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
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Introduction

If you enjoy crocheting hats, snoods or scarves, then this is the book for you; scoodies combine all these features – and our delightful designs are really easy to make.


There are twenty cosy hooded scarves that won't just look fabulous in winter; their chunky yarns mean that they are also a great way to keep your head toasty and warm.

From elegant and chic to sporty and fun, there's loads of variety to choose from. You're sure to find the perfect scoodie to suit your style.






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Orange

Level of difficulty 2

DIMENSIONS

Hood

Width 26cm (10¹/₄in)

Height 33cm (13in)

Shawl collar

Circumference 67cm (26¹/₂in)

Height 16cm (6¹/₄in)

MATERIALS

Schachenmayr original Boston (60yd/1³/₄oz, 55m/50g) in Esprit Marl (Col 280), 5¹/₃ oz (150g), and in Red (Col 30) and Pumpkin (Col 26), 1³/₄ oz (50g) each

Crochet hooks K (7mm) and L (8mm)

TENSION

In main pattern

with hook size K (7mm)

10 sts and 7 rows = 10.5 × 12cm (4 × 4¹/₂in)

In hood pattern

with hook size L (8.0 mm)

9.5 sts and 10.5 rows = 10 × 10cm (4 × 4in)

PATTERN

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The new black

Main pattern

Work Chart A in rounds. The arrow indicates the start ch, the numbers the row changes. Work rnds 1 and 2 once, then repeat rnd 3, changing to Chart B to incorporate decreases where indicated. When changing col, work last sl st in rnd in new col.

Colour sequence

Alternate 1 rnd in Red, 1 rnd in Pumpkin.



Instructions

Shawl collar

See Charts A and B.

Using Hook size K (7mm) and starting at the bottom, ch 64 in Red and join in a ring with a sl st. The collar is worked in rounds.

Rnd 1 (Chart A): Join Pumpkin, ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in each ch of ring, using Red sl st into 3rd starting ch (63 sts).

Rnd 2 (Chart A): Using Red, ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), work 2dc (UK tr) into first dc (UK tr), *miss 1 dc (UK tr), work 2dc (UK tr) into next dc (UK tr); rep from * to end of rnd, using Pumpkin sl st into 3rd starting ch (32 2dc (UK tr) groups). Rnd 3 (Chart B, decrease): Using Pumpkin, ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), work 2dc (UK tr) between 1st and 2nd sts in first 2dc (UK tr) group, (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 6 times, (work 1dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) twice, (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 14 times, (work 1dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) twice, (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 7 times, using Red sl st into 3rd starting ch (28 2dc [UK tr] groups and 4dc [UK tr]).

Rnd 4 (Chart B): Using Red, ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), work 2dc (UK tr) between 1st and 2nd sts in first 2dc (UK tr) group, (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 6 times, work 2dc (UK tr) between next two dc (UK tr), (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 14 times, work 2dc (UK tr) between next two dc (UK tr), (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 7 times, using Pumpkin sl st into 3rd starting ch (30 2dc [UK tr] groups).

Rnd 5 (As Rnd 3 in Chart A): Using Pumpkin, ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), work 2dc (UK tr) between 1st and 2nd sts in each 2dc (UK tr) group to end of rnd, using Red sl st into 3rd starting ch.



Orange



Rnd 6 (As Rnd 3 in Chart B, decrease): Using Red, ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), work 2dc (UK tr) between 1st and 2nd sts in first 2dc (UK tr) group, (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 5 times, (work 1dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) twice, (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 14 times, (work 1dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) twice, (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 6 times, using Pumpkin sl st into 3rd starting ch (26 2dc [UK tr] groups and 4dc [UK tr]).

Rnd 7 (As Rnd 4 in Chart B): Using Pumpkin, ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), work 2dc (UK tr) between 1st and 2nd sts in first 2dc (UK tr) group, (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 5 times, work 2dc (UK tr) between next two dc (UK tr), (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 14 times, work 2dc (UK tr) between next two dc (UK tr), (work 2dc [UK tr] between 1st and 2nd sts in next 2dc [UK tr] group) 6 times, using Red sl st into 3rd starting ch (28 2dc [UK tr] groups).

Rnd 8 (As Rnd 3 in Chart A): Using Red, ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), work 2dc (UK tr) between 1st and 2nd sts in each 2dc (UK tr) group to end of rnd, using Pumpkin sl st into 3rd starting ch.

Rnd 9: Using Pumpkin, ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 4sc (UK dc), sc (UK dc) 2tog over next 2dc (UK tr) (see "How it's done"), *3sc (UK dc), sc (UK dc) 2tog over next 2dc (UK tr); rep from * 8 more times, work 1sc (UK dc) in each dc (UK tr) to end of rnd, sl st into first sc (UK dc) of rnd (46 sts). Fasten off.

Hood

Attach Esprit Marl to stitch 24 of the shawl collar (middle of front). The hood is worked in rows.

Row 1: Using Hook L (8mm), ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), work 1sc (UK dc) into each st of the previous rnd starting with stitch 24, turn (46 sts).

Row 2: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), work 1sc (UK dc) into each st, turn.

Repeat Row 2 another 28 times. (hood height approx. 28cm[11in]).

Row 31: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 19sc (UK dc), (sc [UK dc] 2tog) 4 times, 19sc (UK dc), turn (42 sts).

Row 32: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 42sc (UK dc), turn.

Row 33: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 17sc (UK dc), (sc [UK dc] 2tog) 4 times, 17sc (UK dc), turn (38 sts).

Row 34: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 38sc (UK dc), turn.

Row 35: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 11sc (UK dc), (sc [UK dc] 2tog) 8 times, 11sc (UK dc) (30 sts). Fasten off.



Finishing off

Fold hood in half with the right sides together and sew up the top seam of the hood using whipstitch. Include the stitch loops of the opposite layers with each stitch.

Crochet around the edge of the hood as follows:

Rnd 1: Using Hook L (8mm), join Pumpkin to Front middle st, ch 1, 1sc (UK dc) into same st, *ch 1, miss 1 row end, 1sc (UK dc) through back loop of next row end; rep from * to end of rnd, using Red sl st into 1st sc (UK dc).

Rnd 2: Using Red, *1sc (UK dc) in next ch of previous rnd, ch 1; rep from * to end of rnd, sl st into 1st sc (UK dc).

Joining yarn at centre back, work 1 rnd of sc (UK dc) in Red along the bottom edge of the shawl collar, join with sl st to 1st sc (UK dc). Sew in all yarn ends.

Evergreen

Level of difficulty 1

DIMENSIONS

Circumference 80cm (31½in)

Height 43cm (17in)

MATERIALS

Schachenmayr original Aventica (131yd/1¾oz, 120m/50g) in Tropical Green Color (Col 111), 5⅓ oz (150g), and Art Deco Color (Col 85), 1¾ oz (50g)

Hook size J (6mm)

TENSION

In main pattern

with hook size J (6mm)

10.5 sts and 9.5 rows = 10 × 10cm (4 × 4in)

In cuff pattern

with hook size J (6mm)

11 sts and 7 rows = 10 × 4cm (4 × 1½in)

PATTERN

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Made in minutes

Main pattern

Work Chart in rounds. The numbers indicate the row changes. Work rnd 1 once, then repeat rnds 2 and 3.

