



Gisèle Sweater By Auguste Knit

Featuring a classic yet contemporary design, Gisèle is a versatile addition to any ensemble. Its gentle drape ensures comfort without compromising style, making it perfect for both casual and more formal occasions. The timeless silhouette is adorned with subtle detailing, it can be used both ways so that the neckline opening will be in the back or in the front. You can also add a silk scarf to use as a bow for the neck. You'll find instructions for creating a silk scarf in the pattern.

Whether you're a seasoned knitter or embarking on your first project, this pattern offers clear and concise instructions, to guide you through each step. With its straightforward construction and seamless finish, you'll enjoy every moment of knitting this masterpiece.

Sizes: XS (S) M (L) XL

Finished bust circumference: 82.5 (89.5) 101 (110.5) 120 cm / 33 (35.75) 40.5 (44.25) 48".

Ease: Suggested positive ease on bust circumference 5 cm / 2". Pictured in size S.

Length from underarm to hem: 25 (25) 25 (25) 25 cm / 9.8 (9.8) 9.8 (9.8) 9.8". The length can easily be altered to your own liking (the raglan length is longer for the bigger sizes, therefore the total length of the sweater will also be longer).

Upper arm circumference: 32 (33) 34 (35.5) 37.5 cm / 12.75 (13.25) 13.75 (14.25) 15".

Sleeve length from underarm: 45 (45) 45 (45) 45 cm / 17.75 (17.75) 17.75 (17.75) 17.75".

Gauge: 17 sts x 24 rnds = 10 x 10 cm / 4 x 4" using 5 mm (US8) needles, holding two strands of yarns together.

Needles: 4 mm (US6) and 5 mm (US8) circular needles, 4 mm (US6) DPNs.

Yarn: 150 (175) 225 (250) 275 g Biches & Bushes Le Petit Silk & Mohair (70 % super kid mohair, 30 % mulberry silk - 210 m / 230 yds / 25 g) color Light Peach. The sweater is worked with two strands of yarn held together.

Notions: 8 stitch markers, stitch holders or scrap yarn, tapestry needle. Silk/satin fabric if you are doing a silk bow.

Abbreviations:

BO: bind off

BOR: Beginning of round

CO: cast on

M1L: take the loop between the two stitches on your left needle *from front to back*, insert the right needle into the back of the st and knit through the back of the loop (1 st increased)

M1R: take the loop between the two stitches on the left needle *from back to front* and knit it like a regular stitch (1 st increased)

PM: Place marker

RM: Remove marker

RS: Right side

SM: Slip marker

SSK: slip, slip, knit: slip 2 sts knitwise to the right needle, slip them back to the left needle and knit tog through the back loop (1 st decreased)

Tbl: Through the back loop

Tog: Together

Yo: yarn over (1 st increased)

WS: Wrong side

I-cord Bind Off

CO 3 new sts using knit on cast on method. *K2, k2tog tbl, sl sts back to LH needle*, repeat * to * until you have 3 sts left of work, break yarn and pull it through the last 3 sts with a tapestry needle and fasten on the WS.

Instructions for an I-cord ribbon

CO 3 sts, *k3, sl sts back to LH needle*, repeat * to *, until you reach the desired length. Break yarn and pull it through the last 3 sts with a tapestry needle and fasten.

Instructions for silk scarf

You can also sew a silk scarf to use as a bow. The finished scarf measurements are: width 7 cm / 2.75" and length 160 cm / 63".

Cut a piece of silk or satin fabric to the specified dimensions, adding about 1.5 cm / 0.5" seam allowance on all sides. Shape the ends of the fabric into an arrow. Sew both pieces together on the wrong side using a sewing machine, leaving an opening for pulling the fabric through to the right side. Close the opening by sewing by hand. Steam the scarf using an iron.

Yoke

CO 80 (88) 96 (100) 108 sts using regular CO method on 4 mm (US 6) circular needles holding together two strands of mohair.

Row 1 (WS): P to end.

Row 2 (RS): K to end.

Repeat rows 1 - 2 until work measures 3.5 cm / 1.35" from the CO edge. End after a RS row.

Next row (WS): K to end (this is where the collar is folded double).

Row 1 (RS): K to end.

Row 2 (WS): P to end.

Repeat rows 1 - 2 until work measures 7 cm / 2.75" from the CO edge. End after a WS row.

Now you will fold your collar double creating a tube for the ribbon. *Alternative* fold the neckline double and sew it together with the sts on the last row of the ribbing on WS of the work.

With RS facing you pick up and k 80 (88) 96 (100) 108 sts using spare circular needles holding together two strands of mohair. Fold your neckline double with both your main and spare needle facing each other.

Next row (RS): K the st from the working needle together with the corresponding st on the spare needle. Work the hole row like this. *You now have 80 (88) 96 (100) 108 sts.*

Alternative fold the neckline double and sew it together with the sts on the last row of the ribbing on WS of the work.

