INSPIRATION IN EVERY BALL OF YARN

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Writing an introduction turned out to be the most challenging part of our work on this book. The memories from where it all started hit hard, and we can't just casually put them into words.

If it weren't for crocheting, I honestly think we might have gone mad from the challenges we were facing. Crocheting grounded us, and it turned out to be more than a craft, it brought us a community of like-minded people who helped us and made us feel connected at a time when everything seemed lost. Many offered us aid and support, for which we are endlessly grateful.

Our lives have changed dramatically, but we remain resilient. We crochet in our spare moments, on the way to work, waiting for our children after school, before bedtime, and instead of sleeping. We love the crochet community and with this book, we want to show that we'll overcome all challenges and distances, and continue to work together to make fun, happy and quirky toys -- Olga

# BASiC MATERIaLS

Before we get started, you'll need to gather a few essential supplies. In this section, you'll learn about the basic tools needed to complete the toys in this book.

## COLORFUL YARN

For every pattern in this book we've listed the materials used to create that design, including the yarn. We've used *Scheepjes Catona* (50 g / 125 m) and *Scheepjes Stone/River Washed* (50 g / 130 m), both fingering weight yarns. *Scheepjes Catona* is a 100% mercerised cotton with a soft shine and bright colors. It works up really easily and is smooth to the touch. *Scheepjes Stone Washed* has a soft and woolly feel, and *Scheepjes River Washed* is an expressive yarn with 2 different colors spun together. Don't feel tied to the choices of yarn thickness though: any weight of cotton, acrylic or wool can be used as a substitute, provided you use the right crochet hook accordingly. Check the chart on the next page for a quick comparison of yarn weights and corresponding recommended hook sizes.

The patterns don't give the yarn quantity. The amounts are rather small and will vary according to how loosely or tightly you crochet. You could use some of the remnants from other projects or start with a new ball of yarn. When more than one 50g ball is needed, we mention this in the materials list.

## CROCHET HOOKS

Hooks as well come in different sorts and sizes. Bigger hooks make bigger stitches than smaller ones. It's important to match the right hook size with the right weight of yarn.

For amigurumi, you generally want to use a hook two or three sizes smaller than what is recommended on your yarn label. The crochet fabric should be quite tight, without any gaps through which the stuffing can escape. Using a smaller hook makes it easier to achieve this. Hooks are usually made from aluminum or steel. Metal hooks tend to slip between the stitches more easily. Preferably choose a crochet hook with a rubber ergonomic handle.

## STITCH MARKER

A stitch marker is a small metal or plastic clip. It's a simple tool to mark your starting point and give you the assurance that you've made the right number of stitches in each round. Mark the last stitch of the round with your stitch marker. You move your stitch marker up one round at the end of each round. When you reach your stitch marker after crocheting a new round, you take it out, crochet in this stitch, then put it in the last stitch of the round you crocheted.

## STUFFING

For the filling, polyester fiberfill is advised. It's washable and non-allergenic. The individual parts of a toy are stuffed while the piece is being crocheted. The stuffing of wider pieces such as the head or body begins when they are roughly half finished. For stuffing very thin pieces in which you cannot fit a finger, the back of a crochet hook or a chopstick can be used. Generally, when stuffing a toy, it's important to use more stuffing than you might initially think. If the toy isn't stuffed tightly, it will lose its shape over time. On the other hand, if it's overstuffed, the stuffing may cause the fabric to stretch and become visible. You'll need to find the right balance.

## TAPESTRY NEEDLE

For sewing, a tapestry needle with a rounded tip is used. This rounded tip makes it easier to insert your needle in a specific space without splitting your yarn.

## SEWING PINS

It can be handy to have some sewing pins lying around, to help position body parts before sewing them on permanently.

## AMIGURUMI GALLERY

With each pattern, we have included a URL and QR code that will take you to that character's dedicated online gallery. Share your finished amigurumi, find inspiration in the color and yarn choices of your fellow crocheters and enjoy the fun of crocheting. # WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW BEFORE YOU START

## PATTERN STRUCTURE

All patterns in this book are worked in continuous spirals, not in joined rounds. Crocheting in spirals can be confusing, since there's no clear indication of where a new round begins and the previous one ends. To keep track of the rounds, you can mark the end of a round with a stitch marker or safety pin. After crocheting the next round, you should end up right above your stitch marker. Move your stitch marker at the end of each round to keep track of where you are.

At the beginning of each line you will find 'Rnd + a number' to indicate which round you are in. If a round is repeated, you'll read 'Rnd 9 – 12', for example. You then repeat this round four times, crocheting the stitches in rounds 9, 10, 11 and 12.

Although we usually crochet in rounds, occasionally it happens that we switch to rows, going back and forth instead of working in continuous spirals. When we switch to rows, it will

be indicated with 'Row + a number'. You end the row with a ch 1 and turn your crochetwork to start the next. Don't count this turning chain as a stitch and skip it when working the next row (unless otherwise mentioned).

At the end of each line you will find the number of stitches you should have in square brackets, for example [9]. When in doubt, take a moment to check your stitch count.

When parts of the instructions repeat throughout the round, we place them between rounded brackets, followed by the number of times this part should be worked. We do this to shorten the pattern and make it less cluttered.

## SAFETY

Please leave out small accessories when the toy is gifted to children under the age of three.

This book uses crochet abbreviations. You'll read about the stitches and their relevant abbreviations on the following pages. If this is your first time crocheting from a pattern, the abbreviations might feel like a foreign language. However, once you get used to them, they actually make it easier to quickly decipher a pattern. This book is written using US crochet terms.

# STITCH INSTRUCTIONS

In the following pages, you'll discover straightforward, step-by-step guides to all the essential stitches and techniques that you'll use every time you pick up a hook.

## STITCH TUTORIAL VIDEOS

With each stitch explanation we have included a URL and QR code that will take you to our online stitch tutorial video, showing the technique step by step to help you master it even more quickly. Simply follow the link or scan the QR code with your smartphone. Phones with iOS will scan the QR code automatically in camera mode. For phones with Android, you may need to install a QR Reader app first.

### HOLD THE HOOK AND YARN (HAND POSITION)

Usually, we handle the hook with the same hand we use to write, but it's not a rule. If you take it with your right hand, you will crochet from right to left. If you take it with your left hand, you will crochet from left to right. There are different ways of holding a crochet hook. You will need to experiment and find the way that feels the most comfortable for you.

#### Pencil grip

Hold the hook as you would a pencil, grasping it between your thumb and index finger, in the middle of the flat thumb rest. Your middle finger is positioned on the other side to balance the hook.

