ALPENGLLOW

DETAILS

This sweater is like a charcuterie board, with a little bit of everything to satisfy your knitty appetite! Stranded colorwork, mosaic knitting, corrugated ribbing and more. This sweater is hard to put down, as you crave just one more row!



SIZES

1 (2, 3, 4, 5)(6, 7, 8, 9)

See the Notes section for helpful tips on picking the right size for you!



FINISHED BUST CIRCUMFERENCE

32 (36, 40.5, 43.75, 47.25)(52, 55.5, 60, 64.5)"

81.5 (91.5, 103, 111, 120)(132, 141, 152.5, 164) cm

Recommended ease is 0 to +4"/0 to +10 cm; sample is shown in Size 2 on 5'5" person with a 34"/86.5 cm bust with 2"/5 cm of positive ease.



YARN

A - Sport weight wool (75 g/300 yds)

141 (160, 175, 192, 210)(232, 254, 275, 300) m

B - Lace weight cashmere/silk blend (held double) (25 g/315 yds)

81 (92, 101, 110, 121)(133, 146, 162, 173) yds

74 (84, 92, 101, 110)(122, 134, 148, 158) m

C - Sport weight wool (75 g/300 yds)

D - Sport weight wool (50 g/200 yds)

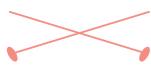

Main: US 4/3.5 mm –24"/60 cm to 40"/100 cm circular & preferred needles for small circumference knitting (such as Magic Loop or DPNs)

Ribbing: US 2/2.75 mm - 16"/40 cm circular for collar, 32-40"/80-100 cm for hem and preferred needles for small circumference knitting for cuffs.

(Use the needle size you need to achieve gauge. The Ribbing needle should be 2 US sizes smaller than the Main needle.)



SUGGESTED NEEDLES



NOTIONS

Stitch marker, row counter (recommended), scissors, waste yarn or stitch holders



GAUGE

23 sts & 38 rows = 4"/10 cm on Main needle.

Measured over stockinette stitch knit in sport weight yarn with Main needle in the round, after blocking.

SUGGESTED YARN

A - Magpie Fibers Dyed in the Skein 100% SW American Wool (75 g/300 yds) - 1 (1, 1, 1, 1)(1, 1, 1, 2) skeins Spicy Beaver (orange)
B - Magpie Fibers Plume 75% Cashmere/25% Silk (25 g/315 yds) - 1 skein Lil' Bit Bougie (pink) or Magpie Fibers Feather 70% Mohair/30% Silk (50 g/470 yds) - 1 skein Lil' Bit Bougie (pink)
C - Magpie Fibers Dyed in the Skein 100% SW American Wool (75 g/300 yds) - 3 (4, 4, 4, 5)(5, 6, 6, 7) skeins Midnight Train to Georgia (navy)
D - Spincycle Yarns Dyed in the Wool 100% SW American Wool (50 g/200 yds) - 1 (2, 2, 2, 2)(2, 2, 2, 3) skeins Ghost Ranch (multi)

- To pick your size, measure around your full bust, then add or subtract your desired ease to that number. Pick the size closest to that from the *FINISHED BUST CIRCUMFERENCE* on page 2 - DETAILS.
- This sweater is knit from the top down starting with the yoke, the sleeves are separated and put on hold as the body is finished. The sleeves are returned to the needle to knit at the end, as is the collar which is picked up and knit from the cast on edge.
- Take care with your SLEEVE GAUGE! Most knitters will tighten up when knitting a smaller circumference (IE sleeves). You may need to go up a needle size for the sleeves to stay on gauge.
- The Yarn B for this sweater is 2 strands of lace weight yarn held together as one.
- You can knit the body and sleeves of this sweater to your desired length, just take note that any modifications will affect the yardage required. Purchase yarn accordingly.
- When working stranded colorwork, one color will be more dominant than the other. Here is a great blog post to maintain color dominance in your project: <https://tinyurl.com/n4ucsj8e>

- When working the Mosaic pattern for the body and sleeves, take care to always slip the MC sts purlwise with the working yarn held to the back so that your floats are hidden.
- If you do not care for the Long Tail Tubular Bind Off, you can sub in your favorites - such as a regular Bind Off or Jeny's Surprisingly Stretchy Bind Off.
- Charts are read beginning in the lower right-hand corner, reading all rows from right to left as for working in the round.

