BECAUSE WE ALL NEED A LITTLE ROMANCE . . .

This is a collection of five patterns, three of which are available individually and the other two are exclusive to the collection.

All patterns are unashamedly romantic and feminine. Some are beaded, some are pointy, some are ruffled, all are enjoyable to knit and wonderful to wear!

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DARE TO DREAM

BOO KNITS

This is a little shawl that is quietly sophisticated and heavily beaded – unashamedly romantic, so airy and so dreamy with a little extra weight coming from the beads, it stays in place and feels so very, very luxurious. The open, lacy pattern is reminiscent of the art deco period, geometric, linear and yet still elegantly feminine.

REQUIREMENTS

Yarn: DyeForYarn Tussah Silk Lace 100g/695m skein (I used 380m for the second size – required yardage will vary according to size knit, chosen yarn and tension)

Finished size Medium size measures 66" (168cm) wide along top edge, 106" (268cm) wide along bottom edge, 19" (48cm) deep using DyeForYarn Tussah Silk Lace

Needles : 4mm (US6), 4.5mm (US7) and 5mm (US8)

Beads and crochet hook size 0.75mm (small enough to fit through the hole of your chosen beads – I used approx 500 beads for the green shawl – I would recommend size 5's or 6's though beads are optional – it looks lovely without them too!), Stitch Markers, Yarn Needle and Blocking Pins


Gauge is not critical and any yarn is suitable for this pattern though needle size and yardage requirements will vary.

Size Options: The body of the shawl can be adjusted to suit your own style. Details for changing the size of the shawl can be found in the pattern notes. Yarn and bead requirements stated are for the small version.

NB. PLEASE READ THROUGH THE ENTIRE PATTERN BEFORE STARTING TO KNIT THIS SHAWL

ABBREVIATIONS

k - knit
p - purl
ktb - knit through the back of the stitch
kyok - knit without dropping the original stitch, bring the yarn forward and knit the same stitch again
k2tog - knit 2 stitches together as one
ssk - slip a stitch knitwise, slip another knitwise, transfer to left hand needle and knit together through the back
s2kpsso - slip next 2 stitches together as to knit, k1, pass 2 slipped stitches over (centred 2 stitch decreased)
yo - yarn over
bo - bind off or cast off
co - cast on
pm - place marker
slm - slip marker
cs - centre stitch



HELPFUL HINTS: The first and last two stitches of every row should be knit with the first and last knit through the back (ktb). The yarn overs (yo) in this pattern help to keep the top edge of the shawl pucker free and also need to be of a uniform size. At the edges of the shawl I do mine in the following way:- **Between a knit and a purl** – bring the yarn over your work, under the needle, over the needle to the back and under again ready to purl your next stitch. **Between a purl and a knit** – bring your yarn to the back of your work, over your work and under the needle, over the back of the needle and under again to the back of your work ready for your next knit stitch. **Between two knit stitches** – bring the yarn over your needle to the front and then under the needle, over your work to the back ready for your next knit stitch. **Between two purl stitches** – bring the yarn over the needle towards the back of your work and then under the needle, over your work to the front ready for your next purl stitch.

INSTRUCTIONS

With 4mm needles (US6) cast on two stitches, knit seven rows, at the end of the last row do not turn work but rotate 90 degrees, pick up and knit one stitch in each of the three garter ridge, turn and knit two stitches in the cast on edge. (7 sts).

HELPFUL HINT:- I found it useful to place stitch markers every 12 stitches. With right side of work facing place one with five stitches between the right marker of the centre stitch and one with six stitches between it and the marker to the left of the centre stitch, as soon as you have enough stitches to do so. Each new marker can be placed with 12 stitches between each. If you do this as you knit the main body it makes stitch counting much quicker and easier and falls in the correct position for the start of the lace pattern.

INSTRUCTIONS – 4mm (US 6) needles

Set up row (Wrong Side) : k2, yo, p1, pm, p1, pm, p1, yo, k2 (9 sts)

Row 1 k2, kyok, knit to last three stitches, kyok, k2 (13 sts)

Row 2 (and all wrong side rows) k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2 (15 sts)

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until you have 117 (141, 165, 189, 213) stitches ending with a wrong side row.

LACE SECTION – Change to 4.5mm needles (US 7). Bead placement is highlighted.

