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# Introduction

I never get tired of designing and knitting socks. Occasionally I wander off and design other things but I still think about socks while I'm doing it – trying to work out how I can adapt the stitch pattern I'm using for this hat or shawl to a pair of socks; thinking about knitting socks in the colour of the yarn I'm currently using for something else; or an idea hits me, seemingly out of nowhere, and I have to scribble it down for later. I don't think my obsession with socks will ever stop.

The inspiration for a lot of the designs in this book began with the beautiful colours of the yarns. I love all kinds of colour – from eye-searing neons to delicate, muted pastels. The great thing about socks is that you can knit them in any colour. Amazing sock yarn is available in pretty much every shade imaginable and a colour you might not want next to your face will be fine all the way down there on your feet.

Since **Coop Knits Socks Volume 1** was published, many people have shown me their feet, clad in finished socks from the book, either in person at knitting events or online on Ravelry, Twitter or Instagram, I absolutely love seeing them so long may this continue!

# Dave

## YARN

Another Crafty Girl Merino Sock (100% superwash merino; 366m [400yds] per 100g skein) 1 skein in Citrus

Small quantity of smooth 4ply waste yarn (for afterthought heel version only)

## NEEDLES

2.5mm [UK 13-12/US 1-2] 80cm [32in] circular needles or DPNs (or size needed to get correct tension)

Stitch markers

Tapestry needle

## TENSION

36 sts and 50 rounds = 10cm [4in] over st st

## SIZES

Small (Medium, Large)

To fit foot circumference: 20.5 (23, 25.5) cm [8 (9, 10) in]

Actual foot circumference of sock (unstretched): 18 (20.5, 23) cm [7 (8, 9) in]

Length of leg to top of heel flap: 15cm [6in]

Foot length is fully adjustable within the pattern.

Finished sock measures 0.5cm [ $\frac{1}{4}$ in] less than actual foot length, to ensure a good fit.

## PATTERN NOTES

The pattern gives instructions for a heel flap and an afterthought heel version of these socks. The heel flap version is shown in the photographs.

## HEEL FLAP VERSION

### CUFF

Cast on 64 (72, 80) sts. Join to work in the round, being careful not to twist. Place marker for start of round.

**Round 1:** \*K1, p2, k1; rep from \* to end. Work this round a further 19 times (20 rounds).

### LEG

**Rounds 1-54:** Knit.

### HEEL FLAP

Turn work so WS is facing. Heel flap will be worked back and forth on the next 32 (36, 40) sts, beginning with a WS row. Keep remaining 32 (36, 40) sts on needles for instep.

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p31 (35, 39).  
**Row 2 (RS):** \*Sl1 wyib, k1; rep from \* to end. Rep these 2 rows a further 14 times, then work row 1 once more.

### HEEL TURN

**Row 1 (RS):** Sl1 wyib, k18 (20, 22), ssk, k1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 2 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p7, p2tog, p1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 3:** Sl1 wyib, knit to 1 st before gap, ssk, k1, turn.

**Row 4:** Sl1 wyif, purl to 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1, turn.  
 Rep last 2 rows a further 4 (5, 6) times. All heel sts have been worked. 20 (22, 24) heel sts remain.

### GUSSET

Begin working in the round again as follows:

**Set-up round:** Sl1, k19 (21, 23), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap (1 st in each slipped st along edge of the flap), k32 (36, 40) across instep sts, pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap, k36 (38, 40). Place marker for new start of round (at start of instep sts). 84 (90, 96) sts.

**Round 1:** K32 (36, 40), ssk, knit to 2 sts before end of round, k2tog, 2 sts dec.

**Round 2:** Knit.

Last 2 rounds set gusset decreases. Rep these 2 rounds a further 9 (8, 7) times. 20 (18, 16) sts dec; 64 (72, 80) sts remain. You now have 32 (36, 40) sts each on instep and sole.

### FOOT

Work st st in the round (knit every round) as set until the sock measures 5 (5.5, 6) cm [2 (2, 2½) in] less than the desired foot length.

### TOE

**Round 1:** K1, ssk, k26 (30, 34), k2tog, k1, pm, k1, ssk, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. 60 (68, 76) sts.

**Round 2:** Knit.

**Round 3:** \*K1, ssk, knit to 3 sts before marker, k2tog, k1, slm; rep from \* once more. 4 sts dec.

Rep last 2 rounds a further 9 (10, 12) times. 40 (44, 52) sts dec; 20 (24, 24) sts remain. Cut yarn, leaving a 30cm [12in] tail. Graft sts together using Kitchener stitch. Weave in ends.





## AFTERTHOUGHT HEEL VERSION

### CUFF AND LEG

Work as Heel Flap version.

### HEEL SET-UP

**Next round:** K32 (36, 40), use a length of waste yarn to knit 32 (36, 40) sts to end of round. Slip these 32 (36, 40) sts back on to left needle and then knit them again with the working yarn.

You now have 32 (36, 40) sts of waste yarn in your fabric. After completion of the toe, you will return to these sts, unpick the waste yarn and work an 'afterthought' heel.

### FOOT

Continue to work in st st as set until sock measures 10.5 (11.5, 12.5) cm [4 (4½, 5) in] less than the desired foot length when measured from the row of waste yarn sts.

### TOE

Work as Heel Flap version.

### AFTERTHOUGHT HEEL

Pick up the right leg (or side) of the 32 (36, 40) main yarn sts under the row of waste yarn sts. Turn the sock and rep the process again, picking up 32 (36, 40) sts from the other side of the waste yarn. You now have 64 (72, 80) sts on your needles. Carefully remove the waste yarn, ensuring all sts are safely on your needles. Begin to work in the round as follows:

**Round 1:** K32 (36, 40), pick up and knit 2 sts in the gap between the sole and instep, k32 (36, 40), pick up and knit 2 sts in the gap between the sole and instep, place marker for start of round. 68 (76, 84) sts.

**SMALL SIZE ONLY**

**Round 2:** \*K32, k2tog; rep from \* once more. 66 sts.

**MEDIUM SIZE ONLY**

**Round 2:** \*K17, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 72 sts.

**LARGE SIZE ONLY**

**Round 2:** Knit. 84 sts.

**ALL SIZES**

Knit 8 rounds.

**SHAPE HEEL**

**LARGE SIZE ONLY**

**Round 1:** \*K12, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 78 sts.

**Round 2:** Knit.

**Round 3:** \*K11, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 72 sts.

**Round 4:** Knit.

**LARGE AND MEDIUM SIZES**

**Round 5:** \*K10, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 66 sts.

**Round 6:** Knit.

**ALL SIZES**

**Round 7:** \*K9, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 60 sts.

**Round 8:** Knit.

**Round 9:** \*K8, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 54 sts.

**Round 10:** Knit.

**Round 11:** \*K7, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 48 sts.

**Round 12:** Knit.

**Round 13:** \*K6, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 42 sts.

**Round 14:** Knit.

**Round 15:** \*K5, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 36 sts.

**Round 16:** Knit.

**Round 17:** \*K4, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 30 sts.

**Round 18:** Knit.

**Round 19:** \*K3, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 24 sts.

**Round 20:** Knit.

**Round 21:** \*K2, K2tog; rep from \* to end. 18 sts.

**Round 22:** \*K1, K2tog; rep from \* to end. 12 sts.

**Round 23:** \*K2tog; rep from \* to end. 6 sts.

Break the yarn, leaving a 15cm [6in] tail, thread tail through the remaining sts and pull tightly to close the heel. Weave in the ends.

Whimsy Sokkusu O (100% superwash merino; 380m [415 yds] per 115g skein)  
1 skein in Fall Foliage

## NEEDLES

2.5mm [UK 13-12/US 1-2] 80cm [32in] circular needles or DPNs (or size needed to get correct tension)  
Stitch markers  
Tapestry needle

## TENSION

36 sts and 50 rounds = 10cm [4in] over st st  
46 sts and 50 rounds = 10cm [4in] over leg and foot stitch patterns (unstretched)

## SIZES

Small (Medium, Large)  
To fit foot circumference: 20.5 (23, 25.5) cm [8 (9, 10) in]  
Actual foot circumference of sock (unstretched): 16 (18, 20.5) cm [6¼ (7¼, 8) in]  
Length of leg to top of heel flap: 15cm [6in]  
Foot length is fully adjustable within the pattern.  
Finished sock measures 0.5cm [¼in] less than actual foot length, to ensure a good fit.

