## ORTHAGON WRAPPER

KEPHREN PRITCHETT

**DIFFICULTY** ○○○○

**FINISHED SIZE** 73½" long and 22¼" wide.

**YARN** Blue Sky Fibers Baby Alpaca Sport Weight (100% baby alpaca; 110 yd [101 m]/1¾ oz [50 g]): #533 Navy Blue (A) and #812 Blue Cheese (B), 8 skeins each.

**YARN WEIGHT** (2)

**NEEDLES** Size 5 (3.75 mm): 32" circular (cir) and two double-pointed (dnp). Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

**NOTIONS** Marker (m); stitch holders; spare size 5 (3.75 mm) or smaller cir needle; waste yarn for provisional CO; tapestry needle.

**GAUGE** 21 sts and 42 rows = 4" in garter st.

### Notes

• This wrapper is worked in two pieces and grafted at the center. Each piece begins with an I-cord cast-on that continues into the I-cord border. Increases are worked at the center to form a mitered square accentuated by stripes in varying widths. When the width of the shawl is

reached, one side of the mitered square is bound off, and the stripes are continued until the piece measures half of the finished length of the shawl. After working the first half of the shawl, the second half is worked the same way with the colors reversed.

- When changing colors, do not break yarn. Hold the color not in use in front of the working yarn when knitting the first three I-cord stitches of each right-side row. This way the non-working yarn will be concealed within the I-cord border.

### Stitch Guide

#### MITERED SQUARE PATTERN:

**Row 1 (RS)** Knit to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, sl m, M1L, knit to last 3 sts, sl 3 pwise wyf—2 sts inc'd.

**Row 2 (WS)** Knit to last 3 sts, sl 3 pwise wyf. Rep Rows 1 and 2 for patt.

#### CENTER PATTERN:

**Row 1** Knit to last 3 sts, sl 3 pwise wyf. Rep Row 1 for patt.

#### First Half

**I-cord border:** With A, dnp, and using a provisional method, CO 3 sts. **Next row (RS)** K3, do not turn; slide sts to other end of needle. Rep last row 2 more times. **Next row (RS)** With cir needle, k3, pick up and knit 1 st from I-cord. Remove waste yarn from provisional CO and place 3 sts onto dnp, turn dnp clockwise 180 degrees so that purl side of I-cord is facing, sl these 3 sts pwise wyf onto cir needle, turn—7 sts. **Next row (WS)** K3, place marker (pm), k1, sl 3 pwise wyf. Work Mitered Square patt (see Stitch Guide) in stripe sequence as foll: work 36 rows with A, 2 rows with B, 34 rows with A, 4 rows with B, 32 rows with A, 6 rows with B, 30 rows with A, 8 rows with B, 28 rows with A, 10 rows with B, 26 rows with A—223 sts. Break A and cont with B only. Work 12 rows, ending with a WS row—235 sts. **Next row (RS)** K3, return

these 3 sts to left needle, \*k2, ssk, return 3 sts on right needle to left needle; rep from \* 114 more times, removing m when you come to it—120 sts rem. Join A. Work Center patt (see Stitch Guide) in stripe sequence as foll: work 24 rows with A, 14 rows with B, 22 rows with A, 16 rows with B, 20 rows with A. Break A and cont with B only. Work 18 rows, ending with a WS row. Break B. With RS facing, sl last 3 sts at left end of needle to dnp, turn dnp 180 degrees counterclockwise so that knit side of I-cord is facing, and sl these 3 sts back to cir needle. Place sts on holder.

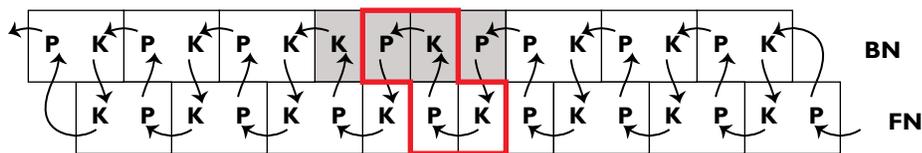
#### Second Half

**I-cord border:** With B, dnp, and using a provisional method, CO 3 sts. **Next row (RS)** K3, do not turn; slide sts to other end of needle. Rep last row 2 more times. **Next row (RS)** With cir needle, k3, pick up and knit 1 st from I-cord. Remove waste yarn from provisional CO and place 3 sts onto dnp, turn dnp clockwise 180 degrees so that purl side of I-cord is facing, sl these 3 sts pwise wyf onto cir needle, turn—7 sts. **Next row (WS)** K3, pm, k1, sl 3 pwise wyf. Work Mitered Square patt in stripe sequence as foll: work 36 rows with B, 2 rows with A, 34 rows with B, 4 rows with A, 32 rows with B, 6 rows with A, 30 rows with B, 8 rows with A, 28 rows with B, 10 rows with A, 26 rows with B—223 sts. Break B and cont with A only. Work 12 rows, ending with a WS row—235 sts. **Next row (RS)** K3, return these 3 sts to left needle, \*k2, ssk, return 3 sts on right

- K** knitwise
- P** purlwise
- FN** front needle
- BN** back needle
- pattern repeat



#### Grafting





needle to left needle; rep from \* 114 more times, removing m when you come to it—120 sts rem. Join B. Work Center patt in stripe sequence as foll: work 24 rows with B, 14 rows with A, 22 rows with B, 16 rows with A, 20 rows with B. Break B and cont with A only. Work 16 rows, ending with a WS row. **Next row** (RS) Knit to last 3 sts, sl 3 sts to dpn wyb, turn dpn 180 degrees counterclockwise so that knit side of l-cord is facing, and sl these 3 sts back to cir needle. Break A, leaving an 80" tail for grafting. Place sts on holder.

## Finishing

Weave in ends except grafting tail. Block halves to measurements. **Join halves:** Place sts onto separate cir needles. With A from 2nd half threaded on a tapestry needle, WS tog, and first half in front of 2nd half, graft sts in patt foll grafting diagram or written instructions as foll:

**Step 1** Insert tapestry needle pwise into st on front needle, leave st on needle.

**Step 2** Insert tapestry needle kwise into st on back needle, leave st on needle.

**Step 3** Insert tapestry needle kwise into st on front needle, remove st from needle;

insert tapestry needle pwise into next st on front needle, leave st on needle.

**Step 4** Insert tapestry needle pwise into st on back needle, remove st from needle; insert tapestry needle kwise into next st on back needle, leave st on needle. Rep Steps 3 and 4 once more.

**Step 5** Insert tapestry needle kwise into st on front needle, remove st from needle; insert tapestry needle pwise into next st on front needle, leave st on needle.

**Step 6** Insert tapestry needle pwise into st on back needle, remove st from needle; insert tapestry needle pwise into next st on back needle, leave st on needle.

**Step 7** Insert tapestry needle kwise into st on front needle, remove st from needle; insert tapestry needle pwise into next st on front needle, leave st on needle.

**Step 8** Insert tapestry needle kwise into st on back needle, remove st from needle; insert tapestry needle pwise into next st on back needle, leave st on needle. Rep Steps 7 and 8 until 4 sts rem on each needle.

**Step 9** Insert tapestry needle kwise into st on front needle, remove st from needle; insert tapestry needle pwise into next st on

front needle, leave st on needle.

**Step 10** Insert tapestry needle kwise into st on back needle, remove st from needle; insert tapestry needle kwise into next st on back needle, leave st on needle.

**Step 11** Insert tapestry needle kwise into st on front needle, remove st from needle; insert tapestry needle pwise into next st on front needle, leave st on needle.

**Step 12** Insert tapestry needle pwise into st on back needle, remove st from needle; insert tapestry needle kwise into next st on back needle, leave st on needle.

Rep Steps 11 and 12 once more.

**Step 13** Insert tapestry needle kwise into st on front needle and remove st from needle.

**Step 14** Insert tapestry needle pwise into st on back needle and remove st from needle. Weave in ends.

## EULER CARDIGAN LINDA MARVENG

**DIFFICULTY** ○○○○

**FINISHED SIZE** 33½ (37, 41, 44, 48, 52)" circumference at underarm. Cardigan shown measures 33½"; modeled with 1½" of positive ease.

**YARN** Lorna's Laces Shepherd Worsted (100% superwash Merino wool; 225 yd [206 m]/4 oz [113 g]): #14ns Denim, 6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 8) skeins.

**YARN WEIGHT** (4)

**NEEDLES** Sizes 6 (4 mm) and 7 (4.5 mm). Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

**NOTIONS** Cable needle (cn); stitch holders; tapestry needle.

**GAUGE** 20 sts and 27 rows = 4" in St st on larger needles; 35-st front band = 5½" wide.

### Notes

- This cardigan is worked back and forth from the bottom up in separate pieces and seamed.

### Back

With smaller needles, CO 84 (92, 102, 110, 120, 130) sts. **Next row** (RS) K1, \*p1,

k1tbl; rep from \* to last st, k1. **Next row** P1, \*p1tbl, k1; rep from \* to last st, p1. Rep last 2 rows until piece measures 1½" from CO, ending with a WS row. Change to larger needles. Work in St st until piece measures 15" from CO, ending with a WS row. **Shape armholes:** BO 4 (4, 4, 5, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows, then BO 3 (3, 3, 4, 4) sts at beg of foll 2 (2, 4, 2, 2, 2) rows—70 (78, 82, 92, 102, 112) sts rem. BO 2 (2, 2, 3, 3, 3) sts at beg of next 2 (4, 4, 2, 4, 4) rows, then BO 1 (1, 1, 2, 2, 2) st(s) at beg of foll 4 (4, 4, 4, 4, 6) rows, then BO 0 (0, 0, 1, 1, 1) st at beg of foll 0 (0, 0, 4, 4, 6) rows—62 (66, 70, 74, 78, 82) sts rem. Work even until armhole measures 7 (7½, 7¾, 8¼, 8¾, 9)",

ending with a WS row. Shape neck and left shoulder using short-rows as foll:

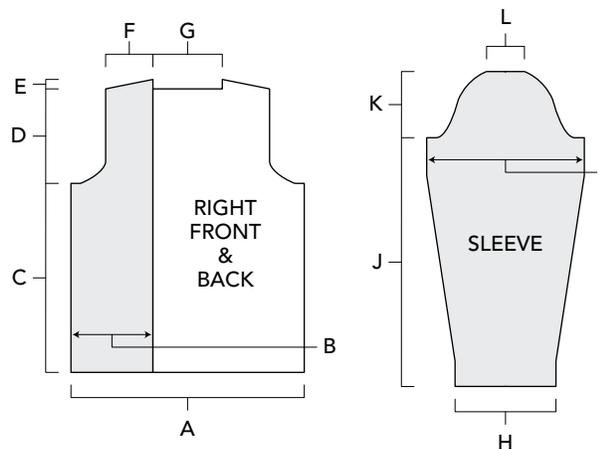
**Short-row 1** (RS) K17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27) and place these sts on holder for right shoulder, BO 28 sts, knit to last 6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 8) sts, wrap next st, turn—17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27) sts rem for left shoulder.

**Short-row 2** (WS) Purl to end.

**Short-row 3** K6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 8), wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 4** Purl to end.

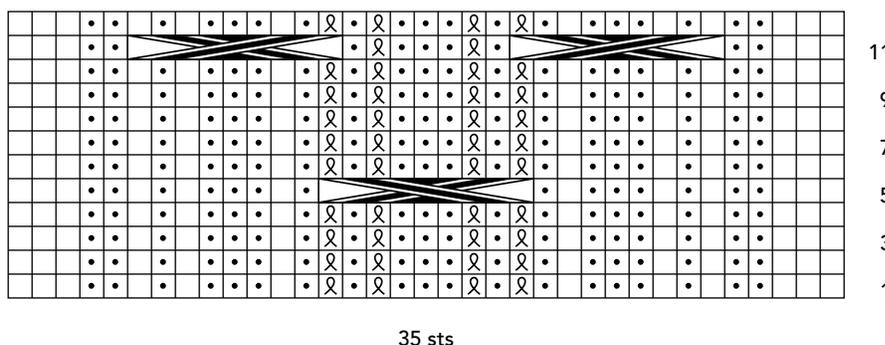
**Next row** (RS) Knit to end, working wraps tog with wrapped sts. Purl 1 WS row. Place sts on holder. **Right shoulder:** Return 17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27) right shoulder sts to needle and, with WS facing, rejoin yarn.



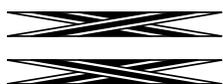

- k on RS; p on WS

- k1tbl on RS; p1tbl on WS



- sl 6 sts onto cn, hold in back, k1, p1, k1, sl last 3 sts from cn to left needle, p3, (k1, p1, k1) from cn
- sl 6 sts onto cn, hold in front, k1, p1, k1, sl last 3 sts from cn to left needle, p3, (k1, p1, k1) from cn

Shape shoulder using short-rows as foll:

**Short-row 1** (WS) Purl to last 6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 8) sts, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 2** (RS) Knit to end.