Row 1 (RS) : k2, kyok, k2, [k5, **k1**, k6] repeat to last four stitches k1, kyok, k2

Row 2 (and all WS rows) : k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 3 : k2, kyok, k5, [k3, yo, k2tog, k1, ssk, yo, k4] rep to last seven stitches, k4, kyok, k2

Row 5 : k2, kyok, k1, **k1**, k6 [k2, yo, k2tog, k1, **k1**, k1, ssk, yo, k3] rep to last ten stitches, k5, **k1**, k1, kyok, k2

Row 7 : k2, kyok, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k3 [k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k3] rep to last 13 stitches, k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k1, kyok, k2

Row 9 : k2, kyok, k2, [yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, yo, k1] rep to last four stitches, k1, kyok, k2

Row 11 : k2, kyok, k4, **k1** [k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k2, **k1**] rep to last seven stitches, k4, kyok, k2

Row 13 : k2, kyok, k3, ssk, yo, ssk, yo, k1 [yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, yo, k1] rep to last ten stitches, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k3, kyok, k2

Row 15 : k2, kyok, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k3 [k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k3] rep to last 13 stitches, k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k1, kyok, k2

Row 17 : k2, kyok, k2, [k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, k1] repeat to last four stitches k1, kyok, k2

Row 19 : k2, kyok, k1, yo, ssk, yo, s2kpsso [yo, k2tog, yo, k2, **k1**, k2, yo, ssk, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last six stitches, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, kyok, k2

Row 21 : k2, kyok, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso [yo, ssk, yo, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last nine stitches, yo, ssk, yo, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, kyok, k2

Row 23 : k2, kyok, k2, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso [yo, ssk, yo, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last twelve stitches, yo, ssk, yo, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k2, kyok, k2

Row 25 : k2, kyok, k6, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso [yo, ssk, yo, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last fifteen stitches, yo, ssk, yo, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k6, kyok, k2

Row 27 : k2, kyok, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso [yo, ssk, yo, k2, **k1**, k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last six stitches, yo, ssk, yo, k1, kyok, k2

Row 29 : k2, kyok, k3, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k1, [ssk, yo, ssk, yo, k3, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k1] repeat to last ten stitches, ssk, yo, ssk, yo, k3, kyok, k2

Row 31 : k2, kyok, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k3 [k2, yo, ssk, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k2tog, yo, k3] rep to last 13 stitches, k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k1, kyok, k2

Row 33 : k2, kyok, k2, [yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, yo, k1] rep to last four stitches, k1, kyok, k2

Row 35 : k2, kyok, k4, **k1** [k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k2, **k1**] rep to last seven stitches, k4, kyok, k2

Row 37 : k2, kyok, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, yo, k1 [yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, yo, k1] rep to last ten stitches, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, kyok, k2

Row 39 : k2, kyok, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k3 [k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k3] rep to last 13 stitches, k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso, yo, ssk, yo, k1, kyok, k2

Row 41 : k2, kyok, k2, [k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, k1] repeat to last four stitches k1, kyok, k2

Rows 19 to 42 can be repeated to enlarge the shawl but yardage requirements will increase

Row 43 : k2, kyok, k1, yo, ssk, yo, s2kpsso [yo, k2tog, yo, k2, **k1**, k2, yo, ssk, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last six stitches, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, kyok, k2

Row 45 : k2, kyok, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso [yo, ssk, yo, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last nine stitches, yo, ssk, yo, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, kyok, k2

Row 47 : k2, kyok, k2, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso [yo, ssk, yo, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last twelve stitches, yo, ssk, yo, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k2, kyok, k2

Row 49 : k2, kyok, k6, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso [yo, ssk, yo, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last 15 stitches, yo, ssk, yo, k1, **k1**, k1, **k1**, k6, kyok, k2

Row 51 : k2, kyok, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso [yo, ssk, yo, k2, **k1**, k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last six stitches, yo, ssk, yo, k1, kyok, k2

Change to 5mm needles (US 8)

Please Note: Rows 55 and 57 will have more than 12 stitches between the stitch markers – this is to enable you to block your shawl with nice pointy points.

Row 53 : k2, kyok, (yo, k2tog) x 3, yo, s2kpsso [yo, ssk, yo, k2, **k1**, k2, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last nine stitches, yo, (ssk, yo) x 3, kyok, k2

Row 55 : k2, kyok, k1, (yo, k2tog) x 4, yo, s2kpsso [yo, ssk, yo, k1, yo, k1, **k1**, k1, yo, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last 12 stitches, yo, (ssk, yo) x 4, k1, kyok, k2

Row 57 : k2, **k1**, (yo, k2tog) x 6, yo, s2kpsso [yo, ssk, yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, **k1**, yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last 15 stitches, yo, (ssk, yo) x 6, **k1**, k2

Row 58 : (wrong side row) Bind off knit-wise using the 'amazingly stretchy bind-off'; K2, [put two stitches back on left hand needle and knit together through the back, k1] repeat until one stitch remains, then thread yarn through last stitch and gently pull to tighten. Weave ends in and soak in luke warm water and block into crescent shape gently pulling your edge to create points. Wait until your shawl is dry, unpin, wear and enjoy!

DRIFT AWAY

BOO KNITS

This cute little shawl is shallow and wide with a beautiful ruffle at the bottom. It has the ability to be whatever you want, depending on your choice of yarn – in tussah silk lace it is sumptuous and sophisticated, in alpaca silk lace it is delicate and vintage looking and yet in colour changing cotton it is youthful and flirty.



