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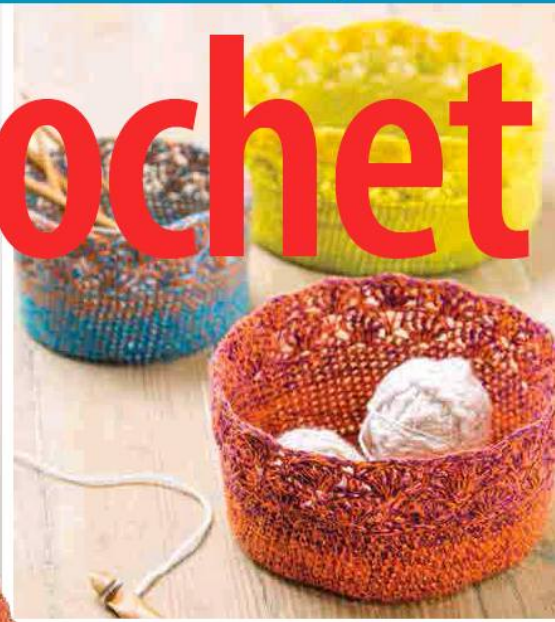
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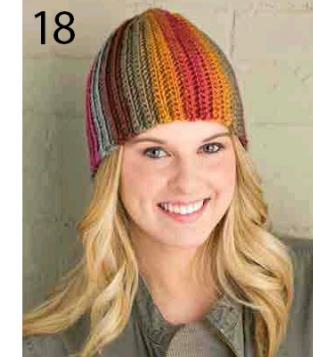

The Colorful Accessories chapter features fun fashion accessories to add a touch of flair to your wardrobe. We've included a delicious collection of scarves, cowls, hats, fingerless mitts, totes and more, all showing off the new cake and self-striping yarns to their best advantage!

The Colorful Style chapter includes nine garments for you! In this chapter, colorful cake yarns are used to enhance the shapes of these simple yet stylish garments. Crochet the Bandolier Vest for a light layer of warmth as summer transitions to fall. Or make the Kimono Card for a just-right layer as the weather turns cold. Also included in this chapter are a pretty sweater in plum-luscious shades, a practical V-neck vest in gray tones and a very wearable poncho.

The Colorful Home chapter is filled with an array of afghans, baskets, pillows and a rug. Home decor projects tend to be larger and require lots of color changes, but every project in this chapter uses no more than 2 different colorways, reducing the amount of ends to sew in.

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Shades of Autumn Wrap

1 2 3 4 5 6 EASY

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

20 inches wide x 80 inches long

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Unforgettable medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3½ oz/270 yds/ 100g per ball):
4 balls #3956 polo
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

GAUGE

7 blocks = 4 inches; 7 rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Each chain in a chain-2 space counts as a stitch when skipping stitches.

The graph shows the stitches to work for each row. Odd-numbered right-side rows are read from right to left. Even-numbered wrong-side rows are read from left to right. When the first symbol of a row is a mesh, work a beginning mesh. When the first symbol of a row is an increase, work an increasing beginning mesh. When the last symbol of a row is an increase, work an increasing ending mesh.

Join with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Mesh: Ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in next st.

Block: 2 dc in ch-2 sp, dc in next st.

Open filet stitches crocheted on the diagonal add drama and interest to this beautiful shawl. A pretty picot edging finishes it all off.



Beg Mesh: Ch 5 (counts as dc and ch 2), sk ch-2 sp, dc in next dc.

Increasing beginning mesh (inc beg mesh): Ch 6 (counts as tr and ch 2), dc in first st.

Increasing ending mesh (inc end mesh): Ch 2, tr in last st worked in.

Beginning decrease (beg dec): Ch 3 (does not count as st), sk ch-2 sp, dc in next dc.

Ending decrease mesh (end dec mesh): Ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, yo, insert hook in 2nd to last dc, pull up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook, yo twice, insert hook in last dc, pull up a lp, [yo,

draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo, pull through 3 lps on hook.

Picot: Ch 5, sl st in 4th ch from hook, ch 2.

WRAP

Row 1 (RS): Ch 37, dc in 7th ch from hook (counts as inc beg mesh), [ch 2, sk next 2 chs (see Pattern Notes), dc in next ch] 10 times, inc end mesh (see Special Stitches), turn. (12 ch-2 sps)

Row 2 (WS): Inc beg mesh (see Special Stitches), mesh (see Special Stitches) over each sp across, inc end mesh, turn. (14 mesh)

Rows 3–6: Rep row 2.

Row 7: Inc beg mesh, [mesh over next mesh] 5 times, [block (see Special Stitches) over mesh] until 5 mesh rem, [mesh over mesh] 5 times, inc end mesh, turn. (12 mesh, 12 blocks)

Row 8: Inc beg mesh, mesh over each mesh and block across, inc end mesh, turn. (26 mesh)

Rows 9–17: [Rep rows 7 and 8] 4 times. Rep row 7 once more. (12 mesh, 32 blocks)

Rows 18–28: Follow graph (see Pattern Notes), inc only at 1 side. (55 mesh)

Rows 29–87: Follow graph, inc at 1 side and dec on the other side. (12 mesh, 43 blocks)

Rows 88–98: Follow graph, dec only at 1 side. (44 mesh)

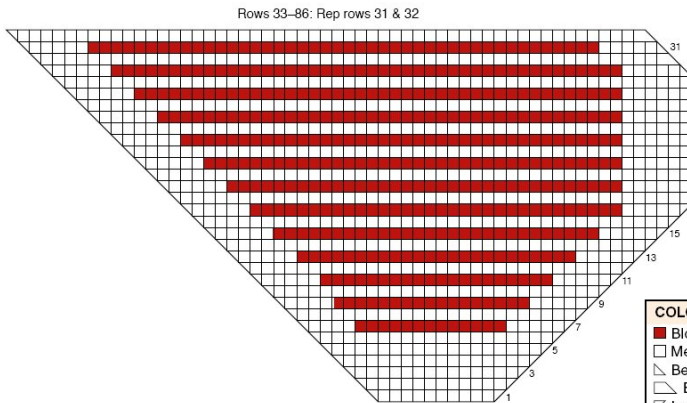
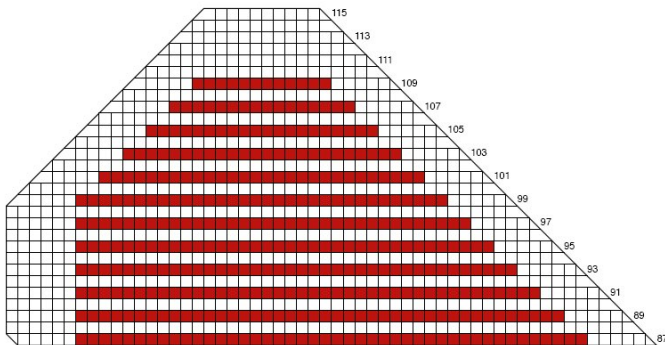
Rows 99–115: Follow graph, dec at both sides. Do not fasten off. (10 mesh)

Border

Rnd 1 (RS): Working in sides of rows and dc along top and bottom, [sc, picot (see Special Stitches)] around wrap, join (see Pattern Notes) in first sc.

Fasten off.

Block to measurements. **CW**

Plum Perfect Cowl

1 2 3 4 5 6 EASY

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Opening at Ribbing: 32 inches

Depth: 12 inches

MATERIALS

- Caron Big Cakes medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (10½ oz/603 yds/300g per cake):
1 cake #7483 plum pudding
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook
- Tapestry needle
- 1¾-inch button: 1
- Snap



GAUGE

Rnds 1–7 of Cowl Body = 2¼ inches

PATTERN NOTES

Join with slip stitch in indicated stitch unless otherwise stated.

To work into the back bar of a half double crochet stitch, work into the horizontal 3rd loop that lies parallel underneath the head of the stitch. To do this, tilt the top edge toward you to reveal the 3rd loop of the half double crochet below the top of the stitch. Insert hook into this loop.

COWL

RIBBING

Row 1: Leaving a 6-inch tail for seaming, with G hook, ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook and across, turn. (8 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, sc in back lps (see *Stitch Guide*) only of next 6 sc, sc in last sc, turn.

Rows 3–100: Rep row 2. At end of last row do not fasten off.

COWL BODY

Setup rnd: Change to H hook, rotate work to work in row ends, sc in the end of each row of ribbing. **Join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. (100 sc)

Rnd 1: Ch 1, hdc in back lp only of each st, join in first hdc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, working in back lps only, (hdc in 5 sts, 2 hdc in next st) around until less than 6 sts rem, hdc in each rem st. Join in first st. (116 sts)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in back bar (see *Pattern Notes*) of each hdc around. Join in first st.

Rnd 4: Ch 1, hdc in back lps only of each sc around. Join in first st.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around each hdc. Join in first st.

Rnd 6: Ch 1, working in hdc of rnd 4, hdc in each hdc behind the fpdc. Join in first st.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in each st around. Join in first st.

[Rep rnds 1–7] 4 more times. (213 sts)

Detachable Tab

Row 1: With G hook, ch 13, hdc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, turn. (12 hdc)

Row 2: Ch 1, hdc in each st across, turn.

Rep row 2 until tab is 6 inches in length, then fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

Sew the side of the ribbing closed with the long tail.

Sew button in the center of the tab and snaps at the ends.

Block finished project and enjoy.



Pair this with your favorite sweater and jeans and you are all set for a weekend getaway! Working in rounds keeps the long colorways of the cake yarn flowing smoothly from one color to the next.

FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given fit child's size; changes for woman's and man's sizes are in [].

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Child's Hat: 17½ inches in circumference x 7½ inches long

Woman's Hat: 20 inches in circumference x 9 inches long

Man's Hat: 22½ inches in circumference x 10 inches long

MATERIALS

- Classic Elite Liberty Wool light (light worsted) weight wool yarn (1¼ oz/122 yds/50g per ball):
 Man's: 1 ball #7883 smokey bonfire and 2 balls #78196 root beer
 Woman's: 1 ball each #7805 magenta and #7834 lilac daydream
 Child's: 1 ball each #7879 midnight blue and #7884 patchwork calico
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

3 dc rnds of Crown = 3½ inches

PATTERN NOTES

Any size Hat can be made using any of the 3 stitch patterns, resulting in 9 variations from a single pattern.

Work Crown for size needed and then skip to instructions for Body and Ribbing in same size.

Carry yarn not in use on wrong side of Hat.



One easy pattern, three simple-to-crochet textured stitches and your choice of a variegated and coordinating solid-colored yarn make this pattern one you'll make many times this winter!

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

HATS

CROWN

All Sizes

Rnd 1 (RS): With solid color ch 4, 11 dc in 4th ch from hook, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in 4th ch of beg ch-4. (12 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each dc around, join in beg ch-3. (24 dc)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in next dc, [2 dc in next dc,

dc in next dc] around, join in beg ch-3. (36 dc)

Rnd 4: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 2 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc] around, join in beg ch-3. (48 dc)

Rnd 5: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 3 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next 3 dc] around, join in beg ch-3. (60 dc)

Woman's & Man's Sizes Only

Rnd 6: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 4 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next 4 dc] around, join in beg ch-3. ([72] dc)

Man's Size Only

Rnd 7: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 5 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next 5 dc] around, join in beg ch-3. ([84] dc)

CHILD'S HAT

Body

Rnd 1 (RS): With variegated, ch 1, sc in **back lps** (see Stitch Guide) of each st around, join, turn. (60 sts)

Rnd 2 (WS): Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), sk next sc, [dc in next sc, ch 1, sk next sc] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4, turn.

Rnd 3 (RS): With solid color, ch 1, sc in dc, [working in front of next ch-1 sp, dc in next sc 2 rnds below, sc in next dc] around, join in beg sc, do not turn.

Rnds 4-21: [Rep Rnds 1-3] 6 times. At the end of Rnd 21, fasten off variegated only.

Ribbing

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), hdc in each of next 2 sts, **fphdc** (see Stitch Guide) around next st, [hdc in each of next 3 sts, fphdc around next st] around, join in top of beg ch-2.

Rnd 2: Ch 2, fphdc around next st, [hdc in next st, fphdc around next st] around, join in top of beg ch-2.

Messenger Bag

1 2 3 4 5 6 BEGINNER

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

10 inches wide x 11 inches long

MATERIALS

- Premier Yarns Sweet Roll medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (5 oz/245 yds/140g per ball):
2 balls #1047-10 black pepper swirl
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- 40½-inch #40-1009 leather shoulder bag strap by Byhands Hand Craft
- #718-38 press lock by Dritz
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers
- Straight pins

GAUGE

7 sc = 2 inches; 6 rows = 1½ inches

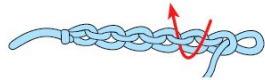
PATTERN NOTE

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

BAG

FRONT

Row 1 (WS): Ch 36, working in back bar of ch (see illustration), sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (35 sc)



Back Bar of Chain

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Rows 3–45: Rep row 2. Place marker at each end of last row.

This trendy and practical bag is stylish enough to become a favorite accessory and yet simple enough for a beginner to make with success! Leather handles and a metal clasp finish off the look in style.



BACK

Rows 46–94: Rep row 2. Place marker at each end of last row.

Front Flap

Rows 95–112: Rep row 2. At the end of row 112, fasten off.

FRONT POCKET

Row 1: Ch 26, working in back bar of ch, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (25 sc)

Rows 2–35: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of row 35, fasten off.

STRAP TAB

Make 2.

Row 1: Ch 3, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, turn. (2 sc)

Rows 2 & 3: Ch 1, sc in each st, turn.

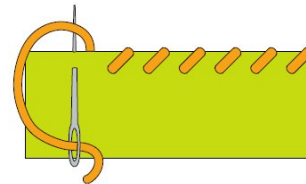
At the end of row 3, leaving a 6-inch length, fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

Following manufacturer's directions, attach base plate of press lock to Pocket centered between rows 18 and 24.

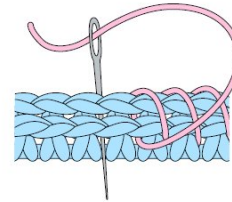
Position Pocket centered on Front between rows 2 and 36 and secure with straight pins.

Thread needle with 30-inch length, starting at center bottom leaving 15-inch length at beg free for opposite edge. Working toward corner, work **overcast stitch** (see illustration) to corner and up edge of Pocket, knot to secure. Going back to center bottom of Pocket, thread rem length on needle and sew opposite side of Pocket to Front. Remove straight pins.




Overcast Stitch

With Pocket facing, fold at markers on row 45 and position row 1 of Front to row 94 of Back, secure with straight pins along edges. Thread needle with 24-inch length, beg at bottom fold **whip-stitch edges** (see illustration) tog, ending at row 1 of front. Sew opposite edge in same manner. Remove markers.



Whipstitch Edges

Fold Flap forward on front of Pocket. Following manufacturer's directions, attach press lock centered on row 112 directly in line with base plate. Lock in place.

To secure Strap Tab to leather strap, thread rem length on needle, insert through straight edge of D hook of strap, holding opposite side of foundation ch to row 3, sew edges tog and sew to side edge of rows 1 and 2 of Front sewn edge of Bag. Sew 2nd Strap Tab to rem D ring and secure to opposite edge. 



November Lights Scarf

1 2 3 4 5 6 EASY

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

7½ inches wide x 66 inches long

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Boutique Treasure medium (worsted) weight acrylic/wool yarn (3½ oz/151 yds/100g per ball): 2 balls #1923 tapestry
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

9 sc and 3 ch-5 sps = 4½ inches;
3 rows = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-6 at beginning of row counts as first treble crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.



