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
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Introduction to Mosaic Knitting

Love the look of colorwork knitting, but don't want to deal with carrying two (or more) strands of yarn along each row? Mosaic knitting is for you!

With mosaic, only one yarn is held per row/round, and the stitches of the other color are slipped. Only the stitches meant to be in the color being held are knit (or purled) normally in each row/round.

When knitting a mosaic pattern, all stitch pattern rows or rounds will involve slipped stitches, with the yarn always held to the wrong side of the work. On the right side, the color being slipped is what's showing, while the working yarn is hidden in the back.

A variety of looks can be achieved with mosaic knitting; since it's essentially colorwork made with slipped stitches, it really has near-infinite possibilities!

Mosaic can look identical to stranded colorwork, if done in Stockinette Stitch, with the colors changing every round (A). It can be a more typical mosaic pattern, with the same color always used for two rows/rounds at a time, but still in Stockinette (B).

Mosaic elements can be placed onto a solid colored piece (C), in stripes, bands, borders, yokes, motifs, etc.

More classic mosaic patterning is often done in Garter Stitch, with each color used for two rows/rounds (RS/WS or knit/purl) (D).

You can achieve even more variety with different kinds of slip-stitch patterning, by combining more than two colors (E), or even combining slips with other knitting techniques like cables (F). See, the possibilities really are endless!

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

23.25 (46.75)" circumference x

7.25" height

Sample is 23.25" size

YARN

Provincial Tweed™ (worsted weight, 80%
Fine Superwash Highland Wool, 20%
Donegal Tweed; 250 yards/100g): MC
Cream 27716, CC Jam 27579, 1 hank each

NEEDLES

US 5 (3.75mm) 16" (for smaller cowl) or
24-32" (for larger cowl) circular needles,
or size to obtain gauge

US 4 (3.5mm) circular needles of same
length, or one size smaller than size
used to obtain gauge

NOTIONS

Yarn Needle

Stitch Marker

GAUGE

24 sts and 42 rnds = 4" in Mock
Basketweave Pattern on larger needles,
blocked (gauge is not crucial, but it will
affect finished size and yardage
requirements)

Arkin Cowl

Notes:

A strong geometric mosaic pattern in contrasting colors makes for an eye-catching and modern cowl. The shorter length size goes around the neck once and fits closely, while the longer length version is designed to wrap twice for an extra layer of warmth.

This cowl is worked in the round from the bottom edge of the ribbing to the top. For a taller cowl, work one additional repeat of the Mock Basketweave pattern before working Rounds 1-2 again and then the Rib at the top.

The stitch pattern is both written and charted. Only one yarn color is used for each round—on chart, the color of the round number is the color used on that round. The chart is worked in the round; read each chart row from right to left as a RS row.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to the back.

Mock Basketweave (in the round over a multiple of 10 sts)

Rnd 1: With CC, (SI1, K6, SI1, K2) to end.

Rnd 2: Rep Rnd 1.

Rnd 3: With MC, (K8, SI2) to end.

Rnd 4: Rep Rnd 3.

Rnd 5: With CC, (SI1, K1, SI1, K2) to end.

Rnd 6: Rep Rnd 5.

Rnd 7: With MC, (K3, SI2, K5) to end.

Rnd 8: Rep Rnd 7.

Rnd 9: With CC, (K2, SI1, K2, SI1, K4) to end.

Rnd 10: Rep Rnd 9.

Rnd 11: With MC, (K3, SI2, K5) to end.

Rnd 12: Rep Rnd 11.

Rnd 13: With CC, (SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI1, K2) to end.

Rnd 14: Rep Rnd 13.

Rnd 15: With MC, (K8, SI2) to end.

Rnd 16: Rep Rnd 15.

Rep Rnds 1-16 for pattern.

DIRECTIONS

With smaller circular needles and MC, CO 140 (280) sts.

Join to work in the rnd and PM for BOR, being careful not to twist sts.

Work 2x2 Rib for 1.25".

Knit one rnd.

Switch to larger circular needles. Join CC and begin Mock Basketweave pattern. Work three full reps of pattern (48 rnds), then work Rnds 1-2 one more time. Break CC.

Next Rnd: Switch to smaller circular needles; with MC, K all.

Work 2x2 Rib for 1.25".

BO all sts in pattern.

Finishing

Weave in ends, wash, and block.

VAQUERO COWL

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

7.25" width x 60" circumference

YARN

Twill™ (worsted weight, 100% Superwash Merino Wool; 149 yards/100g): MC Black Cherry Heather 27928, CC Horchata Heather 27926, 3 hanks each

NEEDLES

US 6 (4mm) 16" circular needles, or size to obtain gauge

NOTIONS

Yarn Needle
Stitch Markers
Crochet Hook
Scrap Yarn
Extra Circular Needles (to hold provisional stitches during finishing)

GAUGE

22 sts and 33 rnds = 4" in Mosaic Stockinette Stitch in the round, blocked

Vaquero Cowl

Notes:

An ode to the cowboy with its Southwestern motif, the Vaquero Cowl is the perfect accessory to keep you toasty warm out on the trail.

The Vaquero Cowl is knit in the round using simple slipped stitches to create the pattern. Starting with a provisional cast on, the two ends are grafted together during finishing to create a seamless circular scarf.

Only one yarn color is used for each round—the color of the chart round number is the color used on that round. Charts are worked in the round; read each chart row from right to left as a RS row.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to the back.

DIRECTIONS

Use crochet hook and scrap yarn to provisionally CO 80 sts with MC. PM and join for knitting in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts.

Work Chart A, repeating chart eight times around.

Work Chart B, repeating chart eight times around.

Work Chart A, repeating chart eight times around.

Work Chart C, repeating chart five times around.

Cont working charts in established order five more times, ending final rep of Chart C on Row 45.

Break MC. Break CC leaving a 30" tail.

Finishing

Weave in ends (except for CC tail).

Carefully undo Provisional Cast On sts and put sts on spare needle.

With CC yarn tail, using Kitchener Stitch, graft ends tog.

Weave in remaining end and block.

QUINTESSENCE SCARF

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

9" width x 71" length

YARN

Palette™ (fingering weight, 100% Peruvian Highland Wool; 231 yards/50g):
MC Asphalt Heather 24243, CC Brass Heather 25542, 2 balls each

NEEDLES

US 4 (3.5mm) straight or circular needles (24-32"), or size to obtain gauge

NOTIONS

Yarn Needle
Crochet Hook (for tassels)
Cardboard Piece (3.5" wide, for tassels)

GAUGE

28 sts and 57 rows = 4" in Garter Stitch
Mosaic Pattern, blocked

Quintessence Scarf

Notes:

Quintessence means the purest form, and this scarf epitomizes the purest form of mosaic knitting—worked flat and in Garter Stitch, simple but stunning. The Quintessence Scarf is a bold statement of a scarf, cheerful and suitable for anyone.

This scarf is knit in one piece from end to end. It is important to block the finished scarf to show off the pattern at its best. Once blocked, tassels are added to both ends.

Stitch patterns are both written and charted. Only one yarn color is used for each row—on charts, the color of the row number is the color used on that row. Charts are worked flat; read RS rows (odd numbers) from right to left, and WS rows (even numbers) from left to right.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to WS of work (with yarn in back on RS rows, yarn in front on WS rows).

Section A (flat over a multiple of 12 sts plus 15)

Row 1 (RS): With CC, SI1, K1, (SI2, K1) to last st, SI1.

Row 2 (WS): SI1, K1, (SI2, K1) to last st, SI1.

Rows 3-4: With MC, K1, SI1, (K2, SI1) to last st, K1.

Rows 5-6: With CC, rep Rows 1-2.

Rows 7-8: With MC, rep Rows 3-4.

Rows 9-10: With CC, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI2, (K1, SI2, K1, SI1, K3, SI1, K1, SI2) to last 8 sts, K1, SI2, K1, SI1, K2, SI1.

Rows 11-12: With MC, rep Rows 3-4.

Section B (flat over a multiple of 12 sts plus 15)

Row 1 (RS): With CC, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, *(K2, SI1) two times, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1; rep from * to last 8 sts, (K2, SI1) two times, K1, SI1.

Row 2 (WS): SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, *(K2, SI1) two times, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1; rep from * to last 8 sts, (K2, SI1) two times, K1, SI1.

Rows 3-4: With MC, K3, SI1, K2, SI1, *K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1; rep from * to last 8 sts, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3.

Rows 5-6: With CC, SI2, (K2, SI1) to last 4 sts, K2, SI2.

