Sample is shown in size 1 with 30 cm positive ease at the bust.

PREPARATION

Size

1, 2 (3, 4)

Yarn

Bulky weight + Lace weight

1130, 1180 (1320, 1440) meters / 470, 490 (550, 600) grams of Como Grande (Merino wool) 03 from LAMANA 120 meters/ 50 grams

1130, 1180 (1320, 1440) meters / 95, 100 (110, 120) grams of Premia (Silk mohair) 47 from LAMANA 300 meters/ 25 grams

Needles

4.5 mm (US 7) / 3.75 mm (US 5) a circular needle and a short tip needle (or longer if magic loop technique is used) or Double-Pointed Needles.

4 mm (US 6) a circular needle

Gauge

18 sts x 27 rows / 10 cm x 10 cm in 4.5 mm needle, with moss stitch (after wash)

Notions

Stitch markers, tapestry needle or crochet hook, cable needle, stitch holders, waste yarn or extra needle, 5, 5 (6, 6) buttons (2 cm)

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Technique

Reading Charts

When working on the right side, follow the chart from right to left, and when working on the wrong side, follow the chart from left to right, making sure to understand the symbols on RS and WS and check the section marked by the blue dotted line for the repeat pattern.

Moss stitch in the round, repeat Row 1-4(Cast on an even number of stitches)

Row 1 : (K1, P1) repeat to end

Row 2 : (K1, P1) repeat to end

Row 3 : (P1, K1) repeat to end

Row 4 : (P1, K1) repeat to end

Moss stitch in flat, repeat Row 1-4(Cast on an even number of stitches)

Row 1 (RS) : (K1, P1) repeat to end

Row 2 (WS) : (K1, P1) repeat to end

Row 3 (RS) : (P1, K1) repeat to end

Row 4 (WS) : (P1, K1) repeat to end

M1R : Insert left hand needle from back to front under the bar between the stitches and K this bar.

M1L : Insert left hand needle from front to back under bar and K1tbl this bar.

M1RP : Insert the left hand needle from front to back bar between the stitches and Ptbl this bar.

M1LP : Insert the left hand needle from back to front, under the bar between the stitches and P this bar.

1/1 LCTP : Place 1 st on the cable needle(CN) and hold it to the front, P1 the next st and K1tbl the st on CN.

1/1 RCTP : Place 1 st on CN and hold it to the back, K1tbl the next st and P1 the st on CN.

2/1 RC : Place 1 st on CN and hold it to the back, K2 the next 2 sts and K1 the st on CN.

2/1 RCP : Place 1 st on CN and hold it to the back, K2 the next 2 sts and P1 the st on CN.

2/1 LC : Place 2 sts on CN and hold it to the front, K1 the next st and K2 the sts on CN.

2/1 LCP : Place 2 sts on CN and hold it to the front, P1 the next st and K2 the sts on CN.

2/2 RC : Place 2 sts on CN and hold it to the back, K2 the next 2 sts and K2 the st on CN.

2/2 LC : Place 2 sts on CN and hold it to the front, K2 the next 2 sts and K2 the st on CN.

Como Grande & Premia
LAMANA x Soumine

This pattern is a written pattern included charts.

Baguette Jacket is a jacket version of the Baguette Sweater, a basic Aran knit that pairs well with any outfit. The clean design, with its simple arrangement of uncomplicated patterns, really emphasizes its neatness.

Baguette Jacket is knitted using a top-down method and features overall patterning with reference to a chart. The shoulder line is formed first, and the back is knitted flat down to the underarm. Stitches are picked up from both shoulders to create the neckline, which is also knitted down to the underarm. The body is then worked in one piece, joining the front and back, and knitted flat downwards. Stitches are picked up from the neckline to create a folded neckband. The sleeves are knitted by picking up stitches around the armhole and working downwards, maintaining the pattern. Finally, after washing, sew on the buttons.

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PATTERN

BACK

"Work in pattern" refers to following the chart to create the pattern while maintaining the ribbing pattern.

Using 4.5 mm (US 7) needles, cast on 36 sts.

After knitting the setup row (WS) using Back chart, begin knitting flat from Row 1 to Row 38, 38 (46, 46).

Row 39, 39 (47, 47) Cut the yarn and place 3 sts on a stitch holder, then work Row 39, 39 (47, 47) of Back chart starting from the fourth st, and place the last 3 sts on a stitch holder.
You have now 106, 106 (122, 122) sts on your working needle.

Continue knitting flat following Back chart until Row 78, 72 (82, 76).

For sizes 2 and 4 only

Row 1 (RS) K1, M1L, work in pattern to before last st, M1R, K1 (+2 sts)

Row 2 (WS) P1, work 1 st in moss stitch, work in pattern to before last 2 sts, work 1 st in moss stitch, P1

Rows 3-6 Rep Row 1-2

For all sizes

You have now 106, 112 (122, 128) sts on your working needle.

Transfer all sts to waste yarn and cut the yarn.

RIGHT FRONT

Using 4.5 mm / (US 7) needles, with the RS facing, pick up and knit 38, 38 (46, 46) sts along the right shoulder.

