In this pattern I encourage you to use this as a foundation and customize design features to fit your desired look and function. There are many ways to use this pattern and a variety of design features - including an optional double knit button band, sweet crochet scallop edgings, invisible folded over hemline, long balloon or short sleeves, and ribbed or simple seed bind off edgings.

The Amoretta blouse is worked top down, flat for each shoulder - which are then connected together at the back and continued working flat until the point of the neckline is complete. Then you have the option to keep working flat in order to add a button band later on - or you can join in the round to create a seamless pullover style blouse.

This pattern can be your go-to when you want a simple elegant “base” which you can dress up or dress down depending on the details you choose to add or omit in the design. Truly your perfect all-season blouse.

Sizes

- 1 (2, 3, 4, 5){6, 7, 8, 9} - Finished garment bust circumferences: 28 (32, 36, 40, 44){48, 52, 56, 60}” / 71 (81, 91.5, 101.5, 111.5){122, 132, 142, 152}cm
- Choose your size to match your desired garment bust circumference. This pattern is suggested to be worn with 0”-2” / 0-5cm of negative ease. Meaning the circumference of the garment is 0”-2” / 0-5cm smaller than your bust circumference.
- Consult schematic on page 2 for garment measurements.
- Light blue sample shown in size 2 - model has 34” bust.

Yarn

- Fingering weight yarn.
- The light blue/green sample with crochet scallop edge is made from Biches & Bûches - Le Petit Lambswool: 100% Lambswool, 270yds / 247m per 50g / 1.75oz skein. Colorway: Soft Green Grey.
 - approx. 2 (2, 3, 3, 4){4, 5, 5, 5}50g / 1.75oz skeins total required for the short sleeve version.
 - approx. 4 (4, 5, 5, 6){6, 7, 7, 7}50g / 1.75oz skeins total required for the long sleeve version.
- Please note: The Biches & Bûches Le Petit Lambswool yarn is very airy and light - meaning you get higher yardage out of the grams called for. If you are using a denser yarn instead, you will likely need more yarn.

Needles

- 3.75mm / US 5 circular needles for main fabric
- 3.0mm / US 2.5 circular needles for rib or double knit edges.
- Optional: 6/0 3.5mm crochet hook (for scallop edge)

Gauge

- 22 stitches and 30 rows/rounds in 4”/10cm in stockinette stitch.
- Adjust needle size to obtain the correct gauge.

Notions

- 2 lengths of scrap yarn (for holding sleeve stitches)
- removable stitch markers
- tapestry needle
- row counter (recommended)
- For double knit button band: 6 (6, 7, 8, 8){8, 8, 9, 9} 14mm / 9/16” buttons. If you will work the ribbed edgings, you will need 2 (2, 1, 1, 1){2, 2, 2, 2} extra button(s). If you would like your garment longer than the pattern rec, you will need more buttons. ***See note on bottom left of page 4*.**

(left leaning one stitch increase)

Insert the tip of your left hand needle under the bar in between the stitches from front to back, with the tip of your right hand needle purl into the back loop of that bar.

m1p = Make One Purl

(right leaning one stitch increase)

Insert the tip of your left hand needle under the bar in between the stitches from back to front, with the tip of your right hand needle purl into that bar.

m1r = Make One Right

(right leaning one stitch increase)

Insert the tip of your left hand needle under the bar in between the stitches from back to front, with the tip of your right hand needle knit into that bar.

