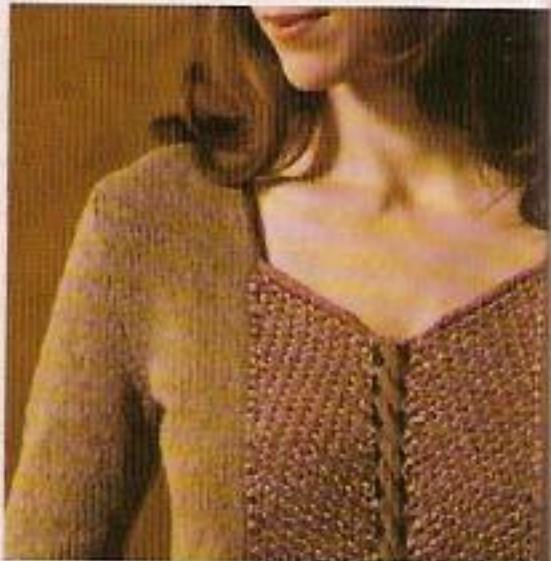

Notes

Each front piece is worked in intarsia to join the center panel with the side panel. Twist yarns when changing colors to prevent holes. Initial cast-on stitches are for the center-front section, which is worked in biased seed stitch. Stitches for the MC side panel are cast on a few stitches at a time on subsequent rows.

For ease of measuring your progress, run a reference line through the MC stitches after completing side-panel cast-on rows. To insert the reference line, thread a yarn needle with a length of contrasting waste yarn. Run the waste yarn through each MC stitch without taking the stitches off of the needle. When measuring length, measure to the reference line. Reference lines will be removed during finishing.

The center panel is worked with three different colors in a one row per color stripe pattern. Color changes are easy as the next color is waiting at the end of each row.

Stitches

Biased Seed Stitch: (even number of sts)

Color sequence Changing colors every row, work as foll: CC2, CC3, CC1.

Right Front:

Row 1 (RS) K1, k2tog, *p1, k1; rep from * to last st, M1P, k1.

Row 2 (WS) P1, *p1, k1; rep from * to last st, p1.

Row 3 K1, p2tog, *k1, p1; rep from * to last st, M1, k1.

Row 4 P1, *k1, p1; rep from * to last st, p1.

Rep Rows 1–4 for patt.

Left Front:

Row 1 (WS) P1, ssp, *k1, p1; rep from * to last st, M1, p1.

Row 2 (RS) K1, *k1, p1; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 3 P1, ssk, *p1, k1; rep from * to last st, M1P, p1.

Row 4 K1, *p1, k1; rep from * to last st, k1.
Rep Rows 1–4 for patt.

BACK

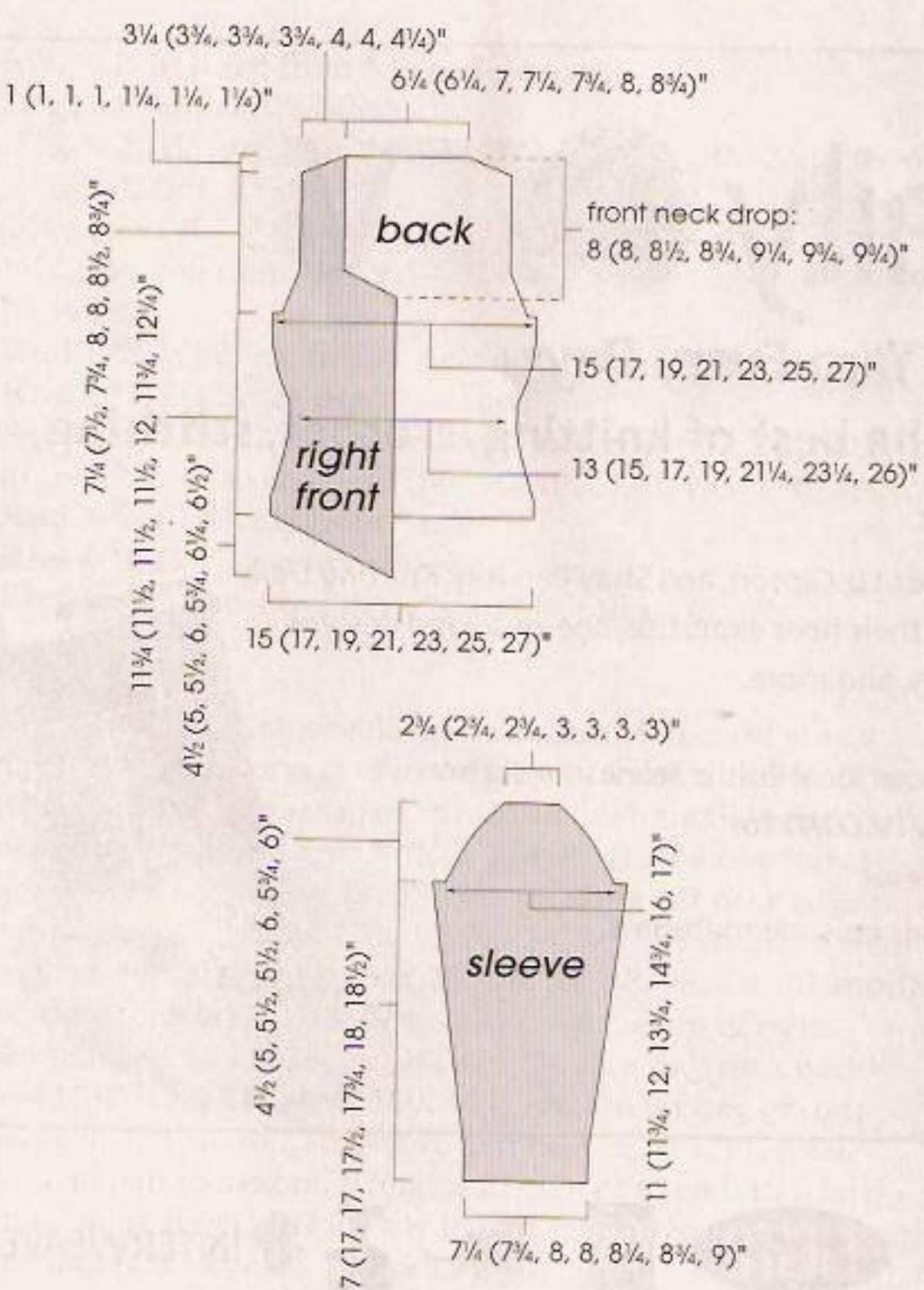
With larger needle and MC, CO 90 (102, 114, 126, 138, 150, 162) sts. Do not join. Work 4 rows in St st. **Shape waist:** Dec 1 st each end of needle on next row—2 sts dec'd. Rep dec row every 3 (3, 3, 3, 6, 5, 11) rows 5 (5, 5, 5, 4, 4, 2) more times—78 (90, 102, 114, 128, 140, 156) sts rem. Work even in St st until piece measures 4 (4, 4, 4, 4½, 4½, 5)" from CO. **Shape bust:** Inc 1 st each end of needle on next row—2 sts inc'd. Rep inc row every 9 (8, 9, 9, 14, 10, 21) rows 5 (5, 5, 5, 4, 4, 2) more times—90 (102, 114, 126, 138, 150, 162) sts. Work even in St st until piece measures 11½ (11½, 11½, 11½, 12, 11½, 12½)" from CO, ending with a WS row. **Shape armholes:** BO 3 (5, 6, 8, 9, 11, 11) sts at beg of next 2 rows—84 (92, 102, 110, 120, 128, 140) sts rem. Dec 1 st each end of needle every row 0 (0, 0, 0, 4, 8, 10) times, then every other row 1 (3, 6, 6, 6, 6, 7) time(s), then every 4th row 2 (2, 2, 4, 3, 2, 2) times—78 (82, 86, 90, 94, 96, 102) sts rem. Work even in St st until armholes measure 7½ (7½, 7½, 8, 8, 8½, 8¾)", ending with a WS row. **Shape shoulders:** BO 4 sts at beg of next 10 (6, 6, 4, 12, 12, 10) rows, then 5 sts at beg of next 0 (4, 4, 6, 0, 0, 2) rows—38 (38, 42, 44, 46, 48, 52) sts rem. BO all sts.

RIGHT FRONT

With larger needle and CC1, CO 20 (20, 24, 26, 26, 28, 30) sts. Do not join.

Row 1 (RS) Purl.

Row 2 Knit.



Row 3 With CC2, work first row of biased seed st for right front (see Stitches).

With MC and using the knitted method (see page 32), CO 3 (3, 3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts for side panel, purl these new sts, change to CC3 and work Row 2 of seed st patt. The side panel will be worked in St st with MC only, while the 20 (20, 24, 26, 26, 28, 30) sts at center front are worked in seed st patt with three colors, joined to MC section intarsia-style (see Notes). Cont as established, CO 3 (3, 3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts at beg of each WS row 7 (9, 11, 12, 10, 11, 12) more times, then CO 2 (2, 0, 2, 2, 3, 3) sts once—46 (52, 60, 67, 72, 79, 85) sts total; 26 (32, 36, 41, 46, 51, 55) sts for side panel. Insert reference line (see Notes). Work 4 rows as established. **Shape waist:** Dec 1 st at side edge (end of RS rows; beg of WS rows) on next row, then every 3 (3, 3, 3, 6, 5, 11) rows 5 (5, 5, 5, 4, 4, 2) more times—40 (46, 54, 61, 67, 74, 82) sts rem. Work even in patt until piece measures 4 (4, 4, 4, 4½, 4½, 5)" from reference line. **Shape bust:** Inc 1 st at side edge on next row, then every 9 (8, 9, 9, 14, 10, 21) rows 5 (5, 5, 5, 4, 4, 2) more times—46 (52, 60, 67, 72, 79, 85) sts. Work in patt until piece measures 11½ (11½, 11½, 12, 11½, 12½)" from reference line, ending with a RS row. **Shape armhole:** BO 3 (5, 6, 8, 9, 11, 11) sts at beg of next WS row—43 (47, 54, 59, 63, 68, 74) sts rem. Dec 1 st at armhole edge every row 0 (0, 0, 0, 4, 8, 10) times, then every other row 1 (3, 6, 6, 6, 6, 7) time(s), then every 4th row 2 (2, 2, 4, 3, 2, 2) times—40 (42, 46, 49, 50, 52, 55) sts rem. Work even until armhole measures 2½ (3, 3¼, 3, 3¼, 3¼)", ending with a WS row. **Shape neck:** (RS) With CC1, purl across seed st section, do not knit MC sts, turn. With CC1, knit to end of row. With CC1, BO all seed st section sts pwise—20 (22, 22, 23, 24, 24, 25) sts rem. Work in St st on MC sts until armhole measures 7½ (7½, 7½, 8, 8, 8½, 8¾)". **Shape shoulders:** BO 4 sts at armhole edge 5 (3, 3, 2, 6, 6, 5) times, then 5 sts 0 (2, 2, 3, 0, 0, 1) time(s)—no sts rem.

LEFT FRONT

With larger needle and CC1, CO 20 (20, 24, 26, 26, 28, 30) sts. Do not join.

Row 1 (WS) Knit.

Row 2 Purl.

Row 3 With CC2, work first row of biased seed st for left front (see Stitches).

With MC and using the knitted method, CO 3 (3, 3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts for side panel, knit these new sts, change to CC3 and work Row 2 of seed st patt. Cont as established, CO 3 (3, 3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts at beg of each RS row 7 (9, 11, 12, 10, 11, 12) more times, then CO 2 (2, 0, 2, 2, 3, 3) sts once—46 (52, 60, 67, 72, 79, 85) sts total; 26 (32, 36, 41, 46, 51, 55) sts for side panel. Insert reference line. Work 4 rows. Work waist, bust, and armhole shaping as for right front, beg armhole shaping on a RS row. Work even until armhole measures 2½ (3, 3, 3¼, 3, 3¼, 3¼)", ending with a RS row. **Shape neck:** (WS) With CC1, knit across seed st section, do not knit MC sts, turn. With CC1, purl to end of row. With CC1, BO all seed st section sts kwise. Complete as for right front.

SLEEVES

With larger needle and MC, CO 44 (46, 48, 48, 50, 52, 54) sts. Do not join. Work in St st for 1½", ending with a WS row. Inc 1 st each end of needle on next row, then every 14 (14, 14, 8, 8, 8, 6) rows 4 (4, 4, 16, 8, 9, 23) more times, then every 12 (10, 10, 0, 8, 6, 0) rows 6 (7, 7, 0, 10, 12, 0) times—66 (70, 72, 82, 88, 96, 102) sts. Work in St st until

piece measures 17 (17, 17, 17½, 17¾, 18, 18½)" from CO, ending with a WS row. **Shape cap:** BO 3 (5, 6, 8, 9, 11, 11) sts at beg of next 2 rows—60 (60, 60, 66, 70, 74, 80) sts rem. Dec 1 st each end of needle every row 3 (3, 0, 3, 3, 5, 5) times, then every other row 3 (5, 6, 4, 6, 4, 5) times, then every 4th row 4 (5, 6, 7, 6, 6, 5) times, then every other row 4 (3, 5, 3, 5, 4, 5) times, then every row 3 (1, 0, 1, 0, 3, 5) time(s)—26 (26, 26, 30, 30, 30, 30) sts rem. BO 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 6, 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows—16 (16, 16, 18, 18, 18, 18) sts rem. BO all sts.

FINISHING

Remove reference lines. Block all pieces to size. Sew shoulder seams. Sew sleeves into armholes. Sew sleeve and side seams.

Side and back neck edges: With RS facing, cir needle, and MC, pick up and knit 33 (33, 34, 35, 37, 39, 40) sts along right-front neck along side panel (do not pick up sts along center-front bias panel), 38 (38, 42, 44, 46, 48, 52) sts along back neck, 33 (33, 34, 35, 37, 39, 40) sts along left-front neck on side panel—104 (104, 110, 114, 120, 126, 132) sts total.

Row 1 (WS) Knit.

Row 2 Purl.

BO all sts kwise. **Cords:** (make 2) With dpn and MC, CO 4 sts. Work 21½ (21½, 21½, 22, 22½, 22½, 23½)" I-cord. Place sts on holder. Mark center-front edges of bodice at 1" intervals or as desired. Tack CO edges of two I-cord strands tog. Tack I-cord to center-front edges at marked intervals, twisting the two I-cord strands between tacks. Adjust I-cord length as necessary. To finish I-cord ends, thread tail onto yarn needle and run tail through sts twice, then fasten tail into I-cord. Tack finished ends of I-cord strands tog. Weave in ends. ☐

Rep Rows 1 and 2 until piece measures 1½" from CO, ending with a WS row. **Next row (RS)** P2tog, *k1, sl 1 with yarn in front (wyf), k1, p2tog; rep from * to end—37 sts rem.

Row 1 (WS) K1, *p3, k1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 (RS) P1, *k1, sl 1 wyf, k1, p1; rep from * to end.

Rep last 2 rows until piece measures 8" from CO, ending with a WS row. **Hand:** Work 2 rows even in St st. **Next row (RS)** Cont in St st, inc 10 sts evenly spaced across—47 sts. Work 2 rows even in St st. **Thumb gusset:** (WS) P22, pm, p3, pm, inc row (RS) Knit to m, sl m, k1, left lifted inc (LLI), knit 1 st before next m, right lifted inc (RLI), k1, sl m, knit to end—2 sts inc'd. **Next row (WS)** Purl. Rep last 2 rows 6 more times, ending with a WS row—61 sts total: 17 sts between m. Work 2 rows even in St st. **Next row (RS)** Knit to m, BO 17 sts, knit to end of row—44 sts rem. **Next row (WS)** Purl all closing gap above thumbhole by pulling tightly on working y after passing the gap. Work in St st until piece measures 1½" from thumb gusset BO, ending with a WS row. **Next row (RS)** Inc 3 sts evenly spaced across—47 sts.

Row 1 (WS) *K2, p3; rep from * to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 2 (RS) P2, *k1, sl 1 wyb, k1, p2; rep from * to end.

Rep last 2 rows for 1", ending with a WS row. BO all sts in p.

FINISHING

Sew hand seam from BO edge to beg of wrist rib. **Buttonband:** Pick up and knit 44 sts along left side of opening from CO to end of wrist rib.

Rows 1 and 3 (WS) K2, p40, k2.

Row 2 Knit.

With RS facing, BO all sts. On second mitt, pick up sts for buttonband along right side of opening, from end of wrist rib to CO, and work as for first buttonband. **Buttonhole band:** CO 52 sts.

Row 1 (RS) K1, yo, *k5, pass the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th sts over the first st, yo; rep from * to last st, k1—23 sts rem.

Row 2 (P1, * (p1, yo, k1tbl) in next st, p1; rep from * to end—45 sts.

Row 3 K2, k1tbl, *k3, k1tbl; rep from * to last 2 sts, k2.

Row 4 Purl.

BO all sts. Sew BO edge of buttonhole band to side of rib opening opposite buttonband. Sew 8 buttons to buttonband opposite the first 8 holes between shells formed on buttonhole band. Weave in ends. ☐

Row 1 Esc (see Stitches) in 5th ch from hook (tch count as ch 1, esc, ch 1), *ch 1, sk 1 ch, esc in next ch; rep from * across, turn.

Row 2 Ch 3 (counts as esc, ch 1), sk esc, sk ch-1 sp, esc in next esc, *ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, esc in next esc; rep from * across, turn.

Rep Row 2 for patt.

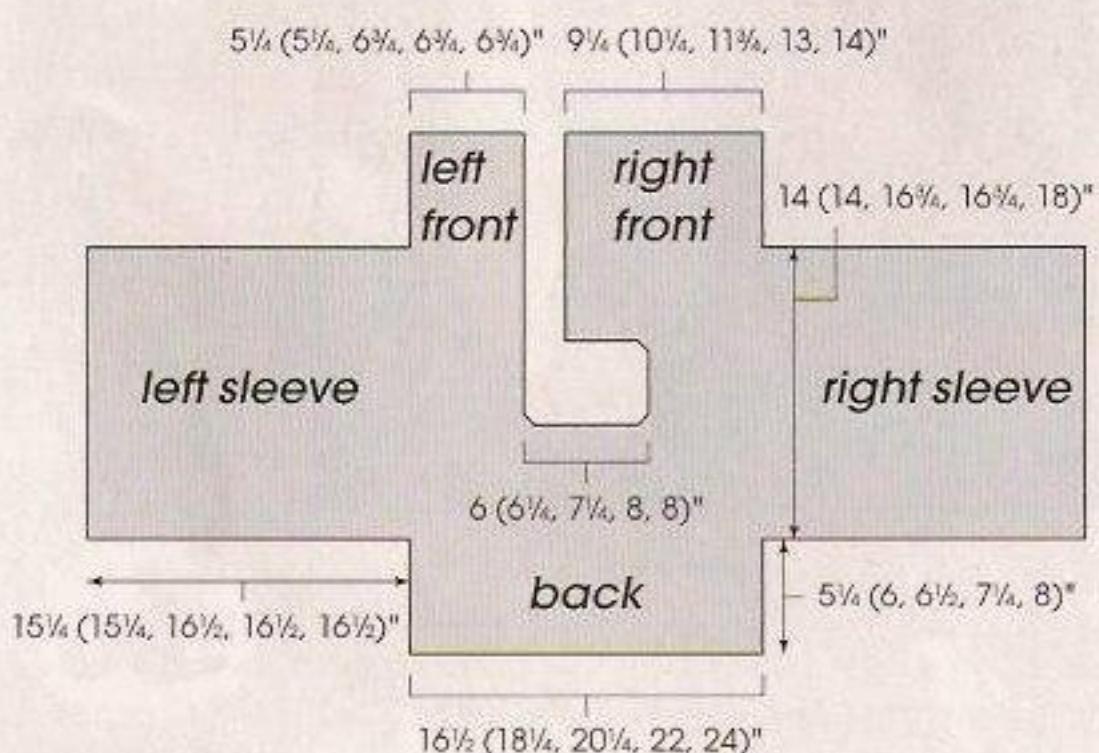
JACKET

Back: With larger hook, ch 87 (97, 107, 117, 127). **Next row** (RS) Work Row 1 of extended mesh patt (see Stitches)—43 (48, 53, 58, 63) esc. Work Row 2 of patt 15 (15, 19, 19, 19) times, ending with a WS row. **Sleeves:** With WS still facing, ch 82 (82, 88, 88, 88), drop yarn, turn so RS is facing, join new yarn with larger hook and sl st to tch of previous row, ch 80 (80, 86, 86, 86), fasten off. Pick up working yarn (at beg of RS row, at end of sleeve), esc in 5th ch from hook (tch counts as ch 1, esc, ch 1), *ch 1, sk 1 ch, esc in next ch; rep from * to body section, cont in extended mesh patt across body to foundation ch of second sleeve; rep from * to end, turn—123 (128, 139, 144, 149) esc. Work Row 2 of extended mesh patt across all sts 18 (18, 22, 22, 24) times, ending with a RS row. **Neck:**

Row 1 (WS) Work in patt for 55 (57, 61, 63, 65) esc (including tch), leave rem sts unworked, sc in ch-1 sp, sl st in esc, turn.

Row 2 (RS) Sk sl st, sl st in sc, sl st in esc, sc in ch-1 sp, esc in esc, work in extended mesh patt across, turn—54 (56, 60, 62, 64) esc.

Work Row 2 of extended mesh patt 21 (21, 25, 25, 27) times, ending with a WS row. **Left-front panel:**



Row 1 (RS) Work in patt for 14 (16, 17, 19, 21) esc (including tch), leave rem sts unworked, turn.

Work Row 2 of extended mesh patt 15 (15, 19, 19, 19) times, ending with a WS row. Fasten off. **Right sleeve and neck shaping:**

Row 1 With WS facing, join yarn with sl st into 12 (13, 16, 17, 18)th esc from sl st on Row 1 of neck opening (leaving 11 [12, 15, 16, 17] esc unworked between the sl st on Row 1 of neck opening and the joining sl st of this row), sc in next ch-1 sp, esc in next esc, work in extended mesh patt across, turn—55 (57, 61, 63, 65) esc.

Row 2 Work in extended mesh patt to last 2 esc, esc in next esc, sc in ch-1 sp, sl st in last esc, turn—54 (56, 60, 62, 64) esc.

Row 3 Sk sl st, sl st in sc, esc in next esc, work in patt across, turn.

Work Row 2 of extended mesh patt 5 times, ending with a RS row.

Row 9 (WS) Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), esc in first esc, work in patt across, turn.

Row 10 Work in patt to last esc, esc in last esc, ch 1, (esc, ch 1, dc) all in 3rd ch of tch, turn—55 (57, 61, 63, 65) esc.

Row 11 Ch 18 (20, 26, 28, 30), esc in 5th ch from hook (4 skipped ch count as ch 1, esc, ch 1), *ch 1, sk 1 ch, esc in next ch; rep from * across ch sts, ch 1, sk 1 ch, esc in dc, ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, work in patt across, turn—64 (67, 74, 77, 80) esc.

Work Row 2 of extended mesh patt 12 (12, 16, 16, 18) times, ending with a WS row. Fasten off. **Right-front panel:** With RS facing, sk 40 (40, 43, 43, 43) esc, join yarn with sl st to next esc, ch 2 (counts as esc), work in patt across, turn—24 (27, 31, 34, 37) esc. Work Row 2 of extended mesh patt 15 (15, 19, 19, 19) times, ending with a WS row. Fasten off.

EDGINGS

Block body to schematic measurements. Spray with water and allow to dry. With WS facing, whipstitch sleeve and side seams. **Cuffs:** Join yarn with smaller hook to sleeve seam with RS facing.

Rnd 1 Ch 1, sc 40 (40, 50, 50, 60) around cuff, gathering fabric as you work, sl st to first sc, turn.

Row 2 Ch 16, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, sl st to body twice (first sl st joins ribbing to sleeve, second counts as tch), turn—15 sc.

Row 3 Sk both sl sts, sc-blo in next sc and each sc across, turn.

Row 4 Ch 1, sc-blo in next sc and each sc across, sl st to body twice, turn.

Rep Rows 3–4 evenly around cuff opening. Fasten off.

Whipstitch ends tog. **Neck ribbing:** Join yarn with smaller hook to neck edge of right front with RS facing.

Row 1 Ch 16, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, sl st to body twice (first sl st joins ribbing to body, second counts as a turning ch), turn—15 sc.

Rep Rows 3–4 of cuff evenly around neck opening. Fasten off. **Body ribbing:** Join yarn with smaller hook to lower edge of left front with RS facing.

Row 1 Ch 11, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, sl st to body twice (first sl st joins ribbing to body, second counts as tch), turn—10 sc.

