FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

25" wide x 35" long

YARN

Dishie™ (worsted weight, 100% Cotton; 190 yards/100g): MC Navy 26670, 5 skeins; C1 Swan 25409, 2 skeins

HOOKS

US 7 (4.5 mm) Crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge

NOTIONS

Yarn Needle

GAUGE

1 Square = 5"

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WindRose Rug

Notes

Create your favorite new home decor accent with this elegant rug design made of crochet tapestry squares combining two different patterns. Finish the rug with a simple single crochet border.

Tapestry squares are worked separately and then joined in a 6 x 4 squares rectangle. Border is worked after all motifs are joined.

Special Stitches

Reverse Single Crochet (reverse SC)

Working from left to right, insert hook from front to back in next st to right, YO, pull up lp, YO, pull through 2 lps on hook.

Tapestry Double Crochet (TDC)

Work DC with working yarn, carrying unused color inside the st. To change color: work DC until there are 2 lps left on hook, YO with new color and pull through.

Tapestry Treble Crochet (Ttr)

Work tr with working yarn, carrying unused color inside the st. To change color: work tr until there are 2 lps left on hook, YO with new color and pull through.

DIRECTIONS

Square A (Make 12)

With C1, ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring.

Rnds will beg from central st of first edge of square.

Work following rnds in TDC (see *Special Stitches*), changing colors as shown in Windrose Chart – Quarter A.

Rnd 1: Ch 3 (counts as a TDC throughout), Ttr in ring, [ch 2, Ttr, TDC, Ttr] in ring 3 times, ch 2, Ttr in ring, sl st in 3rd ch to join. 8 Ttr, 4 TDC, 4 ch-2 sps.

Rnds 2-5: Ch 3, TDC in each st around, working (TDC, Ttr, ch 2, Ttr, TDC) in each ch-2 sp, sl st in 3rd ch to join. Fasten off. 8 Ttr, 68 TDC, 4 ch-2 sps at end of last rnd.



Square B (Make 12)

Rep Square A, following Windrose Chart – Quarter B.

With WS facing, join A and B Squares with mattress stitch, alternating patterns in a 6 x 4 rectangle.

Border (Work Tight)

With RS facing, join MC with sl st in the center of the long side of the rectangle.

Row 1: Ch 1, [SC in each st and ch-sp to next corner, 2 SC in ch-2 sp at corner] 4 times, SC in each st to the end of row turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, [SC in each SC to next corner, 2 SC in last SC of edge, 2 SC in next SC] 4 times, SC in each SC to end of row, turn.



Rep Row 2 until border measures 2.5”.

Final Row: With RS facing, reverse SC all sts.

Finishing

Sew ends of Border. Weave in ends and block.
