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HELLO, CREATIVE SOUL!

SIZE:

GRINCH is approx. 38cm/16 inches tall.

YARN

I prefer using 10 ply/aran/worsted wool texture yarn. The yarn should be about 100 meters for every 50 grams (length and weight are the most important factors, so please keep them in mind when choosing your yarn). You can use a different texture yarn, but be sure to check the tension/gauge.

For this project, I used red and white stripes for the Grinch's body and arms because I ran out of green yarn. If you'd like, you can make the entire body in green without the stripes!

All patterns by @Polushkabunny are assigned a category. Each category has a list of the yarns. That means you can choose any yarn from the recommended yarn list. All the patterns of the E category can use any yarn from the E category yarn list.

TOOLS

A pair of 3mm one pointed needles or circular needles with a cord (work in rows).
Tapestry needle for sewing parts together (short and long)

GAUGE/TENSION

12 stitches x 16 rows over 5cm/2in with 3mm knitting needles (stockinette stitch). If the measurements of your swatch are slightly different, don't worry. If your sample turned out to be larger than the reference, then your yarn is too thick, you need to pick up the different yarn.

OTHER MATERIALS

Stuffing approx.100g

Ø13mm black safety eyes x2

A bit of black embroidery thread or wool (for a mouth)



TIPS

Stuffing soft toy

The way you stuff will be crucial in determining the finished product shape. For the toy, I use a hollow fiber and I recommend putting in small amounts of stuffing and building up a shape. Try to fill up right to the end, in all corners.

Insert a tapestry needle carefully between knitted stitches from outside to move stuffing perfectly into place and 'sculpt' the stuffed pieces.

Eyes

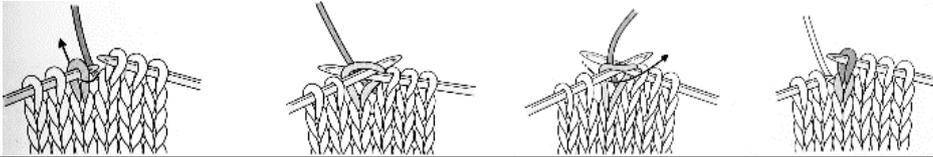
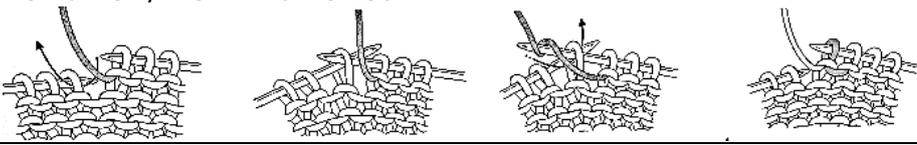
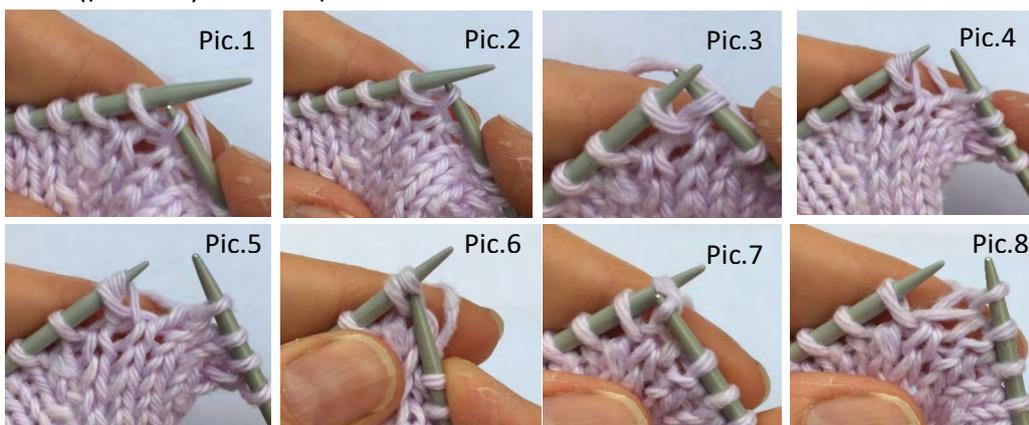
If the toy is for a child under 3, it is recommended that you embroider the eyes for safety reasons.