Rep Rows 3–4 of cuff evenly around lower-body edge. Fasten off. **Front-panel ribbing:** Place 6 (6, 7, 7, 8) st markers evenly along right-front panel. Join yarn with smaller hook to lower edge of ribbing at right-front panel with RS facing.

Row 1 Ch 11, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, sl st to body twice (first sl st joins ribbing to body, second counts as tch), turn—10 sc.

Row 2 Sk both sl st, sc-blo in next sc and each across, turn.
Row 3 Ch 1, sc-blo in next sc and each across, sl st to body twice, turn.
 Rep Rows 2-3 evenly across panel to marker, ending with Row 2. ***Next row** Ch 1, sc-blo in next 4 sc, ch 2, sk 2 sc, sc-blo in each sc across, sl st to body twice, turn—buttonhole made. **Next row** Sk both sl st, sc-blo in next sc and each across to ch-sp, 2 sc in ch-sp, sc-blo in each sc across, turn. Rep Rows 2-3 evenly across panel to next marker, ending with Row 2. Rep from * across panel. Fasten off. Rep above for left panel without buttonholes joining yarn at upper edge of neck ribbing with RS facing. Weave in ends.

Notes

Sleeves are worked in the round to underarm, then worked in rows for cap shaping.

When knitting in rows, first and last stitches should be worked in garter stitch for selvedges.

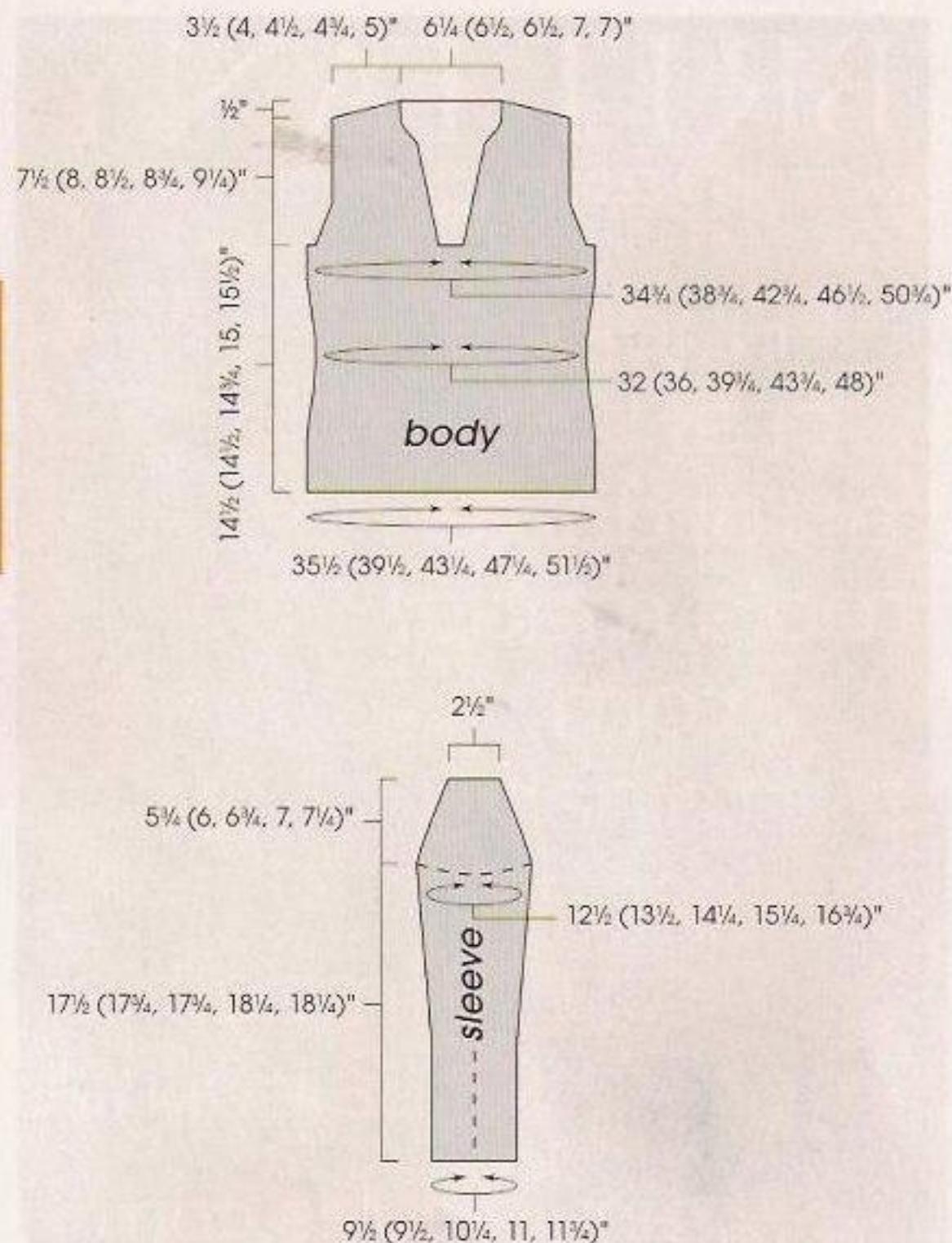

Mark side seams and darts: Place marker (pm) for side seam (and beg of rnd), k25 (27, 30, 33, 36), pm for dart, k50 (57, 62, 67, 73), pm for dart, k25 (27, 30, 33, 36), pm for side seam, k25 (27, 30, 33, 36), pm for dart, k50 (57, 62, 67, 73), pm for dart, knit to end. Purl 1 rnd (garter ridge). Faux side seams: Sl first m, work 1 st in faux side seam patt (see Stitches) knit to next seam m, sl m, work 1 st in faux side seam patt, knit to end. Work in St st with faux side seams in garter st until piece measures 3 (3, 3½, 3½, 4)" from CO. **Shape waist:** **Dec rnd**

*Work in patt to dart m, sl m, ssk, work to 2 sts before next dart m, k2tog; rep from * once, work to end—4 sts dec'd. Rep Dec rnd every 8th rnd 4 times more—180 (202, 224, 246, 270) sts rem. Work 13 rnds even. **Inc rnd** *Work in patt to dart m, sl m, M1, work to next dart m, M1, sl m; rep from * once, work to end—4 sts inc'd. Rep Inc rnd every 10th rnd 3 more times—196 (218, 240, 262, 286) sts. Remove dart m and work even until piece measures 14½ (14½, 14½, 15, 15½)" from CO. **Divide for front and back:** Beg working in rows on back sts only. **Armpholes:** (RS) K2tog (eliminating faux seam st), BO 5 (6, 8, 8, 8) sts, knit to next seam m, sl m, k1, turn, place rem 97 (108, 119, 130, 142) sts on holder for front. **Next row (WS)** P2tog (eliminating faux seam st), BO 5 (6, 8, 8, 8) sts, purl to end—87 (96, 103, 114, 126) sts rem for back. BO 0 (0, 0, 3, 6) sts at beg of next 0 (0, 0, 2, 2) rows—87 (96, 103, 108, 114) sts rem. Dec 1 st each end of needle on every RS row 6 (7, 8, 8, 8) times—75 (82, 87, 92, 98) sts rem. Work in St st until armholes measure 7½ (8, 8½, 8½, 9¼)", ending with a WS row. **Shape neck and left**



shoulder: Work short-rows as foll: (RS) K20 (23, 25, 26, 29) for right shoulder, BO 35 (36, 37, 40, 40) sts for neck, knit to last 10 (11, 12, 13, 14) sts, wrap next st, turn, purl to end. **Next row** (RS) Knit across, picking up and working wrap with wrapped st. Place 20 (23, 25, 26, 29) sts on holder (left shoulder). **Right shoulder:** With WS facing, join yarn to neck edge. Purl to last 10 (11, 12, 13, 14) sts, wrap next st, turn, knit to end. **Next row** (WS) Purl across, picking up and working wrap. Place 20 (23, 25, 26, 29) sts on holder. **Front:** With RS facing, join yarn to side edge. **Armholes and neck:** (RS) BO 5 (6, 8, 8, 8) sts, k39 (43, 47, 52, 58), BO 9 (10, 9, 10, 10) center sts for neck, knit to end. **Next row** (WS) BO 5 (6, 8, 8, 8) sts, purl to neck edge; join yarn to opposite neck edge (to work both sides at the same time), purl to end—39 (43, 47, 52, 58) sts each side. Cont to shape armholes as for back and **AT THE SAME TIME** dec 1 st at each neck edge every 5th row once and then every 6th row 7 more times—25 (28, 31, 33, 36) sts rem each side. Work until armholes measure 6 1/4 (6 1/2, 7, 7 1/4, 7 1/2)"", ending with a WS row. **Shape crew neck:** BO 3 (3, 4, 5, 5) sts at each neck edge once, then dec 1 st at each neck edge every RS row 2 times—20 (23, 25, 26, 29) sts rem for shoulders. Cont to work until armholes measure 7 1/2 (8, 8 1/2, 8 3/4, 9 1/4)"". Work shoulder shaping as for back.

SLEEVES

CO 58 (58, 62, 66, 70) sts. Do not join. **Next row** (WS) K1, work purl twist st (see Stitches) to last st, k1. **Next row** (RS) K1, work in patt to last st, k1. Cont as established until piece measures 6 1/2 (6 1/2, 6 1/2, 7, 7)"", ending with a RS row. **Next**

row (WS) Purl and dec 5 (4, 4, 4, 4) sts evenly—53 (54, 58, 62, 66) sts rem. Pm and join in the rnd. **Next rnd** K26 (27, 29, 31, 33), pm for center of sleeve, knit to end. Knit 5 rnds. **Inc rnd** Work to center of sleeve m, M1, sl m, k1, M1, work to end. Rep Inc rnd every 10 (8, 8, 7, 6)th rnd 8 (10, 10, 11, 13) times—71 (76, 80, 86, 94) sts. Work even until piece measures 17 1/2 (17 1/4, 17 1/4, 18 1/4, 18 1/4)"". **Divide for sleeve cap:** (RS) BO 5 (6, 8, 8, 8) sts, k66 (70, 72, 78, 86), turn. **Next row** (WS) BO 5 (6, 8, 8, 8) sts, purl to end. BO 0 (0, 0, 3, 6) sts at beg of next 0 (0, 0, 2, 2) rows—61 (64, 64, 66) sts rem. Dec 1 st each side every row 3 (3, 0, 0, 0) times, then every other row 5 (6, 8, 8, 8) times, then every 4th row 4 (4, 5, 5, 5) times, then every other row 5 (6, 6, 6, 7) times. BO 3 sts at beg of next 4 rows. BO rem 15 (14, 14, 14, 14) sts.

FINISHING

Block sweater and sleeves. **Left-front band:** With RS facing, beg at crew-neck edge, pick up and knit 40 (43, 46, 48, 51) sts down left neck shaping to center front BO sts. **Next row** (WS) Work purl twist st across. **Inc row** (RS) Work purl twist st to last st, M1, k1. Rep Inc row on every RS row 3 more times—44 (47, 50, 52, 55) sts. Work even until band measures 1 1/2 (1 1/4, 1 1/4, 1 1/4, 1 1/4)"", ending with a RS row. BO all sts. **Right-front band:** With RS facing, beg at center-front BO sts, pick up and knit 40 (43, 46, 48, 51) sts along right front. **Next row** (WS) Work purl twist st across. **Inc row** (RS) K1, M1, work purl twist st to end. Rep Inc row on every RS row 3 more times. Work even until band measures 1 1/2 (1 1/4, 1 1/4, 1 1/4, 1 1/4)"", ending with a RS row.

Row 1 (WS) BO 18 (19, 21, 22, 23) sts, dec 1 st, work to end. **Row 2** (RS) Dec 1 st, work to end.

Rep Row 2 every 4th row and **AT THE SAME TIME** dec 1 st at beg of every WS row until 5 sts rem. BO as foll: K2tog, k1, pass 2nd st over first st; k2tog, pass 2nd st over first st; rep from * until all sts are BO. **Hood:** With RS facing, beg at center-front edge of right-front band, pick up and knit 91 (95, 95, 101, 101) sts for hood around neck shaping, ending at center-front edge of left band. **Next row** (WS) K1, p45 (47, 47, 50, 50), pm, purl to 1 st before end, k1. Working in purl twist st, work even for 8 rows. **Inc row** (RS) Work to m, M1, sl m, k1, M1, work to end. Rep Inc row every 10th row 5 more times—103 (107, 107, 113, 113) sts. Work even until hood measures 12 3/4", ending with a WS row. **Shape top of hood:** (RS) Work 51 (53, 53, 56, 56) sts, BO 1 st, work to end.

Short-row shaping (working left side first): (WS) Work to last 8 (8, 8, 9, 9) sts, wrap next st, turn, work in patt to end. Work to last 16 (16, 16, 18, 18) sts, wrap next st, turn, work to end. Work to last 24 (24, 24, 27, 27) sts, wrap next st, turn, work to end. Work to last 32 (32, 32, 36, 36) sts, wrap next st, turn, work to end. Work to last 40 (40, 40, 45, 45) sts, wrap next st, turn, work to end. Work across, picking up wraps as you go. Place 51 (53, 53, 56, 56) sts on holder. With WS facing, join yarn at BO center st. Work short-rows as for left side, reversing shaping. Join shoulders with three-needle BO. Sew sleeve caps into armholes. Sew bottom edge of left-front band to the BO center sts at center-front opening. Sew bottom edge of right-front band to the BO center sts, lapping right band over left. Using three-needle BO, join the top halves of the hood tog. Crochet 16 button loops by working short chains, then working sc into each ch around and joining into a ring. Attach 6 evenly spaced button loops to the outer edge of the split cuff. Repeat for other sleeve. Attach buttons on the opposite edge of the cuffs to match the button loops.

Attach the rem 4 button loops evenly spaced on the asymmetrical flap of the right band (see photo). Attach buttons just beyond the left-front band edge to match button loops. Weave in ends. ☐

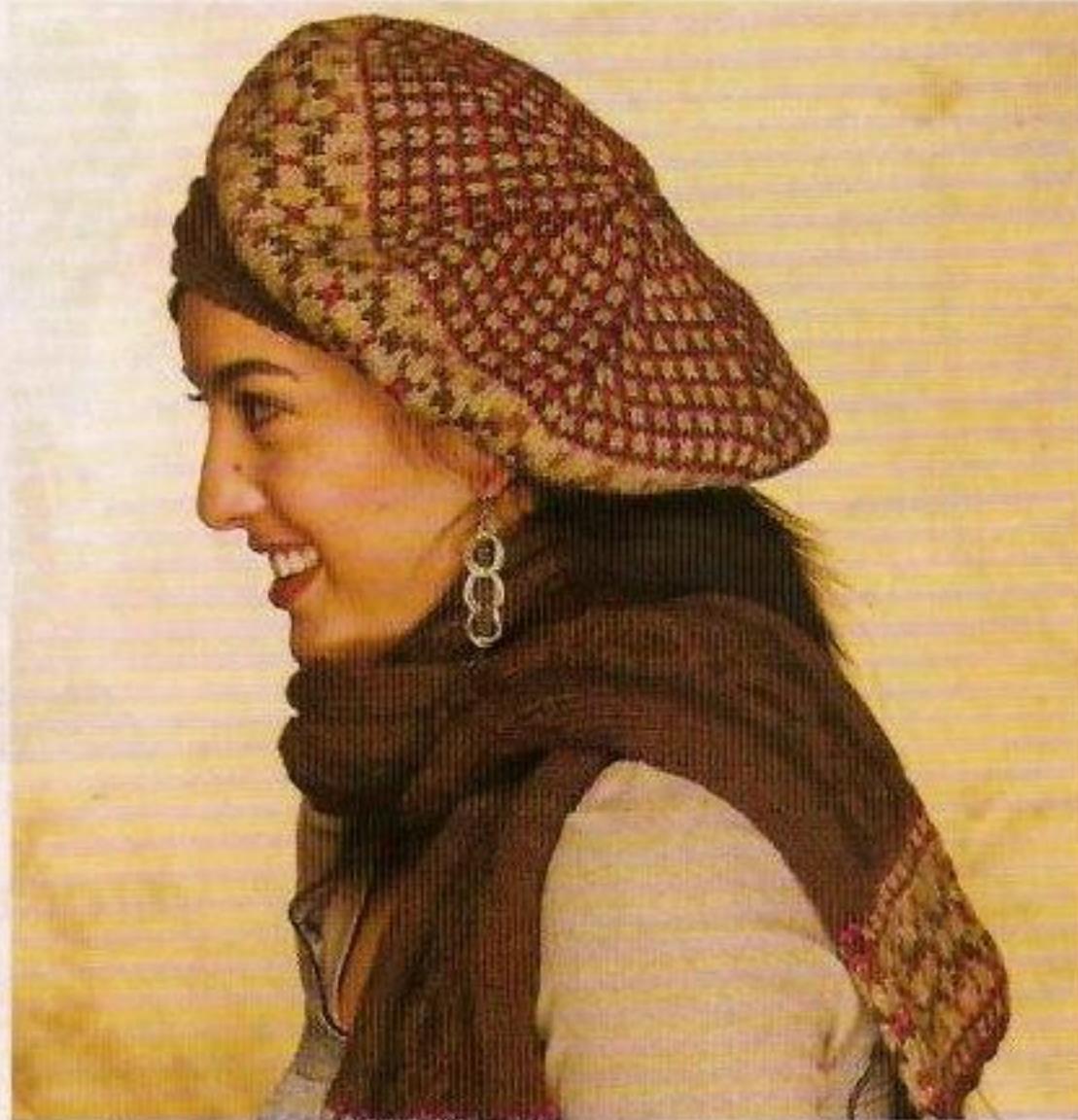

Work Rnds 1–4 of Fair Isle Pattern 1 chart. **Inc rnd** Inc 2 sts evenly around in patt, work Rnd 1 of Fair Isle Pattern 2

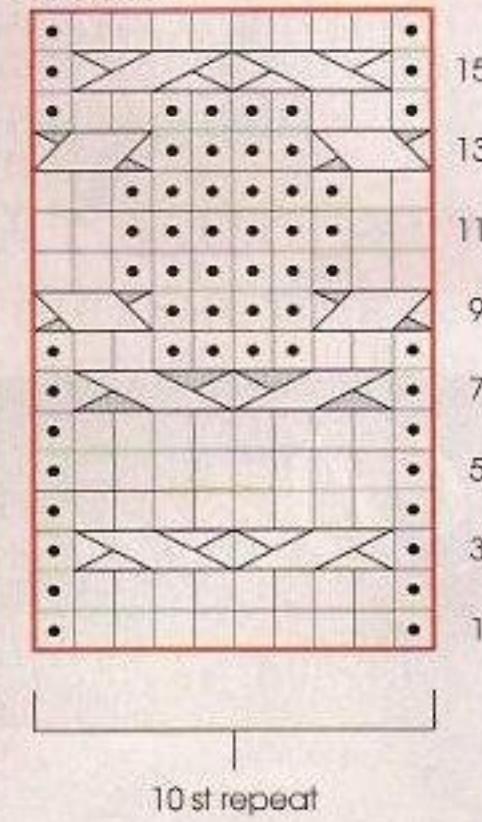

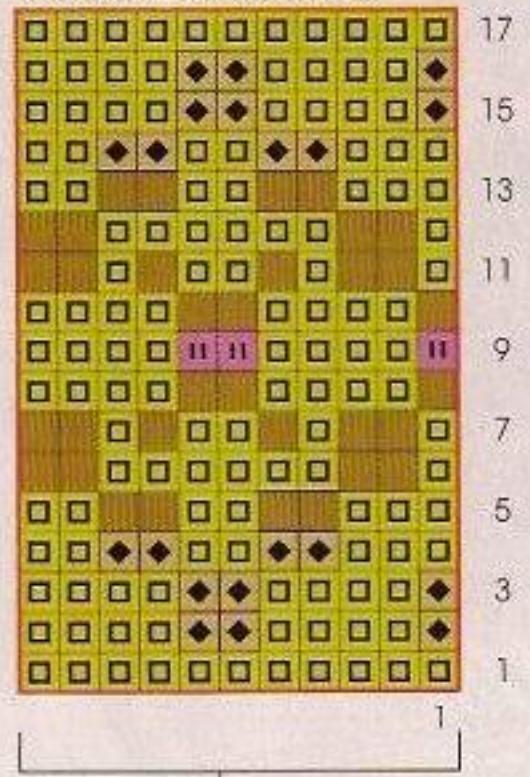

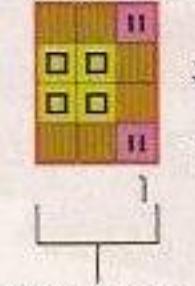

Work Rnds 1–3 of Fair Isle Pattern 1 chart. **Dec rnd** Cont in patt, *work to 3 sts before m, work dbl dec (see Stitches), sl m; rep from * around—14 sts dec'd. Work 1 rnd even in patt. Cont in patt, changing to dpn when necessary, rep Dec rnd every other rnd until 2 sts rem between m—14 sts total rem. **Next rnd** With walnut, [k2tog] around—7 sts rem. Cut yarn, leaving a 10" tail. Thread tail through rem sts and secure to WS of hat.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends. Block over an 11" plate. Thread black thin elastic onto yarn needle and run through the inside edge of the lower edge of hatband and secure ends on WS.

Rnds 2–5 *Work Fair Isle Pattern 1 across 33 sts, work St 1 once more, p1 in background color; rep from * once. Work Rnds 2–4 of patt, maintaining p1 sts as established in background color of each rnd.

Rnds 6–22 Change to Fair Isle Pattern 2; work 11-st rep across 33 sts, work St 1 once more, p1 in background color; rep from * once. Work Rnds 2–17 of patt, maintaining p1 sts as established in background color of each rnd.

Rnds 23–26 Rep Rnds 2–5.

Rnd 27 Rep Rnd 1.

Body: Cont with walnut, change to smaller cir needle and Cable chart as foll: *K6, p6; beg with Rnd 1, work next 10 sts from Cable chart, p6, k6, p1; rep from * once. Cont as established, work Rnds 2–16 of Cable chart once, then 16-rnd rep 24 times (or desired length). **Fair Isle border:** Change to larger cir needle and rep Rnds 1–27 of Fair Isle border. BO all sts.

