NORTH ROW

Some places call to you and you have to return again and again and some are so special that they beg you to stay and never leave. Fell Garth II is a collection of 19 pieces shot at our homestead, Fell Garth, in the stunning Lake District of Northern England. We invite you to join us in the Cumbrian Fells for some knitting pleasure from a host of talented designers ready to inspire with designs in 5 of our yarns.

This beautiful cowl neck sweater, designed by Holli Yeoh, is worked in pieces from the bottom up. The collar is then worked in the round and the sweater seamed.



Inspired by the breathtaking scenery of Ireland's Northern Headlands, Arranmore is spun in a mill that traces its roots to the homespun tweed industry of 19th century County Donegal. Blending cashmere and silk with a fine merino wool creates an authentic tweed yarn of the finest quality. With a colour palette reminiscent of the wild Irish coastlands, this yarn was designed for makers appreciating the best of luxury and tradition.

SIZES: To fit bust: 76-81 [86-91: 97-102: 107-112: 117-122: 127-132] cm (30-32 [34-36: 38-40: 42-44: 46-48: 50-52] in)

GARMENT MEASUREMENTS: Bust: 101 [113: 122: 131: 142: 152] cm (39.75 [44.5: 48: 51.5: 56: 59.75] in)

Length (from side neck): 51 [52: 53: 54: 55: 56] cm (20 [20.5: 20.75: 21.25: 21.5: 22] in)

Sleeve seam: 44 [45: 45: 46: 46: 46] cm (17.25 [17.75: 17.75: 18: 18: 18] in)

YARN: The Fibre Co. Arranmore Light (80% merino wool, 10% cashmere, 10% silk, 300 m (328 yd) per 100g hank) in River Esque – 4 [4: 4: 5: 5: 6] hanks

NEEDLES: 1 pair 3.25 mm (US 3) needles (or size to obtain gauge)
3.25 mm (US 3) circular needle (or size to obtain gauge)
1 pair 4 mm (US 6) needles (or size to obtain gauge)

TENSION: 21.5 sts and 30 rows to 10 cm (4 in) measured over patt, 22 sts and 30 rows to 10 cm (4 in) measured over st st, both using 4 mm (US 6) needles.

It is vitally important to check your tension before starting to knit your garment as the tension governs the finished size. If you work to the wrong tension, your garment will not fit as shown in the photograph and you may run out of yarn, or need to buy more.

Check your tension by knitting a swatch at least 12 cm (5 in) square. If there are more sts and rows to 10 cm (4 in) than stated, try again using thicker needles. If there are fewer sts and rows to 10 cm (4 in) than stated, try again using thinner needles.

Yarn quantities are based on average requirements and are therefore approximate.

Pattern is given for the smallest size, with changes for the larger sizes given in square brackets [] afterwards. Where only one figure is given, this refers to all sizes.

Repeat the figures in round brackets () the number of times stated afterwards.

This pattern is written and tested for the specified yarn from The Fibre Co. Using another yarn might not achieve the intended results.

DIRECTIONS

BACK

Using 3.25mm (US 3) needles cast on 110 [122: 131: 140: 152: 164] sts.

Row 1 (RS): Knit.

Row 2: P2, *K1, P2, rep from * to end.

These 2 rows form fancy rib.

Work in fancy rib for a further 8 rows, dec [dec: -: inc: inc: dec] 1 st at end of last row and ending with RS facing for next row. 109 [121: 131: 141: 153: 163] sts.

Change to 4mm (US 6) needles.

Now work in patt as follows:

Row 1 (RS): K14 [12: 17: 14: 12: 17], (yfwd, K7, sl 1, K1, pss0, K7) 5 [6: 6: 7: 8: 8] times, yfwd, K2tog, K13 [11: 16: 13: 11: 16].

Row 2: Purl.

Rows 3 to 16: As Rows 1 and 2, 7 times.

Row 17: K13 [11: 16: 13: 11: 16], sl 1, K1, pss0, (yfwd, K7, K2tog, K7) 5 [6: 6: 7: 8: 8] times, yfwd, K14 [12: 17: 14: 12: 17].

Row 18: Purl.

Rows 19 to 32: As Rows 17 and 18, 7 times.

These 32 rows form patt.

Cont in patt until Back measures 49 [50: 51: 52: 53: 54] cm (19.25 [19.5: 20: 20.5: 20.75: 21.25] in), ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape Shoulders

Keeping patt correct, cast off 6 [7: 8: 9: 11: 12] sts at beg of next 8 [4: 4: 2: 8: 6] rows, then 0 [8: 9: 10: 0: 13] sts at beg of foll 0 [4: 4: 6: 0: 2] rows. 61 [61: 63: 63: 65: 65] sts.

Break yarn and leave sts on a holder.

FRONT

Work as given for Back until 10 [10: 12: 12: 14: 14] rows less have been worked than on Back to start of shoulder shaping, ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape Front Neck

Next row (RS): Patt 34 [40: 45: 50: 56: 61] sts and turn, leaving rem 75 [81: 86: 91: 97: 102] sts on a holder.

Work on this set of sts **only** for first side of neck as follows:

Keeping patt correct, dec 1 st at neck edge of next 8 rows, then on foll 0 [0: 1: 1: 2: 2] alt rows. 26 [32: 36: 41: 46: 51] sts.

