YARN

Main colour

Jamieson and Smith, 2 Ply Jumper Weight (100% Shetland wool, 115m per 25g ball, 4 Ply / fingering weight yarn) in colourway 01.

6 (7, 7, 8, 8, 8) [9, 9, 10, 10, 11] {12, 12, 13, 13} balls (*estimated*)

Contrast colours

Various Jamieson and Smith, 2 Ply Jumper Weight (100% Shetland wool, 115m per 25g ball, 4 Ply / fingering weight yarn). You can change the contrast colours or use different shades of red and blue for different motives or ribbing.

RED

2 Ply Jumper Weight in colourway 1403, 2 balls for sizes 1-11, 3 balls for sizes 12-15

BLUE

2 Ply Jumper Weight in colourway 142, 2 balls for sizes 1-11, 3 balls for sizes 12-15

Feel free to use different colours and colour combinations.

Note that adding length or repeating an extra colourwork chart will consume more yarn.

NEEDLES

3.0mm / US 2.5 for ribbing, DPNs or long circular needles for magic loop

3.5mm / US 4 for main colour, DPNs or long circular needles for magic loop

3.75mm / US 5 for colourwork, circular needles (80 cm / 32 inch)

Or needle sizes necessary to obtain gauge.

GAUGE

in stockinette st in the round on 3.5mm / US 4 needles (sleeves): 10 x 10 cm

24 sts x 34 rounds

in colourwork st in the round on 3.75mm/ US 5 needles (yoke, body): 10 x 10 cm

26 sts x 27 rounds

OTHER

3 stitch markers of different colours, waste yarn, tapestry needle

SKILLS / TECHNIQUES

Knit, purl, colourwork, short rows (German Short Row), duplicate stitch, invisible increase left, cast on, cast off

German Short Rows

(RS) On the right side, knit x sts and turn your work to WS.

(WS) Hold yarn in front, slip one stitch as if to purl and pull the yarn directly over the (right-hand) needle. This rotation creates a double stitch (DS) as the stitch has two legs now. Bring the yarn back to front, purl the next stitch tightly and continue purling according to the pattern. Turn to RS.

(RS) Slip one stitch as if to purl, pull the yarn directly over the (right-hand) needle until it creates a double stitch. Knit the next stitch tightly and continue knitting according to the pattern. Turn x sts before the DS.

Repeat until there are x sts according to the pattern. Knit 1 round where you knit the DS together as if it were one.

Increase Make 1 Left (M1L)

M1L = Increase the left-hand needle from front to back, under the bar between the stitches and knit this bar through the back loop.

Invisible Increase Left (Inv-L)

Knit according to the pattern and the colourwork chart.

Slip the stitch marked with Symbol 1 purlwise on your (right-hand) needle. Use the (left-hand) needle and pick up from behind the left leg of the stitch in the row below. Knit this lifted stitch through the back loop. You have just increased one stitch. The new stitch is marked with Symbol 2 in the chart.




Symbol 1: Step 1 of Inv-L Increase: slip st purlwise



Symbol 2: Step 2 of Inv-L Increase: place left leg of st in the row below slipped st on left needle

SIZES

There are sizes 1 (2, 3, 4, 5, 6) [7, 8, 9, 10, 11] {12, 13, 14, 15} to fit bust sizes 75 (80, 85.5, 91, 96.5, 101.5) [107, 112.5, 118, 123, 128.5] {134, 139.5, 145, 150} cm with approximately 6 cm of positive ease.



A. Finished bust measurement: 80 (86, 91, 97, 101.5, 108) [112.5, 118.5, 124, 129, 134] {140, 144.5, 151, 155.5} cm

B. Total length (front): 49 cm

C. Yoke depth: 23 (23, 23, 23, 23, 23) [24, 24, 24, 24, 25] {25, 25, 26, 26} cm

D. Body length (underarm to hem): 20 cm

E. Sleeve length: 43 cm

F. Sleeve circumference: 29 (32, 32, 32, 35, 35) [38, 38, 38, 41, 41] {44, 47, 50, 53} cm

G. Wrist circumference: 16.5 (16.5, 16.5, 16.5, 18, 18) [18, 19.5, 19.5, 20.5, 20.5] {20.5, 22, 22, 22} cm

INSTRUCTIONS

YOKE

CAST ON / NECKLINE

Using the smaller needles 3.0mm/US 2.5 and MC, CO 104 (108, 112, 112, 116, 120) [124, 128, 128, 132, 136] {140, 140, 144, 148} sts.

