

 PATTERN**

Amillë is a rectangular shawl knit primarily in the round. Although it is a large project, the unique construction means there are no endless stretches of monotonous repeats. It features alternate rest rows, most of which are knit, not purled, no knit on border, and no tricky stitches. These knitter friendly features combine to make it an interesting, rewarding knit. Optional beads, which are placed as you knit, add a touch of sparkle. Please take the time to check your gauge, as this is a generously sized shawl as written, and the unusual construction method makes it difficult to resize.


## Materials

- ✓ **Yarn:** Knit Picks Alpaca Cloud Lace Yarn, 440 yards (50 g), 4 skeins
- ✓ **Needles:** U.S. Size 1.5 (2.5mm), set of 5 double point needles plus 1 long (at least 48") circular needle, or size needed to obtain gauge
- ✓ **Other Materials:** stitch markers, tapestry needle, waste yarn, blocking pins and / or wires, 1200 seed beads (size 6/0 or 8/0), Super Floss, or 28 gauge wire (for adding beads), if desired

## Measurements

- ✓ **Gauge:** 28 stitches and 36 rows = 4" (10cm) in stockinette stitch, after blocking. Correct gauge is critical for accurate yardage and finished size
- ✓ **Finished Size:** 22" (56 cm) wide x 76" (193 cm) long, after blocking
- ⓘ **Bead Info:** Smaller number/0 = larger beads. Larger number/0 = smaller beads. 1200 beads = 100g of 6/0 beads or 45g of 8/0 beads

# Construction Notes

This shawl begins at the center back, with a circular cast on. The first chart is worked in the round, then 2 of the sides are expanded, creating the central strip. Stitches are picked up around the edge of this strip, and the rest of the shawl is knit in the round. The border is knit as you go, and ends with a chain bind off, no need for a crochet hook. Please refer to the schematic for a visual overview of construction.

Beading is entirely optional. If you choose not to use beads, simply knit all of the stitches with the B symbol. Beads are placed on individual stitches prior to knitting them. There are a variety of ways to place beads while knitting, experiment to see which is most comfortable for you. Size 6/0 beads will add a bold shine while 8/0 beads will add a subtle sparkle. The sample shawl was knit with 6/0 beads.

# Instructions

## Set Up

Using the circular cast on of your choice (Emily Ocker’s, iCord, etc.), cast on 8 stitches. Knit one row, arranging stitches evenly on 4 double point needles, two per needle. Place row marker and work one row of yo, k1, yo, k1. Knit 1 row plain. If you prefer to work with the magic loop method, place stitch markers every 4 stitches.

## Chart A — Overview

Begin knitting Chart A, reading all rows from right to left. Work the chart on each needle, for a total of 4 repeats. All even numbered rows in this chart are knit. Be careful of the yarn over at the beginning of each row, as it has a tendency to slide off the needle. On row 14 (a plain knit row), knit across needle #1, then knit 1 stitch from needle #2. Repeat across each needle, ending with 20 stitches on each needle. If you are using the magic loop method, simply move each stitch marker one stitch to the left. On row 16, repeat this entire procedure, ending with 22 stitches on each needle.

After row 29 you will have 40 stitches on each needle. Do not work the plain knit row. Break your working yarn. Set aside your empty needle, and work with the 4 remaining needles. With the needle in your right hand as #1, and the needle in your left hand as needle #2, slip (without knitting) 20 stitches from needle #2 to needle #1. Then slip 23 stitches from needle #3 to needle #2. Slip 20 stitches from needle #4 to needle #3. Finally, slip 23 stitches from needle #1 to needle #4. You will have 2 needles with 37 stitches, and 2 needles with 43 stitches. The stitch count should alternate - 1 needle with 37 stitches, then 1 with 43, then 37, then 43. Each needle should have a pair of leaves centered on it. Leaving one of the stretches of 43 stitches on the needle, transfer all the other stitches to 3 separate pieces of waste yarn, one for each needle. Join working yarn on the needle with 43 stitches, with the wrong side facing you, and purl across. You are now ready for Chart B.

