MAUDE SWEATER



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Version 1.2 (English)

Sizes:

1 (2, 3, 4, 5) (6, 7, 8, 9) 10, 11

Sizes 1 (2, 3, 4, 5) (6, 7, 8, 9) 10, 11 are intended to fit an approximate actual bust circumference of 75 (80, 85, 90, 95) (100, 110, 120, 130) 140, 150 cm.

Bust circumference of finished garment:

99 (103, 110.5, 114.5, 118) (125.5, 133.5, 145, 156) 164, 175 cm

Upper arm circumference of finished garment:

38 (38, 42, 42, 42) (45.5, 45.5, 49.5, 53.5) 57, 61 cm

Recommended length of finished garment:

61 (62, 62, 62.5, 63) (63.5, 64, 65.5, 66) 67.5, 68 cm (measured mid-back excluding neck edge)

Recommended length of finished sleeve:

Between 38 to 42 cm (measured from underarm cast-on edge), depending on your chosen length

Yoke depth:

24.5 (25.5, 25.5, 26, 26.5) (27, 27.5, 29, 29.5) 31, 31.5 cm (measured mid-back excluding neck edge)

Gauge:

21 sts x 40 rows in slipped stitch pattern on 4.5mm needles = 10 x 10 cm after blocking

21 sts x 32 rows in double moss stitch on 4mm needles = 10 x 10 cm after blocking

21 sts x 30 rows in stockinette stitch, lace pattern, and all other textured patterns on 4mm needles = 10 x 10 cm after blocking

Needles:

Circular needles: 3mm (40 cm), 3.5mm (40 – 120) cm, 4mm (40 - 120) cm, 4.5mm (80 - 120) cm

Materials:

295 (305, 315, 325, 335) (350, 365, 390, 415) 440, 460 g Cashmere Sock by Sysleriget (100g = 400 m) *held together with* 150 (150, 160, 165, 165) (175, 185, 195, 205) 220, 230 g Brushed Deluxe by Sysleriget (50g = 400 m). Amounts include a 15% buffer rounded to the nearest 5g.

If you wish to lengthen or shorten the sweater, you may require more or less yarn.

** Yarn used in the pictures is:*

Version 1: Cashmere Sock by Sysleriget in shade Dazzling Purple held together with Brushed Deluxe by Sysleriget in shade Desert Breeze, with the longer sleeve length.

Version 2: Cashmere Sock by Sysleriget in shade Undyed held together with Silk Mohair by Isager in shade E0 with the longer sleeve length.

Size guide

Maude Sweater is designed to have approximately 24 cm of positive ease, meaning it is designed to be approximately 24 cm larger in circumference than your bust measurement.

The Maude Sweater is a delicate sweater featuring a variety of textures and lacework. Whilst the sweater looks intricate to work, each 'section' includes an easily memorisable 4 row pattern repeat, so there are no complicated charts to follow.

First, the back is worked back and forth with increases to shape the shoulders. Stitches are then picked up along the slanted edge where the increases were worked to form each shoulder and worked back and forth whilst shaping the neck. The shoulders are joined at the front of the neck and worked back and forth. The front is then joined to the back at the underarms and worked in the round until the desired length is achieved. Sleeve stitches are picked up around the armhole opening; short rows are worked to shape the shoulder followed by working in the round across the sleeve whilst working strategically placed decreases to taper the sleeves without disrupting the textured patterns. The body and sleeves are finished in ribbing. Finally, stitches are picked up and knitted in rib along the neck edge, then folded over and secured on the wrong side.

Abbreviations

BOR = beginning of round

RS = right side

WS = wrong side

k = knit

p = purl

sl = slip stitch purlwise

st(s) = stitch(es)

sk = slip 1 stitch knitwise, return stitch back to the left needle

ssk = slip 1 stitch knitwise, slip the next stitch on the needle knitwise, return these two stitches to the left needle and knit them together through the back loop

ssp = slip 1 stitch knitwise, slip the next stitch on the needle knitwise, return these two stitches to the left needle and purl them together through the back loop

k2tog = knit two stitches together

tbl = through the back loop

wyf = with yarn held in front

wyb = with yarn held in back

yo = yarnover

M1L = Make 1 Left; work an increase by inserting the left needle under the strand between the stitches from front to back and knitting it through the back loop.

M1Lp = Make 1 Left purl; work an increase by inserting the left needle under the strand between the stitches from front to back and purling it through the back loop.

M1R = Make 1 Right; work an increase by inserting the left needle under the strand between the stitches from back to front and knitting it through the front loop.

M1Rp = Make 1 Right purl; work an increase by inserting the left needle under the strand between the stitches from back to front and purling it through the front loop.

German Short Rows

Work to turning point. Turn the work, slip the first stitch purlwise, and bring the working yarn in front of the work and up and over the needle, pulling it tightly so that it pulls both 'legs' of the slipped stitch over the needle. Continue as the pattern describes. When working across the turning stitch, work both 'legs' of the stitch as one stitch.

