## DESCRIPTION

The Chantal sweater is worked from the top down in slip stitch. First, the left and right shoulders are worked separately. Then, stitches are picked up to work the right and left fronts, shaping the neckline with increases, after which they are joined with additional stitches picked up for the neckline to knit the front straight down to the armholes. After that, stitches are picked up to work the back. German Short Rows are used on both the front and back to ensure a comfortable fit at the shoulders. Once all the parts are completed, they are joined for knitting in the round. Next, stitches are picked up to work the neckline in a 2x2 rib, worked in the round, which is then folded and attached to the wrong side. Finally, the stitches are picked up to work the sleeves in the round.

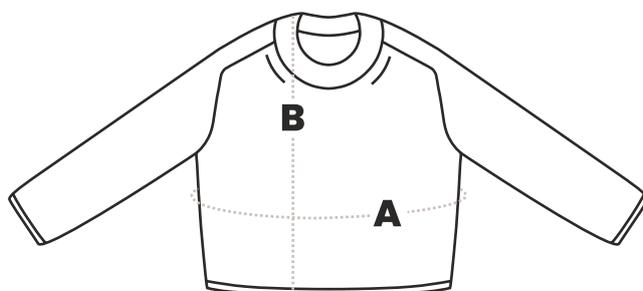

## SIZE GUIDE

The Chantal Sweater has a relaxed fit and is designed to have approx. 15 cm [6 in] of positive ease with slightly reduced ease in larger sizes, to ensure a more comfortable fit. This means the garment's measurements will be approx. 15 cm [6 in] larger than your actual bust circumference. The sizes XS / S / M / L / XL / 2XL / 3XL are designed to fit a bust circumference of 80-85 / 85-90 / 90-95 / 95-100 / 100-110 / 110-120 / 120-130 cm [31½-33½ / 33½-35½ / 35½-37½ / 37½-39½ / 39½-43¼ / 43¼-47¼ / 47¼-51¼ in].

Before you begin, measure yourself to determine the right size. For example, if your bust circumference is 90 cm [35 in], you should knit a size M. If you are between sizes, choose the size based on how loose you prefer the sweater to fit. Using the diagram with the finished garment measurements can be a helpful reference when deciding which size to select.

**GAUGE****After washing and blocking:**

26 sts x 40 rows = 10 x 10 cm [4 x 4 in] in slip stitch on 4.5 mm [US 7] needles.

Please make sure to knit a swatch. Ensure that your swatch gauge matches the given one. If you cannot achieve the required gauge using the suggested needles, adjust your needle size to reach the correct gauge.

**NEEDLES**

Circular needles

4.5 mm [US 7] 40, and 80 or 100 cm [16, and 32 or 40 in]

3 mm [US 2½] 40, and 80 or 100 cm [16, and 32 or 40 in]

Double-pointed needles:

3 mm [US 2½] or long circular needles for the Magic Loop technique.

250 / 300 / 300 / 350 / 350 / 400 / 400 g Wild & Soft by Gepard Garn 50 g = 240 m [262 yds]

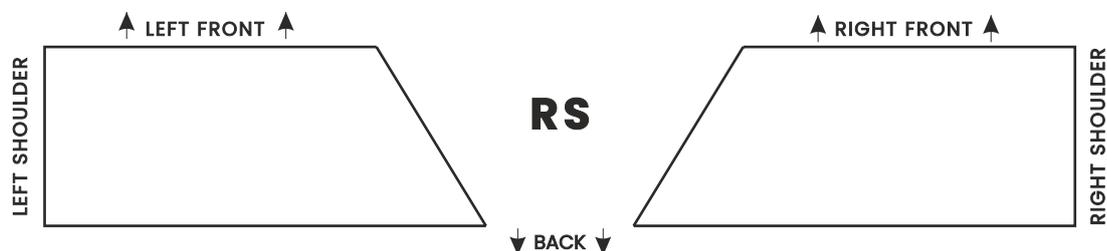

## ABBREVIATIONS

**BOR** - Beginning Of Round

**RS/WS** - Right Side/Wrong Side

**RSR/WSR** - Right Side Row/Wrong Side Row

**Est Pat** (Established Pattern): Continue knitting in accordance with the pattern or stitch sequence that has been previously introduced and established in the instructions.

