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

MEANDER MITTS

Fingerless mittens worked in an allover cable pattern with twisted-rib cuffs and thumb gusset. Sized for Women's.



KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Circumference (above thumb) Approximately 7½"/19cm
- Length 9"/23cm

MATERIALS

- 1 2oz/62g skein (each approx 200yd/183m) of Buffalo Gold #3 Sportweight (100% Pure Bison Down 2-ply)
- One set (5) size 3 (3.25mm) double-pointed needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Cable needle
- Two stitch markers
- Scrap yarn
- One larger needle for bind-off (optional)

GAUGE

24 sts and 32 rnds = 4"/10cm over St st using size 3 (3.25mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK THE GAUGE.

STITCH GLOSSARY

2-st RT K2tog and keep on LH needle, insert RH needle into first st on LH needle and k that st again, dropping both sts off LH needle.

2-st RPC Sl next st to cn and hold to *back* of work, k1, p1 from cn.

2-st LPC Sl next st to cn and hold to *front* of work, p1, k1 from cn.

Kf-b Inc 1 st by k into the front and back of the next st.

TWISTED RIB 1

(multiple of 4 sts)

Rnds 1 and 2 *K2, p2; rep from * around.

Rnd 3 *2-st RT, p2; rep from * around.

Rep rnds 1-3 for twisted rib 1.

TWISTED RIB 2

(multiple of 4 sts)

Rnd 1 *K2, p2; rep from * around.

Rnd 2 *2-st RT, p2; rep from * around.

Rep rnds 1 and 2 for twisted rib 2.

Instructions

CUFF

With size 3 dpns, cast on 48 sts. Join, being careful not to twist, and pm for beg of rnd. Work in twisted rib 1 for 4"/10cm, end with a rnd 2.

HAND

Beg chart

Next rnd [Kf-b] twice, pm for end of thumb gusset, beg rnd 1 of chart, working 8-st rep 5 times—50 sts.

Cont to work chart pat as established for hand sts only and inc at beg of rnds for thumb gusset as foll:

Rnd 2 K4.

Rnd 3 Kf-b, k2, Kf-b—6 sts.

Rnd 4 K6.

Rnd 5 Kf-b, p1, 2-st RT, p1, kf-b—8 sts.

Rnd 6 K1, p2, k2, p2, k1.

Rnd 7 Kf-b, p2, 2-st RT, p2, kf-b—10 sts.

Cont to work in established pats, working incs at beg and end of gusset sts every other rnd and working new gusset sts into twisted rib 2 until there are 18 gusset sts—64 sts. Work even in pats for 10 rnds more, ending with a chart rnd 1.

Next rnd Work first 18 sts in pat and place on scrap yarn for thumb, sl marker for beg of rnd, remove marker for end of gusset, cast on 2 sts, k2, *p2, k2; rep from * around.

Next rnd P2, RT, p1, work 8-st rep of chart rnd 3 5 times, p1, k1, p1.

Next rnd P2, k2, p1, work 8-st rep of chart rnd 4 5 times, p1, k1, p1.

Next rnd P2, RT, p1, work 8-st rep of chart row 5 5 times, p1, k1, p1.

Next rnd P2, k2, p1, work 8-st rep of chart row 4 5 times, p1, k1, p1.

Next rnd Remove stitch marker, p1, pm for new beg of rnd, * 2-st RPC, 2-st LPC; rep from * around.

Next rnd K1, [p2, k2] 11 times, p2, k1.

Next rnd Remove stitch marker, k1, pm for new beg of rnd, beg with p2 work rnd 2 of twisted rib 2 to end of rnd.

Cont to work in twisted rib 2 as established for 7 rnds more, end with a rnd 1. Bind off in pat.

Note For a smooth transition, after binding off the 2nd to last st, pick up and k one st in the first bound-off st and use it to bind off the last st, pass 2nd to last st over the last st and fasten off.

THUMB


Place thumb sts on needles. With free dpn, pick up and k 2 sts from cast-on sts over opening—20 sts. Pm for beg of rnd, insert RH needle from front to back in running strand before next st, twist loop, and slip to LH needle.

Next rnd Leaving a 6"/15cm tail, rejoin yarn and k twisted loop tog with first st of rnd, k1 [p2, k2] 4 times, insert RH needle in running strand before next st, twist loop and slip to LH needle, p twisted loop tog with next st, p1. Work in established pat for 8 rows more. Bind off in pat.

FINISHING

Hand-wash gently. Lay flat to dry. ♦

CHART



The NEW details

Coralie Meslin

Scarlet rays emanate from the sunburst that settles on one side of Meslin's standard-fitting coat, knit in Cascade Yarns' "Cash Vero." The half circle is worked with short rows; the ribbed back waist adds flattering shaping. Deep ribbing at the collar, cuffs and bottom edge frames the look.

Scorchers in red and orange heat up the fall.

The Warming Trend



Heather Carlson

Exaggerated bobbles line the inner perimeter and bell sleeves of Carlson's loose-fitting cabled cardigan. The piece, worked in "Baby Alpaca Grande Tweed" from Plymouth Yarn, is closed with a garter-stitch belt.

Proportion and texture mark Connally's sleeveless dress, with its floppy ribbed cowl and below-the-hip pockets. It's knit in Blue Sky Alpacas' "Worsted Hand Dyes" and sports a central traveling rib and cable pattern on a purl background, flanked by a slip-stitch shadow rib that also rings the hemline.

Poludnenko's cardigan, in "Zara Chiné" from Filatura Di Crosa/Tahki. Stacy Charles, begins with the triple cable at the hip; from there, the main rib and staggered cable pattern is picked up and worked upward (the sleeves are similarly formed, starting with a double-cable band). The neckband consists of cabled fabric that is folded in half and sewn to create a double thickness.

Figure-eight cables writ large gradually diminish as they travel up the purled background of Muinonen's rounded triangular blanket shawl, knit here in Alpaca With A Twist's "Highlander."

Shiri Mar

Mor's cable-lapel cardigan, in Classic Elite Yarns' "Kumara," is a feast for knitters who hunger for variety. The body is a medley of textured and eyelet pattern stitches, and the ribbed front bands—including that reversible cable shown on the right neck—are knit along with the front pieces and joined at the back of the neck. Simple snaps give closure.





Jodi Snyder

Half classic ski pullover,
half Guernsey stunner.
Snyder's turtleneck epitomizes autumnal knitting.
Stitched in "Ecco" from
Zitron/Skacel Collection,
the Guernsey knit/purl-
patterned yoke is anchored
by alternating columns
of traditional cables and
a ribbed border.

The intricate open cables on Simola's close-fitting cap, in straw-colored "Kid Classic" from Rowan/Westminster Fibers, yield a beautiful, sculptural negative space.

Above: Bicolored pom-poms punctuate the earflaps and point of Nicholas's Fair Isle-patterned stocking cap with embroidered details. It's knit from the garter-stitch band up (the flaps are done separately) with "Julia" from Nashua Handknits/Westminster Fibers.


Anne Featonby

Opposite: Turquoise Fair Isle patterning makes for an eye-catching contrast against the merlot field of Featonby's oversized tam, in Dale of Norway's "Freestyle." The double decreases that shape the crown are elegantly integrated into the colorwork pattern.

This page: Amanda Crawford's tie-front cardigan relies on a clever stitch scheme to create its checked fabric. Worked in Lion Brand Yarn's "LB Collection Organic Wool," it also features short set-in sleeves and patch pockets.

Opposite: A doubled strand of Lorna's Laces' 100% organic wool "Green Line Worsted" emphasizes the boldness of the staghorn cable that travels down the center of Cathy Carron's pullover. The sweater's knit in the round from just under the collar down, then separated again for the vent in the ribbing.

Below: The subtle natural striations in Be Sweet's "Bamboo" lend depth to Kristin Omdahl's cut-out top. It's worked in the round from the garter-stitch bottom, up through the stockinette body. Back stitches are held while the front cutouts are knit back and forth. **Opposite:** A ribbed shawl collar and crisp organic-cotton/merino "Chesapeake" from Classic Elite Yarns add modernity to the classic construction of Amy Polcyn's cabled pullover. The center cable panels continue fluidly from the ribbed edges.

This page: **MARI LYNN PATRICK** shaped the flounced peplum of this wrap sweater, knit in Koigu Wool Designs' "Kersti," with decreases. An extra flounce of ribbing starts as a front band, then swags below the ribbed waistband to the center back. The three-quarter bell sleeves flare prettily, and the flattering bodice closes with hidden snaps.

Opposite: **ANNE FARNHAM** injects military-jacket smartness into her feminine cropped number. Knit in one piece in Reynolds/JCA's "Lopi," it features a faux double-breasted seed-stitch front panel that snaps (the buttons are decorative), surrounded by an eyelet texture panel with seed-stitch details.

Opposite: A touch of Fair Isle amps up the interest factor of **NICOLE REESE**'s short-sleeve swing jacket. The body is knit top-down in one piece with "Luxury Tweed Chunky" by Debbie Bliss/KFI; the edges and Fair Isle collar are worked in "Luxury Tweed Aran."

This page: A sassy one-sided pleat is just one of the pleasures of **DEBORAH NEWTON**'s skirted jacket, knit in "Handspun Semi Solids" from Manos del Uruguay/Fairmount Fibers. The texture pattern is made from short lines of knit stitches staggered on a background of reverse stockinette. The lapels are picked up and knit to form a classic notched collar.



This page: A long, lean sleeveless hoodie by Elsebeth Lavold, in "Calm Wool" by Elsebeth Lavold/KFI, is sure to become a go-to weekend layer. The body is knit in a textured rib stitch, while cables edge the front bands, hood, sleeves, pocket tops and vented sides.

Opposite: Josh Bennett's loose-fitting jacket, knit in one piece to the armholes with Bergère de France's "Lima," sports wide sleeves, fold-under knitted hems at all the edges, an I-cord drawstring through the waist and knitted flowers embellished with Crystallized Swarovski Elements.

This page: The leaf-lace patterning on the neckband and flared three-quarter sleeves of Melissa LaBarre's buttoned cardigan is echoed in the yarn-over raglan increases made as the piece is picked up and knit top-down from the collar. Work it in "Aspire Super Chunky" by Naturally NZ/Fiber Trends.

Opposite: Dina Mor's seed-stitch hoodie is made extra-cushy by holding together a strand each of Aslan Trends' cotton/alpaca-blend "Artesanal" and angora/wool-blend "Invernal." Backwards single crochet borders the edges, including the double-seamed hood. Gathered at the cuffs, it also features a curved lower back.

Lepore's three-quarter-sleeve cardigan embodies her signature femininity. The back lace flounce is shaped with increases that occur in the main lace pattern, while the sleeves, lapels and bottom border are worked in a fisherman's rib. The body of the sweater is knit in one piece from the top down in a variety of lace patterns in "Rio" by Tahki Yarns/Tahki•Stacy Charles and "Baby Kid Extra" by Filatura Di Crosa/Tahki•Stacy Charles held together. The lapels, worked from the bottom up, are knit separately and sewn on.





gauge



Stitches measured over 2"/5cm.



Rows measured over 2"/5cm.

Note: Gauge should be taken over at least 2"/5cm and preferably over 4"/10cm. Make a test swatch at least 4"/10cm square. If the number of stitches and rows does not correspond to the gauge given, you must change the needle size. An easy rule to follow is: **To get fewer stitches to the inch/cm, use a larger needle; to get more stitches to the inch/cm, use a smaller needle.** Continue to try different needle sizes until you get the same number of stitches in the gauge.

sizing

Directions are given for the smallest size, with the larger sizes in parentheses. If there is only one figure, it applies to all sizes. **SIZE+** listed under a pattern number indicates that a garment is sized XXL or larger.

basic stitches

Garter stitch Knit every row. Circular knitting: Knit one round, then purl one round. **Stockinette stitch** Knit right-side rows and purl wrong-side rows. Circular knitting: knit all rounds. (U.K.: stocking stitch) **Reverse-stockinette stitch** Purl right-side rows and knit wrong-side rows. Circular knitting: purl all rounds. (U.K.: reverse stocking stitch)

glossary

bind off Used to finish an edge or segment. Lift the first stitch over the second, the second over the third, etc. (U.K.: cast off)

bind off in ribbing Work in ribbing as you bind off. (Knit the knit stitches, purl the purl stitches.) (U.K.: cast off in ribbing)

3-needle bind-off With the right side of the two pieces facing and the needles parallel, insert a third needle into the first stitch on each needle and knit them together. Knit the next two stitches the same way. Slip the first stitch on the third needle over the second stitch and off the needle. Repeat for three-needle bind-off.

cast on Placing a foundation row of stitches upon the needle in order to begin knitting.

decrease Reduce the stitches in a row (that is, knit 2 together).

increase Add stitches in a row (that is, knit in front and back of stitch).

knitwise Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to knit it.

make one With the needle tip, lift the strand between the last stitch knit and the next stitch on the left-hand needle and knit into back of it. One knit stitch has been added.

make one p-st With the needle tip, lift the strand between the last stitch worked and the next stitch on the left-hand needle and purl it. One purl stitch has been added.

no stitch On some charts, "no stitch" is indicated with shaded spaces where stitches have been decreased or not yet made. In such cases, work the stitches of the chart, skipping over the "no stitch" spaces.

place markers Place or attach a loop of contrast yarn or purchased stitch marker as indicated.

pick up and knit (purl) Knit (or purl) into the loops along an edge.

purlwise Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to purl it.

selvage stitch Edge stitch that helps make seaming easier.

slip, slip, knit Slip next two stitches knitwise, one at a time, to right-hand needle. Insert tip of left-hand needle into fronts of these stitches, from left to right. Knit them together. One stitch has been decreased.

slip, slip, slip, knit Slip next three stitches knitwise, one at a time, to right-hand needle. Insert tip of left-hand needle into fronts of these stitches, from left to right. Knit them together. Two stitches have been decreased.

slip stitch An unworked stitch made by passing a stitch from the left-hand to the right-hand needle as if to purl.

work even Continue in pattern without increasing or decreasing. (U.K.: work straight)

yarn over Making a new stitch by wrapping the yarn over the right-hand needle. (U.K.: yfwd, yon, yrn)

skill levels for knitting

1. Beginner

Ideal first project.

2. Easy

VERY EASY listed under a pattern number indicates basic stitches, minimal shaping and simple finishing.


3. Intermediate

For knitters with some experience. More intricate stitches, shaping and finishing.


4. Experienced

For knitters able to work patterns with complicated shaping and finishing.


three-needle bind-off



1. Hold right sides of pieces tog on two needles. Insert third needle knitwise into first stitch of each needle, and wrap yarn knitwise.



2. Knit these two stitches together, and slip them off the needles. *Knit the next two stitches together in the same manner.



3. Slip first stitch on 3rd needle over 2nd stitch and off needle. Rep from * in step 2 across row until all stitches are bound off.

*** Steel crochet hooks are sized differently from regular hooks—the higher the number, the smaller the hook, which is the reverse of regular hook sizing.



INSTRUCTIONS

1 LONG COAT

Standard fitting coat with deep rib details and sunburst pattern on right front. Sized for Small, Medium, Large and X-Large. Shown in size Small on page 66.



KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust (closed) 36 (40, 44, 48)"/91.5 (101.5, 111.5, 122)cm
- Length 35 (36, 36½, 37½)"/89 (91.5, 92.5, 95)cm
- Upper arm 12 (12½, 13¾, 14¼)"/30.5 (31.5, 35, 36)cm

MATERIALS

- 15 (17, 19, 21) 1¾oz/50g balls (each approx 98yd/90m) of Cascade Yarns *Cash Vero* (extrafine merino wool/microfiber/cashmere) in #7 cinnabar
- One pair size 8 (4.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Size G-6 (4mm) crochet hook
- One 1½"/38mm button and one 1¾"/45mm button
- Stitch markers

GAUGE

18 sts and 24 rows = 4"/10cm over St st using size 8 (4.5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

Lifted Increase (LI)

Turn the work on the left needle so that the purl

side of the work is visible. Insert the tip of the right needle from the top down into the stitch one row below the stitch that is on the left needle, knit into it, then knit the stitch that is on the left needle.

SHORT ROW WRAPPING

(wrap and turn - w&t)

Knit (Purl) side

- 1) Wyib (wyif), sl next st purlwise.
- 2) Move yarn between the needles to the front (back).
- 3) Sl the same st back to LH needle. Turn work, bring yarn to the knit (purl) side between needles. One st is wrapped.
- 4) When short rows are completed, pick up wraps to hide as foll: Work to just before wrapped st. For knit side: Insert RH needle under the wrap and knitwise into the wrapped st, k them together. For purl side: Insert RS needle from behind into the back loop of the wrap and place it on the LH needle; p wrap tog with st on needle.

NOTE

The lower edge ribbing is picked up and worked down after the back and front pieces are joined.

BACK

Cast on 86 (95, 104, 113) sts. Work in St st for 7½"/18cm, end with a WS row.

Dec row (RS) K2, ssk, k to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2. Rep dec row every 6th row 6 times more—72 (81, 90, 99) sts. Work even until piece measures 14"/35.5cm from beg, dec 1 (inc 2, dec 1, inc 2) sts on last RS row—71 (83, 89, 101) sts. **Next row** K4, p3, *k3, p3; rep from * to last 4 sts, k4. Cont in rib for 5"/12.5cm, inc 1 st (dec 1 st, inc 1 st, dec 1 st) on last WS row—72 (82, 90, 100) sts. P next row on RS. Cont in rev St st (p on

WS, k on RS) to end of piece and work as foll: **Inc row (WS)** K2, M1, k to last 2 sts, M1, k2. Rep inc row every 4th (6th, 4th, 6th) row 4 (3, 4, 3) times more—82 (90, 100, 108) sts. Work even until piece measures 22 (22½, 22½, 23)"/56 (57, 57, 58.5)cm from beg.

Armhole shaping

Bind off 4 (4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 0 (0, 2, 3) sts at beg of next 4 rows—74 (82, 82, 86) sts. Work 1 row even. **Dec row (WS)** K2, ssk, k to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2. Rep dec row every other row 5 (5, 3, 3) times more—62 (70, 74, 78) sts. Work even until armhole measures 8 (8½, 9, 9½)"/20.5 (21.5, 23, 24)cm.

Shoulder and neck shaping

Bind off 5 (6, 7, 7) sts at beg of the next 4 rows, 6 (7, 7, 8) sts at beg of next 2 rows, AT SAME TIME, after 2 rows of shoulder shaping have been worked, bind off center 22 (24, 24, 26) sts for neck and working both sides at once, bind off 4 sts from each neck edge once.

LEFT FRONT

Cast on 56 (60, 65, 69) sts. Work in St st until piece measures 12"/30.5cm from beg, end with a WS row. **Dec row (RS)** K2, ssk, k to end. Work 11 rows even. Rep last 12 rows once more—54 (58, 63, 67) sts. Work even until piece measures 21 (22, 22½, 23½)"/53 (56, 57, 59.5)cm from beg.

Neck, armhole and shoulder shaping






Cast on 12 sts.

Short row shaping (1)

Next row (RS) K10, w&t. **Next row (WS)** P8, w&t. **Next row (RS)** K to end,

picking up wrap. **Next row (WS)** P to end, picking up wrap. **Inc row (RS)** K2, [LI] 9 times, k1—21 sts. **Next row (WS)** P2, *k1, p1; rep from * to last st, p1. **Inc row (RS)** K1, LI, rib to last 2 sts, LI, k1—23 sts. **Next row (WS)** P3, *k1, p1; rep from * to last 2 sts, p2. **Inc row (RS)** K1, LI, work in rib to last 2 sts, LI, k1—25 sts. **Next row (WS)** P2, *k1, p1; rep from * to last 3 sts, k1, p2. Rep last 4 rows 3 times—37 sts. **Inc row (RS)** K1, *LI, k1; rep from * to end—55 sts. Cont in St st, work 5 rows even. **Inc row (RS)** K1, LI, k to last 2 sts, LI, k1—57 sts. Work 5 (5, 7, 7) rows even. **Inc row (RS)** K1, [LI] 1 (2, 2, 3) times, k to last 1 (3, 4, 5) sts, [LI] 0 (2, 3, 4) times, k1—58 (61, 62, 64) sts.

Armhole shaping

Next row (WS) Bind off 4 (4, 5, 5) sts at beg of row, p to end—54 (57, 57, 59) sts. Work 4 (6, 6, 8) rows even. **Inc row (RS)** K4 (4, 3, 3), [LI] 46 (48, 50, 52) times, k4 (5, 4, 4)—100 (105, 107, 111) sts. Work 15 (17, 19, 21) rows even. **Inc row (RS)** K4 (3, 1, 1), [LI, k2] 31 (33, 35, 36) times, k3 (3, 1, 2)—131 (138, 142, 147) sts. Work 13 (15, 17, 19) rows even.

Short row shaping (2)

Next row (RS) K96 (100, 102, 106), w&t, leaving rem sts on a holder.

Next row (WS) P10, w&t.

Next row (RS) K10.

Next row (WS) P8, w&t.

Next row (RS) K8.

Short row shaping (3)

Next row (WS) Bind off 40 (42, 42, 44) sts, w&t.

Next row (RS) K1.

Next row (WS) P1 st beyond wrap, picking it up as you go, w&t.

Next row (RS) K3.

Next row (WS) P1 st beyond wrap, picking it up as you go, w&t.

Next row (RS) K5. Cont in pat as established until the last RS row is as foll:

Next row (RS) K53 (55, 57, 59).

Next row (WS) P2 sts beyond wrap, picking it up as you go.

Next row (RS) K56 (58, 60, 62).

Bind off.

Short row shaping (4)

With RS facing, rejoin yarn to sts on holder, bind off 19, k to end.

Work 1 row.

Next row (RS) K2, wrap and turn.

Next row (WS) P to end.

Next row (RS) K4, picking up wrap as you go, wrap and turn.

Next row (WS) P to end.

Next row (RS) K6, picking up wrap as you go, wrap and turn.

Next row (WS) P to end.

Next row (RS) K10, picking up wrap as you go, wrap and turn.

Next row (WS) P to end.

Next row (RS) K12, picking up wrap as you go, wrap and turn.