**Short-row 3** P6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 8), wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 4** Knit to end.

**Next row** (WS) Purl to end, working wraps tog with wrapped sts. Place sts on holder.

### Left Front

With smaller needles, CO 28 (32, 36, 40, 46, 50) sts. **Next row** (RS) K1, \*p1, k1tbl; rep from \* to last st, k1. **Next row** (WS) P1, \*p1tbl, k1; rep from \* to last st, p1. Rep last 2 rows until piece measures 1½" from CO, ending with a WS row. Change to larger needles. **Next row** (RS) Knit and inc 0 (0, 1, 1, 0, 1) st—28 (32, 37, 41, 46, 51) sts. Cont in St st until piece measures 15" from CO, ending with a WS row. **Shape armhole:** At beg of RS rows, BO 4 (4, 4, 5, 5, 5) sts once, then BO 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts 1 (1, 2, 1, 1, 1) time(s)—21 (25, 27, 32, 37, 42) sts rem. Work 1 WS row. At beg of RS rows, BO 2 (2, 2, 3, 3, 3) sts 1 (2, 2, 1, 2, 2) time(s), then BO 1 (1, 1, 2, 2, 2) st(s) 2 (2, 2, 2, 3) times,

then BO 0 (0, 0, 1, 1, 1) st 0 (0, 0, 2, 2, 3) times—17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27) sts rem. Work even until armhole measures 7 (7½, 7¾, 8¼, 8¾, 9)", ending with a RS row. Shape shoulder using short-rows as foll:

**Short-row 1** (WS) Purl to last 6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 8) sts, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 2** (RS) Knit to end.

**Short-row 3** P6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 8), wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 4** Knit to end.

**Next row** (WS) Purl to end, working wraps tog with wrapped sts. Place sts on holder.

### Right Front

With smaller needles, CO 28 (32, 36, 40, 46, 50) sts. **Next row** (RS) K1, \*k1tbl, p1; rep from \* to last st, k1. **Next row** (WS) P1, \*k1, p1tbl; rep from \* to last st, p1. Rep last 2 rows until piece measures 1½" from CO, ending with a WS row. Change to larger needles. **Next row** (RS) Knit and inc 0 (0, 1, 1, 0, 1) st—28 (32, 37, 41, 46, 51) sts. Cont in St st until piece measures 15" from CO, ending with a RS row. **Shape armhole:** At beg of WS rows, BO 4 (4, 4, 5, 5, 5) sts once, then BO 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 4) sts 1 (1, 2, 1,

1, 1) time(s)—21 (25, 27, 32, 37, 42) sts rem. Work 1 RS row. At beg of WS rows, BO 2 (2, 2, 3, 3, 3) sts 1 (2, 2, 1, 2, 2) time(s), then BO 1 (1, 1, 2, 2, 2) st(s) 2 (2, 2, 2, 2, 3) times, then BO 0 (0, 0, 1, 1, 1) st 0 (0, 0, 2, 2, 3) times—17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27) sts rem. Work even until armhole measures 7 (7½, 7¾, 8¼, 8¾, 9)", ending with a WS row. Shape shoulder using short-rows as foll:

**Short-row 1** (RS) Knit to last 6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 8) sts, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 2** (WS) Purl to end.

**Short-row 3** K6 (6, 7, 7, 8, 8), wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 4** Purl to end.

**Next row** (RS) Knit to end, working wraps tog with wrapped sts. **Next row** Purl. Place sts on holder.

### Sleeves

With smaller needles, CO 40 (40, 44, 44, 48, 48) sts. **Next row** (RS) K1, \*p1, k1tbl; rep from \* to last st, k1. **Next row** (WS) P1, \*p1tbl, k1; rep from \* to last st, p1. Rep last 2 rows until piece measures 2" from CO, ending with a WS row. Change to larger needles. Work in St st until piece

measures 3¼" from CO, ending with a WS row. **Inc row (RS)** K1, M1, knit to last st, M1, k1—2 sts inc'd. Rep inc row every 10 (10, 10, 8, 8, 6)th row 8 (10, 10, 12, 12, 14) more times—58 (62, 66, 70, 74, 78) sts. Work even until piece measures 19¾ (19¾, 19¾, 19¾, 20, 20)" from CO, ending with a WS row. **Shape cap:** BO 4 (4, 4, 5, 5, 5) sts at beg of next 2 rows, then BO 1 st at beg of foll 26 (30, 32, 22, 24, 28) rows—24 (24, 26, 38, 40, 40) sts rem. BO 2 sts at beg of next 2 (2, 2, 8, 8, 8) rows, then BO 3 sts at beg of foll 2 rows—14 (14, 16, 16, 18, 18) sts rem. BO all sts.

## Finishing

Weave in ends. Block pieces to measurements. With RS tog, join shoulders using three-needle BO. **Collar:** (Make 2) With larger needles, CO 37 sts. **Set-up row (WS)** P3, k2, p1, k1, p1, k3, p1, k1, p2tog, yo, p2tog, k3, p2tog, yo, p2tog, k1, p1, k3, p1, k1, p1, k2, p3—35 sts rem. Work Drop Cable chart until piece measures 26 (26½, 26¾, 27¼, 27¾, 28)" from CO, or until collar fits slightly stretched along right front to center back neck, ending with Row 12. **Next row (RS)** K3, p2, k1, p1, k1, p3, k1, p1, k1tbl, yo, drop next st from left needle, k1tbl, p3, k1tbl, yo, drop next st from left needle, k1tbl, p1, k1, p3, k1, p1, k1, p2, k3. Ravel 2 dropped sts down to set-up row. Place sts on holder. With RS tog, join collars using three-needle BO. Sew sel-edge edge of collar to center front edge and back neck edge, centering collar seam at center back. Sew sleeves into armholes. Sew sleeve and side seams.

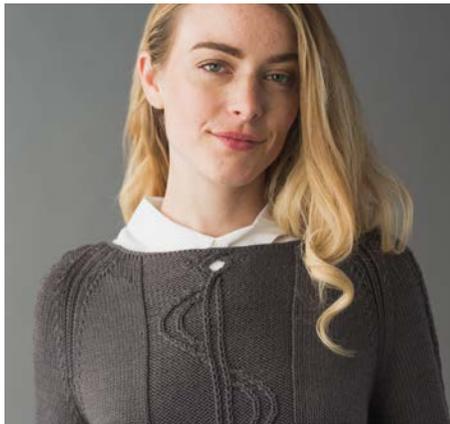

## FOURIER RAGLAN DONNA ESTIN

**DIFFICULTY** ○○○○

**FINISHED SIZE** 36¼ (40½, 44¼, 48½, 52¼)" circumference at underarm. Pullover shown measures 36¼"; modeled with 3¼" of positive ease.

**YARN** Sugar Bush Yarns Crisp (100% extra-fine superwash Merino; 95 yd [87 m]/1¾ oz [50 g]); #2019 Lead, 15 (17, 18, 20, 22) balls.

**YARN WEIGHT** (3)

**NEEDLES** Size 5 (3.75 mm); 24" and 32" circular (cir) and set of double-pointed (dnp). Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

**NOTIONS** Markers (m); cable needle (cn); stitch holders; tapestry needle.

**GAUGE** 22 sts and 30 rnds = 4" in St st; 30 sts of Body chart = 5" wide.

### Notes

- The body and sleeves of this pullover are worked in the round from the lower edge to the yoke, then the pieces are joined for working the raglan shaping. At the center front opening, the garment is worked back and forth beginning and



ending at the center front, then joined in the round again and finished with an I-cord bind-off.

- Slip stitches purlwise with yarn in back.

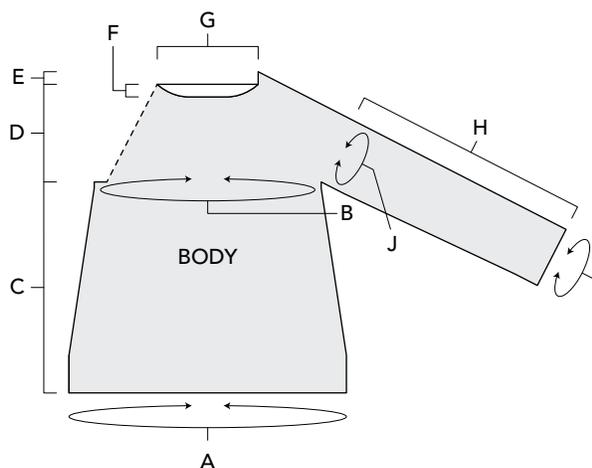
### Body

With longer cir needle, CO 248 (272, 292, 316, 336) sts. Place marker (pm) and join in the rnd. **Next rnd** P124 (136, 146, 158, 168), pm for side, purl to end. Purl 3 rnds. **Next rnd** \*K47 (53, 58, 64, 69), pm for chart, p13, k1, p2, k1, p13, pm for chart, k47 (53, 58, 64, 69), sl m; rep from \* once more. **Next rnd** \*Knit to m, p13, sl 1 (see Notes), p2, sl 1, p13, sl m, knit to m, sl m; rep from \* once more. Rep last 2 rnds 0 (1, 2, 4, 5) more time(s). **Next rnd** \*K10, pm, k29, pm, knit to m, sl m, work Body chart over 30 sts, sl m, k8 (14, 19, 25, 30), pm, k29, pm, k10, sl m; rep from \* once more. Cont in patt for 19 (18, 17, 17, 16) more rnds. **Dec rnd**

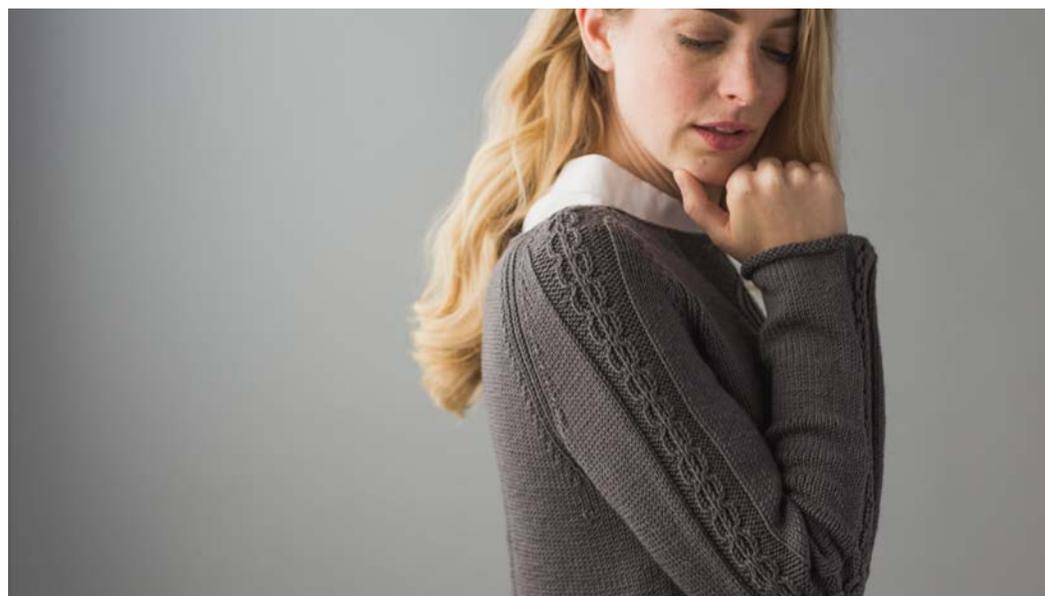
\*[Knit to m, sl m, ssk] 2 times, knit to m, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, [knit to 2 sts before m, k2tog, sl m] 2 times, knit to m, sl m; rep from \* once more—8 sts dec'd. Rep dec rnd every 20 (19, 18, 18, 17)th rnd 4 more times—208 (232, 252, 276, 296) sts rem. Remove 8 shaping m. Work 19 (18, 17, 17, 16) rnds even. **Dec rnd** \*K10, ssk, work in patt to 12 sts before side m, k2tog, k10, sl m; rep from \* once more—204 (228, 248, 272, 292) sts rem. Work even until Rows 1–56 of Body chart have been worked 2 times, then work through Row 14 (10, 6, 4, 0) of chart, ending 6 (7, 7, 8, 8) sts before end of rnd on last rnd. Leave sts on needle and set aside. Do not break yarn.

