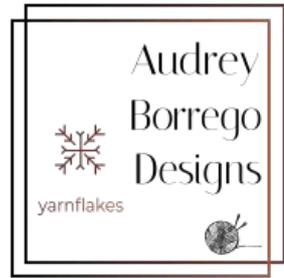


# Calamondin



## Notes

Calamondin is a colourwork raglan sweater with a loose fit. Worked from the top down, it features stripes of geometric stranded knitting motifs, long ribbed edges and a round neck. With ease in the upper body depth and a fine fingering weight fabric, it's an easy to wear lightweight garment.

## **Yarn :**

You will need two colours of fingering weight yarn in the following amounts :

MC : 850 (**895** / 955 / **1025** / 1110 / **1230**), (1400 / **1550** / 1690 / **1820** / 1900) m

930 (**980** / 1045 / **1120** / 1215 / **1345**), (1535 / **1695** / 1850 / **1990** / 2080) yds

CC : 290 (**330** / 360 / **385** / 420 / **450**), (485 / **520** / 565 / **610** / 660) m

320 (**360** / 395 / **420** / 460 / **495**), (530 / **570** / 620 / **670** / 720) yds

The sample is knit with Filcolana Artwetta (210 m – 230 yds / 50 g) in 977 Marzipan (MC) and Bulbe Bizarre Sock Extrafine (400 m – 437 yds / 100 g) in Leeloo (CC).

## **Needles :**

*Main Fabric* : 3.25 mm (US 3) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

*Ribbing* : 3 mm (US 2.5) circular needles with appropriate length to knit in the round and magic loop or DPNs.

or sizes required to get gauge

## **Gauge :**

26 sts x 33 rnds per 10 cm – 4" with main needles in stockinette and stranded knitting after blocking

Note that a different round gauge will affect the raglan and armhole depth.

Due to the generous ease, you may sacrifice the exact stitch gauge in order to have the correct round gauge, and eventually adjust the bust circumference at the underarm.

## **Notions :**

Stitch markers, locking stitch markers, tapestry needle and scissors

Scrap yarn to place sts on hold

Row counter recommended

## **Techniques used :**

Top down raglan sweater

Back neck and front neck shaping worked flat

Upper body joined in the round to work raglan shaping with simple increases

Straight body

Straight sleeves slightly gathered at the cuffs

1/1 ribbed hem, cuffs and collar

Picking up stitches

German Twisted and Backwards Loop Cast-on, Basic Bind-off

Stranded knitting with two colours per rnd and few floats to catch

Colourwork pattern fully charted along the raglan shaping

Two Charts are worked simultaneously for the different sleeve and body raglan shaping (except for Size 2 where the same Chart will be worked)

Pattern includes charted instructions

Charts show two contrast options (light / dark background and dark / light motifs)


**Sizes :** 1 (2 / 3 / 4 / 5 / 6), (7 / 8 / 9 / 10 / 11)

All measurements are those of the finished sweater.

Choose a size with about 15 to 20 cm – 6 to 7 ¾" positive ease at bust.

If you are in between sizes, size down for a better upper body fit.

Shown in size 4 on a 95 cm – 37 ½" bust and a 35 cm – 13 ¾" upper arm.

## **Abbreviations :**

- CO : cast-on
- st(s) : stitch(es)
- rnd(s) : round(s)
- MC : main colour
- CC : contrast colour
- RS : right side
- WS : wrong side
- BOR : beginning of round
- m : marker
- PM : place marker
- sm : slip marker
- rm : remove marker
- inc : increase
- dec : decrease
- k : knit stitch
- p : purl stitch
- m1L : make 1 left, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from front to back, knit through the back loop (1 inc)
- m1R : make 1 right, lift the bar between the stitches onto the left needle from back to front, knit through the front loop (1 inc)
- k2tog : knit the next 2 sts together (1 dec)
- s2kp : slip the next 2 sts together knitwise, k1 then passed slipped sts over (2 dec)
- \*-\* : repeat instructions between asterisks

## **Notes :**

Left and Right parts refer to the sweater when worn.

The sample used a basic bind-off everywhere (working stitches in pattern and passing them over), with a larger needle size on the collar to adjust tension. You may substitute this for your preferred method : aim for a reasonably loose bind-off, not too stretchy to avoid flaring out.

## Reading the Chart

Knitting in the round, always read the Chart from right to left.

You will find two sets of Charts in the pattern with opposite contrasts : one with a light background colour (MC) and one with a dark background colour. Follow the one closer to your colour choice.