Rows 7-8: With MC, (K2, SI1) two times, K1, *(K2, SI1) two times, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1; rep from * to last 8 sts, (K2, SI1) two times, K2.

Rows 9-10: With CC, (SI1, K2) two times, SI1, *K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1; rep from * to last 8 sts, K1, SI1, (K2, SI1) two times.

Rows 11-12: With MC, K1, (SI1, K2) to last 2 sts, SI1, K1.

Rows 13-14: With CC, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, *(K2, SI1) two times, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1; rep from * to last 8 sts, (K2, SI1) two times, K1, SI1.

Rows 15-16: Rep Rows 11-12.

Rows 17-18: Rep Rows 9-10.

Rows 19-20: Rep Rows 7-8.

Rows 21-22: Rep Rows 5-6.

Rows 23-24: Rep Rows 3-4.

Rows 25-26: Rep Rows 1-2.

Rows 27-28: With MC, K4, (SI1, K2) to last 5 sts, SI1, K4.

Rows 29-30: With CC, (SI1, K2) two times, SI1, *K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1; rep from * to last 8 sts, K1, (SI1, K2) two times, SI1.

Rows 31-32: Rep Rows 27-28.

Section C (flat over a multiple of 12 sts plus 15)

Row 1 (RS): With MC, K1, SI1, (K2, SI1) to last st, K1.

Row 2 (WS): K1, SI1, (K2, SI1) to last st, K1.

Rows 3-4: With CC, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI2, (K1, SI2, K1, SI1, K3, SI1, K1, SI2) to last 8 sts, K1, SI2, K1, SI1, K2, SI1.

Rows 5-6: With MC, rep Rows 1-2.

Rows 7-8: With CC, SI1, K1, (SI2, K1) to last st, SI1.

Rows 9-10: With MC, rep Rows 1-2.

Rows 11-12: With CC, rep Rows 7-8.

DIRECTIONS

With MC, CO 63 sts.

Knit two rows.

Join CC and work Rows 1-12 of Section A once.

Work Rows 1-32 of Section B a total of 30 times, then Rows 1-26 once more.

Work Rows 1-12 of Section C once.

Break CC.

With MC, knit two rows.

BO all sts.

Finishing

Weave in ends, wash, and block to diagram.

Once completely dry, add tassels.

Tassels

Using CC, wrap yarn eight times around a piece of cardboard measuring 3.5" wide, slide the yarn off cardboard, keeping it in the wrapped loop.

Push crochet hook through lower edge of scarf next to outermost lower CC st, from back to front.

Loop yarn around crochet hook and pull through knitting, then tuck the other end of yarn loop through to form a knot.

Cut end of yarn loop to form a tassel.

Make 22 tassels total, placing 11 along lower edge of each short end of the scarf.

KITCHEN GARDEN COWL

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

9" width x 48.25" circumference

YARN

Chroma™ (fingering weight, 70% Superwash Wool, 30% Nylon; 396 yards/100 grams): MC Bare 25248, CC Galentine 28032, 1 ball each

NEEDLES

US 3 (3.25mm) straight or circular needles (24-32"), or size to obtain gauge
US 2 (2.75mm) straight or circular needles (24-32"), or one size smaller than size used to obtain gauge

NOTIONS

Yarn Needle
Smooth Scrap Yarn or Stitch Holder
Crochet Hook (for Provisional Cast On)
Scrap Yarn (for Provisional Cast On)
Blocking Pins and/or Wires (optional)

GAUGE

31 sts and 72 rows = 4" in Mosaic Pattern
on larger needles, blocked (gauge is not crucial, but it will affect finished size and yardage requirements)

Kitchen Garden Cowl

Notes:

The geometric style of mosaic knitting is combined with a large floral design to evoke the stone beds and riotous organic growth of a French kitchen garden in this generously sized cowl.

The Kitchen Garden Cowl is a long rectangle, worked flat from the short end in a mosaic stitch pattern, and then grafted together. Two charts alternate over the length of the body.

Only one yarn color is used for each row—the color of the chart row number is the color used on that row. Charts are worked flat; read RS rows (odd numbers) from right to left, and WS rows (even numbers) from left to right.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to WS of work (with yarn in back on RS rows, yarn in front on WS rows).

Grafting in Garter Stitch

Thread yarn end through a blunt yarn needle. Hold needles parallel with WSs facing in and both needles pointing to the right. Perform Step 2 on the first front st, then Step 4 on the first back st, then cont from Step 1, always pulling yarn tightly so the grafted row tension matches the knitted fabric.

Step 1: Pull yarn needle K-wise through front st and drop st from knitting needle.

Step 2: Pull yarn needle P-wise through next front st, leaving st on knitting needle.

Step 3: Pull yarn needle K-wise through back st and drop st from knitting needle.

Step 4: Pull yarn needle P-wise through next back st, leaving st on knitting needle.

Rep Steps 1-4 until all sts have been grafted together, finishing by working Step 1 through the last remaining front st, then Step 3 through the last remaining back st.

DIRECTIONS

Using smooth waste yarn and a Provisional Cast On method, CO 69 sts.

With MC and smaller needles, knit two rows.

Switch to larger needles.

Work Rows 1-142 of Chart A (Part 1 then Part 2).

Switch to smaller needles.

With MC, knit two rows.

Switch to larger needles.

Work Rows 1-142 of Chart B (Part 1 then Part 2).

Switch to smaller needles.

With MC, knit two rows.

Cont working Chart A and Chart B as established each two more times, always knitting two rows with MC on smaller needles between chart reps.

Break MC.

Next Row (RS): With CC, K across.


Break CC, leaving 36" tail.

Finishing

Transfer all sts to st holder (a smooth piece of waste yarn works well for this). Wash and block to measurements.

When fully dry, transfer live sts back to needle. Remove provisional CO yarn and place sts on needle. With CC tail, graft live sts from the two ends of cowl tog in garter st. Weave in all ends.



YARN

Wool of the Andes™ (sport weight,
100% Peruvian Highland Wool; 137
yards/50g): MC Coal 25268, CC White

Can You Keep a Secret? Hat

Notes:

The subtle geometric design of this hat was created around the notion that some secrets are best kept locked away, like a carefully handwritten entry in a diary, tucked beneath a mattress.

The hat begins with a tubular style cast on setup, worked flat, and continues with a ribbed brim worked in the round. The body features a two-color mosaic motif—each round is worked with one color only, and the secret design emerges using slipped stitches.

Only one yarn color is used for each round—the color of the chart round number is the color used on that round. Charts are worked in the round; read each chart row from right to left as a RS row.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to the back, unless it's stated otherwise.

DIRECTIONS

Setup

Using smaller needles and waste yarn, CO 51 (56, 61) sts.

Row 1 (RS): With MC, (K1, YO) to last st, K1. 101 (111, 121) sts.

Row 2 (WS): (Sl1 WYIF, K1) to last st, Sl1 WYIF.

Row 3: (K1, Sl1 WYIF) to last st, K1.

Row 4: Rep Row 2.

Row 5: (K1, Sl1 WYIF) to last st, PM for BOR, slip final st to RH needle and join to work in the rnd.

Brim

Rnd 1 (RS): Slip last st back to LH needle and K2tog with first st of rnd, P1, (K1, P1) to end. 100 (110, 120) sts. Cont working 1x1 Rib until brim measures 1.5" from CO edge. Carefully remove waste yarn by snipping it with scissors and unravelling it.

Body

Switch to larger circular needles.

Setup Rnd: *K9 (10, 11), KFB; rep from * to end. 110 (120, 130) sts.

Rnds 1-62: Join CC and work Chart A, repeating chart 11 (12, 13) times per rnd.

Crown

Rnds 1-20: Work Chart B, repeating chart 11 (12, 13) times per rnd.

Switch to DPNs when there are too few sts to fit comfortably on circular needles.

Finishing

Break both yarns, leaving 10" tails.

Using yarn needle, thread CC through live sts, and pull tight to close top of hat.

Weave in all ends on WS, and block gently.

Optional: Using leftover yarn, make a pom-pom and tie it onto top of hat.

Bathymetry Hat

Notes:

This pattern was inspired by a half-remembered door on a building from the 1920s in New York City.

The Bathymetry Hat is great for learning how to cable and mosaic knit in the same project. As it is knit in the round, there are no right and wrong sides to deal with. All of the cables are simple two-stitch twists. The cables pop as they are knit in a single color over the top of the Garter Stitch and Reverse Stockinette Stitch background, which has a kind of marled effect from the striping colors.

The stitch pattern is both written and charted. Only one yarn color is used for each round—on chart, the color of the round number is the color used on that round. The chart is worked in the round; read each chart row from right to left as a RS row.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to the back.