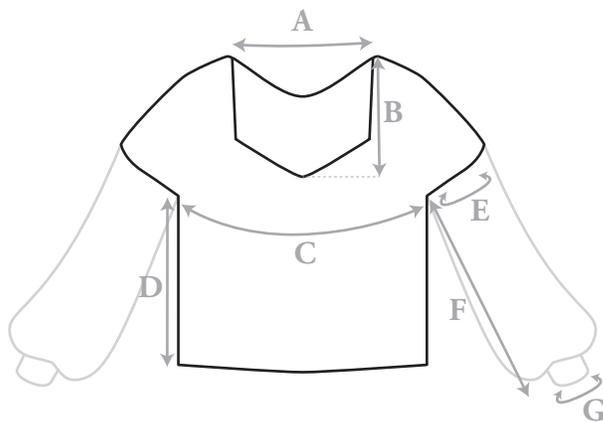
m1l = Make One Left

(left leaning one stitch increase)

Insert the tip of your left hand needle under the bar in between the stitches from front to back, with the tip of your right hand needle knit into the back loop of that bar.

CDD = Center Double Decrease

Slip two sts together as if to k2tog, k1, with LH needle pass the two slipped sts over and off the RH needle.

Schematic (Finished Garment Measurements)**A** - Neckline Width - 8.25 (8.75, 9, 9, 9.5){9.5, 9.75, 9.75, 10}" / 20.9 (22.2, 22.8, 22.8, 24.1){24.1, 24.7, 24.7, 25.4}cm

(the rib neckline finishing option will subtract 1" / 2.5cm from this ^)

B - Neckline Depth - 7.5 (8, 8.2, 8.2, 8.8){9, 9.3, 9.8, 9.8}" / 19 (20.3, 20.8, 20.8, 23.4){22.8, 23.6, 24.9, 24.9}cm

(the rib neckline finishing option will subtract .5" / 1.2cm from this ^)

Also, if you would like your neckline to be not as deep as what is described for your size above, working the rib neckline edging will add more structure and bring up the neckline depth)

C - Bust Circumference - 28 (32, 36, 40, 44){48, 52, 56, 60}" / 71.1 (81.3, 91.4, 101.6, 111.7){121.9, 132.1, 142.2, 152.4}cm**D** - Underarm to Hem Length - 9.5" / 24.1cm (or 11" / 27.9cm with ribbing option)**E** - Upper Sleeve Circumference - 10.25 (11, 11.75, 12.5, 14){15.5, 17.25, 19, 20}" / 26 (27.9, 29.8, 31.75, 35.5){39.37, 43.8, 48.3, 50.8}cm

For Long Sleeve Option:

F - Underarm to Cuff Length - 15 (15.5, 15.5, 16, 16){16.5, 16.5, 17, 17}" / 38 (39.4, 39.4, 40.6, 40.6){41.9, 41.9, 43.2, 43.2}cm

(the rib cuff finishing option will add 1.5" / 3.8cm to this ^)

G - Wrist Circumference - 4 (4.5, 5, 5.25, 5.75){6, 6.25, 6.75, 7}" / 10.2 (11.4, 12.7, 13.3, 14.6){15.2, 15.9, 17.1, 17.8}cmWith any questions contact hundredacrewool@gmail.com

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*Instructions**Right Shoulder: (wearers right)*

*Note: Each Shoulder is worked flat independently, then joined together via the back sts. **Tutorial:**

With 3.75mm / US 5 needles, CO 5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}sts using long tail CO method, tw.

(WS) Row 1: Pfb, p3 (3, 3, 5, 5){5, 7, 7, 7}, pfb, tw.
+2sts

(RS) Row 2: K1, m1r, pm, m1l, m1r, pm, k5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}, pm, m1l, k1, tw. +4sts

Row 3: P to m, m1ptbl, slm, p5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}, slm, m1p, p to m, m1ptbl, slm, p2. +3sts

Row 4: K2, slm, m1l, k to m, m1r, slm, k5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}, slm, m1l, k to end, tw. +3sts

Work rows 3 - 4 5 (5, 6, 6, 6){7, 8, 8, 9} more times. Then work row 3 once more. Break yarn leaving a tail and slide this right shoulder fabric down your needle so the live sts are in the middle of the cord. You should now have 15 (15, 17, 17, 17){19, 21, 21, 23}sts for the front, 5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}sts for the shoulder, and 30 (30, 34, 34, 34){38, 42, 42, 46}sts for the back.

