Circular needle size 3 mm (60 cm)

Circular needle size 3.5 mm (80 cm)

Crochet hook size 3 mm

Gauge

21 sts and 29 rows on size 3.5 mm

in col A = 10 x 10 mm

Yarn

Col A

Bella from Permin 883264 (Soft Rose)
(145 m / 50 g) 75% kid mohair, 20% wool
and 5% polyamid

250 (300) 300 (350) 350 (400) g

Col B

Arwetta Classic from Filcolana

101 (Natura White)

(210 m / 50 g) 80% merino wool and
20% nylon

LACE POLO

XS (S) M (L) XL (XXL)

Abbreviations

k: Knit

p: Purl

rnd: Round

k2tog: Knit 2 stitches together

ssk: Slip 2 stitches knitwise one after the other, place the 2 sts back onto the left needle and work k2tog tbl

M1R: With the left needle pick up the loop between two stitches from the back, then work the loop as k1

M1L: With the left needle pick up the loop between two stitches from the front, then work the loop as k1 tbl

M1Rp: With the left needle pick up the loop between two stitches from the front, then work the loop as p1 tbl

M1Lp: With the left needle pick up the loop between two stitches from the back, then work the loop as p1

Info

The sweater is knit with col A apart from the lace edge on the collar, which is worked in col B. The sweater is knit from the top down.

E-st (edge stitch) is worked by slipping the 1st stitch purl-wise with the yarn to the front

Collar

Cast on 101 (101) 105 (105) 105 (105) sts loosely on size 3.5 mm needle with col A.

1st row: E-st, p to the last st, k1.

2nd row: E-st, k2tog, k to the last 3 sts, ssk, k1.

Work 1st and 2nd row a total of 14 (14) 14 (14) 14 (14) times
= 73 (73) 77 (77) 77 (77) sts.

Work the next row in stockinette stitch (k all sts), making the wrong side of the

collar to the right side of the sweater. Place markers as follows:

K 12 (12) 13 (13) 13 (13), place marker (first half of front), k 12 (12) 12 (12) 12 (12), place marker (left sleeve; this marker is also the marker for the beginning of the round), k 24 (24) 26 (26) 26 (26), place marker (back), k 12 (12) 12 (12) 12 (12), place marker (right sleeve), k to the last stitch on the needle and knit it together with the first stitch on the needle (joining the work into a round), place marker (short row marker), k to end of round = 72 (72) 76 (76) 76 (76) sts.

The beginning of the round is between sleeve and back. You can use a different type/color marker to distinguish this marker from the rest.

Raglan

Work in the round in stockinette stitch. Work short rows shaping the neckline, while at the same time working increases for raglan. Use the technique German Short Rows for the short rows.

- K1, M1L, *k to 1 st before marker, M1R, k2, M1L*, repeat from * to * once more, k to 10 sts before the short row marker, turn work, p to marker at beginning of round.
- P1, M1Lp, p to 1 st before marker, M1Rp, p2, M1Lp, p to 10 sts before the short row marker, turn work, k to marker at beginning of round.

Work these two instructions 3 more times, turning 2 sts further toward the short row marker each time. The turning points are thus moved toward the center of the front.

You have now increased for raglan a total of 4 times. From here work in the round again = 104 (104) 108 (108) 108 (108) sts.

Continue increasing for raglan as follows:

1st round: K1, M1L, *k to 1 st before marker, M1R, k2, M1L*, work from * to * another 2 times, k to 1 st before marker, M1R, k1.

2nd round: K all sts.

Work 1st and 2nd round a total of 23 (24) 25 (26) 27 (28) times.

Now increase on every round, i.e. only working the 1st round above. Work the 1st round a total of 4 (6) 8 (11) 13 (16) times.

You have now increased a total of 31 (34) 37 (41) 44 (48) times
= 320 (344) 372 (404) 428 (460) sts.

The stitch counts for the different parts are: 86 (92) 100 (108) 114 (122) sts for front and back and 74 (80) 86 (94) 100 (108) sts for each sleeve.

Body

Divide the work for body and sleeves, remove the markers as you pass them. K across sts for back, place sts for right sleeve on a stitch holder, cast on 12 (12) 14 (14) 14 (14) new sts, k across sts for front, place sts for left sleeve on a stitch holder, cast on 12 (12) 14 (14) 14 (14) new sts and place marker for new beginning of the round in the center of these
= 184 (196) 220 (236) 252 (268) sts for the body.

Work straight down in stockinette stitch until the work measures 45 (46) 47 (48) 49 (50) cm from the neck

(not including the collar) or until the sweater is 8 cm shorter than the desired length. Change to a size 3 mm needle and work 8 cm in rib (k1, p1). Bind off loosely in rib.

Sleeves

Place sts for one sleeve back onto a size 3.5 mm needle. Pick up and knit 12 (12) 14 (14) 14 (14) sts in the cast on at the underarm. Place a marker in the center of the picked up sts (beginning of round) = 86 (92) 100 (108) 114 (122) sts.

Work in stockinette stitch in the round, while at the same time decreasing every 6th (6th) 5th (5th) 4th (4th) round a total of 17 (17) 21 (21) 21 (26) times as follows: K1, k2tog, k to the last 3 sts, ssk, k1 = 52 (58) 58 (66) 72 (70) sts.

Continue working straight down in stockinette stitch until the sleeve measures 36 (36) 36 (36) 36 (36) cm (below the sleeve), or until the sleeve is 8 cm shorter than desired. Change to a size 3 mm needle and work 8 cm in rib (k1, p1). Bind off loosely in rib. Work the second sleeve identically to the first.

Lace edging on the collar

Using a crochet hook size 3 mm and col B, crochet a picot edging all the way around the collar. Begin at the center front at one edge of the collar. Work as follows: *3 ch, 1 dc in the 1st ch, jump 2 sts, 1 sc in the next st*, repeat from * to * all the way around the collar.

Finishing

Weave in all ends. Wash the sweater following the directions for the yarn. It is important to block the collar while it is wet, as it will roll otherwise.
