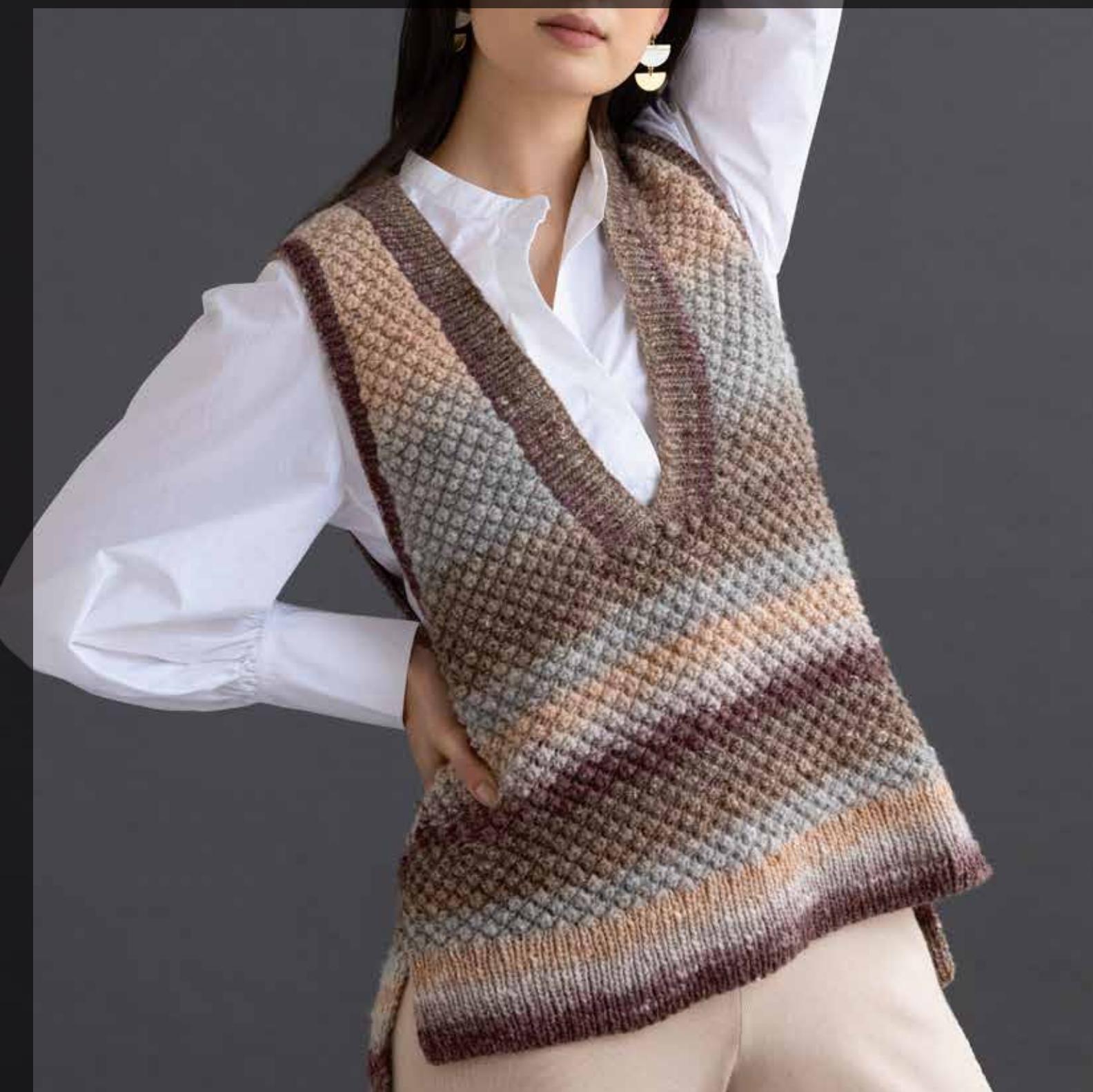

Sizes

Sized for X-Small (Small, Medium, Large, 1X, 2X, 3X). Shown in size Small.

Finished Measurements

- Bust 38 (42, 46, 50½, 55, 59, 63)in/96.5 (106.5, 117, 128.5, 139.5, 150, 160)cm.
- Back Length 26 (26½, 27, 27½, 28, 28½, 29)in/66 (67.5, 68.5, 70, 71, 72.5, 73.5)cm.
- Front Length 24 (24½, 25, 25½, 26, 26½, 27)in/61 (62, 63.5, 65, 66, 67.5, 68.5)cm.