#### Knife grip

Hold the hook in the same manner as you would hold a knife, grasping it between your thumb on one side and index and middle finger on the other side, resting the end of the hook against your palm.

### Hold the yarn

The free hand holds your crochet work and at the same time controls the tension of the yarn. You can weave the yarn through your fingers or just place the thread between your palm and two or three fingers. Keep in mind that you have to maintain a steady tension while crocheting, so that your stitches come out even.

### Tension

It can be challenging to master the tension of your yarn when you are new to crochet. You are not alone — tension is the one thing most beginning crocheters have a hard time with.

To maintain tension in the working yarn, you may find it helpful to unravel a long end of your yarn ball (your tension is tighter when the weight of the ball pulls your yarn tight), and wrap the yarn around the fingers of the hand opposite the one holding the hook.


### SLIP KNOT


Tying a slip knot onto the crochet hook is one of the first things you need to know to get started with crocheting. It's like casting the yarn onto the hook so you can start crocheting.

**Step 1:** Wrap the yarn into a loop, so that the shorter strand lies behind the longer one. Insert the crochet hook through the loop, catch the longer yarn and bring it through the loop.

**Step 2:** Pull on both ends of the yarn to tighten the knot around the hook.




### YARN OVER HOOK

The yarn over hook technique is used in every type of crochet stitch. Wrap the yarn over the hook from back to front. The yarn is now wrapped around the tip of the crochet hook, so that the hook can grab and pull the yarn.

### CHAIN (abbreviation: ch)

If you're working in rows, your first row will be a series of chain stitches.

**Step 1:** Use the hook to draw the yarn through the loop.

**Step 2:** Pull the loop until tight.

**Step 3:** Wrap the yarn over the hook from back to front. Pull the hook, carrying the yarn, through the loop already on your hook. You have now completed one chain stitch.

**Step 4:** Repeat these steps as indicated in the pattern to create a foundation chain.

### COUNTING CHAIN STITCHES

Each V-shaped chain counts as one stitch. Never count your first slip knot and the loop on the hook. Make sure that the chain is untwisted and the front is directed towards you for easier counting.

### INSERT THE HOOK (PLACEMENT OF STITCHES)

With the exception of chains, all crochet stitches require the hook to be inserted in existing stitches. Insert the hook underneath both top loops of the stitch in the row or round below. When inserting the hook, you take it from front to back through a stitch. The point of the hook must always look down or sideways, so the hook doesn't snag the yarn or the fabric.


When asked to crochet FLO or BLO you make the same stitch, but leave one loop untouched.

#### Inserting the hook in front loops only (abbreviation: FLO)

When working in Front Loops Only, you pick up only the front loop towards you.

#### Inserting the hook in back loops only (abbreviation: BLO)

When working in Back Loops Only, you pick up only the back loop away from you.

**SINGLE CROCHET (abbreviation: sc)**

Single crochet is the stitch that will be most frequently used in this book.


**Step 1:** Insert the hook into the next stitch.

**Step 2:** Wrap the yarn over the hook. Pull the yarn through the stitch. You will see that there are now two loops on the hook.

**Step 3:** Wrap the yarn over the hook again and draw it through both loops at once.

**Step 4:** You have now completed one single crochet.

**Step 5:** Insert the hook into the next stitch to continue.

**HALF DOUBLE CROCHET**


**(abbreviation: hdc)**

**Step 1:** Bring your yarn over the hook from back to front before placing the hook in the stitch.

**Step 2:** Wrap the yarn over the hook and draw the yarn through the stitch. You now have three loops on the hook.

**Step 3:** Wrap the yarn over the hook again and pull it through all three loops on the hook. You have completed your first half double crochet.

**Step 4:** To continue, bring your yarn over the hook and insert it in the next stitch.

**DOUBLE CROCHET (abbreviation: dc)**


**Step 1:** Bring your yarn over the hook from back to front before placing the hook in the stitch.

**Step 2:** Wrap the yarn over the hook and draw the yarn through the stitch. You now have three loops on the hook.

**Step 3:** Wrap the yarn over the hook and pull it through the first two loops on the hook. You now have two loops on the hook.


**Step 4:** Wrap the yarn over the hook one last time and draw it through both loops on the hook. You have now completed one double crochet.

**Step 5:** To continue, bring your yarn over the hook and insert it in the next stitch.

**TRIPLE CROCHET (abbreviation: tr)**

**Step 1:** Bring your yarn over the hook twice from back to front before placing the hook in the stitch.


**Step 2:** Wrap the yarn over the hook and draw the yarn through the stitch. You now have four loops on the hook.

**Step 3:** Wrap the yarn over the hook again and pull it through the first two loops on the hook. You now have three loops on the hook.

**Step 4:** Wrap the yarn over the hook again and pull it through the first two loops on the hook. You now have two loops on the hook.

**Step 5:** Wrap the yarn over the hook again and pull it through the first two loops on the hook. You have now completed one triple crochet. Start the next triple crochet in the next stitch.

**SLIP STITCH (abbreviation: slst)**

A slip stitch is used to move across one or more stitches at once or to finish a piece.


**Step 1:** Insert your hook into the next stitch.

**Step 2:** Wrap the yarn over the hook and draw through the stitch and loop on your hook at once.

**CHECKING THE STITCH TOTAL**

Counting stitches will help you check that you are following the pattern correctly. The easiest way to count stitches is to look at the plaited tops (V's at the top of your crochetwork). If you discover you missed one stitch or made one too many, you can always try to correct it by making an [extra] decrease or increase in the following round (see below and on the next page).

**INVISIBLE DECREASE (abbreviation: dec)**

When decreasing, two stitches are crocheted together. The number of stitches in a round therefore decreases and the piece shrinks.

**Step 1:** Insert the hook in the front loop of your first stitch. Now immediately insert your hook in the front loop of the second stitch. You now have three loops on your hook.

**Step 2:** Wrap the yarn over the hook and pull it through the first two loops on the hook.

**Step 3:** Wrap the yarn over the hook again and pull it through the remaining two loops on the hook. You have now completed one invisible decrease.




### INCREASE (abbreviation: inc)

To increase, two single crochet stitches are made in the same stitch. This way, new stitches are created and the piece expands.

**Step 1:** Make a first single crochet stitch in the next stitch.

**Step 2:** Make a second single crochet stitch in the same stitch.



### MAGIC RING

To start an amigurumi piece, you need a little circle. A magic ring is the ideal way to start crocheting in the round as there will be no hole left in the middle of your starting round. You start by crocheting over an adjustable loop and finally pull the loop tight when you have finished the required number of stitches.