— GLOSSARY —

{ } - Repeat

1/1 LPC - Place stitch on CN and hold to front, p1; k1 from CN.

1/1 RPC - Place stitch on CN and hold to back, k1; p1 from CN.

BO - Bind off

BOR - Beginning of round

CN - Cable needle

CO - Cast on

CONT - Continue/d

DEC/D - Decrease/d

DPN/S - Double pointed needle/s

EST - Established

INC/D - Increase/d

K - Knit

K2TOG - Knit 2 stitches together. [1 st dec'd]

LHN - Left hand needle

LLI - Lifted Left Increase: Slip stitch purlwise to RHN needle, lift the left leg of the stitch in the row below the slipped stitch and place it on the LHN. Knit it thru the back loop. [1 st inc'd]

M - Marker

P - Purl

PM - Place marker

PREV - Previously

REM - Remaining

REP - Repeat

RHN - Right hand needle

RND/S - Round/s

RS - Right side

SL - Slip stitch purlwise (unless knitwise is indicated).

SM - Slip marker

SSK - Slip the next 2 stitches knitwise and then knit them together thru the back loops. [1 st dec'd]

ST/S - Stitch/es

WS - Wrong side

W&T - Wrap and turn: Knit Row (Purl Row) Slip next stitch to RHN, pass yarn from back (front) to front (back), slip stitch back to LHN. Turn to work other side, passing yarn to front (back) of work. It is a good practice to give the yarn a little tug to keep your wraps snug.

-To resolve a wrapped KNIT stitch on the RIGHT side: Insert the RHN into the wrap and then into the wrapped stitch and knit them together.

-To resolve a wrapped PURL stitch on the WRONG side: Insert the RHN from behind, under the wrap, and lift the wrap onto the LHN. Purl the wrap and wrapped stitch together.

YOKE SETUP

Using yarn A and Main needle, CO 120 (120, 120, 120, 128)(128, 128, 132, 132) sts using the Long Tail Cast On method. Place a BOR marker, and join to work in the round. *The BOR is located at the center back of the sweater.*

Rnd 1: Knit

Sizes 1-4 ONLY

Rnd 2: Knit. Proceed to Short Row Back Neck Shaping.

Sizes 5-9 ONLY

Rnd 2 (INC): {K- (-, -, -, 3)(3, 3, 2, 2), LL1} to end of rnd.
[- (-, -, -, 32)(32, 32, 44, 44) sts inc'd;
- (-, -, -, 160)(160, 160, 176, 176) sts on needle]

SHORT ROW BACK NECK SHAPING

The short row shaping will be worked flat, back and forth in rows.

Short Row 1 (RS): K20 (20, 20, 20, 30)(30, 30, 36, 36), W&T.

Short Row 2 (WS): Purl to BOR M, SM, p20 (20, 20, 20, 30)(30, 30, 36, 36), W&T.

Short Row 3: Knit to prev wrapped st, resolve by knitting the wrapped st with its wrap, k4, W&T.

Short Row 4: Purl to prev wrapped st, resolve by purling the wrapped st with its wrap, p4, W&T.

Rep [Short Rows 3 & 4] 3 more times.

Short Row 11 (RS): Knit to BOR marker.

Rnd 12: Knit, resolving rem wrapped sts as they are encountered. (*See Notes on pg. 3 for a tutorial on resolving the final wrapped stitch.*)

YOKE INCREASES #1

SIZE 1: *K9, LL1; rep from * to end of rnd. [12 sts inc'd; 132 total sts]

SIZE 2: *K4, LL1; rep from * to end of rnd. [24 sts inc'd; 144 total sts]

SIZE 3: *K2, LL1, k1, LL1; rep from * to end of rnd. [48 sts inc'd; 168 total sts]

SIZE 4: *{K1, LL1} 7 times, {k2, LL1} 2 times; rep from * 5 more times to end of rnd. [54 sts inc'd; 174 total sts]

SIZE 5: *K4, LL1; rep from * to end of rnd. [32 sts inc'd; 192 total sts]

SIZE 6: *{K2, LL1} 4 times, k3, LL1; rep from * 9 more times to end of rnd. [50 sts inc'd; 210 total sts]

SIZE 7: *{K2, LL1} 18 times, {k1, LL1} 13 times; rep from * once more to end of rnd. [62 sts inc'd; 222 total sts]

SIZE 8: *{K2, LL1} 3 times, k1, LL1; rep from * 15 more times to end of rnd. [64 sts inc'd; 240 total sts]

