Dictionary

st(s) // stitch(es)

r // row

rnd(s) // round(s)

BOR // beginning of round

k // knit

p // purl

k tbl // knit through back loop

p tbl // purl through back loop

sl st // slip st

pss0 // pass the slipped st over

k2tog // knit 2 sts together

k2tog tbl // knit 2 sts together through the back loop

p2tog // purl 2 sts together

p2tog tbl // purl 2 sts together through the back loop

s1wyif // slip 1 with yarn held in front

dec // decrease

inc // increase

yo // yarn over

m1L // make 1 left inc, knitwise

m1R // make 1 right inc, knitwise

m1P // make 1 left inc, purlwise

M // marker

cM // chart marker

Northern Augustins no.1

Size : a (b) c (d) e (f) g (h).

Your bust circumference : 80 (90) 100 (110) 120 (130) 140 (150) cm.

Full length, measured CF below the neckline : 52 (54) 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 (66) cm.

Positive ease : This sweater has a positive ease of approximately 5-10 cm, depending on your bust circumference. When you're deciding which size to knit, choose the one which corresponds to your own actual bust circumference.

Gauge : 16 sts x 22 rows = 10 x 10 cm in Stockinette Stitch at needle size 6 mm.

Needle size : Circular needles 5 + 6 (40 / 60 / 80 cm).

Yarn : The sweater is knitted with 2 colours of yarn, and with 2 threads of each colour.

Colour A: New Zealand lambswool, G-uld (450 m pr 100g).

Colour B: New Zealand lambswool, G-uld (450 m pr 100g).

Amount :

Colour A: 300 (300) 350 (400) 450 (500) (550) 550 g.

Colour B: 100 (100) 125 (125) 150 (150) (175) 175g.

Work : The sweater is knitted top-down in the round in multicoloured Stockinette Stitch, with finishing rib edges.

Pattern

Before you begin

Please read the entire pattern before casting on.

Be sure to make a swatch before you begin, to ensure the right gauge.

Increasing method: When increases are made to shape the yoke, left leaning increases are used. The increases are knitted in the following way:

m1L: Work to the place where the increase is to be made. Insert the left side needle from front to back into the horizontal strand between the two stitches. Knit the stitch through the back loop.

Knitting with dominance: for this sweater, colour B is the dominant colour. When knitting, hold colour B over your index finger, whilst holding colour A over both your index- and middle finger. Thereby, colour B becomes the dominant colour, as it is closest to your knit-wear.

Neckline

With circular needles 5 mm and 2 threads of colour A, cast on 76 (78) 80 (82) 84 (86) 88 (90) sts with the Italian tubular cast on method.

Gather work and place a M between the first and last st = BOR.

Knit *k 1, p 1* in the rnd until the neckline measures 16 cm.

Change to circular needles 6 mm and k 1 rnd.

At the next rnd, inc 16 (22) 28 (34) 40 (46) 52 (58) sts evenly.

There are now a total of 92 (100) 108 (116) 124 (132) 140 (148) sts on the needles.

K 1 rnd.

Yoke

Join 2 threads of colour B to the work.

Starting at BOR, knit all 48 rnds of “*Chart 1*”.

When “*Chart 1*” is finished, there are a total of 230 (250) 270 (290) 310 (330) 350 (370) sts on the needles.

Starting at BOR, knit begin to knit “*Chart 2*”, and repeat this until the yoke is 23 (24) 25 (26) 27 (28) 29 (30) cm, measured below the neckline.

On the next rnd, and whilst still following “*Chart 2*”, divide the work for body and sleeves:

Start at BOR, place the next 55 (55) 60 (60) 65 (65) 70 (70) sts on a stitch holder (1st sleeve), cast on 10 sts, k 60 (70) 75 (85) 90 (100) 105 (115) sts (front), place the next 55 (55) 60 (60) 65 (65) 70 (70) sts on a stitch holder (2nd sleeve), cast on 10 sts, k 60 (70) 75 (85) 90 (100) 105 (115) sts (back).

Body

There are now a total of 140 (160) 170 (190) 200 (220) 230 (250) sts on the needles.

Still following “*Chart 2*”, k in the rnd until the sweater is 48 (50) 52 (54) 56 (58) 60 (62) cm (or 4 cm from preferred length), measured CF from below the neckline.

Break the yarn in colour B and change to circular needles 5 mm - from this point onwards, the body is only knitted with colour A.

Knit *k 1, p1* for 4 cm.

With the italian tubular bind off method, bind off all sts.

Sleeves

Now, the sleeves must be knitted.

Place the first sleeve’s sts on circular needles 6 mm and pick up 10 sts from the underarm cast on row with colour A, starting at the center of the row. Place a M between the first and last st = BOR.

There are now a total of 65 (65) 70 (70) 75 (75) 80 (80) sts on the needles.

Still following “*Chart 2*”, k in the rnd until the sleeve is 40 (40) 41 (41) 42 (42) 43 (43) cm (or is 4 cm from preferred length), measured from the underarm cast on row and downwards.

At the next rnd, dec evenly to 32 (32) 34 (34) 36 (36) 40 (40) sts.

Break the yarn in colour B and change to circular needles 5 mm - from this point onwards, the sleeve is only knitted with colour A.

Knit *k 1, p1* for 4 cm.


With the italian tubular bind off method, bind off all sts.

Repeat instructions for the second sleeve.

Finishing

Weave in all ends.

Rinse the sweater by hand in luke warm water and let it dry laying flat.
