



Baby Goose Knit Pattern

Supplies:

To create the goose you will need.

- 1. Yarn: Alize Alpaca Royal (250 m per 100 g)**
 - * For body - shade 01 (off-white)
 - * For beak, feet – shade 36 (terra-cotta)
- 2. Yarn: LanaGold 800**
 - * For headband - shade 386
- 3. Knitting needles size 1.5 mm - 4 pcs (please use the needles size appropriate for your yarn, in case you use yarn other than indicated above).**
- 4. 3 mm beads - 2 pcs**
- 5. Needle for sewing pieces.**
- 6. Pins for securing pieces.**
- 7. Polyester for stuffing.**
- 8. Comfortable scissors.**
- 9. Tweezers to help stuffing the toy.**

Please note.

All main pieces are worked in the round, knitwise through front strand.

Increase – make one through back strand (make 1 towards) and through front strand (make 1 away). This technique will help you avoid holes in the fabric.

Decrease working 2 stitches together through front strand.

Head

Sign *n, refers to n - number of repeats in a round. Each round uses all 3 needles.

Cast on 12 stitches and arrange them on 3 needles - 4 stitches on each needle. Join in the round. (pic. 1)

1 rnd: (1 K st, y.o., 2K st, y.o., 1 K st)*3 = 18 st

2 rnd: 18 K st

3 rnd: (2 K st, y.o., 3 K st, y.o., 1 K st)*3 = 24 st

4 rnd: 24 K st

5 rnd: (3 K st, y.o., 4 K st, y.o., 1 K st)*3 = 30 st

6 rnd: 30 K st

7 rnd: (4 K st, y.o., 5 K st, y.o., 1 K st)*3 = 36 st

8-23 rnd: (16 rnds) – 36 K st


24 rnd: (4 K st dec, 4 K st, dec) *3 = 30 st

25 rnd: (3 K st dec, 3 K st, dec) *3 = 24 st


26 rnd: (2 K st, dec, 2 K st, dec) *3 = 18 st

27 rnd: (1 K st, dec, 1 K st, dec) *3 = 12 st

*Cut yarn leaving a 20 cm long tail.
Slip the stitches from the knitting
needle using a sewing needle. (pic.
3,2). Do not cinch closed, you will use
this hole for stuffing later.*



Head



Close the initial hole and weave in.(pic. 4) In the end the top of the head should have a snowflake look.(pic. 5)

Please note, it is better to go through each second stitch, the piece will look neater this way.

Carefully stuff the head. Close the hole and weave in.(pic. 6,7)

Body

Sign *n, refers to n - number of repeats in a round. Each round uses all 3 needles.

Cast on 12 stitches and arrange them on 3 needles - 4 stitches on each needle. Join in the round.

1 rnd: (1 K st, y.o., 2K st, y.o., 1 K st)*3 = 18 st

2 rnd: 18 K st

3 rnd: (2 K st, y.o., 3 K st, y.o., 1 K st)*3 = 24 st

4 rnd: 24 K st

5 rnd: (3 K st, y.o., 4 K st, y.o., 1 K st)*3 = 30 st

6 rnd: 30 K st

7 rnd: (4 K st, y.o., 5 K st, y.o., 1 K st)*3 = 36 st

8-19 rnd: (12 rnds) – 36 K st

20 rnd: (4 K st dec, 4 K st, dec) *3 = 30 st

21-23 rnd: (3 rnds) -30 K st

24 rnd: (3 K st dec, 3 K st, dec) *3 = 24 st

25-26 rnd: (2 rnds)- 24 K st

27 rnd: (2 K st, dec, 2 K st, dec) *3 = 18 st

28-29 rnd: (2 rnds) – 18 K st

30 rnd: (1 K st, dec, 1 K st, dec) *3 = 12 st

31-32 rnd: (2 rnds) – 12 K st

Cut yarn leaving a 20 cm long tail.

Slip the stitches from the knitting needle using a sewing needle (pic. 8)

Close the initial hole. Weave in.

Stuff the body carefully(pic. 9)

Close the hole at the end.

Do not cut yarn, you will use this tail to sew the body to the head.



Wings

Cast on 9 stitches. Leave a 15 cm long yarn tail. You will use the tail to sew on wings later.

1-20 rnd: (20 rnds) - Sel st, 8 K st = 9 st

20 rnd: Sel st, dec, 3 K st, dec, 1 K st = 7 st


21 rnd: Sel st, 6 K st = 7 st

22 rnd: Sel st, dec, 1 K st, dec, 1 K st = 5 st

23 rnd: Sel st, 4 K st = 5 st

24 rnd: Sel st, (dec) *2 = 3 st

Slip the stitches from the knitting needle using a sewing needle (pic. 10) and cinch together. Weave in (pic. 11).
Knit the second wing in the same manner (pic. 12).



Feet - option 1

There are two options of knitting feet in the pattern.

Cast on 20 stitches, leaving a 15 cm yarn tail. Arrange the stitches on 3 needles - 7*7*6 (pic. 13\1)

1-7 (7 rnds) 20 K st

8 rnd: 1 K st, dec, 4 K st, dec, 2 K st, dec,
4 K st, dec, 1 K st = 16 st

9-10 (2 rnds) 16 K st

11 rnd: 1 K st, (dec, 2 K st)*3, dec, 1 K st = 12 st



12-14 (3 rnds) 12 K st

Move the stitches on a sewing needle and cinch closed.