### Sleeves

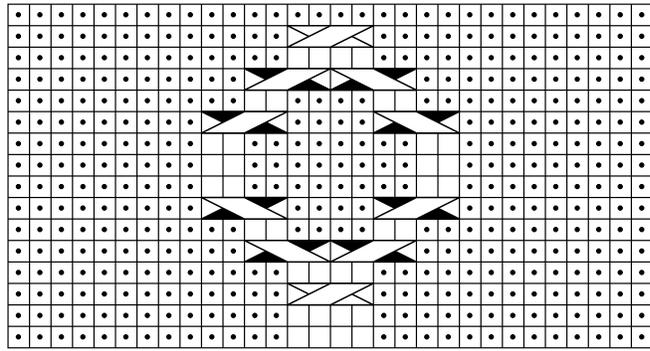
With dnp, CO 57 (57, 57, 67, 67) sts. Pm and join in the rnd. Purl 3 rnds. **Set-up rnd**

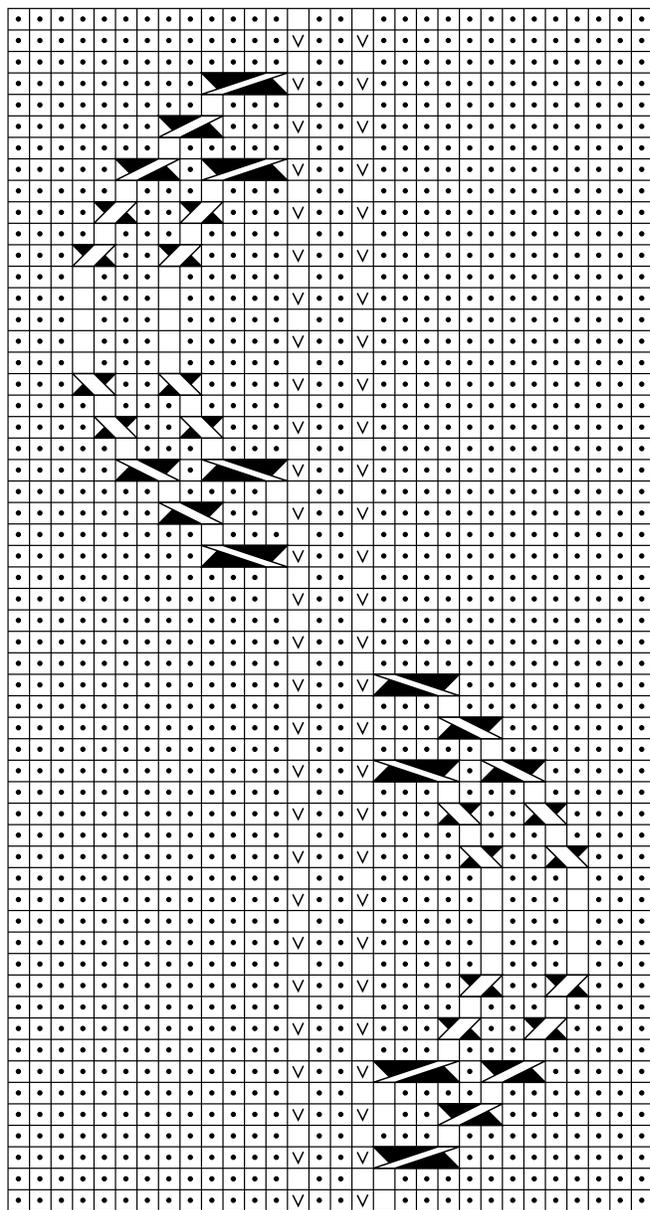

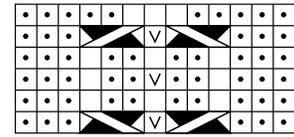

K22 (22, 22, 27, 27), pm for chart, p5, k3, p5, pm for chart, k22 (22, 22, 27, 27). **Next rnd** Knit to m, sl m, work Sleeve chart over 13 sts, sl m, knit to end. Cont in patt until piece measures 2" from CO. **Inc rnd** K1, M1L, work in patt to last st, M1R, k1—2 sts inc'd. Rep inc rnd every 28 (14, 10, 11, 7)th rnd 4 (8, 11, 10, 15) more times—67 (75, 81, 89, 99) sts. Work even until piece measures 19" from CO, ending 6 (7, 7, 8, 8) sts before end of rnd on last rnd, and ending both sleeves on same odd-numbered chart row. Place next 12 (14, 14, 16, 16) sts on holder for underarm—55 (61, 67, 73, 83) sts rem. Place sts on separate holder. Make a note of last chart row worked.

Yoke

**Joining rnd** With longer cir needle, \*hold one sleeve to body, RS tog, and using the three-needle method, loosely BO 12 (14, 14, 16, 16) body and sleeve underarm sts tog\*, work body sts in patt to 6 (7, 7, 8, 8) sts before side m, rep from \* to \*, work in patt to end of body. Pm for beg of rnd. **Next rnd** \*Pick up and knit 1 st from armhole and work it tog with first st of sleeve, cont in patt



across 53 (59, 65, 71, 81) sleeve sts, sl last sleeve st to right needle, pick up and knit 1 st from armhole, transfer sl st to left needle and work these 2 sts tog, pm for raglan, work body sts in patt to underarm, pm for raglan; rep from \* once more—290 (322, 354, 386, 426) sts: 55 (61, 67, 73, 83) sts for each sleeve, 90 (100, 110, 120, 130) sts each for front and back. **Next rnd** \*Work in patt to 2 sts before raglan m, k2tog, sl m; rep from \* to end—286 (318, 350, 382, 422) sts rem: 54 (60, 66, 72, 82) sts for each sleeve, 89 (99, 109, 119, 129) sts each for front and back. **Shape raglan:** **Note:** Short-rows beg before raglan shaping ends; read the foll sections all the way through before proceeding; raglan shaping will eventually use Sleeve chart sts; remove Sleeve chart m when necessary. **Dec rnd** \*K1, p1, k1, k2tog, work in patt to 4 sts before raglan m, ssk, k1, p1, sl m; rep from \* to end—8 sts dec'd. Keeping sts adjacent to raglan m in rib as established, rep dec rnd every 3rd (3rd, 3rd, 3rd, next) rnd 13 (9, 7, 3, 3) more times, then every 2nd rnd 7 (15, 20, 27, 32) times—118 (118, 126, 134, 134) sts rem: 12 (10, 10, 10, 10) sts for each sleeve, 47 (49, 53, 57, 57) sts each for front and back. **At the same time**, after Rows 1–56 of Body chart have been worked a total of 3 times from CO, shape upper back using German short-rows as foll: **Note:** First short-row is a raglan dec rnd; beg rnd 4 sts before raglan m and work last raglan dec of rnd first.

**Short-row 1 (RS)** Work raglan dec, work sleeve sts in patt, sl m, work in patt to chart m, sl m, work Row 1 of Back chart over 30 sts, sl m, work in patt to 2 sts before front chart m, turn.

**Short-row 2 (WS)** Make double st, work in patt to 2 sts before front chart m, turn.

**Short-row 3** Make double st, work in patt to 2 sts before double st, turn.

**Short-row 4** Make double st, work in patt to 2 sts before double st, turn.

**Short-rows 5 and 6** Rep Short-rows 3 and 4.

**Short-row 7 (RS)** Make double st, work in patt to front chart m, working double sts as single sts, sl m, p13, sl 2 sts onto cn, hold in back, k2, transfer 2 sts from cn to left needle, turn.

#### Front opening:

**Row 1 (WS)** P2, ssk, k11, work in patt to 4 sts before center front turning point, working double sts as single sts, k2tog, p2, turn.

**Row 2 (RS)** K2, ssp, p10, work in patt to 4 sts before center front opening, p2tog, k2, turn.

**Row 3** P2, ssk, k9, work in patt to 4 sts before opening, k2tog, p2, turn.

**Row 4** K2, p10, work in patt to 2 sts before opening, k2, turn.

**Row 5** P2, k1f&b, k9, work in patt to 3 sts before opening, k1f&b, p2, turn.

**Row 6** K2, p1f&b, p10, work in patt to 3 sts before opening, p1f&b, k2, turn.

**Row 7** P2, k1f&b, k11, work in patt to 3 sts before opening, k1f&b, p2, turn.

**Row 8** Sl 2, p13, work in patt to 2 sts before opening, sl 2 sts onto cn, hold in back, k2, k2 from cn, wyb sl next st and pull yarn tightly, p12, work in patt to end—center front opening is closed and raglan shaping is complete.

**Next rnd** Work in patt to front chart m, p30, work in patt to end—Back chart is complete. Using the I-cord method, BO all sts as foll: \*With RS facing, k1 but do not drop st from left needle. Turn right needle clockwise and insert tip of left needle from left to right into st on right needle. Remove right needle—1 st CO. Rep from \* 2 more times—3 sts CO. **Next row** K2, k2tog tbl, transfer 3 sts from right needle to left needle, pull yarn tight. Rep last row until 3 sts rem. BO all sts. Sew ends of I-cord tog.

## Finishing

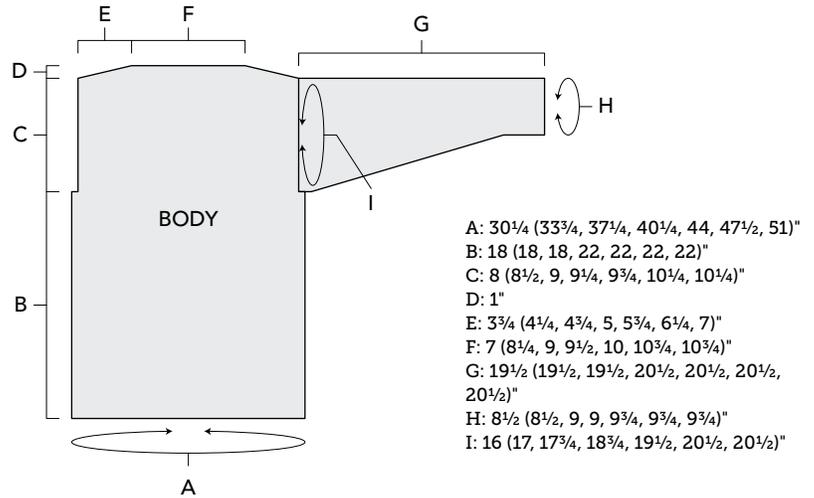
Weave in ends. Block, allowing lower edge and cuffs to roll under.

**FINISHED SIZE** 30¼ (33¾, 37¼, 40¼, 44, 47½, 51)" circumference at underarm. Pull-over shown measures 30¼"; modeled with 1¾" of negative ease.

**YARN** Plymouth Yarn Incan Spice (45% superfine Merino wool, 25% baby alpaca, 15% mulberry silk, 15% yak; 218 yd [199 m]/1¾ oz [50 g]): #2 Orange, 7 (7, 8, 10, 10, 11, 12) balls.

**YARN WEIGHT** (2)

**NEEDLES** Size 4 (3.5 mm): 16" and 24" circular (cir) and set of double-pointed (dnp). Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

**NOTIONS** Markers (m); cable needle (cn); stitch holders; tapestry needle.

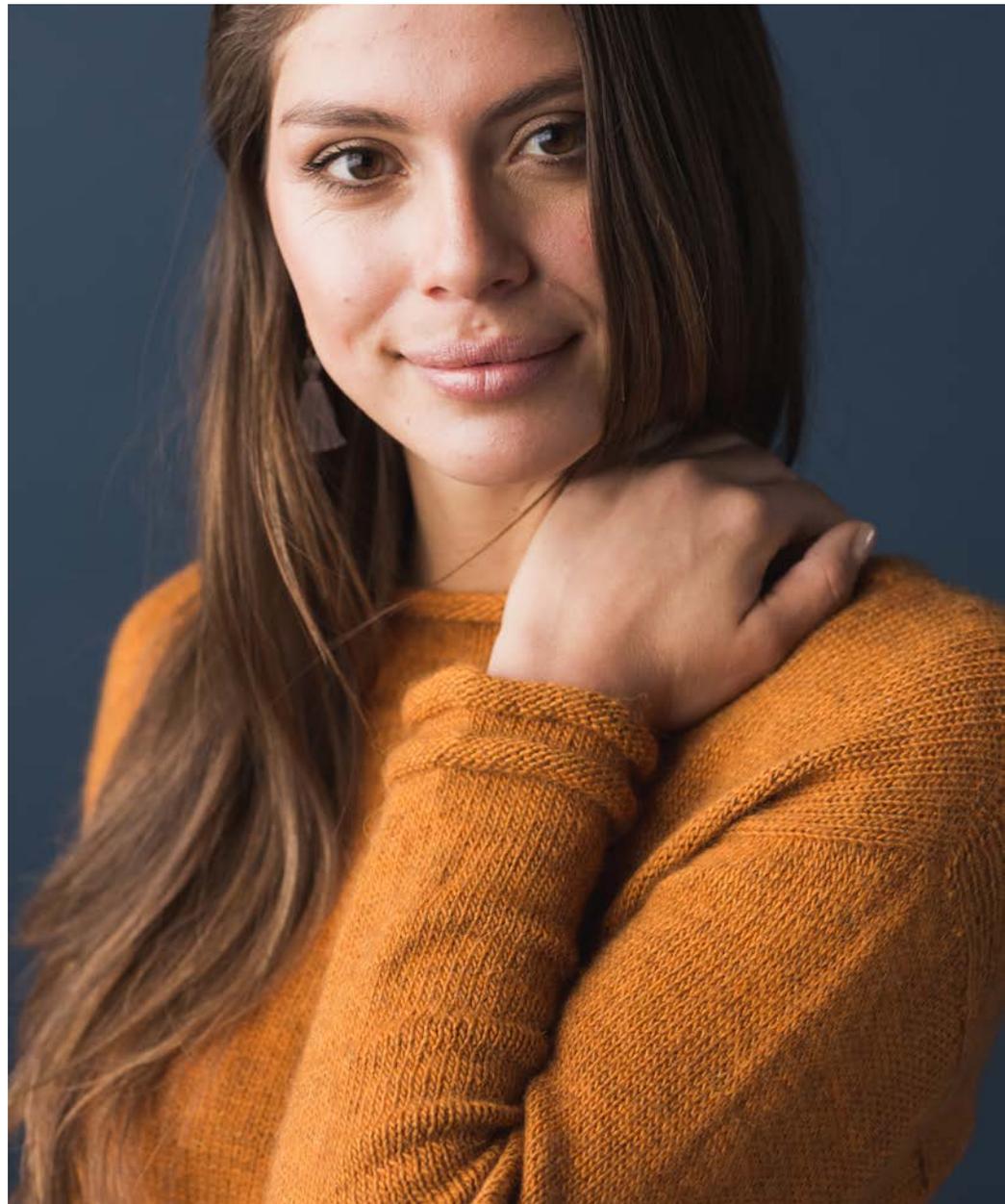
**GAUGE** 27 sts and 38 rnds = 4" in St st.