Swatch Patterns

Pattern for **slipped stitch** swatch on 4.5mm needles (cast on an odd number of stitches):

Row 1 (RS): Knit across row.

Row 2 (WS): P1, *sl1 wyf, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Repeat rows 1 and 2.

Pattern for **double moss stitch** swatch on 4mm needles (cast on an odd number of stitches):

Row 1 (RS): P1, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Row 2 (WS): K1, *p1, k1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Row 3 (RS): K1, *p1, k1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Row 4 (WS): P1, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Repeat rows 1 to 4.

Pattern for **lace pattern** swatch on 4mm needles (cast on multiple of 8 stitches plus 4 stitches):

Set-up row (WS): Purl across row.

Row 1 (RS): *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 2 (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (RS): K8, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 4 (WS): Purl across row.

Repeat rows 1 to 4.

Pattern

Back

Cast on 41 (41, 41, 43, 43) (45, 45, 47, 49) 49, 51 sts on a 4mm 80 cm circular needle with your chosen yarn.

Set-up row (WS): P1, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

You will now work increases either side of the work to shape the back as follows:

Row 1 (RS): K1, **M1L**, *p1, k1*, repeat between * to * across row until 2 sts left on needle, p1, **M1R**, k1. (2 sts increased)

Row 2 (WS): P1, **M1Rp**, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * until 2 sts left on needle, k1, **M1Lp**, p1. (2 sts increased)

Row 3 (RS): K1, **M1Lp**, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * until 2 sts left on needle, k1, **M1Rp**, k1. (2 sts increased)

Row 4 (WS): P1, **M1R**, *p1, k1*, repeat between * to * until 2 sts left on needle, p1, **M1L**, p1. (2 sts increased)

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of 9 (9, 9, 9, 9) (9, 9, 9, 9) 10, 10 times.

You have worked a total of 36 (36, 36, 36, 36) (36, 36, 36, 36) 40, 40 increase rows and increased by 72 (72, 72, 72, 72) (72, 72, 72, 72) 80, 80 sts.

There are a total of 113 (113, 113, 115, 115) (117, 117, 119, 121) 129, 131 sts on the needle

Sizes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 10, and 11: Work row 1, one more time.

Sizes 7, 8, and 9: Work rows 1 to 3, one more time.

All sizes.

You have now worked a total of 38 (38, 38, 38, 38) (38, 40, 40, 40) 42, 42 rows and there are a total of 115 (115, 115, 117, 117) (119, 123, 125, 127) 131, 133 sts on the needle.

You will now work an eyelet pattern over the next 6 rows as follows:

Row 1 (WS): Knit across row.

Row 2 (RS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (WS): P1, *yo, slip 1 st purlwise, p1, pass slipped st over the purled st as if to bind off*, repeat between * to * across row until there are no sts left on the needle.

Row 4 (RS): Knit across row.

Row 5 (WS): Knit across row.

Row 6 (RS): Purl across row.

Break the yarn so you can slide the stitches along the needle to work another RS row. You will now work the next textured panel.

Change to a 4.5mm 80 cm circular needle.

Row 1 (RS): Knit across row.

Row 2 (WS): P1, *sl1 wyf, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Work rows 1 and 2 a total of 8 (7, 7, 8, 9) (10, 10, 10, 11) 10, 11 times.

Change back to a 4mm 80 cm circular needle.

Row 1 (RS): Purl across row.

Row 2 (WS): Knit across row.

Row 3 (RS):

Sizes 1, 2, 3, 7, and 10: Knit across row, whilst increasing 1 st somewhere on the row. (1 st increased)

Sizes 4, 5, 8, and 11: Knit across row, whilst working a k2tog somewhere on the row. (1 st decreased)

Sizes 6 and 9: Knit across row, whilst decreasing 3 sts evenly spread across the row using k2tog. (3 sts decreased)

All sizes.

Row 4 (WS): Purl across row.

There are a total of 116 (116, 116, 116, 116) (116, 124, 124, 124) 132, 132 sts on the needle.

Size 2 only:

You will now work the lace panel whilst shaping the armhole, as follows:

Row 1 (RS): *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 2 (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (RS): K8, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 4 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of x (3, x, x, x) (x, x, x, x) x, x times.

Sizes 1 and 2 only:

You will now work the lace panel whilst shaping the armhole, as follows:

Row 1 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * until 12 sts left on needle, k4, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 2 and all WS rows (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k2, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 11 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k2, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 5 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k1, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * until 10 sts left on needle, k5, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 7 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 9 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 8 (WS): Purl across row.

Size 1 only: You have remaining decreases to work:

Row 9 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k3, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * until 8 sts left on needle, k3, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 10 and all WS rows (WS): Purl across row.

Row 11 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 7 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 13 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * until 6 sts left on needle, k1, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 15 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k4, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 5 sts left on needle, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 16 (WS): Purl across row.