Cuff pattern

Work Chart in rounds (rnds a and b). Work rnd a once, with the sc (UK dc) between 2 dc (UK tr) of the previous rnd, then repeat rnd b, through back loop only.



Instructions

See Chart.

Using Hook J (6mm), ch 85 loosely in Tropical Green Color, join in a ring with a sl st.

Rnd 1: Ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) into each ch in ring, join with sl st to 3rd starting ch (84 sts).

Rnd 2: Ch 2 (does not count as a stitch), work 1dc (UK tr) into the space before the first dc (UK tr) of previous rnd, work 1dc (UK tr) between each pair of dc (UK tr) in the previous rnd, work 1dc (UK tr) after the last dc (UK tr) in previous rnd, join with a sl st to 1st dc (UK tr) of this rnd.

Rnd 3: Ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), work 1dc (UK tr) between each pair of dc (UK tr) in the previous rnd, join with a sl st to 3rd starting ch.

Repeat last 2 rnds 15 times more. (approx. 35cm [13¾in]).

Fasten off Tropical Green Color and join in Art Deco.

Rnd 34 (Chart Rnd a): Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), work 1sc (UK dc) into the space before the first dc (UK tr) of previous rnd, work 1sc (UK dc) between each pair of dc (UK tr) in the previous rnd, work 1sc (UK dc) after the last dc (UK tr) of the previous rnd, join with a sl st to 1st sc (UK dc) in this rnd.

Rnd 35 (Chart Rnd b): Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), work 1sc (UK dc) BLO in each sc (UK dc) of previous rnd, join with a sl st to 1st sc (UK dc) of this rnd.

Repeat Rnd 35 another 5 times. Fasten off.

Sew in all yarn ends.

DIMENSIONS

Hood

Width 28cm (11in)

Height 35cm (13³/₄in)

Scarf ends

Length 125cm (49¹/₂in)

Width 16cm (6¹/₄in)

MATERIALS

Schachenmayr original Lizanne
(60yd/3¹/₂oz, 55m/100g) in Esprit
Color (Col 80), 24¹/₇oz (700g)

Hook size N/P (10mm)

TENSION

In pattern

with hook size N/P (10mm)

8dc (UK tr) and 4 rows =
10 × 10cm (4 × 4in)

PATTERN

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Stitches in curves

Pattern

Work Chart in rows.

Instructions

See Chart.

Start the hood at the back of the head.

Using Hook N/P (10mm), loosely crochet 12 ch.

Continue working in rows, turning at the end of each row.

Row 1: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in 5th ch from hook, 1dc (UK tr) into next 9 ch, 7dc (UK tr) into last ch, turn work through 180 degrees, work 1dc (UK tr) into each ch on opposite side, turn (29 sts).

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 11dc (UK tr), (2dc [UK tr] into next st) 5 times, 12dc (UK tr), turn (34 sts).

Row 3: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) into same stitch, 11dc (UK tr), (2dc [UK tr] into next st, 1dc [UK tr] into next st) 5 times, 11dc (UK tr), 2dc (UK tr) into last st, turn (41 sts).

Row 4: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) into same stitch, 13dc (UK tr), (2dc [UK tr] into next st, 1dc [UK tr] into next 2 sts) 5 times, 11dc (UK tr), 2dc (UK tr) into last st, turn (48 sts).

Row 5: Ch 3, (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) into same stitch, 14dc (UK tr), (2dc [UK tr] into next st, 1dc [UK tr] into next 3 sts) 5 times, 12dc (UK tr), 2dc (UK tr) into last st, turn (55 sts).

Now work the ch for the scarf onto the two sides. At the end of row 5, work 80 ch. Allow the work to rest for a while, and join new yarn to the other side and again work 80 ch.

Trim the yarn and tighten. Take up the first side of the work again, turn.

Row 6: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) into 4th ch from hook 1dc (UK tr) into each ch of the first row of ch, each st across the hood and each ch of the second row of ch, work 1 more dc (UK tr) into the last ch, turn (217 sts).

Row 7: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) into same stitch, 1dc (UK tr) in each st to last st, 2dc (UK tr) in last st, turn (219 sts).

Rows 8 to 11: Repeat Row 7 another 4 times (227 sts).

Mark the centre st of the head.

Row 12: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) into same stitch, 1dc (UK tr) in each st until there are 14 sts left to work before the centre st, *dc (UK tr) 2tog (see “How it’s done”), 1dc (UK tr); rep from * 9 more times, 1dc (UK tr) in each st to last st, 2dc (UK tr) in last st (219 sts). Fasten off.

Sew in all yarn ends.



Blue Velvet

Simply pleasant

Level of difficulty 1

DIMENSIONS

Hood

Width 26cm (10¹/₄in)

Height 23cm (9in)

Loop

Circumference 173cm (68in)

Height 26cm (10¹/₄in)

MATERIALS

Schachenmayr original Boston (60yd/1³/₄oz, 55m/50g) in Storm Grey Heather (Col 92), 5¹/₃ oz (150g), and in Mint (Col 66), Charcoal Heather (Col 98) and Olive Gold (Col 23), 3¹/₂oz (100g) each

Hook size K (7mm)

TENSION

In pattern

with hook size K (7mm)

12.5 sts and 10 rows = 12 × 12cm (4³/₄ × 4³/₄in)

PATTERN

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Pattern

Work Chart in rounds. The numbers indicate the row changes. Work rnds 1 and 2 once, then repeat rnds 3 and 4 (1 stripe). When changing col, work last sl st in rnd in new col.

Colour sequence

Work rnds 1 and 2 in Storm Grey Heather, 1 stripe each (rnds 3 and 4) in Mint, Charcoal Heather and Olive Gold, 2 stripes in Storm Grey Heather, 1 stripe each in Mint, Charcoal Heather, Olive Gold and Storm Grey Heather (total of 20 rnds). When changing col, work last sl st in rnd in new col.

Instructions

See Chart.

Using Hook K (7mm) work 180 ch in Storm Grey Heather and join in a ring with a sl st.

Continue working in the given colour sequence.

Rnd 1: Ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), 2dc (UK tr) in first ch, *miss 1 ch, 2dc (UK tr) in next ch, rep from * to end, join with sl st to 1st dc (UK tr) in this rnd (179 sts).

Rnd 2: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc) between first and last dc (UK tr) from previous rnd, ch 1, *1sc (UK dc) between next pair of 2dc (UK tr) from previous rnd, ch 1, rep from * to end of rnd, join with sl st to 1st sc (UK dc) of this rnd.

Rnd 3: Ch 3 (does not count as a stitch), 2dc (UK tr) in 1st ch of previous rnd, miss 1sc (UK dc), 2dc (UK tr) in next ch, *miss next sc (UK dc), 2dc (UK tr) in next ch, rep from * to end, join with sl st to 1st dc (UK tr) in this rnd.

Rnd 4: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc) between first and last dc (UK tr) from previous rnd, ch 1, *1sc (UK dc) between next pair of 2dc (UK tr) from previous rnd, ch 1, rep from * to end of rnd, join with sl st to 1st sc (UK dc) of this rnd.

