About



Difficulty: ★★☆☆☆

Once upon a time, there lived a fairy that wanted wings of a butterfly. Thus, they set out to create a collar inspired by monarch butterflies!

Dear fairies, welcome to my pattern!

For this project, thinner yarns are ideal so that the collar drapes more naturally on your shoulders. Any yarn material is suitable for this project.

Yarn Details

5 colours are used for this design.

- **Brand used**
 - Milk Cotton 依棉 ([link](#))
- **Material (adjust to preferences)**
 - Acrylic, 4 ply thickness
- **Colours (~250 g total)**
 - Black: ~90 g (~250 m)
 - Orange: ~100 g (~250 m)
 - Dark orange: ~30 g (~70 m)
 - Yellow: ~20 g (~45 m)
 - White: ~10 g (~25 m)

Skills needed

- Colour changing
- Colour chart reading
- Bobbin/intarsia colourwork
crochet (recommended)



Tools Required

- Hook (3.5 mm)
- Stitch markers
- Scissors
- Tapestry needle + sewing kit
- **Fasteners** = 14pc of 12.5 mm diameter magnet buttons were used for this sample ([link](#))



Stitch Abbreviations (US terms)

- **ch** = chain
- **sl st** = slip stitch
- **sc** = single crochet
- ***fsc** = *modified* foundation single crochet (see tutorial library p.15)
- **inc** = 2 sc in one stitch
- **inc3** = 3 sc in one stitch
- **dec** = decrease 2 sc into one stitch
- **dec3** = decrease 3 sc into one stitch

Colour changes

This is a very integral skill required for this pattern, and all colour changes in this pattern occur in **SINGLE CROCHET ONLY**.

Steps

1. In **Colour A**, insert your hook into the next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop. Now you should have TWO loops in **Colour A** on your hook.
2. Move the yarn of **Colour A** forward.
3. In **Colour B**, create a slip knot.
4. Pull through the slip knot into the loops created by **Colour A**.

Repeat step at the stitch before the new colour!



1. Last stitch before new colour



2. This step can be skipped depending on your chosen colour changing method






Reading Colour Charts

This pattern relies heavily on colour charts (also known as alpha charts).


Chart Flow

- You would first need to pick the direction of the chart flow. In my pattern, the directions have been indicated with red arrows at the edges of each row.
- Charts are read in a snake-like flow!




Increases and Decreases

- Increases are indicated by additional pixels on the next row.
- Decreases are indicated by a reduced number of pixels on the next row.
- Special instructions will be written for any inc & dec of more than 3 stitches.




Colourwork crochet

Generally, there are 3 main colourwork crochet methods to choose from:

<i>Tapestry</i>	<i>Intarsia/Bobbin</i>	<i>Stranded</i>
 <p>Chart notes: You can just use one of the colour charts to create both right and left components.</p> <p>PROS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Reversible• Minimal sewing <p>CONS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Colour bleeds• Thicker/uneven results	 <p>Chart notes: You can just use one of the colour charts to create both right and left components.</p> <p>PROS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Reversible• No colour bleeds <p>CONS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lots of sewing in ends• Bobbins required	 <p>Chart notes: You need the normal and mirrored colour charts to create both right and left components.</p> <p>PROS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Minimal sewing• Minimal colour bleeds <p>CONS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• NOT reversible

- Both normal and mirrored colour charts are available in this pattern
- Personally, I recommend the intarsia/bobbin method for this project!

Back bumps

For the collar ties, instructions will ask you to crochet into the back bumps of the chain created.


Steps



1. After chaining



2. Turn the chain to its backside



3. These are the back bumps



4. Slip stitch into them for the ties

Standing single crochet

This will be used to start a row whose decreases exceed 3 stitches (it will be specified in the pattern).

Steps

This starts at the start of the row you are about to working on.

1. Make a slip knot in the required colour.
2. Insert your hook into the desired stitch and place the slip knot through your crochet hook.
3. Pull through the slip knot, yarn over and pull through the loop to create a ch.
4. Insert your hook into the same stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop. You should now have TWO loops on your hook.
5. Yarn over, pull through both loops. This creates your standing sc.
6. Continue crocheting sc as normal.

