



Augustins Cables No 4

About

Sizes: a (b) c (d) e (f) g (h).

Your bust circumference: 80 (90) 100 (110) 120 (130) 140 (150) cm.

The circumference of the sweater: 112 (122) 132 (142) 152 (162) 172 (182) cm (after washing).

Positive ease: This sweater has a positive ease at approximately 30 cm, depending on your bust circumference. When deciding which size to knit, choose the one which corresponds to your own actual bust circumference.

Full length, measured below the neckline and downwards: 60 (62) 64 (66) 68 (70) 72 (74) cm.

Gauge: 10 sts x 15 rows = 10 x 10 cm in Purl Stitch at circular needle 10 mm (after washing).

Needle size(s): 2 different needle sizes are used, whilst knitting the sweater.

- Circular needle 9 mm (the lengths 40 and 60 cm are recommended).

- Circular needle 10 mm (the lengths 40, 60 and 80 cm are recommended).

Yarn: "[Bockens Lovikka](#)", Holma Garn (60 m per 100g).

Amount: 1150 (1200) 1250 (1300) 1350 (1400) 1450 (1500) g.

Other: Cable needle (between 8-10 mm).

Method: The sweater is knitted top-down in the round using Purl Stitch. A series of raglan increases are created on each side of the 4 cable panels, to shape the yoke. The cables continue down along the body, and each is finished by an I-cord bow at its end. All edges of the sweater is knitted in 1x1 rib, and the sleeves are broad in their shape.

Before you begin

- Please read the entire pattern before casting on.
- Be sure to make a swatch before beginning, to ensure the right gauge.
- In this pattern, the following methods are used: Purl Stitch, left- and right leaning purl increases, 1x1 rib, Italian Bind Off and Cast On, and cables.

Pattern

Neckline

With circular needle 9 mm, cast on 52 (52) 56 (56) 60 (60) 64 (64) sts, using the method Italian Cast On. Join the work in the round, and place a M between the first and last st = M1 and BOR.

Now, knit rib (*k 1, p 1*), and repeat *-* until the work measures 16 cm.

The high neck has now been knitted.

Yoke

Now, the yoke with its raglan increases must be knitted in Purl Stitch, whilst at the same time following *Chart 1* and *2* at each of the 4 raglan panels.

Change to circular needle 10 mm, and p 1 rnd, whilst at the same time placing 4 rM's in the following way:

- P 2 (2) 3 (3) 4 (4) 5 (5) sts (*back*), and then place rM1 at the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 1*, and then place rM2 at the right side needle.



- P 7 (7) 7 (7) 7 (7) 7 (7) sts (*sleeve 1*), and then place rM3 at the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 2*, and then place rM4 at the right side needle.
- P 3 (3) 5 (5) 7 (7) 9 (9) sts (*front*), and then place rM5 at the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 1*, and then place rM6 at the right side needle.
- P 7 (7) 7 (7) 7 (7) 7 (7) sts (*sleeve 2*), and then place rM7 at the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 2*, and then place rM4 at the right side needle.
- P 1 (1) 2 (2) 3 (3) 4 (4) sts (*back*).
- You are now back at M1, and the work has been divided into the 4 raglan panels.

Now, continue to knit the raglan increases and cables in the following way:

1st rnd

- P until reaching rM1, m1R purlwise, and then move rM1 to the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 1*, move rM2 to the right side needle, and then m1L purlwise.
- P until reaching rM3, m1R purlwise, and then move rM3 to the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 2*, move rM4 to the right side needle, and then m1L purlwise.
- P until reaching rM5, m1R purlwise, and then move rM5 to the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 1*, move rM6 to the right side needle, and then m1L purlwise.
- P until reaching rM7, m1R purlwise, and then move rM7 to the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 2*, move rM8 to the right side needle, and then m1L purlwise.
- P until reaching M1.

2nd rnd

- P until reaching rM1, and then move rM1 to the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 1*, and then move rM2 to the right side needle.
- P until reaching rM3, and then move rM3 to the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 2*, and then move rM4 to the right side needle.
- P until reaching rM5, and then move rM5 to the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 1*, and then move rM6 to the right side needle.
- P until reaching rM7, and then move rM7 to the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 2*, and then move rM8 to the right side needle.
- P until reaching M1.