### Notes

- The body of this pullover is worked in the round from the lower edge to the underarm, then the front and back are worked separately back and forth. After the shoulders are joined, sleeve stitches are picked up and the sleeve is worked in the round from the top down.

## Body

Using the long-tail method, CO 216 (240, 264, 288, 312, 336, 360) sts. Place marker (pm) and join in the rnd. Purl 6 rnds. Knit 8 rnds. Purl 5 rnds. Work in St st for 1".

**Set-up rnd** K62 (62, 62, 76, 76, 76, 76), pm, k46 (58, 70, 68, 80, 92, 104), pm, k62 (62, 62, 76, 76, 76, 76), pm, k46 (58, 70, 68, 80, 92, 104). **Next rnd** \*Work Cable chart for your size to m, sl m, knit to m, sl m; rep from \* once more. Cont in patt through Row 125 (125, 125, 157, 157, 157, 157) of chart. Work in St st until piece measures 18 (18, 18, 22, 22, 22, 22)" from CO. **Divide for front and back:** **Next rnd** Remove beg-of-rnd m, k35 (35, 35, 44, 44, 44, 44) and place last 8 (8, 8, 12, 12, 12, 12) sts worked on holder for underarm, k100 (112, 124, 132, 144, 156, 168) and place these sts on holder for front, k8 (8, 8, 12, 12, 12, 12) and place these sts on holder for underarm, knit to end—100 (112, 124, 132, 144, 156, 168) sts rem for back. Work back and forth in rows.

## Back

Work even until armhole measures 8 (8½, 9, 9¼, 9¾, 10¼, 10¾)" ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders using German short-rows as foll:

**Short-row 1** (RS) Knit to last 4 (5, 6, 6, 6, 7, 8) sts, turn.

**Short-row 2** (WS) Make double st, purl to last 4 (5, 6, 6, 6, 7, 8) sts, turn.

**Short-row 3** Make double st, knit to 4 (4, 5, 5, 6, 7, 8) sts before double st, turn.

**Short-row 4** Make double st, purl to 4 (4, 5, 5, 6, 7, 8) sts before double st, turn.

Rep last 2 short-rows 3 more times. **Next row** (RS) Knit to end, working double sts as single sts. **Next row** (WS) Purl to end, working double sts as single sts. **Next row** (RS) K26 (28, 32, 34, 38, 42, 48) and place these sts on holder for right shoulder, k48 (56, 60, 64, 68, 72, 72) and place these sts on holder for neck, knit to end and place last 26 (28, 32, 34, 38, 42, 48) sts on holder for left shoulder.

## Front

Return 100 (112, 124, 132, 144, 156, 168) front sts to needle and, with RS facing, rejoin yarn. Work as for back. With RS tog, join shoulders using three-needle BO.

## Sleeves

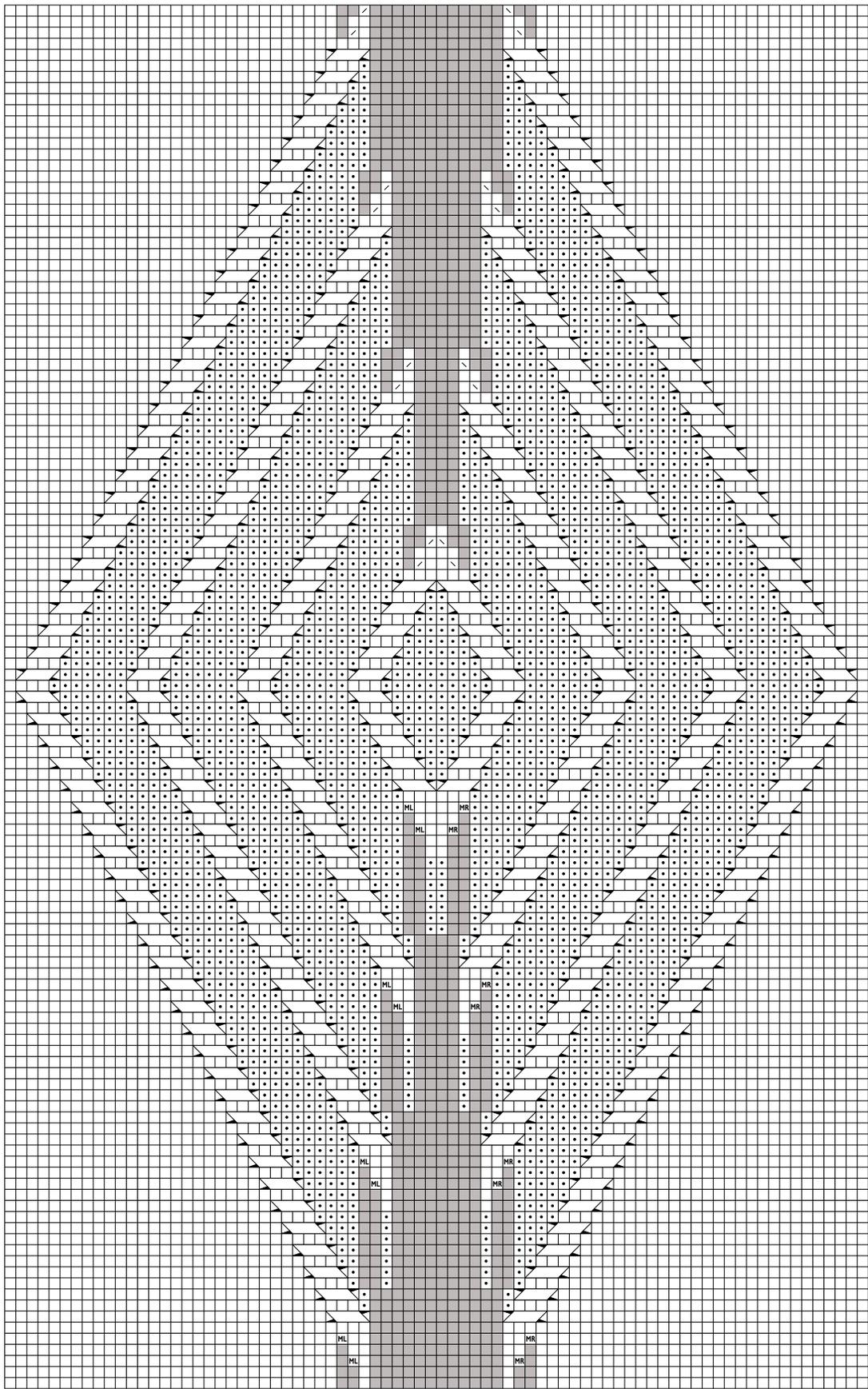
With 16" cir needle and RS facing, beg at center of underarm, k4 (4, 4, 6, 6, 6, 6) underarm sts, pick up and knit 100 (106, 112, 114, 120, 126, 126) sts evenly spaced around armhole edge, k4 (4, 4, 6, 6, 6, 6) underarm sts—108 (114, 120, 126, 132, 138, 138) sts total. Pm and join in the rnd. Work in St st for 1". **Dec rnd** K1, k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, ssk, k1—2 sts dec'd. Rep dec rnd every 5 (5, 5, 4, 4, 4, 4)th rnd 24 (27, 29, 32, 32, 35, 35) more times, changing to dpn when necessary—58 (58, 60, 60, 66, 66, 66) sts rem. Work even until piece measures 17¾ (17¾, 17¾, 18¾, 18¾, 18¾, 18¾)" from underarm. Purl 5 rnds. Knit 8 rnds. Purl 6 rnds. BO all sts kwise.

## Finishing

Place 96 (112, 120, 128, 136, 144, 144) held neck sts onto 16" cir needle. Join yarn. Knit 2 rnds. Purl 6 rnds. BO all sts kwise. Weave in ends. Block to measurements.

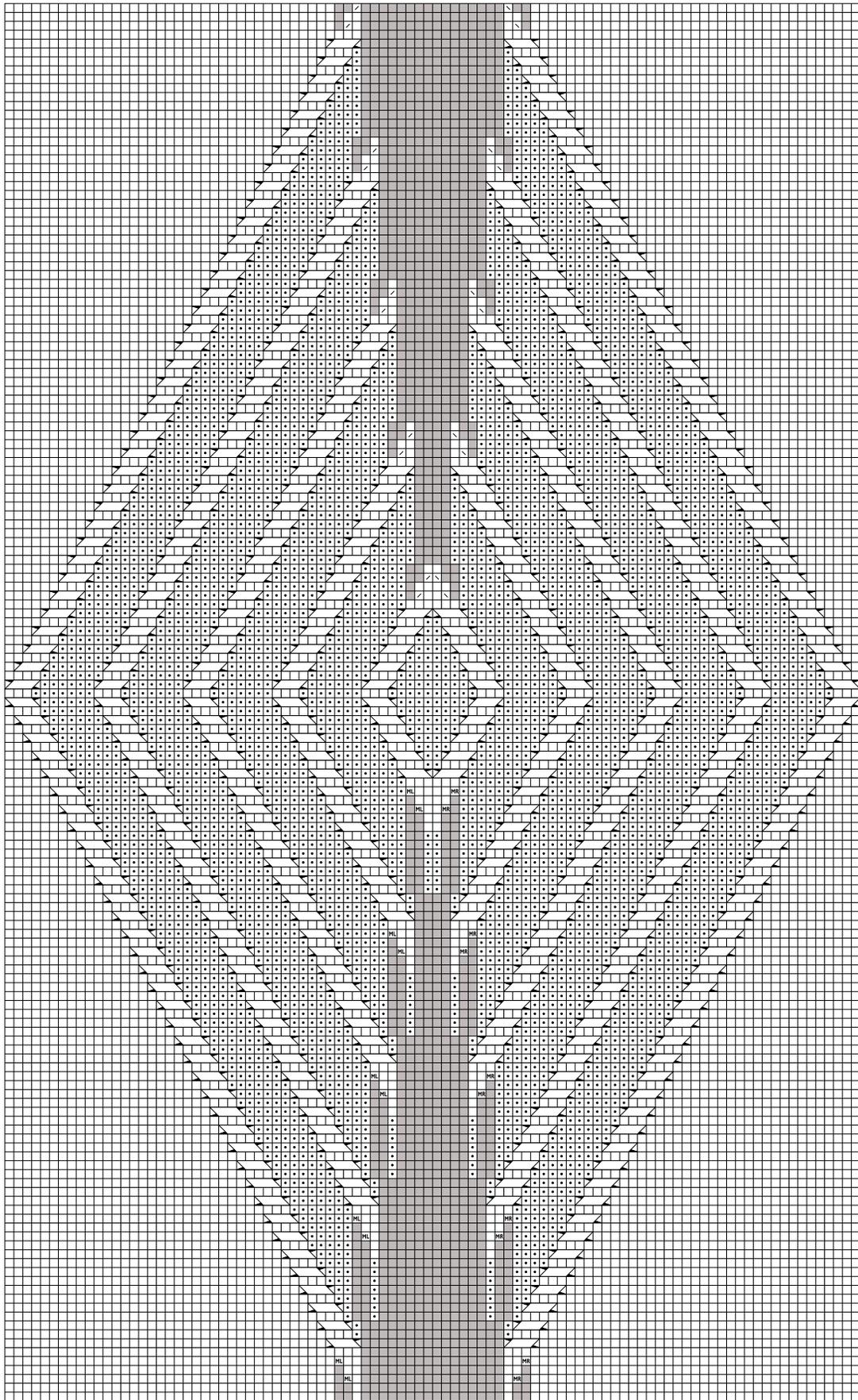

**DIFFICULTY** ○○○○

**FINISHED SIZE** 13" wide and 88" long.

**YARN** Fibra Natura Dona (100% superfine Merino superwash; 126 yd [115 m]/1¾ oz [50 g]): #134 Glacier (pale blue; A), #132 Alabaster (white; B), #130 Steely (dark gray; C), and #103 Amber (gold; D), 3 balls each; #124 Darkest Ink (black; E), 1 ball. Yarn distributed by Universal Yarn.