Keeping to col sequence, repeat Rnds 3 and 4 until 18 rnds have been completed in total, ending with Olive Gold.

Place stitch markers on sts 80 and 100 to mark the middle 20 sts (10 ch and 10 sc [UK dc]).

Rnd 19: Using Storm Grey Heather, work as for Rnd 3 to the first marker, dc (UK tr) 2tog over next 2 ch (see “How it’s done”), (dc [UK tr] 2tog over last ch just worked and next ch) 8 times, cont in patt as for Rnd 3 to end, join with sl st to 1st dc (UK tr) in this rnd (170 sts).



Blue Velvet

Rnd 20: Work as for Rnd 4 to the first marker, over the dec sts from previous rnd work sc (UK dc) 2tog, (sc [UK dc] 3tog) twice, sc (UK dc) 2tog, cont in patt as for Rnd 4 to end (164 sts). Fasten off.

Finishing off

Sew up the hood using whipstitch. Fold the loop in half with the right sides facing and count seven dc (UK tr) groups on both sides of the decreased dc (UK tr) section. Start the seam at this point and continue to the curve, include the stitch loop of the opposite layer in the sewing.

Crochet around the top and bottom edges of the loop in Charcoal Heather, working 2sc (UK dc) into each unworked ch. Make the sc (UK dc) along the top of the hood tighter so the hood sits a little firmer. Sew in all yarn ends.





Peppermint

Snuggle snood

Level of difficulty 1

DIMENSIONS

Circumference 152cm (60in)

Height 30cm (11³/₄in)

MATERIALS

Schachenmayr Select Highland Alpaca (45yd/3¹/₂oz, 41m/100g) in Mint (Col 2965), 17³/₅oz (500g), and in Yellow (Col 2918), 3¹/₂oz (100g)

Hook size O (12mm)

TENSION

In sc (UK dc) pattern

with hook size O (12mm)

6 sc (UK dc) and 6 rows =
10 × 10cm (4 × 4in)

Instructions

Using Hook O (12mm) and Mint, loosely crochet 80 ch and join in a ring with a sl st.

Rnd 1: Ch 1 (counts as a stitch), sc (UK dc) in 2nd ch from hook, sc (UK dc) into each ch to end, join to 1st ch with a sl st (80 sts).

Rnd 2: Ch 1 (counts as a stitch), sc (UK dc) BLO into each st to end, join to 1st ch with a sl st.

Repeat Rnd 2 another 14 times. Fasten off.

Finishing off

Fold the loop in half with the right sides facing and sew 20cm (7³/₄in) along the back of the head in Mint.

Top edging Rnd: Join Yellow to any stitch on the top of the scoodie, *4sc (UK dc), 1dc (UK tr) around the post of the sc (UK dc) 3 rows from the top; rep from * to end, sl st into 1st st.

Bottom edging Rnd: Join Yellow to any stitch on the bottom of the scoodie, sc (UK dc) in every st to end, sl st into 1st st.

Sew in all yarn ends.

Soft & Cosy

Level of difficulty 1

DIMENSIONS

Circumference 65cm (25½in)

Height 46cm (18in)

MATERIALS

Schachenmayr original Lumio Color (82yd 5⅓ oz, 75m/150g) in Turquoise-Pink (Col 92), 15¼/soz (450g)

Hook size 0 (12mm)

TENSION

In pattern

with hook size 0 (12mm)

6 dc (UK tr) and 4 rows =
10 x 10cm (4 x 4in)

XXL crochet

Instructions

Using Hook 0 (12mm), work 40 ch loosely and join in a ring with a sl st. **Rnd 1:** Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in 5th ch from hook, 1dc (UK tr) into each ch, join with 1 loose sl st into the 3rd starting ch (40 sts).

Rnd 2: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), (1hdc [UK htr] into the gap after the next st) 8 times 23dc (UK tr), (1hdc [UK htr] into the gap after the next st) 8 times, 1dc (UK tr) into loose sl st from previous rnd, join with a loose sl st to first ch.

Rnds 3-18: Repeat Rnd 2 another 16 times.

Rnd 19: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 40sc (UK dc). Fasten off.

Finishing off

Sew in all the yarn ends. Make a cord 85cm (33½in) long and thread through the front edge, missing alternate rounds. Make 2 pompoms 8cm (3¼in) in diameter (see “How it’s done”) and attach to the ends of the cord.





Multicolour

Level of difficulty 1

DIMENSIONS

Hood

Width 27cm (10³/₄in)

Height 32cm (12¹/₂in)

Scarf ends

Length right 37cm (14¹/₂in), left 88cm (34³/₄in)

Width 14cm (5¹/₂in)

MATERIALS

Schachenmayr original Bravo Big Color (131yd/7oz, 120m/200g) in Lime Tweed (Col 371), Fuchsia Tweed (Col 336) and in Candy Print (Col 92), 7oz (200g) each

Hook size N/P (10mm)

TENSION

In Lacy pattern

with hook size N/P (10mm)

11 sts (scarf width) and 6 rows = 15 × 12.5cm (6 × 5in)

In hdc (UK htr)

with hook size N/P (10mm)

6 sts and 5 rows = 9 × 10cm (3¹/₂ × 4in)

PATTERN

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Lacy pattern

Lacy pattern (scarf)

Work Chart in rows. The numbers on both sides indicate the beginning of the row.

The Chart gives the full width of the scarf. Black symbols = Fuchsia Tweed, grey symbols = Lime Tweed. When changing col, finish the last stitch in the next col.

Instructions

Scarf

See Chart.

Using Hook N/P (10mm), work 12 ch in Fuchsia Tweed.

Row 1: 1sc (UK dc) in 2nd ch from hook, 1sc (UK dc) in each ch to end, turn (11 sts).

Row 2: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 2sc (UK dc), (ch 1, miss 1 st, 1sc [UK dc]) 4 times, 1sc (UK dc), turn.

Row 3: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc), (ch 1, miss 1 st, 1sc [UK dc]) 5 times, turn.

Rows 4 to 5: Repeat Rows 2 to 3, changing to Lime Tweed at end of row 5.

Row 6: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 2sc (UK dc), (ch 1, miss 1 st, 1sc [UK dc]) 4 times, 1sc (UK dc), turn.

Row 7: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in next st, (ch1, miss 1 st, 1dc [UK tr]) 4 times, 1dc (UK tr), change to Fuchsia Tweed at end of row, turn.

Rows 8 to 9: Repeat Rows 2 to 3, changing to Lime Tweed at end of Row 9.

Row 10: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 2sc (UK dc), (ch 1, miss 1 st, 1sc [UK dc]) 4 times, 1sc (UK dc), turn.

Row 11: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in next st, (ch1, miss 1 st, 1dc [UK tr]) 4 times, 1dc (UK tr), turn.

Row 12: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 2sc (UK dc), (ch 1, miss 1 st, 1sc [UK dc]) 4 times, 1sc (UK dc), turn.



Multicolour

Repeat Rows 11 to 12 another 32 times, changing to Fuschia Tweed at end of last row.

Now work the last 9 rows from the Chart as follows:

Row 77: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc), (ch 1, miss 1 st, 1sc [UK dc]) 5 times, turn.