REQUIREMENTS

Yarn: DyeForYarn Tussah Silk Lace 100g/695m skein (used) or Lichtfaden Alpaca/Silk Lace 100g/800m (or substitute any laceweight/light fingering– required yardage will vary.

Finished size 62" (160cm) wide along top edge, 118" (300cm) wide along bottom edge, 16" (41cm) deep using DyeForYarn Tussah Silk Lace –Shawl shown is the small size, and used 400 yards of DyeForYarn Tussah Silk Lace.

Needles etc: 4mm (US6) and 4.5mm (US7), Stitch Markers, Yarn Needle and Blocking Pins

Gauge is not critical and any yarn is suitable for this pattern though needle size and required yardage will vary.

Size Options: Should you require an even larger shawl the body of the shawl can be made larger. The stitch repeat is 12 stitches and an increase of 12 stitches will be achieved with each eight rows knit within the main body of the shawl.

NB. PLEASE READ THROUGH THE ENTIRE PATTERN BEFORE STARTING TO KNIT THIS SHAWL



ABBREVIATIONS

k - knit

p – purl

ktb – knit through the back of the stitch

kfb – knit into the front of the stitch and then into the back of the same stitch thus making two stitches from one

kyok – knit without dropping the original stitch, bring the yarn forward and knit the same stitch again

k2tog – knit 2 stitches together as one

ssk – slip a stitch knitwise, slip another knitwise, transfer to left hand needle and knit together through the back

szkpsso – slip next 2 stitches together as to knit, k1, pass 2 slipped stitches over (centred 2 stitch decreased)

yo – yarn over

bo – bind off or cast off

co – cast on

pm – place marker

slm – slip marker

cs – centre stitch

HELPFUL HINTS: The first and last two stitches of every row should be knit. Always knit the first and last stitch through the back (ktb). The **kyok** is carried out by knitting the stitch in the normal manner leaving the old stitch on the left hand needle and the new stitch on the right hand needle, bring the yarn forward and knit into the old stitch again. This creates three stitches from one. The yarn overs (yo) in this pattern help to keep the top edge of the shawl pucker free and also need to be of a uniform size. At the edges of the shawl I do mine in the following way:- **Between a knit and a purl** – bring the yarn over your work, under the needle, over the needle to the back and under again ready to purl your next stitch. **Between a purl and a knit** – bring your yarn to the back of your work, over your work and under the needle, over the back of the needle and under again to the back of your work ready for your next knit stitch. **Between two knit stitches** – bring the yarn over your needle to the front and then under the needle, over your work to the back ready for your next knit stitch. **Between two purl stitches** – bring the yarn over the needle towards the back of your work and then under the needle, over your work to the front ready for your next purl stitch.



INSTRUCTIONS

With 4mm needles (US6) cast on two stitches, knit seven rows, at the end of the last row do not turn work but rotate 90 degrees, pick up and knit one stitch in each of the three garter ridge, turn and knit two stitches in the cast on edge. (7 sts).

HELPFUL HINT:- I found it useful to place stitch markers every 12 stitches. With right side of work facing place one with five stitches between the right marker of the centre stitch and one with six stitches between it and the marker to the left of the centre stitch, as soon as you have enough stitches to do so. Each new marker can be placed with 12 stitches between each. If you do this as you knit the main body it makes stitch counting much quicker and easier and falls in the correct position for the start of the lace pattern. You don't need to know where the centre stitch is but I find it useful to mark the halfway point of the row.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR GARTER STITCH BODY – 4mm needles (US 6)

Set up row (Wrong Side) : k2, yo, k1, pm, k1, pm, k1, yo, k2 (9 sts)

Row 1 k2, kyok, knit to last three stitches, kyok, k2 (13 sts)

Row 2 (and all wrong side rows) k2, yo, knit to last two stitches, yo, k2 (15 sts)

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until you have 189, (213, 237, 261) stitches ending with a wrong side row.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR STOCKING STITCH BODY – 4mm needles (US 6)

Set up row (Wrong Side) : k2, yo, p1, pm, p1, pm, p1, yo, k2 (9 sts)

Row 1 k2, kyok, knit to last three stitches, kyok, k2 (13 sts)

Row 2 (and all wrong side rows) k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2 (15 sts)

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until you have 183 (207, 231, 255) stitches ending with a wrong side row.

Lace Set Up Row 1 k2, kyok, knit to last three stitches, kyok, k2

Lace Set Up Row 2 k2, yo, knit to last two stitches, yo, k2

LACE SECTION – Change to 4.5mm needles (US 7)

PLEASE NOTE:- The number of stitches between your stitch markers will increase progressively throughout the lace section.