**Step 1:** Start with the yarn crossed to form a circle.

**Step 2:** Draw up a loop with your hook, but don't pull it tight.

**Step 3:** Hold the circle with your index finger and thumb and wrap the working yarn over your middle finger.

**Step 4-5:** Make one chain stitch by wrapping the yarn over the hook and pulling it through the loop on the hook.

**Step 6:** Now insert your hook into the circle and underneath the tail. Wrap the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop.

**Step 7:** Keep your hook above the circle and wrap the yarn over the hook again.


**Step 8:** Pull it through both loops on the hook. You have now completed your first single crochet stitch.

Continue to crochet (repeating step 6, 7, 8) until you have the required number of stitches as mentioned in the pattern.

**Step 9-10:** Now grab the yarn tail and pull to draw the center of the ring tightly.


You can now begin your second round by crocheting into the first single crochet stitch of the magic ring. You can use a stitch marker to remember where you started.


### STARTING A CIRCULAR PIECE WITH 2 CH STITCHES

If you don't want to use the magic ring technique, there's an easier way to start crocheting in the round. The downside of this technique is a tiny hole that remains visible in the center of the piece.

**Step 1:** Start by making a slip knot. Then, make 2 chain stitches and work x sc into the second chain from the hook where x is the number of sc stitches you would make in your magic ring.

**Step 2:** Make a slst in the first stitch. You now have a little circle to start with.

### CROCHET AROUND A FOUNDATION CHAIN

Some pieces start with an oval. You make an oval by crocheting around a foundation chain.

**Step 1:** Crochet a foundation chain with as many chains as mentioned in the pattern and skip the first chain on the hook.


**Step 2-3:** Work a sc stitch in the next chain stitch. Work your crochet stitches into each chain across as mentioned in the pattern.

**Step 4:** The last stitch before turning is usually an increase stitch.

**Step 5:** Turn your work upside down to work into the underside of the chain stitches. You'll notice that only one loop is available, simply insert your hook in this loop. Work your stitches into each chain across.

**Step 6:** When finished, your last stitch should be next to the first stitch you made. You can now continue working in spirals.

### COLOR CHANGE – invisible color change

When you want to switch from one color to the next, you work to within two stitches before a color change.

**Step 1:** Make the next single crochet stitch as usual, but don't pull the final loop through.

**Step 2-3:** Instead, wrap the new yarn color around your hook and pull it through the remaining loops. To make a neat color change, you can make the first stitch in the new color a slip stitch instead of a single crochet. Don't pull the slip stitch too tight or it will be difficult to crochet into in the next round. Tie the loose tails in a knot and leave them on the inside.


**PiCOT STiTCH (abbreviation: ch-2-picot)**

**Step 1:** Make two chain stitches. Insert your hook in the first chain stitch you made.

**Step 2:** Wrap the yarn around your hook and draw it through both loops on the hook. You have now completed one picot stitch.





**FASTENiNG OFF**

**Step 1:** When you've finished crocheting, cut the yarn a couple of inches / cm from your last stitch. Pull the yarn through the last loop until it is all the way through. You now have a finished knot.

**Step 2:** Thread the long tail through a tapestry needle and insert it through the back loop of the next stitch. This way the finishing knot will remain invisible in your finished piece. You can use this yarn tail to continue sewing the pieces together.



**CLOSiNG OFF A PiECE**

**Step 1:** After several decreases in the last round, a small hole will remain at the end of some pieces.

**Step 2:** Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread the yarn tail left at the end of the piece onto a yarn needle, then insert the needle through each of the front loops of the stitches in the last round. Tighten and insert the needle through the nearest stitch, make a knot, and hide the yarn tail inside the piece.


**JOiNiNG PARTS - SEWiNG**

First, pin the parts you want to sew to one another, so you can evaluate the result and adjust if necessary. If possible, use the leftover yarn tail from when you fastened off, or use a new length of the same yarn color of one of the pieces that you want to join.

**Option 1** – When the different pieces are open: position the piece on the body and sew all around it, going through the stitches of both the extremity and the body.

**Option 2** – When the opening of the different pieces is sewn closed before attaching them to the body: line up the stitches and sew through both loops of the open side and between the stitches of the closed side. Use the same yarn color as the pieces you want to join together.

Always make sure the pieces are securely attached so that they can't be pulled off. Make small, neat stitches and try to make them show as little as possible.





# TALL STRAWBERRY GNOME

## MATERIALS

Fingering weight yarn (Scheepjes Catona 50 g / 125 m) in: White (106), Light brown (179), Red (115), Dark yellow (208), Dark green (515) / B 1 / 2.25 mm crochet hook / Yarn needle / Pins / Stitch markers / Fiberfill / Optional: pipe cleaner (12" / 30 cm long)

## SKILLS NEEDED

magic ring (page 12), working in front or back loops only (page 9), half double crochet (page 10), double crochet (page 10), crochet in rows (page 7), changing color (page 13)

## SIZE

8.2" / 21 cm tall when made with the indicated yarn.

## HAT (start in red yarn)

Crochet from the tip of the hat down. The strawberry is sewn on later.

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2 – 15:** sc in all 6 st [6]

**Rnd 16:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [9]

**Rnd 17:** sc in all 9 st [9]

**Rnd 18:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [12]

**Rnd 19:** sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 20:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [16]

**Rnd 21 – 22:** sc in all 16 st [16]

**Rnd 23:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [20]

**Rnd 24 – 25:** sc in all 20 st [20]

**Rnd 26:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [24]

**Rnd 27 – 28:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 36 – 37:** sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 38:** (sc in next 8 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [40]

**Rnd 39 – 40:** sc in all 40 st [40]

**Rnd 41:** (sc in next 9 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [44]

**Rnd 42 – 43:** sc in all 44 st [44]

**Rnd 44:** (sc in next 10 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [48]

**Rnd 45 – 46:** sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 47:** (sc in next 11 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [52]

**Rnd 48 – 49:** sc in all 52 st [52]

**Rnd 50:** (sc in next 12 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [56]

**Rnd 51:** BLO sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 52:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 53:** FLO sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 54:** (sc in next 13 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [60]

**Rnd 55:** (sc in next 14 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [64]

**Rnd 56:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [72]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end.

Pull up a loop of dark green yarn in the first leftover front loop of round 50 (picture 1). Work with the tip of the hat pointing towards you.

**Rnd 60:** (ch 5 (picture 2), start in second ch from the hook, slst in this ch, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch (picture 3), skip 2 st on the hat, slst in next st on the hat (picture 4)) repeat 20 times (picture 5)

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end. Fold the pipe cleaner in half and insert it into the hat (picture 6). Stuff the hat firmly with fiberfill and continue stuffing the hat and body as you go.



**BODY** (in dark green yarn)

Pull up a loop of dark green yarn in the first leftover back loop of round 52 (picture 7). Work with the tip of the hat pointing away from you.

