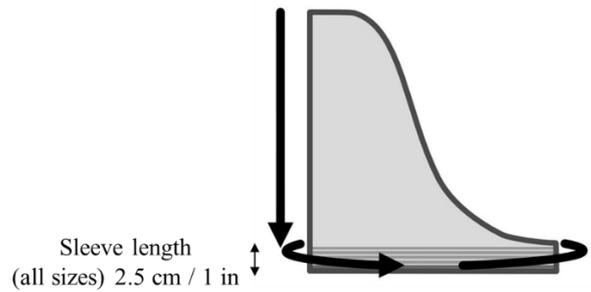




Long sleeve

Sizes: (1, 2, 3) (4, 5, 6) (7, 8, 9) (10, 11)

Finished bust circumference (after blocking): (89.5, 94, 99.5) (105, 109, 114.5) (120, 129.5, 139.5) (150.5, 160) cm / (35.25, 37, 39.25) (41.25, 43, 45) (47.25, 51, 55) (59.25, 63) in

Intended positive ease: 3 – 5cm (1.25 – 2in).

Sample Size: 3

Bust circumference of model: 96cm / 37.75in

Skill Level

3/5: Techniques include increases, decreases, bind off, intarsia colorwork, chart-reading skills or ability to follow written instructions, lace knitting, simple cables, short rows, seaming.

Materials

MC: Pascuali Filati Naturali PUNO (50g/1.75oz, 200m/219yds, 70% Cotton, 30% Alpaca). Sample photographed in the “022” colourway.

Short Sleeve version:

(5, 5, 5) **(6, 6, 6)** (7, 7, 8) **(9, 9)** balls fingering weight yarn.
(901, 952, 1000) **(1064, 1126, 1181)** (1261, 1387, 1497) **(1646, 1791)** m / (985, 1041, 1094) **(1164, 1231, 1292)** (1379, 1517, 1637) **(1800, 1959)** yds.

Long Sleeve version:

(7, 7, 7) **(8, 8, 8)** (9, 10, 10) **(11, 12)** balls fingering weight yarn.
(1245, 1313, 1382) **(1450, 1535, 1600)** (1708, 1854, 1977) **(2154, 2317)** m / (1362, 1436, 1511) **(1586, 1679, 1750)** (1868, 2028, 2162) **(2356, 2534)** yds.

CC: Blacker Yarns LYONESSE (50g/1.75oz, 175m/191yds, 50% Falklands wool, 50% Linen). Sample photographed in the “Tourmaline” colourway.

(1, 1, 1) **(1, 1, 1)** (1, 1, 1) **(1, 1)** ball fingering weight yarn.
(91, 92, 93) **(94, 96, 97)** (98, 101, 105) **(107, 111)** m / (100, 101, 102) **(103, 105, 106)** (107, 110, 115) **(117, 121)** yds.

3.25mm (US 3) straight needles or 32in/80cm (or 40in/100cm) circular needle for main fabric, per knitter preference, or size required to get gauge.

3.25mm (US 3) 10in/25cm circular needle for sleeve main fabric, or same size as gauge needle.

2.5mm (US 1.5) straight needles or 32in/80cm (or 40in/100cm) circular needle, per knitter preference, or two sizes smaller than gauge needle.

2.5mm (US 1.5) 10in/25cm circular needle for neckband and sleeve hems, or two sizes smaller than gauge needle.

Additional tools: 2.5mm size crochet hook for picking up sts, 2 st markers, blunt tapestry needle, 4 scrap pieces of yarn or st holders, measuring tape.

Gauge

29 sts and 38 rows in St st over 10cm / 4in with larger needles (worked flat), after blocking.

Notes

Always twist yarns when changing between CC and MC yarns (see *Tutorials* section on the Intarsia technique).

When working with more than one balls of yarn in a single row, 1st and 2nd balls of yarn will be the balls of yarn as seen from the side facing the knitter (see *Abbreviations & Glossary* section for CC1, CC2, CC3, MC1 and MC2).

Selvedge sts: In every piece, work 1 selvedge st at each side by slipping the 1st st of every row purlwise unless otherwise specified.

Stitch Guide

Garter Hem (worked back and forth)

Row 1: (RS) Slip 1 purlwise, knit to end of row.

Row 2: (WS) Slip 1 purlwise, knit to end of row.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 six (6) times in total.

Garter Cuff (worked in the round)

Round 1: Purl to end of round.

Round 2: Knit to end of round

Repeat Rounds 1 and 2 five (5) times in total.

St st pattern (worked back and forth)

Row 1: (RS) Slip 1 purlwise, knit to end of row.

Row 2: (WS) Slip 1 purlwise, purl to end of row.

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 for pattern.