Sizes 1 and 2 only:

You have decreased by 16 (8, x, x, x) (x, x, x, x) x, x sts and there are a total of 100 (108, x, x, x) (x, x, x, x) x, x sts on the needle.

Break the yarn and put sts on hold.

Sizes 3, 5, and 10 only:

You will now work the lace panel as follows:

Row 1 (RS): K8, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 2 (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (RS): *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 4 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of x (x, 5, x, 5) (x, x, x, x) 1, x time(s).

Sizes 3 and 5 only:

Break the yarn and put the sts on hold.

Size 10 only:

You have armhole shaping remaining to work.

Sizes 4 and 8 only:

You will now work the lace panel as follows:

Row 1 (RS): *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 2 (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (RS): K8, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 4 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of x (x, x, 5, x) (x, x, 2, x) x, x times.

Size 4 only:

Break the yarn and put the sts on hold.

Size 8 only:

You have armhole shaping remaining to make.

Sizes 6 and 7 only:

You will now work the lace panel as follows:

Row 1 (RS): *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 2 (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (RS): K8, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 4 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of x (x, x, x, x) (3, 3, x, x) x, x times.

You have armhole shaping remaining to make.

Sizes 6, 7, 9 and 10 only:

You will now work increases every RS row as follows:

Row 1 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 8 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 2 and every WS row (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 9 sts left on needle, k5, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 5 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k2, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 10 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k2, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 7 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 11 sts left on needle, k4, yo, ssk, k1, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 8 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 8 a total of x (x, x, x, x) (1, 1, x, 1) 1, x time.

Sizes 8 and 11 only:

You will now work increases every RS row as follows:

Row 1 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 8 sts left on needle, k4, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 2 and all WS rows (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 9 sts left on needle, k5, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 5 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k2, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 10 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k2, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 7 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 11 sts left on needle, k4, yo, ssk, k1, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 9 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 8 sts left on needle, k4, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 11 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 9 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 13 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 10 sts left on needle, k4, yo, ssk, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 15 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k3, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 11 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k3, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 16 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 16 a total of x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, 1, x) x, 1 time.

Size 11 only: Work rows 1 to 8 one more time.

Size 11 only:

You have additional increases to work every row as follows:

Row 17 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * until 8 sts left on needle, k4, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 18 (increase row) (WS): P4, **M1Lp**, purl across row until 4 sts left on needle, **M1Rp**, p4. (2 sts increased)

Row 19 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k2, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 10 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k2, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 20 (increase row) (WS): P4, **M1Lp**, purl across row until 4 sts left on needle, **M1Rp**, p4. (2 sts increased)

Sizes 8 and 11 only:

You have increased by x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, 16, x) x, 32 sts and there are a total of x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, 140, x) x, 164 sts on the needle.

Sizes 9 and 10 only:

You will work 8 more increase rows as follows:

Row 9 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k4, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 10 and all WS rows (WS): Purl across row.

Row 11 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 9 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, **M1L**, k4 (2 sts increased).

Row 13 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * until 10 sts left on needle, k4, yo, ssk, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 15 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k3, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 11 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k3, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 16 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 9 to 16 a total of x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, x, 1) 1, x time, then work rows 1 to 8 one more time.

Sizes 6, 7, 9 and 10 only:

You have increased by x (x, x, x, x) (8, 8, x, 24) 24, x sts and there are a total of x (x, x, x, x) (124, 132, x, 148) 156, x sts on the needle.

Break the yarn and put the sts on hold.



Left shoulder

All sizes.

With the RS facing and using the **short tail of the yarn** (so you can slide your stitches back to begin knitting with the RS facing and the long end of yarn that comes from the yarn skein), pick up 39 (39, 39, 39, 39) (39, 41, 41, 41) 43, 43 sts

along the left slanted edge on the back yoke where the increases were worked using a 4mm needle 40 cm or larger. This is the equivalent of picking up 1 st for each row worked. The direction of picking up stitches is from the neck along to the outer shoulder.

You will now work double moss stitch as follows:

Row 1 (RS): P1, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Row 2 (WS): K1, *p1, k1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Row 3 (RS): K1, *p1, k1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Row 4 (WS): P1, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of 4 (4, 4, 4, 4) (4, 5, 5, 4) 4, 4 times. You have worked a total of 16 (16, 16, 16, 16) (16, 20, 20, 16) 16, 16 rows.

You will now continue to work in double moss stitch while working increases every other row to shape the neckline as follows:

Row 5 (RS): K1, **M1Lp**, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row. (1 st increased)

Row 6 (WS): *K1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Row 7 (RS): K1, **M1Lp**, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * until 1 st left on the needle, k1. (1 st increased)

Row 8 (WS): P1, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Work rows 5 to 8 a total of 4 (4, 4, 4, 4) (4, 4, 4, 5) 5, 5 times. You have increased a total of 8 (8, 8, 8, 8) (8, 8, 8, 10) 10, 10 sts.

There are a total of 47 (47, 47, 47, 47) (47, 49, 49, 51) 53, 53 sts on the needle.