FINISHING

Sew ends closed. Weave in ends. Lay flat and block edges, being careful not to flatten cable. ☐

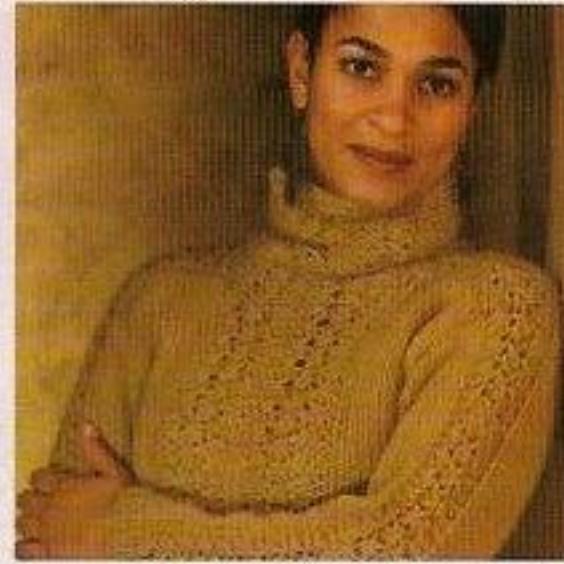

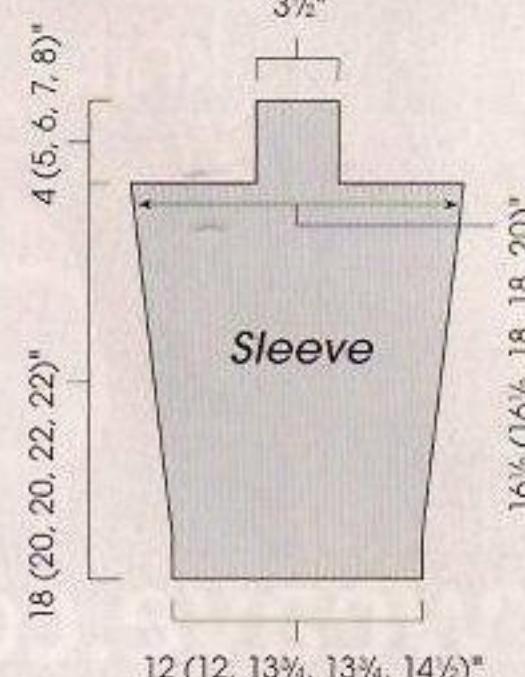
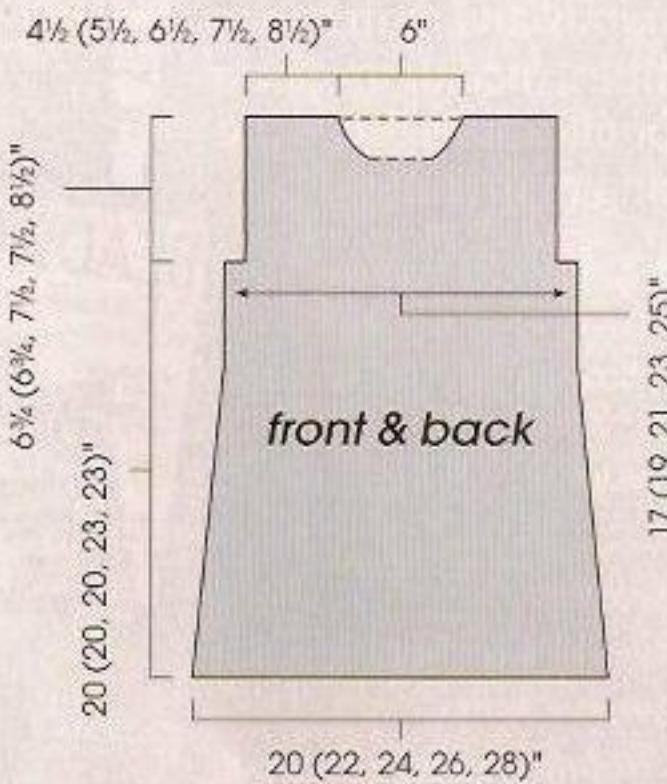

Cont in established patt until piece measures 4 (4, 4, 7, 7)" from CO, ending with Row 2 of lace patt. **Shaping:** (RS) Knit to m, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, ssk, k8, k2tog, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, knit to end. Cont lace patt and dec 2 sts in center St st panel in this manner every 14 rows 5 more times—12 sts dec'd; no more St sts left between lace panels; 52 (58, 64, 72, 78) sts rem. Work even until piece measures 20 (20, 20, 23, 23)" from CO, ending with Row 2 of lace patt. **Shape armholes:** BO 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows—46 (52, 58, 66, 72) sts rem. Work even in patt for 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ (6 $\frac{1}{4}$, 7 $\frac{1}{2}$, 7 $\frac{1}{2}$, 8 $\frac{1}{2}$)", ending with Row 3 of lace patt. **Next row (WS)** BO 14 (17, 20, 24, 27) sts, work center 18 sts in patt, purl to end. **Next row (RS)** BO 14 (17, 20, 24, 27) sts, place 18 sts on holder for neck.

FRONT

Work as for back until armholes measure 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ (4 $\frac{3}{4}$, 5 $\frac{1}{2}$, 5 $\frac{1}{2}$, 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ "), ending with Row 4 of lace patt. **Shape front neck:** K14 (17, 20, 24, 27), remove m, k3, place center 12 sts on holder, join new yarn, k3, remove m, k14 (17, 20, 24, 27). Work each side separately at the same time. **Next row (WS)** P14 (17, 20, 24, 27), k3, move to other shoulder, k3, p14 (17, 20, 24, 27). **Next row (RS)** K15 (18, 21, 25, 28), k2tog, move to other shoulder, ssk, k15 (18, 21, 25, 28). **Next row** P14 (17, 20, 24, 27), k2, move to other shoulder, k2, p14 (17, 20, 24, 27). **Next row** K14 (17, 20, 24, 27), k2tog, move to other shoulder, ssk, k14 (17, 20, 24, 27). **Next row** P14 (17, 20, 24, 27), k1, move to other shoulder, k1, p14 (17, 20, 24, 27). **Next row** K13 (16, 19, 23, 26), k2tog, move to other shoulder, ssk, k13 (16, 19, 23, 26). **Next row** P14 (17, 20, 24, 27), move to other shoulder, p14 (17, 20, 24, 27). **Next row** BO 14 (17, 20, 24, 27) sts, move to other shoulder, BO 14 (17, 20, 24, 27) sts.

SLEEVES

With larger needles, CO 39 (39, 43, 43, 47) sts.

Row 1 *K1, p1; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 2 *P1, k1; rep from * to last st, p1.

Rows 3–6 Rep Rows 1 and 2 two more times.

Establish patt: (RS) K15 (15, 17, 17, 19), pm, work Row 1 of lace patt over 9 sts, pm, k15 (15, 17, 17, 19).

Row 2 (WS) P15 (15, 17, 17, 19), sl m, work Row 2 of lace patt, sl m, p15 (15, 17, 17, 19).

Cont in patt and **AT THE SAME TIME** inc 1 st each end of needle every 10 rows 7 (7, 8, 8, 9) times—53 (53, 59, 59, 65) sts. Work even in patt until sleeve measures 18 (20, 20, 22, 22)" from CO, ending with Row 2 of lace patt. **Shoulder saddle:**

Row 1 (RS) BO 21 (21, 24, 24, 27) sts, k1, sl m, work Row 3 of lace patt over 9 sts, sl m, work to end in patt.

Row 2 (WS) BO 21 (21, 24, 24, 27) sts, p1, sl m, work Row 4 of lace patt over 9 sts, sl m, p1—11 sts rem.

Work in patt, with lace over center 9 sts and 1 selvedge st each side, until saddle measures 4 (5, 6, 7, 8)", ending with Row 4 of lace patt. Place 11 sts on holder.

FINISHING

Neck: **Note:** Neck is worked in rows on a cir needle. Join right sleeve to back and front. Join left sleeve to front only. With size 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ (10 $\frac{1}{2}$, 11, 11, 11) needles and RS facing, sl 11 sts from left-sleeve saddle, pm, pick up and knit 3 sts along left-front

neck edge, sl 12 sts from front holder onto needle, pm, pick up and knit 3 sts along right-front neck edge, pm, sl 11 sts from right-sleeve saddle, pm, sl 18 sts from back neck—58 sts total. Join yarn to left-sleeve saddle with RS facing.

Row 1 (RS) *K2tog, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1, ssk*, work Row 1 of lace patt over next 18 sts, rep from * to * once, work Row 1 of lace patt over 18 sts, turn—54 sts rem.

Row 2 (WS) Work Row 2 of lace patt 6 times around. Cont in lace patt until neck measures 10", ending with Row 4 of patt. BO all sts very loosely. Sew sleeve and neck seams. Lay flat and block body. Sew side and sleeve seams. ☐

Rnd 3 Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 2, (dc, ch 4, sc, ch 7, sc, ch 4) in same ch-3 sp, dc4tog (see Stitches) in the same ch-3 sp and the next ch-3 sp, (ch 4, sc, ch 4) in same ch-3 sp, *dc4tog in same ch-3 sp and the next ch-3 sp, (ch 4, sc, ch 7, sc, ch 4) in same ch-3 sp, dc4tog in the same ch-3 sp and the next ch-3 sp, (ch 4, sc, ch 4) in same ch-3 sp; rep from * 2 times, dc2tog in same ch-3 sp, sl st to first dc, fasten off, weave in ends.

HALF GRANNY SQUARE

Make and join 36 (36, 39, 39) half squares.

Ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring.

Row 1 Ch 1, sc 6 times in ring, turn.

Row 2 Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), dc-cl in next sc, *ch 3, dc-cl in next sc; rep from * 2 times, ch 1, dc in last sc, turn—4 dc-cl.

Row 3 Ch 8 (counts as sc, ch 7), sc in ch-1 sp, ch 4, dc4tog in same ch-1 sp and the next ch-3 sp, (ch 4, sc, ch 4) in same ch-3 sp, dc4tog in same ch-3 sp and the next ch-3 sp, (ch 4, sc, ch 7, sc, ch 4) in same ch-3 sp, dc4tog in same ch-3 sp and the next ch-3 sp, (ch 4, sc, ch 4) in same ch-3 sp, dc4tog in the same ch-3 sp and the next ch-1 sp, (ch 4, sc, ch 8, sl st) in same ch-1 sp. Fasten off, weave in ends.

THREE-QUARTER GRANNY SQUARE

Make and join 8 (8, 10, 10).

Ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring.

Row 1 Ch 1, sc 8 times in ring, turn.

Row 2 Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), dc-cl in next sc, *ch 3, dc-cl in next sc; rep from * 4 times, ch 1, dc in last sc, turn—6 dc-cl.

Row 3 Ch 8 (counts as sc, ch 7), sc in ch-1 sp, ch 4, dc4tog in

same ch-1 sp and the next ch-3 sp, (ch 4, sc, ch 4) in same ch-3 sp, *dc4tog in same ch-3 sp and the next ch-3 sp, (ch 4, sc, ch 7, sc, ch 4) in same ch-3 sp, dc4tog in same ch-3 sp and the next ch-3 sp, (ch 4, sc, ch 4) in same ch-3 sp; rep from * 1 time, dc4tog in same ch-3 sp and the next ch-1 sp, (ch 4, sc, ch 8, sl st) in same ch-1 sp. Fasten off, weave in ends.

JOINING GRANNY SQUARES

Follow directions for all motifs above to Rnd/Row 3.

Rnd/Row 3 Cont in Rnd/Row 3 to first ch-7 corner sp, ch 3, sl st to adjoining granny's ch-7 corner sp, ch 3, sc to working granny in same ch-3 sp, *ch 3, sl st to adjoining granny's ch-4 sp, dc4tog to working granny in same ch-3 sp and the next ch-3 sp, sl st to adjoining granny's next ch-4 sp, ch 3, sc to working granny in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sl st to adjoining granny's next ch-4 sp, dc4tog to working granny in same ch-3 sp and the next ch-3 sp, sl st to adjoining granny's next ch-4 sp, ch 3, sc to working granny in same ch-3 sp, ch 3, sl st to adjoining granny's ch-7 sp, ch 3, sc to working granny in same ch-3 sp, cont in Rnd 3 to end, or rep from * for each adjoining edge. Fasten off, weave in ends.

Cont joining all motifs in same manner by connecting all side ch-4 sps and all corner ch-sp, referring to layout diagrams, making separate body and shawl pieces. Once body and shawl are completed, pin to schematic measurements and lightly spray with water to block before continuing.

SEAMING

On body piece, place WS of fronts and back tog.

Sizes 32 (36)" only:

Whipstitch half of shoulder seam (referring to diagram), leaving remainder unworked to connect shawl collar.

Sizes 40 (45)" only:

Unwind granny edges at back shoulder seam, connect granny squares in same manner as body with a sl st in each ch-sp across, fasten off, weave in ends.

All sizes: Place RS of body and WS of shawl tog. Whipstitch three-quarter and half granny squares of shawl to body. Unwind rem full granny squares along neck edge of shawl. Connect grannies in same manner as body by sl st in each ch-sp around neck. Fasten off, weave in ends.

FINISHING

Armbands: Join yarn with sl st to RS of armhole.

Rnd 1 Ch 1, sc evenly around opening (end with any even number of sts), sl st to first sc, turn.

Rnd 2 Ch 1, sc in each sc around, sl st to first sc, turn.

Rnd 3 Ch 1, sc in next sc, *ch 3, sk 1 sc, sc in next sc; rep from * around, sl st to first sc. Fasten off, weave in ends.

Body edging: With RS facing, join yarn with sl st to bottom edge of right front.

Rnd 1 Ch 1, sc evenly around half grannies (end with any even number of sts), at full granny square *sc in corner ch-7 sp, [ch 2, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 1, sc in next ch-4 sp] twice, ch 2, sc in corner ch-7 sp; rep from * around full granny square edges, cont sc evenly around half grannies, sl st to first sc, turn.

Work Rnd 2 of armband edging, working 2 sc into ch-2 sps and 1 sc into ch-1 sps (end with any even number of sts), sl st into first sc, turn. Work Rnd 3 of armbands. Fasten off, weave in ends. **Closures:** Cut grosgrain ribbon into two 2" pieces. Tuck under ends of ribbon. Pin one ribbon piece 8" up from the bottom edge on the RS of the left front. Pin other ribbon

to the WS of right front 8" up from bottom edge and 11" in from side edge. With sewing needle and matching thread, backstitch ribbon pieces to vest. Whipstitch hook-and-eye closures to ribbon pieces. Use shawl pin or kilt pin to close opposite panel at any point along the right side. ☐

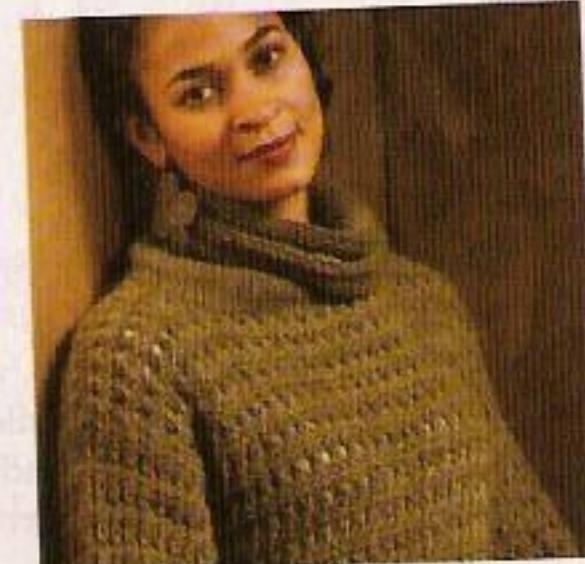

It is important to knit to the number of rows/rounds specified rather than knitting to the dimensions of the schematic. The sweater will grow a lot with blocking.

Stitches

Slip-Stitch Mesh in the Round:

Rnd 1 Purl.

Rnd 2 Purl.

Rnd 3 *K1, sl 1 wyb; rep from * around.

Rnd 4 *P1, sl 1 wyb; rep from * around.

Rnd 5 *Yo, k2tog; rep from * around.

Rnd 6 Knit.

Rep Rnds 1-6 for patt.

Note: The first yo on Rnd 5 may cause the m to slip to the left; watch for this and be sure to return it to the correct spot.

Slip-Stitch Mesh in Rows:

Row 1 (RS) Purl.

Row 2 Knit.

Row 3 K2, *sl 1 wyb, k1; rep from * to end.

Row 4 *K1, sl 1 wyb; rep from *, end k2.

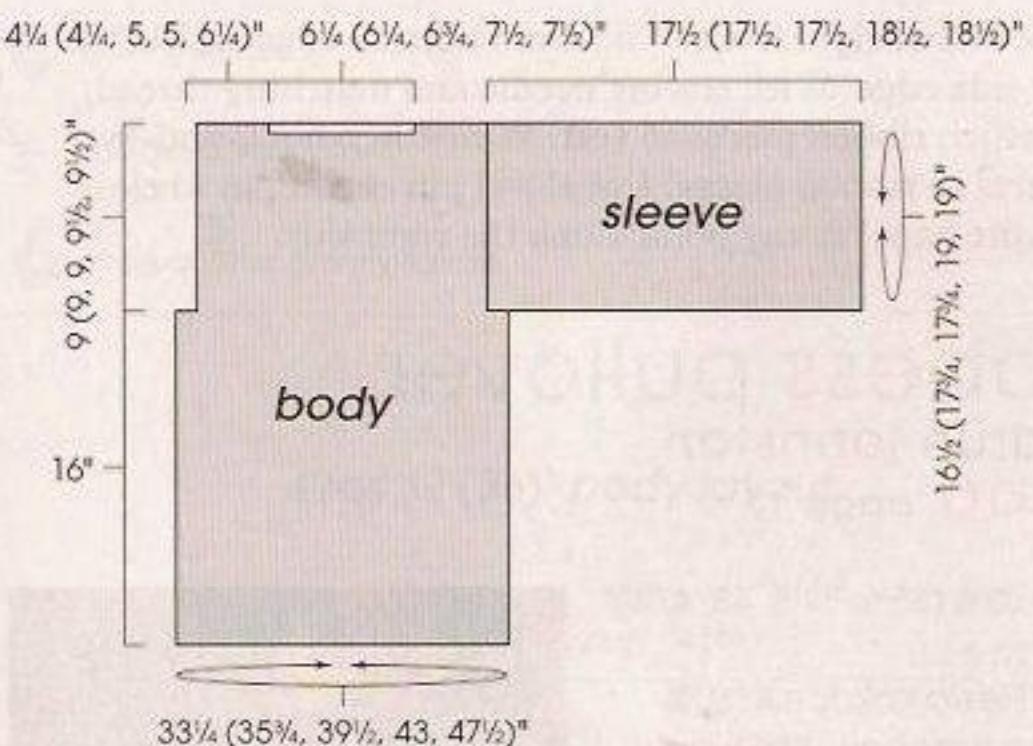
Row 5 K1, *yo, k2tog; rep from *, end k1.

Row 6 Purl.

Rep Rows 1-6 for patt.

BODY

With smaller, longer cir needle, CO 108 (116, 128, 140, 156) sts. Place marker (pm) and join in the rnd. Work Rnds 1-6 of slip-stitch mesh in the rnd (see Stitches) for a total of 14



reps—84 rnds total. Shape armholes: BO 3 (5, 5, 7, 7) sts, work in patt until there are 48 (48, 54, 56, 64) sts on right needle, BO 6 (10, 10, 14, 14) sts, work in patt until there are 48 (48, 54, 56, 64) sts on right needle after last BO section, BO last 3 (5, 5, 7, 7) sts. Cut yarn and fasten off. Place one set of 48 (48, 54, 56, 64) sts on a holder or scrap yarn for front.

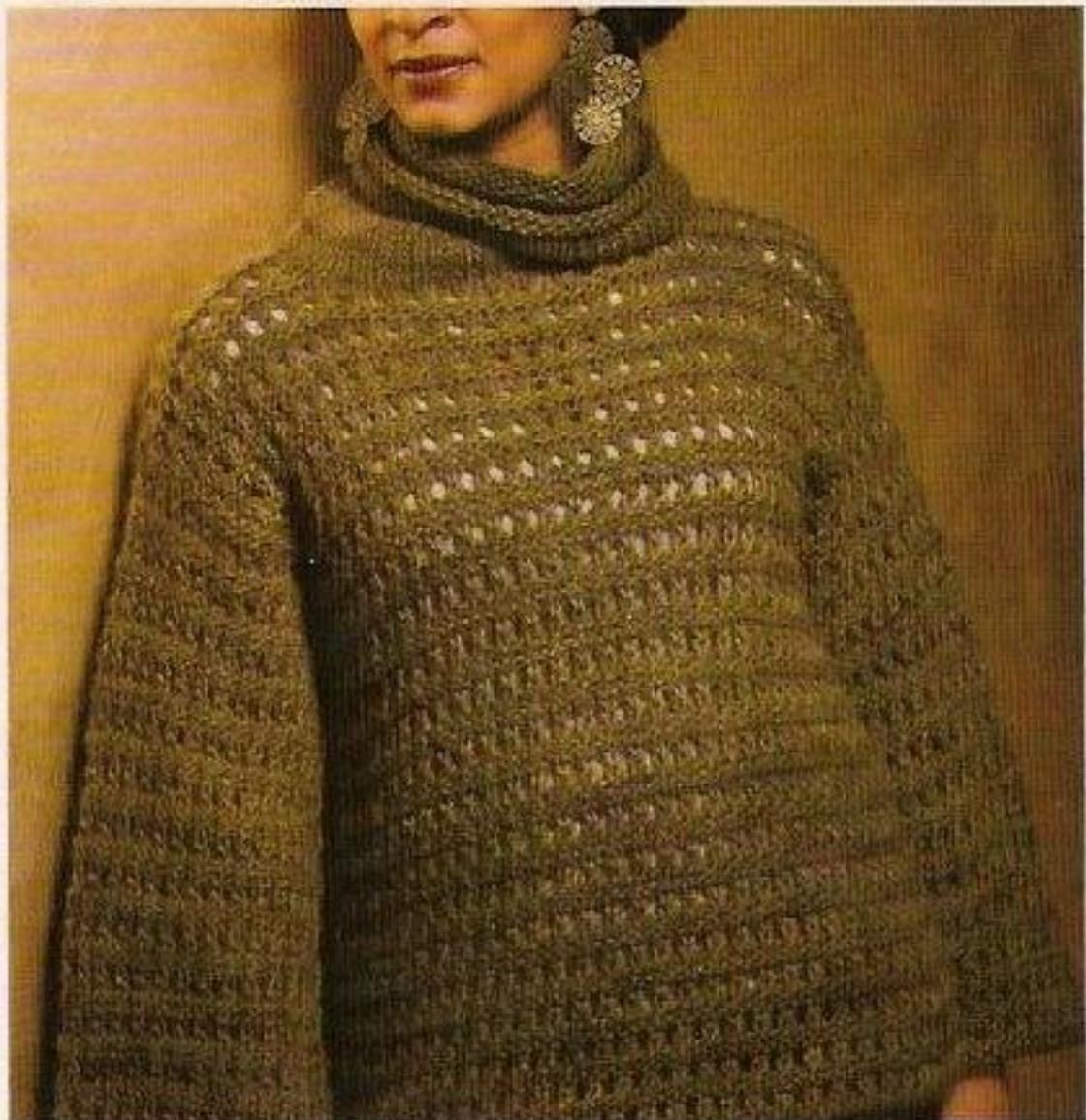
BACK

With WS facing, join yarn to back sts; beg with Row 2 of slip st mesh in rows, work through Row 6, then work 6-row rep 7 times—47 rows total.

Sizes 43 (47 1/2)" only: Work Rows 1 and 2 of patt once more. Leave all sts on a holder or scrap yarn.

FRONT

Place held sts for front on needle. With WS facing, join yarn and, beg with Row 2, work through Row 6 of mesh patt in rows 6 times—35 rows total. **Neck:** Work 14 (14, 16, 16, 20) sts in patt; place next 20 (20, 22, 24, 24) sts on a holder for neck; join a second ball of yarn and work rem 14 (14, 16, 16, 20) sts in patt. Working both sides at same time, cont in patt for a total of 2 more reps—47 rows total.



Sizes 43 (47 1/2)" only: Work rows 1 and 2 of patt once more. All sizes: Shoulders: Join 14 (14, 16, 16, 20) sts of each shoulder with three-needle BO; on back, leave rem 20 (20, 22, 24, 24) sts on a holder for neck.

SLEEVES

With RS facing and smaller, shorter cir needle, beg at center of underarm, pick up and knit 3 (5, 5, 7, 7) sts at underarm, 24 (24, 24, 25, 25) sts up the armhole to shoulder seam, 24 (24, 24, 25, 25) sts down to underarm, then 3 (5, 5, 7, 7) sts across rem underarm. Pm and join in the rnd—54 (58, 58, 64, 64) sts total.

Sizes 43 (47 1/2)" only: Dec 2 sts on first rnd at underarm—62 sts rem.

All sizes: Work 15 (15, 15, 16, 16) reps of mesh patt in the rnd. Purl 2 rnds. BO all sts.

