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
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





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
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
Caitlin's crochet world

I learned to crochet as a child, first from elementary school classmates, and later from craft books. As someone who loved art, mathematics and textiles, I found crochet to be a captivating combination of the three. I was fascinated by the beautiful designs that crocheters could create, just by making a series of knots. I was even more excited to discover that the process was mathematical: that different stitches took up different amounts of space, and that they could be joined to create predictable shapes. Best of all, crocheting gave me an excuse to collect beautiful threads and yarns, which I could transform, stitch by stitch, into soft, textured lace.

My earliest thread crochet projects were snowflake ornaments, many of which still hang on my parents' Christmas tree each year. I come from an area famous for its long, snowy winters, and I associate crochet snowflakes with the warmest parts of those winters: Christmas decorating, holiday gift giving and winter evenings spent crocheting near a warm stove.

I hope the snowflakes in this collection will bring the same warmth and brightness to your winters, and that you enjoy making them as much as I've enjoyed designing them.

Tools and materials

One of the attractions of crochet snowflakes is that they do not require a large collection of specialised tools or materials. Select a steel hook and a ball of crochet thread, gather a few common household supplies and you will be ready to begin.

Crochet thread (A)

Snowflakes are usually crocheted from cotton crochet thread, which comes in sizes from 3 to 100, with higher numbers indicating finer threads. Thicker threads are easiest to crochet and, for that reason, all of the patterns in this collection were designed for size 10 thread. Experiment with finer threads and smaller hooks to create smaller, lighter-weight snowflakes. Or you may also wish to try other thicker materials, such as yarns, to create a larger snowflake.

Scissors

A small, sharp-pointed pair of scissors is especially helpful for clipping thread ends.

Crochet hooks (B)

For crocheting in thread, you will need a small, steel crochet hook. The patterns in this book use a 1.75mm crochet hook with size 10 thread. Thread thicknesses vary, as do the tensions of individual crocheters, so any hook size recommendation should be taken as a starting point only. For the purposes of these snowflakes, the correct hook is the one that allows you to work most comfortably with your chosen thread.

Starch or fabric stiffener

In order to hold their shapes, most snowflakes need to be stiffened. The material you use as a stiffener will depend on how you

plan to use the snowflake, and on your personal preference. Laundry starch (either liquid starch or heavy spray starch) can be used to stiffen snowflakes for hanging or for use as appliques, while preserving the thread's soft feel. Homemade sugar starches (recipes are available online) produce a similar effect. Commercial fabric stiffeners will give the snowflakes a hard or semi-hard finish, which can be useful for jewellery, hair accessories or hanging applications. (A mixture of white glue and water can be used as a substitute for fabric stiffener.)

Straight pins (C)

Use straight pins made from stainless steel, nickel-plated brass or another rust-proof material to hold your snowflake in position during blocking. It is a good idea to test the pins before use, to ensure that they will not stain the snowflakes. To do this, pin some to a piece of white fabric or a crochet sample, dampen it with your choice of stiffener, let it dry and then check for rust spots or stains.

Blocking board components

Snowflakes are best blocked on a blocking board, which can be made quickly and cheaply using readily available materials. You will need paper, tape, corrugated cardboard or cork board, cling film and the instructions on page 15.



Core techniques

For readers who are new to crochet (and those who could use a review), this section provides instruction on the stitches used in this book, as well as information about blocking and finishing. If you have never crocheted before, start by working the stitches with a large crochet hook in medium-weight yarn. Once you are comfortable with them, switch to thread.


Holding the hook and yarn




Thread and hook sizes used for snowflake samples
opposite: 1 size 40 crochet cotton; 1.25mm hook
 2 size 30 crochet cotton; 1.25mm hook
 3 size 10 crochet cotton; 1.75mm hook
 4 cotton embroidery thread; 1.75mm hook
 5 size 3 crochet cotton; 2mm hook
 6 3mm (1/8in) polyester ribbon; 2mm hook
 7 medium-weight cotton yarn; 4mm hook



Holding the hook as if it were a pen is the most widely used method. Centre the tips of your right thumb and forefinger over the flat section of the hook.