Row 1 (RS): k2, kyok, k2, [yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1] repeat to last four stitches k1, kyok, k2

Row 2: k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 3: k2, kyok, knit to last three stitches, kyok, k2

Row 4: k2, yo, knit to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 5: k2, kyok, k2, k2tog, (k1, yo) x3, k1, [(yo, k1) x3, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, (k1, yo) x3, k1] rep to last ten stitches, (yo, k1) x3, ssk, k2, kyok, k2

Row 6: k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 7: k2, kyok, knit to last three stitches, kyok, k2

Row 8: k2, yo, knit to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 9: k2, kyok, k1, yo, k1, yo, k2, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k2, (yo, k1) x3, [(yo, k1) x3, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k2, (yo, k1) x3] rep to last eighteen stitches, (yo, k1) x3, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k2, yo, k1, yo, k1, kyok, k2

Row 10: k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 11: k2, kyok, knit to last three stitches, kyok, k2

Row 12: k2, yo, knit to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 13: k2, kyok, k2, (yo, k1) x3, [(yo, k1) x3, yo, ssk, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k2tog, (yo, k1) x4] rep to last seven stitches, (yo, k1) x3, k1, kyok, k2

Row 14: k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 15: k2, kyok, knit to last three stitches, kyok, k2

Row 16: k2, yo, knit to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 17: k2, kyok, k2, s2kpsso, k2tog, k2tog, (yo, k1) x4, kyok, [(k1, yo,) x4, ssk, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k2tog, (yo, k1) x4, kyok] rep to last sixteen stitches, (k1, yo) x4, ssk, ssk, s2kpsso, k2, kyok, k2 (if you are using stitch markers they can be removed now)

Row 18: k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 19: k2, kyok, knit to last three stitches, kyok, k2

Row 20: k2, yo, knit to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 21: k2, kfb to last two stitches, k2

Row 22: k2, purl to last two stitches, k2

Row 23: k2, purl to last two stitches, k2

Row 24 : PICOT BIND OFF (wrong side row)

Using the knit cast on, cast on three stitches twisting them onto the left hand needle, bind off five stitches returning the stitch to the left hand needle, [cast on 3, bind off 5] repeat to the end of the row, pull thread through the final stitch to finish and pull gently. Weave ends in and soak in luke warm water and block into crescent shape gently pulling your edge to create gently dips that are not quite points. Wait until your shawl is dry, unpin, wear and enjoy!

NOTE:- The picot bind off eats yarn! Should you be running short of yarn then an amazingly stretchy bind off could be used. ; K2, [put two stitches back on left hand needle and knit together through the back, k1] repeat until one stitch remains, then thread yarn through last stitch and gently pull to tighten.

PROMISE ME . . .

BOO KNITS

This crescent shaped shawl is so pretty with its delicate lace pattern and beading. Light as a feather in 2ply lace or more substantial in fingering weight yarn, either way, this little shawl is totally romantic and yet suitable for all ages, Bride, Bridesmaid or even Mother of the Bride. Then again, why wait for a wedding? *Promise me . . .* you will knit one of these and love wearing it every day!



REQUIREMENTS

Yarn: Madelinetosh Tosh Merino Light 100g/420yrd/384m skein – one skein for the smallest size
BookKnitsToo! SuperKidSilk Lace 50g/500m skein (you could use Rowan Kidsilk Haze, Lichtfaden Kidsilk or other 2ply kid silk lace yarn)

Finished size Small size measures 80" (203cm) wide along top edge, 100" (254cm) wide along bottom edge, 15" (38cm) deep using Madelinetosh Tosh Merino Light

Needles : 4 mm, (US6), 4.5mm (US7) and 5mm (US8)

Beads and crochet hook size 0.75mm (small enough to fit through the hole of your chosen beads – I used approx 500 beads for the small sized shawl – I would recommend size 6's though beads are optional – it looks lovely without them too!), Stitch Markers, Yarn Needle and Blocking Pins

Gauge is not critical and any yarn is suitable for this pattern though needle size and yardage requirements will vary.

Size Options: The body of the shawl can be adjusted to suit your own style and the lace section can be repeated to enlarge the shawl. Yarn and bead requirements stated are for the small size.

NB. PLEASE READ THROUGH THE ENTIRE PATTERN BEFORE STARTING TO KNIT THIS SHAWL

Row 1 k2, kyok, knit to last three stitches, kyok, k2 (13 sts)

Row 2 (and all wrong side rows) k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2 (15 sts)

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 until you have 189, (213, 237) stitches ending with a wrong side row.

LACE SECTION – Change to 4.5mm (US7) needle. Beads are placed on the stitch before it is knit, placement is highlighted.