A slipped stitch pattern is used, which will be applied in 2 ways. The pattern repeat is 2 stitches and 2 rows. For a swatch, cast on a number of stitches that is a multiple of 2 + 1 stitch for symmetry.

### **Method 1 (slipped stitches in RS):**

Row 1 (RS): K1, \* slip 1 purlwise with yarn in back, K1 \*. Repeat from \* to \* to the end of the row.

Row 2 (WS): Purl all stitches.

### **Method 2 (slipped stitches in WS):**

Row 1 (WS): P1, \* slip 1 purlwise with yarn in front, P1 \*. Repeat from \* to \* to the end of the row.

Row 2 (RS): Knit all stitches.

## RIGHT SHOULDER

The right shoulder (positioning when worn) is worked back and forth in slip stitch using **4.5 mm [US 7] 80 or 100 cm [32 or 40 in]** circular needles.

Cast on 25 sts on **4.5 mm [US 7] 80 or 100 cm [32 or 40 in]** circular needles using a Long-Tail Cast-On technique.

Work in the **German Short rows technique** to shape the neckline edge.

When the instructions say 'Turn', this indicates that you should turn your work around, slip the first stitch purlwise, and create a double stitch at the turning point. The term '**Work number of sts after the last turn**' means that you should work up to the double stitch created during the previous row's turn, work this stitch, and then proceed to work the specified number of stitches following it.

Work as follows:

**Row 1 (RS):** Work 5 sts (K1, SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1), turn.

**Row 2 (WS):** P all sts.

**Row 3 (RS):** Work in est pat up to the last turn, then work 4 sts after the last turn (SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1), turn.

**Row 4 (WS):** P all sts.

Work rows 3-4 a total of 4 times (your last turn is 4 sts before the end of the RS row).  
Finish with the WS row. The short rows are now complete.

Work straight as follows:

**Row 1 (RS):** K1, \* SLIPW wyib, K1 \*, repeat from \* to \* to the end of the row.

**Row 2 (WS):** P all sts.

Work rows 1-2 a total of 20/20/23/23/26/26/29 times.

Finish with the WS row

Work 1 more row (as row 1).

**Now you have** 25 sts on the needles and worked 41/41/47/47/53/53/59 rows (if counted along the shorter side).

Break the yarn and place the sts on hold to continue working on them later.

## LEFT SHOULDER

The left shoulder (positioning when worn) is worked back and forth in slip stitch using **4.5 mm [US 7] 80 or 100 cm [32 or 40 in]** circular needles.

Cast on 25 sts on **4.5 mm [US 7] 80 or 100 cm [32 or 40 in]** circular needles using a **Reverse Long-Tail Cast-On technique**.

Work in the **German Short rows technique** to shape the neckline edge as follows:

**Row 1 (WS):** Work 5 sts (P1, SLIPW wyif, P1, SLIPW wyif, P1), turn.

**Row 2 (RS):** K all sts.

**Row 3 (WS):** Work in est pat up to the last turn, then work 4 sts after the last turn (SLIPW wyif, P1, SLIPW wyif, P1), turn.

**Row 4 (RS):** K all sts.

Work rows 3-4 a total of 4 times (your last turn is 4 sts before the end of the WS row).  
Finish with the RS row. The short rows are now complete.

Work straight as follows:

**Row 1 (WS):** P1, \* SLIPW wyif, P1 \*, repeat from \* to \* to the end of the row.

**Row 2 (RS):** K all sts.

Work rows 1-2 a total of 20/20/23/23/26/26/29 times.  
Finish with the RS row

Work 1 more row (as row 1).

**Now you have** 25 sts on the needles and worked 41/41/47/47/53/53/59 rows (if counted along the shorter side).

Break the yarn and place the sts on hold to continue working on them later.

## RIGHT FRONT

The right front (positioning when worn) is worked back and forth in slip stitch using **4.5 mm [US 7] 80 or 100 cm [32 or 40 in]** circular needles.