*To pick up sts, insert the needle between the first and second sts from the right edge (near the 3 shoulder sts set aside) and pick up and knit along the shoulder line, ensuring that 2 rows out of the 3 shoulder rows are visible. Except for the setup row of the back panel, pick up and knit 1 stitch for each stitch.

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Following Right front chart, work Setup Row (WS), then start from Row 1 and work until Row 66, 60 (70, 64).

Buttonhole on Row 61 (...83, 105, 127...) Work in pattern before last 5 sts, yo, k2tog, p1, k2

* Buttonholes should be made regularly on the RS every 22 rows, starting from row 61. If you want to adjust the spacing between the buttons (approx. 8 cm / 3.1"), you should adjust the placement of the first buttonhole accordingly.

For sizes 2 and 4 only

Row 1 (RS) K1, M1L, work in pattern to the end (+1 st)

Row 2 (WS) Work in pattern to before last 2 sts, work 1 st in moss stitch, p1

Rows 3~6 Rep rows 1~2

You have now 58, 61 (66, 69) sts on your working needle.

Transfer all sts to waste yarn and cut the yarn.

LEFT FRONT

Using 4.5 mm (US 7) needles, with the RS facing, pick up and knit 38, 38 (46, 46) sts along the left shoulder. Following Left front chart, work Setup Row (WS), then start from Row 1 and work until Row 66, 60 (70, 64).

For sizes 2 and 4 only

Row 1 (RS) Work in pattern to before last st, M1R, k1 (+1 st)

Row 2 (WS) P1, work 1 st in moss stitch, work in pattern to the end

Rows 3-6 Rep rows 1-2

You have now 58, 61 (66, 69) sts on your working needle. Do not cut the yarn.

PATTERN

BODY

Work Row 67, 67 (71, 71) from Left front chart, backwards loop cast on 1, 3 (1, 3) sts, transfer the sts from the back panel onto the needle, work Row 79, 79 (83, 83) from Back chart, backwards loop cast on 1, 3 (1, 3) sts, and Work Row 67, 67 (71, 71) from Right front chart. You have now 224, 240 (256, 272) sts on your working needle.

Continue working in pattern (repeating the section marked by the blue dotted line on the chart and maintaining moss stitch for the cast-on sts underarm) until the total length from the back neck edge is 49, 49 (57, 57) cm / 19.3, 19.3 (22.4, 22.4) “, or 6 cm / 2.4 “ shorter than the desired length.

Switch to 3.75 mm needles.

Ribbing Setup (RS) Sl1wyb, (k1, p1) rep to the center of the back panel, k2tog, (p1, k1) repeat to last st, k1 (-1 st)

Ribbing (WS) Sl1wyf, (p1, k1) rep to before last 2 sts, p2

Ribbing (RS) Sl1wyb, (k1, p1) rep to before last 2 sts, k2

Work in ribbing until it measures 6 cm / 2.4 “, ending on a WS row.

Using the Ruke bind-off technique, carefully bind off all sts to avoid looseness, and cut the yarn.

NECKBAND

Using 4 mm (US 6) needles, with the RS facing, pick up and knit sts along the neckline: (1 st per 1 st, and 2 sts every 3 rows) Pick up and knit 39 sts along the right front, 2 sts along the shoulder sts, 30 sts along the back neck, 2 sts along the other shoulder sts, and 38 sts along the left front — for a total of 111 sts (odd number).

Setup Row (WS) P2, (k1, p1) rep to last 1 st, p1

Row 1 (RS) Sl1wyb, (k1, p1) rep to last 2 sts, k2

Row 2 (WS) Sl1wyf, (p1, k1) rep to last 2 sts, p2

Rows 3~6 Rep Row 1~2

Row 7 (Buttonhole Row, RS) Sl1wyb, k1, p1, k1, yo, k2tog, (p1, k1) rep to last st, k1

Row 8 (WS) Sl1wyf, (p1, k1) rep to last 2 sts, p2

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Rows 9~12 Rep Row 1~2

Row 13 (RS) Bind off 9 sts using Ruke bind-off method, (k1, p1) rep to last 10 sts, k1, bind off 9 sts, and cut the yarn.

Row 14 (WS) (p1, k1) rep to last st, p1

Row 15 (RS) (k1, p1) rep to last st, k1

Row 16 (WS) (p1, k1) rep to last st, p1

Rows 17~24 Rep Row 15~16

Fold the ribbing to the WS, positioning it downward. Using a crochet hook, slip the stitch on the left needle as if to knit, inserting the hook into the corresponding stitch from the start of the ribbing, and slip stitch them together. Continue this process for all stitches. Alternatively, you can use a tapestry needle to graft the facing stitches together. And close the holes formed at the sides of the fold using a tapestry needle.

SLEEVES

Please note that we will maintain the shape of 2 sts out of the 3 shoulder line sts to seamlessly blend them with the sleeve pattern. If the number of sleeve sts differs from the given instructions, pay attention to adjust the position of the sleeve pattern accordingly. Position the pattern so that it slopes toward the front of the garment.