Row 78: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 2sc (UK dc), (ch 1, miss 1 st, 1sc [UK dc]) 4 times, 1sc (UK dc), change to Lime Tweed at end of row, turn.

Row 79: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in next st, (ch1, miss 1 st, 1dc [UK tr]) 4 times, 1dc (UK tr), turn.

Row 80: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 2sc (UK dc), (ch 1, miss 1 st, 1sc [UK dc]) 4 times, 1sc (UK dc), change to Fuchsia Tweed at end of row, turn.

Row 81: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc), (ch 1, miss 1 st, 1sc [UK dc]) 5 times, turn.

Row 82: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 2sc (UK dc), (ch 1, miss 1 st, 1sc [UK dc]) 4 times, 1sc (UK dc), turn.

Rows 83 to 84: Repeat rows 81 to 82.

Row 85: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 11sc (UK dc). Fasten off.



Hood

Lay the scarf out horizontally, with right side facing, and measure approx. 37cm (14½in) from the right edge. Join Candy Print at the edge of an sc (UK dc) row at this point.

Row 1: Using Hook size N/P (10mm), ch 2 (counts as a stitch), working 2hdc (UK htr) into the edge of each lacy row end and 1hdc (UK htr) into the edge of each sc (UK dc) row end, continue until you have 34hdc (UK htr), ending with an hdc (UK htr) into a sc (UK dc) row end.

Row 2: Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), 1hdc (UK htr) into each st to end, turn.

Row 3 (right side): Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), 1hdc (UK htr) BLO into each st to end, turn.

Rows 4 to 15: Repeat Rows 2 to 3 another 6 times.

Row 16: Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), 12hdc (UK htr), (sc [UK dc] 2tog) 4 times (see “How it’s done”), 13hdc (UK htr). Fasten off leaving a long length of yarn.

Finishing off

Fold hood in half with the right sides together and, with the long end, sew up the top seam of the hood using whipstitch. Include the stitch loops of the opposite layers with each stitch.

Edging Row 1: Using Hook N/P (10mm) and Lime Tweed, work 1sc (UK dc) into first hdc (UK htr), ch 1, work 1sc (UK dc) into same stitch, work 1 sc (UK dc) into each hdc (UK htr) to the end. Fasten off.

Edging Row 2: Using Hook N/P (10mm) and Fuchsia Tweed, work 1sc (UK dc) into each sc (UK dc) to the end. Fasten off. Sew the ends of the edging rows to the scarf. Sew in all the yarn ends.

Striped loop (worked in rounds)

Using Hook M/N (9mm) and Navy, loosely crochet 64 ch and join in a ring with a sl st.

Rnd 1: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in 5th ch from hook, 1dc (UK tr) into each ch, sl st into the 3rd starting ch (64 sts).

Rnd 2: Turn to work the rnd in the opposite direction, ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 63dc (UK tr) BLO, change to Lime, sl st into the 3rd starting ch.

Rnd 3: Turn to work the rnd in the opposite direction, ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 63dc (UK tr) BLO, sl st into the 3rd starting ch.

Rnd 4: Turn to work the rnd in the opposite direction, ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 63dc (UK tr) BLO, change to Navy, sl st into the 3rd starting ch.

Cont to work 2 rnds in Navy and 2 rnds in Lime, alternating between the two colours, until you have worked 16 rnds.

The loop will measure 30cm (11³/₄in). Add 2 more rnds if desired. Fasten off.

Finishing off

Sew in all the yarn ends, and attach 1 button to the middle of the back, and to the left and right sides.

Loop in iris (worked in rows)

(Photo on right)

Using Hook M/N (9mm) and Iris, loosely crochet 28 ch.

Row 1: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) into 5th ch from hook, 1dc (UK tr) into each ch, turn (28 sts).

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 27dc (UK tr) BLO, turn.

Repeat Row 2 another 32 times. Add more rows if desired. Fasten off.

Finishing off

Fold the loop in half with the right sides facing and sew together over 20dc (UK tr). Leave the remaining 8dc (UK tr) open for the slit.

Using Hook M/N (9mm) and lime, crochet around the top and bottom edge, working 2sc (UK dc) into each row end, and sl st around the slit.

Sew in all yarn ends. Attach 1 button to the middle of the back, and to the left and right sides.



Hood in navy (worked in rows)

(Photo on page 32)

Using Hook M/N (9mm) and Navy, loosely crochet 58 ch.

Row 1: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) into 5th ch from hook, 1dc (UK tr) into each ch, turn (58 sts).

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 57dc (UK tr) BLO, turn.

Repeat Row 2 another 12 times.

The hood should measure 28cm (11in) after 14 rows, you can add 1 or 2 more rows if you like.

Finishing off

Fold the hood in half and sew, the seam will be on the top of the head. In Iris, make a pompom of 6cm (2½in) diameter (see “How it’s done”) and attach to the hood.

Using Hook M/N (9mm) and Iris, loosely crochet 1 rnd of crab stitch (rev sc [UK dc]) around the hood. Work 1 st into each row end around the front and 1 st into each dc (UK tr) around the base.

Using Iris, embroider a star onto the side of the hood and attach the decorative button. Sew in all the yarn ends.

Mix & Match

Striped hood (worked in rows)

Using Hook M/N (9mm) and Lime, loosely crochet 18 ch.

Row 1: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) into 5th ch from hook, 1dc (UK tr) into each ch to last ch, 2dc (UK tr) in last ch, turn work through 180 degrees, 1dc (UK tr) into back of each ch, turn (36 sts).

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 16dc (UK tr) BLO, (3dc [UK tr] BLO into next st) twice, 17dc (UK tr) BLO, change to Iris at end of row, turn (40 sts).

Row 3: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 18dc (UK tr) BLO, (3dc [UK tr] BLO into next st) twice, 19dc (UK tr) BLO, turn (44 sts).

Row 4: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 20dc (UK tr) BLO, (3dc [UK tr] BLO into next st) twice, 21dc (UK tr) BLO, change to Lime at end of row, turn (48 sts)

Row 5: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 47dc (UK tr) BLO, turn.

Row 6: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 47dc (UK tr) BLO, change to Iris at end of row, turn.

Row 7: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 47dc (UK tr) BLO, turn.

Row 8: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 47dc (UK tr) BLO, change to Lime at end of row, turn.



Row 9: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) BLO in same stitch, 46dc (UK tr) BLO, 2dc (UK tr) BLO in last st, turn (50 sts).

Row 10: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 49dc (UK tr) BLO, change to Iris at end of row, turn.

Row 11: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) BLO in same stitch, 48dc (UK tr) BLO, 2dc (UK tr) BLO in last st, turn (52 sts).

Row 12: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 51dc (UK tr) BLO, change to Lime at end of row, turn.

Row 13: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) BLO in same stitch, 50dc (UK tr) BLO, 2dc (UK tr) BLO in last st, turn (54 sts).

Row 14: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 53dc (UK tr) BLO, change to Iris at end of row, turn.

Row 15: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) BLO in same stitch, 52dc (UK tr) BLO, 2dc (UK tr) BLO in last st, turn (56 sts).

The hood will now measure 29cm (11¹/₂in) in width.

Add more rows if desired. Fasten off.