Materials

- 4 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5, 6) x 100g hanks of Noro *Miyabi* in #04.
- One pair size US 7/4.5mm needles or size to obtain gauge.
- One size US 4/3.5mm circular needle, 24in/60cm long.
- Stitch markers.

Gauge

22½ sts and 26 rows to 4in/10cm over patt st using size US 7/4.5mm needles.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE.

General and Knitting Abbreviations

Crochet Abbreviations

BP back post; **BPdc** back post double crochet; **BPtr** back post single crochet; **BPsc** back post treble crochet; **ch** chain(s); **ch-** refers to chain or space previously made (i.e., ch-1 space); **ch-sp** chain space previously made; **dc** double crochet (UK: tr=treble); **dc2tog** double crochet 2 stitches together; **dtr** double treble (UK: trtr=triple treble); **FP** front post; **FPdc** front post double crochet; **FPtr** front post single crochet; **FPtr** front post treble crochet; **grp(s)** group(s); **hdc** half double crochet (UK: htr=half treble); **lp(s)** loop(s); **sc** single crochet (UK: dc=double crochet); **sc2tog** single crochet 2 stitches together; **sk** skip(ped); **sl st** slip stitch (UK: sc=single crochet); **sp(s)** space(s); **t-ch** turning chain; **tr** treble (UK: dtr=double treble); **trtr** triple treble (UK: qtr=quadruple treble).

Glossary

bind off To finish off an edge and keep stitches from unraveling by lifting the first stitch over the second, the second over the third, etc. (UK: cast off).

bind off in ribbing Maintain the rib pattern as you bind off (knit the knit stitches; purl the purl stitches) (UK: cast off in ribbing)

cast on Form a foundation row by making specified number of loops on the knitting needle.

decrease Reduce the number of stitches in a row (i.e., knit 2 together; purl 2 together).

increase Add to the number of stitches in a row (i.e., knit in front and back of stitch).

knitwise Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to knit it.

make one Insert tip of LH needle from front to back under the strand between the last stitch worked and the next stitch on the needle. Knit into the back loop to increase one stitch.

make one purl stitch With the needle tip, lift the strand between the last stitch worked and the next stitch on left-hand needle and purl it. One purl stitch has been added.

no stitch On some charts, "no stitch" is indicated with shaded spaces where stitches have been decreased or not yet made. In such cases, work the stitches of the chart, skipping over the "no stitch" spaces.

place markers Loop a piece of contrasting yarn or a purchased stitch marker onto the needle.

pick up and knit/purl Knit (or purl) into the loops along an edge.

purlwise Insert the needle into the stitch as if you were going to purl it.

selvage stitch Edge stitch that helps make seaming easier.

skip Skip specified number of stitches of the previous row and work into next stitch (UK: miss).

slip, slip, knit/purl Slip next two sts knitwise (purlwise), one at a time, to right-hand needle. Insert tip of left-hand needle into fronts of these sts from left to right and knit/purl them together to decrease one stitch.

slip stitch In knitting, pass a stitch from the left-hand to the right-hand needle as if to purl without working it. In crochet, insert hook through loop or edge, yarn over and pull through loop on hook (UK: ss or sc).

work even Continue in specified pattern without increasing or decreasing (UK: work straight).

yarn over In knitting, make a new stitch by placing the yarn over the right-hand needle (UK: yfwd, yon, yrn). In crochet, wind yarn around hook. (UK: yoh or yrh).

Notes

1) First and last stitch is worked as selvage in stockinette stitch throughout and is included in the stitch count.

2) Back is 2in/5cm longer than front.

Rib Pattern

(over odd number of sts)

Row 1 (RS) K1, *p1, k1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 (WS) P1, *k1, p1; rep from * to end.

Rep rows 1 and 2 for K1, P1 rib.

Trinity Stitch

(multiple of 4 sts plus 2)

Row 1 (WS) P1, *(k1, p1, k1) into next st, p3tog; rep from * to last st, p1.

Row 2 (RS) K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 3 P1, *p3tog, (k1, p1, k1) into next st; rep from * to last st, p1.

