

DARK MOSS PULLOVER

Dark Moss is a simple yet elegant pullover, designed rather oversized for a comfortable flowy look and feel.

Perfect garment to complete outfits with high waisted skirts, jeans and go over dresses, ideal both in the office and outdoors. The side slits provide a beautiful modern touch to otherwise seamless pullover.

Stitches and techniques: knit, purl, cables, short rows, decreases;

Size: design meant to be oversized, all the calculations are provided for the size XS-S and the final measurements (after blocking) are shown on page 3. These can be easily adjusted to any size, please use your creative thinking and basic math!

Yarn: Aran Wool 3ply from Kerry Woollen Mills, 100% rustic wool, ca. 516 g, roughly 2,5 skeins (1 skein 200 g and 334 m), colour Green Bushes.

You might want to use softer and heavier yarn for even more luxurious feel & look.

Needles: 4.0 mm circular needles with a 100-120 cm long cable, cable needle or safety pin if needed, crochet hook or tapestry needle to weave in the ends and bind off.

Gauge: 15 sts and 20 rows in 10 cm with stockinette stitch.

Front and Back: Cast on 110 sts for both Front and Back separately. I use long tail cast on. Work the halves separately or both at the same time at your convenience.

R1. Slip first stitch, k1, p2, continue k2, p2, until the end of the row. Turn around and keep working 2x2 ribbing for a total of 14 rows.

R15. Slip 1, k1, p2, k2, p2, k2, p1, k8, p2, k8, p1, k2, p2, k2, p2, k2 (you get 9 bases for cables).

R16. Work the wrong side following the stitch pattern for a total of 8 rows.



R23. (start working first cables) Slip 1, k1, p2, k2, p2, k2, p1, (move 4 sts to a cable needle, k4, k4 from the cable needle, p2, k8, p2)*, repeat (*) 3 more times, move 4 sts to a cable needle, k4, k4 from the cable needle, p1, k2, p2, k2, p2, k2.

R24. Work like in R16. Continue for a total of 8 rows.

R31. (start working second cables) Slip 1, k1, p2, k2, p2, k2, p1, (k8, p2, move 4 sts to a cable needle, k4, k4 from the cable needle, p2)**, repeat (**) 3 more times, p2, k8, p1, k2, p2, k2, p2, k2.

R32. Work like in R16. Continue for a total of 8 rows.

R39. Work the cables as in R23.

R40. Continue as in R16 for another 8 rows.

R47. Work the cables as in R31.

R48. Continue as in R16 for another 8 rows. In the last row on the side panels, k2tog where p2 was, so slip 1, p1, k2tog, p2, k2tog, p2 in the beginning of the last row; and p2, k2tog, p2, k2tog, p2 in the end of the row. Side panels should be of 8 sts each.

R55. (working cables + joining front and back in a round). Start with front, work as in R23, when you reach the side panel, take the back half of the garment and knit together corresponding stitches, keeping the front on top. Continue working stitches of the back as in R23 and join the side panels in the end by knitting corresponding stitches together. Also keep the front half on top. Join in a round and mark the beginning of the row.

R56. Work all stitches in the round starting from the first stitch of former side panel. k8, p1, k8, (p2, k8)₈, p1, k8, k1, k8, (p2, k8)₈, p1. Repeat for 7 more rows.

R64. Move 4 sts to a cable needle, k4, k4 from the cable needle, p1, (k8, p2, work the cable twist, p2)***, repeat (***) 3 times, k8, p1, work the cable, p1, continue on the back as on the front and finish with p1.

R65. Work all the stitches in a round following the existing pattern for another 7 rows.

R72. K8, p1, cable twist, p2, k8, p2, cable twist, p2, k8, p2, cable twist, p2, k8, p2, cable twist, p1 and the same on the back side.

R73. Work all the stitches in a round following the existing pattern for another 7 rows.

R80. (preparation for adding the sleeves). Using provisional cast on add 38 sts for the right sleeve, k7, k2tog, SSK, k6, k2tog, SSK, k7, add another 38 sts for the left sleeve and join in the round.

R81. Kall (220).

R82. K37, k2tog, k70, SSK, k36, k2tog, k70, SSK.

R83. Kall (216).

R84. K37, k2tog, k9, SSK, k14, SSK, k14, SSK, k14, SSK, k9, SSK, k36, k2tog, k9, SSK, k14, SSK, k14, SSK, k14, SSK, k9, SSK.

R85. Kall (204).

R86. K37, k2tog, k62, SSK, k36, k2tog, k62, SSK.

R87. Kall (200).

R88. K36, k2tog, k14, SSK, k13, SSK, k13, SSK, k14, SSK, K36, k2tog, k14, SSK, k13, SSK, k13, SSK, k14, SSK.

R89. Kall (190).

R90. K36, k2tog, k60, SSK, k36, k2tog, k60, SSK.

