About

Size: (a) b (c) d (e) f (g) h.

Your bust circumference: (80) 90 (100) 110 (120) 130 (140) 150 cm.

Total bust width of the sweater: 95 (105) 115 (125) 135 (145) 155 (165) cm.

Full length, measured CF below the neckline: 48 (50) 52 (54) 56 (58) 60 (62) cm.

Positive ease: This sweater has a positive ease at approximately 20 cm, depending on your bust circumference. When deciding which size to knit, choose the one which corresponds to your own actual bust circumference.

Gauge: 24 sts x 32 rows = 10 x 10 cm in Stockinette Stitch, at needle size 3,5 mm (after washing).

Needle sizes: 2 different needle sizes are used, whilst knitting the sweater:

- 2 sets of circular needles 3 mm (the lengths 40 and 60 cm are recommended).
- Circular needles 3,5 mm (the lengths 40, 60 and 80 cm are recommended).

Yarn: The sweater is knitted with 1 thread, in each of the 3 colours:

Colour A (main colour): "Finull", in shade "402", Rauma (175 m pr 50 g).

Colour B (contrast colour): "Finull", in shade "0424", Rauma (175 m pr 50 g).

Colour C (contrast colour): "Finull", in shade "0467", Rauma (175 m pr 50 g).

Amount: The following amounts are used when knitting the sweater:

Colour A: 250 (300) 350 (400) 450 (500) 550 (600) g.

Colour B: 50 (50) 50 (100) 100 (100) 150 (150) g.

Colour C: 50 (50) 50 (100) 100 (100) 150 (150) g.

Method: This sweater is knitted top-down in the round in Stockinette Stitch, with raglan increases shaping the yoke. All edges of the blouse are knitted in 2x2 rib, and are broad and double layered. To create the two coloured pattern of the sweater, a chart is followed down along the whole work.

Before you begin

- Please read the entire pattern before casting on.
- Be sure to make a swatch before beginning, to ensure the right gauge.
- In this pattern, the following methods are used: Judy's Magic Cast On, 2x2 rib, 3-needle knitting, Stockinette Stitch, right- and left leaning decreases and increases.

Pattern

Neckline

With *colour A* and 2 sets of circular needles 3 mm, cast on (224) 232 (240) 248 (256) 264 (272) 280 sts, using the method "Judy's Magic Cast On" - (112) 116 (120) 124 (128) 132 (136) 140 sts on each set.

Now, knit *k 2, p 2* for the first (112) 116 (120) 124 (128) 132 (136) 140 sts, and then place the following (112) 116 (120) 124 (128) 132 (136) 140 sts on a thread to rest - the resting sts must later be used when folding the neckline to become double layered.

Over the (112) 116 (120) 124 (128) 132 (136) 140 sts which are left on the needle, continue to knit in the rnd in the following way:

Gather work, and place a M between the first and last st = M1 and BOR.

Knit *k 2, p 2* until the neckline measures 12 cm in total.

Now, the neckline must be folded, and then knitted together using the method 3-needle knitting. This is done in the following way:

Starting at BOR, place the 112 (116) 120 (124) 128 (132) 136 (140) resting sts onto a new circular needle 3 mm, and place the 2 needles with their WS facing each other, so that the neckline will be knitted together from the RS.

Now, *k2tog* (1 st from each of the 2 needle sets) throughout the rnd.

K 1 rnd, whilst at the same time evenly increasing 0 (8) 16 (24) 32 (40) 48 (56) sts, using the method m1L. There is now a total of 112 (124) 136 (148) 160 (172) 184 (196) sts on the needle.

Change to circular needle 3,5 mm, and k 1 rnd whilst at the same time placing 8 rM's:

K 18 (20) 22 (24) 26 (28) 30 (32) (*back*), place rM1, k 6, place rM2, k 8 (10) 12 (14) 16 (18) 20 (22) (*1st sleeve*), place rM3, k 6, place rM4, k 36 (40) 44 (48) 52 (56) 60 (64) (*front*), place rM5, k 6, place rM6, 8 (10) 12 (14) 16 (18) 20 (22) (*2nd sleeve*), place rM7, k 6, place rM8, k 18 (20) 22 (24) 26 (28) 30 (32) (*back*).

Yoke

The yoke, with its raglan increases, must now be made, whilst at the same time following *Chart 1*, to create the pattern of the sweater.