Instructions

Back

HEM TO ARMHOLE SHAPING

With smaller needles, using CC yarn, cast on (142, 148, 156) **(164, 172, 180)** (188, 204, 218) **(234, 248)** sts using the Long Tail method. Change to MC yarn and work the Garter Hem (see *Stitch Guide* section).

Change to larger needles and proceed to work in St st pattern, until piece measures (8, 8.5, 8.5) **(9, 7, 7)** (7.5, 6.5, 7) **(8, 8.5)** cm / (3.25, 3.25, 3.25) **(3.5, 2.75, 2.75)** (3, 2.5, 2.75) **(3.25, 3.25)** in from cast on edge, ending with a WS row.

Next row (RS): **Decrease Row:** Slip 1, K2, K2tog, knit to last 5 sts, SSK, K3. (2 sts decreased)

Continuing in St st pattern, repeat Decrease Row every (22, 22, 22) **(22, 20, 20)** (20, 18, 18) **(18, 18)** rows (4, 4, 4) **(4, 5, 5)** (5, 6, 6) **(6, 6)** more times.

(132, 138, 146) **(154, 160, 168)** (176, 190, 204) **(220, 234)** sts remaining on needle.

Continue in St st pattern, until piece measures (38, 38.5, 38.5) **(39, 39.5, 39.5)** (40, 40.5, 41) **(42, 43)** cm / (15, 15.25, 15.25) **(15.25, 15.5, 15.5)** (15.75, 16, 16.25) **(16.5, 17)** in from cast on edge, ending with a WS row.

ARMHOLE SHAPING

Continue working in St st pattern.

Next row (RS): BO (6, 7, 8) **(8, 9, 10)** (10, 12, 13) **(14, 16)** sts at beg of next 2 rows.

BO 3 sts at beg of next 4 rows.

BO (2, 2, 2) **(2, 2, 2)** (2, 2, 3) **(3, 3)** sts at beg of next 2 rows.

BO (1, 1, 1) **(1, 1, 1)** (1, 1, 2) **(2, 2)** sts at beg of next 2 rows.

BO (0, 1, 1) **(1, 1, 1)** (1, 1, 2) **(2, 2)** sts at beg of next 2 rows.

BO (0, 0, 1) **(1, 1, 1)** (1, 1, 1) **(2, 2)** sts at beg of next 2 rows.

BO (0, 0, 0) **(1, 1, 1)** (1, 1, 1) **(1, 2)** sts at beg of next 4 rows.

BO 1 st at beg of next 2 rows (0, 0, 0) **(0, 1, 2)** (4, 4, 6) **(9, 9)** time(s) in total.

(102, 104, 108) **(112, 114, 118)** (122, 132, 134) **(140, 146)** sts remaining on needle.

Work even in St st pattern, until Armhole measures (16.5, 16.5, 17) (**17.5, 17.5, 18**) (18.5, 19.5, 21) (**22, 23**) cm / (6.5, 6.5, 6.75) (**7, 7, 7**) (7.25, 7.75, 8.25) (**8.75, 9**) in, ending with a WS row.

NECK SHAPING

Continue working in St st pattern.

Rows 1 and 2: (RS) Slip 1, work (30, 30, 31) (**32, 33, 34**) (36, 39, 40) (**42, 45**) sts for right shoulder, join a second ball of yarn and BO centre (40, 42, 44) (**46, 46, 48**) (48, 52, 52) (**54, 54**) sts for back neck, work to end - (31, 31, 32) (**33, 34, 35**) (37, 40, 41) (**43, 46**) sts at each side. Work both sides at once with separate balls of yarn. Turn to WS, slip 1, work (30, 30, 31) (**32, 33, 34**) (36, 39, 40) (**42, 45**) sts for left shoulder. Continue with second ball of yarn and BO 2 sts at right neck edge, work to end of right shoulder.

Rows 3 and 4: (RS) Slip 1, work (28, 28, 29) (**30, 31, 32**) (34, 37, 38) (**40, 43**) sts for right shoulder. With second ball of yarn BO 2 sts at left neck edge, work to end of left shoulder. Turn to WS, slip 1, work (28, 28, 29) (**30, 31, 32**) (34, 37, 38) (**40, 43**) sts for left shoulder. Continue with second ball of yarn and BO 1 st at right neck edge, work to end of right shoulder.

Rows 5 and 6: (RS) Slip 1, work (27, 27, 28) (**29, 30, 31**) (33, 36, 37) (**39, 42**) sts for right shoulder. With second ball of yarn BO 1 st at left neck edge, work to end of left shoulder. Turn to WS, slip 1, work (27, 27, 28) (**29, 30, 31**) (33, 36, 37) (**39, 42**) sts for left shoulder. Continue with second ball of yarn and work to end of right shoulder.

