SKIFTNING (NUANCES) – WOMAN'S PULLOVER

Skiftning is a raglan pullover worked from the top down, with short rows to raise the back neck. The sweater's distinctive look comes from alternating stripe rows of two different prints of our big favorite Raggi yarn.

YARN

Raggi (75% superwash wool, 25% polyamide, 165 yd/150 m / 100 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS

Soft Cotton (100% cotton, 87 yd/80 m / 50 g)

Svensk Ull 4 tr (4-ply Swedish Wool) (100% Swedish wool, 148 yd/135 m / 100 g)

GAUGE Approx. 18 sts x 24 rows/rnds in stockinette on larger size needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm.

Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

SIZES XS (S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL)

POSITIVE EASE Approx. 8 in / 20 cm

GARMENT CHEST Approx. 37¾ (41, 44, 47¼, 51¼, 56, 60¾, 65½) in / 96 (104, 112, 120, 130, 142, 154, 166) cm

GARMENT SLEEVE LENGTH Approx. 20 (20, 20½, 20½, 21, 21, 21, 21) in / 51 (51, 52, 52, 53, 53, 53, 53) cm

YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

Color 1: Approx. 120 (120, 120, 120, 120, 120, 140, 140) g (color 1558, Charcoal Black)

Color 2: Approx. 250 (250, 280, 300, 300, 350, 350, 370) g (color 15216, Imagine Thunder)

Color 3: Approx. 250 (250, 280, 300, 300, 350, 350, 370) g (color 15223 Woody)

NEEDLES U. S. sizes 6 and 7 / 4 and 4.5 mm: 32-48 in / 80-120 cm circulars

NOTIONS 5 stitch markers

LEVEL OF DIFFICULTY Intermediate

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

See Tips and Shortcuts on the last page for common abbreviations and other useful information.

M1R = make 1 right: With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from back to front and knit into front loop = right-leaning increase.

M1L = make 1 left: With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from front to back and knit into back loop = left-leaning increase.

M1R-p = make 1 right-purl: With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from back to front and purl into front loop = right-leaning increase.

M1L-p = make 1 left-purl: With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from front to back and purl into back loop = left-leaning increase.

German Short Rows: Double st (DS): The double stitch or German short rows is a turning method that does not leave holes at each turn. Work to st where work will be turned. Sl 1 purlwise wyf, firmly pull yarn backwards over right needle so you flip st and have 2 stitch legs or a double stitch (DS) on the needle; work rem sts on needle.

After working the specified number of short rows, you will join the double sts one at a time. Work to 1st DS,

knit or purl it in pattern, catching both legs of DS to make 1 st.

It will help you keep track of the double sts if you place a marker at each so you can count them and minimize the danger of missing one as you continue knitting. For more help, see the video on Järbo's youtube channel: <https://youtu.be/Sn28lla3W9s>.

Backwards Loop Cast-on: *Form a loop so working end of yarn lies in front of yarn coming from previous stitch; place loop on right needle.* Repeat *-* until you have made the specified number of cast-on stitches.

NECKBAND RIBBING AND BACK NECK

With smaller size circular and color 1, CO 80 (84, 88, 96, 100, 104, 104, 108) sts. Join, being careful not to twist cast-on row; pm for beginning of rnd. Work around in k2, p2 ribbing until neckband measures approx. 4 in / 10 cm. Change to larger size circular and knit 1 rnd, *at the same time*, increasing 0 (0, 0, 0, 10, 12, 16, 18) sts evenly spaced around = 80 (84, 88, 96, 110, 116, 120, 126) sts.

Cut color 1 and add color 2. Marker at beginning of rnd = center back (CB).



SHORT ROWS

Now work German short rows to raise back neck. On the first row, place 4 markers for raglan shaping.

Row 1 (RS): K16 (17, 18, 20, 22, 24, 25, 26), M1R, k1, pm, k1, M1L, k4 (4, 4, 4, 6, 6, 6), M1R, k1, pm, k1, M1L, k1; turn and DS.

Row 2 (WS): Purl to CB (center back marker), p16 (17, 18, 20, 23, 24, 25, 27), M1R-p, p1, pm, p1, M1L-p, p4 (4, 4, 4, 6, 6, 6), M1R-p, p1, pm, M1L-p, p1; turn and DS.

Row 3 (RS): Knit to CB, *knit until 1 st before next marker, M1R, k1, slm, k1, M1L*; rep *-* once more. Knit until 2 sts after previous DS; turn and DS.

Row 4 (WS): Purl to CB, *purl until 1 st before next marker, M1R-p, p1, slm, p1, M1L-p*; rep *-* once more. Purl until 2 sts after previous DS; turn and DS.

Rep Rows 3-4 once more. Now knit to CB, remove marker and knit to next marker without an increase.

NOTE Rnd now begins here.

RAGLAN

To stripe the sweater, alternate color 2 and color 3 on every rnd. Increase on every other rnd at the raglan markers.

Rnd 1 (Increase Rnd, color 3): *Slm, k1, M1L, knit until 1 st before next marker, M1R, k1*; rep *-* 3 more times = 8 sts increased.

Rnd 2 (color 2): Knit around.

Rep Rnds 1-2 until you've worked 20 (23, 24, 26, 26, 26, 26) increase rnds.

NOTE This includes those made while you worked short rows.