Left Shoulder: (wearers left)

With the RS of the right shoulder on your needles facing you, CO 5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}sts on your RH needle, tw.

(WS) Row 1: Pfb, p3 (3, 3, 5, 5){5, 7, 7, 7}, pfb, tw.
+2sts

(RS) Row 2: K1, m1r, pm, k5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}, pm, m1l, m1r, pm, m1l, k1, tw. +4sts

Row 3: P2, slm, m1p, p to m, m1ptbl, slm, p5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}, slm, m1p, p to end, tw. +3sts

Row 4: K to m, m1r, slm, k5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}, slm, m1l, k to m, m1r, slm, k2, tw. +3sts

Work rows 3 - 4 5 (5, 6, 6, 6){7, 8, 8, 9} more times. Then work row 3 once more. You should now have the same stitch count and distribution as the right shoulder.

Top Back:

*Note: Now you will connect each shoulder to form the back with newly CO sts.

(RS) Row 1: K to m, m1r, slm, k5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}, slm, m1l, k to m, rm, k2, CO 12 (16, 12, 12, 16){10, 6, 8, 4}sts using BWL CO method, slide the right shoulder up to the LH needle, taking care to not twist newly CO sts, k to m, rm, k to m, m1r, slm, k5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}, slm, m1l, k to end, tw.

(WS) Row 2: *P to m, m1ptbl, slm, p5 (5, 5, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}, slm, m1p*, rep *-* again, p to end, tw. 120 (124, 132, 136, 140){146, 158, 160, 164} stitches total on your needles.

Sleeve Increases:

(RS) Row 1: K to m, slm, m1l, k to m, m1r, slm, k to m, slm, m1l, k to m, m1r, slm, k to end, tw. +4sts

(WS) Row 2: P all sts slipping markers as you come to them.

Work rows 1 - 2 10 (10, 10, 10, 11){11, 11, 11, 11} more times. You should now have 17 (17, 19, 19, 19){21, 23, 23, 25}sts for left front, 27 (27, 27, 29, 31){31, 33, 33, 33}sts for left sleeve, 76 (80, 84, 84, 88){90, 94, 96, 100}sts for back, 27 (27, 27, 29, 31){31, 33, 33, 33}sts for right sleeve, and 17 (17, 19, 19, 19){21, 23, 23, 25}sts for right front.

V-Neckline & Sleeve Increases:

(RS) Row 1: K2, pm, m1l, *K to m, slm, m1l, k to m, m1r, slm*, rep *-* again, k to last 2sts, m1r, pm, k2, tw.
+6sts

(WS) Row 2: P2, slm, m1p, p to m bef the last 2sts slipping markers as you go, m1ptbl, slm, p2, tw. +2sts
Work rows 1 - 2 9 (11, 11, 11, 8){6, 5, 4, 2} more times. You should now have 37 (41, 43, 43, 37){35, 35, 33, 31}sts for each the left & right front, 47 (51, 51, 53, 49){45, 45, 43, 39}sts for each sleeve, and 76 (80, 84, 84, 88){90, 94, 96, 100}sts for the back.

For Sizes 5-9 Only:

V-Neckline, Bust, & Sleeve Increases:

(RS) Row 1: K2, slm, m1l, *k to m, m1r, slm, k1, m1l, k to one st bef m, m1r, k1, slm, m1l*, rep *-* again, k to last m, m1r, slm, k2, tw. +10sts

(WS) Row 2: P2, slm, m1p, p to m bef the last 2sts slipping markers as you go, m1ptbl, slm, p2, tw. +2sts
Work rows 1 - 2 - (-, -, -, 3){5, 6, 9, 10} more times. You should now have - (-, -, -, 49){53, 56, 63, 64}sts for each the left & right front, - (-, -, -, 57){57, 59, 63, 61}sts for each sleeve, and - (-, -, -, 96){102, 108, 116, 122}sts for the back.