Row 1 (RS) : k2, kyok, k2, [k4, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k5] repeat to last four stitches k1, kyok, k2

Row 2 (and all WS rows) : k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 3 : k2, kyok, k5, [k3, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k4] rep to last seven stitches, k4, kyok, k2

Row 5 : k2, kyok, k3, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k1, k1, [k1, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k1, k1, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k1, k1] rep to last ten stitches, k1, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k3, kyok, k2

Row 7 : k2, kyok, k4, k1, yo, k2tog, k1, ssk, yo, k1 [yo, k2tog, k1, ssk, yo, k1, yo, k2tog, k1, ssk, yo, k1] rep to last 13 stitches, yo, k2tog, k1, ssk, yo, k1, k4, kyok, k2

Row 9 : k2, kyok, k2, [k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1] rep to last four stitches, k1, kyok, k2

Row 11 : k2, kyok, k2, k2tog, yo, k1, [yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1] rep to last seven stitches, yo, ssk, k2, kyok, k2

Row 13 : k2, kyok, k1, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, k1, [k1, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, k1] rep to last ten stitches, k1, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, k1, k1, kyok, k2

Row 15 : k2, kyok, k2, ssk, yo, k1, yo, k2tog, k3, k1, [k3, ssk, yo, k1, yo, k2tog, k3, k1] repeat to last thirteen stitches, k3, ssk, yo, k1, yo, k2tog, k2, kyok, k2

These sixteen rows can be repeated to enlarge your shawl. Always complete Row 16 (wrong side row) before proceeding with the lace border.

LACE BORDER - Beads are placed on the stitch before it is knit, placement is highlighted.

NOTE – Rows 1-14 for the lace border are the same as the Lace Section should you be deciding whether you can get another repeat out of your yarn.

Row 1 (RS) : k2, kyok, k2, [k4, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k5] repeat to last four stitches k1, kyok, k2

Row 2 (and all WS rows) : k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 3 : k2, kyok, k5, [k3, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k4] rep to last seven stitches, k4, kyok, k2

Row 5 : k2, kyok, k3, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k1, k1, [k1, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k1, k1, k1, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k1, k1] rep to last ten stitches, k1, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k3, kyok, k2

Row 7 : k2, kyok, k4, k1, yo, k2tog, k1, ssk, yo, k1 [yo, k2tog, k1, ssk, yo, k1, yo, k2tog, k1, ssk, yo, k1] rep to last 13 stitches, yo, k2tog, k1, ssk, yo, k1, k4, kyok, k2

Row 9 : k2, kyok, k2, [k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1] rep to last four stitches, k1, kyok, k2

Row 11 : k2, kyok, k2, k2tog, yo, k1, [yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k1] rep to last seven stitches, yo, ssk, k2, kyok, k2

Row 13 : k2, kyok, k1, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, k1, [k1, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, k1] rep to last ten stitches, k1, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, k1, k1, kyok, k2

Change to 5mm needles (US 8)

Row 15 : k2, kyok, k1, yo, ssk, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k1 [yo, ssk, yo, ssk, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k1] repeat to last thirteen stitches, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, kyok, k2

Row 17 : k2, kyok, k1, k1, [k1, yo, ssk, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, k1] repeat to last four stitches, k1, kyok, k2

Beads are placed on the stitch after it is knit, placement is highlighted.

Row 19 : k2, yo, k1, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, s2kpsso, [yo, k1, yo, ssk, yo, s2kpsso, yo, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, s2kpsso] repeat to last six stitches, yo, k1, yo, ssk, yo, k1, yo, k2

Row 20 : (wrong side row) Bind off knit-wise using the 'amazingly stretchy bind-off'; K2, [put two stitches back on left hand needle and knit together through the back, k1] repeat until one stitch remains, then thread yarn through last stitch and gently pull to tighten. Weave ends in and soak in luke warm water and block into crescent shape gently pulling your edge to create points. Wait until your shawl is dry, unpin, wear and enjoy!

Alternate Ending for Row 20 Bind Off: Should you prefer, and have enough yarn, a picot bind off would look lovely - Using the knit cast on, cast on three stitches twisting them onto the left hand needle, bind off five stitches returning the stitch to the left hand needle, [cast on 3, bind off 5] repeat to the end of the row and pull thread through stitch to finish and pull gently.

NEW BEGINNINGS

BOO KNITS

This wide, triangular, shawl is knit in one piece from the top centre with two increases (one at each end) on every wrong side row and four increases on every right side row (at each end and each side of the centre stitch). It is a wonderfully addictive shawl with panels of stocking stitch interspersed with panels of lace. Comprising four different sections that can be selected to make your shawl as individual as you are.

The wonderful versatility of this shawl makes it possible to knit in almost any weight of yarn (though yardage and needle requirements will vary) and is simple enough for beginners to lace knitting and yet interesting enough for those with more experience.