## PATTERN NOTES

The charted stitch patterns are also given as written instructions at the end of the pattern.

## ABBREVIATIONS

**m1:** Pick up the strand between stitches from front to back and knit through the back of this loop. 1 stitch increased.

**m1r:** Pick up the strand between stitches from back to front and knit this loop. 1 stitch increased.

**m1 purlwise:** Pick up the strand between stitches from front to back and purl through the back of this loop. 1 stitch increased.

## SOCK ONE

### CUFF AND LEG

Cast on 64 (72, 80) sts. Join to work in the round, being careful not to twist. Place marker for start of round.

**Rounds 1-18:** \*P1, k2, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Rounds 19-22:** \*K1, p2, k1; rep from \* to end.

**Rounds 23-26:** \*P1, k2, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Rounds 27-30:** Rep rounds 19-22.

**Rounds 31-40:** \*P1, k2, p1; rep from \* to end.

Work rounds 19-40 once more.

Work rounds 19-30 once more (74 rounds).

### HEEL FLAP

Turn work so WS is facing. Heel flap will be worked back and forth on the next 32 (36, 40) sts, beginning with a WS row. Keep remaining 32 (36, 40) sts on needles for instep.

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p31 (35, 39).

**Row 2 (RS):** \*Sl1 wyib, k1; rep from \* to end.

Rep these 2 rows a further 14 times, then work row 1 once more.

### HEEL TURN

**Row 1 (RS):** Sl1 wyib, k18 (20, 22), ssk, k1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 2 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p7, p2tog, p1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 3:** Sl1 wyib, knit to 1 st before gap, ssk, k1, turn.

**Row 4:** Sl1 wyif, purl to 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1, turn.

Rep last 2 rows 4 (5, 6) more times. All heel sts have been worked. 20 (22, 24) heel sts remain.

### GUSSET

Begin working in the round again as follows:

**Set-up round:** Sl1 wyib, k19 (21, 23), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap (1 st in each slipped st along edge of flap), work across 32 (36, 40) instep sts as foll: reading from right to left, work across row 1 of chart A, rep sts outlined in red 6 (7, 8) times in total before completing the row, pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap, k36 (38, 40). Place marker for new start of round (at start of instep sts). 84 (90, 96) sts.

**Round 1:** Work in pattern from row 2 of chart A, rep sts outlined in red 6 (7, 8) times in total, before completing the row, ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog, 2 sts dec.

**Round 2:** Work in pattern from row 3 of chart A, rep sts outlined in red 6 (7, 8) times in total, before completing the row, knit to end.

Working next row of chart each time, rep last 2 rounds a further 9 (8, 7) times. 20 (18, 16) sts dec; 64 (72, 80) sts remain. You now have 32 (36, 40) sts each on instep and sole.

**Round 1:** P1, k2, \*p2, k2\*, p2, k2, p1.

**Round 2:** P1, k2, \*p1, k2tog, k1, m1 purlwise\*, p1, k2tog, k1, m1r, p1.

**Round 3:** P1, k2, \*p1, k2, p1\*, p1, k3, p1.

**Round 4:** P1, k2, \*k2tog, k1, m1 purlwise, p1\*, k2tog, k1, m1r, k1, p1.

**Round 5:** P1, k2, \*k2, p2\*, k4, p1.

**Round 6:** P1, k1, k2tog, \*k1, m1 purlwise, p1, k2tog\*, k1, m1 purlwise, k2, p1.

**Round 7:** P1, k2, \*k1, p2, k1\*, k1, p1, k2, p1.

**Round 8:** P1, k2tog, k1, \*m1 purlwise, p1, k2tog, k1\*, m1 purlwise, p1, k2, p1.

### CHART B

MULTIPLE OF 4 + 8 STS AND 8 ROUNDS

Rep instructions from \* to \* as indicated in the pattern.

**Round 1:** P1, k2, \*p2, k2\*, p2, k2, p1.

**Round 2:** P1, m1l, k1, \*ssk, p1, m1 purlwise, k1\*, ssk, p1, k2, p1.

**Round 3:** P1, k2, \*k1, p2, k1\*, k1, p1, k2, p1.

**Round 4:** P1, k1, m1l, \*k1, ssk, p1, m1 purlwise\*, k1, ssk, k2, p1.

**Round 5:** P1, k2, \*k2, p2\*, k4, p1.

**Round 6:** P1, k2, \*m1 purlwise, k1, ssk, p1\*, m1 purlwise, k1, ssk, k1, p1.

**Round 7:** P1, k2, \*p1, k2, p1\*, p1, k3, p1.

**Round 8:** P1, k2, \*p1, m1 purlwise, k1, ssk\*, p1, m1 purlwise, k1, ssk, p1.

Kettle Yarn Co Twist (100% British Superwash Bluefaced Leicester; 183m [200yds] per 50g skein) 2 skeins in Canal

## NEEDLES

2.5mm [UK 13-12/US 1-2] 80cm [32in] circular needles or DPNs (or size needed to get correct tension)  
Cable needle  
Stitch markers  
Tapestry needle

## TENSION

36 sts and 50 rounds = 10cm [4in] over st st  
30 sts = 7cm [2¾in] over chart cable pattern  
36 rounds = 8.5cm [3¼in] over chart cable pattern (2 repeats)

## SIZES

Small (Medium, Large)  
To fit foot circumference: 20.5 (23, 25.5) cm [8 (9, 10) in]  
Actual foot circumference of sock (unstretched): 17.5 (19.5, 21.5) cm [7 (7¾, 8½) in]  
Length of leg to top of heel flap: 16cm [6¼in]  
Foot length is fully adjustable within the pattern.  
Finished sock measures 0.5cm [¼in] less than actual foot length, to ensure a good fit.

## PATTERN NOTES

The charted stitch patterns are also given as written instructions at the end of the pattern.

## ABBREVIATIONS

**1/1 LT:** Slip next st to cable needle and place at front of work, k1tbl, then k1tbl from cable needle  
**1/1 RT:** Slip next st to cable needle and place at back of work, k1tbl, then k1tbl from cable needle  
**1/1 LPT:** Slip next st to cable needle and place at front of work, p1, then k1tbl from cable needle  
**1/1 RPT:** Slip next st to cable needle and place at back of work, k1tbl, then p1 from cable needle

## BOTH SOCKS

### CUFF

Cast on 70 (78, 86) sts. Join to work in the round, being careful not to twist. Place marker for start of round.

**Round 1:** [P1, k1tbl] 1 (2, 3) times, \*p2, k1tbl, p1, k1tbl, p4, k1tbl, p1, k1tbl, p2, k2tbl, p2, k1tbl, p1, k1tbl, p4, k1tbl, p1, k1tbl, p2\*, [k1tbl, p1] 2 (4, 6) times, k1tbl, work from \* to \* once more, [k1tbl, p1] 1 (2, 3) times, k1tbl.  
Rep last round 15 more times (16 rounds).

### LEG

**Round 1:** [P1, k1tbl] 1 (2, 3) times, reading from right to left, work 30 sts from row 1 of chart A, [k1tbl, p1] 2 (4, 6) times, k1tbl, work 30 sts from row 1 of chart A, [k1tbl, p1] 1 (2, 3) times, k1tbl.  
Working next row of chart A each time, continue in pattern as set until chart A has been completed 3 times (54 rounds).

### HEEL FLAP

Turn work so WS is facing. Heel flap will be worked back and forth on the next 36 (40, 44) beginning with a WS row. Keep remaining 34 (38, 42) sts on needles for instep.

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p35 (39, 43).

**Row 2 (RS):** \*Sl1 wyib, k1; rep from \* to end.

Rep these 2 rows a further 14 times, then work row 1 once more.

### HEEL TURN

**Row 1 (RS):** Sl1 wyib, k20 (22, 24), ssk, k1, turn, leaving remaining 12 (14, 16) sts unworked.

**Row 2 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p7, p2tog, p1, turn, leaving remaining 12 (14, 16) sts unworked.

**Row 3:** Sl1 wyib, knit to 1 st before gap, ssk, k1, turn.

**Row 4:** Sl1 wyif, purl to 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1, turn.

Rep last 2 rows a further 5 (6, 7) times. All heel sts have been worked. 22 (24, 26) heel sts remain.