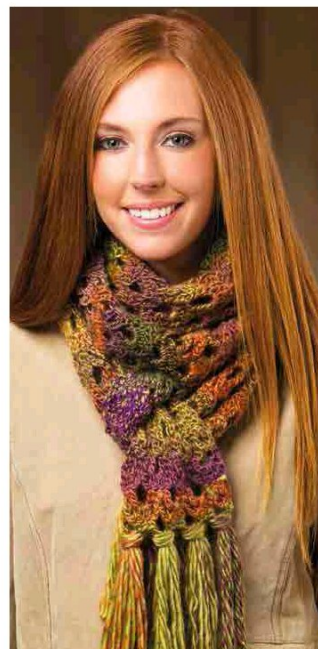
SCARF

Row 1 (RS): Ch 42, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next ch, *ch 5, sk next 5 chs, sc in each of next 3 chs, rep from * across to last 2 chs, ch 5, sc in each of last 2 chs, turn. (16 sc, 5 ch-5 sps)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *ch 3, sk next sc, 3 dc in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, sk next sc, sc in next sc, rep from * across, turn. (15 dc, 6 sc, 10 ch-3 sps)

Row 3: Ch 6 (see Pattern Notes), sc in each of first 3 dc, *ch 5, sk each of next ch-3 sp, next sc, and next ch-3 sp, sc in each of next 3 dc, rep from * across, ch 2, sk last ch-3 sp, tr in last sc, turn. (2 tr, 15 sc, 4 ch-5 sps, 2 ch-2 sps)

Row 4: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), sk first tr, dc in first ch-2 sp, *ch 3, sk next sc, sc in next sc, ch 3**, sk next sc, 3 dc in next ch-5 sp, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sk last ch-2 sp, dc in each of first 2 chs of beg ch-4, turn. (16 dc, 5 sc, 10 ch-3 sps)



Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 dc, *ch 5, sk each of next ch-3 sp, next sc, and next ch-3 sp**, sc in each of next 3 dc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in next dc, sc in top of beg ch-3, turn. (16 sc, 5 ch-5 sps)

Rows 6–149: [Rep rows 2–5 consecutively] 36 times. At end of last row, fasten off.

FRINGE

Cut 80 14-inch strands of yarn.

For each knot of Fringe, hold 8 strands tog and fold length in half. Insert hook from RS in ch-5 sp at end of Scarf, pull folded end through, pull ends through fold, pull ends to tighten knot. Work Fringe in each ch-5 sp across each short end. Trim ends even to desired length.

Beautiful multicolor yarn in soft autumn hues creates a seasonal fashion accessory that will dress up any style.



Easy Breezy Shawl

1 2 3 4 5 6 BEGINNER

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

17 inches wide x 70 inches long, excluding fringe

MATERIALS

- Caron Big Cakes medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (10½ oz/603 yds/300g per cake):
2 cakes #7482 toffee brickle
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

7 dc = 2 inches; 5 rows = 3 inches

PATTERN NOTES

To maintain color striping sequence when joining the 2nd cake, begin the 2nd cake with the next color that follows the last color of the first cake. Cut away extraneous yarn as needed and save it to make fringe.

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-8 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-5 unless otherwise stated.

SHAWL

Row 1: Ch 69, dc in 4th ch from hook (*beg 3 sk chs count as first dc*), dc in next 5 chs, [ch 5, sk next 5 chs, dc in next 7 chs] across, turn. (42 dc, 5 ch-5 sps)

Row 2: Ch 3 (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in next 6 dc, [ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, dc in next 7 dc] across, working last dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Rows 3 & 4: Rep row 2.

Row 5: Ch 8 (*see Pattern Notes*), sk first 6 dc, [dc in next dc, 5 dc in next ch-5 sp, dc in next dc, ch 5, sk next 5 dc] across, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn. (37 dc, 6 ch-5 sps)

Row 6: Ch 8, sk next 5 chs, [dc in next 7 dc, ch 5, sk next 5 chs] across, dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-8, turn.

Rows 7 & 8: Rep row 6.

Row 9: Ch 3, 5 dc in first ch-5 sp, dc in next dc, [ch 5, sk next 5 dc, dc in next dc, 5 dc in next ch-5 sp, dc in next dc] across, working last dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-8, turn. (42 dc, 5 ch-5 sps)

Rows 10–12: Rep row 2.

Rows 13–116: [Rep rows 5–12] 13 times. Fasten off after last row.

FRINGE

Cut 168 12-inch lengths of yarn, representing yarn colors equally. Arrange pieces in pairs to create balanced color distribution.

For each Fringe, hold 2 lengths tog and fold in half. Insert hook from RS in dc at short end of Shawl, pull folded end through, pull ends through fold, pull ends to tighten knot. Work Fringe in each dc across each short end. Trim ends evenly to desired length. ✂

A simple pattern of alternating openwork chain stitches and double crochet blocks creates the intriguing texture for this stylish shawl. Flirty fringe adds a fun finishing touch.



Short Rib Hat

1 2 3 4 5 6 EASY

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

20 inches in circumference x
9 inches tall

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand Yarn Landscapes medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3½ oz/147 yds/ 100g per ball):
1 ball #204 desert spring
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

GAUGE

15 sc = 4 inches; 20 rows = 4 inches (unstretched)

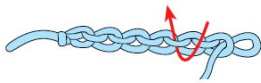
PATTERN NOTES

Work in back loop of each stitch throughout unless otherwise stated.

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

HAT

Row 1 base row (WS): Ch 34, working in **back bars** (see illustration), sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (33 sc)



Back Bar of Chain

Row 2 (RS): Working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*) here and throughout, sc in first 25 sts, leave rem sts unworked, turn. (25 sc)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. (25 sc)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each of first 25 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts of base row, turn. (27 sc)



Short rows show off this pretty color palette worked in single crochet rib stitch. Make a bunch for gifts too!

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. (27 sc)

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in each of first 27 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts of base row, turn. (29 sc)

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. (29 sc)

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in each of first 29 sc, sc in each of next 2 sts of base row, turn. (31 sc)

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. (31 sc)


Row 10: Ch 1, sc in each of first 31 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts of base row, turn. (33 sc)

Row 11 base row: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. (33 sc)

Rows 12–80: [Rep rows 2–11] 6 times, then rep rows 2–10. At end of last row, do not turn or fasten off.

FINISHING

Working in ends of rows of top edge, ch 1, [insert hook in next row, yo, pull up a lp] 15 times, yo and draw through all 16 lps on hook, ch 1 to secure.

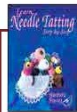
Hold first and last rows with RS tog. With WS facing, working through both thicknesses, sl st in each st across to seam. Fasten off. 



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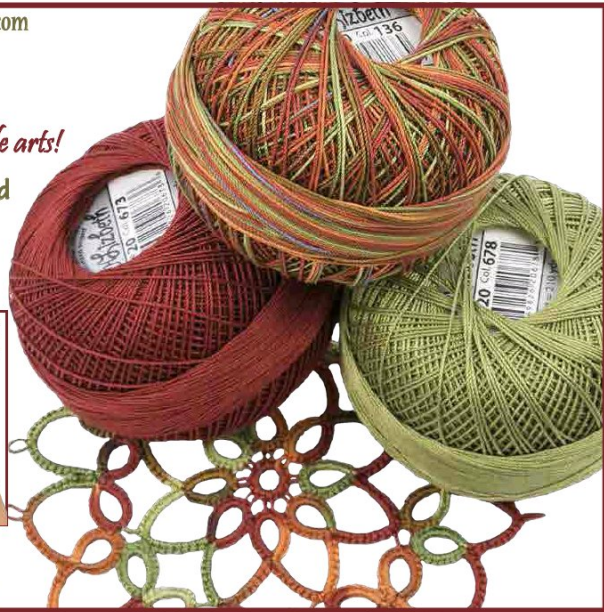

1 2 3 4 5 6 INTERMEDIATE

FINISHED SIZE

About 4½ inches x 81 inches
before fringe

MATERIALS

- Premier Yarns Puzzle bulky (chunky) weight yarn (7 oz/328 yds/200g per skein):

FIRST HALF

Note: All sts are worked in *back lps* (see *Stitch Guide*) only.

Row 1 (RS): With backgammon, ch 200, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch, turn. (199 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sc, [*2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc, sk next sc, sc in next 3 sc, sk next sc, sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc**, sc in next 3 sc] 7 times more, then rep from * to ** once, sc in next 2 sc, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to brainteaser in last sc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sc, [*2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc, sk next sc, sc in next 3 sc, sk next sc, sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc**, sc in

Crochet two skinny scarves and then twist them together to create this unusual scarf. Using a long-stripping yarn really shows off this design to its best advantage.



next 3 sc] 7 times more, then rep from * to ** once, sc in next 2 sc, change color to backgammon in last st, turn.

Rows 5 & 6: Rep Rows 3 and 4. At end of Row 6, do not ch 1. Finish off. Mark first sc of last row as top.

2ND HALF

Work same as First Half. Mark last sc of last row as top.

FINISHING

Hold 2 halves with RS tog and marked sc in upper right-hand corner. With tapestry needle and matching color yarn and starting with marked sc, sew edges tog for 1 inch.

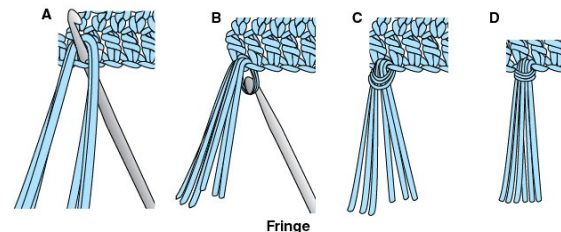
Twist halves around each other, pinning at each cable crossing, until cabling is complete.

Chain-2 at beginning of round does not count as a stitch unless otherwise stated.

COWL

Leaving a 6-inch tail, ch 134.

Rnd 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each st across, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc to form a ring, turn. (133 sts)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sl st in first sc and in each st around, join in beg ch-1 sp, turn.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in the first sl st and in each st around, join in the first sc, turn.

Rnd 4: Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk the first 3 sc, dc in the next sc, ch 1, working in front of the dc just made, dc in the 2nd sk sc, *dc in the next sc, sk the next 2 sc, dc in the next sc, ch 1, working in front of the dc just made, dc in the first sk sc (*dc cross-st made*); rep from * around to the last sc, dc in the last sc, join in the top of ch-2 turning ch, turn. (33 *dc cross-sts*, 33 *dc*)

Rnd 5: Ch 2, dc in the first dc, sk the next dc, dc in the next ch-1 sp, *sk the next 2 dc, dc in the next dc, ch 1, working in front of the dc just made, dc in the first sk dc, dc in the next ch-1 sp (*dc cross-st made*);

rep from * around to the last dc, sk the last dc, 2 dc in the same st as beg ch-2, join in the top ch-2 turning ch, turn. (32 *dc cross-sts*, 36 *dc*)

Rnd 6: Ch 2, sk the first 3 dc, dc in the next dc, ch 1, working in front of the dc just made, dc in the 2nd sk dc, dc in the next ch-1 sp, *sk the next 2 dc, dc in the next dc, ch 1, working in front of the dc just made, dc in the first sk dc, dc in the next ch-1 sp (*dc cross-st made*); rep from * around to the last 3 dc, sk the next 2 dc, dc in last dc, ch 1, working in front of the dc just made, dc in the first sk dc, dc in the same st as beg ch-2, join in the top ch-2 turning ch, turn. (33 *dc cross-sts*, 33 *dc*)

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in the same st as join and in each dc and ch-1 sp around, join in the first sc, turn. (133 *sc*)

Rnds 8 & 9: Rep rows 2 and 3.

Rnds 10–45: [Rep rows 4–9] 6 times, fasten off.

FINISHING

With 6-inch beg tail, sew the foundation ch opening. Wet-block.

Made by alternating a double crochet cross stitch and a rib stitch, this cowl can easily be mistaken for a knit rib.

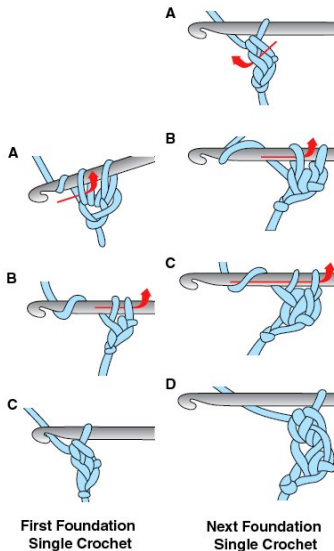

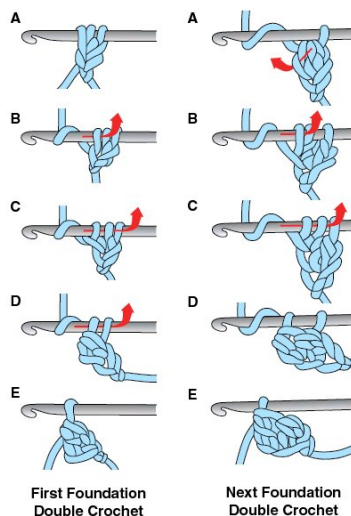

 2 skeins #1978 baroque stripe
- Size L/11/8mm Tunisian crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size K/10½/6.5mm crochet hook
- Tapestry needle

GAUGE

In RevTss: 13 sts = 4 inches;
 9 rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Each row in Tunisian crochet consists of 2 parts—a Forward Pass where you pick up the stitches, and a Return Pass where you work the stitches off the hook.



Right side of work is always facing. Each piece is worked as a parallel-ogram. The hat is seamed to make a continuous loop.
 Join yarn with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Crochet Cast On: Place slip knot on standard crochet hook, position Tunisian hook in left hand, resting it on top of yarn coming from ball and directly under the lp on standard hook; yo around the Tunisian hook and draw yarn through lp on standard hook. *The yarn will now be above the Tunisian hook. Slide it around the front of the hook to the back, yo and draw through lp on standard hook; rep from * until 1 fewer sts than needed are on the Tunisian hook. Slide final lp on the standard hook onto the Tunisian hook.

Reverse Tunisian Simple Stitch (RevTss): With yarn in back, insert hook under back vertical bar from right to left, yo, draw up a lp.

Extended Tunisian Simple Stitch (ExTss) in end st: Insert hook under both vertical bars of final st in row, yo, draw up a lp, ch 1.

End Stitch (end st): Insert hook under both vertical bars of final st in row, yo, draw up a lp.

Increase (inc): Insert hook under top lp only of next horizontal st, yo, draw up a lp.

Single crochet 2 together (sc2tog): Sc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts.

HAT

Note: Right edge of piece is top of hat.

Row 1 (RS):

A. Crochet cast on (see *Special Stitches*) 33 sts. (33 sts)

B. Yo, draw through first lp; *yo, draw through 2 lps; rep from * until 3 lps rem on hook, yo, draw through 3 lps (dec made), 1 lp rem on hook and counts as first st of next row.

Row 2:

A. Sk dec, RevTss (see *Special Stitches*) in next 30 sts, **inc** (see *Special Stitches*), **end st** (see *Special Stitches*). (33 sts)

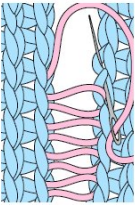
B. Rep row 1 B.

Rows 3–43: Rep row 2.

Bind off: Sk dec, inserting hook as if to RevTss, sl st in each of next 30 sts, sl st under top strand of next horizontal st, working under both vertical bars sl st in final st. Fasten off leaving a 30-inch tail for sewing.

FINISHING

With tapestry needle and ending tail, **invisible seam** (see *illustration*) bound-off edge to first row.