COWL

With RS facing and smaller, shorter cir needle, beg at back neck sts, k20 (20, 22, 24, 24) sts from holder, then pick up and knit 6 (6, 6, 7, 7) sts down left-front neck edge, k20 (20, 22, 24, 24) from front neck holder, then pick up and knit 6 (6, 6, 7, 7) sts from right-front neck edge—52 (52, 56, 62, 62) sts total. Pm and join in the rnd. Knit every rnd for 2 1/2". Change to larger cir needle and knit every rnd until cowl measures 11 1/2" from pick-up rnd. BO all sts loosely.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Block sweater to schematic measurements. Be careful not to overstretch the garment when wet. ☐

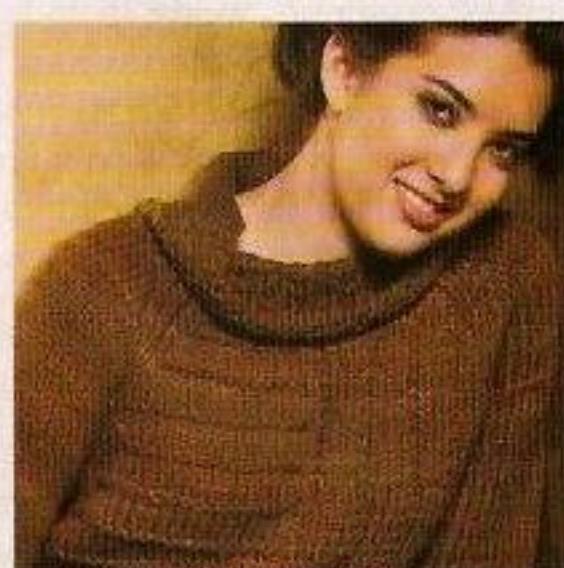

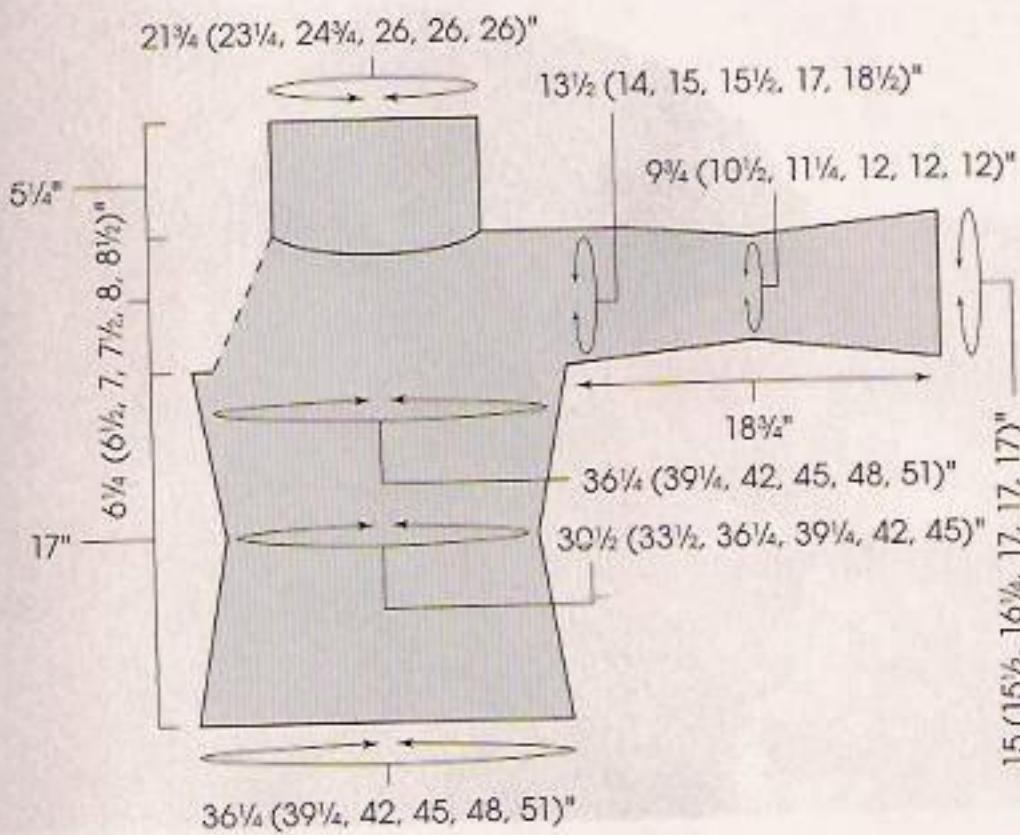

Rnd 5 (first dec rnd) *K1, k2tog, knit to next m, sl m, knit to 3 sts before next m, ssk, k1, sl m; rep from * once more—4 sts dec'd.

Rnd 6 Work Rnd 6 of asymmetrical patt maintaining patt as est. Cont in patt and rep Dec rnd every 10th rnd 3 more times—84 (92, 100, 108, 116, 124) sts rem. Work even in patt until piece measures 8 1/4" from CO—40 rnds completed.

Rnd 41 (first inc rnd) *K1, M1L, knit to next m, sl m, knit to last st before next m, M1R, k1, sl m; rep from * once more—4 sts inc'd.

Cont in patt and rep inc rnd every foll 10th rnd 3 more times—100 (108, 116, 124, 132, 140) sts. Work even in patt until piece measures 16 1/4" from CO. Work next rnd in patt to last 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts, BO next 6 (6, 6, 8, 8, 8) sts, work to next side m, BO 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts before m and 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts after m, work rem sts in patt—88 (96, 104, 108, 116, 124) sts. Set aside.

SLEEVES

With dpn, CO 41 (43, 45, 47, 47, 47) sts. Pm and join in the rnd.

Rnd 1 K6 (7, 8, 9, 9, 9), p1, k2, pm, [k3, p1] 5 times, k3, pm, k2, p1, k6 (7, 8, 9, 9, 9).

Rnd 2 and all even rnds Knit.

Rnd 3 K6 (7, 8, 9, 9, 9), p1, k2, sl m, knit to next m, sl m, k2, p1, k6 (7, 8, 9, 9, 9).

Rnd 5 K6 (7, 8, 9, 9, 9), p1, k2, sl m, ssk, [k3, p1] 4 times, k3, k2tog, sl m, k2, p1, k6 (7, 8, 9, 9, 9)—2 sts dec'd.

Rnd 7 Rep Rnd 3.

Rnd 9 K6 (7, 8, 9, 9, 9), M1L, p1, k2, sl m, ssk, p1, [k3, p1] 4 times, k2tog, sl m, k2, p1, M1R, k6 (7, 8, 9, 9, 9).

Rnd 11 K7 (8, 9, 10, 10, 10), p1, k2, sl m, knit to next m, sl m, k2, p1, k7 (8, 9, 10, 10, 10).

Rnd 13 K7 (8, 9, 10, 10, 10), p1, k2, sl m, ssk, k1, [p1, k3] 3 times, p1, k1, k2tog, sl m, k2, p1, k7 (8, 9, 10, 10, 10)—2 sts dec'd.

Rnd 15 K7 (8, 9, 10, 10, 10), p1, k2, sl m, knit to next m, sl m, k2, p1, k7 (8, 9, 10, 10, 10).

Rnd 17 K7 (8, 9, 10, 10, 10), M1L, p1, k2, sl m, ssk, k2, [p1, k3] 2 times, p1, k2, k2tog, sl m, k2, p1, M1R, k7 (8, 9, 10, 10, 10).

Rnd 19 K8 (9, 10, 11, 11, 11), p1, k2, sl m, knit to next m, sl m, k2, p1, k8 (9, 10, 11, 11, 11).

Rnd 21 K8 (9, 10, 11, 11, 11), p1, k2, sl m, ssk, [k3, p1] 2 times, k3, k2tog, sl m, k2, p1, k8 (9, 10, 11, 11, 11)—2 sts dec'd.

Rnd 23 K8 (9, 10, 11, 11, 11), p1, k2, sl m, knit to next m, k2, p1, k8 (9, 10, 11, 11, 11).

Rnd 25 K8 (9, 10, 11, 11, 11), M1L, p1, k2, sl m, ssk, [p1, k3] 2 times, p1, k2tog, sl m, k2, p1, M1R, k8 (9, 10, 11, 11, 11).

Rnd 27 K9 (10, 11, 12, 12, 12), p1, k2, sl m, knit to next m, sl m, k2, p1, k9 (10, 11, 12, 12, 12).

Rnd 29 K9 (10, 11, 12, 12, 12), p1, k2, sl m, ssk, k1, p1, k3, p1, k1, k2tog, sl m, k2, p1, k9 (10, 11, 12, 12, 12)—2 sts dec'd.

Rnd 31 K9 (10, 11, 12, 12, 12), p1, k2, sl m, ssk, k5, k2tog, sl m, k2, p1, k9 (10, 11, 12, 12, 12)—2 sts dec'd.

Rnd 33 K9 (10, 11, 12, 12, 12), M1L, p1, k2, sl m, ssk, k1, p1, k1, k2tog, sl m, k2, p1, M1R, k9 (10, 11, 12, 12, 12).

Rnd 35 K10 (11, 12, 13, 13, 13), p1, k2, sl m, ssk, k1, k2tog, sl m, k2, p1, k10 (11, 12, 13, 13, 13)—2 sts dec'd.

Rnd 37 K10 (11, 12, 13, 13, 13), M1L, p1, k2, remove m, sl 2, k1, p2sso, remove m, k2, p1, M1R, k10 (11, 12, 13, 13, 13).

Rnd 39 K11 (12, 13, 14, 14, 14), M1L, p1, ssk, k1, k2tog, p1, M1R, k11 (12, 13, 14, 14, 14).

Rnd 41 K12 (13, 14, 15, 15, 15), p1, sl 1, k2tog, pssso, p1, k12 (13, 14, 15, 15, 15)—27 (29, 31, 33, 33, 33) sts rem.

Work even in St st for 5 rnds.

Rnd 47 K1, M1L, knit to last st, M1R, k1—29 (31, 33, 35, 35, 35) sts.

Rep shaping of Rnd 47 every foll 6 (6, 6, 6, 4, 4) rnds 2 more times, then every foll 8 (8, 8, 8, 4, 4) rnds 2 times, then every foll 0 (0, 0, 0, 6, 4) rnds 2 times, then every foll 0 (0, 0, 0, 0, 4) rnds 2 times—37 (39, 41, 43, 47, 51) sts. Work 9 (9, 9, 9, 9, 5) rnds even. **Next rnd** Work to last 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts, BO next 6 (6, 6, 8, 8, 8) sts, work to end—31 (33, 35, 35, 39, 43) sts rem. Set first sleeve aside. Work second (left) sleeve, do not set aside. **Joining rnd:** Knit across left sleeve sts, pm, k2 from front, pm, work rem front sts in patt (*k3, p1; rep from * to m, sl m, k1, purl to 3 sts before m, k1), pm, k2, pm, knit across first (right) sleeve sts, pm, k2 from back, pm, work rem back sts in patt to last 2 sts, pm, k2, pm for beg of rnd—150 (162, 174, 178, 194, 210) sts total. **Next rnd** (first dec rnd) *K2tog, knit to last 2 sleeve sts, ssk, sl m, k2, sl m, k2tog, knit to last 2 sts of front, ssk, sl m, k2, sl m; rep from * across opposite sleeve and back—142 (154, 166, 170, 186, 202) sts. Dec in this manner every foll 4th rnd 4 (4, 4, 5, 4, 3) times more, then every other rnd 4 (5, 6, 5, 8, 11) times—78 (82, 86, 90, 90, 90) sts rem. Work 1 rnd even; piece measures about 6 1/4 (6 1/2, 7, 7 1/2, 8, 8 1/2) from underarm. **Shape neck with short-rows:** K2tog, knit to last 2 sleeve sts, ssk, sl m, k2, sl m, k2tog, k3, BO 12 (14, 16, 18, 18, 18) sts for front neck, k2, ssk, sl m, k2, sl m, k2tog, knit to last 2 sleeve sts, ssk, sl m, k2, sl m, k2tog, knit

to last 2 back sts, ssk, wrap next st, turn, work to end of back, wrap next st, turn, k2tog, work to end of back sts, ssk, knit next st with wrap, k1, sl m, k2tog, knit to last 2 sts of sleeve, ssk, sl m, k2, sl m, k2tog, k2, pick up and knit 12 (14, 16, 18, 18, 18) sts, k2, ssk, sl m, k2, sl m, k2tog, knit to last 2 sleeve sts, ssk, sl m, k2, sl m, k2tog, knit to last 2 back sts, ssk, sl m, k2—60 (64, 68, 72, 72, 72) sts. **Collar:** Change to shorter cir needle, remove all m except for beg-of-rnd.

Rnds 1, 5, and 9 *K3, p1; rep from * to end.

Rnds 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, and 12 Knit.

Rnds 3, 7, and 11 *K1, p1, k2; rep from * to end.

Rnds 13, 17, and 21 *P3, k1; rep from * to end.

Rnds 14, 16, 18, 20, 22, and 24 Purl.

Rnds 15, 19, and 23 *P1, k1, p2; rep from * to end.

BO loosely in 1x1 rib.

Place marker (pm) and join in the rnd. Work in St st for 1". **Shape crown:**

Rnd 1 *K2tog, k8; rep from * to end—63 sts rem.

Rnd 2 and all even rnds Knit.

Rnd 3 *K2tog, k7; rep from * to end—56 sts rem.

Rnd 5 *K2tog, k6; rep from * to end—49 sts rem.

Rnd 7 *K2tog, k5; rep from * to end—42 sts rem.

Rnd 9 *K2tog, k4; rep from * to end—35 sts rem.

Rnd 11 *K2tog, k3; rep from * to end—28 sts rem.

Rnd 13 *K2tog, k2; rep from * to end—21 sts rem.

Rnd 15 *K2tog, k1; rep from * to end—14 sts rem.

Rnd 17 *K2tog; rep from * to end—7 sts rem.

Cut yarn, leaving an 8" tail. Thread tail onto yarn needle and draw through live sts; pull tightly to fasten. Weave in ends. ☐

Rep last 2 rows until rib measures 5½" from CO, ending with a RS row. **Next row** (WS) Slipping m, purl all sts. **Next row** (RS) K2, sl m, work Row 1 of textured patt over 45 (51, 57, 63) sts, sl m, k2. Work in patt for 3 more rows. **Inc row** (RS) K2, sl m, M1, work in patt to last 2 sts, M1, sl m, k2—2 sts inc'd. Keeping St st selvedges and working new sts into textured patt, rep Inc row every 12th row 5 more times—61 (67, 73, 79) sts. Work even in patt until piece measures 17½" from CO, ending with a WS row. **Shape cap:** BO 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows—53 (59, 65, 71) sts rem. **Next row** (RS) K3, work in patt to last 3 sts, k3. **Next row** (WS) P3, work to last 3 sts, p3. **Dec row** (RS) K2, ssk, work to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2—2 sts dec'd. Keeping 3-st St st selvedges at each edge, work 3 rows in patt. Work Dec row. **Next row** (WS) P3, work to last 3 sts, p3. Rep last 2 rows 15 (19, 23, 26) more times—19 (17, 15, 15) sts rem. BO all sts.

FINISHING

Sew fronts and back to sleeves along raglan lines. Sew sleeve and side seams. **Buttonband:** With RS facing and smaller needles, beg at neck edge, pick up and knit 105 (111, 113, 119) sts evenly spaced along left front. Work in seed st (see Stitches) for 1¼", ending with a WS row. Knit 1 RS row, purl 1 WS row. BO all sts kwise. **Buttonhole band:** Work as for buttonband until band measures ½", ending with a WS row. **Buttonhole row** (RS) Keeping in patt, work 31 (21, 23, 23) sts, work a 4-st one-row buttonhole, [work 30 (24, 24, 26) sts, make buttonhole] 2 (3, 3, 3) times, work last 2 sts in patt. Complete as for buttonband. Sew buttons onto buttonband opposite buttonholes. **Collar:** With RS facing and larger needles, pick up and knit 167 (179, 191, 203) sts evenly spaced around entire neck edge. **Next row** (RS of collar; WS of sweater) K1 (selvedge st), [k3, p3] 2 times, pm, work Row 7 of Cable chart over 24 sts, pm, p3, [k3, p3] 15 (17, 19, 21) times, pm, work Row 7 of Cable chart over 24 sts, pm, [p3, k3] 2 times, k1 (selvedge st). **Next row** K1, [p3, k3] 2 times, sl m, cont cable patt over 24 sts, sl m, cont in rib patt to m, sl m, cont cable patt over 24 sts, sl m, [k3, p3] 2 times, k1. Work in patt until collar measures 9", ending with a WS row. **Next row** (RS) Work 13 sts, sl m, *k3, p3, k2, k2tog, p2, p2tog, k2tog, k2, p3, k3*, work to next m, rep from * to *, work to end—161 (173, 185, 197) sts rem. Work even in rib until collar measures 10", ending with a WS row. BO all sts in patt. ☐

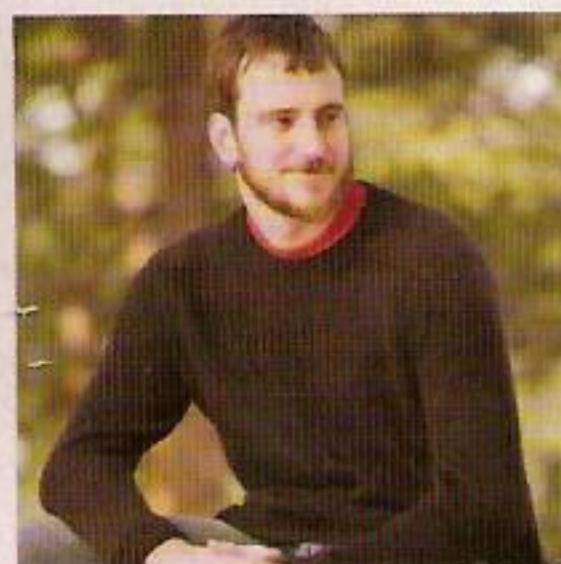

Beg with left shoulder, use the invisible-provisional method (see page 32) to CO 26 (28, 28, 32, 32, 32) sts. Work in St st until piece measures 3½ (4, 4½, 4¾, 5, 5½)" from CO, ending with a RS row. **Next row** (WS) BO 10 (12, 12, 16, 16, 16) sts, knit rem 16 sts. Cont in St st until narrow portion measures 6½ (6¾, 6¾, 7, 7½, 8)" from BO. **Right shoulder:** (RS) K16, CO 10 (12, 12, 16, 16, 16) sts using the backward-loop method (see page 32)—26 (28, 28, 32, 32, 32) sts. Work in St st until piece measures 3½ (4, 4½, 4¾, 5, 5½)" from new CO. Place sts on holder. **Note:** Half of the saddle sts will contribute to the front length and the other half to the back length; the yoke width will also add to back length.

Upper Back

With RS of yoke facing, pick up and knit 56 (58, 62, 66, 68, 70) sts along long edge of yoke. Purl 1 WS row. **Next row** (RS) K18 (19, 21, 22, 23, 23), pm, k20 (20, 20, 22, 22, 24), pm, k18 (19, 21, 22, 23, 23). Shoulder slope will be worked to the outside of each marker using short-rows. **Next row** (WS)

Purl to 4 sts past second m, wrap next st, turn.

Next row (RS) Knit to 4 sts past second m, wrap next st, turn. **Next row** (WS) Purl to 4 sts past second m, pick up wrap and p2tog with wrapped st, k4, wrap next st, turn. **Next row** (RS) Knit to 4 sts past second m, pick up wrap and p2tog tbl with wrapped st, k4, wrap next st, turn. Cont in this manner until all sts are consumed. Work until piece measures 3½ (4, 4½, 4¾, 5, 5)" or 2 (2½, 2½, 2½, 3, 3)" less than desired armhole depth. **Armholes:** Inc 1 st each end of needle every RS row 3 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5) times—62 (66, 70, 74, 78, 80) sts. At end of foll 2 rows, using backward-loop method CO 3 sts—68 (72, 76, 80, 84, 86) sts. At end of next 2 rows, CO 4 (4, 4, 4, 4, 5) sts—76 (80, 84, 88, 92, 96) sts. Place sts on a holder.

UPPER FRONT

With RS facing, pick up and knit 15 (16, 18, 19, 20, 20) sts along right shoulder, CO 25 (25, 25, 27, 27, 29) for neck, pick up and knit 15 (16, 18, 19, 20, 20) sts along left shoulder—55 (57, 61, 65, 67, 69) sts. **Next row** P23 (24, 26, 28, 29, 30), k9, p23 (24, 26, 28, 29, 30). Work in St st with 9 center sts in slip st motif (see Stitches) for 4 (4½, 5, 5, 5½)". Work armhole shaping in the same manner as upper back for a total of 75 (79, 83, 87, 91, 95) sts.

LOWER BODY

Note: This section can be completed now, or work just a couple rnds, then place sts on waste yarn and return to body after completing sleeves. Work 75 (79, 83, 87, 91, 95) sts of upper front and 76 (80, 84, 88, 92, 96) sts of upper back and join in the rnd—151 (159, 167, 175, 183, 191) sts. Cont in patt as established until body measures 12½ (12½, 13, 13¼, 13½, 13¾)" from underarm. Work in garter st for 2". BO all sts.

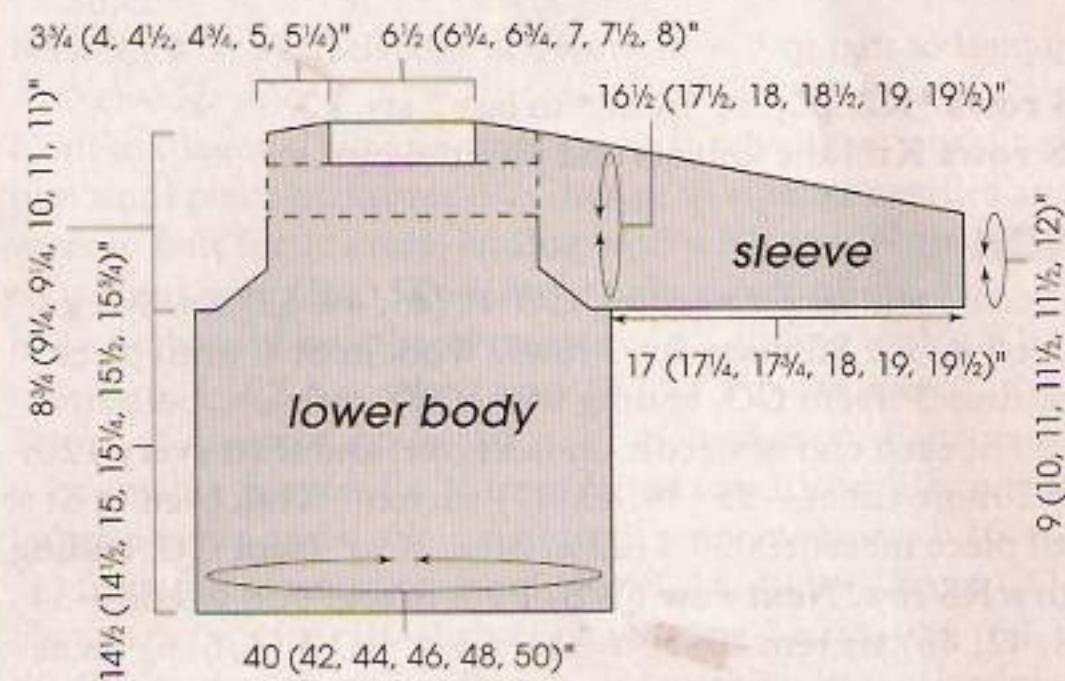
NECK

Pick up and knit 26 (26, 30, 30, 32, 32) sts across back of neck, 16 sts along one saddle, 26 (26, 30, 32, 32) sts along front of neck, 16 sts along other saddle—84 (84, 92, 92, 96, 96) sts total. Work in garter st for 1". **Next knit rnd** *K2tog, k2; rep from * around—63 (63, 69, 69, 72, 72) sts rem. BO all sts.

SLEEVE

Sleeve cap: Beg at center of underarm, pick up and knit 75 (78, 81, 84, 84, 87) sts around armhole, ending at center of underarm. Join in the rnd.

Set-Up Rnd 1 K50 (52, 54, 56, 56, 58), wrap next st, turn.



