## Dainty Shells Scarf

Feminine in a plush chenille yarn, this scarf showcases the pretty shell stitch. Front post and back post double crochet adds a subtle depth and definition to the overall pattern, and the shell stitch appears again in the edging.



## DAINTY SHELLS SCARF

### YARN

Medium-weight cotton/rayon chenille yarn  
5.25 oz (150 g)/360 yd (330 m)

### HOOK

Size 8/H (5 mm)

### STITCHES USED

Double crochet  
Front post double crochet  
Back post double crochet

### GAUGE


3 1/2 shell clusters = 4" (10 cm) on 8/H hook

### NOTION

Tapestry needle

### FINISHED SIZE

5" (13 cm) wide and 60" (152 cm) long



Front post and back post double crochet stitches form ridges between shells.

## SCARF

First half of scarf is worked first, then second half is picked up from beg of first half and worked out to the end.

**Foundation row:** Ch 26. Starting in fifth ch from hook, work [2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc] in same ch (shell cluster), \* sk 2 ch, work 1 dc in next ch, sk 2 ch, work [2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc] in next ch. Rep from \* across, 1 dc in last ch, ch 3, turn.

**Row 1:** \* Work [2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc] in ch-1 sp, FPdc in dc, rep from \* across, [2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc] in ch-1 sp, dc in top of tch, ch 3, turn.

**Row 2:** \* Work [2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc] in ch-1 sp, BPdc in dc, rep from \* across, [2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc] in ch-1 sp, dc in top of tch, ch 3, turn.

Rep rows 1 and 2 for 28" (71 cm) from beg, end row 2. Work edging as foll:

## EDGING

**Row 1:** \* Work [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in ch-1 sp, FPdc in dc, rep from \* across, [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in ch-1 sp, dc in top of tch, ch 3, turn.



Both ends of the scarf are finished with scalloped edging.

**Row 2:** \* Work [4 dc, ch 2, 4 dc] in ch-2 sp, BPdc in dc, rep from \* across, [4 dc, ch 2, 4 dc] in ch-2 sp, dc in top of tch, ch 3, turn.

**Row 3:** \* Work [4 dc, ch 2, 4 dc] in ch-2 sp, FPdc in dc, rep from \* across, [4 dc, ch 2, 4 dc] in ch-2 sp, dc in top of tch, ch 3, turn. Fasten off.

## SECOND HALF OF SCARF

Join yarn in right corner of beg of scarf, ch 3.

**Foundation row:** Work [2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc] in same ch as cluster, \* sk 2 ch, work 1 dc in same ch as dc, sk 2 ch, work [2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc] in same ch as cluster. Rep from \* across, 1 dc in same ch as last dc, ch 3, turn.

Cont with row 1 of scarf, rep scarf and edging as for first half. Fasten off.

## **FINISHING**

Weave in ends using tapestry needle.

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# Raspberry Puff Scarf

A soft, lacy, puff-stitch pattern in a beautifully draping ribbon yarn creates a scarf for any season. Make it bright and bold, or in a soft shade for a vintage look. A trellis shell stitch pattern finishes the ends.



## RASPBERRY PUFF SCARF

### **YARN**

Medium-weight rayon ribbon  
5.25 oz (150 g)/225 yd (207 m)

### **HOOK**

Size 8/H (5 mm)

### **STITCHES USED**

Single crochet  
Double crochet  
Puff stitch

### **GAUGE**


3 puff sts = 4" (10 cm) on 8/H hook

### **NOTION**

Tapestry needle

### **FINISHED SIZE**

5" (13 cm) wide and 46" (117 cm) long



Rayon ribbon yarn is hooked in double-crochet clusters called puff stitches.

## SCARF

Scarf is worked lengthwise.

**Foundation row:** Ch 129. Starting in fourth ch from hook, work 1 dc, \* ch 2, sk next ch, 1 sc in next ch, ch 2, sk next ch, 1 dc in each of next 3 ch, rep from \* across, 1 dc in each of last 2 ch, ch 3 (counts as dc now and throughout), turn.

**Row 1:** Sk first st, 1 dc in next st, \* ch 3, 1 dc in first dc of 3-dc cluster, 1 puff st in next dc, 1 dc in next dc, rep from \* across, ch 3, 1 dc in next dc, 1 dc in top of tch, ch 3, turn.

**Row 2:** Sk first st, 1 dc in next st, \* ch 2, 1 sc in ch-3 sp, ch 2, 1 dc in next dc, 1 dc in puff st, 1 dc in next dc, rep from \* across, ch 2, 1 sc in ch-3 sp, ch 2, 1 dc in next dc, 1 dc in top of tch, ch 3, turn.