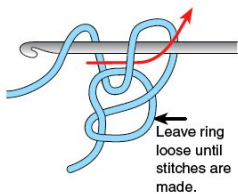
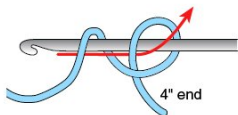

Row 8: Ch 7, (dc, sc) in 4th ch from hook, ch 3, sk next 3 chs of ch-7, [(dc, sc) in next dc, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp] across, ending with (dc, sc) in last dc, turn. (5 (dc, sc) groups; 4 ch-3 sps)

Rows 9–36: [Rep rows 7 and 8 alternately] 14 times. (19 (dc, sc) groups; 18 ch-3 sps)

Rows 37–126: Rep row 7.

Straight Edge Trim

Row 127: Ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), dc in first dc, [ch 1, V-st (see Special Stitches) in next dc] 17 times, ch 1, V-st in last dc, turn. (19 V-sts, 18 ch-1 sps)

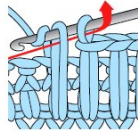

Rnd 2: [3 sc in next st, sc in next st, 3 sc in next st, sc in each of next 42 sts] twice. (98 sc)

Rnd 3: Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 46 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 44 sts. (102 sc)

Rnd 4: Sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in each of next 3 sts, sc in each of next 48 sts, 2 sc in each of next 3 sts, sc in each of next 45 sts. (108 sc)

Rnd 5: [Sc in next st, tr in next st] around to last 2 sts, sc dec (see Stitch Guide) over last 2 sts. (54 sc, 53 tr)

Rnd 6: [Tr in next st, sc in next st] around, ending with tr in last st. (54 sc, 53 tr)

Rnd 7: [Sc in next st, tr in next st] around, ending with sc in last st. (54 sc, 53 tr)


Rnds 8–33: [Rep rnds 6 and 7 alternately] 13 times.

Rnd 34: Rep rnd 6, turn to RS.

Rnd 35 (RS): Sc in each st around, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. (107 sc)

Rnd 36: Working over sts of rnds 34 and 35 and in top lps of tr of rnd 33, [2 long sc (see Special Stitch) in next tr] around, join in top of first long sc. Fasten off. (106 long sc)

ASSEMBLY

Thread tapestry needle with 1 strand cedar chest and sew ends of handles where desired to top edge of Tote.

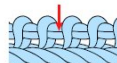

Row 2: Tks in first st, [pull up lp in **horizontal bar** (see illustration) of buttonhole] twice, tks in next 2 sts, [yo, sl next st, tks, psso] across to last 5 sts, tps in last 5 sts (95 lps on hook); work lps off hook.

Rows 3–6: Tks in 5 sts, [yo, sl in next st, tks in next st, psso] across to last 5 sts, tps in last 5 sts (95 lps on hook); work lps off hook.

Rows 7–18: Rep rows 1–6 twice.

Row 19: Rep row 1.

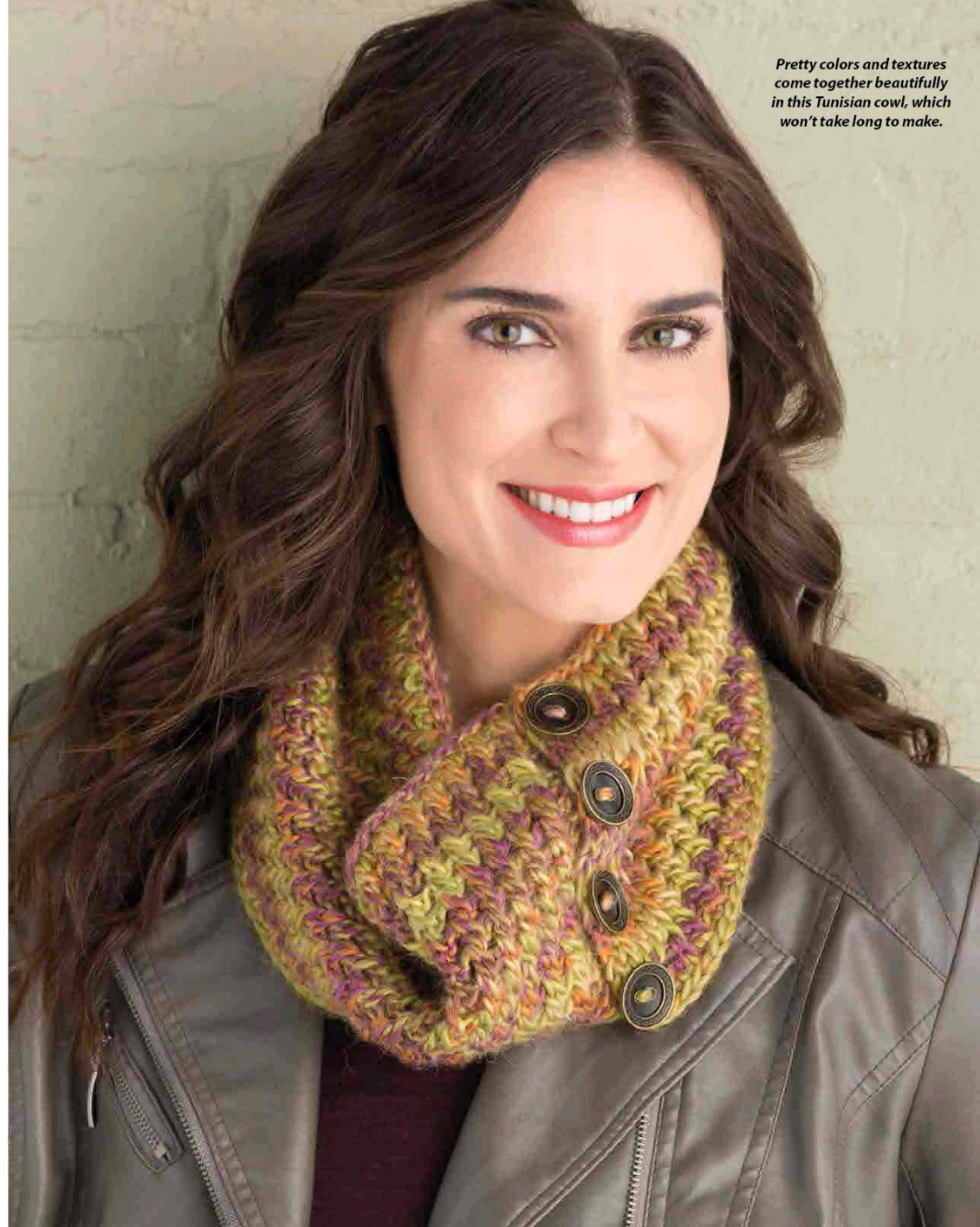
Row 20: Rep row 2.

Row 21: **Sl st bo** (see Special Stitches) in each st across. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew on buttons to match buttonholes.

Chain-3 at beginning of round does not count as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

First row beginning star stitch (r1 beg star st): Pull up lps in chs 2, 3 and 5, yo, pull through all 4 lps.

First row star stitch (r1 star st): Pull up a lp in ch made to close previous st, pull up a lp in last ch worked into for previous st, sk 1 ch, pull up a lp in next ch, yo, pull through all 4 lps.



Take one skein of a beautiful variegated yarn and crochet this pretty headband in star stitch. It's quick to finish, so make several for gift-giving this holiday season.

Beginning star stitch (beg star st): Pull up lps in chs 2 and 3, pull up a lp in ch used to close 2nd star st of previous row, yo, pull through all 4 lps.

Star stitch (star st): Pull up a lp in ch made to close previous st, pull up a lp in last ch worked into for

previous st, sk top of next star st, pull up a lp in ch used to close next star st, yo, pull through all 4 lps.

STAR ST PATTERN

Row 1: R1 beg star st (see *Special Stitches*), ch 1, *r1 star st (see *Special Stitches*), ch 1, rep from * across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), beg star st (see *Special Stitches*), ch 1, *star st (see *Special Stitches*), ch 1, rep from * across, turn.

Rep row 2 for pattern.

HEADBAND

Row 1: Ch 23, work row 1 of Star St Pattern.

Rows 2-46 [2-52, 2-56]: Work row 2 of Star St Pattern.

FINISHING

Turn at end of last row, ch 1, align short edges of Headband,

working through both thicknesses, sl st across edge to seam. This becomes WS of Headband.

Edging

First Side

Rnd 1: Turn RS out, sc evenly around Headband.

Rnd 2: Working loosely, sl st in the back lp (see *Stitch Guide*) of each st around, place marker in first st.

Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2, move marker up as work progresses. Fasten off.

Second Side

Turn Headband to edge opposite side.

Rnd 1: Join (see *Pattern Notes*) to edge of Headband just left of seam, ch 1, sc evenly around.

Rnds 2 & 3: Work as for First Side Edging. Fasten off.

Weave in ends.

Pompoms

Make 1 Pompom about 1½ inches in diameter, and 2 Pompoms about 1½ inches in diameter.

When tying the yarn around the center of the Pompom, leave the ends of this yarn long for securing to Headband. Use a little fabric glue as you make your Pompom or when you finish it to secure it tog. Place on Headband so that, with the seam at the back of the head, the Pompoms will sit tog in a close group about 3½ inches left of center. Pull the tie ends of each Pompom through the fabric of the Headband. Secure with a knot and weave in ends.

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Crocheting With Self-Striping Yarns

Self-striping yarns are most often those gorgeous, multicolored, center-pull cake skeins that are so popular right now. There are several regularly shaped skeins or balls that have very long striping as well. No matter their shape, they are all absolutely irresistible!

The first thing we need to know is that cake yarns in particular are very long striping yarns with colors that usually don't repeat. If you want to make something with repeated stripes be sure to buy several cakes of the same color and/or dye lot all at one time. Better to have plenty of yarn than to run out! The stripes are either beautifully contrasting, mesmerizingly monochromatic or delightfully complementary. Once you get them home, though, you might wonder, where do I even begin? What are the best stitches to use with self-striping yarn? What are the best items to make to utilize all of these tantalizing colors?



The striping in cake yarns can change very abruptly, so planning for your color changes will be important if you have a particular striping already in mind. The beginning of a new stripe of color is called a run. In order to make cohesive items such as garments, we should begin each piece with the same color and at the beginning of the run. Doing this ensures that all the striping matches throughout our project. Each sleeve will have the same striping as the body, and the front and back of the garment will have stripes that seam beautifully. Sounds easy, doesn't it? There are just a few tricks you will need to use to get them to match, along with starting with the same run.

To make our garment, we will need to work the front and back pieces each with their own skein making sure to pay attention to the striping—gauge can be a game changer here! We want to make sure we work exactly the same number of rows per run. When we seam the body, the stripes should match perfectly.

Sleeves do require a bit more thought and ends to weave in. They are usually much thinner than the body of a garment, so it's important to factor that into how wide we want our stripes. If we want our stripes to match the height of the stripes of the body, we will need to work the same number of rows in the run, cut the yarn at the end of the row, and then add the new color at the beginning of the next row. It does require planning and paying attention but the end results are well worth it!

Since many cake yarns do not usually have color repeats, you will need to buy a new cake for each part of your garment. The good news is that you'll have the same colors left over to make a whole new design! We can use these leftovers or we can separate a new skein's colors for some really fun projects!



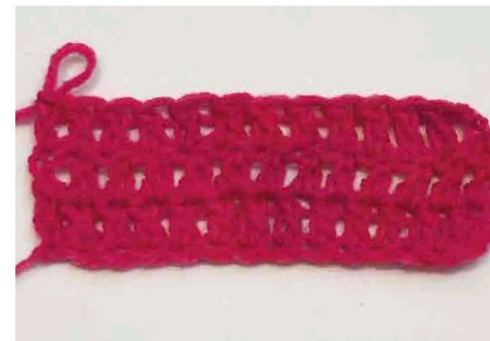
Once we have cut each run and rolled them into separate balls there really is no limit to what can be made! We have all the colors needed for a perfectly coordinated motif afghan or top. We can make matching striped mittens, mitts or slippers. Toys are always a fun option, especially with the brighter colors! We could

even make several coordinating mandalas—all with different color rotations from just one skein of yarn. The possibilities are only limited by our imaginations!

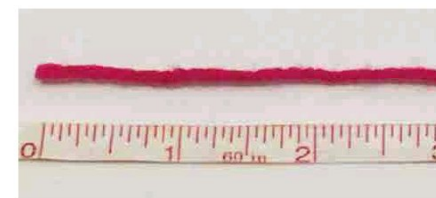

Afghans are really stunning in self-striping yarns. It's all the fun with none of the stress over which colors to choose. If you prefer not to have a very noticeable color change right in the middle of a row, a little math and a swatch might be needed. We begin our swatch by crocheting a few rows in the gauge our pattern indicates.




Count the number of rows crocheted and write the number down. Next, we will unravel our swatch and measure how much yarn was used to make our swatch.



We then divide that number by the number of rows we crocheted. This tells us how much yarn we need for each row. We can then measure our runs and adjust our gauge accordingly. We can also either add stitches and make our afghan wider with thinner stripes, or we can subtract stitches from the pattern and make a thinner afghan with wider striping.

If you are a bit more adventurous, why not just throw caution to the wind? You could easily crochet until you're at the end of the final row of the run, cut the extra yarn (leaving enough to weave in) and begin the next row with the new color. There's no counting and each stripe is fearless fun just waiting to see how many rows we can get out of a run. This is my preferred method—I love to live on the wild side!

Solid or textured stitches really showcase the loveliness of these yarns. The self-striping does all the work for you. You can use lacy stitches, but you will find that the stitches start to compete with the yarn for attention and can quickly become unattractive. Solid or textured stitches tend to be more harmonious with striping. The lengths of each run won't always be consistent depending on brand and dye lot so we might need to occasionally adjust them regardless of which stitch we choose. That said, the granny stitch works absolutely fantastically with these yarns! The best and only way to know if your stitch is going to work with striping is to make that swatch. It's pretty amazing what those squares can teach us!

The easiest way to ensure that your self-striping yarn is going to work with your project is to choose a pattern that already features the self-striping yarn you have chosen. A pattern designed in a solid color will look completely different in a self-striping yarn. With so many new self-striping patterns available, why not go with one that already has the work done for you? No matter what method you use, make sure to have fun!

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-5 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

First foundation double crochet (first foundation dc): Ch 2, yo, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook (see illustration A), yo, pull up 1p, yo, pull through 1 lp on hook (see illustration B—ch-1 completed),

[yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice (see illustrations C–E—dc completed).

Next foundation double crochet (next foundation dc): *Yo, insert hook in last ch-1 made (see illustration A), yo, pull up 1p, yo, pull through 1 lp on hook (see illustration B—ch-1 completed), [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice (see illustrations C–E—dc completed), rep from * as indicated in instructions.

VEST

LEFT BACK

Row 1 (RS): With size F hook, **first foundation dc** (see *Special Stitches*), **next foundation dc** (see *Special Stitches*) 89 [93, 97, 101, 105, 109] times, turn. (90 [94, 98, 102, 106, 110] dc)

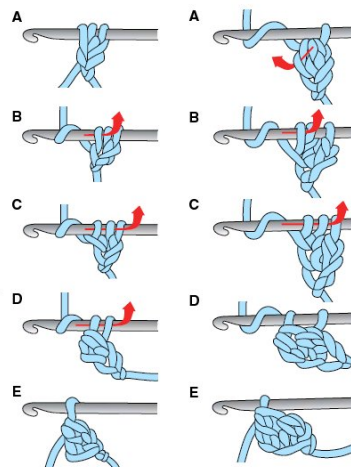
Row 2: Working in sps between sts, ch 1, sc in sp between first and 2nd sts, [ch 4, sk next 3 sps, sc in next sp] across to last 5 sts, ch 4, sk next 3 sps, dc in last st, turn. (22 [23, 24, 25, 26, 27] ch sps)

Row 3: Ch 5 (see *Pattern Notes*), sc in first ch-4 sp, [ch 4, sc in next ch-4 sp] across, ch 2, dc in last sc, turn. (21 [22, 23, 24, 25, 26] ch-4 sps, 2 ch-2 sps)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first dc, ch 4, [sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 4] across, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch-5, turn. (22 [23, 24, 25, 26, 27] ch sps)

Row 5: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), 4 dc in each ch-4 sp across, dc in last sc, turn. (90 [94, 98, 102, 106, 110] dc)

Next rows: Rep rows 2–5 consecutively for pattern until piece measures 7¼ [7¼, 8, 8¼, 9, 9] inches from beg, ending with row 4 [5, 2, 4, 5, 5].

