

BAGGU Pouch N°2

Introduction

BAGGU pouch N°2 is knitted in the round from bottom up without any seams. You can easily adjust the size in diameter and height as you want. The small squares in the pattern are there to help you count the rows.

Size

The sample measures 12 cm / 4 ¾ " in diameter and 15.5 cm / 6 " in maximum height, but you can adjust the size as you wish.

Gauge

Stockinette stitch blocked with 2.5 mm / 1 ½ US needles with 1 strand : 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" = 28 sts x 46 rows.

Material

Yarn : fingering 100g = 400m / 437 yds.

Yarns used for the sample :

- **Color A** : Maruma Yarn - Donegal mohair tweed - Noyer 2703 - 170 m / 185 yds / 42 g
- **Color B** : Maruma Yarn - Donegal mohair tweed - Plume 2715 - 170 m / 185 yds / 42 g

Needles : size N°1 : 4 mm / 6 US + size N°2 : 6 mm / 10 US + size N°3 : 3 mm / 4 US + size N°4 : 2.5 mm / 1 ½ US.

Accessories : 2 stop cords + 2 cord ends (You can easily find them on sites like Etsy.com)

Notions : 2 markers.

Abbreviations


CO : Cast on.
R : Row
RS : Right Side.
WS : Wrong Side.
inc : Increase.
dec : Decrease.
k : Knit.
p : Purl.

A : yarn color A.
B : yarn color B.

M : Marker.
Mbor : Marker beginning of round.
PM : Place marker.
PMbor : Place marker beginning of round.
RM : Remove marker.
RMbor : Remove marker beginning of round.
slMbor : Slip marker beginning of the round.

ssk : Slip, slip, knit : slip the first stitch knitwise, slip the second stitch knitwise, then slide the left-hand needle into the front part of both stitches and knit them together.
k2tog : Knit 2 sts together.
K2togTBL-drop1 : Knit 2 stitches together through back of loop removing only the first stitch off the left needle.
K2tog-drop1 : Knit 2 stitches together removing only the first stitch off the left needle.
KTBL : Knit through the back loop.
M1R : Make one Right : With the left needle, take the horizontal strand between the two stitches from back to front, then knit this stitch through the front loop.
sl2wyif : Slip 2 sts with yarn in front : bring yarn forward and slip the next 2 stitches purlwise.
sl : Slip purlwise.

Construction



Before you start :

The result of section 1 has to be dense and fairly rigid. Refer to the "needles" section on page 2 to know the needle sizes to use, however if the fabric you get is too loose or too tight, you can go up or down a needle size. If you change the size of needles N°1, don't forget to adjust the sizes of needles N°2, 3 and 4.

For example :

If you use 4.5 mm / 7 US for needles size N°1, so :

- for needles size N°2 : use 6.5 mm / 10 ½ US
- for needles size N°3 : use 3.5 mm / 4 US
- for needles size N°4 : use 3 mm / 2 ½ US

If you use 3.5 mm / 4 US for needles size N°1, so :

- for needles size N°2 : use 5.5 mm / 9 US
- for needles size N°3 : use 2.5 mm / 1 ½ US
- for needles size N°4 : use 2 mm / 0 US

SECTION 1 : the bottom

-> I-Cord : with 2 strands A held together and the needles size N°1, CO 3 sts, (put these 3 sts back on the left needle, k3) 2 times.

(The following tutorial photos show the knitting with light yarn for greater visibility but in the sample this part is knitted with the dark yarn)



□ **Step 1 (RS)** : with the 3sts on the right needle, turn the work 90° to the right, pick up and knit 1 st from the beginning of the I-Cord (1 st inc : 4 sts)



□ **Step 2 (RS)** : put these 4 sts back on left needle, k2, ssk. (1 st dec : 3 sts)

□ **Step 3 (RS)** : (put these 3 sts back on the left needle, k3) 2 times. (3 sts)

-> Repeat step 1 to step 3 2 more times :

-> From now on, turn the work like a snail to pick up the next stitch. Place the beginning of round marker on the front of the snail and not on the needle, like this :



-> You will need to move the marker closer to the edge as the diameter of the snail grows.

-> To pick up the stitches, take both legs of the stitch and make sure you always pick up in the same place as the snail turns :



□ **Step 4 (RS)** : (with the 3sts on the right needle, pick up and knit the next st along the snail, put these 4 sts back on the left needle, k2, ssk) repeat to Mbor.

□ **Step 5 (RS)** : repeat step 4.

□ **Step 6 (RS)** : (with the 3sts on the right needle, pick up and knit the next st along the snail, put these 4 sts back on the left needle, k2, ssk, put these 3 sts back on the left needle, k3) repeat to Mbor.

-> Repeat step 4 to step 6 up to the desired diameter stopping at the Mbor. (the sample measures 14 cm / 5.5" in diameter). Your snail has to stay flat, if there is a blister it means the stitch is not picked up in the right place.



