

CHILD'S ZIPPERED JACKET

393152

YARN

Aurora (70% premium acrylic, 15% mohair, 15% wool, 284 yd/260 m / 100 g)

Tencel Blow (58% Tencel™ lyocell, 42% alpaca, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

ALTERNATE YARN SUGGESTIONS FOR TENCEL BLOW

Ulrika (100% superwash wool, 109 yd/100 m / 50 g)

GAUGE Approx. 12 sts x 16 rows/rnds in stockinette on larger size needles = 4 x 4 in / 10 x 10 cm. Adjust needle size to obtain correct gauge if necessary.

SIZES-CL 86-92 (98-104, 110-116, 122-128, 134-140) cl

SIZES-AGES 1-2 (2-4, 4-6, 6-8, 8-10) years

GARMENT POSITIVE EASE Approx. 8 in / 20 cm

GARMENT CHEST Approx. 78¼ (29¼, 30¾, 32¾, 34) in / 72 (74, 78, 83, 86) cm

GARMENT LENGTH Approx. 15¾ (17¾, 19¾, 21¾, 23¾) in / 40 (45, 50, 55, 60) cm, including collar

GARMENT SLEEVE LENGTH Approx. 12¾ (13¾, 14½, 15½, 16¼) in / 32 (35, 37, 39, 41) cm

YARN AMOUNTS AND COLORS

Color 1: Approx. 110 (130, 150, 170, 190) g (color 31608, Shimmering Beige, Aurora)

Color 2: Approx. 150 (170, 190, 210, 230) g (color 460016, Beige, Tencel Blow)

Color 3: Approx. 30 (40, 50, 60, 70) g (color 460003, Grey Pear, Tencel Blow)

NEEDLES U. S. size 10½ / 7 mm: 24 in / 60 cm or longer (sleeves in magic loop); U. S. 6 / 4 mm 24 in / 60 cm or longer (pockets in magic loop)

NOTIONS 16 stitch markers, separating zipper 16 (18, 20, 22, 24) in / 40 (45, 50, 55, 60) cm long, pins, length of smooth contrast color waste yarn for pocket placement

DESIGNER Elin Berlin / Wool & Beyond

A warm and cozy knitted “fleece jacket” for children. It’s knitted from the top down with pockets, a doubled collar, and zipper attached with a knitted facing on the inside.

STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

M1R = make 1 right: With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from back to front and knit into front loop = right-leaning increase.

M1L = make 1 left: With left needle, lift strand between 2 sts from front to back and knit into back loop = left-leaning increase.

German Short Rows: Double st (DS): The double stitch or German short rows is a turning method that does not leave holes at each turn. Work to st where work will be turned. Sl 1 purlwise wyf, firmly pull yarn backwards over right needle so you flip st and have 2 stitch legs or a double stitch (DS) on the needle; work rem sts on needle.

After working the specified number of short rows, you will join the double sts one at a time. Work to 1st DS, knit or purl it in pattern, catching both legs of DS to make 1 st.

It will help you keep track of the double sts if you place a marker at each so you can count them and minimize the danger of missing one as you continue knitting.

YOKE

With larger size circular and colors 1 and 2 held together, CO 40 (42, 42, 44, 44) sts.

Begin on WS: Sl 1 wyf, purl until 1 st rem, k1.

On the next row, place markers to divide sts for front, back, sleeves, and raglan stitches. The increases also begin on the next row. Increases are always made on every other row (that is, on all RS rows) next to the raglan stitches.

Row 1 (RS): (*left front*) Sl 1 wyf, k6 (6, 6, 7, 7), M1R, pm, (*raglan st*) k2, pm, M1L, (*left sleeve*) k2 (3, 3, 2, 2) M1R, pm, (*raglan st*) k2, pm, M1L, (*back*) k14 (14, 14, 16, 16), M1R, pm, (*raglan st*) k2, pm, M1L, (*right sleeve*) k2 (3, 3, 2, 2), M1R, pm, (*raglan st*) k2, pm, M1L, (*right front*) k7 (7, 7, 8, 8).

Row 2 (WS): Sl 1 wyf, purl until 1 st rem, k1.

Row 3 (RS): Sl 1 wyf, (knit to next marker, M1R, sl m, k2, sl m, M1L) 4 times, knit to end of row.

Row 4 (WS): Work as for Row 2.

Repeat Rows 3-4 a total of 9 (9, 10, 10, 11) times until there are 120 (122, 130, 132, 140) sts total.



Work Rows 3-4 once more *WITHOUT* any increases on Row 3.

Now shape the back with German short rows *at the same time* as making the last increases:

Row 1 (RS): Sl 1 wyf, knit to next marker, M1R, sl m, k2, sl m, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sl m, k2, sl m, M1L, knit until 2 sts rem before next marker; turn.

Row 2 (WS): DS, purl until 2 sts before next marker; turn.

Row 3 (RS): DS, knit until 2 sts before previous turn; turn.