Next row (RS): Ch 5, sc in next ch-4 sp, [ch 4, sc in next ch-4 sp] twice, ch 2, dc in next sc, ch 39, sk next 10 ch sps, dc in next sc, ch 2, sc in next ch-4 sp, [ch 4, sc in next ch-4 sp] 10 times, ch 2, dc in last st, turn. ([12] ch-4 sps, [4] ch-2 sps)

Sized to 3X

Next foundation single crochet (next foundation sc): [Insert hook in last ch-1 made (see illustration A), yo, pull up lp, yo, pull through 1 lp on hook (see illustration B—ch-1 completed), yo, pull through both lps on hook (see illustrations C and D—sc completed)] as indicated.

Shell: [(Dc, ch 2) twice, dc] in indicated st.

Beginning V-stitch (Beg V-st): Ch 5 (counts as a dc and ch 2), dc in the indicated st.

V-stitch (V-st): (Dc, ch 2, dc) in the indicated st.

Single crochet join (sc join): Place slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo and pull up a lp, yo and draw through both lps on hook.

PONCHO

Leaving about a 30-inch-long tail, **first foundation sc** (see *Special Stitches*), 228 **next foundation sc** (see *Special Stitches*). (229 foundation sc)

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, sc in the first st, *sk the next 2 sts, **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in the

next st, sk the next 2 sts, sc in next st; rep from * across, turn. (38 shells, 39 sc)

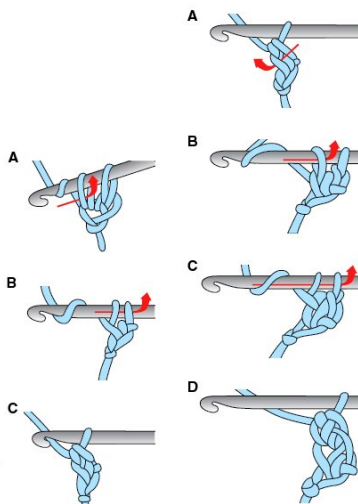
Row 2: Beg V-st (see *Special Stitches*) in the first sc, sk next dc, sc in next dc, *shell in the next sc, sk next dc, sc in next dc; rep from * to the last sc, **V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in the last sc, turn. (38 sc, 38 shells, 1 V-st, 1 Beg V-st)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in the first dc, shell in the next sc, *sk next dc, sc in next dc, shell in next sc; rep from * across, sc in the 3rd ch of ch-5 turning ch, turn. (38 shells, 39 sc)

Rows 4–19: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 8 times. Do not turn.

Row 20: Ch 1, sc 54 sts evenly across short side edge. Fasten off.

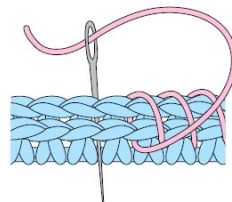
With RS facing, **sc join** (see *Special Stitches*) in the corner on the opposite short side edge and rep row 20.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) in each sc around, join in the ch-1 sp.

Fasten off.

BORDER

With RS facing, join yarn at the bottom short end corner.

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in the same st as join, *sk the next 2 sts, shell in the next st, sk the next 2 sts, sc in next st** 8 times, shell in the next st, sk the next 2 sts, sc in the seam st; rep from * to ** across. Do not turn. (18 shells, 19 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *[ch 2, sk next dc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 2, sc in next sc; rep from * around, ch 2, join in the first sc. Fasten off. (279 sc, 280 ch-2 sps)

FINISHING

Weave in ends; block if desired.

Foundation row: Loosely ch 65 [71, 77, 85, 90], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (64 [70, 76, 84, 90] sc)

One simple stitch and a gorgeous self-striping yarn make this easy-to-wear sweater a winner!



Sized to 2X

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Work even in sc rows until piece measures 5 inches, ending with a WS row.

Fasten off.

2nd Layer

Work as for First Layer until piece measures 2 inches, ending with a WS row. Lay WS of 2nd Layer on RS of First Layer. From RS, working in each corresponding st through both thicknesses, sc in each st across. (64 [70, 76, 84, 90] sc)

Work even in sc rows until piece measures 8½ [8½, 7¾, 8, 8] inches.

Next row (dec): Sc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, sc in each st across to last 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, turn. (62 [68, 74, 82, 88] sc)

Work even until piece measures 12 [12½, 10½, 11, 11¼] inches.

Rep dec row. (60 [66, 72, 80, 86] sc)

Sizes Large, X-Large & 2X-Large Only

Work even until piece measures [13½, 14, 14½] inches.

Rep dec row. ([70, 78, 84] sc)

All Sizes

Work even until piece measures 15½ [16, 16¼, 17, 17½] inches, ending with a WS row. (60 [66, 70, 78, 84] sc)

Shape Armholes

Sl st in each of first 3 sts, (sl st, ch 1, sc) in next st, sc in each st across to last 3 sts, turn, leaving rem sts unworked. (54 [60, 64, 72, 78] sc)

Dec row: Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sts] 1 [1, 1, 2, 2] time(s), sc in each st across to last 2 [2, 2, 4, 4] sts, [sc dec in next 2 sts] 1 [1, 1, 2, 2] time(s), turn. (52 [58, 62, 68, 74] sc)

Rep dec row 1 [3, 5, 2, 3] time(s). (50 [52, 52, 60, 62] sc)

Sizes X-Large & 2X-Large Only

Dec row: Sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each st across to last 2 sts, sc dec, turn.

Rep last row twice. ([54, 56] sc)

All Sizes

Work even until piece measures 22½ [23½, 24, 25, 26] inches, ending with a WS row. (50 [52, 52, 54, 56] sc)

Shape Right Shoulder

Row 1 (RS): Sc in each of first 15 [16, 15, 16, 16] sc, turn, leaving rem sts unworked.

Row 2 (WS): Sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in each st across, turn. (14 [15, 14, 15, 15] sc)

Work even until piece measures 23½ [24½, 25, 26, 27] inches.

Fasten off.

Shape Left Shoulder

Row 1 (RS): Sk 20 [20, 22, 22, 24] sts across center of Back from last st of Right Shoulder, join (see *Pattern Notes*) in next st, ch 1, sc in same st, sc in each st across, turn. (15 [16, 15, 16, 16] sc)

Row 2: Sc in each st across to last 2 sc, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (14 [15, 14, 15, 15] sc)

Work in established pattern until piece measures same as Right Shoulder. Fasten off.

FRONT

Work as for Back until piece measures 21 [22, 22½, 23½, 24½] inches, ending with a WS row. (50 [52, 52, 54, 56] sc)

Shape Neck & Left Shoulder

Row 1 (RS): Sc in first 18 [19, 19, 20] sc, turn, leaving rem sts unworked.

Row 2: Sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in each st across, turn. (17 [18, 18, 18, 19] sc)

Row 3: Sc in each st across to last 2 sc, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (16 [17, 17, 17, 18] sc)

Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately until 14 [15, 14, 15, 15] sc rem.

Work even until piece measures 23½ [24½, 25, 26, 27] inches.

Fasten off.

Shape Neck & Right Shoulder

Row 1 (RS): Sk 14 [14, 14, 16, 16] sts across center of Front from last st of Left Shoulder, join in next st, ch 1, sc in same st, work sc in each st across, turn. (18 [19, 19, 19, 20] sc)

Row 2: Sc across to last 2 sc, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (17 [18, 18, 18, 19] sc)

Row 3: Sc in each st across to last 2 sc, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (16 [17, 17, 17, 18] sc)

Rep rows 2 and 3 until 14 [15, 14, 15, 15] sc rem.

Work in established pattern until piece measures same as Left Shoulder. Fasten off.

SLEEVE

Make 2.

First Layer

Foundation row: Loosely ch 39 [41, 43, 45, 47], sc in 2nd ch from hook, and in each ch across, turn. (38 [40, 42, 44, 46] sc)

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Work even in sc rows until piece measures 4 inches, ending with a WS row. Fasten off.

2nd Layer

Loosely ch 43 [45, 47, 49, 51], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (42 [44, 46, 48, 50] sc)

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Work even in sc rows until piece measures 2 inches, ending with a RS row.

Dec row: Ch 1, *sc in next 8 [8, 9, 9, 10] sc, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from * 3 times, 2 [4, 2, 4, 2] sc, turn. (38 [40, 42, 44, 46] sc)

Lay WS of 2nd layer on RS of First Layer.

From RS, working in each corresponding st through both thicknesses, sc in each st across. (38 [40, 42, 44, 46] sc)

Work even in sc rows until piece measures 5½ [5¼, 5¾, 6¼, 6¾] inches.

Inc row: 2 sc in first st, sc in each st across to last st, 2 sc in last st, turn. (40 [42, 44, 46, 48] sc)

Work even in sc rows and at the same time, rep inc row every 2½ [2½, 1¾, 1½, 1¼] inches 4 [4, 5, 6, 6] times. (48 [50, 54, 58, 60] sc after last inc row)

Work even in sc rows until piece measures 18½ [18, 17, 16¾, 16] inches, ending with a WS row.

Shape Cap

Row 1 (RS): Sl st in each of first 3 sts, (sl st, ch 1, sc) in next st, sc across to last 3 sts, turn, leaving rem sts unworked. (42 [44, 48, 52, 54] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each st across to last 2 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (40 [42, 46, 50, 52] sc)

Rep last row 10 [12, 16, 17, 21] times. Fasten off. (20 [18, 14, 16, 10] sc)

ASSEMBLY

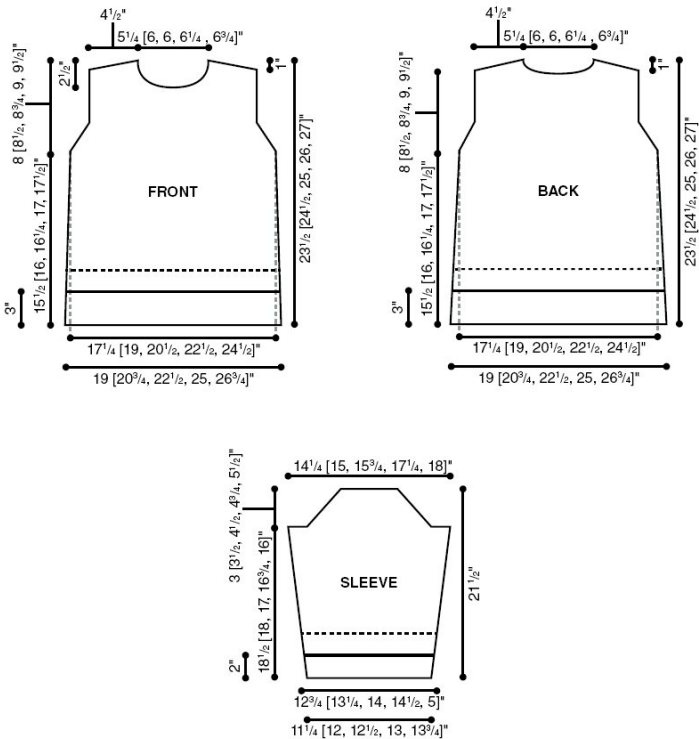
Sew Shoulder seams. Sew in the Sleeves.

Sew side and Sleeve seam. Rep for other side and Sleeve seam.

Neck Edge

Starting at a Shoulder seam, work approximately 50 [52, 54, 56, 58] sc evenly sp around neck opening. Join in first sc. Fasten off.

Weave in all ends. **CW**

- Yarn needle



GAUGE

4 shells = 5 inches; 8 shell rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Shell: (2 dc, ch 3, sl st in first ch of ch-3—for picot, 2 dc) in indicated sp.

SHAWL

Row 1: Ch 3, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) to form a ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in ring, ch 1, 3 dc in ring, turn. (6 dc)

Row 2: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-2, sk next 2 dc, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 sp, sk next 2 dc, 3 dc in last dc, turn. (12 dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, sk next 2 dc, 3 dc in sp before next 3-dc group, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 sp, sk next 3 dc, 3 dc in sp before next 3-dc group, sk next 2 dc, 3 dc in last dc, turn. (18 dc)

Row 4: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, sk next 2 dc, [3 dc in sp before next 3-dc group, sk next 3 dc] twice, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 sp, [sk next 3 dc, 3 dc in sp before next 3-dc group] twice, sk next 2 dc, 3 dc in last dc, turn. (24 dc)

Row 5: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, sk next 2 dc, [shell (see *Special Stitch*) in sp before next 3-dc group] 3 times, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 sp, (sk next 3 dc, shell in sp before next 3-dc group) 3 times, sk next 2 dc, 3 dc in last dc, turn. (36 dc)

Row 6: Ch 3, 2 dc in same sp as beg ch-3, sk next 2 dc, [shell in sp before next shell] 3 times, shell in next sp before 3-dc group, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 sp, [shell in sp before next shell] 3 times, shell in next sp before 3-dc group, sk next 2 dc, 3 dc in last dc, turn. (44 dc)

Row 7: Ch 3, 2 dc in same sp as beg ch-3, sk next 2 dc, [shell in sp before next shell] across to last sp before 3-dc group, shell in next sp before 3-dc group, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 sp, [shell in sp before next shell] across to last sp before last 3-dc group, shell in last sp before 3-dc group, sk next 2 dc, 3 dc in last dc, turn.

Rows 8–37: [Rep row 7] 30 times or desired length, working 1 shell inc each side of center and (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in center ch-1 sp. Fasten off.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

PATTERN STITCH

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 2: Rep row 1.

Row 3: Ch 1, [sc in next st, sk next st, 3 dc in next st, sk next st] across, ending with sc in last st, turn.

Row 4: Rep row 3.

PULLOVER

BACK

Row 1 (WS): With size H hook, ch 66 [70, 78, 86, 94, 102], sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (65 [69, 77, 85, 93, 101] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3: Work row 3 of Pattern Stitch. (16 [17, 19, 21, 23, 25] 3-dc groups, 17 [18, 20, 22, 24, 26] sc)

Row 4: Rep row 3 of Pattern Stitch.

Rep rows 1–4 of Pattern Stitch consecutively until Back measures 12½ [13, 13½, 14, 14½, 15] inches or desired length.

Armhole Shaping

Sl st across first 4 sts, ch 1, continue in Pattern Stitch across, leaving last 4 sts unworked, turn. (57 [61, 69, 77, 85, 93] sts)

Continue in Pattern Stitch until Armhole Shaping measures 8½ [9, 9, 9½, 9½, 10] inches, ending with sc row. Fasten off.

FRONT

Work as for Back until Armhole Shaping measures 3½ [4, 4, 4½, 4½, 5] inches.

First Neck Shaping

Ch 1, work in Pattern Stitch across 21 [23, 27, 31, 35, 38] sts, turn.

Sizes Small & Medium Only

Continue in Pattern Stitch, dec 1 st at neck edge every 4th row 4 times. (17 [19] sts)

Sizes Large, X-Large & 3X-Large Only

Continue in Pattern Stitch, dec 1 st at neck edge every row twice, and then every 3rd row 4 times. (21, 25, 32] sts)

Size 2X-Large Only

Continue in Pattern Stitch, dec 1 st at neck edge every row 3 times, and then every 3rd row 4 times. (28] sts)

All Sizes

Work until Armhole Shaping measures 8½ [9, 9, 9½, 9½, 10] inches, ending with sc row. Fasten off.