Break the yarn and put the sts on hold.

Right shoulder

All sizes.

With the RS facing and using the **short tail of the yarn** (so you can slide your stitches back to begin knitting with the RS facing and the long end of yarn that comes from the yarn skein), pick up 39 (39, 39, 39, 39) (39, 41, 41, 41) 43, 43 sts along the right slanted edge on the back yoke where the increases were worked using a 4mm needle 40 cm or larger. This is the equivalent of picking up 1 st for each row worked.

The direction of picking up stitches is from the outer shoulder edge towards the neck.

You will now work double moss stitch as follows:

Row 1 (RS): P1, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Row 2 (WS): K1, *p1, k1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Row 3 (RS): K1, *p1, k1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Row 4 (WS): P1, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of 4 (4, 4, 4, 4) (4, 5, 5, 4) 4, 4 times. You have worked a total of 16 (16, 16, 16, 16) (16, 20, 20, 16) 16, 16 rows.

You will now continue to work in double moss stitch while working increases every other row to shape the neckline as follows:

Row 5 (RS): *P1, k1*, repeat between * to * until 1 st left on needle, **M1Rp**, k1. (1 st increased)

Row 6 (WS): *P1, k1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Row 7 (RS): *K1, p1*, repeat between * to * until 2 sts left on needle, k1, **M1Rp**, k1. (1 st increased)

Row 8 (WS): P1, *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Work rows 5 to 8 a total of 4 (4, 4, 4, 4) (4, 4, 4, 5) 5, 5 times. You have increased a total of 8 (8, 8, 8, 8) (8, 8, 8, 10) 10, 10 sts.

There are a total of 47 (47, 47, 47, 47) (47, 49, 49, 51) 53, 53 sts on the needle.

Do not break the yarn.

Front

The right and left fronts are now joined together, while continuing to work double moss stitch as follows:

Row 1 (RS): *P1, k1*, repeat between * to * until 1 st left for the right front, p1, cast on 21 (21, 21, 23, 23) (25, 25, 27, 25) 25, 27 sts using the backwards-loop method, *p1, k1*, repeat between * to * until 1 st left on the needle, p1.

There are now a total of 115 (115, 115, 117, 117) (119, 123, 125, 127) 131, 133 sts on needle.

Row 2 (WS): *K1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row until 1 st left, k1.

Row 3 (RS): *K1, p1*, repeat between * to * across row until 1 st left on needle, k1.

Row 4 (WS): *P1, k1*, repeat between * to * until 1 st left on needle, p1.

Row 5 (RS): *P1, k1*, repeat between * to * until 1 st left on needle, p1.

Row 6 (WS): Repeat row 2.

You will now work an eyelet pattern over the next 6 rows as follows:

Row 1 (RS): Purl across row.

Row 2 (WS): Knit across row.

Row 3 (RS): K1, *yo, slip 1 st knitwise, k1, pass slipped st over the knitted st as if to bind off*, repeat between * to * across row until there are no sts left on the needle.

Row 4 (WS): Purl across row.

Row 5 (RS): Purl across row.

Row 6 (WS): Knit across row.

You will now work the next textured panel.

Change to a 4.5mm 80 cm circular needle.

Row 1 (RS): Knit across row.

Row 2 (WS): P1, *sl1 wyf, p1*, repeat between * to * across row.

Work rows 1 and 2 a total of 8 (7, 7, 8, 9) (10, 10, 10, 11) 10, 11 times.

Change back to a 4mm 80 cm circular needle.

Row 1 (RS): Purl across row.

Row 2 (WS): Knit across row.

Row 3 (RS):
Sizes 1, 2, 3, 7, and 10: Knit across row, whilst increasing 1 st somewhere on the row. (1 st increased)

Sizes 4, 5, 8, and 11: Knit across row, whilst working a k2tog somewhere on the row. (1 st decreased)

Sizes 6 and 9: Knit across row, whilst decreasing 3 sts evenly spread across the row using k2tog. (3 sts decreased)

All sizes.

Row 4 (WS): Purl across row.

There are a total of 116 (116, 116, 116, 116) (116, 124, 124, 124) 132, 132 sts on the needle.

Note: For sizes 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 9, and 10: The lace pattern on the front is offset from the lace pattern on the back to ensure the pattern lines up correctly when joining the body.

Sizes 3, 4, 5, 8, and 10 only:

You will now work the lace panel as follows:

Row 1 (RS): *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 2 (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (RS): K8, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 4 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of x (x, 5, 5, 5) (x, x, 2, x) 1, x time(s).

Do not break yarn.

Size 1 only:

You will now work the lace panel whilst shaping the armhole, as follows:

Row 1 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * until 12 sts left on needle, k4, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 2 and all WS rows (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k2, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 11 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k2, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 5 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k1, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * until 10 sts left on needle, k5, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 7 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 9 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 9 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k3, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * until 8 sts left on needle, k3, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 11 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 7 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 13 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * until 6 sts left on needle, k1, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 15 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k4, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 5 sts left on needle, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 16 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 16 a total of 1 (x, x, x, x) (x, x, x, x) x, x time.