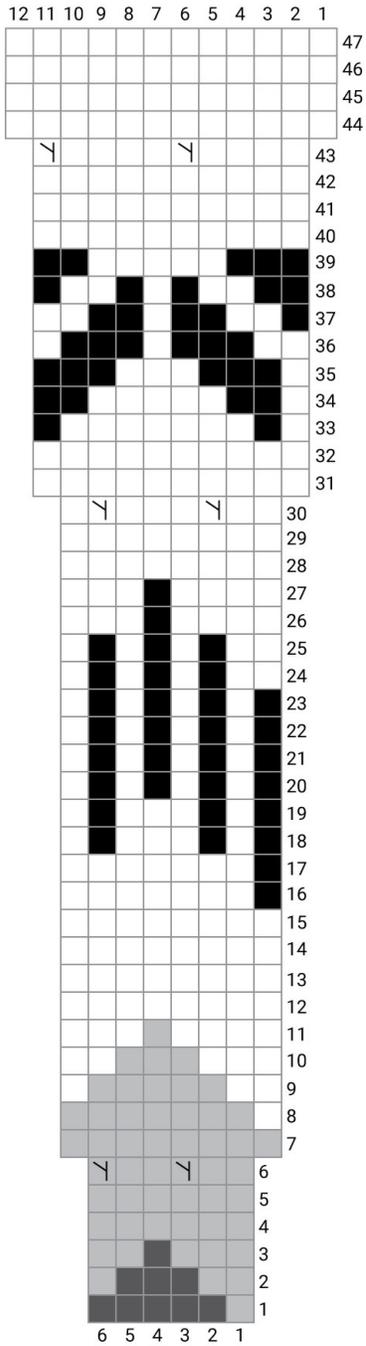
SIZE 9: *{K1, LL1} 13 times, {k2, LL1} 6 times; rep from * 3 more times to end of rnd. [76 sts inc'd; 252 total sts]

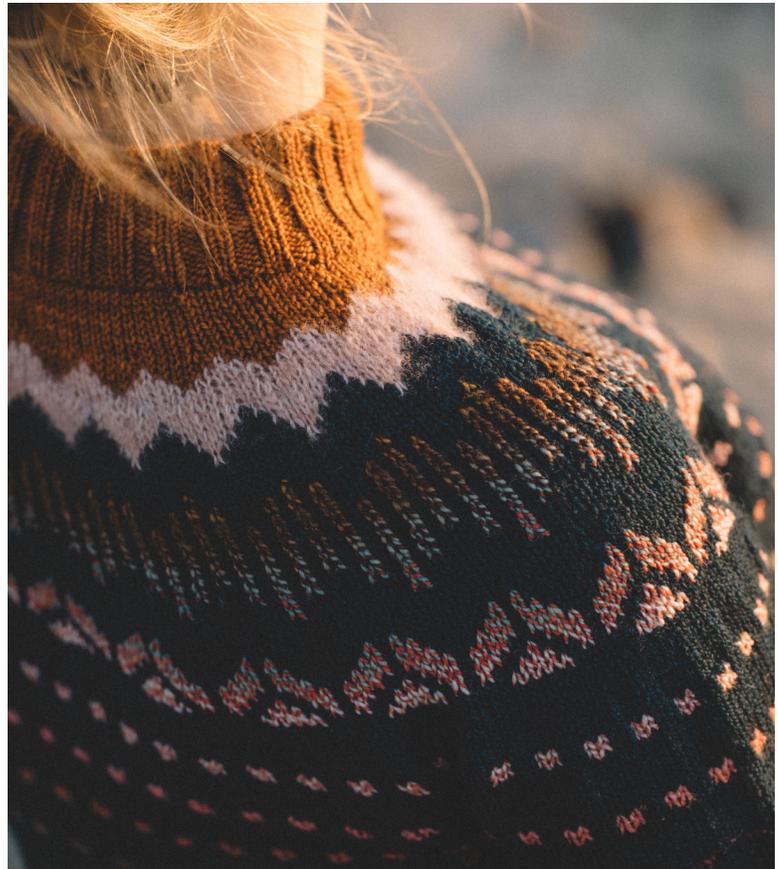
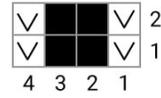

YOKE SECTION ONE

The first portion of the yoke is worked from Chart A as stranded colorwork, using up to 2 colors on a given row, as shown in the chart.