**YARN WEIGHT** (3)

**NEEDLES** Size 6 (4 mm). Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

**NOTIONS** Markers (m); stitch holders; blocking wires; tapestry needle.

**GAUGE** 18 sts and 36 rows = 4" in garter st.

### Notes

- This scarf is worked from short end to short end. The chevrons are worked using the intarsia method. Join a new strand of yarn for each block of color and twist yarns at each color change to avoid holes.
- Slip stitches purlwise with yarn in front unless indicated otherwise.





## Scarf

### CENTER STRIPE

With E and using the knitted method, CO 2 sts. Place sts on holder; do not break yarn.

### FIRST TRIANGLE

With A, CO 2 sts. **Set-up row** (WS) Sl 1 (see Notes), k1.

**Row 1** (RS) Sl 1, CO 1 st, k1–3 sts.

**Row 2** Sl 1, CO 1 st, k2–4 sts.

**Row 3** Sl 1, CO 1 st, knit to last st, CO 1 st, k1–2 sts inc'd.

**Row 4** Sl 1, knit to end.

Rep last 2 rows 17 more times—40 sts. Break yarn; place sts on holder.

### SECOND TRIANGLE

With B, work as for first triangle.

### CHEVRON SECTION 1

**Row 1** (RS) Working across first triangle, with C, sl 1, CO 1 st, k36, ssk, k1, place marker (pm), sl 2 held E sts pwise wyb, pm, working across 2nd triangle with D, k1, k2tog, k36, CO 1 st, k1–82 sts.

**Row 2** (WS) With D, sl 1, knit to m, with E, p2, with C, knit to end.

**Row 3** With C, sl 1, CO 1 st, knit to 3 sts before m, ssk, k1, with E, sl 2 pwise wyb, with D, k1, k2tog, knit to last st, CO 1 st, k1.

**Row 4** With D, sl 1, knit to m, with E, p2, with C, knit to end.

Rep last 2 rows 18 more times. Break C and D.

### CHEVRON SECTION 2

**Row 1** (RS) With B, sl 1, CO 1 st, knit to 3 sts before m, ssk, k1, with E, sl 2 pwise wyb, with A, k1, k2tog, knit to last st, CO 1 st, k1.

**Row 2** (WS) With A, sl 1, knit to m, with E, p2, with B, knit to end.

Rep last 2 rows 19 more times. Break A and B.

### CHEVRON SECTION 3

**Row 1** (RS) With D, sl 1, CO 1 st, knit to 3 sts before m, ssk, k1, with E, sl 2 pwise wyb, with C, k1, k2tog, knit to last st, CO 1 st, k1.

**Row 2** (WS) With C, sl 1, knit to m, with E, p2, with D, knit to end.

Rep last 2 rows 19 more times. Break C and D.

### CHEVRON SECTION 4

**Row 1** (RS) With A, sl 1, CO 1 st, knit to 3 sts before m, ssk, k1, with E, sl 2 pwise wyb, with B, k1, k2tog, knit to last st, CO 1 st, k1.

**Row 2** (WS) With B, sl 1, knit to m, with E, p2, with A, knit to end.

Rep last 2 rows 19 more times. Break A and B.

### CHEVRON SECTION 5

**Row 1** (RS) With C, sl 1, CO 1 st, knit to 3 sts before m, ssk, k1, with E, sl 2 pwise wyb, with D, k1, k2tog, knit to last st, CO 1 st, k1.

**Row 2** (WS) With D, sl 1, knit to m, with E, p2, with C, knit to end.

Rep last 2 rows 19 more times. Break C and D.

### CHEVRON SECTIONS 6–12

Rep chevron sections 2–5 again, then work chevron sections 2–4 once more.

### ENDING TRIANGLES

**Row 1** (RS) With C, sl 1, k2tog, knit to 3 sts before m, ssk, k1, with E, sl 2 pwise wyb, with D, k1, k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, ssk, k1–4 sts dec'd.

**Row 2** (WS) With D, sl 1, knit to m, with E, p2, with C, knit to end.

Rep last 2 rows 17 more times—10 sts rem.

**Next row** (RS) With C, sl 1, sssk, with E, sl 2 pwise wyb, with D, k3tog, k1–6 sts rem.

**Next row** (WS) With D, sl 1, BO 1 st kwise, with E, BO 2 sts pwise, with C, BO 2 sts kwise—no sts rem.

## Finishing

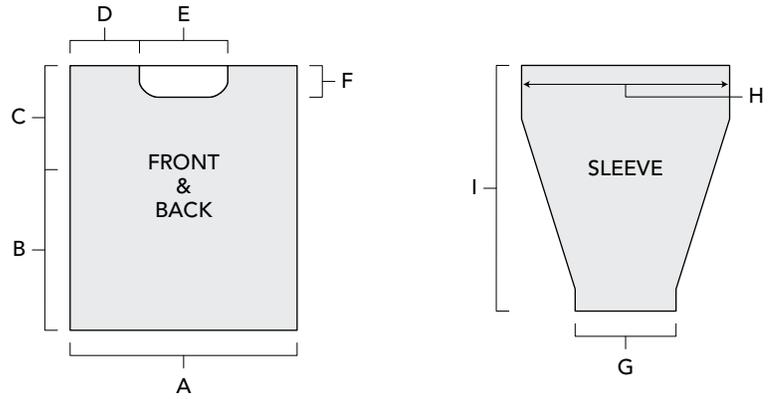
Weave in ends but do not trim. Wet-block using blocking wires, pinning to blocking board and stretching to open up fabric. Trim ends once fully dry.

**YARN** Jagger Spun Super Lamb 4/8 (100% superwash wool; 124 yd [113 m]/1¾ oz [50 g]): Navy (MC), 8 (8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 12) skeins; Natural (CC1), 1 (1, 2, 2, 2, 2) skein(s); Marigold (CC2), 1 skein.

**YARN WEIGHT** (4)

**NEEDLES** Size 7 (4.5 mm): straight. Size 6 (4 mm): 16" circular (cir). Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

**NOTIONS** Marker (m); stitch holder; tapes-try needle.

**GAUGE** 19 sts and 29 rows = 4" in St st on larger needles.

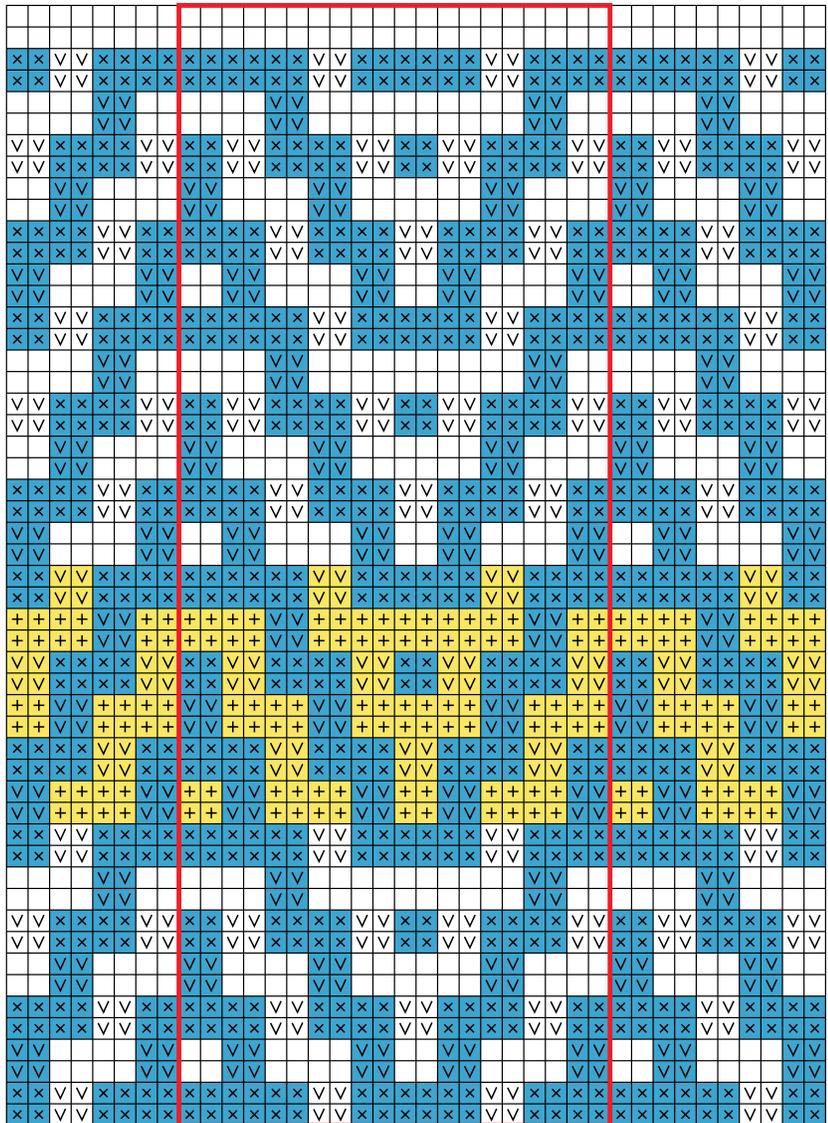

## Back

With MC and larger straight needles, CO 78 (86, 94, 102, 110, 118, 126) sts. Knit 1 row. Purl 1 row. Knit 2 rows, ending with a WS row. Work in k2, p2 rib for 4 rows, ending with a WS row. With CC1, knit 1 row, purl 1 row. **Next row** (RS) K2 with MC, beg and ending as indicated for your size, work Colorwork chart to last 2 sts, k2 with MC. **Next row** (WS) P2 with MC, work in patt to last 2 sts, p2 with MC. **Next row** K2 with CC1, work in patt to last 2 sts, k2 with CC1. **Next row** P2 with CC1, work in patt to last 2 sts, p2 with CC1. Rep last 4 rows 2 more times—Row 12 of chart is complete. **Next row** (RS) K2 with MC, work in patt to last 2 sts, k2 with MC. **Next row** P2 with MC, work in patt to last 2 sts, p2 with MC. **Next row** K2 with CC2, work in patt to last 2 sts, k2 with CC2. **Next row** P2 with CC2, work in patt to last 2 sts, p2 with CC2. Rep last 4 rows 2 more times—Row 24 of chart is complete. **Next row** (RS) K2 with MC, work in patt to last 2 sts, k2 with MC. **Next row** P2 with MC, work in patt to last 2 sts, p2 with MC. **Next row** K2 with CC1, work in patt to last 2 sts, k2 with CC1. **Next row** P2 with CC1, work in patt to last 2 sts, p2 with CC1. Rep last 4 rows 6 more times—Row 52 of chart is complete. Break CC1 and CC2 and cont with MC only. Work in St st until piece measures 20½ (21, 21, 21½, 21½, 22, 22)" from CO, ending with a WS row. BO all sts.

## Front

Work as for back until piece measures 18 (18½, 18½, 19, 19, 19½, 19½)" from CO, ending with a WS row. **Shape neck: Next row** (RS) K30 (33, 37, 40, 44, 47, 50) and place these sts on holder for left shoulder, BO 18 (20, 20, 22, 22, 24, 26) sts, knit to end—30 (33, 37, 40, 44, 47, 50) sts rem for right shoulder. **Right shoulder:** Purl 1 WS row. At beg of RS rows, BO 3 sts 0 (0, 0, 1, 1, 1, 1) time, then BO 2 sts 2 (2, 2, 1, 1, 1, 1) time(s)—26 (29, 33, 35, 39, 42, 45) sts rem. Work 1 WS row. **Dec row** (RS) K1, k2tog, knit to end—1 st dec'd. Rep dec row every RS row 1 (1, 1, 2, 2, 2, 2) more time(s)—24 (27, 31, 32, 36, 39, 42) sts rem. Work even until piece measures 20½ (21, 21, 21½, 21½, 22, 22)" from CO, ending with a WS row. BO all sts. **Left shoulder:** Return 30 (33, 37, 40, 44, 47, 50) left shoulder sts to needle and, with WS facing,

rejoin MC. At beg of WS rows, BO 3 sts 0 (0, 0, 1, 1, 1, 1) time, then BO 2 sts 2 (2, 2, 1, 1, 1, 1) time(s)—26 (29, 33, 35, 39, 42, 45) sts rem. **Dec row (RS)** Knit to last 3 sts, ssk, k1—1 st dec'd. Rep dec row every RS row 1 (1, 1, 2, 2, 2, 2) more time(s)—24 (27, 31, 32, 36, 39, 42) sts rem. Work even until piece measures 20½ (21, 21, 21½, 21½, 22, 22)" from CO, ending with a WS row. BO all sts.