**HEAD** (1 version only - Knitted flat 2 needles)

Note: Cut a piece of green yarn about 40 cm (approximately 16 inches) long; we will use this for shaping.

	Green: Cast on 24 sts using a Long Tail Cast On Method
Row 1	slP, Purl across [24]
Row 2	slK, K1, *(RLI, K4)from*rep x5, RLI, K1, P1 [30]
Row 3	slK, Purl across [30]
Row 4	slK, K8, *(RLI, K1)from*rep x12, K8, P1 [42]
Row 5	slK, Purl across [42]
Row 6	slK, K8, *(K1, RLI, K1)from*rep x12, K8, P1 [54]
Row 7	slK, Purl across [54]
Row 8	slK, K8, *(RLI, K3)from*rep x12, K8, P1 [66]
Row 9	slK, Purl across [66]
Row 10	slK, K8, *(K2, RLI, K2)from*rep x12, K8, P1 [78]
Row 11-23	slK, Stockinette stitch, P1 [78]

	<p>NOTE: +video It's crucial to complete this step, as it greatly impacts the final appearance of the head. Using a tapestry needle and a piece of the green yarn, we'll create a whip stitch down the center of the head to help shape the face. Start by positioning your work with the wrong side facing you. Count 18-19 stitches from the beginning of the row and stitch through the next 26-28 stitches, making sure to leave long tails on both ends on the <i>Right Side</i>. This technique will help keep the increases from stretching when we stuff the head. Watch the video tutorial providing for this project by scanning the QR code.</p>

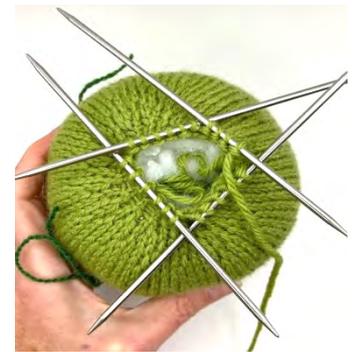
BODY (knitted flat 2 needles)

NOTE: You can knit the body in the round. Before you begin knitting the body in the round, refer to the Assembling section. There, you'll find instructions on placing safety eyes, securing them, sewing the head, and stuffing it.

To start knittign the body, **Pick up and knit 22 stitches from the cast-on edge across 4 needles. Follow the pattern provided below but ignore the edge stitches (K1 at the start and P1 at the end). The number of stitches for each round will be 2 less than what is indicated in the brackets in the pattern.

**Note: "Pick up and knit" means to use yarn to "knit up" stitches along the edge. You are to grab the stitch at the edge of the work with the working needle, wrap the working yarn around it, and pull the yarn through

	Green: **Pick up and knit (see Note**above) 24 stitches along the casted on edge.
Row 1	slP, Purl across [24]
Row 2	slK, *(RLI, K11)from*rep x2, P1 [26]

There are both knitting version (knitted flat and knitted in the round) are provided. For the knitted in the round use 3mm double pointed needles.

ARMS (knitted in the round). Bottom-up

Rd 1-34	Knit around changing color in each 5 th rd [15]