(28, 28, 29) (**30, 31, 32**) (34, 37, 38) (**40, 43**) sts remaining on needle, at each side.

Proceed with Shoulder Shaping.

SHOULDER SHAPING

Continue working in St st pattern. Work the two shoulders separately as follows:

Right Shoulder:

Row 1: (RS) Knit to end of row.

Row 2: (WS) Purl (21, 21, 21) (**22, 23, 24**) (27, 29, 30) (**32, 34**) sts, turn and mds (see *Tutorials* section on German short rows).

Row 3: (RS) Knit to end of row.

Row 4: (WS) Purl (14, 14, 14) (**14, 15, 16**) (20, 21, 22) (**24, 25**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 5: (RS) Knit to end of row.

Row 6: (WS) Purl (7, 7, 7) (**7, 7, 8**) (13, 14, 14) (**16, 16**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 7: (RS) Knit to end of row.

For sizes 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 only:

Row 8: (WS) Purl (-, -, -) (-, -, -) (6, 7, 7) (**8, 8**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 9: (RS) Knit (-, -, -) (-, -, -) (6, 7, 7) (**8, 8**) sts.

All sizes:

Next row (WS): Purl to end of row. Cut MC yarn and place sts on hold.

Left Shoulder:

Row 1: (RS) Knit (21, 21, 21) (**22, 23, 24**) (27, 29, 30) (**32, 34**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 2: (WS) Purl to end of row.

Row 3: (RS) Knit (14, 14, 14) (**14, 15, 16**) (20, 21, 22) (**24, 25**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 4: (WS) Purl to end of row.

Row 5: (RS) Knit (7, 7, 7) (**7, 7, 8**) (13, 14, 14) (**16, 16**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 6: (WS) Purl to end of row.

For sizes 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 only:

Row 7: (RS) Knit (-, -, -) (-, -, -) (6, 7, 7) **(8, 8)** sts, turn and mds.

Row 8: (WS) Purl (-, -, -) (-, -, -) (6, 7, 7) **(8, 8)** sts.

All sizes:

Next row (RS): Knit to end of row. Cut MC yarn and place sts on hold.

Front

HEM TO ARMHOLE SHAPING

Note: *Before proceeding read shaping instructions carefully. Centre front lace panel and shaping at sides take place at the same time.*

With smaller needles, using CC yarn, cast on (142, 148, 156) **(164, 172, 180)** (188, 204, 218) **(234, 248)** sts using the Long Tail method. Change to MC yarn and work the Garter Hem (see *Stitch Guide* section).

Change to larger needles and proceed to work in St st pattern, until piece measures (8, 8.5, 8.5) **(9, 7, 7)** (7.5, 6.5, 7) **(8, 8.5)** cm/ (3.25, 3.25, 3.25) **(3.5, 2.75, 2.75)** (3, 2.5, 2.75) **(3.25, 3.25)** in from cast on edge, ending with a WS row.

Next row (RS): **Decrease Row:** Slip 1, K2, K2tog, knit to last 5 sts, SSK, K3. (2 sts decreased)

Continuing in St st pattern, repeat Decrease Row every (22, 22, 22) **(22, 20, 20)** (20, 18, 18) **(18, 18)** rows (4, 4, 4) **(4, 5, 5)** (5, 6, 6) **(6, 6)** more times.

(132, 138, 146) **(154, 160, 168)** (176, 190, 204) **(220, 234)** sts remaining on needle.

AT THE SAME TIME, when piece measures (27, 27.5, 27.5) **(28, 28.5, 28.5)** (29, 29.5, 30) **(31, 32)** cm/ (10.75, 10.75, 10.75) **(11, 11.25, 11.5)** (11.5, 11.5, 11.75) **(12.25, 12.5)** in from cast on edge, ending with a RS row, mark centre 28 sts by placing a marker on each side. Proceed as follows:

Next Row (WS): Slip 1, work to marker, slip marker, purl 13 sts, join a ball of CC yarn and purl 2 sts, join a second ball of MC yarn and purl next 13 sts, slip marker and work to end.

Row 1; Next row (RS): With MC yarn slip 1, work to marker, slip marker, work over the next 28 sts from Chart 1 (changing between CC and MC yarns as indicated in Chart), slip marker and work to end.

Row 2; Next row (WS): With MC yarn slip 1, work to marker, slip marker, work over the next 28 sts from Chart 1 (changing between CC and MC yarns according to the Chart), slip marker and work to end.

Continue working the sts between the two markers as established in Rows 1 and 2, for 42 rows in total (indicated as Set-up rows in Chart 1) then proceed with the Armhole and Neckline shaping.