### Sleeves

With MC and larger straight needles, CO 38 (38, 42, 42, 46, 46, 46) sts. Knit 1 row. Purl 1 row. Knit 2 rows, ending with a WS row. Work in k2, p2 rib for 8 rows, ending with a WS row. **Inc row (RS)** K1, M1L, knit to last st, M1R, k1—2 sts inc'd. Rep inc row every RS row 0 (0, 0, 0, 3, 9, 9) more times, then every 4th row 5 (9, 15, 18, 24, 21, 21) times, then every 6th row 12 (10, 7, 6, 0, 0, 0) times—74 (78, 88, 92, 102, 108, 108) sts. Work even until piece measures 19 (19½, 20, 20½, 21½, 22, 22)" from CO, ending with WS row. BO all sts.

### Finishing

Weave in ends. Block pieces to measurements. Sew shoulder seams. **Neckband:** With MC, smaller cir needle, and RS facing, beg at center back, pick up and knit 88 (92, 92, 104, 104, 108, 112) sts evenly spaced around neck edge. Place marker (pm) and join in the rnd. Work in k2, p2 rib for 9 rnds. Loosely BO all sts in patt. Sew sleeves to body. Beg at wrist, sew sleeve and side seams.

## CARTESIAN PULLOVER IRINA ANIKEEVA

**DIFFICULTY** ○○○○

**FINISHED SIZE** 47¼ (51¾, 55¼, 59¾, 64¼, 67¾)" circumference at underarm. Pullover shown measures 47¼"; modeled with 14¼" of positive ease.

**YARN** Trendsetter Yarns Placid (60% cashmere, 25% superwash wool, 15% nylon; 120 yd [110 m]/1¾ oz [50 g]): #5216 Smoke, 8 (8, 9, 10, 10, 11) balls.

**YARN WEIGHT** (5)

**NEEDLES** Sizes 8 (5 mm) and 10½ (6.5 mm): 32" circular (cir). Size 8 (5 mm): set of double-pointed (dnp). Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

**NOTIONS** Markers (m); stitch holders; waste yarn for provisional CO; spare size 8 (5 mm) or smaller 32" cir needle; tapestry needle.

**GAUGE** 14 sts and 22 rows = 4" in Horizontal Rib patt on larger needle.

### Notes

- This pullover is worked from the top down beginning with a provisional cast-on. The back saddles and back part of the sleeves are worked back and forth

to the underarm, then the stitches are placed on a holder. Stitches for the front and front part of the sleeves are picked up from the provisional cast-on and worked to the underarm after shaping the neck. The front and back are then joined in the round, and the body is worked to the lower edge.

### Stitch Guide

#### HORIZONTAL RIB IN ROWS:

**Row 1** (RS) Knit.

**Row 2** (WS) Purl.

**Rows 3 and 5** Purl.

**Rows 4 and 6** Knit.

Rep Rows 1–6 for patt.

#### HORIZONTAL RIB IN ROUNDS:

**Rnds 1 and 2** Knit.

**Rnds 3–6** Purl.

Rep Rnds 1–6 for patt.

#### VERTICAL RIB IN ROWS: (WORKED OVER 16 STS)

**Row 1** (RS) P1, [k2, p2] 3 times, k2, p1.

**Row 2** (WS) K1, [p2, k2] 3 times, p2, k1.

Rep Rows 1 and 2 for patt.

#### VERTICAL RIB IN ROUNDS: (WORKED OVER 16 STS)

**Rnd 1** P1, [k2, p2] 3 times, k2, p1.

Rep Rnd 1 for patt.

### Right Saddle

With larger needle and using a provisional method, CO 67 (71, 73, 77, 81, 84) sts. Do not join. Beg with Row 3, work Horizontal Rib in rows (see Stitch Guide) for 10 rows, ending with Row 6. Break yarn; place sts on holder.

### Left Saddle

Work as for right saddle. Do not break yarn.

### Sleeves and Back

Join saddles and shape shoulders and sleeves using short-rows as foll:

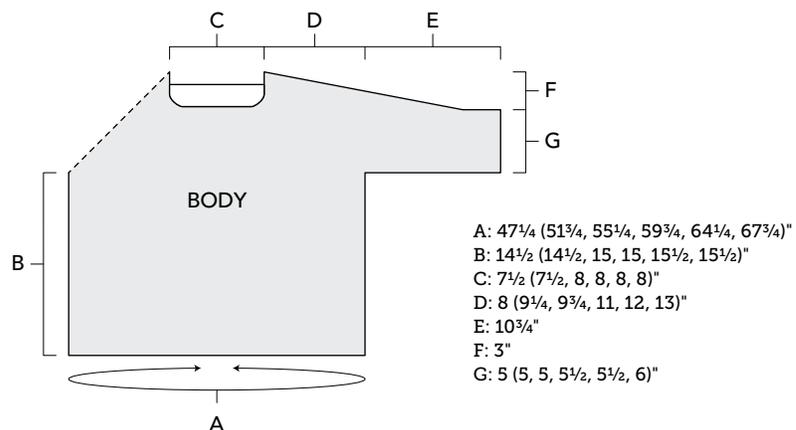
**Short-row 1** (RS) Work in patt to last 20 sts of left saddle, place marker (pm), work Vertical Rib in rows (see Stitch Guide) over 16 sts, pm, work 4 sts in patt as established, then, using the backward-loop method, CO 26 (26, 28, 28, 28, 28) sts, return right saddle sts to left needle and work first 4 sts in patt as established, pm, work Vertical Rib in rows over 16 sts, pm, k1 (Row 1 of Horizontal Rib), wrap next st, turn—160 (168, 174, 182, 190, 196) sts.

**Short-row 2** (WS) [Work Row 2 of Horizontal Rib to m, sl m, work Vertical Rib to m, sl m] 2 times, p1 (Row 2 of Horizontal Rib), wrap next st, turn.

**Short-rows 3 and 4** Work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 5** (Patt shifting row; RS) Work in patt to m, M1L or M1LP as needed to maintain patt, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, k2tog or p2tog as needed to maintain patt, work in patt to 2 sts before m, ssk or ssp as needed to maintain patt, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, M1R or M1RP as needed to maintain patt, work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-rows 6–8** Work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn. Rep Short-rows 5–8 two more times. **Next row** (RS) Work in patt to m, M1L or M1LP, sl



m, work in patt to m, sl m, k2tog or p2tog, work in patt to 2 sts before m, ssk or ssp, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, M1R or M1RP, work in patt to end, working wrap tog with wrapped st. **Next row** Work to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work to end. \*Work 2 rows even in patt. **Next row (RS)** Work in patt to m, M1L or M1LP, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, k2tog or p2tog, work in patt to 2 sts before m, ssk or ssp, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, M1R or M1RP, work in patt to end. Work 1 WS row. Rep from \* 2 (2, 3, 3, 3, 3) more times—20 sts at center back between m. Work even until piece measures 5 (5, 5, 5½, 5½, 6)" from center of saddle (measured along cuff edge), ending with a RS row. **Next row (WS)** Work 38 sts and place these sts on holder for right sleeve, work 84 (92, 98, 106, 114, 120) sts and place these sts on holder for back, work to end—38 sts rem for left sleeve. Place sts on holder. Make a note of last patt rows worked.

### Left Front and Sleeve

Remove waste yarn from left saddle provisional CO, place 67 (71, 73, 77, 81, 84) sts onto larger needle, and, with WS facing, rejoin yarn. **Next row (WS)** Purl to last 20 sts, pm, work Row 2 of Vertical Rib over 16 sts, pm, p4. Shape sleeve and neck using short-rows as foll:

**Short-row 1 (RS)** Work Row 3 of Horizontal Rib over 4 sts, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, p1 (Row 3 of Horizontal Rib), wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 2 (WS)** Work in patt to end.

**Short-row 3 (Neck inc row)** P1, M1RP, work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn—68 (72, 74, 78, 82, 85) sts.

**Short-row 4** Work in patt to end.

**Short-row 5 (Neck inc and patt shifting row)** K1, M1R, work in patt to 2 sts before m, ssk, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, M1R, work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn—69 (73, 75, 79, 83, 86) sts.

**Short-row 6** Work in patt to end.

**Short-row 7 (Neck inc row)** P1, M1RP, work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn—70 (74, 76, 80, 84, 87) sts.



**Short-row 8 (WS)** Work in patt to end. Place sts on holder.

### Right Front and Sleeve

Remove waste yarn from right saddle provisional CO, place 67 (71, 73, 77, 81, 84) sts onto larger needle, and, with WS facing, rejoin yarn. **Next row (WS)** P4, pm, work Row 2 of Vertical Rib over 16 sts, pm, purl to end. **Next row (RS)** Work Row 3 of Horizontal Rib to m, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, work Row 3 of Horizontal Rib over 4 sts. Shape sleeve and neck using short-rows as foll:

**Short-row 1 (WS)** [Work in patt to m, sl m] 2 times, work 1 st, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 2 (Neck inc row; RS)** Work in patt to last st, M1LP, work 1 st in patt—68 (72, 74, 78, 82, 85) sts.

**Short-row 3** Work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 4 (Neck inc and patt shifting row)** Work in patt to m, M1L, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, k2tog, work in patt to last st, M1L, work 1 st in patt—69 (73, 75, 79, 83, 86) sts.

**Short-row 5** Work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 6 (Neck inc row)** Work in patt to last st, M1LP, work 1 st in patt—70 (74, 76,

80, 84, 87) sts.

**Short-row 7** Work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn.

**Join fronts:**

**Short-row 1** (RS) Work in patt to m, M1LP, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, p2tog, work in patt to end of right front, then, using the cable method, CO 20 (20, 22, 22, 22, 22) sts, work left front sts in Horizontal Rib to 2 sts before m, ssp, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, M1RP, work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn—160 (168, 174, 182, 190, 196) sts.

**Short-rows 2–4** Work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 5** (RS) Work in patt to m, M1LP, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, p2tog, work in patt to 2 sts before m, ssp, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, M1RP, work in patt to wrapped st, work wrap tog with wrapped st, work 5 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7) sts in patt, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-rows 6–8** Rep Short-rows 2–4.

**Patt shifting row** (RS) Work in patt to m, M1L or M1LP, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, k2tog or p2tog, work in patt to 2 sts before m, ssk or ssp, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, M1R or M1RP, work in patt to end. \*Work 3 rows even in patt, then rep patt shifting row. Rep from \* 2 (2, 3, 3, 3, 3) more times—20 sts at center front between m. Work even in patt until piece measures 5 (5, 5, 5½, 5½, 6)" from center of saddle (measured along cuff edge), ending 1 row before last patt rows of back.

**Next row** (WS) Work 38 sts and place these sts on holder for left sleeve, work in patt to end—122 (130, 136, 144, 152, 158) sts rem. Place last 38 sts on holder for right sleeve—84 (92, 98, 106, 114, 120) sts rem for front. Break yarn. With RS facing, rejoin yarn to front sts. **Joining row** (RS) K1, work front sts in patt to last st, k1, pm for side, working across back sts, k1, work in patt to last st, k1—168 (184, 196, 212, 228, 240) sts total. Pm and join in the rnd.

## Lower Body

**Next rnd** K1, work in patt in rnds (see Stitch Guide) to 1 st before side m, k1, sl m, k1, work in patt in rnds to last st, k1. Cont in patt as established until piece measures



13 (13, 13½, 13½, 14, 14)" from underarm, ending with Rnd 6 of Horizontal Rib in rnds. Change to smaller cir needle.

**Sizes 47¼ (51¾)" only:**

**Inc rnd** \*K1, M1L, knit to m, M1L, sl m, work in Vertical Rib to m, sl m, knit to m, sl m, work in Vertical Rib to m, sl m, M1L, knit to 1 st before m, M1L, k1, sl m; rep from \* once more—176 (192) sts.

**Sizes 55¼ (59¾, 64¼)" only:**

**Inc rnd** \*K1, M1L, k11 (13, 15), M1L, knit to m, M1L, sl m, work in Vertical Rib to m, sl m, knit to m, sl m, work in Vertical Rib to m, sl m, M1L, k11 (13, 15), M1L, knit to 1 st before m, M1L, k1, sl m; rep from \* once more—208 (224, 240) sts.

