Crochet hook and yarn ready? So let's get started!

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You are allowed:

- Sell ready made shawls out of purchased pattern, in a quantity up to 10 pcs. a year (as a private person),
providing the name and author of the shawl "Melody by Julita Janicka". Non commercial use only.
 - Publish photos of ready made shawls, also tagged "Melody by Julita Janicka".

Cooperation: Lukasz Janicki.

- Yarn: 1600 m for a medium-sized shawl, 2000 m for a large one.
- Crochet hook: 3 mm (choose the right one for you).

My shawl:

- Colors: light peach, peach, rose, crocus, capri, dark blue, navy blue.
- Yarn: cotton + acrylic, 3ply, 2000 m. Size after blocking: 200 x 70 cm.
- Crochet hook: 3 mm.



Pattern notes:

- It is recommended to print the pattern in color and in horizontal orientation.
- The pattern contains two versions of the shawl, choose the one you like best. The difference is in rows 4/26.
- Start the shawl by making 5 chain stitches locked in a circle.
- Each row is marked with a different color and has numbering. Turn your work around after each row.
- The right side of the shawl are the odd rows.
- Pink arrows in the chart indicate where a given element is made.
- The amount of yarn over puff/double crochet to make popcorns is marked in the chart with a red number for the entire row.
- The charts show half of the shawl from the edge to the top, the other part is to be made in mirror reflection from the top to the edge. The top is marked with red color and is not included in mirror reflection. The stitches behind the top will help you to continue the pattern.
- It is recommended to use markers - it will make your work easier.
- Repeat rows 6 to 27 until preferred size of the shawl is reached.
- It is recommended to block ready made shawl - borders and motifs will get a nice/proper shape.

Abbreviations (US crochet terms):

 - chain	 - 2 front post double crochet with chain between	 - picot
 - single crochet	 - popcorn made of 4/5 double crochet stitches	 - slip stitch
 - double crochet	 - 2 back post double crochet stitches together connected at the top in one stitch	 - 2 back post double crochet sts together connected at the top
 - treble crochet	 - 2 front post double crochet stitches together connected at the top in one stitch	 - 2 front post double crochet sts together connected at the top
 - front post double crochet	 - front post treble crochet	 - in one stitch: back post double crochet, chain, double crochet, chain and back post double crochet
 - back post double crochet	 - puff, 4 times yarn over	 - 2 front post half double crochet sts together connected at the top
 - front post single crochet	 - „snail” motif: puff (yo4) with 4 single crochet stitches	 - 3 double crochet sts in one place
 - back post single crochet	 - together connected at the top: 2 back post double crochet sts in one stitch and 2 back post double crochet sts in one stitch	 - front post popcorn made of 4 front post double crochet stitches
 - front post half double crochet	 - together connected at the top: 2 back post double crochet stitches in one stitch and back post double crochet in one stitch	<p>Grey arrow: - the basis of the chart, do not make this row</p> <p>Pink arrow: - pink arrows indicate the place to make the element</p> <p>Red dot: - number of yarn over puff/elements in the popcorn</p> <p>Yellow arrow: - outline to continue stitches behind the top</p>




The pattern includes two versions of the shawl motif to choose from. The difference is only in the stitch used in the rows 4/26.

You can choose one or two versions as you wish.

Version B




How to make a "snail" motif? It is easy.

Make a puff out of 4 yarn over (pic. 1), and then insert the hook on the side of the puff going through its center (pic. 2, 3), wrap yarn around the hook and while pulling it through the middle of the puff make single crochet (sc) - (pic. 4, 5, 6), and then in the same way inserting the hook on the side of the puff make next 3 single crochet (sc) - (pic 7).




pic. 7 - how the "snail" looks like on the right side;
pic. 8 - "snail" on the wrong side;

Caution: In ready made shawl on its right side "snails" will be seen as on pic. 8, on their wrong side.



Rows 1-12



! Before you start - see tips and abbreviation.

Start the shawl by making 5 chain stitches locked in a circle and inside of it make the first row.

r. 3 – Notice the front post half double crochet stitches.


r. 4 – Before starting the row, choose the pattern version: A or B (see page 4). The charts drawn in all the pattern refer to A version.

If the B version has been chosen, then back post double crochet should be made in this row instead of the front post double crochet seen in the chart, while the front post single crochet stitches remain unchanged in both versions.

r. 9 – Two front post double crochet stitches together connected at the top make in front post double crochet stitches of row 7 (the place is indicated by the pink arrow).

r. 11 – Front post single crochet make in front post double crochet stitches together connected at the top of row 9 (the place is indicated by the pink arrow).

Rows 13-22




The motif to be repeated multiple times is marked with the green frame.

- r. 13 – Back post single crochet in double crochet of row 11 (the place is indicated by the pink arrow).
- r. 14 – Puffs under chain of row 12 (the exceptions are the first puffs, which should be made under the chain of row 13). Single crochet under chains.
- r. 15 – Make popcorns in single crochet stitches. Make a single crochet in a single crochet (the place is indicated by the pink arrow).
- r. 16 – Pay attention to the back post half double crochet, which should be made in the back post single crochet. Puffs in a single crochet.
- r. 18 – "Snails" made of puffs 4 times yarn over with 4 single crochets - see photo tutorial.

4 back post double crochet stitches together connected at the top: two in the first place and two in the second. At the beginning 3 back post double crochet stitches together connected at the top: one in the first place and two in the second.

Rows 23-27





r. 25 – Front post double crochet stitches together connected at the top in front post treble crochet stitches of row 23.


r. 26 – If the B version has been chosen, then back post double crochet should be made in this row instead of the front post double crochet seen in the chart, while the front post single crochet stitches remain unchanged in both versions.

Make rows 1-27, then repeat 6-27 until your preferred shawl size will be reached.


The endings of the shawl at the row 12:

r. M – Make front post double crochet stitches as separate elements (these are not X cross stitches).



Alternatively, you can also end the shawl at the row 11.