Sizes 2XL-4XL only: Rep only Rnd 1 a total of 4 (7, 10) times.

There are now 240 (268, 280, 304, 318, 356, 384, 414) sts for the yoke. Next, divide the yoke for body and sleeves and cast on new sts for the underarms.

Remove CB marker, place next 46 (52, 54, 58, 60, 68, 74, 80) sts on a holder for sleeve and CO 12 (12, 14, 14, 18, 16, 18, 18) sts with backwards loop method, Remove next marker and knit across front [= 74 (82, 86, 94, 99, 110, 120, 129) sts] to next marker, remove marker, CO 12 (12, 14, 14, 18, 16, 18, 18) sts with backwards loop

method, and place next 46 (52, 54, 58, 60, 68, 74, 80) sts on a holder for sleeve, remove last marker and knit across back [= 74 (82, 86, 94, 99, 110, 120, 129) sts]. Knit 6 (6, 7, 7, 9, 8, 9, 9) sts of underarm, pm for beginning of rnd = 172 (188, 200, 216, 234, 252, 272, 290) sts for body.

BODY

Continue knitting around in stockinette, alternating the two colors until body measures approx. 9¾ (10¼, 11, 11¾, 11¾, 12¾, 13, 13½) in / 25 (26, 28, 30, 30, 32, 33, 34) cm from underarms. Cut both yarns. Knit 1 rnd with color 1, *at the same time*, decreasing 0 (0, 0, 0, 2, 0, 0, 2) sts evenly spaced around = 172 (188, 200, 216, 232, 252, 276, 292) sts rem.

Change to smaller size circular and work in k2, p2 ribbing until lower edge measures approx. 2¾ in / 7 cm. BO in ribbing.

SLEEVES

Look at the color of the last-knitted st on the sleeve and begin with the other color. Beginning at the center of the underarm, with larger size needle, pick up and knit 6 (6, 7, 7, 9, 8, 9, 9) sts along underarm, 1 st in gap between armhole and sleeve sts on holder, place these sts onto needle and knit sleeve sts. Pick up and knit 1 st in gap between sleeve sts and armhole, and end by picking up and knitting 6 (6, 7, 7, 9, 8, 9, 9) sts along underarm = 60 (66, 70, 74, 80, 86, 94, 100) sts for sleeve. Stripe the sleeve as est, knitting around in stockinette until sleeve measures approx. 4 in / 10 cm.

Now begin sleeve shaping as follows:

Decrease Rnd: K1, k2tog, knit until 3 sts rem, ssk, k1.

Rep decrease rnd approx. every 1¼ (1¼, 1¼, 1¼, 1¼, 1¼, ¾, ¾) in / 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, 2, 2) cm a total of 2 (3, 3, 3, 6, 7, 11, 14) times = 56 (60, 64, 68, 68, 72, 72, 72) sts rem and sleeve is approx. 17¼ (17¼, 17¾, 17¾, 18¼, 18¼, 18¼, 18¼) in / 44 (44, 45, 45, 46, 46, 46, 46) cm long.

Change to color 1 and knit 1 rnd. Change to smaller size circular and knit around in k2, p2 ribbing for approx. 2¾ in / 7 cm). BO in ribbing.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Dampen sweater, preferably from a spray bottle. Roll sweater in a towel to absorb excess water. Lay flat to dry, patted out to finished measurements.





TIPS & SHORTCUTS

To avoid questions: Before you begin knitting, read through the pattern.

Stitch count: Always knit or crochet a gauge swatch as recommended in the pattern. If your stitch count doesn't match the gauge given in the pattern, try again with larger or smaller needles or hook. If your gauge doesn't match that in the pattern, your item will not be the correct size or shape.

Highlight the size you will knit or crochet throughout the pattern to make it easier to follow the instructions.

Charts: It will be easier to follow a chart if you mark your row with a ruler and magnetic board or sticky note.

Ease: The amount of ease included in our garments varies depending on the type and shape of the garment. To determine the right size, we recommend that you first measure your body. Then you can calculate the garment size depending on how much ease you want the garment to have. The schematics for each piece show all the garment measurements.

Two-color stranded knitting: When knitting more than 3-4 stitches of the same color, twist the color strands around each other on the wrong side to avoid long strands or "floats" on the back. If the yarns need to be twisted on several rows/rounds, make sure you do not stack the twists in the same place to prevent the yarns from showing through on the right side.

Tips för hand dyed yarn: Make sure you have enough yarn to complete your project. The colors may vary from time to time. To get a smooth color mix, you can alternate between two skeins: knit two rows from one and two rows from another skein.

CROCHETING

ch = chain stitch, **dc** = double crochet, **dtr** = double treble crochet, **hdc** = half double crochet, **htr** = half treble crochet, **sc** = single crochet, **sl st** = slip stitch, **tr** = treble crochet, **tr tr** = triple treble crochet

DIFFICULTY

Beginner: Anyone with no experience knitting/crocheting. Easy techniques and clear explanations.

Adventurous Beginner: For a beginner ready to take the next step. Clear explanations so you can try some new techniques.

Intermediate: Anyone who has knitted/crocheted for a while but who wants a challenge. More advanced techniques and two steps occur at the same time.

Experienced: For experienced knitters/crocheters who have already tried many techniques and methods. Advanced/uncommon techniques and several steps occur simultaneously.