Work 1 row, ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape Shoulder

Cast off 6 [7: 8: 9: 11: 12] sts at beg of next and foll 2 [1: 1: 0: 2: 2] alt rows, then 0 [8: 9: 10: 0: 0] sts at beg of foll 0 [1: 1: 2: 0: 0] alt rows **and at same time** dec 1 st at neck edge of next and foll alt row.

Work 1 row.

Cast off rem 6 [8: 9: 10: 11: 13] sts.

Return to 75 [81: 86: 91: 97: 102] sts left on holder for second side of neck, slip centre 41 sts onto another holder (for Collar), re-join yarn with RS facing and patt to end. 34 [40: 45: 50: 56: 61] sts.

Complete to match first side of neck, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES

Using 3.25mm (US 3) needles cast on 50 [53: 53: 56: 59: 59] sts.

Work in fancy rib as given for Back for 10 rows, inc 1 [0: 2: 1: 0: 2] sts evenly across last row and ending with RS facing for next row.

51 [53: 55: 57: 59: 61] sts.

Change to 4mm (US 6) needles.

Starting with a K row, now work in st st throughout as follows:

Work 10 [8: 6: 6: 4] rows, ending with RS facing for next row.

Next row (RS): K2, M1, K to last 2 sts, M1, K2.

Working all sleeve increases as set by last row, inc 1 st at each end of 12th [10th: 8th: 8th: 8th: 6th] and every foll 12th [10th: 8th: 8th: 8th: 6th] row until there are 69 [61: 63: 73: 85: 67] sts.

For 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Sizes Only

Inc 1 st at each end of every foll [12th: 10th: 10th: 10th: 8th] row until there are [73: 79: 83: 87: 91] sts.

For All Sizes

Cont straight until Sleeve measures 44 [45: 45: 46: 46: 46] cm (17.25 [17.75: 17.75: 18: 18: 18] in), ending with RS facing for next row. Cast off.

COLLAR

Join both shoulder seams.

With RS facing and using 3.25mm (US 3) circular needle, pick up and knit 13 [13: 16: 16: 19: 19] sts down left side of front neck, K across 41 sts on front holder, pick up and knit 13 [13: 16: 16: 19: 19] sts up right side of front neck, then K across 61 [61: 63: 63: 65: 65] sts on back neck holder inc [inc: dec: dec: 0: 0] 1 [1: 1: 1: 0: 0] st at centre. 129 [129: 135: 135: 144: 144] sts.

Turn work, so that **WS** of body (RS of Collar) is facing for next rnd and work in rnds as follows:

Rnd 1 (RS of Collar): Knit.

Rnd 2: *K2, P1, rep from * to end.

Last 2 rnds form fancy rib. Work 4 rnds.

Rnd 5: K2, pm, K58 [58: 58: 58: 61: 61], pm, K5, pm, K61 [61: 67: 67: 73: 73], pm, K3.

Rnd 6: K2, sm, M1, patt to next marker, M1, sm, K2, P1, K2, sm, M1, patt to next marker, M1, sm, K2, P1.

Keeping each pair of 5 sts between each pair of shoulder markers correct as set by last 2 rows and taking inc sts into patt, cont as follows: Work 5 rnds.

Next rnd: As Rnd 6.

Rep last 6 rnds 4 times more. 153 [153: 159: 159: 168: 168] sts.

Remove markers.

Cont in fancy rib until Collar measures 18 cm (7 in) from pick-up rnd, ending after a rep of patt Rnd 1.

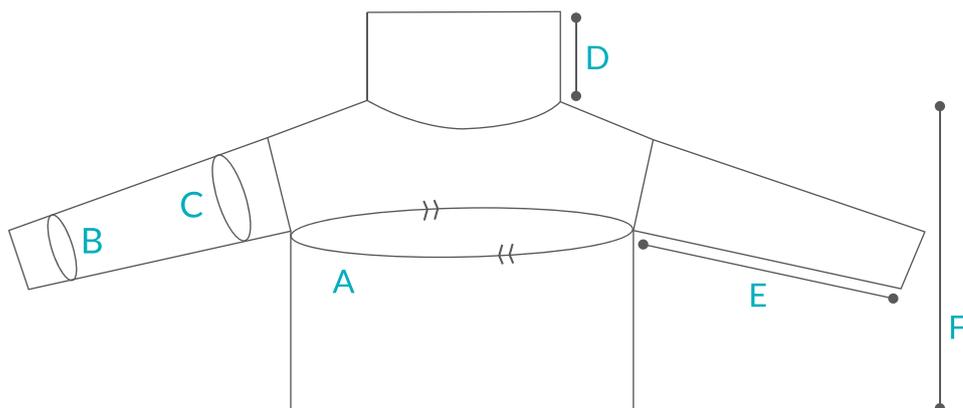
Cast off in patt.

FINISHING

Mark points along side seam edges 17 [18: 19: 20: 21: 22] cm (6.5 [7: 7.5: 7.75: 8.25: 8.5] in) either side of shoulder seams.

Sew cast-off edges of Sleeves to Back and Front between these points. Join side and sleeve seams.

Weave in ends. Steam or wet block to given measurements.