## Colourwork

Catching floats : in fingering weight, you can catch floats when skipping more than 7 stitches. You may do it more often if you prefer, just make sure not to catch a float in the same place in two consecutive rounds.

Colour dominance : CC will form the motifs while MC will be the background colour. To have consistent colour dominance : hold CC to the left and always carry it under MC without twisting the strands.

## Back Neck

You will work the back neck, shoulders and front neck shaping flat in stockinette using only MC.

With main needles and MC, CO 94 (94 / 102 / 102 / 110 / 110), (118 / 126 / 126 / 134 / 134) sts using a stretchy [German Twisted Cast-on](#).

(German Twisted Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

**set-up row (WS)** : p2, pm, p3, pm, p18, pm, p3, pm, p42 (42 / 50 / 50 / 58 / 58), (66 / 74 / 74 / 82 / 82), pm, p3, pm, p18, pm, p3, pm, p2

Fronts : 2 sts each

Back : 42 (42 / 50 / 50 / 58 / 58), (66 / 74 / 74 / 82 / 82) sts

Sleeves : 18 sts each

Raglans : 3 sts each, 12 total

Total : 94 (94 / 102 / 102 / 110 / 110), (118 / 126 / 126 / 134 / 134) sts

The 3 sts between markers separating fronts, sleeves and back will form the raglan lines. You will increase on either side of them on the body and sleeves every other row as well as on the front edges from row 3 to shape the neckline.

**row 1 (RS)** :

Left Front : knit to m, m1R

Left Sleeve : sm, k3, sm, m1L, knit to m, m1R, sm, k3, sm

Back : m1L, knit to m, m1R

Right Sleeve : sm, k3, sm, m1L, knit to m, m1R, sm, k3, sm

Right Front : m1L, knit to end (8 inc)

**row 2 (WS)** : purl

**row 3** : k1, m1L, (knit to m, m1R, sm, k3, sm, m1L) x 4, knit to 1 st before end, m1R, k1 (10 inc)

**row 4** : purl

Work rows 3-4 a total of 10 (10 / 10 / 10 / 8 / 8), (8 / 6 / 6 / 6 / 6) times.

Fronts : 23 (23 / 23 / 23 / 19 / 19), (19 / 15 / 15 / 15 / 15) sts each

Back : 64 (64 / 72 / 72 / 76 / 76), (84 / 88 / 88 / 96 / 96) sts

Sleeves : 40 (40 / 40 / 40 / 36 / 36), (36 / 32 / 32 / 32 / 32) sts each

Raglans : 3 sts each, 12 total

Total : 202 (202 / 210 / 210 / 198 / 198), (206 / 194 / 194 / 202 / 202) sts

You will add even more sts to the neck edges, using a [knitted cast-on](#).

(Knitted Cast-on Tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

**row 5 (RS)** : CO 2 sts knitwise, (knit to m, m1R, sm, k3, sm, m1L) x 4, knit to end (10 inc)

**row 6 (WS)** : CO 2 sts purlwise, purl to end (2 inc)

Work rows 5-6 a total of 2 (2 / 2 / 2 / 2 / 2), (2 / 3 / 3 / 3 / 3) times.

Fronts : 29 (29 / 29 / 29 / 25 / 25), (25 / 24 / 24 / 24 / 24) sts each

Back : 68 (68 / 76 / 76 / 80 / 80), (88 / 94 / 94 / 102 / 102) sts

Sleeves : 44 (44 / 44 / 44 / 40 / 40), (40 / 38 / 38 / 38 / 38) sts each

Raglans : 3 sts each, 12 total

Total : 226 (226 / 234 / 234 / 222 / 222), (230 / 230 / 230 / 238 / 238) sts

**row 7 (RS)** : CO 3 sts knitwise, (knit to m, m1R, sm, k3, sm, m1L) x 4, knit to end (11 inc)

**row 8 (WS)** : CO 3 sts purlwise, purl to end (3 inc)

Work rows 7-8 a total of 1 (1 / 1 / 1 / 3 / 3), (3 / 4 / 4 / 4 / 4) times.

Fronts : 33 (33 / 33 / 33 / 37 / 37), (37 / 40 / 40 / 40 / 40) sts each

Back : 70 (70 / 78 / 78 / 86 / 86), (94 / 102 / 102 / 110 / 110) sts

Sleeves : 46 sts each

Raglans : 3 sts each, 12 total

Total : 240 (240 / 248 / 248 / 264 / 264), (272 / 286 / 286 / 294 / 294) sts

## Join in the Round

You will join in the round by casting-on new sts at the front neck using a [backwards loop cast-on](#).