### GUSSET

Begin working in the round again as follows:

**Set-up round:** Sl1 wyib, k21 (23, 25), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap (1 st in each slipped st along edge of flap), work across 34 (38, 42) instep sts as follows: [P1, k1tbl] 1 (2, 3) times, reading from right to left, work from row 1 of chart A, [k1tbl, p1] 1 (2, 3) times, pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap, k38 (40, 42). Place marker for new start of round (at start of instep sts). 88 (94, 100) sts.

**Round 1:** Work in pattern as set over 34 (38, 42) instep sts, (chart A and twisted rib as established), ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog, 2 sts dec.

**Round 2:** Work in pattern as set over 34 (38, 42) instep sts, (chart A and twisted rib as established), knit to end.

**Round 3:** P3, [1/1 LPT] twice, [1/1 RPT] twice, p2, 1/1 RT, 1/1 LT, p2, [1/1 LPT] twice, [1/1 RPT] twice, p3.

**Round 4:** P4, k1tbl, p1, k2tbl, p1, k1tbl, p3, k4tbl, p3, k1tbl, p1, k2tbl, p1, k1tbl, p4.

**Round 7:** P5, 1/1 LPT, 1/1 RPT, p2, 1/1 RPT, 1/1 RT, 1/1 LT, 1/1 LPT, p2, 1/1 LPT, 1/1 RPT, p5.

**Round 8:** P6, k2tbl, p3, k1tbl, p1, k4tbl, p1, k1tbl, p3, k2tbl, p6.

**Round 9:** P6, 1/1 LT, p3, k1tbl, 1/1 RPT, p2, 1/1 LPT, k1tbl, p3, 1/1 RT, p6.

**Round 10:** P6, k2tbl, p3, [k2tbl, p1] twice, k2tbl, p3, k2tbl, p6.

**Round 11:** P5, 1/1 RT, 1/1 LT, p2, [1/1 LPT, 1/1 RPT] twice, p2, 1/1 RT, 1/1 LT, p5.

**Round 12:** P5, k4tbl, p3, k2tbl, p2, k2tbl, p3, k4tbl, p5.

**Round 13:** P4, 1/1 RPT, 1/1 LT, [1/1 LPT, p2] twice, 1/1 RPT, p2, 1/1 RPT, 1/1 RT, 1/1 LPT, p4.

**Round 14:** P4, k1tbl, p1, k2tbl, p1, k1tbl, p3, k1tbl, p2, k1tbl, p3, k1tbl, p1, k2tbl, p1, k1tbl, p4.

**Round 15:** P3, [1/1 RPT] twice, [1/1 LPT] twice, p2, 1/1 LPT, 1/1 RPT, p2, [1/1 RPT] twice, [1/1 LPT] twice, p3.

**Round 16:** Repeat round 2.

**Round 17:** P2, [1/1 RPT] twice, p2, [1/1 LPT] twice, p2, 1/1 LT, p2, [1/1 RPT] twice, p2, [1/1 LPT] twice, p2.

**Round 18:** P2, k1tbl, p1, k1tbl, p4, k1tbl, p1, k1tbl, p2, k2tbl, p2, k1tbl, p1, k1tbl, p4, k1tbl, p1, k1tbl, p2.

 Small quantity of smooth 4ply waste yarn.

## NEEDLES

2.5mm [UK 13-12/US 1-2] 80cm [32in] circular needles or DPNs (or size needed to get correct tension)  
 Cable needle  
 Stitch markers  
 Tapestry needle

## SOCK ONE

### CUFF

Cast on 68 (76, 84) sts. Join to work in the round, being careful not to twist. Place marker for start of round.

**Rounds 1 and 2:** \*P4, [k2, p2] 3 times, p4, [k2, p2] 3 (4, 5) times, k2; rep from \* once more.

**Round 3:** \*P4, reading from right to left, work 12 sts from row 1 of chart A, p4, [k2, p2] 3 (4, 5) times, k2; rep from \* once more.

Last round sets chart A and rib patterns. Working next row of chart A each time, continue in pattern as set until Chart A has been completed 3 times (24 chart A rounds; 26 rounds total).

**LEG**

**Round 27:** \*P4, reading from right to left, work 22 sts from row 1 of chart B, [p2, k2] 2 (3, 4) times; rep from \* once more. Last round sets chart B and rib patterns. Work as set until chart B has been completed once (24 rounds).

**Round 51:** \*P4, reading from right to left, work 22 sts from row 1 of chart B, [p2, k2] 2 (3, 4) times; rep from \* once more. Last round sets chart C and rib patterns. Work as set until chart C has been completed once (24 rounds).

**HEEL SET-UP**

**Round 75:** P4, work 22 sts from row 1 of chart B, [p2, k2] 2 (3, 4) times, use a piece of waste yarn to knit 34 (38, 42) sts to end of round. Slip these 34 (38, 42) sts back on to left needle and then knit them again with the working yarn.

You now have 34 (38, 42) sts of waste yarn in your fabric. After completion of the toe, you will return to these sts, unpick the waste yarn and work an 'afterthought' heel.

**FOOT**

**Round 76:** P4, work 22 sts from row 2 of chart B, [p2, k2] 2 (3, 4) times, knit to end. Last round sets chart B and rib on instep, and st st on sole. Continue to work as set until chart B is complete.

**Round 99:** P4, work 22 sts from row 1 of chart C, [p2, k2] 2 (3, 4) times, knit to end. Last round sets chart C and rib on instep, and st st on sole. Continue to work as set until chart C is complete.

**Round 123:** P4, work 12 sts from row 1 of chart A, p4, [k2, p2] 3 (4, 5) times, k2, knit to end. Last round sets chart A and rib on instep, and st st on sole. Continue to work as set until sock measures 11.5 (12, 13.5) cm [4½ (4¾, 5¼) in] less than the desired foot length when measured from the row of waste yarn sts.

**TOE**

**Round 1:** Knit.

**Round 2:** K1, ssk, k28 (32, 36), k2tog, k1, pm, k1, ssk, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. 64 (72, 80) sts.

**Round 3:** Knit.

**Round 4:** \*K1, ssk, knit to 3 sts before marker, k2tog, k1, slm; rep from \* once more. 4 sts dec.

Rep last 2 rounds a further 10 (11, 13) times. 44 (48, 56) sts dec; 20 (24, 24) sts remain. Cut yarn, leaving a 30cm [12in] tail. Graft sts together using Kitchener stitch. Weave in ends.

**AFTERTHOUGHT HEEL**

Pick up the right leg (or side) of the 34 (38, 42) main yarn sts under the row of waste yarn sts. Turn the sock and rep the process again, picking up 34 (38, 42) sts from the other side of the waste yarn. You now have 68 (76, 84) sts on your needles. Carefully remove the waste yarn, ensuring all sts are safely on your needles. Begin to work in the round as follows:

**Round 1:** K34 (38, 42), pick up and knit 2 sts in the gap between the sole and instep, k34 (38, 42), pick up and knit 2 sts in the gap between the sole and instep and place marker for start of round. 72 (80, 88) sts.

**SMALL SIZE ONLY**

**Round 2:** Knit. 72 sts.

**MEDIUM SIZE ONLY**

**Round 2:** \*K38, k2tog; rep from \* once more. 78 sts.

**LARGE SIZE ONLY**

**Round 2:** \*K20, k2tog; rep from \* to end of round. 84 sts.

**ALL SIZES**

Knit 8 rounds.