Place a BOR marker and join in the round, being careful not to twist. Work in (K2, P2) ribbing for 9 rounds or until the collar measures 2 cm.

SHORT ROW SHAPING

Change to larger needles 3.5mm/US 4, knit 1 round.

(RS) K 26 (27, 28, 28, 29, 30) [31, 32, 32, 33, 34] {35, 35, 36, 37} sts from BOR, turn.

Use the German Short Row Method to create a double stitch (DS).

(WS) P to BOR, SM and P 26 (27, 28, 28, 29, 30) [31, 32, 32, 33, 34] {35, 35, 36, 37} sts, turn.

(RS) Knit until 3 sts before DS, turn.

(WS) Create DS, purl until 3 sts before DS, turn.

Continue until you have 7 DSs on each side of the BOR.

Next row (RS): Knit 1 round and close the gaps, working each DS together as one.

Knit 1 round.

INCREASE

Increase evenly over one round.

Increase as follows:

Sizes 1, 2, 3: K6, (K2, M1L) until 6 sts remain, K6.

Sizes 4, 5, 6, 7, 8: (K2, M1L) around.

Sizes 9, 10, 11, 12: K1, (K1, M1L) 6 times, (K2, M1L) to last 7 sts, (K1, M1L) to end.

Sizes 13, 14, 15: K1, (K1, M1L) 12 times, (K2, M1L) to last 13 sts, (K1, M1L) to end.

On your needles are now 150 (156, 162, 168, 174, 180) [186, 192, 198, 204, 210] {216, 222, 228, 234} sts, 46 (48, 50, 56, 58, 60) [62, 64, 70, 72, 74] {76, 82, 84, 86} sts increased.

Change to the largest needles 3.75mm/US 5 for the colourwork chart.

COLOURWORK CHART

Knit the colourwork chart from right to left, starting with row 1. Repeat the 14-st pattern 25 (26, 27, 28, 29, 30) [31, 32, 33, 34, 35] {36, 37, 38, 39} times.

If you want, you can place a marker after each 14-st pattern repeat. The chart starts at BOR, at the back of the sweater and continues to the front. Use Inv-L increases according to the chart.



Colourwork Chart



Part I (rounds 1 – 72)

Try finishing the motive before you separate the sleeves from the yoke.

Round 27: 5th increase round: 350 (364, 378, 392, 406, 420) [434, 448, 462, 476, 490] {504, 518, 532, 546} sts in total

Round 24: 4th increase round: 300 (312, 324, 336, 348, 360) [372, 384, 396, 408, 420] {432, 444, 456, 468} sts in total

Round 20: 3rd increase round: 275 (286, 297, 308, 319, 330) [341, 352, 363, 374, 385] {396, 407, 418, 429} sts in total

Round 11: 2nd increase round: 250 (260, 270, 280, 290, 300) [310, 320, 330, 340, 350] {360, 370, 380, 390} sts in total

Round 4: 1st increase round: 200 (208, 216, 224, 232, 240) [248, 256, 264, 272, 280] {288, 296, 304, 312} sts in total

SEPARATE SLEEVES AND BODY

Separate the sleeves and the body when the yoke depth for sizes 1 (2, 3, 4, 5, 6) [7, 8, 9, 10, 11] {12, 13, 14, 15} is 23 (23, 23, 23, 23, 23) [24, 24, 24, 24, 25] {25, 25, 26, 26} cm. Try finishing the motive on Colourwork Chart Part 1 before you separate the sleeves from the yoke.

From BOR, K 52 (55, 58, 60, 63, 66) [72, 72, 76, 78, 78] {80, 83, 88, 90} sts. Transfer 70 (72, 74, 75, 77, 78) [80, 81, 83, 86, 88] {91, 93, 96, 98} sts onto waste yarn. Use the backwards loop to CO 0 (1, 2, 3, 4, 4) [5, 6, 7, 8, 9] {11, 12, 13, 14} sts, place marker A, use the backwards loop to CO 0 (1, 2, 2, 3, 4) [5, 5, 6, 8, 9] {10, 11, 13, 14} sts.