Finishing off

Work sc (UK dc) around the front edge in Lime, working 2sc (UK dc) into each row end. Sew in all yarn ends. Make 2 cords, each measuring 20cm (7³/₈in), in Lime, and attach to the sides.

In mesh pattern with hook size I (5.5mm)

18dc (UK tr) and 7 rows =

Work Chart in rows. The numbers on each side show the rows.

Instructions

Scarf

See Chart.

Using Hook I (5.5mm) and Black, crochet 40 ch.

Row 1: Ch 4 (counts as 1dc (UK tr) and 1ch), 1dc (UK tr) into 5th ch from hook, miss 2 ch, *(1dc [UK tr], 1 ch, 1dc [UK tr]) into the next st, miss 2 ch; rep from * to last ch, 1dc (UK tr) into last ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 4 (counts as 1dc (UK tr) and 1ch), 1dc (UK tr) into last dc (UK tr) of prev row, miss 2 sts, *(1dc [UK tr], 1 ch, 1dc [UK tr]) into next st, miss 2 sts; rep from * to end, 1dc (UK tr) into 3rd starting ch in previous row, turn.

Repeat Row 2 another 118 times or until work measures approx. 168cm.

Bow

Using Hook I (5.5mm) and Cherry, crochet 10 ch.

Row 1: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1hdc (UK tr) in 2nd ch from hook, 9hdc (UK htr), turn (10 sts).

Row 2: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1hdc (UK tr) in each st to end, turn.

Repeat Row 2 another 13 times.

Make a row of ch approx. 25cm (9³/₄in) long. Wrap around the bow 3 times and sew into place.

Finishing off

Sew the scarf together to make a loop. For the hood, fold the hood in half with the right sides facing and sew up approx. 20cm (7³/₄in). Include the stitch loops of the opposite layers with each stitch. Sew the bow onto the scodie in the desired position. Sew in all yarn ends.

Rnds 6 to 15: In Grey and Black.

Rnds 16 to 20: In White.

Changing colours

When changing colours, work the last part of the last st in the new col to make a smooth colour transition.

In rounds 6 to 15 keep the col that is not being used behind the work, and crochet around the yarn with every second dc (UK tr).

Instructions

Using Hook N/P (10mm) and White, loosely crochet 140 ch, join with a sl st to first ch.

Rnd 1: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) into each ch, sl st into the 3rd starting ch (140 sts).

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 9dc (UK tr) rfp, 10dc (UK tr) rbp, *10dc (UK tr) rfp, 10dc (UK tr) rbp, repeat from * to end, sl st into 3rd starting ch.

Rnds 3 to 5: Work as Rnd 2, changing to Grey at the end of Rnd 5.

Rnd 6: In Grey, ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 9dc (UK tr) rbp, in Black 10dc (UK tr) rfp, * in Grey, work 10dc (UK tr) rbp, in Black work 10dc (UK tr) rfp, repeat from * to end, sl st into the 3rd starting ch in Grey.

Rnds 7 to 10: As Rnd 6, changing to Black at the end of Rnd 10.

Rnds 11 to 15: In Black, ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 9dc (UK tr) rfp, in Grey 10dc (UK tr) rbp, *in Black, 10dc (UK tr) rfp, in Grey 10dc (UK tr) rbp, repeat from * to end, sl st into the 3rd starting ch in Black, changing to White at the end of Rnd 15.

Rnds 16 to 20: In White, ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 9dc (UK tr) rbp, 10dc (UK tr) rfp, *10dc (UK tr) rbp, 10dc (UK tr) rfp, repeat from * to end.

Fasten off at end of rnd 20.

Row 2: Join new yarn at point b in Chart A, ch 2 (does not count as a stitch), miss 1st dc (UK tr), 4dc (UK tr), *3dc (UK tr) in next st, 3dc (UK tr), dc (UK tr) 3tog, 3dc (UK tr); repeat from * to last 6 sts, 3dc (UK tr) in next st, 3dc (UK tr), dc (UK tr) 2tog. Fasten off.

Repeat Row 2 another 7 times working in col sequence given, ending with Row 9 in Red.



Lady in Red



Hood

With right side of scarf facing, starting at the 4th point and ending at the 9th point of the prev row as shown in the schematic, follow Chart B and continue the col sequence.

Row 10: Join yarn at point a of Chart B, ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in same st, (3dc [UK tr], dc [UK tr] 3tog, 3dc [UK tr], 3dc [UK tr] in next st) 4 times, 3dc (UK tr), dc (UK tr) 3tog, 3dc (UK tr), 2dc (UK tr) in last st (51 sts). Fasten off.

Row 11: Work as Row 10, joining the yarn at point b in Chart B.

Row 12: This row will straighten the hood. Join yarn at arrow b in prev row ch1, 1sc (UK dc) in same st, (1sc [UK dc], 2hdc [UK htr], 3dc [UK tr], 2hdc [UK htr], 2sc [UK dc]) twice (to arrow c), over the middle dip (not shown) work (sc [UK dc] 2tog) twice, 1sc (UK dc) in the middle st, (sc [UK dc] 2tog) twice, 1sc (UK dc), (1sc [UK dc], 2hdc [UK htr], 3dc [UK tr], 2hdc [UK htr], 2sc [UK dc]) twice (arrows c to d), turn (47 sts).

Row 13 (wrong side): Ch 1, 1sc (UK dc) into the last st of the prev row, 17sc (UK dc), (sc [UK dc] 2tog) twice, sc (UK dc) 3tog, (sc [UK dc] 2tog) twice, 18 sc (UK dc) (41 sts).

Fasten off. Cut the yarn, leaving it fairly long.

Finishing off

Use this yarn to sew up the back hood seam in whipstitch. Fold the hood in half with the right sides facing, including the stitch loops of the opposite layers when sewing.

Work 1 row of sc (UK dc) along the long sides of the scarf in Red (see grey area in Chart A), joining the yarn on the wrong side (see arrow c) and working 3sc (UK dc) in each point and sc (UK dc) 3tog in each dip, finish with sc (UK dc) 2tog in last 2 sts. Sew in all yarn ends.

Row 16: Work as Row 4 until there are 4 sts left before marked st, (dc [UK tr] 2tog) twice (see “How it’s done”), dc (UK tr) in marked st, (dc [UK tr] 2tog) twice, dc (UK tr) to end, turn (49 sts).

Row 17: Work as Row 5 until there are 4 sts left before marked st, (sc [UK dc] 2tog) twice (see “How it’s done”), sc (UK dc) in marked st, (sc [UK dc] 2tog) twice, sc (UK dc) to end, change to Eggplant at the end of the row, turn (45 sts).

Row 18: Work as Row 6, after the fifth dc (UK tr) ftp 2 below, work 1sc (UK tr), sc (UK tr) 2tog (mark this st as the new centre st), 1sc (UK tr), *1dc (UK tr) ftp 2 below, 3 sc (UK dc); repeat from * to end (44 sts). Fasten off Eggplant.

Row 19: Work as Row 16 (40 sts).

Row 20: Work as row 17 (36 sts).

Fold the hood in half with the right sides facing. Sew up the back hood seam in whipstitch, including the stitch loops of the opposite layers. Turn the hood right side out.