**SHAPE HEEL****LARGE SIZE ONLY**

**Round 1:** \*K12, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 78 sts.

**Round 2:** Knit.

**LARGE AND MEDIUM SIZES**

**Round 3:** \* K11, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 72 sts.

**Round 4:** Knit.

**ALL SIZES**

**Round 5:** \* K10, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 66 sts.

**Round 6:** Knit.

**Round 7:** \*K9, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 60 sts.

**Round 8:** Knit.

**Round 9:** \*K8, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 54 sts.

**Round 10:** Knit.

**Round 11:** \*K7, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 48 sts.

**Round 12:** Knit.

**Round 13:** \*K6, k2tog; rep from \* to end. 42 sts.

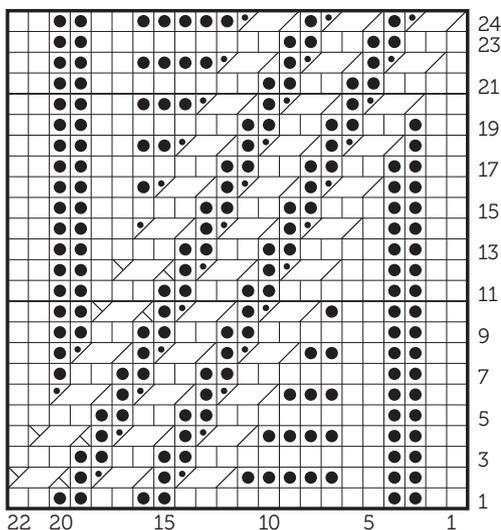

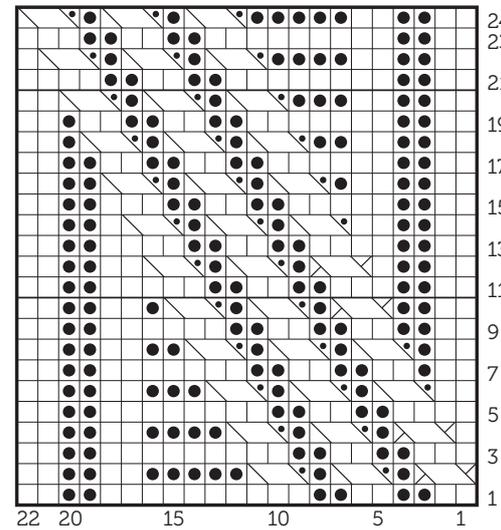
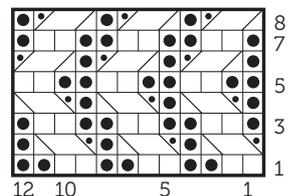

**Round 76:** \*[K2, p2] 2 (3, 4) times, work 22 sts from row 2 of chart C, p4, knit to end. Last round sets chart C and rib on instep, and st st on sole. Continue to work as set until chart C is complete.

**Round 99:** \*[K2, p2] 2 (3, 4) times, work 22 sts from row 1 of chart B, p4, knit to end. Last round sets chart B and rib on instep, and st st on sole. Continue to work as set until chart B is complete.

**Round 123:** K2, [p2, k2] 3 (4, 5) times, p4, work 12 sts from row 5 of chart A, p4, knit to end.

Last round sets chart A and rib on instep, and st st on sole. Continue to work as set until sock measures 11.5 (12, 13.5) cm [4½ (4¾, 5¼) in] less than the desired foot length when measured from the row of waste yarn sts.

Work as Sock One.

Last round sets rib and chart A patterns. Working next row of chart A each time, continue as set until chart A has been completed 5 times (40 rounds).

**Partial round:** Remove start of round marker, k6 (9, 11), place marker for new start of round.

**Round 41:** K6 (8, 11), work 20 sts from row 1 of chart A, k12 (17, 22), work 20 sts from row 1 of chart A, k6 (9, 11).

Last round sets st st and chart A pattern. Continue to work in pattern as set, working next row of chart A each time, until chart A has been completed a further 4 times (32 rounds).

### HEEL FLAP

Turn work so WS is facing. Heel flap will be worked back and forth on the next 32 (38, 42) beginning with a WS row. Keep remaining 32 (36, 42) sts on needles for instep.

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p31 (37, 41).

**Row 2 (RS):** \*Sl1 wyib, k1; rep from \* to end.

Rep the last 2 rows a further 14 times then work row 1 once more.

### HEEL TURN

**Row 1 (RS):** Sl1 wyib, k18 (20, 22), ssk, k1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (14, 16) sts unworked.

**Row 2 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p7 (5, 5), p2tog, p1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (14, 16) sts unworked.

**Row 3:** Sl1 wyib, knit to 1 st before gap, ssk, k1, turn.

**Row 4:** Sl1 wyif, purl to 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1, turn.

Rep last 2 rows a further 4 (6, 7) times. All

heel sts have been worked. 20 (22, 24) heel sts remain.

### GUSSET

Begin working in the round again as follows:

**Set-up round:** Sl1 wyib, k19 (21, 23), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap (1 st in each slipped st along edge of flap), work across 32 (36, 42) instep sts as follows: K6 (8, 11), work 20 sts from row 1 of chart A, k6 (8, 11), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap, k36 (38, 40). Place marker for new start of round (at start of instep sts). 84 (90, 98) sts.

**Round 1:** K6 (8, 11), work 20 sts from next row of chart A, k6 (8, 11), ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog. 2 sts dec.

**Round 2:** K6 (8, 11), work 20 sts from next row of chart A, k6 (8, 11), knit to end.

Working next row of chart each time, rep last 2 rounds a further 9 (8, 6) times. 20 (18, 14) sts dec; 64 (72, 84) sts.

## SOCK TWO

### CUFF AND LEG

Cast on 64 (74, 84) sts. Join to work in the round, being careful not to twist. Place marker for start of round.

**Round 1:** \*[K2, p1, k1tbl, p1] 2 (3, 4) times, k2, work 20 sts from **row 5** of chart A; rep from \* once more.

Last round sets rib and chart A patterns. Working next row of chart A each time, continue as set until row 4 of chart A has been completed 5 times (40 rounds).

**Partial round:** Remove start of round marker, k6 (9, 11), place marker for new start of round.

**Round 41:** K6 (8, 11), work 20 sts from **row 5** of chart A, k12 (17, 22), work 20 sts from row 5 of chart A, k6 (9, 11).

Last round sets st st and chart A pattern. Continue to work in pattern as set, working next row of chart A each time, until row 4 of chart A has been completed a further 4 times (32 rounds).

Last round sets rib and chart patterns. Working next row of charts each time, continue in pattern as set until charts have been completed twice (64 rounds).

Turn work so WS is facing. Heel flap will be worked back and forth on the next 32 (36, 40) sts beginning with a WS row. Keep remaining 32 (36, 40) sts on needles for instep.

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p0 (1, 2), k2, [p2, k2] 3 times, p2 (4, 6), k2, [p2, k2] 3 times, p1 (2, 3).

**Row 2 (RS):** \*Sl1 wyib, k0 (1, 2), p2, k10, p2, k2 (4, 6), p2, k10, p2, k1 (2, 3).

Rep the last 2 rows a further 14 times then work row 1 once more.

### HEEL TURN

**Row 1 (RS):** Sl1 wyib, k18 (20, 22), ssk, k1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 2 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p7, p2tog, p1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 3:** Sl1 wyib, knit to 1 st before gap, ssk, k1, turn.

**Row 4:** Sl1 wyif, purl to 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1, turn.

Rep last 2 rows a further 4 (5, 6) times. All heel sts have been worked. 20 (22, 24) heel sts remain.

### GUSSET

Begin working in the round again as follows:

**Set-up round:** Sl1 wyib, k19 (21, 23), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap (1 st in each slipped st along edge of flap), work across 32 (36, 40) instep sts as follows: K1 (2, 3), p2, work row 1 of chart A, p2, k2 (4, 6), p2, work row 1 of chart B, p2, k1 (2, 3), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap, k36 (38, 40). Place marker for new start of round (at start of instep sts). 84 (90, 96) sts.

**Round 1:** K1 (2, 3), p2, work row 2 of chart A, p2, k2 (4, 6), p2, work row 2 of chart B, p2, k1 (2, 3), ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog. 2 sts dec.

**Round 2:** K1 (2, 3), p2, work row 3 of chart A, p2, k2 (4, 6), p2, work row 3 of chart B, p2, k1 (2, 3), knit to end.

Working next row of charts each time, rep last 2 rounds a further 9 (8, 7) times. 20 (18, 16) sts dec; 64 (72, 80) sts remain. You now have 32 (36, 40) sts each on instep and on sole.

