FAIRISLE KNITTING



Don't get in a tangle with two-colour knitting, Kate Buller's step-by-step guide, taken from her new book 'The Knitter's Bible', will give you all the help you need.

Fairisle is the term used when two different coloured yarns are knitted across every row. The technique originates from the Shetland Isles, off the northern coast of Scotland where knitters have made beautiful, multi-coloured garments for centuries. The yarns are worked together across the row, and the yarn not in use can either be stranded or woven in across the back of the fabric. The secret of knitting with the Fairisle method is to keep the knitting elastic by stranding or weaving the yarn not in use loosely across the back of the work. When worked properly, the yarns should remain untangled at the end of every row.






THE STRANDING METHOD


This method involves carrying the yarn not in use loosely across the back of the work. Don't strand the yarn across more than three stitches, if you do so, you will create a loop that can get caught up and distort the fabric. There are different ways of holding the yarn when stranding, choose the method you feel most comfortable with, and remember, practice makes perfect.

Holding the yarns in the right hand


ON A KNIT ROW



Step 1 Insert the right needle into the next stitch, holding both coloured yarns together in the right hand as if they are one yarn.




Step 2 Using the index finger, loop the blue yarn over the pink yarn and knit the next 3 stitches with the blue yarn.




Step 3 Drop the blue yarn off the index finger, then loop the pink yarn with the index finger and take it under the blue yarn. Knit the next three stitches with pink.


ON A PURL ROW



Step 1 Insert the right needle into the next stitch, holding both coloured yarns together in the right hand as if they are one yarn.




Step 2 Using the index finger, loop the blue yarn over the pink yarn and purl the next 3 stitches with the blue yarn.




Step 3 Drop the blue yarn off the index finger, then loop the pink yarn with the index finger and take it under the blue yarn. Purl the next 3 stitches with pink.

Holding yarns in both hands

ON A KNIT ROW




Step 1 Hold the blue yarn in the left hand and the pink in the right. Knit the next three stitches with the blue in the following way: with the point of the right hand needle, loop the blue from the right to the left. Pull the new loop through the stitch on the needle to the front, forming a new stitch. Drop the new stitch off the left needle.



Step 2 Take the pink yarn forward in the right hand, across the top of the blue yarn, and knit the next three stitches in the same way as you would for a normal knit stitch, using the pink yarn looped over the index finger. At the same time hold the blue yarn away from the needles so that the two colours are kept separate.

ON A PURL ROW



Step 1 Hold the blue yarn over the left thumb in the left hand and the pink yarn in the right hand. Insert the right needle in the next stitch.



Step 2 Take the pink yarn forward in the right hand and purl the next three stitches in pink, holding the blue away from the tip of the right needle.

Step 3 Purl the next three stitches with the blue yarn, using the left thumb and index finger. Keep hold of the blue yarn until the needle goes through the stitch.



THE WEAVING METHOD

Sometimes it's necessary to carry a colour over more than three stitches across the back of the work. In such cases, you need to catch the loop of yarn being carried across the work on every third or fourth stitch. This can be done by using both hands to hold the yarns.

ON A KNIT ROW



Step 1 Hold the blue yarn in the left hand and the pink yarn in the right hand. Insert the right needle into the next stitch, and take the blue yarn over the right needle.


Step 3 Knit the next stitch with the pink yarn, holding the blue yarn down behind the work. Continue weaving in the blue yarn on every third stitch as shown.




Step 2 Take the pink yarn forward in the right hand and knit the next stitch with the pink yarn, holding the blue yarn away from the tip of the right needle.



ON A PURL ROW





Step 1 Hold the blue yarn in the left hand and the pink yarn in the right hand. Insert the right needle into the next stitch, then take the blue yarn over the right needle.



Step 2 Take the pink yarn forward in the right hand and purl the next stitch in the same way as you would for a normal purl stitch.

Step 3 Hold down the blue yarn in front of the work with the left thumb. Purl the stitch with the pink yarn. Continue weaving in the blue yarn on every third or fourth stitch as shown.



KATE'S TIPS

- Always take the yarn not in use and catch it in with the end stitch by taking it under or over the knitting yarn.
- Spread out the stitches on both needles as you work to help keep the tension correct and the fabric elastic
- There are two ways of stopping yarns getting twisted and tangled; when using the stranding method, always keep the same colour up and the same colour down across the back of the work; when using both methods, turn knit rows clockwise and purl rows anti-clockwise
- When using the weaving method, always try to catch the yarn on a different stitch on every row to prevent a ridge from forming

BRANDON MABLY

"He follows in the famous footsteps of his mentor Kaffe Fassett, but Brandon Mably has always had his own enthusiasms. In fact, a talent for boundless, spur-of-the-moment enthusiasm; every kind; new and old; transient and lasting, has ruled his life." says Kathryn Samuels.

"I was a total disaster at school" admits Brandon, the soft lilt in his voice telling of a childhood spent in Wales. "I had too many passions, never could concentrate at anything for a moment, always on to the next thing. When I left all I knew was that I wanted to do something creative and work with people." How to channel all this energy worried his mother – but not him.


Today, happily, after a few false starts he is settled in a career that allows him both satisfactions. The freedom to be creative and to mix that creativity with his very obvious enjoyment of people. He has worked in Kaffe Fassett's design studio for the past ten years designing many of his own successful knitting patterns for Rowan. He is writing his first solo knitting book (to be published next year). Now, after assisting Kaffe in the varied workshops the studio organises, he has taken over responsibility for these sessions in the UK.

Eleven years ago life wasn't such a perfect mix. The small boy whose enthusiasm for knitting needles was definitely weapon based, studied hotel management and catering after leaving school. He worked as a

chef in hotel kitchens and in an American summer camp; tried his hand at tele-sales and did a stint on the fish counter at Selfridges. Each job was attacked with enthusiasm, each one eventually failing to provide the right combination. "My mother firmly told me it was time to buckle down and stop all this to-ing and fro-ing."

It was a chance meeting, during one of those interminable waits for a London bus, that set him on the right course. He began chatting to his next-door-neighbour in the queue, who turned out to be Kaffe, who told him about his work and his search for the perfect cover for *Glorious Inspirations*, the book he had just finished. Brandon was intrigued and asked to visit the studio. "As soon as I walked in I knew it felt right. I loved the colour and the creativity. There were eight people working in the studio at the time and I took to spending as much of my free time there as I could. I asked Kaffe for a job. Twice he said No! – after all I had no art training, no knitting or needlepoint skills, nothing much to offer." On the third time of asking Kaffe agreed – this time his enthusiasm obviously showed signs of lasting. He began his apprenticeship.

Brandon has a passion for the unusual and collects many pieces on his travels. Opposite: Brandon wears Shark, one of his own designs.





After six months in the studio he dared his first design, based on an Indian straw basket. It gave him inspiration that was completely in tune with his instinctive design preferences. Colour certainly, in vivid green, grape, blue and yellow, used harmoniously; geometric shape but because the original was handworked and stretched with use, the eventual look was slightly irregular. "I love design that has movement which might mean a wobble, not a strictly regimented pattern." The learning curve was steep but proved to be endlessly fascinating.

At this point his enthusiasm for taking over the workshops is evident. "What I so enjoy is being able to share what I've learnt to do with other people." he says "To show them how to look at colour, break down the psychological barriers about colour and let them play with their ideas." I feel I know exactly what he means. Most of us say we love colour but after a decade when fashion in clothes and home decorating has dictated chic, bland, monochromes, I for one have forgotten how to dare more than just a splash in my dress or my surroundings. "I love showing how colours harmonise, how much you need to tickle a shade to bring the picture to life. But above all how to look. Look really well at something. I'm often astounded that people beaver away at some work for ages and don't ever stand back, look properly at the whole scheme and have the confidence to make personal choices."

Brandon travels a lot. As Kaffe's assistant he has accompanied him on trips to India, Guatemala, South Africa and Vietnam to name a handful, working with Oxfam or governments sponsored bodies to help indigenous skills adapt and find international markets. They went back to Australia in May for patchwork and knitting workshops; there's the exhibition in Stockholm to organise, the on-going projects for Rowan, furnishing fabrics for Designers Guild, tapestries for Ehrman and the books. "I have ten designs to finish before Christmas for my own book" said Brandon, trying hard not to sound panicky.

When it all gets too much he flees to his cottage in Rye, Kent which he bought with his twin sister Belinda six years ago. "I wanted to be back near to the coast. I was brought up close to the sea and the ocean has a very powerful pull. I found this house at the very end of an exploring day. I peered in through the window of a fisherman's terraced cottage and saw this wonderful kitchen with 9inch wide wooden floorboards and an orangery at the back. I fell in love with it. I had to have it." Belinda felt the same way and now lives there full time, working at a local Art College.


Brandon manages to get to what he calls his "paint box" a least once a month. "I drop the keys and go for a long walk on the beach, around the town. I relax eventually. It's as if I've taken my mind out, given it a good wash and then put it back completely refreshed." Then it's time to get the paints out; the living-room is warm red with an orange ceiling; the kitchen butter yellow with diamond painted blue and ochre floor. Kaffe has painted cacti all over the orangery. Brandon fought hard with the local council to be allowed to re-instate the garden privy. "Every house needs two loos" he laughs. The privy is now his favourite room, decorated with shells from the beach and painted in strong pastel hues.

Back in London, clear-headed, he's ready and enthusiastic for anything the studio throws at him. Could be a new knitting design; could be visit to Wormwood Scrubs to work with the Lifers. "That was a fantastic experience. You might think I'd get some flack but I didn't. These guys were so proud of what they were doing; it helped them relax, they had something to send out as presents and they were allowed to continue sewing in their cells after lock-up.

It made me realise that anyone who works with their hands has a chance to achieve a much higher sensibility of beauty. You're focused, centred, you never take things for granted."

THE LUXURY OF MOHAIR

On catwalks around the world, from Milan and Paris to London and New York, this season sees the return of mohair.

The delicate appearance and lustre of mohair makes it one of our most exquisite natural fibres. Silky and lustrous, it can take on many guises, from the baby softness of kid mohair knits to crisply woven suiting fabrics. Fashion designers like Ottavia Missoni love mohair. It produces colours that have an unmatched clarity and glow, fabrics that are virtually uncrushable, and results in garments that are warm, light and wonderful to wear. 'I like the contrast and texture of mohair,' says designer Bill Blass. 'Especially with co-ordinating fabrics and other natural yarns. It has a great way of enriching styles.'

The mohair fibre comes from the back of the Angora goat, not to be confused with the angora rabbit - the rabbit produces angora, the goat, mohair. The goat is said to have originated in the mountains of Tibet, and records have been uncovered from the ancient Sumerian civilisation of Turkestan, dating back to the 14th century B.C., which mention the existence of goats, kids and white wool for clothing. The Bible records its appearance in Egypt 1500 years before Christ. The book of Exodus tells us that the sons of Israel fled from Egypt, 'carrying with them goats whose fleece was used to make fabric to dress the altar.'

The mohair industry was born in Ankara, the capital city of Turkey and the best mohair came from the province of Ankara, hence the name. The word mohair derives from the Arabic for 'cloth of bright goat's hair - 'mukhaya'. In the 13th century Genghis Khan expelled Suleyman Shah from the land of the Turkomans, who drove his flocks of Angora goats on an incredible trek of thousands of miles from Turkestan. There the Angora goats found a favourable climate, with pure air and water making perfect conditions for breeding and growing excellent fleece. However, the Angoran people attributed the beauty of the mohair produced by the fleece to the power of the holy man Hadji Bayram Veli, and wove the fibres into a lustrous silky cloth, worn by Sultans.

In 1554 a pair of Angora goats was sent as a gift to the Holy Roman Emperor. Demand for this versatile and beautiful fibre soon exceeded supply and the Sultan of Turkey prohibited the export of the raw fleece to Europe. Only spun Mohair entered the market, but by 1600 the quality of home grown woollen yarns had improved to the extent that the demand for Mohair declined.

Having made successful treks of thousands of miles from their original homeland in Tibet, the Angora goat resisted many later attempts to transport it. Throughout the 18th century repeated attempts to farm the goat in countries throughout Europe failed, but success eventually came in 1830, when twelve bucks and one doe safely arrived in South Africa. Unfortunately it became obvious that all twelve males had been secretly deprived of their fertility before their departure. Luckily the doe had given birth to a male on board ship and the animals were cross-bred with local goats, which led to a hardier animal. Thirty more Angoras followed and South Africa soon became one of the world's leading suppliers of high quality mohair. Today, South Africa and Turkey remain important breeding countries while Texas, in the United States, has also become an important producer. The goat has found a home in places as far afield as Kenya and Lesotho in Africa, Argentina in South America, Australia and New Zealand and, in the last twenty years, small numbers have been bred and raised in England.

Kid mohair is renowned as the softest mohair yarn. Taken from the young goat, or kid, when it is about six months old, it is spun into a soft, warm yarn perfect for hand knitting into sweaters. A fleece taken from an older goat will produce a coarser fibre better suited for jackets and throws, but all mohair has the springy curl that characterises the coat of the endearing animals themselves. In Britain, shearing takes place twice a year, in the spring and in late summer, when the crimped fleece comes away in soft handfuls. After washing, the fibres have a breathtaking lustre and whiteness which is mohair's trademark, a lustre which is enhanced by the dyeing process.

Mohair is an all-season fashion fibre that is amazingly versatile. Made into warm knits for winter, or spun into airy fabrics that breathe with the body for warmer days, it is used for an incredibly wide range of products, from fake fur to furnishing fabrics. For beauty, colour and silkiness of texture, mohair exemplifies beauty and quality as much today as it did for the Sultans of old.

DID YOU KNOW

- The special lustre, unique to mohair, is derived from the large flat scales on the outer layer of the fibres, which make a soft, slippery yarn that reflects more light than wool
- As a decorating fabric, mohair is ideal for concert halls and hotel lobbies because of its sound absorbency and flame-resistant qualities
- In 1860 one Angora goat was sold for its weight in silver in the United States
- In ancient Egypt, a natural teasel was used to comb mohair cloth worn by the Pharaohs

CARING FOR MOHAIR

Rowan's newest mohair yarns, Kid Classic and Kid Soft are blended with the very finest lambswool and Merino wool. Take good care of these luxury yarns and they will repay you with years of wear. Wash in tepid water and a mild handwash detergent. Squeeze gently, never wring or rub. Rinse well in cool water and roll in a towel to remove excess water, or place in a pillowcase and spin. Lay out flat to dry. Don't keep mohair garments on hangers, instead, fold them and store on a shelf.

KNITTING WITH MOHAIR

Closely knitted mohair garments will feel hard and unyielding, so always make sure you use a loose tension, the secret of mohair is its light airiness. An open fabric can still be very warm.


Mohair may shed fibres as it is knitted, to help prevent this, place the yarn in the fridge for a couple of hours. Place a cloth on your lap to protect your clothes

THE MOHAIR CENTRE

You can visit a unique visitor's centre, to see over one hundred Angora goats and learn more about how mohair makes the transition from animal to yarn, if you visit The Mohair Centre in East Sussex, England. Open at weekends and during the school holidays, The Mohair Centre caters for group visits and holds a variety of spinning and weaving courses during the week. 

CLEVER IDEAS

Curl up and keep warm with cosy winter knits this season.