With the RS facing, **pick up and knit** a total of 29/29/33/33/37/37/41 sts along the right shoulder's short side. This is equivalent to picking up and knitting 2 sts for every 3 rows.

**Note:** Start by picking up and knitting the stitch directly beneath the first live stitch. Continue by picking up 2 stitches and then skipping 1, repeating this pattern across.

Now, work in the **German Short Rows technique** to shape the shoulder as follows:

**Row 1 (WS):** Work 5 sts (P1, SLIPW wyif, P1, SLIPW wyif, P1), turn.

**Row 2 (RS):** K all sts.

**Row 3 (WS):** Work in est pat up to the last turn, then work 4 sts after the last turn (SLIPW wyif, P1, SLIPW wyif, P1), turn.

**Row 4 (RS):** K all sts.

Repeat rows 3-4 one more time.

Now, continue working in the **German Short Rows technique** while simultaneously making **increases** along the neckline.

**Note:** When working with increases, integrate them into the established pattern starting from the row where stitches need to be slipped. Do it as follows: 6 stitches along which the increases occur remain constant in the pattern (meaning they are worked the same way each time). Increases are made to the side of these stitches, so pay attention to what the stitch next to these 6 stitches was in the pattern before you made the increase. If it was a knit stitch, then the added stitch will be slipped in the pattern, and if it was a slipped stitch, then the added stitch will be knitted in the pattern.

Work as follows:

**Row 1 (WS):** Work 6 sts in est pat (P1, SLIPW wyif, P1, SLIPW wyif, P1, SLIPW wyif), **MIPR**, work up to the last turn, then work 4 sts after it (SLIPW wyif, P1, SLIPW wyif, P1), turn.

**Row 2 (RS):** K all sts.

Work rows 1-2 a total of 3/3/4/4/5/5/6 times (your last turn is 4 sts before the end of the WS row).

Finish with the RS row. The short rows are now complete.

**Now you have** 32/32/37/37/42/42/47 sts on the needles.

Now, continue working with increases along the neckline:

**Row 1 (WS):** Work 6 sts in est pat (P1, SLIPW wyif, P1, SLIPW wyif, P1, SLIPW wyif), **MIPR**, work to the end of the row in est pat.

**Row 2 (RS):** K all sts.

Work rows 1-2 a total of 8/8/7/7/6/6/5 times. Finish with the RS row.

Work 1 more row with increase (as row 1).

**Now you have** 41/41/45/45/49/49/53 sts on the needles and worked 17/17/15/15/13/13/11 rows (if counted along the armhole side).

Break the yarn and place the sts on hold to continue working on them later.

## LEFT FRONT

The left front (positioning when worn) is worked back and forth in slip stitch using **4.5 mm [US7] 80 or 100 cm [32 or 40 in]** circular needles.

Take the left shoulder piece and lay it out with the RS facing up. Leave a yarn tail on the left that is approximately 3.5 times the length of the shoulder edge. Make sure the working yarn is on your right side. Using that yarn tail, **pick up and knit** a total of 29/29/33/33/37/37/41 stitches along the short side of the shoulder. This is equivalent to picking up 2 stitches for every 3 rows of your work.

**Note:** Conclude by picking up the last stitch directly beneath the live stitch.

Now, work in the **German Short Rows technique** to shape the shoulder as follows:

**Row 1 (RS):** Work 5 sts (K1, SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1), turn.

**Row 2 (WS):** P all sts.

**Row 3 (RS):** Work in est pat up to the last turn, then work 4 sts after the last turn (SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1), turn.

**Row 4 (WS):** P all sts.

Repeat rows 3-4 one more time.

Now, continue working in the **German Short Rows technique** while simultaneously making **increases** along the neckline:

**Row 1 (RS):** Work 6 sts in est pat (K1, SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib), **MIL**, work up to the last turn, then work 4 sts after it (SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1), turn.

**Row 2 (WS):** P all sts.

Work rows 1-2 a total of 3/3/4/4/5/5/6 times (your last turn is 4 sts before the end of the RS row).

Finish with the WS row. The short rows are now complete.