For All Sizes:

Remove the two st markers on each side of the v-neck. If you would like a button band down the center front of your garment, continue working flat. Or for no opening at the blouse front, join in the round after row/rnd 1 on the next page by not turning your work & continue working on the RS of the garment joining in the round at the center front and place BOR m. If you join in the round, work the two sts around BOR tighly so there is no gap.

For Sizes 2 - 9 Only:

Extra Sleeve & Bust Increases:

Row/Rnd 1: *K to m, m1r, slm, k1, m1l, k to one st bef m, m1r, k1, slm, m1l*, rep *-* again, k to end.

+8sts

Row/Rnd 2: Work all sts in stockinette st slipping markers as you come to them.

Work rows 1 - 2 - (1, 3, 4, 5){10, 12, 11, 15} more times. You should now have - (43, 47, 48, 55){64, 69, 75, 80}sts for each the left & right front, - (55, 59, 63, 69){79, 85, 87, 93}sts for each sleeve, and - (84, 92, 94, 108){122, 134, 140, 154}sts for the back.

For Sizes 1 & 8 & 9 Only:

Extra Sleeve Increases:

Row/Rnd 1: *K to m, slm, k1, m1l, k to one st bef m, m1r, k1, slm*, rep *-* again, k to end. +4sts

Row/Rnd 2: Work all sts in stockinette st slipping markers as you come to them.

Work rows 1 - 2 1 (-, -, -, -){-, -, 4, 3} more times. You should now have 37 (-, -, -, -){-, -, 75, 80}sts for each the left & right front, 51 (-, -, -, -){-, -, 97, 101}sts for each sleeve, and 76 (-, -, -, -){-, -, 140, 154}sts for the back.

For Sizes 4 - 5 Only:

Extra Bust Increases:

Row/Rnd 1: *K to m, m1r, slm, k to m, slm, m1l*, rep *-* again, k to end. +4sts

Row/Rnd 2: Work all sts in stockinette st slipping markers as you come to them.

Work rows 1 - 2 - (-, -, 4, 2){-, -, -, -} more times. You should now have - (-, -, 53, 58){-, -, -, -}sts for each the left & right front, - (-, -, 63, 69){-, -, -, -}sts for each sleeve, and - (-, -, 104, 114){-, -, -, -}sts for the back.

For All Sizes:

Split The Sleeves:

Row/Rnd 1: *K to m, rm, slip all sts until the next marker onto scrap yarn or st holder, rm, CO 5 (5, 6, 6, 7){7, 8, 8, 9}sts onto RH needle using BWL CO method*, rep *-* again, k to end. +10 (10, 12, 12, 14){14, 16, 16, 18}sts

Work 71 rows/rounds in stockinette st. The body should measure approx. 9.5" / 24.7cm long from underarm.

***Note*:** Body Length: If you are knitting flat and you would like to knit the body of your garment longer, then make sure to do so in 12 row increments to ensure even button placement.

This will also require more buttons in the amount of 12 row increments you add. Ex: If you knit 24 more rows, you need 2 extra buttons.

Working Flat: If you choose any edging shown on the next page other than the crochet edging, then complete your selected hemline (page 5) and neckline edging (page 6) before proceeding to the "Double Knit Button Band" section. Or if will be doing the Crochet Scallop Hem, proceed to the "Double Knit Button Band" section below, then "Crochet Scallop Hem" on page 5, then "Crochet Scallop Neckline" on page 6.

Working In The Round: Proceed to the "Body Finishing" section on the next page to complete your chosen hemline.

Double Knit Button Band:

Left Button Band:

With 3.0mm / US 2.5 circular needles pick up one st in every edge st starting from the top of the left edge of the blouse center opening - right where you stopped increasing for the neckline or at the top left edge of your neckline edging if already in place. If you did not add extra length you should have 76 (76, 80, 92, 92){94, 98, 106, 112}sts on your needles, or 97 (97, 101, 113, 113){115, 119, 127, 133}sts if you completed the ribbed neckline and hem edgings.