REQUIREMENTS

Yarn & Needles: Rowan Creative Focus Worsted - 5.5mm needles and knit in order - Setup, Charts ABCD
Finished size when blocked - 90 inches wide, 32 inches deep (230cm wide, 80cm deep)
Beads and crochet hook size 0.75mm (small enough to fit through the hole of your chosen beads should you be knitting a laceweight shawl and wish to use them. Stitch Markers, Yarn Needle and Blocking Pins.
Gauge: 14 stitches to 4 inches, however, gauge is not critical and any yarn is suitable for this pattern though needle size and yardage requirements will vary.

ktb - knit through the back of the stitch
co - cast on
bo - bind off or cast off
pm - place marker

cs - centre stitch
m1l - make one stitch by picking up the bar between the two stitches and knitting into the back of it

INSTRUCTIONS – THESE INSTRUCTIONS HAVE BEEN WRITTEN FOR THE WORSTED WEIGHT VERSION – NEEDLE SIZE, NUMBER OF REPEATS AND YARDAGE WILL VARY DEPENDING ON CHOSEN YARN All m1 and m1r are done knitwise. The rows that are knit on the wrong side have been shown in *italics* for the ease of reading. The first and last stitch of every row should be knit through the back (ktb) and the first and last three stitches of every row should be knit. These edging stitches are **NOT** shown on the chart.

With 5.5mm needles (US9) cast on 3 stitches, knit 7 rows, at the end of the last row do not turn work but rotate 90 degrees, pick up and knit 3 stitches, one in each garter ridge, turn and knit three stitches in the cast on edge. (9 sts).

Set up Row : k3, pm, p1, pm, **p1** (cs), pm, p1, pm, k3

Either proceed to charts or written instructions below.

Row 1 (Right Side) : k3, slm, m1l, k to centre stitch marker, m1r, slm, **k1** (cs), slm, m1l, k to last three stitches, m1r, slm, k3

Row 2 (Wrong Side) : k3, slm, m1l, p to marker, slm, **p1**, slm, p to marker, m1r, slm, k3

Rows 3, 5, 7, 9, 13, 15, 17, 19 : as Row 1

Rows 4, 6, 10, 12, 16, 18 : as Row 2

Rows 8, 14, 20 : *k3, slm, m1l, k to last marker, m1r, slm, k3 (wrong side)*

Row 11 : k3, slm, m1l, k3, pm, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, pm, k1, m1r, slm, **k1** (cs), slm, m1l, k1, pm, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo, pm, k3, m1r, slm, k3

Place a stitch marker every twelve stitches as the rows get longer. The pattern stitch markers are not mentioned from now on but using them keeps the pattern in line.

Rows 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 17, 19, 21, 23 : as Row 1

Rows 6, 12, 18, 24 : *k3, slm, m1l, k to last marker, m1r, slm, k3 (wrong side)*

Row 15 : k3, m1l, k3, [yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1] repeat to one stitch before the centre stitch marker, k1, m1r, slm, **k1** (cs), slm, m1l, k1, [k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo] repeat to last six stitches k3, m1r, k3

Row 17 : k3, m1l, k5, [yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1] repeat to two stitches before centre stitch marker, k2, m1r, slm, **k1** (cs), slm, m1l, k2, [k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo] repeat to last eight stitches, k5, m1r, k3

Row 19 : k3, m1l, k7, [yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1] repeat to three stitches before centre stitch marker, k3, m1r, slm, **k1** (cs), slm, m1l, k3, [k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo] repeat to last ten stitches, k7, m1r, k3

CHANGE UP ONE NEEDLE SIZE

Row 27 : k3, m1l, k2, **k1**, [yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo, **k1**] repeat to seven stitches before centre stitch marker, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, ssk, k1, m1r, slm, **k1** (cs), slm, m1l, k1, k2tog, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo [**k1**, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo] repeat to last six stitches, **k1**, k2, m1r, k3

Row 33 : k3, m1l, k2, k2tog, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo, **k1**, [yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo, **k1**] repeat to ten stitches before centre stitch marker, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, ssk, k4, m1r, slm, **k1** (cs), slm, m1l, k4, k2tog, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo [**k1**, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, k1, yo] repeat to last twelve stitches, **k1**, yo, k1, yo, k1, ssk, ssk, k2, m1r, k3



Row 35 : k3, m1l, k4, k2tog, k2tog, k1, yo, **k1**, yo, **k1**, [yo, **k1**, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, **k1**, yo, **k1**] repeat to eleven stitches before centre stitch, yo, **k1**, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, **k1**, yo, m1r, slm, **k1** (cs), slm, m1l, yo, **k1**, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, **k1**, yo [**k1**, yo, **k1**, yo, k1, ssk, s2kpsso, k2tog, k1, yo, **k1**, yo] repeat to last fourteen stitches, **k1**, yo, **k1**, yo, k1, ssk, ssk, k4, m1r, k3


Row 36 : (wrong side row) Bind off knit-wise using the 'amazingly stretchy bind-off'; k2, [put two stitches back on left hand needle and knit together through the back, k1] repeat until one stitch remains, then thread yarn through last stitch and gently pull to tighten. Weave ends in and soak in luke warm water and block to shape, gently pulling your edge to create points. Wait until your shawl is dry, unpin, wear and enjoy!