K 105 (110, 115, 121, 126, 132) [137, 143, 148, 152, 157] {161, 166, 170, 175} sts. Transfer 70 (72, 74, 75, 77, 78) [80, 81, 83, 86, 88] {91, 93, 96, 98} sts onto waste yarn. Use the backwards loop to CO 0 (1, 2, 3, 4, 4) [5, 6, 7, 8, 9] {11, 12, 13, 14} sts, place marker B, use the backwards loop to CO 0 (1, 2, 2, 3, 4) [5, 5, 6, 8, 9] {10, 11, 13, 14} sts, K 53 (55, 57, 61, 63, 66) [65, 71, 72, 74, 79] {81, 83, 82, 85} sts.

Yoke end: 350 (364, 378, 392, 406, 420) [434, 448, 462, 476, 490] {504, 518, 532, 546} sts

Each sleeve: 70 (72, 74, 75, 77, 78) [80, 81, 83, 86, 88] {91, 93, 96, 98} sts


Continue the chart with 210 (224, 238, 252, 266, 280) [294, 308, 322, 336, 350] {364, 378, 392, 406} sts on your needles.

Continue knitting Part II of the chart, below:

Note from the author: Be careful that this pattern has not been tested and check the length and fit of the yoke before you separate sleeves and body. Try separating it after you finish the motive you are knitting.



Colourwork Chart

Part II (row 73 – 99)



Optional: You can stop after row 99 and start the ribbing. You can also continue the chart with optional motives for longer body or repeat another motive from the colourwork chart. Note that adding length will consume more yarn.

Optional motives



Continue in MC until body measures 18 cm from underarm or 2 cm before desired finished length.

Change to the smallest needles 3.0mm/US 2.5 and knit one last round. Sizes 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15 need to decrease 2 sts in this round by knitting together the 3rd and 4th stitches after marker A and after marker B. The other sizes do not need to decrease. 208 (224, 236, 252, 264, 280) [292, 308, 320, 336, 348] {364, 376, 392, 404} sts in total.

Work in (K2, P2) ribbing for 10 rounds.

Cast off with your preferred method.

SLEEVES

Transfer 70 (72, 74, 75, 77, 78) [80, 81, 83, 86, 88] {91, 93, 96, 98} sleeve sts from waste yarn onto needles sized 3.5mm/US 4. Pick up 0 (3, 1, 1, 4, 3) [5, 5, 4, 6, 5] {7, 10, 11, 14} sts, place marker BOR and pick up 0 (2, 2, 1, 3, 3) [6, 5, 4, 6, 5] {7, 9, 12, 14} sts.

70 (77, 77, 77, 84, 84) [91, 91, 91, 98, 98] {105, 112, 119, 126} sts in total. Continue knitting with MC.

Optional: If you want to continue the motive on the sleeve, you need to pick up 0 (6, 5, 5, 4, 3) [2, 2, 0, 6, 5] {4, 10, 8, 14} sts, place marker BOR and pick up 0 (6, 5, 4, 3, 3) [2, 1, 1, 6, 5] {3, 9, 8, 14} sts.

70 (84, 84, 84, 84, 84) [84, 84, 84, 98, 98] {98, 112, 112, 126} sts in total. Continue knitting with MC and CC. After you finish the motive, continue knitting with MC. Knit 10 rounds.

Decrease round: K4 sts, K2tog, K until 6 sts before BOR, SSK, K to end.

Repeat the decrease round every 10th (9th, 8th, 7th, 7th, 7th) [6th, 6th, 5th, 5th, 5th] {4th, 4th, 4th, 3rd} round until 48 (48, 48, 48, 52, 52) [52, 56, 56, 60, 60] {60, 64, 64, 64} sts remain. If needed, decrease only 1 st in the decrease round.

Knit until the sleeve measures 38 cm from underarm / 5 cm less than your desired length.

Transfer to smallest needles 3.0mm/US 2.5 and knit one round.

Work in (K2, P2) ribbing for 20 rounds or until the cuff measures 5 cm. Cast off with your preferred method.

Repeat these instructions for the second sleeve.

Weave in all the ends, hand wash gently, lay flat to dry and block your sweater.

Wear it and dance a little happy dance.
