BIG BIRD VEST

It is a structure that knits the upper part of the back first, picks up the stitches from the shoulder, knits the right and left upper part, and then connects the three panels at the armpits and knits the body as one panel of knitting to complete the structure.

Materials

3.5mm, 4.5mm, 6.0mm needles
tapestry needle
4 buttons or a zipper

Yarn

Gepard Teddy Dear (referred to as T Yarn hereinafter)
Gepard Woolia (referred to as W Yarn hereinafter)

*Please refer to the size guide for the amount of yarn required.

Gauge(6mm needles)

10 x 10(cm) / 12 set stitches x 19 rows

*Measurements were made based on after washing.

Due to the nature of the yarn and the double knitting structure, both the stitches and rows stretch after washing.
“Be sure to check the gauge after washing.”

Similarly, it may feel smaller than expected during work, but once it's washed after completion, it will be finished similar to the guide size.

***The double knitting technique is used for all work in flat parts of this pattern.**

Set stitches

In this pattern, the unit of stitches for double knitting is called ‘set stitches’.

Set stitches that Knit with T Yarn and Purl with W Yarn. It is marked with  on the chart.



Set stitches that Knit with W Yarn and Purl with T Yarn. It is marked with  on the chart.



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Chart

The chart was made based on the ‘RS’, which is mainly worked with T Yarn (boucle yarn).

Read the rows from bottom to top.

Read odd number rows from right to left, and read even number rows from left to right.

In even number rows, the yarn indicated by the chart is exchanged.

-  **Set SSK**
Rearrange the two set stitches into 2 knit stitches and 2 purl stitches, then SSK and P2tog.
-  **Set K2tog**
Rearrange the two set stitches into 2 knit stitches and 2 purl stitches, then K2tog and SSP.
-  **Volume row 1**
Slip T Yarn stitch, knit W Yarn stitch, bind off with slipped T Yarn stitch.
-  **Volume row 3**
Backward loop cast on with T Yarn, bring W Yarn to front and purl with W Yarn and bring W Yarn to back.
-  **Set turn from RS**
-  **Set turn from WS**
-  **Set increase stitches (any preferred method)**
-  **Set backward loop cast on**


**All directions in the design (right chest, left chest, etc.) are based on when worn.

**Because a total of 3 sizes of needles are used, pay attention to when it changes.

**It's not recommended to be machine washed as there is a risk of them becoming felted.

**Both edges of all knit in flat use the ‘knit double knitting side neatly’ method. Use this method except when joining a new yarn because of the structure, and right after the rows which use special techniques.

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
1. Facing the RS of the back, pick up the stitches only from the outside layer.

Start picking up from the **17th (18th) 19th (20th) 21st** loop of the left end to the right. Leave T Yarn to the left with the required length (60cm), pick up **17 (18) 19 (20) 21** stitches from right to left. At this time, pick up with the left yarn, not the yarn connected to the ball.




2. Facing the WS of the back, pick up the stitches only from the inside layer.

Pick up **17(18)19(20)21** stitches from right to left with W Yarn.
3. **Turn to face the RS of the back.**
Combine the stitches picked up in 1 and 2 into a set stitch in the order of T Yarn and W Yarn on one needle (4.5mm).

After completing one row (first row of Part. 4 chart) of Part. 3 (left front), make 5 (5) 5 (5) 6 set stitches. Then, work one row (first row of Part. 4 chart) of Part. 1 (back) following the pattern. Make 5 (5) 5 (5) 6 set stitches again. Finally, work one row (first row of Part. 4 chart) of Part. 2 (right front). Now left front, back, and right front are connected.



Starting from the Row 2 of the chart, work in flat according to the chart key.

Because there is a difference in the total rows of the back and left/right fronts, **Count from the first row as Row 1 again on the Part. 4 chart.**


Work on **29(32)34(36)39** set stitches at the bottom of the right front according to the chart key. Break both yarns with about 15cm of yarn tail, then leave all the stitches to rest. The stitches on the rest will be used for the i-cord edging.

Please note that the Part. 5 chart starts from the WS (even number rows).




Continue from Part. 4, work on **29(32)34(36)39** set stitches at the bottom of the left front according to the chart key. Leave all stitches on the right front and back to rest, and only work on the left front. Break both yarns with about 15cm of yarn tail, then leave all the stitches to rest. The stitches on the rest will be used for the i-cord edging.

Please note that the Part. 7 chart starts from the WS (even number rows).






Part. 8

Using a **3.5mm needle**, pick up stitches starting from the back neck line and knit i-cord using the accent color W Yarn.


**All stitches are picked up facing the RS.

You can start knitting the i-cord after picking up all the stitches, or you can go ahead and pick up some stitches and knit the i-cord to a certain extent, then pick up more stitches and knit the i-cord again. In the latter case, the accent color W yarn is divided into two skeins that will be used separately for picking up the stitches and knitting the i-cord.

In the same way, pick up the stitches from the armhole and make i-cord.


Using a **4.5 mm needle**, pick up stitches to knit pockets. Pick up **21(23)25(25)27** stitches regardless of the number of stitches in the pocket area indicated.

*For pockets, knit with W yarn of desired color. Feel free to create mismatched color pockets or add a horizontal color line.

The first row that knits after picking up the stitches is Row 1.

Row 1 / slip 1 st as purl side, purl to the end.

Row 2 / slip 1 st as knit side, knit to the end.



Repeat 'Row1-2' until the vertical length of the pocket marked on the body remains about 4cm (same for all sizes).

Knit 1x1 rib for the remaining area and bind off tightly. Even when knitting the rib, keep slipping the first stitch. (The rib is also knitted with the same 4.5mm needles.)

Sew both vertical sides of the pocket with a tapestry needle according to the area of the pocket on the body.

Part. 11 Finish the vest with buttons or zippers. If the process of making a button loop with knitting needles is difficult, you can make a loop with a crochet hook and sew it.