RT (right twist)

SI1 to CN, hold in back; K1, K1 from CN.

LT (left twist)

SI1 to CN, hold in front; K1, K1 from CN.

Bathymetry Chart (worked in the rnd)

Rnd 2: With CC, P2, SI1, P7, (SI2, P6) two times, SI2, P7, SI1, P2. 38 sts.



Work as for Long Tail Cast On, with CC over thumb and MC over index finger. When all sts are CO, drop slipknot from needle. Join to work in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts, and PM for BOR.
Rnd 1: With MC, K all.
Rnd 2: With CC, *P2, SI1, P7, (SI2, P6) two times, SI2, P7, SI1, P2; rep from * two more times.
 Rep Rnds 1-2 until hat measures 1" from CO edge, ending with Rnd 2.

River Ripples Wrap

Notes:

The River Ripples Wrap reminds us to slow down and take notice of nature's everyday beauty, like the elegance of a slow-moving stream that creates gorgeous ever-changing ripples that spread outward.

Worked on the bias, the wrap includes relaxing Garter Stitch with a few mosaic "rivers" running through it. It is a simple, soothing project to allow oneself to reflect on the day.

The stitch pattern is both written and charted. Only one yarn color is used for each row—on chart, the color of the row number is the color used on that row. The chart is worked flat; read RS rows (odd numbers) from right to left, and WS rows (even numbers) from left to right.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to WS of work (with yarn in back on RS rows, yarn in front on WS rows).

Solid Section (worked flat)

Row 1 (RS): K1, KFB, K to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1.

Row 2 (WS): K across.

Rep Rows 1-2 for pattern.

Mosaic Section (flat over 110 sts)

Row 1 (RS): With CC, K1, KFB, *SI2, (K3, SI1) three times; rep from * seven times, SI2, K3, SI2, K2tog, K1.

Row 2 and all WS rows: With same color as previous row, knit the purl sts and slip the slipped sts.

Row 3: With MC, K1, KFB, *(K3, SI1) two times; K1, SI1, K3, SI1; rep from * seven times, K3, SI1, K3, K2tog, K1.

Row 5: With CC, K1, KFB, *K5, (SI1, K3) two times, SI1; rep from * seven times, K5, SI2, K2tog, K1.

Row 7: With MC, K1, KFB, *(K3, SI1) two times, K5, SI1; rep from * seven times, K3, SI1, K3, K2tog, K1.

Row 9: With CC, K1, KFB, *K3, SI1, K1, (SI1, K3) two times, SI1; rep from * seven times, K3, SI1, K1, SI2, K2tog, K1.

Row 11: With MC, K1, KFB, *(K3, SI1) three times, K1, SI1; rep from * seven times, K3, SI1, K3, K2tog, K1.

Row 13: With CC, K1, KFB, *K3, (SI1, K2) two times, SI1, K4; rep from * seven times, K3, SI1, K2, SI1, K2tog, K1.

Row 15: With MC, K1, KFB, *K1, (SI1, K1, SI1, K2) two times, SI1, K1, SI1; rep from * seven times, (K1, SI1) two times, K2, SI1, K2tog, K1.

Row 17: With CC, K1, KFB, *K6, (SI1, K3) two times; rep from * seven times, K6, SI1, K2tog, K1.

Row 19: With MC, K1, KFB, *(SI1, K1) three times, SI1, K5, SI1, K1; rep from * seven times, (SI1, K1) three times, SI1, K2tog, K1.

Row 21: With CC, K1, KFB, K to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1.

Row 23: With MC, K1, KFB, *K1, SI1, K5, (SI1, K1) three times, SI1; rep from * seven times, K1, SI1, K5, K2tog, K1.

Row 25: With CC, K1, KFB, *(K3, SI1) two times, K6; rep from * seven times, K3, SI1, K3, K2tog, K1.

Row 27: With MC, K1, KFB, *(SI1, K1, SI1, K2) two times, (SI1, K1) two times; rep from * seven times, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, K2tog, K1.

Row 29: With CC, K1, KFB, *K4, (SI1, K2) two times, SI1, K3; rep from * seven times, K4, SI1, K2, K2tog, K1.

Row 31: With MC, K1, KFB, *SI1, K1, (SI1, K3) three times; rep from * seven times, SI1, K1, SI1, K3, SI1, K2tog, K1.

Row 33: With CC, K1, KFB, *(SI1, K3) two times, SI1, K1, SI1, K3; rep from * seven times, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, K2tog, K1.

Row 35: With MC, K1, KFB, *SI1, K5, (SI1, K3) two times; rep from * seven times, SI1, K5, SI1, K2tog, K1.

Row 37: With CC, K1, KFB, *(SI1, K3) two times, SI1, K5; rep from * seven times, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, K2tog, K1.

Row 39: With MC, K1, KFB, *SI1, K3, SI1, K1, (SI1, K3) two times; rep from * seven times, SI1, K3, SI1, K1, SI1, K2tog, K1.

Row 41: With CC, K1, KFB, *(SI1, K3) three times, SI2; rep from * seven times, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, K2tog, K1.

DIRECTIONS

With MC and smaller needles, CO 110 sts using Long Tail Cast On.

Work 46 reps of Solid Section Rows 1-2.

Using larger needles and either the written or charted instructions, work Mosaic Section Rows 1-42. Break CC.

With MC and smaller needles, work 40 reps of Solid Section.

With larger needles, work Mosaic Section Rows 1-42. Break CC.

With MC and smaller needles, work ten reps of Solid Section.

With larger needles, work Mosaic Section Rows 1-42. Break CC.

With MC and smaller needles, work 40 reps of Solid Section.


With larger needles, work Mosaic Section Rows 1-42. Break CC.

With MC and smaller needles, work 46 reps of Solid Section.


Bind Off: With MC and RS facing, K1, (K1, SI2 back to LH needle, K2tog TBL) until all sts are bound off. Break MC and draw tail through remaining loop. Draw tight to fasten.

Finishing

Weave in ends, wash, and block to diagram.

Interlocken Shawl

Notes:

Stacks of building blocks, constructed with mosaic knitting, march across this asymmetrical triangular shawl. The same basic block structure repeats in sections of varying widths for an appearance ranging from the simple to the complex.

The Interlocken Shawl begins at one tip and grows to the opposite edge. The mosaic sections use slipped stitches to create the colorwork motif, while rows of Garter Stitch frame the mosaic blocks and provide a contrasting texture.

Only one yarn color is used for each row—the color of the chart row number is the color used on that row. The chart is worked flat; read RS rows (odd numbers) from right to left, and WS rows (even numbers) from left to right.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to WS of work (with yarn in back on RS rows, yarn in front on WS rows).

Stockinette Body Pattern (worked flat)

Row 1 (RS): Sl1, KFB, K to last 4 sts, K2tog, K2.

Row 2 (WS): K3, P to last st, KFB. 1 st inc.

Row 3: Sl1, KFB, K to end. 1 st inc.

Row 4: Rep Row 2. 1 st inc.

Rep Rows 1-4 for pattern.

Garter Ridge Pattern (worked flat)

Row 1 (RS): Sl1, KFB, K to end. 1 st inc.

Row 2 (WS): K to last st, KFB. 1 st inc.

DIRECTIONS

With MC and smaller needles, CO 3 sts.

Row 1 (RS): K across.

Row 2 (WS): K2, KFB. 4 sts.

Row 3: Sl1, K3.

Work Rows 1-30 of Interlocken Mosaic Chart. 64 sts.

Switch to smaller needles.

With MC, work Rows 1-2 of Stockinette Body Pattern. 65 sts.

With CC, work Garter Ridge Pattern once. 67 sts. Break CC.

With MC, work Rows 1-4 of Stockinette Body Pattern ten times, then work Rows 1-2 once more. 98 sts.

Second Mosaic Blocks

Join CC and work Garter Ridge Pattern once. 100 sts.

With MC, work Rows 1-2 of Stockinette Body Pattern. 101 sts.

Switch to larger needles.

Work Rows 17-30 of Interlocken Mosaic Chart. 112 sts.

Switch to smaller needles.

With MC, work Rows 1-2 of Stockinette Body Pattern. 113 sts.

With CC, work Garter Ridge Pattern once. 115 sts. Break CC.

With MC, work Rows 1-4 of Stockinette Body Pattern four times, then work Rows 1-2 once more. 128 sts.

Third Mosaic Blocks

Join CC and work Garter Ridge Pattern once. 130 sts.

With MC, work Rows 1-2 of Stockinette Body Pattern. 131 sts.

Switch to larger needles.