Rep rows 1 and 2 four times more (5 puff st rows in all), end row 2, do not fasten off. Ch 1, turn to work along end of scarf, work edging as foll:



Main scarf is worked side to side. Several rows of lacy openwork are added at each end.

## EDGING

**Foundation row:** Work 25 sc across end of scarf, ch 3, turn.

**Row 1:** Work 2 dc in first st, sk 2 sts, 1 sc in next st, ch 6, sk 5 sts, 1 sc in next st, sk 2 sts, 5 dc in next sc (shell made), sk 2 sts, 1 sc in next sc, ch 6, sk 5 sts, 1 sc in next st, ch 2, sk 2 sts, 3 dc in last st, ch 1, turn.

**Row 2:** Work 1 sc in first st, ch 5, 1 sc in ch-5 sp, ch 5, 1 sc in third dc of shell, ch 5, 1 sc in ch-5 sp, ch 5, 1 sc in top of tch, ch 5, turn.

**Row 3:** Work \*1 sc in ch-5 sp, 5 dc in next st, 1 sc in ch-5 sp, ch 5, 1 sc in ch-5 sp, 5 dc in next st, 1 sc in ch-5 sp, ch 2, 1 dc in top of tch, ch 1, turn.

**Row 4:** Work 1 sc in first st, ch 5, 1 sc in third dc of shell, ch 5, 1 sc in ch-5 sp, ch 5, 1 sc in third dc of shell, ch 5, 1 sc in third ch of tch, ch 3, turn.

**Row 5:** Work 2 dc in first st, 1 sc in ch-5 sp, ch 5, 1 sc in ch-5 sp, 5 dc in next st, 1 sc in ch-5 sp, ch 5, 1 sc in ch-5 sp, 3 dc in top of tch, ch 1, turn.

Rep rows 2–5 once more, then rep rows 2–3, fasten off.

Work other end of scarf to correspond.

## FINISHING


Weave in ends using tapestry needle.

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# Pico Mesh Scarf

Pamper yourself with a silk-blend scarf in an elegant and easy picot mesh stitch. The scarf is soft, luxurious, and sophisticated. For a crisper, more casual look, try this scarf in a shiny cotton/rayon blend.



Luxurious silk/wool blend yarn hooked in a dainty picot mesh pattern.

## PICOT MESH SCARF

### YARN

Medium-weight silk/wool blend yarn

3.5 oz (100 g)/220 yd (202 m)

### HOOK

Size 8/H (5 mm)

### STITCHES USED

Single crochet

Double/triple crochet

### GAUGE

3 1/2 clusters = 4" (10 cm) on 8/H hook

### NOTION

Tapestry needle

### FINISHED SIZE

5" (13 cm) wide and 50" (127 cm) long

## SCARF

**Foundation row:** Ch 32. Work 1 sc in second ch from hook\* [ch 4, 1 sc in third ch from hook (picot made)] twice, ch 1, sk 4 chs, 1 sc in next ch, rep from \* across (6 ch-4 sps), ch 9 (counts as 1 dc, ch 4), turn.

**Row 1:** Work 1 sc in third ch from hook, ch 1, 1 sc in center of 2 picots, \* [ch 4, 1 sc in 3rd ch from hook] twice, ch 1, 1 sc between 2 picots, rep from \* across, ch 4, 1 sc in 3rd ch from hook, 1 dtr in last sc, ch 1, turn.

**Row 2:** Work 1 sc in first dtr, \* [ch 4, 1 sc in third ch from hook] twice, ch 1, 1 sc between 2 picots, rep from \* across, 1 sc in fifth ch of beg ch 9.

Rep rows 1 and 2 for 50" (127 cm) end row 2, fasten off.

Join yarn in the right-hand corner of other end of scarf, ch 9, work rows 1 and 2 once only, as foll:

**Row 1:** Work 1 sc in third ch from hook, ch 1, 1 sc in next sp, \* [ch 4, 1 sc in third ch from hook] twice, ch 1, 1 sc in next sp, rep from \* across, ch 4, 1 sc in third ch from hook, ch 1, 1 dtr in last st, ch 1, turn.

**Row 2:** Work 1 sc in first dtr, \* [ch 4, 1 sc in third ch from hook] twice, ch 1, 1 sc between 2 picots, rep from \* across, 1 sc in the fifth ch of beg ch 9. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends using tapestry needle.