SIZES 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, & 6: Work Rnds 1-47 from Chart A on pg. 6, repeating the chart across the rnd, joining yarns B, C & D when needed, and breaking them when finished. See below for st counts after each increase rnd.

SIZES 7, 8 & 9: Work Rnds 1-46 from Chart A on pg. 6, repeating the chart across the rnd, joining yarns B, C & D when needed, and breaking them when finished. Proceed to Yoke Increases #5. See below for st counts after each increase rnd.

STITCH COUNTS AFTER YOKE INCREASES

44 (48, 56, 58, 64)(70, 74, 80, 84) sts are inc'd on each inc rnd.

Rnd 6 INC: 176 (192, 224, 232, 256)(280, 296, 320, 336) total sts

Rnd 30 INC: 220 (240, 280, 290, 320)(350, 370, 400, 420) total sts

Rnd 43 INC: 264 (288, 336, 348, 384)(420, 444, 480, 504) total sts

YOKE INCREASES #5 - SIZES 7, 8, 9 ONLY

SIZE 7: *K36, LL1; rep from * to end of rnd. [12 sts inc'd; 456 sts total]

SIZE 8: *K19, LL1; rep from * to end of rnd. [24 sts inc'd; 504 sts total]

SIZE 9: *K13, LL1; rep from * to end of rnd. [36 sts inc'd; 540 sts total]

YOKE SECTION TWO

The second portion of the yoke, along with the body, is worked by alternating sections of stockinette with yarn C and Mosaic knitting using Chart B, where only color D is used for 2 rnds, and the other stitches are slipped without being knitted.

FINISH YOKE

Begin Yoke & Body Repeat (below), rep Rnds 1-10 until the Yoke measures close to 5.5 (6.25, 6.25, 7, 7.75)(7.75, 8.75, 10, 10)"/14 (16, 16, 18, 20)(20, 22, 25.5, 25.5) cm from the center of the front cast on edge, finishing with Rnd 6 of the repeat. *I would err on being a bit longer, rather than shorter, than this goal length, if necessary to finish with Rnd 6 of the repeat.*

YOKE & BODY REPEAT

Rnds 1 - 2: Join yarn D. Work Rnds 1-2 from Chart B on pg. 6, repeating the chart across the rnd.

At this point you can either break yarn D, or carry it loosely up the inside of the sweater, until it is ready to be used again in 8 rnds.

Rnds 3 - 10: Knit with yarn C.

Keep in mind, the beauty of a top-down sweater is trying it on as you go! Make sure you like the yoke depth before proceeding to the next section. Please note that the collar will add 2"/5 cm more length to your final yoke depth measurement, and the addition of both the sleeves and collar will greatly affect the finished fit of your sweater. When trying on my sweaters to check for yoke depth, I prefer them to hit approximately 2"/5 cm below my underarm, before separating the sleeves from the body. Your preference may vary.

SEPARATE SLEEVES AND BODY

K40 (44, 52, 55, 60)(67, 72, 78, 85) back sts, place 52 (56, 64, 64, 72)(76, 84, 96, 100) sleeve sts on hold using waste yarn or a stitch holder, CO 12 (16, 12, 16, 16) (16, 16, 16, 16) sts for the underarm using the Backwards Loop method, k80 (88, 104, 110, 120)(134, 144, 156, 170) front sts, place 52 (56, 64, 64, 72)(76, 84, 96, 100) sleeve sts on hold using waste yarn or a stitch holder, CO 12 (16, 12, 16, 16)(16, 16, 16, 16) sts for the underarm using the Backwards Loop method, knit the rem 40 (44, 52, 55, 60)(67, 72, 78, 85) back sts. 184 (208, 232, 252, 272)(300, 320, 344, 372) body sts on needle.

BODY

Beginning on Rnd 8 of the Body Repeat, cont in the est pattern, until the body measures 8.75"/22 cm or 2"/5 cm less than the desired length, ending with Rnd 10 of the pattern repeat.

HEM

The hem utilizes corrugated ribbing, knitting with one color (in this case yarn D) and purling with a different color (yarn C). Take care to always return C to the back of your work after each set of purl sts, so your floats don't end up showing on the front of your sweater.

Change to Ribbing needle.

Rib Pattern: *P1 with C, return yarn to back, k2 with D, bring C to front and p1; rep from * to end of rnd.

Cont working in the est rib pattern for 1.75"/4.5 cm. Break D.