An alternative way to hold the hook is to grasp the flat section of the hook between your right thumb and forefinger as if you were holding a knife.




To control the supply and keep an even tension on the yarn, loop the short end of the yarn over your left forefinger and take the yarn coming from the ball loosely around the little finger on the same hand. Use the middle finger on the same hand to help hold the work. If left-handed, hold the hook in the left hand and the yarn in the right.



Making a slip knot



1 Loop the yarn as shown.



2 Insert the hook into the loop, catch the yarn with the hook and pull it through to make a loop over the hook.



3 Gently pull the yarn to tighten the loop around the hook and complete the slip knot.

Working a foundation chain (ch)


The foundation chain is the equivalent of casting on in knitting, and it is important to make sure that you have made the required number of chains for the pattern you are going to work. Count each V-shaped loop on the front of the chain as one chain stitch, except for the loop on the hook, which is not counted. You may find it easier to turn the chain over and count the stitches on the back of the chain – each raised 'bump' on the back of the chain counts as one stitch. When working the first row of stitches (usually called the foundation row) into the chain, insert the hook under one thread or two, depending on your preference.



1 Holding the hook with the slip knot in your right hand and the yarn in your left, wrap the yarn over the hook. Draw the yarn through the loop on the hook to make a new loop and complete the first chain stitch.




2 Continue in this way, drawing a new loop of yarn through the loop on the hook until the chain is the required length. Move the thumb and second finger that are grasping the chain upwards after every few stitches to keep the tension even. When working into the chain, insert the hook under one thread (for a looser edge) or two (for a firmer edge), depending on your preference.




Working a slip stitch (sl st)


Slip stitch is the shortest of all the crochet stitches and its main uses are for joining rounds, making seams and carrying the hook and yarn from one place to another.



1 Insert the hook from front to back into the required stitch.



2 Wrap the yarn over the hook (yarn over) and draw it through both the work and the loop on the hook. One loop remains on the hook and one slip stitch has been worked.



Working a double crochet (dc)



1 Begin with a foundation chain (see page 10) and insert the hook from front to back into the second chain from the hook. Wrap the yarn over the hook (yarn over) and draw it through the first loop, leaving two loops on the hook.



2 To complete the stitch, yarn over and draw it through both loops on the hook, leaving one loop on the hook. Continue in this way, working one double crochet into each chain.



3 At the end of the row, turn and work one chain for the turning chain (note that this chain does not count as a stitch). Insert the hook into the first double crochet at the beginning of the row. Work a double crochet into each stitch of the previous row, being careful to work the final stitch into the last stitch of the row, not into the turning chain.

Working in rounds

Snowflakes are worked in rounds, which means that they are worked outwards from a central ring called a foundation ring.



Making a foundation ring

Work a short length of foundation chain (see page 10) as specified in the pattern. Join the chains into a ring by working a slip stitch into the first stitch of the foundation chain.

Working into the ring

Work the number of turning chains specified in the pattern – three chains are shown here (counting as a treble crochet stitch). Inserting the hook into the space at the centre of the ring each time, work the number of stitches specified in the pattern into the ring.

Count the stitches at the end of the round to check you have worked the correct number. Join the first and last stitches of the round together by working a slip stitch into the top of the turning chain.

Finishing off the final round

To make a neat edge, finish off the final round by using this method of sewing the first and last stitches together in preference to the slip stitch joining method shown above.



1

Cut the yarn, leaving an end of about 10cm (4in), and draw it through the last stitch. With right side facing, thread the end in a tapestry needle and take it under both loops of the stitch next to the turning chain.





Pull the needle through and insert it into the centre of the last stitch of the round. On the wrong side, pull the needle through to complete the stitch, adjust the length of the stitch to close the round and then weave in the end on the wrong side in the usual way.




Blocking and stiffening

To make your snowflake flat, neat and symmetrical (and to ensure that it stays that way during hanging), it is necessary to block and stiffen it.




1 Make a blocking board. Copy the blocking diagram shown here on to a sheet of paper. Tape the paper to a flat piece of corrugated cardboard, cork board or any other rigid, pin-friendly material, such as polystyrene.