R91. Kall (186).

R92. K36, k2tog, k5, SSK, k12, SSK, k11, SSK, k12, SSK, k5, SSK, k36, k2tog, k5, SSK, k12, SSK, k11, SSK, k12, SSK, K5, SSK.

R93. Kall (174).

R94. K36, k2tog, k47, SSK, k36, k2tog, k47, SSK.

R95. Kall (170).

R96. K36, k2tog, k10, SSK, k7, SSK, k3, SSK, k7, SSK, k10, SSK, k36, k2tog, k10, SSK, k7, SSK, k3, SSK, k7, SSK, k10, SSK.

R97. Kall (158).

R98. K36, k2tog, k18, SSK, k19, SSK, k36, k2tog, k18, SSK, k19, SSK.

R99. Kall (152).

R100. K36, k2tog, k10, SSK, k12, SSK, k10, SSK, k36, k2tog, k10, SSK, k12, SSK, k10, SSK.

R101. Kall (146).

R102. K36, k2tog, k33, SSK, k36, k2tog, k33, SSK (142).

R103. (defining the neckline and starting with short rows) K37, k10, k12 on extra needle, kall till the end of the row.

R104. K36, k2tog, k8, wrap around 9th and turn the work to the wrong side.

R104rev. P45, p2tog, p30, SSP, p36, p2tog, p8, wrap around the 9th, turn the work.

R105. K54, SSK, k10, SSK, k45, k2tog, k4, wrap around the 5th, turn the work.

R105rev. P41, p2tog, p26, SSP, p36, p2tog, p4, wrap around the 5th, turn the work.

R106. K105, k2tog, wrap around the 1st, turn the work.

R106rev. P37, p2tog, p24, SSP, p36, p2tog, wrap around the last, turn the work.

R107. K97, wrap around the last one and turn the work.

R107rev. P35, p2tog, p5, p2tog, p8, p2tog, p5, SSP, p 34, wrap around the last and turn the work.

R108. K87, wrap & turn.

R108rev. P31, p2tog, p18, SSP, p31, wrap & turn.

R109. K79, wrap & turn.

R109rev. P28, p2tog, p3, p2tog, p6, p2tog, p3, SSP, p28, wrap & turn.

R110. K69, wrap & turn.

R110rev. P25, p2tog, p12, SSP, p25, wrap & turn.

R111. K61, wrap & turn.

R111rev. P22, p2tog, p10, SSP, p22, wrap & turn.

R112. K53, wrap & turn.

R112rev. P19, p2tog, p8, SSP, p19, wrap & turn.

R113. K45, wrap & turn.

R113rev. P16, p2tog, p6, SSP, p16, wrap & turn.

R114. K37, wrap & turn.

R114rev. P13, p2tog, p4, SSP, p2tog, p13, wrap & turn.

R115. K30, wrap & turn.

R115rev. P10, p2tog, p2, SSP, p10, wrap & turn.

R116. K21, wrap & turn.

R116rev. P7, p2tog, p2tog, p7, wrap & turn.

R117. (moving all the stitches to the main needles and starting working th turtle neck) Kall (102).

R118. (Start new row in the middle of the back!) P1, k2, k2tog, k5, p2, k8, p2, k8, p2, k8, p2, k8, p2, k8, p2, k8, p2, k5, k2tog, k2, p1.

R119. Work all the stitches in a round following the existing pattern for a total of 7 rows.

R126. P1, twist the cable, p2, twist, repeat for all, p1.

R127. Work all the stitches in a round following the existing pattern for a total of 7 rows.

R134. P1, k8, p2, twist the cable, repeat for all according to the existing pattern.

R135. Work all the stitches in a round following the existing pattern for a total of 7 rows.

R142. P1, twist the cable, p2, twist, repeat for all, p1.

R143-144. Work all the stitches in a round following the existing pattern.

R145. Bind off.

Sleeves:

Right. R1. Begin at the back side, pick up 49 sts.

R2. Kall (49).

R3. K37, k2tog, k9, SSK.

R4. Kall (47) untill desired length.

Left. R1. Begin at the back underarm, pick up 49 sts.

R2. Kall (49).

R3. K10, SSK, k36, k2tog.

R4. Kall (47) untill desired length.

Finishing:

All that is left to do now is to bind off the sleeves. You can use any methods you like, here I prefer a standars bind off which is less stretchy than tubular, yet still does the job and keeps the edge from rolling. I also made an extra row of simple chains with crochet hook around the sleeves to prevent the edge from rolling.

Weave in the ends using crochet hook or a tapestry needle and give the garment a nice bath. Lay flat to dry and enjoy once it's ready to wear!

Legend:

Kall - knit all

SSK - slip slip knit

k2tog - knit 2 together

SSP - slip slip purl

p2tog - knit 2 together

1 cm = 0.39 in