**Size 67¾" only:**

**Inc rnd** \*K1, M1L, [k11, M1L] 2 times, knit to m, M1L, sl m, work in Vertical Rib to m, sl m, knit to m, sl m, work in Vertical Rib to m, sl m, M1L, [k11, M1L] 2 times, knit to 1 st before m, M1L, k1, sl m; rep from \* once more—256 sts.

**All sizes:**

**Next rnd** K1, \*p2, k2; rep from \* to last 3 sts, p2, k1. Rep last rnd for 1½". **Tubular BO:** With 2 smaller cir needles held parallel, work as foll: Sl 1 st to front needle, \*sl 2 sts to back needle, sl 2 sts to front needle; rep from \* to last 3 sts, sl 2 sts to back needle, sl 1 st to front needle. Break yarn, leaving

a tail 4 times length of finished edge. With tail threaded on a tapestry needle, graft sts using Kitchener st.

## Finishing

With RS tog, join front and back sleeve sts using three-needle BO. Sew any gaps between sleeves and body closed. **Neck I-cord edging:** With dpn and using a provisional method, CO 3 sts. With RS facing and beg at back of left saddle, work applied I-cord as foll: \*K2, sl 1 pwise wyb, yo, pick up and knit 1 st from neck edge, pass yo and sl st over, slide sts to opposite end of needle; rep from \*, picking up 3 sts for every 4 rows and 1 st for each st around neck edge. Break yarn, leaving a 12" tail. Remove waste yarn from provisional CO and place sts onto other dpn. With tail threaded on a tapestry needle, graft sts using Kitchener st. Work I-cord cuff edgings as for neck edging. Weave in ends. Block to measurements.

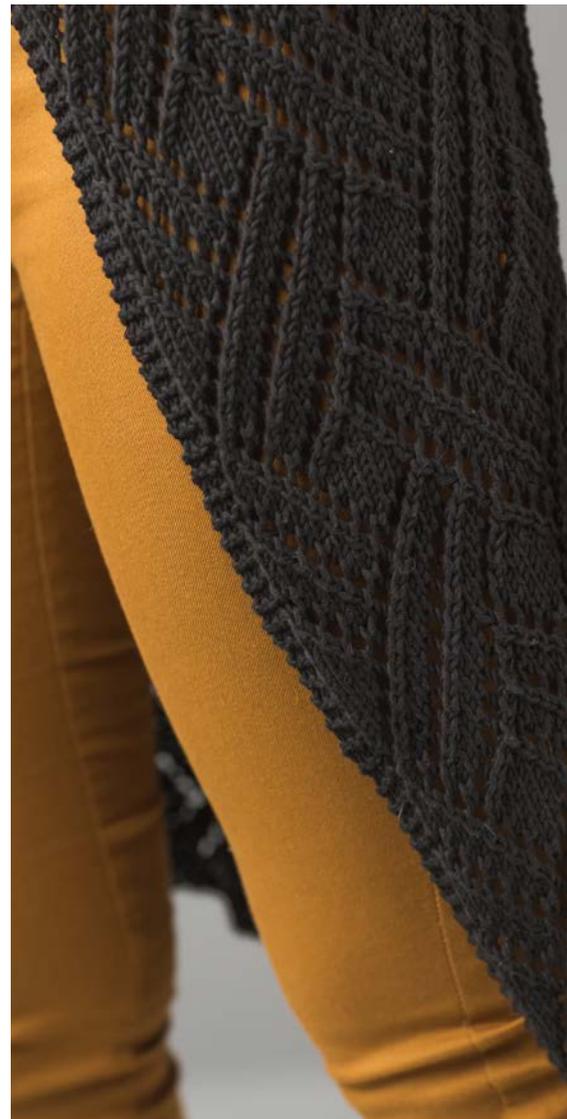

**for armholes:** **Next row (RS)** Work in patt to m, sl m, k2, sl 1 st onto cn and hold in back, k1, transfer st from cn to left needle, place next 65 (81) sts on holder for back, place foll 66 (74) sts on holder for left front, keeping m in place—67 (75) sts rem for right front. **Right front:** Work even until armhole measures 8 (9)", ending with a WS row. Make a note of last chart row worked. Place sts on holder, keeping m in place. Do not break yarn. **Back:** Return 65 (81) back sts to needle and, with RS facing, rejoin yarn. **Next row (RS)** K3, sl m, work in patt to m, sl m, k2, sl 1 st onto cn and hold in back, k1, transfer st from cn to left front holder—64 (80) sts rem for back. Work even until armhole measures 8 (9)", ending with same chart row as right front. Place sts on holder, keeping m in place. Break

yarn. **Left front:** Return 67 (75) left front sts to needle and, with RS facing, rejoin yarn. Work even until armhole measures 8 (9)", ending with same chart row as right front. Break yarn. **Join fronts and back:** Return back and right front sts to needle holding left front sts. **Next row (RS)** With working yarn attached to right front, \*work in patt to m, sl m, k2, sl 1 st onto cn and hold in back, k1, k1 from cn, k2, sl m; rep from \* once more, work in patt to end—198 (230) sts. **Next row** \*Work in patt to m, sl m, k6, sl m; rep from \* once more, work in patt to end. Rep last row 6 more times. Work in lace patt over all sts until piece measures 12 (14)" from join at top of armhole, ending with a WS row. **Upper edging:** Change to smaller needle. Using the backward-loop method, CO 4 sts to

left needle. **Next row (RS)** \*K3, ssk, turn. **Next row (WS)** K4. Rep last 2 rows until all sts have been worked—4 edging sts rem. BO all sts. **Lower edging:** Remove waste yarn from provisional CO and place 198 (230) sts onto smaller needle. Work edging as for upper edging.

## Finishing

Weave in ends. Block to measurements.

**DIFFICULTY** ○○○○

**FINISHED SIZE** 37½ (41, 44½, 48½, 52, 55½, 59½)" circumference at underarm. Tee shown measures 41"; modeled with 8" of positive ease.

**YARN** Kelbourne Woolens Mojave (60% cotton, 40% linen; 185 yd [169 m]/1¼ oz [50 g]); #46 Smoke Gray, 4 (5, 5, 6, 7, 8, 8) skeins.

**YARN WEIGHT** (3)

**NEEDLES** Sizes 3 (3.25 mm) and 4 (3.5 mm): straight. Size 4 (3.5 mm): 16" circular (cir). Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

**NOTIONS** Marker (m); removable m; stitch holders; tapestry needle.

**GAUGE** 22 sts and 34 rows = 4" in charted patt on larger needles.

### Notes

- This top is worked back and forth from the bottom up in separate pieces and seamed. After the shoulders and sides are seamed, stitches are picked up to work the armhole bands and neckband.



### Back

With smaller needles, CO 103 (113, 123, 133, 143, 153, 163) sts. Knit 10 rows, ending with a WS row. Change to larger straight needles. Knit 1 row. Purl 1 row. **Next row** (RS) K1, beg and ending as indicated for your size, work Triangle chart to last st, k1. **Next row** P1, work in patt to last st, p1. Cont in patt until piece measures 11½ (11½, 12½, 12½, 13½, 14½, 14½)" from CO. Place removable m at each edge to mark beg of armhole. Work even until armhole measures 7½ (7½, 8, 8½,

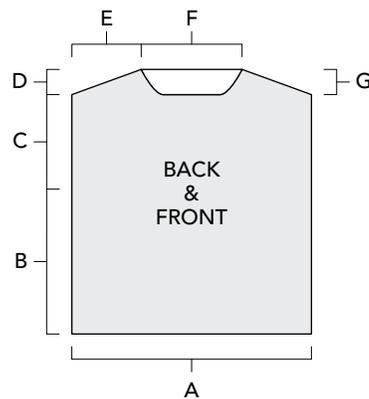
9, 9½, 10)", ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders using short-rows as foll:

**Short-rows 1 and 2** Work in patt to last 2 (3, 5, 3, 4, 4, 7) sts, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-rows 3 and 4** Work in patt to 2 (3, 5, 4, 4, 4, 6) sts before wrapped st, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-rows 5 and 6** Work in patt to 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts before wrapped st, wrap next st, turn.

Rep last 2 short-rows 6 (7, 7, 7, 8, 7, 7) more times—53 (53, 55, 55, 55, 57, 57) sts between wrapped sts at center back. **Next**



- A: 18¾ (20½, 22¼, 24¼, 26, 27¾, 29¾)"
- B: 11½ (11½, 12½, 12½, 13½, 14½, 14½)"
- C: 7½ (7½, 8, 8½, 9, 9½, 10)"

**2 rows** Work in patt to end, working wraps tog with wrapped sts. Place sts on holder.

## Front

Work as for back until armhole measures  $7\frac{1}{4}$  ( $7\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $7\frac{3}{4}$ ,  $8\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $8\frac{3}{4}$ ,  $9\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $9\frac{3}{4}$ )", ending with a WS row. **Shape neck: Next row (RS)**

Work 39 (44, 49, 54, 59, 64, 69) sts and place these sts on holder for left front, BO 25 sts, work in patt to end—39 (44, 49, 54, 59, 64, 69) sts rem for right front. **Right front:** Work 1 WS row. Shape shoulder using short-rows as foll:

**Short-row 1 (RS)** BO 2 sts, work to last 2 (3, 5, 3, 4, 4, 7) sts, wrap next st, turn—37 (42, 47, 52, 57, 62, 67) sts rem.

**Short-row 2 (WS)** Work to end.

**Short-row 3** BO 1 st, work to 2 (3, 5, 4, 4, 4, 6) sts before wrapped st, wrap next st, turn—36 (41, 46, 51, 56, 61, 66) sts rem.

**Short-row 4** Work to end.

**Short-row 5** BO 1 st, work to 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts before wrapped st, wrap next st, turn—1 st dec'd.

**Short-row 6** Work to end.

Rep last 2 short-rows 6 more times—29 (34, 39, 44, 49, 54, 59) sts rem.

**Sizes 41 (44½, 48½, 52, 55½, 59½)" only:**

**Short-row 19 (RS)** Work to 3 (3, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts before wrapped st, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 20 (WS)** Work to end.

Rep last 2 short-rows 0 (0, 0, 1, 0, 0) more time.

**All sizes:**

**Next row (RS)** Work to end, working wraps tog with wrapped sts. Place sts on holder.

**Left front:** Return 39 (44, 49, 54, 59, 64, 69) left front sts to needle and, with WS facing, rejoin yarn. Shape shoulder using short-rows as foll:

**Short-row 1 (WS)** BO 2 sts, work to last 2 (3, 5, 3, 4, 4, 7) sts, wrap next st, turn—37 (42, 47, 52, 57, 62, 67) sts rem.

**Short-row 2 (RS)** Work to end.

**Short-row 3** BO 1 st, work to 2 (3, 5, 4, 4, 4, 6) sts before wrapped st, wrap next st, turn—36 (41, 46, 51, 56, 61, 66) sts rem.

**Short-row 4** Work to end.

**Short-row 5** BO 1 st, work to 3 (3, 3, 4, 4, 5, 5) sts before wrapped st, wrap next st, turn—1 st dec'd.

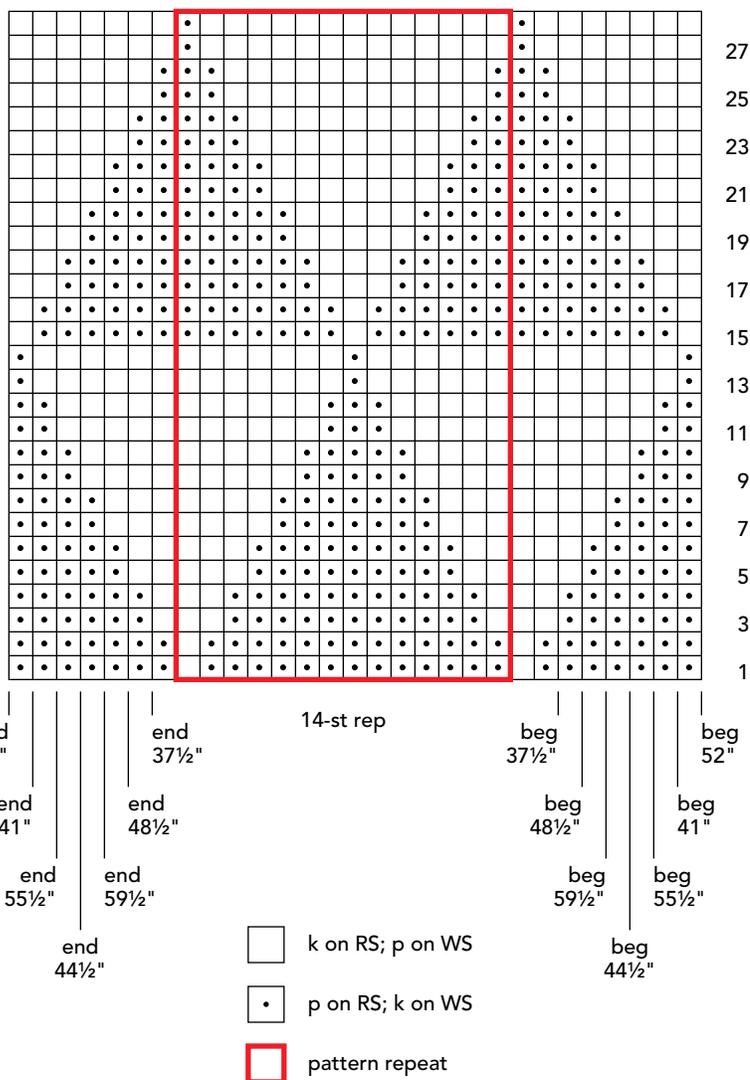
**Short-row 6** Work to end.