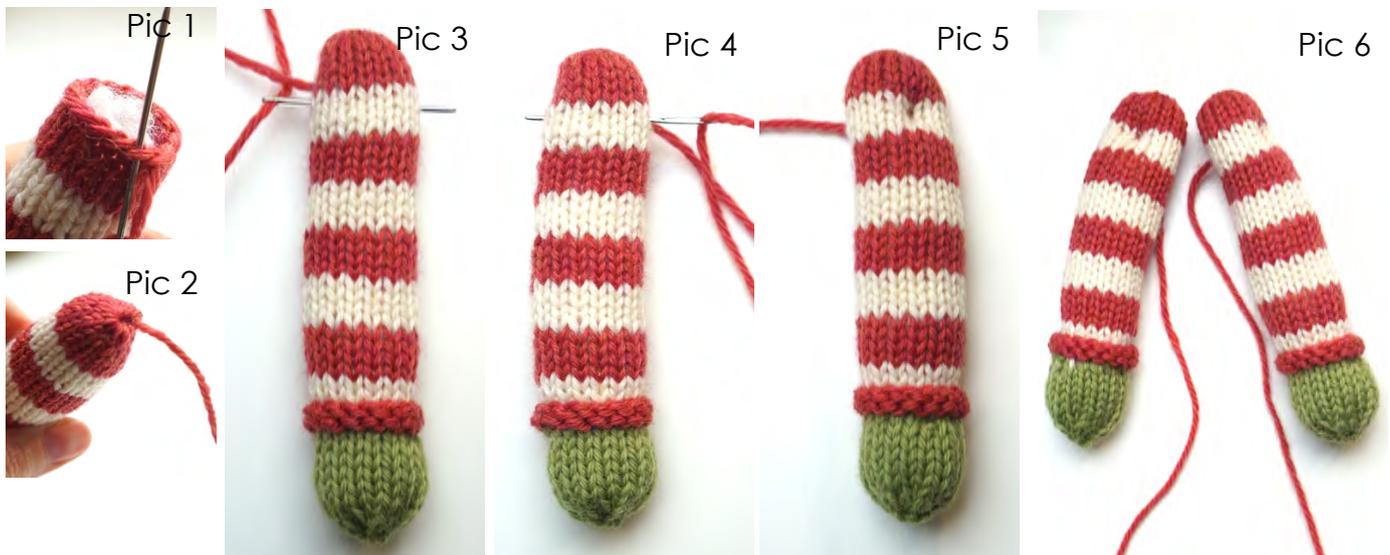

Row 10	sK, K2tog x3 [7]

Cut off a thread, leaving a long tail for sewing. Work a tapestry needle with the tail through remaining stitches and pull tight.

Sew the on the right side, matching row ends and using a mattress stitch. Stuff as you work.

MAKE UP ARMS: Work a tapestry needle with the tail left in the beginning of the knitting through casted on stitches (pic 1), pull tight (pic.2). Leave the tail for shaping and attaching. Using the tail “squeeze” a top of an arm shaping a “shoulder”, just make several stitches back and forth (through this point we will attach the arm to the body). Do not cut off a thread, leave it for attaching (pic.3-6).



LEGS. Both options. Bottom Up.

Work tapestry needle through remaining stitches. Leave a long tail for attaching

- **+video tutorial** (Knitted Grinch) Sew the sole in whip stitch on the right side working through the outer legs of the stitches only.
- Sew the back of the leg in mattress stitch on the Right Side stuffing as you work.
- Using the tail for attaching “squeeze” the top of the leg by 2 stitches to shape a “hip” (pass the thread through the stuffing from one side to another back and forth).

FACE SHAPING

PLACE SAFETY EYES into the stitches that mark the spots for placing safety eyes. Secure the safety eyes.

SEW THE HEAD on the right side, matching row ends and using a mattress stitch. Begin from the top head, working down the head. When the sewing process is complete stuff the head. Please refer to the provided images and follow the recommendations:

- Do not overstuff, don't let the stitches stretch.
- **Distribute the stuffing throughout the toy by inserting a long thin sewing needle into the knitted stitches and moving the stuffing around to fill the space.**
- Move stuffing up to the top of the head shaping a high forehead. The arrows in the pictures show how to distribute stuffing.