Next row (WS) P to end.

Next row (RS) K to end, picking up wrap as you go. Work 2 rows even.

Shoulder shaping

Next row (WS) Bind off 5 (6, 7, 7) sts, p to end. Work 1 row even.

Next row (WS) Bind off 5 (6, 7, 7) sts, p to end. Work 1 row even.

Next row (WS) Bind off 6 (7, 7, 8) sts.

SLEEVES

Cast on 42 sts. Work in St st for 6 rows. Inc 1 st each side on next row, then every 8th (6th, 4th, 4th) row 5 (4, 5, 8) times more, every 0 (8th, 6th, 6th) row 0 (2, 4, 2) times—54 (56, 62, 64) sts. Work even until piece measure 9 (9, 9½, 9½)"/23 (23, 24, 24)cm from beg.

Cap shaping

Bind off 4 (4, 5, 5) sts at beg of the next 2 rows—46 (48, 52, 54) sts. **Dec row (RS)** K2, ssk, k to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2. Work 1 row even. Rep last 2 rows 14 (15, 17, 18) times more—16 sts. Bind off all sts.

Ribbing

With RS facing, pick up and k 42 sts along the lower edge of sleeve.

Next row (WS) *K3, p3; rep from * to end. Cont in rib for 14 rows. Dec 1 st at each side of next row. Work 14 rows even. Dec 1 st at each side of next row, then work even until ribbing measures 8"/20.5cm. Bind off sts in rib.

FINISHING

Block pieces to measurements. Sew shoulder and side seams. Set in sleeves.

Lower edge ribbing

With RS facing and beg at left front, pick up and k 56 (60, 65, 69) sts along left front, 85 (95, 103, 113) sts across back, and 56 (60, 65, 69) sts along right front—197 (215, 233, 251) sts. **Next row (WS)** P4, k3, *p3, k3; rep from * to last 4 sts, p4. Cont in rib until piece measures 4"/10cm from beg. Bind off in rib.

Lightly block open bottom ribbing.

Left front edging

With RS facing, beg at just below first neck dec, pick up and k 112 (118, 120, 126) sts along right front edge to neck pieces. P 1 row. Bind off loosely. Work along right front to correspond.

Collar

With RS facing, pick up and k 51 sts up the right front, 35 (37, 37, 39) sts across the back neck, and 51 sts down the left front—137 (139, 139, 141) sts. **Next row (WS)** P4 (5, 5, 6), k3, *p3, k3; rep from * to last 4 sts, p4 (5, 5, 6). Cont in rib until collar measures 4"/10cm. Bind off in rib. Attach larger button to left front as pictured, crochet a loop at top of right front for closing. Attach smaller button to inside of right front, crochet a loop at top of left front for closing. *

2 BELTED CARDIGAN

Loose-fitting, allover cable pattern cardigan with bobble edges and garter stitch belt. Sized for Small, Medium, Large, X-Large. Shown in size Small on page 67.



KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust (closed) 34½ (40½, 46, 52)"/87.5 (103, 117, 132)cm
- Length 24 (24½, 25½, 26)"/61 (62, 64.5, 66)cm
- Upper arm 11 (12, 13, 14½)"/28 (30.5, 33, 37)cm

MATERIALS

- 12 (14, 16, 18) 3½oz/100g hanks (each approx 110yd/100m) of Plymouth Yarn Co. *Baby Alpaca Grande Tweed* (baby alpaca/acrylic/polyester) in #2055 cranberry tweed
- One pair size 10½ (6.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Cable needle (cn) & stitch markers

GAUGES

- 14 sts and 17 rows = 4"/10cm over St st using size 10½ (6.5mm) needles.
- 17 sts and 20 rows = 4"/10cm over chart pats using size 10½ (6.5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGES.

STITCH GLOSSARY

3-st RPC Slip 1 st to cn and hold to *back*, k2, p1 from cn.

3-st LPC Slip 2 sts to cn and hold to *front*, p1, k2 from cn.

Make bobble (MB)

K into front, back, front, back and front of next st—5 sts made. Work 4 rows in St st over these 5 sts. **Next row (RS)** Pass the 2nd, 3rd and 4th sts over the first st.

BACK


Cast on 88 (100, 112, 124) sts.

Beg chart pat

Row 1 (RS) Work 6-st rep of chart #1 (first 6 sts of chart) 2 (3, 4, 5) times, work next 64 sts of chart, work 6-st rep of chart #5 (last 6 sts of chart) 2 (3, 4, 5) times. Cont in pats as established until piece measures 8"/20.5cm from beg. Dec 1 st each side on next row, then every 8th row 5 times more—76 (88, 100, 112) sts. Work even until piece measures 16 (16, 16½, 16½)"/40.5 (40.5, 42, 42)cm from beg.

Armhole shaping

Bind off 3 (4, 5, 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 (3, 3, 3) sts at beg of next 2 (2, 4, 4) rows. Dec 1 st each side every other row 1 (4, 3, 6) times—64 (66, 72, 76) sts. Work even until armhole measures 8 (8½, 9, 9½)"/20.5 (21.5, 23, 24)cm. Bind off all sts in pat.



LEFT FRONT

Cast on 33 (39, 45, 51) sts.

Beg chart pats

Row 1 (RS) Work 6-st rep of chart #1 (first 6 sts of chart) 2 (3, 4, 5) times, work 16 sts of chart #2, work 4 sts of chart #4, p1. Cont in pats as established, working decs at side edge (beg of RS rows) as for back—27 (33, 39, 45) sts. Work even until same length as back to armhole. Shape armhole at side edge as for back—21 (24, 28, 30) sts. Work even until same length as back. Bind off all sts in pat.

RIGHT FRONT

Cast on 33 (39, 45, 51) sts.

Beg chart pats

Row 1 (RS) P1, work 4 sts of chart #3, work 16 sts of chart #2, work 6-st rep of chart #5 (last 6 sts of chart) 2 (3, 4, 5) times. Cont in pats as established, and complete to correspond to left front, reversing all shaping.

SLEEVES

Cast on 48 sts. Work in rev St st (p on RS, k on WS) for 6 rows. **Bobble row (RS)** K2, *MB, k3; rep from * to last 6 sts, MB, k2, MB, k2. Work in St st for 3 rows. Work in rev St st for 2 rows.

Beg chart pat

Row 1 (RS) K2, p2, work 16 sts of chart #2, p2, work 4 sts chart #4, p2, work 16 sts of chart #2, p2, k2. Cont in pats as established, inc 1 st each side (working inc sts into k2, p2 rib) every 0 (20th, 18th, 10th) row 0 (2, 4, 7) times—48 (52, 56, 62) sts. Work even until piece measures 17½ (17½, 18, 18)"/44.5 (44.5, 45.5, 45.5)cm from beg.

Cap shaping

Note When working chart #2, rep rows 1-4 only to end of piece.

Bind off 3 (4, 5, 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 (3, 3, 3) sts at beg of next 2 (2, 4, 4) rows—38 (38, 34, 38). Work 16 (18, 18, 20) rows even. Bind off 4 (4, 2, 4) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 5 sts at beg of next 6 rows.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

Bands and collar

With RS facing, beg at lower edge of right front, pick up and k114 (118, 122, 126) sts evenly to center back neck. Work in rev St st for 3 rows.





- Hips 38 (42, 46, 50)"/96.5 (106.5, 116.5, 127)cm
- Bust 32 (36, 40, 44)"/81 (91.5, 101.5, 111.5)cm
- Length 33 (33½, 34½, 35)"/84 (85, 88, 89)cm

MATERIALS

- 10 (11, 12, 12) 3½oz/100g hanks (each approx 100yd/90m) of Blue Sky Alpacas *Worsted Hand Dyes* (alpaca/merino) in #2010 rusty orange
- One pair size 9 (5.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One each sizes 9 and 11 (5.5 and 8mm) circular needle 16"/40cm long
- Cable needle (cn), stitch markers and holders
- Small amount of scrap yarn (for pockets)
- Two ½"/13mm snaps (for pockets)

GAUGE

20 sts and 24 rows = 4"/10cm over float st rib or cable chart pat using smaller needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

STITCH GLOSSARY

S2KP Sl 1, k2tog, pass sl st over k2tog.

3-st RPC Sl 1 st to cn and hold to *back*, k2, p1 from cn.

3-st LPC Sl 2 sts to cn and hold to *front*, p1, k2 from cn.

4-st RC Sl 2 sts to cn and hold to *back*, k2, k2 from cn.

FLOAT STITCH RIB

(multiple of 5 sts)

Row 1 (RS) *K1, p1, slip next 2 sts wyif, p1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 K the knit sts, p the purl and slipped sts. Rep rows 1 and 2 for float st rib.

BACK

With smaller straight needles, cast on 94 (104, 114, 124) sts. Work in float st rib as foll: **Next row (RS)** K2, [k1, p1, slip next 2 sts wyif, p1] 9 (10, 11, 12) times, [p1, slip next 2 sts wyif, p1 k1] 9 (10, 11, 12) times, k2. Cont in rib as established until piece measures 4"/10cm from beg.

Beg chart pat

Next row (RS) K3, p4, k1, p4, cont float st rib over next 15 (20, 25, 30) sts, work 40 sts of chart, cont float st rib over next 15 (20, 25, 30) sts, p4, k1, p4, k3. Cont in pats as established, working sts outside of rib as k the knit sts and p the purl sts, until piece measures 11"/28cm from beg.

Waist shaping

Next (dec) row (RS) K2, SKP, work to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2. Rep dec row every 4th row 9 times more—74 (84, 94, 104) sts. Work even until pieces measures 20"/50.5cm from beg.

Next (inc) row 1 (RS) K3, M1, work to last 3 sts, M1, k3—76 (86, 96, 106) sts.


Work 5 rows even.

Next (inc) row 2 (RS) K3, M1 purl (work same as M1 knit but purl into back loop), work to last 3 sts, M1 purl, k3. Work 5 rows even. Rep inc row 2—80 (90, 100, 110) sts. Work even until piece measures 25 (25, 25½, 25½)"/63.5 (63.5, 65, 65)cm from beg.

Armhole shaping

Bind off 6 (6, 7, 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

SK2P, k2. Rep dec row 1 every other row 0 (1, 2, 3) times more—64 (70, 74, 80) sts. **Dec row 2 (RS)** K2, k2tog, work to last 4 sts, SKP, k2. Rep dec 2 row every other row 2 (3, 2, 3) times more—58 (62, 68, 72) sts. Work even until armhole measures 7 (7½, 8, 8½)"/18 (19, 20.5, 21.5)cm.

Neck shaping
Next row (RS) Work 11 (13, 15, 17) sts, place center 36 (36, 38, 38) sts on a holder, join 2nd ball of yarn and work to end. Working both sides at once, dec 1 st at each neck edge (2 sts in from edge) every other row twice—9 (11, 13, 15) sts each side. Work even until armhole measures 8 (8½, 9, 9½)"/20.5 (21.5, 23, 24)cm. Place sts each side on holders for 3-needle bind-off.

FRONT

Work as for back until piece measures 2 rows less than back to waist shaping.
Pocket openings
Next row (RS) Work 8 (13, 18, 23) sts, place 19 sts on scrap yarn, cast on 19 sts, cont 40 sts of chart, pm, place next 19 sts on scrap yarn, cast on 19 sts, pm, work to end. Cont in pats and work waist and armhole shaping same as back. Work even until armhole measures 4½ (5, 5½, 6)"/11.5 (12.5, 14, 15)cm.

Neck shaping
Next row (RS) Work 13 (15, 17, 19) sts, place next 32 (32, 34, 34) sts on a holder, join 2nd ball of yarn and work to end. Working both sides at once, dec 1 st at each neck edge (2 sts in from edge) every other row 4 times—9 (11, 13, 15) sts each side. Work even until armhole measures 8 (8½, 9, 9½)"/20.5 (21.5, 23, 24)cm.

Place sts each side on holders for 3-needle bind-off.
FINISHING
Block pieces to measurements. Join shoulder seams using 3-needle bind-off. Sew side seams.
Pocket trims
With RS facing slip 19 sts from scrap yarn to smaller needles and work in garter st for 7 rows. Bind off.

Pocket linings


With RS facing and smaller straight needles, along cast-on edge of pocket opening, pick up and k 19 sts and work in St st for 8"/20.5cm. Bind off. Armhole edging

With RS facing and smaller circular needle, pick up and k 75 sts evenly around armhole. Join and work in p2, k1 rib for 5 rnds. Bind off in rib.



KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust (closed) 31 (32½, 34, 35½)"/78.5 (82.5, 86, 98)cm
- Length 21¾ (22¼, 23¼, 23¾)"/55 (56.5, 59, 60.5)cm
- Upper arm 14 (14½, 15¼, 16)"/35.5 (37, 39, 40.5)cm

MATERIALS

- 11 (12, 13, 14) 1¾oz/50g balls (each approx 137yd/125m) of Filatura di Crosa/Tahki•Stacy Charles, Inc. *Zara Chiné* (merino wool) in #805 rust
- Size 6 (4mm) circular needle, 29"/74cm long OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One pair size 6 (4mm) straight needles
- Cable needle & seven ½-inch/12mm buttons

GAUGE

23 sts and 30 rows = 4"/10cm over k3, p2 rib, slightly stretched, using size 6 (4mm) needles. TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

K3, P2 RIB

(over a multiple of 5 sts plus 3)

Row 1 (RS) K3, *p2, k3; rep from * to end.

Row 2 P3, *k2, p3; rep from * to end.

Rep these 2 rows for k3, p2 rib.

CABLE PATTERN

(over 8 sts)

Rows 1 and 3 Knit.

Row 2 and all WS rows Purl.

Row 5 Sl 4 sts to cn and hold to *front*, k4, k4 from cn (8-st LC).

Rows 7, 9 and 11 Knit.

Row 12 Purl. Rep rows 1-12 for cable pat.

CABLED WAISTBAND

Beg at center right front edge, cast on 30 sts.

Row 1 (RS) P1, [p1, k8] 3 times, p2.

Rows 2-4 K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Cable row 5 P1, [p1, 8-st LC] 3 times, p2.

Rows 6-12 K the knit sts and p the purl sts. Rep rows 1-12 until piece measures 28 (30, 32, 34)"/71 (76, 81, 86.5)cm from beg. Bind off.

LOWER RIB

Working into one long edge of the waistband, pick up and k 165 (177, 189, 201) sts evenly spaced.

Row 1 (WS) K1 (selvage st), *p3, k1; rep from * to end. Work in rib as established for 3 rows more.

Inc row (WS) K1, *p3, M1, k1; rep from * to last 4 sts, end p3, k1—205 (220, 235, 250) sts. Work in k3, p2 rib until 1¼"/4.5cm from pick up row. Bind off in rib.

BODY

Along the opposite long edge of the waistband, from RS, pick up and k 170 (180, 190, 200) sts. **Row 1 (WS)** K1 (selvage st), *p3, k2; rep from *, end p3, k1. Work even in k3, p2 rib for 12 rows.

Placed cable set-up

Next row (RS) Rib 16 sts, k8 (for row 1 of placed cable), rib 82 (87, 92, 97), k8 (for row 1 of placed cable), rib to end. Cont to work established sts in rib, work the two 8-st placed cables, working rows 1-12 of cable pat 3 times. Then, work in rib on all sts until piece measures 13½ (13½, 14, 14)"/34 (34, 35.5, 35.5)cm from beg.

Divide for armholes

Place first 40 (43, 46, 49) sts and last 40 (43, 46, 49) sts onto holders (or scrap yarn) to be worked later for fronts.

BACK

Working on the 90 (94, 98, 102) back sts only, bind off 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows—80 (84, 88, 92) sts.

Placed cable set-up

Next row (RS) Rib to the 3rd k-3 rib, k8, rib to end. Cont to work established sts in rib, work the 8-st placed cable, working rows 1-12 of cable pat twice. Then, cont in rib on all sts for 4 rows.

Placed cable set-up

Next row (RS) Work to the last two k-3 ribs before the left armhole edge, k8, work to end. Cont to work established sts in rib, work the 8-st placed cable, working rows 1-12 of cable pat once. Cont in rib pat on all sts until armhole measures 7½ (8, 8½, 9)"/19 (20.5, 21.5, 23)cm.

Shoulder shaping

Bind off 7 (7, 8, 9) sts at beg of next 4 rows, 6 (8, 8, 8) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Bind off rem 40 sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Rejoin yarn to work the 40 (43, 46, 49) sts on hold for right front. To shape armhole, bind off 3 sts from armhole edge once, then 2 sts once. Work even on 35 (38, 41, 44) sts until armhole measures 5½ (6, 6½, 7)"/14 (15, 16.5, 18)cm.

Neck shaping

Note At beg of neck, work a placed cable set-up in the 2nd and 3rd from the last k3 ribs at the armhole edge and rep the cable pat (rows 1-12)

once. To shape neck, bind off 4 (5, 6, 7) sts from neck edge once, 3 sts once, 2 sts once, dec 1 st every other row 6 times. Work even on 20 (22, 24, 26) sts until armhole measures same as back.

Shoulder shaping

From shoulder edge, bind off 7 (7, 8, 9) sts twice, then 6 (8, 8, 8) sts once.

LEFT FRONT

Work as for right front, reversing all shaping AND making an 8-st placed cable in the last two k-3 ribs before the center edge rib just after working the armhole shaping. Work the 8-st cable for 2 (12-row) reps.

SLEEVES

Cuff

Beg at the seam edge, cast on 21 sts. **Row 1 (RS)** P1, [p1, k8] twice, p2. **Rows 2-4** K the knit sts and p the purl sts. **Cable row 5** P1, [p1, 8-st LC] twice, p2. **Rows 6-12** K the knit sts and p the purl sts. Rep rows 1-12 until piece measures 9"/23cm from beg. Bind off.

Lower rib

Working into one long edge of the cuff, pick up and k 57 sts evenly spaced.


Row 1 (WS) K1 (selvage st), *p3, k1; rep from * to end. Work in rib as established for 3 rows more. **Inc row (WS)** K1, *p3, M1, k1; rep from * to last 4 sts, end p3, k1—70 sts. Work in k3, p2 rib until 1¾"/4.5cm from beg. Bind off in rib.

Upper sleeve

Along opposite long edge of cuff, pick up and k 60 sts. **Row 1 (WS)** K1 (selvage st), *p3, k2; rep from *, end p3, k1. Cont in k3, p2 rib as established for 6 rows more. Inc 1 st each side of next row—62 sts. Work even for 5 rows more.

Placed cable set-up

Next row (RS) Rib to the 3rd k-3 rib, k8, rib to end. Cont to work established rib, with the 8-st placed cable, working rows 1-12 of cable pat 3 times, AT SAME TIME, cont to inc 1 st each side every 8th (8th, 6th, 6th) row 10 (12, 14, 16) times more, AND when piece measures 14"/35.5cm from beg, work a 2nd placed cable as foll: Working over the (6th and 5th) k-3 ribs from the end of the row, k8 over these sts. Then, rep cable pat twice. After completing this cable

placement, work even in rib on 82 (86, 90, 94) sts until piece measures 17 (17, 17½, 17½)"/43 (43, 44.5, 44.5)cm from beg.

Cap shaping

Bind off 3 sts at beg of next 4 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 4 rows. Dec 1 st at beg of next 10 (12, 14, 16) rows. On the next RS row, make a placed cable in the center k3 ribs, AT SAME TIME, cont to dec 1 st at beg of the next 6 rows. There are 46 (48, 50, 52) sts. Bind off 4 sts at beg of next 6 rows. Bind off rem 22 (24, 26, 28) sts.

FINISHING

Do not block pieces. Sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

Left front band

Pick up and k 100 (105, 110, 115) sts.

Row 1 (WS) K1, * p3, k2; rep from *, end p3, k1. Cont in k3, p2 rib for 6 rows more. Bind off in rib.

Right front band

Work as for left front band for 2 rows along the left front edge.

Buttonhole row (WS) Rib 7 (12, 17, 22) sts, [yo, k2tog, rib 13 sts] 6 times, yo, k2tog, rib to end. Complete as for left front band.

COLLAR


Beg at the center of the front bands, pick up and k 90 sts evenly around neck edge.

Row 1 (WS) K1 (selvage st), [p8, k2] 8 times, p8, k1 (selvage st). Work even as established for 4 rows.

Cable row (RS) K1, [8-st LC, p2] 8 times, 8-st LC, k1. Work even as established for 18 rows. Rep cable row. Work even as established for 6 rows. Bind off. Fold collar to WS and sew in place. Sew on buttons. ♦

5 CABLED SHAWL

Triangular cape worked from the top down with expanding cables worked on rev St st ground. Shown on page 70.



KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Width (across top) Approx 120"/304.5cm
- Length (top to longest point) 35"/89cm

MATERIALS

- 8 3½oz/100g hanks (each approx 145yd/133m long) of Alpaca With A Twist *Highlander* (baby alpaca/wool/microfiber/viscose) in #5014 ochre
- Four size 10 (6mm) circular needles, 40"(100cm) long OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One size 10 (6mm) circular needle, 24"(60cm) long
- Two size 10 (6mm) double-pointed needles (dpn)

- Cable needle (cn)
- Point protectors to keep sts on long needles

GAUGE

16 sts and 20 rows = 4"/10cm over St st, using size 10 (6mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE

STITCH GLOSSARY

M1 k-st Insert the LH needle from front to back under the strand between last st worked and the next st on the LH needle. Knit into the back loop to twist the st.

M1 p-st under the strand between last st worked and the next st on the LH needle. Purl into the front loop to twist the stitch.

Inc 1 L Sl next st to RH needle, insert tip of RH needle into the left loop of st below slipped st and place loop on LH needle, pass sl st back to LH needle, then p each st separately.

Inc 1 R Insert right needle into right loop of stitch just below next stitch, place loop onto left needle and p it, then p the stitch on needle.

6-st LC Sl next 3 sts to cn and hold to *front*, k3, k3 from cn.

6-st RC Sl next 3 sts to cn and hold to *back*, k3, k3 from cn.

3/1 LPC Sl next 3 sts to cn and hold to *front*, p1, k3 from cn.