2nd Neck Shaping

Sk center 15 [15, 15, 15, 17] sts (for Neck opening) **join** (see Pattern Notes) in next st and rep as for First Neck Shaping.

SLEEVE

Make 2.

Row 1: Ch 32 [32, 32, 34, 34, 34], sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (31 [31, 31, 33, 33, 33] sc)

Continue in Pattern Stitch and inc 1 st each side edge of Sleeve 14 [15, 15, 17, 17, 18] times every 3rd row until 59 [61, 61, 67, 67, 69] sts.

Work even in Pattern Stitch until Sleeve measures 14 [14, 14, 14½, 14½, 15] inches or desired length, ending with sc row.

Armhole Shaping

Sl st across first 4 sts, ch 1, continue in Pattern Stitch across, leaving last 4 sts unworked, turn. (51 [53, 53, 59, 59, 61] sts)

The classic vest gets an updated look when crocheted in open V-stitches and a beautiful self-striping yarn!



Sized to 3X

When counting stitches, each shell and each V-st count as 3 stitches (ch-1 space of V-st counts as 1 stitch).

When there are insufficient stitches to complete a shell or V-st due to shaping, dc in each available st and space until stitch pattern can be resumed.

Single crochet join (sc join):

Double crochet decrease (dc dec -see Stitch Guide) in last 2 stitches. (One stitch decreased)

Beginning double decrease (bdd): Ch 2, dc dec in next 2 stitches. (Two stitches decreased)

Ending double decrease (edd): Dc dec in last 3 stitches. (Two stitches decreased).

PATTERN

Row 1 (RS): Dc in 4th ch (3 sk chs count as dc) from hook, dc in each of next 2 chs, *sk next ch, V-st (see Special Stitches) in next ch, sk next ch, dc in each of next 3 chs, rep from * across, dc in last ch, turn.

Row 2 (WS): Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), sk next dc, V-st in next dc, *sk next 2 dc, shell (see Special Stitches) in ch-1 sp of next V-st, sk next 2 dc, V-st in next st, rep from * across, sk next dc, dc in last st, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, *shell in ch-1 sp of next V-st**, V-st in center dc of

next shell, rep from * across ending last rep at **, dc in last st, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, *V-st in center dc of next shell**, shell in ch-1 sp of next V-st, rep from * across ending last rep at **, dc in last st, turn.

Rep rows 3 and 4 for pattern.

VEST

BODY

Row 1 (RS): With size I hook, ch 133 [151, 163, 181, 193, 211] work pattern row 1. (131 [149, 161, 179, 191, 209] sts)

Row 2 (WS): Work pattern row 2. (22 [25, 27, 30, 32, 35] V-sts, 21 [24, 26, 29, 31, 34] shells, 2 dc)

Rows 3-30 [3-29, 3-29, 3-28, 3-28, 3-27]: (Rep pattern rows 3 and 4) 14 [13, 13, 13, 13, 12] times, then (rep row 3) 0 [1, 1, 0, 0, 1] time(s).

RIGHT FRONT ARMHOLE AND NECK SHAPING

Sizes Small, X-large & 2X-large only

Row 31 [29, 29]: Bsd (see Special Stitches), work across next 24 [34, 35] sts, edd (see Special Stitches), turn. (26 [36, 37] sts)

Row 32 [30, 30]: Bdd (see Special Stitches), work across to last 2 sts, esd (see Special Stitches), turn. (23 [33, 34] sts)

Row 33 [31, 31]: Bsd, work across to last 3 sts, edd, turn. (20 [30, 31] sts)

Sizes X-large and 2X-large only

Row [32]: Bdd (see Special Stitches), work across to last 2 sts, esd (see Special Stitches), turn. (27 [28] sts)

Row [33]: Bsd (see Special Stitches), work across to last 3 sts, edd (see Special Stitches), turn. (24 [25] sts)

Sizes Small, X-large & 2X-large only

Rows 34-44 [34-45, 34-46]: Continue as established decreasing one st at neck edge every row 9 [8, 9] more times until 11 [16, 16] sts rem, then work 2 [4, 4] rows even.

Row [31, 31, 29]: Bdd, work across to last 2 sts, esd, turn. ([26, 29, 36] sts)

Row [32, 32, 30]: Bsd, work across to last 3 sts, edd, turn. ([23, 26, 33] sts)

Sizes Large & 3X-large only

Row [33, 31]: Bdd, work across to last 2 sts, esd, turn. ([23, 30] sts)

Size 3X-large only

Row [32]: Bsd, work across to last 3 sts, edd, turn. ([27] sts)

Row [33]: Bdd, work across to last 2 sts, esd, turn. ([24] sts)

Sizes Medium, Large and 3X-large only

Rows [33-44, 34-45, 34-46]: Continue as established decreasing 1 st at neck edge every row 9 [8, 8] more times until 14 [15, 16] sts rem, work 3 [4, 5] rows even.

Row [45, 46, 47]: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each sp across, fasten off. ([14, 15, 16] sts)

BACK

On Cape, Rows 24–34 form the Armhole openings.

CAPE

Row 1 (WS): Starting at neckline, ch 50, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (49 sc)

Row 2 (RS): Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each of next 5 sc, 3 dc

in next sc, dc in each of next 6 sc, 3 dc in next sc, dc in each of next 21 sc, 3 dc in next sc, dc in each of next 6 sc, 3 dc in next sc, dc in each of next 6 sc, turn. (57 dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in each dc to center dc of 3-dc group, *3 dc in center dc**, dc in each dc to center dc of next 3-dc group, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, dc in each rem dc across, turn. (65 dc)

Row 4: Rep row 3. (73 dc)

Row 5: Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next dc, dc in next dc, *ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc**, rep from * to center dc of 3-dc group, 3 dc in center dc, dc in next dc, rep from * to ** to next 3-dc group, dc in next dc, 3 dc in center dc, dc in next dc, rep from * to ** to 3-dc group, dc in next dc, 3 dc in center dc, dc in next dc, rep from * to ** across, turn. (81 sts)

Row 6: Ch 3, dc in each ch-1 sp and each dc across, working 3 dc in center dc of each 3-dc group, turn. (89 dc)

Rows 7 & 8: Rep row 3. (105 sts)

Rows 9–20: [Rep rows 5–8 consecutively] 3 times. (201 sts)

Rows 21–23: Rep rows 5–7. (225 sts)

LEFT FRONT

Row 24: Ch 3, dc in each st to first 3-dc group, dc in next st, turn, leaving rem sts unworked. (28 dc)

Row 25: Ch 4, sk next dc, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] across to last st, dc in last st, turn.

Row 26: Ch 3, dc in each ch-1 sp and dc in each dc across, turn.

Rows 27 & 28: Ch 3, dc in each st across, turn.

Rows 29–32: Rep rows 25–28 consecutively.

Rows 33 & 34: Rep rows 25 and 26. At the end of row 34, fasten off.

BACK

Row 24: Sk next st on row 23, join (see *Pattern Notes*) in next st, ch 3, [dc in each st to center dc of 3-dc group, 3 dc in center dc] twice, dc in each st to next 3-dc group, dc in next st, turn. (172 dc)

Row 25: Ch 4, sk next st, dc in next st, *ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] across to center dc of 3-dc group, 3 dc in center dc, dc in next st, rep from * once, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] across, turn.

Row 26: Ch 3, dc in each dc and each ch-1 sp across, working 3 dc in center dc of each 3-dc group, turn.

Rows 27 & 28: Ch 3, dc in each st across, working 3 dc in center dc of each 3-dc group, turn.

Rows 29–32: Rep rows 25–28 consecutively.

Rows 33 & 34: Rep rows 25 and 26. At the end of row 34, fasten off.

RIGHT FRONT

Row 24: Sk next st on row 23, join in next st, ch 3, dc in each st across, turn. (28 dc)

Rows 25–34: Rep rows 25–34 of Left Front. At the end of row 34, do not fasten off, turn.

JOINING

Row 35: Ch 3, dc in next 28 dc across Right Front, dc in first st of Back, place stitch marker between last st on Right Front and first st on Back, dc across, working 3 dc in center dc of 3-dc groups, work dc in st on Left Front, place stitch marker between last st on back and first

st on Left Front, dc in each rem st across, turn.

Row 36: Ch 3, dc in each st across to marker, work 3 dc in marked st, dc in next st across working 3 dc in center dc of each 3-dc group across to next marker, work 3 dc in marked st, dc in each rem st across, turn, remove markers.

Rows 37–40: Rep rows 5–8. At the end of row 40, fasten off.

CAPE EDGING

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join yarn at center back neck, sc across to left neck edge, 3 sc in corner, sc evenly down Left Front to bottom left corner, work 3 sc in corner, sc across bottom, working 3 sc in center dc of each 3-dc group to right corner, work 3 sc in corner, sc evenly up Right Front to right neck edge, work 3 sc in corner, sc across back of neck, join in beg sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, [sc in each sc to center sc of corner, 3 sc in corner] twice, sc across bottom edge, 3 sc in center sc of 3-sc group in corner, sc up Right Front to 2 sc before center corner sc, ch 3, sk 2 sc (buttonhole made), 3 sc in center corner st, sc in each rem sc across, join in beg sc.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, [sc in each sc to center corner sc, 3 sc in center corner sc] around until ch-3 sp of buttonhole, work 4 sc in ch-3 sp of buttonhole, sc in next st, 3 sc in next st, sc in each rem sc, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Sew button to Left Front of Cape opposite buttonhole.

ARMHOLE EDGING

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join yarn in side edge of row 34 of opening, ch 1, work 54 sc evenly sp around Armhole opening, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rep rnd 1 on rem Armhole opening. CW

- Size M/13/9mm crochet hook
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

10 sts = 4 inches; 10 rows = 4 inches in pattern stitch with size K hook
 Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first extended single crochet unless otherwise stated.

Body of garment is worked in 1 piece beginning at lower back, separating into left and right fronts at neck. Sleeves are worked onto body and worked from the

top down. Front pieces will seem narrow until wide collar is added across neck edges.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Single crochet join (sc join):

Place slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo and pull up a lp, yo and draw through both lps on hook.

Extended single crochet (ext sc):

Insert hook in indicated st or sp, yo, draw lp through, yo, draw through 1 lp on hook, yo, draw through both lps on hook.

Long extended single crochet (lng ext sc):

Insert hook in next st 2 rows below, yo, draw lp through pulling lp up to height of current row, yo, draw through 1 lp on hook, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook.

PATTERN STITCH

Row 1 (WS): Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), ***ext sc** (see *Special Stitches*) in **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each of next 3 sts**, sc in next st, rep from * across ending last rep at **, ext sc in both lps of last st, turn.

Row 2 (RS): Ch 2, sk first st, *ext sc in front lp of each of next 3 sts**, **lng ext sc** (see *Special Stitches*) in next st 2 rows below, rep from * across ending last rep at **, ext sc in last st.

Row 3: Ch 2, ext sc in front lp of next st, *sc in next st**, ext sc in front lp of each of next 3 sts, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, ext sc in front lp of next st, ext sc in both lps of last st, turn.

Row 4: Ch 2, ext sc in front lp of next st, *lng ext sc in next st 2 rows below**, ext sc in front lp of each of next 3 sts, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, ext sc in front lp of next st, ext sc in both lps of last st, turn.

CARDI

BODY

Row 1 (RS): Beg at lower back with size M hook, ch 50 [54, 62, 66, 70, 74], working in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each ch, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across to last ch, sc through both lps of last ch, turn. Change to size K hook. (49 [53, 61, 65, 69, 73] sts)

Rows 2–77 [2–77, 2–77, 2–79, 2–79, 2–79]: With size K hook, [work rows 1–4 of pattern stitch] 19 times, then [rep rows 1 and 2] 0 [0, 0, 1, 1, 1] time(s).

LEFT FRONT

Row 78 [78, 78, 80, 80, 80]: Maintaining established pattern, work even across first 17 [19, 23, 25, 27, 29] sts, turn, leaving rem sts unworked.

Rows 79–153 [79–153, 79–153, 81–157, 81–157, 81–157]: Work even in established pattern.

At end of last row, do not fasten off.

SIDE EDGING

Change to size M hook; working across long edge of piece, ch 1, sc in each row end across. (153 [153, 153, 157, 157, 157] sts)

Fasten off.

RIGHT FRONT

Row 78 [78, 78, 80, 80, 80]: With WS facing, using size K hook, sk center 15 sts to left of Left Front for back neck, **sc join** (see *Special Stitches*) in next st, ch 1, work even in established pattern across next 16 [18, 22, 24, 26, 28] sts, turn. (17 [19, 23, 25, 27, 29] sts)

Rows 79–153 [79–153, 79–153, 81–157, 81–157, 81–157]: Work even in established pattern. Fasten off.

Side Edging

With RS facing, working across long edge of piece, with size

M hook, sc join at lower right-hand corner of right front, sc in each row end across. (153 [153, 153, 157, 157, 157] sts) Fasten off.

SLEEVE

Row 1: With WS facing, using size K hook, sk first 52 sts of side edging, sc join in next st, ch 1 (*counts as beg ch-2*), continue pattern row 1 across next 48 [48, 48, 52, 52, 52] sts, turn. (49 [49, 49, 53, 53, 53] sts)

Rows 2–26 [2–26, 2–24, 2–24, 2–22, 2–22]: Work pattern rows 2–4, then [rep pattern rows 1–4] 5 [5, 5, 5, 4, 4] times, then [rep pattern rows 1 and 2] 1 [1, 0, 0, 1, 1] times(s). Change to size M hook.

Row 27 [27, 25, 25, 23, 23]: With size M hook, ch 1, sc in first st, *ch 2, sk next st, sc in next st, rep from * across, turn. (24 [24, 24, 26, 26, 26] ch-2 sps, 25 [25, 25, 27, 27, 27] sc)

Row 28 [28, 26, 26, 24, 24]: Ch 1, sc in first sc, sc in next sp, *ch 2, sk next sc, sc in next sp, rep from * across, ending with sc in last sc, turn.

Row 29 [29, 27, 27, 25, 25]: Ch 1, sc in first st, *ch 2, sk next st**, sc in next sp, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in last st, turn.

Rows 30 & 31 [30 & 31, 28 & 29, 28 & 26 & 27, 26 & 27]: Rep last 2 rows.

Row 32 [32, 30, 30, 28, 28]: Ch 1, sc in first st, 2 sc in each sp across, sc in last st. Fasten off.

Rep for 2nd sleeve.

COLLAR

Row 1 (RS): With size M hook, sc join at bottom edge of right front edge, [ch 2, sk next row, sc in next row] 37 [37, 37, 38, 38, 38] times, ch 2, sk next row, working across back neck, sc in first st, [ch 2, sk next st, sc in next st] 7 times, ch 2, working across left front, sk first

- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers: 12
- 16-inch diameter round pillow form

GAUGE

WS measurement: 3 tr = 1 inch;
3 tr rnds = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Do not join rounds unless otherwise indicated.

Place stitch marker in back loop of first stitch of all half double crochet and treble crochet rounds to mark beginning first stitch, and move marker to first stitch of next round as work progresses.

Increase rnd (inc rnd): Working in back of indicated st, insert hook in horizontal bar directly below top lps.