Row 4 (WS): DS, purl until 2 sts before previous turn; turn.

Row 5 (RS): DS, knit until 5 sts before previous turn; turn.

Row 6 (WS): DS, purl until 5 sts before previous turn; turn.

Row 7 (RS): DS, knit to next marker, M1R, sl m, k2, sl m, M1L, knit to next marker, M1R, sl m, k2, sl m, M1L, knit to end of row.

Row 8 (WS): Sl 1 wyf purl until 1 st rem, k1.

After working all the increases (raglan sts are now included in the front and back), the total stitch counts are:

SLEEVES = 24 (25, 27, 26, 28) each.

BACK = 40 (40, 42, 44, 46).

FRONT = 20 (20, 212, 22, 23) each side.

On the next RS row, divide for body and sleeves, placing sleeve sts on holders and casting on sts for underarms as follows:

Sl 1 wyf, knit to 1st marker, remove 1st marker, k2, remove 2nd marker, place next 24 (25, 27, 26, 28) sts on a holder (left sleeve), CO 4 (5, 5, 6, 6) sts, remove 3rd marker, knit to 4th marker, remove 4th marker, knit to 5th marker, remove 5th marker, k2, remove 6th marker, place next 24 (25, 27, 26, 28) sts on a holder (right sleeve), CO 4 (5, 5, 6, 6) sts, remove 7th marker, k2, remove 8th marker, knit to end of row = 88 (90, 94, 100, 104) sts rem for body.

BODY

Work body back and forth in stockinette:

Row 1 (WS): Sl 1 wyf, purl until 1 st rem, k1.

Row 2 (RS): Sl 1 wyf, knit to end of row.

Repeat Rows 1-2 until body measures approx. 3¼ (3¾, 4¼, 4¾, 5¼) in / 8.5 (9.5, 11, 12, 13.5) cm from underarm.

On next RS row, begin the lower edge in garter stitch (= knit on all rows). Work edging in a contrast color if you like. If you want to make the lower edge in another color, substitute color 3 for color 2. On the next row, place pockets by knitting in a length of smooth contrast color, waste yarn for the pocket opening as follows:

Sl 1 wyf, k4, CHANGE TO WASTE YARN, k12 (12, 13, 14, 14) with waste yarn, move pocket sts back to left needle, CHANGE TO WORKING YARN, knit across until 17 (17, 18, 19, 19) sts rem.

CHANGE TO WASTE YARN, k12 (12, 13, 14, 14) with waste yarn, move pocket sts back to left needle, CHANGE TO WORKING YARN, and knit to end of row.

Continue the body in garter st:

All Rows: Sl 1 wyf, knit to end of row.

When piece measures approx. 13½ (15, 17, 19, 21) in / 34 (38, 43, 48, 53) cm from top of neck to lower edge, BO.

COLLAR

With color 2 and smaller size needle, beginning on RS, pick up and knit *an even number of sts* all along neckline: *pick up and knit 1 st in a st, pick up st in space between 2 sts*; rep *-* all along neckline **EXCEPT** in space between raglan sts. Do *NOT* pick up an extra st in the space between front/back/sleeve and raglan sts (where the increases were made) – to avoid making holes in these places.

Now work the edging:

Row 1 (WS): Sl wyf, *p1, k1tbl*; rep *-* until 2 sts rem, p1, k1.

Row 2 (RS): Sl 1 wyf, *k1, p1*; rep *-* until 2 sts rem, k2.

Row 3 (WS): Sl 1 wyf, *p1, k1*; rep *-* until 2 sts rem, p1, k1.

Repeat Rows 2-3 until edging measures approx. 5¼ (6, 6, 6, 6) in / 13 (15, 15, 15) cm.

On next, RS, row, BO the center sts. The sts along the edge will be on hold while the next step is worked for the facings to be sewn to the inside of the zipper, as follows:

Sl 1, k1, p1, k1, p1, k1 (= 6 sts along right side), BO sts until 6 sts rem on left side, *at the same time* as you have 1 st remaining on right needle (from binding off previous st), move st on right needle to left needle, k2tog, p1, k1, p1, k2 (= 6 sts on left side).



FACING

Now work each facing separately, back and forth on each respective side until they are the same length as front edge (excluding collar).

Left side (WS): Sl 1 wyf, p1, k1, p1, k1, p1.

Left side (RS): K1, p1, k1, p1, k2.

Right side (WS): P1, k1, p1, k1, p1, k1.

Right side (RS): Sl 1 wyf, k1, p1, k1, p1, k1.

BO facings on RS when facing is same length as front edge (excluding collar).

SLEEVES

The right and left sleeves are both knitted the same way. Slip one set of held sleeve sts to larger size needle.