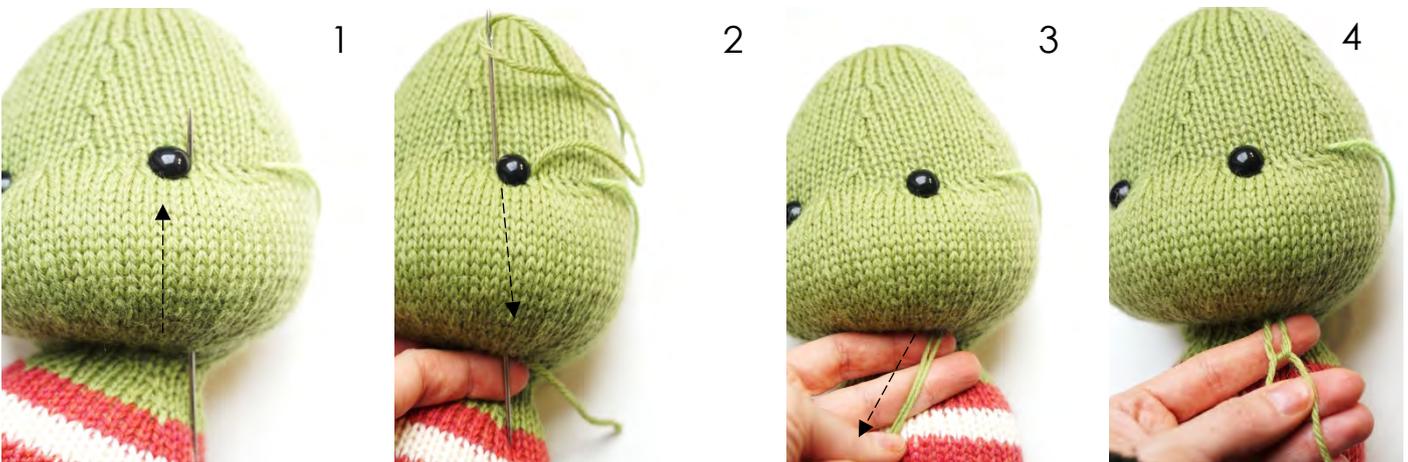


SEW THE BODY on the right side, matching row ends and using a mattress stitch, stuffing as you go. Please refer to the provided images and follow the recommendations regarding measurements on previous page.

EYE SOCKETS (necessary) [+video tutorial](#) (Knitted Grinch):

Now we should make eye sockets using a long needle and a green yarn. Follow the instruction and the video tutorial:

1. The needle with the thread goes from the bottom (a neck, pic.1) toward to eye inner or outer "corner" (pic.1) and then through the eye opposite corner (pic.2) goes back to the start point.
2. Leave both tails outside at the start point.
3. Repeat the same for the second eye.



4. To shape the eye sockets, you have two pairs of yarn ends at the neck. Tighten each pair by pulling on the tails (see pics 3-4). It's best to leave these tails until you've finished assembling the face, as you may want to adjust them for a better cheeks shape.

Weave in ends after the face will be complete.



Embroidery +video tutorial (Knitted Grinch)

Use sewing pins to mark places for eyebrows, mouth.

Embroider a nose with a dark green. Make several horizontal wide stitches without tightening them.

Embroider the mouth and eyebrows with a black yarn (for eyebrows you can use dark green as used for the nose too).

Create some fun eyelids for your Grinch to add a dash of "personality" using the same green yarn used to knit the toy.

HAIR +video tutorial (Knitted Grinch)

To create a hair, simply attach green yarn on the cheeks and head.



If you want to shape the cheeks or gather stretched stitches, you can use the thread ends from the whip stitches made in the center of the face. Simply hold the tail in one hand and gently pull the stitches together with the other for a smooth finish. Once you're happy with the shape, weave in the ends.

For a visual guide, check out my video tutorial where I walk you through this process step by step.



ARM/LEG ATTACHING +video tutorial (Knitted Grinch)

To attach the legs and arms, follow these steps:

1. Use the tails left on each leg and arm for this purpose.
2. Using a long needle, insert the tail through the body at the spot where you want to attach the first leg or arm (see pic. 1).
3. Pull the thread through the body to the opposite side and make a securing stitch there (just a small stitch at the place -pic.2).
4. Thread the tail through the second leg/arm at its attachment point (pic.3).
5. Make here a securing stitch to fix the thread in place (pic.4).
6. Then pull the tail back and forth through the body and legs/arms (through the attaching points) several times to ensure a secure attachment. Weave in end.
7. Then pull the tail of the second leg/arm back and forth through the body and legs/arms. Weave in ends.





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