3/1 RPC Sl next 1 st to cn and hold to *back*, k3, p1 from cn.

4/1 LPC Sl next 4 sts to cn and hold to *front*, p1, k4 from cn.

4/1 RPC Sl next 1 st to cn and hold to *back*, k4, p1 from cn.

3/2 LPC Sl next 3 sts to cn and hold to *front*, p2, k3 from cn.

3/2 RPC Sl next 2 sts to cn and hold to *back*, k3, k2 from cn.

8-st LC Sl next 4 sts to cn and hold to *front*, k4, k4 from cn.

8-st RC Sl next 4 sts to cn and hold to *back*, k4, k4 from cn.

4/2 LPC Sl next 4 sts to cn and hold to *front*, p2, k4 from cn.

4/2 RPC Sl next 2 sts to cn and hold to *back*, k4, p2 from cn.

5/2 LPC Sl next 5 sts to cn and hold to *front*, p2, k5 from cn.

5/2 RPC Sl next 2 sts to cn and hold to *back*, k5, p2 from cn.

5/1 LPC Sl next 5 sts to cn and hold to *front*, p1, k5 from cn.

5/1 RPC Sl next 1 st to cn and hold to *back*, k5, p1 from cn.

10-st LC Sl next 5 sts to cn and hold to *front*, k5, k5 from cn.

10-st RC Sl next 5 sts to cn and hold to *back*, k5, k5 from cn.

Dec 9 sts Sl 4 sts to RH needle, *pass second st on LH needle over first st on same needle, sl first st from LH needle to RH needle, pass second st on RH needle over first st on same ne-

dle, sl first st on RH needle to LH needle; rep from * 3 times more, end pass second st on LH needle over first st on same needle, p rem st.

NOTES

1) Shawl is worked back and forth in rev St st (p on RS, k on WS), circular needles are used to accommodate the large number of sts. Beg with dpns, changing to and adding longer circular needles as needed.

2) Cable chart does not show the rev St sts worked outside the chart. The cable will use these rev St sts.

SHAWL

Beg center panel

With dpns, cast on 3 sts and work in I-cord for 12 rows. Leave these 3 sts in place on dpn, with same dpn, beg in tenth row of I-cord, pick up and knit 1 st in this row and in each of the next 9 rows of I-cord, and in each of the 3 sts of the first row of I-cord—16 sts. **Next (inc) row (RS)** Sl 1, k1, yo, p2, M1 p-st (for left panel), place marker (pm), p8, pm (for center panel), M1 p-st, p2, yo, k2 (for right panel)—20 sts. **Next row** Sl 1, k19. Change to shorter circular needle and continue to work back and forth in rows. **Next (inc) row (RS)** Sl 1, k1, yo, p4, M1 p-st, slip marker (sm), p8, sm, M1 p-st, p4, yo, p2—24 sts. **Next row** Sl 1, k23. **Next (inc) row (RS)** Sl 1, k1, yo, p2, [k into front, back and front of next st] twice, p2, M1 p-st, sm, p3, [k into front, back and front of next st] twice, p3, sm, M1 p-st, p2, [k into front, back and front of next st] twice, p2, yo, k2—40 sts. **Next row** Sl 1, k4, p6, k3, sm, p12, sm, k3, p6, k5.

Beg long cables

Note On rows 3, 11, 21, 33, 47, 63, 83 and 107, work cables on the left panel (beg of RS rows) as RC, work the cables on the center panel and right panel (end of RS rows) as LC. On chart rows 12, 20, 34, 48, 52, 68 and 84 work the M1 incs ONLY on the center cable panel, not on the left and right panels. This will result in 2 additional p sts on each of these rows that are NOT shown on the chart. The M1 incs on rows 92, 106 and 114 are worked on all 7 cables.

Beg cable chart


Row 1 (RS) Sl 1, k1, yo, p3, work row 1 of chart over next 6 sts, p3, M1 p-st, sm, p3, work row 1 of chart over next 6 sts, p3, sm, M1 p-st, p3, work row 1 of chart over next 6 sts, p3, yo, k2—44 sts.

Row 2 (WS) Sl 1, k5, work row 2 of chart over next 6 sts, k4, sm, k3, work row 1 of chart over next 6 sts, k3, sm, k4, work row 1 of chart over next 6 sts, k6.

Row 3 (RS) Sl 1, k1, yo, p4, work row 3 of chart over next 6 sts (RC), p4, M1 p-st, sm, p3, work row 3 of chart over next 6 sts (LC), p3, sm, M1 p-st, p4, work row 3 of chart over next 6 sts (LC), p4, yo, k2—48 sts.

Row 4 (WS) Sl 1, k6, work row 4 of chart over next 6 sts, k5, sm, k3, work row 4 of chart over next 6 sts, k3, sm, k5, work row 4 of chart over next 6 sts, k7.

Row 58 Sl 1, k8, inc 1 R, p4, inc 1 L, k19, work chart row 58 over 16 sts, k19, inc 1 R, p4, inc 1 L, k7, sm, k4, work chart row 58 over 16 sts, k4, sm, k7, inc 1 R, p4, inc 1 L, k19, work chart row 58 over 16 sts, k19, inc 1 R, p4, inc 1 L, k9—196 sts.

Row 59 Sl 1, k1, yo, p7, k8, p19, work chart row 59 over 16 sts, p19, k8, p7, M1 p-st, sm, p4, work chart row 59 over 16 sts, p4, sm, M1 p-st, p7, k8, p19, work chart row 59 over 16 sts, p19, k8, p7, yo, k2—200 sts.

Row 60 Sl 1, k9, p8, k21, work chart row 60 over 12 sts, k21, p8, k8, sm, k6, work chart row 60 over 12 sts, k6, sm, k8, p8, k21, work chart row 60 over 12 sts, k21, p8, k10.

Row 61 Sl 1, k1, yo, p8, k8, p21, work chart row 61 over 12 sts, p21, k8, p8, M1 p-st, sm, p6, work chart row 61 over 12 sts, p6, sm, M1 p-st, p8, k8, p21, work chart row 61 over 12 sts, p21, k8, p8, yo, k2—204 sts.

Row 62 Sl 1, k10, *[work chart row 62 over 8 sts, k23] twice, work row 62 over 8 sts*, k9, sm, k8, work chart row 62 over 8 sts, k8, sm, k9, rep from * to * once, k11. Cont as established, sl first st of every row, and k the second st and last 2 sts of every row, cont to work yo's and inc's every RS row, work sts between cables as Rev St st, AT SAME TIME follow chart over all 7 cables until row 141 has been worked—375 sts. Knit 1 row on WS.

FINISHING


I-cord edging

Next row (RS) Cast on 5 sts, *k4, k2togtbl, sl these 5 sts back to LH needle, pull yarn tight

across back of sts; rep from * until all shawl sts have been worked—5 sts rem. Pull yarn tight across back of work, bind off 5 sts. Fasten off and weave in ends. ♦



- Length 25 (26, 26, 26 1/2)"/63.5 (66, 66, 67.5)cm
- Upper arm 14 (15, 15, 16)"/36 (66.5, 66.5, 68)cm

MATERIALS

- 13 (15, 16, 18) 1 1/4 oz/50g balls (each approx 128yd/117m) of Classic Elite Yarns Kumara (extrafine merino/baby camel) in #5755 cognac
- One pair size 6 (4mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Cable needle (cn) and two sets of large snaps

GAUGES

- 21 sts and 30 rows = 4"/10cm over candle flame pat using size 6 (4mm) needles.
 - 18 sts and 30 rows = 4"/10cm over floral ridge pat using size 6 (4mm) needles.
 - 23 sts and 28 rows = 4"/10cm over bound bales pat using size 6 (4mm) needles.
 - 21 sts and 27 rows = 4"/10cm over open basketweave pat using size 6 (4mm) needles.
- TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGES.



CANDLE FLAME PATTERN

(over a multiple of 4 sts plus 2)

Row 1 (RS) P2, *k1, yo, k1, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 2 K2, *p3, k2; rep from * to end.

Row 3 P2, *k3, pass 3rd st on RH needle over the 1st and 2nd sts, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 4 K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Rep rows 1-4 for candle flame pat.

FLORAL RIDGE PATTERN

(over a multiple of 4 sts plus 2)

Row 1 (RS) P2, *(k1 without dropping off, yo, and k1 again) in each of the next 2 sts, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 2 Knit.

Row 3 P2, *k3tog tbl, k3tog, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 4 K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Rep rows 1-4 for floral ridge pat.

BOUND BALES PATTERN

(over a multiple of 8 sts plus 2)

Rows 1, 3, and 5 (RS) P2, *k6, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 2, 4, and 6 K2, *p6, k2; rep from * to end.

Row 7 P2, *sl next 6 sts onto cn, wrap yarn twice around these 6 sts, then knit them from cn, p2; rep from * to end.

Row 8 K2, *p6, k2; rep from * to end.

Rows 9 and 11 P2, *k6, p2; rep from * to end.

Rows 10 and 12 K2, *p6, k2; rep from * to end.

Rep rows 7-12 only for bound bales pat.

OPEN BASKETWEAVE PATTERN

(for back and sleeves—over a multiple of 6 sts)

Rows 1-4 *K3, p3; rep from * to end.

Row 5 (RS) *Yo, k3tog, yo, k3; rep from * to end.

Rows 6-8 *P3, k3; rep from * to end.

Row 9 *K3, yo, k3tog, yo; rep from * to end.

Rows 10-12 *K3, p3; rep from * to end.

Rep rows 5-12 only for open basketweave pat for back and sleeves.

OPEN BASKETWEAVE PATTERN

(for left front—over a multiple of 6 sts plus 3)

Rows 1-4 *K3, p3; rep from * to last 3 sts, k3.

Row 5 (RS) *Yo, k3tog, yo, k3; rep from * to last 3 sts, yo, k3tog, yo.

Rows 6-8 *P3, k3; rep from * to last 3 sts, p3.

Row 9 *K3, yo, k3tog, yo; rep from * to last 3 sts, k3.

Rows 10-12 *K3, p3; rep from * to last 3 sts, k3.

Rep rows 5-12 only for open basketweave pat for left front.

OPEN BASKETWEAVE PATTERN

(for right front)

(Worked over a multiple of 6 sts)

Rows 1-4 P3, *k3, p3; rep from * to end.

Row 5 (RS) K3, *yo, k3tog, yo, k3; rep from * to end.

Rows 6-8 K3, *p3, k3; rep from * to end.

Row 9 Yo, k3tog, yo, *k3, yo, k3tog, yo; rep from * to end.

Rows 10-12 P3, *k3, p3; rep from * to end.

Rep rows 5-12 only for open basketweave pat.

RIBBED CABLE PANEL

(Worked over 24 sts)

Row 1 (RS) Sl 8 sts to cn and hold to *back*, [k1, p1] 4 times from LH needle, [k1, p1] 4 times from cn, [k1, p1] 4 times from LH needle.

Rows 2-7 K the knits and p the purls.

Row 9 [k1, p1] 4 times, sl 8 sts to cn and hold to *front*, [k1, p1] 4 times from LH needle, [k1, p1] 4 times from cn.

Rows 10-16 K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Rep rows 1-16 for ribbed cable panel.

BACK

Cast on 88 (92, 96, 104) sts. **Next row (RS)** *K1, p1; rep from * to end. Rep this row 5 more times. Work in candle flame pat for 4 1/4" / 11cm, keeping first and last sts in St st for selavage sts throughout, and end on a pat row 3.

Next row (WS) Knit. **Next row** Knit, dec 12 sts evenly across row—76 (80, 84, 92) sts. Knit one row. Work in floral ridge pat for 5" / 12.5cm, ending with a pat row 5.

keeping first and last sts in St st throughout, and end on a pat row 3. **Next row (WS)** Knit. **Next row** Knit, inc 24 (28, 24, 24) sts evenly across row—100 (108, 108, 116) sts. Knit one row. Work in bound bales pat for 5" / 12.5cm, keeping first and last edge sts in St st throughout, and ending on a pat row 5. **Next row (WS)** Knit. **Next row** Knit, dec 14 (16, 10, 12) sts evenly across row—86 (92, 98, 104) sts. Knit one row. Work in open basketweave pat for 1 1/4" / 3cm, keeping first and last sts in St st throughout, and end with a WS row.

Armhole shaping

Keeping in open basketweave pat, bind off 3 sts at beg of next 4 (4, 4, 6) rows—74 (80, 86, 86) sts.

Work even until armhole measures 7 1/2 (8 1/2, 8 1/2, 9) / 19 (21.5, 21.5, 23) cm, end with a RS row.

Neck shaping

Next row (WS) Work 16 (19, 22, 22) sts in established pat, join a 2nd ball of yarn and bind off center 42 sts, work to end. Working both sides at once, bind off 3 sts from each neck edge twice, then bind off rem 10 (13, 16, 16) sts each side for shoulders.

LEFT FRONT

Cast on 59 (63, 67, 71) sts.

Row 1 (RS) *K1, p1; rep from * to last st, k1.

Row 2 *P1, k1; rep from * to last st, p1.

Rep rows 1 and 2 twice more.

Next row (RS) K1 (edge st), work in candle flame pat over next 34 (38, 42, 46) sts, eliminating the 2 p sts at each edge, [p1, k1] 12 times.

Next row [P1, k1] 12 times, work in candle flame pat over next 34 (38, 42, 46) sts, p1 (edge st).

Cont as established until candle flame pat section measures 4 1/4" / 11cm, end with a pat row 3.

Next row (WS) [P1, k1] 12 times, k to last st, p1.

Next row K to last 24 sts AND dec 4 sts evenly across these sts, then [p1, k1] 12 times—55 (59, 63, 67) sts. **Next row** [P1, k1] 12 times, k to last st, p1. **Next row** K1 (edge st), work in floral ridge pat over next 30 (34, 38, 42) sts, eliminating the 2 p sts at each edge, [p1, k1] 12 times.

Next row [P1, k1] 12 times, work in floral ridge pat over next 30 (34, 38, 42) sts, p1 (edge st).

Cont as established until floral ridge pat section measures 5" / 12.5cm, end with a pat row 3.

Next row (WS) [P1, k1] 12 times, k to last st, p1.

Next row K to last 24 sts AND inc 8 (12, 8, 12) sts evenly across these sts, then [p1, k1] 12 times—63 (71, 71, 79) sts. **Next row** [P1, k1] 12 times, k to last st, p1. **Next row (RS)** K1 (edge st), work in bound bales pat over next 38 (46, 46, 54) sts, eliminating the 2 p sts at each edge, [p1, k1] 12 times. **Next row** [P1, k1] 12 times, work in bound bales pat over next 38 (46, 46, 54) sts, p1 (edge st). Cont as established until bound bales pat section measures 5" / 12.5cm, ending with a pat row 5.

Next row (WS) [P1, k1] 12 times, k to last st, p1. **Next row** K to last 24 sts AND dec 5 (7, 1, 3) sts evenly across these sts, then [p1, k1] 12 times—58 (64, 70, 76) sts. **Next row** [P1, k1] 12 times, k to last st, p1. **Next row (RS)** K1 (edge st), work in open basketweave pat to last 24 sts. [p1, k1] 12 times. **Next row** [P1, k1] 12 times, work in open basketweave pat to end. Work 2 more rows as established.

Neck and armhole shaping

Dec row (RS) Work as established to last 25 sts, p2tog, k1, [p1, k1] 11 times.

Working in established pats, rep dec row every other row 9 (12, 19, 22) times more, then every 4th row 7 (7, 4, 4) times more, AT SAME TIME, when piece measures same length as back to armhole, shape armhole at side edge same as back. When armhole measures 8 (9, 9, 9½)"/20.5 (23, 23, 24)cm, bind off from shoulder edge 10 (13, 16, 16) once—25 sts.

Work even in k1, p1 rib for 5½"/14cm, then bind off all sts in rib.

RIGHT FRONT

Work to correspond to left front, reversing all shaping and placement of ribbing (24 ribbed sts should be at center edge, that is beg of RS rows and end of WS row), AT SAME TIME, when piece measures 13"/33cm, work the 24 ribbed sts in ribbed cable panel for 48 rows (4 pat reps), then cont in k1, p1 rib across these 24 sts to end of piece.

SLEEVES

Cast on 48 (52, 56, 60) sts.

Row 1 (RS) *K1, p1; rep from * to end.

Rep this row 5 more times. Work in candle flame pat for 4¼"/11cm, keeping first and last edge sts in St st throughout, and inc 1 st at each edge on 9th row of this section, then every 6th row 3 times more—56 (60, 64, 68) sts. End section with a pat row 3.

Next row (WS) Knit.

Next row Knit, dec 8 sts evenly across row—48 (52, 56, 60) sts.

Next row Knit. Work in floral ridge pat for 5"/12.5cm, keeping first and last edge sts in St st throughout, and inc 1 st each side on 7th row of this section, then every 8th row 3 times more—56 (60, 64, 68) sts. End section with a pat row 3.

Next row (WS) Knit.

Next row Knit, inc 16 (12, 16, 20) sts evenly across row—72 (72, 80, 88) sts.

Next row Knit. Work in bound bales pat for 5"/12.5cm eliminating the 2 p sts at each edge, keeping first and last edge sts in St st throughout, and inc 1 st each side on 7th row of this section, then every 8 rows 3 times more—80 (80, 88, 96) sts. End section with a pat row 11.

Next row (WS) Knit.

Next row Knit, dec 6 (0, 8, 10) sts evenly across—74 (80, 80, 86) sts.


Next row Knit. Work in open basketweave pat for 1¼"/3cm, keeping first and last edge sts in St st throughout, and end with a WS row.

Cap shaping

Bind off 3 sts at beg of next 4 (4, 4, 6) rows. Dec 1 st each side of next row, then every other row 15 (18, 18, 18) times more—30 sts. Work even for 0 (0, 0, 3) rows. Bind off 3 sts at beg of next 4 rows. Bind off rem 18 sts.

FINISHING

Block all pieces to measurements. Sew side and shoulder seams. Sew bound off edges of ribbed panels tog at center back neck, then sew side edge of rib to back neck. Sew sleeve seams, then join sleeves to body. Sew snap to inside of ribbed panels approx 12"/30.5 from lower edge. ♦

Standard-fitting pullover with all over cable pattern and Guernsey patterned bodice. Sized for Small, Medium, Large, 1X, 2X, 3X and shown in size Small on page 72.

KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust 36 (43, 46, 49½, 52, 56)"/91.5 (109, 116.5, 125.5, 132, 142)cm
- Length 21 ¼ (22 ¼, 23 ½, 24, 24 ½, 25 ¾)"/55 (56.5, 59.5, 61, 62, 65.5)cm
- Upper arm 14 (15, 16, 17, 18, 19)"/35.5 (38, 40.5, 43, 45.5, 48)cm

MATERIALS

- 14 (16, 17, 19, 21, 23) 1 ¼ oz/50g balls (each approx 120yd/110m) of Zitron/Skacel Collection, Inc. Ecco (extrafine merino superwash) in #137 spice
- One pair each sizes 4 and 6 (3.5 and 4mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One each sizes 6 and 8 (4 and 5mm) circular needle 16"/40cm long
- Cable needle (cn)
- Stitch markers and holders

GAUGES

- 34 sts and 31 rows = 4"/10cm over cable chart pat using larger needles.
- 22 sts and 32 rows = 4"/10cm over Guernsey chart pat using larger needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGES.

STITCH GLOSSARY

6-st RC Sl 3 sts to cn and hold to *back*, k3, k3 from cn.

6-st LC Sl 3 sts to cn and hold to *front*, k3, k3 from cn.

K2, P2 RIB

(multiple of 4 sts, plus 2)

Row 1 *K2, p2; rep from *, end k2.

Row 2 K the knit sts, and p the purl sts.

Rep row 2 for k2, p2 rib.

K2, P2 RIB

(in the round, multiple of 4 sts)

Rnd 1 *K2, p2; rep from * around.

Rep rnd 1 for k2, p2 rib.


BACK

With smaller needles, cast on 154 (182, 194, 210, 222, 238) sts. Work in k2, p2 rib for 2"/5cm. Change to larger needles.

Beg cable chart pattern

Row 1 (RS) P0 (0, 2, 0, 2, 0), [k2, p2] 0 (0, 1, 0, 1, 0) times, k1, work 28-st rep of chart 5 (6, 6, 7, 7, 8) times, work last 12 sts of chart once, k1, [p2, k2] 0 (0, 1, 0, 1, 0) times, p0 (0, 2, 0, 2, 0).

CABLE CHART



Cont in pats as established until piece measures $13\frac{1}{2}$ ($13\frac{1}{2}$, $14\frac{1}{4}$, $14\frac{1}{4}$, $14\frac{1}{4}$, 15)/34.5 (34.5, 36, 36, 36, 38)cm from beg, end with chart row 6 (6, 12, 12, 12, 6) and dec 54 (64, 68, 74, 78, 84) sts evenly across last row—100 (118, 126, 136, 144, 154) sts.

Note It is not necessary to center the Guernsey chart pat on the piece, just follow the continuity of the texture pat while shaping.

Armhole shaping

Work in guernsey chart pat and bind off 6 (6, 7, 8, 8, 9) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 3 sts at beg of next 2 (4, 4, 4, 4, 4) rows. Dec 1 st each side every other row 5 (7, 7, 7, 8, 10) times—72 (80, 86, 94, 100, 104) sts. Work even until armhole measures $7\frac{1}{2}$ (8 , $8\frac{1}{2}$, 9 , $9\frac{1}{2}$, 10)/19 (20.5, 21.5, 23, 24, 25.5)cm.

Shoulder shaping

Bind off 6 (8, 8, 10, 10, 11) sts at beg of next 4 rows, 7 (7, 9, 9, 11, 11) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Place rem 34 (34, 36, 36, 38, 38) sts on holder for back neck.

FRONT

Work as for back, including armhole shaping, until armholes measure 5 ($5\frac{1}{2}$, 6, $6\frac{1}{2}$, 7, $7\frac{1}{2}$)/12.5 (14, 15, 16.5, 17.5, 19)cm, ending with a WS row.