**Rnd 13 – 14:** sc in all 64 st [64]

**Rnd 15:** {sc in next 6 st, dec} repeat 8 times [56]

**Rnd 16 – 18:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 19:** {sc in next 5 st, dec} repeat 8 times [48]

**Rnd 20 – 21:** sc in all 48 st [48]

Finish stuffing the hat and body.

**Rnd 22:** BLO sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 23:** {sc in next 4 st, dec} repeat 8 times [40]

**Rnd 24:** {sc in next 3 st, dec} repeat 8 times [32]

**Rnd 25:** {sc in next 2 st, dec} repeat 8 times [24]

**Rnd 26:** {sc in next st, dec} repeat 8 times [16]

**Rnd 27:** dec 8 times [8]

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Weave in the yarn end (picture 8). Bend the tip of the hat into a curled shape.

**BEARD** (in white yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** sc in next 2 st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next 2 st [8]

**Rnd 3:** sc in next 2 st, inc in next 4 st, sc in next 2 st [12]

**Rnd 4:** {sc in next 2 st, inc in next st} repeat 4 times [16]

**Rnd 5:** {sc in next 3 st, inc in next st} repeat 4 times [20]

**Rnd 6:** {sc in next 4 st, inc in next st} repeat 4 times [24]

**Rnd 7:** {sc in next 3 st, inc in next st} repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 8:** {sc in next 4 st, inc in next st} repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 9 – 13:** sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 14:** {sc in next 4 st, dec} repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 15 – 16:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 17:** {sc in next 13 st, dec} repeat 2 times [28]

**Rnd 18:** sc in all 28 st [28]

The beard doesn't need to be stuffed. Flatten the opening of the beard and sc in next 14 st through both layers to close the opening (picture 9). Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Sew the straight top side of the beard to the remaining front loops left on round 2 of the body (picture 10).

**Rnd 1:** start 8 sc in a magic ring [8]

**Rnd 2:** {sc in next st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next st} repeat 2 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** {sc in next 2 st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next 2 st} repeat 2 times [16]

**Rnd 4 – 5:** sc in all 16 st [16]

**Rnd 6:** dec 8 times [8]

Stuff the nose firmly with fiberfill. Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Leave a yarn tail for sewing. Sew the nose on the top center of the beard, over rounds 15-18 (picture 11).

**ARM** (make 2, start in light brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** {sc in next st, inc in next st} repeat 3 times [9]

**Rnd 3 – 4:** sc in all 9 st [9]

**Rnd 5:** dec, sc in next 7 st [8]

Change to dark green yarn.

**Rnd 6:** BLO sc in all 8 st [8]

**Rnd 7 – 13:** sc in all 8 st [8]

The arm doesn't need to be stuffed. Flatten the opening of the arm and sc in next 4 st through both layers to close the opening. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Sew the arms symmetrically on the sides of the body, using the front loops left on round 2 of the body (picture 12). Make sure that the color change line is on the inside of the arms.

**Big FLOWER** (make 3, start in dark yellow yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

Change to white yarn.

Stuff the strawberry firmly with fiberfill and continue stuffing as you go.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing (picture 25).

### STALK (in dark green yarn)

Ch 8. Crochet in rows.

### ASSEMBLY

- Sew the strawberry leaves to the strawberry. Sew the stalk to the top of a strawberry. Sew the small flower to the other strawberry. Embroider seeds on the strawberries with dark yellow yarn (each seed is 1 stitch long) (picture 27).
- Sew the strawberry with the small flower to the tip of the hat (picture 28).
- Sew 3 big flowers to the side of the hat (picture 28).

**Rnd 19:** {sc in next 5 st, dec} repeat 8 times [48]

**Rnd 20 – 21:** sc in all 48 st [48]

Finish stuffing the hat and body.





#### **LEAF** (make 4, 2 in light green yarn and 2 in green yarn)

Ch 8. Stitches are worked around both sides of the foundation chain (picture 14).

**Rnd 1:** start in second ch from the hook, sc in this ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next 2 ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, sc + ch-2-picot + sc in next ch (pictures 15-18). Continue on the other side of the foundation chain, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next 2 ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch [14 + picot] Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing (picture 19).

#### **BIG FLOWER** (start in dark yellow yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

Change to white yarn.

**Rnd 2:** work this round in BL0, (slst + ch 3 + 2 dc + ch 3 + slst in next st) repeat 5 times [20] (pictures 20-23) Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

#### **SMALL FLOWER** (start in dark yellow yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

Change to white yarn.

**Rnd 2:** work this round in FL0, (slst + ch 1 + 2 dc + ch 1 + slst in next st) repeat 5 times [20] (pictures 24-27) Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

#### **ORANGE** (make 2, in orange yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc in all 6 st [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 14:** {sc in next 6 st, dec} repeat 8 times [56]

**Rnd 15 – 17:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 18:** {sc in next 5 st, dec} repeat 8 times [48]

**Rnd 19 – 20:** sc in all 48 st [48]

Finish stuffing the hat and body.

**Rnd 21:** BLO sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 22:** {sc in next 4 st, dec} repeat 8 times [40]

**Rnd 23:** {sc in next 3 st, dec} repeat 8 times [32]

**Rnd 24:** {sc in next 2 st, dec} repeat 8 times [24]

**Rnd 25:** {sc in next st, dec} repeat 8 times [16]

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Weave in the yarn end (picture 5). Bend the tip of the hat into a curled shape.

**Rnd 6:** {sc in next 3 st, inc in next st} repeat 4 times [20]

**Rnd 7:** {sc in next 4 st, inc in next st} repeat 4 times [24]

**Rnd 8:** {sc in next 3 st, inc in next st} repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 9 – 13:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 14:** {sc in next 3 st, dec} repeat 6 times [24]

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing (picture 16).

**Rnd 55:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [72]

**Rnd 56:** (sc in next 8 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [80]

**Rnd 57:** sc in all 80 st [80]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end. Fold the pipe cleaner in half and insert it into the hat (picture 1). Stuff the hat firmly with fiberfill and continue stuffing the hat and body as you go.

## BODY (in red yarn)

Pull up a loop of red yarn in the first leftover back loop of round 52 (picture 2). Work with the tip of the hat pointing away from you.

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 16:** (sc in next 10 st, dec) repeat 2 times [22]





  - Rnd 56:** (sc in next 9 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [88]
  - Rnd 57:** (sc in next 10 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [96]
  - Rnd 58:** sc in all 96 st [96]



(picture 14). Sew one open side closed, weaving your yarn needle through the front loop on each row-end and pulling the yarn to close the opening (picture 15). Stuff the pumpkin firmly with fiberfill (picture 16). Sew the top side closed in the same way as the bottom side (picture 17).