2 Cover it with cling film, so that it will be waterproof.




3 Soak the snowflake with strong laundry starch solution, fabric stiffener or (for applications that do not require a stiff snowflake) water.



4 Gently squeeze out any excess liquid, and press the snowflake approximately to shape.



5 Lay the snowflake on the blocking board, on the centre of the blocking diagram. Use the diagram's lines as guides to aid in symmetrical placement of the snowflake's arms.



6 Adjust the snowflake until it is flat and even, with straight arms and neat loops. Secure the snowflake to the board with straight pins. Let it dry completely before removing it.





Snowflake patterns

The snowflakes in this chapter are organised by level of difficulty. Leaf through and choose your favourite designs, or start with the basic patterns and work your way up to the advanced ones, learning new techniques as you go.

1 Chamonix

Skill level: 

This simple snowflake is composed of the three most basic stitches: the chain, the slip stitch and the double crochet. The pattern is designed for size 10 crochet thread, but if you are new to crochet, you may find it easier to make it with yarn first.

Materials:

■ Thread required: 3.7m (4yd)

Tools:

■ 1.75mm crochet hook

Finished diameter: 57mm (2¼in)


Foundation ring: ch 10, and join with sl st in first ch. (See Steps 1–2.)

Rnd 1: ch 1 (counts as dc). [ch 12, dc] 5 times in ring. ch 12 and join with sl st in initial ch 1. (See Steps 3–4.)

Rnd 2: ch 1 (counts as dc). *ch 7. [dc, ch 10, dc] in top of next ch-12 point. ch 7.** dc in next dc. Repeat from * 4 more times, and from * to ** once. Join with sl st in initial ch 1. Fasten off; weave in ends. (See Steps 4–8.)

sl st in the first chain of the ch 10, to form the foundation ring.

ch 1 (this counts as the first dc of Rnd 1). [ch 12, dc] in the foundation ring, five times. Then ch 12.

sl st in the ch 1 that began the round. ch 1 (this counts as the first dc of Rnd 2).

4



*ch 7. Work [dc, ch 10, dc] in the top of the next ch-12 point.

5



ch 7.** dc in the next dc.

6



Repeat Steps 5 and 6 four more times.

7



Begin a fifth repeat of Steps 5 and 6, but stop before making the final dc of Step 6. sl st in the ch 1 that began the round. Fasten off and weave in ends.

2 Reykjavik

Skill level: ❄️

This little crystal features a compact central star with points made from long, chained loops. This pattern provides an opportunity for you to practise with asterisks, which are often used in crochet patterns to indicate repeats and partial repeats.

Materials:

■ Thread required: 2.7m (3yd)

Tools:

■ 1.75mm crochet hook

Finished diameter: 48mm (1½in)

Foundation ring: ch 6, and join with sl st in first ch. (See Step 1.)


Rnd 1: ch 1 (counts as dc). 11 dc in ring. Join with sl st in initial ch 1. (See Step 2.)

Rnd 2: ch 1 (counts as dc). dc in 1 dc. *ch 4, and dc in 2 dc. Repeat from * 4 more times. ch 4, and join with sl st in initial ch 1. (See Steps 3–5.)

Rnd 3: ch 1 (counts as dc). *ch 4. dc in next dc. [2 dc, ch 10, 2 dc] in ch-4 point.** dc in 1 dc. Repeat from * 4 more times, and from * to ** once. Join with sl st in initial ch 1. Fasten off; weave in ends. (See Steps 6–8.)

1 ch 6, and sl st in the first chain to form the foundation ring.



2 ch 1 (this counts as the first dc of Rnd 1). If dc in foundation ring, sl st in the ch 1 that began the round.



3 ch 1 (this counts as the first dc of Rnd 2). dc in 1 dc. *ch 4, dc in 2 dc.



4 Returning to Step 3, repeat all the instructions that come after the * four more times. (You will have a total of five ch-4 points.)