Note: *Before starting Chart 1, cut 2 lengths of CC yarn around 50cm/19.5in in length and set aside. These small lengths will be used to work each side of the chart (as CC1 and CC3 starting in Set-up Row 29 up to Set-up Row 36). After Set-up Row 36 the lace is worked with a single strand of CC yarn (main ball). Use the main ball of CC yarn starting in Set-up Row 1.*

ARMHOLE and NECKLINE SHAPING

Note: *Before proceeding read shaping instructions carefully. Armhole and Neckline shaping take place at the same time. Neckline shaping will continue after Armhole Shaping is complete.*

Row 1; Next row (RS): BO for armhole (see *Armhole Shaping* section below), knit to last 2 sts before marker, K2tog (*neckline shaping*), slip marker, work in pattern over 14 sts (according to Chart 1), use a 2nd ball of CC yarn to work in pattern over the next 14 sts (according to Chart 1), slip marker, SSK (*neckline shaping*), knit to end of row.

Row 2; Next row (WS): BO for armhole (as in RS), purl to marker, work in pattern over the next 14 sts, use 2nd ball of CC yarn to work in pattern over the next 14 sts, slip marker and purl to end of row.

Continue to work as in Rows 1 and 2, binding off sts at both armholes according to the *Armhole Shaping* section below and AT THE SAME TIME decreasing 1 st before and after marker (as shown in Row 1 above) every RS row, for (23, 24, 25) (**26, 26, 27**) (27, 29, 29) (**30, 30**) times in total. The intarsia section does not narrow.

Armhole Shaping:

For the Upper Left Front sts are BO at beg of RS rows. For the Upper Right Front sts are BO at beg of WS rows.

BO (6, 7, 8) (**8, 9, 10**) (10, 12, 13) (**14, 16**) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

BO 3 sts at beg of next 4 rows.

BO (2, 2, 2) (**2, 2, 2**) (2, 2, 3) (**3, 3**) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

BO (1, 1, 1) (**1, 1, 1**) (1, 1, 2) (**2, 2**) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

BO (0, 1, 1) (**1, 1, 1**) (1, 1, 2) (**2, 2**) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

BO (0, 0, 1) (**1, 1, 1**) (1, 1, 1) (**2, 2**) sts at beg of next 2 rows.

BO (0, 0, 0) (**1, 1, 1**) (1, 1, 1) (**1, 2**) sts at beg of next 4 rows.

BO 1 st at beg of next 2 rows (0, 0, 0) (**0, 1, 2**) (4, 4, 6) (**9, 9**) time(s) in total.

(28, 28, 29) (**30, 31, 32**) (34, 37, 38) (**40, 43**) sts remain on needle for each shoulder.

Work even in established pattern, until Armhole measures (18, 18.5, 18.5) (**19, 19.5, 20**) (20.5, 21.5, 22.5) (**23.5, 24.5**) cm / (7, 7.25, 7.25) (**7.5, 7.75, 7.75**) (8, 8.5, 8.75) (**9.25, 9.75**) in, ending with a WS row.

SHOULDER SHAPING

Continue working in established pattern. Work the two shoulders separately as follows:

Left Shoulder:

Row 1: (RS) Work to end of row.

Row 2: (WS) Work over (21, 21, 21) (**22, 23, 24**) (27, 29, 30) (**32, 34**) sts, turn and mds (see *Tutorials* section on German short rows).

Row 3: (RS) Work to end of row.

Row 4: (WS) Work over (14, 14, 14) (**14, 15, 16**) (20, 21, 22) (**24, 25**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 5: (RS) Work to end of row.

Row 6: (WS) Work over (7, 7, 7) (**7, 7, 8**) (13, 14, 14) (**16, 16**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 7: (RS) Work to end of row.

For sizes 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 only:

Row 8: (WS) Work over (-, -, -) (-, -, -) (6, 7, 7) (**8, 8**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 9: (RS) Work over (-, -, -) (-, -, -) (6, 7, 7) (**8, 8**) sts.

All sizes:

Next row (WS): Work to end of row. Cut MC and CC yarns and place sts on hold. Remove marker.

Right Shoulder:

Row 1: (RS) Work over (21, 21, 21) (**22, 23, 24**) (27, 29, 30) (**32, 34**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 2: (WS) Work to end of row.

Row 3: (RS) Work over (14, 14, 14) (**14, 15, 16**) (20, 21, 22) (**24, 25**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 4: (WS) Work to end of row.

Row 5: (RS) Work over (7, 7, 7) (**7, 7, 8**) (13, 14, 14) (**16, 16**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 6: (WS) Work to end of row.