PLEASE NOTE – ALL RIGHT SIDE ROWS (ODD) SHOULD BE READ RIGHT TO LEFT WHEREAS ALL WRONG SIDE ROWS (EVEN) SHOULD BE READ LEFT TO RIGHT

SWEET DREAMS BOO KNITS

This little crescent shaped shawl has been designed to be knit in fingering weight or heavy/medium laceweight and adorned with beads. It is completely your decision whether to compliment, contrast or totally omit the beads, whatever you choose your shawl will be both a SWEET knit and a DREAM to wear! With a stocking stitch body and repeatable lace section, that is beautifully effective and yet breathtakingly simple,

Sweet Dreams is another shawl that can be knit in a variety of sizes making it truly adaptable and giving you the opportunity to make it totally unique!

REQUIREMENTS

Yarn: Madelinetosh Tosh Merino Light or any fingering weight or laceweight yarn. **Finished size** – Medium in Madelinetosh TML 87" (221cm) wide along top edge, 17" (43cm) deep (each size should make a difference of about 7" in width and 1" in depth)

Needles : 4mm, (US 6), 4.5mm (US7) and 5mm (US8), Stitch Markers, Yarn Needle and Blocking Pins

Beads and crochet hook size 0.75mm (small enough to fit through the hole of your chosen beads – The smallest size takes about 300 beads and you will need an additional 50 for each size you go up – I would recommend size 5's or 6's though beads are, as always, optional.

Gauge - is not critical and any yarn is suitable for this pattern though needle size and yardage requirements will vary. Mine was – Fingering Weight 13sts to 4" after very aggressive blocking.

Size Options: The body of the shawl can be adjusted to suit your own style, all you need to know is that the lace section needs to be started when you have a multiple of 12 stitches plus 13 ending at the end of a wrong side row. The first size can be achieved with a 420yard skein of yarn of Madelinetosh Tosh Merino Light, larger sizes will require additional yardage.

NB. PLEASE READ THROUGH THE ENTIRE PATTERN BEFORE STARTING TO KNIT THIS SHAWL



ABBREVIATIONS

k - knit

p – purl

ktb – knit through the back of the stitch

kfb – knit forward and then backwards into one stitch – creating two stitches from one

kyok – knit without dropping the original stitch, bring the yarn forward and knit the same stitch again – creating three stitches from one

k2tog – knit 2 stitches together as one

ssk – slip a stitch knitwise, slip another knitwise, transfer to left hand needle and ktb

s2kpsso – slip next 2 stitches together as to knit, k1, pass 2 slipped stitches over (centred 2 stitch decreased)

yo – yarn over

co – cast on

HELPFUL HINTS: The first and last stitch of every row should be knit through the back (ktb). The yarn overs (yo) in this pattern help to keep the top edge of the shawl pucker free so keep them loose.

HELPFUL HINT:- I found it useful to place stitch markers every 12 stitches – this is easiest to do when you have 31 stitches at the end of a wrong side row – you will have one more stitch at the beginning of a right side row than at the end. Each new marker can be placed with 12 stitches between.

INSTRUCTIONS

With 4.5mm needles (US7) needles for fingering weight/4mm (US6) for laceweight cast on two stitches, knit 3 rows, at the end of the last row do not turn work but rotate 90 degrees, yo, pick up and knit one stitch in the garter ridge, yo, turn and knit two stitches in the cast on edge. (7 sts).

MAIN BODY

Row 1 (right side) : k2, kyok, k1, kyok, k2 (11 sts)

Row 2 (wrong side) : k2, yo, p to last two sts, yo, k2 (13 sts)

Row 3 : k2, kyok, knit to last three stitches, kyok, k2 (17 sts)

Row 4 : k2, yo, p to last two sts, yo, k2 (19 sts)

Repeat Rows 3 and 4 rows until you have 157 (181, 205) stitches ending with a wrong side row.



LACE SET UP (CHART A) – Bead placement from this point is **highlighted**.

Row 1 (right side) : k2, kyok, k4, [k5, **k1**, k6] repeat to last six stitches k3, kyok, k2

Row 2 (wrong side and all future wrong side rows) : k2, yo, p to last two sts, yo, k2

Row 3 : k2, kyok, k1, yo, k3, k2tog, **k1** [ssk, k3, yo, **k1**, yo, k3, k2tog, **k1**] repeat to last nine stitches, ssk, k3, yo, k1, kyok, k2

NB – A WRONG SIDE ROW WILL ALWAYS NEED TO BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO MOVING TO THE NEXT CHART

LACE SECTION (CHART B) – This section can be repeated as necessary – a wrong side row should be completed prior to repeating the section or moving onto the lace border.