Next 2 rnds: Using C only, *p1, k2, p1; rep from * to end of rnd.

(If choosing not to do a Tubular Bind Off, work 1 more rnd as est, then bind off in rib pattern and proceed to Sleeves on pg. 9.)

Rearranging Sts for BO: *1/1 RPC, k1, p1; rep from * to end of rnd.

Tubular BO Setup Rnd 1: {K1, sl 1 wyif} to the end of the rnd.

Tubular BO Setup Rnd 2: {Sl 1 wyib, p1} to the end of the rnd.

Sl each st purlwise, slipping the knit sts onto the working needle and the purl sts onto a spare needle, OR reference the Kitchener Stitch on One Needle Tutorial linked in the Notes on pg. 3 to skip this step.

Break yarn, leaving a tail 3 x the length of the sts to be bound off, and BO all sts using the Kitchener stitch.

SLEEVES (same for both)

Place the 52 (56, 64, 64, 72)(76, 84, 96, 100) sts of one sleeve onto Main needle for your preferred method of small circumference knitting. Starting from the middle of the cast-on underarm sts, attach yarn C and pick up and knit 7 (9, 7, 9, 9)(9, 9, 9, 9) sts, knit across the live sleeve sts, pick up and knit 7 (9, 7, 9, 9)(9, 9, 9, 9) sts, PM and join for working in the round. *We have picked up 2 more sts than we cast on for the underarm of the body to help reduce any underarm gaps.*
66 (74, 78, 82, 90)(94, 102, 114, 118) sts

Knit 1 rnd.

DEC RND: K2tog, knit to the last 2 sts, ssk. [2 sts dec'd; 64 (72, 76, 80, 88)(92, 100, 112, 116) total sts]

Knit 1 rnd.

SLEEVE SHAPING

To avoid disrupting the stitch pattern on the sleeves, we want to pair 2 dec rnds within the sections of stockinette that occur between the charted rounds. You will use the Sleeve Pattern repeat in the following column, working the decreases for your size on Rnds 4 & 9 when necessary. The charted pattern will shift so that the round begins with the opposite color after each decrease section. If you were using Chart B before the decrease rnd, you will now use Chart C, and then back to Chart B after your next set of decreases.

SLEEVE PATTERN REPEAT

Rnds 1 - 2: Join yarn D. Work Rnds 1-2 from Chart B or C to keep the stitch pattern lined up, repeating the chart across the rnd.

Rnd 3: Knit.

Rnd 4: Knit OR work a Dec Rnd.

Rnds 5 - 8: Knit.

Rnd 9: Knit OR work a Dec Rnd.

Rnd 10: Knit.

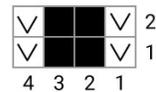
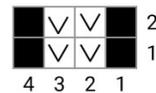

You will work approximately 13.5 repeats of the 10-rnd Sleeve Pattern Repeat. Space 2 (6, 8, 10, 14)(10, 14, 20, 22) Dec Rnds along the sleeve length, pairing 2 Dec Rnds per Sleeve Pattern Repeat on Rnds 4 & 9. By size, that is 1 (3, 4, 5, 7)(5, 7, 10, 11) pairs of decreases. I have added a chart on pg. 10 of where I recommend to place the decreases by size.

After completing the sleeve shaping 4 (12, 16, 20, 28)(20, 28, 40, 44) sts have been dec'd, and 60 (60, 60, 60, 60)(72, 72, 72, 72) sts remain.

Cont working in the est pattern until the sleeve measures 14.75"/37.5 cm (or 3.25"/8 cm less than your desired length) ending after Rnd 6 of the Sleeve Pattern Repeat. Break yarn D.

CUFF

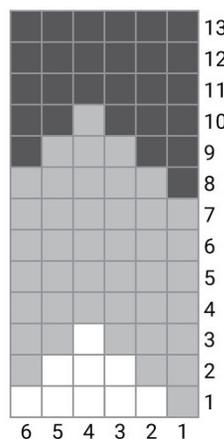
Work Rnds 1-13 of Chart D, repeating the chart across the rnd, joining and breaking yarn colors as necessary.

After completing Rnd 13, change to Ribbing needle.

Rib Pattern: Using yarn A only, {k2, p2} around.

Cont working in the est rib pattern for 2"/5 cm.

(If choosing not to do a Tubular Bind Off, bind off in rib pattern, work 1 more rnd as est and proceed to Finishing.)