Shawl collar

Foundation Rnd: Using Hook L (8mm) and Eggplant, start at the middle of the back of the hood with right side facing, and sl st 21 along the right side of the hood, ch 14 for the middle front, then from the front edge of the left side of the hood work another 21 sl st to the middle of the back of the hood. Finish the rnd with a sl st into the 1st st (56 sts).

Rnd 1: Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), hdc (UK htr) into each sl st BLO and each ch around, join with a sl st into the 2nd starting ch.

Rnd 2: Ch 2 (does not count as a stitch), hdc (UK htr) into space before 1st hdc (UK htr) in previous rnd, *hdc (UK htr) into space before next hdc (UK htr) in previous rnd; repeat from * to end, hdc (UK htr) after last hdc (UK htr) of previous rnd, join with a sl st into 1st hdc (UK htr) of this rnd.

Rnd 3: Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), hdc (UK htr) into space after 1st hdc (UK htr) in previous rnd, *hdc (UK htr) after each hdc ((UK htr) in previous rnd, join with a sl st into 2nd starting ch.

Rnds 4 to 9: Repeat Rnds 2 to 3 three times, turn after the end of Rnd 9.

Rnd 10 (wrong side): Ch 1 (does not count as a st), sc (UK dc) in each st to end. Fasten off.

Crochet in sc (UK dc) around the front of the hood in Pine and the middle part of the shawl collar in Eggplant.

Cord stopper

Using Hook L (8mm) and Pine, ch 10, join in a ring with a sl st.

Rnd 1: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), sc (UK dc) into each ch, join with a sl st to 1st st (10 sts).

Rnd 2: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), sc (UK dc) into each st, join with a sl st to 1st st.

Rnd 3: Work as Rnd 2.

After rnd 3 cut the yarn, leaving a reasonable length, and backstitch a vertical line up the middle to create a tube down both sides.

Cord

Using Hook L (8mm) and 1 strand each of Eggplant and Pine, ch approx 110. Use a safety pin to thread this chain through the second rnd of the shawl collar. Start to the left of the 2 middle front sts and thread cord from front to back, miss 2 sts, thread the cord from back to front. Continue around in this way finishing just before the two middle sts. Use a hook to thread the ends of the cord through the tubes of the cord stopper. Cut off the ends to the desired length. Tie each end securely and trim neatly.

Rnd 2: Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), 2dc (UK tr) rfp (see “How it’s done”), *4hdc (UK htr), 2dc (UK tr) rfp; repeat from * to last 3 sts, 3hdc (UK htr), join with sl st to 2nd starting ch.

Rnd 3: Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), *2dc (UK tr) rfp, 1hdc (UK htr), hdc (UK htr) 2tog, 1hdc (UK htr), 2dc (UK tr) rfp, 4hdc (UK htr); repeat from * to last 11 sts, 2dc (UK tr) rfp, 1hdc (UK htr), hdc (UK htr) 2tog, 1hdc (UK htr), 2dc (UK tr) rfp, 3hdc (UK htr), join with sl st to 2nd starting ch (66 sts).

Rnd 4: Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), *2dc (UK tr) rfp, 3hdc (UK htr), 2dc (UK tr) rfp, 4hdc (UK htr); repeat from * to last 11 sts, (2dc (UK tr) rfp, 3hdc [UK htr]) twice, join with sl st to 2nd starting ch.

Rnd 5: Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), *2dc (UK tr) rfp, 3hdc (UK htr), 2dc (UK tr) rfp, 1hdc (UK htr), hdc (UK htr) 2tog, 1hdc (UK htr); repeat from * to last 10 sts, 2dc (UK tr) rfp, 3hdc (UK htr), 2dc (UK tr) rfp, 1hdc (UK htr), hdc (UK htr) 2tog, join with sl st to 2nd starting ch (60 sts).

Rnd 6: Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), 2dc (UK tr) rfp, *3hdc (UK htr), 2dc (UK tr) rfp; repeat from * to last 2 sts, 2hdc (UK htr), join with sl st to 2nd starting ch, changing to Coral at end of rnd.

Rnd 7: Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), 2dc (UK tr) rfp, *3hdc (UK htr), 2dc (UK tr) rfp; repeat from * to last 2 sts, 2hdc (UK htr), join with sl st to 2nd starting ch.



Coral Reef

Rnds 8 to 10: Work as Rnd 7.

Rnd 11: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), sc (UK dc) in each st to end, join with sl st to 1st st.

Rnd 12: Work as Rnd 11.

Hood

Using Storm Grey Heather, crochet the hood onto the shawl collar in bobble pattern. The rnd change for the shawl collar will be at the middle of the back of the hood.

Count to the 27th st from the middle of the back to the left. Join before this st with wrong side facing (see arrow in Chart B).

Row 1 (wrong side): Using Hook J (6mm), ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), sc (UK dc) in next st, (ch 1, miss 1 st, sc [UK dc] in next st) 13 times, (ch 1, sc [UK dc] in next st) twice, (ch 1, miss 1 st, sc [UK dc] in next st) 13 times, leave last 5 sts of previous rnd unworked, turn (57 sts).

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), cluster into 1st ch space, *ch 1, miss 1 st, cluster in next ch space; repeat from * to last st, dc (UK tr) in last st, turn.



Row 3: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), sc (UK dc) in last st of previous rnd, *ch 1, miss 1 st, sc (UK dc) in ch space; repeat from * to last 2 sts, ch 1, miss 1 st, sc (UK dc) in 3rd starting ch, turn.

Rows 4 to 22: Repeat Rows 2 and 3 a further 9 times, then Row 2 once.

Row 23: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), sc (UK dc) in last st of previous rnd, (ch 1, miss 1 st, sc [UK dc] in next ch space) 10 times, (sc [UK dc] into next ch space) 8 times; (ch 1, miss 1 st, sc [UK dc] in next ch space) 10 times, turn, change to Coral at end of row (49 sts).

Row 24: Ch 1 (does not count as stitch), sc (UK dc) in each ch and sc (UK dc) of previous rnd.

Cut the yarn, leaving it fairly long.

Finishing off

Fold hood in half with the right sides together and, with the long end, sew up the top seam of the hood using whipstitch. Include the stitch loops of the opposite layers with each stitch.

Crochet around the front edge of the hood in Strom Grey Heather. Attach yarn to the st in Coral just left of the 5 unworked middle sts.

Cord

Using Hook J (6mm) and Coral, ch 120 turn and work 1 sl st into each ch, starting in the 2nd ch from the hook. Fasten off.

Thread the cord in and out of the dc (UK tr) around the front of the hood. Make a pompom of 5.5cm (2¼in) diameter using all three yarns (see “How it’s done”) and sew to the tip of the hood. Sew in all yarn ends.

Row 3: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc) in each st to end, turn.

Row 4: Work as Row 2. Fasten off.

With wrong side of completed strip facing, and the starting ch at the top, join Turquoise to the first ch.

Row 1: Ch 1 (counts as a stitch), work 1sc (UK dc) into each ch to the end, turn (39 sts).

Complete as for first half of strip from Row 2 to 4.