Work Rows 25-32 of Interlocken Mosaic Chart, followed by Rows 1-32, then Rows 1-6 once more. 166 sts.

Switch to smaller needles.

With MC, work Rows 1-2 of Stockinette Body Pattern. 167 sts.

With CC, work Garter Ridge Pattern once. 169 sts. Break CC.

With MC, work Rows 1-4 of Stockinette Body Pattern three times. 178 sts.

Smaller Size Only: Ending Section

Row 1 (RS): Sl1, KFB, K to last 4 sts, K2tog, K2.






Interlocken Mosaic Chart

25" depth x 61" width

YARN

Palette™ (fingering weight, 100% Peruvian Highland Wool; 231 yards/50g): MC Midnight Heather 25540, 2 balls; C1 Clarity 25548, C2 Wonderland Heather 26044, C3 Caribbean 25095, 1 ball each

NEEDLES

US 3 (3.25mm) 16-32" circular needles, or size to obtain desired fabric
US 5 (3.75mm) DPNs or straight or circular needles, or two sizes larger than size used to obtain gauge (for bind off)

NOTIONS

Yarn Needle
21 Stitch Markers (1 of unique color)
Locking Stitch Marker
Blocking Pins and/or Wires

GAUGE

28 sts and 40 rows = 4" in Little Boxes pattern on smaller needles, blocked

Little Boxes Shawl

Notes:

Little Boxes Shawl is inspired by charming row homes sitting shoulder to shoulder as far as the eye can see, in a city laid out on a grid. The inverted and bouncing boxes reflect the variations in ornamentation, color of brick, and renovations over the centuries.

The shawl is worked in single color Garter Stitch from two stitches at the point, then in an engaging two-color mosaic Stockinette pattern for nine repeats, and is finished off with a short row Garter Stitch edge. As the triangle grows, the mosaic pattern gains new motifs one stitch at a time.

Color Recommendations: Either two solid colors, one solid color and one color-changing or gradient yarn, or one solid main color and multiple contrasting colors. Solid colorways (as opposed to multis or tonals) are best, as they offer the best definition for the box motif.

Finished edge is worked using short rows. When the pattern says to turn, use the German Short Row Method.

Stitch patterns are both written and charted. Only one yarn color is used for each row—on charts, the color of the row number is the color used on that row. Charts are worked flat; read RS rows (odd numbers) from right to left, and WS rows (even numbers) from left to right.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to WS of work (with yarn in back on RS rows, yarn in front on WS rows).

LLS (left lifted slipped increase)

With LH needle, pick up st just below top st on RH needle from the front, then slip it to RH needle P-wise.

I1B (increase 1 below)

With LH needle, pick up loop of same color as working yarn from the WS, bringing needle down from the top, then knit st through the back loop to twist.

EM (edge marker)

Marker 3 sts from each edge.

SEM = Slip EM.

LM (Little Boxes marker)

Marker at end of full pattern (red line).

PLM = Place LM / **SLM** = Slip LM.

MM (midpoint marker)

Marker at midpoint of pattern (blue line).

PMM = Place MM / **SMM** = Slip MM.

Little Boxes (worked flat over 22 sts)

Row 1 (RS): With CC, K across.

Row 2 (WS): With CC, P across.

Row 3: With MC, SI2, K7, SI2, SMM, K11, SLM.

Row 4: With MC, P11, SMM, SI2, P7, SI2, SLM.



Rep Short Rows 3–6 until 10 working sts remain. 240 sts.

Next Row (RS): K3, SEM, M1L, K to end. 1 st inc; 241 sts.

Next Row (WS): K across.


Rep those two rows two more times, then RS row once more. 244 sts.

With larger needles, BO all sts K-wise to last 2 sts, K2tog, pass first st over next st, pull yarn through to fasten.

Finishing

Weave in ends, soak in gentle soapy water, remove excess water, and block to diagram with wires and pins.

GAUGE

20 sts and 32 rows = 4" in Mosaic Pattern, blocked (gauge is not crucial, but it will affect finished size and yardage requirements)

Maze Ruana

Notes:

Inspired by the colorful ruanas created and worn in South America, this wrap makes an eye-catching outdoor piece. Its mesmerizing mosaic pattern reminiscent of a maze dazzles when worked in a gradient yarn.

The Maze Ruana is worked in one piece from the bottom of the back towards the shoulders, where it is split into two sections for the fronts, which are worked from the top down. For a good fit, the neckline is shaped slightly. Front bands and a shawl collar are added after finishing the main piece.

Stitch patterns are both written and charted. Only one yarn color is used for each row—on charts, the color of the row number is the color used on that row. Charts are worked flat; read RS rows (odd numbers) from right to left, and WS rows (even numbers) from left to right. The charts do not include any edging stitches—please refer to the written instructions.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to WS of work (with yarn in back on RS rows, yarn in front on WS rows).

DS (double stitch)

Please refer to German Short Rows in Glossary.



Weave in ends, wash, and block to measurements.

Front Bands & Shawl Collar

With RS facing and beginning at bottom edge of Right Front, with MC, PU and K 160 sts from Right Front (approx 2 sts for every 3 rows), PU and K 27 from BO neck sts (1 st from each BO st), PU and K 160 sts from Left Front (approx 2 sts for every 3 rows). 347 sts.

Next Row (WS): K across.

Short Row 1 (RS): K177, turn.

Short Row 2: DS, K6, turn.

Short Row 3: DS, K to 5 sts after DS created in previous row, turn.

Rep last Short Row 18 more times.



MONTAGE PULLOVER

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

32 (36, 40, 44, 48, 52, 56)" finished bust circumference; meant to be worn with 1-4" positive ease

Larger sample is 44" size and model is 44" bust; smaller sample is 36" size and model is 35" bust

YARN

Swish™ (worsted weight, 100% Fine Superwash Merino Wool; 110 yards/50g); MC 7 (8, 9, 10, 11, 13, 14) skeins; CC 2 (2, 2, 2, 3, 3, 3) skeins

Samples are

36" size: MC Squirrel Heather 24090, CC White 24662

and

44" size: MC Dove Heather 25631, CC Amethyst Heather 25147

NEEDLES

US 8 (5mm) 16", 24" & 32" circular needles, or size to obtain gauge

US 8 (5mm) DPNs or two 24" circular needles for two circulars technique or 32" or longer circular needles for Magic Loop technique, or size to obtain gauge

US 6 (4mm) 16" circular needles, or two sizes smaller than size used to obtain gauge

US 6 (4mm) DPNs or 32" circular needles for Magic Loop technique, or two sizes smaller than size used to obtain gauge

NOTIONS

Yarn Needle
Stitch Markers
Scrap Yarn or Stitch Holder

GAUGE

20 sts and 42 rnds = 4" in Mosaic Pattern in the round on larger needles, blocked

20 sts and 28 rnds = 4" in Stockinette Stitch in the round on larger needles, blocked

Montage Pullover

Notes:

The highlight of this simple but elegant pullover is its Garter Stitch mosaic yoke, which adds a big pop of contrast with both color and texture. Mosaic knitting is a great way to create bold graphical elements without stranded colorwork.

The sweater is worked seamlessly and in the round, from the top down. Choose two colors of yarn with lots of contrast for the best results.

Rounds are worked in pairs, two rounds using the same color. For the first round, work as indicated in the chart. The next round in the same color is always worked by purling the same stitches that were knit in the previous round, and slipping the same stitches that were slipped.

Only one yarn color is used for each round—the color of the chart round number is the color used on that round. The chart is worked in the round; read each chart row from right to left as a RS row.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to the back.

DIRECTIONS

Neckline

With MC and smaller 16" circular needles, CO 84 (96, 104, 116, 120, 120, 120) sts. PM and join to work in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts.

Work 1x1 Rib for 1.25".

Change to larger 16" circular needles.

Size 48" Only

Rnd 1: K all.

Rnd 2: P all.

Rnd 3: (K15, M1) eight times. 128 sts.

Rnd 4: P all.

Size 52" Only

Rnd 1: K all.

Rnd 2: P all.

Rnd 3: (K7, M1, K8, M1) to end. 136 sts.

Rnd 4: P all.

Size 56" Only

Rnd 1: K all.

Rnd 2: P all.

Rnd 3: (K5, M1) 24 times. 144 sts.

Rnd 4: P all.

Yoke

Change to 24" and 32" circular needles as needed to accommodate number of sts.

Next Rnd: Work Mosaic Yoke Chart 21 (24, 26, 29, 32, 34, 36) times around.

Cont as established until all rnds of chart have been worked. 210 (240, 260, 290, 320, 340, 360) sts.

