



SOLENE SKIRT

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KNITTING PATTERN

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PERCET SUMMER SKIRT



Solène skirt captures the essence of summer—light as a breeze, soft as sun-warmed petals. The flowing shape and delicate lace give the skirt a light, graceful movement with every step.

Whether worn barefoot in the grass or paired with your favorite summer shoes, Solène skirt is made for moments that feel timeless. There is also a pattern for a matching top.

The skirt is knitted from the hem upwards, beginning with a beautifully scalloped edge. An easy-to-follow lace chart guides the creation of elegant lace panels, adding delicate detail to the design.

The hem is wide and flowy, giving the skirt a graceful drape. Shaping is achieved with two sets of decreases, enhancing the fluid silhouette. The waist is finished with a neatly double-folded waistband and an I-cord ribbon. For a more secure and comfortable fit, an elastic band can be added.

SPECIFICATIONS

Sizes

XS (S) M (L) XL (2XL)

Finished waist circumference

72 (78) 84 (90) 96 (102) cm / 28.5
(30.5) 33 (35.5) 38 (40)"

Finished hem circumference

216 (222) 228 (234) 240 (246) cm / 85
(87.5) 90 (92) 94.5 (97)"

Length including waistband

43 cm / 17"

The length can be adjusted by adding lace panels to the hem. The length of one chart repeat is approximately. 5 cm / 2"

Gauge

20 sts x 28 rnds = 10 x 10 cm / 4 x 4" in Stockinette St using 4 mm (US 6) needles

Needles

3.5 mm (US 4) and 4 mm (US 6) circular needles.

Yarn

300 (330) 370 (400) 430 (450) g
Knitting for Olive Pure Silk (100 % silk / 250 m / 273 yds / 50 g). *The skirt is worked holding two strands of yarn together.*

Notions

Stitch markers, tapestry needle, elastic band for the waistband 2.5 cm / 1" wide and the same length as the waist measurement of the finished skirt.

Abbreviations

BO: bind off

BOR: beginning of round

CDD: centered double decrease. Sl 2 sts kwise, k1, pass slipped sts over.

CO: cast on

K: knit

Kwise: knit wise

M1: make 1

M1p: make 1 purl

P: purl

Rnd: round

SSK: slip, slip, knit: slip 2 sts knitwise to the right needle, slip them back to the left needle and knit tog through the back loop (1 st decreased)

Sl: slip

Sts: stitches

Tog: together

Yo: yarn over (1 st increased)

WS: Wrong side



INSTRUCTIONS

CO alternative 1

CO 432 (444) 456 (468) 480 (492) sts using Tubular CO method on 4 mm (US 6) circular needles. Place a marker to indicate BOR. Join to work in the rnd.

CO alternative 2

CO 434 (444) 456 (468) 480 (492) sts using regular Long tail CO method on 4 mm (US 6) circular needles. Place a marker to indicate BOR. Join to work in the rnd.

Rnd 1 – 2: p to end.

Hem

Work according to chart as follows:

Rnd 1: Work according to the chart to end. Chart is repeated 36 (37) 38 (39) 40 (41) times in one rnd.

Repeat rnd 1, 31 more times. Now you have worked 2 times the chart (32 rnds in total).

Decrease rnd 1: Work decreases by working k2tog, 144 times evenly distributed on the next rnd. [144 sts decreased]

Tip: Use an online stitch decrease calculator to help you. You now have 288 (300) 312 (324) 336 (348) sts.

Next rnd: K to end.

Work according to chart as follows:

Rnd 1: Work according to the chart to end. Chart is repeated 24 (25) 26 (27) 28 (29) times in one rnd.

Repeat rnd 1, 47 more times. Now you have worked 3 times the chart after decrease rnd 1 (48 rnds in total).

Decrease rnd 2: Work decreases by working k2tog, 144 times evenly distributed on the next rnd. [144 sts decreased]

Tip: Use an online stitch decrease calculator to help you. You now have 144 (156) 168 (180) 192 (204) sts.

Next rnd: K to end.

Work according to chart as follows:

Rnd 1: Work according to the chart to end. Chart is repeated 12 (13) 14 (15) 16 (17) times in one rnd.

Repeat rnd 1, 47 more times. Now you have worked 3 times the chart after decrease rnd 2 (48 rnds in total).

Waistband

Change to 3.5 mm (US 4) circular needles.

Rnd 1: K to end.

Repeat rnd 1, 4 more times.

INSTRUCTIONS

Create holes for I-cord ribbon as follows:

Rnd 1: K O (O) O (O) O (2), *k10 (11) 10 (8) 10 (8), k2tog, yo*, repeat 11 (11) 13 (17) 15 (19) more times, k O (O) O (O) O (2).

And then:

Rnd 1: K to end.

Repeat rnd 1, 4 more times.

And then:

Rnd 1: p to end.

And then:

Rnd 1: K to end.

Repeat rnd 1, 9 more times.

BO all sts.

I-Cord ribbon

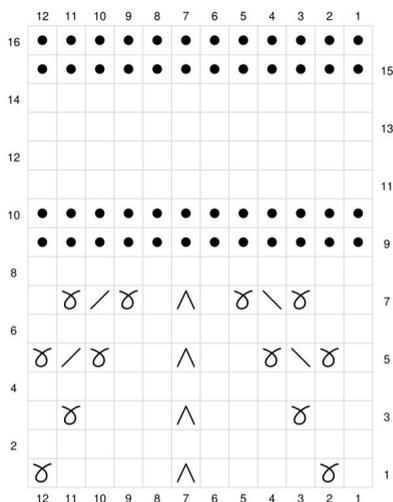
CO 3 sts, *k3, sl sts back to LH needle*, repeat * to *, until you reach the desired length.

Break yarn and pull it through the last 3 sts with a tapestry needle and fasten.

The ribbon should be approx 50 cm / 19.5" longer than your finished waist measurement.

Finishing

Weave in all ends. Fold the waistband double, slip the elastic band inside the folded waistband, attach by sewing on the WS side of the skirt. Thread the I-cord tie through the holes at the waistband. Wet block your skirt or steam it using the steam function on your iron.
