**st(s)** // stitch(es)

**s1wyif** // slip 1 st with yarn held in front

## About

**Sizes:** a (b) c (d) e (f) g (h).

**Your bust circumference:** Ca. 80 (90) 100 (110) 120 (130) 140 (150) cm.

**Positive ease:** This blouse has a fitted yoke with an ease at approx 5-0 cm, whilst the body and sleeves have free width. When deciding which size to knit, choose the one which corresponds to your own actual bust circumference, and choose the smaller size if in between sizes.

**Full length, measured from the shoulder and down:** Ca 52 (54) 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 (66) cm.

**Gauge:** 16 sts x 22 rows = 10 x 10 cm in laced Stockinette Stitch, at needle size 6 mm (after wash).

**Needle sizes:** Circular needles 5 + 5,5 + 6 mm (the lengths 40, 60 and 80 cm are recommended). Double pointed needles 5 mm (unless the method "Magic Loop" is used).

**Yarn:** The blouse is knitted with 2 different threads of yarn held together.

*1st thread:* "Luna", by Permin (175 m pr 50 g), in the colour "Kalksten".

*2nd thread:* "Bella", by Permin (145 m pr 50 g), in the colour "Mist".

**Amount:** *1st thread:* 300 (300) 350 (400) 450 (500) 550 (600)g.

*2nd thread:* 300 (350) 400 (450) 500 (550) 600 (600)g.

**Other:** Cable needle 5 mm and 10 mm elastic tread for the waist (length needed: your waist circumference -5cm) and neckline (length needed: the length of the neckline hem -5 cm) of the blouse.

**Method:** The blouse is knitted top-down in the round following a laced chart throughout the work. First, the fitted yoke is knitted, and then stitches are picked up along its cast on row for the sleeves. The sleeves are knitted in the round, following the chart, and are finished with a 1x1 twisted rib edge, in which a row of eyelet holes is knitted, for the insertion of an I-cord ribbon. To form the body, stitches are picked up along the bind off row of the yoke - and to make the body more voluminous, a series of increases are made on the first round. Hereafter, the body is knitted in the round, following the chart, and finished with a 1x1 twisted rib edge. Lastly, stitches are picked up along the neckline, for a finishing hem in 1x1 twisted rib, and an elastic band is inserted into the hem, as well as in the bind off row of the yoke.

### Before you begin

- Please read the entire pattern before casting on.
  - Be sure to make a swatch before beginning, to ensure the right gauge.
  - In this pattern, the following methods are used: 1x1 twisted rib (k 1 tbl, p 1), KFB, Italian Bind Off, Stockinette Stitch, right- and left leaning decreases and increases, 3- needle knitting.

## Pattern

### Yoke

With needle size 5,5 mm, cast on 126 (140) 154 (168) 182 (196) 210 (224) sts.

Gather work, and place a M between the first and last st = CB and BOR.

K 1 rnd, whilst at the same time placing a marking thread in each side of the work:

Place the 1st thread after the 31. (35.) 38. (42.) 45. (49.) 52. (56.) st = sM1.

Place the 2nd thread after the 94. (96.) 115. (126.) 136. (147.) 157. (168.) st = sM2.

In addition, place a 3rd thread between the first and last st of the rnd = sM3.



Let the 3 marking threads rest in the work whilst knitting the yoke, as they later must be used, when sts are picked up for sleeves and neckline.

Now, knit the next 4 rnds in the following way:

*1st rnd:* P all sts throughout the rnd.

*2nd rnd:* Knit \*k2tog, yo\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

*3rd rnd:* P all sts throughout the rnd.

*4th rnd:* K all sts throughout the rnd.

On the next rnd, *Chart 1* begins.

*Chart 1* is 20 rnds in height, and 14 sts in width, and the 14 sts must be repeated throughout each of the 20 rnds.

Repeat knitting *Chart 1*, until the yoke is 17 (18) 19 (20) 21 (22) 23 (24) cm, measured from the cast on row (should you wish to make the the yoke longer or shorter, repeat *Chart 1* until the right length is reached).

Let the last knitted rnd, either be rnd 1, 5, 8, 12, 13, 16 or 20 from *Chart 1*.