5 ch 4, and sl st in the ch 1 that began the round, to create the sixth point. ch 1 (this counts as the first dc of Rnd 3).



6 *ch 4, and dc in the next dc.



7 [2 dc, ch 10, 2 dc] in the next ch-4 point. ** dc in the next dc.



8 Repeat Steps 6 and 7 four more times. Begin a fifth repeat, but stop when you get to the ** in Step 7. sl st in the ch 1 that began the round. Fasten off and weave in ends.

3 Sapporo

Skill level: 

In Sapporo, treble crochets and long chains work together to form a clean, rounded design.

Materials:

■ Thread required: 6.4m (7yd)

Tools:

■ 1.75mm crochet hook

Finished diameter: 70mm (2¾in)

Foundation ring: ch 6, and join with sl st in first ch. (See Step 1.)

Rnd 1: ch 3 (counts as tr), tr in ring. [ch 3, 2 tr] 5 times in ring. ch 3. Join with sl st in top of initial ch 3. (See Steps 1–2.)

Rnd 2: ch 3 (counts as tr), tr in next tr. * [2 tr, ch 9, 2 tr] in ch-3 point. ** tr in 2 tr. Repeat from * 4 more times, and from * to ** once. Join with sl st in top of initial ch 3. (See Steps 3–5.)



Rnd 3: sl st in 1 tr. * ch 4. Skip 2 tr. [3 tr, ch 6, 3 tr] in next ch-9 loop. ch 4. Skip 2 tr. ** sl st in 2 tr. Repeat from * 4 more times, and from * to ** once. Join with sl st in sl st. Fasten off; weave in ends. (See Steps 5–8.)

4 Banff

Skill level: ❄️

This pattern creates points with picots, which are small loops of chain closed with slip stitches.

Materials:

■ Thread required: 4.6m (5yd)

Tools:

■ 1.75mm crochet hook

Finished diameter: 70mm (2½in)

Foundation ring: ch 6, and join with sl st in first ch. (See Step 1.)



Rnd 1: ch 1 (counts as dc), 11 dc in ring. Join with sl st in initial ch 1. (See Step 1.)

Rnd 2: ch 1 (counts as dc), dc in 1 dc, *ch 6, dc in 2 dc. Repeat from * 4 more times. ch 6, and join with sl st in initial ch 1. (See Steps 2–4.)

Rnd 3: sl st in 1 dc and in ch-6 space. ch 1 (counts as dc), 3 dc in same ch-6 space. *ch 11, sl st in 4th ch from hook to form picot, ch 7, 4 dc in same ch-6 space as last dc, ch 8, ** 4 dc in next ch-6 space. Repeat from * 4 more times, and from * to ** once. Join with sl st in initial dc. Fasten off; weave in ends. (See Steps 5–8.)



8 Repeat Steps 6 and 7 four more times. Begin a fifth repeat, but stop when you get to the ** in Step 7. sl st in the ch 1 that began the round. Fasten off and weave in ends.

5 Bariloche

Skill level: ❄️

The gentle curves of this star are created from a mix of stitches, including double, treble and double treble crochets.

Materials:

■ Thread required: 6.4m (7yd)

Tools:

■ 1.75mm crochet hook

Finished diameter: 64mm (2½in)

Foundation ring: ch 6, and join with sl st in first ch. (See Step 1.)

Rnd 1: ch 1 (counts as dc). 11 dc in ring. Join with sl st in initial ch 1. (See Step 1.)

Rnd 2: ch 4 (counts as dtr). [ch 2, dtr] in each of 11 dc. ch 2, and join with sl st in top of initial ch 4. (See Steps 2–3.)

Rnd 3: ch 1 (counts as dc). *ch 5. 2 dtr in next dtr. ch 5.** dc in next dtr. Repeat from * 4 more times, and from * to ** once. Join with sl st in initial ch 1. (See Steps 3–5.)

Rnd 4: *5 dc in ch-5 space. [dc, tr] in 1 dtr. ch 3. [tr, dc] in 1 dtr. 5 dc in ch-5 space.** sl st in dc. Repeat from * 4 more times, and from * to ** once. Join with sl st in sl st. Fasten off; weave in ends. (See Steps 6–8.)