Make note of the number of sts you picked up so you can mirror it on the right side. Break yarn. Slide all sts to the other end of the needle and with WS of work facing you, CO 9 sts onto RH needle. Turn work.

(RS) Row 1: *K1, sl1wyif* 4 times, k2togtbl, tw.

(WS) Row 2: *Sl1wyif, k1*4 times, sl1wyif, tw.

Repeat rows 1 - 2 until all the edge sts you had picked up have been worked.

Bind off all 10sts: k2tog, *k2tog, BO* to end.

Right Button Band:

With 3.0mm / US 2.5 circular needles pick up the same number of sts you did for the left button band starting from the bottom right edge of the blouse center opening. Break yarn. Place a removable st marker on your needle cord after the 6th (6th, 5th, 5th, 5th){5th, 5th, 5th, 6th} from the top, then place a removable st marker on your cord after every 12sts to mark where you will be making button holes. 10 (10, 3, 3, 3){5, 9, 5, 10}sts below the last st m, or 7 (7, 12, 12, 12){2, 6, 2, 7}sts below the last st m if you completed rib edgings.

Slide all sts to the other end of your needle and with WS facing you join yarn and CO 9sts.

(RS) Row 1: *K1, sl1wyif* 4 times, k2togtbl, tw.
(WS) Row 2: *Sl1wyif, k1*4 times, sl1wyif, tw.
 Repeat rows 1 -2 until you reach the next st marker on your cord and have just finished a WS row.
 Remove st marker.

Buttonhole:

(RS) Row 3: *K1, slwyif* twice, k1, tw.
(WS) Row 4: *Sl1wyif, k1* twice, sl1wyif, tw.
 Repeat rows 3 - 4 once more.
 Break yarn. With RS facing you, slip 5sts onto RH needle. Join yarn.
(RS) Row 5: Sl1wyif, k1, sl1wyif, k2togtbl, tw.
(WS) Row 6: *Sl1wyif, k1* twice, tw.
 Repeat rows 5 - 6 once more. Break yarn.
 Keep WS facing you and slip 5 sts from LH needle to RH needle, tw.

Keep repeating everything in the box above.
 Once you have completed the last buttonhole, repeat rows 1 - 2 shown above until all the rows of the double knit button are complete. Bind off all 10sts of the button band the same as you did on the left side.

Body Finishing: (for body and sleeves only)

Choices: Proceed to the section of preferred edge.

“Rib Hem”



“Folded Over Hem”



“Crochet Scallop Hem”



“Simple Seed Hem”



Rib Hem:

Switch to 3.0mm / US 2.5 circular needles.

Working Flat:

(RS) Row 1: *K1tbl, p1*to end, tw.

(WS) Row 2: *K1, p1tbl*to end, tw.

Repeat rows 1 - 2 until you have worked 16 rows total. Then bind off with sewn italian bind off.

Working In The Round:

Rnd 1: *K1tbl, p1*to end.

Repeat rnd 1 until you have worked 16 rnds total.

Then bind off with sewn italian bind off.

Crochet Scallop Hem:

Bind off all sts on your needles. With 6/0 3.5mm crochet hook, work scallop edge (US terms):

Insert crochet hook into next edge st, single crochet, skip 2 edge sts, work 5 double crochet stitches in the next edge stitch, skip 2 edge sts rep *-* until the entire bind off edge has been worked. Break yarn.

Folded Over Hem: (for body only)

Looking at the RS of your garment, work one full row/round purling all sts.

