MATERIALS

8 skeins of **Seashell** color 08

Crochet hook 3.5 mm / US E/4

Blocking pins

Scissors

Yarn needle

Measuring tape

1 stitch marker

YARN QUALITY

 **Seashell**, Hobbii

40% Cotton, 35% Viscose, 25% Linen

50 g (1.75 oz) = 150 m (164 yds)

GAUGE

After the setup rows and one pattern repeat, your work measures approx. 16 cm / 6.5" in width and 9 cm / 3.5" in depth.

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 178 cm / 70"

Depth: 80 cm / 31"

PATTERN INFORMATION

The Purpureal Shawl is worked from the top down, starting at the center and increasing outwards. The main pattern is an easy-to-remember two-row repeat. It consists mostly of treble crochets and chain spaces, creating an interesting fabric that is both open and lacy, as well as textured and three-dimensional. A delicate, lace border is added last to decorate the edge of the shawl.

ABBREVIATIONS

US terms

beg: beginning

beg-CH-5: beginning chain 5

CH: chain

CH-1-sp: chain 1 space

CH-3-sp: chain 3 space

CH-5-sp: chain 5 space

cl: cluster

FPTR: front post treble crochet

hk: hook

lp(s): loop(s)

PM: place marker

rep: repeat

RS: right side

SC: single crochet

SLST: slip stitch

sp: space

WS: wrong side

YO: yarn over

SPECIAL STITCHES

TR (treble crochet): YO twice, insert hk in indicated sp, YO and pull up a lp (4 lps on hk). [YO and pull through 2 lps] x3 times.

3-FPTR-cl (3 front post treble crochet cluster): *YO twice, insert hk around post of next TR going in from the front and coming out the back, YO and pull up a lp, [YO and pull through 2 lps] x2 times, rep from * 2 more times. YO and pull through all 4 lps on hk, CH 1. See also photos 3–6.

6-FPTR-cl (6 front post treble crochet cluster): *YO twice, insert hk around post of next TR going in from the front and coming out the back, YO and pull up a lp, [YO and pull through 2 lps] x2 times, rep from * 5 more times. YO and pull through all 7 lps on hk, CH 1. See also photos 20–22.

double shell: [3 TR, CH 3, 3 TR] in same sp. See also photos 10–12.

triple shell: [3 TR, CH 3, 3 TR, CH 3, 3 TR] in same sp. See also photo 14.

picot: CH 7, SLST in third CH from hk.

PATTERN NOTES

- The pattern uses standard US terminology.
- Smaller stitch repeats are written in square brackets [like this]. The symbols * and † are used to mark the beginning of a larger repeat sequence.
- CH 5 at the beginning of rows counts as TR, CH-1-sp.
- Stitch counts are given in brackets at the end of the row. If no stitch count is given, it is the same as the previous row.

SETUP ROWS

Start with a magic ring.

Setup row 1 (WS): CH 5 (counts as TR, CH-1-sp here and throughout). Triple shell in magic ring, CH 1, 1 TR in magic ring. Close magic ring (photo 1). Turn. [1 triple shell, 2 TR, 2 CH-1-sps]

Setup row 2 (RS): CH 5 (photo 2). *3-FPTR-cl across the next 3 TR (photos 3–6), CH 5, SC in next CH-3-sp, CH 5 (photo 7). Rep from * once more (photo 8). 3-FPTR-cl across the last 3 TR, CH 1, TR in last TR (photo 9). Turn. [3 3-FPTR-cl, 2 SC, 4 CH-5-sps, 2 TR, 2 CH-1-sps]

Setup row 3: CH 5. Double shell in next cl (photos 10–12), CH 1, SC in next SC, CH 1 (photo 13), triple shell in next cl (photo 14), CH 1, SC in next SC, CH 1 (photo 15), double shell in last cl (photo 16), CH 1, TR in last TR (photo 17). Turn. [**2** double shells, **1** triple shell, **2** SC, **2** TR, **6** CH-1-sps]

Setup row 4: CH 5 (photo 18). *3-FPTR-cl across the next 3 TR, CH 5, SC in next CH-3-sp, CH 5 (photo 19), 6-FPTR-cl across the next 6 TR (photos 20–22), CH 5, SC in next CH-3-sp, CH 5 (photo 23). 3-FPTR-cl across the next 3 TR and PM in this center cl (photo 24). CH 5, SC in next CH-3-sp, CH 5 (photo 25), 6-FPTR-cl across the next 6 TR (photo 26), CH 5, SC in next CH-3-sp, CH 5 (photo 27), 3-FPTR-cl across the next 3 TR, CH 1, TR in last TR (photo 28). Turn. [**3** 3-FPTR-cl, **2** 6-FPTR-cl, **4** SC, **8** CH-5-sps, **2** TR, **2** CH-1-sps]

PATTERN REPEAT

Row 1 (WS): CH 5 (photo 29). *Double shell in next cl (photo 30), CH 1, SC in next SC, CH 1 (photo 31). Rep from * across until you reach marked center cl (photos 32–33). Remove marker, triple shell in next cl and PM in fifth, center TR made (photo 34). †CH 1, SC in next SC, CH 1 (photo 35), double shell in next cl (photo 36). Rep from † across until you reach last TR (photos 37–38). CH 1, TR in last TR (photo 39). Turn. [**4** double shells, **1** triple shell, **4** SC, **2** TR, **10** CH-1-sps]

Row 2 (RS): CH 5 (photo 40). 3-FPTR-cl across the next 3 TR, CH 5, SC in next CH-3-sp, CH 5 (photo 41), *6-FPTR-cl across the next 6 TR, CH 5, SC in next CH-3-sp, CH 5. Rep from * across until 1 TR remains before marked center TR (photo 42). Remove marker, 3-FPTR-cl across the next 3 TR and PM in this cl (photo 43), CH 5, SC in next CH-3-sp, CH 5 (photo 44). †6-FPTR-cl across the next 6 TR, CH 5, SC in next CH-3-sp, CH 5. Rep from † across until 1 cl remains (photo 45). 3-FPTR-cl in last cl, CH 1, TR in last TR (photo 46). Turn. [**3** 3-FPTR-cl, **4** 6-FPTR-cl, **6** SC, **12** CH-5-sps, **2** TR, **2** CH-1-sps]

Your work should now measure approx. 16 cm / 6.5" in width and 9 cm / 3.5" in depth. Keep repeating rows 1-2 until your shawl measures your desired size. The sample shows 50 rows including the setup rows.

BORDER

Border row (WS): *CH 7, SLST in third CH from hk (picot made), CH 4, SLST in next CH-5-sp. Rep from * across (photo 47) until you reach last CH-1-sp. CH 7, SLST in third CH from hk (picot made), CH 4, SLST in last CH-1-sp. [**101** picots]

Fasten off.

Weave in all ends and block to dimensions, gently stretching the fabric to open up the stitches. The sample was steam blocked.

Photo 47 presents a close-up on the picot border after blocking. It also shows you how to easily count your rows along the center of your shawl, so you can keep track of your progress: each circled petal represents 2 rows.