### PUMPKIN STALK (make 2, in dark yellow yarn)

Ch 8. Crochet in rows.

**Row 1:** start in second ch from the hook, slst in next 7 ch [7]

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing (picture 18).

- Sew the stalk to the top of the pumpkin.
- Sew one pumpkin to the top of the hat.



**Rnd 1:** join with a slst in the first ch to make a circle (make sure your circle isn't twisted, pictures 9-11), (sc in next 2 ch, 3 sc in next ch) repeat 4 times [20]

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing (picture 12). Sew the buckle in the center over the black stripe of the hat.



### **SNOWBALL** (in milky white yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** BLO inc in all 6 st [12]

**Rnd 3:** BLO (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** BLO (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** BLO (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6 – 10:** BLO sc in all 30 st [30]

Stuff the snowball firmly with fiberfill and continue stuffing as you go.

**Rnd 11:** BLO (sc in next 3 st, dec) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 12:** BLO (sc in next 2 st, dec) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 13:** BLO (sc in next st, dec) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 14:** BLO dec 6 times [6]

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Leave a long tail for sewing (picture 13). Sew the snowball to the tip of the hat (picture 14).

**CANDY CANE** (in milky white yarn)**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]**Rnd 2:** inc in all 5 st [10]**Rnd 3 – 40:** sc in all 10 st [10]**Rnd 41:** dec 5 times [5]

Fold 2 pipe cleaners in half and insert them into the candy cane. Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Weave in the yarn end (picture 15). Tie a long strand of bright red yarn to the top of the candy cane and wrap it all around to the bottom end (picture 16). Fasten the bright red yarn with a knot and weave in the yarn ends. Bend the tip of the candy cane into a curled shape (picture 17).

**GIFT BOX** (make 3, 1 in green yarn, 1 in deep red yarn and 1 in yellow yarn)**Rnd 1:** start 8 sc in a magic ring [8]**Rnd 2:** inc in all 8 st [16]**Rnd 3:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [24]**Rnd 4:** sc in all 24 st [24]**Rnd 5:** BLO sc in all 24 st [24]**Rnd 6 – 7:** sc in all 24 st [24]**Rnd 8:** BLO sc in all 24 st [24]

Stuff the gift box firmly with fiberfill and continue stuffing as you go.

**Rnd 9 – 12:** sc in all 24 st [24]

Finish stuffing the gift box.

**Rnd 13:** BLO sc in all 24 st [24]**Rnd 14:** (sc in next st, dec) repeat 8 times [16]**Rnd 15:** dec 8 times [8]

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Weave in the yarn end (picture 18). Using a contrasting piece of yarn, make 4 long stitches from round 1 to round 15, at regular intervals all around. Make a bow on top with the yarn ends (pictures 19-20).



**Rnd 34:** (sc in next 11 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [52]

**Rnd 35 – 36:** sc in all 52 st [52]

**Rnd 37:** (sc in next 12 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [56]

**Rnd 38 – 39:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 40:** FLO (sc in next 13 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [60]

**Rnd 41:** (sc in next 14 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [64]

**Rnd 42:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [72]

**Rnd 43:** (sc in next 8 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [80]

Change to white yarn.

**Rnd 44:** (slst in next st, ch 1) repeat 80 times [80] (picture 1)

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end. Stuff the hat firmly  
with fiberfill and continue stuffing the hat and body as  
you go.

**BODY** (in red yarn)

Pull up a loop of red yarn in the first leftover back loop of round 39 (picture 2). Work with the tip of the hat pointing away from you.

**Rnd 1 – 2:** BLO sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 3 – 6:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 13 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [60]

**Rnd 8 – 11:** sc in all 60 st [60]

**Rnd 12:** (sc in next 14 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [64]

**Rnd 13 – 14:** sc in all 64 st [64]

**Rnd 15:** (sc in next 6 st, dec) repeat 8 times [56]

**Rnd 16 – 18:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 19:** (sc in next 5 st, dec) repeat 8 times [48]

**Rnd 20 – 21:** sc in all 48 st [48]

Finish stuffing the hat and body.

**Rnd 22:** BLO sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 23:** (sc in next 4 st, dec) repeat 8 times [40]

**Rnd 24:** (sc in next 3 st, dec) repeat 8 times [32]

**Rnd 25:** (sc in next 2 st, dec) repeat 8 times [24]

**Rnd 26:** (sc in next st, dec) repeat 8 times [16]

**Rnd 27:** dec 8 times [8]

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Weave in the yarn end (picture 3).

**BEARD** (in white yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** sc in all 6 st [6]

**Rnd 3:** sc in next 2 st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next 2 st [8]

**Rnd 4:** sc in next 2 st, inc in next 4 st, sc in next 2 st [12]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [16]


**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [20]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [24]

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 9 – 13:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 14:** (sc in next 3 st, dec) repeat 6 times [24]



**Rnd 15:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 16:** (sc in next 10 st, dec) repeat 2 times [22]

**Rnd 17:** sc in all 22 st [22]

The beard doesn't need to be stuffed. Flatten the opening of the beard and sc in next 11 st through both layers to close the opening (picture 4). Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Sew the straight top side of the beard to the remaining front loops left on round 2 of the body (picture 5).

### **NOSE** (in light brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 8 sc in a magic ring [8]

**Rnd 2:** (sc in next st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next st) repeat 2 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next 2 st) repeat 2 times [16]

**Rnd 4 – 5:** sc in all 16 st [16]

**Rnd 6:** dec 8 times [8]

Stuff the nose firmly with fiberfill. Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Leave a yarn tail for sewing. Sew the nose on the top center of the beard, over rounds 14-17 (picture 6).

### **ARM** (make 2, start in light brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [9]

**Rnd 3 – 4:** sc in all 9 st [9]

**Rnd 5:** dec, sc in next 7 st [8]

Change to red yarn.

**Rnd 6:** BLO sc in all 8 st [8]

**Rnd 7 – 18:** sc in all 8 st [8]

The arm doesn't need to be stuffed. Flatten the opening of the arm and sc in next 4 st through both layers to close the opening. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Sew the arms symmetrically on the sides of the body, using the front loops left on round 2 of the body (picture 7). Make sure that the color change line is on the inside of the arms.





### SMALL HEART (make 2, in red yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start in a magic ring: (ch 2 + 2 dc + 2 hdc + ch + 2 hdc + 2 dc + ch 2 + slst).

Pull the magic ring tightly closed (picture 8). Fasten off and weave in the yarn end.

### ENVELOPE (make 3, in white yarn)

Ch 11. Crochet in rows.