For sizes 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 only:

Row 7: (RS) Work over (-, -, -) (-, -, -) (6, 7, 7) (**8, 8**) sts, turn and mds.

Row 8: (WS) Work over (-, -, -) (-, -, -) (6, 7, 7) (**8, 8**) sts.

All sizes:

Next row (RS): Work to end of row. Cut MC and CC yarns and place sts on hold. Remove marker.

Join Shoulders and Side Seams

To join each shoulder, proceed as follows: transfer sts of right Back shoulder to a smaller size needle. Repeat for right Front shoulder. Line up the 2 needles one in front of the other, with RS facing. Proceed to work a 3-needle BO (see *Tutorials* section) for the remaining sts as follows: with a third larger needle, knit 1 st from front needle together with 1 st from back needle. Repeat for next st. BO the 1st st on third needle by passing st over. Continue until all sts are BO. Repeat for other shoulder.

Sew both side seams using MC yarn (see *Tutorials* section).

Sleeves

The sleeves are worked top down in the round in St st pattern. The instructions below are for one sleeve. Repeat instructions to work second sleeve.

SLEEVE CAP

With RS facing, starting from side seam, use crochet hook and MC yarn to pick up sts around armhole, placing sts on larger needle. Start to pick up (6, 7, 8) (**8, 9 10**) (10, 12, 13) (**14, 16**) sts by picking up 1 st for each st along the BO edge (see *Tutorials* section), then pick up (40, 41, 42) (**43, 44, 46**) (49, 49, 51) (**52, 53**) sts evenly around armhole up to the shoulder seam, then (40, 41, 42) (**43, 44, 46**) (49, 49, 51) (**52, 53**) sts evenly around armhole up to the underarm BO sts, then (6, 7, 8) (**8, 9 10**) (10, 12, 13) (**14, 16**) sts by picking up 1 st for each st along the BO edge.

Place marker for beginning of round and join. Knit to (7, 7, 7) (**8, 8, 10**) (10, 10, 10) (**10, 10**) sts past the shoulder seam, turn and mds. Purl to (7, 7, 7) (**8, 8, 10**) (10, 10, 10) (**10, 10**) sts past the shoulder seam, turn and mds.

* *Knit to 3 sts past the last double st, turn and mds. Purl to 3 sts past the last double st, turn and mds.*

Repeat from * 2 more times.

** *Knit to 2 sts past the last double st, turn and mds. Purl to 2 sts past the last double st, turn and mds.*

Repeat from ** (2, 2, 3) (**3, 3, 3**) (3, 3, 3) (**3, 3**) more times.

*** *Knit to 1 st past the last double st, turn and mds. Purl to 1 st past the last double st, turn and mds.*

Repeat from *** (17, 18, 17) (**17, 18, 18**) (21, 21, 23) (**24, 25**) more times.

Complete round by knitting to side seam.

Next round: Knit to end of round.

Continue to *Sleeve – Main Fabric* section.

SLEEVE – MAIN FABRIC

Work main fabric of Sleeve based on the Short or Long Sleeve version below, per knitter preference.

Short Sleeve version:

Proceed with *Sleeve Cuff* section.

Long Sleeve version:

Knit for (8, 8, 8) **(8, 8, 6)** (6, 6, 6) **(6, 6)** rounds in total.

Next round; **Sleeve Decrease Round:** K2, K2tog, knit to last 4 sts, SSK, K2. (2 sts decreased)

Repeat the Sleeve Decrease Round every (8th, 8th, 8th) **(8th, 8th, 6th)** (6th, 6th, 6th) **(6th, 6th)** round (11, 8, 6) **(6, 4, 20)** (18, 17, 11) **(12, 8)** more times, then every (6th, 6th, 6th) **(6th, 6th, 4th)** (4th, 4th, 4th) **(4th, 4th)** round (7, 11, 14) **(14, 17, 4)** (7, 9, 18) **(17, 23)** times in total.

(54, 56, 58) **(60, 62, 62)** (66, 68, 68) **(72, 74)** sts remaining on needle.

Work even (in the round in St st pattern) until Sleeve measures (41.5, 41.5, 42) **(42, 42.5, 42.5)** (42.5, 43, 43) **(43.5, 43.5)** cm / (16.25, 16.25, 16.5) **(16.5, 16.75, 16.75)** (16.75, 17, 17) **(17.25, 17.25)** in from armhole.

Proceed with *Sleeve Cuff* section.

SLEEVE CUFF

Change to smaller needle and work in Garter Cuff pattern for 10 rounds in total (see *Stitch Guide* section).

Next round: Change to CC yarn and knit to end of round.

Next round: Remove marker and BO all sts in pattern.

Finishing

Wet-block pieces.