Next row (WS): P to end.

Change to 5 mm (US8) circular needles. Place 8 markers for increases as follows:

Next row (RS): K13 (15) 18 (20) 22 (left front), PM, k1, PM, k12 (12) 10 (8) 8 (left sleeve), PM, k1, PM, k26 (30) 36 (40) 44 (back), PM, k1, PM, k12 (12) 10 (8) 8 (right sleeve), PM, k1, PM, k13 (15) 18 (20) 22 (right front).

Next row (WS): P to end.

Next you will start doing raglan increases as follows:

Row 1 (RS): *K to m, M1L, SM, k1, SM, M1R* 4 times, k to end. [8 sts increased]

Note: At the same time slip the last st on each row with yarn in front to make a nice edge.

Row 2 (WS): P to end.

Repeat rows 1 and 2, 10 (11) 12 (15) 17 more times.

Now join to work in the rnd, PM to indicate BOR, and continue working increases as follows:

Rnd 1: *K to m, M1L, SM, k1, SM, M1R* 4 times, k to end. *[8 sts increased]*

Rnd 2, 3 and 4: K to end.

Repeat rows 1 - 4, 8 (8) 8 (8) 8 more times.

You now have 232 (248) 272 (292) 316 sts, 50 (52) 54 (56) 60 sts for each sleeve, 64 (70) 80 (88) 96 sts for back and front and 1 st in each raglan seam.

Body

On the next row separate the sleeves and body as follows:

Next rnd: K to m, RM, k1, RM, place next 50 (52) 54 (56) 60 sts for the sleeves on stitch holder or scrap yarn, CO 4 (4) 4 (4) 4 sts for the underarm, RM, k1, RM, k to m, RM, k1, RM, place next 50 (52) 54 (56) 60 sts for the sleeves on stitch holder or scrap yarn, CO 4 (4) 4 (4) 4 sts for the underarm, RM, k1, RM, k to end. *You now have 140 (152) 172 (188) 204 sts for the body.*

Continue working in the rnd in Stockinette St until your work measures 25 cm / 9.8" from the underarm.

Now work a hem and create holes for the I-cord ribbon as follows:

Rnd 1: K68 (74) 84 (92) 100 sts, k2tog, yo, k2, yo, k2tog, k to end.

Rnds 2 & 3: K to end.

Rnd 4: P to end (this is where the hem folds double).

Rnds 5 - 11: K to end.

BO all sts.

Sleeves

Place the sleeve sts that were on hold back to 5 mm (US8) circular needles. Beginning in the middle of the underarm, pick up and k 2 (2) 2 (2) 2 sts, k sleeve sts and pick up and k 2 (2) 2 (2) 2 sts. *You now have 54 (56) 58 (60) 64 sts.*

Work in Stockinette St in the rnd until work measures approx. 45 (45) 45 (45) 45 cm / 17.75 (17.75) 17.75 (17.75) 17.75". BO using the I-cord BO method. Cut the threads and weave in the end.

Rnd 1: With RS of sleeve facing up, pick up and k 54 (56) 58 (60) 64 sts using 4 mm (US6) circular needles holding together two strands of mohair below the I-cord edge (that the pick up rnd is hidden behind the edge). Join to work in the rnd. Place m to indicate BOR.

Work a frilled edge as follows:

Rnd 1: *K2, yo* to end.

Rnd 2 & 3: K to end. *Notion: K yo:rs tbl.*

BO all sts using I-cord BO method.

Work the other sleeve the same way.

Collar edge

Pick up sts for an decorative I-cord from the purl row where the collar is folded double as follows:

Row 1: With RS of yoke facing up, pick up and k 80 (88) 96 (100) 108 sts using 4 mm (US6) circular needles holding together two strands of mohair.

Row 2: BO all sts using I-cord BO method.

Work a frilled edge as follows:

With RS of yoke facing up pick up and k 118 (122) 144 (166) 188 sts using 4 mm (US 2.5) circular needles holding together two strands of mohair below the I-cord edge (that the pick up rnd is hidden behind the edge).

Work a neckline edge in the flat as follows.

Row 1 (WS): *P2, yo* to end.

Row 2 (RS): K to end. *Notion: K yo:rs tbl.*

Row 3 (WS): P to end.



BO all sts using I-cord BO method.

Finishing

Fold hem lining double and attach by sewing on the WS side of the body. Work I-cord ribbons for both sleeves, neck and for the hem. The length for the ribbons for the sleeves should be approx 50 cm / 19.85", neck 90 cm / 35" and hem 140 cm / 55".

Slip ribbon for hem and neck using a safety pin through the tube created. Attach the ribbons for the sleeves to the cuffs by sewing a couple of stitches on the back part of the cuff.

Weave in all ends. Wet block your sweater or steam it using the steam function on your iron.