Chart 1 is 24 rows in height, and 2 sts in width, which are repeated throughout each of the 24 rows. Please note, that *Chart 1* is repeated throughout the whole work, and only finished when reaching the rib edge of the body and sleeves.

Now, follow the instructions below:

Join *colour B* and *C* to the work, and begin to knit *Chart 1* (and repeat it in height and width, until reaching the point where the rib edges of the body and sleeves must be knitted), whilst at the same time knitting raglan increases in the following way:

1st rnd: K until reaching rM1, m1R, move rM1, k 6, move rM2, m1L, k until reaching rM3, m1R, move rM3, k 6, move rM4, m1L, k until reaching rM5, m1R, move rM5, k 6, move rM6, m1L, k until reaching rM7, m1R, move rM7, k 6, move rM8, m1L, k the remaining sts.

2nd rnd: K all sts.

Knit the *1st-2nd rnd* in a total of 34 (36) 38 (40) 42 (44) 46 (48) times.

There are now 384 (412) 440 (468) 496 (524) 552 (580) sts on the needle.

On the next rnd, divide the work for body and sleeves in the following way:

- Starting at BOR, k until 3 sts after rM1.
- Place the next 82 (88) 94 (100) 106 (112) 118 (124) sts on a thread to rest (*1st sleeve*).
- Cast on 4 (8) 12 (16) 20 (24) 28 (32) sts and place a M (=sM1) after the 2. (4.) 6. (8.) 10. (12.) 14. (16.) new st - let sM1 rest in the work until the sleeves must be knitted.
- K until 3 sts after rM5.
- Place the next 82 (88) 94 (100) 106 (112) 118 (124) sts on a thread to rest (*2nd sleeve*).
- Cast on 4 (8) 12 (16) 20 (24) 28 (32) sts and place a M (=sM2) after the 2. (4.) 6. (8.) 10. (12.) 14. (16.) new st - let sM2 rest in the work until the sleeves must be knitted.
- K the remaining sts.

There is now a total of 228 (252) 276 (300) 324 (348) 372 (396) sts for the body.

Remove the 8 rM's from the work, and mark the last knitted rnd in *Chart 1*, to know from where to begin, when later knitting the sleeves.

Body

Now the body must be knitted - this is done in the following way:

Continue to k in the rnd following *Chart 1*, until the sweater is 42 (44) 46 (48) 50 (52) 54 (56) cm (or until 6 cm from being the preferred length), measured CF from below the neckline.

Break the yarn in colour *B* and *C*, and stop knitting *Chart 1* - from this point onwards, the body will only be knitted with *colour A*.

A series of decreases must now be knitted, to make the sweater more fitted at the bottom.

Change to circular needle 3 mm and k 1 rnd, whilst at the same time evenly decreasing 24 sts, using the method k2tog.

There is now a total of 204 (228) 252 (276) 300 (324) 348 (372) sts on the needle.

Now, the finishing rib edge, which is double layered, must be knitted:

K 1 rnd of rib (*k 2, p 2*) and place a marking thread CB (M1) in this row.

Let M1 rest in the work, whilst continuing knitting the edge - the thread indicates from which horizontal row you later must pick up sts, to finish the double layered edge.

Continue in rib (*k 2, p 2*), until the edge measures 12 cm.

Now the edge must be folded, and then knitted together using the method 3-needle knitting. This is done in the following way:

With a new set of 3 mm needles, and starting from the WS at M1, pick up 204 (228) 252 (276) 300 (324) 348 (372) sts along the marked horizontal row.

Place the 2 needles with their WS facing each other, so that the double layered edge will be knitted together from the WS.

Now, finish the edge, by knitting the next rnd in the following way (make sure not to bind off too tight, nor too loosely):

K2tog *k2tog (1 st from each needle), bind off 1 st*, and repeat *-* throughout the rnd.

Break the yarn.

Sleeves

Now, the 2 sleeves must be knitted.

With needle size 3,5 mm, and starting at sM1 from the RS, pick up 2 (4) 6 (8) 10 (12) 14 (16) sts directly along the armhole cast on row (the new sts are to the left of sM1).

In continuation hereof, place the resting 82 (88) 94 (100) 106 (112) 118 (124) sleeve sts onto the needle, and finish, by picking up 2 (4) 6 (8) 10 (12) 14 (16) new sts from the armhole cast on row (these sts are to the right of sM1).

There is now a total of 86 (96) 106 (116) 126 (136) 146 (156) sts on the needle.
Let sM1 continue around in the work, as it marks BOR.

Join *colour A, B and C* to the work.

