



# BLUEBERRY SWEATER

SISU KNITWEAR • AUGUST 2022



**Sizes:** XS (S) M (L) XL (2XL) 3XL

**Bust circumference:** 80 (89) 98 (111) 120 (129) 138 cm

**Gauge:** 18 sts on needle 4.5 mm (US7) = 10 cm

**Needles:** Circular needles 3.5 mm (US4) and 4.5 mm (US7) (40 and 80/100 cm)  
Double pointed needles 3.5 mm (US4) and 4.5 mm (US7)

**Yarn:** Léttlopi by Istex (50 g = 100 m)

**A** 400 (400) 450 (500) 500 (550) 600 g

**B** 100 (100) 100 (100) 150 (150) 150 g

**C** 50 (50) 50 (100) 100 (100) 100 g

## KNITTING PATTERN

A very ordinary thing for Norwegians to do in the fall, is to pick blueberries. We pick them, save them for the winter and are enjoying nature's own vitamins, minerals and antioxidants. Nothing is like a fresh and warm blueberry pie.

The sweater is worked bottom up, and has an a-line shaped body. Perfect for trips.  
Colors in Léttlopi by Istex - **A** 0054 **B** 1403 **C** 9418

### Size guide and measurements

The measurements in this pattern is only correct if the given gauge is achieved.  
The sweater should have a positive ease from 5 to 10 cm.

The sizes XS (S) M (L) XL (2XL) 3XL are intended to fit a bust measurement of approx. 80-85 (85-90) 90-95 (95-100) 100-110 (110-120) 120-130 cm.

Measure yourself or the one your knitting for, to find the perfect size.  
If you're 85 cm around your bust, you should knit a size S that measures 89 cm.

### Body

Cast on 160 (176) 192 (216) 232 (248) 264 sts with circular needle size 3.5 mm (US4) and color **A**. Join and knit pattern chart **A**. Change to circular needle size 4.5 mm (US7) and knit stockinette stitch until garment measures 38 (40) 42 (44) 45 (46) 47 cm, while you're decreasing 2 sts in each side every 7. (7.) 7. (8.) 8. (9.) 10. cm 4 times in total. Cast off 8 (8) 8 (12) 12 (14) 16 sts in each side for armholes. Put garment aside, work sleeves.

### Sleeves

Cast on 40 (40) 40 (44) 44 (48) 48 sts with double pointed needle size 3.5 mm (US4) and color **A**. Join and knit pattern chart **A**. Change to double pointed needle size 4.5 mm (US7) and knit stockinette stitch with color **A**, while increasing 2 sts under sleeve every 6th round until you have a total of 64 (64) 64 (68) 68 (76) 76 sts.

Continue until sleeve measures 40 (42) 44 (46) 48 (50) 52 cm. Cast off 8 (8) 8 (12) 12 (14) 16 center underarm sts. Put aside, and work the other sleeve the same way.

### Round yoke

Transfer sleeve sts to the circular 4.5 mm (US7) garment needle, placing one sleeve above each armhole cast-off. The round and pattern chart begins behind left sleeve (place a marker here). Check that you have 240 (256) 272 (288) 304 (328) 336 sts on your needle.

Knit stocking stitch for 1 (1) 2 (3) 5 (5) 6 rounds. Knit pattern chart **B**, and cast off as showed in the chart. When you're done knitting the pattern chart on the yoke, you should have 90 (96) 102 (108) 114 (123) 126 sts left on your needle.


**Neckband**

Change to circular needle size 3.5 mm (US4) and knit stocking stitch for 1 round with color **C**, while decreasing 10 (14) 16 (18) 20 (23) 26 sts evenly in the round. Cast of all stitches loosely. You're not working any ribbing on this sweater.

**Finishing**


Sew together under the arms with kitchener stitch, and weave in all ends on the wrong side. Good luck with your project, and have a nice trip picking blueberries in the woods.