Set-Up Rnd 2 P25 (26, 27, 28, 28, 29), wrap next st, turn. You should have two "gaps" on either side of the center sts. **Next rnd** Knit to gap, (the last st worked should be a wrapped st), wrap next st, turn. Cont in this manner (working wraps with wrapped sts), working 1 more st beyond the previous st worked (worked not wrapped) until the only sts left unworked are the 8 taken from the underarm. The sleeve cap is now complete and you may work the final RS rnd across these rem 8 sts. **Lower sleeve:** Work 1" even in St st. **Dec rnd** K1, k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, ssk, k1. Rep Dec rnd every 4th rnd 20 times total—35 (38, 41, 44, 44, 47) sts rem. Work even until sleeve measures 15 (15½, 15¾, 16, 17, 17½)" from underarm, or desired length. Work in garter st for 2". BO all sts. ☐

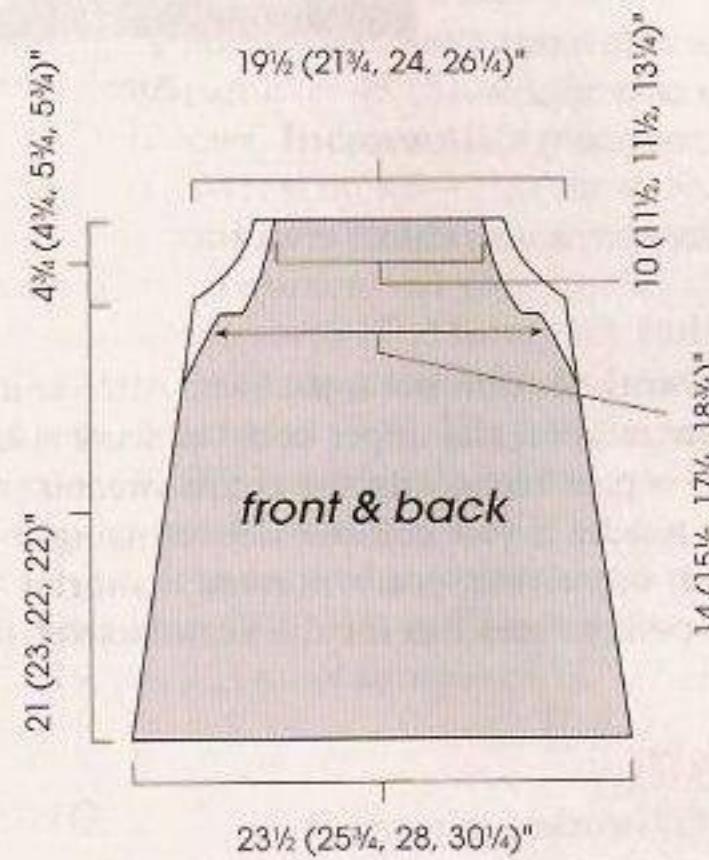

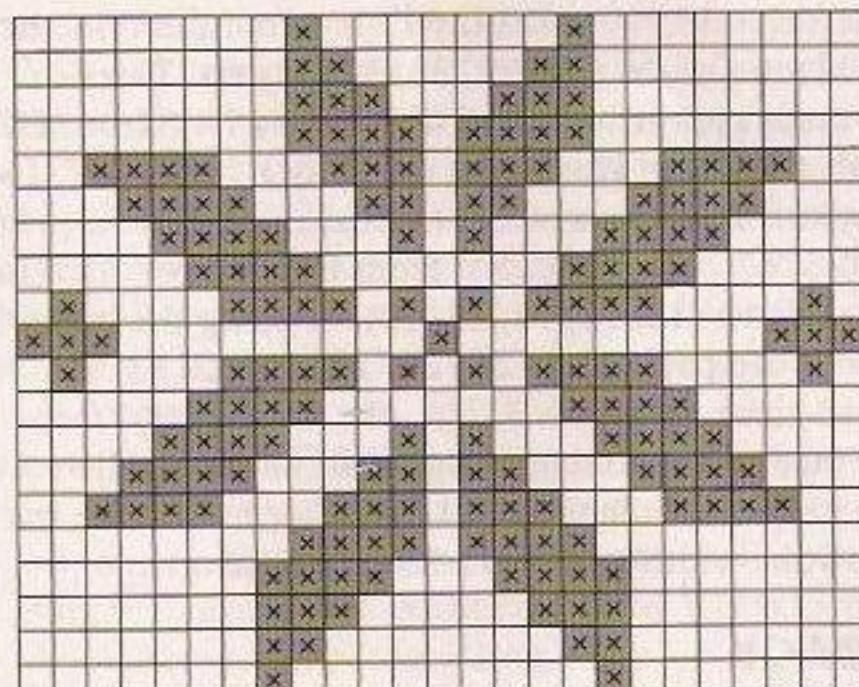

With CC, k5 (7, 9, 11), place marker (pm), work Snowflake chart over center 25 sts, pm, with CC knit to end. Cont working chart between m, keeping edges in CC and **AT THE SAME TIME** when piece measures 21 (23, 22, 22)" from CO, ending with a WS row, shape armholes as foll: BO 5 (5, 7, 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows—25 (29, 29, 33) sts rem. Cont in patt through end of chart. Knit 1 row with CC. With MC, purl 1 row, then work 2 rows in seed st. BO all sts kwise.

Notes

Because of the drastic overlap of the fronts, the sizes included in the pattern are more versatile than just the finished sizes listed above. Choose a size based on the width of the back; the fronts can be overlapped as desired to create a custom fit in the bust and stomach area, while the back width is a static measurement. This means each size can be adjusted to accommodate another 3", at least, for the front of the body.

The fronts are intended to overlap by about 5–8", but this is adjustable.

The sweater is shown in size 40½", modeled with 4" of positive ease, creating a loose and casual look. However, the jacket also looks great with minimal ease, creating a fitted look. The more ease in the fit, the shorter the main portion of the sleeve needs to be, as the modified drop shoulder will fall below the shoulder line. The tighter the fit, the longer that sleeve will need to be, as the armhole falls closer to the true shoulder line.

The diagonal ribs are not intended to meet perfectly at the seams, though it may happen in some places for some sizes.

Stitches

Diagonal Rib: (multiple of 4 sts)

Note: The direction in which the rib slants depends on which rows are worked on the RS and which on the WS.

Row 1 *K2, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 2 P1, *k2, p2; rep from * to last 3 sts, k2, p1.

Row 3 *P2, k2; rep from * to end.

Row 4 K1, *p2, k2; rep from to last 3 sts, p2, k1.

Rep Rows 1–4 for patt.

BACK

With larger needle and MC, CO 70 (78, 86, 94, 102) sts.

Row 1 (RS) K1 (selvedge st), work Row 2 of diagonal rib (see Stitches) to last st, k1 (selvedge st).

Row 2 (WS) P1 (selvedge st), work Row 3 of patt to last st, p1 (selvedge st).

Cont in diagonal rib and working St st selvedges, work in patt until piece measures 6". Change to smaller needles and work in patt for 1" more, ending with a RS row. Knit 1 WS row. **Next row (RS)** Work in 1×1 rib across all sts. Cont in 1×1 rib until waistband measures 4", ending with a RS row. Knit 1 WS row. **Next row (RS)** K1 (selvedge st), work Row 1 of diagonal rib to last st, k1 (selvedge st). Cont in patt with smaller needles for 1" from top of waistband. Change to larger needles and work in patt until piece measures 6 (6, 6, 7, 7)" from top of waistband and 18 (18, 18, 19, 19)" from CO.

Shape armholes: BO 7 sts at beg of next 2 rows—56 (64, 72, 80, 88) sts rem. Keeping in patt and working St st selvedges at

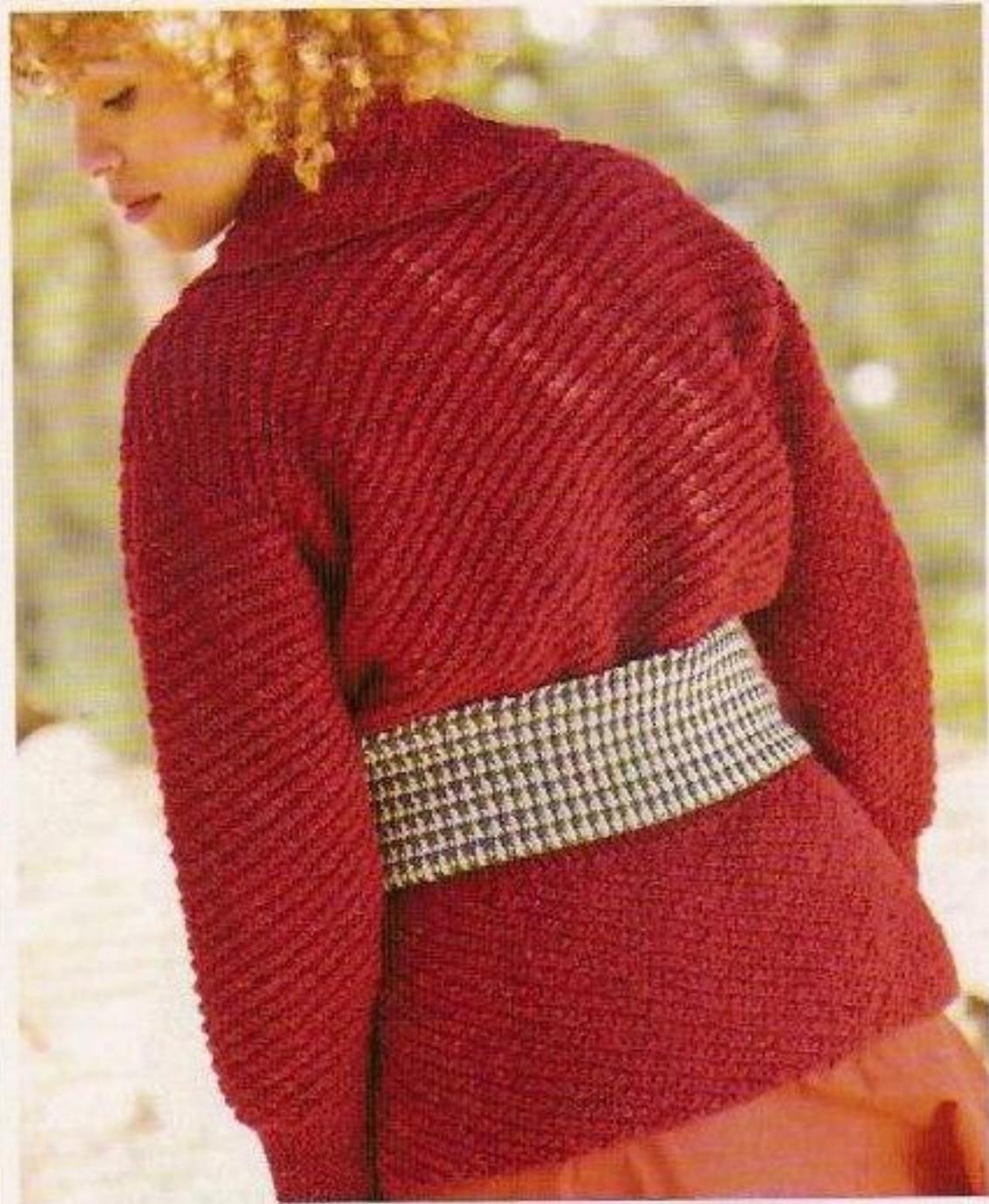
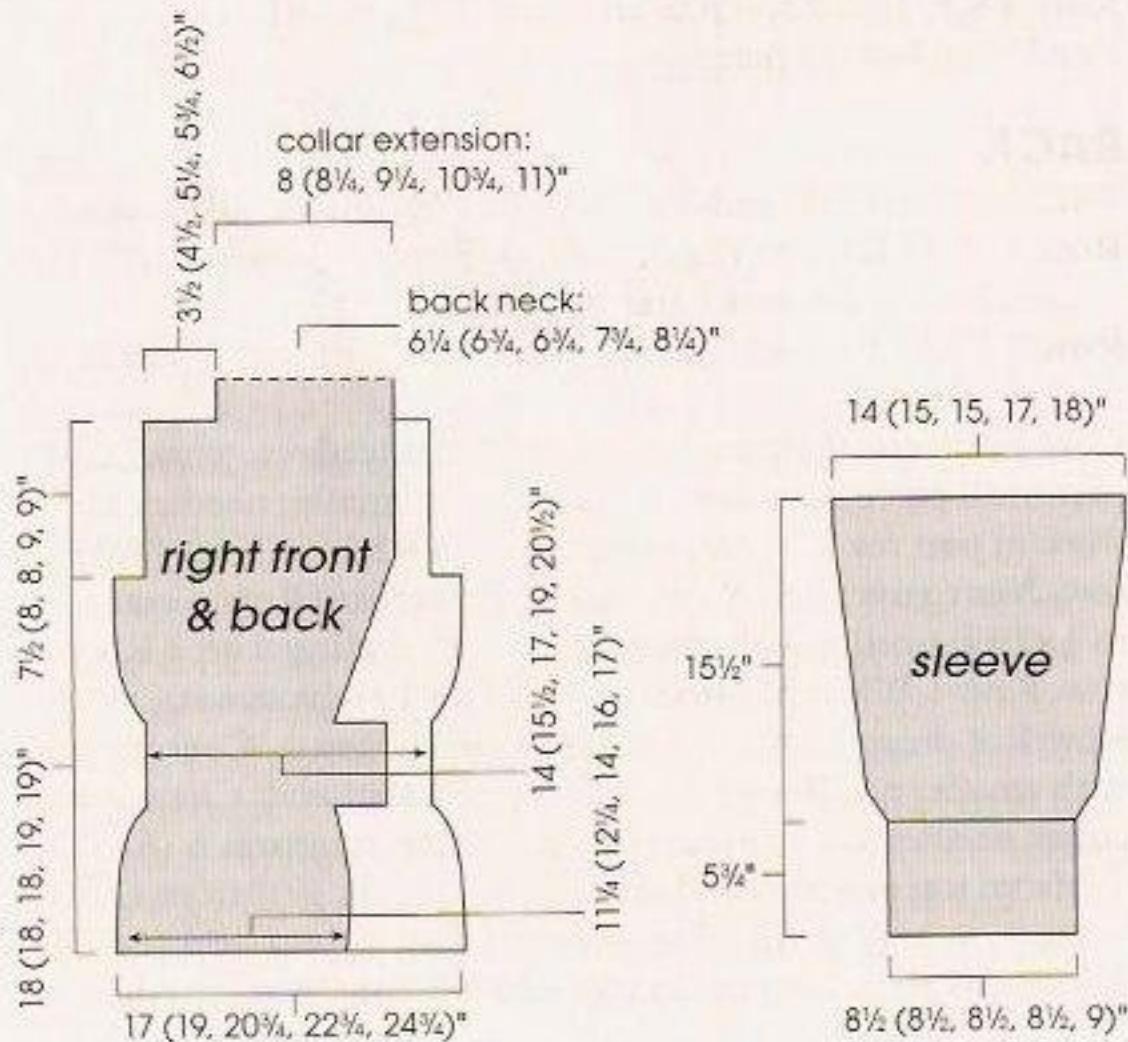
each edge, work until armholes measure $7\frac{1}{2}$ (8, 8, 9, 9)". **Next row** Work 15 (18, 22, 24, 27) sts in patt, BO 26 (28, 28, 32, 34) sts for back neck, work to end in patt. Place rem 15 (18, 22, 24, 27) sts each side on separate holders for shoulders.

RIGHT FRONT

With larger needle and MC, CO 46 (50, 58, 66, 70) sts. **Next row** (RS) K1, work Row 1 of diagonal rib to last st, k1. Keeping St st selvedges, cont in patt until piece measures 6". Change to smaller needles and work in patt for 1" more, ending with a RS row. Knit 1 WS row and at end of row use the backward-loop method to CO (see page 32) 13 sts—59 (63, 71, 79, 83) sts. **Next row** (RS) K13, work in 1x1 rib to end. **Next row** (WS) Work in 1x1 rib to last 13 sts, p13. Rep last 2 rows until waistband measures 4", ending with a WS row. **Next row** (RS) BO 13 sts, purl to end—46 (50, 58, 66, 70) sts rem. **Next row** (WS) P1, work Row 1 of diagonal rib to last st, p1. Cont in patt with smaller needles for 1" from top of waistband. Change to larger needles, cont in patt shape neck edge as foll: at beg of RS rows, inside selvedge, inc 1 st every 6th row 9 times—9 sts inc'd at neck edge. **AT THE SAME TIME**, when piece measures 6 (6, 6, 7, 7)" from top of waistband and 18 (18, 18, 19, 19)" from CO, shape armhole by BO 7 sts at beg of next WS row—7 sts removed by armhole shaping; 48 (52, 60, 68, 72) sts after all neck and armhole shaping is complete. Cont in patt until armhole measures $7\frac{1}{2}$ (8, 8, 9, 9)". Place sts on holder.

LEFT FRONT

With larger needle and MC, CO 46 (50, 58, 66, 70) sts. Work as for back to end of waistband. After knitting 1 WS row, work next row as foll: (RS) Cont with smaller needle, k1, work Row 1 of diagonal rib to last st, k1. Cont in patt for 1". Change to larger needles and shape neck edge as foll: at end of RS rows, inside selvedge, inc 1 st every 6th row 9 times and **AT THE SAME TIME**, when piece measures 6 (6, 6, 7, 7)" from top of waistband and 18 (18, 18, 19, 19)" from CO, shape armhole as foll: at beg of next RS row, BO 7 sts—7 sts removed by armhole shaping, 9 sts inc'd at neck edge; 48 (52, 60, 68, 72) sts when all shaping is complete. Work in patt until armhole measures $7\frac{1}{2}$ (8, 8, 9, 9)". Place sts on holder.



SLEEVES

Note: Assembling the body pieces before knitting the sleeves is recommended if you are making a jacket with different ease amounts than the modeled sample. Assemble the body, including the collar, and try on the garment, noting how far the armhole falls down on the upper arm. You can determine the needed length for the sleeve by knowing how far down the armhole hangs over the arm. **Cuff:** With smaller needle and MC, CO 25 sts. Work in garter st (knit every row) until piece measures $8\frac{1}{2}$ (8 $\frac{1}{2}$, 8 $\frac{1}{2}$, 8 $\frac{1}{2}$, 9)" from CO. BO all sts. With larger needle and working along one long (selvedge) edge of cuff, pick up and knit 46 (46, 46, 46, 50) sts. **Next row** (WS) For right sleeve: P1 (selvedge st), work Row 1 of diagonal rib to last st, p1. For left sleeve: P1 (selvedge st), work Row 2 of diagonal rib to last st, p1. Cont in patt and inc 1 st each end of row inside selvedges on every 5th (5th, 5th, 3rd, 3rd) row 6 (8, 8, 12, 12) times—58 (62, 62, 70, 74) sts. Work even in patt until piece measures $21\frac{1}{4}$ " from bottom of cuff (see Notes on sleeve length). BO all sts.

FINISHING

With WS of pieces facing, join 15 (18, 22, 24, 27) sts of each shoulder with three-needle BO, leaving rem front-neck sts on holders. Sew side seams. **Collar:** Transfer held sts of one front to larger needle and cont in established patt, working St st selvedges at each edge, until collar reaches to the center of back neck. Rep for other held front sts. Try on garment and determine if collar pieces are long enough; adjust accordingly. With RS of garment facing and WS of collar facing, join sts with three-needle BO. Sew selvedge of collar to BO edge of back neck. **Belt:** With smaller needle and grey heather yarn, CO 23 sts. Work 7 rows in St st, then knit 1 WS row, knit 1 RS row, knit 1 WS row. Join cream and work as foll: **Row 1** (RS) With grey heather, k1, *sl 1 pwise, k2; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 2 (WS) With grey heather, knit.

Row 3 With cream, k1, *k2, sl 1 pwise; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 4 With cream, knit.

Rep Rows 1–4 until piece measures 28 (31½, 36, 41, 44½)" from beg of two-color patt. Knit 2 rows with grey heather. Cont with grey heather only, work in St st for 2", ending with a RS row. Knit 1 WS row. Work in St st for 2½". BO all sts. With grey heather, tack belt to right-front waistband extension along the purl fold line, matching purl fold line with selvedge edge of extension (belt facing should wrap around waistband extension, with 2½" section of belt facing falling to the WS of right front). Tack facing to WS of right front. Use mattress st to seam selvedge edges of belt and facing around the extension. Tack belt to right front as needed to secure belt. On left front, fold smaller belt facing around waistband and tack to WS of left front. Iron the facing sections of the belt. Sew clasps to the belt as shown, adjusting amount of overlap as desired. Sew in sleeves, then sew sleeve seams. Weave in ends. ☐

FINISHING

Knit 1 rnd even.

Rnd 1 (inc rnd) Knit to 1 st before first m, yo, k1, sl m, yo, knit to 1 st before 2nd m, yo, k1, sl m, yo, knit to 1 st before 3rd m, yo, k1, sl m, yo, knit to 1 st before last m, yo, k1, sl m, yo, knit to end—8 sts inc'd.

Rnd 2 Knit.

Rep last 2 rnds 6 (8, 8, 10, 11, 13) more times—270 (292, 308, 338, 368, 388) sts. **Divide for armholes:** At beg of rnd, remove contrasting m, knit across left-front sts to m, place 60 (64, 68, 72, 80, 85) sleeve sts on waste yarn, removing m, use the backward-loop method to CO 2 sts for underarm, place contrasting m (new beg of rnd), CO 2 more sts for underarm, k75 (82, 86, 95, 104, 109) sts of back, place next 60 (64, 68, 72, 80, 85) sts on waste yarn for 2nd sleeve, removing m, CO 4 sts for underarm, knit to new beg of rnd—158 (172, 180, 198, 216, 226) sts for lower body. Work in St st until piece measures 13 (13 1/2, 13 1/2, 14, 14 1/2, 15) " from underarm. Knit 1 rnd, inc 3 (inc 3, inc 2, dec 2, inc 1, dec 2) sts evenly



around—161 (175, 182, 196, 217, 224) sts. Change to CC and work Rnds 1–6 of lace and cable patt (see Stitches) until patterned section measures 4 (4, 4 1/2, 5, 5 1/2, 5 1/2) ", ending with Rnd 5 of patt. BO all sts loosely.

SLEEVES

Place 60 (64, 68, 72, 80, 85) sleeve sts on dpn. Join yarn, knit to end of sleeve, pick up and knit 2 sts in underarm, pm for beg of rnd, pick up and knit 2 sts in underarm, join in the rnd. Knit 4 rnds even. **Dec rnd** K2tog, knit to 2 sts before m, ssk—2 sts dec'd. Rep Dec rnd every 6 (6, 6, 6, 4, 4)th rnd 4 (3, 4, 3, 2, 3) times, then every other rnd 0 (3, 1, 4, 9, 7) time(s) more—50 (50, 56, 56, 56, 63) sts rem. Work even in St st until sleeve measures 7" from underarm. Knit 1 row, dec 1 (1, 0, 0, 0, 0) st—49 (49, 56, 56, 56, 63) sts rem. Change to CC and work Rnds 1–6 of lace and cable patt until cuff measures 3 (3, 3 1/4, 4, 4 1/4) ", ending with Rnd 5 of patt. BO all sts loosely.

FINISHING

Neckband: With RS facing, MC, and smaller cir needle, beg at upper right back, pick up and knit 24 (27, 27, 32, 35, 36) sts across back neck, 10 (10, 10, 12, 12, 13) sts across top of left sleeve, 25 (25, 29, 29, 32, 32) sts along left-front edge, pm, 22 (25, 25, 30, 33, 34) sts across center-front neck, pm, 25 (25, 29, 29, 32, 32) sts along right-front neck, and 10 (10, 10, 12, 12, 13) sts along top of right sleeve—116 (122, 130, 144, 156, 160) sts total; pm and join in the rnd. 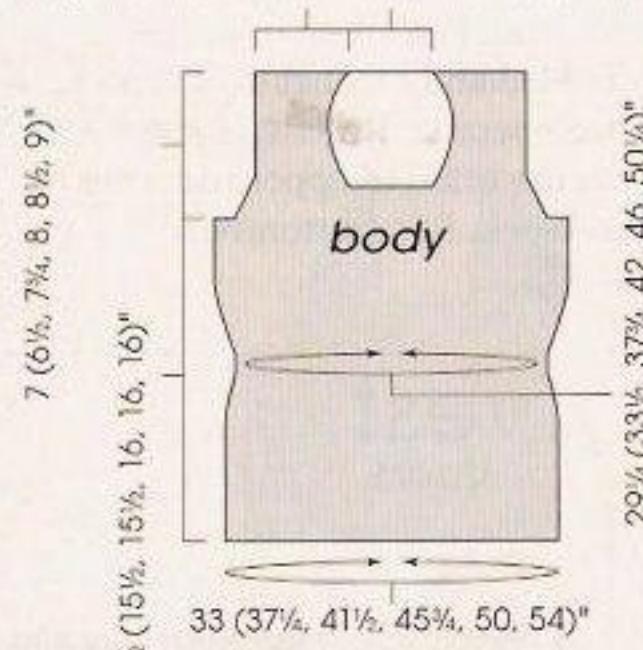

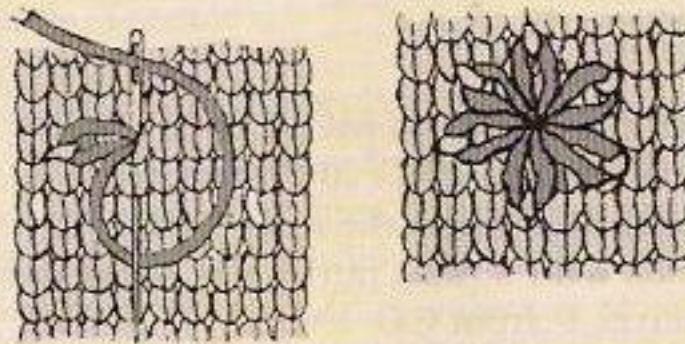

on holder. **Back:** Place back sts on cir needle. With RS facing, join yarn and work 2 rows in St st. **Shape armholes:** **Next row** K1, k2tog, work to last 3 sts, ssk, k1—2 sts dec'd. Rep last row every RS row 3 (4, 4, 5, 6, 8) more times—56 (63, 70, 75, 80, 83) sts rem. Work even until armhole measures 6½ (6½, 7½, 7½, 8½, 8½) ", ending with a WS row. **Next row** K20 (24, 24, 24, 26, 26), BO 16 (15, 22, 27, 28, 31) sts for neck, knit to end—20 (24, 24, 24, 26, 26) sts rem for each shoulder. Place sts on holders.