« Right Sleeve »

Using 4.5 mm (US 7) needles, with RS facing, pick up and knit sts starting from the underarm (approx. 2 sts every 3 rows):

Pick up and knit 1 st at the underarm center, 27, 27 (29, 29) sts along the back, pm, transfer the 3 sts from the stitch holder to the needle (with yarn in back, do not cut the yarn), 44, 44 (47, 47) sts along the front, and 0, 2 (0, 2) sts at the underarm

You have now 75, 77 (80, 82) sts on your working needle. Pmm and begin knitting in the round.

Setup Row 1 Work in moss stitch to 6 sts before m, pm, work Setup Row 1 of the sleeve chart (removing the marker as you go), pm, work in moss stitch to mm

Setup Row 2 smm, work in moss stitch to m, sm, work Setup Row 2 of the sleeve chart, sm, work in moss stitch to mm

PATTERN

« Left Sleeve »

Using 4.5 mm (US 7) needles, with RS facing, pick up and knit sts starting from the underarm (approx. 2 sts every 3 rows): Pick up and knit 1, 1 (0, 2) st at the underarm center, 44, 44 (47, 47) sts along the front, pm, transfer the 3 sts from the stitch holder to the needle (with yarn in back, do not cut the yarn), 27, 27 (29, 29) sts along the back, and 0, 2 (1, 1) sts at the underarm

You have now 75, 77 (80, 82) sts on your working needle. Pmm and begin knitting in the round.

Setup Row 1 Work in moss stitch for 10, 10 (12, 14) sts, pm, work Setup Row 1 of Sleeve chart, pm, work in moss stitch to mm

Setup Row 2 smm, work in moss stitch to m, sm, work Setup Row 2 of Sleeve chart, sm, work in moss stitch to mm

« Both Sleeves »

Size 1 only

Rows 1~10 smm, work in moss stitch to m, sm, work Sleeve chart, sm, work in moss stitch to mm

Row 11 (Decrease row) smm, k2tog or p2tog in pattern, continue working the chart to 2 sts before mm, k2tog or p2tog in pattern (-2 sts)

Sizes 2, (3, 4) only

Rows 1~12 smm, work in moss stitch to m, sm, work Sleeve chart, sm, work in moss stitch to mm

Row 13 (Decrease row) smm, k2tog or p2tog in pattern, continue working the chart to 2 sts before mm, k2tog or p2tog in pattern (-2 sts)

« All Sizes »

Continue working in pattern, incorporating decrease rows every 11, 11 (13, 13)th row, for a total of 98, 110 (110, 122) rows, approx. 36, 40 (40, 44) cm / 14, 15.7 (15.7, 17.3) ", or until the sleeve measures 6 cm / 2.4 " shorter than the desired length.

Switch to 3.75 mm / (US 5) needles, removing all markers except the main marker.

Sizes 1 and 2 only

Ribbing Setup Row sm, k2tog, (p1, k1) rep to 1 st before m, p1 (-1 st)

All Sizes

Ribbing sm, (k1, p1) rep to m

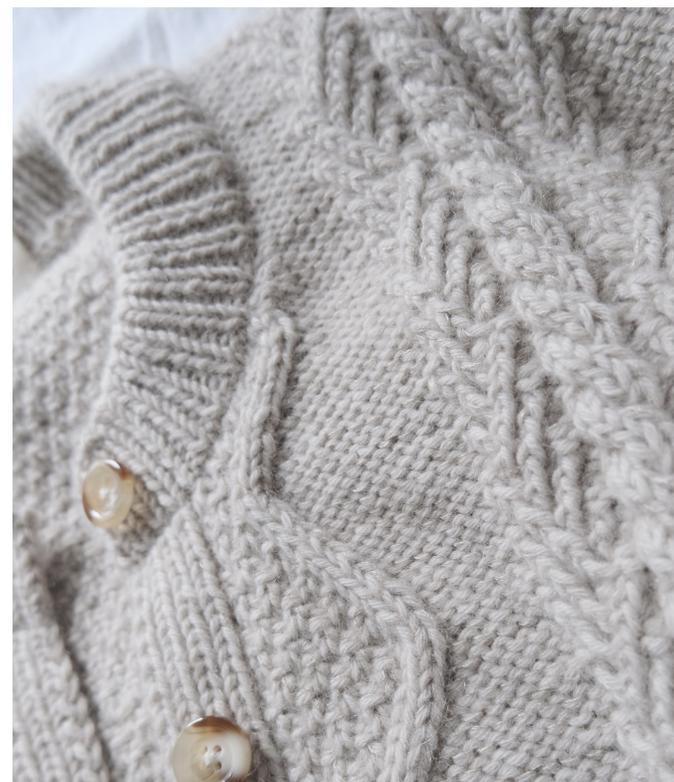
Work the ribbing for 6 cm / 2.4 ".

Using the Ruke bind-off technique, carefully bind off all sts to avoid looseness, and cut the yarn.

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FINISHING

Weave in all ends. sew the buttons after wash.