Neck shaping

Next row (RS) Work 27 (31, 33, 37, 39, 41) sts, join a 2nd ball of yarn and bind off center 18 (18, 20, 20, 22, 22) sts, work to end. Working both sides at once, bind off 2 sts from each neck edge once, dec 1 st at each neck edge every other row 6 times—19 (23, 25, 29, 31, 33) sts each side. Work even until same length as back to shoulder. Shape shoulders as for back.

SLEEVES

With smaller needles, cast on 70 (70, 74, 74, 78, 78) sts. Work in k2, p2 rib for 2"/5cm. Change to larger needles.

Beg chart pattern

For size Small and Medium only—Row 1 (RS) K1, work 28-st rep of chart twice, work last 12 sts on chart once, k1.

For size Large and 1-X—Row 1 (RS) P2, k1, work 28-st rep of chart twice, work last 12 sts on chart once, k1, p2.




Work even until piece measures $17\frac{1}{2}$ ($17\frac{1}{2}$, 18, 18, $18\frac{1}{2}$, $18\frac{1}{2}$)/44.5 (44.5, 45.5, 45.5, 47, 47)cm from beg, and dec 40 (46, 48, 50, 54, 58) sts evenly across last WS row—78 (82, 88, 94, 100, 104) sts.

GUERNSEY CHART



Note It is not necessary to center the Guernsey chart pat on the piece, just follow the continuity of the texture pat while shaping.

Cap shaping

Work in Guernsey chart pat and bind off 6 (6, 7, 8, 8, 9) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st each side every other row 19 (21, 23, 25, 28, 29) times. Bind off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Bind off rem 20 sts.

FINISHING


Sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

Cowl

With smaller circular needle, beg at left shoulder seam, pick up and k88 (88, 92, 92, 96, 96) sts evenly around neck edge, including sts from holders. Pm to mark beg of rnd. Join and work in rnds of k2, p2 rib for $1\frac{1}{2}$ "/4cm. **Inc rnd** *K1, M1, k1, p2; rep from * around—110 (110, 115, 115, 120, 120) sts. Work even in k3, p2 rib until cowl measures 4"/10cm. Change to larger circular needle and work even until cowl measures 8"/20.5cm. Bind off all sts loosely in rib. ♦

8 LACE PANEL GLOVES

Stockinette st gloves. Knit in the round with a leaf lace panel on the back of the hand. Sized for adult woman and shown on page 73.



KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Circumference (back of hand above thumb) $7\frac{1}{2}$ -8"/19-20.5cm
- Length (tip of middle finger to bottom of cuff) $11\frac{1}{2}$ "/29cm

MATERIALS

- 2 1 1/4oz/50g hanks (each approx 160yd/146m) of Artyarns *Cashmere Sock* (cashmere/wool/nylon) in #295 oxblood
- One set (4) size 2 (2.75mm) double-pointed needles OR SIZE TO GET GAUGE
- One pair size 2 (2.75mm) needles
- 2 extra size 2 (2.75mm) dpns to hold sts when working fingers
- Scrap yarn (for tubular cast-on)
- Stitch markers
- Tapestry needle

GAUGE

28 sts and 36 rnds = 4"/10cm over St st, using size 2 (2.75) dpns.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

STITCH GLOSSARY

M1R Insert LH needle from back to front under the strand between last st worked and the next st on the LH needle. Knit into the front loop to twist the st.

M1L Insert the LH needle from front to back under the strand between last st worked and the next st on the LH needle. Knit into the back loop to twist the st.

K3, P3 RIB

(multiple of 6 sts)

Rnd 1 *K3, p3; rep from * around.

Rep rnd 1 for k3, p3 rib.

LEFT GLOVE

With single pointed needles and scrap yarn, cast on 27 sts using double (or long tail) cast-on method. Change to main yarn. Beg with the knit row, work 3 rows in St st (k on RS, p on WS).

Next row (WS) P1, *k1 from first row by inserting LH needle from back to front into the bump of the st pecking through scrap yarn and ktbl, p1; rep from * to end—54 sts. Remove scrap yarn.

CUFF

Working in k3, p3 rib, divide sts evenly on 3 dpns, pm and join to work in round, being careful not to twist. Work in k3, p3 rib for 4"/10cm.

HAND

Beg lace pattern

Next rnd K15, p3, work rnd 1 of lace chart over 15 sts, p3, k18. Cont in pat until 8 rnds of lace chart have been worked twice. Work to end of rnd.

Beg thumb gusset

Next (inc) rnd K10, pm, M1L, k2, M1R, pm, k3, p3, cont lace pattern, p3, k18. Rep inc rnd every other round 8 times more—72 sts.

Next rnd K10, drop marker, place 20 thumb sts on holder or scrap yarn, drop marker. Join and work in pat to end of rnd—52 sts. Cont in pat until piece measures approx 8"/20.5cm or desired length to base of fingers, end with a chart row 8. **Next rnd** Drop marker for beg of rnd, k11, pm for new beg of rnd.

FINGERS

Little finger

Next rnd K20 and place these sts on spare dpn, with free needle, k6, with 2nd needle, k6, with 3rd needle, cast on 3 sts, place rem 20 sts on spare dpn—15 little finger sts, 40 sts on spare dpns. Join finger 15 sts, distributing evenly on needles, and work in St st (k every rnd) for approx 2"/5cm or desired length of finger. **Next (dec) rnd** [Ssk, k1, ssk] 3 times—9 sts. **Next (dec) rnd** [Ssk, k1] 3 times—6 sts. Cut yarn and thread through rem sts with tapestry needle.

Ring Finger

Place next 6 sts from each spare dpn onto 2 working dpns. Rejoin yarn at palm-side base of previous finger. With free needle, k6, with 2nd needle, cast on 3 sts, with 3rd needle, k6, pick up and k2 sts from cast-on sts for previous finger—17 sts. Join, distributing sts evenly on needles, and work in St st for approx 3"/7.5cm or desired length of finger. **Next (dec) rnd** [Ssk, k1, ssk] 3 times, ssk—10 sts. **Next (dec) rnd** [Ssk, k1] twice, [ssk] twice—6 sts. Cut yarn and thread through rem sts with tapestry needle.

Middle Finger

Place next 7 sts from each spare dpn onto 2 working needles. Rejoin yarn at palm-side base of previous finger.

With free needle, k5, with 2nd needle, k2, cast on 1 st, k2, with 3rd needle, k5, pick up and k2 sts from cast-on sts for previous finger—17 sts. Join, distributing sts evenly on needles, and work in St st for approx 3 1/4"/8.5cm or desired length of finger. Work dec rnds same as for ring finger.

Index Finger

Work same as for middle finger for 3"/7.5cm or desired length of finger. Work dec's same as for ring finger.

Thumb

Place 20 sts from scrap yarn on 3 dpns. Rejoin yarn at palm-side. K19, k last st of rnd tog with first st of previous rnd—19 sts. Cont even in St st for 2"/5cm or desired length of thumb.

Next rnd [Ssk, k1] 5 times, [ssk] twice—12 sts.

Next rnd [Ssk] 6 times—6 sts. Cut yarn and pull through rem sts.

RIGHT GLOVE

Work same as for left glove until cuff measures 4"/10cm.

HAND

Beg lace pattern

Next rnd K18, p3, work rnd 1 of lace chart, p3, k15. Cont in pat until 8 rnds of lace chart have been worked twice. Work to end of rnd.

Beg thumb gusset

Next (inc) rnd K18, p3, work lace chart over 15 sts, p3, k3, pm, MIL, k2, M1R, pm, k10. Rep inc rnd every other round 8 times more—72 sts.

Next rnd Work to first marker, drop marker, place 20 thumb sts on holder or scrap yarn, drop marker, work to end of rnd—52 sts. Work even until glove measures approx 8"/20.5cm or desired length to base of fingers, end with a chart row 7. **Next rnd** Drop beg of rnd marker, work even to last 11 sts, pm for new beg of rnd.

FINGERS


Little finger

Next rnd K20 and place these sts on spare dpn, with free needle, k6, with second needle, k6, with third needle, cast on 3 sts, place rem 20 sts on spare dpn—15 finger sts, 40 sts on spare dpns. Join 15 finger sts, distributing evenly on needles, and work same as for left glove little finger.

Work rem fingers and thumb same as for left glove, only rejoining yarn at back of hand. ♦

MATERIALS

- 2 1.4oz/40g skeins (each approx 168yd/154m) of Kia Ora/Zealana Rimu (NZ merino wool/possum) in #3 riverbank
- One each size 3 (3.25mm) circular needles, 16 and 24"/41 and 61cm long OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One set (4) size 3 (3.25mm) double-pointed needles (dpn)
- Stitch marker
- Tapestry needle

GAUGES

29 sts and 32 rnds = 4"/10cm over k2, p2 rib, using size 3 (3.25mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

STITCH GLOSSARY

Visible Increase (VI) Insert the LH needle from front to back into the strand between last st worked and the next st on the LH needle. Knit into the front loop for an open increase.

K2, P2 RIB

(over an even number of sts)

Rnd 1 *K2, p2; rep from * around.

Rep rnd 1 for k2, p2 rib.

CROWN

(Note Change to longer needles as needed)

With dpns, cast on 12 sts and divide evenly between 3 needles. Join and pm for beg of rnd.

Rnd 4 Purl

Rnd 5 Knit

Rnd 6 (inc) *K1, VI; rep from * around—24 sts. Rep rnds 1-6 once—48 sts. **Work rnds 1-5 once. Knit one rnd. Rep rnds 1-5**.

Next (inc) rnd *K2, VI; rep from * around—72 sts. Rep from ** to **.

Next (inc) rnd *K3, VI; rep from * around—96 sts. Rep from ** to **.

Next (inc) rnd *K4, VI; rep from * around—120 sts. Rep from ** to **.

Next (inc) rnd *K5, VI; rep from * around—144 sts. Rep from ** to **.

Next (inc) rnd *K6, VI; rep from * around—168 sts. Rep from ** to **.

Next (dec) rnd *K2tog, k5; rep from * around—144 sts. Knit one rnd.

BRIM

Work in k2, p2 rib for 8"/20.5cm

Bind off in rib.

FINISHING

Fold brim in half to RS, and with tapestry needle and yarn, sew down around circumference of hat. ♦

10 CABLED CAP

Snug fitting cabled cap, worked in the round from the ribbed brim up. Sized for adult woman and shown on page 74.



KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Circumference (stretched) 21"/53.5cm
- Length 7 3/4"/19.5cm

MATERIALS

- 2 1 3/4 oz/50g balls (each 151yd/138m) Rowan/Westminster Fibers, Inc. *Kid Classic* (lamb-wool/kid mohair/nylon) in # 851 straw
- One size 6 (4mm) circular needle, 16"/40cm long
- One size 8 (5mm) circular needle, 24"/60cm long

- Cable needle (cn) and stitch marker

GAUGES

- 19 sts and 25 rnds = 4"/10cm over St st, using size 8 (5mm) needles.







M1L Insert the LH needle from front to back into the strand between last st worked and the next st on the LH needle. Knit into the back loop to twist the st.

Twisted S2KP Sl 2 sts tog as if to ptbl, place both sl sts back on LH needle in their new orientation, sl 2 tog knitwise, k1, pass sl st tog over k st.

CHART 2



K1, P1 RIB

(over an even number of sts)

Rnd 1 *P1, k1; rep from * to end. Rep rnd 1 for p1, k1 rib.

BODY

With circular needle, cast on 126 (140) sts. Pm and join for knitting in the round. Work in k1, p1 rib for 9 rnds.

For size Small only

Next (inc) rnd P1, M1R, k2, M1R, k3, M1R, k2, M1L, p1; rep from * around—182 sts.

For size Medium only

Next (inc) rnd P1, [M1R, k3] twice, M1R, k2, p1; rep from * around—182 sts.

Beg chart 1

Work 13-st rep of chart 14 times to end of rnd. When the 8 rnds of chart have been worked 4 times, rep rnds 1 and 2 once more.

Beg chart 2

Work decreasing rep of chart 2 seven times around—175 sts. When 26 rnds of chart 2 are complete, cut yarn, thread tail through rem 7 sts, and fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends and block to size by washing and stretching over a plate to dry. ♦



Next (dec) rnd Work chart rnd 40, [k to 2 sts before marker, k2tog] 4 times—83 sts.



- One size 1 (2.25mm) circular needle, 20"/50cm long OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One set (5) size 1 (2.25mm) double-pointed needles
- One size B-1 (2.25mm) crochet hook
- Stitch markers and scrap yarn

GAUGE

26 sts and 40 rows to 4"/10cm over double knit and charted pattern, after blocking, using size 1 (2.25mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

PROVISIONAL CAST ON

Using scrap yarn and crochet hook, ch the number of sts to cast on plus a few extra. Cut a tail and pull the tail through the last chain. With knitting needle and yarn, pick up and knit the stated number of sts through the "purl bumps" on the back of the chain. To remove waste chain, when instructed, pull out the tail from the last crochet stitch. Gently and slowly pull on the tail to unravel the crochet stitches, carefully placing each released knit stitch on a needle.

DOUBLE KNIT

The charted portion of this hat is worked in double knit as foll: with one strand of each color at *back*, knit the first (RS) st with color indicated on chart. Move both strands to *front* of work and purl the 2nd (WS) st with the opposite color. These 2 sts are represented by 1 square on the chart. Each set of sts will always contain 1 MC st and 1 CC st.

BRIM

With circular needle and MC, cast on 136 sts using provisional cast on. PM and join, being careful not to twist sts. Work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) for 3 rounds.

Next rnd Release the provisional cast on and distribute these 136 sts evenly over 4 dpns, pm for beg of rnd, taking care that this marker lines up with first marker. With purl side facing, join CC to these new sts and purl 1 rnd.

Set-up for Double Knit Pat

With RS facing out, fold CC section of work to inside of MC section. With circular needle *sl 1 MC, sl 1 CC from dpns; rep from * until all 272 sts are on one circular needle. (Note From here on, both colors will be used in each round.)

Next rnd With MC and CC at back of work in double knit as foll: *k1 MC, move MC and CC to front of work, p1 CC; repeat from * around. **Next rnd** [Work 20 sts as established, pm] 7 times, work 14 sts, pm, [work 20 sts, pm] 5 times, work 18 sts.

Beg chart

Work each rnd as foll: A section of chart over 118 sts, B section of chart over 36 sts, rep A section over 118 sts. When 28 rnds of chart are complete, work one rnd even in double knit.

CROWN





BRIM

With smaller needle and A, cast on 120 sts, placing marker (pm) every 40 sts. Join for working in the rnd and work rnds 1-3 of Latvian Braid once, then work rnds 2 and 3 once more, slipping markers (sm) every rnd.

Change to larger needles and MC, work in St st (k every rnd) for 42 rnds.

- Length 22 1/2 (23, 24, 25, 25 1/2)"/57 (58.5, 61, 63, 64.5)cm

MATERIALS

- 7 (8, 9, 10, 11) 1 3/4 oz/50g hanks (each approx 138yd/126m) of Alchemy Yarns of Transformation *Silk Purse* (silk) in #76e topaz
- One pair size 5 (3.75mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Size 5 (3.75mm) circular needle 32"/80cm long

GAUGE

24 sts and 30 rows = 4"/10cm over St st using size 5 (3.75mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

SEED STITCH

(over an even number of sts)

Row 1 (RS) *K1, p1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 K the purl sts and p the knit sts.

Rep row 2 for seed st.

K1, P1 RIB

(over an even number of sts)

Row 1 *K1, p1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 K the knit sts, and p the purl sts.

Rep row 2 for k1, p1 rib.

BACK

With straight needles cast on 93 (105, 115, 127, 137) sts. Work in seed st for 1 1/2"/4cm. K next row on RS, inc 8 (8, 10, 10, 12) sts evenly spaced across—101 (113, 125, 137, 149) sts. P 1 row. Cont in St st (k on RS, p on WS), inc 1 st each side every 8th row 5 times, every 4th row twice, every other row 13 times—141 (153, 165, 177, 189) sts. Work even until piece measures 12 (12, 12, 12 1/2, 12 1/2)"/30.5 (30.5, 30.5, 31.5, 31.5)cm from beg.

Armhole shaping

Bind off 2 sts at beg of next 12 rows—117 (129, 141, 153, 165) sts. Work even for 3 (3 1/2, 4, 4 1/2, 5)"/7.5 (9, 10, 11.5, 12.5)cm.

Cast on 2 sts at beg next 12 rows—141 (153, 165, 177, 189) sts. Work even until armhole measures 6 1/2 (7, 8, 8 1/2, 9)"/16.5 (18, 20.5, 21.5, 23)cm.

Shoulder shaping

Bind off 3 (3, 3, 3, 5) sts at beg of next 24 (24, 14, 6, 6) rows, 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) sts at beg of next 6 (6, 16, 24, 24) rows. Bind off rem 57 (57, 59, 63, 63) sts for back neck.

LEFT FRONT

With straight needles cast on 33 (39, 44, 50, 55) sts. Work in seed st for 1 1/2"/4cm. K next row on RS, inc 2 (2, 3, 3, 4) sts evenly spaced across—35 (41, 47, 53, 59) sts. P 1 row. Cont in St st, inc 1 st at side (beg of RS rows) same as back—55 (61, 67, 73, 79) sts.

Armhole shaping

Bind off 2 sts at beg of next 6 RS rows—49 (55, 61, 67, 73) sts. Work even for 3 (3 1/2, 4, 4 1/2, 5)"/7.5 (9, 10, 11.5, 12.5)cm.

Cast on 2 sts at beg of next 6 RS rows—49 (55, 61, 67, 73) sts. Work even until armhole measures 6 1/2 (7, 8, 8 1/2, 9)"/16.5 (18, 20.5, 21.5, 23)cm.

Shoulder shaping

Bind off 3 (3, 3, 3, 5) sts at beg of next 12 (12, 7, 3, 3) RS rows, 2 (4, 4, 4, 4) sts at beg of next 3 (3, 8, 12, 12) RS rows. Bind off rem 13 (13, 14, 16, 16) sts.

RIGHT FRONT

Work to correspond to left front, working all shaping at beg of WS rows.

FINISHING

Block pieces to measurements. Sew shoulder seams, sew last 13 (13, 14, 16, 16) sts on each front along back neck.

Front bands and collar

With RS facing and circular needle, beg at lower right front edge, pick up and k 118 (120, 126, 132, 134) sts evenly along right front edge, 33

sts along back neck and 118 (120, 126, 132, 134) sts evenly along left front edge—269 (273, 285, 297, 301) sts. Work in seed st for 4 1/2"/11.5cm. Bind off loosely in pat.

Armhole bands

With RS facing and circular needle, pick up and k 79 (85, 97, 103, 109) sts evenly around each armhole edge.

Work in seed st for 1 1/2"/2.5cm. Bind off in pat.


Sew side and armhole band seams.

Tie

Cast on 18 sts.

Work in k1, p1 rib, slipping first st of *every* row until tie measures approx 45 (49, 53, 57, 61)"/114 (124.5, 134.5, 144.5, 155)cm.

Bind off in rib. ♦

KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust (closed) 32 (36, 40, 44, 48, 52)"/81 (91.5, 101.5, 111.5, 122, 132)cm
- Length 24 3/4 (25, 26, 26 1/2, 27 1/2, 28)"/63 (63.5, 66, 67.5, 70, 71)cm

- Upper arm 13 (14, 15, 16, 17, 18)"/33 (35.5, 38, 40.5, 43, 45.5)cm

MATERIALS

- 4 (4, 5, 5, 6, 7) 3½oz/100g hanks (each approx 185yd/170m) of Lion Brand Yarn *LB Collection Organic Wool* (organic wool) in #124 toffee (MC)
- 3 (3, 4, 4, 5, 5) hanks in #134 avocado (CC)
- One pair each sizes 8 and 9 (5 and 5.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Stitch holders

GAUGE

16 sts and 30 rows = 4"/10cm over pat st using larger needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

K1, P1 RIB

(over a multiple of 2 sts plus 1)

Row 1 (RS) K1, *p1, k1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 K the knit sts, and p the purl sts.

Rep 2 for k1, p1 rib.

PATTERN STITCH

(over a multiple of 2 sts plus 1)

Row 1 (RS) With MC, k1, *k next st in the row below, k1; rep from * to end. **Row 2** With MC, purl. **Row 3** With CC, k2, *k next st in the row below, k1; rep from *, end k1. **Row 4** With CC, purl. Rep rows 1-4 for pat st.

BACK

With smaller needles and MC, cast on 65 (73, 81, 89, 97, 105) sts. Work in k1, p1 rib for 8 rows. Change to larger needles and cont in pat st until piece measures 17 (17, 17½, 17½, 18, 18)"/43 (43, 44.5, 44.5, 45.5, 45.5)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Armhole shaping

Bind off 4 (4, 5, 6, 7, 8) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st each side on next row, then every other row 3 (5, 6, 7, 8, 9) times more—49 (53, 57, 61, 65, 69) sts. Work even until armhole measures 7½ (7½, 8, 8½, 9, 9½)"/18.5 (19, 20.5, 21.5, 23, 24)cm, end with a WS row.

Shoulder shaping

Bind off 6 (7, 7, 8, 9, 10) sts at beg of next 2 rows, then 5 (6, 7, 8, 8, 9) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Bind off rem 27 (27, 29, 29, 31, 31) sts.

LEFT FRONT

With smaller needles and MC, cast on 37 (41, 45, 49, 53, 57) sts. Work in k1, p1 rib for 8 rows. Change to larger needles.

Next row (RS) Work in pat st over first 31 (35, 39, 43, 47, 51) sts, place rem 6 sts on holder for frontband. Work even until piece measures 15 (15, 15½, 16, 16½, 17)"/38 (38, 39.5, 40.5, 42, 43)cm, end with a WS row.

Neck and armhole shaping

Next (dec) row (RS) Work to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. Rep dec row every 6th row 11 (11, 12, 12, 13, 13) times more. AT SAME TIME, when piece measures same length as back to underarm, shape armhole at beg of RS rows same as back.

When all shaping is completed, work even on

rem 11 (13, 14, 16, 17, 19) sts until piece measures same length as back to shoulder. Shape shoulder at side edge same as back.