FINISHING

With RS tog, join shoulders using Kitchener st. **Neckline and armholes:** Beg at center-back neck, with RS facing and using MC and crochet hook, working from left to right, work rev sc around neck edge. 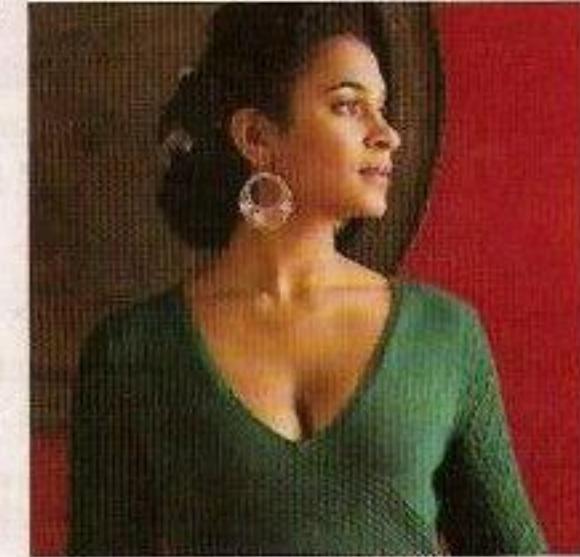

Notes

It is important to wet-block the gauge swatch, soaking and hand washing it as you would the finished garment, as this yarn can relax considerably after washing.

The Japanese short-row method is used in shaping the waist and shoulders. There is no wrapping required in this technique, and it appears very neat when finished. You can use the traditional short-row technique (as explained in the Glossary) if preferred.

Stitches

SR SSK: (beg 1 st before gap) Sl 1 kwise; on WS of work, locate the bar that connects next 2 sts on left needle; with right needle tip, pick up bar from bottom to top; knit the lifted bar along with slipped st (like a ssk).

SR K2TOG: (beg at gap) On WS of work, locate the bar that connects the first 2 sts on right needle one row below (this bar connects the sl st with the next st); with left needle tip, pick up this bar from top to bottom and knit it tog with next st on left needle (like a k2tog).

SR P2TOG: (beg at gap) On WS of work, locate bar that connects 2 sts on right needle one row below (this bar connects the sl st with the next st); sl 1 pwise, then with left needle tip, pick up the bar from bottom to top, sl st on right needle back to left needle, purl 2 loops on left needle tog (like a p2tog).

FRONT

CO 105 (117, 123, 135) sts. Knit 5 rows. Work Rows 1–8 of Feather Lace chart 6 times. Work in St st until piece measures 9 (9½, 10, 10½)" from CO, ending with a WS row.

Shape waist: **Dec row** K2, ssk, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2—2 sts dec'd. Rep Dec row every 4th row 13 more times—77 (89, 95, 107) sts rem. Work even until piece measures 17½ (18, 18½, 19)" from CO, ending with a WS row. Work short-rows as foll:

Row 1 (RS) Knit to last 4 sts, turn.

Row 2 (WS) Sl 1 pwise, purl to last 4 sts, turn.

Row 3 Sl 1 pwise, knit to 3 sts before last turning point, turn.

Row 4 Sl 1 pwise, purl to 3 sts before last turning point, turn. Rep Rows 3 and 4 ten (twelve, thirteen, fifteen) more times—37 (43, 46, 52) sts unworked at each end of needle. Break yarn, leaving a 10" tail. Place removable marker on center st. With RS facing, sl all sts onto left needle. **End short-rows:**

Join yarn. K3, *SR SSK (see Stitches), k2; rep from * to 3 sts before center st, SR SSK, take yarn tail and bring it over the left needle from back to front, then take it between needles to back, use the working yarn to knit this loop tog with the next st, k1, M1R, knit center st, M1L, k1, **SR K2TOG (see Stitches), k2; rep from ** to last 4 sts, SR K2TOG, k3—79 (91, 97, 109) sts. **Garter waistband:**

Row 1 (WS) K2, ssk, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2—77 (89, 95, 107) sts rem.

Row 2 (RS) Knit.

Row 3 P2, p2tog, purl to center st, M1R pwise, purl center st, M1L pwise, purl to last 4 sts, ssp, p2.

Rows 4 and 5 Purl.

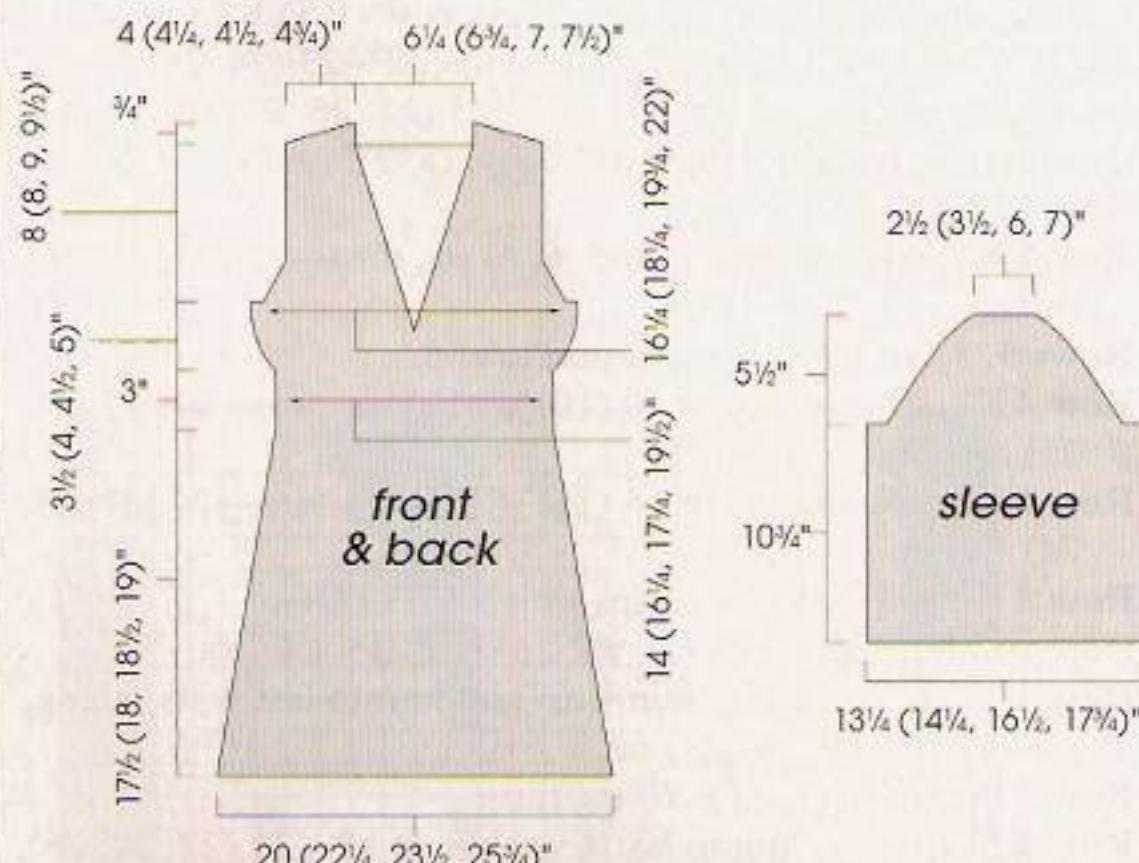
Row 6 (RS) K2, ssk, knit to center st, M1R, knit center st, M1L, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2.

Row 7 Knit.

Rep Rows 2–7 three more times—9 garter ridges. **Left-front bodice:**

Next row (RS) K2, M1R, k18 (21, 23, 26), M1R, place marker (pm), k1, M1L, knit to 1 st before center st, k2tog—41 (47, 50, 56) sts rem for left front; place 38 (44, 47, 53) right-front sts on holder, turn. **Next row** K3, purl to end. Keeping 3 sts at neck edge in garter st, work 2 rows even. **Inc row** Knit to m, M1R, sl m, k1, M1L, knit to end—2 sts inc'd. Rep Inc row every 4th row once more—45 (51, 54, 60) sts. Remove m. Work even until piece measures 24 (25, 26, 27)" from CO (measuring along side edge) and ending with a WS row. **Shape armhole:** BO 10 sts at beg of next row—35 (41, 44, 50) sts rem. **Next row (WS)** K3, purl to end. **Dec row** K2, ssk, knit to end—1 st dec'd. Rep Dec row every other row 7 (9, 10, 15) more times, then every 4th row 4 (7, 7, 7) times, then every 6th row once—22 (23, 25, 26) sts rem. Work even until armhole measures 8 (8, 9, 9½)". Place sts on holder.

Right-front bodice: Place 38 (44, 47, 53) right-front sts on needle. With RS facing, join yarn. **Next row (RS)** K17 (20, 21, 24), M1R, pm, k1, M1L, knit to last 2 sts, M1L, k2—41 (47, 50, 56) sts. **Next row** Purl to last 3 sts, k3. Keeping 3 sts at neck edge in garter st, work 2 rows even. **Inc row** Knit to m, M1R, sl m, k1, M1L, knit to end—2 sts inc'd. Rep Inc row every 4th row once more—45 (51, 54, 60) sts. Remove m. Work even until piece measures

Work 2 rows even. **Dec row (RS)** Knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2—1 st dec'd. Rep Dec row every other row 7 (9, 10, 15) more times, then every 4th row 4 (7, 7, 7) times, then every 6th row once—22 (23, 25, 26) sts rem. Work even until armhole measures 8 (8, 9, 9½)". Place sts on holder.

BACK

CO 105 (117, 123, 135) sts. Knit 5 rows. Work Rows 1–8 of Feather Lace chart 6 times. Work in St st until piece measures 9 (9½, 10, 10½)" from CO, ending with a WS row.

Shape waist: **Dec row** K2, ssk, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2—2 sts dec'd. Rep Dec row every 4th row 13 more times—77 (89, 95, 107) sts rem. Work even until piece measures 17½ (18, 18½, 19)" from CO, ending with a RS row. **Waistband:** Beg with a WS row, knit 2 rows, purl 3 rows, knit 1 row. Rep last 6 rows 3 more times, then knit 1 more row—9 ridges.

Bodice: Work 2 rows in St st. **Next row** K2, M1R, k13 (16, 17, 20), M1R, k14 (17, 18, 21), M1R, k19 (19, 21, 21), M1L, k14 (17, 18, 21), M1L, k13 (16, 17, 20), M1L, k2—83 (95, 101, 113) sts. Work 5 rows even. **Inc row** K2, M1R, knit to last 2 sts, M1L, k2—2 sts inc'd. Rep Inc row every 8th row 2 (2, 3, 3) more times—89 (101, 109, 121) sts. Work even until piece measures 24 (25, 26, 27)" from CO, ending with a WS row. **Shape armholes:** BO 6 sts at beg of next 2 rows—77 (89, 97, 109) sts rem. **Dec row** K2, ssk, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2—2 sts dec'd. Rep Dec row every other row 0 (1, 2, 6) more time(s), then every 4th row 0 (3, 3, 3) times—75 (79, 85, 89) sts rem. Work even until armholes measure 8 (8,

9, 9½)", ending with a WS row. **Next row** (RS) K23 (24, 26, 27), BO 29 (31, 33, 35) sts, knit to end—23 (24, 26, 27) sts rem for each shoulder. Place first 23 (24, 26, 27) sts (right shoulder) on holder. **Shape left neck and shoulder:**

Row 1 Purl.

Row 2 K2, ssk, knit to last 5 (5, 6, 6) sts, turn—22 (23, 25, 26) sts rem.

Rows 3, 5, and 7 Sl 1 pwise, purl to end.

Row 4 K2, ssk, knit to last 10 (10, 12, 12) sts, turn—21 (22, 24, 25) sts rem.

Row 6 K2, ssk, knit to last 15 (15, 18, 18) sts, turn—20 (21, 23, 24) sts rem.

Row 8 Knit all sts, closing gaps with SR K2TOG.

Place sts on holder. **Shape right neck and shoulder:**

Row 1 With RS facing, join yarn and knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2—22 (23, 25, 26) sts rem.

Row 2 Purl to last 5 (5, 6, 6) sts, turn.

Row 3 Sl 1 pwise, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2—21 (22, 24, 25) sts rem.

Row 4 Purl to last 10 (10, 12, 12) sts, turn.

Row 5 Sl 1 pwise, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2—20 (21, 23, 24) sts rem.

Row 6 Purl to last 15 (15, 18, 18) sts, turn.

Row 7 Sl 1 pwise, knit to end.

Row 8 Purl all sts, closing gaps with SR P2TOG (see Stitches).

SLEEVES

CO 69 (75, 87, 93) sts. Knit 5 rows. Work Rows 1–8 of Feather Lace chart 11 times—piece measures about 10½" from CO. **Shape cap:** While cont in lace patt, decs are worked to shape cap. Note that reps below maintain lace patt, but instructions outside of reps are not part of charted lace patt.

Row 1 (RS) BO 5 sts, knit until there are 3 sts on right needle, *yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1; rep from * to last st, k1—64 (70, 82, 88) sts rem.

Row 2 BO 5 sts, purl to end—59 (65, 77, 83) sts rem.

Row 3 K3, *yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso, k1, yo, k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, k2.

Even-numbered Rows 4–20 P2, p2tog, purl to last 4 sts, ssp, p2—2 sts dec'd.

Row 5 K2, ssk, k1, yo, ssk, k1, *k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1; rep from * to last 7 sts, k2tog, yo, k1, k2tog, k2—55 (61, 73, 79) sts rem.

Row 7 K4, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso, *k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso; rep from * to last 4 sts, k4—51 (57, 69, 75) sts rem.

Row 9 K4, *yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1; rep from * to last 3 sts, k3—49 (55, 67, 73) sts rem.

Row 11 K3, *yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso, k1, yo, k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, k2—47 (53, 65, 71) sts rem.

Row 13 K2, *k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1; rep from * to last st, k1—45 (51, 63, 69) sts rem.

Row 15 K2, *k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso; rep from * to last 5 sts, k5—43 (49, 61, 67) sts rem.

Row 17 K4, k2tog, yo, k1, *yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1; rep from * to last 4 sts, yo, ssk, k2—41 (47, 59, 65) sts rem.

Row 19 K2, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, *yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso, k1, yo, k1; rep from * to last 3 sts, k3—39 (45, 57, 63) sts rem.

Row 21 K2, yo, ssk, k1, *k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, k2—37 (43, 55, 61) sts rem.

Row 22 Purl (no decs).

Row 23 K2, yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso, *k1, yo, k1, yo, k1,

sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso; rep from * to last 7 sts, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, k2.

Rows 24 and 28 P2, p2tog, purl to last 4 sts, ssp, p2—2 sts dec'd.

Row 25 K1, k2tog, yo, k1, *yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1; rep from * to last st, k1—35 (41, 53, 59) sts rem.

Row 26 Purl (no decs).

Row 27 K3, yo, k1, *yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso, k1, yo, k1; rep from * to last 7 sts, yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso, k3.

Row 29 K1, ssk, k1, *k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1; rep from * to last 5 sts, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, k2—33 (39, 51, 57) sts rem.

Row 30 Purl (no decs).

Row 31 K1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso, *k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso; rep from * to last 5 sts, k1, yo, k1, yo, k3.

Even-numbered Rows 32–46 P2, p2tog, purl to last 4 sts, ssp, p2—2 sts dec'd.

Row 33 K4, k2tog, yo, k1, *yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1; rep from * to last 6 sts, yo, ssk, k4—31 (37, 49, 55) sts rem.

Row 35 K2, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, *yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso, k1, yo, k1; rep from * to last 5 sts, yo, k1, ssk, k2—29 (35, 47, 53) sts rem.

Row 37 K2, yo, ssk, k1, *k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1; rep from * to last 4 sts, k2tog, yo, k2—27 (33, 45, 51) sts rem.

Row 39 K3, k2tog, *k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso; rep from * to last 8 sts, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, k3—25 (31, 43, 49) sts rem.

Row 41 K3, *yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, k2—23 (29, 41, 47) sts rem.

Row 43 K2, *yo, k1, sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pssso, k1, yo, k1; rep from * to last st, k1—21 (27, 39, 45) sts rem.

Row 45 K2, ssk, yo, ssk, k1, *k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1; rep from * to last 6 sts, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k2—17 (23, 35, 41) sts rem.

Row 47 K2, ssk, knit to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2—13 (19, 31, 37) sts rem.

BO all sts.

FINISHING

Wet-block all pieces. **Neckband:** CO 3 sts. Work in garter st until piece measures 8 (8½, 8¾, 9½)". BO all sts. Sew band to back neck edge, easing along curve and covering BO sts at back neck. Place 20 (21, 23, 24) right-back shoulder sts onto needle, then pick up and knit 2 sts from end of garter band—22 (23, 25, 26) sts total. With RS tog, join shoulder using three-needle BO. Pick up and knit 2 sts from opposite end of garter band, then place 20 (21, 23, 24) left-back shoulder sts onto needle—22 (23, 25, 26) sts total. With RS tog, join shoulder using three-needle BO. Sew sleeves into armholes, easing along sleeve cap. Sew side and sleeve seams. Weave in ends. ☐

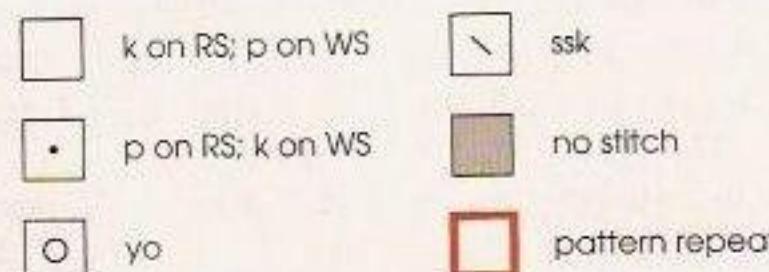
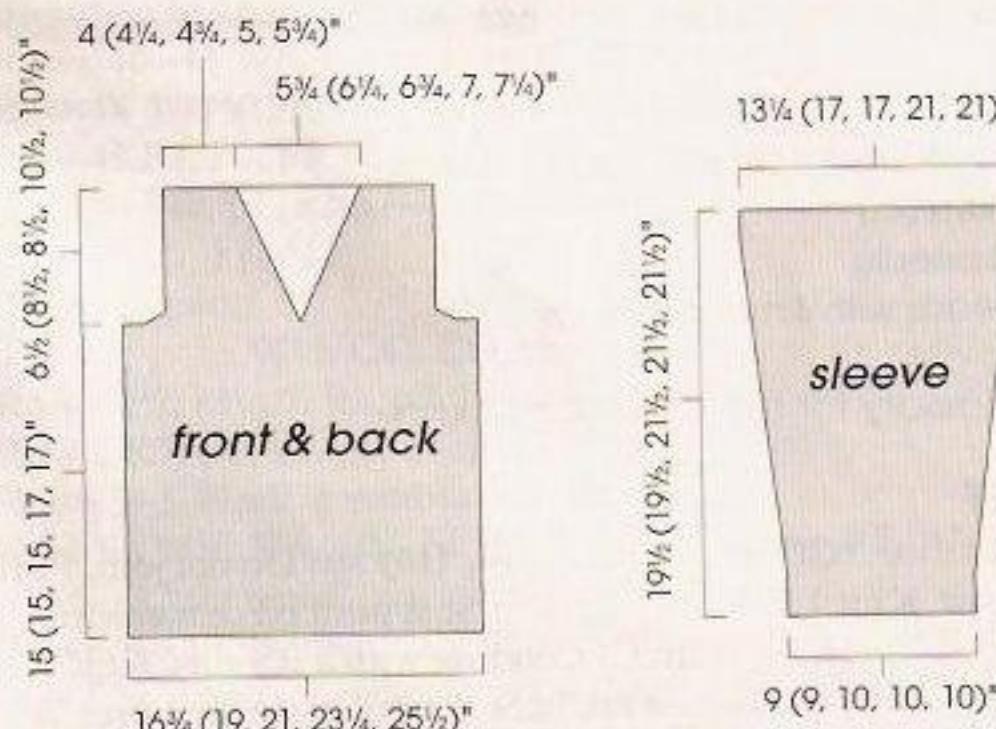

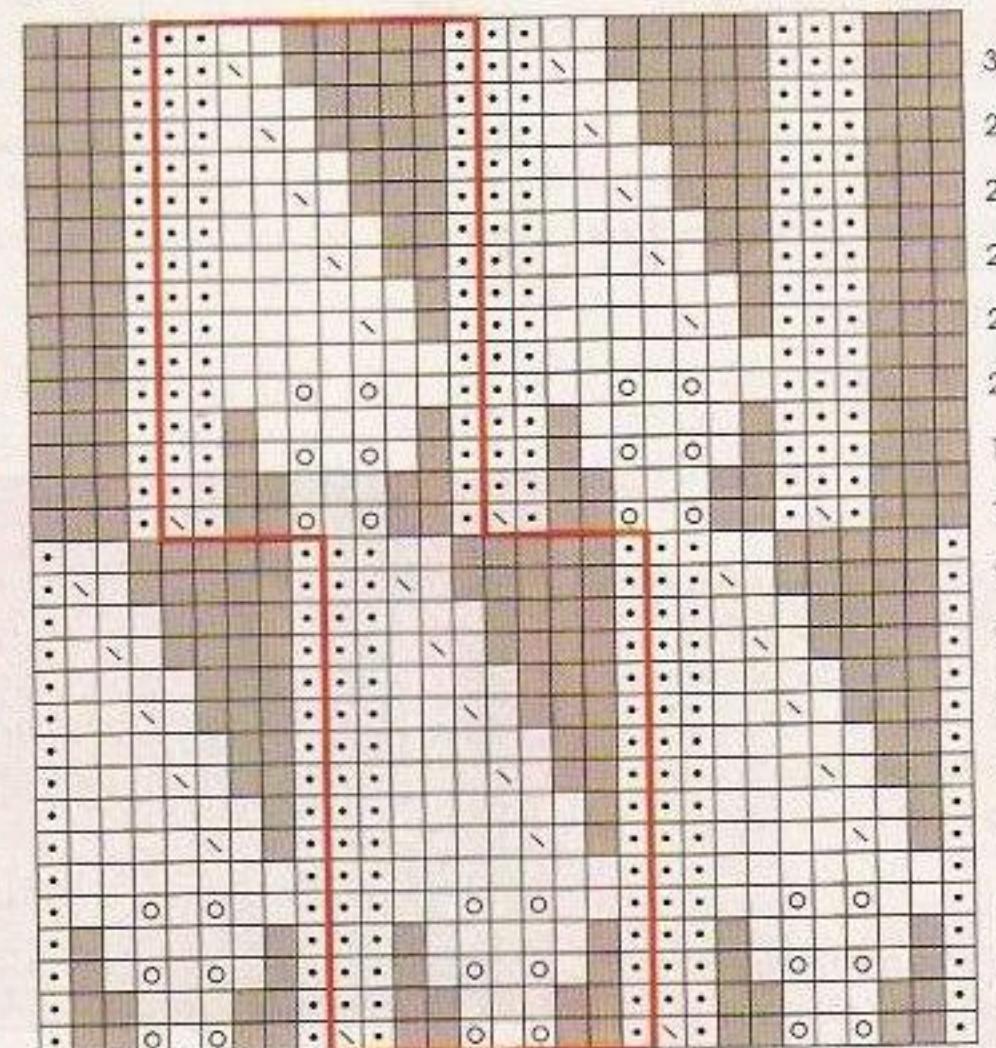
Keeping in patt (see Notes), BO 7 (10, 12, 15, 15) marked sts at beg of next 2 rows. Work even in patt until armholes measure about 6½ (8½, 8½, 10½, 10½)", ending with WS Row 32 (16, 16, 16, 16) of chart. BO all sts in patt.

FRONT

Work as for back until piece measures same as back to armholes, ending with WS Row 16 (16, 16, 32, 32) of chart—76 (86, 96, 105, 115) sts. Mark first and last 7 (10, 12, 15, 15) sts, and mark center 8 (8, 8, 7, 7) sts. **Shape armholes and front neck**: Keeping in patt (see Notes), BO marked 7 (10, 12, 15, 15) sts at beg of row, work to center m, sl m, p2 (2, 2, 3, 3), [ssk] 1 (1, 1, 0, 0) time, place sts on right needle on holder for left front; k1 and place this st on holder for V-neck; p3, sl m, work in patt to end. **Next row** BO 7 (10, 12, 15, 15) marked sts for armhole, work in patt to m at neck, k3. **Right-front neck**: Keeping in patt (see Notes), working rev St st at



leaf



front neck and as needed at side edge), dec 1 st (p2tog tbl) 1 st in from neck edge every other row 4 (0, 0, 0, 0) times, then every 4th row 8 (11, 14, 9, 12) times, then every 6th row 0 (2, 0, 6, 4) times—18 (19, 21, 22, 26) sts rem when counted on Row 32 of chart. When piece measures same as back to shoulders, BO all sts. **Left-front neck**: Transfer held sts to needle. With WS facing, work as foll: K3, sl m, work in patt to end. Cont in patt, working decs (p2tog) 1 st in from neck edge, and complete as for right front.