The sleeve is now knitted in the rnd following *Chart 1* (starting at the rnd, which was marked after dividing for body and sleeves), whilst decreasing evenly down along the work. Knit the first rnd in the following way:

K 1, k2tog, k until 3 sts before sM1, k2tog tbl, k 1.

Continue to knit the sleeve following the instructions below:

*K 7 (7) 6 (6) 5 (5) 4 (4) rnds.

Knit the next rnd in the following way: k 1, k2tog, k until 3 sts before sM1, k2tog tbl, k 1.*

Knit *-* in a total of 14 (15) 16 (17) 18 (19) 20 (21) times.

There is now 56 (64) 72 (80) 88 (96) 104 (112) sts on the needle.

Continue to k in the rnd, following *Chart 1*, without any decreases, until the sleeve is 40 (40) 41 (41) 42 (42) 43 (43) cm (or 6 cm from being the preferred length), measured from the armhole cast on row and downwards.

Break the yarn in *colour B and C*, and stop knitting *Chart 1* - from this point onwards, the sleeve will only be knitted with *colour A*.

Change to circular needle 3 mm and k 1 rnd, whilst at the same time decreasing 8 (12) 16 (20) 24 (28) 32 (36) sts evenly, using the method k2tog.

There are now a total of 48 (52) 56 (60) 64 (68) 72 (76) sts on the needle.

Now, the finishing rib edge, which is double layered, must be knitted:

K 1 rnd of rib (*k 2, p 2*) and place a marking thread CB (M1) in this row.

Let M1 rest in the work, whilst continuing knitting the edge - the thread indicates from which horizontal row you later must pick up sts, to finish the double layered edge.

Continue in rib (*k 2, p 2*), until the edge measures 12 cm.

Now the edge must be folded, and then knitted together using the method 3-needle knitting.
This is done in the following way:

With a new set of 3 mm needles, and starting from the WS at M1, pick up 48 (52) 56 (60) 64 (68) 72 (76) sts along the marked horizontal row.

Place the 2 needles with their WS facing each other, so that the double layered edge will be knitted together from the WS.

Now, finish the edge, by knitting the next rnd in the following way (make sure not to bind off too tight, nor too loosely):

K2tog *k2tog (1 st from each needle), bind off 1 st*, and repeat *-* throughout the rnd.

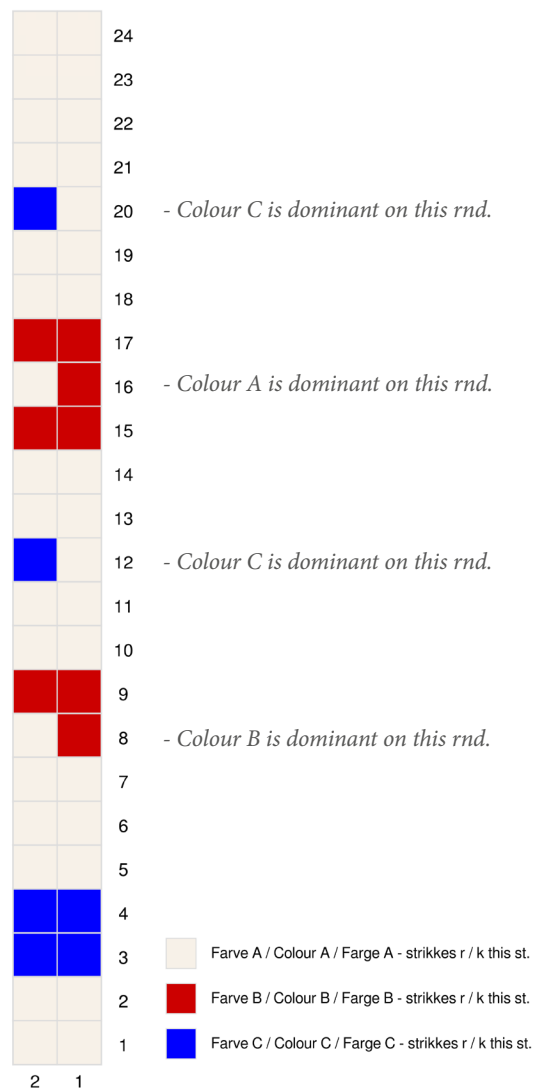
Break the yarn.

Knit the 2nd sleeve in the same way.

Finishing

- Weave in all ends.
- Rinse the sweater in lukewarm water with wool soap, lay it into shape, and let it dry laying flat.