## Chart B — Overview

On this chart, you are working back and forth, therefore all even numbered rows are slip 1, purl across. The slipped stitch matches the first stitch on the knit side rows, which is also slipped. These 2 slipped stitches will make it easier to pick up stitches along the edges for Chart E. Make sure these slipped are quite loose to facilitate blocking. Knit Chart B once, then move on to Chart C.

## Chart C — Overview

This chart is very similar to Chart B, (Row 1 is different) and is worked a total of 12 times. To easily count pattern repeats, begin at the very center of your knitting, (Chart A), and count the beaded pairs of leaf stems. You should have 15 pairs of stems (2 from Chart A, 1 from Chart B, and 12 from Chart C).

## Chart D — Overview

Chart D is worked once. To work the 6 to 1 decrease in row 15, begin by knitting 2 double decreases, (sl2k1pss0, sl2k1pss0), then cast off 1 by slipping the first stitch over the 2nd. End after knitting row 15, do not work the purl row. Break yarn, slip stitches to a piece of waste yarn, and place the 43 stitches from the opposite side of Chart A on a needle. Rejoin working yarn with wrong side facing you, slip 1, purl across. Work Charts B, C, and D on the second side. Make sure you have the same number of leaves on both sides, and remember to not work the final purl row (row 16) of Chart D.

## Set Up for Working in the Round

From this point on, you will be knitting in the round, on 1 long circular needle. To do this, you need to pick up stitches around the edge of your strip. Transfer 32 live stitches (from Chart D) onto the right hand side of your circular needle, place stitch marker, transfer final stitch. This marker is your row marker, which is always before the corner stitch, which is shown in pink on the charts. Make sure this marker is different from the other markers you will be using, so that you don't lose track of where the rows begin.

Pick up and knit 111 stitches along the central strip by placing your needle through both loops of your slipped stitch, from front to back, and knitting them. This should bring you up to the stitches from Chart A, which have been patiently waiting for you. Place these 37 stitches on your left hand needle, place a stitch marker, knit these 37 stitches, and place another stitch marker. Pick up and knit 111 stitches along the second side of your strip, place stitch marker. You now have one half completely on the needles, with 292 stitches (32 short side + 1 corner stitch + 111 picked up + 37 from Chart A, + 111 picked up). You should have 4 stitch markers in place - 2 on either side of the central 37 stitches, and 1 on each end, to mark the corner stitches.

Place the 33 stitches from Chart D on your left hand needle, knit 32, place stitch marker, k1. Pick up and knit 111 stitches along the long side, place stitch marker. Place the 37 stitches from Chart A on your left hand needle, knit these 37 stitches, place stitch marker. Pick up and knit 111 stitches, place stitch marker. Knit 32 stitches. Now, you are finally ready to knit in the round, with 584 total stitches on your needles (260 + 32 x 2). You should have a total of

8 stitch markers - 1 before each corner stitch, and 1 on either side of the 37 center stitches from Chart A.

## Chart E — Overview

To work rows, you will need to keep track of 3 charts simultaneously. Chart E1 is the basic diamond pattern, and is worked on the long sides of your shawl, on either side of the central 37 stitches. Chart E2 is worked over the 37 stitches in the center of the long side, and gradually decreases down to nothing. Chart E3 is worked on the short sides of your shawl. To work a complete row, begin with Chart E1. The pattern repeat is outlined in black. When you come to your first stitch marker move on to Chart E2. Work row 1 of Chart E2 over these 37 stitches, slide stitch marker, and continue with row 1 of Chart E1, omitting the corner stitch (shown in pink on the chart). When you come to the next stitch marker (corner stitch), work row 1 of Chart E3 over the short side of your shawl. Repeat this entire sequence for the 2nd half of your shawl. Stitch count totals for each section are in the tables on [page 8](#).

When working row 18 (the final plain knit row), move your center stitch markers inwards by 10 stitches on each side. In other words, when you come to your first stitch marker (for Chart E2, not your corner stitch markers), remove it, knit 10 stitches, and replace the stitch marker. Knit 15 stitches, place a new marker, knit 10, remove the old stitch marker. You should have 15 stitches between these two stitch markers. Make sure to do this on both long sides.