You have decreased by 16 (x, x, x, x) (x, x, x, x) x, x sts and there are a total of 100 (x, x, x, x) (x, x, x, x) x, x sts on the needle.

Do not break yarn.

Size 2 only:

You will now work the lace panel whilst shaping the armhole, as follows:

Row 1 (RS): K8, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 2 (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (RS): *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 4 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of x (3, x, x, x) (x, x, x, x) x, x times.

You will now work decreases every RS row as follows:

Row 5 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k3, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 8 sts left on needle, k3, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 6 and all WS rows (WS): Purl across row.

Row 7 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 7 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 9 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k1, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 6 sts left on needle, k1, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 11 (decrease row) (RS): K3, ssk, k4, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 5 sts left on needle, k2tog, k3. (2 sts decreased)

Row 12 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 5 to 12 a total of x (1, x, x, x) (x, x, x, x) x, x time.

You have decreased by x (8, x, x, x) (x, x, x, x) x, x sts and there are a total of x (108, x, x, x) (x, x, x, x) x, x sts on the needle.

Do not break yarn.

Sizes 6, 7, and 10 only:

You will now work the lace panel as follows:

Row 1 (RS): K8, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 2 (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (RS): *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 4 sts left on needle, k4.

Row 4 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 4 a total of x (x, x, x, x) (3, 3, x, x) 1, x time(s).

Do not break yarn.

Sizes 6 and 7 only:

You will now work increases every RS row as follows:

Row 1 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 8 sts left on needle, k4, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 2 and all WS rows (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 9 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 5 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo *, repeat between * to * across row until 10 sts left on needle, k4, yo, ssk, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 7 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k3, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 11 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k3, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 8 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 8 a total of x (x, x, x, x) (1, 1, x, x) x, x time.

You have increased by x (x, x, x, x) (8, 8, x, x) x, x sts and there are a total of x (x, x, x, x) (124, 132, x, x) x, x sts on the needle.

Do not break the yarn.

Sizes 8 and 11 only:

You will now work increases every RS row as follows:

Row 1 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 8 sts left on needle, k4, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 2 and all WS rows (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 9 sts left on needle, k5, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 5 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k2, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 10 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k2, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 7 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 11 sts left on needle, k4, yo, ssk, k1, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 9 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 8 sts left on needle, k4, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 11 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 9 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 13 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 10 sts left on needle, k4, yo, ssk, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 15 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k3, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 11 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k3, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 16 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 16 a total of x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, 1, x) x, 1 time.

Size 11 only: Work rows 1 to 8 one more time.

Size 11 only:

You have additional increases to work every row as follows:

Row 17 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * until 8 sts left on needle, k4, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 18 (increase row) (WS): P4, **M1Lp**, purl across row until 4 sts left on needle, **M1Rp**, p4. (2 sts increased)

Row 19 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k2, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * until 10 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k2, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 20 (increase row) (WS): P4, **M1Lp**, purl across row until 4 sts left on needle, **M1Rp**, p4. (2 sts increased)

Sizes 8 and 11 only:

You have increased by x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, 16, x) x, 32 sts and there are a total of x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, 140, x) x, 164 sts on the needle.

Do not break yarn.

Sizes 9 and 10 only:

You will now work increases every RS row as follows:

Row 1 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 8 sts left on needle, k4, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 2 and all WS rows (WS): Purl across row.

Row 3 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 9 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k1, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 5 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 10 sts left on needle, k4, yo, ssk, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 7 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k3, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 11 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k3, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 9 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 8 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 11 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 9 sts left on needle, k5, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 13 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k2, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across row until 10 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k2, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 15 (increase row) (RS): K4, **M1R**, k1, k2tog, yo, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across row until 11 sts left on needle, k4, yo, ssk, k1, **M1L**, k4. (2 sts increased)

Row 16 (WS): Purl across row.

Work rows 1 to 16 a total of x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, x, 1) 1, x time, then work rows 1 to 8 one more time.

Sizes 9 and 10 only:

You have increased by x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, x, 16) 16, x sts and there are a total of x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, x, 148) 156, x sts on the needle.

Do not break yarn.

Body

The front is now joined with the back to knit in the round as follows:

Joining round:

Sizes 1, 4, 8, 11 only: *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across the front until 4 sts left on needle, k4, cast on 4 (x, x, 4, x) (x, x, 12, x) x, 20 sts using the backwards-loop technique, *k4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across the back until 4 sts left on needle, k4, cast on 4 (x, x, 4, x) (x, x, 12, x) x, 20 sts using the backwards-loop technique, place a BOR marker and join to work in the round.

Sizes 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 9, and 10 only: *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across the front until 4 sts left on needle, k4, cast on x (0, 0, x, 8) (8, 8, x, 16) 16, x sts using the backwards-loop technique, *yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across the back until 4 sts left on needle, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, cast on x (0, 0, x, 8) (8, 8, x, 16) 16, x sts using the backwards-loop technique, place a BOR marker and join to work in the round.