LEFT: **FRILLED HOTTIE COVER** by Kim Hargreaves. Hot water bottle covers are seriously stylish this year, so make the cosiest cover ever when you knit this one in Rowan's new Kid Classic. Its frilly, turn-down collar and button fastenings use the same techniques as for knitting a sweater, making it the ideal project for a beginner to practice their skills.

ABOVE: **STITCHED EDGINGS** Decorative stitches like cross stitch are quick to do and make all the difference to a plain knitted cushion. Use contrasting colour yarns in subtle tones, or make an impact with bright shades.

ABOVE RIGHT: **COTTON NAPKINS** With Rowan's handwoven cotton fabrics now available by the metre, use rich colours like plain aubergine or deep red and maroon stripes to make stylish table linen for winter entertaining. For napkins cut squares of cotton and hem the edges by hand or machine. Wrap wooden chopsticks tightly with raffia and loosely tie the rolled napkin and chopsticks together with raffia bows.

RIGHT: **SIMPLE SHAPES** Rowan's new yarn Kid Classic, made from a mix of mohair and lambswool, knits up into such a lovely 'touchy-feely' fabric that it's hard to resist making it into cushions for relaxing with on cold winter evenings. Knit simple squares to cover feather cushion pads and embellish with the simplest of embroidery stitches.





LEFT: POMPOM DECORATIONS Strictly for fun, get the children to make woolly pom-poms from leftover balls of yarn and hang them along the mantelpiece for your festive decorations. They look great on the Christmas tree too, or try them across a winter window.



BOTTOM LEFT & OPPOSITE: FELTED FABRICS For the ultimate in cosy chic, make cushions from felted knitted fabric. Knit a square larger than you need and wash on a hot machine cycle. The fabric will thicken and felt, and when dry is easily cut and sewn together to make cushion covers. Decorate with stripes of contrast coloured woollen embroidery or make into a simple envelope cushion with button fastenings.

BELOW: HEARTS CARDIGAN Any little girl will be delighted to wear this adorable 4ply botany cardigan with its two-tone body and ribbed sleeves. Picot edgings, Fairisle patterning, hearts which can be worked using the Intarsia technique, and a wide plain border, give you a chance to try out no fewer than five different techniques within the same garment. Find the pattern in 'Pipsqueaks' £9.95, available from Rowan stockists.







ABOVE LEFT: LOOPY PENCIL BAG Jane Bunce designs the most desirable knitted bags for children, and this one, knitted in Magpie Aran with a top border of loop stitch, is just right for carrying around those essential items like coloured pencil crayons. It only takes an evening to knit, and would be very much appreciated by any small artist.

ABOVE: KNITTED SHEEP Knitted toys are always irresistible, and none more so than this mother sheep with her lambs. A Debbie Bliss classic design, the sheep are knitted in garter stitch for texture and take just three balls of Rowan Wool Cotton.


LEFT: COTTON STRIPE If your kids cry 'too scratchy' at the sight of a woollen sweater, make them this deep pink and ecru stripey knit in Rowan Wool Cotton which is as easy to wear as a sweat shirt. The slash neck and simple set-in sleeves makes it an ideal sweater for beginners to tackle too. Find the pattern in 'Pipsqueaks', as before.



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


THE EASY LIFE

Simplicity is the key to stylish contemporary living, so hit the right note with Erica Knight's deliciously easy throws and cushions. Relax and take it easy, making beautiful home textiles these days doesn't mean knitting complicated stitch patterns. The new knitting means one colour fabrics and basic stitches. All you need is a handful of natural yarns and the most elementary skill. Cast on and knit every row in crisp cotton for a textured cushion cover. Make strips of knitting with alternating knit and purl sides and you have a chenille throw with a modern twist, or stitch chunky squares together with the seams on the outside for the latest look. Find all these ideas, and more, in Erica Knight's new book 'simple knits for easy living'.








OPPOSITE LEFT AND TOP: SQUARES THROW Knit yourself a crisp cotton bed cover or a sumptuous chenille throw with a beaded and tasseled fringe to drape over a sofa or chair. When you knit in strips of alternating knit and purl squares, you can make the throw as big or as small as you like - simply stop knitting when the strips are long enough and make as many, or as few, as you need.

OPPOSITE CENTRE: 'bain' BAG A small, cotton wash bag is knitted in moss stitch for its textural quality, while the single row of blue moss stitch at the bottom looks like embroidery. The bag has a separate panel of stocking stitch which is embroidered with the word 'bain' and stitched on afterwards. Why not knit more than one of these bags and embroider the panels with family initials to hang in a row in the bathroom.

OPPOSITE BOTTOM: TEXTURED PATCH Perfect for beginners, this cushion is knitted in easy squares and seamed together with alternate knit and purl sides out for a fashionable 'patchwork' look. The simple textures sit equally well in a contemporary living space or with rustic furniture, especially if the cushion is knitted in different tones of muted shades or neutrals. The chunky yarn and big needles makes it quick to complete too.

ABOVE: SIMPLE CUSHION Knitted in easy garter stitch in either cotton or chenille, this cushion is a perfect example of uncomplicated knitting. With no shaping, just a straight length of simple knitting folded and seamed to make a simple envelope back, knit it in cool cotton or enhance the texture with the luxury of chenille. BACK

Cast on 102 (116) sts using 4½mm (US 7) needles and yarn A.

Using the **intarsia** technique described on the information page, starting and ending rows as indicated, joining and breaking off colours as required and beg with a K row, work in patt foll chart, which is worked entirely in st st, as follows:
Cont straight until chart row 42 has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape side vents

Place markers at both ends of last row.

Keeping chart correct, inc 1 st at each end of next row.

Work 1 row.

Inc 1 st at each end of next row.

Rep last 3 rows 4 times more. 122 (136) sts.

Cont straight until chart row 86 (90) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Keeping chart correct, cast off 10 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 102 (116) sts.

Cont straight until chart row 150 (158) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 11 (13) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 80 (90) sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off 11 (13) sts, patt until there are 16 (18) sts on right needle and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

Cast off rem 12 (14) sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 26 (28) sts, patt to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

LEFT FRONT

Cast on 41 (48) sts using 4½mm (US 7) needles and yarn A.

Beg with a K row, work in patt foll chart as follows:
Cont straight until chart row 42 has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape side vent

Place marker at end of last row.

Keeping chart correct, inc 1 st at marked edge of next row.

Work 1 row.

Inc 1 st at marked edge of next row.

Rep last 3 rows 4 times more. 51 (58) sts.

Cont straight until chart row 86 (90) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape armhole

Keeping chart correct, cast off 10 sts at beg of next row. 41 (48) sts.

Cont straight until chart row 140 (146) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape neck

Place marker at beg of next row to denote start of neck shaping.

Keeping chart correct, dec 1 st at neck edge on next 5 rows, then on foll 2 (3) alt rows. 34 (40) sts.

Work 1 row, ending with chart row 150 (158).

Shape shoulder

Cast off 11 (13) sts at beg of next and foll alt row.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 12 (14) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 41 (48) sts using 4½mm (US 7) needles and yarn A.

Beg with a K row, work in patt foll chart as follows:
Cont straight until chart row 42 has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape side vent

Place marker at beg of last row.

Keeping chart correct, inc 1 st at marked edge of next row.

Work 1 row.

Inc 1 st at marked edge of next row.

Rep last 3 rows 4 times more. 51 (58) sts.

Complete to match left front, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 72 sts using 3½mm (US 5) needles and yarn A.
Joining in and breaking off colours as required, cont as follows:

Row 1 (RS): Using yarn A, purl.

Row 2: Using yarn A, knit.

Rows 3 and 4: Using yarn B, knit.

Row 5: Using yarn B, purl.

Rows 6 and 7: Using yarn C, purl.

Row 8: Using yarn C, knit.

Rows 9 and 10: Using yarn A, knit.

Row 11: Using yarn A, purl.

Rows 12 and 13: Using yarn D, purl.

Row 14: Using yarn D, knit.

Rows 15 and 16: Using yarn E, knit.

Row 17: Using yarn E, purl.

Rows 18 and 19: Using yarn A, purl.

Row 20: Using yarn A, knit.

These 20 rows form border patt.

Change to 4½mm (US 7) needles and work in patt foll chart as follows:

Work 2 rows.

Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 10th row until there are 92 (80) sts.

Medium-extra large size only

Inc 1 st at each end of every foll 8th row until there are 96 sts.

Both sizes

Cont straight until chart row 114 (118) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Cast off.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the information page.

Join shoulder seams using back stitch.

Back hem and side vent border

Cast on 224 (238) sts using 3½mm (US 5) needles and yarn A.

Mark 51st st in from each end of row.

Work the 20 border patt rows as given for sleeves, working decreases on 2nd and every foll alt row as follows:

Decrease row (WS): Work 2 tog, *patt to within 1 st of marked st, work 3 tog (marked st in centre st of this group), rep from * once more, patt to last 2 sts, work 2 tog tbl.

When all 20 border patt rows are complete, cast off rem 164 (178) sts.

Sew cast-off edge of border in place to back along hem and side edges below markers. Sew shaped edges of border and back together.

Left front side vent, hem and front opening edge border

Cast on 226 (237) sts using 3½mm (US 5) needles and yarn A.

Mark 51st st from beg and 116th (123rd) sts from end of row.

Work the 20 border patt rows as given for sleeves, working decreases on 2nd and every foll alt row as follows:

Decrease row (WS): *Patt to within 1 st of marked st, work 3 tog (marked st in centre st of this group), rep from * once more, patt to last 2 sts, work 2 tog tbl. When all 20 border patt rows are complete, cast off rem 176 (187) sts.

Right front side vent, hem and front opening edge border

Cast on 226 (237) sts using 3½mm (US 5) needles and yarn A.

Mark 51st st from end and 116th (123rd) sts from beg of row.

Work the 20 border patt rows as given for sleeves, working decreases on 2nd and every foll alt row as follows:

Decrease row (WS): Work 2 tog, *patt to within 1 st of marked st, work 3 tog (marked st in centre st of this group), rep from * once more, patt to end.

When all 20 border patt rows are complete, cast off rem 176 (187) sts.

Sew cast-off edge of front borders in place in same way as for back border, matching straight row end edge of border to start of front neck shaping.

Collar


Cast on 104 (110) sts using 3½mm (US 5) needles and yarn A.


Row 1 (RS): Using yarn A, purl.

Row 2: Using yarn A, K5, K3tog, K to last 8 sts, K3tog tbl, K5.

Row 3: Using yarn D, knit.

Row 4: Using yarn D, K4, K3tog, K to last 7 sts, K3tog tbl, K4.





Row 5: Using yarn D, purl.

Row 6: Using yarn E, P3, P3tog, P to last 6 sts, P3tog
tbl, P3.

Row 7: Using yarn E, purl.

Row 8: Using yarn E, K2, K3tog, K to last 5 sts,
K3tog tbl, K2.

Row 9: Using yarn A, knit.

Row 10: Using yarn A, K1, K3tog, K to last 4 sts,
K3tog tbl, K1.



Row 11: Using yarn A, purl.

Cast off rem 84 (90) sts, still decreasing as before.

Sew cast-off edges of collar to neck edge, matching
stripes of collar to stripes of front borders.



Work a further 10 rows in st st.

Next row (RS) (eyelet row): *K2tog, yfwd, rep from * to last st, K1.

Beg with a P row, work 5 rows in st st.

Rep last 6 rows once more.

Both sweaters

Beg with a K row, cont in st st until back measures 39 (40: 40: 41: 41) cm from picot row, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Cast off 3 (4: 4: 5: 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

105 (109: 115: 119: 125) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 5 (5: 7: 7: 9) rows, then on every foll alt row until 79 (81: 85: 87: 91) sts rem. Cont straight until armhole measures 21 (21: 22: 22: 23) cm, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 7 (7: 7: 7: 8) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

65 (67: 71: 73: 75) sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off 7 (7: 7: 7: 8) sts, K until there are 10 (10: 12: 12: 12) sts on right needle and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

Cast off rem 6 (6: 8: 8: 8) sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 31 (33: 33: 35: 35) sts, K to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

FRONT

Work as for back until 14 (14: 14: 16: 16) rows less have been worked than on back to start of shoulder shaping, ending with a WS row.

Shape neck

Next row (RS): K31 (31: 33: 34: 36) and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row. 27 (27: 29: 30: 32) sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 5 rows, then on foll 2 (2: 2: 3: 3) alt rows. 20 (20: 22: 22: 24) sts.

Work 3 rows, ending with a RS row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 7 (7: 7: 7: 8) sts at beg of next and foll alt row. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 6 (6: 8: 8: 8) sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 17 (19: 19: 19: 19) sts, K to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 77 (79: 81: 83: 85) sts using smallest size needles. Beg with a K row, work 10 rows in st st.

Next row (RS) (picot edging row): *K2tog, yfwd, rep from * to last st, K1.

Change to middle size needles and beg with a P row, work 9 rows in st st.

Change to largest size needles.

Sweater with eyelets only

Work a further 10 rows in st st.

Next row (RS) (eyelet row): *K2tog, yfwd, rep from * to last st, K1.

Beg with a P row, work 5 rows in st st.

Rep last 6 rows once more.

Both sweaters

Beg with a K row, work straight in st st until sleeve measures 45 (45: 46: 46: 46) cm from picot row, ending with a WS row.

Shape top

Cast off 3 (4: 4: 5: 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

71 (71: 73: 73: 75) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 rows, then on foll 4 (3: 4: 3: 4) alt rows, then on every foll 4th row until 47 sts rem.

Work 1 row. Dec 1 st at each end of next and foll 3 alt rows, then on foll 3 rows, ending with a WS row. 33 sts.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Cast off rem 25 sts.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the info page.

Join right shoulder seam using back stitch.

Neckband

With RS facing and middle size needles, pick up and knit 22 (22: 22: 24: 24) sts down left side of neck,

17 (19: 19: 19: 19) sts from front, 22 (22: 22: 24: 24) sts up right side of neck, and 38 (40: 40: 42: 42) sts from back. 99 (103: 103: 109: 109) sts.

Sweater with eyelets only

Beg with a P row, work 7 rows in st st.

Next row (RS) (eyelet row): *K2tog, yfwd, rep from * to last st, K1.

Rep last 8 rows twice more.

Work a further 7 rows in st st.

**Sweater without eyelets only**

Beg with a P row, work 31 rows in st st.

Both sweaters

Next row (RS) (picot edging row): *K2tog, yfwd, rep from * to last st, K1.

Change to smallest size needles.


Beg with a P row, work 31 rows in st st.

Cast off knitwise.

Cords

Following instructions as for design 4, Miss Brown on page 75, make one cord 150 cm long for body and two cords, each 46 cm long, for sleeves.



Cast on 170 (178: 182) sts using 3½ mm (US 3) needles and yarn D.

Break off yarn D and join in yarn C.

Row 1 (RS): K2, *P2, K2, rep from * to end.

Row 2: P2, *K2, P2, rep from * to end.

These 2 rows form rib.

Work a further 3 rows in rib.

Break off yarn C and join in yarn B.

Work a further 5 rows in rib, inc 1 (0: 1) st at each end of last row. 172 (178: 184) sts.

Change to 4 mm (US 6) needles.

Using the **fair isle** technique described on the information page, starting and ending rows as indicated, joining and breaking off colours as required and beg with a K row, work in patt foll chart, which is worked entirely in st st, as follows:

Cont straight until chart row 110 (116: 124) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Keeping chart correct, cast off 6 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 160 (166: 172) sts.