NECKBAND

With CC yarn and RS facing, use Crochet hook and start at shoulder seam to pick up 1 st for every bound-off st at the horizontal segment of the neckline (centre back), 1 st for every other row along V neck shaping and 1 st at the base of the V neckline (centre st). Evenly space the picked up sts and adjust their number to an even number. Transfer picked up sts to smaller circular needle. Place marker for beginning of round and proceed to work 1×1 ribbing working the 1st st of the neckband so that the centre st will be worked as a K st.

Next round; **Neckband Decrease Round:** Work in pattern to 1 st before the centre st, CDD, work in pattern to end of round. (2 sts decreased)

Work 2 rounds in pattern.

Repeat Neckband Decrease Round one last time.

Work 2 rounds in pattern.

Next round: Work Tubular BO (see *Tutorials* section).

Remove marker. Weave in remaining ends neatly on WS of fabric.

Abbreviations & Glossary

2/2 LC: slip 2 sts onto cn, hold in front, K2, K2 from cn.

2/2 RC: slip 2 sts onto cn, hold in back, K2, K2 from cn.

Beg: begin(ning).

BO (Bind Off): Work first st, * work next st, slip first st over the second st on right hand needle. Repeat from * to BO all sts.

CC: contrast colour yarn.

CC1: first ball of CC yarn attached, as seen from the side facing the knitter.

CC2: second ball of CC yarn attached, as seen from the side facing the knitter.

CC3: third ball of CC yarn attached, as seen from the side facing the knitter.

CDD (Central Double Decrease): insert right needle through next 2 sts on left needle, knitwise and slip them off to right needle. Knit next st. Pass the 2 slipped sts over the knitted st and off the needle (see *Tutorials* section).

Cm: centimeter(s)

cn: cable needle.

G: gram(s)

in: inch(es)

K: knit

K2tog (Knit 2 together): knit two sts on left needle together (see *Tutorials* section).

K3tog (Knit 3 together): knit three sts on left needle together (see *Tutorials* section).

Ktbl: Knit 1 st through the back loop (see *Tutorials* section).

Long Tail Cast On: for instructions see *Tutorials* section.

M: meter(s)

MC: main colour yarn.

MC1: first ball of MC yarn attached, as seen from the side facing the knitter.

MC2: second ball of MC yarn attached, as seen from the side facing the knitter.

Mds (Make a double st): In next row work the double st as K2tog or P2tog, depending on pattern.

Oz: ounce(s).

P: purl.

P2tog (Purl 2 together): purl two sts on left needle together.

Ptbl: Purl 1 st through the back loop (see *Tutorials* section).

RC (Right Cross): Slip 1 st onto cn, hold in back, K1, K1 from cn.

RS (Right Side): the side that will be visible when the garment is worn.

S: selvedge st.

SSK (Slip Slip Knit): slip 2 sts knitwise then insert left needle through front of slipped sts from left and knit them together (see *Tutorials* section).

SSSK (Slip Slip Slip Knit): slip 3 sts knitwise then insert left needle through front of slipped sts from left and knit them together (see *Tutorials* section).

St(s): stitch(es).

St st (Stockinette St pattern): knit right-side rows and purl wrong-side rows.

Work even: continue in pattern without increases or decreases.