Now, the next 5 rnds are knitted in the following way:

*1st rnd:* K all sts throughout the rnd.

*2nd rnd:* P all sts throughout the rnd.

*3rd rnd:* Knit \*k2tog, yo\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

*4th rnd:* P all sts throughout the rnd.

*5th rnd:* K all sts throughout the rnd, and place a marking thread CB - the tread marks the rnd from where sts later must be picked up for the body.

The yoke is now completed.

Bind off all sts (not to tight), and break the yarn.

### Sleeves

Now, sts for the first sleeve must be established - this is done by both picking up and casting on sts in the following way:

With needle size 5 mm and starting from the RS at sM1, pick up 15 sts along the cast on row of the yoke (the 15 are to the left of sM1).

In continuation of the 15 picked up sts, cast on 50 (52) 54 (56) 58 (60) 62 (64) sts.

In continuation of the cast on sts, pick up 15 sts along the cast on row of the yoke, starting 15 sts to the right of sM1.

You are now back at sM1, and have a total of 80 (82) 84 (86) 88 (90) 92 (94) sts on the needle.

K 1 rnd, whilst at the same time placing a M between the first and last st = BOR.

Change to circular needle 5,5 mm and knit the next 4 rnds in the following way:

*1st rnd:* P all sts throughout the rnd.

*2nd rnd:* Knit \*k2tog, yo\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

*3rd rnd:* P all sts throughout the rnd.

*4th rnd:* K all sts throughout the rnd, whilst at the same time evenly increasing the stitch count to 84 (84) 84 (98) 98 (98) 112 (112) sts, using the method m1L.

(Please note, that size C already have the correct stitch count, and should not be adjusted).



On the next rnd, *Chart 1* begins.

*Chart 1* is 20 rnds in height, and 14 sts in width, and the 14 sts must be repeated throughout each of the 20 rnds.

Change to circular needles 6 mm, and repeat knitting *Chart 1*, until the sleeve is 56 (56) 57 (57) 58 (58) 59 (59) cm, measured from the cast on row (should you wish to make the sleeve longer or shorter, repeat *Chart 1* until it is 7 cm from being the preferred length).

Let the last knitted rnd, either be rnd 1, 5, 8, 12, 13, 16 or 20 from *Chart 1*.

Change to circular needles 5,5 mm and knit increases on the next and, to make the sleeve slightly puffy:

Knit \*k2tog\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

There is now a total of 42 (42) 42 (49) 49 (49) 56 (56) sts on the needle.

Now, the next 3 rnds are knitted in the following way:

*1st rnd:* Knit \*k2tog, yo\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

*2nd rnd:* P all sts throughout the rnd.

*3rd rnd:* K all sts throughout the rnd.

Change to circular needle 5 mm, and knit the next 12 rnds in the following way:

*1st-5th rnd:* Knit \*k 1 tbl, p 1\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

*6th rnd:* Knit \*k2tog tbl, yo, k 1 tbl, p 1\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd (eyelet row, for the insertion of an I-cord ribbon).

*7th-12th rnd:* Knit \*k 1 tbl, p 1\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

Break the yarn, and bind off all sts using the method Italian Bind Off.

*Knit the 2nd sleeve in the same way.*

### **I-cord ribbons**

Now, to I-cord ribbons must be knitted separately.

Knit the first ribbon, following the instructions below:

Cast on 5 sts at needle size 5 mm, and place them onto the leftside needle.

Continue to knit the I-cord only from the RS in the following way:

Knit \*k 5, place the 5 sts back onto the leftside needle\*, and repeat \*-\* until the I-cord measures 70 (70) 72 (72) 76 (76) 78 (78) cm.

Now, finish the I-cord by lifting the 4 sts furthest to the right, over the 1 st furthest to the left.

Break the yarn, pull the thread through the remaining st, and tighten.

*Knit the 2nd I-cord ribbon in the same way.*

### **Body**

Now, sts for the body must be established, by picking up sts at the yoke in the following way:

Starting at CB by the marking thread from the RS, pick up 126 (140) 154 (168) 182 (196) 210 (224) sts with needle size 5 mm along the bind off row of the yoke.



