

BRIOCHEVRON WRAP





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Choose a colorful array of fingering weight yarns and knit this large wrap in two-color brioche. The main color is a black and white marled yarn from Woolfolk while bright color pops from Hedgehog Fibres decorate the striped background. Increases and decreases form the graphic chevron lines and the fabric length is customizable.

Finished Measurements: 19" / cm wide, 80" / 203cm long. Measurements taken after blocking.

Yarn: Fingering weight

Shown in: MC - Woolfolk Sno (100% Merino Wool; 223yds / 204m per 50g skein) Color 1 + 15 Black & White
CC - Hedgehog Fibres Sock Yarn (90% Merino, 10% Nylon; 437yds / 400m per 100g skein)
CC sample stripes shown in Coral, Highlighter, Oracle, Harajuku, Hush, Electric, Boombox, Where's My Bike?, Envy, Fool's Gold, Night Ride, Jelly, Skinny Dip, Work it!, Typewriter, Pollen, Budgie, Brithday Cake, Vengeance, Oh Snap!, and a few one-of-a-kind Potluck and club colors.

Yardage: MC - 1300 yds / 1189m
CC - 1250yds / 1143m

The contrast color used small amounts of leftover sock yarn and mini skeins. The colorful stripes vary between 3 and 12 rows.

Needles: 24" US 4 / 3.5mm circular

Notions: Tapestry needle

Gauge: 24 sts & 20 rows = 4" / 10cm in two-color briochevон stitch

Pattern Notes: In two-color brioche stitch, two rows are worked for each counted row that appears on the face of the fabric. The first color is worked across the row and then the row is worked again using the second color. The next row is worked the same way, once across with the first color and worked again with the second color. When counting rows, count only the stitches going up on a knit column. For example, when you work 4 rows, count 4 knit column stitches, even though you will have worked 8 rows. 2 worked rows = 1 counted row.

When you put down your knitting and forget which color you just used and which color to use next, look at the color of the yo in the row just worked. That is the last color you used.

INSTRUCTIONS

Using MC, CO 3 sts, *slip 3 sts to left needle, k3, repeat from * 159 more times.

Set-Up Row 1 RS MC: Pick up and k159 sts along I-cord edge, pick up and k3 sts from CO edge. Do not turn, slide sts to work the same row with the other color. 165 sts.

Set-Up Row 1 RS CC: Using CC, sl3, (sl1yo, p1) to last 4 sts, sl1yo, sl3 wyif. Turn work.

Set-Up Row 2 WS MC: P3, (brp1, sl1yo) to last 4 sts, brp1, p3. Do not turn, slide sts to work the same row with the other color.

Set-Up Row 2 WS CC: CC is hanging in back, sl3, (sl1yo, brk1) to last 4 sts, sl1 yo, sl3 wyib. Turn work.

Row 1 RS MC: K3, *brkyobrk, sl1yo, (brk1, sl1yo) 5 times, brRsl dec, sl1yo, brLsl dec, sl1yo, (brk1, sl1yo) 5 times, brkyobrk, sl1yo, repeat from * 4 more times. On the last repeat, ignore the last sl1yo. K the last 3 sts. Do not turn, slide sts to work the same row with the other color.

Row 1 RS CC: CC is hanging in front, sl3, (sl1yo, brp1) to last 4 sts, sl1yo, sl3 wyif. Turn work.

Row 2 WS MC: P3, (brp1, sl1yo) to last 4 sts, brp1, p3. Do not turn, slide sts to work the same row with the other color.

Row 2 WS CC: CC is hanging in back, sl3, (sl1yo, brk1) to last 4 sts, sl1 yo, sl3 wyib. Turn work.

Repeat Rows 1 & 2 until work measures approximately 80" / 203cm ending with Row 2 WS CC.

FINISHING

Next Row RS MC: K3, (brk1, k1) to last 4 sts, brk1, k3. Turn to BO on the WS.

Reverse the order of the first three stitches and BO all sts with an I-cord BO as follows, *k2, k2tog tbl, repeat from * to last 3 sts, Graft the 6 total sts together.

Break yarn, weave in ends, and block the finished wrap.