Work in stockinette st until the fabric measures 1.5” / 3.8cm from the purl row/rnd. Flip this extra length of fabric inward towards the WS of the garment and complete a knitted bind off so that the fabric lays flat and the purl row/rnd is the very bottom edge of the garment as follows:

Pick up the back loop of the stitch 3” below in the same st column as the next st on your LH needle & place the loop on your LH needle, k2tog, rep *-* once, BO one st, [rep *-* once, BO once st] rep [-] to end.

When binding off, do so somewhat loosely to ensure fabric lays flat.

Tip: Before you begin binding off all your live sts to the inside of the body, it may help you to first thread a scrap yarn through each stitch in the row of knit sts 3” / 7.6cm down from your live sts. This is so you can see where you are seaming more clearly. After completing the bind off pull out the thread.

Note: When you are picking up your edge sts for the button band, make sure to pick up the edge sts of this folded over fabric together with the RS body edge sts.

Simple Seed Hem:

Working Flat:

(RS) Row 1: Purl all sts.

(WS) Row 2: Purl all sts.

Bind off all sts using the “k1, pass one over” method.

Working In The Round:

Rnd 1: Purl all sts.

Rnd 2: Knit all sts.

Bind off all sts using the “k1, pass one over” method.

Sleeves:

Choices: Proceed to the section of your preferred sleeve style on the next page.

Short Sleeves: (complete this section for each sleeve)

Slip all 51 (55, 59, 63, 69){79, 85, 97, 101}sts on hold onto 3.75mm / US 5 circular needles.
Join yarn and pick up 5 (5, 7, 7, 7){7, 9, 9, 9}sts from the edge of the underarm sts you cast on for the body & place BOR m. You should now have 56 (60, 66, 70, 76){86, 94, 106, 110}sts on your needles.

Rnd 1: K all sts.

Now proceed back to “Body Finishing” to follow your desired edging style.

Long Sleeves: (complete this section for each sleeve)

Slip all 51 (55, 59, 63, 69){79, 85, 97, 101}sts on hold onto 3.75mm / US 5 circular needles.
Join yarn and from the edge of the underarm sts you cast on in the body pick up 3 (3, 4, 4, 4){4, 5, 5, 5}sts, place BOR m, pick up 2 (2, 3, 3, 3){3, 4, 4, 4}sts. You should now have 56 (60, 66, 70, 76){86, 94, 106, 110}sts on your needles.

K all sts every round until your sleeve measures 6 (6.5, 6.5, 7, 7){7.5, 7.5, 8, 8}” / 15 (16, 16, 18, 18){19, 19, 20, 20}cm long from underarm.

Increase Rnd: K2, m1l, k to last 2 sts, m1r, k2.

Work one Increase Rnd followed by .75” / 2cm of stockinette st a total of 10 times. You should now have 76 (80, 86, 90, 96){106, 114, 126, 130}sts on your needles.

Now knit all rows even until your sleeve measures 13.5 (14, 14, 14.5, 14.5){15, 15, 15.5, 15.5}” / 34.3 (35.5, 35.5, 36.8, 36.8){38, 38, 39.4, 39.4}cm long from underarm or as long as you would like it before working your choice of edging.

Decrease Rnd 1: *K2tog* rep to end.

38 (40, 43, 45, 48){53, 57, 63, 65}sts now on your needles.

For Sizes 1 - 6 Only:

Decrease Rnd 2: k3 (2, 2, 0, 0){1, -, -, -}, *K2tog, k0 (1, 1, 1, 1){1, -, -, -}* rep *-* to last 3 (2, 2, 0, 0){1, -, -, -}st(s), k to end.

22 (28, 30, 30, 32){36, -, -, -}sts now on your needles.

For Sizes 7 - 9 Only:

Decrease Rnd 2: k- (-, -, -, -){-, 4, 1, 2}, *K2tog, k1, k2tog* rep *-* to last - (-, -, -, -){-, 3, 2, 3}sts, k2tog, k to end.

-(-, -, -, -){-, 36, 38, 40}sts now on your needles.