All sizes.

If required to accommodate the larger number of sts, change to a longer circular needle.

There are now a total 208 (216, 232, 240, 248) (264, 280, 304, 328) 344, 368 sts on the needle.

Round 1: Knit across round.

Round 2: *Yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 3: Knit across round.

Round 4: *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 5: Knit across round.

Round 6: *Yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 7: Knit across round.

Work rounds 1 to 7 once, then work rounds 4 to 7 another 2 (1, 1, 1, 1) (1, 1, 1, 1) 0, 0 time(s).

You will now work a 'section divider' as follows:

Round 1: Purl across round.

Round 2: Purl across round.

Round 3: Knit across round.

Round 4: Knit across round.

Round 5: Purl across round.

Round 6: Purl across round.

Round 7: Knit across round.

You will now work the next textured panel as follows:

Round 1: *P1, k3*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 2: Knit across round.

Round 3: K2, *p1, k3*, repeat between * to * across round until 2 sts left before BOR marker, p1, k1.

Round 4: Knit across round.

Work rounds 1 to 4 a total of 6 times.

Sizes 10 and 11 only: Work rounds 1 and 2 once more.

All sizes

You will now work a 'section divider' as follows:

Round 1: Purl across round.

Round 2: Purl across round.

Round 3: Knit across round.

Round 4: Knit across round.

Round 5: Purl across round.

Round 6: Purl across round.

You will now work the final textured panel in double moss stitch as follows:

Round 1: *K1, p1*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 2: *K1, p1*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 3: *P1, k1*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 4: *P1, k1*, repeat between * to * across round.

Work rounds 1 to 4 a total of 7 times.

It is recommended to try on your sweater here and work more rounds in double moss stitch to lengthen the sweater if that is your preference. You may require more yarn.

Note: if you met row gauge listed at the beginning of the pattern there is a further 10.5 cm still to be worked. This should be factored into your calculation when deciding on the length of your sweater.

You will now work the final 'section divider' as follows:

Round 1: Purl across round.

Round 2: Purl across round.

Round 3: Knit across round.

Round 4: Knit across round.

Round 5: Purl across round.

Round 6: Purl across round

Change to 3.5mm needles and knit one round.

Continue using 3.5mm needles and work *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * until the end of the round.

Work ribbing for 7 cm.

Work 2 rounds of double knitting before binding off using the Italian bind-off technique as follows:

Round 1: *K1, sl1 wyf*, repeat between * to * until end of round.

Round 2: *Sl1 wyb, p1*, repeat between * to * until end of round.

Bind-off using the Italian bind-off technique.

Sleeves

Pick up and knit a total of 80 (80, 88, 88, 88) (96, 96, 104, 112) 120, 128 sts with a 4mm 40 cm circular needle along the armhole edge, which equates to approximately 2 sts for every 3 rows along the back and front of the armholes and 1 st for every cast-on st at the underarm as follows:

For example pick up 27 (28, 31, 32, 29) (31, 31, 34, 36) 38, 40 sts on the back, 49 (52, 57, 52, 51) (57, 57, 58, 60) 66, 68 sts on the front and 4 (0, 0, 4, 8) (8, 8, 12, 16) 16, 20 sts in the cast-on sts at the underarm. Place a BOR marker at the center of the cast-on sts at the underarm.

Note: Sizes 2 and 3 have no underarm cast-on sts to pick up. Place your BOR marker at the center of the underarm.

Break the yarn.

Place an additional marker splitting the sts in half at the top of the shoulder (**shoulder marker**) as follows: 40 (40, 44, 44, 44) (48, 48, 52, 56) 60, 64 sts on the front and 40 (40, 44, 44, 44) (48, 48, 52, 56) 60, 64 sts on the back.

Short rows are now worked to shape the shoulders.

Slip sts from the left needle to the right needle until 24 (24, 26, 26, 26) (28, 28, 30, 34) 36, 38 sts after the **shoulder marker**.

Re-join your yarn and begin with the WS facing as follows:

Row 1 (WS): Knit to 24 (24, 26, 26, 26) (28, 28, 30, 34) 36, 38 sts after the **shoulder marker**, turn work.

Row 2 (RS): Purl to 3 (3, 3, 3, 3) (4, 4, 4, 4) 5, 5 sts after where you re-joined the yarn, turn work.

Row 3 (WS): Purl to 3 (3, 3, 3, 3) (4, 4, 4, 4) 5, 5 sts after last WS row turn, turn work.

Row 4 (RS): Knit to 3 (3, 3, 3, 3) (4, 4, 4, 4) 4, 5 sts after last RS row turn, turn work.

Row 5 (WS): Knit to 3 (3, 3, 3, 3) (4, 4, 4, 4) 4, 5 sts after last WS row turn, turn work.