1 ch 6, and sl st in the first chain to form the foundation ring. ch 1 (this counts as the first dc of Rnd 1). 11 dc in foundation ring. sl st in the ch 1 that began the round.

2 ch 4 (this counts as the first dtr of Rnd 2). [ch 2, dtr] in each of the 11 dc.

3 ch 2, and sl st in top of the ch 4 that began the round. ch 1 (this counts as the first dc of Rnd 3).



4 *ch 5. 2 dtr in next dtr. ch 5.** dc in next dtr.

5 Repeat Step 4 four more times. Begin a fifth repeat, but stop when you get to the **. sl st in the ch 1 that began the round.

6 *5 dc in the next ch-5 space. [dc, tr] in 1 dtr. ch 3.



7 [tr, dc] in the next dtr, and 5 dc in the next ch-5 space.** sl st in dc.

8 Repeat Steps 6 and 7 four more times. Begin a fifth repeat, but stop when you get to the ** in Step 7. sl st in the next sl st. Fasten off and weave in ends.

6 St Paul

Skill level: 

Named for the smaller of the Twin Cities of Minneapolis and St Paul, this snowflake features a hexagonal base, decorated with loops of chain.

Materials:

■ Thread required: 4.6m (5yd)

Tools:

■ 1.75mm crochet hook

Finished diameter: 67mm (2½in)

Foundation ring: ch 6, and join with sl st in first ch. (See Step 1.)

Rnd 1: ch 4 (counts as dtr), dtr in ring, [ch 5, 2 dtr] 5 times in ring, ch 5, and join with sl st in top of initial ch 4. (See Steps 1–2.)

Rnd 2: sl st in dtr, and in ch-5 space, ch 3 (counts as tr), and 5 tr in same space. *ch 1, 6 tr in next ch-5 space. Repeat from * 4 more times, ch 1, and join with sl st in top of initial ch 3. (See Steps 3–5.)

Rnd 3: sl st in 2 tr, *ch 10, and sl st in 10th ch from hook to form picot, sl st in next tr, ch 5. Skip 2 tr, and sl st in ch-1 space, ch 5.** Skip 2 tr, and sl st in 1 tr. Repeat from * 4 more times, and from * to ** once. Skip 2 sl st, and join with sl st in sl st. Fasten off; weave in ends. (See Steps 5–8.)






1 ch 6, and sl st in the first chain to form the foundation ring. ch 4 (this counts as the first dtr of Rnd 1). dtr in ring.

3 sl st in dtr, and in ch-5 space. ch 3 (this counts as the first tr of Rnd 2), and 5 tr in same space.

4 *ch 1, 6 tr in next ch-5 space.

5 Repeat Step 4 four more times. ch 1, sl st in the top of the ch 3 that began the round, and in 2 tr.

6 *ch 10, and sl st in the tenth ch from the hook to form picot.

7 sl st in next tr. ch 5, skip 2 tr, and sl st in ch-1 space. ch 5.** Skip 2 tr, and sl st in 1 tr.

8 Repeat Steps 6 and 7 four more times. Begin a fifth repeat, but stop when you get to the ** in Step 7. Skip 2 sl st, and sl st in 1 sl st. Fasten off and weave in ends.

7 Minneapolis

Skill level: 

Minneapolis shares its two inner rows with St Paul, but an extra row of stitches and variations in the border make it a design all its own.

Materials:

■ Thread required: 8.2m (9yd)

Tools:

■ 1.75mm crochet hook

Finished diameter: 83mm (3¼in)

Foundation ring: ch 6, and join with sl st in first ch. (See Step 1.)

Rnd 1: ch 4 (counts as dtr). dtr in ring. [ch 5, 2 dtr] 5 times in ring. ch 5, and join with sl st in top of initial ch 4. (See Step 1.)

Rnd 2: sl st in dtr, and in ch-5 space. ch 3 (counts as tr), and 5 tr in same space. *ch 1. 6 tr in next ch-5 space. Repeat from * 4 more times. ch 1, and join with sl st in top of initial ch 3. (See Step 1.)