-> To make it lay nice and flat, iron the snail. (use a damp cloth to protect it from the iron)

-> Pick up and knit all st around the snail, PMbor. Make sure to have an even stitch count (for the sample 118 sts)



SECTION 2 :

□ **R1 (RS)** : with 2 strands A held together and the needles size N°2, k to Mbor, slMbor.

□ **R2 (RS)** : (k2togTBL-drop1) to 1 st before Mbor, sl the last st on the right needle, RMbor, sl this st back on the left needle, k2togTBL-drop1 one last time, sl the last knitted st from right to left needle, PMbor, sl this st back on the right needle.

-> Repeat R2 1 more time : □

□ **R3 (RS)** : (with 2 strands B held together k2togTBL-drop1, with 2 strands A held together k2togTBL-drop1) repeat to 1 st before Mbor, sl the last st before Mbor on the right needle, RMbor, sl this st back on the left needle, k2togTBL-drop1 one last time, sl the last knitted st from right to left needle, PMbor, sl this st back on the right needle, twist the next st on the left needle (= sl purlwise on the right needle then sl knitwise again on the left needle) before knitting the next row. Cut A.

□ **R4 (RS)** : with 2 strands B held together (k2tog-drop1) to 1 st before Mbor, sl the last st before Mbor on the right needle, RMbor, sl this st back on the left needle, k2tog-drop1 one last time, sl the last knitted st from right to left needle, PMbor, sl this st back on the right needle, twist the next st on the left needle (= sl purlwise on the right needle then sl purlwise again on the left needle) before knitting the next row.

□ **R5 (RS)** : with 2 strands B held together (k2togTBL-drop1) to 1 st before Mbor, sl the last st before Mbor on the right needle, RMbor, sl this st back on the left needle, k2togTBL-drop1 one last time, sl the last knitted st from right to left needle, PMbor, sl this st back on the right needle, twist the next st on the left needle (= sl purlwise on the right needle then sl knitwise again on the left needle) before knitting the next row.

-> Repeat R4 and R5 4 more times (or the desired height) :

R4 : □ □ □ □

R5 : □ □ □ □

-> Don't cut B.

□ **R6 (RS)** : from the beginning of the row, with 2 strands A held together and the needles size N°3, ktbl to Mbor, slMbor. Cut only one strand A.

SECTION 3 :

□ **R7 (RS)** : take back the 2 strands B held together and k to Mbor, slMbor.

-> Repeat R7 4 more times :

R7 : □ □ □ □

□ **R8 (RS)** : with the needles size N°4 k to Mbor, slMbor.

-> Repeat R8 4 more times :

R8 : □ □ □ □

□ R9 (RS) : * at the back of the work, with the left needle, pick up the color A bump st 11 rows below and k2tog the next st with this bump together * repeat between the two ** to Mbor, slMbor.



-> Cut B.

SECTION 4 :

□ R10 (RS) : take back the strand A and k to Mbor distributing 6 k2tog, slMbor. (6 sts dec. For the sample 112 sts)

□ R11 (RS) : k to Mbor, slMbor.

-> Repeat R11 until the length is sufficient to close the pouch (for the 14 cm / 5.5" diameter sample, R11 was repeated for 6 cm / 2.4")



-> Don't cut A. Place a marker halfway through the stitches.

SECTION 5 :

□ R12 (RS) : with only one strand B (pay attention to cross yarn A with yarn B at the back of the work to carry it on the 3 first sts then leave A aside) k the first st, k the second and pass the first over the second (1 st dec), k the next st and pass the first st over the second (1 st dec), k to the halfway marker, slm, k the first st, k the second and pass the first over the second (1 st dec), k the next st and pass the first st over the second (1 st dec), k to Mbor, slMbor. Cut B. (4 sts dec. For the sample 108 sts)

-> Work back and forth :

□ R13 (RS) : take back the strand A and k to 2 sts before the halfway marker, sl2wyif, turn on WS.

□ R14 (WS) : k2, p to 2 sts before Mbor, sl2wyif, turn on RS.

-> Repeat R13 and R14 8 more times :

R13 : □ □ □ □ □ □ □ □

R14 : □ □ □ □ □ □ □ □

□ R15 (RS) : with only one strand A, at the back of the work, with the left needle, pick up the B bump st 18 rows below and k2tog the next st with this bump together * at the back of the work, with the left needle, pick up the B bump st 18 rows below, k2tog the next st with this bump together and pass the first st over the second * repeat between the two ** to the halfway marker, pass yarn through the last st, cut B, RM. Proceed in the same way for the other side from R13 with 1 strand A.

-> Gently iron the pouch with a damp cloth on top of it.

-> The cord : measure the cord length you need, triple this measurement, and cut 7 strands of this length with yarn B. (For the sample 140 cm). Wind yarns on themselves as in this tutorial video :