Break CC.

Next Rnd: Work inc or dec sts depending on size.

Size 32": (K105, M1) two times. 212 sts.

Size 36": (K120, M1) two times. 242 sts.

Size 40": (K65, M1) four times. 264 sts.

Size 44": (K71, K2tog, K70, K2tog) two times. 286 sts.

Size 48": (K78, K2tog) four times. 316 sts.

Size 52": (K168, K2tog) two times. 338 sts.

Size 56": K all. 360 sts.

Next Rnd: K all.

Cont in St st until yoke measures 8 (8, 8.5, 9, 9.5, 10, 10.5)".

Divide for Sleeves & Body

Next Rnd: K68 (78, 86, 94, 104, 112, 120) back sts, transfer next 38 (43, 46, 49, 54, 57, 60) sleeve sts to st holder or scrap yarn, use Backward Loop Cast On to CO 12 (12, 14, 16, 16, 18, 20) sts, K68 (78, 86, 94, 104, 112, 120) front sts, transfer next 38 (43, 46, 49, 54, 57, 60) sleeve sts to st holder or scrap yarn, CO 6 (6, 7, 8, 8, 9, 10) sts, PM for BOR, CO 6 (6, 7, 8, 8, 9, 10) sts. 160 (180, 200, 220, 240, 260, 280) sts for Body.

Body

Cont in St st until Body measures 13.5", or 3" shorter than desired length, from underarm.

Change to smaller 32" circular needles. Work 1x1 Rib for 3". BO all sts.

Sleeves (make two the same)

Transfer sleeve sts for one sleeve from holder onto larger DPNs (or circulars for working around a small circumference). With MC and beginning at center underarm, PU and K 6 (6, 7, 8, 8, 9, 10) sts, PM for BOR, K38 (43, 46, 49, 54, 57, 60) sleeve sts, PU and K 6 (6, 7, 8, 8, 9, 10) sts to center underarm. 50 (55, 60, 65, 70, 75, 80) sts.

Knit 13 (11, 9, 7, 7, 5) rnds.

Dec Rnd: K1, SSK, K to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1. 2 sts dec.

Work the last 14 (12, 10, 8, 8, 8, 6) rnds 5 (6, 8, 9, 10, 11, 13) more times. 38 (41, 42, 45, 48, 51, 52) sts.

WE until sleeve measures 15", or 3" shorter than desired length, from center underarm.

Next Rnd: Inc 0 (1, 0, 1, 0, 1, 0) st, K to end. 38 (42, 42, 46, 48, 52, 52) sts.

Change to smaller DPNs.


Work 1x1 Rib for 3".

BO all sts.



Arista Pullover

Notes:

This modern casual sweater features an allover diamond mosaic pattern that's fun and easy to knit, three-quarter length sleeves worked in the main color, and a universally flattering scoop neck.

The sweater is worked from the bottom up in the round to the underarms, and then back and forth in rows through the armhole and neck shaping. Stitches are picked up around the armhole in the main color and short rows are worked to form the sleeve cap before the rest of the sleeve is worked in the round.

The stitch pattern is both written and charted. Only one yarn color is used for each row—on chart, the color of the row number is the color used on that row. The chart is worked both in the round and flat. When working in the round, read each chart row from right to left as a RS row. When working flat, read RS rows (odd numbers) from right to left and WS rows (even numbers) from left to right.

While working armhole and neck shaping, the stitch count will change as stitches are decreased. Maintain Mosaic Diamonds pattern as much as possible by lining up motifs with previous rows; this will mean beginning and ending rows differently than shown on chart and in written directions.

While working the Mosaic Diamonds pattern flat, always knit the first and last sts of the row on the RS and purl the first and last sts of the row on the WS. This will provide a stable edge for picking up armhole stitches later.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to WS of work (with yarn in back on RS rows, yarn in front on WS rows).

Mosaic Diamonds (in the round over a multiple of 12 sts)

Rnd 1: With MC, (K2, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1) to end.

Rnd 2: Rep Rnd 1.

Rnd 3: With CC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Rnd 4: Rep Rnd 3.

Rnd 5: With MC, (K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1) to end.

Rnd 6: Rep Rnd 5.

Rnd 7: With CC, (K2, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1) to end.

Rnd 8: Rep Rnd 7.

Rnd 9: With MC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Rnd 10: Rep Rnd 9.

Rnd 11: With CC, (K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1) to end.

Rnd 12: Rep Rnd 11.

Rnd 13: With MC, (K2, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1) to end.

Rnd 14: Rep Rnd 13.

Rnd 15: With CC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Rnd 16: Rep Rnd 15.

Rnd 17: With MC, (K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1) to end.

Rnd 18: Rep Rnd 17.

Rnd 19: With CC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Rnd 20: Rep Rnd 19.

Rnd 21: With MC, (K2, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1) to end.

Rnd 22: Rep Rnd 21.

Rnd 23: With CC, (K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1) to end.

Rnd 24: Rep Rnd 23.

Rnd 25: With MC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Rnd 26: Rep Rnd 25.

Rnd 27: With CC, (K2, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1) to end.

Rnd 28: Rep Rnd 27.

Rnd 29: With MC, (K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1) to end.

Rnd 30: Rep Rnd 29.

Rnd 31: With CC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Rnd 32: Rep Rnd 31.

Rep Rnds 1-32 for pattern.

Mosaic Diamonds (worked flat)

Row 1 (RS): With MC, (K2, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1) to end.

Row 2 (WS): With MC, (P1, SI1, P2, SI1, P1, SI1, P2, SI1, P2) to end.

Row 3: With CC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Row 4: With CC, (P2, SI1) to end.

Row 5: With MC, (K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1) to end.

Row 6: With MC, (SI1, P2, SI1, P3, SI1, P2, SI1, P1) to end.

Row 7: With CC, (K2, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1) to end.

Row 8: With CC, (P1, SI1, P2, SI1, P1, SI1, P2, SI1, P2) to end.

Row 9: With MC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Row 10: With MC, (P2, SI1) to end.

Row 11: With CC, (K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1) to end.

Row 12: With CC, (SI1, P2, SI1, P3, SI1, P2, SI1, P1) to end.

Row 13: With MC, (K2, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1) to end.

Row 14: With MC, (P1, SI1, P2, SI1, P1, SI1, P2, SI1, P2) to end.

Row 15: With CC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Row 16: With CC, (P2, SI1) to end.

Row 17: With MC, (K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1) to end.

Row 18: With MC, (SI1, P2, SI1, P3, SI1, P2, SI1, P1) to end.

Row 19: With CC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Row 20: With CC, (P2, SI1) to end.

Row 21: With MC, (K2, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1) to end.

Row 22: With MC, (P1, SI1, P2, SI1, P1, SI1, P2, SI1, P2) to end.

Row 23: With CC, (K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1) to end.

Row 24: With CC, (SI1, P2, SI1, P3, SI1, P2, SI1, P1) to end.

Row 25: With MC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Row 26: With MC, (P2, SI1) to end.

Row 27: With CC, (K2, SI1, K2, SI1, K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K1) to end.

Row 28: With CC, (P1, SI1, P2, SI1, P1, SI1, P2, SI1, P2) to end.

Row 29: With MC, (K1, SI1, K2, SI1, K3, SI1, K2, SI1) to end.

Row 30: With MC, (SI1, P2, SI1, P3, SI1, P2, SI1, P1) to end.

Row 31: With CC, (SI1, K2) to end.

Row 32: With CC, (P2, SI1) to end.

Rep Rows 1-32 for pattern.

DIRECTIONS

Lower Body

With smaller circular needles and MC, CO 216 (240, 264, 288, 312, 336, 360, 384, 408) sts. Join for working in the rnd and PM for BOR, being careful not to twist sts.

Work 2x2 Rib for 1". Switch to larger circular needles.

With CC, knit one rnd.

Next Rnd: Work first rnd of Mosaic Diamonds to end. Cont in Mosaic Diamonds pattern until work measures 16 (16, 16.5, 16.5, 17, 17, 17.5, 17.5, 17.5)" from CO edge, ending with an even-numbered rnd.

Upper Body

Next Rnd: Work in pattern for 105 (116, 128, 139, 150, 161, 172, 184, 195) sts, BO 6 (8, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 16, 18) sts for underarm, work in pattern for 101 (111, 123, 133, 143, 153, 163, 175, 185) sts, move last 102 (112, 124, 134, 144, 154, 164, 176, 186) just-worked sts to st holder or scrap yarn for Back, BO 5 (7, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15, 15, 17) sts (removing BOR M when you come to it), break working yarn and pass end through last st remaining on RH needle to fasten off. Break other yarn. 102 (112, 124, 134, 144, 154, 164, 176, 186) sts on needles for Front.