Row 4 K1, purl to last st, k1.

Rep rows 1-4 for Trinity st.

Back

With US 7/4.5mm needles, cast on 113 (125, 137, 151, 165, 177, 189) sts.

Work in k1, p1 for 5in/12.5cm.

Next (dec) row (RS) Work in rib, dec'ing 7 (7, 7, 9, 11, 11, 11) sts evenly across—106 (118, 130, 142, 154, 166, 178) sts, placing markers each end of row for beg of side seam.

Beg with **Row 1 (WS)**, work in Trinity St until piece measures 13in/33cm from beg.

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Armhole shaping

Bind off 3 (4, 5, 5, 6, 8, 10) sts at beg of next 2 rows, then 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 5, 6) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

Dec 1 st each side every row 3 (5, 7, 7, 9, 9, 9) times, every other row 3 (4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 11) times, every 6th row 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4, 4) times, then every 8th row 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, 3, 4) times—70 (74, 78, 84, 88, 90, 90) sts.

Work even until armhole measures 10 $\frac{3}{4}$ (11 $\frac{1}{4}$, 11 $\frac{3}{4}$, 12 $\frac{1}{4}$, 12 $\frac{3}{4}$, 13 $\frac{1}{4}$, 13 $\frac{3}{4}$)in/27.5 (28.5, 30, 31, 32.5, 33.5, 35) cm, end with a WS row.

Neck and shoulder shaping

Next row (RS) Work 25 (26, 28, 30, 32, 32, 32) sts, join a second ball of yarn and bind off center 20 (22, 22, 24, 24, 26, 26) sts, work to end of row.

Working both sides at once, bind off from each neck edge 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 6) sts once, 4 sts once, then 3 sts once.

Dec 1 st at each neck edge every RS row 2 times AT SAME TIME, when armhole measures 12 (12 $\frac{1}{2}$, 13, 13 $\frac{1}{2}$, 14, 14 $\frac{1}{2}$, 15)in/30.5 (32, 33, 34.5, 35.5, 37, 38)cm, bind off 4 (4, 5, 5, 6, 6, 6) sts from each shoulder edge twice, then bind off rem 3 (4, 4, 5, 5, 5, 5) sts.

Front

With size US 7/4.5mm needles, cast on 113 (125, 137, 151, 165, 177, 189) sts.

Work in k1, p1 rib for 3in/8cm.

Next (dec) row (RS) Work in rib, dec'ing 7 (7, 7, 9, 11, 11, 11) sts evenly across—106 (118, 130, 142, 154, 166, 178) sts, placing markers each end of row for beg of side seam. Beg with **Row 1 (WS)**, work in Trinity St until piece measures 11in/28cm from beg.

On last WS row, mark the center 18 sts.

Armhole and neck shaping

Row 1 (RS) Bind off 3 (4, 5, 5, 6, 8, 10) sts, work to center marked sts, join a second ball of yarn and bind off center 18 sts, work to end.

Row 2 (WS) Bind off 3 (4, 5, 5, 6, 8, 10) sts, patt to end of first side; on 2nd side, patt to end—41 (46, 51, 56, 62, 66, 70) sts each side.

Cont to shape armholes as given for back AT SAME TIME, dec 1 st at each neck edge every 5th row 15 (16, 16, 18, 18, 19, 19) times, AT SAME TIME, when armhole measures same as back, shape shoulder by binding off 4 (4, 5, 5, 6, 6, 6) sts from each shoulder edge twice, then bind off rem 3 (4, 4, 5, 5, 5, 5) sts.

Finishing

Block pieces to measurements. Sew shoulder seams.

Armhole bands

With RS facing and size US 4/3.5mm circular needle, pick up and k 143 (149, 155, 161, 167, 173, 179) evenly along front and back armhole.

Do not join, work back and forth in rows.

Work 4 rows in rib patt. Bind off in rib on WS.

Neckband

With RS facing, size US 4/3.5mm circular needle and starting at bottom right neck edge, pick up and k 203 (213, 219, 229, 233, 241, 245) sts evenly along neck opening to bottom left neck edge.

Do not join, work back and forth in rows.

Work in rib patt for 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ in/4cm. Bind off in rib.

Sew side edges of neckband to bound off sts at front neck, centering where side edges meet.

Sew side seam from marker to top of armhole band. ■