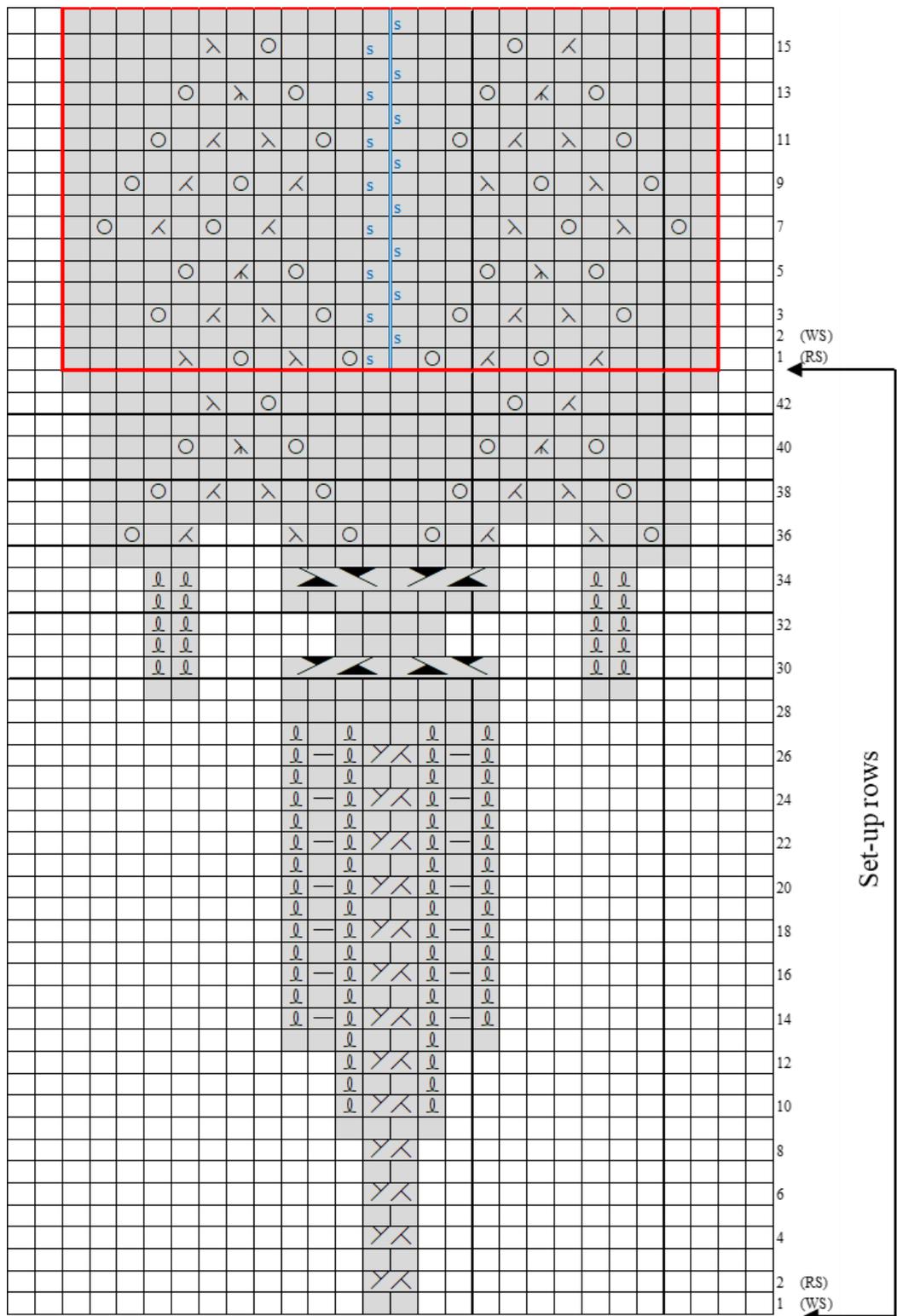
WS (Wrong Side): the side that will not be visible when the garment is worn.

YO (Yarn Over): bring the yarn over needle (see *Tutorials* section).

Yd(s): yard(s).

SET-UP ROWS

Row 1: (WS) With MC P13, join CC yarn and P2, join a 2nd ball of MC yarn and P13.

Row 2: (RS) With MC1 K13, change to CC and RC, change to MC2 and K13.

Row 3: (WS) With MC1 P13, change to CC and P2, change to MC2 and P13.

Rows 4, 6 and 8: (RS) Repeat Row 2.

Rows 5 and 7: (WS) Repeat Row 3.

Row 9: (WS) With MC1 P12, change to CC and P4, change to MC2 and P12.

Row 10: (RS) With MC1 K12, change to CC and Ktbl, RC, Ktbl, change to MC2 and K12.

Row 11: (WS) With MC1 P12, change to CC and Ptbl, P2, Ptbl, change to MC2 and P12.

Row 12: (RS) Repeat Row 10.

Row 13: (WS) With MC1 P10, change to CC and P2, Ptbl, P2, Ptbl, P2, change to MC2 and P10.

Row 14: (RS) With MC1 K10, change to CC Ktbl, P1, Ktbl, RC, Ktbl, P1, Ktbl, change to MC2 and K10.

Row 15: (WS) With MC1 P10, change to CC and Ptbl, P1, Ptbl, P2, Ptbl, P1, Ptbl, change to MC2 and P10.

Rows 16, 18, 20, 22, 24 and 26: (RS) Repeat Row 14.

Rows 17, 19, 21, 23, 25 and 27: (WS) Repeat Row 15.

Row 28: (RS) With MC1 K10, change to CC and K8, change to MC2 and K10.

Row 29: (WS) With MC1 P5, join a new ball of CC yarn (CC1) and P2, change to MC1 and P3, change to CC2 and P8, change to MC2 and P3, join a 3rd ball of CC (CC3) and P2, change to MC2 and P5.

Row 30: (RS) With MC1 K5, change to CC1 and Ktbl twice, change to MC1 and K3, change to CC2 and 2/2 LC, 2/2 RC, change to MC2 and K3, change to CC3 and Ktbl twice, change to MC2 and K5.