**Row 1:** start in second ch from the hook, sc in next 10 ch, ch 1, turn [10]

**Row 2 – 12:** sc in all 10 st, ch 1, turn [10]

**Row 13:** sc in all 10 st [10]

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing (picture 9).

Fold the piece in half and sew all along the edges (picture 10). Using red yarn, embroider the outline of an envelope on one side of the piece (picture 11).

Sew 1 red heart in the center of an envelope (picture 12).

### BAG (in brown yarn)

Ch 13. Crochet in rows.

**Row 1:** start in second ch from the hook, sc in next 12 ch, ch 1, turn [12]

**Row 2 – 16:** sc in all 12 st, ch 1, turn [12]

**Row 17:** sc in all 12 st [12]

Ch 30 to make the bag strap. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing (picture 13). Sew the loose end of the strap to the first stitch of row 17.

Fold the piece in half and sew along the left and right sides, but leave the top side unsewn (picture 14).

Sew 1 red heart to the front of the bag (picture 15).

### ASSEMBLY

Put 1 envelope in the bag and put the bag around the gnome's arm. Now pin the arms up, towards the center of the hat. Sew the tip of each hand to the envelope with the heart. Sew the envelope to the hat (picture 16).

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end (picture 21).

### ASSEMBLY

- Glue the arrow feathers to the toothpick, insert the toothpick through the hat and glue the white heart as an arrowhead to the opposite side of the toothpick (picture 22).
- Embroider the mouth with a piece of black yarn, 1-2 rounds below the nose. The mouth is 2 stitches wide.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing (picture 19).

**Rnd 4:** dec 6 times [6]

Stuff the nose firmly with fiberfill. Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Leave a long tail for sewing. Sew the nose in the center of the body, right below the brim of the hat (picture 23).

### BUNNY EAR (make 2, in white yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc in all 6 st [12]

**Rnd 3 – 7:** sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 8:** {sc in next 2 st, dec} repeat 3 times [9]

**Rnd 9 – 10:** sc in all 9 st [9]

**Rnd 11:** {sc in next st, dec} repeat 3 times [6]

**Rnd 12:** sc in all 6 st [6]

The ear doesn't need to be stuffed. Flatten the opening of the ear and sc in next 3 st through both layers to close the opening. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Sew the ears just above the brim of the hat, with 3-4 stitches between them. Use the nose as a guide to position the ears symmetrically (picture 23). You can sew them to the hat with a few extra stitches.

### SMALL FLOWER (make 5, 3 with pink petals and 2 with blue petals, start in dark yellow yarn)

You find the instructions on page 91-92.

### ASSEMBLY

- Embroider the mouth with a piece of black yarn, 1-2 rounds below the nose. The mouth is 2 stitches wide (picture 24).
- Sew 5 small flowers on the brim of the hat, in front of the bunny ears (picture 24).

**Rnd 29:** sc in all 12 st [12]  
**Rnd 30:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [16]  
**Rnd 31 – 32:** sc in all 16 st [16]  
**Rnd 33:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [20]

- Rnd 34 – 35:** sc in all 20 st [20]  
**Rnd 36:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [24]  
**Rnd 37 – 38:** sc in all 24 st [24]  
**Rnd 39:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [28]  
**Rnd 40:** FLO (skip 1 st (picture 1, the pin indicates the front loop where we'll work the next stitches), sc + dc + ch-2-picot + dc + sc in next st (pictures 2-3), skip 1 st, slst in next st (picture 4)) repeat 7 times [42]  
 Fasten off and weave in the yarn end. Fold 1 pipe cleaner in half and insert it into the hat (picture 5). Stuff the hat firmly with fiberfill and continue stuffing the hat and body as you go.

**Rnd 7 – 8:** sc in all 36 st [36]  
**Rnd 9:** (sc in next 8 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [40]  
**Rnd 10 – 11:** sc in all 40 st [40]  
**Rnd 12:** (sc in next 9 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [44]  
**Rnd 13 – 14:** sc in all 44 st [44]  
**Rnd 15:** (sc in next 10 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [48]  
**Rnd 16 – 17:** sc in all 48 st [48]  
**Rnd 18:** (sc in next 11 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [52]  
**Rnd 19 – 20:** sc in all 52 st [52]

 Fasten off and weave in the yarn end.

Pull up a loop of green yarn in the first leftover back loop of round 21 of the hat (picture 12). Work with the tip of the hat pointing away from you.

**Rnd 2:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 3:** FLO sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 13 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [60]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 14 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [64]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [72]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 72 st [72]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end (picture 13).

### BODY (in blue yarn)

Pull up a loop of blue yarn in the first leftover back loop of round 2 of the green hat brim (picture 14). Work with the tip of the hat pointing away from you.

**Rnd 1 – 2:** BLO sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 3 – 6:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 13 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [60]

**Rnd 8 – 11:** sc in all 60 st [60]

**Rnd 12:** (sc in next 14 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [64]

**Rnd 13 – 14:** sc in all 64 st [64]

**Rnd 15:** (sc in next 6 st, dec) repeat 8 times [56]

**Rnd 16 – 18:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 19:** (sc in next 5 st, dec) repeat 8 times [48]

**Rnd 20 – 21:** sc in all 48 st [48]

Finish stuffing the hat and body.

**Rnd 22:** BLO sc in all 48 st [48]



**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [20]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [24]

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 9 – 13:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 14:** (sc in next 3 st, dec) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 15:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 16:** (sc in next 10 st, dec) repeat 2 times [22]

**Rnd 17:** sc in all 22 st [22]

The beard doesn't need to be stuffed. Flatten the opening of the beard and sc in next 11 st through both layers to close the opening (picture 16). Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Sew the straight top side of the beard to the remaining front loops left on round 2 of the body (picture 17).

### NOSE (in light brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 8 sc in a magic ring [8]

**Rnd 2:** (sc in next st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next st) repeat 2 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next 2 st) repeat 2 times [16]

**Rnd 4 – 5:** sc in all 16 st [16]

**Rnd 6:** dec 8 times [8]

Stuff the nose firmly with fiberfill. Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Leave a yarn tail for sewing. Sew the nose on the top center of the beard, over rounds 14-17 (picture 18).

### ARM (make 2, start in light brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [9]

**Rnd 3 – 4:** sc in all 9 st [9]

**Rnd 5:** dec, sc in next 7 st [8]

Change to blue yarn.

**Rnd 6:** BLO sc in all 8 st [8]

**Rnd 7 – 13:** sc in all 8 st [8]

The arm doesn't need to be stuffed. Flatten the opening of the arm and sc in next 4 st through both layers to close the opening. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Sew the arms symmetrically on the sides of the body, using the front loops left on round 2 of the body (picture 19). Make sure that the color change line is on the inside of the arms.