**Now you have** 32/32/37/37/42/42/47 sts on the needles.

Now, continue working with increases along the neckline:

**Row 1 (RS):** Work 6 sts in est pat (K1, SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib), **MIL**, work to the end of the row in est pat.

**Row 2 (WS):** P all sts.

Work rows 1-2 a total of 8/8/7/7/6/6/5 times. Finish with the WS row.

Work 1 more row with increase (as row 1).

**Now you have** 41/41/45/45/49/49/53 sts on the needles and worked 17/17/15/15/13/13/11 rows (if counted along the armhole side).

Do not break the yarn.

Join the fronts as follows:

With the WS facing, purl all stitches of the left front (41/41/45/45/49/49/53 sts). Then, take a new thread and attach it to the main yarn, leaving a small tail. Using both strands, cast on 23/25/25/27/27/29/29 stitches using the **reverse long tail cast-on method**. Break the additional yarn. Next, using the main working yarn, purl all stitches of the right front (41/41/45/45/49/49/53sts).

**Now you have** 105/107/115/117/125/127/135 sts on the needles and worked 18/18/16/16/14/14/12 rows (if counted along each armhole side).

Do not break the yarn.

## FRONT

The front is worked back and forth in slip stitch using **4.5 mm [US 7] 80 or 100 cm [32 or 40 in]** circular needles.

Work straight as follows:

**Row 1 (RS):** K1, \* SLIPW wyib, K1 \*, repeat from \* to \* to the end of the row.

**Row 2 (WS):** P all sts.

Work rows 1–2 a total of 5/4/7/6/9/8/9 times. Finish with the WS row.

**Now you have** 105/107/115/117/125/127/135 sts on the needles and worked 28/26/30/28/32/30/30 rows (if counted along each armhole side).

Now work with **increases** as follows:

**Row 1 (RS):** Work 6 sts in est pat (K1, SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib), **MIL**, work to the last 6 sts of the row, **MIR**, work 6 sts in est pat (SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1).

**Row 2 (WS):** P all sts.

Work rows 1–2 a total of 10/12/12/14/14/16/18 times. Finish with the WS row.

**Now you have** 125/131/139/145/153/159/171 sts on the needles and worked 48/50/54/56/60/62/66 rows (if counted along each armhole side).

Break the yarn.

## BACK

The back is worked back and forth in slip stitch using **4.5 mm [US 7] 80 or 100 cm [32 or 40 in]** circular needles.

**Note:** The right and left sides of the back are worked with a slipped stitch pattern differently:

**RS:** K all sts before the BOR marker, work in slip stitch pattern after the BOR marker.

**WS:** P all sts before the BOR marker, work in a slip stitch pattern after the BOR marker.

Join the shoulders to work the back as follows:

With the RS facing join the yarn and pick up and knit 35/35/39/39/43/43/47 sts along the left shoulder (2 sts of 3 rows). Then, take a new thread and attach it to the main yarn, leaving a small tail. Using both strands, cast on 35/37/37/39/39/41/41 sts using the Long-tail cast-on method. Break the additional yarn. Next, using the main working yarn, pick up and knit 35/35/39/39/43/43/47 sts along the right shoulder (2 sts of 3 rows).

Break the yarn.

**Now you have** 105/107/115/117/125/127/135 sts on the needles.

With the RS facing slip the first 52/54/58/58/62/64/68 sts PW to the right-hand needle without knitting them. Place a stitch marker to indicate the BOR. Re-join the yarn and work in the **German Short Rows technique** to shape the back.

Work as follows:

**Row 1 (RS):** Beginning at the BOR marker work 21/21/21/23/23/23/23 sts in slip st (K1, \* SLIPW wyib, K1 \*, repeat from \* to \* 21/21/21/23/23/23/23 sts until have been worked). Turn.

**Row 2 (WS):** Purl all sts to the BOR marker, slip BOR marker, and work 20/22/22/22/2/24/24 sts in slip st (\* SLIPW wyif, P1 \*, repeat from \* to \* 20/22/22/22/2/24/24 sts after the BOR marker until have been worked). Turn.