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# Garden Trellis Scarf

The unusual stitch in this scarf looks like a trellis of flowers. The effect is achieved by combining clusters of triple crochet with openwork.



## GARDEN TRELLIS SCARF

### **YARN**

Medium-weight cotton/rayon blend bouclé yarn

8 oz (225 g)/585 yd (538 m)

### **HOOK**

Size 8/H (5 mm)

### **STITCHES USED**

Single crochet

Double crochet

Triple crochet

Triple crochet 2 together

Double triple crochet

### **GAUGE**


2 clusters = 4" (10 cm) on 8/H hook

### **NOTION**

Tapestry needle

### **FINISHED SIZE**

6" (15 cm) wide and 64" (162 cm) long



Cotton/rayon bouclé yarn crocheted in alternating rows of flowers and lattice.

## SCARF

**Foundation row:** Ch 35. Starting in eighth ch from hook, work 1 dc, \* ch 2, sk 2 ch, 1 dc into next ch, rep from \* (10 ch-2 sps), ch 1, turn.

**Row 1:** Work 1 sc in first dc, \* ch 9, sk 1 dc, [1 sc, ch 4, 1 tr2tog] in next dc, sk 1 dc, [1 tr2tog, ch 4, 1 sc] in next dc, rep from \* once, ch 9, sk 1 dc, 1 sc in third ch of tch (3 ch-9 loops, 2 clusters), ch 10 (counts as dtr, ch 4), turn.

**Row 2:** Work 1 sc in first ch-9 sp, \* ch 4, [1 tr2tog, ch 4, 1 Sl st, ch 4, 1 tr2tog] in top of next tr2tog, ch 4, 1 sc in next ch-9 sp, rep from \* once, ch 4, 1 dtr in last sc, (6 ch-4 lps, 2 clusters), ch 1, turn.

**Row 3:** Work 1 sc in first dtr, \* ch 5, 1 sc in top of next tr2tog, rep from \* across, ch 5, 1 sc in sixth ch of tch, (5 ch-5 sp), ch 5, (counts as 1 dc, ch 2), turn.

**Row 4:** Work 1 dc in next ch-5 sp, ch 2, 1 dc in next sc, \*ch 2, 1 dc in next ch-5 sp, ch 2, 1 dc in next sc, rep from \* across (10 ch-2 sps), ch 1, turn.

Rep rows 1–4 for 62" from beg, end row 4. Work edging as foll:



Shell edging finishes the scarf ends.

## EDGING

**Row 1:** Sk first dc, work 5 dc in next dc, 1 sc in next dc, \* 5 dc in next dc, 1 sc in next dc, rep from \* across (5 shells), fasten off.

Join yarn in right-hand corner at other end of scarf, ch 1, rep row 1 of edging.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends using tapestry needle.



# Peaches and Cream Scarf

This summery peaches-and-cream scarf gets its airy texture from a lofty yarn and a shell-stitch pattern.



## PEACHES AND CREAM SCARF

### **YARN**

Lightweight cotton/rayon blend yarn

4 oz (113 g)/220 yd (202 m)

### **HOOK**

Size 6/G (4.5 mm)

### **STITCHES USED**

Single crochet

Double crochet

Triple crochet

Triple crochet 3 together

### **GAUGE**


1 tr3tog cluster = 2" (10 cm) on 6/G hook

### **NOTION**

Tapestry needle

### **FINISHED SIZE**

5" (13 cm) wide and 48" (122 cm) long



Leaf-shaped clusters are worked in both directions from a center foundation row.

## SCARF

First half of scarf is worked first, then second half is picked up from beg of first half and worked out to the end.

**Foundation row:** Ch 22. Starting in fifth ch from hook, work [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in ch, ch 4, sk 7 ch, [1 dc, ch 4, 1 dc] in next ch, ch 4, sk 7 ch, [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in next ch, 1 dc in last ch, ch 3 (counts as dc now and throughout), turn.

**Row 1:** Work [3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc] in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk 1 ch-4 sp, [1 tr3 tog, ch 3] 3 times in next ch-4 sp, 1 tr3tog in same sp, ch 2, sk 1 ch-4 sp, [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in next ch-2 sp, 1 dc in top of tch, ch 3, turn.

**Row 2:** Work [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk 1 ch-2 sp, [2 sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] twice, 2 sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sk 1 ch-2 sp [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in last ch-2 sp, 1 dc in top of tch, ch 3, turn.

