## ~YARN~

The sweater in the photo on first page is in size M with a positive ease of 5 cm. It was made of a set of skeins from the "Dress for Fall" collection from <https://kokonki.pl/>


The sweater Charlotte is worked from top to bottom in rounds with turning the piece. The work begins with the largest skein that has all the colors.

Next, the yoke is divided into the body and sleeves. Each of these elements is made separately, also in rounds with turning the work.

The last round of the yoke should be on the color (ovv) or (vvv), so that the continuity of colors on the transition from yoke to sleeve is preserved.

The skeins for the sleeves start from the third solid color, which is (vvv).

Finally, as a possible addition, there is a solid color skein (hhh).



Note: If, due to different tension of the yarn while working, the last round of the yoke comes out higher than the color (ovv), split the yarn from the main skein for the sleeves and the body.

The sample set will be worked from the outside of the skein.

Or any Fingering/Sock weight yarn of the following yardages:

SIZE		S	M	L	XL	2XL	3XL
The skein for the yoke and body	m	900	1000	1100	1200	1300	1400
2 skeins for sleeves	m	200	200	250	250	250	300
The completion of the last color	m	250	250	250	250	250	250

## ~ MEASUREMENTS AND GAUGE ~

22 dc x 10 rows with a 3mm hook after blocking gives a square of 10 x 10cm.

Recommended positive ease around bust of 0 - 10 cm.



**Fragment of round 3:**  
work crossed dc in the following order




The rounds marked in **BLACK** are the **RIGHT** side of the piece.  
 In the diagram read from **RIGHT** to **LEFT** from the three stitches instead of the first double  
 crochet.

The rounds marked in **RED** are the **WRONG** side of the work, read  
 from **LEFT** to **RIGHT**.

Rounds marked in **GRAY** are repetitions, do not work them again.

The part of the round marked in **GREEN** is a motif, i.e. repeated stitches.



**~RIBBING~**

Work the whole ribbing  
 on the right side.



Make a chain with (112, **120**, 120) (**128**, 128, **136**) stitches and close it in a circle with  
 a slip stitch.


Then work the ribbing in rounds without turning the piece. The number of double crochets for a  
 given size is equal to the number of initial chain stitches. Chain 3 at the beginning of each round  
 will be counted as one double crochet (you may use any other technique to start the round).

In the last round of the ribbing (three front post double crochets in one stitch), the number of  
 stitches increases by half and for the given size equals (168, **180**, 180) (**192**, 192, **204**).


Round 1 is the first round of the yoke. After completing it, turn the work for the first time, and  
 each subsequent round is worked alternately on the right and wrong sides according to the  
 color markings on the chart.







**NOTE:** After round 17, try on the yoke. Check if it fits. If you cannot comfortably catch edges under the arms, add extra rounds. These can be rounds of double crochets or diamonds from the chart on the next page.


Finish the yoke with a round of double crochets worked on the wrong side. Then separate the sleeves on the right side.

The number of stitches in rounds 14 - 18 is: (282, 300, 330) (354, 384, 408).





**~ROUND 14 -18~** for size L, XL

## ~BODY AND SLEEVES SEPARATION~

chain 3, (81, 90, 99) (105, 114, 124) double crochets on the back,

(9, 9, 9) (11, 11, 13) underarm chain stitches,

skip (57, 57, 63) (68, 74, 76) for the sleeve,

(86, 95, 104) (112, 121, 131) double crochets on the front,


(9, 9, 9) (11, 11, 13) underarm chain stitches,

skip (57, 57, 63) (68, 74, 76) for the sleeve.

Close the round with the slip stitch.

The number of double crochets for the body (including the double crochets worked into the chain stitches under the arms): (186, 204, 222) (240, 258, 282).

**NOTE:** If a better fit is needed, you can adjust the division or change the number of stitches added under the arms. Keep in mind that the number of double crochets in the body must be divisible by 6.




## ~BODY~

Work the body in rounds, turning the work at the end of each round. After three or five rounds, create the decorative diamond pattern.


Work round 5 on the right side.

Then, continue working the rounds of double crochet. When the sweater is 10 cm shorter than the desired length, finish on the wrong side and proceed to round 11.

In round 14, you can decrease the number of double crochets (it must be an even number). Then, continue working the ribbing rounds on the right side without turning the work.



~SLEEVE~



On the two horizontal double crochets, work two double crochets of the sleeve.

The sleeve is worked in rounds, turning the work at the end of each round. The number of double crochets for the sleeve (including the double crochets worked on the stitches of the round that separates the sleeves and on the chain stitches under the arms) is:  
 (70, 70, 76) (83, 89, 93).

After the first 6 rounds (or fewer), you may start decreasing by working two double crochets together every other round—once on the right side and once on the left side of the join. The sleeve should be measured as you go, adjusting the decreases and length as needed.



When the sleeve is 10 cm shorter than the desired length, finish on the wrong side (make sure the number of double crochets in the last round is divisible by 3; if necessary, work two double crochets together).

Proceed to round 11.

In round 14, you can reduce the number of double crochets (it must be an even number).

Then, continue working the ribbing rounds on the right side without turning the work.