SLEEVES

With larger needles, CO 40 (40, 45, 45, 45) sts. **Set-up row** (WS) K2, *p1, k4; rep from * to last 3 sts, p1, k2. Beg with Row 1, work first 16 rows of Leaf chart, ending with a WS row. Cont in patt, inc 1 st each end of needle (see Notes) on next row, then every 4th row 0 (5, 0, 21, 21) times, then every 6th row 0 (12, 7, 3, 3) times, then every 8th row 0 (0, 8, 0, 0) times, then every 10th row 9 (0, 0, 0, 0) times, working all new sts in rev St st until a multiple of 5 sts are available to incorporate into leaf patt—60 (76, 77, 95, 95) sts, counted on Row 32 of patt. Work even until piece measures about 19½ (19½, 21½, 21½, 21½)" from CO, ending with WS Row 16 or 32. BO all sts in patt.

FINISHING

Sew BO sts of each front to corresponding shoulder sts of back. With smaller cir needle, RS facing, and beg at right shoulder seam, pick up and knit 28 (28, 28, 33, 33) sts along back neck, 42 (52, 52, 72, 72) along left-front neck, place marker (pm), k1 V-neck st from holder, pm, pick up and knit 42 (52, 52, 72, 72) sts along right-front neck—113 (133, 133,

178, 178) sts total. Pm and join for working in the rnd.

Rnd 1 *P1, k1, p1, k2; rep from * to 5 sts before marked V-neck st, p1, k1, p1, k2tog, k1 (V-neck st), ssk, **p1, k1, p1, k2; rep from ** to end—111 (131, 131, 176, 176) sts rem.

Rnd 2 Work in rib to 2 sts before V-neck st, p2tog, k1 (V-neck st), p2tog tbl, work in patt to end—109 (129, 129, 174, 174) sts rem.

BO all sts in rib, dec 1 st before and after V-neck st. Sew in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams. Weave in ends. Block lightly to measurements. ☐

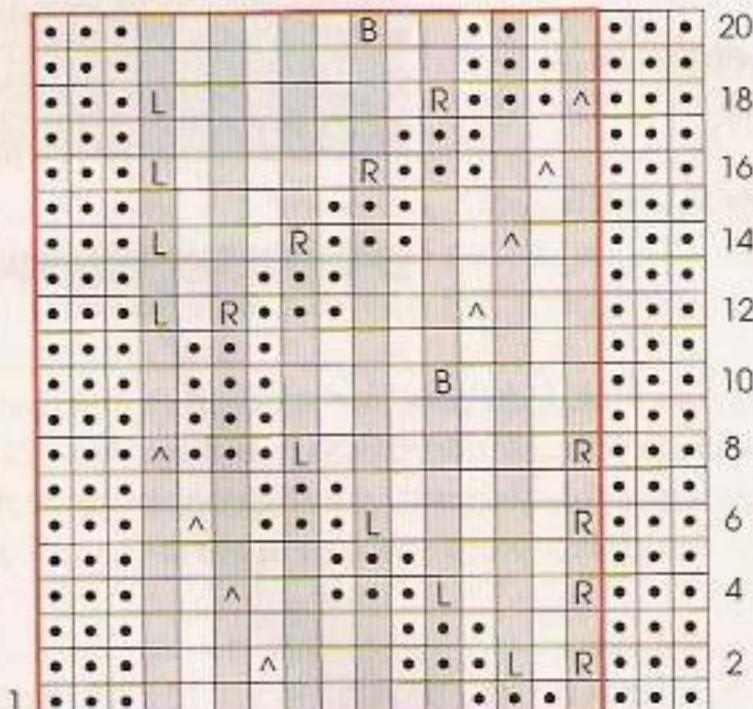
Beaded Long-tail Cast-on: Prestring specified number of beads using a strand of yarn long enough for long-tail CO. Make a slipknot, keeping beaded strand to the left (this is the end not attached to the ball of yarn). Nudge 1 bead toward slipknot and CO 1 st, trapping the bead in place by pulling it through the loop you're making. Cont in this manner until all sts are CO.

Place Bead: Place bead onto shaft of crochet hook. With hook, take stitch off needle and push bead off hook, pulling stitch through bead. Place stitch back on needle and knit as normal.

STOLE

String 107 E beads onto ball of yarn, alternating between brown and amber. Using the beaded long-tail CO (see Stitches), CO 107 sts. Knit 1 row. **Establish patt:** (WS) K4, working WS Row 1 of chart, rep 16-st rep as indicated on chart, k4. Cont working chart on center 99 sts and working first and last 4 sts of each row in garter st (not indicated on chart). Work Rows 1–20 of chart 18 times (360 rows) or until desired length, ending with a RS row. Knit 1 row. Set aside. With extra needle and new yarn, use the beaded long-tail CO to CO 107 sts. With RS

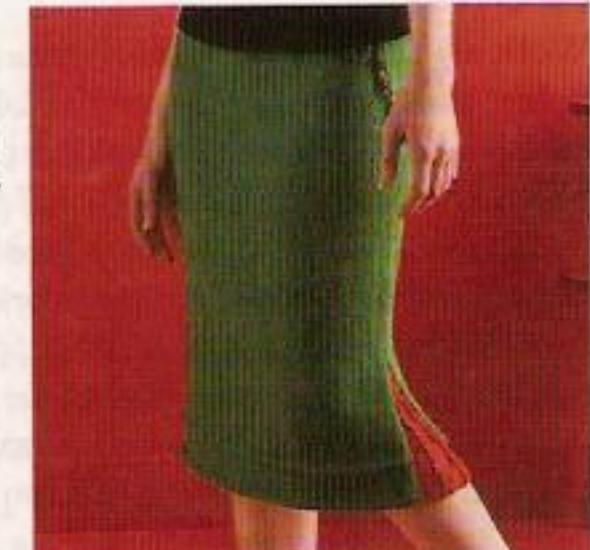

Place sts on holder. **Back panel:** Rep from * to *; do not cut yarn. **Join panels:** With RS facing, place front and back panel sts on cir needle. Rep Dec rnd every 6th rnd 4 times—150 (164, 180, 196, 208) sts rem. Work 1 rnd even, removing dart m. Work 4 more rnds even. **Drawstring casing:** Purl 1 rnd, knit 3 rnds. **Next rnd** *Ssk, knit to 2 sts before side m, k2tog, turn, leaving rem sts unworked. Working back and forth in rows, work 3 rows in St st. BO these sts—75 (82, 90, 98, 104) sts rem on needle. With RS facing, join yarn to rem sts and work as foll: Ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog. Work 3 rows in St st. BO all sts.

Row 1 (RS) P6, k1, p6, k1, p6, k1, p6.

Row 24 K2, ssk, p1, k2, ssk, p1, k2tog, k2, p1, k2tog, k2—15 sts rem.

Rows 26–31 Work in established patt.

Row 32 K1, ssk, p1, k1, ssk, p1, k2tog, k1, p1, k2tog, k1—11 sts rem.

Rows 34–37 Work in established patt.

Row 38 Ssk, p1, ssk, p1, k2tog, p1, k2tog—7 sts rem.

Row 39 P1, k1, p1, k1, p1, k1, p1.

Rows 40–43 Work in established patt.

Row 44 Ssk, k1, p1, k1, k2tog—5 sts rem.

Row 45 P2, k1, p2.

Row 46 Ssk, p1, k2tog—3 sts rem.

Row 47 P1, k1, p1.

BO sts in patt.

Size 45" only: With CC, CO 31 sts.

Row 1 P7, k1, p7, k1, p7, k1, p7.

Row 2 K7, p1, k7, p1, k7, p1, k7.

Rows 3–5 Work in established patt.

Row 6 (WS) K5, ssk, p1, k5, ssk, p1, k2tog, k5, p1, k2tog, k5—27 sts rem.

To finish drawstring casing, fold the front and back "flap" sections down with RS tog. Slip st the BO edges to the bumps of the purl row, leaving the ends open for inserting the ties. Steam-block skirt to finished measurements, paying particular attention to the hem area. Pin side inserts between openings on each side; with WS facing and MC, sew into place using overcast st so that the panels fall to the inside of the skirt. Using MC, make two twisted cords, 42 (45, 48, 51, 53)" long. Insert one drawstring cord through front casing and one through the back casing. Add beads to the ends of the drawstrings, if desired (note: adding beads will weight the ends of the drawstrings, keeping them straight). ☐

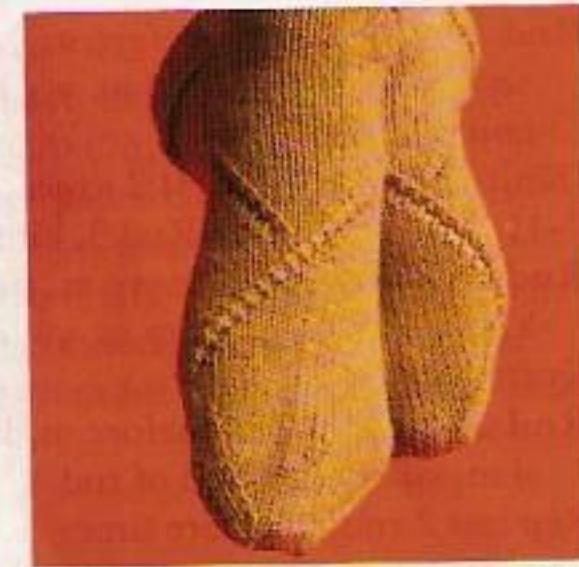

CUFF

CO 52 sts. Divide sts evenly onto 3 dpn, place marker (pm) and join in the rnd. Work in twisted rib (see Stitches) for 1".

LEFT LEG

Rnd 1 Yo, pm, ssk, [k23, k2tog, pm, yo] 2 times.

Rnd 2 Knit.

Rnd 3 Knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, [knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo] 2 times, knit to end of rnd.

Rep last 2 rnds once more, then knit 1 rnd.

Rnd 7 Knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to 4 sts before m, MT (see Stitches), [knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo] 2 times, knit to end of rnd.

Knit 1 rnd, rep Rnd 3, knit 1 rnd.

Rnd 11 Knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, k1, MT, knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to end of rnd.

[Knit 1 rnd, rep Rnd 3] 2 times, then knit 1 rnd. Rep Rnds 7–11. Knit 1 rnd, rep Rnd 3, knit 1 rnd.

Rnd 25 Knit to m, yo, sl m, sl 1, k2tog, pss0, remove m, yo, knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to end of rnd.

Knit 1 rnd.

Rnd 27 Knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to end of rnd.

Rep last 2 rnds 10 more times. Knit 1 rnd.

Rnd 49 Knit to m, remove m, yo, ssk, k2tog, remove m, yo, knit to end of rnd, remove m. Proceed to heel.

RIGHT LEG

Rnd 1 Yo, pm, ssk, k23, k2tog, pm, yo, M1, pm, ssk, k23.

Rnd 2 Knit.

Rnd 3 Knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to end of rnd.

Rep last 2 rnds once more, then knit 1 rnd.

Rnd 7 Knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, k2, MT, knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to end of rnd.

Knit 1 rnd, rep Rnd 3, knit 1 rnd.

Rnd 11 Knit to 2 sts before m, MT, k2, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to end of rnd.

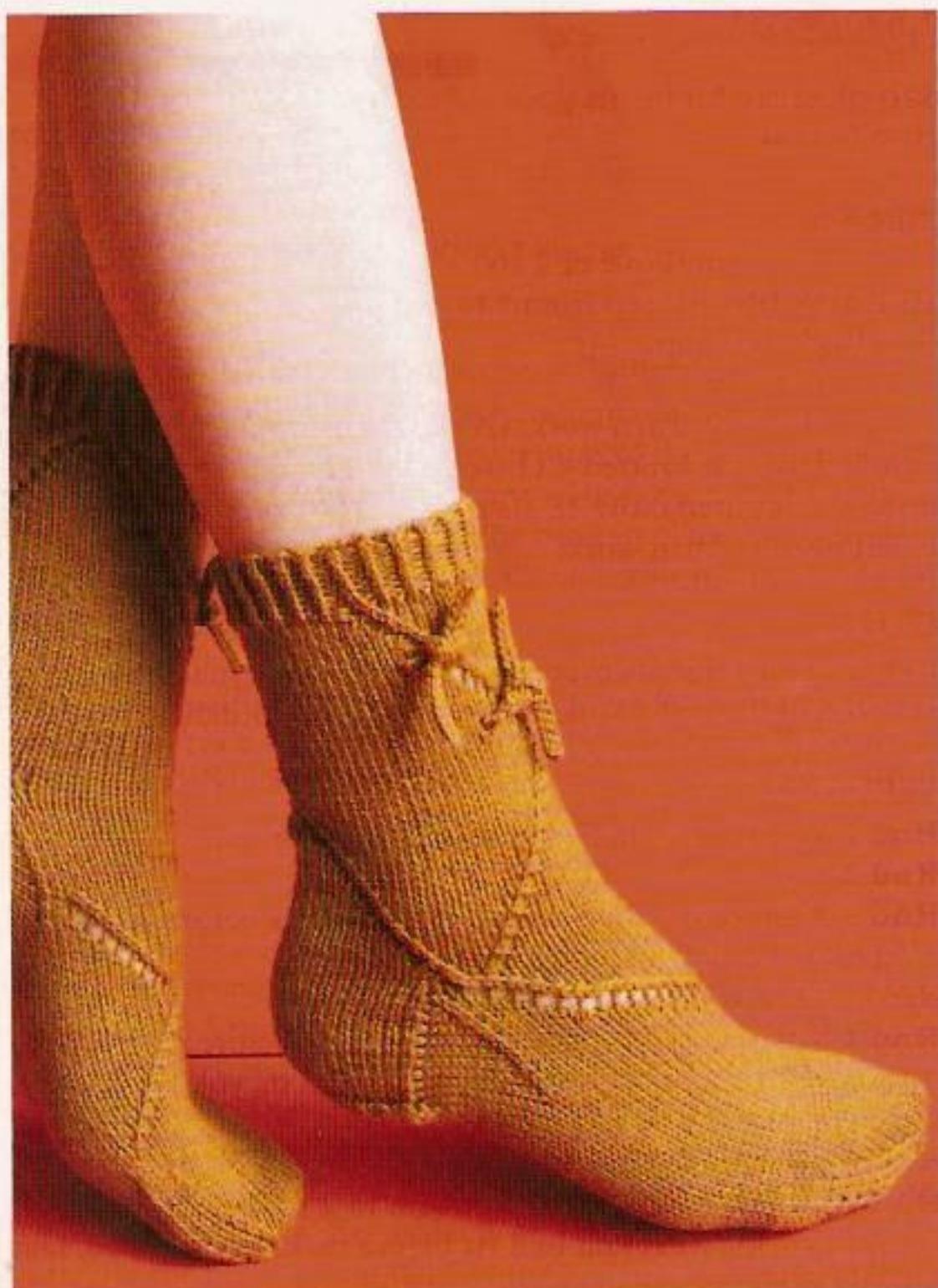
[Knit 1 rnd, rep Rnd 3] 2 times, then knit 1 rnd. Rep Rnds 7–11. Knit 1 rnd, rep Rnd 3, knit 1 rnd.

Rnd 25 Knit to m, remove m, yo, ssk, sl st back to left needle, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to end of rnd.

Knit 1 rnd.

Rnd 27 Knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to end of rnd.

Rep last 2 rnds 10 more times. Knit 1 rnd.



Rnd 49 K1, k2tog, remove m, yo, knit to m, remove m, yo, ssk (using last st of this rnd and first st of next rnd), sl st back to left needle, remove m. Proceed to heel.

HEEL

The heel flap is worked back and forth over the last 26 sts of the rnd, leaving the first 26 sts on the needles for the instep.

Set-up row Turn work, sl 1, p25.

Row 1 (RS) Sl 1, k25.

Row 2 (WS) Sl 1, p25.

Rep these 2 rows 10 more times. **Turn heel**:

Row 1 (RS) Sl 1, k14, ssk, k1, turn.

Row 2 (WS) Sl 1, p5, p2tog, p1, turn.

Row 3 Sl 1, knit to 1 st before gap, ssk, k1, turn.

Row 4 Sl 1, purl to 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1, turn.

Rep last 2 rows 3 more times—16 sts rem. K16 heel sts.

Gusset: Set-up rnd With an empty needle (now Needle 1), pick up and knit 12 sts along sl st edge of heel flap, then 1 st between heel flap and instep; with an empty needle (Needle 2), k26 instep sts; with an empty needle (Needle 3), pick up and knit 1 st between instep and heel flap, then 12 sts along other sl st edge of heel flap, k8 heel sts, pm for beg of rnd. Sl rem 8 heel sts from heel needle onto Needle 1—68 sts: 21 sts on Needle 1, 26 sts on Needle 2, and 21 sts on Needle 3.

LEFT-FOOT GUSSET

Rnd 1 Needle 1: knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; Needle 2: k24, k2tog, pm, yo; Needle 3: k1, ssk, knit to end—66 sts rem.

Rnd 2 Knit.

Rnd 3 Needle 1: knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; Needle 2: knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to end of needle; Needle 3: k1, ssk, knit to end—2 sts dec'd.

Rep last 2 rnds 5 more times, then work Rnd 2 again—54 sts rem. **Next rnd** Needle 1: knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; Needle 2: yo, pm, ssk, knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to end of needle; Needle 3: k1, ssk, knit to end—52 sts rem: 13 sts on Needle 1, 26 sts on Needle 2, and 13 sts on Needle 3. Knit 1 rnd. Proceed to left foot.

RIGHT-FOOT GUSSET

Rnd 1 Needle 1: knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; Needle 2: yo, pm, ssk, knit to end of needle; Needle 3: k1, ssk, knit to end—66 sts rem.

Rnd 2 Knit.

Rnd 3 Needle 1: knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; Needle 2: knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to end of needle; Needle 3: k1, ssk, knit to end—2 sts dec'd.

Rep last 2 rnds 5 more times, then work Rnd 2 again—54 sts rem. **Next rnd** Needle 1: knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; Needle 2: knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog, pm, yo; Needle 3: k1, ssk, knit to end—52 sts rem: 13 sts on Needle 1, 26 sts on Needle 2, and 13 sts on Needle 3. Knit 1 rnd. Proceed to right foot.

LEFT FOOT

Next rnd Knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to end of rnd. **Next rnd** Knit. Rep last 2 rnds 6 more times. **Next rnd** Knit to m, remove m, knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to end of rnd. **Next rnd** Knit. **Next rnd** Knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to end of rnd. Rep last 2 rnds 8 more times. Knit 1 rnd, removing m. Proceed to toe.

RIGHT FOOT

Next rnd Knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m, yo, knit to end of rnd. **Next rnd** Knit. Rep last 2 rnds 6 more times. **Next rnd** Knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to m, remove m, knit to end of rnd. **Next rnd** Knit. **Next rnd** Knit to m, yo, sl m, ssk, knit to end of rnd. Rep last 2 rnds 8 more times. Knit 1 rnd, removing m. Proceed to toe.

TOE

Rnd 1 Needle 1: knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; Needle 2: k1, ssk, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1; Needle 3: k1, ssk, knit to end—4 sts dec'd.

Rnd 2 Knit.

Rep last 2 rnds 7 more times—20 sts rem. K5 from Needle 1 onto Needle 3—10 sts on each needle. Break yarn, leaving a long tail. Use Kitchener st to graft sts tog.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Block as desired. ☐

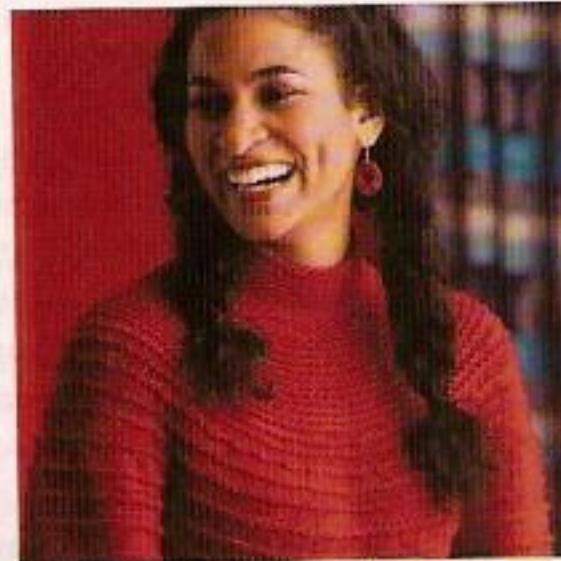

With longer cir needle, CO 140 (152, 164, 176, 192) sts.

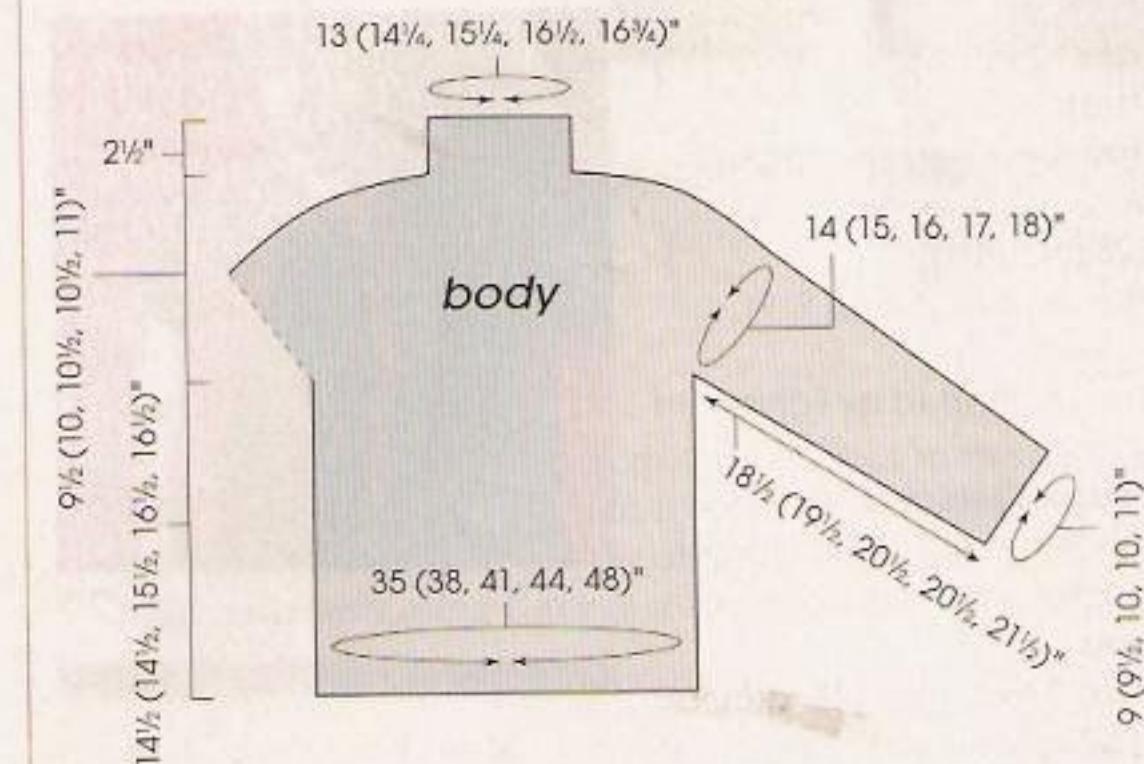

Work in rings patt for body (see Stitches) through Rnd 87 (87, 93, 99, 99)—piece measures about 14½ (14½, 15½, 16½, 16½)" from CO. **Next rnd** *Purl to 8 sts before m, BO next 8 sts for underarm; rep from * once more—62 (68, 74, 80, 88) sts rem for each of front and back. Place sts on holders.