Rnd 2: [Ch 3, sk next 2 sts, sl st in front lp of next st] 4 times. (4 ch-3 lps)

Rnd 3: [(Sc, hdc, 3 dc, ch 2, sc around post of last dc—leaf tip made, 2 dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-3 lp] 4 times. (4 leaves)

Rnd 4: Working in **horizontal back bar** (see illustration) of hdc sts 3 rnds below, 2 tr in each st around. (24 tr)

Rnd 5: Rep rnd 2. (8 ch-3 lps)

Rnd 6: Rep rnd 3. (8 leaves)

Rnd 7: **Inc rnd** (see Special Stitch), work 2 tr in first st, tr in next st, [2 tr in next st, tr in next st] around. (36 tr)

Rnd 8: Rep rnd 2. (12 ch-3 lps)

Rnd 9: Rep rnd 3. (12 leaves)

Rnd 10: **Inc rnd:** 2 tr in first st, tr in each of next 2 sts, [2 tr in next st, tr in each of next 2 sts] around. (48 tr)

Rnds 11 & 12: Rep rnds 2 and 3. (16 leaves)

Rnd 13: **Inc rnd:** 2 tr in first st, tr in each of next 3 sts, [2 tr in next st, tr in each of next 3 sts] around. (60 tr)

Rnds 14 & 15: Rep rnds 2 and 3. (20 leaves)

Rnd 16: **Inc rnd:** Tr in each of next 2 sts, [2 tr in next st, tr in each of next 4 sts] 11 times, 2 tr in next st, tr in each of next 2 sts. (72 sts)

Rnds 17 & 18: Rep rnds 2 and 3. (24 leaves)

Rnd 19: **Inc rnd:** 2 tr in first st, tr in each of next 5 sts, [2 tr in next st, tr in each of next 5 sts] around. (84 tr)

Rnds 20 & 21: Rep rnds 2 and 3. (28 leaves)

Rnd 22: **Inc rnd:** Tr in each of next 3 sts, [2 tr in next st, tr in each of next 6 sts] around to last 4 sts, 2 tr in next st, tr in each of next 3 sts. (96 tr)

Rnds 23 & 24: Rep rnds 2 and 3. (32 leaves)

Rnd 25: **Inc rnd:** 2 tr in first st, tr in each of next 7 sts, [2 tr in next st, tr in each of next 7 sts] around. (108 tr)

Rnds 26 & 27: Rep rnds 2 and 3. (36 leaves)

Rnd 28: **Inc rnd:** Tr in each of next 4 sts, [2 tr in next st, tr in

each of next 8 sts] around to last 5 sts, 2 tr in next st, tr in each of next 4 sts. (120 tr)

Rnds 29 & 30: Rep rnds 2 and 3. (40 leaves)

Rnd 31: **Inc rnd:** 2 tr in first st, tr in each of next 9 sts, [2 tr in next st, tr in each of next 9 sts] around. (132 tr)

Rnds 32 & 33: Rep rnds 2 and 3. At the end of rnd 33, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (44 leaves)

ASSEMBLY

With RS facing block Pillow pieces, arranging leaves to lie smooth and flat. Let dry completely.

With Pillow pieces WS tog and working through both layers of sts of rnd 31, sl st join unworked back lp of any tr of first layer to front facing lp of any tr of back layer, sl st in same manner in each st around inserting pillow form before closing. Fasten off. (132 sl sts)

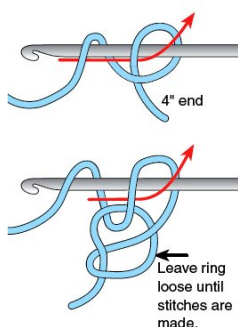

Rnd 5: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (30 sc)

Rnd 6: [Sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (36 sc)

Rnd 7: [Sc in each of next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (42 sc)

Rnd 8: [Sc in each of next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (48 sc)

Rnd 9: [Sc in each of next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (54 sc)

Rnd 10: [Sc in each of next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (60 sc)

Rnd 11: [Sc in each of next 9 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (66 sc)

Rnd 12: [Sc in each of next 10 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (72 sc)

Rnd 13: [Sc in each of next 11 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (78 sc)

Rnd 14: [Sc in each of next 12 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (84 sc)

Rnd 15: [Sc in each of next 13 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (90 sc)

Rnd 16: [Sc in each of next 14 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (96 sc)

Rnd 17: [Sc in each of next 15 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (102 sc)

Rnd 18: [Sc in each of next 16 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (108 sc)

Rnd 19: [Sc in each of next 17 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (114 sc)

Side

Rnd 1: Working in **back lp only** (see *Stitch Guide*) of sts for this rnd only, sc in each st around.

Rnds 2–12: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 13: Working in back lp only of sts, sc in each of next 3 sts, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in each of next 5 sts] around to last 3 sts, ch 1, sk next st, sc in each of next 2 sts.

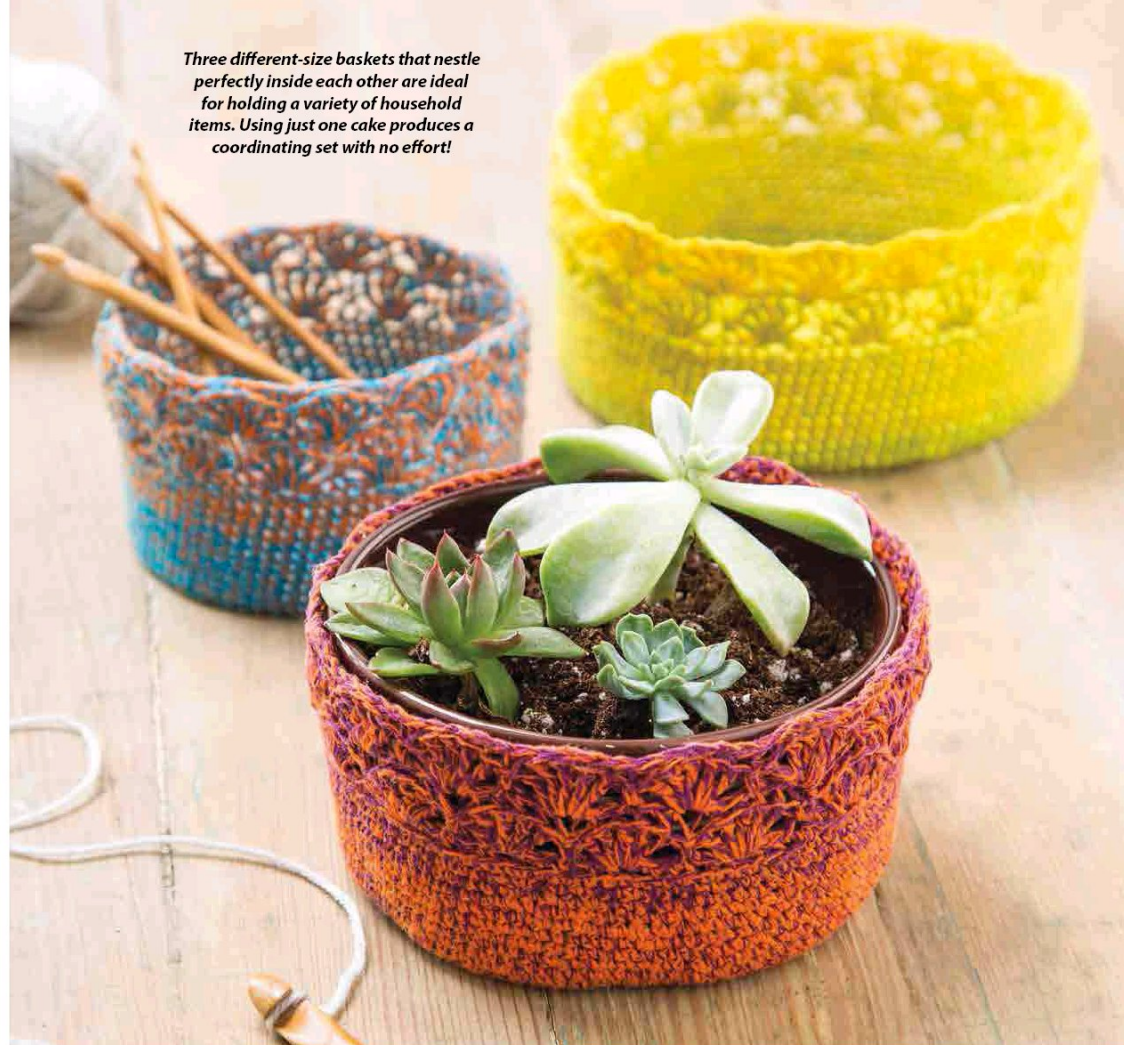
Rnd 14: [Sc in next sc, sk next 2 sc, **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-1 sp, sk next 2 sc] around, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. (19 shells)

Rnd 15: Ch 2, working in back lp only of sts, sc in each of next 5 tr, [ch 1, sc in each of next 5 tr] around, ending with sl st in ch-2 sp at beg of rnd.

Rnd 16: **Beg shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in ch-2 sp, sk next 2 sc, sc in next sc, sk next 2 sc, [shell in next ch-1 sp, sk next 2 sc, sc in next sc, sk next 2 sc] around, ending with 2 tr in same ch as beg shell, join in 4th ch of beg ch-4.

Rnd 17: Ch 1, working in back lp only of sts, sc in each of next 3 tr, sk next sc, [sc in each of next 5 tr, sk next sc] around, ending with sc in each of rem 2 tr, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Row 1 (RS): Change to N/P hook, ch 1, working in back lps, sk first st, (sc, dc) in next st, *sk next st, (sc, dc) in next st, rep from * across. Turn. (16 sc, 16 dc)

Rows 2-34: Ch 1, sk first st, (sc, dc) in next st, *sk next st, (sc, dc) in next st, rep from * across. Turn.

2ND SL ST SECTION

Row 1 (RS): Change to 12mm crochet hook, ch 1, working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sl st in each st across. Turn. (32 sl sts)

Rows 2-9: Ch 1, working in back lps, sl st in each st across. Turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

FINISHING

Block to finished measurements, if desired.

Looped single crochet (lp sc): Insert hook in indicated st and in ch-7 lp 2 rows below, yo, pull up a lp, yo, draw through both lps on hook.

THROW

Row 1: Ch 122, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 2 chs, *ch 7, sk next 3 chs, sc in each of next 5 chs; rep from * across, sc in each of last 3 chs, turn. (76 sc, 15 ch-7 lps)

Row 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each of next 2 sts, *working behind next ch-7 lp, tr in each of next 3 sk chs**, dc in each of next 5 dc; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, dc in each of last 3 sts, turn. (45 tr, 76 dc)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, *ch 7, sk next 3 sts, lp sc (see Special Stitch) in next st, ch 7, sk next 3 sts, sc in next st; rep from * across, working last sc in top of beg ch-3, turn. (16 sc, 15 lp sc, 30 ch-7 lps)

Row 4: Ch 3, *working behind next ch-7 lp, tr in each of next 3 sk sts 2 rows below, dc in next sc; rep from * across, turn. (90 tr, 31 dc)


Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, *lp sc in next st, ch 7, sk next 3 sts, lp sc in next st**, sc in each of next 3 sts; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in next st, sc in top of beg ch-3, turn. (46 sc, 15 lp sc, 15 ch-7 lps)

Row 6: Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 sts, *working behind next ch-7 lp, tr in each of next 3 sk sts 2 rows below**, dc in each of next 5 sc; rep from * across, ending last rep at **, dc in each of last 3 sts, turn. (45 tr, 76 dc)

Rep rows 3-6 until throw measures 60 inches, ending with row 4.

Last row: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, lp sc in next st, *sc in each of next 3 sts, lp sc in next st; rep from * across to last 2 sts, sc in each of last 2 sts. Fasten off. (91 sc, 30 lp sc)

FINISHING

Block lightly, if desired.

Each row in Tunisian crochet consists of a forward pass where stitches are picked up and a return pass where stitches are worked off the hook.

The loop remaining on hook at end of return pass is first stitch of following row.

Right side of work is always facing.

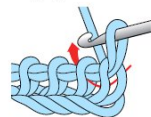

Row 2 return: Yo, draw through first lp, *[yo, draw through 2 lps] until 2 lps rem before marked lp, yo, draw through 4 lps (marked st

will become center in cl of 3 vertical bars), rep from * until 1 lp rem. (1 lp on hook)

Row 3 return: Rep row 2 return.

Rows 4–57: Rep row 3 and row 3 return, noting that there will be 2 fewer sts on hook at the end of forward pass of each row.

Row 58: Pick up lp under horizontal bar at top of cl, work end st. (3 sts)

Row 58 return: Yo, draw through all 3 lps. Fasten off.

LOWER PILLOW FRONT

Make 1.

Work as for Pillow Back through row 34 return.

Bind off: [sl st as if to rev TSS under next st] 23 times, sl st under horizontal bar at top of cl, [sl st as if to rev TSS under next st] 23 times, sl st as if to work end st under final st. Fasten off.



UPPER PILLOW FRONT

Make 1.

Row 1: Using crochet cast on, cast on 65 sts. (65 sts)

Row 1 return: Yo, draw through first lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps] 30 times, yo, draw through 4 lps, [yo, draw through 2 lps] 31 times. (1 lp on hook)

Row 2: [Rev TSS under next st] 30 times, pick up lp under horizontal bar at the top of cl (mark this lp), [rev TSS under next st] 30 times, work end st. (63 sts)

Row 2 return: Yo, draw through first lp, *yo, draw through 2 lps, rep from * until 2 lps rem before marked lp, yo, draw through 4 lps (marked st will become center 1 in a cl of 3 vertical bars), rep from * until 1 lp rem. (1 lp on hook)

Row 3: *Rev TSS under next st, rep from * until cl, pick up lp under horizontal bar at top of cl (move marker to this lp on hook), rep from * until 1 st rem, work end st. (2 fewer sts than previous row forward pass)

Row 3 return: Rep row 2 return.

Row 4: Rep row 3.

Row 5 buttonhole row: * [Rev TSS under next st] 13 times, yo, sk next st, [rev TSS under next st] 13 times*, yo, sk cl (mark the yo), rep from * to *, work end st. (57 sts)

Row 5 return: Rep row 2 return.

Rows 6–30: Rep row 3 and row 3 return, noting that there will be 2 fewer sts on hook at the end of forward pass of each row.

Row 31: Pick up lp under horizontal bar at top of cl, work end st. (3 sts)

Row 31 return: Yo, draw through all 3 lps. Fasten off.

FINISHING

With WS facing, place Lower Front on Back, place Upper Front on Back, (Upper Front will overlap Lower Front for 8 rows; if necessary use locking st markers to keep everything in place).

Joining & Edging

Rnd 1: With RS facing, working through both layers, join yarn in bottom corner, ch 1, 3 sc in same place as beg ch-1, sc in opposite side of each ch or end of row around, working through all 3 layers at overlap area, placing 3 sc in each corner, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, **reverse sc** (see Stitch Guide) in each st around, join in beg reverse sc. Fasten off.

THROW

SQUARE A

Used for first Square only.

Row 1: Working **crochet cast on** (see Special Stitches), cast on 34 sts. (34 sts)

Row 1 return: Yo, draw through first lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps] 15 times, yo, draw through 3 lps, [yo, draw through 2 lps] 16 times. (1 lp on hook)

Row 2: [Rev TSS (see Special Stitches) under next st] 15 times,



pick up a lp under horizontal bar at top of cl (at top of 4-lp cl formed in previous row return mark this lp with locking marker), [rev TSS under next st] 15 times, work end st (see Special Stitches). (33 sts)

Row 2 return: Yo, draw through first lp, *yo, draw through 2 lps, rep from * until 2 lps rem before marked lp, yo, draw through 4 lps (marked st will become center in cl of 3 vertical bars), rep from * until 1 lp rem. (1 lp on hook)

Row 3: *Rev TSS under next st, rep from * until cl, pick up lp under horizontal bar at top of cl (move marker to this lp on hook), rep from * until 1 st rem, work end st. (2 fewer sts than previous row forward pass)

Row 3 return: Rep row 2 return.

Rows 4–16: Rep row 3 and row 3 return, noting that there will be 2 fewer sts on hook at end of forward pass of each row.