RIGHT FRONT

With smaller needles and MC, cast on 37 (41, 45, 49, 53, 57) sts. Work in k1, p1 rib for 8 rows. Change to larger needles.


Next row (RS) Work in rib over first 6 sts, place sts on holder for front band, work in pat st over rem 31 (35, 39, 43, 47, 51) sts. Cont to work as for left front, reversing all shaping.

SLEEVES

With smaller needles and MC, cast on 53 (57, 61, 65, 69, 73) sts. Work in k1, p1 rib for 8 rows. Change to larger needles and cont in pat st until piece measures 5 (5, 5½, 5½, 6, 6)"/12.5 (12.5, 14, 14, 15, 15)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Cap shaping

Bind off 4 (4, 5, 6, 7, 8) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Dec 1 st each side on next row, then every other row 2 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4) times more, every 4th row 6 (6, 6, 6, 7, 7) times, every other row 4 (4, 5, 5, 4, 5) times. Bind off rem 19 (21, 21, 21, 23, 23) sts.



FINISHING

Lightly block pieces to measurements.

Left frontband

With RS facing, smaller needles and MC, cast on 1 st, then work in rib pat as established over 6 sts from left front holder—7 sts. Cont in k1, p1 rib until band measures same length as front edge to shoulder when slightly stretched. Mark beg and end of last row for beg of back neckband. Cont in k1, p1 rib for 3 1/4 (3 1/2, 3 1/2, 3 1/4, 3 1/4)"/8 (8, 9, 9, 9.5, 9.5)cm. Bind off in rib.

Right frontband

With RS facing, smaller needles and MC, work in rib pat as established over 6 sts from right front holder, cast on 1 st—7 sts. Cont to work same as left frontband. Sew shoulder seams. Sew bound-off edges of frontbands tog. Sew inner edges of frontbands to front edges, matching markers to shoulder seams, then cont to sew back neckband to back neck edge, centering seam. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

Pockets (make 2)

With larger needles and CC, cast on 25 sts. Beg with row 3, work in pat st until piece measures 4 3/4"/12cm from beg, end with row 4. Change to smaller needles and MC. Work in k1, p1 rib for 8 rows. Bind off loosely in rib. Sew on pockets.

Belt

With smaller needles and MC, cast on 5 (5, 5, 7, 7, 7) sts. Work in k1, p1 rib for 42 (45, 49, 53, 57, 62)"/106.5, 114.5, 124.5, 134.5, 144.5, 157.5)cm. Bind off in rib. ♦

21 CABLED PULLOVER

Loose-fitting pullover knit in the round from the top down. Sized for Small, Medium, Large, X-Large and shown in size Small on page 83.



KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust 35 (39 1/4, 43 1/2, 46 1/4)"/89 (99.5, 110, 117.5)cm
- Length 23 (24 1/4, 27 1/2, 27 3/4)"/58.5 (61.5, 70, 70.5)cm
- Upper arm 14 1/4 (16 1/2, 18 1/2, 19)"/34.5 (42, 47, 48)cm

MATERIALS

- 10 (11, 12, 13) 4oz/113g hanks (each approx 210yd/192m) Lorna's Laces *Green Line Worsted* (organic merino wool) in solitude
- One each size 10.5 (6.5mm) circular needle, 16"/40cm and 29"/74cm long OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One set (5) size 10.5 (6.5mm) double-pointed needles (dpns)
- Cable needle (cn), stitch markers and 2 stitch holders

GAUGE

13 sts and 20 rnds = 4"/10cm over St st, using size 10.5 (6.5mm) needle.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK THE GAUGE.

STITCH GLOSSARY

Inc 1B Inc 1 st by k into the st below the next st and then k the next st.

10-st RC Sl 5 sts to cn and hold to *back*, k5, k5 from cn.

10-st LC Sl 5 sts to cn and hold to *front*, k5, k5 from cn.

NOTE

1) Sweater is worked with 2 strands of yarn held together throughout.

2) Slip markers (sm) each rnd, unless otherwise noted.

COLLAR

With longer circular needle and 2 strands of yarn held tog, cast on 101 (107, 115, 121) sts. Work back and forth as foll: **Row 1 (RS)** K5, *p1, k1; rep from * to last 6 sts, p1, k5. **Row 2** P the purl sts, and k the knit sts. Rep last 2 rows 9 times more or until piece measures 4 1/2"/11.5cm from beg, end with a WS row. **Next row** K5, *k2tog; rep from * to last 6 sts, k6—56 (59, 63, 66) sts. Change to shorter needle and purl one row.

Join neck

With purl side facing, place marker (pm) for beg of rnd, and join for working in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts. Knit 2 rnds.

YOKES

Set-up rnd K10 (for one side of cable), p1 (2, 3, 3), k1 (1, 1, 2) pm, k7 (for sleeve), pm, k18 (19, 21, 22) (for back), pm, k7 (for sleeve), pm, k1 (1, 1, 2) p1 (2, 3, 3), k10 (for other side of cable).

(Inc) Rnd 1 (and all odd numbered rnds) *K the knit sts, p the purl sts to 1 st before marker, Inc 1B, slip marker (sm), Inc 1B; rep from * 3 times more, k the knit sts, p the purl sts to end of rnd—64 (67, 71, 74) sts.

Rnd 2 K the knit sts, p the purl sts around.

Rnd 4 Rep rnd 2.

Rnd 6 10-st LC, work in pat to last 10 sts, 10-st RC.

Rnds 7-12 Rep rnds 1 and 2 as established.

Change to longer needle when necessary.

Rep rnds 1-12 until inc rnd has been worked a total of 20 (23, 26, 27) times—216 (243, 271, 282) sts. Rep rnd 2 once more.

Divide body and sleeves

Next rnd (Note Slip marker (sm) for beg of rnd, drop all other markers) Work next 32 (36, 40, 42) sts in pat, sm, place 47 (53, 59, 61) sts on holder for sleeve, work 58 (65, 73, 76) back sts, place 47 (53, 59, 61) sts on 2nd holder for sleeve, work next 32 (36, 40, 42) sts in pat—122 (137, 153, 160) body sts.

BODY

Work in pat as established, discontinuing incs and working rnd 1 as k the knit sts, p the purl sts, until piece measures 10 (10, 11, 11)"/25.5 (25.5, 28, 28) sts from underarm, end with a rnd 9, 10, 11, or 12.

Divide for ribbing

Next rnd [K2tog] 5 times, p1, [k1, Inc 1 B] 24 (28, 32, 69) times, k1 (2, 2, 0), [k1, Inc 1 B] 25 (28, 32, 0) times, k1 (1, 1, 0), p1, [k2tog] 5 times—161 (183, 207, 219) sts. Turn work to beg working back and forth.

Row 1 (WS) P5, *k1, p1; rep from * to last 6 sts, k1, p5. **Row 2** K the knit sts, and p the purl sts. Rep rows 1 and 2 until piece measures 15 (15, 17, 17)"/38 (38, 43, 43)cm from underarm. With RS facing bind off as foll: Bind off 5 sts, *k2tog and bind off resulting st, bind off next st; rep from * to last 5 sts, bind off as usual.

SLEEVES

Place 45 (53, 59, 61) sts on shorter circular needle or dpns, at underarm, cast on 1 st, pm for beg of rnd—46 (54, 60, 62) sts. **Next rnd** *K1, p1; rep from * around. Rep this rnd until sleeve measures 18 (18, 19, 19)"/45.5 (45.5, 48, 48)cm from underarm. Bind off as foll: K2tog, k1, pass first st on RH needle over 2nd st to bind off *k2tog, pass first st on RH needle over 2nd st to bind off, bind off next st; rep from * around.

FINISHING

Sew body and sleeve tog at underarm. ♦

KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust 34 (36, 38, 40)"/86.5 (91.5, 96.5, 101.5)cm
- Length 21 1/4 (22, 22 1/4, 22 3/4)"/55 (56, 56.5, 58)cm
- Upper arm 13 1/4 (14, 14 1/2, 15 1/2)"/33.5 (35.5, 37, 39.5)cm

MATERIALS

- 9 (9, 10, 11) 1 1/4oz/50g balls (each approx 115yd/105m) of Be Sweet Bamboo (bamboo) in #622 sage
- Size 3 (3.25mm) needles, one each 24"/60cm and 16"/40cm long OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Stitch markers

GAUGE

24 sts and 32 rows = 4"/10cm over St st using size 3 (3.25mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

BODY

With longer circular needle, cast on 204 (216, 228, 240) sts. Place marker for beg of rnd and join being careful not to twist sts.

Rnd 1 K102 108, 114, 120, pm (for side seam), k to end of rnd.

Rnd 2 Purl. Cont in garter st (k 1 rnd, p 1 rnd) as established until piece measures 2"/5cm from beg. Then, work in St st (k every rnd) until piece measures 15"/38cm from beg.

Separate at armhole


Next rnd Bind off 3 sts, k to 3 sts before side seam marker, bind off 3 sts, remove marker, bind off 3 sts, k to last 3 sts, with separate length of yarn, bind off 3 sts. There are 96 (102, 108, 114) sts each for front and for back. Leave the first sts on holder to be worked later for front.

BACK

Work back and forth on 96 (102, 108, 114) sts as foll: **Row 1 (WS)** Purl. **Dec row 2 (RS)** K1, ssk, k to the last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. Rep last 2 rows 2 (2, 3, 5) times more—90 (96, 100, 102) sts. Work even in St st (k on RS, p on WS) until armhole measures 6 1/2 (6 1/4, 6 3/4, 7 1/4)"/16 (16.5, 17, 18.5)cm, end with a RS row.

Next row (WS) P 21 (24, 26, 27), k 48 center sts (for neck), p 21 (24, 26, 27). Cont to work the shoulder sts in St st AND the center 48 sts in garter st (k every row), until armhole measures 6 1/4 (7, 7 1/4, 7 3/4)"/17 (18, 18.5, 19.5)cm.

Last row Work 21 (24, 26, 27) sts, bind off center 48 sts, work rem sts. Leave the shoulder sts



on hold for binding off with the front shoulders in the finishing.

FRONT

Work as for back until the armhole shaping is completed—90 (96, 100, 102) sts. Work even for 1 (3, 3, 3) rows more.

Flower Cut Out

Next row (RS) K42 (45, 47, 48), join a 2nd ball of yarn and bind off center 6 sts, k to end. Working both sides at once with separate balls of yarn, work even until piece measures 3"/7.5cm from the 6-st bind-off.

Next row (RS) K sts of first side, cast on 6 sts, k sts of the 2nd side—90 (96, 100, 102) sts. P 1 row on all sts.

Next row (RS) K21 (24, 26, 27), join a 2nd ball of yarn and bind off center 48 sts, k to end. Working both sides at once with separate balls of yarn, work even for 2"/5cm from the 48-st bind-off.

Next row (RS) Knit the first side, cast on 48 sts, k sts of the 2nd side. P 1 row on all sts.

Next row (RS) K42 (45, 47, 48), *insert RH needle under the 6 cast-on sts from the rows below and pick up a loop to place on LH needle, then k next st on LH needle and pass the picked up loop over and off the needle; rep from * until all 6 sts are worked, k to end. Work even in St st for 6 rows more.

Next row (WS) P 21 (24, 26, 27), k 48 center sts, p 21 (24, 26, 27). Cont to work the shoulder sts in St st AND the center 48 sts in garter st until armhole measures same as back.

Last row Using the 3-needle bind off method, join 21 (24, 26, 27) sts of one shoulder with the matching back shoulder, bind off center 48 sts, join the rem shoulder st to the back shoulder.

SLEEVES

Note Sleeves are picked up around the armhole edge and worked in rounds to the cuff edge. With shorter circular needle, from the RS and beg at the armhole edge, above the bind-off, pick up and k 40 (42, 44, 47) sts to the shoulder, then 40 (42, 44, 47) sts along the other armhole edge. Do not join; turn work.

Row 1 (WS) Purl to the bound-off st, pick up and purl this st, then pass the last sleeve st over this st and off the needle.


Row 2 Knit and rep row 1.

Rep these 2 rows until all bound-off armhole sts are joined. There are 80 (84, 88, 94) sts. Join to work in the round and pm to mark beg of rnd. Work in rnds of St st for 5"/12.5cm.

Dec rnd K1, k2tog, k to the last 3 sts, ssk, k1. K 3 rnds. Rep the last 4 rnds 7 (7, 8, 8) times more—64 (68, 70, 76) sts. K 12 rnds.

Split the cuff

Next row (RS) Bind off 1 st, k to end. Work in rows of garter st for 1 1/2"/4cm. Bind off. Rep for other sleeve. *

KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust 34 (36, 38, 43, 46)"/86.5 (91.5, 96.5, 109, 117)cm
- Length 21 1/4 (21 1/4, 23 1/4, 24 1/4, 24 1/4)"/54 (55, 59, 61.5, 63)cm
- Upper arm 13 1/4 (14, 14 1/4, 16, 16 1/2)"/34 (35.5, 37.5, 40.5, 42)cm

MATERIALS

- 15 (16, 18, 21, 23) 1 1/4oz/50g balls (each approx 103yd/94m) of Classic Elite Yarns *Chesapeake* (organic cotton/fine merino) in #5997 metro green
- One pair size 10 1/2 (6.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Size 10 1/2 (6.5mm) circular needle, 24"/60cm long
- Cable needle

GAUGES

- 14 sts and 18 rows = 4"/10cm over St st using 2 strands of yarn held tog and size 10 1/2 (6.5mm) needles.
- 22 sts of one cable panel (chart 1) = 5"/12.5cm wide using size 10 1/2 (6.5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGES.

STITCH GLOSSARY

3-st **LPC** Sl 2 sts to cn and hold to *front*, p1, k2 from cn.

3-st **RPC** Sl 1 st to cn and hold to *back*, k2, p1 from cn.

4-st **LC** Sl 2 sts to cn and hold to *front*, k2, k2 from cn.

4-st **RC** Sl 2 sts to cn and hold to *back*, k2, k2 from cn.

M1 p-st Insert the LH needle from front to back under the strand between last st worked and the

next st on the LH needle. Purl into the back loop to twist the st.

SHORT ROW WRAPPING

See pattern #1.

NOTE

Work with 2 strands of yarn held tog throughout.

BACK

With 2 strands of yarn held tog, cast on 62 (66, 70, 78, 82) sts. **Row 1 (RS)** P2, *k2, p2; rep from * to end. **Next row** K the knit sts and p the purl sts for k2, p2 rib. Cont in k2, p2 rib for 3"/7.5cm.

Beg chart 1

Row 1 (RS) K21 (23, 25, 29, 31), p1, M1 p-st, work sts 3-20 of row 1 of chart 1, M1 p-st, k21 (23, 25, 29, 31)—64 (68, 72, 80, 84) sts. **Row 2** P21 (23, 25, 29, 31), work row 2 of chart 1 over 22 sts, p 21 (23, 25, 29, 31). Cont to work as established, working center 22 sts foll chart 1, until piece measures 13 (13, 14, 14, 14)"/33 (33, 35.5, 35.5, 35.5)cm from beg.

Armhole shaping

Bind off 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Dec row (RS) K1, ssk, work to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. Rep dec row every other row 2 (3, 4, 5, 5) times more—50 (52, 54, 58, 62) sts. Work even until armhole measures 7 (7 1/2, 8, 9, 9 1/2)"/18 (19, 20.5, 23, 24)cm.

Shoulder shaping

Bind off 4 (5, 5, 6, 6) sts at beg of next 4 rows. 5 (4, 5, 5, 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Bind off rem 24 sts.

FRONT

Work as for back to the armhole.

Neck and armhole shaping

Next row (RS) Bind off 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) sts, work to the center 12 sts, join 2 new strands of yarn, bind off center 12 sts, work to end. **Next row (WS)** Bind off 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) sts, work to end of row working each side with separate balls of yarn. **Next row (RS)** K1, ssk, work to the last 8 sts of first side; k2tog (for neck dec), work rem 6 sts; on 2nd side, work 6 sts, ssk (for neck dec), work to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. Cont to dec 1 st at each side of armhole edges every other row 2 (3, 4, 5, 5) times more, AT SAME TIME, work neck dec's every 4th row 5 times more. After all shaping is completed, work even on rem 13 (14, 15, 17, 19) sts each side until armhole measures same as back.

Shoulder shaping

Bind off 4 (5, 5, 6, 6) sts from each shoulder edge twice, then 5 (4, 5, 5, 7) sts once.

SLEEVES

With 2 strands of yarn held tog, cast on 30 (30, 34, 38, 38) sts. Work in k2, p2 rib as on back for 3"/7.5cm.

Beg chart 2

Row 1 (RS) K10 (10, 12, 14, 14), p1, M1 p-st, work sts 3-10 of row 1 of chart 2, M1 p-st, p1, k10 (10, 12, 14, 14). **Row 2** P10 (10, 12, 14, 14), work row 2 of chart 2 over 12 sts, p10 (10, 12, 14, 14). Cont to work as established, working center




12 sts foll chart 2 for 8 rows more. **Inc row (RS)** K1, inc 1 st in next st, work to the last 3 sts, inc 1 st in next st, k2. Rep inc row every 4th row 8 (9, 9, 9, 10) times more—50 (52, 56, 60, 62) sts. Work even until piece measures 17 (17 17, 17 1/2, 17 1/2)"/43 (43, 43, 44.5, 44.5)cm from beg.

Cap shaping

Bind off 4 (4, 4, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Work dec row as on back on the next RS row, then every other row 2 (3, 3, 6, 7) times more. Bind off 2 sts at beg of next 14 (14, 16, 14, 14) rows. Bind off rem 8 sts.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

Collar

With 2 strands of yarn held tog and circular needle, beg and end at the center 12-st bind-off, pick up and k 78 (82, 86, 90, 94) sts evenly around neck edge. Working back and forth in rows, work as foll: **Row 1 (WS)** [P2, k2] 4 times, pm, *p2, k2; rep from * to last 16 sts, pm, [k2, p2] 4 times.

Stitch Key

- k on RS, p on WS
- p on RS, k on WS
- 3-st RPC
- 3-st LPC
- 4-st RC
- 4-st LC

Short row 2 (RS) Work in k2, p2 rib to 1 st before the 2nd marker, w&t. **Short row 3 (WS)** Sl 1, work in k2, p2 rib to 1 st before the first marker, w&t. **Short row 4** Sl 1, work in rib to 2 sts before the last wrapped st, w&t. Rep short row 4 until collar measures 4"/10cm, when measured at the center back neck. On next 2 rows, work to end of row picking up the wrapped sts. Then, cont in k2, p2 rib on all sts until collar measures 3"/7.5cm, when measured at the center front edge. Bind off loosely. Overlap the right collar edge over the left collar edge and sew through both thicknesses at the 12-st bind-off. Block lightly to measurements, being careful not to press or block the ribs. ♦

24 FELTED ROSES CHAIR

Knitted and felted flowers attached to purchased chair. Shown on pages 86 and 87.



KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

Approx 16 felted roses will cover a 12"/30cm square of chair surface.

MATERIALS

- 2 3 1/2 oz/100g hanks will make 10 roses, (each approx 220yd/201m) of Cascade Yarns *Cascade 220* (Peruvian highland wool) in #8904 purple and #7803 magenta
- One pair size 15 (10mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Yarn needle

GAUGE

12 sts and 10 rows = 4"/10cm over St st using 2 strands of yarn held tog and size 15 (10mm) needles. TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

ROSE

With 2 strands of a color held tog, cast on 12 sts.

Row 1 (RS) Knit. **Row 2 and all WS rows** Purl.

Row 3 *K in front and back of next st; rep from * to end—24 sts. **Row 5** Rep row 3—48 sts.

Row 7 Rep row 3—96 sts. **Row 8** Purl. Bind off.

Flower shaping


To shape rose, form spiral and sew in place at back, working between first 2 rows and sewing through all layers. Weave in ends before felting.

FELTING

- 1) Use a low water setting and hottest temperature in a top loading washing machine. Add small amount of laundry detergent and jeans or towels for agitation.
- 2) Place roses in a lingerie bag or zippered pillowcase and add to machine. Check the felting progress frequently, removing roses when the individual stitches are no longer visible and roses are felted to the desired size.
- 3) Place roses in cool water to stop the felting process and remove suds. Remove from lingerie bag and roll gently in towel to remove excess water.
- 4) Block and re-shape while wet. Allow to air dry completely.

FINISHING

Hot glue or sew to chair as desired. ♦

KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust (closed) 32 (34, 36, 38)"/81 (86, 91.5, 96.5)cm

- Length 26½ (26¾, 27¾, 28¾)"/67 (68, 70.5, 73)cm
- Upper arm 13 (13½, 14½, 15)"/33 (34, 36, 38)cm

MATERIALS

- 14 (15, 16, 17) 1¼oz/50g hanks (each approx 114yd/104m) of Koigu Wool Designs *Kersti* (merino wool) in #114 ochre
- Two pair size 7 (4.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One pair size 6 (4mm) needles
- Size 7 (4.5mm) circular needle, 29"/74cm long
- Stitch markers
- 6 sets of large plastic snaps
- Removeable stitch markers or safety pins

GAUGES

- 21 sts and 28 rows = 4"/10cm over St st using size 7 (4.5mm) needles.
- 28 sts and 27 rows = 4"/10cm over rib pattern using size 7 (4.5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGES.

BASIC PEPLUM SKIRT

The back peplum is made in 3 segments (1, 2 and 3), that are joined to form the skirt.

CENTER SEGMENT 1

With size (4.5mm) needles, cast on 73 (83, 93, 103) sts. **Row 1 (RS)** K1, p1, k1, *p7, k1, p1, k1; rep from * 6 (7, 8, 9) times more.

Row 2 K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Cont in rib as established for 25 rows more. Piece measures approx 4"/10cm from beg.

Dec row (WS) [P1, k1, p1, SKP, k3, k2tog] 7 (8, 9, 10) times, p1, k1, p1—59 (67, 75, 83) sts. Leave sts on hold.

SIDE SEGMENTS 2 AND 3

(both segments are the same)

With size (4.5mm) needles, cast on 83 sts.

Row 1 (RS) K1, p1, k1, *p7, k1, p1, k1; rep from * 7 times more.

Row 2 K the knit sts and p the purl sts.