Cont straight until chart row 194 (200: 208) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 18 (19: 20) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 124 (128: 132) sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off 18 (19: 20) sts, patt until there are 22 (23: 24) sts on right needle and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

Cast off rem 18 (19: 20) sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 44 sts, patt to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

FRONT

Work as given for back until chart row 174 (180: 188) has been completed, ending with a RS row.

Shape neck

Next row (WS): Patt 68 (71: 74) sts and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row. 64 (67: 70) sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 7 rows, then on foll 2 alt rows, then on foll 4th row. 54 (57: 60) sts.

Work 3 rows, ending with chart row 194 (200: 208).

Shape shoulder

Cast off 18 (19: 20) sts at beg of next and foll alt row.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 18 (19: 20) sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 24 sts, patt to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 78 sts using 3½ mm (US 3) needles and yarn D. Break off yarn D and join in yarn C.

Work 5 rows in rib as given for back.

Break off yarn C and join in yarn B.

Work a further 5 rows in rib, inc 1 st at each end of last row. 80 sts.

Change to 4 mm (US 6) needles and work in patt foll chart as follows:

Work 2 rows.

Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 4th row until there are 146 sts.




Shaping note:

All **side seam decreases** are worked 2 sts in from ends of rows. To dec 1 st at beg of rows work: K2, K to last 4 sts, K2tog tbl, K2.

K2tog, K to end. To dec 1 st at end of rows work: K to last 4 sts, K2tog tbl, K2.

All side seam and sleeve increases are worked 2 sts in from ends of rows. To inc 1 st at beg of rows work: K2, M1, K to end. To inc 1 st at end of rows work: K to last 2 sts, M1, K2.

BACK

Cast on 133 (141: 147: 155: 161) sts using 2 1/4mm (US 2) needles.

Work 3 rows in garter st, ending with a RS row.

Row 4 (WS): P1 (1: 0: 0: 1), *K1, P1, rep from * to last 0 (0: 1: 1: 0) st, K0 (0: 1: 1: 0).**Row 5:** As row 4.

Last 2 rows form moss st.

Work a further 9 rows in moss st.

Change to 3 1/4mm (US 3) needles and beg with a K row, cont in st st until back measures 30 (31: 32: 33: 34) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row until 121 (129: 135: 143: 149) sts rem, then on every foll 4th row until 105 (113: 119: 127: 133) sts rem.

Work 11 (13: 13: 15: 15) rows, ending with a WS row.

Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row until there are 115 (123: 129: 137: 143) sts, then on every foll 4th row until there are 127 (135: 141: 149: 155) sts.

Work 11 (13: 13: 15: 15) rows, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Cast off 5 (6: 6: 7: 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

117 (123: 129: 135: 141) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 7 (7: 9: 9: 11) rows, then on foll 8 (9: 9: 10: 10) alt rows.

87 (91: 93: 97: 99) sts.

Cont straight until armhole measures

21 (21: 22: 22: 23) cm, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 8 (8: 8: 9: 9) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

71 (75: 77: 79: 81) sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off 8 (8: 8: 9: 9) sts, K until there are 11 (12: 13: 12: 13) sts on right needle and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

Cast off rem 7 (8: 9: 8: 9) sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 33 (35: 35: 37: 37) sts, K to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

LEFT FRONT

Cast on 76 (80: 83: 87: 90) sts using 2 1/4mm (US 2) needles.

Work 3 rows in garter st, ending with a RS row.

Row 4 (WS): *K1, P1, rep from * to last 0 (0: 1: 1: 0) st, K0 (0: 1: 1: 0).**Row 5:** K0 (0: 1: 1: 0), *P1, K1, rep from * to end.

Last 2 rows form moss st.

Work a further 8 rows in moss st.

Row 14 (WS): Moss st 9 and slip these 9 sts onto a holder for button band, moss st to end.

67 (71: 74: 78: 81) sts.

Change to 3 1/4mm (US 3) needles and beg with a K row, cont in st st until left front measures 30 (31: 32: 33: 34) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Dec 1 st at beg of next and every foll 6th row until 61 (65: 68: 72: 75) sts rem, then on every foll 4th row until 53 (57: 60: 64: 67) sts rem.

Work 11 (13: 13: 15: 15) rows, ending with a WS row. Inc 1 st at beg of next and every foll 6th row until there are 58 (62: 65: 69: 72) sts, then on every foll 4th row until there are 61 (65: 68: 72: 75) sts.

Work 1 row, ending with a WS row.

Shape front neck

Work 22 (24: 24: 26: 26) rows dec 1 st at end (front neck edge) of next and every foll 6th row **and at same time** inc 1 st at beg (side seam edge) of 3rd and 2 foll 4th rows.

60 (64: 67: 70: 73) sts.

Shape armhole

Next row (RS): Cast off 5 (6: 6: 7: 7) sts, K to last 0 (2: 2: 0: 0) sts, (K2tog) 0 (1: 1: 0: 0) times.

55 (57: 60: 63: 66) sts.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at armhole edge of next 7 (7: 9: 9: 11) rows, then on foll 8 (9: 9: 10: 10) alt rows **and at same time** dec 1 st at front neck edge on next (5th: 5th: 3rd: 3rd) and 3 (1: 3: 0: 1) foll 6th rows, then on every foll 4th row. 35 (36: 37: 37: 38) sts.

Dec 1 st at front neck edge only on every foll 4th row from previous dec until 23 (24: 25: 26: 27) sts rem.

Cont straight until left front matches back to start of shoulder shaping, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 8 (8: 8: 9: 9) sts at beg of next and foll alt row. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 7 (8: 9: 8: 9) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 76 (80: 83: 87: 90) sts using 2 1/4mm (US 2) needles.

Work 3 rows in garter st, ending with a RS row.

Row 4 (WS): K0 (0: 1: 1: 0), *P1, K1, rep from * to end.**Row 5:** *K1, P1, rep from * to last 0 (0: 1: 1: 0) st, K0 (0: 1: 1: 0).

Last 2 rows form moss st.

Work a further 8 rows in moss st.

Row 14 (WS): Moss st to last 9 sts and turn, leaving these last 9 sts on a holder for buttonhole band.

67 (71: 74: 78: 81) sts.

Change to 3 1/4mm (US 3) needles and beg with a K row, cont in st st until right front measures 30 (31: 32: 33: 34) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Dec 1 st at end of next and every foll 6th row until 61 (65: 68: 72: 75) sts rem, then on every foll 4th row until 53 (57: 60: 64: 67) sts rem.

Complete to match left front, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 59 (59: 61: 63: 63) sts using 2 1/4mm (US 2) needles.

Work 3 rows in garter st, ending with a RS row.

Row 4 (WS): K1, *P1, K1, rep from * to end.**Row 5:** As row 4.

Last 2 rows form moss st.

Work a further 9 rows in moss st.

Change to 3 1/4mm (US 3) needles and beg with a K row, cont in st st as follows:

Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 8th row until there are 85 (79: 85: 87: 81) sts, then on every foll 6th row until there are 93 (95: 97: 99: 101) sts.

Cont straight until sleeve measures 41 (41: 42: 42: 42) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape top

Cast off 5 (6: 6: 7: 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

83 (83: 85: 85: 87) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 5 rows, then on foll 3 alt rows, then on every foll 4th row until 57 (55: 57: 55: 57) sts rem.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll alt row until 51 sts rem, then on foll 5 rows, ending with a WS row. 41 sts.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 4 rows.

Cast off rem 25 sts.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the info page.

Join both shoulder seams using back stitch.

Button band

Slip 9 sts left on holder for button band onto 2 1/4mm (US 2) needles and rejoin yarn with RS facing.

Cont in moss st as set until band, when slightly stretched, fits up left front opening edge to beg of front neck shaping, up neck edge and across to centre back neck, ending with a WS row.

Cast off.

Viktoriya Sh

Slip stitch band in place.

Mark positions for 7 buttons on this band - lowest button 20 cm up from cast-on edge, top button 1 cm below beg of front neck shaping and rem 5 buttons evenly spaced between.

Buttonhole band

Work as for button band, rejoining yarn with WS facing and with the addition of 7 buttonholes to correspond with positions marked for buttons worked as follows:

Buttonhole row (RS): Moss st 4, yrn (to make a buttonhole), work 2 tog, moss st 3.

Slip stitch band in place, joining ends of bands at centre back neck.

For tie belt, make a twisted or knitted cord approx 140 cm long.




To make a twisted cord: Get a friend to help and measure off required lengths of yarn. (Finished length of cord will be about one third original length of yarn.) Knot ends together and insert a pencil at each end in front of knot and between lengths of yarn. Facing each other and holding yarn together between thumb and finger in front of knot, turn pencil clockwise. Continue until strands are tightly twisted, then bring pencils together and allow cord to twist. Remove pencils and knot ends.

To make a knitted cord: Using two double pointed needles the same size as those used for cuffs, cast on 4 sts.

Next row (RS): K4 - all 4 sts now on right needle, *slip sts to opposite end of needle and transfer this needle to left hand, without turning work and taking yarn quite tightly across back of work, K same 4 sts again - all 4 sts now on right needle again, rep from * until cord is required length.

Next row: K4tog and fasten off.

Pattern note: The pattern is worked over a multiple of 8 sts plus 1 as follows:

Row 1 (RS): K2, *slip next 5 sts purlwise with yarn at front of work, K3, rep from *, ending with slip 5, K2.

Rows 2 and 4: K2, *P5, K3, rep from *, ending P5, K2.

Row 4: K4, *insert right needle point under loose strand laying across front of work and knit this loop tog with next st, K7, rep from *, ending last rep K4. Where part patt reps occur resulting in slipped sts being worked at side edges, strand yarn loosely to and from row ends before working next st.

BACK

Cast on 109 (115: 121: 127: 133) sts using 3mm (US 2/3) needles.

Work 11 rows in garter st.

Change to 3 1/4mm (US 5) needles.

Next row (WS): P0 (0: 3: 0: 1), K0 (3: 3: 1: 3), *P5, K3, rep from * to last 5 (0: 3: 6: 1) sts, P5 (0: 3: 5: 1), K0 (0: 0: 1: 0).

Cont in patt setting sts as follows:

Row 1 (RS): Slip next 5 (0: 3: 0: 0) sts purlwise with yarn at front of work, K3 (3: 3: 1: 4), *slip next 5 sts purlwise with yarn at front of work, K3, rep from * to last 5 (0: 3: 6: 1) sts, slip next 5 (0: 3: 5: 0) sts purlwise with yarn at front of work, K0 (0: 0: 1: 1).

Row 2: P0 (0: 3: 0: 1), K0 (3: 3: 1: 3), *P5, K3, rep from * to last 5 (0: 3: 6: 1) sts, P5 (0: 3: 5: 1), K0 (0: 0: 1: 0).

Row 3: K2 (0: 0: 0: 0), (insert right needle point under loose strand laying across front of work and knit this loop tog with next st) 1 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K5 (3: 5: 1: 4), *K2, insert right needle point under loose strand laying across front of work and knit this loop tog with next st, K5, rep from * to last 5 (0: 3: 6: 1) sts, K2 (0: 2: 2: 0), (insert right needle point under loose strand laying across front of work and knit this loop tog with next st) 1 (0: 1: 1: 0) times, K2 (0: 0: 3: 1).

Row 4: As row 2.

These 4 rows form patt and are repeated throughout. Patt a further 4 (6: 6: 8: 8) rows.

Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row until 91 (97: 103: 109: 115) sts rem. Patt 13 rows, ending with a WS row.

Keeping patt correct, inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 8th row until there are 109 (115: 121: 127: 133) sts, taking inc sts into patt.

Cont straight until back measures 37 (38: 38: 39: 39) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Keeping patt correct, cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 101 (107: 113: 119: 125) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 (5: 7: 9: 11) rows, then on every foll alt row until 77 (79: 81: 83: 85) sts rem. Cont straight until armhole measures 20 (20: 21: 21: 22) cm, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 7 (7: 8: 8: 8) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 63 (65: 65: 67: 69) sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off 7 (7: 8: 8: 8) sts, patt until there are 12 (12: 11: 11: 12) sts on right needle and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

Cast off rem 8 (8: 7: 7: 8) sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 25 (27: 27: 29: 29) sts, patt to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

LEFT FRONT

Note: As row end edges of fronts form actual finished edges of garment, it is important these edges are kept neat. Therefore, all new balls of yarn should be joined in at side seam or armhole edges of rows. Cast on 59 (62: 65: 68: 71) sts using 3mm (US 2/3) needles.

Work 11 rows in garter st.

Change to 3 1/4mm (US 5) needles.

Next row (WS): K6, *P5, K3, rep from * to last 5 (0: 3: 6: 1) sts, P5 (0: 3: 5: 1), K0 (0: 0: 1: 0).

Cont in patt as follows:

Row 1 (RS): Slip next 5 (0: 3: 0: 0) sts purlwise with yarn at front of work, K3 (3: 3: 1: 4), *slip next 5 sts purlwise with yarn at front of work, K3, rep from * to last 3 sts, K3.

Row 2: K6, *P5, K3, rep from * to last 5 (0: 3: 6: 1) sts, P5 (0: 3: 5: 1), K0 (0: 0: 1: 0).

Row 3: K2 (0: 0: 0: 0), (insert right needle point under loose strand laying across front of work and knit this loop tog with next st) 1 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K5 (3: 5: 1: 4), *K2, insert right needle point under loose strand laying across front of work and knit this loop tog with next st, K5, rep from * to last 3 sts, K3.

Row 4: As row 2.

These 4 rows form patt and are repeated throughout. Patt a further 4 (6: 6: 8: 8) rows.

Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at beg of next and every foll 6th row until 50 (53: 56: 59: 62) sts rem. Patt 13 rows, ending with a WS row.



Dec 1 st at armhole edge of next 3 (5: 7: 9: 11) rows, then on every foll alt row until 43 (44: 45: 46: 47) sts rem.

Cont straight until 29 (29: 29: 31: 31) rows less have been worked than on back to start of shoulder shaping, ending with a RS row.

Shape neck

Keeping patt correct, cast off 7 (8: 8: 8) sts at beg of next row and 5 sts at beg of foll alt row.

31 (31: 32: 33: 34) sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 3 rows, then on foll 4 (4: 4: 5: 5) alt rows, then on every foll 4th row until 22 (22: 23: 23: 24) sts rem.

Work 7 rows, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 7 (7: 8: 8: 8) sts at beg of next and foll alt row.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 8 (8: 7: 7: 8) sts.

Mark positions for 7 buttons along left front opening edge - lowest button to be 5 cm up from cast-on edge, last button 2 cm below neck shaping and rem 5 buttons evenly spaced between.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 59 (62: 65: 68: 71) sts using 3mm (US 2/3) needles.

Work 11 rows in garter st.

Change to 3 1/4mm (US 5) needles.

Next row (WS): P0 (0: 3: 0: 1), K0 (3: 3: 1: 3), *P5, K3, rep from * to last 3 sts, K3.

Cont in patt as folls:

Row 1 (RS): K6, *slip next 5 sts purlwise with yarn at front of work, K3, rep from * to last 5 (0: 3: 6: 1) sts, slip next 5 (0: 3: 5: 0) sts purlwise with yarn at front of work, K0 (0: 0: 1: 1).