Join the side pieces to the middle strip as shown in the schematic. The diagram shows the left side piece and middle strip, and the broken line represents the increases along the diagonal. Place the left side piece on the middle strip with the wrong sides facing and the stitch loops lined up. Slip st the two pieces together with Ocean Color, stitch by stitch, inserting the hook through from the side piece. Slip st the right side piece of the hood onto the other side of the strip. Again, insert the hook from the side piece. Front hood edge: With right side facing, join Ocean Color to the first st at the bottom of the right side of the hood, ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc) in corner of hood, *ch 1, 1sc (UK dc); repeat from * evenly around the hood to the other corner.

Bottom hood edge: With right side facing, join Turquoise to the first st at the bottom of the left side of the hood, ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), work 22sc (UK dc) to middle back of hood, work 22 sc (UK dc) from middle back of hood to right side of the hood.

These 44 sts will be joined to the scarf later on.

Scarf

See Chart B.

Using hook L (8mm) and Ocean Color, ch 13.

Row 1: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in 4th ch from hook, 1dc (UK tr) in each ch to end, turn (14 sts).

Row 2: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc) in each st to end, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in next st, (1dc [UK tr] rfp 2 below, 2dc [UK tr]) 4 times, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc) in each st to end, turn.

Repeat Rows 3 and 4 until work measures approx 143cm (56¹/₄in), ending with a Row 3.

Do not cut the yarn, crochet around the scarf by working 2sc (UK dc) into the same stitch at the corners, work 1 ch, 1sc (UK dc) down the long side, working the sc (dc) around the edge dc (UK tr) or edge ch, and work 1sc (UK dc) into each st on the short sides.

Finishing off

Lay the scarf down horizontally. Measure approx. 30cm (11³/₄in) from the right edge and mark. Count 44 stitches from this mark, and make another mark.

Place the marked scarf sts at the edges of the hood, and sew the two pieces together in Ocean Color.

NOTE

The short end of the scarf will be on the front when you wear it, and the longer one down the back. If you want to wind the longer scarf end around your neck, just continue crocheting until it is the length you desire.

PATTERN

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Scarf pattern

Work Chart A in rows. The numbers on both sides indicate the beg of the row. Work rows 1 to 3 once, then repeat rows 4 to 9 increasing 1 st at each end of row 7 as shown. Work rows 4 and 5, (marked in grey in the pattern) in turn in *Pink, Apple Green, Royal, repeat from *. Work all other rows in Suede. When changing colours, finish the last st in the row in the next col.

Hood pattern

Work Chart C in rows. The numbers on the sides indicate the beginning of the row. Repeat rows 1 to 10. The sc (UK dc) of the previous row are shown below the first row. Work rows 1, 3 and 7, (marked grey in the pattern) on the right side in turn in *Royal, Pink, Apple Green, Pink, repeat from *. Work all other rows in Suede.

Instructions

Scarf

See Chart A. Work in given col sequence.

Using Hook J (6mm) and Suede, ch 8.

Row 1: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 2dc (UK tr) in 4th ch from hook, (1dc [UK tr], 2dc [UK tr] in next st) 3 times, 1dc (UK tr) in last st, turn (13 sts).

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), (2dc [UK tr], 2dc [UK tr] in next st, 3dc [UK tr]) twice, turn (15 sts).

Row 3: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), (1sc [UK dc], ch 1, miss 1 st) 7 times, 1sc (UK dc) in last st, change col at end of row, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc), *1sc (UK dc), ch 1, miss 1 st; rep from * to last 2 sts, 2sc (UK dc), turn.

Row 5: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), *1sc (UK dc), ch 1, miss 1 st; repeat from * to last st, 1sc (UK dc) in last st, change col at end of row, turn.

Row 6: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc), *1sc (UK dc), ch 1, miss 1 st; rep from * to last 2 sts, 2sc (UK dc), turn.

Row 7: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in same st, 1dc (UK tr) in each st to the last 2 sts, 2dc (UK tr) in next st, 1dc (UK tr), turn (17 sts).

Row 8: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in each st to end, turn.





Mexican Theme



Row 9: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), *1sc (UK dc), ch 1, miss 1 st; repeat from * to last st, 1sc (UK dc) in last st, change col at end of row, turn.

Repeat rows 4 to 9 in col sequence given another 6 times, then rows 4 to 7 once (31 sts).

Work should measure approx 49cm (19¹/₂in).

Cut yarn and set work aside.

Work the right side of the scarf in the same way. Join the two together in Row 50 as shown in Chart B. The chart only shows the outer sts of the two parts (1 = left piece, 2 = right piece). The yarn end of the left piece of the scarf is marked by a *. Row 50: Work as Row 8 to the end of the right piece of the scarf, ch 11 after the last dc (UK tr), then continue working as Row 8 over the left piece of the scarf (73 sts).

Row 51: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc) in each stitch and ch to end, turn.

Row 52: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc) in each stitch to end, turn.

Row 53: Work as Row 52, changing col at end of row for start of hood pattern.

Continue in the hood pattern. See Chart C. Work in given col sequence.

Row 1: Ch 2 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in same st, *miss 2 sts, 3dc (UK tr) in next st; repeat from * to last 3 sts, miss 2 sts, 2dc (UK tr) in last st. Fasten off.

Row 2: With right side facing, join Suede to first st, ch 2 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in same st, *miss 2 sts, (1dc [UK tr], ch 1, 1dc [UK tr]) in next st; repeat from * to last 3 sts, miss 2 sts, 2dc (UK tr) in last st. Fasten off.

Row 3: With right side facing, join relevant col to first st, ch 2 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in same st, *miss 2 sts, (1dc [UK tr], ch 1, 1dc [UK tr]) in next st; repeat from * to last 3 sts, miss 2 sts, 2dc (UK tr) in last st. Fasten off.

Row 4: With right side facing, join Suede to first st, ch 2 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in each st and ch to end, turn.

Row 5: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in each st to end, turn.

Row 6: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1sc (UK dc) in each st to end. Fasten off.

Row 7: With right side facing, join relevant col to first st, ch 2 (counts as a stitch), *ch 1, miss 1 st, cluster in next st; rep from * to last 2 sts, ch 1, miss 1st, 1dc (UK tr) in last st. Fasten off.

Rows 8 to 10: Work as Rows 4 to 6.

Repeat Rows 1 to 10 once, then Row 1 once working in given col sequence, ending with Apple Green.

Next row: With right side facing, join Suede to first st, ch 2 (counts as a stitch), 1dc (UK tr) in each st to end. Fasten off.

Hood height should be approx. 30cm(11³/₄in). Cut the yarn, leaving it fairly long.

Finishing off

Fold hood in half with the right sides together and, with the long end, sew up the top seam of the hood using whipstitch. Include the stitch loops of the opposite layers with each stitch.



Work 1 row of crab stitch (see “How it’s done”) in Suede around the scarf pieces and hood, starting at the beginning of the scarf ends. Tighten the ends of the scarves by threading the yarn through the first row of sts, and secure the ends well.





Make 3 tassels in Suede with Pink ties (see “How it’s done”). Sew the tassels onto the ends of the scarves and the tip of the hood.

Fold the tip of the hat downwards slightly to form a triangle. Sew the tip in Suede, working between the two last rows of dc (UK tr) on the underside. Sew in all yarn ends.









CHAIN STITCHES (CASTING ON)




Before you start crocheting, make a loop.