### BELLFLOWER (make 2, start in green yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc in all 6 st [12]

Change to blue yarn.

**Rnd 3:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5 – 10:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 11:** (sc in next 4 st, dec) repeat 4 times [20]

**Rnd 12:** (skip 1 st, sc + dc + ch-2-picot + dc + sc in next st, skip 1 st, slst in next st) repeat 5 times [25 st + 5 picots]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end (picture 20). The bellflower doesn't need to be stuffed. Sew one bellflower to the tip of the hat (picture 21).

### STEM (in green yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2 – 35:** sc in all 6 st [6]

The stem doesn't need to be stuffed. Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Fold 2 pipe cleaners in half and insert them into the stem.

Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Weave in the yarn end. Bend the tip of the stem into a curled shape. Sew 1 bellflower between rounds 5-6 of the stem (picture 22).

### HEAD AND BODY (make 2, in black yarn)

### DOUBLE WINGS ON LEFT SIDE (in white yarn)

Pull up a loop of white yarn in the first loop below the head, on the left-hand side.

FLO slst in this loop, (ch 4 + tr + ch 4 + slst in same front loop) repeat 2 times [5]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end. Embroider 3 dark yellow stripes on the bee's body.

Sew a bee to each bellflower (picture 28).

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end (picture 39). Embroider 3 dark yellow stripes on the bee's body (picture 40).

#### ASSEMBLY

- Embroider the mouth with a piece of black yarn, 1-2 rounds below the nose. The mouth is 2 stitches wide.
- Sew the bee to the side of the hat.

**Rnd 58 – 59:** sc in all 52 st [52]

**Rnd 60:** (sc in next 12 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [56]

**Rnd 61:** FLO sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 62:** (sc in next 13 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [60]

**Rnd 63:** (skip 2 st (picture 2, the pin indicates the stitch where we'll work the next stitches), 7 tr in next st (pictures 2-3), skip 2 st, slst in next st) repeat 10 times [80]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end. Stuff the hat firmly with fiberfill and continue stuffing the hat and body as you go.

## HAT – GREEN BRIM (start in green yarn)

Pull up a loop of green yarn in the first leftover back loop of round 60 (picture 4). Work with the tip of the hat pointing away from you.

**Rnd 1:** BLO sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 2:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 3:** FLO sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 13 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [60]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 14 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [64]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [72]



**Rnd 7:** sc in all 72 st [72]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end.

### **BODY** (in pink yarn)

Pull up a loop of pink yarn in the first leftover back loop of round 2 of the green hat brim (picture 5). Work with the tip of the hat pointing away from you.

**Rnd 1 – 2:** BLO sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 3 – 6:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 7:** [sc in next 13 st, inc in next st] repeat 4 times [60]

**Rnd 8 – 11:** sc in all 60 st [60]

**Rnd 12:** [sc in next 14 st, inc in next st] repeat 4 times [64]

**Rnd 13 – 14:** sc in all 64 st [64]

**Rnd 15:** [sc in next 6 st, dec] repeat 8 times [56]

**Rnd 16 – 18:** sc in all 56 st [56]

**Rnd 19:** [sc in next 5 st, dec] repeat 8 times [48]

**Rnd 20 – 21:** sc in all 48 st [48]

Finish stuffing the hat and body.



**Rnd 22:** BLO sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 23:** {sc in next 4 st, dec} repeat 8 times [40]

**Rnd 24:** {sc in next 3 st, dec} repeat 8 times [32]

**Rnd 25:** {sc in next 2 st, dec} repeat 8 times [24]

**Rnd 26:** {sc in next st, dec} repeat 8 times [16]

**Rnd 27:** dec 8 times [8]

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Weave in the yarn end. Bend the tip of the hat into a curled shape.

### NOSE (in light brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 8 sc in a magic ring [8]

**Rnd 2:** {sc in next st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next st} repeat 2 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** {sc in next 2 st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next 2 st} repeat 2 times [16]

**Rnd 4 – 5:** sc in all 16 st [16]

**Rnd 6:** dec 8 times [8]



Stuff the nose firmly with fiberfill. Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Leave a yarn tail for sewing. Sew the nose in the center of the body, right below the brim of the hat (picture 6).

### HAIR BRAIDS (make 2, in white yarn)

Ch 4 (picture 7). Crochet in rows.

**Row 1:** start in second ch from the hook, {sc in next ch on the base chain, ch 20 (picture 8), start in second ch from the hook, sc in next 19 ch (picture 9)} repeat 3 times [3 locks] (picture 10)

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Make a braid with the 3 locks. Wrap a piece of pink yarn a couple of times around the end of the braid and make a knot at the back of the braid. Weave in the pink yarn ends (picture 11). Sew the hair braids on either side of the head, at 2-3 stitches from the nose, using the front loops left on round 2 of the body (picture 12).

**ARM** (make 2, start in light brown yarn)**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]**Rnd 2:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [9]**Rnd 3 – 4:** sc in all 9 st [9]**Rnd 5:** dec, sc in next 7 st [8]

Change to pink yarn.

**Rnd 6:** BLO sc in all 8 st [8]**Rnd 7 – 13:** sc in all 8 st [8]

The arm doesn't need to be stuffed. Flatten the opening of the arm and sc in next 4 st through both layers to close the opening. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Sew the arms symmetrically on the sides of the body, using the front loops left on round 2 of the body (picture 13). Make sure that the color change line is on the inside of the arms.

**LEAF** (make 2, in green yarn)

Ch 12 (picture 14). Stitches are worked around both sides of the foundation chain.

**Rnd 1:** start in second ch from the hook, hdc in next 10 ch, 2 hdc (pictures 15-16) + ch-2-picot (pictures 17-18) + 2 hdc in next ch (picture 19). Continue on the other side of the foundation chain, hdc in next 10 ch [24 + picot]

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing (picture 20).

**TULIP** (make 2, start in green yarn)**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]**Rnd 2:** inc in all 6 st [12]

Change to pink yarn.

**Rnd 3:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]**Rnd 5 – 12:** sc in all 24 st [24]**Rnd 13:** (skip 1 st, 6 dc in next st, skip 1 st, slst in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end. The tulip doesn't need to be stuffed. Sew 1 tulip to the tip of the hat. Sew 1 leaf to the side of the green part of the hat (picture 21).

**STEM** (in green yarn)**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]**Rnd 2 – 35:** sc in all 6 st [6]

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Fold 2 pipe cleaners in half and insert them into the stem. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Weave in the yarn end. Bend the tip of the stem into a curled shape. Sew 1 tulip to the tip of the stem. Sew 1 leaf to the side of the stem (picture 22).