Rearranging Sts for BO: *K1, 1/1 LPC, p1; rep from * to end of rnd.

Tubular BO Setup Rnd 1: {K1, sl 1 wyif} around.

Tubular BO Setup Rnd 2: {Sl 1 wyib, p1} around.

Sl each st purlwise, slipping the knit sts onto the working needle and the purl sts onto a spare needle, OR reference the Kitchener Stitch on One Needle Tutorial linked in the Notes on pg. 3 to skip this step.

Break yarn, leaving a tail 3 x the length of the sts to be bound off, and BO all sts using the Kitchener stitch.

Repeat for the other sleeve.

— DIRECTIONS —

COLLAR

Using the Ribbing needle and yarn A, start at the center back of the neck and pick up and knit 120 (120, 120, 120, 128)(128, 128, 132, 132) sts around the cast on edge. Place a BOR marker and join to work in the round.

Rib Pattern: {K2, p2} around.
Cont working in the est rib pattern for 4"/10 cm.

Bind off loosely in rib pattern, leaving a 36"/90 cm long tail for weaving. Fold collar in half inwards and sew bound off edge to rim created by picking up sts.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Wet block sweater by letting it soak in lukewarm bath with wool wash for at least 15 minutes.

Gently squeeze the excess water from your sweater. Sandwich sweater between clean towels and step on top to remove as much moisture as possible without distorting your sweater.

Repeat with fresh towels if necessary. Lay sweater flat to dry using the schematic to help achieve the desired shape and measurements.

Trim yarn tails and wear!

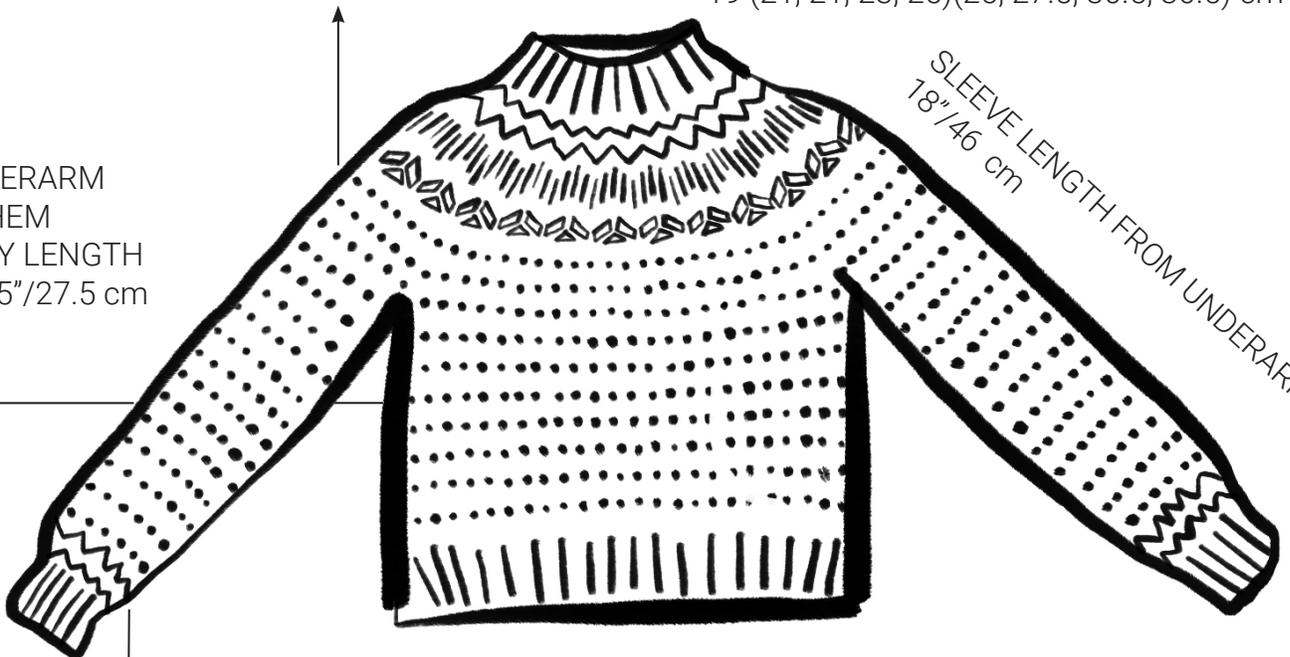