Row 6 (RS): Purl to 3 (3, 3, 3, 3) (3, 3, 4, 4) 4, 5 sts after last RS row turn, turn work.

Row 7 (WS): Purl to 3 (3, 3, 3, 3) (3, 3, 4, 4) 4, 5 sts after last WS row turn, turn work.

Row 8 (RS): Knit until 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) (3, 3, 4, 4) 4, 4 sts after last RS row turn, turn work.

Row 9 (WS): Knit until 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) (3, 3, 4, 4) 4, 4 sts after last WS row turn, turn work.

Row 10 (RS): Purl to 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) (3, 3, 3, 3) 4, 4 sts after last RS row turn, turn work.

When you turn the work, you will be 3 sts away from the BOR marker located at the underarm.

Row 11 (WS): Purl to 2 (2, 3, 3, 3) (3, 3, 3, 3) 4, 4 sts after last WS row turn, turn work.

When you turn the work, you will be 3 sts away from the BOR marker located at the underarm.

Row 12 (RS): Knit to the BOR marker.

The German short rows are now complete, and you can remove the shoulder marker.

You will now work the lace panel as follows:

Note: The number of times you choose to repeat the lace pattern will determine the length of your sleeve. Each 4-round pattern repeat equates to approximately 1.5 cm in added sleeve length.

Recommendations:

Repeat rounds 1 to 4 a total of 5 times, if you have shorter arms; the finished sleeve length will be 38 cm.

Repeat rounds 1 to 4 a total of 8 times if you have longer arms; the finished sleeve length will be 42 cm.

Round 1: *K4, yo, ssk, k2tog, yo*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 2: Knit across round.

Round 3: *Yo, ssk, k2tog, yo, k4*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 4: Knit across round.

Work rounds 1 to 4 a total of 5 to 8 times, depending on your chosen sleeve length.

You will now work a 'section divider' as follows:

Round 1:

Sizes 1, 2, and 5: Purl across round.

Sizes 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11: P2tog, then purl across round.
(1 st decreased)

Round 2: Purl across round.

Round 3: Knit across round.

Round 4: K2tog, knit across round until 2 sts left, k2tog tbl. (2 sts decreased)

Round 5: Purl across round.

Round 6:

Sizes 1, 2, and 5: Purl across round.

Sizes 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11: Purl across round until 2 sts left before BOR marker, p2tog. (1 st decreased)

Round 7: Knit across round.

A total of 2 (2, 4, 4, 2) (4, 4, 4, 4) 4, 4 sts have been decreased.

There are now a total of 78 (78, 84, 84, 86) (92, 92, 100, 108) 116, 124 sts on the needle.

You will now work the next textured panel.

Sizes 10 and 11 only: At the same time, you will work a decrease round a total of x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, x, 4) 6 times during the 24 rounds of the textured panel.

You will work the decreases in the following rounds:

Size 10: Rounds 4, 8, 16, and 20.

Size 11: Rounds 4, 8, 12, 16, 20, and 22.

Decrease round: ssk, knit across round to until 2 sts left before BOR marker, k2tog tbl. (2 sts decreased)

Note: Maintain the stitch pattern as established in rounds 1-4 as you work the decrease rounds. This means you may need to start the stitch pattern in a different point than in the written instructions below.

Sizes 1, 2, and 5 only:

Round 1: K2, *p1, k3*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 2: Knit across round.

Round 3: *P1, k3*, repeat between * to * across round until 2 sts left, p1, k1.

Round 4: Knit across round.

Work rounds 1 to 4 a total of 6 times.

Sizes 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 only:

Round 1: *P1, k3*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 2: Knit across round.

Round 3: K2, *p1, k3*, repeat between * to * across round until 2 sts left, p1, k1.

Round 4: Knit across round.

Work rounds 1 to 4 a total of 6 times.

Sizes 10 and 11 only:

A total of x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, x, 8) 12 sts have been decreased. There are now a total of x (x, x, x, x) (x, x, x, 108) 112 sts on the needles.

All sizes.

You will now work a 'section divider' as follows:

Sizes 1 and 2 only:

Round 1: Purl across round.

Round 2: Purl across round.

Round 3: Knit across round.

Round 4: Knit across round.

Round 5: Purl across round.

Round 6: Purl across round.

Round 1:

Sizes 1, 2, 4, and 5 only: Purl across round.

Sizes 3, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 only: P2tog, then purl across round.
(1 st decreased)

Round 2: Purl across round.

Round 3: Knit across round.

Round 4:

Sizes 1 and 2 only: Knit across round.

Sizes 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 only: K2tog, knit across round until 2 sts left before BOR marker, k2tog tbl. (2 sts decreased)

Round 5: Purl across round.

Round 6:

Sizes 1, 2, 4, and 5 only: Purl across round.

Sizes 3, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 only: Purl across round until 2 sts left before BOR marker, p2tog. (1 st decreased)
A total of 0 (0, 4, 2, 2) (4, 4, 4, 4) 4, 4 sts have been decreased.
There are now a total of 78 (78, 80, 82, 84) (88, 88, 96, 104) 104, 108 sts on the needle.