**Row 3 (RS):** K all sts to the BOR marker, slip the BOR marker, work in est pat to the last turn, then work 4 after the last turn (SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1). Turn.

**Row 4 (WS):** P all sts to the BOR marker, slip the BOR marker, work in est pat to the last turn, then work 4 after the last turn (SLIPW wyif, P1, SLIPW wyif, P1). Turn.

Work rows 3-4 a total of 7/7/8/8/9/9/10 times (Your last turn is 4 sts before the end of the WS row).

The short rows are now complete.

Work straight as follows:

**Row 1 (RS):** K all sts to the BOR marker, slip the BOR marker, K1, \* SLIPW wyib, K1 \*, repeat from \* to \* to the end of the row.

**Row 2 (WS):** P all sts to the BOR marker, slip the BOR marker, \* SLIPW wyif, P1 \*, repeat from \* to \* to the end of the row.

Work rows 1-2 a total of 14/13/15/14/16/15/15 times. Finish with the WS row.

**Now you have** 105/107/115/117/125/127/135 sts on the needles and worked 28/26/30/28/32/30/30 rows along the right armhole side and 27/25/29/27/31/29/29 rows along the left armhole side.

Now work with **increases** as follows:

**Row 1 (RS):** K all sts to the BOR marker, slip the BOR marker, work in est pat to the last 6 sts of the row, **MIR**, work 6 sts in est pat (SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1, SLIPW wyib, K1).

**Row 2 (WS):** P all sts to the BOR marker, slip the BOR marker, work in est pat to the last 6 sts of the row, **MIPL**, work 6 sts in est pat (SLIPW wyif, p1, SLIPW wyif, P1, SLIPW wyif, P1).

Work rows 1-2 a total of 10/12/12/14/14/16/18 times. Finish with the WS row.

K all sts to the BOR marker.

**Now you have** 125/131/139/145/153/159/171 sts on the needles and worked 48/50/54/56/60/62/66 rows (if counted along each armhole side).

Do not break the yarn.

## BODY

The body is worked in the round in slip stitch using **4.5 mm [US 7] 80 or 100 cm [32 or 40 in]** circular needles.

Join the front and back as follows:

Beginning at the BOR marker, work 63/65/69/73/77/79/85 sts in est pat across the back, then cast on 7/7/7/9/9/11/11 sts in an extension of the back stitches using the **backward loop method**, work 125/131/139/145/153/159/171 sts in est pat across the front, cast on 7/7/7/9/9/11/11 sts in an extension of the front stitches the same way, work 62/66/70/72/76/80/86 sts in est pat across the back (to the BOR marker).

**Now you have** 264/276/292/308/324/340/364 sts on the needles.

Work as follows:

**Round 1:** K all sts.

**Round 2:** K1, \* SLIPW wyib, K1 \*, repeat from \* to \* to the end of the round.

Work rounds 1-2 until the sweater measures approx. 54/55/56/58/60/63/66 cm [21¼ / 21¾ / 22 / 22¾ / 23½ / 24¾ / 26 in] excluding the neckline, from the center of the back – or to the length you prefer.

**Note:** Extending the length of the garment in your knitting may require additional yarn. Try on and check the garment length before you begin working the rib.

Shift the BOR marker forward by one stitch, so that the first stitch of the round is slipped.

Switch to circular needles **3 mm [US 2½] 80 or 100 cm [32 or 40 in]** and work 1 round (K all sts).

Work 4 rounds of 1x1 rib (K1, P1).

Work double knitting before binding off using the Italian bind-off technique as follows:

**Round 1:** \* K1, Sll purlwise wyif \*, repeat from \* to \* to end of round.

**Round 2:** \* Sll purlwise wyib, P1 \*, repeat from \* to \* to end of round.

Bind off the stitches using the **Italian bind-off technique**. Not too tightly.

## NECKLINE

The neckline is worked in the round in 2x2 rib using a **3 mm [US 2½] 40 cm [16 in]** circular needles, and then it is folded inward and attached.

**Tip:** When picking up stitches for the neckline, you will need two sets of circular needles: one 4.5 mm [US 7] 40 cm for the outside, and one 3 mm [US 2½] 80 or 100 cm for the inside.