Cont in rib as established for 25 rows more. Piece measures approx 4"/10cm from beg.

Dec row (WS) [P1, k1, p1, SKP, k3, k2tog] 8 times, p1, k1, p1—67 sts. Leave sts on hold.

Join the 3 segments

Joining row (RS) With size 7 (4.5mm) circular needle, work 66 sts of segment 2, k the last st tog with first st of segment 1, work 57 (65, 73, 81) sts, k the last st tog with the first st of segment 3, rib to end—191 (199, 207, 215) sts. Work even in rib pat for 6 rows. There are 23 (24, 25, 26) sets of wide k-5 ribs on the WS.

Note The decreasing to shape the skirt will be worked on WS rows in the alternate wide knit ribs.

Dec row 1 (WS) Rib 3 sts, SKP, work even over the next wide k-5 rib segment and rib to the beg of the following wide k-5 rib segment (or rib 14 sts), SKP, then cont to dec 1 st (by SKP) at beg of every alternate wide k-5 segment across. There are a total of 12 (12, 13, 13) dec's worked for a count of 179 (187, 194, 202) sts. Work even in established rib for 5 rows.

Dec row 2 (WS) Rib 10 sts, SKP, work even over the next wide k-5 rib segment and rib to the beg of the following wide k-5 rib segment, SKP, then cont to dec 1 st (by SKP) at beg of every alternate wide rib segment across. There are a total of 11 (12, 12, 13) dec's worked for a count of 168 (175, 182, 189) sts. Work even in rib for 5 rows.

Dec row 3 (WS) Rib 5 sts, k2tog, work even over the next wide k-4 rib segment and rib to 2 sts before the end of the following wide k-4 rib segment, k2tog, then cont to dec 1 st (by k2tog) at end of every alternate wide rib segment across. There are a total of 12 (12, 13, 13) dec's worked for a count of 156 (163, 169, 176) sts. Work even in rib for 5 rows.

Dec row 4 (WS) Rib 11 sts, k2tog, skip the next wide k-4 rib segment and rib to 2 sts before the end of the following wide k-4 rib segment, k2tog, then cont to dec 1 st (by k2tog) at end of every alternate wide k-4 rib segment across. There are a total of 11 (12, 12, 13) dec's worked for a count of 145 (151, 157, 163) sts. Work even in rib for 5 rows.

Dec row 5 (WS) Rib 3 sts, *SK2P, rib to next 3-st segment; rep from *, end rib 3—99 (103, 107, 111) sts. Work even for 1 row, dec'ing 20 (18, 16, 14) sts evenly spaced across—79 (85, 91, 97) sts. Leave sts on hold on the circular needle.

Waistband

Separately, with size 6 (4mm) needles, cast on 17 sts. Work in k1, p1 rib for 13 (14, 15, 16)"/33 (35.5, 38, 40.5)cm. Bind off. Then, cont along one long edge of the waistband, pick up and k 79 (85, 91, 97) sts in the purl sts of the waistband. Then, using the 3-needle bind-off method, join the waistband to the skirt sts on holder.

BODICE

Working from the RS along the opposite long edge of the waistband, with size 7 (4.5mm) needles, pick up and k 61 (67, 73, 79) sts. Beg with a (WS) purl row, work in St st for 5 rows.

Next row (RS) K 20 (22, 24, 26), pm, inc 1 st in next st, k to end. Rep inc row every other row 9 times more—53 (56, 59, 62) sts. Work even until bodice measures same as back.

working both sides at once, bind off 5 sts from each neck edge once.

LEFT FRONT PEPLUM SKIRT

Note Each front peplum is made in 2 segments (1 and 2) that are joined to form the skirt. Use the instructions for back peplum for the decreasing and joining method.

SEGMENTS 1 AND 2

(both segments are the same.)

With size 7 (4.5mm) needles, cast on 63 sts.

Row 1 (RS) K1, p1, k1, *p7, k1, p1, k1; rep from * 5 times more. Then cont to work each segment foll the back. There are 51 sts after the sts are decreased at 4"/10cm and 100 sts after the 2 segments are joined. Then after working the alternate segment decreasing (see back pep- plum for clarification), there are 53 sts.

Waistband

With size 6 (4mm) needles, cast on 17 sts and work in k1, p1 rib for 8 (8½, 9, 9½)"/20.5 (21.5, 23, 24)cm. Bind off. Then cont along one long edge, pick up and k 53 sts and join the waistband to the peplum.

BODICE

Working from the RS along the opposite long edge of the waistband, with size 7 (4.5mm) needles, pick up and k 43 (46, 49, 52) sts. Beg with a (WS) purl row, work in St st for 5 rows.

Next row (RS) K 20 (22, 24, 26), pm, inc 1 st in next st, k to end. Rep inc row every other row 9 times more—53 (56, 59, 62) sts. Work even until bodice measures same as back.

Armhole shaping

Next row (RS) Bind off 4 sts, work to end. Cont to shape armhole, bind off 2 sts at armhole edge 2 (2, 3, 3) times.

Dec row (RS) K1, ssk, k to end. Rep dec row every other row 4 (6, 6, 7) times more—40 (41, 42, 44) sts. Work even until armhole measures 5½ (5¾, 6¼, 6¾)"/14 (14.5, 16, 17)cm, end with a RS row.

Neck shaping

Next row (WS) Bind off 8 (8, 9, 9) sts, work to end. Cont to shape neck, binding off 5 sts from neck edge once, 4 sts once, 2 sts 4 times—15 (16, 16, 18) sts. Work even until armhole measures same as back to shoulder.

Shoulder shaping

Bind off 5 (5, 5, 6) sts from armhole edge twice, 5 (6, 6, 6) sts once.

RIGHT FRONT

Work to correspond to left front, reversing all shaping.

SLEEVES

With size 7 (4.5mm) needles, cast on 75 (81, 87, 93) sts. **Row 1 (RS)** K1, p1, k1, [p3, k1, p1, k1] 12 (13, 14, 15) times. Cont in rib for 3 rows more. K 1 row, p 1 row.

Dec row (RS) K20 (23, 26, 29), pm, SKP, k31, k2tog, pm, k to end. P 1 row.

Cont to dec 1 st (after first marker) by SKP and 2

sts before 2nd marker by k2tog) every other row 12 times more.




Next row (WS) P21 (24, 27, 30), k7, p21 (24, 27, 30) and remove markers—49 (55, 61, 67) sts.

Inc row (RS) K1, inc 1 st in next st, k to last 2 sts, inc 1 st in next st, k1.

Rep inc row every 6th (8th, 8th, 10th) row 9 (7, 6, 5) times more—69 (71, 75, 79) sts. Work even until piece measures 13½" (34cm) from beg.

Cap shaping

Bind off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows.



↑ = Direction of work

Dec row 1 (RS) K to last 3 sts, SKP, k1.

Dec row 2 (WS) P to last 3 sts, p2tog, p1.

Rep dec rows 1 and 2 until there are 31 sts.

Bind off 3 sts at beg of next 6 rows. Bind off rem 13 sts.

SWAG RUFFLE

Beg at outer edge with circular needle, cast on 153 (159, 165, 171) sts.

Row 1 (RS) K1, p1, k1, *p3, k1, p1, k1; rep from * to end. Work even in rib for 4 rows more.

Short row 1 (WS) Rib 71, w&t. Rib to end of row.

Short row 2 (WS) Rib 65, w&t. Rib to end of row.

Short row 3 (WS) Rib to within 6 sts of previous wrapped st, w&t. Work to end of row.* Rep between *'s 6 times more. On next row, work to end of row, closing up wraps. Then cont in rib over all sts until piece measures 2 1/2" (6.5cm), when measured along the short end.

Dec row (RS) Rib 3 sts, [SK2P, rib 3 sts] 25 (26, 27, 28) times—103 (107, 111, 115) sts. K1 row. Bind off knitwise.

FINISHING


Block pieces to measurements. At the peplum slits, block the rib section with facing out as the fabric naturally folds. Sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams. Then, using a dress form or while jacket is tried on, pin or baste the swag ruffle in place with the short end pinned across the right front overlapping by 1 1/2" (4cm) at the neck edge then draped across front and around to waistband. Baste in place, then sew with invisible running sts along the bound-off edge.

Neckband

With RS facing, beg at right front ruffle, pick up and k 99 (99, 105, 105) sts evenly around neck edge. **Next row (WS)** P1, k1, p1, *k3, p1, k1, p1; rep from * to end. Cont in rib as established for 1 3/4" (4.5cm). Bind off in rib. Sew on snaps, with 3 sets at the waistband and 2 sets spaced evenly between the waistband and neck, and one at top of neckband, to close the front. ♦

KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust (closed) 34 1/2 (37, 39 1/2, 43)"/87.5 (94, 100, 109)cm
- Length 19 1/4 (19 1/2, 20 1/2, 21)"/49 (49.5, 52, 53.5)cm
- Upper arm 13 (13 1/2, 15 1/4, 16)"/33 (34, 38.5, 40.5)cm

MATERIALS

- 19 (21, 23, 25) 3 1/2 oz/100g balls (each approx 110yd/100m) of Reynolds/JCA, Inc. *Lopi* (Icelandic wool) in #9964 ochre tweed
- One each size 9 and 10 (5.5 and 6mm) circular needle, each 29" (74cm) long OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Size I/9 (5.5mm) crochet hook
- Six 1 1/8-inch/27mm fabric covering buttons
- Fabric to cover buttons
- Five 3/4-inch/19mm snaps

GAUGES

- 13 sts and 20 rows = 4" (10cm) over seed st using smaller needles.
- 13 sts and 18 rows = 4" (10cm) over bell pat st using larger needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGES.

SEED STITCH

Row 1 (RS) *K1, p1; rep from * to end.
Row 2 K the purl sts, and p the knit sts.
 Rep row 2 for seed st.

BELL PATTERN STITCH

(over a multiple of 8 sts)

Row 1 (RS) *P2, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, p2; rep from * to end. **Rows 2 and 4** *K2, p1, k2, p1, k2; rep from * to end. **Rows 3 and 5** *P2, k1, p2, k1, p2; rep from * to end. **Row 6** rep row 2. Rep rows 1-6 for bell pat st.

BODY

With smaller circular needle, cast on 96 (104, 112, 120) sts. Work in seed st for 1 3/4" (4.5cm), end with a RS row. Change to larger needles.

Next row (WS) Knit. Then, cont in bell pat st until piece measures 11" (28cm) from beg, end with a (RS) pat row 5.

Separate for armholes

Next row (WS) Work 18 (20, 22, 24) sts of left front, bind off 4 sts, work 52 (56, 60, 64) sts of back, bind off 4 sts, work to end on 18 (20, 22, 24) sts for right front. Sl these sts to st holders.

SLEEVES

With smaller circular needle, cast on 42 (44, 50, 52) sts. Work in seed st for 1 3/4" (4.5cm), end with a RS row. Change to larger needles.

Next row (WS) Knit.

Next row (RS) P1 (2, 1, 2), work bell pat st over next 40 (40, 48, 48) sts, p1 (2, 1, 2). Cont in bell pat st as established until piece measures 11" (28cm) from beg, end with a (RS) pat row 5.

Next row (WS) Bind off 3 (4, 3, 4) sts, work to the last 3 (4, 3, 4) sts, join a separate length of yarn and bind off 3 (4, 3, 4) sts—36 (36, 44, 4) sts. Leave sts on hold to be worked with the body in the yoke.

YOKE

Rejoin yarn to the right front from the RS and with larger needle, working row 1 of bell pat st, work 18 (20, 22, 24) sts of right front, 36 (36, 44, 44) sts of one sleeve, 52 (56, 60, 64) sts of back, 36 (36, 44, 44) sts of sleeve, 18 (20, 22, 24) sts of left front—160 (168, 192, 200) sts.

Work even in established pat for 1 row

Raglan armhole shaping

Next row (RS) Work 16 (18, 20, 22) sts, ssk, pm, pl, k1, pm, k2tog, work 28 (28, 36, 36) sts, ssk, pm, pl, k1, pm, k2tog, work 48 (52, 56, 60) sts, ssk, pm, pl, k1, pm, k2tog, work 28 (28, 36, 36) sts, ssk, pm, pl, k1, pm, k2tog, work 16 (18, 20, 22) sts—152 (160, 184, 192) sts.

Note The 2 sts between the 4 sets of markers at the raglan armhole will be worked in seed st throughout the armhole shaping.

Work 3 rows even.

Dec row (RS) *Work to 2 sts before marker, ssk, sl marker, work 2 sts in seed st, sl marker, k2tog; rep from * 3 times more, work in pat to end—8 sts are decreased. Rep dec row every 4th row twice more, then every other row 11 (12, 14, 15) times—40 (40, 48, 48) sts. Bind off.

FINISHING

Block jacket lightly. Sew sleeves into the armhole bind-offs. Sew side and sleeve seams.

Right front placket

With smaller needle, cast on 18 sts.

Row 1 (WS) P1, work seed st to last st, p1. **Row 2 (RS)** Sl 1 purlwise wyib, work in seed st to last st, k1. Rep rows 1 and 2, cont to work placket to fit the center right front, sewing the placket in place while knitting to ensure the best lengthwise fit. When piece fits to neck edge, bind off sts in pat.


Left front band

With smaller needles, cast on 6 sts.

Row 1 (WS) Sl 1 purlwise wyif, work seed st to last st, p1. **Row 2 (RS)** K1, work seed st to last st, k1. Rep rows 1 and 2, cont to work band to fit the center left front, sewing the band in place while knitting. At end of band, bind off sts in pat.

Neckband

Front the RS, with smaller needle, pick up and k 72 (72, 80, 80) sts evenly around the neck edge. **Row 1 (WS)** Sl 1 purlwise wyif, work seed st to last st, p1. **Row 2 (RS)** Sl 1 purlwise wyib, work seed st to last st, k1. Rep rows 1 and 2 until neckband measures 1 1/4" (4.5cm). Bind off all sts knitwise on the RS. With crochet hook, work a chain sl st (see pattern # 16) along the center right front at 1 st in from the edge. Cover the buttons with fabric. Sew 5 snaps evenly spaced along the WS of the center front edge at 1/2" (1.5cm) inside the edge. Sew other half of snaps along the left front band on the RS to correspond. Sew on 3 buttons on top of the first 3 snaps to the right front placket. Sew on 3 more buttons in alignment with the buttons (see photo for placement). ♦

- Upper arm 15 (16, 17 1/2)"/38 (40.5, 44.5)cm

MATERIALS

- 9 (10, 11) 3 1/2 oz/100g hanks (each approx 110yd/100m) of Debbie Bliss/KFI *Luxury Tweed Chunky* (merino wool/angora) in #14 yellow (MC)
- 4 (4, 4) 1 1/4 oz/50g balls (each approx 96yd/88m) of Debbie Bliss/KFI *Luxury Tweed Aran* (merino wool/angora) in #6 eggplant (A)
- 1 ball each in #11 green (B), #21 magenta (C), #5 grape (D) and #7 natural (E)
- Two size 10 1/2 (6.5mm) circular needles, 16"/40cm length and 32"/81cm length OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One size 8 (5mm) circular needle, 24"/61cm length OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Stitch holders and stitch markers
- One 1 1/4"/31mm button

GAUGE

- 12 sts and 17 rows = 4"/10cm over St st using larger circular needle.
- 18 sts and 24 rows = 4"/10cm over chart pat using smaller circular needle.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

NOTES

- 1) Jacket is knit from the neck down.
- 2) All bands are worked using 2 strands of A held tog.

STITCH GLOSSARY

Kf-b Knit in front and back of st—1 st increased.

Pf-b Purl in front and back of st—1 st increased.

MIR Insert LH needle from back to front under the strand between the last st worked and the next st on LH needle. Knit into the front loop to twist the st.

M1L Insert LH needle from front to back under the strand between the last st worked and the next st on LH needle. Knit into the back loop to twist the st.

JACKET

Shape neck and raglan sleeve

Beg at neck edge, with longer larger needle and MC, cast on 1 st (front), pm, cast on 6 sts (sleeve), pm, cast on 18 sts (back), pm, cast on 6 sts (sleeve), pm, cast on 1 st (front)—32 sts.

Inc row 1 (RS) [K to 1 st before next marker, kf-b, sl marker (sm), kf-b] 4 times, k to end—40 sts. Purl next row.

Inc row 2 (RS) K1, M1, kf-b, sm, kf-b, [k to 1 st before next marker, kf-b, sm, kf-b] 3 times, M1, k1—50 sts. Purl next row. Rep last 2 rows 3 times more—80 sts.

Inc row 3 (RS) Cast on 2 sts (left neck edge), [k to 1 st before next marker, kf-b, sm, kf-b] 4 times, k to end, cast on 2 sts (right neck edge)—92 sts. Purl next row.

Inc row 4 (RS) [K to 1 st before next marker, kf-b, sm, kf-b] 4 times, k to end—100 sts. Purl next row. Rep last 2 rows 11 (13, 15) times more—188 (204, 220) sts.

Divide for body and sleeves

Next row (RS) Dropping markers, k 25 (27, 29), cast on 3 sts (left underarm), place next 42 (46, 50) sts on holder (left sleeve), k 54 (58, 62), cast on 3 sts (right underarm), place next 42 (46, 50) sts on holder (right sleeve), k 25 (27, 29)—110 (118, 126) body sts. Mark beg and end of last row.

Next row (WS) P2, pm, p23 (25, 27), pm, p3, pm, p25 (27, 29), pm, p4, pm, p25 (27, 29), pm, p3, pm, p23 (25, 27), pm, p2. Cont in St st until piece measures 3" (7.5cm) above marked row, end with a WS row.

Swing shaping

Next (inc) row (RS) K to next marker, MIR, sm, [k to next marker, sm, MIR, k to next marker, MIL, sm] 3 times, k to next marker, sm, MIL, k to end—118 (126, 134) sts. Rep last row every 10th row 4 times more—150 (158, 166) sts. Work even until piece measures 13" (33cm) above marked row, end with a WS row.

Bottom edging


Change to 2 strands of A held tog. Knit next 2 rows, then purl 2 rows. Bind off loosely knitwise.

FINISHING

Lightly block piece to measurements.

Sleeve bands

With RS facing, shorter larger circular needle and MC, pick up and k 1 st in 2nd and 3rd cast-

on sts at underarm, k42 (46, 50) sts from sleeve holder, pick up and k 1 st in first cast-on st—45 (49, 53) sts. Join and pm for beg of rnds. Change to 2 strands of A held tog. Knit 1 rnd, purl 2 rnds, then k 1 rnd. Bind off loosely knitwise.

Buttonband

With RS facing, longer larger circular needle and 2 strands of A held tog, pick up and k 56 (59, 62) sts evenly spaced along left front edge. Knit 1 row, then purl 2 rows. Bind off loosely knitwise.

Buttonhole band

With RS facing, longer larger circular needle and 2 strands of A held tog, pick up and k 56 (59, 62) sts evenly spaced along right front edge. Knit 1 row. **Next (buttonhole) row (RS)** Purl to last 3 sts, bind off next 2 sts, p1. **Next row** Purl, casting on 2 sts over bound-off sts. Bind off loosely knitwise.

Collar

With WS facing, smaller circular needle and 1 strand of A, pick up and k 62 sts evenly spaced

along entire next edge. **Next (inc) row (WS)** [Pf-b] 6 times, [pf-b, p1] 25 times, [pf-b] 6 times—99 sts.

Beg chart pat

Row 1 (RS) Beg with st 1 of chart, work to st 13, then work sts 6-13 10 times, work sts 14-19 once. Cont to foll chart in this way through row 6. **Next (inc) row (RS)** K1, M1R, cont to foll row 7 of chart to last 2 sts, M1L, k1. Cont to foll chart, AT SAME TIME, rep inc row every 6th row twice more—105 sts. Work even through row 25. Knit next row for turning ridge.

Collar lining

With A, cont in St st for 6 rows.

Next (dec) row (RS) K1, k2tog, k to last 3 sts, ssk, k1. Rep dec row every 6th row twice more—99 sts. Work even until 25 rows have been completed from turning ridge. Bind off. Sew side edges of collar and collar lining tog. Sew bound-off edge of collar lining to neck edge. Sew on button. ♦

SHORT ROW WRAPPING

See pattern #1.

32-ST PLEAT PATTERN

Note Sl all sl sts purlwise.

Row 1 (RS) Sl 1 wyib, k7, p1, k14, p1, k7, sl 1 wyib. **Row 2** P1, p7, sl 1 wyib, p14, sl 1 wyib, p7, p1. Rep these 2 rows for the 32-st pleat pat.

BACK

With larger needles, cast on 75 (83, 91, 99) sts.

Row 1 (RS) K2 (selvage sts), work next 71 (79, 87, 95) sts foll chart for textured pat st, k2 (selvage sts). **Row 2 (WS)** P2 (selvage sts), work chart pat to last 2 sts, p2 (selvage sts). Cont to work in this way until 10 more rows are worked.

Dec row (RS) K1, ssk, work to the last 3 sts, k2tog, k1—73 (81, 89, 97) sts. Rep dec row every 6th row 8 times more—57 (65, 73, 81) sts. Work even for 3 rows more OR until piece measures 11 1/4" / 28.5cm from beg. Change to smaller needles. Note # of last row worked.

Waistband

Next row (RS) Knit, inc 17 sts evenly spaced across—74 (82, 90, 98) sts. **Next row (WS)** P2, *k2, p2; rep from * to end. Cont in k2, p2 rib until waistband measures 3" / 7.5cm, end with a RS row. **Next row (WS)** Purl, dec 17 sts evenly spaced across—57 (65, 73, 81) sts. Change to larger needles.

BODICE

Cont with next row and textured pat, work in pat foll chart for 2 rows.

Inc row (RS) K2, M1, work pat to last 2 sts, M1, k2—59 (67, 75, 83) sts. Rep inc row every 4th row 5 times more—69 (77, 85, 93) sts. Work even until bodice measures 4 1/2 (4 1/2, 5, 5)" / 11.5 (11.5, 12.5, 12.5)cm above the waistband.