**BUTTERFLY****HEAD AND BODY** (make 2, in black yarn)

Ch 8. Crochet in rows.

**Row 1:** start in second ch from the hook, slst in next 6 ch, 4 sc in next ch [10]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end. Tie 2 short yarn ends to the head to make the antennae, with 1 stitch between them. Make a knot at the end of each antenna and trim the yarn ends. Add wings on either the right or left side.

**WINGS ON RIGHT SIDE** (in light yellow yarn)

Pull up a loop of light yellow yarn in the third loop below the head, on the right-hand side.

Slst in this loop, (ch 3 (picture 23) + 2 dc + ch 3 (picture 24) + slst in same loop (picture 25)) repeat 2 times (pictures 26-28) [7]


Fasten off and weave in the yarn end. Embroider 2 white dots on the wings (over 1 stitch each).

**WINGS ON LEFT SIDE** (in light yellow yarn)

Pull up a loop of light yellow yarn in the third loop below the head, on the left-hand side.

Slst in this loop, (ch 3 + 2 dc + ch 3 + slst in same loop) repeat 2 times [7]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end. Embroider 2 white dots on the wings (over 1 stitch each). Sew a butterfly to each tulip.



# SMALL TULIP GNOME

## MATERIALS

Fingering weight yarn (Scheepjes Catona 50 g / 125 m) in:  
White (106), Light brown (179), Pink (518), Green (412),  
Light yellow (522), Black (110) / B 1 / 2.25 mm crochet hook  
/ Yarn needle / Pins / Stitch markers / Fiberfill

## SKILLS NEEDED

magic ring (page 12), working in front or back loops  
only (page 9), half double crochet (page 10), double crochet  
(page 10), triple crochet (page 11), crochet in rows (page 7),  
changing color (page 13)

## SIZE

4.7" / 12 cm tall when made  
with the indicated yarn.

## HAT (in pink yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc in all 6 st [12]

**Rnd 3:** {sc in next st, inc in next st} repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** {sc in next 2 st, inc in next st} repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** {sc in next 3 st, inc in next st} repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** {sc in next 4 st, inc in next st} repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 8:** {sc in next 5 st, inc in next st} repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 9 – 19:** sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 20:** FLO {sc in next 6 st, inc in next st} repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 21:** {skip 2 st, 7 tr in next st, skip 2 st, slst in next st}  
repeat 8 times [64]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end (picture 29). Stuff  
the hat firmly with fiberfill and continue stuffing the hat  
and body as you go.

## BODY (in white yarn)

Pull up a loop of white yarn in the first leftover back loop of  
round 19 (picture 30). Work with the tip of the hat pointing  
away from you.

**Rnd 1:** BLO sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 2 – 3:** sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 4:** {sc in next 20 st, inc in next st} repeat 2 times [44]

**Rnd 5:** sc in all 44 st [44]

**Rnd 6:** {sc in next 10 st, inc in next st} repeat 4 times [48]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 8:** {sc in next 7 st, inc in next st} repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 9 – 11:** sc in all 54 st [54]

**Rnd 12:** {sc in next 7 st, dec} repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 13:** {sc in next 6 st, dec} repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 14:** sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 15:** {sc in next 5 st, dec} repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 16:** {sc in next 4 st, dec} repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 17:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 18:** {sc in next 3 st, dec} repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 19:** {sc in next 2 st, dec} repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 20:** {sc in next st, dec} repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 21:** dec 6 times [6]

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Weave in the yarn end (picture 31).

#### **NOSE** (in light brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 8 sc in a magic ring [8]

**Rnd 2:** (sc in next st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next st) repeat 2 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 4:** dec 6 times [6]

Stuff the nose firmly with fiberfill. Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail. Using your yarn needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull it tight to close. Leave a long tail for sewing. Sew the nose in the center of the body, right below the brim of the hat.

#### **LEAF** (in green yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

**Rnd 2:** inc in all 5 st [10]

**Rnd 3:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [15]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next st, ch 5 (picture 32), start in second ch from the hook, slst in this ch, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch (picture 33), skip 1 st on Rnd 3, sc in next st on Rnd 3 (picture 34)) repeat 5 times [30]  
Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing (picture 35).

### STALK (in green yarn)

Ch 20. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Fold the stalk in half and sew both ends to the middle of the leaf (picture 36). Sew the leaf on top of the hat (picture 37).

### BUTTERFLY

#### HEAD AND BODY (in black yarn)

You find the instructions on page 110.

#### WINGS ON BOTH SIDES (in light yellow yarn)

Pull up a loop of light yellow yarn in the third loop below the head, on the right-hand side.

**Right wings:** slst in this back loop, (ch 3 + 2 dc + ch 3 + slst in same back loop) repeat 2 times [7]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end.

Pull up a loop of light yellow yarn in the third loop below the head, on the left-hand side.

**Left wings:** slst in this front loop, (ch 3 + 2 dc + ch 3 + slst in same front loop) repeat 2 times [7]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end (picture 38). Embroider 4 white dots on the wings (over 1 stitch each) (picture 39).

### ASSEMBLY

- Embroider the mouth with a piece of black yarn, 1-2 rounds below the nose. The mouth is 2 stitches wide (picture 40).
- Sew the butterfly to the side of the hat (picture 40).





## VARIATIONS

### KEYCHAIN

The small gnome can be used as a keychain.

Make 35 ch with the yarn color of your choice and fasten off. Fold the chain in half and sew the ends to the tip of the gnome's hat.

### ADDING LEGS

The legs pattern below can be used for all tall gnomes in this book.

**LEG** (make 2, in the example we start with red yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc in all 6 st [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4 – 7:** sc in all 18 st [18]

Stuff the foot firmly with fiberfill and continue stuffing as you go.

**Rnd 8:** sc in next 5 st, dec 4 times, sc in next 5 st [14]

**Rnd 9:** sc in next 3 st, dec 4 times, sc in next 3 st [10]

**Rnd 10:** sc in all 10 st [10]

Finish stuffing the foot with fiberfill. The legs don't need to be stuffed.

**Rnd 11:** FLO (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [15]

Fasten off and weave in the yarn end (picture 1). Pull up a loop of white yarn in the first leftover back loop of round 10 (picture 2).

**Rnd 12:** BLO sc in all 10 st [10]

**Rnd 13 – 26:** sc in all 10 st [10]

Sc in next 3 st to end up at the side of the leg, add extra sc if needed. Flatten the opening of the leg and sc in next 5 st through both layers to close the opening (picture 3). Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Sew the legs to the remaining front loops at the bottom of the body.