Rep last 2 short-rows 6 more times—29 (34, 39, 44, 49, 54, 59) sts rem.

**Sizes 41 (44½, 48½, 52, 55½, 59½)" only:**

**Short-row 19 (WS)** Work to 3 (3, 4, 4, 5, 5)

## TRIANGLE



sts before wrapped st, wrap next st, turn.

**Short-row 20 (RS)** Work to end.

Rep last 2 short-rows 0 (0, 0, 1, 0, 0) more time.

**All sizes:**

**Next row (WS)** Work to end, working wraps tog with wrapped sts. Break yarn, leaving a  $2\frac{1}{2}$ -yd tail. Place sts on holder.

## Finishing

Weave in ends except  $2\frac{1}{2}$ -yd tail. Block pieces to measurements. With RS tog and  $2\frac{1}{2}$ -yd tail, join shoulders using three-needle BO as foll: BO 29 (34, 39, 44, 49, 54, 59) front and back shoulder sts tog, BO 45 back neck sts, BO 29 (34, 39, 44, 49, 54, 59) front and back shoulder sts

tog. Sew side seams from lower edge to m. **Armhole band:** With larger cir needle and RS facing, beg at underarm, pick up and knit 84 (84, 90, 95, 101, 106, 112) sts evenly spaced around armhole edge. Place marker (pm) and join in the rnd. [Purl 1 rnd, knit 1 rnd] 4 times. BO all sts pwise. **Neckband:** With larger cir needle and RS facing, beg at center back, pick up and knit 113 sts evenly spaced around neck edge. Pm and join in the rnd. [Purl 1 rnd, knit 1 rnd] 3 times. BO all sts pwise.

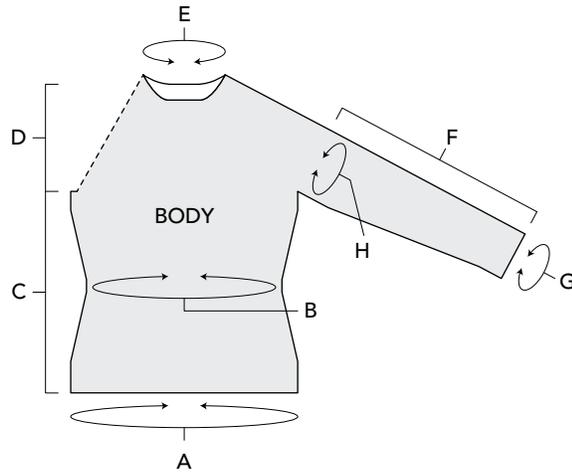

- A: 36 (40, 44<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 48, 52<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 55<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>)"
- B: 31<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> (35<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 40, 43<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 48, 50<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>)"
- C: 16 (16, 16<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, 16<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, 17, 17)"
- D: 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> (8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, 9, 9<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 11)"
- E: 17 (19, 21, 22, 24, 25)"
- F: 17<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> (17<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, 18, 18, 18<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, 19)"

## UNDULATING LINES PULLOVER

STELLA EGIDI

**DIFFICULTY** ○○○○

**FINISHED SIZE** 36 (40, 44<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 48, 52<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 55<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>)" circumference at underarm. Pullover shown measures 36"; modeled with 4" of positive ease.

**YARN** Mountain Meadow Wool Alpine (100% Merino-Targhee wool; 255 yd [233 m]/3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> oz [100 g]): Natural Cream, 5 (6, 6, 7, 8, 8) skeins.

**YARN WEIGHT** 3

**NEEDLES** Size 5 (3.75 mm): 16" and 32" circular (cir). Size 6 (4 mm): 24" and 36" cir and set of double-pointed (dnp). Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain the correct gauge.

**NOTIONS** Markers (m); stitch holders; tapestry needle.

**GAUGE** 20 sts and 30 rnds = 4" in St st on larger needle; 24 sts and 35 rnds = 4" in charted patt on smaller needle.

### Notes

- This pullover is worked in the round from the top down. The back neck is shaped with short-rows.



## Stitch Guide

**FOLDED HEM BIND-OFF:** Fold fabric to WS along turning ridge. Working in same st column as first st on left needle, place purl bump of st 5 rnds below turning ridge onto left needle, k2tog, \*place purl bump of st 5 rnds below turning ridge onto left needle, k2tog, \*place purl bump of st 5 rnds below turning ridge onto left needle, k2tog, pass 2nd st over first to BO 1 st; rep from \* to end. Fasten off last st.

## Yoke

With smaller, shorter cir needle, CO 102 (114, 126, 132, 144, 150) sts. Place marker (pm) and join in the rnd. Knit 1 rnd. Purl 1 rnd. Work Rows 1–59 of Undulating Lines chart, changing to smaller, longer cir needle when necessary—255 (285, 315, 330, 360, 375) sts. Change to larger needle and St st. **Inc rnd** K3, M1L, \*k15, M1L; rep from \* to last 12 sts, k12—272 (304, 336, 352, 384, 400) sts. Shape back neck using German short-rows as foll:

**Short-row 1 (RS)** K19 (21, 24, 25, 27, 28), turn.

**Short-row 2 (WS)** Make double st, purl to m, sl m, p19 (21, 24, 25, 27, 28), turn.

**Short-row 3** Make double st, knit to double st, knit double st as single st, k19 (21, 24, 25, 27, 28), turn.

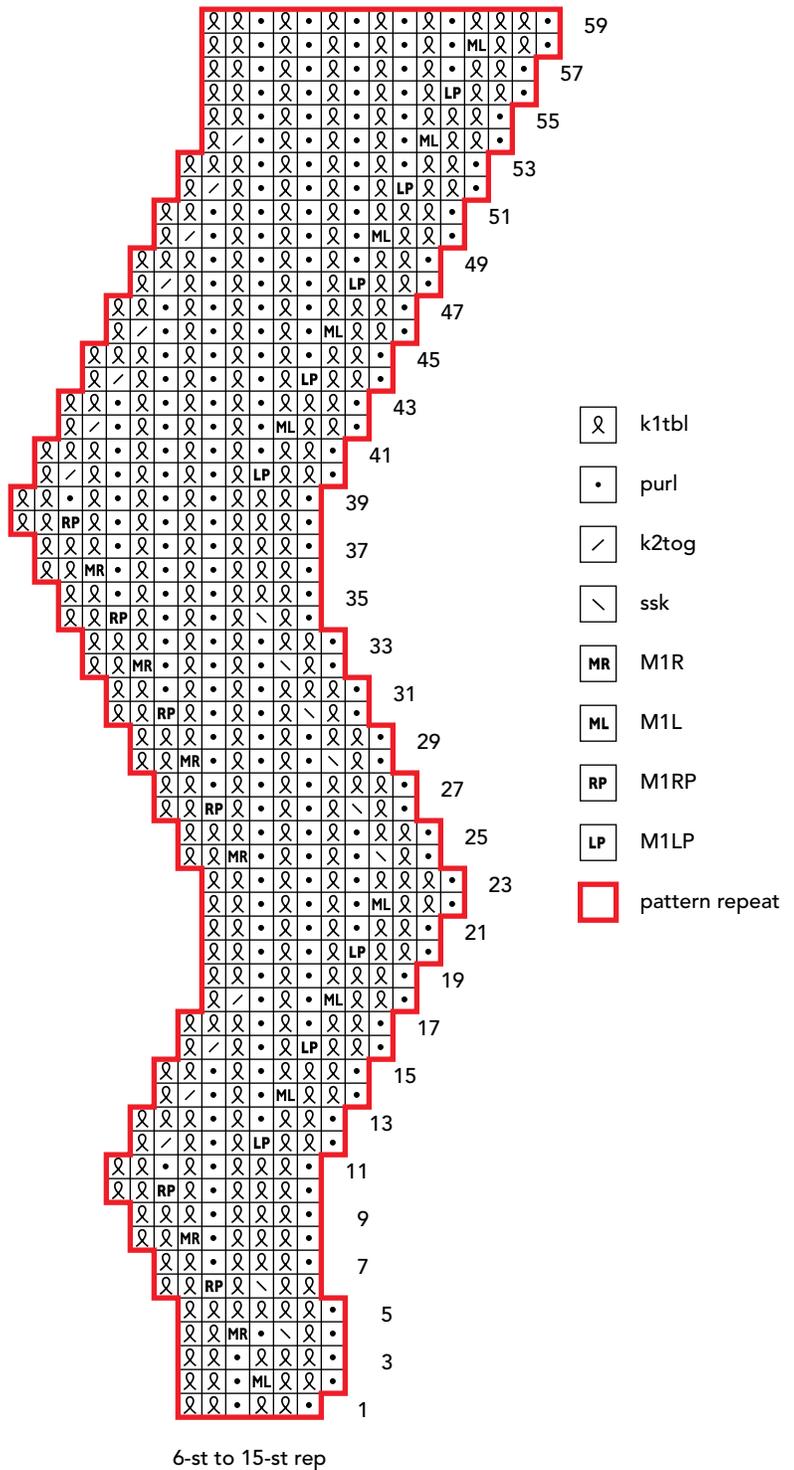
**Short-row 4** Make double st, purl to double st, purl double st as single st, p19 (21, 24, 25, 27, 28), turn.

Rep Short-rows 3 and 4 three more times. **Next row (RS)** Make double st, knit to m—piece measures about 8" from CO at center back. **Next rnd** Knit, working double sts as single sts. Work even until piece measures 8½ (8½, 9, 9¾, 10¼, 11)" from CO at center back. **Divide for body and sleeves:** **Next rnd** K43 (48, 54, 56, 62, 63), place next 50 (56, 60, 64, 68, 74) sts on holder for right sleeve, using the backward-loop method, CO 2 (2, 2, 4, 4, 6) sts for underarm, pm for side, CO 2 (2, 2, 4, 4, 6) sts for underarm, k86 (96, 108, 112, 124, 126), place next 50 (56, 60, 64, 68, 74) sts on holder for left sleeve, CO 2 (2, 2, 4, 4, 6) sts for underarm, pm for side, CO 2 (2, 2, 4, 4, 6) sts for underarm, knit to end—180 (200, 224, 240, 264, 276) sts rem for body.

## Body

Work even until piece measures 1½" from underarm. **Shape waist: Dec rnd** \*Knit to 3 sts before m, ssk, k1, sl m, k1, k2tog;

rep from \* once more, knit to end—4 sts dec'd. Rep dec rnd every 8th rnd 5 more times—156 (176, 200, 216, 240, 252) sts rem. Work even until piece measures 8" from underarm. **Inc rnd** \*Knit to 1 st before m, M1R, k1, sl m, k1, M1L; rep from \* once more, knit to end—4 sts inc'd. Rep inc rnd every 8th rnd 5 more times—180 (200, 224, 240, 264, 276) sts. Work even until piece measures 16 (16, 16½, 16½, 17, 17)" from underarm. Purl 1 rnd for turning ridge. Knit 5 rnds. Using the Folded Hem method (see Stitch Guide), BO all sts.

### Sleeves

Place 50 (56, 60, 64, 68, 74) sleeve sts onto larger dpn. With RS facing, beg at center of underarm, pick up and knit 2 (2, 2, 4, 4, 6) sts along underarm CO, k50 (56, 60, 64, 68, 74) sleeve sts, pick up and knit 2 (2, 2, 4, 4, 6) sts along underarm CO—54 (60, 64, 72, 76, 86) sts total. Pm and join in the rnd. Knit 16 (13, 12, 9, 8, 7) rnds.

**Dec rnd** K1, k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, ssk, k1—2 sts dec'd. Rep dec rnd every 16 (13, 12, 9, 8, 7)th rnd 6 (8, 9, 13, 14, 18) more times—40 (42, 44, 44, 46, 48) sts rem. Work even until piece measures 17½ (17½, 18, 18, 18½, 19)" from underarm. Purl 1 rnd for turning ridge. Knit 5 rnds. Using the Folded Hem method, BO all sts.

### Finishing

Weave in ends. Block to measurements.