Armhole shaping

Bind off 4 (4, 5, 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows. **Dec row (RS)** Ssk, work pat to last 2 sts, k2tog. **Next row (WS)** P1, work pat to last st, p1. Rep the last 2 rows 2 (3, 5, 6) times more—55 (61, 63, 67) sts. Work even until armhole measures 7 (7 1/2, 8, 8 1/2)" / 18 (19, 20.5, 21.5)cm. Mark the center 9 sts on the last WS row.

Neck and shoulder


Bind off 5 (6, 6, 7) sts at beg of next 4 rows, 5 (6, 7, 7) sts at beg of next 2 rows, AT SAME TIME, bind off center 9 sts and working both sides at once, bind off 4 sts from each neck edge twice.

LEFT FRONT

With larger needles, cast on 54 (58, 62, 66) sts. **Row 1 (RS)** K2 (selvage sts), then beg with st 5 (1, 5, 1), work in pat foll chart for textured pat st, end k1 (selvage st). Cont to work pat in this way until 10 more rows are worked.

Side edge shaping

Dec row (RS) K1, ssk, work to end of row. Rep dec row every 6th row 8 times more—45 (49, 53, 57) sts. Work even until same length as back to waistband, end with same row. Change to smaller needles.



GAUGE


16 sts and 23 rows = 4" / 10cm over textured pat st using larger needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

NOTE

There are 2 selvage sts when indicated along the seam edges with 1 st for seaming and 1 st for framing the edge.

TEXTURED PATTERN STITCH



Stitch Key

Waistband

Next row (RS) Knit, inc 9 sts evenly spaced—54 (58, 62, 66) sts. **Next row (WS)** P2, *k2, p2; rep from * to end. Cont in k2, p2 rib until waistband measures 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ "/7.5cm, end with a RS row. **Next row (WS)** Purl, dec 9 sts evenly spaced—45 (49, 53, 57) sts. Change to larger needles.

BODICE

Cont with next row and textured pat, work in pat foll chart for 2 rows.

Neck shaping

Note Read before cont to knit.

Next row (RS) K2, M1, work to last 2 sts, k2tog (neck dec). Rep inc at side seam edge every 4th row 5 times more AT SAME TIME, dec 1 st at neck edge every RS row 15 times more, then dec 1 st at neck edge (every alternate 2nd and 4th row) a total of 13 times more, AT SAME TIME, when piece measures same as back, shape armhole at seam edge, by binding off 4 (4, 5, 6) sts once. Then, on next RS row, work dec row as foll: ssk, work in pat to end. Rep dec row every other row 2 (3, 5, 6) times more.

After all shaping is completed, work even on 15 (18, 19, 21) sts until armhole measures same as back.

Shoulder shaping

Bind off 5 (6, 6, 7) sts for shoulder edge twice, then 5 (6, 7, 7) sts once.

RIGHT FRONT

Note The right front is different from left front as it includes an inverted pleat in the lower edge. With larger needles, cast on 85 (89, 93, 97) sts.

Row 1 (RS) K1 (selvage st), beg with st 1, end with st 15, work in textured pat st over 31 sts, work in pleat pat over 32 sts, beg with st 1 and end with st 11 (15, 11, 15) work in textured pat st over 19 (23, 27, 31) sts, k2 (selvage sts). Cont in pat as for left front, working side edge shaping dec's at end of rows for a total of 9 times and cont on 76 (80, 84, 88) sts until same length as back to waistband, ending with same row. Change to smaller needles.

Waistband

Note The waistband increasing on the next row will take place while simultaneously forming the inverted pleat. Read carefully before cont to knit. **Next row (RS)** K1, pm, k23, AT SAME TIME, inc'ing 3 sts across these sts (for 26 sts), pm; then form pleat as foll: *sl next 8 sts to first dpn, sl next 8 sts to 2nd dpn, sl next 8 sts to 3rd dpn, allow pleat to fold for the first half of the inverted pleat and lay the 3 dpns on top of each other with textured pat sts on top, 2nd dpn in middle and 8 sts at back; then with RH needle, k3 sts tog, one from each of the 3 needles, over the next 8 sts AT SAME TIME, M1 st twice over these sts (for 10 sts), pm *, then rep between *'s once more for the 2nd half of the inverted pleat, k next 2 (6, 10, 14) sts AND inc 3 sts (by M1) over these sts, end k2 (selvage sts). There are 54 (58, 62, 66) sts.

At this point, work as for left front, beg at the waistband and reversing all shaping by working neck shaping decs at beg of RS rows and side edge incs at end of RS rows.

SLEEVES

With larger needles, cast on 35 (35, 43, 43) sts.

Row 1 (RS) K2 (selvage sts), work next 31 (31, 39, 39) sts foll chart for textured pat, k2 (selvage sts). Cont to work in this way for 3 rows more.

Inc row (RS) K2, M1, work to last 2 sts, M1, k2. Rep inc row every 6th row 9 (8, 9, 8) times more, then every 4th row 0 (3, 0, 3) times—55 (59, 63, 67) sts.

Work even until piece measures 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ "/44.5cm from beg.

Cap shaping

Bind off 4 (4, 5, 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows—47 (51, 53, 55) sts.

Dec row (RS) K1, ssk, work pat to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1.

Next row (WS) P2, work pat to last 2 sts, p2. Rep the last 2 rows 14 (16, 17, 18) times more—17 sts. Bind off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Bind off 13 sts.

FINISHING

Block lightly to measurements. Sew shoulder seams. Set in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

Left front trim

With larger needles, beg at top of waist band and working toward lower left front edge, pick up and k 57 sts along center front edge. K1 row on WS. Bind off purlwise on the RS.

Right front trim

With larger needles, beg at the lower right front edge, [pick up and k 10 sts, cast on 4 sts and skip a 1-inch/2.5cm space] 4 times, pick up and k 1 st. K 1 row on the 57 sts. Bind off purlwise on the RS.

LEFT LAPEL

Place a marker at 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ "/3.8cm down from the shoulder edge at the left front neck. From the WS of left front shaped edge, beg at top of waistband,

pick up and k 47 (49, 51, 53) sts along neck edge, up to the marker.



Row 1 (RS of jacket, WS of lapel) Knit.

Row 2 K1 (selvage st), beg with st 3 (1, 3, 1), work 8-st rep of chart 5 (5, 6, 6) times, end with st 15 (15, 11, 11), k1 (selvage st).

Row 3 P1, work pat to last st, p1.

Row 4 (RS of lapel) Bind off 3 sts, work to last 3 sts, dec 1 st, k1.

Cont to bind off 3 sts at beg of the next 12 (14, 14, 15) RS rows, then 2 sts at beg of the next 2 (0, 1, 0) RS rows, AT SAME TIME, dec 1 st at end of every 4th row 3 (3, 3, 4) times more. Then, to trim the lapel, with smaller needles from



RS of lapel, pick up and k 42 (44, 46, 48) sts evenly along the bound-off edge. K1 row on WS. Bind off purlwise, do not fasten off. Join lapel to the left front trim and with crochet hook, make a 12"/30.5cm chain tie (for inner closing). Fasten off. Rejoin yarn to WS of right front at side seam and top of waistband and make a 14"/36cm chain tie to correspond (for inner closing).

RIGHT LAPEL

Work as for left lapel, reversing all shaping by binding off at beg of WS rows and dec at end of WS rows.

COLLAR

Place a marker at center of the top edge of each lapel. With circular needle, working from the RS of jacket, pick up and k sts from center of right lapel marker to center of left lapel marker as foll: 22 sts to the shoulder seam, 42 sts from back neck, 22 sts to opposite marker—86 sts. Place markers to mark center 12 sts in back neck.

Row 1 (RS) K2, *p2, k2; rep from * to end.

Row 2 P2, *k2, p2; rep from * to end.

Short row 1 Work in rib to the marked back neck 12 sts, work these 12 sts, w & t.

Short row 2 Work 15 sts, w & t.

Short row 3 Work to the wrapped st, pick up wrapped st closing hole, work 2 more sts, w & t. Rep short row 3 until 10 sts remain unworked in short rows at each end of collar. Then work even in rib on all sts for 2"/5cm.

Bind off in rib. Sew on buttons opposite button-loops. Sew one button to each sleeve cuff edge. Reinforce the pleat from the WS and lightly block the pleat open. ♦

29 HOODED VEST

Loose-fitting tunic length vest in rib stitch with coin cable trim and hood. Sized for Small, Medium, Large, 1X, 2X. Shown in size Small on page 92.



KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust (closed) 41 (43, 48, 52, 56)"/104 (109, 122, 132, 139.5)cm
- Length 32 (32 1/4, 33 1/2, 34 1/2, 34 3/4)"/81 (83, 85, 87.5, 88)cm

MATERIALS

- 17 (19, 21, 24, 26) 1 1/4oz/50g balls (each approx 82yd/75m) of Elsebeth Lavold/KFI *Calm Wool* (wool/camel/alpaca) in #3 ashes
- One pair size 8 (5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One set (5) size 5 (3.75mm) double-pointed needles (dpn)
- Cable needle (cn), stitch markers and holders
- One large decorative metal hook and eye closure

GAUGE

17 sts and 26 rows = 4"/10cm over seeded rib pat using size 8 (5mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

SEEDED RIB STITCH

(multiple of 4 sts, plus 1)

Row 1 (WS) P1, *k2, p1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 (RS) K3, p1, *p3, k1; rep from *, end k2. Rep rows 1 and 2 for seeded rib st.

STITCH GLOSSARY

3-st LC (inc) Sl 2 sts to cn and hold to *front*, yo, k1, k2 from cn for 4 sts.

3-st RC (inc) Sl 1 st to cn and hold to *back*, k2, yo, k1 from cn for 4 sts.

4-st RC Sl 2 sts to cn and hold to *back*, k2, k2 from cn.

4-st LC (inc) Sl 2 sts to cn and hold to *front*, k2, k2 from cn.

SHORT ROW WRAPPING

See pattern #1.

NOTE When working chart pat, the outside selvage sts (or the sts at beg and end of every row) will be worked in garter st (k every row) instead of reverse St st (p on RS, k on WS) as shown on the chart.

BACK

Cast on 105 (113, 121, 129, 137) sts.

Row 1 (WS) K1, p6, k1, work next 89 (97, 105, 113, 121) sts in row 1 of seeded rib st, k1, p6, k1.

Row 2 (RS) K1 (selvage st), k6, p1, work next 89 (97, 105, 113, 121) sts in row 2 of seeded rib, p1, k6, k1 (selvage st). The pat has been set up with selvage sts and the first and last 8 sts foll cable chart and all other sts in seeded rib st. Work 1 more row in established pat. Then, after working row 4 of chart pat, work even on 109 (117, 125, 133, 141) sts until piece measures 3 1/4"/8cm from beg.

Dec row (RS) Work 10 sts of cable chart, ssk, work to last 12 sts, k2tog, work 10 sts of cable chart. Rep dec row every 12th row 7 times more—93 (101, 109, 117, 125) sts. Work even until piece measures 22 1/2 (23, 23 1/2, 24, 24)"/57 (58.5, 59.5, 61, 61)cm from beg, end with a RS row.

ARMHOLE SHAPING

Bind off 10 sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Next row (WS) K1, p6, k1, work next 57 (65, 73, 81, 89) sts in seeded rib st, k1, p6, k1. The first and last 8 sts are reset in pat foll cable chart row 2, with rem sts in seeded rib. Cont to work in this way foll cable chart as before. Then, after row 4 of chart pat, work even on 77 (85, 93, 101, 109) sts until armhole measures 8 1/2 (8 3/4, 9, 9 1/2, 9 3/4)"/21.5 (22, 23, 24, 24.5)cm. On the last WS row, work (p2tog) twice at center of each cable for 73 (81, 89, 97, 105) sts.

SHOULDER SHAPING

Note The shoulder shaping is worked using short rows. Alternatively, work shoulder shaping by binding off 8 (9, 10, 12, 13) sts at beg of

next 4 rows, 7 (9, 11, 11, 13) sts at beg of next 2 rows, then place the 27 rem sts on a st holder.

SHORT ROW SHAPING

Short row 1 (RS) Work to last 8 (9, 10, 12, 13) sts, w&t.

Short row 2 Rep short row 1.

Short row 3 Work to 8 (9, 10, 12, 13) sts before last wrapped st, w&t.

Short row 4 Rep short row 3.

Short row 5 Work to 7 (9, 11, 11, 13) sts before last wrapped st, w&t.

Short row 6 Rep short row 5.

Sl the 23 (27, 31, 35, 39) sts from each sloped shoulder on separate st holders and place the center 27 sts on a separate st holder.

POCKET LINING (MAKE 2)


Cast on 25 sts. Work in seeded rib st for 6 3/4"/17cm. Leave sts on hold.

LEFT FRONT

Cast on 61 (65, 69, 73, 77) sts. **Row 1 (WS)** K1, p6, k1, work next 45 (49, 53, 57, 61) sts in row 1 of seeded rib st, k1, p6, k1. **Row 2 (RS)** K1 (selvage st), k6, p1, work next 45 (49, 53, 57, 61) sts in row 2 of seeded rib st, p1, k6, k1 (selvage st). The pat has been set up with selvage sts and the first and last 8 sts foll cable chart and all the other sts in seeded rib st. Work 1 row more in established pat. Then, after working row 4 of chart pat, work even on 65 (69, 73, 79, 81) sts until piece measures 3 1/4"/8cm from beg.

Dec row (RS) Work 10 sts of cable chart, ssk, work to end. Rep dec row every 12th row 7 times more, AT SAME TIME, when piece measures 12 (12 1/2, 13, 13 1/2, 13 1/2)"/30.5 (32, 33, 34, 34)cm from beg, prepare to join pocket lining as foll: on last WS row, pm to mark the center front 15 sts, then work 25 sts, pm, work to end. **Next row (RS)** Work 10 sts of cable chart, work to first marker, bind off 25 sts between markers, work to end. **Joining row (WS)** Work 15 sts, work seeded rib across 25 pocket lining sts, work to end. Then, cont to work left front with side seam shaping as established, working even on 57 (61, 65, 69, 73) sts after all decreases.

Armhole shaping

Next row (RS) Bind off 10 sts, work to end of row.

Next row (WS) Work in pat to the last 8 sts, k1, p6, k1. The 8 sts at armhole are reset in pat foll cable chart with the rem sts in pats as established. Then, after row 4 of chart pat, work even on 49 (53, 57, 61, 65) sts until armhole measures same as back. On last WS row, work (p2tog) twice at center of side cable only for 47 (51, 55, 59, 63) sts.

Shoulder shaping


Work as for back (in regular bind offs or in short rows) over the 23 (27, 31, 35, 39) shoulder sts. Place rem 24 sts on a holder.

RIGHT FRONT

Work to correspond to left front, reversing placement of pocket (at 15 sts from center front edge) and all shaping. Work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) for 2"/5cm, end with a RS row.

FINISHING

Block pieces to measurements. Using 3-Needle bind-off method, join shoulder seams tog.



Pocket trims (make 2)

Cast on 8 sts. Work rows 1-5 of chart, then rep rows 6-13 on 10 sts for 6 1/4"/17cm, OR until trim fits along the pocket opening. On the last WS row, (p2tog) twice at center of the cable. Bind off and sew to pocket opening. Sew pocket linings in place to WS of fronts.

Leaving 9"/23cm open at lower edge, sew the side seams.

HOOD

From the RS, work 24 sts from right front, pick up 1 st in the shoulder seam, work 13 sts from back neck, pm, work center st, pm, work 13 back neck sts, pick up 1 st in the shoulder seam, 24 sts from left front—77 sts.

Work in pat as established for 3 rows.

Inc row (RS) Work to center back neck marked st, inc 1 st, k1, inc 1 st, work to end. Rep inc row every 4th row 3 times more working inc's into seeded rib pat—85 sts.

Work even until hood measures 10 1/4"/26cm from beg.

Shape top of hood

Short row 1 (RS) Work to 4 sts before center back st, w&t, work to end.

***Short row 2 (RS)** Work to 5 sts before last wrapped st, w&t. Work to end of row.*

Rep between *'s 3 times more, working (p2tog) on the last WS row at center of cable. Leave these sts on hold.

Work the other half of hood, shaping top by beg short rows on a WS row. Then, using 3-needle bind-off, join the seam at the top of hood on the 81 sts. Sew on hook and eye closure at center front edge. ♦

KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust (closed) 36 (38, 40, 44, 48)"/91.5 (96.5, 101.5, 111.5, 122)cm
- Length 23 (23 1/2, 24, 24 1/2, 25)"/58.5 (59.5, 61, 62, 63.5)cm
- Upper arm 18 (19, 20, 20 1/4, 22 1/4)"/45.5 (48, 51, 54, 56.6)cm

MATERIALS

- 12 (13, 14, 16, 19) 1 1/4oz/50g skeins (each approx 120yd/110m) of Bergère de France *Lima* (superwash merino/alpaca) in #226.551 marbre (A)
- 1 skein in #204.501 vendage (B)

- Size 5 (3.75mm) circular needle, 29"/74cm long OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Two size 5 (3.75mm) double-pointed needles (dpn) (for drawstring)
- Stitch markers
- Size 5mm Crystallized Swarovski Elements *Crystal Round Pearl* style #5810 12 in color #160 mauve, 7 in color #388 maroon, 7 in color #309 dark purple

GAUGE

24 sts and 32 rows = 4"/10cm over St st using size 35 (3.75mm) needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

FLOWERS (make 4 in B)

From Nicky Epstein's *Knitted Embellishments*, Basic Flower, page 18.

Cast on 55 sts. **Row 1 (WS)** Purl.

Row 2 (RS) K1, *yo, k2, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo, k1; rep from * to end.

Rows 3, 5 and 7 Purl.

Rows 4 and 6 *K2, ssk, k2tog, k2, yo, k1, yo; rep from *, end last rep k1.

Row 8 K1, k2tog, *k1, ssk, k2tog; rep from *, end k2—34 sts.

Row 9 P2, *p3tog, pl; rep from * to end—18 sts.

Row 10 *K2tog; rep from * to end—9 sts.

Cut yarn, leaving a long end. With tapestry needle, pull yarn through the 9 sts on needle and draw up tightly to form flower center. Seam rows tog to complete flower and leave end in place for tacking flower to cardigan.

BODY

Hem

With A, cast on 216 (228, 240, 264, 288) sts.

Row 1 (RS) K54 (57, 60, 66, 72), place marker (pm), k108 (114, 120, 132, 144), pm, k54 (57, 60, 66, 72). Markers separate the fronts from the back at each armhole edge. Cont to work in St st (k on RS, p on WS) until piece measures 2"/5cm from beg, end with a RS row.

Hem joining row (WS) Folding hem up to sts on needle, insert RH needle into first st on LH needle and P this st tog with first cast-on st, *insert RH needle into next st on needle and p this st tog with next cast-on st; rep from * until hem is joined. Work even in St st for 12 rows.

Dec row (RS) *K to 3 sts before the marker, k2tog, k1, sl marker, k1, ssk; rep from * once, k to end. Rep dec row every 12th row 4 times more—196 (208, 220, 244, 268) sts. Work even until piece measures 9"/23cm from beg, end with WS row.

Drawstring row (RS) *K2, yo, k2tog; rep from * to end. Work even in St st for 1 row.

Neck dec row (RS) K2, ssk, k to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2. Rep neck dec row every 4th row 23 (24, 25, 26, 27) times more, AT SAME TIME, after working 1 more WS row even after the neck dec row, shape seam edge as foll: **Inc row (RS)** *K to 2 sts before marker, inc 1 st in next

st, sl marker, inc 1 st in next st; rep from * once, k to end. Rep the inc row every 6th row 4 times more. There are 108 (114, 120, 132, 144) sts for back after all inc's are completed. Work even, while continuing the neck dec's, until piece measures 14"/35.5cm from beg.

Armhole shaping

Next row (RS) *Work to 4 (4, 4, 6, 6) sts before marker bind off 8 (8, 8, 12, 12) sts removing marker; rep from * once more, work to end. Sl the sts for right and left fronts to holders and work the back sts only as foll:

Next row (WS) Rejoin yarn at back armhole and bind off 3 sts, purl to end of back. Bind off 3 sts at beg of next row, then bind off 2 sts at beg of next 2 (2, 2, 2, 4) rows.

Dec row (RS) K2, ssk, k to the last 4 sts, k2tog, k2. Rep dec row every other row 2 (3, 5, 6, 7) times more—84 (88, 90, 96, 102) sts. Work even on these sts until armhole measures 9 (9½, 10, 10½, 11)"/23 (24, 25.5, 26.5, 28)cm. Bind off.

LEFT FRONT

Return to 26 (28, 30, 33, 38) sts on hold for left front and p 1 row.

Armhole shaping

Next row (RS) Bind off 3 sts, work to end. Cont to work the neck dec row as established, shape armhole by binding off 2 sts for armhole edge 1 (1, 1, 1, 2) times.

Then work dec row as on back at armhole edge every RS row 3 (4, 6, 7, 8) times. After all shaping is completed, work even on 18 (19, 19, 21, 23) sts until armhole measures same as back. Bind off.

RIGHT FRONT

Return to the sts on hold for right front and work as for left front, reversing all shaping, by working armhole shaping at beg of WS rows.

SLEEVES

With A, cast on 108 (114, 120, 128, 134) sts. Work in St st for 2"/5cm, end with a RS row.

Hem joining row (WS)

Work as for body. Then cont in St st until piece measures 11½"/29cm from beg.

Cap shaping

Bind off 4 (4, 4, 6, 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows. **Dec row (RS)** K2, ssk, k to last 4 sts, k2tog, k2. Rep dec row every other row 2 (3, 4, 5, 6) times more—84 (88, 92, 94, 98) sts. Work even for 0 (0, 0, 2, 2) rows. Bind off 2 sts at beg of next 36 (38, 40, 40, 42) rows. Bind off rem 12 (12, 12, 14, 14) sts.

FINISHING

Block pieces to measurements. Sew shoulder seams.

Front band

With RS facing and circular needle, pick up and k 132 (135, 138, 141, 144) sts up to right front shoulder, 47 (49, 51, 53, 55) sts across back neck, 132 (135, 138, 141, 144) sts to lower left

front edge—311 (319, 327, 335, 343) sts. Work in St st for 3½"/9cm. Then fold front band to WS and pick up 1 st in the corresponding pick up row while AT THE SAME TIME, binding off sts on the needle to join the band.