## Chart F — Overview

Chart F is a two part Chart, similar to Chart E. Chart F1 is worked on the short sides as well as the long sides. Chart F2 is worked between your central stitch markers, which have moved inwards by 10 stitches on each side. On Row 16 remove central stitch markers as you come to them. Leave corner stitch marker in place. Stitch count totals for each section are in the tables on [page 8](#).

## Chart G — Overview

Work Chart G once, repeating across all 4 sides of your shawl. When Chart G is complete make sure to count your stitches. Stitch count totals for each section are in the tables on [page 8](#).

## Chart H — Overview

Chart H is a transitional chart, which begins to grow the leaves that will make up the border pattern. All 4 sides of your shawl are the same, just with more repeats on the long sides. Stitch count totals for each section are in the tables on [page 8](#).

## Chart I — Overview

Chart I is the leafy border chart, and is knit across all 4 sides of your shawl, with more repeats on the long sides. The pattern repeat is outlined in black. If using stitch markers to mark each pattern repeat they will migrate by one stitch on rows 15, 19, 23, and 27. For the first 12 rows of this chart you will be increasing at a very rapid rate. From this point onwards, you are actually decreasing the number of stitches per row, to compensate for the rapid increase in the first 12 rows. After working row 27, knit 1 row plain, stopping 1 stitch before the corner stitch. Row 29 represents the bind off, please see following section for bind off directions. Stitch count totals for each section are in the tables on [page 8](#).

## Bind Off

For the bind off you will be creating chains to connect groups of stitches. This makes a very stretchy bind off, which blocks into beautiful little loops. This bind off is worked with a double strand of yarn, to help stabilize the edge.

Join a second strand of yarn, and begin row 29. After the first decrease insert your left hand needle into the front of the stitch on your right hand needle, knit this stitch. You have chained 1 stitch. Repeat this 8 more times, for a total of 9. If you prefer you can work this chain with a crochet hook. The curved line tells you how many stitches to chain. After you have a 9 stitch chain, work the next decrease on the chart, in this case, a k4tog. You now have 2 stitches on your right hand needle. Cast off one stitch, by passing the rightmost stitch over the 2nd stitch, and off the needle. Work another 9 stitch chain into this stitch, and then work the next decrease.

Continue in this manner around the entire shawl. The decreases are aligned with the pattern so that each leaf tip is closed, and everything lines up symmetrically. The shorter chains between the pairs of leaves are not stretched during the blocking process, to help accentuate the curving lines of the leaves.

After completing the bind off, weave in any ends, soak, and block. When blocking you may find it helpful to use blocking wires on either side of the central strip. When blocking the loops, do not stretch out the shorter loops. You may block the rest of the loops straight, using wires, or into gentle curves, pinning each loop individually. When dry, wear your work of art with pride. After all, you just knit over 108,000 stitches!

**Row 1,** \*yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, PB, yo, k1\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, **(32 TS)**

**Row 2,** and all even rows, knit

**Row 3,** \*yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, k2, yo, PB, yo, k2\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times,**(40 TS)**

**Row 5,** \*yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, k3, yo, PB, yo, k3\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times,**(48 TS)**

**Row 7,** \*yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, k4, yo, PB, yo, k4\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times,**(56 TS)**

**Row 9,** \*yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, ssk, k2, yo, k1, yo, PB, yo, k1, yo, k2, k2tog\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, **(64 TS)**

**Row 11,** \*yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, ssk, k2, yo, k2, yo, PB, yo, k2, yo, k2, k2tog\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, **(72 TS)**

**Row 13,** \*yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, ssk, k2, yo, k3, yo, PB, yo, k3, yo, k2, k2tog, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, **(80 TS)**

**Row 14,** \*knit across needle #1, knit 1 from needle #2\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, ending with 20 stitches on each needle.

**Row 15,** \*yo, k1, yo, PB, yo, ssk, k2, yo, ssk, k5, k2tog, yo, k2, k2tog, yo, PB\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, **(88 TS)**

**Row 16,** \*knit across needle #1, knit 1 from needle #2\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, ending with 22 stitches on each needle.