Row 2: P0 (0: 3: 0: 1), K0 (3: 3: 1: 3), *P5, K3, rep from * to last 3 sts, K3.

Row 3: K6, *K2, insert right needle point under loose strand laying across front of work and knit this loop tog with next st, K5, rep from * to last 5 (0: 3: 6: 1) sts, K2 (0: 2: 2: 0), (insert right needle point under loose strand laying across front of work and knit this loop tog with next st) 1 (0: 1: 0) times, K2 (0: 0: 3: 1).

Row 4: As row 2.

These 4 rows form patt and are repeated throughout. Complete to match left front, reversing shapings and working buttonholes to correspond with positions marked for buttons on left front as folls:

Buttonhole row (RS): K2, K2tog, yfwd, patt to end.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 51 (51: 55: 55: 59) sts using 3mm (US 2/3) needles.

Work 11 rows in garter st, inc 1 st at each end of last row. 53 (53: 57: 57: 61) sts.

Change to 3 1/4mm (US 5) needles.

Next row (WS): P1 (1: 3: 3: 5), K3, *P5, K3, rep from * to last 1 (1: 3: 3: 5) sts, P1 (1: 3: 3: 5).

Cont in patt as folls:

Row 1 (RS): Slip next 0 (0: 3: 3: 5) sts purlwise with yarn at front of work, K4 (4: 3: 3: 3), *slip next 5 sts purlwise with yarn at front of work, K3, rep from * to last 1 (1: 3: 3: 5) sts, slip next 0 (0: 3: 3: 5) sts purlwise with yarn at front of work, K1 (1: 0: 0: 0).

Row 2: P1 (1: 3: 3: 5), K3, *P5, K3, rep from * to last 1 (1: 3: 3: 5) sts, P1 (1: 3: 3: 5).

Row 3: K0 (0: 0: 0: 2), (insert right needle point under loose strand laying across front of work and knit this loop tog with next st) 0 (0: 1: 1: 1) times, K4 (4: 5: 5: 5), *K2, insert right needle point under loose strand laying across front of work and knit this loop tog with next st, K5, rep from * to last 1 (1: 3: 3: 5) sts, K1 (1: 2: 2: 2), (insert right needle point under loose strand laying across front of work and knit this

loop tog with next st) 0 (0: 1: 1: 1) times, K0 (0: 0: 0: 2).

Row 4: As row 2.

These 4 rows form patt and are repeated throughout. Keeping patt correct, inc 1 st at each end of 7th and every foll 12th row until there are 79 (79: 83: 83: 87) sts, taking inc sts into patt.

Cont straight until sleeve measures 40 (40: 41: 41: 42) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape top

Keeping patt correct, cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 71 (71: 75: 75: 79) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 rows, then on foll 3 (3: 4: 4: 5) alt rows, then on every foll 4th row until 55 (55: 53: 53: 55) sts rem.

Work 5 rows.

Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row until 82 (86: 90: 94: 98) sts rem.

Patt 9 rows, ending with a WS row.

Keeping patt correct, inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row until there are 92 (96: 100: 104: 108) sts, taking inc sts into rev st st.

Cont straight until back measures

37 (38: 38: 39: 39) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Keeping patt correct, cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 84 (88: 92: 96: 100) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 (5: 5: 7: 7) rows, then on every foll alt row until 68 (70: 72: 74: 76) sts rem.

Cont straight until armhole measures

22 (22: 23: 23: 24) cm, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 5 (5: 6: 6: 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 58 (60: 60: 62: 64) sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off 5 (5: 6: 6: 6) sts, patt until there are 10 (10: 9: 9: 10) sts on right needle and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

Cast off rem 6 (6: 5: 5: 6) sts.

With RS facing, slip centre 28 (30: 30: 32: 32) sts onto a holder, rejoin yarn to rem sts, patt to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

FRONT

Work as for back until 16 (16: 16: 18: 18) rows less have been worked than on back to start of shoulder shaping, ending with a WS row.

Shape neck

Next row (RS): Patt 24 (24: 25: 26: 27) sts and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 6 rows, then on foll 2 (2: 2: 3: 3) alt rows. 16 (16: 17: 17: 18) sts.

Work 5 rows, ending with a RS row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 5 (5: 6: 6: 6) sts at beg of next and foll alt row.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 6 (6: 5: 5: 6) sts.

With RS facing, slip centre 20 (22: 22: 22: 22) sts onto a holder, rejoin yarn to rem sts, patt to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 40 (40: 42: 44: 44) sts using smaller size needles.

Beg with a P row, work in rev st st throughout as follows:

Work 8 rows, ending with a WS row.

Change to larger needles and cont in rev st st, inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 10th (8th: 8th: 8th: 8th) row until there are 44 (56: 62: 64: 58) sts, then on every foll 8th (6th: 6th: 6th: 6th) row until there are 60 (62: 64: 66: 68) sts.

Cont straight until sleeve measures 41 (41: 42: 42: 43) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape top

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 52 (54: 56: 58: 60) sts. Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 rows, then on foll 2 alt rows, then on every foll 4th row until 34 (36: 38: 40: 42) sts rem.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and foll 0 (1: 2: 3: 4) alt rows, then on foll 3 rows, ending with a WS row. 26 sts.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Cast off rem 18 sts.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the information page.

Join right shoulder seam using back stitch.

Neckband

With RS facing and smaller size needles, pick up and knit 22 (21: 21: 21: 21) sts down left side of front neck, patt across 20 (22: 22: 22: 22) sts from front, pick up and knit 22 (20: 20: 20: 20) sts up right side of front neck, and 4 (4: 4: 3: 3) sts down right side of back neck, work across 28 (30: 30: 32: 32) sts from back as follows: P0 (1: 1: 2: 2), K2, P2, patt 20 sts, P2, K2, P0 (1: 1: 2: 2), then pick up and knit 6 (5: 5: 4: 4) sts up left side of back neck. 102 sts.




Row 2: As row 1.

Last 2 rows form moss st.

Work in moss st for a further 8 rows.

Change to 3 1/4 mm (US 5) needles.

Work in moss st for a further 24 rows.

Row 35 (RS): Knit.

Break off yarn A and join in yarn B.

Beg with a P row, work 3 rows in st st.

Break off yarn B and join in yarn C.

Beg with a K row, cont in st st throughout as follows:

Cont straight until back measures

28 (29: 29: 30: 30) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Cast off 4 (5: 5: 6: 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

103 (107: 113: 117: 123) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 5 (5: 7: 7: 9) rows, then on foll 6 (7: 7: 8: 8) alt rows.

81 (83: 85: 87: 89) sts.

Cont straight until armhole measures 21 (21: 22: 22: 23) cm, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 8 (8: 9: 9: 9) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

65 (67: 67: 69: 71) sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off 8 (8: 9: 9: 9) sts, K until

there are 13 (13: 12: 12: 13) sts on right needle and

turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

Cast off rem 9 (9: 8: 8: 9) sts.

Row 2: *P1, K1, rep from * to last 1 (0: 1: 0: 1) st, P1 (0: 1: 0: 1).

Last 2 rows form moss st.

Work in moss st for a further 8 rows.

Change to 3 1/4 mm (US 5) needles.

Work in moss st for a further 24 rows.

Row 35 (RS): K45 (48: 51: 54: 57), moss st 20.

Join in yarn B.

Row 36: Using yarn A moss st 20, P1, using yarn B P44 (47: 50: 53: 56).

Row 37: Using yarn B K44 (47: 50: 53: 56), using yarn A K1, moss st 20.

Row 38: As row 36.

Join in yarn C.

Row 39: Using yarn C K42 (45: 48: 51: 54), using yarn B K2, using yarn A K1, moss st 20.

Row 40: Using yarn A moss st 20, P1, using yarn B P2, using yarn C P42 (45: 48: 51: 54).

Last 2 rows form patt.

Cont in patt as now set until left front matches back to beg of armhole shaping, ending with a WS row.

Shape armhole

Cast off 4 (5: 5: 6: 6) sts at beg of next row.

61 (63: 66: 68: 71) sts.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at armhole edge of next 5 (5: 7: 7: 9) rows, then on foll 6 (7: 7: 8: 8) alt rows. 50 (51: 52: 53: 54) sts.

Cont straight until 21 (21: 21: 23: 23) rows less have been worked than on back to start of shoulder shaping, ending with a RS row.

Shape neck

Keeping patt correct, cast off 15 (16: 16: 16: 16) sts at beg of next row. 35 (35: 36: 37: 38) sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge of next 5 rows, then on foll 5 (5: 5: 6: 6) alt rows. 25 (25: 26: 26: 27) sts.

Work 5 rows, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 8 (8: 9: 9: 9) sts at beg of next and foll alt row.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 9 (9: 8: 8: 9) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 65 (68: 71: 74: 77) sts using 3 mm (US 2/3) needles and yarn A.

Row 1 (RS): *P1, K1, rep from * to last 1 (0: 1: 0: 1) st, P1 (0: 1: 0: 1).

Row 2: P1 (0: 1: 0: 1), *K1, P1, rep from * to end.

Last 2 rows form moss st.

Work in moss st for a further 8 rows.

Change to 3 1/4 mm (US 5) needles.

Work in moss st for a further 24 rows.

Row 35 (RS): Moss st 20, K45 (48: 51: 54: 57).

Join in yarn B.

Row 36: Using yarn B P44 (47: 50: 53: 56), using yarn A P1, moss st 20.

Row 37: Using yarn A moss st 20, K1, using yarn B K44 (47: 50: 53: 56).

Row 38: As row 36.

Join in yarn C.

Row 39: Using yarn C moss st 20, K1, using yarn B K2, using yarn A K42 (45: 48: 51: 54).

Row 40: Using yarn C P42 (45: 48: 51: 54), using yarn B P2, using yarn A P1, moss st 20.

Last 2 rows form patt.

Complete to match left front, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 69 (69: 71: 73: 73) sts using 3 mm (US 2/3) needles and yarn A.

Row 1 (RS): K1, *P1, K1, rep from * to end.

Row 2: As row 1.

Last 2 rows form moss st.

Work in moss st for a further 8 rows.

Change to 3 1/4 mm (US 5) needles.

Work in moss st for a further 24 rows, inc 1 st at each end of 21 st of these rows. 71 (71: 73: 75: 75) sts.

Row 35 (RS): Knit.

Break off yarn A and join in yarn B.

Beg with a P row, work 3 rows in st st.

Break off yarn B and join in yarn C.

Beg with a K row, cont in st st throughout as follows: Inc 1 st at each end of every foll 24th (20th: 20th: 20th: 16th) row from previous inc until there are 77 (79: 81: 83: 85) sts.

Cont straight until sleeve measures 41 (41: 42: 42: 42) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape top

Cast off 4 (5: 5: 6: 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

69 (69: 71: 71: 73) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 rows, then on foll 3 alt rows, then on every foll 4th row until 43 (41: 43: 41: 43) sts rem.

Work 1 row, ending with a WS row.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and foll 2 (1: 2: 1: 2) alt rows, then on foll 5 rows. 27 sts.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Cast off rem 19 sts.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the info page.


Join both shoulder seams using back stitch.

Collar

With RS facing, 3 1/4 mm (US 5) needles and yarn C, starting and ending 15 (16: 16: 16: 16) sts in from front opening edges, pick up and knit 26 (26: 26: 28: 28) sts up right side of neck, 31 (33: 33: 35: 35) sts from back, and 26 (26: 26: 28: 28) sts down left side of neck. 83 (85: 85: 91: 91) sts.

Work in moss st as given for sleeves for 9 cm. Cast off. Make a button loop along row end edge of each front directly below neck cast-off. Sew on button beneath collar on left front and inside right front to correspond with loops.

13 sts and 19 rows to 10 cm measured over stocking stitch using 6½mm (US 10½) needles.

Pattern note: As row end edges of fronts form actual finished edges of garment, it is important these edges are kept neat. Therefore, all new balls of yarn should be joined in at side seam or armhole edges of rows.

BACK

Cast on 53 (55: 59: 61: 65) sts using 6mm (US 10) needles.

Row 1 (RS): K1 (2: 0: 0: 1), P3 (3: 1: 2: 3), *K3, P3, rep from * to last 1 (2: 4: 5: 1) sts, K1 (2: 3: 3: 1), P0 (0: 1: 2: 0).

Row 2: P1 (2: 0: 0: 1), K3 (3: 1: 2: 3), *P3, K3, rep from * to last 1 (2: 4: 5: 1) sts, P1 (2: 3: 3: 1), K0 (0: 1: 2: 0).

Rep last 2 rows 8 times more.

Change to 6½mm (US 10½) needles and beg with a K row, cont in st st, shaping side seams by inc 1 st at each end of 3rd and every foll 6th row until there are 61 (63: 67: 69: 73) sts.

Cont straight until back measures 25 (26: 26: 27: 27) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

55 (57: 61: 63: 67) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 rows, then on foll 2 (2: 3: 3: 4) alt rows, 45 (47: 49: 51: 53) sts.

Cont straight until armhole measures 21 (21: 22: 22: 23) cm, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 4 (4: 5: 5: 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

37 (39: 39: 41: 43) sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off 4 (4: 5: 5: 5) sts, K until there are 9 (9: 8: 8: 9) sts on right needle and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

Cast off rem 5 (5: 4: 4: 5) sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 11 (13: 13: 15: 15) sts, K to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

LEFT FRONT

Cast on 27 (28: 30: 31: 33) sts using 6mm (US 10) needles.

Row 1 (RS): K1 (2: 0: 0: 1), P3 (3: 1: 2: 3), *K3, P3, rep from * to last 5 sts, K3, P1, K1.

Row 2: K2, *P3, K3, rep from * to last 1 (2: 4: 5: 1) sts, P1 (2: 3: 3: 1), K0 (0: 1: 2: 0).

Rep last 2 rows 8 times more.

Change to 6½mm (US 10½) needles and cont in patt as follows:

Row 1 (RS): K to last 2 sts, P1, K1.

Row 2: K2, P to end.

Rep last 2 rows once more, inc 1 st at beg of first row, 28 (29: 31: 32: 34) sts.

Divide for pocket

Next row (RS): K11 (12: 13: 14: 15), slip rem 17 (17: 18: 18: 19) sts on a holder (for pocket front), turn and cast on 15 (15: 16: 16: 17) sts (for pocket back).

26 (27: 29: 30: 32) sts.

Beg with a P row, work 21 rows in st st on these sts at **the same time** inc 1 st at side seam edge of every 6th row from previous inc, ending with a WS row, 29 (30: 32: 33: 35) sts.

Break yarn and leave sts on a second holder.

Work pocket front

Slip 17 (17: 18: 18: 19) sts left on first holder onto 6½mm (US 10½) needles, rejoin yarn with RS facing and cont as follows:

Rep last 2 rows 10 times more.

Break yarn.

Join sections

Next row (RS): K across first 14 (15: 16: 17: 18) sts from second holder, then holding WS of pocket front against RS of pocket back, K tog first st of pocket front with next st of pocket back, K tog rem 14 (14: 15: 15: 16) sts of pocket back with sts of pocket front, P1, K1. 31 (32: 34: 35: 37) sts.

Cont in patt as follows:

Row 1 (RS): K2, P to end.

Row 2: K to last 2 sts, P1, K1.

These 2 rows form patt.