**Row 3:** Work [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in next ch-2 sp, ch 4, sk 1 ch-3 sp, 2 sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, 2 sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, sk 1 ch-3 sp, [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in last ch-2 sp, 1 dc in top of tch, ch 3, turn.

**Row 4:** Work [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in next ch-2 sp, ch 4, sk 1 ch-3 sp, [1 dc, ch 4, 1 dc] in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, sk 1 ch-3 sp, [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in next ch-2 sp, 1 dc in top of tch, ch 3, turn.

Rep rows 1–4 for 24" (61 cm) from beg, fasten off.



Strands of cotton and rayon twisted together give the yarn a two-tone tweed look.

## SECOND HALF OF SCARF

Join yarn in right corner of beg of scarf, ch 3.

**Foundation row:** Work [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in same ch as dc cluster, ch 4, sk 7 ch, [1 dc, ch 4, 1 dc] in same ch as dcs, ch 4, sk 7 ch, [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in same ch as dc cluster, sk 1 ch, 1 dc in same ch as dc.

Rep rows 1–4 for 24" (61 cm) from beg, fasten off.

## **FINISHING**

Weave in ends using tapestry needle.

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## Blooming Ascot

Step into spring with this soft, feminine ascot. A slit at one end of the scarf allows you to pull the other end through for an adjustable fit, and a flower adds a decorative touch.



## BLOOMING ASCOT

### YARN

Medium-weight cotton/nylon blend yarn

3.5 oz (100 g)/194 yd (180 m)

### HOOK

Size 8/H (5 mm)

### STITCHES USED

Single crochet

Double crochet

### GAUGE

12 1/2 dc = 4" (10 cm) on 8/H hook

### NOTION

Tapestry needle

### FINISHED SIZE

7" (18 cm) wide and 44" (112 cm) long



Scarf is alternating rows of single and double crochet with feminine picot edging at the ends.

## SCARF

**Foundation row:** Ch 22. Starting in second ch from hook, work 1 sc in each ch across (21 sc), ch 3 (counts as dc now and throughout), turn.

**Row 1:** Sk first st, work 1 dc in each of next 19 sts, 1 dc in tch (21 dc), ch 1 (counts as sc now and throughout), turn.

**Row 2:** Sk first st, work 1 sc in each of next 19 sts, 1 sc in top of tch (21 sc), ch 3, turn.

Rep rows 1 and 2 for 33" (84 cm) from beg.

Form opening as foll:

**Next row:** Beg with row 1, work 1 dc in each of next 9 sts, ch 1, turn. Cont to rep rows 1 and 2 over these 10 sts for 2" (5 cm), end row 2, fasten off.

Sk 1 st at center of scarf at opening edge, rejoin yarn, ch 3. Beg with row 1, work 1 dc in each of 9 rem sts. Cont to rep rows 1 and 2 over these 10 sts for 2" (5 cm), end at outside edge and with row 2. Ch 3, turn, work 10 dc (first opening half), ch 1, 10 dc across rem sts (second opening half).

Rep rows 1 and 2 across all 21 sts for 40" (102 cm) from beg, end row 2. Ch 3, turn, work edging as foll:

## EDGING

**Row 1:** Work 2 dc in same st as tch, \* sk 4 st, [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in next st (shell made); rep from \* across, sk 4 sc, 3 dc in top of tch, ch 2, turn.

**Row 2:** Work 2 dc in same st as tch, \* ch 1, [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc] in ch-2 sp of next shell; rep from \* across, ch 1, 3 dc in top of tch, ch 4, turn.

**Row 3:** Work 1 Sl st in fourth ch from hook, 1 sc in same st as tch, \* 3 dc in ch-1 sp, [1 sc, ch 4, Sl st in fourth ch from hook, 1 sc] in ch-2 sp of next shell (picot group made). Rep from \* once, 3 dc in ch-1 sp, 1 sc in top of tch, ch 4, Sl st in fourth ch from hook, Sl st in last sc worked, ch 5, turn.

**Row 4:** \* Work [2 dc, ch 4, Sl st in fourth ch from hook, 2 dc] in center dc of 3-dc group, rep from \* across, ch 5, sl st in last st, fasten off.

Work other end of scarf to correspond.



Crocheted flower is sewn onto the scarf next to the opening.

## FLOWER

**Foundation rnd:** Ch 1 (center), ch 3 (counts as dc), work 11 dc in beg ch, join with Sl st to top of beg ch 3 (12 dc).

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, work [1 sc, ch 1, 1 sc] in same st as ch 1, \* ch 1, [1 sc, ch 1, 1 sc] in FL of next st; rep from \* around, ch 1, join with Sl st in both loops of first sc (center petals made).