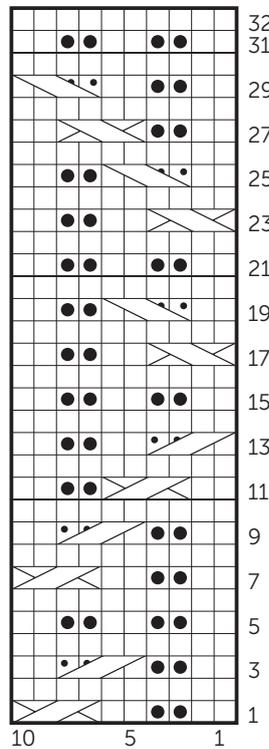

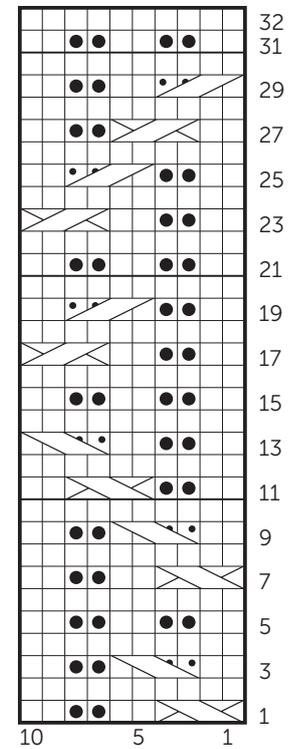

## TENSION

36 sts and 50 rounds = 10cm [4in] over st st  
9 sts = 2cm [ $\frac{3}{4}$ in] over chart A pattern  
18 sts = 4.5cm [ $1\frac{3}{4}$ in] over chart B pattern (2 repeats)

## SIZES

Small (Medium, Large)

To fit foot circumference: 20.5 (23, 25.5) cm [8 (9, 10) in]

Actual foot circumference of sock (unstretched; average of Socks One and Two): 17 (19, 21) cm [ $6\frac{3}{4}$  ( $7\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $8\frac{1}{4}$ ) in]

Length of leg to top of heel flap: 14.5cm [ $5\frac{3}{4}$ in]

Foot length is fully adjustable within the pattern.

Finished sock measures 0.5cm [ $\frac{1}{4}$ in] less than actual foot length, to ensure a good fit.

## PATTERN NOTES

The charted stitch patterns are also given as written instructions at the end of the pattern. These socks are designed to be non-identical. If you would prefer identical socks, simply work two Sock Ones (or Twos). The two socks have very slightly different foot circumferences (by 0.5cm [ $\frac{1}{4}$ in]) due to the different tensions of the two charted patterns.

## SOCK ONE

### CUFF AND LEG

Cast on 66 (72, 78) sts. Join to work in the round, being careful not to twist. Place marker for start of round.

**Round 1:** \*P2 (3, 4), reading from right to left, work 9 sts from row 1 of chart A, p2 (3, 4), reading from right to left, work 9 sts from row 1 of chart B; rep from \* to end. Last round sets reverse st st and chart patterns. Working next row of charts each time, continue in pattern as set until charts have been completed 4 times and rounds 1-8 have been worked once more (72 rounds).

**Heel set-up (partial round):** Remove marker, p1.

### HEEL FLAP

Turn work so WS is facing. Heel flap will be worked back and forth on the next 33 (35, 37) sts beginning with a WS row. Keep remaining 33 (37, 41) sts on needles for instep.

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p32 (34, 36).

**Row 2 (RS):** \*Sl1 wyib, k1; rep from \* to last st, k1.

Rep the last 2 rows a further 14 times then work row 1 once more.

### HEEL TURN

**Row 1 (RS):** Sl1 wyib, k17 (19, 19), ssk, k1, turn, leaving remaining 12 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 2 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p4 (6, 4), p2tog, p1, turn, leaving remaining 12 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 3:** Sl1 wyib, knit to 1 st before gap, ssk, k1, turn.

**Row 4:** Sl1 wyif, purl to 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1, turn.

Rep last 2 rows a further 5 (5, 6) times. All heel sts have been worked. 19 (21, 21) heel sts remain.

### GUSSET

Begin working in the round again as follows:

**Set-up round:** Sl1 wyib, k18 (20, 20), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap (1 st in each slipped st along edge of flap), work across 33 (37, 41) instep sts as foll: P1 (2, 3), work row 9 of chart A, p2 (3, 4), work row 9 of chart B, p2 (3, 4), work row 9 of chart A, p1 (2, 3), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap, k35 (37, 37).

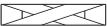

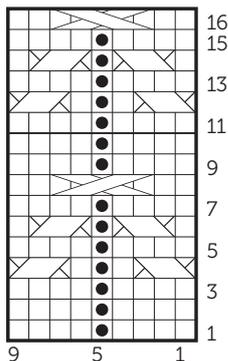
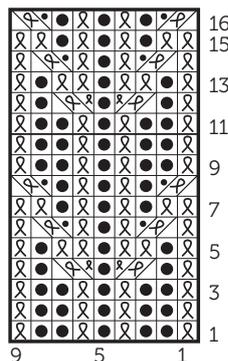

**Round 3:** Knit.

**Round 4:** \*K1, ssk, knit to 3 sts before marker, k2tog, k1, slm; rep from \* once more. 4 sts dec.

Rep last 2 rounds a further 10 (10, 12) times. 44 (44, 52) sts dec; 18 (22, 22) sts remain.

Cut yarn, leaving a 30cm [12in] tail. Graft sts together using Kitchener stitch. Weave in ends.

## SOCK TWO

### CUFF AND LEG

Cast on 66 (72, 78) sts. Join to work in the round, being careful not to twist. Place marker for start of round.

**Round 1:** \*P2 (3, 4), work 9 sts from **row 9** of chart B, p2 (3, 4), work 9 sts from **row 9** of chart A; rep from \* to end.

Last round sets reverse st st and chart patterns. Working next row of charts each time, continue in pattern as set until rounds 9-16 of charts have been completed, then rounds 1-16 worked a further 4 times (72 rounds).

### HEEL FLAP AND TURN

**Set-up round:** Sl1 wyib, k18 (20, 20), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap (1 st in each slipped st along edge of flap), work across 33 (37, 41) instep sts as follows: P1 (2, 3), work row 1 of chart B, p2 (3, 4), work row 1 of chart A, p2 (3, 4), work row 1 of chart B, p1 (2, 3), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap, k35 (37, 37). Place marker for new start of round (at start of instep sts). 84 (90, 94) sts.

**Round 1:** P1 (2, 3), work row 2 of chart B, p2 (3, 4), work row 2 of chart A, p2 (3, 4), work row 2 of chart B, p1 (2, 3), ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog. 2 sts dec.

**Round 2:** P1 (2, 3), work row 3 of chart B, p2 (3, 4), work row 3 of chart A, p2 (3, 4), work row 3 of chart B, p1 (2, 3), knit to end.

Working next row of charts each time, rep last 2 rounds a further 8 (8, 6) times. 18 (18, 14) sts dec; 66 (72, 80) sts. You now have 33 (37, 41) sts on instep and 33 (35, 39) sts on sole.

Work chart A a further 5 times, changing CC for the next mini skein in the sequence each time, thus ending with MC and CC7 (60 rounds).

Remaining sock is worked in MC only.

Turn work so WS is facing. Heel flap will be worked back and forth on the next 30 (35, 40) sts, beginning with a WS row. Keep remaining 30 (35, 40) sts on needles for instep.

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p29 (34, 39).

**Row 2 (RS):** \*Sl1 wyib, k1; rep from \* to last 0 (1, 0) st, k0 (1, 0).

Rep these 2 rows a further 14 times, then work row 1 once more.

### HEEL TURN

**Row 1 (RS):** Sl1 wyib, k16 (19, 22), ssk, k1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 2 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p5 (6, 7), p2tog, p1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 3:** Sl1 wyib, knit to 1 st before gap, ssk, k1, turn.

**Row 4:** Sl1 wyif, purl to 1 st before gap,

p2tog, p1, turn.

Rep last 2 rows 4 (5, 6) more times. All heel sts have been worked. 18 (21, 24) heel sts remain.

### GUSSET

Begin working in the round again as follows:

**Set-up round:** Sl1 wyib, k17 (20, 23), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap (1 st in each slipped st along edge of flap), k30 (35, 40) instep sts, pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap, k34 (37, 40). Place marker for new start of round (at start of instep sts). 80 (88, 96) sts.

**Round 1:** [P1, k3, p1] 6 (7, 8) times, ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog. 2 sts dec.

**Round 2:** [P1, k3, p1] 6 (7, 8) times, knit to end.

Rep last 2 rounds a further 9 (8, 7) times. 20 (18, 16) sts dec; 60 (70, 80) sts remain. You now have 30 (35, 40) sts each on instep and sole.

### FOOT

Work as set (rib on instep and st st on sole) until the sock measures 4.5 (5.5, 6.5) cm [1¾ (2¼, 2½) in] less than the desired foot length.

### TOE

**Round 1:** Knit.

**Round 2:** K1, ssk, k24 (29, 34), k2tog, k1, pm, k1, ssk, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. 56 (66, 76) sts.