Cont in patt until left front matches back to beg of armhole shaping, ending with a WS row.

Shape armhole

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next row.

28 (29: 31: 32: 34) sts.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st armhole edge of next 3 rows, then on foll 2 (2: 3: 3: 4) alt rows, 23 (24: 25: 26: 27) sts.

Cont straight until 11 (11: 11: 13: 13) rows less have been worked than on back to start of shoulder shaping, ending with a RS row.

Shape neck

Cast off 4 (5: 5: 5: 5) sts at beg of next row.

19 (19: 20: 21: 22) sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 5 rows, then on foll 1 (1: 1: 2: 2) alt rows, 13 (13: 14: 14: 15) sts.

Work 3 rows, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 4 (4: 5: 5: 5) sts at beg of next and foll alt row.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 5 (5: 4: 4: 5) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 27 (28: 30: 31: 33) sts using 6mm (US 10) needles.

Row 1 (RS): K1, P1, *K3, P3, rep from * to last 1 (2: 4: 5: 1) sts, K1 (2: 3: 3: 1), P0 (0: 1: 2: 0).

Row 2: P1 (2: 0: 0: 1), K3 (3: 1: 2: 3), *P3, K3, rep from * to last 5 sts, P3, K2.

Rep last 2 rows 8 times more.

Change to 6½mm (US 10½) needles and cont in patt as follows:

Row 1 (RS): K1, P1, K to end.

Row 2: P to last 2 sts, K2.

Rep last 2 rows once more, inc 1 st at end of first row, 28 (29: 31: 32: 34) sts.

Divide for pocket

Next row (RS): K1, P1, K15 (15: 16: 16: 17), turn and leave rem 11 (12: 13: 14: 15) sts on a holder.

Cont on these 17 (17: 18: 18: 19) sts for pocket front as follows:

Next row (WS): K1, P to last 2 sts, K2.

Next row: K1, P1, K to end.

Rep last 2 rows 9 times more and then first of these 2 rows again.

Break yarn and leave sts on a second holder.

Work pocket back

Next row (RS): Cast on 15 (15: 16: 16: 17) sts (for pocket back), then with RS facing K11 (12: 13: 14: 15) sts left on first holder.

Beg with a P row, work 21 rows in st st on these sts at **the same time** inc 1 st at side seam edge of every 6th row from previous inc, ending with a WS row, 29 (30: 32: 33: 35) sts.

Join sections

Return to sts left on second holder for pocket front, rejoin yarn with RS facing and cont as follows:

Next row (RS): K1, P1, then holding WS of pocket front against RS of pocket back, K tog next st of pocket front with first st of pocket back, K tog rem 14 (14: 15: 15: 16) sts of pocket front with sts of pocket back, K rem 14 (15: 16: 17: 18) sts from second holder, 31 (32: 34: 35: 37) sts.

Cont in patt as follows:

Row 1 (RS): P to last 2 sts, K2.

Row 2: K1, P1, K to end.

These 2 rows form patt.






Work 4 rows in garter st.

Shape top

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 37 (39: 41: 43: 45) sts. Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 rows, then on foll alt row, then on every foll 4th row until 23 (25: 27: 29: 31) sts rem.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll alt row until 19 (21: 21: 23: 23) sts rem, then on foll 3 rows, ending with a WS row.

Cast off rem 13 (15: 15: 17: 17) sts.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the info page. Join both shoulder seams using back stitch.

Collar

With RS facing and 6½mm (US 10½) needles, starting and ending at front opening edges, pick up and knit 24 (23: 26: 25: 28) sts up right side of neck, 19 (21: 21: 23: 23) sts from back, and 24 (23: 26: 25: 28) sts down left side of neck. 67 (67: 73: 73: 79) sts.

Row 1 (RS of collar, WS of garment): K1, P1, K3, *P3, K3, rep from * to last 2 sts, P1, K1.

Row 2: K2, P3, *K3, P3, rep from * to last 2 sts, K2. Rep last 2 rows for 10 cm.

Cast off in rib.

Insert zip into front opening. See information page for finishing instructions, setting in sleeves using the set-in method.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row. 25 (25: 26: 27: 28) sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 3 rows, then on foll 3 (3: 3: 4: 4) alt rows, then on foll 4th row. 18 (18: 19: 19: 20) sts.

Work 5 rows, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 6 (6: 6: 7) sts at beg of next and foll alt row. Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 6 (6: 7: 7: 6) sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 25 (27: 27: 27: 27) sts, patt to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 51 (51: 53: 55: 55) sts using 3½mm (US 3) needles.

Work 4 rows in garter st.

Change to 4mm (US 6) needles and cont in patt from chart, setting sts as follows:

Row 1 (RS): (K2, K2tog, K3, yfwd) 0 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K2 (5: 1: 1: 4), *yfwd, K3, sl 1, K2tog, pss, K3, yfwd, K1, rep from * to last 1 (4: 7: 0: 3) sts, (yfwd, K3, sl 1, K1, pss) 0 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K1 (4: 2: 0: 3).

Noting that all incs are worked on WS rows to help keep patt correct, inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 12th row until there are 115 (121: 127: 133: 139) sts, taking inc sts into patt.

Cont straight until back measures 30 (31: 31: 32: 32) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Keeping patt correct, cast off 5 (5: 6: 6: 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 105 (111: 115: 121: 125) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 5 (7: 7: 9: 9) rows, then on foll 6 (6: 7: 7: 8) alt rows. 83 (85: 87: 89: 91) sts.

Cont straight until armhole measures 20 (20: 21: 21:

22) cm, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 6 (6: 6: 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

71 (73: 75: 77: 77) sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off 6 (6: 6: 6: 7) sts, patt until there are 10 (10: 11: 11: 10) sts on right needle and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Row 1 (RS): (K2, K2tog, K3, yfwd) 0 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K2 (5: 1: 1: 4), *yfwd, K3, sl 1, K2tog, pss, K3, yfwd, K1, rep from * to end.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: (K2, K2tog, K2, yfwd) 0 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K1 (4: 1: 0: 3), P1, *K1, yfwd, K2, sl 1, K2tog, pss, K2, yfwd, K1, P1, rep from * to end.

Row 4: *K1, P9, rep from * to last 2 (5: 8: 1: 4) sts, K1, P1 (4: 7: 0: 3).

Row 5: (K2, K2tog, K1, yfwd) 0 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K1 (4: 2: 0: 3), P1, *K2, yfwd, K1, sl 1, K2tog, pss, K1, yfwd, K2, P1, rep from * to end.

Row 6: As row 4.

Row 7: (K2, K2tog, yfwd) 0 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K1 (4: 3: 0: 3), P1, *K3, yfwd, sl 1, K2tog, pss, yfwd, K3, P1, rep from * to end.

Row 8: Purl.

These 8 rows form patt.

Patt a further 3 (5: 5: 7: 7) rows.

Keeping patt correct, inc 1 st at end of next and every foll 12th row until there are 58 (61: 64: 67: 70) sts, taking inc sts into patt.

Cont straight until left front matches back to beg of armhole shaping, ending with a WS row.

Shape armhole

Keeping patt correct, cast off 5 (5: 6: 6: 7) sts at beg of next row. 53 (56: 58: 61: 63) sts.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at armhole edge of next 5 (7: 7: 9: 9) rows, then on foll 6 (6: 7: 7: 8) alt rows. 42 (43: 44: 45: 46) sts. Cont straight until 27 (27: 27: 29: 29) rows less have been worked than on back to start of shoulder shaping, ending with a RS row.

Shape neck

Keeping patt correct, cast off 8 (9: 9: 9: 9) sts at beg of next row and 4 sts at beg of foll alt row.

30 (30: 31: 32: 33) sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 3 rows, then on foll 3 (3: 3: 4: 4) alt rows, then on every foll 4th row until 22 (22: 23: 23: 24) sts rem.

Work 7 rows, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 7 (7: 8: 8: 8) sts at beg of next and foll alt row. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 8 (8: 7: 7: 8) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 52 (55: 58: 61: 64) sts using 3 1/4 mm (US 3) needles.

Work 4 rows in garter st.

Change to 4 mm (US 6) needles and cont in patt from chart, setting sts as follows:

Row 1 (RS): K1, *yfwd, K3, sl 1, K2tog, pss, K3, yfwd, K1, rep from * to last 1 (4: 7: 0: 3) sts, (yfwd, K3, sl 1, K1, pss) 0 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K1 (4: 2: 0: 3).

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: P1, *K1, yfwd, K2, sl 1, K2tog, pss, K2, yfwd, K1, P1, rep from * to last 1 (4: 7: 0: 3) sts, (K1, yfwd, K2, sl 1, K1, pss) 0 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K1 (4: 2: 0: 3).

Row 4: P1 (4: 7: 0: 3), *K1, P9, rep from * to last st, K1.

Row 5: P1, *K2, yfwd, K1, sl 1, K2tog, pss, K1, yfwd, K2, P1, rep from * to last 1 (4: 7: 0: 3) sts, (K2, yfwd, K1, sl 1, K1, pss) 0 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K1 (4: 2: 0: 3).

Row 6: As row 4.

Row 7: P1, *K3, yfwd, sl 1, K2tog, pss, yfwd, K3, P1, rep from * to last 1 (4: 7: 0: 3) sts, (K3, yfwd, sl 1, K1, pss) 0 (0: 1: 0: 0) times, K1 (4: 2: 0: 3).

Row 8: Purl.






These 2 rows form moss st.

Work a further 6 rows in moss st.

Change to 4mm (US 6) needles.

Keeping moss st between cables correct as now set, work a further 17 rows in patt, ending with a WS row.

Next row (RS) (inc): Moss st 3 (6: 3: 6: 3), *K6, M1, moss st 7 (7: 9: 9: 11), M1, rep from * twice more, K6, moss st 9 (9: 11: 11: 13), K6, **M1, moss st 7 (7: 9: 9: 11), M1, K6, rep from ** twice more, moss st 3 (6: 3: 6: 3). 117 (123: 131: 137: 145) sts.

Cont in patt until back measures 31 (32: 32: 33: 33) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Keeping patt correct, cast off 4 (4: 5: 5: 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

109 (115: 121: 127: 133) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 5 (7: 9: 9: 11) rows, then on foll 4 (4: 5: 5: 6) alt rows, then on every foll 4th row until 85 (87: 91: 93: 97) sts rem.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Shape top

Keeping patt correct, cast off 4 (4: 5: 5: 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 7 rows, then on foll 5 (6: 5: 6: 5) alt rows, then on every foll 4th row until 41 sts rem.

Collar

Cast on 91 (95: 95: 99: 99) sts using 3 1/4mm (US 3) needles.

Work in moss st as given for sleeves for 8 cm, ending with a WS row.

Cast off 11 (12: 12: 13: 13) sts at beg of next 2 rows, then 8 sts at beg of foll 4 rows.

Cast off rem 37 (39: 39: 41: 41) sts.

Sew cast-off edge of collar to neck edge, placing row ends 5 sts in from front openings edges.




Row 10: K3, *P1, K3, rep from * to end.

These 10 rows complete bell ruffle.

Cont using yarn F and purl 4 rows, dec 1 (0: 0: 1: 1) st at each end of first of these rows.

89 (95: 99: 105: 109) sts.

Change to 5mm (US 8) needles.

Using the **fair isle** technique described on the information page, starting and ending rows as indicated and beg with a K row, work 11 rows from body chart, which is worked entirely in st st.

Break off all contrast colours and cont in yarn A as follows: Beg with a P row, cont in st st until back measures 30 (31: 31: 32: 32) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

81 (87: 91: 97: 101) sts.

Next row (RS): K3, K3tog, K to last 6 sts, K3tog tbl, K3.

Next row:

Purl. Rep last 2 rows once more, 73 (79: 83: 89: 93) sts.

Cont straight until armhole measures 20 (20: 21: 21: 22) cm, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 7 (8: 8: 9: 10) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

59 (63: 67: 71: 73) sts.

Next row (RS): Cast off 7 (8: 8: 9: 10) sts, K until there are 11 (11: 13: 13: 13) sts on right needle and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

Cast off rem 7 (7: 9: 9: 9) sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 23 (25: 25: 27: 27) sts, K to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.

LEFT FRONT

Cast on 91 (99: 99: 107: 115) sts using 4mm (US 6) needles and yarn C.

Break off yarn C, join in yarn F and work the 10 bell ruffle rows as for back, 47 (51: 51: 55: 59) sts.

Cont using yarn F and purl 4 rows, dec 1 (2: 0: 1: 3) sts evenly across of first of these rows, 46 (49: 51: 54: 56) sts.

Change to 5mm (US 8) needles.

Starting and ending rows as indicated and beg with a K row, work 11 rows from body chart.

Break off all contrast colours and cont in yarn A as follows:

Beg with a P row, cont in st st until left front matches back to beg of armhole shaping, ending with a WS row.

Shape armhole

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row, 42 (45: 47: 50: 52) sts.

Work 1 row.

Next row (RS): K3, K3tog, K to end.

Next row:

Purl. Rep last 2 rows once more, 38 (41: 43: 46: 48) sts.

Cont straight until 17 (17: 17: 19: 19) rows less have been worked than on back to start of shoulder shaping, ending with a RS row.

Shape neck

Cast off 9 (10: 10: 10: 10) sts at beg of next row.

29 (31: 33: 36: 38) sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 5 rows, then on foll 3 (3: 3: 4: 4) alt rows, 21 (23: 25: 27: 29) sts.

Work 5 rows, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 7 (8: 8: 9: 10) sts at beg of next and foll alt row.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 7 (7: 9: 9: 9) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Work to match left front, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 43 (43: 45: 45: 47) sts using 4mm (US 6) needles and yarn C.

Work 6 rows in garter st.

Change to 5mm (US 8) needles.

Using the **fair isle** technique described on the information page, starting and ending rows as indicated, work 7 rows from sleeve chart.

Break off all contrast colours and cont in yarn A as follows:

Beg with a P row, cont in st st, inc 1 st at each end of 2nd and every foll 6th row until there are 63 (63: 65: 65: 63) sts, then on every foll 4th row until there are 77 (77: 81: 81: 85) sts.

Cont straight until sleeve measures 43 (43: 44: 44: 44) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape top

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 69 (69: 73: 73: 77) sts.

Next row (RS):

Knit.

Next row:

Purl.

Next row:

K3, K3tog, K to last 6 sts, K3tog tbl, K3.

Next row:

Purl.

Rep last 4 rows once more.

Cast off rem 61 (61: 65: 65: 69) sts.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the information page.

Join both shoulder seams using back stitch.

Button band

With RS facing, 4mm (US 6) needles and yarn C, pick up and knit 82 (84: 86: 86: 88) sts evenly down left front opening edge, from neck shaping to cast-on edge.

Knit 2 rows.

Cast off knitwise (on WS).

Buttonhole band

With RS facing, 4mm (US 6) needles and yarn C, pick up and knit 82 (84: 86: 86: 88) sts evenly up right front opening edge, from cast-on edge to neck shaping.

Next row (WS): K2, *yfwd, K2tog, K12, rep from * 4 times more, yfwd, K2tog, K8 (10: 12: 12: 14).

Knit 1 row.

Cast off knitwise (on WS).