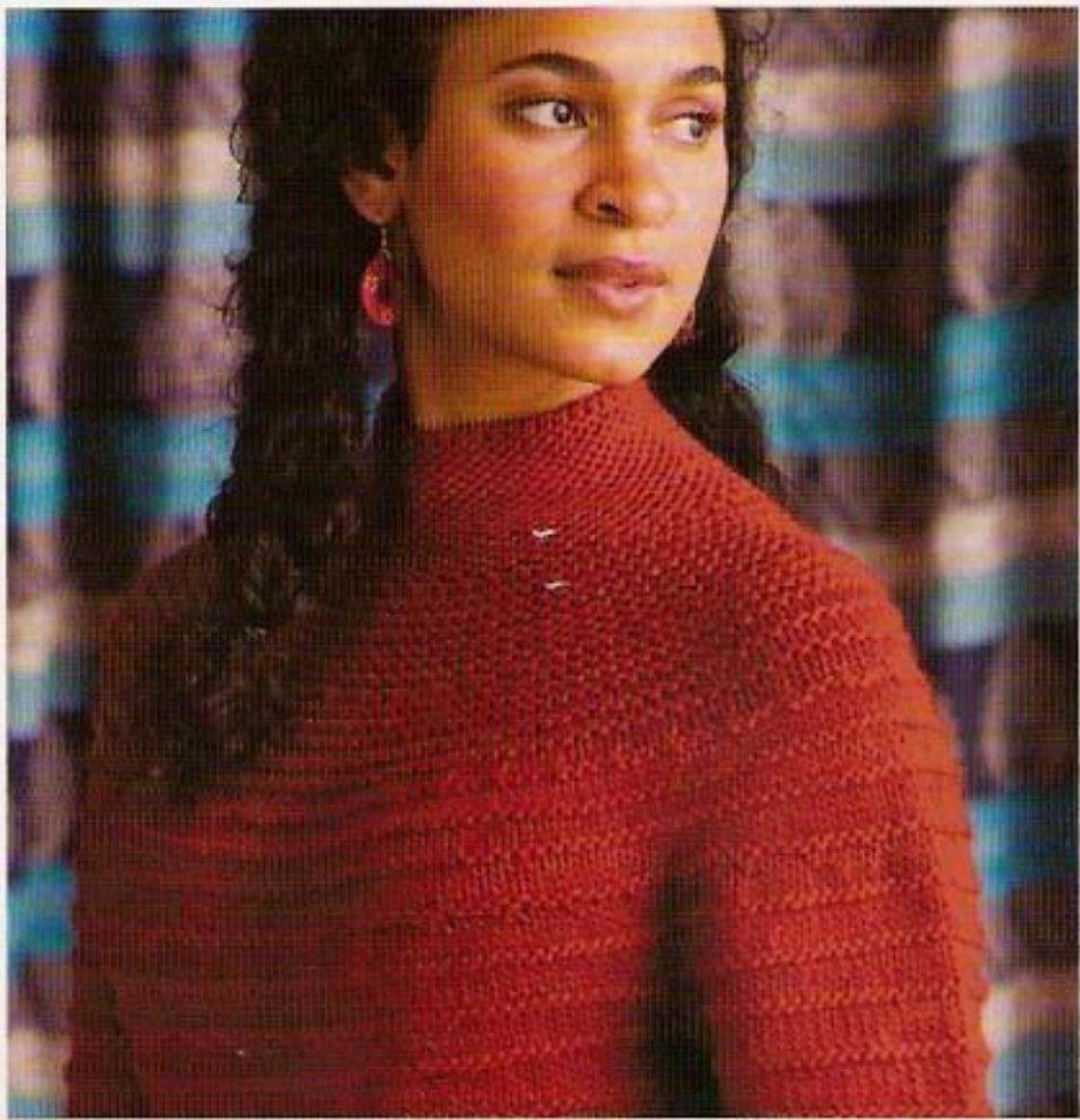
SLEEVES

With shorter cir needle, CO 36 (38, 40, 40, 44) sts. Pm and join in the rnd. Work Rnd 1 of rings patt for sleeves. Cont in patt and shape sleeve as foll: Inc 1 st each side of m on next rnd, then every 10 (10, 10, 8, 9)th rnd 9 (10, 11, 13, 13) more times—56 (60, 64, 68, 72) sts. Work in patt through Rnd 111 (117, 123, 123, 129), ending 4 sts before end of rnd on last rnd—piece measures about 18½ (19½, 20½, 20½, 21½)" from CO. **Next rnd** BO 8 sts, purl to end of rnd—48 (52, 56, 60, 64) sts rem. Place sts on holder. Break yarn, leaving a 12" tail.

YOKE

Place sts on longer cir needle with RS facing in the foll order: 62 (68, 74, 80, 88) back sts, 48 (52, 56, 60, 64) left-sleeve sts, 62 (68, 74, 80, 88) front sts, 48 (52, 56, 60, 64) right-sleeve sts—220 (240, 260, 280, 304) sts total. Pm and join in





the rnd. Work Rnds 1–38 (1–41, 1–41, 1–41, 1–41) of rings patt for yoke, then work in garter st in the rnd (knit 1 rnd, purl 1 rnd) until yoke measures 9½ (10, 10½, 10½, 11)" and **AT THE SAME TIME** work decs on specific rnds as foll:

Rnd 14 *K3 (3, 3, 3, 2), k2tog; rep from * around—176 (192, 208, 224, 228) sts rem.

Rnd 30 (31, 31, 33, 33) *K2 (2, 2, 2, 1), k2tog; rep from * around—132 (144, 156, 168, 152) sts rem.

Rnd 45 (48, 50, 52, 54) *K1 (1, 1, 1, 2), k2tog; rep from * around—88 (96, 104, 112, 114) sts rem.

Rnd 61 (64, 68, 68, 72) [K2, k2tog] 8 (9, 9, 10, 10) times, *k2tog; rep from * to end—52 (57, 61, 66, 67) sts rem.

Neck: Work even in garter st until turtleneck measures 2½". BO all sts loosely.

FINISHING

Block pieces lightly to measurements, being careful not to flatten texture. Use tails to sew underarm seams. Weave in ends. ☐

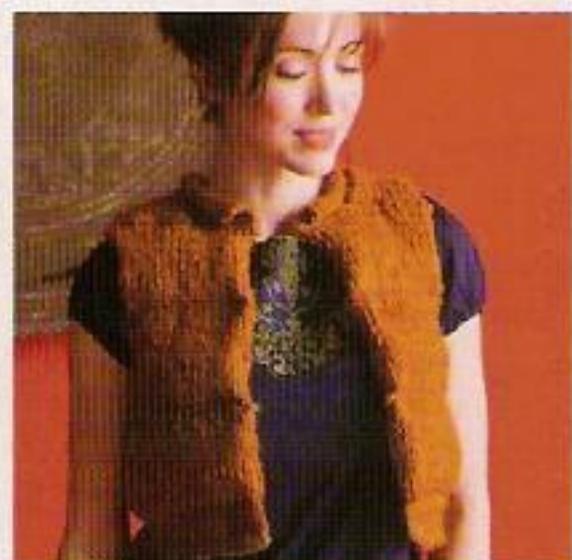

Notes

This vest is worked primarily in the round, but the tubular fabric is flattened and shaped to be worn as a doubled layer all around, not as a cylindrical garment (as most garments worked in the round are worn). The "quilting" lines between puffy sections are formed by rows that are not worked in the round.

Make sure to stop and stuff all "in-the-round" sections with roving before working the quilting lines and closing off those puffy sections.

VEST

With smaller cir needle and 1 strand of yarn, CO 171 (185, 201, 217, 233, 249, 267) sts. **Next row** (RS) P1, *k1, p1; rep from * to end. **Next row** (WS) K1, *p1, k1; rep from * to end. Rep last 2 rows until piece measures 2", ending with a WS row. **Next row** Sl first 2 sts to the spare smaller cir needle, sl next st (a RS purl) to opposite end of working cir needle. Cont to sl sts, slipping all RS knit sts to spare needle and all RS purl sts to opposite end of working needle to last 2 sts, then sl both the RS knit st and last st (RS purl st) to front/spare needle. Sts are now distributed onto the two needles; the spare needle (with RS knits) will be referred to as the front needle and the working cir needle with the RS purls will be referred to as the back needle. With one larger cir needle, join second strand of yarn and beg working across the front needle (with yarn doubled) as foll: P1, knit to last st, p1. Using same strands of yarn, turn work and knit across all sts on back needle with second larger cir needle, then join work in the rnd with sts from front needle. When working across either the front or back, use the opposite end of the needle in question. Cont working in the rnd until piece measures 3½" from beg of St st in the rnd. Stuff this section lightly with roving; pull the roving apart and fluff it up before stuffing. ****Break off one strand of yarn. With smaller cir needle, beg working as foll: P1 from front needle, *p1 from front needle, p1 from back needle; rep from * to last st, p1 from front needle. Purl all sts for 3 more rows. Sl sts as before onto spare needle and smaller cir needle (used to CO).****

With larger cir needle and doubled yarn, work in St st in the rnd as before until piece measures 8 (8, 8½, 8½, 9, 9, 9)" from CO. **Armpholes:** Work first 19 (21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31) sts on front needle in patt, BO next 4 sts, k39 (43, 47, 51, 55, 59, 65), BO next 4 sts, work to end of front needle in patt. On back needle: K19 (21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31), BO next 4 sts, k40 (42, 46, 50, 54, 58, 62), BO next 4 sts, knit to end. Sl sts for back and left front to waste yarn; the first 19 (21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31) sts of the front needle and last 19 (21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31) sts of the back needle make up the right front.

RIGHT FRONT

Joining right-front sts into the rnd (separated from back sts at armhole), work 1 rnd in St st. **Dec rnd** Work in patt to last 4 sts on front needle, k2tog, k2; on back needle, k2, ssk, knit to end. Rep last 2 rnds 2 more times; St st in the round section should now measure about 3½". Stuff section with roving. Rep from ** to ** (in Vest section above). With larger cir needle and doubled yarn, work in St st in the rnd as before

until armhole measures about 6". Break off one strand of yarn. With smaller cir needle, beg working as foll: P1 from front needle, *p1 from front needle, p1 from back needle; rep from * to last st, p1 from front needle. Purl all sts for 1 more row. **Shape neck:** BO first 8 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15) sts and purl to end of row. Purl 1 WS row. Sl sts as before onto spare needle and smaller cir needle. With larger cir needle and doubled yarn, work in St st in the rnd as before until armhole measures 8 (8, 8½, 8½, 9, 9, 9)". **Short-row shaping:** On front needle, knit to last 2 sts, wrap next st, turn. Purl back to end of row. Knit to 3 sts before last wrapped st, wrap next st, turn. Purl to end of row. Rep last 2 rows once more. Knit across all sts, working wraps tog with wrapped sts. Leave sts on front needle. On back larger cir needle, knit across all sts. Turn, purl to last 2 sts, wrap next st, turn. Knit to end of row. Purl to 3 sts before last wrapped st, wrap next st, turn. Knit to end of row. Rep last 2 rows once more. Join the sts on front and back needles with a three-needle BO with smaller needle and one strand of yarn.

LEFT FRONT

Sl left-front sts (first 19 [21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31] sts from front needle and 19 [21, 23, 25, 27, 29, 31] sts from back needle) from waste yarn onto two larger cir needles as before; the purl st and knit st immediately preceding the BO will be at the end of the row on the front needle. Attach doubled yarn to armhole side of front needle and work 1 rnd even on both front and back needle sts. **Dec rnd** K2, ssk, work even in patt to last 4 sts on back needle, k2tog, k2. Rep last 2 rnds 2 more times. Section should now measure about 3½". Rep from ** to ** (in Vest section above). With needles and doubled yarn, work in St st in the rnd as before until armhole measures about 6". Break off one strand of yarn. With smaller cir needle, beg working as foll: P1 from front needle, *p1 from front needle, p1 from back needle; rep from * to last st, p1 from front needle. **Shape neck:** BO 8 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15) sts and purl to end of row. Purl 2 rows. Sl sts as before onto spare needle and smaller cir needle. With larger cir needles and doubled yarn, work in St st in the rnd until armhole measures 8 (8, 8½, 8½, 9, 9, 9)". **Short-row shaping:** On back needle, knit to last 2 sts, wrap next st, turn. Purl to end of row. Knit to 3 sts before last wrapped st, wrap next st, turn. Purl to end of row. Rep last 2 rows once more. Knit across all sts, working wraps tog with wrapped sts. Leave sts on back needle. On front needle, knit across all sts. Turn, purl to last

2 sts, wrap next st, turn. Knit to end of row. Purl to 3 sts before last wrapped st, wrap next st, turn. Knit to end of row. Rep last 2 rows once more. Join the sts on front and back needles with three-needle BO with smaller needle and one strand of yarn.

BACK

Sl rem sts from holder onto two larger cir needles as before. Attach doubled yarn at right-hand edge of RS. Work 1 rnd even. **Dec rnd** K2, ssk, knit to last 4 sts on front needle, k2tog, k2, k2 on back needle, ssk, knit to last 4 sts on back needle, k2tog, k2. Rep last 2 rnds 2 more times. Section should now measure about 3½". Rep from ** to ** (in Vest section above). With larger cir needle and doubled yarn, work in St st in the rnd until section measures 3½". Break off one strand of yarn. With smaller cir needle, beg working as foll: P1 from front needle, *p1 from front needle, p1 from back needle; rep from * to last st, p1 from front needle. Purl 3 more rows. Rep from ** to **. With larger cir needle and doubled yarn, work in St st in the rnd until armhole measures 7 (7, 7½, 7½, 8, 8, 9)". **BO** all sts as foll: With smaller needle and single strand of yarn, *k1 from front needle, k1 from back needle, pass first st over second st to BO; rep from * until all sts are BO.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Sew BO underarm sts tog, and close up holes at front neck. Weave in ends. With smaller cir needle and single strand of yarn, pick up and knit sts evenly around the neck. Work in St st until collar measures 2½ (2½, 3, 3, 3, 4, 4)", ending with a WS row. BO all sts loosely. Block as desired; but do not wet-block. ☐

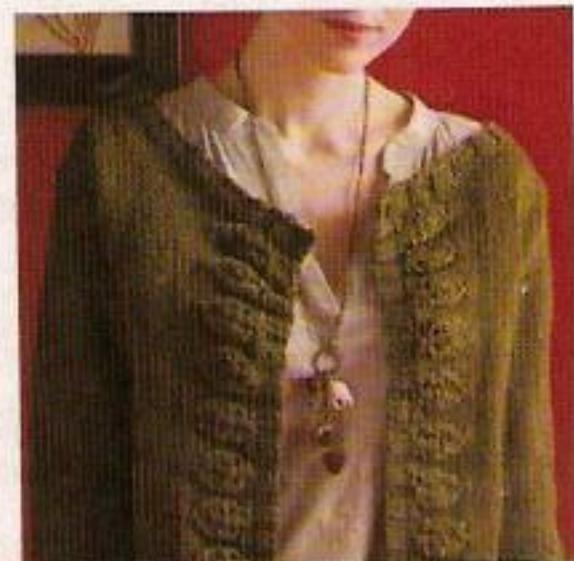

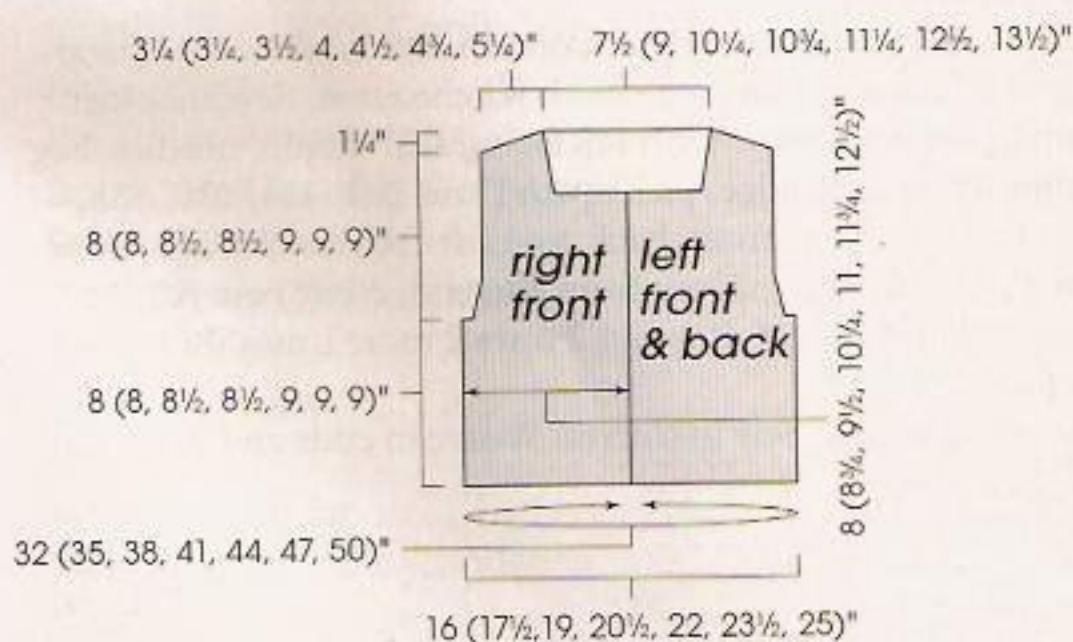

Row 9*Sl 1, k1, pss0, k1, k2tog, p5; rep from *, end sl 1, k1, pss0, k1, k2tog.

Row 11*Sl 1, k2tog, pss0, p5; rep from *, end sl 1, k2tog, pss0.

Row 12 Knit.

LEFT FRONT AND BACK

With smaller needles, CO 70 (74, 74, 78, 78) sts.

Rows 1, 3, and 5 (RS) K4, *k2, p2; rep from * to end k2.

Rows 2 and 4 (WS) P2, *k2, p2; rep from * to last 4 sts, k4.

Change to larger needles.

Row 6 (WS) K1f&b, knit to end—71 (75, 75, 79, 79) sts.

Row 7 K4, p3 (2, 2, 4, 4), place marker (pm), work Row 1 of leaf patt (see Stitches), pm, p3 (2, 2, 4, 4).

Row 8 K3 (2, 2, 4, 4), sl m, work Row 2 of leaf patt, sl m, k3 (2, 2, 4, 4), k4.

Cont in patt through Row 12 of leaf patt. **Next row (RS)** K4, purl to end. **Next row (WS)** Knit. Rep last 2 rows, working in rev St st with garter hem and **AT THE SAME TIME** when piece measures 3 (4 1/4, 4 1/4, 4 1/4, 4) " from CO, use the backward-loop method to CO 1 st at end of every WS row until there are 75 (77, 80, 83, 88) sts, then CO 1 st at end of every other WS row until there are 77 (79, 82, 85, 90) sts. At beg of next RS row, CO 4 sts—81 (83, 86, 89, 94) sts. Work even in patt for 11 (13, 13, 15, 17) rows. **Shape armhole:** At beg of next WS row, BO 26 (28, 30, 32, 34) sts, then 2 sts at beg of foll 2 WS rows—51 (51, 52, 53, 56) sts rem. Work even for 1 1/2 (1 1/2, 2, 2, 2 1/2) ". CO 2 sts at end of next 2 RS rows, then CO 26 (28, 30, 32, 34) sts at end of foll RS row—81 (83, 86, 89, 94) sts. Work 11 (13, 13, 15, 17) rows even. BO 2 sts at beg of next 2 WS rows for neck—77 (79, 82, 85, 90) sts rem. Work even for 9 (11, 12, 14, 15) " for back. CO 2 sts at end of next 2 RS rows for neck—81 (83, 86, 91, 94) sts. Work even for 11 (13, 13, 15, 17) rows. **Shape armhole:** At beg of next WS row, BO 26 (28, 30, 32, 34) sts. BO 2 sts at beg of foll 2 WS rows—51 (51, 52, 53, 56) sts rem. Work 3/4 (1/4, 1, 1, 1 1/4) " even. Place sts on holder.

RIGHT FRONT

With smaller needles, CO 70 (74, 74, 78, 78) sts.

Rows 1, 3, and 5 (RS) K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to the last 4 sts, k4.

Rows 2 and 4 (WS) K4, p2, *k2, p2; rep from * to end.

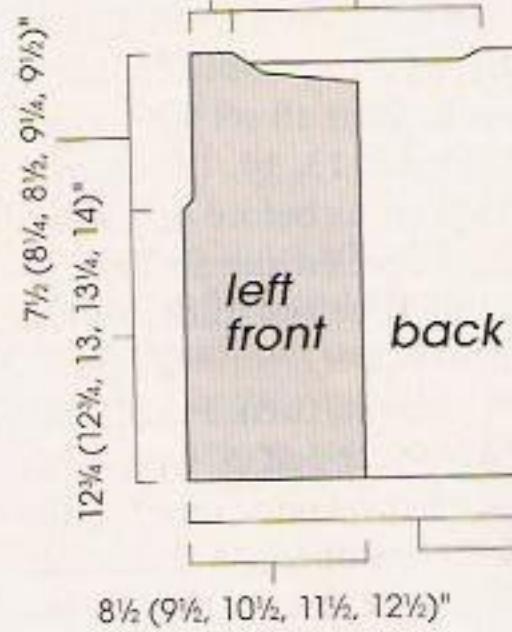
Change to larger needles.

Row 6 (WS) Knit to last st, k1f&b—71 (75, 75, 79, 79) sts.

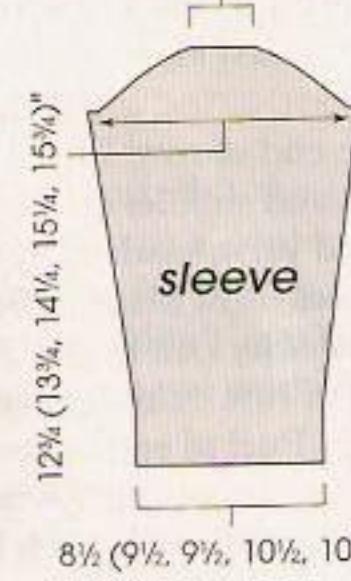
Row 7 P3 (2, 2, 4, 4), pm, work Row 1 of leaf patt, pm, p3 (2, 2, 4, 4), k4.

Row 8 K4, k3 (2, 2, 4, 4), sl m, work Row 2 of leaf patt, sl m, k3 (2, 2, 4, 4).

Cont in this manner through Row 12 of leaf patt. **Next row**

(RS) Purl to last 4 sts, k4. **Next row (WS)** Knit. Rep last 2 rows, working in rev St st with garter-hem and **AT THE SAME TIME** when piece measures 3 (4 1/4, 4 1/4, 4 1/4, 4) " from CO, use the backward-loop method to CO 1 st at end of every WS row until there are 75 (77, 80, 83, 88) sts, then CO 1 st at end of every other WS row until there are 77 (79, 82, 85, 90) sts. At beg of next RS row, CO 4 sts—81 (83, 86, 89, 94) sts. Work even in patt for 11 (13, 13, 15, 17) rows. **Shape armhole:** At beg of next RS row, BO 26 (28, 30, 32, 34) sts, then 2 sts at beg of foll 2 RS rows—51 (51, 52, 53, 56) sts rem. Work 3/4 (1/4, 1, 1, 1 1/4) " even. Place sts on holder.

SLEEVES

With smaller needles, CO 34 (38, 38, 42, 42) sts.

Row 1, 3, and 5 (RS) K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Rows 2 and 4 (WS) P2, *k2, p2; rep from * to end.

Change to larger needles.

Row 6 K1f&b, knit to end—35 (39, 39, 43, 43) sts.

Row 7 P2 (1, 1, 3, 3), pm, work Row 1 of leaf patt, pm, p2 (1, 1, 3, 3).

Row 8 K2 (1, 1, 3, 3), sl m, work Row 2 of leaf patt, sl m, k2 (1, 1, 3, 3).

Cont in this manner through Row 12 of leaf patt. Work in rev St st for 2 ". Inc 1 st each end of row on next RS row, then every 8th RS row 6 (0, 0, 0, 8) times, then every 10th RS row 1 (7, 8, 8, 1) time(s)—51 (55, 57, 61, 63) sts. Work even in rev St st until piece measures 17 (17, 17 1/2, 17 1/2, 18) " from CO. **Shape cap:** BO 3 sts at beg of next 6 (8, 8, 10, 12) rows, then 2 sts at beg of next 10 (8, 12, 12, 14) rows—13 (15, 19, 17, 19) sts rem. BO all sts.

FINISHING

With sts of right front and back on separate needles held parallel and RS facing, join pieces with Kitchener st. Sew shoulder seams. **Neck ribbing:** With RS facing and smaller needles, beg at right-front neck edge, pick up and knit 102 (114, 126, 138, 150) sts along right-front, back, and left-front neck edge. **Next row (WS)** P2, *k2, p2; rep from * to end. **Next row** K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to end. Rep last 2 rows 2 more times. BO all sts in patt.

Sew sleeve seams. Sew in sleeves. Weave in ends and block. ☐