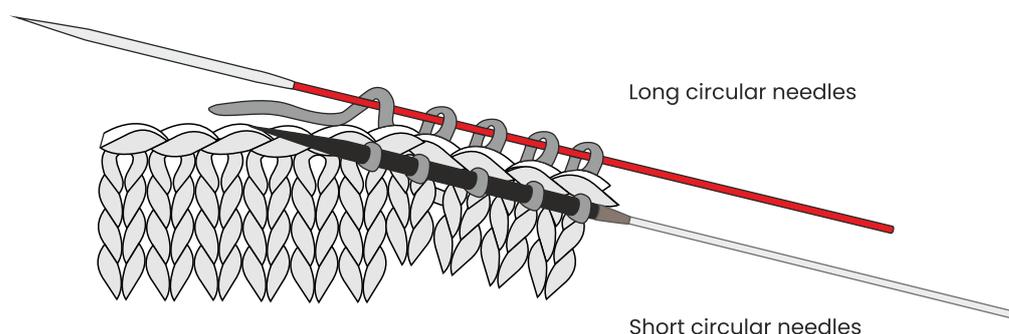

With the RS facing, start at the center of the back. Join the yarn and **pick up and knit** 148/152/152/156/156/160/160 stitches using **4.5 mm [US 7] 40 cm [16 in]** circular needles for the outer edge. Simultaneously, after each stitch you pick up, wrap the yarn around the **3 mm [US 2½] 80 or 100 cm [32 or 40 in]** circular needles for the inner edge. This is equivalent to picking up and knitting one stitch for each stitch along the horizontal sides (back, front, and shoulders), 2 stitches for every 3 rows along the vertical sides (along the increases in the front), and additionally 1 stitch on each side of the shoulders. Place a stitch marker to indicate a BOR.

Work as follows: Start by picking up the first stitch with a **4.5 mm [US 7] 40 cm [16 in]** circular needle. Position the longer circular needle behind the 40 cm needle in the same hand, slightly forward of the 40 cm needle. Wrap the working yarn clockwise around the longer needle, making a full loop around it. Next, pick up the following stitch with your 40 cm needle and loop the working yarn around the longer needle. Continue repeating these steps until all stitches are picked up, and you have the same number of stitches on both needles.

**You have picked up** 36/38/38/40/40/42/42 stitches on the neck back, 24/26/26/28/28/30/30 on the neck front, 20 stitches on each vertical side, 22 stitches on each shoulder, and 1 stitch on each side of both shoulders. Ensure that the same number of stitches is distributed on each needle.



Leave the stitches on the long needles on hold to continue working with them later.

Switch to **3 mm [US 2½] 40 cm [16 in] circular needles** and work 4.5 cm [1¼ in] of 2x2 rib (K2, P2).

Next, work 3 rounds of double knitting for a neatly folded edge as follows:

**Round 1:** \* K2, SL2 purlwise wyif \*, repeat from \* to \* to the end of the round.

Repeat round 1 two more times.

Then work the following 4.5 cm [1¼ in] of 2x2 rib (K2, P2).

Break the yarn.

Fold the neckline in half to the WS and **attach it by binding off the stitches from both needles together.**

Slip 1 stitch knitwise from the near needle, then slip 1 stitch knitwise from the far needle and pass it through the first one. Transfer the stitch onto the RH needle. Next, slip 1 stitch knitwise from the near needle, then slip 1 stitch knitwise from the far needle and pass it through the first one. Transfer the stitch onto the RH needle and pass it through the previous stitch. Repeat until all stitches are bound off. When the last stitch remains, break the yarn, remove the stitch from the needle, thread the end of the yarn through it from bottom to top, and tighten the stitch. Weave in the end using a tapestry needle.

## SLEEVES

The sleeves are worked in the round in slip stitch with decreases towards the cuff using **4.5 mm [US 7] 40 cm [16 in]** circular needles. Cuffs are worked in the round in rib (K1, P1) using **3 mm [US 2½]** double-pointed needles or long circular needles for the Magic Loop technique.