Neckband

With RS facing, 4mm (US 6) needles and yarn C, starting and ending at cast-off edge of front bands, pick up and knit 30 (31: 31: 34: 34) sts up right side of neck, 31 (33: 33: 35: 35) sts from back, and 30 (31: 31: 34: 34) sts down left side of neck, 91 (95: 95: 103: 103) sts.

Knit 2 rows.



TENSION

13 sts and 22 rows to 10 cm measured over moss stitch using 6½mm (US 10½) needles.

POCKET LININGS (make 2)

Cast on 19 sts using 6½mm (US 10½) needles.

Row 1 (RS): K1, *P1, K1, rep from * to end.

Row 2: As row 1.

These 2 rows form moss st.

Work a further 22 rows in moss st.

Break yarn and leave sts on a holder.

LEFT FRONT

Note: As row end edges of fronts form actual finished edges of garment, it is important these edges are kept neat. Therefore, all new balls of yarn should be joined in at side seam or armhole edges of rows.

Lower left front

Cast on 43 (45: 47: 49: 51) sts using 5½mm (US 9) needles.

Knit 3 rows, ending with a RS row.

Change to 6½mm (US 10½) needles and cont in moss st as given for pocket linings until work measures 70 cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

(Note: if you wish to alter finished length of coat, alter length to this point accordingly.)

Place pocket

Next row (RS): Moss st 12 (12: 14: 14: 16), slip next 31 (33: 33: 35: 35) sts onto a holder and in their place moss st across 19 sts of first pocket lining.

Work 39 rows on these 31 (31: 33: 33: 35) sts, ending with a WS row.

Break yarn and leave sts on a second holder.

Work pocket front

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to sts from first holder and work 40 rows in moss st.

Break yarn.

Join sections

Next row (RS): Moss st first 12 (12: 14: 14: 16) sts from second holder, then holding WS of pocket front against RS of pocket lining, work tog first st of pocket front with next st of pocket lining, work tog rem 18 sts of pocket front, then moss st rem 12 (14: 14: 16: 16) sts.

Cont straight until lower left front measures 104 cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

(Note: if length to pocket has been adjusted, remember to adjust this length by same amount.)

Cast off in moss st.

Upper left front

Cast on 43 (45: 47: 49: 51) sts using 6½mm (US 10½) needles.

Work in moss st as given for pocket linings until work measures 11 cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape armhole

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

39 (41: 43: 45: 47) sts.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at armhole edge of next 6 rows.

33 (35: 37: 39: 41) sts.

Cont straight until armhole measures

21 (21: 22: 21: 22) cm, ending with a RS row.

Shape neck

Cast off 9 (10: 10: 11: 11) sts at beg of next row.

24 (25: 27: 28: 30) sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next and every foll alt row until 19 (20: 22: 23: 25) sts rem.

Cont straight until armhole measures

28 (28: 29: 29: 30) cm, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 6 (7: 7: 8: 8) sts at beg of next and foll alt row.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 7 (6: 8: 7: 9) sts.

Holding pieces with WS tog, join left fronts using back stitch.

Mark positions for 7 buttons on left front - lowest button to be 55 cm up from lower edge, top button to be 3 cm below neck shaping and rem 5 buttons evenly spaced between.

RIGHT FRONT

Lower right front

Work as given for lower left front until work measures 55 cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Next row (RS) (buttonhole row): Moss st 5, cast off 2 sts (for buttonhole - cast on 2 sts over these sts on next row), moss st to end.

Making a further 6 buttonholes to correspond with positions marked for buttons on left front, cont as follows:

Cont straight until lower right front matches lower left front to start of pocket, ending with a WS row.

Place pocket

Next row (RS): Moss st 31 (33: 33: 35: 35) and turn, leaving rem 12 (12: 14: 14: 16) sts on a holder.

Work 39 rows on these 31 (31: 33: 33: 35) sts for pocket front, ending with a WS row.

Leave these sts on a second holder and set aside this ball of yarn.

Work pocket back

With RS facing and using new ball of yarn, rejoin yarn to 19 sts of second pocket lining and moss st to end, then moss st across 12 (12: 14: 14: 16) sts from first holder.

Work 39 rows on these 31 (33: 33: 35: 35) sts.

Break yarn.

Join sections

Next row (RS): Using ball of yarn set to one side, moss st first 12 (14: 14: 16: 16) sts of pocket front, then holding WS of pocket front against RS of pocket lining, work tog next st of pocket front with first st of pocket lining, work tog rem 18 sts of pocket front with next 18 sts of pocket lining, then moss st rem 12 (12: 14: 14: 16) sts.

Cont straight until lower right front matches lower left front to cast-off edge, ending with a WS row.

Cast off in moss st.

Upper right front

Cast on 43 (45: 47: 49: 51) sts using 6½mm (US 10½) needles.

Remembering to make buttonholes at positions required, work in moss st as given for pocket linings until upper right front measures 11 cm from cast-on edge, ending with a RS row.

Shape armhole

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row. 39 (41: 43: 45: 47) sts. Complete to match upper left front, reversing shapings. Holding pieces with WS tog, join right fronts using back stitch.

RIGHT BACK

Note: As row end edges of backs form actual finished edges of vent for first 56 cm, it is important these edges are kept neat. Therefore, all new balls of yarn should be joined in at side seam edges of rows.

Cast on 39 (41: 43: 45: 47) sts using 5½mm (US 9) needles.

Knit 3 rows, ending with a RS row.

Change to 6½mm (US 10½) needles and cont in moss st as given for pocket linings until right back matches fronts to beg of armhole shaping, ending with a WS row.

Shape armhole

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

35 (37: 39: 41: 43) sts.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at armhole edge of next 6 rows.

29 (31: 33: 35: 37) sts.

Cont straight until right back matches fronts to start of shoulder shaping, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulder and back neck

Cast off 6 (7: 7: 8: 8) sts at beg of next row, 6 (7: 7: 8: 8) sts at beg of foll row, 6 (7: 7: 8: 8) sts at beg of next row, and 4 sts at beg of foll row.

Cast off rem 7 (6: 8: 7: 9) sts.

LEFT BACK

Cast on 47 (49: 51: 53: 55) sts using 5½mm (US 9) needles.

Knit 3 rows, ending with a RS row.

Change to 6½mm (US 10½) needles and cont in moss st as given for pocket linings until left back measures 56 cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape back vent

Dec 1 st at beg of next row and at same edge on foll 7 rows. 39 (41: 43: 45: 47) sts.

Cont straight until left back matches fronts to beg of armhole shaping, ending with a RS row.

Shape armhole

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row.

35 (37: 39: 41: 43) sts.

Complete to match right back, reversing shapings and ending with a RS row before shaping shoulder and back neck.

Holding pieces with WS tog, join centre back seam above vent using back stitch. Lay right back over left back so first 56 cm overlap by 8 sts and sew through all layers along shaped edge at top of vent.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 43 (43: 45: 47: 47) sts using 6½mm (US 10½) needles.

Purl 2 rows, ending with a WS row.

Viktoriya Sh

Work in moss st as given for pocket linings for 18 rows, dec 1 st at each end of 9th and foll 8th row. 39 (39; 41; 43; 43) sts.

Change to 5½mm (US 9) needles and cont in moss st for a further 16 rows, inc 1 st at each end of 7th and foll 6th row.

43 (43; 45; 47; 47) sts.

Change to 6½mm (US 10½) needles and cont in moss st, inc 1 st at each end of 3rd and every foll 6th row until there are 63 (63; 65; 71; 67) sts, then on every foll 4th row until there are 73 (73; 75; 75; 77) sts. Cont straight until sleeve measures 55 (55; 56; 56; 56) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape top

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

65 (65; 67; 67; 69) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and foll 6 alt rows.

Work 1 row, ending with a WS row.

Cast off rem 51 (51; 53; 53; 55) sts.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the information page.

Join both shoulder seams using back stitch.




Cast on 57 (61; 61; 65; 65) sts using 5½mm (US 9) needles.

Work in moss st as given for pocket linings for 20 cm. Cast off in moss st.

Fold collar in half lengthways with WS tog and sew ends closed. Sew open edges to neck edge, placing ends of collar halfway across top of front neck cast-off sts.

See information page for finishing instructions, setting in sleeves using the shallow set-in method and reversing sleeve seam for first 13 cm for turnback cuff. Fold first 10 cm to RS to form cuff. To help support weight of coat and stop neck and shoulders stretching, lay coat flat and cut a length of tape to fit across entire shoulder and back neck edge. On inside of coat, lay tape over seams and slip stitch in place along both edges.




Next row: K2, (P1, K1) twice.

Next row: Cast off 3 sts, P2.

Next row: K2, P1.

Both sleeves

Cast off rem 3 sts.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the information page.

Join both front and right back raglan seams using back stitch.

Collar

With RS facing, 4mm (US 6) needles and yarn B, pick up and knit 8 sts from top of left sleeve, 10 sts down left side of neck, 21 (22: 23: 25: 25) sts from front, 10 sts up right side of neck, 8 sts from top of right sleeve, and 28 (30: 32: 33: 33) sts from back. 85 (88: 91: 94: 94) sts.

Row 1 (WS of body, RS of collar): K1, *P2, K1, rep from * to end.

Row 2: P1, *K2, P1, rep from * to end.

Rep last 2 rows until collar measures 8 cm from pick-up row.

Next row: K2, P1.

Next row: P3tog.

Next row: K1 and fasten off.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 57 (59: 61: 63: 65) sts using 5mm (US 8) needles.

Row 1 (RS of sleeve, WS of cuff): K1 (2: 0: 1: 2), *P1, K2, rep from * to last 2 (0: 1: 2: 0) sts, P1 (0: 1: 1: 0), K1 (0: 0: 1: 0).

With RS facing, 3½/mm (US 3) needles and yarn D, pick up and knit 136 (139: 142) sts evenly along left front opening edge.

Row 1 (WS): Knit (to form foldline).

Beg with a K row, work in st st for 14 rows.

Cast off.

Right front facing

With RS facing, 3½/mm (US 3) needles and yarn D, pick up and knit 136 (139: 142) sts evenly along right front opening edge.

Row 1 (WS): Knit (to form foldline).

Beg with a K row, work in st st for 4 rows.

Row 6 (RS): K18 (21: 24) and turn.

Purl 1 row on these 18 (21: 24) sts.

Break yarn.

**Return to rem sts, rejoin yarn with RS facing, K2tog, K17 and turn.

Purl 1 row on these 18 sts.

Break yarn.

Rep from ** 5 times more.

With RS facing, join all sections as follows:





Next row: Cast off 3 sts, K1.

Right sleeve only

Next row (RS): Cast off 4 sts, P2tog tbl, P1, K3. 6 sts.

Next row: K1, P2, K2, P1.

Next row: Cast off 4 sts, K1. 2 sts.

Work 9 (11: 11: 13: 13) rows, ending with chart row 104 (106: 108: 110: 112).

Shape armhole

Keeping chart correct, cast off 4 (4: 5: 5: 6) sts at beg of next row. 49 (52: 54: 57: 59) sts.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at armhole edge of next 5 (7: 7: 9: 9) rows, then on foll 4 (4: 5: 5: 6) alt rows. 40 (41: 42: 43: 44) sts.

Cont straight until chart row 151 (153: 157: 157: 161) has been completed, ending with a RS row.

Shape neck

Keeping chart correct, cast off 8 sts at beg of next row, and 4 sts at beg of foll alt row. 28 (29: 30: 31: 32) sts.

Dec 1 st at neck edge of next 3 rows, then on foll 2 (3: 3: 4: 4) alt rows, then on foll 4th row.

22 (22: 23: 23: 24) sts.

Cont straight until chart row 172 (174: 178: 180: 184) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 7 (7: 8: 8: 8) sts at beg of next and foll alt row.

Work 1 row. Cast off rem 8 (8: 7: 8) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 58 (61: 64: 67: 70) sts using 3½mm (US 3) needles and yarn A.

Work in garter st for 3 rows.

Row 4 (WS): K0 (1: 0: 1: 0), *P1, K1, rep from * to end.

Row 5: K1, P2tog, yrn (to make a buttonhole), P1, *K1, P1, rep from * to last 0 (1: 0: 1: 0) st, K0 (1: 0: 1: 0).

Work in moss st as set for a further 2 rows.

Row 8 (WS): Moss st to last 5 sts and turn, leaving last 5 sts on a holder for buttonhole band.

53 (56: 59: 62: 65) sts.

Change to 3½mm (US 5) needles and work in patt foll body chart as follows:

Work 2 (2: 4: 4: 6) rows. Dec 1 st at end of next and every foll 6th row until 46 (49: 52: 55: 58) sts rem.

Work to match left front, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 49 (49: 53: 53: 53) sts using 3½mm (US 3) needles and yarn A.

Work in garter st for 3 rows.

Work in moss st as given for back for 5 rows, ending with a WS row.

Change to 3½mm (US 5) needles and work in patt foll sleeve chart as follows:

Work 2 rows.

Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 8th row until there are 79 (79: 83: 83: 87) sts.

Cont straight until chart row 132 (132: 134: 134: 136) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape top

Keeping chart correct, cast off 4 (4: 5: 5: 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 71 (71: 73: 73: 75) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 rows, then on foll 3 alt rows, then on every foll 4th row until 47 (47: 49: 49: 51) sts rem.

Work 1 row, ending with a WS row.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and foll 1 (1: 2: 2: 3) alt rows, then on foll 7 rows. 29 sts.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Cast off rem 21 sts.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the info page. Join both shoulder seams using back stitch.

Button band

Slip 5 sts left on holder for button band onto 3½mm (US 3) needles and rejoin yarn A with RS facing. Cont in moss st as set until band, when slightly stretched, fits up left front opening edge to neck shaping, ending with a WS row. Cast off. Slip stitch band in place.

Mark positions for 7 buttons on this band - lowest button level with buttonhole already made in right front, top button 1 cm below neck shaping and rem 5 buttons evenly spaced between.

Buttonhole band

Work as given for button band, rejoining yarn with RS facing and with the addition of a further 6 buttonholes to correspond with positions marked for buttons worked as follows:

Buttonhole row (RS): K1, P2tog, yrn (to make a buttonhole), P1, K1.

Slip stitch band in place.

Neckband

With RS facing, 3½mm (US 3) needles and yarn A, starting and ending halfway across top of front bands, pick up and knit 36 (37: 37: 39: 39) sts up right side of neck, 35 (37: 37: 39: 39) sts from back, and 36 (37: 37: 39: 39) sts down left side of neck.

107 (111: 111: 117: 117) sts.


Row 1 (WS): K1, *P1, K1, rep from * to end.


Rep last row 4 times more.

Knit 3 rows.

Cast off knitwise (on WS).

See information page for finishing instructions, setting in sleeves using the set-in method.

TENSION

22 sts and 30 rows to 10 cm measured over reverse stocking stitch using 4mm (US 6) needles.

Pattern note: When working increases, work the "M1P" by picking up loop lying between needles and **purling** into back of this loop.

BACK

Cast on 117 (123: 129: 135: 141) sts using 3 1/4mm (US 3) needles.

Row 1 (RS): K2, *P1, K1, rep from * to last st, K1.

Row 2: K1, *P1, K1, rep from * to end.

Rep last 2 rows twice more.

Change to 4mm (US 6) needles.

Row 7 (RS): K2, (P1, K1) twice, P to last 6 sts, (K1, P1) twice, K2.