(Backwards Loop Cast-on tutorial by Very Pink Knits)

**next row (RS) :** (knit to m, m1R, sm, k3, sm, m1L) x 4, knit to end (8 inc)

Do not turn work.

With the sts just knitted still on your right needle, CO 4 (4 / 12 / **12** / 12 / **12**), (20 / **22** / 22 / **30** / 30) sts on the right needle as well.

Being careful no to twist your knitting and the new cast-on, join to work in the round and k2. Cut yarn and slip sts purlwise to the 4th raglan marker (slipping the first 3 markers you come accross), reaching the beginning of the back just after the left sleeve : **this is the new BOR**. Change the marker to clearly identify it.

Front : 72 (72 / 80 / **80** / 88 / **88**), (96 / **104** / 104 / **112** / 112) sts

Back : 72 (72 / 80 / **80** / 88 / **88**), (96 / **104** / 104 / **112** / 112) sts

Sleeves : 48 sts each

Raglans : 3 sts each, 12 total

Total : 252 (**252** / 268 / **268** / 284 / **284**), (300 / **316** / 316 / **332** / 332) sts

## Raglan

You will now rejoin yarn at the new BOR and work in the round, continuing the raglan increases and starting the stranded colourwork stripes.

Make sure your gauge remains the same in stranded colourwork as in stockinette, adjusting needle size if necessary for the stripes.

The raglan sts are not included in the Charts and should be knitted in MC, except when the entire round is in CC (Chart rounds 15, 24, 30, 36, 45, 50, 51, 56, 57, 62 and 75).

Carry CC when it's not in use by loosely twisting it with MC at the BOR every 3<sup>rd</sup> rnd.

Size 2 ONLY :

You will follow Chart B both on the front and back and on the sleeves.

**raglan round :** (Chart B to m, sm, k3, sm) x 4

Sizes 1 and 3 to 11 ONLY :

You will follow Chart A on the front and back and Chart B on the sleeves. The two Charts will be the same at first but will then differ in increase rates. Make sure to follow both correctly. You can place locking stitch markers on the sleeve sections so that you easily identify them and know which Chart to follow.

**raglan round :** (Chart A to m, sm, k3, sm, Chart B to m, sm) x 2

Work the Chart corresponding to your size and contrast, stopping where the Chart indicates for your size, after round 38 (**38** / 42 / **48** / 52 / **52**), (58 / **64** / 64 / **72** / 78).

Note : If you want a shallower raglan or need to accommodate a looser round gauge, you may stop before and separate body and sleeves earlier. Add the missing body increases by casting on more sts at the underarm. This will result in more sts to pick up on the sleeve underarms, which you will have to decrease quickly.

Try to end in a plain MC section, if not you will have to maintain the colourwork as established when splitting and find your place in the Chart on the body and sleeves.

Front : 94 (**98** / 112 / **118** / 138 / **142**), (154 / **164** / 180 / **188** / 200) sts

Back : 94 (**98** / 112 / **118** / 138 / **142**), (154 / **164** / 180 / **188** / 200) sts

Sleeves : 74 (74 / 76 / **78** / 90 / **90**), (94 / **96** / 96 / **100** / 104) sts each

Raglans : 3 sts each, 12 total

Total : 348 (**356** / 388 / **404** / 468 / **480**), (508 / **532** / 564 / **588** / 620) sts

## Separate body and sleeves

You will now place the sleeve sts on hold, removing raglan markers and cast-on new sts at each underarm with a [backwards loop cast-on](#).

The next round is a plain MC round.

*Back* : knit to m, rm, k3, rm,

*Right sleeve* : place the next 74 (74 / 76 / 78 / 90 / 90), (94 / 96 / 96 / 100 / 104) sts on hold, rm

*Right underarm* : CO 12 (20 / 18 / 24 / 20 / 28), (28 / 30 / 30 / 34 / 34) sts,

*Front* : k3, rm, knit to m, rm, k3, rm

*Left Sleeve* : place the next 74 (74 / 76 / 78 / 90 / 90), (94 / 96 / 96 / 100 / 104) sts on hold, rm

*Left Underarm* : CO 12 (20 / 18 / 24 / 20 / 28), (28 / 30 / 30 / 34 / 34) sts, k3

You've reached the BOR m.