1 Hold the yarn between your little and ring fingers, and thread it behind your middle finger. Now wind the yarn around your index finger and thumb. The end of the yarn will be in your hand.




2 Now pick up the hook and draw the yarn from your index finger through the loop around your thumb. Then take your thumb out of the loop.



3 Push your thumb under the end of the yarn that you are holding in your middle, ring and little fingers.




4 Then spread your thumb and index finger, and tighten the starting loop on the hook. You should be able to move it on the hook, but it must not slide off.



5 In order to cast on more chains, use the hook to draw the yarn through the loop on your index finger and through the loop on your thumb. This creates a chain, also known as chain stitch or ch.

JOINING CHAIN STITCHES IN A RING




To join a row of chain stitches in a ring, insert the hook in the first chain, draw the yarn through and pull it through the chain and the loop on the hook.


STITCH LOOPS

Each crocheted stitch creates a loop with yarn at the front and behind it. The instructions contain three different ways of inserting the hook in the stitches, all of which create different effects.


- 1 Through both of the loops of the stitch
- 2 Through the front loop of the stitch
- 3 Through the back loop of the stitch



1 As a general rule, unless the instructions say otherwise, work through both loops of the stitch.




2 If you work through the front loop only, you can create textured stitches such as bobbles or frills.




3 If you work through the back loop only, it creates a little ridge (made by the front loops of the stitches) that not only looks attractive but can also help when sewing together.

SLIP STITCHES




Insert the hook in the next stitch and place the yarn around the hook. Draw the yarn through both of the loops on the hook.

CRAB STITCH




1 Insert the hook from front to back through the sc (UK dc) in the previous row on the right. The loop on the hook will be flat against the crocheting. Now draw the yarn through...




2 ... and pull both loops upwards so the stitch isn't too tight. The loops will be close together on the hook. Draw the yarn through both loops.



1 To crochet a dc (UK tr), place the yarn around the hook and insert the hook in the next stitch of the previous row. Draw the yarn through the stitch. You will now have 3 loops on the hook.



DOUBLE CROCHET (UK TREBLE) ROUND BACK POST




1 To crochet a double crochet (UK treble) round the back post, place the yarn around the hook and insert it from back to front to back around the double crochet (UK treble) in the previous row. Yarn over and draw through.



2 You will have 3 loops on the hook. Yarn over hook and draw through 2 of the 3 loops. Yarn over hook and draw yarn through the remaining loops.


CHANGING COLOURS

If you are working to a stripy pattern and want to change colours, work the first part of the last sc (UK dc) in the previous round in the old colour so you have 2 loops on the hook. Finish these loops in the new colour. The last sc (UK dc) will have been worked in the old colour, but the loop on the hook will now be in the new colour.




INCREASE STITCHES

If you want to increase individual stitches, then all you do is work a second stitch of the same type into the same place. You can increase any kind of stitch this way, and you can increase in rounds or rows. The number of stitches increases by 1 each time.




DECREASE STITCHES

Decrease two single crochet (UK double crochet) together




1 If you want to decrease (dec) 2 single (UK double) crochet together, draw 1 loop through and onto the hook in each of the 2 stitches.




2 Then place the yarn over the hook again and draw it through all of the loops on the hook. This reduces the number of stitches by 1.

Decreasing double crochet (UK treble)




You can decrease the number of double crochet (UK treble) simply by leaving them out. Instead of working a double crochet (UK treble) into each stitch, simply miss one.

Decrease two double crochet (UK trebles) together




Work half of the first double crochet (UK treble) in the first stitch. You will have 2 loops on the hook. Then work half of another double crochet (UK treble) in the second stitch. You will have 3 loops on the hook. Now place the yarn over the hook and draw through all 3 loops. This reduces the number of stitches by 1.

FINISHING OFF




1 Once you have finished your work, cut the yarn leaving a length of approx. 10cm (4in) after the last stitch. Wrap the yarn around the hook and draw it all the way through the last stitch.



2 Pull the end of the yarn – and you have a firm knot.


SEWING UP

Backstitch




Backstitch is worked close to the outer edge. Place the crocheted pieces together neatly, and if necessary secure them with pins. Now insert the needle through the back of the work to the front, and insert it from the front of the work to the back again. Repeat.

Whipstitch




Place the crocheted pieces together neatly. Now insert the needle through both items from the back through to the front, then from the front to the back through the next stitch. Repeat.


POMPOMS




1 Cut out two cardboard discs of the diameter of the required pompom, and cut a V into the side of each to make an opening. Place the two discs together.




2 Now wind the yarn around both discs until you have filled the hole in the middle. It's easy to guide the needle through the opening cut made earlier.



3 Cut around the edges of the yarn between the cardboard discs.




4 Take a piece of yarn, place it in the middle of the cardboard discs and knot it tightly.




5 You can now remove the cardboard discs, and trim the pompom into a nice round shape.


TASSELS



1 Cut a rectangle out of cardboard. Make it roughly as wide as you want the tassel to be long. Wrap yarn evenly around the cardboard. The more you wind, the thicker the tassel will be.




2 Cut the yarn. Thread a darning needle with a fairly long piece of yarn. Feed it under the yarns along the edge of the cardboard, and secure it with a knot. Now you can cut through the bundle of yarn at the bottom.



3 Bind the bundle at the top. Use another long thread for this. Shape one end into a loop and hold it on the yarn bundle. Wind the remainder of the yarn firmly around the bundle. The end of the loop should peep out at the top, the loop at the bottom. Make a few winds, then feed the yarn through the loop, take hold of both ends and pull. Trim any straggly ends.

FRINGES



Cut a rectangle 2cm ($\frac{3}{4}$ in) longer than the desired fringes out of cardboard. Wrap yarn evenly and not too tightly around the cardboard. Cut open the threads at the bottom, and carefully remove the doubled threads from the cardboard. Insert a suitable crochet hook in the end of the crocheted items. Hook it around the middle of the doubled thread, and draw through the item to make a loop. Draw the ends of the thread through this loop, and carefully tighten. When you have finished, trim all the fringes to the same length.

⦿ = (dc (UK tr), ch 1, dc [UK tr]) into same stitch

⦿ = 2dc (UK tr) into same stitch

⋈ = decrease: dc (UK tr) 2tog

⦿ = 3 dc (UK tr) into same stitch

⋈ = decrease: dc (UK tr) 3tog

⦿ = cluster: 3 dc (UK tr) together in same stitch

⦿ = dc (UK tr) rfp (round front post):

⦿ yoh, work hook from front to back to front around the next dc (UK tr) so the neck of the dc (UK tr) is in front of the hook, yoh, draw loop through, complete dc (UK tr) as normal. The dc (UK tr) will be slightly rounded.

= dc (UK tr) rbp (round back post): yoh, work hook from back to front to back around the next dc (UK tr) so the neck of the dc (UK tr) is behind the hook, yoh, draw loop through, complete dc (UK tr) as normal. The dc (UK tr) will be slightly rounded.


NOTE

If symbols are joined at the bottom, this means the stitches are worked into the same stitch.

If the symbols are joined at the top, it means they are decreased together. Work each stitch as far as the last loop, then yoh and draw through all the remaining loops together.