Knit the *1st-2nd rnd* in a total of 15 (16) 17 (18) 19 (20) 21 (22) times.

There are now 172 (180) 192 (200) 212 (220) 232 (240) sts on the needle.

On the next rnd, divide the work for body and sleeves in the following way:

- P until reaching rM1, and then move rM1 to the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 1*, and then move rM2 to the right side needle.
- Place the next 37 (39) 41 (43) 45 (47) 49 (51) sts on a thread to rest (*sleeve 1*), and then move rM2 to the right side needle.
- Cast on 7 (9) 11 (13) 15 (17) 19 (21) sts, and place a M (sM1) after the 3. (4.) 5. (6.) 7. (8.) 9. (10.) newly made st - let sM1 rest in the work whilst knitting the body.
- Knit *Chart 2*, and then move rM4 to the right side needle.
- P until reaching rM5, and then move rM5 to the right side needle.
- Knit *Chart 1*, and then move rM6 to the right side needle.
- Place the next 37 (39) 41 (43) 45 (47) 49 (51) sts on a thread to rest (*sleeve 2*), and then move rM7 to the right side needle.
- Cast on 7 (9) 11 (13) 15 (17) 19 (21) sts, and place a M (sM2) after the 3. (4.) 5. (6.) 7. (8.) 9. (10.) newly made st - let sM2 rest in the work whilst knitting the body.
- Knit *Chart 2*, move rM8 to the right side needle, and then p the remaining sts.



The work has now been divided, and there is a total of 112 (122) 132 (142) 152 (162) 172 (182) sts on the needle for the body.

Body

Now, the body of the sweater must be knitted in the following way:

1st rnd

- P until reaching rM1, and then move rM1 to the right side needle.
- Knit Chart 1, and then move rM2 to the right side needle.
- P until reaching rM3, and then move rM3 to the right side needle.
- Knit Chart 2, and then move rM4 to the right side needle.
- P until reaching rM5, and then move rM5 to the right side needle.
- Knit Chart 1, and then move rM6 to the right side needle.
- P until reaching rM7, and then move rM7 to the right side needle.
- Knit Chart 2, and then move rM8 to the right side needle.
- P until reaching M1.

Repeat the *1st rnd*, until the sweater is 44 (46) 48 (50) 52 (54) 56 (58) cm, measured from below the neckline and downwards. Should you wish to make the sweater shorter/longer, continue until it is 16 cm from being the preferred length.

On the next rnd, 8 pM's must be placed, to mark from where sts later must be picked up for the 8 I-cord ribbons, which will form the 4 finishing bows.

Knit the rnd in the following way:

- P until reaching rM1, and then remove rM1 from the work.
- K 4 sts, and place a marking thread in the 4 sts just knitted (pM1)
- K the next 4 sts, and place a marking thread in the 4 sts just knitted (pM2)
- Remove rM2 from the work.
- P until reaching rM1, and then remove rM3 from the work.
- K 4 sts, and place a marking thread in the 4 sts just knitted (pM3)
- K the next 4 sts, and place a marking thread in the 4 sts just knitted (pM4)
- Remove rM4 from the work.
- P until reaching rM5, and then remove rM1 from the work.
- K 4 sts, and place a marking thread in the 4 sts just knitted (pM5)
- K the next 4 sts, and place a marking thread in the 4 sts just knitted (pM6)
- Remove rM6 from the work.
- P until reaching rM7, and then remove rM1 from the work.
- K 4 sts, and place a marking thread in the 4 sts just knitted (pM7)
- K the next 4 sts, and place a marking thread in the 4 sts just knitted (pM8)
- Remove rM8 from the work, and p the remaining sts.

Let the 8 pM's rest in the work, whilst the 2 finishing rib edges of the body are being knitted.

Now, the body must be divided into front and back, in order to create 2 separate rib edges, which will form a slit in each side of the work.

This is done in the following way:

Break the yarn, and move BOR to sM1.