**Rnd 2:** Holding center petals forward and working in BL of foundation rnd, [1 sc, ch 2, 1 dc, 1 tr, ch 3, Sl st in first ch of ch-3, 1 tr, 1 dc, ch 2] in each st around, fasten off.

## FINISHING

1. With the opening end of the scarf pointing toward you, position flower on the left side of the opening, centering it on the opening. Using tapestry needle and the loose end from beg of flower, sew flower securely onto scarf.
2. Weave in ends using tapestry needle.

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## The Dazzler

A cross-hatch stitch shows off the wonderful colors in this hand-dyed yarn. The unusual pattern, the elegant drape, and a touch of glitz make this scarf right for a night out.



## THE DAZZLER

### YARN

Lightweight rayon/metallic yarn

8 oz (227 g)/550 yd (506 m)

### HOOK

Size 6/G (4.5 mm)

### STITCHES USED

Single crochet

Double crochet

### GAUGE

4 clusters = 4" (10 cm) on 6/G hook

### NOTION

Tapestry needle

### FINISHED SIZE

6" (15 cm) wide and 50" (127 cm) long

## SCARF

**Foundation row:** Ch 50. Starting in fourth ch from hook, work 2 dc in ch, sk 3 ch, 1 sc in next ch, \* ch 3, dc in each of next 3 ch, sk 3 ch, sc in next ch, rep from \* across, turn.

**Row 1:** Ch 3, 2 dc in first st \* sk next 3 dc [1 sc, ch 3, 3 dc] in next ch-3 sp, sk next st, rep from \* across, sk last 2 sts, sc in top of tch.

Rep row 1 for 50" (127 cm) from beg.

## FINISHING

1. To create a tassel, cut two 18" (46 cm) pieces of yarn and set aside to use for ties. Cut eight 12" (30.5 cm) pieces of yarn; using one of the 18" pieces, tie the 12" pieces together in center and fold in half. Leave the 18" piece to tie tassel to scarf. Wrap the second 18" piece around tassel about 1/2" (1.25 cm) down from top. Do not cut; the ends will become part of tassel. Rep until 14 tassels are completed (7 for each end of scarf). Using tapestry needle

and yarn tied at center of tassel, attach one tassel to each ch-3 sp at end of scarf.

**2.** Weave in ends using tapestry needle.



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# Luxury Scarf

Take the well-loved chevron stitch, add a gorgeous yarn with standout colors, and wrap yourself in this luxuriously long, extra-wide scarf. This scarf features a one-row repeat, so it is easy to crochet.



## LUXURY SCARF

### YARN

Superfine sock yarn, wool/nylon blend

10 oz (300 g)/1,377 yd (1,239 m)

### HOOKS

Size G-6 (4 mm) or size to obtain correct gauge

### STITCHES

Chain stitch

Slip stitch

Double crochet

### GAUGE

14 sts (one patt repeat) = 3" (7.5 cm) in chevron pattern

Take time to check gauge.

### NOTIONS/SUPPLIES

Tapestry needle

### SIZE

17 1/2" x 60" (44.5 x 152.5 cm)

## SCARF

*Note: Dc3tog: (yo, insert hook in next st, yo, draw yarn through st, yo, draw yarn through 2 loops on hook) 3 times, yo, draw yarn through 4 loops on hook.*

Ch 87.

Foundation row: 2 dc in 3rd ch from hook, \*1 dc in each of the next 3 ch, (dc3tog in next 3 ch) 2 times, 1 dc in each of the next 3 ch 3 dc in each of next 2 ch; rep from \* 4 times more, 1 dc in each of the next 3 ch, (dc3tog in next 3 ch) 2 times, 1 dc in each of next 3 ch, 3 dc in last ch, turn.

Row 1: Ch 3 (counts as first dc), 2 dc in the first dc, \*1 dc in each of the next 3 dc, (dc3tog in next 3 dc) 2 times, 1 dc in each of the next 3 dc, 3 dc in each of next 2 dc; rep from \* 4 times more, 1 dc in each of the next 3 ch, (dc3tog in next 3 sts) 2 times, 1 dc in each of the next 3 ch, 3 dc in top of tch, turn.

Rep Row 1 until scarf measures 60" (152.5 cm) from beg. End off.

## **FINISHING**

Weave in loose ends.

To block, lay scarf on a towel, folded in half. Spritz with water, pat into shape, and allow to dry.



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


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