Drawstring

With dpn, cast on 3 sts.

Row 1

Knit, do not turn.

Row 2 Bring yarn around from WS to work this row from RS and knit. Rep row 2 for I-cord for 50 (52, 54, 58, 62)"/127 (132, 137, 147, 157)cm. Sew side and sleeve seams. Set in sleeves. Pull drawstring through the eyelet row. With B, make 4 flowers and sew to upper left front edge using beads to secure, as shown in photo. ♦

- Bust (closed) 32½ (34, 35½, 37½)"/82.5 (86, 90, 95)cm
- Length 20 (20½, 21½, 22½)"/51 (52, 54.5, 58)cm
- Upper arm 12½ (13½, 14½, 15½)"/32.5 (34, 37, 39.5)cm

MATERIALS

- 4 (4, 5, 5) 7oz/200g hanks (each approx 145yd/133m) of Naturally NZ/FiberTrends

Aspire Super Chunky (wool/alpaca) in #2051 pale pink

- One size 13 (9mm) circular needle, 32"/81cm long OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One set (5) size 13 (9mm) double-pointed needles (dpn)
- Three 1½"/27mm buttons
- One large hook and eye closure
- Stitch holders

GAUGE

10 sts and 14 rows = 4"/10cm over k1, p1 rib using size 13 (9mm) needles, after blocking. TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

NOTE

Jacket is worked all in one piece from the neckband down to the lower edges.

K1, P1 RIB

Row 1 *K1, p1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 K the knit sts, and p the purl sts.

Rep row 2 for k1, p1 rib.

STITCH GLOSSARY

S2KP Sl 2 sts as for a k2tog, k1, then pass the 2 sl sts over the k1 one at a time.

NECKBAND

With dpn, cast on 7 sts. Work in k1, p1 rib for 20"/51cm. Then, work in leaf motif as foll:

Row 1 (RS) K1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1.

Row 2 and all even rows Purl.

Row 3 K2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk.

Row 5 K2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk.

Row 7 K2tog, k3, ssk.

Row 9 K2tog, k1, ssk.

Row 11 S2KP.

Row 12 Purl. Fasten off last st.

BODY

From the RS, using circular needle and beg at the cast-on edge of the neckband, working along the long edge, pick up and k 49 sts in this edge, ending at the first row of the leaf motif.

Row 1 (WS) [P1, k1] 4 times, place marker (pm), p1, pm, k1, [p1, k1] twice, pm, p1, pm, k1, [p1, k1] 9 times, pm, p1, pm, k1, [p1, k1] twice, pm, p1, pm, [k1, p1] 4 times. This row has set up the yoke pat with 8 markers in place for working the raglan armhole increases.

Raglan inc row (RS) Work in rib to first marker, * yo, sl marker, k1, sl marker, yo, work in rib to

next marker *; rep between *'s twice more, yo, sl marker, k1, sl marker, yo, work in rib to end.

Next row (WS)

Work in k1, p1 rib, working new sts into k1, p1 rib pat and working 1 st between each set of markers as p1. Rep these 2 rows 9 (10, 11, 12) times more. There are 18 (19, 20, 21) sts for each front, 39 (41, 43, 45) sts for back and 25 (27, 29, 31) sts for each sleeve (not including the k1 sts between the raglan markers). There are a total of 129 (137, 145, 153) sts.

SEPARATE AT ARMHOLES

Next row (RS) Work in rib to first marker, *place 27 (29, 31, 33) sts on st holder or onto a strand of scrap yarn, (this includes both k1 sts between the marker)*; then cast on 3 sts for armhole, work in rib on the 39 (41, 43, 45) sts for back, rep between *'s once for second sleeve, cast on 3 sts for armhole, work to end. There are 81 (85, 89, 93) sts to be worked for body. Cont in k1, p1 rib on these sts for 4 (4 1/2, 5)"/10 (10, 11.5, 12.5)cm.

Next inc row (WS) P1, *k1 into front and back of next st, p1; rep from * to end—121 (127, 133, 139) sts. Cont in k1, p2 rib as established until body piece measures 14 (14, 14 1/2, 15)"/35.5 (35.5, 37, 38)cm from the armhole.

Bind off in rib.

SLEEVES

SI 27 (29, 31, 33) sts from one sleeve holder to the dpns, dividing onto 4 needles AND placing markers either side of the center 3 sts that run along the shoulder line edge of the sleeve.

Rnd 1 Rejoin yarn at armhole edge, pick up and k 1 st in the cast-on sts at armhole [pick up and k in front and back of next cast-on st] twice, and work around in established rib—32 (34, 36, 39) sts. Join to work in rnds and pm to mark beg of rnds.


Being sure that the center 3 sts are marked for the center shoulder line of the sleeve, work in rnds of k1, p1 rib until sleeve measures 5"/12.5cm from the armhole.

BEGIN LEAF CHART

Note Chart is worked in rnds, so that every rnd is worked from the RS. The leaf pat will be centered on the 3 marked center shoulder line sts and will increase to 9 sts when chart is completed.

Next rnd Work in rib to center 3 sts, work row 1 of leaf chart over these sts, work in rib to end. Cont to work in this way foll chart through rnd 14.

Last rnd Work even in k1, p1 rib on the 38 (40, 42, 45) sts. Bind off in rib. Work other sleeve in same way.



Buttonband

From the RS, pick up and k 72 (72, 76, 80) sts evenly along entire left front edge.

Row 1 (WS) *K2, p2; rep from * to end. Work in k2, p2 rib for 4 rows more.

Bind-off row Bind off sts in rib, AT SAME TIME, p2tog, in each of the p2 ribs to keep edge lying flat.

Buttonhole band

From the RS, pick up and k 66 (66, 70, 74) sts up to the edge of the leaf pat.

Row 1 (WS) *K2, p2; rep from * to end.

Next row K the knit sts, and p the purl sts for k2, p2 rib.

Buttonhole row (WS) Rib 4 sts, [k2tog, yo, rib 6 sts] 3 times, rib to end. Work 2 rows more in rib. Bind off sts as for buttonband.

FINISHING

Sew buttonhole band to the edge of the leaf on the neckband. Sew on buttons. Sew hook and eye closure to the edge of the leaf pat on the neckband. ♦

- Upper arm 15 (17, 19, 21 1/2)"/38 (43, 48, 54.5)cm

MATERIALS

- 5 (5, 7, 8) 3 1/2oz/100g hanks (each approx 218yd/200m) of Aslan Trends *Artesanal* (cot-

ton/alpaca/polyamide) in #240 lagoon (A)

- 4 (4, 5, 6) 3 1/2oz/100g hanks (each approx 295yd/270m) of Aslan Trends *Inveral* (rabbit angora/merino wool/polyamide) in #59 sky (B)
- One pair each sizes 7 and 11 (4.5 and 8mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- Size J/10 (6mm) crochet hook
- One 15 (16, 18, 20)"/38 (40.5, 45.5, 51)cm separating zipper in light blue

GAUGE

12 sts and 20 rows = 4"/10cm over seed st using larger needles and A and B held tog.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

NOTE

Use 1 strand of A and B held tog throughout.

STITCH GLOSSARY

Kf-b K1 into front and back of st (for an inc)

SEED STITCH

(over an odd number of sts)

Row 1 (RS) K1, *p1, k1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 Knit the p sts, and purl the k sts.

Rep row 2 for seed st.

BACK

Shirttail

With larger needles and A and B held tog, cast on 21 (27, 33, 41) sts. Work in seed st for 1 row. Inc 1 st each side on next row, then every row 19 times more—61 (67, 73, 81) sts.

Mark beg and end of last row for end of shirttail. Work even until piece measures 10 (10, 10 1/2, 11)"/25.5 (25.5, 26.5, 28)cm above marked row, end with a WS row.

Raglan armhole shaping

Dec 1 st each side on next row, then every other row 19 (22, 25, 29) times more.

Bind off rem 21 sts.

LEFT FRONT

With larger needles and A and B held tog, cast on 31 (35, 37, 41) sts.

Work even in seed st until piece measures 10 (10, 10 1/2, 11)"/25.5 (25.5, 26.5, 28)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Raglan armhole shaping

Dec 1 st at beg of next row, then at same edge every other row 12 (15, 18, 22) times more, end with a RS row—18 (19, 18, 18) sts.

Neck shaping

Next row (WS) Bind off 5 (6, 5, 5) sts, work to end. Dec 1 st from neck edge on next row, then at same edge every other row 4 times more. AT SAME TIME, cont to dec 1 st at raglan armhole edge on next row, then every other row 6 times more. Fasten off last st.

RIGHT FRONT

Work as for left front, reversing all shaping by working raglan shaping at end of RS rows, neck shaping at beg of RS rows.

SLEEVES

With smaller needles and A and B held tog, cast on 25 (27, 29, 33) sts. Work in seed st for 3 rows.

Next (inc) row (WS) K 3 (2, 1, 1), [kf-b in next st] 20 (24, 28, 32) times, k 2 (1, 0, 0)—45 (51, 57, 65) sts. Change to larger needles.

Beg with row 1, cont in seed st until piece measures 14 (14½, 15, 16½)"/35.5 (37, 38, 42)cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Raglan cap shaping

Dec 1 st each side on next row, then every other row 19 (22, 25, 29) times more.

Bind off rem 5 sts.

HOOD

With larger needles and A and B held tog, cast on 101 sts. Work even in seed st until piece measures 8"/20.5cm from beg, end with a WS row.

Back gusset

Bind off 43 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Work even on 15 sts for 14"/35.5cm. Bind off.

FINISHING

Lightly block pieces to measurements.


Set raglan sleeve caps into raglan armholes.

Sew side seams to markers. Sew sleeve seams.

For hood, sew side edges of back gusset to bound-off sts. Sew hood to neck edge.

Edging

Rnd 2 Ch 1, working from left to right, sc in each st around, join rnd with a sl st in beg ch-1. Fasten off. Baste in zipper. Sew zipper in place. ♦

- Bust (closed) 35 (41)"/89 (104)cm
- Length (back of neck to bottom of peplum) 27 (28)"/68.5 (71)cm

MATERIALS

- 17 (19) 1¾oz/50g hanks (each approx 87yd/80m) of Tahki Yarns/Tahki•Stacy Charles, Inc., *Rio* (alpaca/fine merino wool/silk) in #3 tan (A)
- 6 (7) .88oz/25g balls (each approx 268yd/245m) of Filatura di Crosa/Tahki•Stacy Charles, Inc., *Baby Kid Extra* (baby kid mohair/polyamide) in #495 rose (B)
- One each sizes 8 and 9 (5 and 5.5mm) circular needle, 24"/60cm long, OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE
- One size 6 (4mm) needle for sleeve bind off only
- Stitch markers and holders

GAUGES

- 20 sts and 20 rows = 4"/10cm over k1, p1 rib (unstretched) using smaller circular needle and 1 strand each A & B held tog.
- 14 sts and 18 rows = 4"/10cm over Fisherman's rib, using smaller circular needle and 1 strand each A & B held tog.
- 16 sts and 20 rows = 4"/10cm over St st using larger circular needle and 1 strand each A & B held tog.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGES

STITCH GLOSSARY

S2KP Sl 2 sts together knitwise, k1, pss0.

VI (visible increase) Insert the LH needle from front to back into the strand between last st worked and the next st on the LH needle. Knit into the front loop for an open increase.

Inc 1 Increase 1 st by knitting into the front and back of the next st.

K1B Knit 1 st in the row below the st on needle.

FISHERMAN'S RIB

(over an even number of sts)

Set-up row (WS) Purl.

Row 1 *K1B, p1; rep from * to end.

Rep row 1 for Fisherman's rib.

NOTES

1) Work with 1 strand each A and B held tog throughout.

2) Circular needles are used to accommodate large number of sts. Work back and forth as with straight needles.

BODY

Using 1 strand each A & B held tog and smaller circular needle, cast on 93 sts for neck edge.

Set-up row (WS) *P1, k1; rep from *, end p1.

Note Work all inc'd sts into k1, p1 rib.

Row 1 (RS) Inc 1 st in first st, rib 5 sts, yo, place marker (pm), k1, pm, yo, rib 39 sts, yo, pm, k1, pm, yo, rib 39 sts, yo, pm, k1, pm, yo, rib 5 sts, inc 1 st in last st—101 sts.

Cont to inc 1 st each side *every row 5 (7) times more* (for front neck shaping), AT SAME TIME, work a yo each side of the marked "k1" sts every RS row 12 (14) times more—183 (199) sts. Work 1 row even in rib on WS, dropping markers. Change to larger circular needle, K 4 rows.

Eyelet row K1, *yo, k2tog; rep from * to end. P 1 row. K 4 rows, dec 4 (inc 4) sts evenly across last row—179 (203) sts.

Beg chart 1

Work rows 1-14 of chart 1. When chart is complete 62 (70) sts have been inc'd—241 (273) sts.

Divide for body

Next row (RS) K2tog, k36 (42) (for left front), place next 50 (54) sts on holder (for left sleeve), k2tog, k29 (35), k2tog, k29 (35), k2tog, place next 50 (54) sts on holder (for right sleeve), k36 (42), S2KP—135 (159) sts for body. K 3 rows.

Next row (RS) Rep eyelet row. P 1 row. Knit 4 rows.

Next row (RS) Rep eyelet row. P 1 row. Rep last 2 rows 3 times more. K 4 rows.

Next row (RS) Rep eyelet row. P 1 row. K 2 rows.

Next row (RS) Rep eyelet row. P 1 row. K 4 rows.

Beg charts

Next row K4 (2), work row 1 of chart 2, working 16-st rep 2 (3) times, k2, work row 1 of chart 3 three times, work row 1 of chart 4, work row 1 of chart 2, working 16-st rep 2 (3) times, k5 (1). Cont to work chart pats as established through row 20, dec 0 (2) sts on last row—233 (257) sts.

Next row (RS) *K1, yo, ssk, k3, k2tog, yo; rep from * to last st, k1. Purl one row.

Next row *K2, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1; rep from * to last st, k1. Purl one row.

SLEEVES

Place sleeve sts on smaller circular needle. Rejoin yarn to work on RS. K 4 rows. **Eyelet row 2** K1, *yo, k2tog; rep from * to last st, k1. Purl 1 row. K 4 rows, inc 30 (34) sts evenly across last row—80 (88) sts. Work in Fisherman's rib 4 rows.

Beg sleeve pattern

Row 1 (RS) K1, *p2tog, **[k1B, p1] 8 (9) times, k1B**, pm, VI, k1B VI, pm; rep between **'s once, ssk, pm; rep from * once more, k1.

Row 2 Work in Fisherman's rib as established.

Row 3 K1, *k2tog, rib to marker, sm, VI, p1, k1B, p1, VI, sm, rib to last 2 sts before next marker, p2tog, sm; rep from * once more, k1. Cont in this way, working decs and incs as established, until sleeve measures 6 1/2"/16.5cm from eyelet row, end with WS row.

Change to smaller circular needle. K 4 rows. Work eyelet row. P 4 rows. With size 6 (4mm) straight needle, bind off all sts knitwise.

LAPEL BANDS

Right band

With size 8 needle, cast on 30 sts and purl one WS row. Work in Fisherman's rib for 4 rows. **Next row (RS)** P2tog, rib to end. Cont in Fisherman's rib, dec 1 st at beg of every 6th row 15 times more. Work even until piece measures 26 (27)"/66 (68.5)cm from beg. Bind off.

Left band

Work to correspond to right band by working decs at end of rows.





KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

- Bust (closed) 35 (39, 43, 47)"/89 (99, 109, 119)cm
- Length 22 (22 1/2, 23 1/2, 24)"/56 (57, 59.5, 61)cm
- Upper arm 11 (13, 14 1/2, 16 1/2)"/28 (33, 37, 42)cm

MATERIALS

- 8 (9, 11, 12) 1 1/4 oz/50g balls (each approx 66yd/60m) of Mondial/Trendsetter Yarns *Magia* (new wool/acrylic) in #714 natural mix (MC)
- 2 (2, 3, 3) 1 1/4 oz/50g balls (each approx 110yd/100m) of Trendsetter Yarns *Rapunzel* each in #95 whipped cream (A), #52 teal (B), and #345 mist (C)
- 2 (2, 2, 3) 1 1/4 oz/50g balls (each approx 75yd/69m) of Trendsetter Yarns *Zucca* (nylon/polyamide) in #5051 white (D)
- 1 1 1/4 oz/50g ball (each approx 95yd/87m) of Trendsetter Yarns *Sunshine* (viscose/polyester) in #14 silver (E)
- One pair sizes 8 and 9 (5 and 5.5mm) needles OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE

GAUGES

- 15 sts and 22 rows = 4"/10cm over St st using larger needles and *Magia*.
- 16 sts and 18 rows = 4"/10cm over chart pats using larger needles and all yarns.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGES.

BACK

With smaller needles and C, cast on 69 (77, 85, 93) sts.

Bobble row (RS) *P1, k1, MB (k in front, back, front, back and front of next st, work in St st over these 5 sts for 4 rows, pass the 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th sts, one at a time, over the first st), k1; rep from *, end p1. Cont in k1, p1 rib for 2 rows. Change to MC and cont rib until piece measures 2 1/2"/6.5cm from beg, dec 1 st on last WS row—68 (76, 84, 92) sts. Change to larger needles.

Beg charts

Row 1 (RS) Work first st of chart 1, work 10-st rep 6 (7, 8, 9) times, work next 7 (5, 3, 1) sts after rep, working last st in St st. Cont in this way through chart row 39.

Work rows 1-15 of chart 2 as foll: Work 12-st rep 5 (6, 7, 7) times, then work first 8 (4, 0, 8) sts once more.

Work rows 1-11 of chart 3 as foll: Work 8-st rep 8 (9, 10, 11) times, work first 4 sts once more, then cont with MC only to end of piece, AT SAME TIME, when piece measures 13 1/2 (13 1/2, 14, 14)"/34.5 (34.5, 35.5, 35.5)cm from beg at row 11 (11, 13, 13) of chart 2, work as foll:

Raglan armhole shaping

Double dec row (RS) K3tog, work to last 3 sts, k3tog. Work 1 row even. Rep double dec row. Work 1 row even. Rep last 2 rows 0 (2, 4, 6) times more—60 sts.

Single dec row (RS) K2tog, work to last 2 sts, k2tog. Rep single dec row every other row 18 (18, 17, 17) times more. Bind off rem 22 (22, 24, 24) sts for back neck.

LEFT FRONT

With smaller needles and C, cast on 37 (41, 45, 49) sts. Work bobble and rib as for back, ending with last RS row of ribbing.

Next row (WS) Cast on 4 sts for facing, p these

4 sts, work in rib across row AND dec 1 st—40 (44, 48, 52) sts. Change to larger needles, work 4-st facing in St st and MC for entire length of front to neck, AT SAME TIME work charts as for back, working reps as foll:

Chart 1—Row 1 (RS) Work first st of chart, work 10-st rep 3 (3, 4, 4) times, work next 5 (9, 3, 7) sts after rep, working last st in St st.

Chart 2 Work 12-st rep 3 (3, 3, 4) times, work first 0 (4, 8, 0) sts once more.

Chart 3 Work 8-st rep 4 (5, 5, 6) times, work first 4 (0, 4, 0) sts once more.

AT SAME TIME, when same length as back to armhole, work as foll:

Raglan armhole and neck shaping

Work double dec row at armhole edge (beg of RS rows) on next row then every other row 1 (3, 5, 7) times more, then work single dec row every other row 16 (16, 15, 15) times, AT SAME TIME, when there are 20 (20, 21, 21) sts, end with a RS row and work neck shaping as foll:

Next row (WS) Bind off 9 (9, 10, 10) sts (which include the 4 facing sts), work to end. Cont to dec 2 sts (by k3tog) at neck edge every row 5 times. Fasten off last st. Sew facing to WS.

RIGHT FRONT

Work to correspond to left front, cast on for facing at beg RS row, work armhole shaping at end of RS rows and neck shaping at beg of RS rows.

LEFT SLEEVE

With smaller needles and C, cast on 36 (36, 38, 38) sts and work 3 rows in rev St st, 1 row in St st. (Note These 3 rev St st rows will roll to the WS. Measure above these rows.) With MC, work 4 rows in rev St st, 4 rows in k1, p1 rib. Change to larger needles and work chart pats as foll: Rows 13-32 of chart 1, rows 1-11 of chart 3, rows 1-39 of chart 1, rows 1-15 of chart 2, rows 1-11 of chart 3, then work in St st with MC to end of piece, AT SAME TIME, inc 1 st each side every 20th (10th, 8th, 6th) row 4 (8, 10, 14) times—44 (52, 58, 66) sts. Work even through chart row 11 (11, 13, 13) of chart 2—piece measures approx 19 1/2 (19 1/2, 20, 20)"/49.5 (49.5, 50.5, 50.5)cm from beg.

Raglan cap shaping

Work raglan shaping same as back at beg of RS rows and work raglan shaping same as front at end of RS rows. Fasten off last st.

RIGHT SLEEVE

Work to correspond to left sleeve, reversing raglan cap shaping by working front raglan shaping at beg of RS rows and back raglan shaping at end of RS rows.

FINISHING

Block pieces to measurements.

Raglan armhole borders

With RS facing, larger needles and C, beg at right back armhole, pick up and k 33 (35, 37, 39) sts along side of back armhole and 33 (35, 37, 39) sts evenly along right front armhole—66

(70, 74, 78) sts. K 4 rows. Change to MC and k 4 rows. Bind off. Sew raglan sleeve caps into armholes. Sew side seams and sleeve seams.

COLLAR

With smaller needles and MC, cast on 26 (26, 28, 28) sts. Work in k1, p1 rib, inc 1 st at the beg of each row (working inc sts into rib) until the increased edge fits along the front neck edge. Work 2 rows even. Dec same number of sts that were increased. Bind off in rib. Fold collar in half, and sew cast-on and bound-off edges tog along back neck edge, and angled edges along front neck edges. ♦