Leave a 20cm yarn tail.(pic. 13\2)

Stitch up the beginning of the knitting and weave in.(pic. 13\3)

Knit the second foot in the same manner.(pic. 13/4)



Feet - option 2

Cast on 20 stitches using Judy's magic cast-on method - 10 stitches on each needle (pic. 13)

1-2 (2 rnds) 20 K st (pic. 14)

Arrange the stitches on 3 needles (7 st, 7 st, 6 st) (pic. 15)

3-7 (5 rnds) 20 K st

8 rnd: 1 K st, dec, 4 K st, dec, 2 K st, dec,
4 K st, dec, 1 K st = 16 st

9-10 (2 rnds) 16 K st




11 rnd: 1 K st, (dec, 2 K st)*3, dec, 1 K st = 12 st

12-14 (3 rnds) 12 K st

Move the stitches on a sewing needle and cinch closed.

Leave a 20 cm yarn tail. (pic. 16)

Knit the second foot in the same manner.(pic. 17)



Beak

There are two options of knitting the beak in the pattern.



Beak - option 1.

The flat beak, the edges rolled downwards. A goose with such a beak looks older. Ideal for a boy goose.



Beak - option 2.

The beak is wider at the base. A goose with such a beak looks more cute. Ideal for a girl goose.

Beak - option 1

Cast on 30 stitches using Judy's magic cast-on method - 15 stitches on each needle.

1-2 (2 rnds) 30 K st

Arrange the stitches on 3 needles – 10 stitches on each needle.

3-7 (5 rnds) 30 K st

Bind off leaving a 20 cm long yarn tail.(pic. 18)



Beak - option 2

Cast on 18 stitches and arrange them on 3 needles - 6 stitches on each needle. Join in the round.

1-2 (2 rnds) 18 K st

3 rnd: 1 K st, y.o., 7 K st, y.o., 2 K st, y.o., 7 K st, y.o., 1 K st

4 rnd: 22 K st

5 rnd: 1 K st, y.o., 9 K st, y.o., 2 K st, y.o., 9 K st, y.o., 1 K st

6 rnd: 26 K st

7 rnd: 1 K st, y.o., 11 K st, y.o., 2 K st, y.o., 11 K st, y.o., 1 K st

8 rnd: 30 K st Bind off leaving a 20 cm long yarn tail.



Stitch up the beginning of knitting.
(pic. 19, 20)

Tail

Cast on 6 stitches and arrange them on 3 needles - 2 stitches on each needle. Join in the round.(pic. 21)

1-2 (2 rnds) 6 K st

3 rnd: (1 K st, y.o.)*2, 2 K st, (y.o., 1 K st)*2.= 10 st


4 rnd: 10 K st

5 rnd: 1 K st, y.o., 3 K st, y.o., 2 K st, y.o., 3 K st, y.o., 1 K st= 14 st

6 rnd: 14 K st

Bind off leaving a 20 cm long yarn tail.

Stitch up the beginning of knitting and weave in (pic. 22).



Assembly

Sew the head to the body.

Sew carefully going through the head and body stitches in turn. (pic. 23)

Weave in. (pic. 24)

In the photos I show the beak 1 being sewn on, beak 2 is sewn the same way.

Pin the beak edges at the level of round 18 (pic. 26), top of the beak – at round 14 (pic. 25), bottom of the beak - at round 24 (pic. 27)

Carefully sew the beak around and weave in. (pic. 28,29)

Assembly



Sew on wings

Secure them with pins prior to sewing, a little tilted. As if your goose folded them (pic. 30)

Carefully sew the wings and weave in.

Sew on feet and tail.

Secure all the pieces placing your goose on a flat surface, for the way your goose will sit depends on the feet and tail location.

Once you pinned the feet and tail and your goose sits sturdily, you can sew the pieces to the body (pic. 31, 32).

Carefully sew and weave in.

You can locate eyes at your discretion. (pic. 33)

I placed them at the level of round 12 of the head, at both sides of the beak.

With strong black thread sew on eye beads, pulling on the thread a little when sewing to draw eyes closer to each other. (pic. 34)

You can embroider brows. To do this, just make 2 short stitches.

Headband

Knit using 2 strands of yarn.

Cast on 3 stitches.

1-2 (2 rnds) Sel st, 2 K st

3 rnd: Sel st, y.o., 1 K st, y.o., 1 K st

4 rnd: Sel st, 4 K st

5 rnd: Sel st, y.o., 3 K st, y.o., 1 K st

6 rnd: Sel st, 6 K st

7 rnd: Sel st, y.o., 5 K st, y.o., 1 K st

8 rnd: Sel st, 8 K st

9 rnd: Sel st, y.o., 7 K st, y.o., 1 K st

10 rnd: Sel st, 10 K st

11 rnd: Sel st, y.o., 9 K st, y.o., 1 K st

12 -121. (110 rnds) Sel st, 12 K st

122 rnd: Sel st, dec, 7 K st, dec., 1 K st

123 rnd: Sel st, 10 K st

124 rnd: Sel st, dec, 5 K st, dec., 1 K st

125 rnd: Sel st, 8 K st

126 rnd: Sel st, dec, 3 K st, dec., 1 K st

127 rnd: Sel st, 6 K st

128 rnd: Sel st, dec, 1 K st, dec., 1 K st

129 rnd: Sel st, 4 K st

130 rnd: Sel st, dec*2

131 rnd: Sel st, 2 K st

Slip the stitches from the knitting needle using a sewing needle and cinch closed.

Weave in.(pic.35)

Put the headband on the head to define the circumference. And using the same yarn strand, tie the ends (pic. 36), spreading them to the sides (pic. 37)