Rnd 3: sl st in 2 tr. ch 3 (counts as tr). tr in 1 tr. *ch 6. Skip 2 tr, and tr in ch-1 space. ch 6.** Skip 2 tr, and tr in 2 tr. Repeat from * 4 more times, and from * to ** once. Join with sl st in top of initial ch 3. (See Steps 1–4.)

Rnd 4: ch 1 (counts as dc). *ch 10, and sl st in 10th ch from hook to form picot. dc in next tr. [ch 4, dc, ch 4] in next ch-6 space. [dc, ch 6, dc] in next tr. [ch 4, dc, ch 4] in next ch-6 space.** dc in next tr. Repeat from * 4 more times, and from * to ** once. Join with sl st in initial ch 1. Fasten off; weave in ends. (See Steps 4–8.)







8 Tallinn

Skill level: ❄️

With clean lines and rounded petals, this snowflake is reminiscent of a winter blossom.

Materials:

■ Thread required: 5.5m (6yd)

Tools:

■ 1.75mm crochet hook

Finished diameter: 64mm (2½in)

Use crochet snowflakes to embellish lavender sachets for a beautiful and sweet-smelling addition to your home's decor.



Combine several snowflakes to create gorgeous lace coasters and doilies. You can either sew your finished snowflakes together, or join them as you crochet them, by slip stitching the points of each snowflake to those of its neighbours.

Child's dress

Create a winter fashion statement by appliquéing a sprinkle of snowflakes to a little girl's special dress.





Garlands

Hang an elegant snowflake garland to decorate for a holiday or event, or just to brighten up the short winter days.

Method

Crochet, block and stiffen your snowflakes; then crochet a long chain, attaching snowflakes as you go with a stitch into the point. For extra sparkle, embellish the snowflakes with glass seed beads. The beads can either be sewn on the completed snowflakes, or crocheted in place by following these instructions:



1 Decide how many beads you will attach, and where they should be placed (each bead should fall between two stitches).



2 String all of the beads on to the thread before beginning.



3 Start the snowflake, allowing the beads to slide along the thread ahead of the stitches.




4 When you come to a point where you will place a bead, slide the bead up next to the last stitch.



5 Use the next stitch to secure it in place, then continue with the pattern.

Hair bands

Celebrate wintertime with lovely seasonal hair accessories. Attach snowflakes to a pre-made hair band, or crochet your own bands using the instructions below.

Method

Small, compact snowflakes work particularly well for this project. You will want enough to lay out a strip of overlapping snowflakes roughly 23cm (9in) long.



Block and stiffen the snowflakes with strong starch or fabric stiffener.



Then crochet a long chain, double the desired length of the hair band (if the finished band will have a circumference of 56cm [22in], the chain should be 112cm [44in] long).



Fold the chain in half, so that the band is created from a double thickness of chain, and thread the doubled chain through the snowflakes.



Pass one of the loose ends of the chain through its folded end, and join it to the other loose end, to connect the ends of the band.



Finally, use a few stitches to sew each snowflake to one next to it.



Scarf

Who says snowflakes have to be cold? Embrace the winter weather with a cosy and memorable snowflake scarf.

Method

Choose a simple snowflake pattern and your favourite yarn. For a light, lacy scarf, use a lace-weight yarn like the soft wool blend shown here. For a heavier one, use a thicker yarn and a more solid snowflake pattern.



1 As you make each snowflake, join it to the neighbouring snowflakes by slip stitching at the points.



2 If you like, use chains and picots to create a simple edging for the finished scarf (this is particularly helpful if the snowflakes have long points that need support).



3 Soak the scarf in cold water, block it on towels and wear it all winter long.

Repeat all instructions that you have been given, starting with the last *.

Repeat the instructions between the last * and the ** that follows it.


In snowflakes, it is common for a group of stitches to be repeated several times, and then partially repeated again:

■ Repeat from * 4 times, and from * to ** once more

Repeat all instructions, starting at the last *, 4 times. Then begin a fifth repetition, but stop when you get to the **.