Row 17: Pick up lp under horizontal bar at top of cl, work end st. (3 sts)

Row 17 return: Yo, draw through all 3 lps, **do not fasten off** (see Pattern Notes) unless this is the last Square in the strip; **do not fasten off** at the end of final strip. (Fasten off only at end of Squares 9, 18, 27, 36, 45, 54, 63 and 72).

SQUARE B

Used when there is a finished Square below but no Square to the left.

Row 1: Working in ends of rows, sk final row of current Square, pick up lp in end of each rem row along left edge of current Square (17 sts), sl standard crochet hook under final st on Tunisian hook, ch 1 (this replaces the slip knot to beg crochet cast on), cast on 17 sts. (34 sts)

Row 1 return–row 17 return: Work as for Square A.

SQUARE C

Used when there is no Square below, but there is a Square to the left.

Row 1: Using crochet cast on, cast on 17 sts, working in ends of rows along right edge of Square to the left, pick up lp in end of each row. (34 sts)

Row 1 return–row 17 return: Work as for Square A.

SQUARE D

Used when there is a Square below and a Square to the left.

Row 1: Working in ends of rows, sk final row of current Square, pick up lp in end of each rem row

along left edge of current Square (17 sts), working in ends of rows along right edge of Square to the left, pick up lp in end of each row. (34 sts)

Row 1 return–row 17 return: Work as for Square A.

Edging

Rnd 1: Transfer final lp on Tunisian hook to standard hook; working in ends of rows or opposite side of foundation chs, sc in each st around, working 3 sc in each corner.

Rnds 2 & 3: Sc in each sc around, working 3 sc in center sc of each corner.

Rnd 4: Ch 1, **reverse sc** (see Stitch Guide) in each sc around, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Block Pillow and Throw to measurements.

Contrast Color can be worked as it comes off the cake; to duplicate single-color bands as shown in photograph, begin each repeat of rounds 22–29 at beginning of next color.



Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

In round 21, work over Contrast Color for added stability to Basket Sides.

Rnd 1: With MC, ch 11, (sc, ch 2, sc) in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 8 chs, [sc, ch 2, sc] twice in last ch, working in opposite side of beg ch, sc in each of next 8 chs, (sc, ch 2, sc) in last ch, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. (24 sc, 4 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in same st as join, *(sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp, sc in each of next 10 sts, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp*, sc in each of next 2 sts, rep between *, sc in next st, join in beg sc. (32 sc, 4 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in same st as join, sc in next st, *(sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp, sc in each of next 12 sts, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp*, sc in each of next 4 sts, rep between *, sc in each of next 2 sts, join in beg sc. (40 sc, 4 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in same st as join, *sc in each st around to next ch-2 sp, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp, rep from * around, sc in each rem st, join in beg sc. (48 sc, 4 ch-2 sps)

Rnds 5–19: Rep rnd 4. (168 sc, 4 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 20: Ch 1, sc in same st as join, *sc in each st around to next ch-2 sp, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, rep from * around, sc in each rem st, join in beg sc. (176 sc)

BASKET SIDES

Rnd 21: Working with MC, **carrying CC** (see *Pattern Notes*) across WS, ch 1, working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in same st as join, sc in each st around, join in beg sc.

Rnd 22: With MC, ch 1, working in back lps, sc in same st as join, sc in each of next 3 sts, ***change color** (see *Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*) to CC, sc in next st, change color to MC**, sc in each of next 7 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, sc in each of last 3 sts, join in beg sc.

Rnd 23: With MC, ch 1, working in back lps, sc in same st as join, sc in each of next 2 sts, *change color to CC, sc in each of next 3 sts, change color to MC**, sc in each of next 5 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, sc in each of last 2 sts, join in beg sc.

Rnd 24: With MC, ch 1, working in back lps, sc in same st as join, sc in next st, *change color to CC, sc in each of next 5 sts, change color to MC**, sc in each of next 3 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, sc in last st, join in beg sc.

Using one solid color alternated with a long-stripping yarn gives this basket its complicated look. Simple tapestry crochet makes the basket sturdy and practical too.



Rnd 25: With MC, ch 1, working in back lps, sc in same st as join, *change color to CC, sc in each of next 7 sts**, change color to MC, sc in next st, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc.

Rnd 26: With CC, ch 1, working in back lps, sc in same st as join, sc in each of next 3 sts, *change color to MC, sc in next st, change color to CC**, sc in each of next 7 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, sc in each of last 3 sts, join in beg sc.

Rnd 27: With CC, ch 1, working in back lps, sc in same st as join, sc in each of next 2 sts, *change color to MC, sc in each of next 3 sts, change color to CC**, sc in each of next 5 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, sc in each of last 2 sts, join in beg sc.

Rnd 28: With CC, ch 1, working in back lps, sc in same st as join, sc in next st, *change color to MC, sc in each of next 5 sts, change color to CC**, sc in each of next 3 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, sc in last st, join in beg sc.

Rnd 29: With CC, ch 1, working in back lps, sc in same st as join, *change color to MC, sc in each of next 7 sts**, change color to CC, sc in next st, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc.

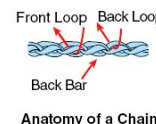
Rnds 30–53: [Rep rnds 22–29] 3 times. Fasten off CC after last rnd.

Rnd 54: With MC, ch 1, working in back lps, sc in same st as join, sc in each st around, join in beg sc.

Rnd 55 (RS): Ch 1, working in both lps, sc in same st as join, sc in each of next 35 sts, ch 16, sk next 16 sc, sc in each of next 72 sts,

Rnd 56 (WS): Ch 1, sc in same st as join, sc in each of next 35 sts, sc in **front lp** (see *illustration*) of each of next 16 chs, sc in each of next 72 sts, sc in front lp of each of next 16 sc, sc in each rem st, join in beg sc.



Rnd 57 (WS): Ch 1, sc in same st as join, sc in each rem st around, join in beg sc, **turn**.

Rnd 58 (RS): Ch 1, sc in same st as join, sc in each st around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. ■

Row 1 (RS): With rainforest stripe, ch 4, 4 dc in 4th ch from hook (3 sk chs count as dc), mark as RS, turn. (5 dc)

Row 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), sk first st, **shell** (see Special Stitches) between previous and next st, sk 3 dc, shell between previous and next st, dc in last dc, turn. (2 shells, 2 dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, sk first st, shell between previous and next st, sk next shell, shell in next sp, sk next shell, shell between last 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (3 shells, 2 dc)

Row 4: Ch 3, shell between first 2 sts, (sk next shell, shell in next sp) twice, sk next shell, shell between last 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (4 shells, 2 dc)

Row 5: Ch 3, shell between first 2 sts, (sk next shell, shell in next sp) 3 times, sk next shell, shell between last 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (5 shells, 2 dc)

Row 6: Ch 3, shell between first 2 sts, (sk next shell, shell in next sp) 4 times, sk next shell, shell between last 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (6 shells, 2 dc)

Row 7: Ch 3, shell between first 2 sts, (sk next shell, shell in next sp) 5 times, sk next shell, shell between last 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (7 shells, 2 dc)

Row 8: Ch 3, shell between first 2 sts, (sk next shell, shell in next sp) 6 times, sk next shell, shell between last 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (8 shells, 2 dc)

Row 9: Ch 3, shell between first 2 sts, (sk next shell, shell in next sp) 7 times, sk next shell, dc in last st, turn.

Row 10: Ch 3, sk first shell, (shell in next sp, sk next shell) 7 times, shell between last 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.

Rows 11–70: (Rep rows 9 and 10) 30 times.

Row 71: Ch 3, sk first shell, (shell in next sp, sk next shell) 7 times, dc in last st, turn. (7 shells, 2 dc)

Row 72: Ch 3, sk first shell, (shell in next sp, sk next shell) 6 times, dc in last st, turn. (6 shells, 2 dc)

Row 73: Ch 3, sk first shell, (shell in next sp, sk next shell) 5 times, dc in last st, turn. (5 shells, 2 dc)

Row 74: Ch 3, sk first shell, (shell in next sp, sk next shell) 4 times, dc in last st, turn. (4 shells, 2 dc)

Row 75: Ch 3, sk first shell, (shell in next sp, sk next shell) 3 times, dc in last st, turn. (3 shells, 2 dc)

Row 76: Ch 3, sk first shell, (shell in next sp, sk next shell) twice, dc in last st, turn. (2 shells, 2 dc)

Row 77: Ch 3, sk first shell, shell in next sp, sk next shell, dc in last st, turn. (1 shell, 2 dc)

Row 78: Ch 2 (counts as dc), sk shell, dc in last st. Fasten off. (2 dc)

BORDER

Border for Panels 1, 3 & 5

Rnd 1: With RS facing, **sc join** (see Special Stitches) peacock in ch at base of row 1 shell, 2 sc in same st, working in sps made by starting and ending dc around Panel, [(3 sc in next sp) 70 times, 3 sc in corner, (3 sc in next sp) 8 times], 3 sc in corner, rep between [] once, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in first st. Fasten off. (480 sc)

Row 2: Ch 3, **bp**tr (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 2 sts, sk next 2 sts, bptr around each of next 2 sts, working in front of sts just made, bptr around each of 2 sk sts, bptr around each of next 2 sts, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

COZY 1

Foundation row: With tidal, ch 12, dc in 4th ch from hook (first 3 sk chs counts as first dc) and in each ch across, turn. (10 dc)

Rows 1–18: Work rows 1 and 2 of **Celtic Weave pattern** (see *Pattern Stitch*) 9 times.

EDGING

Rnd 1: Now working in rnd and with RS facing, ch 3, **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around each st across to beg ch, dc in top of beg ch, working in ends of rows, (sc, ch 3, dc) in end of first row, sk next row, (sc, ch 3, dc) in each rem row, working in opposite side of foundation ch, sk first ch, sc in each rem ch across, working in ends of rows, (sc, ch 3, dc) in each row, sc in each of first 3 sts, ch 6, sk next 3 sts, sc in each of last 3 sts (*button lp made*), **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Last row: Now working in row, ch 1, sk first st, sl st in each of next 2 sts, 8 sc in ch-6 sp, sl st in each of last 3 sts. Fasten off.

FINISHING

With RS facing, sew button at opposite end of Cozy from button lp.

COZY 2

With winery, work same as Cozy 1 through row 18.

Row 19: Ch 3, **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around each st across, leave beg ch-3 unworked, turn. (9 dc)

Row 20: Ch 1, sc in each st across to beg ch, sc in top of beg ch-3, turn. (9 sc)

Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 9 chs, 3 sc in next ch, **mark** (see *Pattern Notes*) center st, sc in next 10 chs, 3 sc in next ch, mark center st, sc in next 24 chs, [3 sc in next ch, mark center st, sc in next 10 chs] 2 times, turn. (76 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) only, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) only, *sc in each st up to marker, 3 sc in marked st; rep from * 3 times, sc in each st across, turn. (84 sc)

Rows 4–13 [15, 17]: Rep rows 2 and 3. (124 [132, 140] sc)

SPLIT FOR BODY

Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, working in front lps only, *sc in each st up to marker, 1 [2, 3] sc in marked st, move marker to last st made, sk next 24 [26, 28] sts for armhole, 1 [2, 3] sc in next marked st, move marker to first st made in marked st; rep from * sc in each st across, turn. (76 [84, 92] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [sc2tog (see *Special Stitches*) in next 2 sts, ch 1] across to last st, sc in last st, turn. (39 [43, 47] sc, 37 [41, 45] ch-1 sps)

Rows 3–32: Ch 1, sc in first st,

[sc2tog in next ch-1 sp and sc, ch 1] across to last st, sc in last st, turn. Fasten off after last row.

SLEEVE

Rnd 1: With RS facing, working around armhole opening, **sc join** (see *Special Stitches*) around post of first marked st, sc around post of next marked st, sc in next 0 [2, 4] sts, *2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts; rep from * around, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc, turn. (32 [34, 36] sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, [sc2tog in next 2 sts, ch 1] around, join in beg sc, turn. (16 [17, 18] sc, 16 [17, 18] ch-1 sps)

Rnds 3–26 [27, 28]: Ch 1, [sc2tog in next ch-1 sp and sc, ch 1] around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 27 [28, 29]: Ch 1, [sc2tog in next ch-1 sp and sc] around, join in beg sc, turn. (16 [17, 18] sc)

Rnd 28 [29, 30]: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 29 [30, 31]: Ch 1, working in back lps only, sc in each st around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 30 [31, 32]: Ch 1, working in front lps only, sc in each st around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 31 [32, 33]: Rep rnd 29 [30, 31]. Fasten off.

Rep for other Sleeve.

HOOD

Row 1: With RS facing, working in unworked lps of foundation ch around neck opening, sc join yarn in first st, sc in each ch across, turn. (68 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [sc2tog in next 2 sts, ch 1] across to last st, sc in last st, turn. (35 sc, 33 ch-1 sps)

Rows 3–24 [26, 28]: Ch 1, sc in first st, [sc2tog in next ch-1 sp and sc, ch 1] across to last st, sc in last st, turn.

- Rnd 8:** *Sc in each of next 8 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from * around. (40 sc)
- Rnds 9–16:** Sc in each st around.
- Rnd 17:** *Sc in each of next 8 sts, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc, rep from * around. (36 sts)
- Rnd 18:** *Sc in each of next 4 sts, sc dec in next 2 sc, rep from * around. (30 sts)
- Stuff Head with fiberfill.
- Rnd 19:** *Sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sc, rep from * around. (24 sts)

- Rnd 20:** *Sc in each of next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sc, rep from * around. (18 sts)
- Rnd 21:** *Sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sc, rep from * around. Leaving 14-inch length, fasten off. (12 sts)
- Finish stuffing Head with fiberfill.

MUZZLE

- Rnd 1:** Ch 5, 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 3 chs, working on opposite side of foundation ch, 3 sc in next ch, sc in each of next 3 chs, do not join. (12 sts)
- Rnd 2:** *Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, rep from * around. (18 sts)
- Rnd 3:** *Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from * around. (24 sts)
- Rnd 4:** *Sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from * around. (30 sts)
- Rnds 5–9:** Sc in each st around. Leaving 16-inch length, fasten off at end of rnd 9.

Stuff Muzzle. Sew to lower part of Head using 16-inch length of yarn.

EAR

Make 2.

- Row 1:** Ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 4 chs, turn. (5 sts)
- Rows 2–4:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
- Row 5:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in last st, turn. (7 sts)
- Rows 6–14:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
- Row 15:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (5 sts)
- Row 16:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sc. Fasten off. (3 sts)

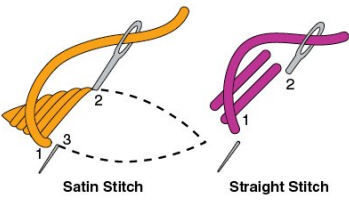
Ear Edging

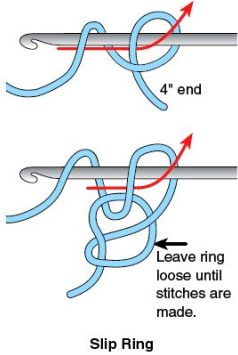

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in first dc, *fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next dc, (dc, tr, dc) in next dc, fpdc around next dc**, sc in next dc, rep from * around ending last rep at **, join in first st. (36 sts)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *fpdc around next fpdc, dc in next dc (dc, tr, dc) in next tr, dc in next dc, fpdc around next fpdc**, sc in next sc, rep from * around ending last rep at **, join in first st. (48 sts)

Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *fpdc around next fpdc, dc in next dc, fpdc around next dc, (dc, tr, dc) in next tr, fpdc around next dc, dc in next dc, fpdc around next fpdc**, sc in next sc, rep from * around

ending last rep at **, join in first st. (60 sts)

Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *fpdc around next st, dc in next dc] twice, (dc, tr, dc) in next tr, [dc in next dc, fpdc around next st] twice**, sc in next sc, rep from * around ending last rep at **, join in first st. (72 sts)

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *fpdc around next fpdc, dc in next dc] twice, fpdc around next dc, (dc, tr, dc) in next tr, fpdc around next dc, [dc in next dc, fpdc around next fpdc] twice**, sc in next sc, rep from * around ending last rep at **, join in first st. (84 sts)

Rnd 8: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *fpdc around next fpdc, dc in next dc] across to next tr, (dc, tr, dc) in next tr, [dc in next dc, fpdc around next fpdc] across to next sc**, sc in next sc, rep from * around ending last rep at **, join in first st. (96 sts)

Rnd 9: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *fpdc around next fpdc, dc in next dc] across to last dc before next tr, fpdc around next dc, (dc, tr, dc) in next tr, fpdc around next dc, [dc in next dc, fpdc around next fpdc] across to next sc**, sc in next sc, rep from * around ending last rep at **, join in first st. (108 sts)

Rnds 10–40: [Rep rnds 8 and 9] 15 times, rep rnd 8 once more. Change to pixie when Pegasus cake is finished. (480 sts)

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Block the blanket.
Make 6 pompoms and sew to the tr on each tip of the star.
Weave in all ends.