224 (248 / 272 / 296 / 328 / 352), (376 / 400 / 432 / 456 / 480) sts

## Body

You will start following Chart C with round 22 (22 / 26 / 32 / 36 / 36), (42 / 48 / 48 / 56 / 2).

Work the body in the round, following Chart C, until it measures about 22 cm – 8 ¾" from the underarm or 10 cm – 4" less than desired length.

*Feel free to change the pattern placements if you enjoy some better or need certain ones to reach the desired length.*

End with a plain MC rnd.

Cut CC.

## Hem

*The hem will be worked in MC.*

Switch to smaller needles.

Knit 1 rnd.

**ribbing rnd** : \*k1, p1\* to end

Work the ribbing rnd until the ribbing measures 10 cm – 4" or desired hem length. Loosely bind-off sts in pattern.

## Sleeves

Using main needles and MC, RS facing and starting in the center of the underarm CO, pick up and knit

6 (10 / 9 / 12 / 10 / 14), (14 / 15 / 15 / 17 / 17) sts from the first half of the underarm then 2 (2 / 2 / 2 / 2 / 2), (3 / 2 / 2 / 2 / 3) extra sts in the gap.

Knit the 74 (74 / 76 / 78 / 90 / 90), (94 / 96 / 96 / 100 / 104) sts held sleeve sts.

Pick up and knit again 2 (2 / 2 / 2 / 2 / 2), (3 / 2 / 2 / 2 / 3) extra sts in the gap then 6 (10 / 9 / 12 / 10 / 14), (14 / 15 / 15 / 17 / 17) sts from the rest of the underarm.

Join to work in the rnd and **pm for BOR**.

90 (98 / 98 / 106 / 114 / 122), (128 / 130 / 130 / 138 / 144) sts

You will start following Chart C with round 22 (22 / 26 / 32 / 36 / 36), (42 / 48 / 48 / 56 / 2).

Sizes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10 ONLY :

To adjust the st count for the pattern, on the following round, decrease 2 sts as follows :  
Chart C to last 3 sts, s2kp (2 dec)

88 (96 / 96 / 104 / 112 / 120), (- / 128 / 128 / 136 / -) sts

ALL SIZES RESUME

Work the sleeve in the round, following Chart C, until it measures about 32 cm – 12 ½" from the underarm or 10 cm – 4" less than desired length.

End with a plain MC rnd.

Cut CC.

*The cuff will be worked in MC.*

Switch to smaller needles.

**dec rnd** : k8 (o / o / **8** / o / o), (o / o / 8 / 6 / 4), \*k2tog, k3 (2 / 4 / **2** / 2 / 2), (2 / 2 / 3 / **3** / 3)\* to end

72 (**72** / 80 / **80** / 84 / **90**), (96 / **96** / 104 / **110** / 116) sts

**Cuff :**

**ribbing rnd** : \*k1, p1\* to end

Work the ribbing rnd until the ribbing measures 10 cm – 4" or desired length.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern.

Repeat for second sleeve.

## Collar

Using smaller needles and MC, RS facing and starting at the back of the right sleeve (after the raglan), pick up and knit

28 (**28** / 34 / **34** / 38 / **38**), (44 / **48** / 48 / **54** / 54) sts from the back neck (about 2 out of 3 sts),

24 sts from the left raglans and sleeve (every stitch),

24 (**24** / 24 / **24** / 28 / **28**), (28 / **32** / 32 / **32** / 32) sts from the left front curve (about 2 out of 3 sts),

4 (**4** / 10 / **10** / 10 / **10**), (14 / **16** / 16 / **20** / 20) sts from the front neck (Sizes 1-2 : every st, Sizes 3 to 6 : about 4 out of 5 sts, Sizes 7 to 9 : about 3 out of 4 sts, Sizes 10-11 : about 2 out of 3 sts),

24 (**24** / 24 / **24** / 28 / **28**), (28 / **32** / 32 / **32** / 32) sts from the right front curve (about 2 out of 3 sts),

and 24 sts from the right raglans and sleeve (every stitch).

Join to work in the rnd and **pm for BOR.**

128 (**128** / 140 / **140** / 152 / **152**), (162 / **176** / 176 / **186** / 186) sts

**ribbing rnd** : \*k1, p1\* to end


Work the ribbing rnd until the ribbing measures 5 cm – 2" or desired length.

Loosely bind-off all sts in pattern, using a larger needle if necessary.

## Finishing


Weave in all ends and gently block the sweater.