Front

From this point, work back and forth in rows, beginning with next WS row of Mosaic Diamonds (worked flat). Note which row is next to ensure starting in same place for Back later.

Shape Front Armhole

Next Row (WS): Rejoin same color yarn as used for last rnd to right edge with WS facing. WE in Mosaic Diamonds to end.

Armhole Dec Row 1 (RS): Switching to next color for next row of Mosaic Diamonds, K1, SSK, work in pattern to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1. 2 sts dec.

Armhole Dec Row 2 (WS): P1, P2tog, work in pattern to last 3 sts, SSP, P1. 2 sts dec.

Rep last two rows 0 (1, 1, 1, 2, 4, 5, 7) more time(s). 98 (104, 116, 126, 136, 142, 144, 152, 154) sts.

Cont in Mosaic Diamonds (maintaining selvages) and work Armhole Dec Row 1 every other row 8 (8, 12, 12, 14, 15, 13, 15, 13) more times. 82 (88, 92, 102, 108, 112, 118, 122, 128) sts.

Begin neck shaping on the next RS row.

Shape Front Neck

Next Row (RS): Work 26 (27, 28, 32, 33, 35, 35, 38, 40) sts in pattern, transfer just-worked sts to st holder or scrap yarn for Left Front, BO center 30 (34, 36, 38, 42, 42, 48, 46, 48) sts, work in pattern to end. 26 (27, 28, 32, 33, 35, 35, 38, 40) sts on needles for Right Front.

Right Front

Next Row (WS): P1, work in pattern to last st, P1.

Next Row (RS): BO 2 (3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3) sts, work in pattern to last st, K1. 24 (24, 25, 29, 30, 32, 32, 35, 37) sts.

Next Row: P1, work in pattern to last st, P1.

Neck Dec Row (RS): K1, SSK, work in pattern to last st, K1. 1 st dec.

Rep last two rows 1 (1, 2, 2, 2, 2, 2, 2, 3) more times, then work Neck Dec Row every fourth row 2 (2, 2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 2, 3) times. 20 (20, 20, 24, 24, 26, 26, 30, 30) sts.

WE in Mosaic Diamonds (maintaining selvage sts) until work measures 7.25 (7.75, 8.25, 8.75, 9.25, 9.75, 10.25, 10.5, 11)" from underarm BO, ending with a WS row.

BO all sts.

Left Front

Transfer 26 (27, 28, 32, 33, 35, 35, 38, 40) held Left Front sts back to needles. Rejoin yarn to neck edge with WS facing.

Next Row (WS): BO 2 (3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3) sts, work in pattern to last st, P1. 24 (24, 25, 29, 30, 32, 32, 35, 37) sts.

Next Row (RS): K1, work in pattern to last st, K1.

Next Row: P1, work in pattern to last st, P1.

Neck Dec Row (RS): K1, work in pattern to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1. 1 st dec.

Rep last two rows 1 (1, 2, 2, 2, 2, 2, 2, 3) more times, then work Neck Dec Row every fourth row 2 (2, 2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 2, 3) times. 20 (20, 20, 24, 24, 26, 26, 30, 30) sts.

WE in Mosaic Diamonds (maintaining selvage sts) until work measures 7.25 (7.75, 8.25, 8.75, 9.25, 9.75, 10.25, 10.5, 11)" from underarm BO, ending with a WS row.

BO all sts.

Back

Transfer 102 (112, 124, 134, 144, 154, 164, 176, 186) held Back sts back to needles. Rejoin yarn to left armhole edge with WS facing. Work back and forth in rows from this point, beginning with next WS row of Mosaic Diamonds (worked flat) noted earlier.

Shape Back Armholes

Work as for Front to Shape Neck section. 82 (88, 92, 102, 108, 112, 118, 122, 128) sts.

WE in Mosaic Diamonds (maintaining selvage sts) until work measures 5.75 (6.25, 6.75, 7.25, 7.25, 7.75, 8.25, 8.5, 8.75)" from underarm BO, ending with a WS row.

Shape Back Neck

Next Row (RS): Work 25 (25, 26, 31, 32, 35, 35, 38, 40) sts in pattern, transfer just-worked sts to st holder or scrap yarn for Right Back, BO center 32 (38, 40, 40, 44, 42, 48, 46, 48) sts, work in pattern to end. 25 (25, 26, 31, 32, 35, 35, 38, 40) sts on needles for Left Back.

Next Row (WS): P1, work in pattern to last st, P1.

Neck Dec Row (RS): K1, SSK, work in pattern to last st, K1. 1 st dec.

Rep last two rows 4 (4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 8, 7, 9) more times. 20 (20, 20, 24, 24, 26, 26, 30, 30) sts.

WE in Mosaic Diamonds (maintaining selvage sts) until work measures 7.25 (7.75, 8.25, 8.75, 9.25, 9.75, 10.25, 10.5, 11)" from underarm BO, ending with a WS row.

BO all sts.

Transfer 25 (25, 26, 31, 32, 35, 35, 38, 40) held Right Back sts back to needles. Rejoin yarn to neck edge with WS facing.

Next Row (WS): P1, work in pattern to last st, P1.


Neck Dec Row (RS): K1, work in pattern to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1. 1 st dec.

Rep last two rows 4 (4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 8, 7, 9) more times. 20 (20, 20, 24, 24, 26, 26, 30, 30) sts.

WE in Mosaic Diamonds (maintaining selvage sts) until work measures 7.25 (7.75, 8.25, 8.75, 9.25, 9.75, 10.25, 10.5, 11)" from underarm BO, ending with a WS row.

BO all sts.

A 32 (35.5, 39, 42.75, 46.25, 49.75, 53.25, 57, 60.5)"
B 11.75 (12.25, 13.5, 14.5, 15.75, 17, 18.25, 19, 20)"
C 9.5 (10.25, 11, 11.75, 12.25, 13.75, 14.5, 15.25, 16)"
D 11 (11.5, 11.5, 12, 12, 12, 12.5, 12.5, 13)"
E 16 (16, 16.5, 16.5, 17, 17, 17.5, 17.5, 17.5)"
F 7.25 (7.75, 8.25, 8.75, 9.25, 9.75, 10.25, 10.5, 11)"
G 6.25 (7, 7.75, 8, 9, 9, 9.75, 9.25, 10)"
H 5.75 (6, 5.75, 6.25, 6.5, 6.75, 7.25, 7, 7.5)" (neck drop)

Sleeves (make two the same)

Sew shoulder seams tog with RS facing out, using Mattress Stitch.

With larger DPNs and MC, beginning at middle of BO underarm sts, PU and K 3 (4, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 8, 9) sts in left half of underarm BO, PU and K 29 (30, 33, 35, 37, 40, 42, 44, 46) sts to top shoulder seam (approx 1 st for every 3 rows), PU and K 29 (30, 33, 35, 37, 40, 42, 44, 46) sts back around other side of armhole to BO sts, PU and K 3 (4, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 8, 9) sts in other half of underarm BO. PM for BOR. 64 (68, 74, 80, 86, 94, 100, 104, 110) sts.

Place locking M 10 (11, 12, 13, 15, 15, 16, 16, 17) sts before shoulder seam and another locking M 10 (11, 12, 13, 15, 15, 16, 16, 17) sts after shoulder seam. Top 20 (22, 24, 26, 30, 30, 32, 32, 34) sts are now marked off.

Next Rnd: K to second M, remove M, W&T. Begin working back and forth in short rows.

Next Short Row (WS): P to first M, remove M, W&T.

Short Row 1 (RS): K to last wrapped st, pick up wrap and K tog with its st, W&T.

Short Row 2 (WS): P to last wrapped st, pick up wrap and P tog with its st, W&T.

Rep Short Rows 1-2 until 14 (15, 15, 16, 16, 16, 17, 17, 18) short rows have been worked on each side of top shoulder seam.

Next Row (RS): K to BOR M, picking up wrap and knitting it tog with its st when you come to it.

Next Rnd: K all, picking up last wrap and knitting it tog with its st when you come to it.

Cont in St st for seven more rnds, then begin sleeve decs.

Sleeve Dec Rnd: K2tog, K to last 2 sts, SSK. 2 sts dec.

Cont in St st, working Sleeve Dec Rnd every 15 (15, 13, 11, 10, 10, 9, 9, 8) rnds 5 (5, 6, 7, 8, 8, 9, 9, 10) more times. 52 (56, 60, 64, 68, 76, 80, 84, 88) sts.