Transfer 25 shoulder sts to **4.5 mm [US 7] 40 cm [16 in]** circular needles.

Starting to the left at the shoulder sts, join the yarn and **pick up and knit** 33/35/37/38/41/42/44 stitches along the first armhole side (2 sts for every 3 rows). Then, pick up and knit 9/9/9/11/11/13/13 sts in the underarm. After that, pick up and knit 33/35/37/38/41/42/44 stitches along the second armhole side (2 sts for every 3 rows). Finally, **K2TOG** (2 first shoulder sts), K21, **SKP** (2 last shoulder sts).

**Now you have** 98/102/106/110/116/120/124 sts on the needles.

Place one marker to indicate the BOR (after SKP decrease). Then, place another marker at the center of the underarm (central marker), directly into the central picked-up stitches of 9/9/9/11/11/13/13 to indicate the central stitch for decreases.

Work in the **German Short Rows technique** to shape the sleeve.

**Note:** The right and left sides of the sleeve are worked with a slipped stitch pattern differently:

**RS:** K all sts before the BOR marker, work in slip stitch pattern after the BOR marker.

**WS:** P all sts before the BOR marker, work in slip stitch pattern after the BOR marker.

Work as follows:

**Row 1 (RS):** Beginning at the BOR marker work 3 sts in slip st (K1, \* SLIPW wyib, K1). Turn.

**Row 2 (WS):** Purl all sts to the BOR marker, slip BOR marker, and work 26 sts in slip st (\* SLIPW wyif, P1 \*, repeat from \* to \* until have been worked 26 sts after the BOR marker). Turn.

**Row 3 (RS):** K all sts to the BOR marker, slip the BOR marker, work in est pat to the last turn, then work 2 sts after the last turn (SLIPW wyib, K1). Turn.

**Row 4 (WS):** P all sts to the BOR marker, slip the BOR marker, work in est pat to the last turn, then work 2 sts after the last turn (SLIPW wyif, P1). Turn.

Work rows 3-4 a total of 15/16/17/17/19/19/20 times (Your last turn is 4/4/4/6/5/7/7 sts before the central underarm sts of the WS row).

The short rows are now complete.

Now join knitting in the round as follows:

**Round 1:** Turn the work on the RS. Knit all stitches before the BOR marker. Then, work in slip stitch pattern up to the last turn. Next, work the first double stitch as normal. Work the following 9/9/9/13/11/15/15 stitches, continuing in the slip stitch pattern. Knit the following **double stitch through the back loop**, and then work all stitches up to the BOR marker, continuing in the slip stitch pattern.

Work as follows:

**Round 2:** K all sts.

**Round 3:** K1, \* SLIPW wyib, K1 \*, repeat from \* to \* to the end of the round.

**Round 4:** K all sts.

Work rounds 3-4 until the sleeve measures approx. 41/41/40/40/38/38/37 cm [16¼/16¼/15¾/15¾/15/15/14½ in] from the underarm, while at the same time, working **central double decreases** every 22/20/20/16/16/14/12th round a total of 6/7/7/8/9/10/10 times.

**Decreasing rounds are worked as follows:** Work to 1 stitch before the central stitch, and work **CDD**. (2 sts have been decreased).

**Tip:** After each CDD has been worked, move the central marker to this new lower central stitch.

**In total, you have** 86/88/92/94/98/100/104 sts on the needles after all decrease rounds have been worked.

Try on the garment and check the sleeve length before working the cuff.

Shift the BOR marker forward by one stitch, so that the first stitch of the round is slipped.

Switch to **double-pointed needles 3 mm [US 2½] or long circular needles** for the Magic Loop technique and work 1 round (K all sts).

Work 4 rounds of 1x1 rib (K1, P1).

Work double knitting before binding off using the Italian bind-off technique as follows:

**Round 1:** \* K1, Sll purlwise wyif \*, repeat from \* to \* to end of round.

**Round 2:** \* Sll purlwise wyib, P1 \*, repeat from \* to \* to end of round.

Bind off the stitches using the **Italian bind-off technique**. Not too tightly.

Work the second sleeve the same way.