Row 31: (WS) With MC1 P5, change to CC1 and Ptbl twice, change to MC1 and P5, change to CC2 and P4, change to MC2 and P5, change to CC3 and Ptbl twice, change to MC2 and P5.

Row 32: (RS) With MC1 K5, change to CC1 and Ktbl twice, change to MC1 and K5, change to CC2 and K4, change to MC2 and K5, change to CC3 and Ktbl twice, change to MC2 and K5.

Row 33: (WS) With MC1 P5, change to CC1 and Ptbl twice, change to MC1 and P3, change to CC2 and P8, change to MC2 and P3, change to CC3 and Ptbl twice, change to MC2 and P5.

Row 34: (RS) With MC1 K5, change to CC1 and Ktbl twice, change to MC1 and K3, change to CC2 and 2/2 RC, 2/2 LC, change to MC2 and K3, change to CC3 and Ktbl twice, change to MC2 and K5.

Row 35: (WS) With MC1 P3, change to CC1 and P4, change to MC1 and P3, change to CC2 and P8, change to MC2 and P3, change to CC3 and P4, change to MC2 and P3.

Row 36: (RS) With MC1 K3, change to CC1 and K1, YO, K1, SSK, change to MC1 and K3, change to CC2 and K2tog, K1, YO, K2, YO, K1, SSK, change to MC2 and K3, continue with CC2 and K2tog, K1, YO, K1, change to MC2 and K3 (*after Row 36 continue with one strand of CC*).

Row 37: (WS) With MC1 P3, change to CC and P22, change to MC2 and P3.

Row 38: (RS) With MC1 K3, change to CC and K2, YO, K1, SSK, K1, K2tog, K1, YO, K4, YO, K1 SSK, K1, K2tog, K1, YO, K2, change to MC2 and K3.

Rows 39 and 41: (WS) Repeat Row 37.

Row 40: (RS) With MC1 K3, change to CC and K3, YO, K1, K3tog, K1, YO, K6, YO, K1, SSSK, K1, YO, K3, change to MC2 and K3.

Row 42: (RS) With MC1 K3, change to CC and K4, K2tog, K1, YO, K8, YO, K1, SSK, K4, change to MC2 and K3.

Row 43: (WS) With MC1 P2, change to CC and P24, change to MC2 and P2.

MAIN PATTERN

Row 1: (RS) (Left front side of neckline – LF) With MC1 K2, change to CC and K4, K2tog, K1, YO, K1, K2tog, K1, YO, K1. (Right front side of neckline – RF). Join a 2nd ball of CC and Slip 1, YO, K1, SSK, K1, YO, K1, SSK, K4, change to MC2 and K2.

Row 2: (WS) (RF) With MC1 P2, change to CC1 and P12. (LF) With CC2 Slip 1, P11, change to MC1 and P2.

- Row 3:** (RS) (LF) With MC1 K2, change to CC1 and K3, YO, K1, SSK, K1, K2tog, K1, YO, K2. (RF) With CC2, Slip 1, K1, YO, K1 SSK, K1, K2tog, K1, YO, K3, change to MC2 and K2.
- Rows 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14 and 16:** (WS) Repeat Row 2.
- Row 5:** (RS) (LF) With MC1 K2, change to CC1 and K4, YO, K1, SSSK, K1, YO, K3. (RF) With CC2 Slip 1, K2, YO, K1, K3tog, K1, YO, K4, change to MC2 and K2.
- Row 7:** (RS) (LF) With MC1 K2, change to CC1 and K1, YO, K1, SSK, K1, YO, K1, SSK, K4. (RF) With CC2 Slip 1, K3, K2tog, K1, YO, K1 K2tog, K1, YO, K1, change to MC2 and K2.
- Row 9:** (RS) (LF) With MC1 K2, change to CC1 and K2, YO, K1, SSK, K1, YO, K1, SSK, K3. (RF) With CC2 Slip 1, K2, K2tog, K1, YO, K1, K2tog, K1, YO, K2, change to MC2 and K2.
- Row 11:** (RS) (LF) With MC1 K2, change to CC1 and K3, YO, K1, SSK, K1, K2tog, K1, YO, K2. (RF) With CC2 Slip 1, K1, YO, K1, SSK, K1, K2tog, K1, YO, K3, change to MC2 and K2.
- Row 13:** (RS) (LF) With MC1 K2, change to CC1 and K4, YO, K1, K3tog, K1, YO, K3. (RF) With CC2, Slip 1, K2, YO, K1, SSSK, K1, YO, K4, change to MC2 and K2.
- Row 15:** (RS) (LF) With MC1 K2, change to CC1 and K5, K2tog, K1, YO, K4. (RF) With CC2, Slip 1, K3, YO, K1, SSK, K5, change to MC2 and K2.