**Round 3:** Knit.

**Round 4:** \*K1, ssk, knit to 3 sts before marker, k2tog, k1, slm; rep from \* once more. 4 sts dec.

Rep last 2 rounds a further 8 (10, 12) times. 36 (44, 52) sts dec; 20 (22, 24) sts remain.

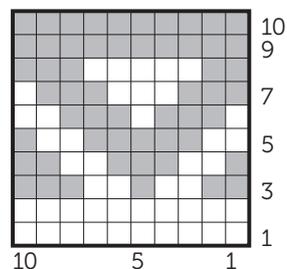

37 sts = 7.5cm [3in] over chart B, C or D cable pattern

24 rounds = 5cm [2in] over charted cable patterns

## SOCK ONE

### CUFF

Cast on 60 (72, 84) sts. Join to work in the round, being careful not to twist. Place marker for start of round.

**Round 1:** \*P3, k1tbl, p1, k1tbl, p3, k3; rep from \* to end.

Last round sets rib pattern, work this round a further 15 times (16 rounds).

### LEG

**Round 1:** Reading from right to left, [work 12 sts from row 1 of chart A] 5 (6, 7) times. Last round sets chart A pattern. Working next row of chart A each time, continue as set until chart A has been completed 5 times and round 1 has been worked once more (61 rounds).

### SMALL AND LARGE SIZES

**Partial round:** Remove start of round marker, p1.

### MEDIUM SIZE ONLY

**Partial round:** Remove start of round marker, p3, k1tbl, p1, k1tbl, p3, k1.

### ALL SIZES

The partial round ensures that the heel flap is correctly positioned.

### HEEL FLAP

Turn work so WS is facing. Heel flap will be worked back and forth on the next 29 (35, 41) beginning with a WS row. Keep remaining 31 (37, 43) sts on needles for instep.

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p28 (34, 40).

**Row 2 (RS):** \*Sl1 wyib, k1; rep from \* to last st, k1.

Rep the last 2 rows a further 14 times then work row 1 once more.

### HEEL TURN

**Row 1 (RS):** Sl1 wyib, k15 (19, 21), ssk, k1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 16) sts unworked.

**Row 2 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p4 (6, 4), p2tog, p1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 16) sts unworked.

**Row 3:** Sl1 wyib, knit to 1 st before gap, ssk, k1, turn.

**Row 4:** Sl1 wyif, purl to 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1, turn.

Rep last 2 rows a further 4 (5, 7) times. All heel sts have been worked. 17 (21, 23) heel sts remain.

### GUSSET

Begin working in the round again as follows:

**Set-up round:** Sl1 wyib, k16 (20, 22), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap (1 st in each slipped st along edge of flap), work across 31 (37, 43) instep sts from row 1 of chart B (C, D), pick up and knit 16 sts along edge of heel flap, k33 (37, 39). Place marker for new start of round (at start of instep sts). 80 (90, 98) sts.

**Round 1:** Work 31 (37, 43) sts from row 2 of chart B (C, D), ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog, 2 sts dec.

**Round 2:** Work 31 (37, 43) sts from row 3 of chart B (C, D), knit to end.

Working next row of chart each time, rep last 2 rounds a further 9 (8, 6) times. 20 (18, 14) sts dec; 60 (72, 84) sts.

You now have 31 (37, 43) sts on instep and 29 (35, 41) sts on sole.

### FOOT

When row 24 of chart is complete, rep rows 5-24 only, working as set (chart B (C, D) on instep and st st on sole) until the sock measures 5 (5.5, 7) cm [2 (2¼, 2¾) in] less than the desired foot length.

**Toe set-up round:** K1, ssk, k25 (31, 37), k2tog, knit to end. 2 sts dec; 58 (70, 82) sts remain.

### TOE

**Round 1:** Knit.

**Round 2:** K1, ssk, k23 (29, 35), k2tog, k1, pm, k1, ssk, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. 54 (66, 78) sts.

**Round 3:** Knit.

**Round 4:** \*K1, ssk, knit to 3 sts before marker, k2tog, k1, slm; rep from \* once more. 4 sts dec.

Rep last 2 rounds a further 8 (10, 13) times. 36 (44, 56) sts dec; 18 (22, 22) sts remain. Cut yarn, leaving a 30cm [12in] tail. Graft sts together using Kitchener stitch. Weave in ends.

Work as Sock One, simply substituting 1/1/1 LPT for the 1/1/1 RPT shown on the charts and written instructions.

23 sts = 5.5cm [2¼in] over chart A or B cable pattern  
40 sts and 48 rounds = 10cm [4in] over broken twisted rib pattern

Small (Medium, Large)  
To fit foot circumference: 20.5 (23, 25.5) cm [8 (9, 10) in]  
Actual foot circumference of sock (unstretched): 17 (19.5, 22) cm [6¾ (7¾, 8¾) in]

### HEEL FLAP

Turn work so WS is facing. Heel flap will be worked back and forth on the next 29 (34, 39) sts beginning with a WS row. Keep remaining 33 (38, 43) sts on needles for instep.

**Row 1 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p28 (33, 38).

**Row 2 (RS):** \*Sl1 wyib, k1; rep from \* to last 1 (0, 1) st, k1 (0, 1).

Rep the last 2 rows a further 14 times then work row 1 once more.

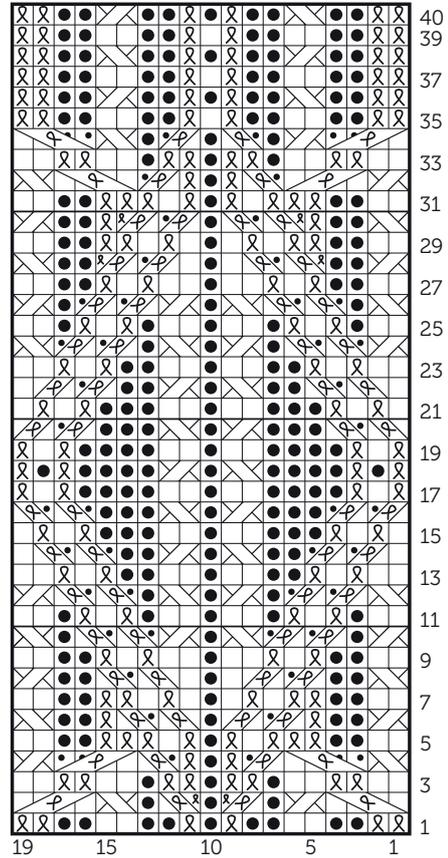
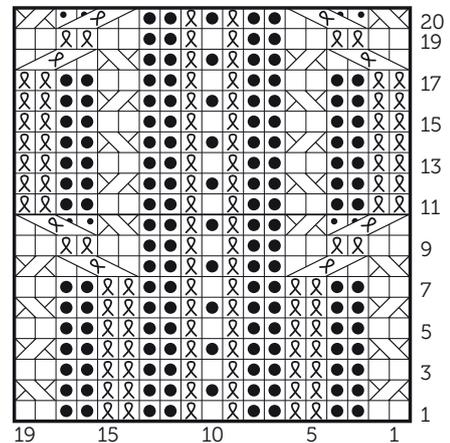

**Row 1 (RS):** Sl1 wyib, k18 (20, 22), ssk, k1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 2 (WS):** Sl1 wyif, p7, p2tog, p1, turn, leaving remaining 10 (12, 14) sts unworked.

**Row 3:** Sl1 wyib, knit to 1 st before gap, ssk, k1, turn.

**Row 4:** Sl1 wyif, purl to 1 st before gap, p2tog, p1, turn.

Rep last 2 rows a further 4 (5, 6) times. All heel sts have been worked. 20 (22, 24) heel sts remain.

### GUSSET

Begin working in the round again as follows:

Place marker for new start of round (at start of instep sts). 84 (90, 96) sts.

### SMALL AND LARGE SIZES

**Round 1:** [Work row 2 of chart B] 4 (-, 5) times, ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog, 2 sts dec.

**Round 2:** [Work row 3 of chart B] 4 (-, 5) times, knit to end.

### MEDIUM SIZE ONLY

**Round 1:** Work from row 2 of chart C, repeating marked section 4 times in total, ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog, 2 sts dec.