Row 8: (K1, P1) 3 times, K to last 6 sts, (P1, K1) 3 times. These 2 rows form patt and are repeated throughout. Cont in patt until back measures 23 cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Next row (RS) (dec): Patt 9, P2tog, P to last 11 sts, P2togtbl, patt 9.

Work 5 rows straight.


Rep last 6 rows 3 times more and then first of these rows (the dec row) again.

107 (113: 119: 125: 131) sts.

Work 9 (9: 11: 11: 13) rows, ending with a WS row.

Next row (RS) (inc): Patt 8, M1P, P to last 8 sts, M1P, patt 8.

Work 7 rows straight.



Rep last 8 rows 3 times more and then first of these rows (the inc row) again.

117 (123: 129: 135: 141) sts.

Cont straight until back measures 50 (51: 51: 51: 52) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape raglan armholes

Cast off 5 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

107 (113: 119: 125: 131) sts.

Next row (RS): K2, (P1, K1) twice, P1, P2tog, P to last 9 sts, P2togtbl, P1, (K1, P1) twice, K2.

Next row: (K1, P1) 3 times, K1, K2togtbl, K to last 9 sts, K2tog, K1, (P1, K1) 3 times.

Rep last 2 rows 1 (2: 4: 5: 7) times.

99 (101: 99: 101: 99) sts.

Next row (RS): K2, (P1, K1) twice, P1, P2tog, P to last 9 sts, P2togtbl, P1, (K1, P1) twice, K2.

Next row: (K1, P1) 3 times, K to last 6 sts, (P1, K1) 3 times.

Rep last 2 rows 33 (33: 32: 32: 31) times.

Cast off rem 31 (33: 33: 35: 35) sts.

LEFT FRONT

Cast on 65 (69: 71: 75: 77) sts using 3 1/4 mm (US 3) needles.

Row 1 (RS): K2, *P1, K1, rep from * to last st, K1.

Row 2: K1, *P1, K1, rep from * to end.

Rep last 2 rows twice more.

Change to 4mm (US 6) needles.

Row 7 (RS): K2, (P1, K1) twice, P to last 8 sts, (K1, P1) 3 times, K2.

Row 8: (K1, P1) 4 times, K to last 6 sts, (P1, K1) 3 times.

These 2 rows form patt and are repeated throughout. Cont in patt until left front measures 23 cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Next row (RS) (dec): Patt 9, P2tog, patt to end.

Work 5 rows straight.

Rep last 6 rows 3 times more and then first of these rows (the dec row) again.

60 (64: 66: 70: 72) sts.

Work 9 (9: 11: 11: 13) rows, ending with a WS row.

Next row (RS) (inc): Patt 8, M1P, patt to end.

Work 7 rows straight.

Rep last 8 rows 3 times more and then first of these rows (the inc row) again.

65 (69: 71: 75: 77) sts.

Cont straight until left front matches back to beg of raglan armhole shaping, ending with a WS row.

Shape raglan armhole

Cast off 5 sts at beg of next row.

60 (64: 66: 70: 72) sts.

Work 1 row.

Next row (RS): K2, (P1, K1) twice, P1, P2tog, P to last 8 sts, (K1, P1) 3 times, K2.

Next row: (K1, P1) 4 times, K to last 9 sts, K2tog, K1, (P1, K1) 3 times.

Rep last 2 rows 1 (2: 4: 5: 7) times.

56 (58: 58: 58: 56) sts.

Next row (RS): K2, (P1, K1) twice, P1, P2tog, P to last 8 sts, (K1, P1) 3 times, K2.

Next row: (K1, P1) 4 times, K to last 6 sts, (P1, K1) 3 times.

Rep last 2 rows 30 (30: 29: 29: 28) times, ending with a WS row.

Leave rem 25 (27: 26: 28: 27) sts on a holder.

Mark positions for 6 buttons on this front - first to be 20 cm up from cast-on edge, last to be 2 cm above beg of raglan armhole shaping and rem 4 buttons evenly spaced between.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 65 (69: 71: 75: 77) sts using 3 1/4 mm (US 3) needles.

Row 1 (RS): K2, *P1, K1, rep from * to last st, K1.

Row 2: K1, *P1, K1, rep from * to end.

Rep last 2 rows twice more.

Change to 4mm (US 6) needles.

Row 7 (RS): K2, (P1, K1) 3 times, P to last 6 sts, (K1, P1) twice, K2.

Row 8: (K1, P1) 3 times, K to last 8 sts, (P1, K1)

4 times.

These 2 rows form patt and are repeated throughout. Cont in patt until right front measures 20 cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Next row (RS) (buttonhole row): K2, P1, K1, yfwd, K2tog, P1, K1, patt to end.

Cont in patt until right front measures 23 cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Next row (RS) (dec): Patt to last 11 sts, P2togtbl, patt 9.

Complete to match left front, reversing shapings and making a further 5 buttonholes to correspond with positions marked for buttons.

When right front is complete, do NOT break off yarn but set this ball of yarn to one side - it will be used for hood.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 67 (67: 69: 71: 71) sts using 3 1/4 mm (US 3) needles.

Row 1 (RS): K2, *P1, K1, rep from * to last st, K1.

Row 2: K1, *P1, K1, rep from * to end.

Rep last 2 rows twice more.

Change to 4mm (US 6) needles.

Next row (RS): K2, (P1, K1) twice, P to last 6 sts, (K1, P1) twice, K2.

Next row: (K1, P1) 3 times, K to last 6 sts, (P1, K1) 3 times.

These 2 rows form patt.

Working all increases 8 sts in from ends of rows as on back and fronts, inc 1 st at both ends of next and every foll 8th row until there are 81 (75: 79: 81: 75) sts, then on every foll 6th row until there are 103 (105: 107: 109: 111) sts.

Cont straight until sleeve measures 45 (45: 46: 46: 46) cm from cast-on edge, ending with a WS row.

Shape raglan armhole

Cast off 5 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

93 (95: 97: 99: 101) sts.

Next row (RS): K2, (P1, K1) twice, P1, P2tog, P to last 9 sts, P2togtbl, P1, (K1, P1) twice, K2.

Next row: (K1, P1) 3 times, K1, K2togtbl, K to last 9 sts, K2tog, K1, (P1, K1) 3 times.

Rep last 2 rows twice, 81 (83: 85: 87: 89) sts.

Next row (RS): Patt 7, P2tog, P to last 9 sts, P2togtbl, patt 7.

Next row: Patt 6, K to last 6 sts, patt 6.

Rep last 2 rows until 21 sts rem, ending with a WS row.

Left sleeve only

Next row (RS): Patt 7, P2tog, P3, P2togtbl, patt 7.

Cast off 5 sts at beg of next row, 14 sts.

Next row: Patt 7, P2tog, P4, K1.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row, 9 sts.

Next row: Patt 7, P2tog.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row, 4 sts.

Right sleeve only

Next row (RS): Cast off 6 sts, P to last 9 sts, P2togtbl, patt 7, 14 sts.

Work 1 row.

Next row: Cast off 4 sts, P2togtbl, patt 7, 9 sts.

Work 1 row.

Next row: Cast off 5 sts, P1, K1, P1, 4 sts.

Work 1 row.

Both sleeves

Cast off rem 4 sts.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the information page.

Join raglan seams using back stitch.

Hood

With RS facing and 4mm (US 6) needles, using ball of yarn left at top of right front, patt across 25 (27: 26: 28: 27) sts of right front, pick up and knit 13 sts from top of right sleeve, 31 (33: 33: 35: 35) sts from back placing marker on centre st, and 13 sts from top of

left sleeve, then patt across 25 (27: 26: 28: 27) sts of left front, 107 (113: 111: 117: 115) sts.

Row 1 (WS): (K1, P1) 4 times, K to last 8 sts, (P1, K1) 4 times.

Keeping 8 sts at front edges in rib as set, cont in rev st st as follows:

Next row (RS) (inc): Patt to marked centre st, M1P, P marked st, M1P, patt to end.

Work 5 rows.

Rep last 6 rows 4 times more and then first of these rows (the inc row) again.

119 (125: 123: 129: 127) sts.

Cont straight until hood measures 30 cm from pick-up row, ending with a WS row.

Shape top

Row 1 (RS) (dec): Patt to within 2 sts of marked st, P2tog, P marked st, P2togtbl, patt to end.

Work 3 rows.

Row 5: As row 1.

Work 1 row.

Row 7: As row 1.

Row 8: Patt to within 2 sts of marked st, K2togtbl, K marked st, K2tog, patt to end.

Rep last 2 rows 3 times more and then first of these 2 rows again, 97 (103: 101: 107: 105) sts.

Work 1 row, dec 1 st at centre.

96 (102: 100: 106: 104) sts.

Next row (RS): Patt 48 (51: 50: 53: 52) sts and turn. Fold hood in half with WS tog and, using a spare needle, cast off sts from both needles tog to form hood seam.

Tie belt

Cast on 9 sts using 3 1/4 mm (US 3) needles.


Row 1 (RS): K2, (P1, K1) 3 times, K1.

Row 2: K1, (P1, K1) 4 times.

Rep last 2 rows until tie belt measures 150 cm.

Cast off in rib.

See information page for finishing instructions, leaving side seams open for first 40 rows.



Felted Cushions

KIM HARGREAVES



YARN

You can use any woollen yarn that will shrink when hot washed. The cushions shown are knitted in Rowan DK Tweed and Felted Tweed. To make the cushions shown in the photograph, you will also need backing fabric, contrast yarns for the embroidery and 5 buttons.

NEEDLES

Use the size of knitting needle recommended for the yarn - details will be on the ball band. This will give a really firm felted fabric. If you want a slightly softer fabric, use a larger size needle.

TENSION

This will depend entirely on how you wash it! Start by knitting a fairly large square of stocking stitch - about 20 cm square is ideal. Once the square has been felted you will not be able to count the stitches or rows, so make a note now of how many stitches and rows you worked.

To felt the knitted fabric, wash it by machine, using the "hot wash" setting. If you want, tumble it dry once it has been washed - this will shrink and felt it further.

Once dry, you can calculate the tension. To work out the stitch tension, divide the number of stitches by the actual width of the felted piece and multiply this by 10 to give you the number of stitches you will have to 10 cm. Similarly, to work out the row tension, divide the number of rows worked by the actual height of the felted piece and multiply this by 10 to give you the number of rows you will have to 10 cm.

FINISHED SIZE

The cushions in the photograph are all 46 cm (18 in) square.

FELTED PANELS

Once you know the tension you will have once the knitting has been felted, you can calculate the number of stitches you need to cast on. For a cushion panel 46 cm wide, multiply your stitch tension by 4.6 and cast on this many stitches.

To calculate the number of rows needed, multiply your row tension by 4.6, for a panel 46 cm deep. If you are unsure of the accuracy of your calculations, add on a few extra stitches or rows - these can simply be taken into the seams if the finished piece does not shrink quite enough.

Cast on the required number of stitches and work the required number of rows. Then hot wash (and tumble dry if required) the finished piece to felt it.

MAKING UP

Once felted and dry, you can make up the cushion covers. Start by pressing the piece as described on the information page.



For the cushion with embroidered lines, you will need a selection of yarns in contrasting colours. Our cushion uses DK Soft in Glacier 174, and Kid Classic in Thyme 826, Juicy 827 and Crushed Velvet 825, all embroidered on a felted panel worked using 3 x 50gm of Felted Tweed in Cranberry 134. Start by knitting and felting a 46 cm square panel. Using photograph as a guide, embroider parallel lines of contrast couching. See page 120 for full instructions. Complete this cushion with a fabric backing panel.

For the cushion with a cross stitch square, you will need a contrast yarn for the embroidery. Our cushion uses DK Soft in Luna 173 on a felted panel worked using 3 x 50gm of DK Tweed in Wren 850. Start by knitting and felting a 46 cm square panel. Then embroider a square in cross stitch onto this panel about 8-10 cm in from all 4 edges, using double yarn. Make each cross stitch about 1.5-2 cm square and position them the same distance apart (see diagram). Complete this cushion with a fabric backing panel.

For the buttoned cushion, make 2 felted panels.

Start by knitting and felting a 46 cm square panel for the front, then knit and felt a second panel 46 cm wide and 66 cm long for the back and flap.

We used contrasting colours of the same yarn - Felted Tweed in Cranberry 134 (we used 3 x 50gm) and Fir 130 (4 x 50gm) - but you could use the same colours or two different yarns. Sew the two felted pieces together along 3 edges and turn this right side out. Insert the cushion pad and fold over the extra felted flap. Secure the flap in place by sewing on the buttons.

BACK

Cast on 110 (122: 130) sts using 3 1/4 mm (US 3) needles and yarn A.

Work 2 rows in garter st.

Row 3 (RS): K2, *P2, K2, rep from * to end.

Row 4: P2, *K2, P2, rep from * to end.

These 2 rows form rib.

Work a further 3 rows in rib, ending with a RS row. Work 3 rows in garter st, inc 1 (0: 1) st at each end of last row.

112 (122: 132) sts.

Change to 4 mm (US 6) needles.

Using the **intarsia** technique described on the information page, starting and ending rows as indicated, joining and breaking off colours as required and beg with a K row, work in patt foll chart for back, which is worked mainly in st st, as follows:

Cont straight until chart row 10 (12: 12) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 8th row until 100 (110: 120) sts rem.

Work 9 rows, ending with a WS row.

Viktoriya Sh

Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 8th row until there are 112 (122: 132) sts, taking inc sts into patt.

Cont straight until chart row 110 (112: 114) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape armholes

Keeping chart correct, cast off 5 (6: 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows. 102 (110: 118) sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 5 (7: 9) rows, then on foll 3 alt rows, then on every foll 4th row until 80 (84: 88) sts rem.

Cont straight until chart row 174 (178: 182) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 8 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

64 (68: 72) sts.


Next row (RS): Cast off 8 sts, patt until there are 11 (12: 13) sts on right needle and turn, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Work each side of neck separately.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next row. Cast off rem 7 (8: 9) sts.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem sts, cast off centre 26 (28: 30) sts, patt to end.

Work to match first side, reversing shapings.



LEFT FRONT

Cast on 55 (59: 63) sts using 3½/mm (US 3) needles and yarn A.

Work 2 rows in garter st.

Row 3 (RS): K2, *P2, K2, rep from * to last st, K1.

Row 4: K1, P2, *K2, P2, rep from * to end.

These 2 rows form rib.

Work a further 3 rows in rib, ending with a RS row.

Work 3 rows in garter st, inc 1 (2: 3) st evenly across last row. 56 (61: 66) sts.

Change to 4mm (US 6) needles.

Beg with a K row, work in patt foll chart for left front as folls:

Cont straight until chart row 10 (12: 12) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Dec 1 st at beg of next and every foll 8th row until 50 (55: 60) sts rem.

Work 9 rows, ending with a WS row.

Inc 1 st at beg of next and every foll 8th row until there are 56 (61: 66) sts, taking inc sts into patt.


Cont straight until chart row 110 (112: 114) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape armhole and front neck

Keeping chart correct, cast off 5 (6: 7) sts at beg and dec 0 (0: 1) st at end of next row. 51 (55: 58) sts.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at armhole edge of next 5 (7: 9) rows, then on foll 3 alt rows, then on 3 foll 4th rows **and at same time** dec 1 st at front opening edge on 3rd (1st: 2nd) and every foll 3rd row. 33 (33: 34) sts.