You will now work the final textured panel in double moss stitch.

Sizes 6, 8, 9, 10, and 11 only: At the same time, you will work a decrease round a total of x (x, x, x, x) (2, x, 4, 6) 6, 6 times during the 28 rounds of the double moss stitch panel. You will work the decreases in the following rounds:

Size 6: Rounds 14 and 28.

Size 8: Rounds 6, 12, 18, and 24.

Sizes 9, 10, and 11: Rounds 4, 8, 12, 16, 20, and 24.

Decrease round: Ssk, work across the round maintaining the stitch pattern until 2 sts left before BOR marker, p2tog tbl. (2 sts decreased)

Note: Use ssp or k2tog tbl as needed to maintain the stitch pattern.

All sizes:

Round 1: *K1, p1*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 2: *K1, p1*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 3: *P1, k1*, repeat between * to * across round.

Round 4: *P1, k1*, repeat between * to * across round.

Work rounds 1 to 4 a total of 7 times.

A total of 0 (0, 0, 0, 0) (4, 0, 8, 12) 12, 12 sts have been decreased. There are now a total of 78 (78, 80, 82, 84) (84, 88, 88, 92) 92, 96 sts on the needles.

It is recommended to try on your sweater here and work more rounds in double moss stitch to lengthen the sleeve if that is your preference. You may require more yarn.

Note: if you met row gauge listed at the beginning of the pattern there is a further 10.5 cm still to be worked. This should be factored into your calculation when deciding on the length of your sleeve.

You will now work the final 'section divider' as follows:

Round 1:

Sizes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, and 10: Purl across round.

Sizes 7, 9, and 11: P2tog, then purl across round. (1 st decreased)

Round 2: Purl across round.

Round 3: Knit across round.

Round 4:

Sizes 1 and 2: Knit across round.

Sizes 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11: K2tog, knit across round until 2 sts left before BOR marker, k2tog tbl. (2 sts decreased)

Round 5: Purl across round.

Round 6:

Sizes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, and 10: Purl across round.

Sizes 7, 9, and 11: Purl across round until 2 sts left before BOR marker, p2tog tbl. (1 st decreased)

A total of 0 (0, 2, 2, 2) (2, 4, 2, 4) 2, 4 sts have been decreased.
There are now a total of 78 (78, 78, 80, 82) (82, 84, 86, 88) 90, 92 sts on the needle.

Change to 3.5mm needles and knit one round while working k2tog decreases evenly across the round a total of 6 times:

Sizes 1, 2, 3, 7, and 10 only: *K11 (11, 11, x, x) (x, 12, x, x) 13, x, k2tog; repeat from * to end of round.

Sizes 4, 8, and 11 only: K1, *k x (x, x, 11, x) (x, x, 12, x) x, 13, k2tog; repeat from * to last st, k1.

Sizes 5, 6, and 9 only: K2, *k x (x, x, x, 11) (11, x, x, 12), x, x, k2tog; repeat from * to last 2 sts, k2.

All sizes.

There are now a total of 72 (72, 72, 74, 76) (76, 78, 80, 82) 84, 86 sts on the needle.

Continue using 3.5mm needles and work *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * until the end of the round.

Work ribbing for 7 cm.

Work 2 rounds of double knitting before binding off using the Italian bind-off technique as follows:

Round 1: *K1, sl1 wyf*, repeat between * to * until end of round.

Round 2: *Sl1 wyb, p1*, repeat between * to * until end of round.

Bind-off using the Italian bind-off technique.

Repeat for second sleeve.

Neck

The neck edge is worked in the round. Using 3mm 40 cm needles, start at the right side of the neck from the back cast-on edge with the RS facing and pick up and knit 110 (110, 110, 114, 114) (118, 124, 128, 128) 128, 132 sts along the neck edge using your chosen yarn. This works out as picking up one stitch for every stitch/row along the back of the neck, along the cast-on sts joining the left and right shoulders at the front of the neck, and approximately 3 out of every 4 rows along the sides of the neck.

For example, 41 (41, 41, 43, 43) (45, 45, 47, 49) 49, 51 sts along the cast-on edge of the back, 24 (24, 24, 24, 24) (24, 27, 27, 27) 27, 27 along the left side of the neck, 21 (21, 21, 23, 23) (25, 25, 27, 25) 25, 27 sts along the cast-on edge between the front left and right at the front of the neck, and 24 (24, 24, 24, 24) (24, 27, 27, 27) 27, 27 sts along the right side of the neck.

Place a BOR marker.

Continue using 3mm needles and work *k1, p1*, repeat between * to * until the end of the round.

Work ribbing for 28 rounds in total.

Fold the neckband over towards the wrong side of your sweater. Knit the stitches on your needle together with the

stitches from the corresponding picked-up edge whilst at the same time binding off.

Nb) Bind the stitches of loosely so the neckband is not too tight.

Finishing

Weave in all ends.