**Round 2:** Work from row 3 of chart C, repeating marked section 4 times in total, knit to end.

### ALL SIZES

**Round 1:** P1, [k1tbl, p1] 0 (1, 2) times, work 32 sts from row 2 of chart D, p1, [k1tbl, p1] 0 (1, 2) times, ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog. 2 sts dec.

**Round 2:** P1, [k1tbl, p1] 0 (1, 2) times, work 32 sts from row 3 of chart D, p1, [k1tbl, p1] 0 (1, 2) times, knit to end.

Working next row of chart each time, rep last 2 rounds a further 9 (8, 7) times. 20 (18, 16) sts dec; 66 (74, 82) sts remain.



You now have 34 (38, 42) sts on instep and 32 (36, 40) sts on sole.

### FOOT

Work as set (twisted rib and chart D on instep and st st on sole) until the sock measures 5 (5.5, 6.5) cm [2 (2¼, 2½) in] less than the desired foot length.

**Toe set-up round:** K1, ssk, k28 (32, 36), k2tog, knit to end. 2 sts dec; 64 (72, 80) sts remain.

### TOE

**Round 1:** Knit.

**Round 2:** K1, ssk, k26 (30, 34), k2tog, k1, pm, k1, ssk, knit to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. 60 (68, 76) sts.

**Round 3:** Knit.

**Round 4:** \*K1, ssk, knit to 3 sts before marker, k2tog, k1, slm; rep from \* once more. 4 sts dec.

Rep last 2 rounds a further 9 (10, 12) times. 40 (44, 52) sts dec; 20 (24, 24) sts remain. Cut yarn, leaving a 30cm [12in] tail. Graft sts together using Kitchener stitch. Weave in ends.

# Why knit socks?

You will often be asked why you would bother to knit socks when you could just buy a pair very easily for not very much money.

## Here's my take...

- » Socks are small and portable, making them perfect commuting or travel companions.
- » Many knitters will have a sock project on the go as well as a larger garment, so that they have something to take along on trips outside the house.
- » Hand-knitted socks are warmer and more comfortable than most shop-bought socks.
- » Socks are also a good way to learn new techniques – they are small and reach the 'finished object' stage much more quickly than a garment.
- » They are possibly the ideal use for the beautifully unique hand-dyed yarns that are available around the world.
- » Most socks can be knitted from 100g of yarn or less.

I'm sure there are many (many) more reasons to knit socks – of course, the perfect answer to this question is always...

**'Because I can!'**

The following pages have some good tips to get the best results from your sock knitting adventures.



## TOP TIPS FOR SOCK KNITTERS

Here are some of my top tips for knitting socks:

### WORK AT A TIGHT TENSION

Make sure that your knitted fabric is firm. Working at a tight tension ensures that your socks will last longer and won't sag. When stitches in fabric are too large, the yarn moves around more and rubs against itself, which causes wear. I usually work at a stocking stitch tension of 36 sts and 50 rows to 10cm [4in], which gives a firm, hard-wearing fabric in most standard sock yarns.

### CHOOSING YARNS: COLOURS

Most of my textured sock designs will require a solid or semi-solid coloured yarn. Too much variegation in the colours makes the texture patterns hard to see. When choosing yarns for colourwork socks, such as Otis, be sure to check that all shades are colourfast before casting on. You can do this by soaking a portion of your skein in tepid water and then pressing the damp yarn on some kitchen roll. If any colour comes off on the towel it may require further rinsing before you knit with it. If colour continues to bleed, contact the yarn company or dyer for further advice.

### CHOOSING YARNS: FIBRES

Some sock yarns have a nylon content, this can help strengthen the socks and make them last longer. A sock yarn which is 100% wool and has no nylon can also wear well, so long as it is knitted at a firm tension. Sock yarns with a small amount of silk can also be very strong. Yarns that are specifically intended for socks are often spun tightly and made from blends that are well-suited to knitting socks.

### CASTING ON

I recommend using the Long-Tail Cast-On Method when casting on for socks. This gives a firm, but stretchy edge to your cuff. You will find a step-by-step tutorial on page 82. There is also a link to an online video tutorial shown on the next page.

### TENSION

Obtaining the correct tension (US: gauge) for both the stocking stitch and stitch patterns in your sock is vital to creating a sock that fits. The needle sizes given are suggestions. Every knitter is different, and the fact that your tension matches in stocking stitch does not guarantee that it will match in the pattern stitch. It may not seem worth knitting a separate swatch in the round, but please be sure to check that you are getting the correct tension once you have knitted 10cm [4in] of the main leg pattern. This will save you from having to rip out a whole sock later.

Once you have knitted 10cm [4in] of the main leg pattern, carefully measure the number of stitches and rows over the central 10cm [4in]. If you have the correct number of stitches and rows, you are using the correct sized needles. If you have too many stitches (and rows), you will need to start again with larger needles. If you have too few stitches (and rows), you will need to try smaller needles.

It is very important to match the tension given in *both* stitch patterns; the needle size that you use to do this does not matter. It is the tension that determines the finished size of your socks and how much yarn is used.

### SOCK SIZING

The socks in this book are all designed with negative ease. This means that the socks have a smaller foot circumference than your feet do. All of the stitch patterns used are inherently stretchy, so to ensure that your socks don't sag, they need to be knitted a little smaller than your foot size.

You will notice that no foot lengths are given in the patterns. This is because all socks can be knitted to the exact foot length required. Very long foot lengths may require more yarn; all of the samples were knitted to a foot length of 23cm [9in]. If you don't know the foot length of your sock recipient, the sizing tables below may prove useful. Sizing varies considerably between manufacturers and countries, so the best method is to measure the foot.

## YARDAGE AND LARGER FEET

If you are knitting socks for a shoe size greater than a UK size 7 you will need to choose a sock yarn with a yardage of greater than 400m [438yds] or purchase two skeins, to ensure you will have enough yarn to complete your socks. The socks shown on female models in this book are a UK size 7 and the socks shown on a man are UK size 10.

## WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS

Where there is only one set of numbers in a pattern instruction, it refers to all sizes. When more than one number is given, the smallest size appears first, with the larger sizes appearing inside brackets in size order. It is always useful to circle or highlight the size you are working throughout the pattern before you start. Read the pattern carefully, as sometimes smaller groups of sizes are treated separately. It is always marked clearly where the instructions return to all sizes.

## USING CHARTS

Charts are a graphical representation of your knitting, with each square representing a stitch (or small group of stitches) and every row of squares representing a round of knitting. All chart rows are read from right to left, since the sock designs in this book are all knitted in the round.

We have given written instructions for all of the non-colourwork charts in this book.

## REPEATING INSTRUCTIONS

Where a pattern tells you to repeat from \* a certain number more times, it means that you should work the instruction once, and then work it a further number of times as instructed. For example, \*p1, k1 tbl; repeat from \* a further 2 times. This means that you repeat "p1, k1 tbl" three times in total (p1, k1 tbl, p1, k1 tbl, p1, k1 tbl).

## SQUARE BRACKETS

Some patterns have instructions given within square brackets. After the bracket it will tell you how many times to work that instruction in total. For example, [k3, p1 tbl] 3 times. This would be worked as k3, p1 tbl, k3, p1 tbl, k3, p1 tbl.

Take care to follow the washing instructions on your ball band. Many sock yarns are machine washable at 40°C on a gentle cycle. Generally, hand-dyed yarns will keep their colours longer if they are hand-washed.

# How to...

## AFTERTHOUGHT HEEL

This type of heel is used in the Orville sock pattern on page 22.



1. Return to the line of waste yarn that was knitted as part of the heel set-up instructions.



2. With RS facing, pick up the right leg of each stitch directly below the row of waste yarn. Use two DPNs, picking up half the total number of stitches on each needle.



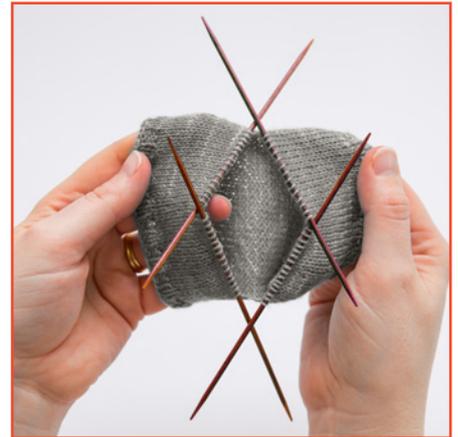
3. Turn the sock and repeat Step 2, picking up the stitches on the other side of the waste yarn.