WE in St st until work measures 10 (10.5, 10.5, 11, 11, 11, 11.5, 11.5, 12)" from underarm.

Switch to smaller DPNs and work 2x2 Rib for 1".

BO all sts loosely in pattern.

Finishing

Neckband

Using smaller circular needles and MC, beginning at left shoulder seam, PU and K 152 (168, 172, 180, 196, 192, 212, 204, 220 sts around neck opening, approx 1 st for every BO st and 1 st for every 2 rows. The exact number doesn't matter, as long as it's a multiple of 4. PM for BOR.

Work 2x2 Rib for 1".

BO all sts loosely in pattern.

Weave in ends, wash, and block to diagram.

Mingling Sweater

Notes:

The texture pattern in the body of this sweater mirrors that in the colorwork yoke. Simple styling and classic colors make this pullover eminently wearable.

The sweater is knit in the round from the bottom up, with a fun slip-stitch colorwork pattern around the yoke, a twist on the mosaic knitting technique. The underarms are seamed using a 3-Needle Bind Off.

The gauge of the Knit Purl Pattern changes substantially when blocked—be careful to match stated blocked gauge.

Only one yarn color is used for each round—the color of the chart round number is the color used on that round. The chart is worked in the round; read each chart row from right to left as a RS row.

Slip all stitches purl-wise with the yarn held to the back.

Knit Purl Pattern (in the round over a multiple of 10 sts)

Rnd 1: (P5, K2, P1, K2) to end.

Rnd 2: Knit all.

Rnd 3: (K2, P1, K2, P5) to end.

Rnd 4: Knit all.

Rnd 5: Rep Rnd 1.

Rnd 6: Knit all.

Rep Rnds 1-6 for pattern.

DIRECTIONS

Body

With smaller needles, CO 110 (120, 130, 140, 150, 160, 170, 180, 190) sts, PM, CO 110 (120, 130, 140, 150, 160, 170, 180, 190) sts. 220 (240, 260, 280, 300, 320, 340, 360, 380) sts. Join in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts; PM for BOR.

Rnd 1: (K1, P3, K1) to end.

Rep Rnd 1 for 1.5".

Switch to larger needles.

Next Rnd: Work Knit Purl Pattern around.

WE until piece measures 14.75 (15.5, 16.25, 16.25, 17, 17, 17.5, 17.5, 18.25)", or desired length, from CO edge, ending with a Rnd 5.

Separate for Underarm

Next Rnd: *Work to 20 (20, 20, 20, 20, 20, 40, 40, 40) sts from next M, work 20 (20, 20, 20, 20, 20, 40, 40, 40) sts in pattern and place these on st holder or scrap yarn for underarm; rep from * once more.

Place 90 (100, 110, 120, 130, 140, 130, 140, 150) sts on st holders for front and back. Set aside until Yoke.

Sleeves (make two the same)

With smaller needles CO 50 (50, 50, 60, 60, 60, 60, 60, 60) sts. Join in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts; PM for BOR.

Rnd 1: (K1, P3, K1) to end.

Rep Rnd 1 for 1.5".

Switch to larger needles.

Next Rnd: Work Knit Purl Pattern around.

Please read through this section before beginning work as Knit Purl Pattern is worked at the same time as sleeve incs. Work inc sts into Knit Purl Pattern.

Cont in Knit Purl Pattern until piece measures 17 (17, 17.75, 17.75, 17.75, 17.75, 18.5, 18.5)".

AT THE SAME TIME, work appropriate Inc Rnd every 6 (6, 5, 5, 4, 4, 3, 2, 2) rnds 15 (15, 18, 18, 17, 17, 46, 9, 9) times, and then every 7 (7, 6, 6, 5, 5, 0, 3, 3) rnds 5 (5, 7, 7, 13, 13, 0, 41, 41) times, ending with a Rnd 6. 90 (90, 100, 110, 120, 120, 150, 160, 160) sts.

K-wise Inc Rnd: KFB, work in pattern to last st, KFB. 2 sts inc.

P-wise Inc Rnd: PFB, work in pattern to last st, PFB. 2 sts inc.

Place the 10 (10, 10, 10, 10, 20, 20, 20) sts before and after M on st holder for underarm. 70 (70, 80, 90, 100, 100, 110, 120, 120) sts for sleeves.

Yoke

Place sts on larger needles in following order: Back, Sleeve, Front, Sleeve. 320 (340, 380, 420, 460, 480, 480, 520, 540) sts.

Size 63.25" Only

Rnds 1-5: Work Knit Purl Pattern.

Rnd 6: (P12, P2tog, P11, P2tog) 20 times. 500 sts.

Sizes - (-, -, -, -, -, 56.75, 60, 63.25)" Only

Rnds 1-5: Work Knit Purl Pattern.

Rnd 6: [P- (-, -, -, -, 10, 11), P2tog] - (-, -, -, -, 40, 40, 40, 20) times, [P- (-, -, -, -, 0, 0, 10), P2tog] - (-, -, -, -, 0, 0, 20) times. - (-, -, -, -, 440, 480, 460) sts.

Sizes - (-, -, 50, 53.25, 56.75, 60, 63.25)" Only

Rnds 1-5: Work Knit Purl Pattern.

Rnd 6: [P- (-, -, -, 14, 10, 9, 10, 10), P2tog] - (-, -, -, 10, 40, 40, 40, 20) times, [P- (-, -, -, 13, 0, 0, 0, 9), P2tog] - (-, -, -, 20, 0, 0, 0, 20) times. - (-, -, -, 430, 440, 400, 440, 420) sts.

Sizes - (-, -, 46.75, 50, 53.25, 56.75, 60, 63.25)" Only

Rnds 1-5: Work Knit Purl Pattern.

Rnd 6: [P- (-, -, 9, 9, 9, 8, 9, 9), P2tog] - (-, -, 20, 30, 40, 40, 20) times, [P- (-, -, 8, 8, 0, 0, 0, 8), P2tog] - (-, -, 20, 10, 0, 0, 0, 20) times. - (-, -, 380, 390, 400, 360, 400, 380) sts.

Sizes - (40, 43.25, 46.75, 50, 53.25, 56.75, 60, 63.25)" Only

Rnds 1-5: Work Knit Purl Pattern.

Rnd 6: [P- (10, 8, 8, 8, 8, 7, 8, 8), P2tog] - (10, 20, 20, 30, 40, 40, 40, 20) times, [P- (9, 7, 7, 7, 0, 0, 0, 7), P2tog] - (20, 20, 20, 10, 0, 0, 0, 20) times. - (310, 340, 340, 350, 360, 320, 360, 340) sts.

Resume All Sizes

Rnds 1-39: Work Mosaic Pattern.

Rnd 40: [P9 (9, 7, 7, 7, 7, 9, 7, 7), P2tog] 20 (10, 20, 20, 30, 40, 20, 40, 20) times, [P8 (8, 6, 6, 6, 0, 8, 0, 6), P2tog] 10 (20, 20, 20, 10, 0, 10, 0, 20) times. 290 (280, 300, 300, 310, 320, 290, 320, 300) sts.

A 36.75 (40, 43.25, 46.75, 50, 53.25, 56.75, 60, 63.25)"

B 15 (15, 16.75, 18.25, 20, 20, 25, 26.75, 26.75)"

C 8.25 (8.25, 8.25, 10, 10, 10, 10, 10, 10)"

D 8.5 (9.25, 9.25, 9.75, 10.5, 10.5, 11.25, 11.25, 12)"

E 14.75 (15.5, 16.25, 16.25, 17, 17, 17.5, 17.5, 18.25)"

F 17 (17, 17.75, 17.75, 17.75, 17.75, 18.5, 18.5)"

Rnd 92: [P5 (5, 5, 5, 5, 4, 5, 5, 5), P2tog] 10 (10, 20, 20, 30, 30, 10, 40, 20) times, [P4 (4, 4, 4, 4, 3, 4, 0, 4), P2tog] 30 (30, 20, 20, 10, 20, 30, 0, 20) times. 210 (210, 220, 220, 230, 230, 210, 240, 220) sts.

Rnds 93-104: Cont in Mosaic Pattern.

Rnd 105: Work Rnd 1 of Mosaic Pattern.

Rnd 106: [P4 (4, 4, 4, 3, 3, 4, 3, 4), P2tog] 10 (10, 20, 20, 30, 30, 10, 40, 20) times, [P3 (3, 3, 3, 2, 2, 3, 2, 3), P2tog] 30 (30, 20, 20, 20, 30, 10, 20) times. 170 (170, 180, 180, 180, 180, 170, 190, 180) sts.