**Row 17,** \*yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, PB, yo, k1, ssk, k2, yo, ssk, k3, k2tog, yo, k2, k2tog, k1, yo, PB, yo, k1\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, **(104 TS)**

**Row 19,** \*yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, k2, yo, PB, yo, k2, ssk, k2, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k2, k2tog, k2, yo, PB, yo, k2\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, **(112 TS)**

**Row 21,** \*yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, k3, yo, PB, yo, k3, ssk, k2, yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, k2, k2tog, k3, yo, PB, yo, k3\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, **(120 TS)**

**Row 23,** \*yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, k4, yo, PB, yo, k4, ssk, k5, k2tog, k4, yo, PB, yo, k4\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times, **(128 TS)**

**Row 11,** \*k1, yo, k2tog, k7, yo, PB, yo, k8, yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, [k8, yo, PB, yo, k7, ssk, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k2tog, k7, yo, PB, yo, k8, yo, sl2k1pssso, yo], repeat stitches within brackets until 18 before stitch marker, k8, yo, PB, yo, k7, ssk, yo\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times

**Row 13,** \*k2, yo, ssk, k15, k2tog, yo, k3, [yo, ssk, k15, sl2k1pssso, yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, sl2k1pssso, k15, k2tog, yo, k3], repeat stitches within brackets until 20 before stitch marker, yo, ssk, k15, k2tog, yo, k1\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times

**Row 15,** \*k1, (yo, ssk) x2, k13, (k2tog, yo) x2, k1, yo, [ssk, yo, ssk, k13, k2tog, yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, ssk, k13, (k2tog, yo) x2, k1, yo], repeat stitches within brackets until 21 before stitch marker, ssk, yo, ssk, k13, (k2tog, yo) x2\* repeat from \* to \* 3 times

**Row 17,** \*k2, (yo, ssk) x2, k11, (k2tog, yo) x2, k3, [yo, ssk, yo, ssk, k11, k2tog, yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, ssk, k11, (k2tog, yo) x2, k3], repeat stitches within brackets until 20 before stitch marker, (yo, ssk), x2, k11, (k2tog, yo) x2, k1\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times

**Row 19,** \*k1, (yo, ssk) x3, k9, (k2tog, yo) x3, k1, yo, [ssk, (yo, ssk) x2, k9, k2tog, yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, ssk, k9, (k2tog, yo) x3, k1, yo], repeat stitches within brackets until 21 before stitch marker, (ssk, yo) x2, k9, (k2tog, yo) x3\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times

**Row 21,** \*k2, (yo, ssk) x3, k7, (k2tog, yo) x3, k3, [yo, (ssk, yo) x2, ssk, k7, k2tog, yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, ssk, k7, (k2tog, yo) x3, k3], repeat stitches within brackets until 20 before stitch marker, (yo, ssk) x3, k7, (k2tog, yo) x3, k1\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times

**Row 23,** \*k1, (yo, ssk) x4, k5, (k2tog, yo) x4, k1, yo, [ssk, (yo, ssk) x3, k5, k2tog, yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, ssk, k5, (k2tog, yo) x4, k1, yo], repeat stitches within brackets until 21 before stitch marker, (ssk, yo) x3, ssk, k5, (k2tog, yo) x4\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times

**Row 25,** \*k2, (yo, ssk) x4, k3, (k2tog, yo) x4, k3, [yo, (ssk, yo) x3, ssk, k3, k2tog, yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, ssk, k3, (k2tog, yo) x4, k3], repeat stitches within brackets until 20 before stitch marker, (yo, ssk) x4, k3, (k2tog, yo) x4, k1\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times

**Row 27,** \*k1, (yo, ssk) x5, k1, (k2tog, yo) x5, k1, yo, [ssk, (yo, ssk) x4, k1, k2tog, yo, sl2k1pssso, yo, ssk, k1, (k2tog, yo) x5, k1, yo], repeat stitches within brackets until 21 before stitch marker, (ssk, yo) x4, ssk, k1, (k2tog, yo) x5\*, repeat from \* to \* 3 times

**Row 28,** knit, ending 1 stitch before final corner stitch. Proceed to bind off instructions on [page 7](#).