For All Sizes:

Now proceed back to “Body Finishing” to follow your desired edging style.

Neckline:

Choices: Proceed to the section of your preferred edge.
“Rib Neckline”



“Crochet Scallop Neckline”



No Neckline Finishing - leave it as it is

*Rib Neckline:*Working In The Round:

Starting from the center back edge of the neckline and while looking at the RS of the fabric, with 3.0mm / US 2.5 circular needles join yarn and pick up approx 2 in every 3 edge sts picking up an even number of sts up to the left side v-neck beginning, pm, pick up one st, pm, pick up one st in every edge st an odd number of sts along the left edge of the v-neck up to the center, pm, pick up one st at center front, pm, pick up one st in every edge st an odd number of sts the same as the left edge, pm, pick up one st, pm, pick up 2 in every 3 edge sts back to the center back making sure to pick up one more st than you did in the first section of the round (an odd number of sts), place BOR m.

Rnd 1: *K1tbl, p1* to end slipping markers as you go.

continued on the next page . . .

Rnd 2: [*K1tbl, p1* to two sts bef m, k1tbl, remove next two st markers, replace one st m on RH needle, CDD, pm], rep [-] twice, rep *-* to end.

Rnd 3: [*K1tbl, p1* to one st bef st m, k1tbl, slm, k1tbl, slm], rep [-] twice, rep *-* to end.

Rnd 4: [*K1tbl, p1* to one st bef m, remove next two st markers, replace one st m on RH needle, CDD, pm, [{p1, k1tbl} to two sts bef m, remove next two st markers, replace one st m on RH needle, CDD, pm], rep [-] again, rep {} to end.

Rnd 5: Rep rnd 1.

Bind off all sts with italian sewn bind off method.

Working Flat:

Starting from the center front edge of the neckline and while looking at the RS of the fabric, with 3.0mm / US 2.5 circular needles join yarn and pick up one st in every edge st an even number of sts along the right edge of the v-neck up to end of your v-neck body increases, pm, pick up one st, pm, pick up 2 in every 3 edge sts up the right side of the neckline across the back and back down to the beginning of the v-neck on the left side until you have an odd number of sts after the m, pm, pick up one st, pm, pick up one st in every edge st up to the center front an even number of sts the same as the right edge, tw.

(WS) Row 1: *P1tbl, k1* to end slipping markers as you go, tw.

(RS) Row 2: Ssk, *k1tbl, p1* to two sts bef m, [k1tbl, remove next two st markers, replace one st m on RH needle, CDD, pm], rep *-* to two sts bef m, rep [-] once, rep *-* to 3 sts bef end, k1tbl, k2tog, tw.

Row 3: P1tbl, [*p1tbl, k1* to one st bef st m, p1tbl, slm, p1tbl, slm], rep [-] once, rep *-* to last 2sts, p1tbl, p1tbl, tw.

Rnd 4: Ssk, [*p1, k1tbl* to two sts bef m, p1, remove next two st markers, replace one st m on RH needle, CDD, pm], rep [-] again, rep *-* to 3sts bef end, p1, k2tog, tw.

Rnd 5: Rep row 1, tw.

Bind off all sts with italian sewn bind off method.

Crochet Scallop Neckline:

Starting at the center front of the v-neckline with 6/0 3.5mm crochet hook, work scallop edge as follows. Make sure to work the scallops into the second edge st inwards from the edge along the entire neckline - this is to give the crochet edge more stability and a clean finish.

Method (US terms):

Insert crochet hook into next edge st, single crochet, skip 2 edge sts, work 5 double crochet stitches in the next edge stitch, skip 2 edge sts rep *-* until the entire neckline edge has been worked. Break yarn.

Finishing:

Weave in all ends and if you created a button band, sew each button in the center of the left button band directly across from each button hole. Gently soak the garment in luke-warm water with some wool wash for 10-15 mintues, wring water out, lay flat to dry. Enjoy!