Row 1 (RS) : k2, kyok, k5, yo, k2, k2tog, **k1** [ssk, k2, yo, k3, yo, k2, k2tog, **k1**] repeat to last twelve stitches, ssk, k2, yo, k5, kyok, k2

Row 2 (and all WS rows) : k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 3 : k2, kyok, **k1**, [ssk, k2, yo, k3, yo, k2, k2tog, **k1**] repeat to last three stitches, kyok, k2

Row 5 : k2, kyok, k4, [k2, yo, k2tog, k3, ssk, yo, k3] repeat to last six stitches, k3, kyok, k2

Row 7 : k2, kyok, k3, ssk, yo, k2 [k1, yo, k2tog, k5, ssk, yo, k2] repeat to last nine stitches, k1, yo, k2tog, k3, kyok, k2

Row 9 : k2, kyok, k7, ssk, yo, **k1**, [yo, k2tog, k7, ssk, yo, **k1**] repeat to last twelve stitches, yo, k2tog, k7, kyok, k2

Row 11 : k2, kyok, k1 [k1, yo, k2, k2tog, **k1**, ssk, k2, yo, k2] repeat to last three stitches, kyok, k2

Row 13 : k2, kyok, k2tog, yo, k2 [k1, yo, k2, k2tog, **k1**, ssk, k2, yo, k2] repeat to last six stitches, k1, yo, ssk, kyok, k2

Row 15 : k2, kyok, k2tog, k3, yo, k2 [k1, yo, k2, k2tog, **k1**, ssk, k2, yo, k2] repeat to last nine stitches, k1, yo, k3, ssk, kyok, k2

Row 17 : k2, kyok, k6, yo, k1, k2tog, k1 [ssk, k1, yo, k5, yo, k1, k2tog, k1] repeat to last twelve stitches, ssk, k1, yo, k6, kyok, k2

Row 19 : k2, kyok, k1 [k1, ssk, k1, yo, k3, yo, k1, k2tog, k2] repeat to last three stitches, kyok, k2

Row 21 : k2, kyok, k4 [k2, ssk, k1, yo, **k1**, yo, k1, k2tog, k3] repeat to last six stitches, k3, kyok, k2

Row 23 : k2, kyok, k2, yo, k2, k2tog, **k1** [ssk, k2, yo, k3, yo, k2, k2tog, **k1**] repeat to last nine stitches, ssk, k2, yo, k2, kyok, k2

NB – A WRONG SIDE ROW WILL ALWAYS NEED TO BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO MOVING TO THE NEXT CHART

LACE BORDER (CHART C)

Row 1 (RS) : k2, kyok, k5, yo, k2, k2tog, **k1** [ssk, k2, yo, k3, yo, k2, k2tog, **k1**] repeat to last twelve stitches, ssk, k2, yo, k5, kyok, k2

Row 2 (and all WS rows) : k2, yo, purl to last two stitches, yo, k2

Row 3 : k2, kyok, **k1**, [ssk, k2, yo, k3, yo, k2, k2tog, **k1**] repeat to last three stitches, kyok, k2

Row 5 : k2, kyok, **k1**, k2tog, yo, kfb [yo, ssk, k7, k2tog, yo, kfb] repeat to last six stitches, yo, ssk, **k1**, kyok, k2

Row 7 – your stitch markers will move on this row: k2, kyok, **k1** (k2tog, yo)x3 [ssk, yo, ssk, k5, k2tog, yo, k2tog, yo] repeat to last ten stitches, (ssk, yo)x2, ssk, **k1**, kyok, k2

Row 9 : k2, kyok, **k1**, (k2tog, yo)x4, kyok [(yo, ssk)x2, k3, (k2tog, yo)x2, kyok] repeat to last twelve stitches, (yo, ssk)x4, **k1**, kyok, k2

Change to 5mm (fingering weight) or 4.5mm (laceweight) needles.

Row 11 – your stitch markers will move on this row: k2, kyok, **k1**, (k2tog, yo)x5, k1, **k1**, k1 [**k1**, k1, (yo, ssk)x2, k1, (k2tog, yo)x2, k1, **k1**, k1] repeat to last sixteen stitches, **k1**, k1, (yo, ssk)x5, **k1**, kyok, k2

NOTE – THERE IS NO KYOK ON THE FOLLOWING ROW

Row 13 : k2, yo, **k1**, yo, **k1**, yo, (k2tog, yo)x7, **k1**, yo, **k1**, [yo, **k1**, (yo, ssk)x2, yo, s2kpsso, yo, (k2tog, yo)x2, **k1**, yo, **k1**] repeat to last nineteen stitches, yo, **k1**, (yo, ssk)x7, yo, **k1**, yo, **k1**, yo, k2

Row 14 : PICOT BIND OFF (wrong side row)

Using the knit cast on, cast on three stitches twisting them onto the left hand needle, bind off five stitches returning the stitch to the left hand needle, [cast on 3, bind off 5] repeat to the end of the row and pull thread through stitch to finish and pull gently. Weave ends in and soak in luke warm water and block into crescent shape gently pulling your edge to create points. Wait until your shawl is dry, unpin, wear and enjoy!