On the first row, a series of increases are knitted, to make the body more voluminous:

Knit \*KFB\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

There is now a total of 252 (280) 308 (336) 364 (392) 420 (448) sts on the needle.

On the next rnd, *Chart 1* begins. *Chart 1* is 20 rnds in height, and 14 sts in width, and the 14 sts must be repeated throughout each of the 20 rnds.

Change to circular needles 6 mm, and repeat knitting *Chart 1*, until the body is 17 (18) 19 (20) 21 (22) 23 (24) cm, measured from the increase rnd and downwards (should you wish to make the the body longer or shorter, repeat *Chart 1* until it is 5 cm from being the preferred length).

Let the last knitted rnd, either be rnd 1, 5, 8, 12, 13, 16 or 20 from *Chart 1*.

Change to circular needles 5,5 mm and knit the next 5 rnds in the following way:

*1st rnd:* K all sts throughout the rnd.

*2nd rnd:* P all sts throughout the rnd.

*3rd rnd:* Knit \*k2tog, yo\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

*4th rnd:* P all sts throughout the rnd.

*5th rnd:* K all sts throughout the rnd.

Change to circular needle 5 mm, and knit the next 7 rnds in the following way:

*1st-7th rnd:* Knit \*k 1 tbl, p 1\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

Break the yarn, and bind off all sts using the method Italian Bind Off.

### Neckline

Now, the neckline in 1x1 twisted rib must be knitted - start by establishing the sts along the cast on rows of the yoke and sleeves, as instructed below:

With needle size 5 mm and starting from the RS by the marking sM3 thread CB, pick up 16 (20) 23 (27) 30 (34) 37 (41) sts along the cast on row of the yoke (back).

In continuation hereof, pick up 50 (52) 54 (56) 58 (60) 62 (64) sts along the cast on row of the first sleeve (shoulder 1).

In continuation hereof, pick up 33 (40) 47 (54) 61 (68) 75 (82) sts along the cast on row of the yoke (front).

In continuation hereof, pick up 50 (52) 54 (56) 58 (60) 62 (64) sts along the cast on row of the second sleeve (shoulder 2).

In continuation hereof, pick up 16 (20) 23 (27) 30 (34) 37 (41) sts along the cast on row of the yoke (back).

You are now back at sM3, and has a total of 166 (184) 202 (220) 238 (256) 274 (292) sts on the needle.

Place a M between the first and last picked up st = CB and BOR.

Now, knit the neckline hem in the following way:

*1st rnd:* Knit \*k 1 tbl, p 1\* and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd. Place a marking thread between the first and last st on this row, and let it rest until the hem must be formed.

*2nd-11th rnd:* Knit \*k 1 tbl, p 1\* and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

*12th rnd:* Knit k2tog tbl, yo (eyelet hole for the elastic thread, which later must be inserted into the hem), \*k 1 tbl, p 1\* and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

*13th-16th rnd:* \*k 1 tbl, p 1\* and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.



Let the sts rest on the needle.

Now, the neckline must be folded, and knitted together using the method 3-needle bind off, to create the hem.

This is done in the following way:

With a new set of 5 mm circular needles, and starting from the WS at the marking thread, pick up 166 (184) 202 (220) 238 (256) 274 (292)sts along the marked horizontal row.

Place the 2 needles with their WS facing each other, so that the hem will be knitted together from the WS.

Now, finish the hem, by knitting the next rnd in the following way (make sure not to bind off too tight, nor too loosely):

K2tog \*k2tog (1 st from each needle), bind off 1 st\*, and repeat \*-\* throughout the rnd.

Break the yarn.

### **Finishing**


- Weave in all ends.
- Rinse the blouse in lukewarm water with wool soap, lay it into shape, and let it dry laying flat.
- To secure the right fit of the blouse, 10 mm elastic thread must now be inserted into the neckline and waistline in the following way:

*From the WS of the work, weave in an elastic thread in the bind off row of the yoke - tighten the elastic, until the blouse becomes fitted at the waist, and finish by tying a knot.*

*From the eyelet hole at CB, insert an elastic thread in the neckline - tighten the elastic, until the blouse becomes fitted and doesn't slide off the shoulders. Finish, by tying a knot.*