Rnds 107-143: Cont in Mosaic Pattern.

Rnd 144: [P3 (3, 2, 2, 2, 2, 3, 2, 3), P2tog] 10 (10, 30, 30,

30, 30, 10, 40, 20) times, [P2 (2, 1, 1, 1, 1, 2, 1,

2), P2tog] 30 (30, 20, 20, 20, 20, 30, 10,

20) times. 130 (130, 130, 130, 130, 130, 130,

140, 140) sts.

Switch to smaller needles.

Rnd 145: (K1, P3, K1) to end.

Rep Rnd 145 for 0.75".

BO in pattern.

Finishing

Seam underarms using 3-Needle Bind Off.

Weave in ends, wash, and block to diagram.



Glossary

Common Stitches & Techniques

Slipped Stitches (SI)

Always slip stitches purl-wise with yarn held to the wrong side of work, unless noted otherwise in the pattern.

Make 1 Left-Leaning Stitch (M1L)

Inserting LH needle from front to back, PU the horizontal strand between the st just worked and the next st, and K TBL.

Make 1 Right-Leaning Stitch (M1R)

Inserting LH needle from back to front, PU the horizontal strand between the st just worked and the next st, and K TFL.

Slip, Slip, Knit (SSK)

(Sl1 K-wise) twice; insert LH needle into front of these 2 sts and knit them together.

Centered Double Decrease (CDD)

Slip first and second sts together as if to work K2tog; K1; pass 2 slipped sts over the knit st.

Stockinette Stitch (St st, flat over any number of sts)

Row 1 (RS): Knit all sts.

Row 2 (WS): Purl all sts.

Rep Rows 1-2 for pattern.

St st in the round: Knit every rnd.

Garter Stitch (in the round over any number of sts)

Rnd 1: Purl all sts.

Rnd 2: Knit all sts.

Rep Rnds 1-2 for pattern.

Garter Stitch flat: Knit every row.

(One Garter ridge is comprised of two rows/rnds.)

1x1 Rib (flat or in the round, over an even number of sts)

Row/Rnd 1: (K1, P1) to end of row/rnd.

Rep Row/Rnd 1 for pattern.

2x2 Rib (flat over a multiple of 4 sts plus 2)

Row 1 (RS): K2, (P2, K2) to end of row.

Row 2 (WS): P2, (K2, P2) to end of row.

Rep Rows 1-2 for pattern.

2x2 Rib (in the round over a multiple of 4 sts)

Rnd 1: (K2, P2) to end of rnd.

Rep Rnd 1 for pattern.

Magic Loop Technique

A technique using one long circular needle to knit in the round around a small circumference. A tutorial can be found at tutorials.knitpicks.com/wptutorials/magic-loop.

Knitting in the Round with Two Circular Needles

A technique using two long circulars to knit around a small circumference. A tutorial can be found at tutorials.knitpicks.com/knitting-in-the-round-with-2-circular-needles.

Backward Loop Cast On

A simple, all-purpose cast on that can be worked mid-row.

Also called Loop, Single, or E-Wrap Cast On. A tutorial can be found at tutorials.knitpicks.com/loop-cast-on.

Long Tail Cast On

Fast and neat once you get the hang of it. Also referred to as the Slingshot Cast On. A tutorial can be found at tutorials.knitpicks.com/long-tail-cast-on.

Cabled Cast On

A strong and nice looking basic cast on that can be worked mid-project. A tutorial can be found at tutorials.knitpicks.com/cabled-cast-on.

3-Needle Bind Off

Used to easily seam two rows of live stitches together.

Felting Join (to splice yarn)

One method for joining a new length of yarn to the end of one that is already being used. A tutorial can be found at tutorials.knitpicks.com/felting-join.

Mattress Stitch

A neat, invisible seaming method that uses the bars between the first and second stitches on the edges. A tutorial can be found at tutorials.knitpicks.com/mattress-stitch.

Provisional Cast On (crochet method)

Used to cast on stitches that are also a row of live stitches, so they can be put onto a needle and used later.

Directions: Using a crochet hook, make a slipknot, then hold knitting needle in left hand, hook in right. With yarn in back of needle, work a chain st by pulling yarn over needle and through chain st. Move yarn back to behind needle, and rep for the number of sts required. Chain a few more sts off the needle, then break yarn and pull end through last chain. (CO sts may be incorrectly mounted; if so, work into backs of these sts.) To unravel later (when sts need to be picked up), pull chain end out; chain should unravel, leaving live sts. A video tutorial can be found at tutorials.knitpicks.com/crocheted-provisional-cast-on.

Provisional Cast On (crochet chain method)

Same result as the crochet method above, but worked differently, so you may prefer one or the other.

Directions: With a crochet hook, use scrap yarn to make a slipknot and chain the number of sts to be cast on, plus a few extra sts. Insert tip of knitting needle into first bump of crochet chain. Wrap project yarn around needle as if to knit, and pull yarn through crochet chain, forming first st. Rep this process until you have cast on the correct number of sts. To unravel later (when sts need to be picked up), pull chain out, leaving live sts. A photo tutorial can be found at tutorials.knitpicks.com/crocheted-provisional-cast-on.

Judy's Magic Cast On

This method creates stitches coming out in opposite directions from a seamless center line, perfect for starting toe-up socks. *Directions:* Make a slipknot and place loop around one of the two needles; anchor loop counts as first st. Hold needles tog, with needle that yarn is attached to on top. In other hand, hold yarn so tail goes over index finger and yarn attached to ball goes over thumb. Bring tip of bottom needle over strand of yarn on finger (top strand), around and under yarn and back up, making a loop around needle. Pull loop snug. Bring top needle (with slipknot) over yarn tail on thumb (bottom strand), around and under yarn and back up, making a loop around needle. Pull loop snug. Cont casting on sts until desired number is reached; top yarn strand always wraps around bottom needle, and bottom yarn strand always wraps around top needle. Stretchy Bind Off

Directions: K2, *insert LH needle into front of 2 sts on RH needle and knit them tog—1 st remains on RH needle. K1; rep from * until all sts have been bound off. A tutorial can be found at tutorials.knitpicks.com/go-your-own-way-socks-toe-up-part-7-binding-off.

Jeny's Surprisingly Stretchy Bind Off (for 1x1 Rib)

Directions: Reverse YO, K1, pass YO over; *YO, P1, pass YO and previous st over P1; reverse YO, K1, pass YO and previous st over K1; rep from * until 1 st is left, then break working yarn and pull it through final st to complete BO.

Kitchener Stitch (also called Grafting)

Seamlessly join two sets of live stitches together.

Directions: With an equal number of sts on two needles, break yarn leaving a tail approx four times as long as the row of sts, and thread through a blunt yarn needle. Hold needles parallel with WSs facing in and both needles pointing to the right. Perform Step 2 on the first front st, then Step 4 on the first back st, then continue from Step 1, always pulling yarn tightly so the grafted row tension matches the knitted fabric:

Step 1: Pull yarn needle K-wise through front st and drop st from knitting needle.

Step 2: Pull yarn needle P-wise through next front st, leaving st on knitting needle.

Step 3: Pull yarn needle P-wise through first back st and drop st from knitting needle.

Step 4: Pull yarn needle K-wise through next back st, leaving st on knitting needle.

Rep Steps 1-4 until all sts have been grafted together, finishing by working Step 1 through the last remaining front st, then Step 3 through the last remaining back st. Photo tutorials can be found at knitpicks.com/learning-center/learn-to-knit/kitchener.

Short Rows

There are several options for how to handle short rows, so you may see different suggestions/instructions in a pattern.

Wrap and Turn (W&T) (one option for Short Rows)

Work until the st to be wrapped. If knitting: Bring yarn to front, SI next st P-wise, return yarn to back; turn work, and SI wrapped st onto RH needle. Cont across row. If purling: Bring yarn to back of work, SI next st P-wise, return yarn to front; turn work and SI wrapped st onto RH needle. Cont across row.


Picking up Wraps: Work to wrapped st. If knitting: Insert RH needle under wrap, then through wrapped st K-wise; K st and wrap tog. If purling: SI wrapped st P-wise onto RH needle, use LH needle to lift wrap and place it onto RH needle; SI wrap and st back onto LH needle, and P tog.

German Short Rows (another option for Short Rows)

Work to turning point; turn. WYIF, SI first st P-wise. Bring yarn over back of right needle, pulling firmly to create a “double stitch” on RH needle. If next st is a K st, leave yarn at back; if next st is a P st, bring yarn to front between needles. When it's time to work into double st, knit both strands tog.

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
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