Modified foundation single crochet (*fsc)

This is a very **MODIFIED** way to do fsc, as it **does not start from chaining**, instead it acts as an extension after an existing row.

Notes

This will be used on rows whose **stitch increase is larger than 3** (i.e. if the chart tells you to add 5 extra stitches at the **end of a row**).

Steps

This starts at the end of the row you are currently working on.

1. Insert your hook into the side of the single crochet space you have created last.
2. Yarn over and pull a loop through. Now you should have TWO loops on your hook.
3. Yarn over and pull it through the first loop **ONLY**. Now you should still have TWO loops on your hook.
4. Yarn over and pull through **BOTH** loops. This forms 1 stitch.

Steps (continued)

5. Insert your hook into the bottom chains formed by the first *fsc. You should be inserting through TWO chains here.
6. Yarn over and pull a loop through. Now you should have TWO loops on your hook.
7. Yarn over and pull it through the first loop ONLY. Now you should still have TWO loops on your hook.
8. Yarn over and pull through BOTH loops. This forms 1 stitch.

Repeat steps 5-8 until required number of stitches has been achieved.

9. Turn and insert hook into the loops created by the *fsc to start the next row.





Overall sample measurements


- At the present, this is a **one size pattern** (I will work on more sizes!)
- The sample fitted a **shoulder width (a)** of 40 cm (15.8 in), **torso length (b)** of 40 cm (15.8 in), and **neck circumference (c)** of 36 cm (14.2 in).





Measurements



Collar

- Ideally, the front part of the collar should rest halfway down your chest, and the hind part 1/3rd way down your back.
- The collar is made up of two parts, which are then crocheted together.




Measurements



Small (Front) Wings

- Ideally, when attached to the collar, the tips of the small wings should reach your lowest ribs.





Please read before proceeding to the pattern!

Crocheting notes


- Do **NOT** ch 1 as a turning chain so that the edges are straight, simply turn and crochet into the first stitch of the next row.
- **Only do normal increases and decreases for additions up of to 3 in one stitch**, for >3, please follow instructions.
- If the gaps between colour changes are far, I suggest that you drop the resting yarn and add another bobbin of that colour later to **prevent colour bleeds** between stitches.

Pattern notes


- The written instructions will only show increases, decreases, special instructions, and row numbers **ONLY**.
- **Colour changes will be shown in the corresponding colour**
- Normal and mirrored colour charts are available in pattern form as well.

Gauge

Although having the exact same gauge is **NOT** necessary, this was my gauge swatch (10 sc x 10 rows) before and after blocking for your reference.

The white boxes outside the black wing area are **BLANK**, do **NOT** crochet these

- Feel free to adjust the length of the tie, and the height of the neck collar (reduce or add rows).



2. Attach the tie to the first stitch on the inner neck perimeter with an sc dec from Row 1 instructions
3. When reaching the end of the inner circumference of the first collar in Row 1, attach the 2nd butterfly collar with the sc dec in Row 1

Row 1: sc dec, 20 sc, sc dec, 21 sc, sc into the 2nd collar, 20 sc, sc dec, 20 sc, sc dec (86)

2nd Collar Tie (done directly after Row 1): ch 81, from the 2nd back bump, 80 sl st

Row 2: sc dec, 82 sc, sc dec, turn (84)

Row 3: 84 sc, turn (84)

Row 4: (sc dec, 12 sc) x6, turn (78)

Row 5: 78 sc, turn (78)

Row 6: 78 sc, turn (78)

Row 7: (24 sc, sc dec) x3, turn (75)

Row 8: 75 sc (75)

Fasten off



Fastener assembly

Steps

1. Lay the collar flat and arrange the wings to your preferences. Attach and mark the wing positions with a stitch marker.
2. Wear the assembled collar + wings and adjust the positions accordingly.
3. Sew on the fasteners.

Notes


- Fasteners should all be on one face of the collar to ensure that the collar can be worn as is without wings.
- **For the small wings**, a minimum of 3 fasteners per wing are recommended.
- **For the large wings**, a minimum of 4 fasteners per wing are recommended.