Row 1: Hdc in 3rd ch from hook (*beg 2 sk chs count as hdc*), hdc in next ch, *2 hdc in next ch, hdc in each of next 3 chs; rep from * across, turn. (73 [78, 83] hdc)

Row 2: Ch 1, working in **back lps** (*see Stitch Guide*) only, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 2 (*see Pattern Notes*), hdc in each st across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 2, hdc in each of next 2 sts, *2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 4 sts; rep from * across, turn. (87 [93, 99] hdc)

Row 5: Ch 1, working in **front lps** (*see Stitch Guide*) only, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 6: Rep row 3.

Row 7: Ch 2, hdc in each of next 1 [2, 3] st(s), *2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 4 sts; rep from * across, turn. (104 [111, 118] hdc)

Rows 8 & 9: Rep rows 2 and 3.

Row 10: Ch 2, hdc in each of next 3 [0, 7] sts, *2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 9 sts; rep from * across, turn. (114 [122, 129] hdc)

Row 11: Ch 1, working in front lps only, sc in first st, **sc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts 1 [1, 0] time(s), sc in each rem st across, turn. (113 [121, 129] sc)

BODY

Row 1: Ch 2, hdc in each of next 15 [17, 19] sts, sk next 25 sts for first armhole, hdc in each of next

31 [35, 39] sts, sk next 25 sts for 2nd armhole, hdc in each of last 16 [18, 20] sts, turn. (63 [71, 79] hdc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, sk next st, *shell (*see Special Stitches*) in next st, sk next st; rep from * across, sc in last st, turn. (2 sc, 30 [34, 38] shells)

Rows 3–28 [3–30, 3–32]: Ch 1, sc in first st, *shell in ch-1 sp of next shell; rep from * across, sc in last st, turn. Fasten off.

BUTTON BAND

Row 1: With RS facing, working in row ends of left edge, work **sc join** (*see Special Stitches*) in row 1 of yoke, sc in each row of yoke, sc in first row of body, [ch 1, sk next row, sc in next row] across body to bottom corner; turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, shell in each ch-1 sp across to yoke section, [sk next sc, shell in next sc] across to last sc of yoke, sc in last st, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, *shell in ch-1 sp of next shell; rep from * across, sc in last st, turn. Fasten off.

BUTTONHOLE BAND

Row 1: With RS facing, working in row ends of right edge, join yarn with sc in last row of body, [ch 1, sk next row, sc in next row] up to yoke, sc in each row of yoke, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [shell in next st, sk next st] 6 times, shell in each ch-1 sp across to last st, sc in last st, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, [shell in ch-1 sp of next shell] 13 [15, 7] times, [(sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-1 sp of next shell, shell in ch-1 sp of next shell] 2 times, (sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-1 sp of next shell, sc in last st, do not turn or fasten off.

Blanket: 34½ inches wide x

32 inches long

Pillow Cover: 18 inches wide x

13 inches long, without pillow insert

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand Yarn Ice Cream light (DK) weight acrylic yarn (3½ oz/394 yds/100g per ball):

5 balls #206 tutti-frutti

- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge

- Tapestry needle

- Stitch markers

- 1 (10 inches x 29 inches) piece of white fabric

- Sewing needle or machine and matching thread

- Polyester fiberfill



GAUGE

Working in pattern: [Shell, sc]

3 times = 4½ inches; 11 rows = 5 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Do not join rounds or turn unless otherwise stated. Place stitch marker at beginning of rounds and where indicated and move up as each round is completed.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Bubble shell: (2 dc, 3 tr, 2 dc) in indicated st.

Shell: 5 dc in indicated st.

Single crochet join (sc join):

Place slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo, pull up a lp, yo and draw through both lps on hook.

BLANKET

Foundation row (RS): Ch 122, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (121 sc)

Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, sc in first sc, [sk next 2 sc, bubble shell (see *Special Stitches*) in next sc, sk next 2 sc, sc in next sc] across, turn. (21 sc, 20 bubble shells)

Row 2 (RS): Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in first sc, [sc in back lp (see *Stitch Guide*) of 2nd tr of next bubble shell*, shell (see *Special Stitches*) in next sc] across, ending last rep at *, 3 dc in last sc, turn. (20 sc, 6 dc, 19 shells)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first dc, [bubble shell in next sc*, sc in center dc of next shell] across, ending last rep at *, sk next 2 dc, sc in top of beg ch-3, turn. (21 sc, 20 bubble shells)

Row 4: Rep row 2.

Rows 5-66: [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 31 times. At end of last row, **do not turn. Place st marker on last st of last row** (see *Pattern Notes*).

BORDER

Rnd 1 (RS): Now working in rnds, with RS facing, working in ends of rows of first side, work 97 dc evenly sp across, working on opposite side of foundation row, 3 dc in first ch, dc in each ch across to last ch, 3 dc in last ch, working in ends of rows of other side, work 97 dc evenly sp across, 3 dc in first dc, work 119 dc evenly sp across to last 3 dc, 3 dc in last dc. (119 dc across each of top and bottom

edges, 97 dc across each side edge, 4 groups of 3 dc)

Rnd 2: Fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around marked st, *[dc in each of next 2 dc, fpdc around next dc] around to next 3-dc group, dc in next dc, fpdc around next dc, rep between [] to next 3-dc group**, [dc in next dc, fpdc around next dc] twice, rep from * around, ending at **, dc in next dc, fpdc around next dc, dc in next dc. Place marker on fpdc at each corner. (150 fpdc, 294 dc)

Rnd 3: *[Fpdc around next fpdc, dc in each dc] around to next marked corner fpdc, dc in corner fpdc, fpdc around same fpdc, rep from * around, dc in next dc. (150 fpdc, 298 dc)

Rnd 4: [Fpdc around each fpdc, dc in each dc] around.

Rnd 5: *[Fpdc around next fpdc, dc in each dc] around to next marked corner fpdc, fpdc around corner fpdc, working behind st just made, dc in same fpdc, rep from * around, dc in next dc. (150 fpdc, 302 dc)

Rnd 6: Rep rnd 4.

Rnd 7: *Sc in each st around to corner fpdc, 3 sc in corner fpdc, rep from *, sc in each rem st, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. Fasten off. (462 sc)

PILLOW

COVER

Front Panel

Foundation row (RS): Ch 56, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (55 sc)

Rows 1-22: Work same as rows 1-22 of Blanket. At end of last row, fasten off. (9 sc, 6 dc, 8 shells)

Edging rnd (RS): Now working in rnds, with RS facing and *working in ends of rows, work 34 sc evenly sp* across first side to foundation row, working on

Edging row: Now working in rows, with RS facing, working in ends of rows, **sc join** (see *Special Stitches*) in foundation row, *work 42 sc evenly sp across, 3 sc in first st*, work 34 sc evenly sp across to last st, 3 sc in last st, working in

ends of rows, sc in first row, rep between *, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (43 sc across each long edge, 34 sc across top edge, 2 groups of 3 sc)

Short Back Panel

Work same as foundation row—row 10 of Front Panel.

Edging rnd: Now working in rnds, with RS facing, *working in ends of rows, work 15 sc evenly sp* across first side to foundation row, working on opposite side of foundation row, 3 sc in first ch, work 34 sc evenly sp across to last ch, 3 sc in last ch, rep between * across other side to last row, sc in each dc across, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (15 sc across each side edge, 34 sc across each top and bottom edge, 2 groups of 3 sc)

ASSEMBLY

With WS held tog, pin Short Back Panel to Front Panel. Overlap first 5 sts of each side edge of Long

Back Panel on 5 sts of each side of Short Back Panel and pin Long Back Panel to Front Panel.

Border

Rnd 1 (RS): With RS of either short edge of Front Panel facing and working through both thicknesses, join in center st of 3-sc at top corner, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each st around, taking care to work through all 3 thicknesses of 5 overlapping sts, join in top of beg ch-3. (186 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, [dc in next dc, *fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next dc] 18 times, dc in next dc, rep between [] 27 times**, dc in next dc, rep from * around, ending at **, join in top of beg ch-3. (96 dc, 90 fpdc)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in same st as base of ch-3, *[dc in next dc, fpdc around next dc] 18 times, 2 dc in next dc, rep between [] 27 times**, 2 dc in next dc, rep from * around, ending at **, join in top of beg ch-3. (100 dc, 90 fpdc)

Rnd 4: Ch 3, [fpdc around each fpdc, dc in each dc] around, join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnd 5: Ch 3, 2 dc in next dc, *[dc in next dc, fpdc around next dc] 18 times, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, rep between [] 27 times**, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, rep from * around, ending at **. (104 dc, 90 fpdc)

Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Pillow Form

With RS tog, fold fabric widthwise and pin around 3 sides, using a ½-inch seam allowance, sew around all 3 sides, leaving an opening for stuffing. Turn piece RS out and stuff with fiberfill to desired firmness. Turn seam allowances at open edges to WS and sew tog. Place inside Pillow Cover.



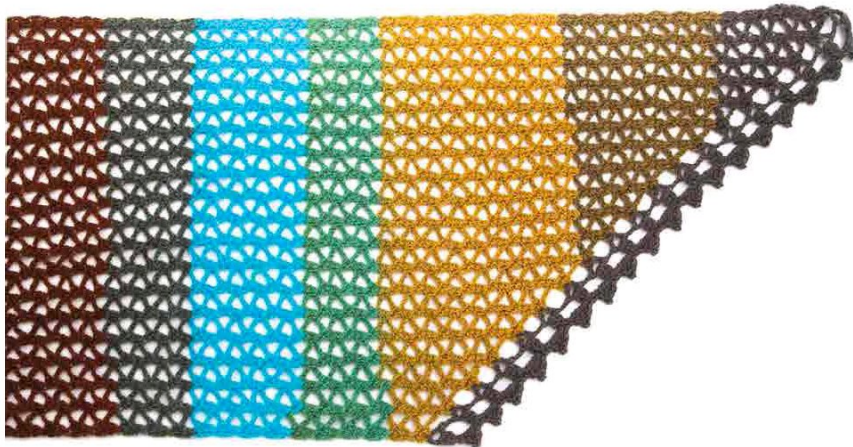

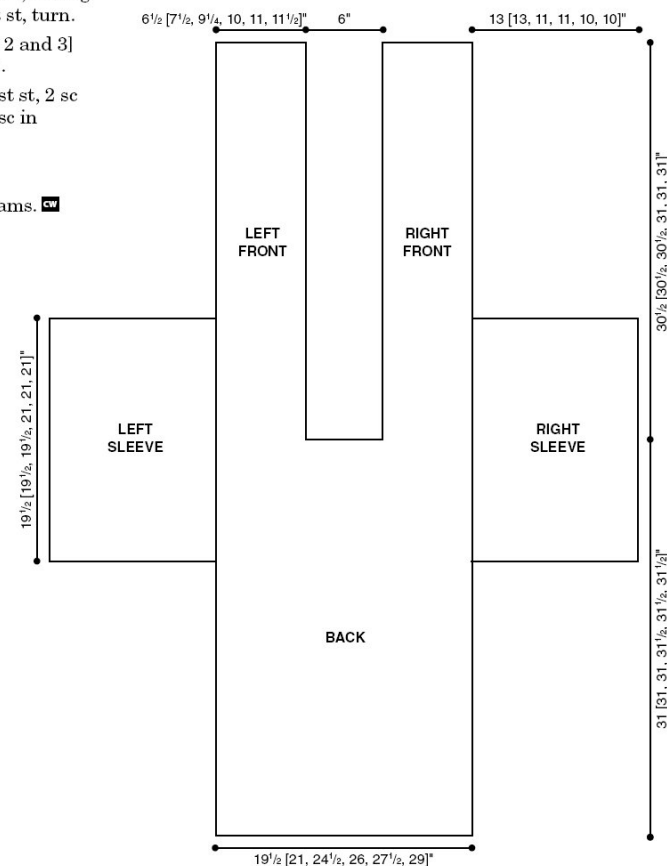

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first 61 [59, 59, 57, 57, 55] sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 89 [93, 99, 103, 109, 115] sc, 2 sc in next st, sc in rem 61 [59, 59, 57, 57, 55] sts, turn. (215 [215, 221, 221, 227, 229] sts)

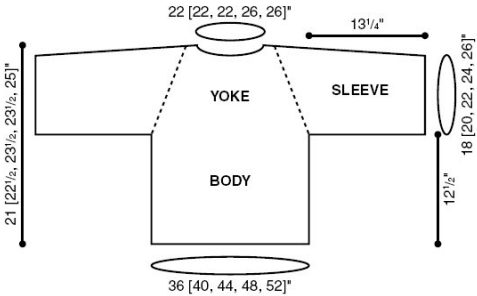

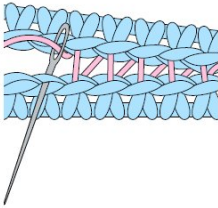

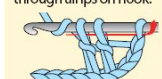
Example of 2-sc dec

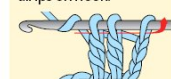

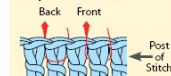


Example of 2-dc dec

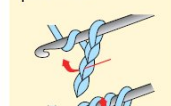

Projects for first-time crocheters using basic stitches, with little or no shaping.

1 2 3 4 5 6 CONFIDENT BEGINNER

Projects for new crocheters who are comfortable with the beginner basic stitches and are ready to combine them into short pattern sequences. Skills include simple increasing, decreasing and minimal color changes.

1 2 3 4 5 6 EASY

Projects using basic stitches, repetitive stitch patterns, simple color changes and easy shaping and finishing. Simple in-the-round projects, such as coasters, hot mats, flowers, hats, neck warmers and cowls fall within this skill category, as well as the ability to read simple stitch charts and keys.

1 2 3 4 5 6 INTERMEDIATE

Projects that incorporate a wide variety of stitch techniques beyond the basics, such as shells, fans, popcorns, clusters, post stitches, basic cables, lace, simple intarsia, shaping and finishing. The crocheter has the ability to read more advanced stitch pattern charts, such as lace and cable charts.

1 2 3 4 5 6 MODERATELY CHALLENGING

Projects that utilize a wide variety of stitches and techniques such as those noted above, as well as more detailed colorwork, shaping, construction and finishing.

1 2 3 4 5 6 CHALLENGING

Projects that require a more intuitive understanding of a pattern or chart and that also include advanced stitches and techniques, as well as more intricate methods such as intarsia, cables, lace, stranded colorwork with numerous color changes and advanced shaping and construction techniques.