Starting from the RS at sM1, place the 56 (61) 66 (71) 76 (81) 86 (91) sts of the back on a thread to rest. Then, place the next 56 (61) 66 (71) 76 (81) 86 (91) sts of the front on circular needle 9 mm.



Starting from the RS, join the yarn to the work, and knit the front rib edge in the following way:

1st (RS): P 1 (p2tog) p 1 (p2tog) p 1 (p2tog) p 1 (p2tog), k 1, *p 1, k 1*,
and repeat *-* throughout the row.

2nd (WS): Knit *p 1, k 1*, and repeat *-* throughout the row.

3rd (RS): Knit *p 1, k 1*, and repeat *-* throughout the row.

4th (WS): Knit *p 1, k 1*, and repeat *-* throughout the row.

Repeat the *3rd-4th row* until the edge measures 16 cm.

On the next row from the RS, bind off all sts using the method Italian Bind Off.

Now, knit the rib edge of the back in the same way.

Sleeves

Now, the 2 sleeves must be knitted.

Start by establishing the sts for *sleeve 1* in the following way:

- With needle size 10 mm, and starting at sM1 from the RS, pick up 4 (5) 6 (7) 8 (9) 10 (11) sts directly in the armhole cast on row (the new sts are to the left of sM1).
- In continuation hereof, place the 37 (39) 41 (43) 45 (47) 49 (51) resting sleeve sts on the needle.
- In continuation hereof, pick up 3 (4) 5 (6) 7 (8) 9 (10) sts directly in the armhole cast on row (the new sts are to the right of sM1).

There is now a total of 44 (48) 52 (56) 60 (64) 68 (72) sts on the needle.

Let sM1 follow down along the sleeve, as it marks BOR.

Join the yarn to the work.

Now, continue to purl in the rnd, until the sleeve is 26,5 (26,5) 27 (27) 27,5 (27,5) 28 (28) cm in total, measured from the armhole cast on row and downwards. Should you wish to knit the sleeve shorter/longer, continue to purl in the rnd until it is 16 cm from being the preferred length.

Change to circular needle 9 mm, and continue, by knitting rib in the (*k 1, p 1*) rnd, until the edge measures 16 cm.

Break the yarn, and bind off all the sts using the method Italian Bind Off.

Knit sleeve 2 in the same way.

I-cord ribbons

Each of the 4 cables, must now be completed with a finishing I-cord bow.

Each of the 4 bows consists of 2 separate I-cord ribbons, where each I-cord is 4 sts in width.

Now, knit the first bow in the following way:

1st I-cord ribbon

Starting at pM1 from the RS, pick up the 4 marked sts with circular needle 9 mm.

Now, knit the I-cord ribbon from the RS on each row in the following way:

Knit *k 4, place the 4 sts back onto the left side needle*.

Repeat *-* until the I-cord ribbon measures 35 cm in total.

When the right length is secured, finish the I-cord ribbon by lifting the 3 sts furthest to the right,



over the 1 st furthest to the left.
Break the yarn, pull the thread through the remaining st, and tighten.

2nd I-cord ribbon

Starting at pM2 from the RS, pick up the 4 marked sts with circular needle 9 mm.
Now, knit the I-cord ribbon from the RS on each row in the following way:

Knit *k 4, place the 4 sts back onto the left side needle*.
Repeat *-* until the I-cord ribbon measures 35 cm in total.

When the right length is secured, finish the I-cord ribbon by lifting the 3 sts furthest to the right, over the 1 st furthest to the left.
Break the yarn, pull the thread through the remaining st, and tighten.

The 2 I-cord ribbons have now been knitted.

Now, knit the remaining 6 I-cord ribbons in the same way as the *1st I-cord ribbon* (pM3, pM5, and pM7) and the *2nd I-cord ribbon* (pM4, pM6, and pM8), and then finish by tying the 4 bows.

Finishing

- Weave in all ends.
- Rinse the sweater in lukewarm water with wool soap, lay it into shape, and let it dry laying flat.




CB8: Place 4 sts on a cable needle behind the work, k 4, k 4 sts from the cable needle.

CF8: Place 4 sts on a cable needle in front of the work, k 4, k 4 sts from the cable needle.