4. The stitches above and below the waste yarn are now spread across four DPNs. If using circular needles, pick up first side on needle tip, slide the stitches onto the cable, and pick up the second side on the needle tip.



5. Carefully remove the waste yarn, taking care that no stitches were missed from the picking up process.



6. The live stitches are now spread across four DPNs and are ready to work.

## KITCHENER STITCH (GRAFTING)

Every sock in this book uses Kitchener stitch to close the toe stitches. This tutorial shows you how, and gives tips on making the graft stitches neat and tidy.



1. Holding needles parallel to each other, thread a tapestry needle with the yarn tail. Insert the tapestry needle into the first stitch on the DPN closest to you **as if to purl** and pull it through, leaving the stitch **on** the needle.



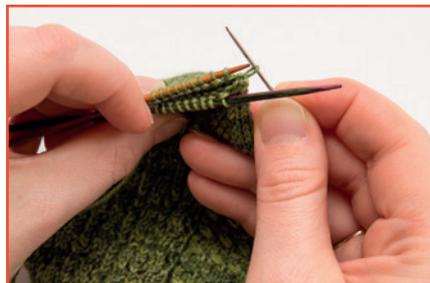
2. Insert the needle into the first stitch on the DPN furthest from you **as if to knit** and pull it through, leaving the stitch **on** the needle.



3. Insert the needle into the first stitch on the DPN closest to you **as if to knit** and pull it through, slipping the stitch **off** the needle.



4. Insert the needle into the first stitch on the DPN closest to you **as if to purl** and pull it through, leaving the stitch **on** the needle.



5. Insert the needle into the first stitch on the DPN furthest from you **as if to purl** and pull it through, slipping the stitch **off** the needle.



6. Insert the needle into the first stitch on the DPN furthest from you **as if to knit** and pull it through, leaving the stitch **on** the needle.

### FINISHING

Repeat steps 3-6 until all the live stitches have been grafted together.

The grafted stitches will be looser than the knitted stitches around them. Use the tapestry needle to neaten them: starting at the first stitch to be grafted, pull each stitch until it matches the knitted stitches on the toe. Take the yarn to the inside of the sock and weave in the end to finish.



How to...

## LONG-TAIL CAST-ON

This cast-on method gives a firm but flexible edge that is perfect for socks.



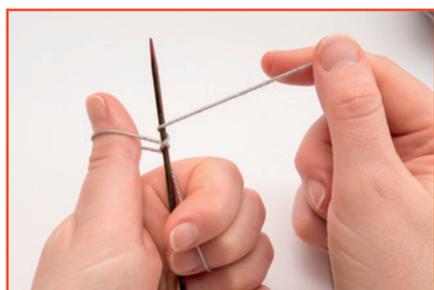
1. Measure approximately 1m [1yd] of yarn, place the yarn over the needle with the ball at the rear and the tail of the yarn towards you. Use your forefinger to hold the yarn on the needle.



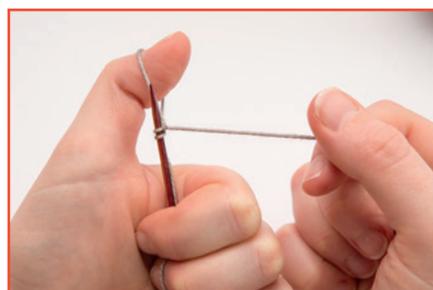
2. Using the tail end of the yarn, make a loop of yarn around your thumb as shown.



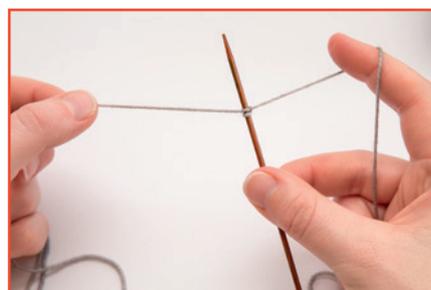
3. Put the needle tip into the loop.



4. Use your right hand to wrap the yarn from the ball side around the needle tip.



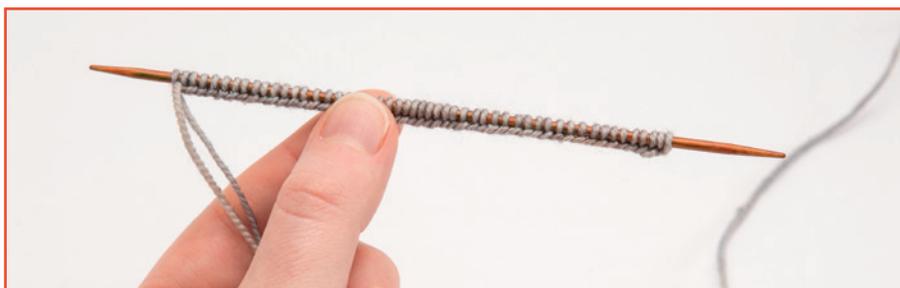
5. Use your thumb to lift the loop off the end of the needle, thus making the first (formed by holding the yarn over the needle) and second stitches.



6. Gently tighten both ends of the yarn (tail and ball sides).

### CONTINUE AS SET

Repeat steps 2 to 6 until you have cast on the desired number of stitches.

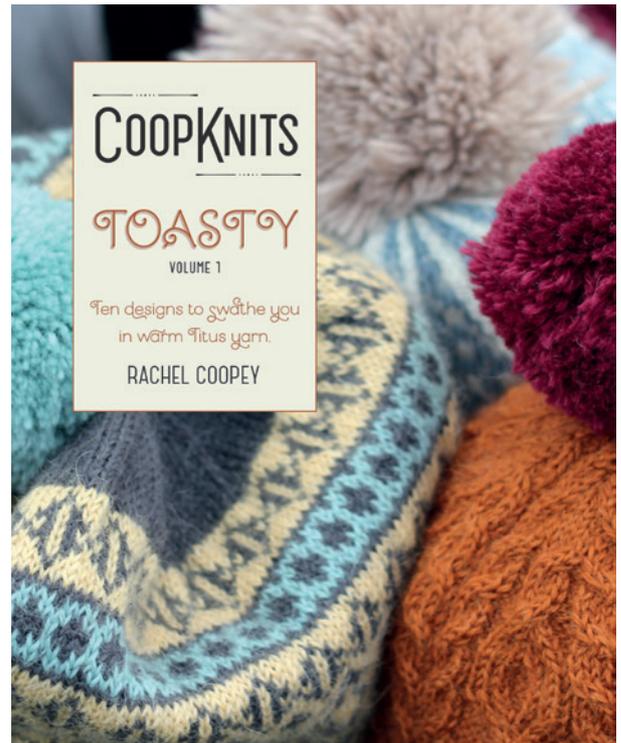
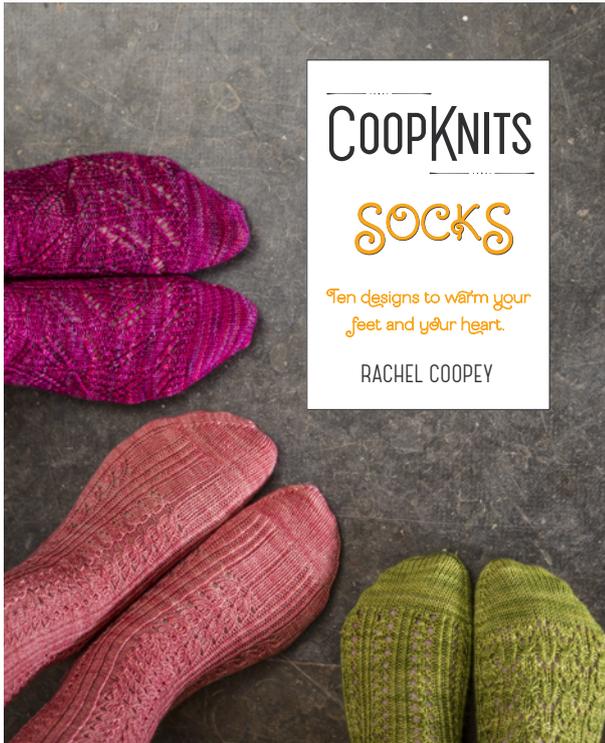

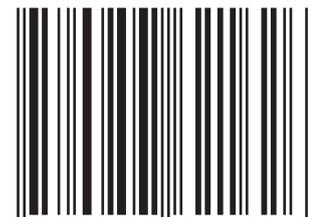