Hold colors 1 and 2 together and begin at the center of the underarm sts. Pick up and knit 2 (3, 3, 3, 3) sts along lower edge of armhole (you might also pick up and knit an extra st in the space between the sleeve sts and the lower edge of armhole to avoid a hole there). Pick up and knit 2 (2, 2, 3, 3) sts along lower edge of armhole, pm to indicate beginning/end of rnd = 28 (30, 32, 32, 34) sts total.

The sleeve is now knitted around in stockinette. If you picked up and knitted extra sts in the space between the lower edge of armhole and sleeve sts, on the first rnd, decrease (k2tog) to join the extra st with either the previous or next st to eliminate the extra st.

Knit around until sleeve measures approx. 10¾ (11½, 12¼, 13, 13¾) in / 27 (29, 31, 33, 35) cm from armhole. Change to smaller size needle. Knit 1 rnd. Cut color 1 and continue with color 2 only. Knit 1 rnd and then begin cuff:

K1, p1; rep *-* around.

Work cuff in k1, p1 ribbing until it is approx. 4¾ (5½, 5½, 5½, 5½) in / 12 (14, 14, 14, 14) cm long. BO in ribbing. Fold cuff doubled. Loosely sew down bound-off edge to last rnd with doubled yarn (color 1 + color 2) on WS of sleeve.

Make the second sleeve the same way.

POCKETS

Work pockets with magic-loop technique on larger size needle.

Needle 1: Pick up the 12 (12, 13, 14, 14) sts along upper side of waste yarn you knitted into the piece.

Needle 2: Pick up the 12 (12, 13, 14, 14) sts along bottom side of waste yarn you knitted into the piece.

Once you've picked up the sts, you can carefully remove the waste yarn so the sts will be live on the needles. Use color 1 + color 3, begin on RS and knit in the round as follows:

Rnd 1, Needle 1: Knit to end of needle, pick up and knit 1 st at side of pocket opening = 13 (13, 14, 15, 15) sts.

Rnd 1, Needle 2: Knit to end of needle, pick up and knit 1 st at side of pocket opening = 13 (13, 14, 15, 15) sts.

Rnd 2, Needle 1: Knit until 1 st rem, k1tbl.

Rnd 2, Needle 2: Knit until 1 st rem, k1tbl.

Rnd 3: Knit around.

Repeat Rnd 3 until pocket is ¾-1¼ in / 2-3 cm from lower edge of jacket. Knit sts on needle 1 once more. Cut yarn and push pocket to inside of jacket so that the smooth side of stockinette is the inside of the pocket and the WS faces you. Sew down lower edge of pocket to WS using duplicate stitch. Make the other pocket the same way.

ZIPPER

Now you can attach the separating zipper along the front edges. Keep the zipper closed while you pin it into place. Begin by turning the collar down so you can see where the top edge of the zipper should be placed and place a pin along the respective side through the outer fabric of the collar (not the part which is turned down) as well as the zipper to keep the upper edge in place. Pin the lower edge of the zipper about ¼-¾ in / 0.5-1 cm above the lower edge of the jacket. Now place a pin in about the center of the zipper and continue pinning the zipper securely to the jacket to hold it in place. To make it easier to sew in the zipper, open it up. Sew down zipper with small invisible stitches along the front edge of the jacket on RS.

After the zipper has been securely sewn down on RS along both sides, fold the collar and facing down and pin them into place against the inside of the jacket. First, using small invisible stitches, sew along the outer edge of the collar and facing along the inside of the zipper and then along the lower edge as well as the other long side of the facing and lower edge of the collar to hold all the pieces in place.



FINISHING

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Dampen jacket, preferably from a spray bottle. Gently press out excess water by rolling jacket in a towel. On a dry towel, lay jacket flat to dry, patting it out to finished measurements.



Tips & shortcuts

TO AVOID QUESTIONS

Before you begin knitting, read through the pattern.

STITCH COUNT

Always knit or crochet a gauge swatch as recommended in the pattern. If your stitch count doesn't match the gauge given in the pattern, try again with larger or smaller needles or hook. If your gauge doesn't match that in the pattern, your item will not be the correct size or shape.

HIGHLIGHT

Highlight the size you will knit or crochet throughout the pattern to make it easier to follow the instructions.

CHARTS

It will be easier to follow a chart if you mark your row with a ruler and magnetic board or sticky note.

EASE

The amount of ease included in our garments varies depending on the type and shape of the garment. To determine the right size, we recommend that you first measure your body. Then you can calculate the garment size depending on how much ease you want the garment to have. The schematics for each piece show all the garment measurements.

TWO-COLOR STRANDED KNITTING

When knitting more than 3-4 stitches of the same color, twist the color strands around each other on the wrong side to avoid long strands or "floats" on the back. If the yarns need to be twisted on several rows/rounds, make sure you do not stack the twists in the same place to prevent the yarns from showing through on the right side.

TIPS FÖR HAND DYED YARN

Make sure you have enough yarn to complete your project. The colors may vary from time to time. To get a smooth color mix, you can alternate between two skeins: knit two rows from one and two rows from another skein.