Dec 1 st at front neck edge only on next (3rd: 2nd) and every foll 3rd row until 29 (31: 33) sts rem, then on every foll 4th row until 23 (24: 25) sts rem. Cont straight until chart row 174 (178: 182) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape shoulders and back neck

Cast off 8 sts at beg of next and foll alt row. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 7 (8: 9) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 55 (59: 63) sts using 3 1/4 mm (US 3) needles and yarn A.

Work 2 rows in garter st.

Row 3 (RS): K3, *P2, K2, rep from * to end.

Row 4: P2, *K2, P2, rep from * to last st, K1.

These 2 rows form rib.

Work a further 3 rows in rib, ending with a RS row. Work 3 rows in garter st, inc 1 (2: 3) st evenly across last row, 56 (61: 66) sts.

Change to 4mm (US 6) needles.

Beg with a K row, work in patt foll chart for right front as folls:

Cont straight until chart row 10 (12: 12) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Dec 1 st at end of next and every foll 8th row until 50 (55: 60) sts rem.

Complete to match left front, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES (both alike)

Cast on 46 sts using 3 1/4 mm (US 3) needles and yarn A.

Work 2 rows in garter st.

Work 5 rows in rib as given for back, ending with a RS row.

Work 3 rows in garter st, ending with a WS row.

Change to 4mm (US 6) needles.

Beg with a K row, work in patt foll chart for sleeve as folls:

Work 2 rows.

Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 8th row until there are 70 sts, then on every foll 6th row until there are 74 (76: 78) sts.

Cont straight until chart row 114 (118: 122) has been completed, ending with a WS row.

Shape top

Keeping chart correct, cast off 5 (6: 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 64 sts.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 rows, then on foll 3 (2: 1) alt row, then on every foll 4th row until 40 sts rem.

Work 1 row.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and foll 2 alt rows, then on foll 3 rows, 28 sts.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Cast off rem 20 sts.

MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the info page.

Join shoulder seams using back stitch.

Button band

With RS facing, 3 1/4 mm (US 3) needles and yarn B, pick up and knit 106 sts evenly down left front opening edge, from beg of front neck shaping to cast-on edge.

Work 3 rows in garter st, ending with a WS row.

Work in rib as given for back for 5 rows.

Work 2 rows in garter st.

Cast off knitwise (on WS).

Buttonhole band

Work as given for button band, picking up sts up right front opening edge and with the addition of 6 buttonholes worked in 3rd row of rib as folls:

Next row (RS): Rib 3, *yarn (to make a buttonhole), work 2 tog, rib 18, rep from * to last 3 sts, yarn (to make 6th buttonhole), work 2 tog, rib 1.

Collar

Cast on 178 (186: 194) sts using 3 1/4 mm (US 3) needles and yarn B.

Work 2 rows in garter st.

Next row (RS) (inc): K1 (5: 9), (K3, M1, K5, M1, K3) 16 times, K1 (5: 9), 210 (218: 226) sts.

Beg with a WS row, work 5 rows in rib as given for back.

Cast off 3 sts at beg of next 40 (42: 44) rows, then 6 sts at beg of foll 6 rows.




Work 5 rows.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row until 41 (45: 43: 47: 43) sts rem, then on every foll 4th row until 39 (41: 39: 41: 41) sts rem, then on every foll alt row until 35 sts rem.

Dec 1 st at each end of next 3 rows, ending with a WS row. 29 sts.

Cast off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Cast off rem 21 sts.


MAKING UP

PRESS all pieces as described on the info page.

Join both shoulder seams using back stitch.

Collar

Cast on 69 (73: 73: 77: 77) sts using 4mm (US 6) needles. Beg with a RS row, cont in garter st throughout as follows: Work 1 row.

Row 2: K to last 10 sts, wrap next st (by slipping next st and then taking yarn to opposite side of work between needles, slip same st back onto left needle - when working back across wrapped sts, work loop made and st to as 1 st), turn.**Row 3:** As row 2.**Rows 4 and 5:** K to last 16 sts, wrap next st and turn.**Rows 6 and 7:** K to last 22 sts, wrap next st and turn.

Rows 8 and 9: K to last 28 sts, wrap next st and turn.

Row 10: Knit to end.

Cont in garter st, inc 1 st at both ends of next and foll 3 (3: 4: 4: 5) alt rows. 77 (81: 83: 87: 89) sts.

Place markers at both ends of last row.

Work 12 (12: 12: 14: 14) rows.

Cast off evenly.

Sew collar to neck edge as folls: positioning collar markers halfway across top of front neck cast-off sts, sew shaped row end edges of collar to front cast-off sts, then sew cast-on edge of collar to front slope and back neck edges.

Shoulder pads (make 2)

Cast on 1 st using 4mm (US 6) needles.

Beg with a RS row, cont in garter st throughout as folls:

Inc 1 st at beg of next 24 rows. 25 sts.

Dec 1 st at beg of next 24 rows. 1 st.

Fasten off.

Fold shoulder pad in half along longest row and sew shaped edges tog. Sew in shoulder pad by attaching ends of longest row to armhole seam and pointed end to shoulder seam.





Row 6: Inc in first st, (yfwd, sl 1, K1, pss0) 3 times, K1. 9 sts.

Row 7: Inc in first st, (yfwd, sl 1, K1, pss0) to end.

Row 8: Inc in first st, K1, (yfwd, sl 1, K1, pss0) to end.

Row 9: Inc in first st, K1, (yfwd, sl 1, K1, pss0) to last st, K1.

Row 10: Inc in first st, (yfwd, sl 1, K1, pss0) to last st, K1.

These 2 rows form moss st.

Inc 1 st at each end of next and every foll 4th row until there are 13 sts.

Work 1 row, ending with a WS row.

Shape back legs

**Cast on 8 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 29 sts.

Next row (RS): Moss st 8, work 3 tog tbl, moss st to last 11 sts, work 3 tog, moss st 8.

Work 3 rows.

Rep last 4 rows once more. 21 sts.

Next row (RS): Moss st 9, M1, moss st 1, M1, moss st 9. 21 sts.

Next row (RS): Moss st 8, M1, moss st 1, M1, moss st to last 9 sts, M1, moss st 1, M1, moss st 8.

Rep last 4 rows once more. 29 sts.

Work 1 row.

Cast off 8 sts at beg of next 2 rows. 13 sts.**

Work 14 rows.

Shape front legs

Work as given for back legs from ** to **.

Work 4 rows.

Dec 1 st at each end of next and every foll 6th row until 5 sts.

Work 3 rows. Cast off rem 5 sts.

HEAD

Cast on 15 sts using 3mm (US 2/3) needles and yarn B.

Beg with a K row, cont in st st as follows:

Work 2 rows.

Inc 1 st at each end of next and foll 3 alt rows. 23 sts.

Work 1 row.

Next row (RS): Inc in first st, K3, M1, K1, M1, K13, M1, K1, M1, K3, inc in last st. 29 sts.

Work 3 rows, inc 1 st at each end of 2nd of these rows. 31 sts.

Next row (RS): Cast on and K 2 sts, K7, M1, K1, M1, K15, M1, K1, M1, K7.

Cast on 2 sts at beg of next row. 39 sts.

Place markers at both ends of last row.

Work 2 rows.

Next row (RS): K8, K2tog, K1, K2tog tbl, K13, K2tog, K1, K2tog tbl, K8. 35 sts.

Work 1 row.

Next row (RS): K7, K2tog, K1, K2tog tbl, K11, K2tog, K1, K2tog tbl, K7. 31 sts.

Work 1 row.

Next row (RS): K6, K2tog, K1, K2tog tbl, K9, K2tog, K1, K2tog tbl, K6. 27 sts.

Next row: P5, P2tog tbl, P1, P2tog, P7, P2tog tbl, P1, P2tog, P5. 23 sts.

Next row: K4, K2tog, K1, K2tog tbl, K5, K2tog, K1, K2tog tbl, K4.

Cast off rem 19 sts.

FEET (make 4)

Cast on 17 sts using 3mm (US 2/3) needles and yarn B.

Beg with a K row, cont in st st as follows:

Work 10 rows.

Inc 1 st at each end of next 3 rows. 23 sts.

Work 2 rows.

Next row (WS): P1, (P2tog) 11 times.

Next row: (K2tog) 6 times.

Break yarn and thread through rem 6 sts.

Pull up tight and fasten off securely.

EARS (make 4)

Cast on 6 sts using 3mm (US 2/3) needles and yarn B.

Beg with a K row, cont in st st as follows:

Work 2 rows.

Next row (RS): K3, M1 and mark this st with a coloured thread, K3. 7 sts.

Work 3 rows.

Next row (RS): K to marked st, M1, K marked st, M1, K to end.

Work 1 row.

Rep last 2 rows once more. 11 sts.

Next row (RS): K1, K2tog tbl, K to last 3 sts, K2tog, K1.

Work 1 row.

Rep last 2 rows twice more. 5 sts.

Next row (RS): K1, sl 1, K2tog, pss0, K1.

Cast off rem 3 sts.

TAIL

Cast on 20 sts using 3mm (US 2/3) needles and yarn A.

Beg with a K row, work in st st for 4 rows.

Cast off.

MAKING UP

PRESS pieces as described on the information page.

Using photograph as a guide, join back seams of feet and insert toy filling. Matching cast-on edge of underside to markers at back of body and cast-off edges of underside to markers at front, and matching legs, sew underside to body, leaving edges open for feet. Join remaining back and top seam at back of body. Run gathering threads around open edges of legs and pull up slightly to fit top of foot. Sew feet in position. Join back seam of head. Insert toy filling into body. Join underchin seam of head from marker to cast-off edge. Then, with seam at centre, join cast-off edge. Insert toy filling into head. Sew head in place, inserting extra toy filling as required. Join pairs of ears together and sew in place. Join long edges of tail to form a long thin tube. Make and attach a small tassel to one end, and attach other end to sheep. Using yarn A, embroider face.

INFORMATION PAGE

TENSION

Obtaining the correct tension is perhaps the single factor which can make the difference between a successful garment and a disastrous one. It controls both the shape and size of an article, so any variation, however slight, can distort the finished look of the garment. No-one wants to spend hours and hours making a "skinny rib" when they really want a "sloppy Joe".

Different designers feature in our books and it is **their** tension, given at the **start** of each pattern, which you must match. Within each pattern there may be different tensions given, for instance, if either **Intarsia** or **Fairisle** techniques and **stocking stitch** are used in the same design. We strongly advise that you knit a square in pattern and/or stocking stitch (depending on the pattern instruction) of perhaps 5 - 10 more stitches and 5 - 10 more rows than those given in the tension note. Place the finished square on a flat surface and measure the central area. If you have too many stitches to 10cm try again using thicker needles, if you have too few stitches to 10cm try again using finer needles. Once you have achieved the correct tension your garment will be knitted to the measurements given in the pattern.

SIZING AND SIZE DIAGRAM NOTE

The instructions are given for the smallest size. Where they vary, work the figures in brackets for the larger sizes. One set of figures refers to all sizes. For ease in reading charts it may be helpful to have the chart enlarged at a printers and then to outline the size you intend to knit on the chart.

Included with every pattern in this magazine is a 'size diagram', or sketch of the finished garment and its dimensions. The purpose of this is to enable you to accurately achieve a perfect fitting garment without the need for worry during knitting. The size diagram shows the finished width of the garment at the under-arm point, and it is this measurement that the knitter should choose first; a useful tip is to measure one of your own garments which is a comfortable fit. Having chosen a size based on width, look at the corresponding length for that size; if you are not happy with the total length which we recommend, adjust your own garment before beginning your armhole shaping - any adjustment after this point will mean that your sleeve will not fit into your garment easily - don't forget to take your adjustment into account if there is any side seam shaping. Finally, look at the sleeve length; the size diagram shows the finished sleeve measurement, taking into account any top-arm insertion length. Measure your body between the centre of your neck and your wrist, this measurement should correspond to half the garment width plus the sleeve length. Again, your sleeve length may be adjusted, but remember to take into consideration your sleeve increases if you do adjust the length - you must increase more frequently than the pattern states to shorten your sleeve, less frequently to lengthen it.

CHART NOTE

Many of the patterns in the book are worked from charts. Each square on a chart represents a stitch

and each line of squares a row of knitting. When working from the charts, read odd rows (K) from right to left and even rows (P) from left to right, unless otherwise stated. Each colour used is given a different symbol or letter and these are shown in the **materials** section, or in the **key** alongside the chart of each pattern.

KNITTING WITH COLOUR

There are two main methods of working colour into a knitted fabric: **Intarsia** and **Fairisle** techniques. The first method produces a single thickness of fabric and is usually used where a colour is only required in a particular area of a row and does not form a repeating pattern across the row, as in the fairisle technique.

Intarsia: The simplest way to do this is to cut short lengths of yarn for each motif or block of colour used in a row. Then joining in the various colours at the appropriate point on the row, link one colour to the next by twisting them around each other where they meet on the wrong side to avoid gaps. All ends can then either be darned along the colour join lines, as each motif is completed or then can be "knitted-in" to the fabric of the knitting as each colour is worked into the pattern. This is done in much the same way as "weaving-in" yarns when working the Fairisle technique and does save time darning-in ends. It is essential that the tension is noted for **Intarsia** as this may vary from the stocking stitch if both are used in the same pattern.

Fairisle type knitting: When two or three colours are worked repeatedly across a row, strand the yarn **not** in use loosely behind the stitches being worked. If you are working with more than two colours, treat the "floating" yarns as if they were one yarn and always spread the stitches to their correct width to keep them elastic. It is advisable not to carry the stranded or "floating" yarns over more than three stitches at a time, but to weave them under and over the colour you are working. The "floating" yarns are therefore caught at the back of the work.

ALL ribs should be knitted to a firm tension, for some knitters it may be necessary to use a smaller needle. In order to prevent sagging in cuffs and welts we suggest you use a "knitting-in" elastic.

PRESSING

After working for hours knitting a garment, it seems a great pity that many garments are spoiled because so little care is taken in the pressing and finishing. After darning in all the ends, block each piece of knitting. Press each piece, except ribs, gently, using a warm iron over a damp cloth. Take special care to press the edges as this will make the sewing up both easier and neater.

FINISHING INSTRUCTIONS

When stitching the pieces together match the colour patterns very carefully.

Use a back stitch for all main knitting seams and an edge to edge stitch for all ribs unless otherwise stated.

Join left shoulder seam using back stitch and neckband seam (where appropriate) using an edge to edge stitch.

Sleeves

Set-in sleeves: Set in sleeve easing sleeve head into armhole using back stitch.

Square set-in sleeve: Set sleeve head into armhole, the straight sides at top of sleeve to form a neat right-angle to cast off sts at armhole on back and front, using back stitch.

Straight cast-off sleeve: Place centre of cast off edge of sleeve to shoulder seam. Sew in sleeve using back stitch using markers as guidelines where applicable.

Shallow set-in sleeves: Join cast-off sts at beg of armhole shaping to cast-off sts at start of sleeve-head shaping. Sew sleeve-head into armhole, easing in shapings.

Join side and sleeve seams using back stitch.

Slip stitch pocket edgings and linings into place. Sew on buttons to correspond with buttonholes. After sewing up, press seams and hems.

Ribbed welts and neckbands and any areas of garter stitch should not be pressed.


